Steve Perun, Program Director of KIIS-AM/FM, will keep his current responsibilities, but has also been named National Program Director for Gannett Radio.



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EMI APPOINTS TOM ZUTAUT TO HEAD NEW LABEL



Charles Koppelman, Chairman and Chief Executive Officer, EMI Records Group North America and Ken Berry, President and CEO of EMI Records Group International, announced the formation of a new record company headed by Tom Zutaut, one of the industry's most successful and respected A&R executives.

The label, which will be based in New York, will have its own Promotion, Sales, Marketing and A&R staffs. It will be distributed in the U.S. by Cema Distribution. Effective September 1, Zutaut will oversee the company as President and Chief Executive Officer, reporting to Koppelman.

Zutaut has played a key role in signing such powerhouse acts as Guns N' Roses, Motley Crue, Enya, Dokken, Tesla and Edie Brickell & The New Bohemians. These six acts alone have sold more than 60 million albums in the United States, according to the Recording Industry Association of America. Zutaut has called his career a "classic mail-room story." He began his career in the

He quickly rose through the ranks, working in inventory, field merchandising and sales, before landing an A&R job at Eletkra Records in Los Angeles. In 1981, he persuaded the label to sign Motley Crue, whose 1983 Elektra debut album, "Shout At The Devil," has sold more than three million copies.

Upon making the announcement, Koppelman said, "I'm a big believer in putting music people in charge. And Tom is a tremendous music person, with a proven ability to develop talent, both artistic and executive. This is the next logical step in his career development, and it's a perfect fit for us as we

launch a major new label." Berry added: "I've known Tom since he was a teenager, and I've taken pride and pleasure in watching him develop as an allaround music executive. He's the perfect choice for an artist-driven label."



<u>A LABOR DAY</u> TRANSFUSION

When we were kids, the long summer would mark the years of our lives. The extended vacat on from school and the great weather came as a reward after nine months of organized learning. Then, the day after Labor Day, we'd get shocked back to reality – a new school year, new teachers, fresh challenges. Back to school brought mixed feelings but none of us at any age can get by "back to school time" without having some kind of emotional response. It's the starting gun of the new year for all our formative periods.

After all these years I still kind of miss school. You see, it really does give us a new start every year – a clear slate and new challenge. Sure, some people feel that way about New Years Eve, but that holiday strikes me as more social and less about our career growth.

This year, for the first time in a long time, I'm really pumped up for the new work year. I went "back to school" at the Talentmasters Boct Camp in Atlanta. I didn't want to go – Atlanta is hot ard miserable in late August and the N.A.E. Convention almost immediately follows the Boot Camp, but Don Anthony has been after me for years to attend. I thank him – he was right.

We need to be empowered - we're dealing with an intangible and it's so easy to lose focus

and run out of steam. Scott Shannon's inspirational keynote captured the spirit of dedication to this business. He relayed the story of a supermarket box boy who hung around at Pirate Radio in Los Angeles until Scott took him in as an intern. Working for no salary, the kid was so focused on getting into radio that when coming into his unpaid job he rolled his father's car over, hitched a ride, and abandoning the car in a ditch.

He can't be reminded often enough of the value of passion and dedication to what we do in radio. As Scott Shannon said of his own determination to keep getting back in the ring and going at it - "I didn't have a Plan B." I needed to be reminded that few of us have a Plan B, so we must persevere at Plan A to make sure we're the absolute best we can be.

In an era of giant faceless multi-station conglomerates, I needed to hear Randy Michaels of Jacor too. He runs a Top 10 Group with personal trust and caring. Randy reaffirmed that talent is the tie-breaker in today's challenged radio. It was exciting to see Randy at breakfast DX'ing radio stations with the newest receiver bells and whistles. Radio's not just a business for Randy – it's a way of life. He suggests that radio stations turn their organization over – so the listeners drive the talent which, in turn drive the PD, GM and the company overall.

As controversial as it was, the passion for radio was felt in the "Stuttering John" ambush of

Mancow. With all the charged fervor of a WWF grudge match, the face-to-face reflected real human emotions and a healthy dose of show-biz. Our business has sometimes thought it ought to grow out of confrontations because we're corporate. It's refreshing to see hot-headed people duke it out. It sure beats talking about how many record calls a station can tolerate in a day, or what somebody's reporting status is.

Q106's Jeff and Jet pointed out the value of teamwork and public image. Radio can still motivate people to show up in throngs for the right cause. The newspapers and TV media can increase our voices a hundredfold when they're brought into the act.

Indeed, one frequency and transmitter is the same as another given the same power and signal. One station can fight its competitor only so much by being sick. The tie-breaker is the talent – jocks who become the listeners' friends and extended family with a real heart and blood pulsing through their veins. Radio is, first and foremost, an entertainment medium. Let's enter the fall – the "New Year" – with a renewed respect for people like Scott Shannon's supermarket box boy who has a paying on-air gig in California. This is our way of life – let's exude the passion and pride of what we are!





MARK, GIVE US A QUICK UPDATE ON YOUR RESUME. WHERE YOU GOT STARTED, WHEN YOU GOT IN AND HOW YOU ENDED UP THERE IN GRAND RAPIDS.

Mark: I went to Columbia College in Chicago and worked at the college station beginning the summer of my freshman year. A good friend to this day, Jeff Kapugi, gave me my first shot doing a morning shift. This later grew into the Music Director then PD of the college station. After graduation I worked at WBUS in suburban Chicago, where I did everything from parttime to overnights to nights. Moving on from there I went to work at WVIC (Goodrich Broadcasting) in Lansing, Michigan, my wife's hometown. After a few short weeks at WVIC, Goodrich transferred me to WSNX, Grand Rapdis/Muskegon as MD and afternoon host. After three years at WSNX, Kevin Gossett (PD/Morning Man at the time) hired me at WGRD, Grand Rapids to be his APD/afternoon host. After two years at 'GRD the station changed ownership and some changes transpired. The GSM at 'GRD segued to WSNX as GM and hired me "back" to "SUNNY" to be PD/Morning Man. It's great to be back! Oh, and here's a funny thing, Jill Gossett, WSNX's General Manager is Kevin's wife.

OH, IS THAT RIGHT?

Yes. Kevin is the Morning Show Host for Evergreen's WASH-FM in Washington, D.C. Jill Gossett, his wife is here with Goodrich Broadcasting as the General Manager of WSNX-FM, WMRR-FM, WSFN-AM.

Jill: Grand Rapids like many cities this year has seen numerous changes due to duopoly restructuring. A year-and-a-half ago significant changes occurred within our staff and I put together our new team. I was very pleased to have Mark McGill join us. His knowledge of the market, having worked now for six years in West Michigan is most valuable.

GRAND RAPIDS IS AN INTER-ESTING MARKET FOR A COUPLE OF REASONS. ONE IS THAT FOR A MARKET ITS SIZE, IT WAS REALLY, UP UNTIL VERY RECENTLY, ONE OF THE LAST MARKETS TO HAVE TWO TOP40S GOING HEAD TO HEAD.

Mark: Exactly. Grand Rapids had two Top40's: WSNX and WGRD.

The only changes SUNNY has seen have really been for the better!

We're very pleased that SUNNY has the largest share in the Grand Rapids market that it has ever seen. We're on the streets of "G.R." with morning show antics or client events every week. WGRD was an adult Hot AC when Liggett Broadcasting purchased it from Regional Broadcasting. Liggett also owned cross-town AC/WLHT. They changed WGRD back to Top40. It seemed to be a hope for WLHT to gain 'GRD's AC adults and for 'GRD to re-establish itself as the Top40 leader, but that didn't happen. SUNNY had entrenched itself as the Top40 leader and WGRD lost in a head-to-head battle. We believe consistency won out and Liggett thought that all they would have to do was say WGRD was Top40 and people would come running back. Fortunately, the market was very happy with SUNNY being the Top40 leader. Everyone found out it's about performance not just labels. WGRD has since changed formats twice. Top40 to Modern Rock to New Rock. They won't play anything "poppy" at all. They'll play some Gin Blossoms and Counting Crows, but we're the only station playing Real McCoy, TLC, Ace Of Base, All-4-One, and Coolio just to name a few. Oh, and WGRD has just been sold

YOU GO AFTER EACH OTHER. OBVIOUSLY THAT'S CHANGED A LITTLE BIT NOW THAT 'GRD IS DOING THE NEW ROCK THING, BUT YOU'RE LESS *DIRECT* COMPETITORS. YET OBVIOUSLY EVERYBODY WITH A SIGNAL IN THE MARKET COMPETES AGAINST EVERYBODY ELSE.

Jill: You betcha. The financial competition is still there for every dollar that comes into our market. We have to share with our advertisers "our story," how we can help their business prosper, and under promise and over deliver to receive more than "our fair share." 1994 was a record year for sales for our properties here. WSNX/WMRR/ WSFN. 1995 is pacing nicely ahead, but we're always striving to do even better.

Mark: Programming-wise we're not calling each other names on the air, well, not anymore. Again, we're the only station playing the poppy stuff. 'GRD's PD and I have remained friends even through the battle.

NOW THAT YOU'VE PRETTY MUCH ACHIEVED TOP40 MARKET CUME EXCLUSIV-ITY, HOW DO YOU SEE WSNX EVOLVING?

ALSO UNIQUE IS WHILE IT'S A COMPETITIVE SITUATION, THERE ISN'T SOME OF THE ANIMOSITY BETWEEN SOME OF THE PERSONALITIES INVOLVED.

Jill: Yes, that's true. There's been a lot of turnover with people going to different stations within the market. This is primarily because of duopoly/personnel changes. There's probably somebody at nearly every station in the market that Mark and I have both worked with.

Mark: While we are competitive it's a friendly kind of competition. It's not uncommon to see some of their staff at our free concerts, and our staff at one of their movie sneaks. Mark: Jill and I with Bill Richards our consultant talk about this often. We're going to continue to stay Mainstream Top40 and play the hits. We've learned from others mistakes that you must stay focused to win with your targeted key demos. We're not going to be one of those station's that's a Hot AC during the day and then at 5 p.m. you turn in to something completely different. We'll focus on continuing to grow our key demos, while "tweaking" or fine tuning our music to achieve mainstream balance

WITH THE ABSENCE OF A HOT AC COMPETITOR, IS THERE A TEMPTATION OR ANY PRESSURE FROM MAN-AGEMENT TO MAYBE ADJUST THE FORMAT TO TRY TO FILL



THAT NICHE? IS THERE ANY SORT OF DISCUSSION OF THAT?

Mark: Sure there's discussion, we'd be foolish not to evaluate our options and where the holes are. Our conclusion amounts to taking advantage of areas we can stretch a little and give our audience the hits they want to hear. We do believe in dayparting somewhat, but again, not so much so that you'd think you're listening to a different station. We focus on staying "hip" and having passion for the music we play.

GIVE US A LOOK AT THE LIFESTYLE OF THE AUDI-ENCE IN THE MARKET.

Mark: They're families. There is a funny saying about Grand Rapids... that there's a church on every corner...well there is, nearly! It's a great place to raise a family and have a home. People are active and enjoy the outdoors. Our market, Grand Rapids/Muskegon is on Lake Michigan so we take advantage of the lakeshore. It's a beautiful resort community in the summertime with fabulous dune beaches, state parks, and tons of marinas. Also, great fishing, hunting and snow skiing is nearby in the winter

Jill: There's a good number of international companies with their world headquarters here, including Amway's corporate offices and manufacturing plants. Perigo, the world's largest drug manufacturer of aspirin and cough syrup is here. The Brunswick Bowling Corp., the Bissell Vacuum Company, Steelcase, Miller Furniture, Herman Guardsman Products, Gerber Foods, and the list goes on! Industry here is excellent and the retail community grows substantially every year.

Mark: Our "litmus test" is that both mother and daughter listen. They're mostly women who are working professionals; moms, and college and high school students. Our main demo is 12-34, with the target being a 26-27 female. A "P-1" listener would typically wake up with SUNNY, get ready for work, maybe get the kids off to school, who also listen, drive to work. maybe listen at work or over the lunch hour, and drive home listening. She also leads a very active lifestyle. There are certainly men who also listen too, but the target is women.

WHAT DO YOU DO TO APPEAL TO HER? WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF FEATURES THAT YOU PROGRAM? WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF THINGS THAT YOU TRY TO GET YOUR STAFF TO DO TO MAKE WSNX BE HER RADIO STATION?

Mark: We live their lifestyle and take an interest in what interests them. We let them know that we care, rather than have them care that we know. We watch the TV shows they do, we read the magazines they do, and play the home Sega video games their families are into.

We go to see the movies they see, and talk about 'em with their input. We frequent their "hang-outs" like the nightclubs, the movie theatres, and the beaches. We give them "local SUNNY free concerts" with national recording artists, other concert tickets, trip giveaways to destinations of their choice, an annual car giveaway of a new convertible Mustang; active lifestyle prizes like waterskiis, waverunners, mountain bikes, campers, an annual "Cash for College" scholarship contest awarding six students each, an annual Bridal Fair, annual High School Football and Basketball halftime contests, and an annual "SUNNY Summers" High School basketball fundraising team. Jill has done a fantastic job of conceptualizing and implementing promotions that are great for programming and that generate sales.

Jill: Thanks Mark! One of the key elements of success at SUNNY has been incorporating promotions that directly benefit programming, the listener and the sales department. We've never sold one out for the other, that's of course also essential for success. I'm so pleased with the super team of people who have worked together to make this happen. Hugh S. McPherson, GSM, Elena Angelos, Marketing Director, Mark Jacobs, Creative Services Director, Mark McClure, Local Sales Manager, Mike St. Cyr, Operations Manager, a hard-working on-air staff and sales team. And of course our programming consultant,

Bill Richards, and sales training consultant, Chuck Mefford.

LET'S TOUCH ON YOUR STAFF A LITTLE BIT. YOU TALKED ABOUT MORNINGS. WHO DOES THE SHOW AND WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT AND WHEN IS IT ON AND GIVE US ALL THE INFO.

Mark: It's "McGill in the Morning." We're on 5:30 a.m. - 10 a.m. I do the morning show with our New Director, Sabrina Fairchild, who is a super "in demo female," and a sidekick/producer. So it's a three-person morning show, plus an intern who can help out. We do a lot of Morning Show "antics" out and about in the community to reach out and touch our listeners. There are several syndicated shows in the market who can't offer this to their listeners, so we feel this is a very good thing for SUNNY. WGRD has Kevin Matthews on a day-later, tape delay basis, Urban AC, WMHG, reaching Muskegon only, has Tom Jovner.

So we do a lot of local stuff. I've got a 16-month-old daughter who's in potty training right now. You wouldn't believe the women who want to offer support and advice to remedies for child care. And believe me, some of it's very funny. We talk about what our listeners find interesting like that, and their love lives. We have special features that listeners can participate in, such as "The McGill Mindbender," and the market four years as well. So we all have been here for a while and know the market.

AFTERNOONS YOU HAVE?

Mike Sinclair. Mike's been at SUNNY for about a year now. He's also been a production director in the market, so he's kind of the Assistant Production Directorr for SUNNY. Mike's show includes a feature of "At-Work Network Trivia." Mike's married and has a young son, so he's doing a lot of relatable lifestyle stuff, too. Nights come alive with Keith Curry, 7 p.m. - midnight. Keith is also our Music Director. When I first came "back" to SUNNY Keith was doing overnights. Keith offered to "help out" and wanted to learn more, so we got him up to speed. He's become a real asset to SUNNY and to me. Keith and I have music meetings every week and he really assists me. Keith works with the record reps and they know he's not just a "speed bump." Keith's night show is very strong! At night we tend to be a bit younger being the only Top40 in town, and Keith really relates to the teens. He also lives the lifestyle, and goes to area football games when he can. Keith will have the cheerleaders and a few players as guests in the studio a couple days before a "big game," which creates quite a stir. Spin, Teen and Rolling Stone magazines are just a few of the read materials Keith keeps up with. He knows what the teens are talking about, what's hot and what's not.

"Useless Trivia." Middays we have "Britta." Britta is from West Michigan. She went to San Diego and worked a bit in radio there. She sang the National Anthem at almost every Chargers home game, then decided to come back home. Britta has been with SUNNY for about a year, and does a super job. We're very pleased with Britta. She's another "in demo female" at SUNNY. Her show includes the feature "Flashback Hits." During the noon hour we throw in a few "Flashback Hits" from the '80s and early '90s.

THE FACT THAT BRITTA IS LOCAL MEANS SHE CAN TALK ABOUT THE MARKET WITH A REAL INATE KNOWLEDGE OF WHAT SHE'S SPEAKING ABOUT.

Absolutely, and it comes through. I've been in the market for six years and our afternoon host has been in WHAT'S THE MUSIC PHILO-SOPHY THERE? WHEN YOU AND KEITH ARE TALKING ABOUT A PARTICULAR THING THAT YOU LISTEN FOR, A PARTICULAR TYPE OF ARTIST OR A PARTICULAR ATTRIBUTE OF A SONG THAT MAKES IT REALLY RIGHT FOR YOUR STATION OVER SOME-THING ELSE?

Mark: Balance is a big word for us and we do have a unique situation. Listening to SUNNY one could tell this. With 'GRD and 'KLQ battling over the Rock product in the Grand Rapids market we can afford to play only the absolute best, big hits on the Alternative/Rock side. The Collective Soul's obvious, but we can wait on other product until it's a big hit, then we'd hit it. The Counting Crows and the Gin Blossoms we're gonna play. So we're kind of unique in that we can let

some of the Alternative stuff get top five, which makes the record guys bang their heads against the wall on why we're not playing something. Coming back to the fact that we're the only station that will play Real McCoy, TLC's Waterfalls, Montell Jordan, Coolio, and Adina Howard, we leave some of the slots open and play those records. We can also wait a little bit on those because nobody's gonna beat us to the punch there! Nobody's gonna be "hipper" than us on the Urban dancy/poppy side. So it's very unique. We're also a very safe radio station with familiar Mainstream variety being the key. We play what people expect from us. They want to hear the Soul Asylum's and Collective Souls, but they want to hear the Fun Factory and the All-4-One's too. So again, it's a matter of balance.

LOOKING AHEAD, WHAT'S NEXT FOR WSNX, MARK McGILL AND JILL GOSSETT?

Mark: I'm real happy here for now. My wife has a great job too, and we enjoy beautiful West Michigan. It's a super place to raise a child. Being from Chicago with my entire family still living there, it would be fantastic to get there by the time our daughter. Kennedy goes to school. She'd have her cousins, aunts and uncles to grow up with. If that doesn't happen we'll continue to enjoy West Michigan, our friends here and working for Goodrich. As for the station, we're going to stay the same. As the market evolves we may as well. As mentioned before, "tweaking" and fine tuning our product is on-going. You can count on WSNX remaining a Mainstream Top40 radio station, doing what we do best!

Jill: The past year-and-a-half here at WSNX/WMRR/WSFN has been a handful what with nearly an entire staff change, separating the FM sales forces, doubling our sales team, opening a satellite Grand Rapids Sales Office, and the headto-head Top40 battle for SUNNY in Grand Rapids. We've accomplished a great deal with Programming and Sales performance. I'm very proud of our team accomplishment! We are currently building a Grand Rapids from which some studio programming will originate. Currently, our studios are in Muskegon with our tower half way between Grand Rapids and Muskegon. SUNNY serves both markets. Personally, I've been having a ball, working hard, but, enjoying the fruits of our labor. Sometime in the not too distant future I will work toward living and working in the same market as my husband. We've been doing the long distance commuting thing for 18 months now. Until then, onward and upward and thank goodness for frequent flier miles

AN AD AGENCY PERSPECTIVE ON

BUYING RADIO

Ad agencies, acting on behalf of their clients, the advertisers, are always on the look out for more. But not just any "more." Not the kind of "more" that leads solely to "mass targeting," also known as the shot-gun approach. But rather, a very specific "more" – streamlined to meet our specific needs. Let's be honest.: ad agencies want more personal service, more "added value," more targeted ideas, more spots, more results, more and mcre (with the exception of rate increases). Our clients are heavily focused on the bottom line, so the more we can do for them, the more results we can generate, the more money we can save them, then the more fruitful our relationship will be.

We need our radio partners to understand that at a very basic level, that is how we think and that is how we need them to think. Once upon a time, our job was to create advertising and plan and buy the media that would expose a target consumer to that advertising. Now we must do more. Cnce upon a time, it was a radio reps job to sell air time to set the rate, assist with a schedule that will reach a broadly defined target audience. Now, as you know, and as most of you do, it is time to find ways to do more. Before we analyze what "more" an advertising agency looks for from radio, let's take a look at what we're already getting.

While radio listeners tune in for music, personalities, news, talk and other format preferences...advertisers and their agencies should be turned on by the media's flexibility. The medium is portable, allowing your message to travel with the consumer. The medium is immediate, conveying up-to-date entertainment and information, and enabling advertisers to change their message as frequently as necessary. The medium is interactive, allowing for consumers to have a voice by calling-in, going to a live remote, or any other form of participation that puts them in contact with both the station and the advertiser. And, there's more. So if radio gives so much, what could an agency still be looking for?

• More information – about your station's listenership as it relates to our client's products and services. The more data that you can provide an agency with that supports that your listeners are our clients core consumers, the better. Just knowing that you do well with women 18-34 is no longer enough. You have the tools to know who that 18-34 year-old really is, what she sounds like, what she buys, where she lives and what she wants. Use those tools and share them with the agency whenever you can, even if we don't ask you for the info.

•More local market data – to keep us up-to-date on what's going on in your ADI. Remember, in many cases, a station rep can be the eyes and ears of an ad agency in a market that they are unable to visit personally on a regular basis. Follow-up with the agencies that are buying your station and those that haven't bought it yet. Provide local market insights that may be relevent to the agency's business, even if they have nothing to do with something your station is trying to sell. Agency's remember reps that go the extra mile and do more.

· More creativity - especially if it involves taking an agency's client and developing an ownable program for them, to set them apart from the standard" advertiser. It might be an on-air program, a merchandising vehicle, a contest or promotion, or perhaps a multi-branded program that leverages the station's relationship with related but non-competing clients. Agency's are looking for creative partners. Once they've finished a spot and it's filling its pod of air time, they're hungry for ideas that will excite them and their client. Create opportunities. Make sure your sales department and programming department are in constant communication about what your advertisers need. If you're going to create new ideas, why not make sure they're the kind of ideas one of your agency's is likely to buy?

Of course, there's more. There's always more, no matter how great a job you're already doing. And you are! You really are! Radio reps throughout the country continue to provide agencies with the highest standard service and product.

RULE OF THE SLUMLORDS

Now that David Letterman is joking about media mergers on a regular basis, I guess it's official: We're at the peak of merger mania in our world of broadcasting.

The Wa't Disney Company takes over Capital Cities/ABC for \$19 billion. Westinghouse Electric lays down \$5.4 billion for CBS. Letterman screams that he's working for bottomfeeders, and hints that he'd like to make a move to ABC.

Here at your local level, radio stations are being traded like baseball cards. The guys from corporate say, "We don't run radio stations for your benefit. This is a business. We run radio stations to make money."

Where does the audience fit into this?

Don't broadcasters use the public airwaves to provide service in the public interest? Or has the public interest thing kinda been swept under the rug, a relic of 'he past?

William Pfeiffer, editor of AIRWAVES RADIO JOURNAL, an Internet-based radio-professional publication, says, "It is the slumlord attitude that says we don't run our building for the tenants benefit. Sadly, people with this attitude truly could not care less about those they presumably serve, because they are serving only two masters: the almighty dollar and themselves. How pleasing it is to realize that the great medium of radio is in the hands of those who could not care less about the listener (whom they supposedly serve)."

Pfeiffer says, "I am certainly not opposed to stations making a profit. But there is more than one way to make a profit. But there is more than one way to make a profit. Many owners still care about service, and their stations are continually at the top of the ratings. However, others seem to have a slash-andburn, who-cares approach which will bring high profit for an owner in the short run, but will leave in its wake, a devastated broadcasting structure that may never recover. It is this reporter's opinion that the new [radio station] ownership regulations foster the latter philosophy at the expense of the former." Pfeiffer can be reached via email at EDITOR@airwaves.com.

Mr. Pfeiffer is hardly alone in his fears. Here in my local Portland Oregonian the editionial says, "Lawmakers should make sure that radio, television and the print media don't lose their multiple independent voices and diversity of opinion in the rush to form media monopolies under deregulation."

Columnist Robert Reno asks if the media are about to join those industries "whose days of glory lie behind them. Railroads, steel, airlines, financial services..."

America is becoming more and more diverse. How much diversity will we have in broadcasting when it is controlled by a handful of corporations? Jeff Cohen of the media watchdog group FAIR says "The old public interest standards are being thrown out. What used to be illegal is now being bragged about."

Any radio programmer who has seen his/her direct competitor turned off knows that it is not a total positive. Next thing you know the owner and upper management no longer feel a sense of urgency to improve or maintain your product. There's no longer this reason to do things. Tools you took for granted disappear. The outdoor advertising, the music and audience research budgets, the part-time hours, the pay scale for your talent. Your station may not be as good, but hey, there's no competition. They've been bought by your company and made into something that does not compete. Great for the owner, sometimes very bad for the audience.

The NAB Radio Show is coming up at the New Orleans Convention Center September 6-9. Will the leaders of our industry address these questions? Or will they ignore them? Many of us who really care about radio will be looking to see their reaction to our current state of merger. As the people who make radio happen, we expect to hear some discussion of these critical issues. We will be watching.

THE VANISHING RADIO ETHIC

I was out on the road, doing a market visit last year and the station that I was hanging at had a live broadcast from a local festival on the weekend that I was in town. The PD and I went to the Promotion Director to find out the schedule so that we could all go to the event, work the booth, and mingle with the listeners (which is still the best audience research available to the industry). The promotion guy said that he hadn't planned on going to the festival since he'd had to work a remote the previous weekend. I pulled the PD aside and said, "This guy definitely needs to go bye - bye in the car - car. Quickly." He has and the quality of radio in general has improved dramatically thanks to his absence.

An isolated incident? Hardly. From talking to people around the country, I get the impression that there are a lot of people working in Radio who think of this as a job rather than a way of life, and that sucks. This is the greatest possible job anyone could ever have, and there are people who actually treat it as a 9 to 5 obligation, and nothing more. Without playing the martyr, I once ended up in a cardiac unit after having worked without a dayoff for 3 1/2 years. I never even noticed that I had done 1200 days in a row until I was hooked up to monitors and a cardiologist and I were trying to figure out how this could happen. Following this little trauma, I adjusted my schedule and took off one Monday a month and felt dramatically better for it.

People going into Radio Promotions need to know a couple of things. It can be an intensely satisfying job. Few rushes can equal pulling off a great stunt or event and totally annihilating the competition. But it takes hard work to do that, and packing up and going home at 5:30pm on Friday afternoon won't cut it. Not if you want to win. The basic analogy that I use with my Promotion Directors is that you're a bartender: count on working weekends and all of the major holidays. When I took the Clifton gig it was the first time since Jimmy Carter was President that I was not at a Radio event on Valentines Day, Halloween, New Year' Eve or any of the other Hallmark holidays, and I missed that terribly.

Rob Riddelmoser (whose birth name was Nick St. Stevens but he changed it for Radio: he thought "Riddlemoser" would flow better Onair) has done Promotions at Hot 102/ Milwaukee, Y-95 / Phoenix and KGGI Riverside. Rob's holding day off but that just doesn't happen. I'm always working. I'm always thinking about what we can do to improve," adds Rob. "I wouldn't know what a vacation is. I know I probably wouldn't like it. The bottom line is that this is my work. This is how I get off," concludes Riddlemoser.

As long as people understand that Radio is a war, then they'll be more motivated to do what it takes to win it. Rick Thomas, Program Director at KSFM / Sacramento has been in a lot of Radio wars. and is always on the winning side. "People need to realize that Radio is about making money. And for your station to make massive money, you have to pull rating shares from other stations and they won't be happy about it. And that's the foundation for the war that we're in," says Thomas. Rick believes in leading by example;



down the Promotion Director spot at Z -100 /Portland and he shares my terror about the growing numbers of Radio employees who don't live in the "24/7" mind set. "We've got the best lifestyle anyone could ever ask for. I should know. I tried a lot of jobs before landing in Radio and now I would never do anything else," says Riddlemoser. He believes that people who understand the energy this industry requires, will win. And those who don't, won't. "My old GM always wanted me to take a

Greensboro, "they're where they're at because they work there asses off. People who are stars in Radio are stars because they worked above and beyond the call of duty. This isn't K-mart. This is life or death," advises Douglas. He believes that if everyone in Radio had a 9 to 5 attitude, we'd all be tied at a six share. But we aren't. The stations that succeed are the stations that have people working from the heart. "You've got to LOVE it. If you have the passion, you won't accept it any other way," says Brian.

Radio is supposed to be fun, while it can also be hard work. Take a step back and look at what we do. There's a million people out there who would die to do what we do. Remember that when you're putting in all of those hours. In promotions, you can make this the best job anyone could ever have, or you can make it the worst. "I like the original 12" which had the House mix. But on the Hip Hop tip I like the 'B.W. Vibe' Remix" Steve 'Smokin' Chavez/KTFM




