

It all seems to be working nicely. According to MCA Sales VP Mike Regan, the label has shipped 300k of the new version to retail. Shipments of the old version were stopped on Jan. 21. Regan estimates there are around 100,000 copies of the old version on the street.

Sales of both versions have been combined on this week's Top 50 Albums chart.

his time, the Hip-Hop Summit Action Network is coming west.

Island Def Jam Chairman Russell Simmons and Minister Benjamin Muhammad, President of the Network, have planned a West Coast minisummit for Feb. 13-14 at the Universal Hilton in Universal City; it's the prelude to a larger summit in L.A. slated for June.

"We intend to get the word out as to exactly what the Hip-Hop Summit is," Simmons explains. "We've been very fortunate to have the **RIAA** and a number of record companies underwrite some of our projects, and we're proud of what has been accomplished so far."

Muhammad says that the purpose of the summit is to "increase the level of communication, do whatever conflict resolution needs to be done within the industry and move forward."

Simmons and Muhammad expect a turnout that will

include hip-hop movers and shakers such as **Tha Row's Suge Knight** and **Dr. Dre**. Guess they have their work cut out for them.

Addressing the first meeting of Knight and Dre, who have clashed since their days at **Death Row Records**, Muhammad says: "In hip-hop, there is a diversity of opinions. We've shown that we can come together and discuss certain issues that are good for all of us. Both see the need for all of us to work together."

The first Hip-Hop Summit, held last June in N.Y., spearheaded a number of key reforms within the urban community, including a literacy program sponsored by Sean "P. Diddy" Combs, as well as mentoring programs initiated by Def Jam and Combs' Bad Boy Records.

"The support and followup have been strong," Simmons says. "Traditionally, a lot of civil-rights organizations from around the country have not been so responsive to the needs of the young, poor black community. Thanks to the Hip-Hop Summit, we have been able to bridge that gap."

Radio One, KKBT-FM's Steve Harvey and KPWR-FM's Big Boy were among the radio people involved in putting the West Coast Summit together, while Rep. Maxine Waters [D, L.A.] "has been a very important part of this development process," Simmons points out.





Meet the New EMI N.A.

ess than a week after Alain Levy reshaped EMI's North American operations, David Munns, Matt Serletic and Roy Lott spent a few painful minutes conversing with us about the shape of things to come. But first, a quick recap of what went down, for those of you who might have been in a coma last week:

■ Levy named his right-hand man, Worldwide Vice Chairman Munns, Chairman/CEO of EMI Recorded Music North America. All EMI Recorded Music business heads on this side of the pond now report to Munnsy. The rest of the existing EMI crew reporting to Munns consists of Andy Slater (President/CEO Capitol), Deane Cameron (President EMI Music Canada), Richard Cottrell (President/CEO EMI Music Distribution), Mike Dungan (President/CEO Capitol Nashville), Steve Greenberg (President/CEO S-Curve Records), Bill

Hearn (President/CEO EMI Christian Music Group) and Bruce Lundvall (President Angel/Blue Note).

■ Levy and Munns made producer Serletic Chairman/CEO of Virgin Records America. Serletic is best known as the producer of "Smooth" from Santana's mega-selling/Grammy-winning Supernatural and for discovering/ producing Matchbox Twenty. Two years ago, he formed Melisma Records, a joint venture with Arista. Melisma and Arista have since parted ways.

■ They appointed former Capitol President/ current EMI Recorded Music North America Deputy President Lott President/COO of Virgin Records America.

Munns recounted to HITS the upshot of a Monday Virgin staff meeting: "I wanted New York to be on the table, because I can't stand anyone having secrets. The office move won't be until later in the year. We have a new building in New York. It's a hundred years old and needs to be retrofitted. I don't expect that to happen until September at the earliest. The message, in the meantime, is that we have a job to do. We have some records out, and we have some good records coming out. We have a Lenny Kravitz record. We have a Gorillaz tour and record. I told everybody to please keep their heads focused. Don't worry about playing politics and get on with your job. And everybody will get a very fair hearing. One thing I can guarantee is that the people who won't be part of a new Virgin are those who spend more time on politics than doing their job."

Munns was also quite clear about the pairing of Serletic and Lott: "Matt is responsible for all the creative issues and logically responsible for the future success of Virgin Records. Roy is the guy who stands behind him, running the business issues, counting the money and installing some business disciplines that this company needs. I think it's an interesting concept. I hope it works. I couldn't find one rocket scientist, so I had to find two."

That said, Serletic sounded like a cross between a politician and a rocket scientist: "This is an amazing opportunity to reach out to a larger number of artists and work with a lot of talented people. I wouldn't have this opportuni-


■ Concurrently, they removed Ray Cooper and Ashley Newton as Virgin America Co-Presidents.

■ They further announced that Virgin HQ will move from Beverly Hills to Manhattan in September. EMI's New York headquarters will move to 150 Fifth Avenue this fall as well. The Slater-led Capitol will serve as EMI's main West Coast presence.

ty being a producer slaving away for four months on one record. So I'm sort of taking this creative, amazing opportunity to build a new roster of incredible artists, while working with some of the best that are on Virgin."

Lott, who's done this dance before, sounded quite, well, polished: "Alain and David are being enormously supportive of Matt and myself, and with Matt's creative vision and his desire to look at new models in the music industry, we're ready to go." Munns took the opportunity to add, "He likes being up to his neck in shit, Roy does."

As for the task of turning EMI North Ameri-

ca around, Munns downplayed the pressure. "Look, I'm just a schlepper, okay? We're trying to sell some records. There's nothing complicated here. Is this the worst job in the record business? I don't know. It's kind of fun right now. This is a great company, and there's no reason we can't sort this out. We have some great records, and there's no reason we can't make more money next year than we made this year."

Munns also revealed a bit about his personal life: "I have two wives. One's called Ann and she's beautiful. The other's called Alain Levy, and I'm only doing this because he's doing it with me."

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WHERE EAGLE'S SORE

Don Henley Has a Problem with the Music Business, and That Means the Music Business Has a Problem

He's way out front on **SB1249**, which seeks to repeal a 1987 amendment to California's seven-year labor statute allowing music companies to sue for damages arising from undelivered albums in the event an artist attempts to void a contract after seven years. But that's hardly it. After a long history in the music industry that's included a legal battle with **Geffen Records** and a reported \$10 million solo deal with **Warner Bros.**, **Don Henley** and his newly formed **Recording Artists Coalition** are challenging the way the music industry does business. This week, he spoke with HITS' **David Adelson**.

Do you have a problem with the way HITS is covering the seven-year statute issue?

Yes. I have a problem when the magazine acts like a mouthpiece of the RIAA. On the other hand, I understand who buys the advertising in the magazine. The coverage seems to be a little slanted, and that's understandable. What I have the biggest problem with is when certain writers at the magazine make snide personal remarks. They turn this into some sort of nasty personal debate rather than sticking to the issues.

Last week we reported discussions of a possible compromise in Sacramento. Were you aware of any of these talks?

I didn't know of any discussions of a compromise until I read it in your magazine. Have you since been informed of discus-

sions of a compromise? No.

Have you had subsequent discussions with Sen. Murray?

Yes.

So you're convinced there are no discussions of a compromise?

Not unless it's going on behind my back. Is that a possibility?

Anything is possible.

Sen. Murray referred to the seven-year statute as indentured servitude. Do you agree with that?

Well, that phrase has historical connotations that Sen. Murray can speak to better than I. But technically speaking, I would say it's pretty accurate.

There's been a lot of talk about the issue of "tacking"—where the labels begin a new seven-year cycle when an existing deal is renegotiated. There's talk of a compromise where the labels would repeal the contested amendment to the seven-year statute and the artists would recognize tacking as an accepted industry practice. Have you heard this?

I did hear something about it. I think one of the attorneys in our camp put forth that proposition for our consideration, but there hasn't been any consensus on that. How do you feel about it personally? I'd have to look at it further before I formed an opinion. At first blush, I don't think it's a good idea.

Are you in favor of backing down at all? Since it's you, the artist, who have taken center stage on this, doesn't any retreat make the artist look bad?

We are always open to discussion, but it needs to be reasonable, meaningful discussion. So far nobody from the other side has made any concrete proposals to us that we can consider.

You don't have to do this....

I need this like a hole in the head. I need it like a fish needs a bicycle.

You've made millions. Why are you doing this?

Because I love music, and I love the people who make music. It's simply a matter of principle with me. I'm part Irish, so I have a very strong sense of injustice. When I see something that's grossly unfair, I generally have to speak out about it. Personally speaking, I've had my own share of problems with the industry, which are well documented. When you get to be my age-I'm 54 years old; I'll be 55 in July-you get to see things more clearly. You know, being a rock & roll star is not the most important thing in my life now. So I don't give a shit who I piss off. I've got three beautiful children and my wife, who are the most important things in my life. The public aspect of my career is not that important to me anymore. I still love songwriting, and on occasion I still love to perform. But the issues that have been taken up by the Recording Artists Coalition are something that I feel I just can't ignore. I wish I could, some days [laughs].

When you and Don Engel sought to get out of your Geffen contract, you did so under the seven-year-statute. Is that correct?

Not entirely. I'm not allowed to talk about that in detail because the terms of the settlement forbid it. I will just say, if I had that to do all over again, I would go to court.

Why didn't you go to court to see that one through?

I didn't have the time. It's not about the

money, it's about the time. No artist can afford to lose two or three years of his or her career waiting for things to work out in court. It's just career suicide. And it had a detrimental impact on my career [anyway]. It sidelined me for too long. Consequently, the album I put out most recently didn't sell as many albums as the previous one. That was partly because I was embroiled in that battle. But if you had a second opportunity to go to court with it, you would commit that time? With the mindset I have today, I think I gave up far too much in that settlement. And you never had the opportunity to

legally test the seven-year statute.

Nobody's ever tested it. Courtney Love may do it.

Let's say, hypothetically, you got a \$10 million advance on your new Warner Bros. deal. Let's also say the first record sells between 1.5 and 2 million copies worldwide. Warner Bros. puts out all that money. Don't they have a right to get it back—even if seven years passes before you deliver all the albums under the deal?

First of all, your numbers are hypothetical. And obviously, nothing can be based on one album. I signed a three-album deal with Warner Bros. So you don't know if they get their money back until the end of that. And then you also have to factor in catalog sales over a period of time. But what you really have to factor in, in my case—which, oddly, no one has mentioned—is that the Eagles albums have made a half a billion dollars for the Warner Group. I don't think I owe them much of anything.

Now suddenly there's talk of a probe of music industry business practices. Is this another front that's opening up?

Well, I was told that Sen. Murray announced this morning that he intends to hold hearings this spring in Sacramento on that very subject—and he may be joined by an Assemblyman. It may be something that goes on in both houses up there.

Are you prepared to fight on this front as well?

Oh, sure. That's another area where the light



needs to shine brightly. I think there needs to be a whole revamping of the contract system. I don't think a record company should sign an artist for more than four albums, period. Let me point out that we're not the only ones looking into record company practices. The fact is, in the lawsuit between the RIAA and Napster, Judge Patel ruled that Napster can engage in discovery if it so desires in regard to collusion. And it's my understanding that there's an ongoing investigation at the U.S. Justice Department of the music business,

chicanery that I can stand.

That said, for all that corporate chicanery you speak of, your manager is Irving Azoff—a true legend in the music industry. There are some people who may see that as a contradiction, or at the very least, ironic. Irving is a complex person. He's not that easily defined. And he's his own person. I'm me and he's him. And Irving has come full circle. Hopefully, none of us are yet the final versions of ourselves. And I think it's possible for people to change and grow. He's been a

particularly in regard to anti-trust issues. It's going on in Washington—in Congress, in the House of Representatives, in the Senate. The chickens are all coming home to roost. Do record companies routinely under-report

and underpay royalties to performers? I'm not going to answer that question. Let

me put it this way: I, as a solo artist and performer, have paid for more record company audits than I care to count. So have a great many of my peers.

Is it safe to say that every time you do an audit, you find something?

Yes. Unfortunately, the audit often costs more than one has got coming.

You know, some people might say....

Some people might say, "He's got a death wish. He's on a suicide mission."

Do you have a death wish, and are you on a suicide mission?

Well, as I said before, I've reached a point in my life and in my career, where I still love music and I still love making music, but I've had about all of this corporate great manager for me. I don't agree with everything he says or everything he does, but at the end of the day, we're partners. There's really no room in this industry to point fingers. In the end, some people are just more covert than others in their actions. Nobody has clean hands in this business. Nobody.

Do you think people are focusing on you in this issue? Do you have a bull's eye on your back?

Yeah. It's the easy way out. They shudder to think this is something that is widespread, but it's going to become apparent eventually. The record companies are trying to focus on me. But this isn't just about me. It's about anyone who has ever signed a professional recording agreement. The Recording Artists Coalition has about 150 members now and we're getting new members every week. So, this is not an individual crusade. This is a movement that will hopefully spread across the entire music industry.

Do you think the RAC will become a strong political voice?

I hope so. Again, it's hard to get artists organized. They don't want to join clubs of any kind. On the other hand, as we go along, more and more people are starting to understand what we're all about and to see that we've had some victories. Now more artists are willing to sign up. It's not an easy thing, especially for a young artist, to voice dissatisfaction with the record company. Record companies can be punitive in ways that are hard to detect and hard to prove. Like...?

That's as far as I'm going to go on that. I have enough lawsuits going. It's always been difficult to prove that a record company is not doing its job. A lot of younger artists don't want to speak out against their record companies because they don't want to lose their opportunity to make records. So, just to reiterate, you are willing to compromise on the seven-year statute?

Let me just stop on the word compromise. We are willing to talk. It will depend on the definition of the word compromise. I can tell you we are not willing to talk about any compromise that gives an artist any kind of liability to be sued for damages—particularly when an artist doesn't know if the option on a given album is going to be picked up or not.

Is there anything we haven't touched on here that you want to address?

Yes. There is a very important point 1 want to make. I have a great deal of respect and admiration for the people who are in the trenches at the record companies. The people who do the dayto-day work in the promotion departments, the art departments, the publicity departments. This is not really about the people, quote unquote, on the ground. This is about corporate policy.

Seven-Year Bitch: The Industry View

Industry heavies haven't exactly been stepping forward to stand up for the music-business exemption in California's seven-year statute. Most label heads would prefer that the **RIAA**'s **Hilary Rosen** do the dirty work, lest they offend artists.

Veteran manager and Ark 21 chief Miles Copeland, who's seen this debate from both sides, has been one of the few willing to speak out on behalf of the industry's argument that the seven years is needed for labels to earn back their investments. "In order for the label to put an unknown recording artist in business," he says, "there is a start-up cost—a substantial investment of money and time. If the artists get what they want, most of the label money will go toward keeping their superstar acts, which means there will be less left over for new-artist development. If artists really want to be treated by the labels as partners, why don't they give the companies a piece of their ancillary businesses, like touring, publishing, merchandising, etc.? Record companies have created that value, so why can't they get their fair share—especially considering the continued erosion of CD sales? I think the labels are open to creative deals, to sharing the risks, but the lawyers insist on their artists getting the money up front."

Copeland's name was the first signed to a letter dated Jan. 7 to California State Senator Kevin Murray, which also included the signatures of BMG's Bob Jamieson, EMI's Alain Levy, Sony's Thomas D. Mottola, UMG's Doug Morris, WMG's Roger Ames and Zomba's Clive Calder, among others.

The missive read, in part: "Artists routinely sign contracts and accept huge advances based upon their commitment to deliver a specified number of albums... They should not be able to walk away from [these] commitments without any liability for damages... This situation is particularly inequitable given that recording artists are in a unique position to determine whether or not the delivery commitments under their agreements are fulfilled within seven years... If record companies lose their ability to sue to recover damages from artists in whom they have invested but who refuse to deliver the albums they have agreed to produce, companies will be unable to invest in as many new artists in the future."



Hollywood Records SVP/GM Abbey Konowitch speaks for his counterparts when he explains: "Coming off last year's soft retail, the lack of new things 'breaking' and Sept. 11, we see the first half of 2002 as the time to introduce new music, new genres and new faces."

While the highlight of the Grammy ceremony this year will no doubt be NARAS boss Mike Greene's electrifying speech, there have been other memorable moments, and not just the **Bruce Vilanch**-penned jokes read on the Teleprompter. A Special HITS Grammy Dialogue With Linkin Park's *Mike Shinoda* by Brian Baker

our years ago, back when Linkin Park was known as Hybrid Theory, practiced in a crummy little rehearsal hovel in Southerm California and lived on Ramen noodles, guitarist Brad Delson assigned his bandmates a little homework—come back with one solid goal you want the band to achieve. Most of the objectives were fairty accessible, but one stood out among the rest. Vocalist/M.C. Mike Shinoda threw down a massive gauntlet to his musical cohorts: Win a Grammy.

It may have seemed ridiculous at the time, but Shinoda's goal is within reach now as Linkin Park is looking at Grammy nods for Best New Artist and Best

Rock Album for *Hybrid Theory* (after legal issues forced them to change their band name, they christened their record with it), an album that has sold almost 5 million copies and was the best-selling release of last year.

Not bad for a group of high school and college buddies who recruited a singing prodigy out of Arizona and successfully cross-pollinated shredding hard rock with a mad hip-hop vibe and flashes of electronica.

On a brief break between tours—which will be followed by work on a remix of the first album and their sophomore record— Shinoda had a new goal—getting off the phone with HITS' Brian "and Cryin" Baker as quickly as possible.

Where were you when you got the news about the Grammy nominations?

When I come home from tour, everyone still tries to get me to do work—in order to get a break, I have to leave town, turn off my cell phone and not talk to anybody. So that's what I did. My fiancée and I went to Hawaii and relaxed. That's where I was when I heard about all this.

It certainly puts the exclamation point on an incredible year. At what point did it register just how big this album was going to be?

As silly as it sounds, I haven't been paying that much attention. In a way, I know the numbers and I know what's going on, but we like to play music, we like to play shows and we like to write stuff. It's not like, get online and check the charts to watch the numbers move. Except for Brad; every time he goes online, he checks. That's how we find out what's going on --from Brad and our manager.

Have you seen how big things have gotten by looking out into the audience?

One show that struck me and made me think, "Wow, we've really come a long way," was when we were playing Docklands in London for 10,000 kids. We hadn't ever played for a crowd that big as a headliner. The kids were out of control and happy; they were crazy. They came ready to go and they let loose... and so did we.

What's been the most gratifying aspect of the past year's success?

On an everyday level, it's nice to be able to tour comfortably and have your friends come out when they can. When you're traveling in an RV and staying in a Motel 6 once or twice a week, that's really difficult. So it's nice to be able to live comfortably and see friends and family when you can. On a larger scale, it's great to be doing something that kids are really into and active with; that's a huge reward. When I was making music 10 years ago, I didn't think anybody would be listening to it and going, "This is my favorite band," or "I go to this band's website every day." It baffles me.

What's on the band's agenda for the coming year?

We've got the Project Revolution Tour through the end of Febuary. It's us, Cypress Hill, Adema and DJ Z-Trip—he's phenomenal. There are no boundaries to what he'll use in his set. He'll use Timbaland, Radiohead and AC/DC. And we've got a DJ battle at every show. For weeks before each show, the local hip-hop station will host a competition for local DJs and the two winners will play between Cypress Hill and us. The winners throughout the tour will be judged online by our fans on our website [www.linkinpark.com]. The one winner from the whole tour will play with us and Korn for 40,000 kids in Mexico City. We love to get our fans involved; they get so riled up about stuff like that.

What about the new album?

As soon as we're done with the tour, we're coming home to finish up the remix album and the new album. With *Hybrid Theory*, we wanted to make an album that was powerful in its directness and encompassed a lot of ideas from different genres, and to do that, we had to stay within certain boundaries. Creatively, there were no boundaries, but sonically we wanted to make a certain statement. With the next album, we get to totally break through those boundaries and go elsewhere.

When will the new album be out?

Hopefully, in the fourth quarter of this year.

What about the remix album?

Tentatively in April. We're shooting for March, but let's be realistic. It's not just a remix album—it's a full reinterpretation of the album, plus b-sides. To give you an idea of how different the songs are going to be, my remix of "Crawling" is almost seven minutes long and Aaron from Staind guests on it. The only live music in the song is the vocals and a little bit of guitar; everything else is sampled. We're trying to stay away from the big-name producers, and stick to underground people that we feel strongly about, to introduce some of these people to the masses. We're not trying to put this one on the radio. This is strictly an artistic venture for our fans and anyone who's interested in electronic or hip-hop music.

Is it really an honor "just to be nominated" for a Grammy?

Hopefully, we do take something home, but even if we don't, we're in the same category as Aerosmith and U2. What more could you ask for? Who would you thank first?

We'll have to thank everybody at the same time. It'll be like this one syllable thing that nobody watching at home will understand.

EMI topper Alain Levy earning high marks among industry pundits for swift action, installing right-hand David Munns as head of North America (as expected) and balancing artist savvy with label savvy in the pairing of producer Matt Serletic with Roy Lott at Virgin. While much previous jabber had Levy putting the Colonies in American hands, noters noting that he has done just that at the label level, while reserving oversight for his trusted second in command (and thus ending speculation that he would bring back some of his former North American PolyGram lieutenants). Eves now on the Joel Katz-repped Lott and Serletic, as the new duo takes control. Observers citing Serletic's creative hot streak as credential enough to strengthen Virgin's roster, while Lott's operational acumen, sharpened under Clive Davis at Arista, will help keep the lid on, business-wise... Meanwhile, with the announcement that the Virgin move to New York won't be accomplished until September, how will Munns and his new team motivate a demoralized group of employees, most of whom

will not be making the trip east with them? While the move makes strategic sense for a company headquartered in London, many wondering how Virgin will compete in the marketplace during the transition. New tracks from Lenny Kravitz and Gorillaz will be among the records needing attention ... Those down for the Mariah derby now include Elektra, IDJ, ArtistDirect and Jive, as whisperers whisper none will make the deal without first sitting down with Carey to see how much guidance she's willing to take. Meanwhile, word of researcher John Coleman making his perceptual study of Carey available to label clients reaches executive ears. Said study, commissioned by Virgin prior to the release of Glitter, reportedly shows that Carev has "confused" her audience, with her pop fans disliking her forays into hip-hop and the hip-hop community not finding her credible... The leaking of certain political machinations out of Sacramento last week sent the artist community into a tizzy, as loose talk hinted that passage of the Sen. Kevin Murray-sponsored bill to repeal the music industry exemption to California's sevenyear statute was unlikely. Chatter among some artist managers and attorneys (read: dealmakers) of a possible compromise raised hackles, to say the least, among the artists represented. Are said dealmakers already taking preliminary steps to bring both sides to the bargaining table, even as artist rhetoric ramps up? Is the Don Henley/Jay Cooper-led Recording Artists Coalition digging in for a prolonged siege against the Hilary Rosen-led RIAA? Meanwhile, according to insiders, any compromise would

likely have at its center an issue known as tacking. Currently, it's common practice for labels to "tack on term," or reset the seven-year clock each time an artist's deal is renegotiated. While this practice has been challenged in lawsuits over the years, it has never been tested in the courts, because the labels' ability to sue for damages if an artist walks (the "exemption" in question) is like a sword of Damocles over the artist's head, making settlement, rather than trial, the way to go. Those in the know now saying a possible compromise could see the artists' side allowing tacking as standard practice in exchange for the repeal of the amendment that enables labels to sue. But as lobbyists including the RIAA's Christina Rose and the RAC's Darius Anderson continue to bend legislators' ears, wonderers wondering why the labels, who've historically practiced tacking with impunity, would find such a scenario enticing if they really have a shot at squelching Murray's bill ... Meanwhile, another anti-RIAA claim gaining attention has to do with alleged fraudulent label accounting practices. The Dixie Chicks sued Sony last August for allegedly underpaying royalties (after which Sony countersued for breach), and those pursuing this issue are now maintaining that the Chicks are but one example of systematic fraud taking place throughout the industry. Despite Arthur Andersen putting accountants in the hot seat in certain other circles, some legal eagles are finding this notion a stretch... Industry oddsmakers betting EMI Publishing heavyweight Big Jon will stay put for the time being, despite being pursued by one West-Coast major to head its Urban division.



An exclusive HITS dialogue with Gene Sinamons

irebreathing rocker. Actor. Self-styled philosopher and unrepentant womanizer. Book author and mangazine publisher. Entrepreneurial genius. No doubt about it, KISS co-founder Gene Simmons is one bad mutha-effer.

But while Simmons has undergone various transformations since his band's 1974 emergence, the singer's cultural contributions may ultimately be overshadowed by his pioneering approach to music marketing. He and KISS singer/songwriter Paul Stanley are considered rock's prototypical hyper-capitaliststhe business-savvy precursors to Madonna, Metallica, Garth Brooks, Limp Bizkit and more. Dismissing post-Woodstock notions about artistic integrity, Simmons helped transform KISS into the shameless moneymaking machine that currently holds over 2,500 merchandising

licenses and has sold more than 80 million albums worldwide. Thanks largely to Simmons' corporate vision, KISS has become the rock & roll equivalent of McDonald's, and that's a compliment.

Now, Simmons is undergoing yet another mutation, this time transforming himself into an inescapable multimedia presence. Late last year, the self-proclaimed "God Of Thunder" launched a solo promotional blitz with the release of KISS: The Box Set, a six-CD retrospective featuring greatest hits, outtakes, demos and intriguing odds and ends. Most interesting of all, however, is Simmons' recently released tell-all autobiography, KISS and Make-Up (Crown Publishers/Hardcover). And he is launching a new music magazine, called, naturally, Tongue. Whether he's weighing-in on his musical cohorts or his romantic relationships with Cher and Diana Ross, Simmons writes in a candid and genuine literary voice.

There's a delectable irony to the KISS saga. Though critics have always shortchanged the band, KISS remains one of the most influential groups in rock history. Everyone from Anthrax and Pantera to Lenny Kravitz and Garth Brooks confesses their love for the group, while new rockers like Slipknot, Mudvayne, Mushroomhead and former Limp Bizkit guitarist Wes Borland have struck paydirt adopting KISS' warpaint aesthetic. Simmons recently spoke with HITS' resident leather-lizard Bruce "Wonders Whatever Happened to Vinnie Vincent" Britt, whose tongue remains lodged firmly in his own cheek.

"Treat every woman complete respect, the donna and the whore.

You have various projects in the works. Does this activity mark the start of a second stage of your career?

Yes it is. Just what the second stage consists of... That's something I'll just have to find out. I have a clothing line starting up and *Tongue* magazine I'm launching in the spring, but they'll be other interviews for that—once people see that it's more than just words.

As a father of two and now an author, is Gene Simmons mellowing?

It's difficult to talk about myself, because we're all delusional. I'm one of the few who actually likes what he sees when he looks in the mirror. I believe I'm much better-looking than I actually am, which has its advantages. When I walk into a room, something deep inside me realizes I'm not the best-looking guy, but I'll walk home with your girlfriend.

How about compared to 25 years ago? You mean in terms of chasing skirt? I would say at least on par, perhaps a little more. *Really*?

Yeah, sure. Marriage is another question. Marriage is obsolete. It's built on the premise that somebody other than your mother is actually going to have dominion over you. She'll be able to tell you what to do, where to go and so on. Forget about love for a second---if you ever split up, she takes 50% of pre-tax gross dollars. That's more than the United States government, which gives you nuclear armed forces and a social security system for your money. Without getting married, you can have access to as many women as you want, and still keep all your money, less taxes. If you get married, you still have to pay taxes, you can't have any other girls, and she's not giving you any unless you beg.

You're talking about love as a business transaction. That's pretty cynical.

Did I say anything that isn't true? If I ever got married, I'd say to my wife, "Look, I love you and all that, but before we get started, tell me how much money you want in case we break up." And she'll start crying, "Oh, that's not romantic." And when that happens, I'm running, 'cause you know you're dead. She's going to pull the female trick, which is, "I don't want to answer anything, so I'll just cry."

In your book, you claim you've slept with over 4,600 women. Those are Wilt Chamberlain numbers. How do you keep count?

Because when I look into my folios, there are photos, and I count: "One, two, three..." It's a ritual. Think of me as a tourist. If you've been there, you want to take a photo of it. **So, who was better—Cher or Diana Ross?** As companions? Every woman who graces you with her company—that's as good as it gets. Treat every woman with complete respect, both the Madonna and the whore.

Because Madonna or whore, it's all relative. Physically, everybody winds up doing the same thing. So if somebody gets called a slut, what does she do differently than somebody who isn't a slut? It's all about words. "I can't do it with you unless I love you." OK, that's fine. The other one says, "I can't do it with you because you've got dark hair, and I only like blond guys." Whatever lifts your skirt, it's all good. And ultimately there's not much difference. So when a girl graces me with her pleasure--which increases my pleasure—I obviously treat her very nicely. Even if I never learn her name. I will open the door for her and kiss her goodnight...and good-bye.

Rock retirements are notoriously shortlived. Is KISS really hanging up their platform boots?

Nothing is forever and at a certain point, you've got to get off the stage.

So you believe in quitting while you're ahead?

I do, but the question is, at what point? Could the right amount of money bring KISS back?

The right amount of money could bring God back. It really has to do with Ace and Peter. If it's not fun playing with those guys, I won't go. But if it's fun, I'd consider it, because, at a certain point, I promised myself I'd never play with those guys again because they were doing chemical things to their bodies that certainly turned Dr. Jekyll into Mr. Hyde. It was not fun. Part of it is fun; the other part's a job. I like to think it can be both.

Rumor has it you and Paul Stanley sign all the KISS checks; there's no power of attorney. Is this reflective of some personal business philosophy?

It's true. My business philosophy is, "Look both ways before you cross the street." It works with cars, and it certainly works with human beings. You might take the point of view that you trust humanity. But if you get run over by a car and the driver did it intentionally or not, who cares? Whether it's by accident or design, you've been run over. So we all have to learn to look both ways.

You don't trust anyone.

Absolutely right. Especially don't trust your wife. I'm not even making a joke. The wife says, "I don't trust my husband," but the worst he'll do is go after her girlfriend. The reason I say don't trust your wife is because her way of punishing you is to go for your money. That's called robbery. A prostitute would at least have the dignity and respect to say how much it's going to cost before the festivities begin. Your wife will tell you nothing.

Tell us about the new box set.

A good deal of it consists of stuff nobody's ever heard before, from me and Paul's first band Wicked Lester and original demos. Along with the hits like "Rock 'n' Roll All Nite" and "Shout It Out Loud," we've included things like the first song I recorded as a 19-year-old kid, wet behind the ears. If you like me singing "God of Thunder," you'll be knocked out to hear Paul Stanley singing the original demo. There's even one of the first things Paul ever recorded in his band, the Postwar Baby Boom. He may have been 15. So it's really obscure stuff for those people who care. But it's certainly the mother of all box sets.

How did you go about compiling it?

It was hard because we couldn't figure out what to leave out. When you've done over 30 albums—some greatest hits, some not—there are just so many tracks. So the questions become: "Do we do a greatest hits box set, or demos, or just unreleased songs?" We just didn't know which way to go, so we decided to try to do it all.

Your meticulousness about the music might surprise critics who view KISS as solely a live attraction.

Well, consider the source. Critics never have to go to school to get qualified. If Earth lost farmers, teachers or the police, everyone would be affected. What would happen if critics disappeared? Even a journalist has to go through school to get a degree. What qualification does a critic have? That's the European idea-the critic says what the work means, and then it means something. In America, it's of the people, for the people, by the people. Our critics are the harshest critics you could ever imagine-they're the ones who vote with money by buying tickets to our shows and albums. So the critic that sits behind the desk doesn't affect me.

Do you care that KISS hasn't been inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame? We said no! They keep asking all the time, and I say, "Let me get this right: You want our costumes and all that to be in your museum, and that's fine. Now, what's my take of the ticket?" And they go, "Well, that's going to be for promotion. The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame gets all of the ticket." So my reply is, "Here's what I'll promise you. I'll put the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in the KISS Museum and I'll give you a slice of the ticket." Why do I need to stand next to some guy who most people don't know? Our awards are under the "K" section in your record store, filed under "KISS." Those are the only awards we really care about. Besides, who decides who's going to be in the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame-the people? Of course not; It's backroom politics.

What is the band's musical legacy? I'm too rich to care. And who decides anyway? When a food magazine comes out with a picture of a dead frog on a plate and says, "This is cuisine," who makes that de"KISS is the embodiment of all things of all things Americahorror movies, novies, rock & roll, science iction, "antasy."



cision? Most of America wants Whoppers. Who's right? We all want to leave a mark, but that's all. We stand right behind the Beatles in the number of Gold records sold by any group in history. The only mark I want to leave is, "We were here." I'm confident we've done that.

Have you always been this excessive?

Never towards self-destruction. Never towards drugs, booze, cigarettes or anything that stops me from being healthy and enjoying my five senses. All that came from my mother, who is a German concentration camp survivor. She always had a very uplifting view about humanity. Even though she was aware that human beings were capable of cruelty, her philosophy was, "Every day above ground was a goddamn good day." So I make sure I enjoy life to its fullest.

In other words, life is meant to be lived to the fullest.

Well, not everybody can be happy. But if not, that's OK, too. If Kurt Cobain wants to blow his head off, that's his prerogative. That's not tragic. Getting hit by a car is tragic. If you decide to jump off a building on your own, at least you have the choice. But before you go, could you sign over your net worth to me? Please help make me even happier and richer.

Why does the KISS phenomenon keep growing?

If I knew, I'd create 10 more bands like KISS. Certainly, it's being in the right place at the right time. I'm not sure the Beatles would have worked in the 1800s; that's just the obvious. Maybe KISS is the embodiment of all things America—horror movies, rock & roll, science fiction, fantasy. Isn't there something fascist about the KISS Army? They swarm on anyone that criticizes the band.

They're certainly vocal. If we have a KISS Army, it's a volunteer army. Nobody forces anybody to join. Our fans go farther than anybody. They tattoo their bodies and faces; they have KISS tribute bands where they dress up in our costumes. Clearly, if I was a Mick Jagger fan, it would be easier because you could just prance around and occasionally strum a guitar. If you're a Gene Simmons fan, you have to put on make-up and build an outfit. You can't go to Kmart and ask for the Gene Simmons outfit in medium. Doesn't fly. So the level of dedication is so high, these fans have a right to be vocal. They work harder than other fans. Briefly summarize the band's 30-year history. I wish I could send a postcard to everybody saying, "Having a ball... Wish you were here." It's still fun, though?

Oh yeah. It beats working. ★

If you still haven't heard of the Strokes, the rock you're living under must be huge.

The handsome group of twentysomething New Yorkers has everyone from *The Face* to *Rolling Stone* to *NME* rubbing its thigh, but singer Julian Casablancas, drummer Fabrizio Moretti, bassist Nikolai Fraiture and guitarists Nick Valensi and Albert Hammond Jr. claim all they wanna do is play some rock & roll. Why all the fuss? The Strokes play catchy pop that builds on retro-jangled rhythms, a playful beat and Casablancas' tuned-up-Lou-Reed set of pipes. The sound is so carefully passive-aggressive and packed with hooks that you have to go back three decades to find any near-comparisons for the Strokes—acts like Television, Talking Heads and the Velvet Underground come back as its closest musical neighbors. The band's RCA debut full-length, *Is This It* has gone from underground sensation to bonafide hit. Sadly, "Is This It," was the same question Casablancas, Fraiture and Moretti asked after HITS' Jennifer "*Night*" Maerz recently broke Budweisers with the band, as it were, talking about fame's double-edge, puke-control and Pamela Anderson.

Julian, when did you start singing in public?

Julian Casablancas: It was at our first show, to like four people. I was so nervous, I puked before I went on-stage; I used to puke a lot in those days So you're not puking now?

JC: No. I'm still nervous, but I know how to perform now—not totally, though Nikolai Fraiture: We're a big bottle of nerves. Nobody can be in our dressing room before the show.

What do you make of the whole Strokes buzz?

JC: People say, "I see you in all these magazines, but I've never heard you," and that blows. The first time you hear about a band, you want to hear the songs and not really have an idea about it. I just want to have people hear the music and decide for themselves. I don't think people like having shit shoved down their throats. It's not like we're doing that—we're saying in interviews that we're just trying to play music, but it's like it doesn't matter because there are a thousand magazines out there. I just go with the flow and hopefully, later on, I'll know how to deal with it.

Fabrizio Moretti: There are two levels of understanding. The first is understanding the music without the hype and the other is understanding it amidst the hype. We're hoping that our music is good enough to transcend both.

What are some of the funniest rumors you've heard about the band? FM: We heard once that we were put together by Julian's father... NF: By his modeling agency...

FM: That we don't actually play music, we just go out on photo shoots. That we're a fake band...

NF: That people don't actually come to our shows. That we're just in magazines.

How do the comparisons to older bands like the Velvet Underground sit with you?

NF: We had a show in Boston and someone came up to Julian and said, "What do you think of the death of Joey Ramone?" And he was like, "It's sad, just as any other person's death is sad." And the guy was like, "You should respect that guy." We understand that, but people go too far with comparisons. They expect us to have been in the '70s and we weren't even born then. It was easier before. So many people come up to us after shows, all drunk and go, "Who the fuck are you?"

FM: Most of the musicians who come up to talk with us are nice, though, and they think that together we can start a revolution. I really believe that can happen. We're at a really good point right now. There's such a stale air in rock music that someone like us succeeding a little bit gives other bands leeway to succeed. It's not a conscious decision, but with whatever amount of attention we get, we want people to recognize that we are a specific band playing our own music, but that there are a lot of other bands that are just as good out there.

NF: New York is really competitive, so the first thing you want is to be successful with other bands and not leading anything.

You guys have been friends since high school. Who had the strictest parents?

FM: Nikolai and I did. Our fathers were both very European, so when we did bad shit, we'd get reprimanded... Catholic upbringing. We weren't stupid, and we didn't do things that were crazy; we just had our fun. I was always keen on drawing. I went to school for sculpture, which was something that my father didn't appreciate at all. He wanted me to be an engineer or some shit like that. And when I told him that I wanted to quit to be with the band, he didn't like it.

Now that you're getting write-ups in big magazines, has your dad changed his mind about your career?

FM: My dad is seriously living vicariously. He calls and asks me for the scoop of the day.

So what rock & roll fantasies do you want to fulfill?

FM: I want to sleep with Pamela Anderson. I'm totally kidding. I don't have any...All the fantasies that I used to have came true.★

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

"When we added 'I Wish You Were Here', I really thought it would be THE big hit for Incubus. After hearing 'Nice To Know You' on the air and the subsequent immediate reaction from our audience, I know THIS is the one. 'Defy You' from Offspring is doing fantastic. I think our listeners would agree that it's great to hear another hit from them, especially since it's something different (without the quirky lyrics and sounds we're used to)."





KEITH DAKIN/MD WDYL/RICHMOND

"It's all about Linkin Park. From 'Runaway' to 'It's Going Down,' they seem to be dominating our airwaves. As far as cool new things, we think the Sense Field is great. It might be a bit mellow, but it seems to work. 'Toxicity' sounds like a smash. And The Strokes still rule. To keep my 'punk-rock' cred, I gotta say I love Phantom Planet."

CARLY BROWN/PD WPGU/CHAMPAIGN

"A new big phone record for us is Something Corporate's 'iF yoU C Jordan,' which has just started reacting. I'm not goin' soft, but Starsailor's 'Good Souls' and Unwritten Law's 'Seein' Red' are a couple of my current personal favorites. 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

IT'S HIP TO BE SQUARE

Time to Make Room for John Mayer by J.R. Griffin



Since the low-key release of his debut last September, Mayer has done what he does best stick to the road. A natural stage talent (he started performing at blues clubs when he was 15), Mayer is winning over fans, one set of ears at a time. Now, with the single "No Such Thing" bubbling at APM, it seems the revenge of the square is upon us. Unfortunately, the only thing hip HITS' J.R. "*Chie Bunker*" Griffin knows about is the hip he threw out square-dancing.

Are you sick of being compared to the Dave Matthews Band?

There was a time when I worried about it, but not anymore. Now, I don't think there's anything bad about it. I learned that it's a compliment, though, from people who kept telling me that it was OK. Comparisons come in and out as times goes on. I've only made one real record. And it's only one point on the plane. It might take two or three records to give people a sense of my music. Even if it doesn't, I don't feel threatened by it. I don't think it's going to hinder my ability to play music for people. **How are you going about defining your sound?**

It's going to take two or three records for me to understand what my constants and variables are. I think I made a record that doesn't repeat. And that's good for me right now. In time, what I want to do is find a healthy pattern with my music so when you hear me on the radio, you go, "That's a John Mayer thing." But I'm not sure if I have a John Mayer thing yet.

You're putting in so much time on the road. Have you been making friends out there?

Now more than ever, people are very aware of the inner workings of how advertising and promotion take place. And consumers have a very acute sense of when they're being sold something. What I've been trying to do is not push my music on people—let them come to the shows and discover it. I have a "No Pounce" rule. I show up, play my songs, say "hello" and leave. We're putting it out there and letting things happen. I just hope that it's making a lasting connection.

Why do you look like a little kid on the album cover?

We wanted people to see the front cover of the CD and ask, "Who's that 10-year-old?" I don't know. I was 23 on that cover. And everyone decided to go with the photo that made me look like I was holding up a little stuffed animal toy.

Does that hinder your ability to score with the ladies?

Um, no. But I don't really look like my album cover, which can be frustrating sometimes. I'll catch checking me out. Instead of going, "Hey John Mayer!"—which I would love—they stare at me for awhile, sneak up and ask, "What's your name?" And then they figure it out. I'd rather have someone come up to me and ask right away.

But your music's so smooth; chicks must dig that.

Yes, my music is smooth. And people probably think that, at times, it's l-i-t-e, lite, but I find that balance between being smooth and lite—not that I even know what those terms mean. I don't gravitate toward distorted sounds. I gravitate toward the sweetest part of the guitar or the most mellow part of a cymbal. I remember when it came time to record *Room For Squares*, people around me were saying, "You're gonna rough this up, right?" We had to add some grit to it, because if I was left to my own devices, that shit would be silky.

Well, even roughed-up, you've still made a pretty smooth make-out record.

Maybe. It's all pretty mellow; it's got a thread. I would certainly never use it as a make-out album, because it would be like making out with your sister. But I've heard that other people have. And as long as nobody tries to hit me up for child support, I'm more than happy to have people copulating to my music.



LAST NIGHT: My friend Tamra is going to kill me. As soon as she heard I'd been invited to an MTV2 taping of the Strokes, she demanded that I get her singer Julian Casablancas' autograph. But the thought of moi stumbling down the bleachers in front of a throng of MTV kids (dressed for TV and making me feel way too old!) was more than I could deal with. Anyway, it was just like American Bandstand, except the Strokes didn't lip-synch. They play live. And, their show is precise, dynamic and very visual. Musically, it's a mixture of Television, the Velvet Underground and early Talking Heads. Is This It will easily make my Top 10 of the year. And, all of a sudden, it's one of the hottest-selling records in the country! (#26 last week.) Get a copy from RCA. It will make you happy even if you don't end up putting it on the air... APM stations continue to score in the ratings. KTZO PD Scott Souhrada: "Although our 12+ share came down, we went 6.1-6.3 in our true target demo, 25-34. When male TSL comes back, from very low this book to historical levels, we'll be in great shape." KBAC Santa Fe pulled an extraordinary 8.4 12+ (#2!!!! overall), 11.3 25-54 and a 16.7 (!!) on weekends. This is particularly impressive since all of the Albuquerque

stations have excellent coverage in Santa Fe. "I credit our entire staff for doing a spectacular job," said PD Ira Gordon. "They're still peeling us off the roof!" Congrats also to PD Harry Reynolds at KTHX Reno, who are up to a 7.6 25-54, which places them at #2 in that crucial cell... American Icon Willie Nelson has sold over 20k copies of The Great Divide in each of the last two weeks.

THE STROKES: I'm stoked about the Strokes!! Chris Stacey told me a story about a woman who came up to him and Willie at an NYC Starbucks and burst into tears at the sheer thrill of meeting one of her heroes.

APM radio is getting warm and fuzzy about Willie as well. With no official add date yet, there are double-digit spins on "Maria (Shut Up And Kiss Me)" at WBOS, KGSR, KRSH, WFPK and other tastemaker stations. No wonder radio's pumped: The track and album are produced by Matt Serletic, whose credits include Santana's "Smoothe," Collective Soul and matchbox twenty. (He was also just named President of Virgin Records.) Lost Highway is rushing out a single. And, reinforcing the notion that adults are once again buying cool music, Ryan Adams' Gold is at 400k sold worldwide! The new single, "Answering Bell," is spinning on KMTT, KBCO, KGSR (in heavy), WMMM, WTTS, WXRV and WBOS among others. "New York, New York" went Top 15 at Hot Adult this week, so it's time to start showing depth on what is shaping up as the new artist album of the year... Other records I like and how they're doing: KMTT adds Citizen Cope. Yeah BABY!! Ben Folds is requesting big at Modern Adults in Tampa, Baltimore and Kansas City. Bob Schneider's "Big Blue Sea" is starting to grow as well. KTCZ moved it to Medium. WMMM and WOKI recently doubled their spins. WRLT also moved it up. MD Keith Coes: "Lonelyland was one of my faves of 2001. I salute Universal for sticking with Bob." On the Jack Johnson tip, "Bubble Toes" is huge at the format. Now, as Universal preps for their 2/18 PoMo impact date on "Flake," some APMs (like KBCO and KXST) are on both tracks. Recent Jack converts include KGSR and KCTY... With tour dates booked well beyond summer, and more than 30k copies sold in eight weeks, North Mississippi All Stars are a grassroots phenomenon a la the Dave Matthews Band. They're on the road constantly and sell lots of records. "Sugartown" will sound amazing next to many library mainstays, like the Stones and Eric Clapton ... Congrats to Virgin's Ray Gmeiner on the story he's building on Mick Jagger's, "Visions Of Paradise," and a #1 Most Added week on Lenny Kravitz's passionate "Stillness Of Heart"... Finally, The first time I heard Train's "Drops of Jupiter" I knew it was Grammy-bound. I was giddy when it was nominated for both Record and Song Of The Year, which means they'll perform it on the telecast at the end of the month. Expect a barnburner!... hitsmm@aol.com

X-ecutioners Built From Scratch (Loud/Columbia/ CRG): Drenched with scratches, beat-boxing, diced samples and jolting lyricism, this DJ crew's CD is such a genuine return to old-school rap, it makes you wanna pop-lock. But what propels the record into the here and now are expansive tracks that blur the line between rock-rap and rap-rock, like standout "It's

Goin' Down," featuring Mike Shinoda and Mr. Hahn of Linkin Park—not since Run DMC collabed with Aerosmith has classic hip-hop meshed so well with rock. Rap all-stars Xzibit, Pharoahe Monch, Big Pun, Everlast, Inspectah Deck and Biz Markie also guest. Check out "Let It Bang" and "Dramacyde." (K.Y.)

Local H Here Comes the Zoo (Palm): It's been seven years since the guitar/drums duo of Scott Lucas and Joe Daniels debuted on Island with Ham Fisted—and after three albums, a label megamerger and a new line-up (Daniels left and Triplefastaction alumnus Brian St. Clair joined), their Illinois rock train rolls on. This disc (on Chris Blackwell's Palm label) finds the



duo—and a few friends—striking a new balance between grungy indie power moves and classic-rock allusions. Compare the cock-rock of "(Baby Wants to) Tame Me" to the Cobainesque "Rock & Roll Professionals." The bipolarity is magnetic: check "Keep Your Girlfriend," "Creature Comforted" and the pointedly un-Zeppy, yet Zeppishly titled "Bryn-Mawr Stomp." (J.O.)



Blue Six Beautiful Tomorrow (Naked Music/ Astralwerks): The man hiding behind the moniker Blue Six is Naked Music founder Jay Denes, and the music in front of the name is crisp, mellow electronica. With a chilled-out house-music vibe, Denes' songs are come-down, late-night beats and sweet melodies rather than dancefloor rave ups. A handful of female

singers add a variety of flavors—in particular, Lysa's lighter-than-air, vocoderized singing on "Sweeter Love" brings a pop sensibility to the sensual grooves. But it's the jazzy, downtempo beats and organic live instrumentation—including muted, colorful trumpet on "Close to Home"—intertwined with Denes' minimalist production that gives *Beautiful Tomorrow* its, well, beauty. (D.S.)

Tanya Donelly Beautysleep (Beggars Group/ 4AD): The voice of Belly—who also lent her skills to PoMo pioneers Throwing Muses and the Breeders—returns with an evocative set that makes the most of her distressed-velvet voice and eclectic pop-rock instincts. Beautysleep favors spare, acoustic-leaning arrangements, which bring out



Donelly's piquant melodies and arresting vocals beautifully. Cases in point: the achingly tender "The Night You Saved My Life," the mysterious "Moonbeam Monkey" (featuring vocals by departed Morphine singer Mark Sandman), the seductive, slide-heavy "Darkside" and the incandescent "The Wave." This one will sneak up on you—forgive us if we call it a sleeper. (S.G.)

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



However, the biggest buzz record during my calls with radio last week had to be Def Jam's Ashanti cut, "Foolish," which officially goes for adds this coming Tuesday. Meanwhile, it's already in a 40x/week rotation at HOT97, WJMN and WXYV, picks up a new add this week at KKWD, and is generating earpicks from real musicheads like KPWR's E-Man, B96's Erik Bradley and WLLD's Beata. This one feels unstoppable. Also from the IDJ camp, I'm totally excited to hear that Dru Hill's third album is almost completed. Can't wait to hear that... Lest you think I've become all business following the David debacle, I should tell you that I am making an attempt to move on. As I was doing prior to meeting him, I've begun once again to check out clubs/night spots in L.A. that I have not previously frequented. This past week, it was a Wednesday night excursion to Club Ghetto-nice name, and yes, I was there having martinis even while doped-up on cold medicine. What am I to do? Not drink for a couple of weeks? I don't think so. Anyhow, the DJ was on fire-nothing but hits and the occasional new track for three straight hours. And the award for best reaction to a new jam during the evening went to (drum roll, please ...) "Knoc" by Knoc-Turn'al. More importantly, the song is enjoying early support from KPWR, KBMB, KSEQ and **KBOS**, is pulling immediate Top 5 phones at both **KXJM** and Z90, and grabs an earpick from this week's Big Willie, **KYWL**'s **Steve Kicklighter**. And, oh—did I mention that while I was at the club I met a hot man and we danced 'til 3 a.m.? More on that later, perhaps... The other big story of the week is the sales jump on *Stillmatic* from **Nas**, which blazes up the chart 16-6 following the recent add of "Got Ur Self A..." to **MTV**. Programming suggestion: Perhaps that's something that should change given the audience reaction over the last 10 days or so. Once again, if your audience is voting with their wallets, take heed... Finally, I have to ask: What in the world is going on where the second suddenly and completely vibing these guys and this song, even as the label gears up for the release of the follow-up, "GotsTa Be." Let me just say that were I still programming, I'd probably go back and readdress the lead single. Or, if that one just didn't work at the end of last year (and it was actually rotated when people could hear it), get on the new one ASAP. The bottom line is, as I've been saying in this space for the last nine months now, these guys look awesome, dance great and are absolutely stars!! Thank you... That's about it for now. Gotta go get ready for some dinner with Capitol's Cindy Levine Baker. Then, it's off to Circus Disco in search of the guy I met at Club Ghetto last week. Wish me luck. Until next week-C-ya...



Greg Powell: ArtistDirect Promo Head Is Ready to Launch A "No Good" Project Perception & Presentation: ArtistDirect Records has gotten phat play as the newest experiment in CEO Ted Fields' grand career. The former co-founder of Interscope Records (along with Jimmy Iovine) is betting the same magic will strike again. A key cog is Greg Powell, VP Urban Promotion, who is getting his first shot at guiding the promotional efforts of the label's urban division. Powell, formerly Field National Director of, first Jive Records, (where he was instrumental in

setting up the promo effort for R. Kelly, Joe, Mystikal, Too \$hort and E-40), and most recently Priority Records as Sr. National Director, introduced his national staff last week at a dinner at Ago Restaurant in Hollywood. The label's first urban release is No Good's "Ballin' Boy," a Miami-flavored cut that gives major shouts to key hip-hop areas of the Dirty South. The song has garnered seven early adds at WEDR, WHTA, WJMI, WTRW, WJTT, WFXE and WJZD. "We feel we're off to a good start," Powell says. We're over 100 spins in two weeks, which is good for a startup label. Aside from No Good, ArtistDirect is looking for success with Naam Brigade out of Philadelphia. Then we have Smilez & Northstar out of Miami, which is growing at the crossover level. The one I'm really excited about is Phats Bossi. out of Los Angeles. His potential is unlimited. He's not a Notorious B.I.G. look-alike, but he has a lot of charisma. And then we have a rapper, Pokerface, out of Phoenix." Spearheading the A&R process is Gary Harris, who signed D'Angelo to EMI Records (he later shifted to Virgin Records). Harris's other credits include the New Jack City soundtrack. Color Me Badd and the soundtrack to Girl Fight. Powell's strategy to set up ArtistDirect as a viable urban radio entity is to "spread the name. But the thing that is going to establish us is the quality of our music and the quality of our people. Our staff, along with our association with BMG, is going to let people know that we are a legitimate company and that we're here to stay." Powell personally interviewed and picked his staff, all while adding to his frequent flyer mileage! "Brian Samson is our Director of National Crossover & Mix Show Promotions, and will handle West Coast Urban radio promotion. The Southwest rep will be Junius Thomas; the Southeast rep will be Denise Young, formerly of Warner Bros. Records. The Midwest rep is DeWayne Holmes, and my Mid-Atlantic/Northeast rep will be Dwight Willacy, formerly of Motown Records. Still to fill is the National Director of Promotion and a Carolinas rep. Diana Cooper is our Promotion Coordinator, as well as my assistant. Tiarra Mukherjee will handle urban publicity, while Chace Johnson, from Priority Records, will handle urban marketing." Powell concludes, "My favorite two words are perception' and 'presentation.' I want to make sure that our presentation and perception are correct, and the music should speak for itself." 


Last year, insiders made it clear to us that whether or not the merger with Valley Media went through, Floridabased Alliance Entertainment Group was going to eventually have a West Coast facility. Arista sales honcho Jordan Katz will host a midnight soiree on Sunday (3/10) to play tracks from Santana's upcoming Shaman LP, slated for a 6/25 release... Also love WEA's plan to rent Pac Bell Park for Monday (3/11), with full access to the facilities, including a pitcher so we can all take our hacks from home plate. Very cool.

Competition for national/world music and entertainment is here with satellite radio & the Internet. The big companies have their plan, but only the big dogs can survive, due to their size, by franchising. So what's the solution for the others? Instead of

panicking, survivors will have to start company-wide initiatives to improve their products.

<u>People:</u> Steve Berger's Nationwide Broadcasting mission statement is: Only the best people! Radio can't create compelling products without compelling people in programming & on air.

<u>Research</u>: I learned one simple motto from the Aussies: **To create** compelling radio stations you need to be listener-driven. Talk to our audience through quality research. Without local research you get poorly targeted programming.

<u>Outside Resources:</u> You need experts to train your people, help interpret research & help you build successful radio products. Most broadcasters don't have the radio programming experience of seeing all the possible competitive radio scenarios play out.

<u>Marketing:</u> Even the greatest radio station in the world won't succeed unless the market knows about it. Word-of-mouth/street promotions only work on the most active formats—Alternative & Rhythm Crossover. To reach adults, you need to use outside marketing—television & direct-mail/telemarketing, reinforced with billboards.

<u>Mornings</u>: Only a great local morning show can touch listener's heartstrings to such a degree that even during a down cycle the station can survive.

<u>Promotions:</u> Radio needs the fun factor. Part of that is mornings, but a large part is contests. Compelling contest design, writing & production create overall community excitement.

<u>Radio:</u> "magic" isn't created by luck, but through honest evaluation & hard work. It's a labor-intensive process, & requires research, the best people, a good plan, realistic goals & the resources to reach them. Eventually, because of the Telecom Bill, 80% of the radio consist of generic nationally programmed formats provided by big radio companies & syndication. But there will be a few compelling local stations with local talent & locally targeted programming.

Now's the time to create the products & talent so that your stations will be left standing. Where does your company stand? Headlining Club Tour

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
