Yee-haw, cowgirl.

Hill's big score follows on the heels of the Dixie Chicks, whose Open Wide/Columbia/CRG album is still selling like beer at a NASCAR speedway, sitting at

#6 this week. Shania Twain's hotly anticipated opus for Mercury Nashville roars in on its Harley Nov. 19. For now, though, consumers are keeping the Faith in impressive numbers.

Fred Meyer's Brian Stevens, who's hard-pressed to identify one end of a horse from the other, gurgled: "Faith Hill fans showed up in force this week. It's a completely pop record, and it's a smash. This bodes very well for the upcoming Shania LP."

Nestled between Hill and the Chicks are RCA's Elvis Presley (#2), Def Jam/IDJ's debuting LL Cool J (#3), Virgin's Rolling Stones (#4) and Arista skate-wunderkind Avril Lavigne (#5), Aftermath/Interscope superstar Eminem (up 10% at #7) and Fo' Reel/Universal's Nelly (#8).

The Top 10 was rounded out with bows by a pair of soul crooners in Motown's Dave Hollister (#9) and Elektra/EEG veteran Gerald Levert (#10). Also making strong debuts this week are Reprise's Fleetwood Mac with a greatest-hits package (#12), Velvet Hammer/Atlantic/Atl G rockers Taproot (#15) and Elektra/EEG singer-songwriter Tracy Chapman (#21).

Added Stevens in between sucking the marrow out of a bone: "LL Cool J had a nice debut. Fleetwood Mac's Greatest Hits brought out the adults again. A nice artist-development story is Taproot, which also had a solid start."

Double-digit increases were registered not only by Dixie Chicks and Eminem but also by MCA's Brown Sugar soundtrack (28-20, up 35%), Arista's Pink (26-23, up 16%), Aware/ Columbia/CRG's John Mayer (#24, up 14%) and Hollywood's Sweet Home Alabama ST (49-38, up 26%).

Next week. Arista's Santana begins his quest to determine whether he's still Supernatural.

Vollack has overseen the soundtracks for such motion picture successes as Charlie's Angels and Spider-Man. She was honored last week in Santa Monica with the City of Hope's Spirit of Life award alongside her peers, WB's Gary LeMel, Universal/UMG's Kathy Nelson, Fox's Robert Kraft, Disney's Chris Montan and Paramount's Burt Berman.

Vollack will be responsible for overseeing the music for all Columbia Pictures releases, including films produced by Revolution Studios, Screen Gems and Sony Pictures Animation. She and her staff will continue to provide music consulting services and assistance to Sony Pictures Classics and local-language productions throughout the world.

Said Pascal: "Lia is peerless. She is beloved by our filmmakers and everyone at the studio. She has barely scratched the surface of her overall contributions to the company. I hope she makes her home here forever. I just wish she wouldn't sleep on my office sofa."

The multi-platinum Charlie's Angels soundtrack featured the Grammy-nominated Destiny's Child single "Independent Women: Part 1." During the summer, the plarinum-selling soundtrack for Spider-Man boasted the #1 single "Hero" by Chad Kroeger and Josey Scott. Vollack has also recently overseen soundtracks for Stuart Little 2, Men in Black II and Mr. Deeds.

Vollack's upcoming projects include the music for Charlie's Angels: Full Throttle, due for release in the summer, and The Amazing Spider-Man, which debuts May 7, 2004. She is also at work on soundtracks for another pair of summer movies, S.W.A.T. and Bad Boys 2, as well as Revolution's Maid in Manhattan, with Jennifer Lopez, which opens nationwide Dec. 13.

Vollack joined Columbia in 1997 as a VP Worldwide Music, was promoted to Sr. VP in 1999 and Executive VP in 2000. She began her career as the first female theatrical sound designer on Broadway, working on more than 150 shows.

Supernatural, Santana's chart-topping 1999 album, matked a career best for the Rock and Roll Hall of Famer, earning nine Grammy Awards, producing back-to-back #1 singles in "Smooth" and "Maria Maria," and selling 25 million albums worldwide, 11 million OTC in the U.S.

Plenty has changed at Arista since then, including the exit of Clive Davis (who coproduced the new record with Carlos) and the appointment of Antonio "L.A." Reid (who executive-produced the disc), but the successful formula remains intact.

The new album finds the legendary guitarist hooking up with a variety of performers in creative partnerships that put a focus on Santana's cross-generational, pan-stylisitc, multi-format appeal. He's joined in the studio by a diverse group including P.O.D., Nickelback's Chad Kroeger, Dido, Citizen Cope, Placido Domingo, Macy Gray, Musiq, Ozomatli and Seal.

Said Reid after we told him we were Avril Lavigne's father: "Carlos has created some of the most beautiful and stirring instrumentals, combined with refreshing, contemporary artist collaborations. And I should know because I signed off on all the studio bills."

The label will ship around 2 million copies of the new album, which will undoubtedly benefit from the successful launch of the first single, "The Game of Love," with Michelle Branch, now Top 10 Requests and Top 15 at Top 40 after being Most Added at CHR/Pop radio. INDIE TOLL-TAKERS TAXED IN PROMO SQUEEZE

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ooks like things are tough all over. As reported this week in the Los Angeles Times, Lenny Lyons' Tri-State Promotions has given up its deals with five Clear Channel stations in four major markets, including KIIS Los Angeles, Z100 New York, KYLD and KMEL San Francisco and Y100 Miami, saying the firm can no longer afford the fees it had guaranteed the stations for the exclusive right to promote records to them.

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The move comes in the wake of Universal Music Group's deci-

sion several months ago to cut its base scale for independent promoters to a maximum of \$1,000 per add, while at the same time reducing the number of stations it is willing to pay indies for at all. UMG's move cut the amount it spends on independent promotion roughly in half.

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As a result, middlemen such as Lyons and Tri-State are being caught in—ahem—the middle of a sticky situation: They have promised their stations' corporate owners a certain amount of money, but as a result of declining sales, a shaky economy and the ever-looming threat of Internet piracy, cash-strapped record labels are no longer willing to pay the premium for station adds they once were, often leaving the indies in a deficit position.

Sources say that under Tri-State's just-terminated agreements with Clear Channel, the firm would have to gross between \$7,500 and \$10,000 per week just to break even with those stations. This year, KIIS reportedly has been adding 2.5 records per week, on average. Z100, KYLD, KMEL and Y100 have been adding an average of 3.2, 3.5, 4.4 and 3.5 records per week, respectively. Lyons declined to comment for this story, but he did say he likes our cartoons.


UMG has seen few labels from other groups follow its lead so far—RCA being one notable exception, budgeting no indie money for Kelly Clarkson—but it's becoming clear that UMG is seeing no impact from its decision to economize apart from saving money: As of last week, the group still could lay claim to half of the 10 most-played Top 40 records and was doing as well or better at all other formats.

In light of such evidence, it could become more difficult for other labels to justify large payments to indies with corporate-level chain deals, but it won't be for lack of trying: Some indies are reportedly spinning to other companies that UMG labels aren't adhering to the new policy, but those with knowledge of the situation say that's fantasy, not fact.

Insiders say that the majority of record companies don't mind paying independents who have actual relationships with programmers with whom they can discuss the merits of a particular track and make the case for playing it. Indeed, as MCA Sr. VP Pop Promotion Craig Lambert puts it, "I support independent promotion—as a service. As in any business, relationships are valuable."

The type of arrangement the labels are chafing against is the one pioneered by Jeff McClusky & Associates in the late '90s as radio rapidly consolidated, whereby the promotion company pays a radio conglomerate for "exclusive access" to pitch songs to some or all of the chain's stations and gets weekly add information for the purpose of billing the labels—without, in some cases, any actual promotion going on at all. Such deals, in which service to labels takes a back seat to billing, have come to be known as "tollbooth promotion." And it has become increasingly expensive as the most powerful chains have leveraged higher and higher fees out of indies.

The Tri-State/Clear Channel shakeup comes less than a week



after Cox Radio announced it viou d discontinue all relationships with independents, due to its distaste for a system which Cox CEO Robert Neil told the Times invites abuse." Cox's position stands in direct opposition to that of C ear Channel, which has repeatedly stated, at times almost tauntingly, that as long as independent promoters are willing to pay them, they would consider it found money. Clear Channel COO Mark Mays has even gone so far as to wonder aloud why labels see a need to pay independent promoters at all.

> But there's the rub: With hundreds of stations operating in a given format and dozens of promoters claiming to hold sway over various programmers, it is extremely difficult for heads of promotion at record labels to know who actually can help give their records an edge. In healthier economic times, the traditional method has been to hedge all bets by paying everybody to do their thing. But with money increasingly scarce, labels are exercising greater discretion. However, it's difficult for a given promotion head to know which indies actually impact airplay in which markets, meaning some hedging is likely to continue.

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In the case of Cumulus, an internal "music policy" memo written by Executive VP John Dickey announcing the chain's exclusive indie relationship with JMA stipulates that indie and programmer shall not cross paths, ever: "There will be no contact from the station level to any representative of JMA," the memo reads, further directing programmers to hold their adds to "allow JMA the required time to communicate the various adds to the various labels prior to public knowledge of adds."

"We have total confidence in the system as it's set up," Cumulus Chairman/President/CEO Lew Dickey told the Times. "We are comfortable with it."

Less comfortable is Infinity Broadcasting. Chairman/CEO John Sykes and President of Programming Andy Schuon have decided to let what deals they have with independents expire, reportedly feeling they can get more out of a direct relationship with the labels,

whom they consider partners, than they could through middlemen.

Meanwhile, those indies who get results will continue to be viewed as valuable by the labels, insiders say. "If people can do something and have relationships, I'm willing to pay them to help get my records played," says one label promotion head.

"I know we provide an extremely valuable service," says indie Skip Bishop, a former programmer and promotion man at RCA and MCA, who had six Cox stations prior to the chain's policy change. "I'm only in markets where either my staff or I have longstanding relationships. We get hired by labels to help develop records through airplay and advise radio as to which songs are looking like hits."

And despite Cox's dramatic move to sever all ties with indies, many continue to stand by the system: "We only started using independent promoters a few years ago," says Emmis President **Rick Cummings**. "In fact, we at one time had a 'no-indie' policy. We tried it to see if we would 'grow horns,' but we didn't. After Cox's decision, we went back to those of our market managers who choose to use indies, and they believe value is created for their stations and for the record companies—they like their partners and the way the relationships are working. We see no reason to discontinue these relationships at this time."

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

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

An L.A. Times account of Lenny Lyons' Tri-State Promotions dropping Clear Channel majors KIIS, Z100, KYLD, KMEL and Y100 as unprofitable is the latest story to focus on the changing indie promotion landscape, as Lyons and others feel the squeeze following. Universal Music Group's move to lower the price of poker. This development comes on the heels of last week's announcement that Cox will no longer allow exclusive indie contracts-further impacting an already-impacted Jeff McClusky & Associates—and has speculators speculating overtime as to what happens next in indiedom. Lyons may renegotiate a more viable deal with the Mays clan, or Clear Channel may choose to find a new highest bidder. But as lean as times currently are, UMG's cutting of its indie scale to 1/8/6 means more and more indies currently exploiting the "tollbooth" model will likely find their deals unfeasible. Insiders saying Lyons had to gross between \$7,500 and \$10k per week just to break even with the stations in question... Surprisingly, few

have followed UMG's lead so far, but observers suggest that others may soon join in lowering the ante: Despite having cut its indie payments nearly in half, UMG currently owns half of the Top 10 most-played records at all the major formats. Will radio chains accept smaller payments for exclusivitv? Will the growing feeling among the labels that paying for an indie company's corporate relationship is wasteful lead to more cutbacks? Will more radio companies back away from indies as legislators and the FCC continue to rattle their regulatory sabers? Stay tuned... Lots of chatter about one high-profile major-label gunslinger who has begun to position himself for a potential run at free agency as his current deal expires. Is this move being viewed as disloyal, or just a case of one player trying to get the best deal he can as executive compensation begins to be affected by the declining economics of the biz?... Bertelsmann's assertion that it will close its acquisition of Zomba/Jive by Christmas has wonderers wondering how the Germans might make lemonade out of the \$3 billion lemon that's coming to be known as Middelhoff's Folly. Given that they'll be paying a hefty premium for a company whose flagship operation has seen its U.S. marketshare plummet by more than 60% in the absence of founder Clive Calder (who has been handsoff for months), who will they get to protect their investment? Pointers pointing to Justin Timberlake's solo project as likely to help reverse Jive's fortunes, but the executive question remains. What

about Barry Weiss? Given the mandate, could he turn the company around, or do the Guterslohers feel they need to bring in Clive>Davis or L.A. Reid to get things back on track? Both execs appear likely to pick up bigger pieces of a reconfigured BMG, with J Records CFO Charles Goldstuck reportedly already hunkered down in negotiations that would result in Davis being bought out and given a larger role within the company-a very ironic notion to anvone who remembers the phrase "mandatory retirement." Meanwhile, a planned reorg of RCA under Bob Jamieson and Richard Sanders is postponed-with all hirings and firings put on hold supposedly until the first of the year-as speculation increases that an Arista/Jive combination will be part of the new BMG outcome... 

HEAD-ON COLLISION: Last week 1 implored my record-company friends to take a deeeeeeeeep breath, and remain focused on the goal of breaking the records you'll be working through the rest of the year. Didn't I promise there would be a lull in "event" records, which would give your developing projects new opportunities for growth? Again, the key words here are "focus" and "goal." One's taste in music is highly subjective, and as long as radio programmers still have a say in what gets played on their stations, you will have to listen to their opinion. How you choose to respond is another matter. When a programmer insists on A&R-ing every record you bring them, silently remind yourself how many radio programmers have successfully made the transition to A&R executive (you can count 'ern on the fingers of one hand), and don't respond. Promotion is like an endless game of "Telephone," where a programmer's



opinion about a record is disseminated to countless others, with every "messenger" putting their own spin on it, to make it seem like they "promoted" this response from the programmer. This has cultivated an environment where a programmer's opinion is elevated above all others. More often than not, however, this opinion is then thrown back in their face, "But you said you liked the record," which has never evoked the response, "You know what—you're right. I'm adding it today." Just as a programmer crit-

FOO FIGHTERS: Will One by One debut at #1? icizing a song has never lead to, "You know what—you're right. You should be running our A&R department." Some programmers, burned by having their words used against them, keep their opinions a closely guarded secret. That does-

n't stop the record community from speculating and projecting how these programmers are going to respond to a song, which is an absurd exercise.... Arguing with a radio programmer is like trying to employ principles of logic when reasoning with a two year-old. This is when the "goal" becomes crucial. (In times of severe duress, the J.G. Bennett quote, "It is impossible to achieve the aim without suffering," which begins the Robert Fripp song, "Exposure," often rings in my head). The music business is shrinking, and if there was ever a time for all of us to treat others as we wish to be treated, this is it. Next week: While others are rearranging deck chairs on the Titanic, keep your eyes on the lifeboat.... You can argue that the first Vines' single, "Get Free," didn't research, but there's no disputing the fact that the album Highly Evolved is already gold, ano PoMo radio is largely responsible. Capitol's Gary Spivack says it's time to get "Outtathaway" and add the new single, and WNFZ, KMYZ, KFMA, WSUN, WBRU, KFTE, WHRL and KZON are among the many who did so this week. In honor of Daylight Saving Time going into effect this weekend, WHFS, WBCN, WROX, WDYL, KRBZ and KWOD decided to "fall back" with an early add on Coldplay's "Clocks." MTV added the video this week. The edit should be somewhere on your desk Atlantic's Kris Metzdorf and Bonnie Slifkin are rejoicing over this week's Taproot debut-#10 on the HITS PoMo chart, bolstered by a Top 15 sales debut and new adds on "Poem" this week from WOCL, WRZX and WARQI Kris is bringing the Donnas by the HITS cesspool tomorrow—we can celebrate Taproot's nearly 60k sales and the Donnas' "Take It Off" being added at Live105 this week! I just hope there are Krispy Kremes involved.... Lava's Greg Dorfman made a quick stop in Chicago on his way from NYC to Christine Chiappetta's wedding in LA., and left the Windy City with adds on Authority Zero's "One More Minute" from both Q101 and WZZN! have a good time with that one. He's been raving about Cinder, which had a big week, coming in at #2 Most





Foo Fighters, One by One (Roswell/RCA): Lest anyone conclude that the Foos' deliriously poppy 2000 hit "Leam to Fly" constituted a mainstream move, the band rocks out with a vengeance on their fourth album, kicking things off with a pair of aggro riff-rockers, led by first single "All My Life." But Dave Grohl can't disguise his melodic gift, which gleams through

the corrosive overlays of such tracks as "Times Like These" and "Disenchanted Lullaby," which jangle anxiously like mutated folk-rock, the harmony-rich "Have It All," the buoyant "Halo" and the moody, understated "Tired of You." The album's big surprise is the epic closer "Come Back," which smolders with all the anguished urgency of Grohl's former band and manages to sustain the intensity for its near-eight-minute length. (BS)

The Donnas, Spend the Night (Atlantic/AG): Oh, to be 20-something with guitars, loud-ass amps and

enough sneer and brute rock abandon to carry you into the next lifetime. In the case of the four gals of The Donnas, who first began focusing their energy on punk-edged, AC/DC inspired rock at 13 or so, this fifth album in four years should make them a "mature"



band at this point. But their latter-day Joan Jett vibe, best displayed in "All Messed Up," "I Don't Care (So There)" and "Dirty Denim," comes across with such unbridled energy and enthusiasm, they might as well be just starting out. It's an uncomplicated formula that will immediately turn on anybody whose rock & roll glands aren't dried up and prematurely pruned with age. (JO)



Suicide, American Supreme (Blast First/Mute): Like Godot's Vladimir and Estragon, Alan Vega and Martin Rev have been prophets of doom since before it became fashionable, and this post-Sept. 11 concept album about Armageddon is no exception. New songs like the lifting techno "Misery Train" and

the disco-funk "Child It's a New World" recall the underrated melodic moodiness of "Cheree" and "Dream Baby Dream." Caught in a video-game firestorm, "Dachau. Disney. Disco," a worthy successor to epics like "Frankie Teardrop" and "Harlem," recreates life during wartime, while the closing tribal stomp "I Don't Know" is a moving existential shrug in the face of absurdity. Still at least 10 years ahead of its time 30 years later, Suicide remains the ultimate affirmation of life. (RT)

Röyksopp, Melody A.M. (Astralwerks): These "Nordic funksters" ambitiously combine elements of electronic pop, dance, film music and modern dassical composition. But what comes out is far more fun than it has any right to be, because Svein Berge and Torbjørn Brundtland have keen instincts for both evocative sounds and killer beats. It's hard to resist the pull of



spaced-out grooves like "Poor Leno," "So Easy," "Eple," "Remind Me" and the epic "Röyksopp's Night Out." But it's just as impossible not to drift away on the atmospherics of such gentler fare as "In Space" and "Sparks." A bonus disc features a handful of inventive remixes and three videos. (SG)

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

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

Don't forget that the latest N.O.R.E. track, "Full Mode," is prominently featured in the movie and will most likely get a huge push in the coming weeks... 

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ts a little hard to believe, but ts now a full 10 years since Firgin opened its first Megastore in Hollywood. Virgin cunder Richard Branson was " town to jump out of a cake, very Branson-esque indeed, and take some questions with **Firgin Entertainment CEO** Glen Ward in the still-gorgeous Sunset Blvd store. While most specialty music retailers are finding themselves closing stores, Virgin has started once again to expand. They opened Dallas last year, Boston this year and are just about to take a smaller version, at some 15k sq. ft. instead of the usual 25k sq. ft. model, into Salt Lake City in November. Add to that a new store in DC next year and Ward states the obvious: "We're on the expansion trail. Which some may say is madness in this particular market, but we're very bullish." Branson agrees, "We're still investing in music quite heavily, and I still believe that it's a good investment. We have a worldwide music chain that's actually profitable, which is unusual at the moment." The new SLC location will put

Virgin at 23 stores nationally. Virgin prides itself on being early to the party with DVD and video games. But even though Branson and Ward both agree that the state of the music business has been dreadful over the last few years, music will continue to be the core of their business for the foreseeable future. That said, Branson is positively giddy over the rollout of Virgin Mobile, his cellular play, and looks beyond that to more electronic lines. "We have a small team of people looking at what Sony has done with electronics," says Branson. "We're trying to decide whether we can move into that area and produce our own." He says he's using Virgin Megastores to break his new cellular brand. "If we break that, it would be like breaking 100 hit recording artists." Would he think about expansion through acquisition? "Generally, my philosophy's against that, but if there are retailers in trouble and we can think of a way of keeping them open-it's certainly something we'd look at" ... FYI: With the left-field success of Norah Jones, Concord Records, distribbed by Alliance's growing Independent Distribution Network, may have a diamond in the rough. Maia Sharp, a singer-songwriter who penned the title cut on the new Dixie Chicks LP, is currently on tour with Art Garfunkel, with whom she cowrote his new LP for Blue Note. Sales are following the tour, including a recent successful in-store at Tower Lincoln Center in N.Y.

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
