PERSISTENCE

With one hot topic being that of employment ...getting a job for many, and getting the job done for others. Both ways, knocking on doors, selling yourself, being equipped with a sharp attitude, having a service to offer is a must. Also, the only "key" other than "who ya know," (dumb luck, right place, right time), etc., is being persistent. I've watched and heard so many people in this process exclaim that they've tried everything. Millions of ways to get in the door but nothing works! Millions is a lot of attempts. In reality, thousands is a lot. It's true that hundreds is still a lot. But most people haven't even tried dozens of times. Your daily mission is to take massive, consistent action. Go for what you want with flexibility and focus. Take immediate action every day no matter how small that action may seem. It may be tough times or a slump, but pursuing your goals must not be cluttered with any sense that there is no solution. Keep trying. Think of new approaches and never indulge in feelings of being depressed or defeated. We all go through setbacks, frustrations, disappointments and problems. The fact that so many great successes by a great number of really famous people are the direct result of vision and persistence.

WELCOME TO THE RADIO BIZ BLAST

With over a four billion dollar year in buying and selling of stations this year (compared with a one billion dollar number last year) there's a lot of concerr. Congress, back on the job now, is looking at pending telecommunications legislation. By November, the House and Senate will have telcom issues in front of President Clinton that still face his threat of veto regarding (at the top of his list), excessive ownership and other assorted issues. A new generation of the radio business has clearly made itself known this past year. It's doubtful that this revolutionary pattern will let up. With it comes opportunity and stress. Who owns what? How many (stations) does "who" own...in what market(s)? What's the impact on the job market? So far, it's got a lot of radio people a bit "up-side down". And with radio being part of the big entertainment companies that include movies, cable, publishing, TV, "INTERNET radio broadcasting," DAB, records, etc., the opportunity factor is obvious. This sweeping change brought on (in part) by deregulation does present some definite room for hard study and keeping up with legislation. New names and faces, new ideas mixed with recognized names and faces...and ideas. Since this time last year when Steven and David started the ball rolling, it seems that each month, week or day ... anything could happen. The "simple" old days are headed for the history books. A fresh attitude developing

new and stronger "brain" muscle. We get to look at everything in a brand new way. Don't blink!

HOUSE OF THE RISING SUN

The NAB Radio Show in New Orleans is loaded with information and (exciting as it was in Las Vegas in April with the awesome display of technological wizardry) will set up a new belief system for the quickly departing year...and era...I will report as much of the indispensable information and knowledge, expectations and basic buzz that I can collect. Of the past 25 or so NAB's, I can't recall one that will be so important. Hope to see you if you make it in!

TECH TREK:

Tapeless studios, satellite delivered programming, ISDN. New technology is booming at a speed almost too fast to comprehend, bringing Digital workstations in all shapes and sizes, even ones for PC's, consoles, mic's, processing, outboard effect gizmo's and gadgets galore! There is no reason that radio stations (in any market) can't sound fantastic. Yet, still there are so many that aren't doing homework, bringing in studio consultants, etc. to get that unique sound that helps you jump out of the dial and leaves a subconscious print on your listeners brain. Many of the listening audience spend gobs of money on sound systems and it blows me away to walk into a station and see equipment ready for a yard sale. We don't have a picture to go along with our programming...MTV picked up on that over a decade ago with some very good results after getting around the old stick in the mud cable operators. And it's the very least we can do to supplement the programming. It's affordable more than ever before, works well in budgets and is an area that should be addressed by every station on the planet. RAP does good reviews (Radio & Production, Irving TX), Network with others with studios that have some extra bells and whistles. Shop around. Bring in a sound man out of radio. They are worth their weight in gold. (Your on-site engineer may not like the "outsider" idea at first, protecting their turf). But, when they better understand what it is you want...if they are really good and on "the team," they should be as excited as you about getting new stuff. Like Nike says, "Just Do It!"

BUILDING A KINGDOM

Starting a station, turning one around or tweaking a sagging format requires a lot of work. (It has always been my favorite programming adventure.) It's a time that there is so much emotion, so many "hats to wear," explaining the why's or why nots, interacting with the entire staff of the station. Working with sales, traffic, office staff, the GM, owner, the

Dee Jays and so forth. There is so much to do. David Tate of Rantell Research once told me that my problem was that I made it look too easy. He was probably right from outward appearances. However, I can assure you it's not that easy. With a focused plan and the backing of your GM and owner support (often referred to as autonomy)....it make things go a lot smoother. Moving swiftly and executing a plan will sometimes make you appear to be "distant" and "tough." Well, when you pin on "the badge," don't expect to win everyone over in a popularity contest. It goes with the territory. After a bit, some will see you in a different light, some will always think "not so kindly" of you. Usually you can get past that. Sometimes you'll need to act on it. One thing you don't need is gossip queens. Weed 'em out fast. Then go on to the basics: Defining the format, (filling the "hole") execution design, promotional thrust, the "handle," (what are you going to call it? That is so important!) Set the playlist, music scheduling, the personality of the station...the "stationality as a whole.) There's lot's to do! The logo, the whole package. But it's all worth it when you take a market, break the spirit of the other guys and make that special bond with listeners from the start. If you'd like to go over some basic (very easy) formatics," the ten commandments" (as I like to call 'em)...the behavior curve of listeners as they should respond to your station, let me know by E-mail or by fax or a phone call. It's cool stuff and works! Building this kingdom you are not only determined, you are unstoppable. Be brilliant, energized, amazing, outrageous, blessed. The other side of the coin, you are never depressed, rather calm before action. You don't fail, you are learning. If you feel lost, you are searching. Something terrible? Nah, just different. (By now you get it). Turn you internalized thoughts and vocabulary to the empowered state. Turbocharge your experience. Make your word your wand, and make your wand sparkle with excitement and with certainty.

MARK SHANDS BACKCOUNTRY RADIO

Backpacking solo, deep in the Columbia Gorge Wilderness Area, forty miles east of Portland, Oregon, I'm almost eight miles deep in this mountainous, forest covered backcountry. This Cedar Swamp area is known for having the best preserve of old growth trees in the Columbia Gorge. Huge, ancient cedars and noble firs surround my campsite.

I haven't seen another human being for a day. Yesterday I hiked in and set up my camp here. This morning I'm ready to make the two mile hike up the side of Green Point Mountain. I hear the view from the top is pretty spectacular.

As I'm headed up the moderately steep trail, I notice there are few signs of foot travel on this trail. When my guide book said this are**a** was seldom used they meant it. As I look several yards ahead I suddenly realize...I'm looking at a face! Wait a secound, that's a dog. Must be hikers coming towards me and their dog is running ahead of them. My god, it really is an unusually large ol' brown dog.

Uh, that's no dog. That's a bear! A big brown

bear, calmly watching me walk towards it. Out of total fear I yell! The bear turns as if commenting to a friend. Then I see a couple of small bear cubs scooting up the surrounding trees. It's potentially dangerous cause if mom bear thinks you're a threat to her cubs, she'll fight you to the death. YOUR death!

After running frantically for a minute or two, I stop. Soon I get the nerve to head back up Green Point Mountain. I try to make a lot of noise. The bears disappear into the thick, ancient forest.

I didn't worry much about the bears until the sun was going down. Back at my base camp the darker it gets the more I'm looking for the bears. After all, the spot where I had met them is only about 5 minutes from here. Yep, just Mark In-The-Dark and the bears way up here. What I could use now is some companionship, plus some noise to drown out those spooky forest night sounds. I find my radio and begin surfing the AM band.

Sounds like Wolfman Jack. It's a taped interview on KEX in Portland with the late, great, Wolfman talkin' about his 16 years on Armed Forces Radio and also his fun times spent with John Lennon. Lots of static, then I hear Monday Night Football. It's New York Giants and The Dallas Cowboys. Already Dallas leads 34 to nothing on this CBS Radio broadcast coming to me from KFXX in Oregon City. Then there's KKOH in Reno, Nevada. Around 640 Khz I hear a station fading in...it's KFI from Los Angeles, a thousand miles from here. Diana Ross and The Supremes roll in on KBOI in Boise, Idaho. I also hear KPAY in Chico, California, KGO and KFAX from San Francisco. There's ABC News on the hour from KOMO in Seattle with news of a rock slide that injured a wedding party at Multhomah Falls, just a few miles away from where I'm camping.

It's a strange sensation. I'm lying here in my sleeping bag, literally miles from anybody, yet I can hear the jock in San Francisco hit the remote switches for his cart machines!

I think I see light on the tent walls. It's dawn. Soon I'll be packed up and hiking out on the Herman Creek trail. Hiking back to civilization and my radio gig.

Wonder if anyone ever hears my radio show when they're trying to hide from bears?

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

LIVING ON A BILLBOARD: THE ANATOMY OF A GREAT PROMOTION By Paige Nienaber

Radio Promotions can tend to be pretty "fly by the seat of our pants" and that always drives G.M.'s crazy. But the fact is, sometimes an event or contest that was thrown together in a day gets more mileage than a project that you've been working on for five months. Usually it's because this new Promotion is topical and more timely than the mega-planned event. I've always gotten more of a jazz out of these spur-of-themoment events and find the "big project" promotions to be almost anti-climactic once they are implemented.

A perfect example is something that KSFM/Sacramento just pulled off. I've been hanging out at FM102 for the past three weeks, playing Promotion Director and holding things together while they searched for a replacement after the last individual in the position had exited the building quickly.

Mark S. Allen rose to fame as KSFM's night jock in the late '80's and early 90's. (You may recognize Mark as a former host of TV's "Scratch" and Comedy Central's "Short Attention Span Theater"). Part of what put Mark on the map in Sacramento was a series of campaigns that he did to raise funds for Muscular Dystrophy Association. In 1988, he went up on a billboard and lived there for 14 days. As a first-time event, it was huge, and was made even bigger by Mark's plummetting 55 feet to the pavement and breaking both of his feet. He was back up on his perch within hours and finished the marathon raising over \$10,000 in donations for MDA, and elevating himself to cult-hero status in the market. This was the start of a series of great stunts for Mark. In the coming years he was buried alive for 18 days, hung in a cage from a crane for two weeks and "stranded" for 30 days on a manmade island that the station built on a barge in the middle of the Sacramento River. Ending your promotions with a bang is always important and for the island stunt Mark was "rescued" by Navy SEALS in a helicopter.

Besides being highly talented, Allen is one of the genuinely nicest people in the business. So when he came to me on my second day at KSFM and said he'd like to reprise his MDA promotions, I said, "absolutely!" I mean how often have you had a jock come to you and beg to be isolated away in a potentially dangerous situation? Having done this kind of thing before, he's wellacquainted with making these kind of promotions work.

"It's always been my belief that four elements must be present for a successful charity-driven stunt.1: Pick a stunt that can be seen for miles or has tremendous signage potential. 2: Pick a place that has adequate parking and can accommodate a large flow of driveup response. 3: Risk - real or perceived, there must be a danger factor..height...the elements, etc. And 4: Endurance - this is the most real way to communicate the fact that someone is giving up a chunk of their life for the cause." It's got to run at least a week," says Mark S. Allen.

My time frame to work with? It was Thursday and for Mark to get a full week out of his promotion, it would have to start on Monday. Since he hadn't done an MDA stunt in three years, and this would be his first as a morning announcer, we decided to return him to the site of his first promotion; the billboard that had almost killed him in 1988. It's conveniently located across the street from KSFM and is at one of staff at 6 a.m., and we bannered the hell out of the board. By 7:30 p.m. Mark had started his marathon.

What made this especially effective was Mark's commitment to the cause. The airstaff got behind this 100%, and Allen's stint on the board to raise funds for MDA became the focus for the station. And the sellline "committed to the children of Sacramento" became the big push. Before and after their shifts, jocks like Trejo, Billy Burke, Davey D., AJ, and PD Rick Thomas braved rotting timber, rickety scaffolding, and the world's narrowest ladder to hang out with Mark on his condo in the clouds. During the week, Mark did his half of the morning show from the board while his partner lbro broadcast from the parking lot below. From 10 a.m. to midnight, Mark checked in twice an hour and the whole vibe of the station centered on helping the children of Sacramento by stopping by to drop off cash with Mark at the board. It was great because it was real. The emotion was raw and intense. It was not uncommon to have people drive up and make their donation with tears in their eyes.



the busiest intersections in town.

It's always easier to get people involved if there's a charity angle, and with three phone calls it was a done deal. Ten minutes of phone time had Mark cleared to live, eat, sleep, broadcast, and... I think you get the idea, on a billboard for seven days.

Over the weekend the platform was prepared and a tent nailed on some plywood so that he could have a place to sleep at night. Since KSFM had started an 18-day run at the California State Fair the day after my arrival in Sacramento, bodies and resources were tight. But on Monday morning I was joined by Joe and Wade from the promotions Take a moment to consider the end result...not cume, not a quarter hour share, but real people who desperately need help and are getting it because of you and your station," says Allen.

Daily press releases were sent out, updating the totals and taking a humorous slant on the marathon, commenting on Mark's personal hygiene and the fact that local businesses were beginning to comment on the smell emanating from 2244 Arden Way. While KSFM got some decent TV out of it, the major payoff was that the station sounded incredibly tapped into the hearts of the audience. By Friday afternoon, special commemorative t-shirts were on sale at the billboard





and were adding to the total donations.

On Labor Day at 1:30 p.m., firefighters with a hook and ladder brought Mark down to earth and rushed him, along with over \$17,000 in cash to the local headquarters of the MDA Telethon where he presented it to the sound of thunderous applause. It was over and Mark went home to his wife, Jannette, who had kicked off the marathon by surprising Mark on Monday with a fortune cookie that she sent up to him announcing that she was pregnant.

I'm back in Minneapolis, KSFM has their new promotion Director, and Mark no longer smells like a vagrant. This was a great promotion for many reasons. It got people passionate. The station and the airstaff did a tremendous job supporting it, and, most importantly the host of the promotion was doing it for the right reason.

"So often in this business we think of the bottom line, e.g., how will this promotion affect the immediate ratings period? These types of stunts should be viewed as statements that will have longlasting results in your community and in the way your station is perceived in that community," concludes Allen.



Joe: Thank you. It's great. Another good one. Number one again, which we knock on wood, went 9.2 to 10.2. Everybody's doing a great job here and I'm very happy.

Dana: Let it be known for the record that when he said "knock on wood," he hit my head.

DOUBLE-DIGIT RATINGS FOR TOP40 STATIONS ARE GET-TING HARDER AND HARDER TO COME BY. WHAT DO YOU ATTRIBUTE SOME OF YOUR SUCCESS TO, BEYOND YOUR OBVIOUS PROGRAMMING GENIUS?

Dana: Probably the fact that we have such an incredibly tight-knit staff. Everybody works whatever hours it takes to get the job done and when somebody can't do something, there's always somebody else that can pick the ball up and run. It's like having an incredibly put together football team.

JOE, IS THERE A SECRET TO THAT? IS THERE A PARTICU-LAR APPROACH THAT YOU TAKE AS THE PROGRAMMER THAT HELPS MAKE THAT HAPPEN? BECAUSE THAT'S A VERY DIFFICULT THING TO DO SOMETIMES?

Joe: I learned a long time ago to work for people you respect and know how to win. Every station I've worked with had a staff of dedicated talent. There was an overwhelming feeling of teamwork. I believe great radio stations bond as a family and the people don't care how many hours they work as long as they win. I try to help my staff succeed both professionally and personally. It's our radio station and <u>mine</u>.

GETTING BACK TO THE FAMILY VIBE, BECAUSE THIS CAN HAPPEN WITH FAMILIES TOO...HOW DO YOU PREVENT SOME OF THE EGO CONFLICT THAT CAN SOMETIMES BECOME THIS SORT OF HALLWAY TALK AND CLOSED DOOR KIND OF OFFICE GOSSIP THAT EVENTUALLY BECOMES A MORALE KILLER? HOW DO YOU AVOID THAT?

Joe: I think everyone in the entertainment business has an ego, it's healthy. But more than ego, there's a sense of pride that runs through Z104. We have a long history of winning and expect to be number one every book. As PD, I let the staff know the game plan, define their role and then help them do their thing.

DANA, IN YOUR MIND IS THERE AN ESSENCE OF MAYBE LEADING BY EXAMPLE THERE TOO?

Oh yes. How can you work for somebody who won't do what you're being asked to do. Joe will work 16 hours a day to get the job done; other days he won't need to. The point is, he will stay to get the job done. He knows this isn't a 9-5 profession. Everyone here is willing to give Joe and the station whatever it takes to get the job done right.

JOE, LET'S BACKTRACK FOR A MOMENT AND GIVE US A QUICK OVERVIEW OF YOUR CAREER, WHERE YOU GOT STARTED AND HOW YOU LANDED IN MADISON.

My brother, John (VP Programming KZPS/KDGE-Dallas)...I know... shameless family plug...got me interested when I was in high school. He was PD at WZOK in Rockford in 1979. I went on to college and came home four years later when Brent at WLUM and he was APD/MD in Minneapolis at KDWB. I didn't know this till after I left and then had met him at the **HITMAKERS** convention in 1992...in fact, it was my honeymoon that I spent at **HITMAKERS**!

I THINK WE'RE GOING TO CHANGE THOSE TO *MATCH-MAKERS* IF WE GET ANY MORE STORIES LIKE THIS.

We met there and it became an instant friendship connection. We've staved in touch ever since. When my situation changed at WTIC-FM and I was no longer music director and I moved to nights, I called Ed regarding the MD position at Z104. I knew he had hired Joe to be his MD, but I didn't know anything about Joe. So I told him, "I know you hired him and I trust your judgement, but what's he like?" He told me it would be a great situation and he said, "You put a call in and I'll put a call in...get your package there." Next thing you know, I was hired. It all happened within a month

AND HE'S BEEN HAPPY EVER SINCE.

Joe: Absolutely. Dana: I have a gun to his head now

Alberts gave me my first radio job at WYFE in Rockford. I moved to WROK/WZOK for five years. Then in 1989, Steve Brill hired me to work with him at WZZU in Raleigh, NC. In 1992, I was part of the ever famous management changes and left as Program Director. I came to Z104 to do a couple weekend shifts for Mr. Ed Lambert while I was looking for another PD job. After four months, MD Denise Lauren and middayer Steve Shannon left so Ed hired me as his Music Director.


NOW DANA, YOU HAVE KIND OF AN ED LAMBERT CONNEC-TION TOO.

Mr. Ed Lambert and I were mutual admirers of each other's work when I was the music director in Milwaukee

so that's why ...

BUT JOE THERE IS SOME-THING ABOUT YOUR STAFF THERE. IN ADDITION TO DANA, WHO'S CERTAINLY GOT SOME GREAT CREDENTIALS, NOT JUST AS A PROGRAM-MING PERSON, BUT AS AN AIR TALENT, YOU'VE REALLY GOT A TEAM OF STAFFERS IN-HOUSE THERE THAT'S REALLY QUITE AMAZING FOR A MARKET THE SIZE OF MADISON.

I am extremely lucky to have a staff that could all work in much larger markets (and most have). We all work well together and think of Z104 as a large market radio station. We just happen to be in Madison, WI, which



is one of America's top five most livable cities. Mid-Continent Media has provided me with more programming tools than a lot of stations in the Top 50, so there is no reason to move on to L.A. or New York.

ED LAMBERT RECENTLY SAID THAT WHEN HE WAS PRO-GRAMMING THERE, HE FELT VERY CONFIDENT THAT HE COULD TAKE THAT STATION INTO ANY MAJOR MARKET AND BE COMPETITIVE.


Dana: I think the same thing holds true now. Absolutely. I would have no problem. I would be totally proud to put this station in L.A., Chicago, New York – anywhere and compete equally or better than other people in the market.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR STAFF. THE SUN COMES UP IN THE MORNING, WHAT'S ON AND LET'S GO AROUND THE DAY AND CHECK OUT YOUR STAFF LINE-UP.

Joe: The Z Morning ZOO has been one of Madison's highest rated morning shows since I've been at Z104. Johnny Danger is the host and has been at Z for five years. He's worked all over the country and started at Z104 doing nights before moving to mornings for the past couple of years. His sidekick, Greg Bair, is from Baraboo, WI, just north of Madison. He has been with the company for over eight years. Cheryl K. came to Z104 from Missouri just over a year ago. Cheryl does morning news and keeps the guys in line. They have great chemistry and really make mornings fun.

Joe: Right.

WHAT ABOUT MIDDAYS?

Joe: Middays are split between me and Mama Love. Leigh Smith is on from 10-noon with the At Work Network. She comes to us from Detroit, where she worked in an advertising agency and for a jazz station. Leigh is also Z104 Promotion Director. I come on at noon with the All Request Hour and continue the At Work Network until 3.

Dana: Joe is the tour guide for the radio station.

Joe: And then in the afternoon obviously is Dana. She does a great job driving people home or driving them away. Dana is on from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. with different features: The Drive Home, The Turbo Jam and Traffic Jam.

Dana: At 4 p.m. Monday-Thursday I do a song that people go, "Oh wow.' They get their own pumps when they're driving home, dancing in their cars at stop lights. And then on Friday I turn it from one song into three songs and just kind of kick the Weekend Turbo Jam on. And then at 5:30 Monday-Friday I play Name That Baby, where I take a baby out of a song and they have to guess it for prizes. They need the title and artist. Every time anybody meets me and they say which DJ are you and they find I'm from Z104 and I say I'm Dana Lundon, I do afternoons they say. "Oh you're the lady with the baby game."

COULD BE A SYNDICATED FEATURE.

Dana: The lady with the baby.

WHAT HAPPENS AT NIGHT?

Joe: Catfish Cooper is on from 7 p.m.-11 p.m. and owns the nighttime airwaves in Madison. He also plays a major role in the overall sound of Z104. He works with our voice guy, Sean Caldwell, on promos, positioning, sweepers etc. Catfish also has a lot of input on strategy and direction of Z104's programming.

WHAT ABOUT OVERNIGHTS? IS THAT A FULLTIME STAFF POSITION, HOURLY, PART-TIME? HOW DOES THAT WORK?

Joe: The Tim Sweet Radio Network is on the air from 11 p.m.-5:30 a.m. Tim is from Madison and started at Z104 as parttime when Mr. Ed was here. He has an interesting resume having worked at night clubs, dump truck driver, and even drove a school bus. Tim has developed into a

very good radio personality.

WITH SO MANY VERY TALENTED PEOPLE WHO ARE OBVIOUSLY READY FROM A TALENT DEVELOPMENT PER-SPECTIVE AND FROM A HARDWORKING PERSPEC-TIVE, READY TO MOVE ON TO SOME OF THOSE MAJOR MARKETS THAT MADISON IS REASONABLY CENTRAL TO, HOW DO YOU HANG ON TO SOME OF THESE FOLKS?

Joe: That's a real good question.

Dana: Most of us here at the station have worked in major and large markets before. But I think I'm a really good example for this question. When I was hired, there was a concern on management's part that I may leave after six months because I had been in the majors and maybe wouldn't be happy in a smaller market. But I have a three-year-old and a husband. I'm looking to be some place I'm happy to raise my son in Madison is a great place to live with so much to do and the company is great, the best I've worked for. We're about ready to close on a house and I plan on staying awhile. I think a lot of us here at Z104 are at a point where we want to stay and have fun in one place for awhile. We know getting into this business that there's a lot of moving, but for now, I'm happy being stationary.

Dana: Top40 has always been a trendy format. It's not always trendsetting, but tends to fall into trends. In its most successful times, Top40 has fallen into the trends at a time when people think that Top40 created the trend. That's the whole idea...to be topically aware nationally and locally, so people will not think you're too hip for the room or you're too stodgy and just hopping on the bandwagon to look hip. I think whatever happens to be what Madison, WI wants and expects from Z104 as a Top40 this year, next year, etc., then we're going to give them what they expect. Both of us go out and talk to the people both in the college circuit and out, and we really try to find out what hits their hot buttons. I think we're very good at that...staying local, hip, fun...always reinventing ourselves. We always sound fresh, yet familiar.



INFINITY SETTLES WITH COMMISSION: The ongoing battle over indecency between Infinity Broadcasting and the FCC is over. An agreement has been reached that is part of a comprehensive settlement that deals with all pending Notices of Apparent Liability, or NAL's and all outstanding complaints. In the settlement, Infinity admits no wrongdoing or any liability. It does agree howev-er, to pony up a "voluntary contribution" to the Feds totalling over \$1.7 million! Other terms include Infinity's agreement to issue a "policy statement to all on-air personnel" dealing with indecent broadcasts. The company also promises to "establish a program to educate and update" all on-air talent about FCC indecency actions...a move obviously aimed at placating the FCC's concerns regarding HOWARD STERN. The deal, which was made public last Friday (9/1) gives both parties a "face saved" way out of their lengthy litigation over \$1.7million+ in assorted fines associated with outstanding NAL's. In exchange, the Commission agrees to dismiss all pending complaints against Infinity.

While Infinity's scrap with the FCC is over, an alliance of broadcasters is vowing to continue mounting a legal challenge to the Commission's indecency policies. STAY TUNED!!




