



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



























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STEP UP TO THE MIKE





es, folks, Arista Nashville's Alan Jackson went back to the top of this week's Top 50 Album chart, dethroning last week's champion, Epic's J.Lo, whose remix album remains at an impressive #3.

And yes, folks, Wind-up's Creed jumped back to #2, with Warner Bros.' Linkin Park at #4 and Def Jam South/IDJ's Ludacris rounding out this week's Top Five.

But look at the numbers: Sales are up this week across the board, and that's a good thing.

"We saw a marked increase over last week's numbers for a majority of titles," said Mike Fuller of Hastings, who must now share his quote with a Canadian retailer following the actions of one of HITS' French editors.

And Fuller ain't just flexing his foo-foo Spandex outfit. While most titles are packing double-digit percentage increases over last week, check out Flawless/Geffen/Interscope's Puddle of Mudd, which jumped 34%. And what about Interscope's Enrique, who posted a 62% increase, thanks to a new single... and a video featuring Anna Kournikova?!

The Russian Kournikova would have shared her video appearance with a Canadian hottie, but only **Anne Murray** and **Gordon Lightfoot** could be found.

"The Enrique and Puddle of Mudd albums are really showing huge gains," said Fuller, whose excitement factor falls somewhere between women's curling and a small soap dish. "Expect these to continue to grow well into the spring."

Meanwhile, Mercury/IDJ's O Brother soundtrack jumped 40%, as did Interscope's No Doubt, while Reprise's Enya posted a 52% jump. Speaking of Reprise, the top

a 52% jump. Speaking of Reprise, the top debut this week belonged to the label's **Chris Isaak**, who bowed at #24.

Meanwhile, eyes and wallets will be open next Tuesday (2/26), when a number of key titles street. We're talking new ones from Maverick/Reprise's Alanis Morissette, WB's Cher, Capitol's Kylie Minogue and Virgin's Gorillaz remixes.

"I cast my vote for ze Cher at ze #1," said a French figure skating judge, responding to pressure from the Warner Music Group.

With 66% of the vote, U2's All That You Can't Leave Behind is winning by a landslide in the Album of the Year category, followed by Bob Dylan's Love and Theft at 13%, and O Brother Where Art Thou? at 12%. India.Arie's Acoustic Soul and OutKast's Stankonia trail with 7% and 3%, respectively. OutKast is well out in front in the Best Rap Album category, however, with 57%.

Alicia Keys is the frontrunner in four categories: "Fallin" has 52% of the vote in both Song of the Year and Record of the Year slots. She has more than 73% of the Best New Artist votes, and she leads in the Best R&B Album, where her Songs in A Minor bests Aaliyah by 12%.

In the Best Rock Album category, U2 dominates with 65%.

The most wide-open race is for Producer of the Year. Dr. Dre leads with 29%, followed by T Bone Burnett (26%) and Jimmy Jam & Terry

Lewis (22%).

Finally, in the closely watched Best Polka Album category, Brave Combo's Kick-Ass Polkas is beating Walter Ostanek & His Band's Happy Times by the slimmest of margins. The tension is unbearable.

Polling closes this Friday, Feb. 22. Vote early, vote often. Your vote could make a difference. No, not really.

Get the Parties Started

on't worry, folks. The show—and the parties—must go on.

Despite the prevailing mood of gloom and doom that has plagued the record industry like a bad hangover, all the scheduled **Grammy** throwdowns will still take place—but expect the festivities to be a trifle subdued this year.

- Grammy week will get under way Monday night (2/25) with NARAS' 12th annual Musi-Cares benefit, this year honoring "Person of the Year" Billy Joel at the Century Plaza Hotel in Century City. Among those on hand will be Tony Bennett, Jon Bon Jovi, Richie Sambora, Garth Brooks, Diana Krall and Rob Thomas. Proceeds provide support for MusiCares' financial assistant program, which ensures that music people have a place to turn in times of financial, medical and personal need, and helps defray the cost of Mike Greene's annual tux rental fee.
- It'll be Clive Davis vs. the politicos on the eve of the awards ceremony, with the legendary record exec's annual soiree at the Beverly Hills Hotel on Tuesday night (2/26) topping the list, featuring a who's-who of performers, undoubtedly topped by multiple nominee Alicia Keys.
- In addition, the newly formed Recording Artist Coalition will stage four separate "Concerts for Artists Rights" on Grammy Eve. The Eagles, Billy Joel, John Fogerty, Stevie Nicks and Sheryl Crow will be at the Forum; Dixie Chicks, Trisha Yearwood, Dwight Yoakam and Emmylou Harris will perform at the Universal Amphitheatre; No Doubt, the Offspring and Weezer will appear at the Long Beach Arena: while Beck, Eddie Vedder and Mike Ness headline the Wiltern.

- ■The ninth annual "Rock the Vote" shindig at the House of Blues that same night will honor the Dave Matthews Band and Destiny's Child with the Patrick Lippert Awards. The West Wing producer Aaron Sorkin will be presented with the "Rock the Nation Magic Mushroom" award and NARM's Pam Horovitz will receive the org's "Founders Award." Nelly Furtado, Goo Goo Dolls and Glenn Lewis will provide the entertainment.
- Three of the Big Five Grammy night parties are apparently off limits to the media. Sony's exclusive post-awards show shindig will be held at Mortons, BMG's soiree will be at the Argyle on Sunset, while Universal Music Group will gather at Cicada downtown, presumably far away from the ravenous members of the fourth estate.
- ■The EMI party will be at the Park Plaza hotel, while Warner Music Group is taking over Mondrian's Skybar for a hoe-down partly underwritten by corporate partner Entertainment Weekly. Synergy is so cool, isn't it?
- Finally, BMG North America's Bob Jamieson is once more hosting a Grammy viewing party from 4:30 to 9 p.m. at the Chaya Brasserie in Beverly Hills.

FOURTH-QUARTER ROCK BREAKTHROUGHS

Three New Artists Are Making the Case for the Growth Genre of '02

t may or may not save your soul these days, but Rock is definitely rolling. RCA's The Strokes, Island Def Jam's Hoobastank and TVT's Default are three new artists who scored momentum out of fourth-quarter campaigns, when conventional wisdom says it's impossible to break a new act. And, thanks to Rock's ongoing strength, all three continue to ride that momentum toward becoming mass-appeal smashes.

For example, The Strokes recently logged a whopping 79% increase in sales, moving to #26 from #50 on the HITS Top 50 Album Chart on the strength of the band's *Saturday Night Live* appearance. Meanwhile, Default recently made its first appearance on the chart with a near-50%

increase. Similarly, Hoobastank has seen impressive gains, with weekly sales over 40k.

On average, it takes at least a year to break a new Rock act, so in order to fairly evaluate these three projects, we'll need to track their progress over the coming months. But early success is proving inspirational and is making Rock the genre to watch. If everything goes right, these records could be the next to join the likes of Wind-up's Creed (4.5 million in the U.S.), Warner Bros.' Linkin Park (6.2m), Flip/Elektra's Staind (4.4m) and Atlantic's P.O.D. (1.6m) in capturing listeners' imaginations—and dollars. Below, the latest on The Q4 Three:

THE STROKES

HITS



This N.Y.C. quintet, whom gushing critics have compared to the **Velvet Underground**, broke first in Europe on the strength of "Last Nite" and "Hard to Explain." Since the release of *Is This It* in

the U.S., they've sold 400k OTC, and their ex-U.S. tally stands at over a million. Here, "Last Nite" has scored huge MTV support and gone Top Five PoMo and Rock nationally. RCA plans to build the U.S. audience further with "Hard to Explain" before attempting a cross. The band, already on the road for a year, is in Japan now and will do two months in Europe before heading back to the States.

Says RCA President Jack Rovner, "It's been growing organically for a while. It's a new rock sound, but I think the audience just finds it good music. The album is full of hits. The SNL appearance helped connect the dots for us, in terms of getting the word out, because for the first time, other than on MTV, kids got to see the band. Though the band's been touring, they've yet to hit the secondary and tertiary markets."

As for whether The Strokes are helping usher in a new era of rock dominance, Rovner notes, "There's something to be said about this audience that first got into NSYNC, Backstreet Boys and Britney—very early on, in some cases 8, 9 and 10—starting to graduate and look for other forms of music, and certainly Rock falls into their focus. I think the good news is we're getting kids to listen to music at a younger age, and this is part of their taste transition from Pop to Rock."

HOOBASTANK



The Tool-influenced California shredders with the weird name recently blew past 300k in U.S. OTC sales, and they're the highest-charted of the three acts dealt with here (#38

this week) behind an aggressive retail campaign. They've supported their debut, released Nov. 20, with two tours—with 311 and with Incubus. Though closed out, first single "Crawling in the Dark" is far from over, with PoMo and Rock rotations strong and #1 MTV spins and TRL love kicking in. Still, Island is prepping videos for both "Remember Me" and "Running Away" and intends to work both, saving crossover efforts for one of the latter.

"We're establishing a brand," says new Island President Julie Greenwald. "We have micromarketed the shit out of this record. Before they go into a market, we make sure Hoobastank is there, and after they leave, we make sure the impact of seeing them live penetrated. Any way we can touch that city, we touch it and touch it hard. We kill them with the 'Stank." Adds VP Promotion Stu Bergen, "We could work this record for another two years."

Is Rock's momentum still on the upswing? "We're betting on it," says Bergen. Adds Greenwald: "The key is they're stars. When you see **Doug [Robb]** onstage, you know 'That kid is a star.' And because of the hard work we did with Rock last year, people are giving us the benefit of the doubt and showing us the love."

DEFAULT



Defining post-grunge hard rock, Vancouver-style, this debut, *The Fallout*, released Oct. 2, has clearly benefited from the guidance of **Nickelback's Chad Kroeger**, as well as the discovery


of singer Dallas Smith, whose musical resume, incredibly, was previously nonexistent. Default has scanned nearly 300k U.S. (and currently over 30k/week) on the strength of smash single "Wasting My Time," which is huge at MTV, VH1, Rock and PoMo and is crossing to Modern Adult and Top 40 now, as the band tours relentlessly.

TVT President Steve Gottlieb notes, "We're doing these numbers, and we haven't broken a sweat yet. This is a band that nobody knows, and by the time people get to know them, it's going to go through the roof." And of the Nickelback connection? "It certainly doesn't hurt, but it's one thing to know that Chad was involved in making some of these songs and another thing to know this band on their own terms—they're very much their own thing. They're great songwriters and phenomenal live performers."

Is Default on the cusp of a new Rock sound? "I think there's definitely a return to melody and vocals," Gottlieb says, "but these guys also play like motherfuckers. I think the genuineness comes through—there seems to be a real response to that. But there is a tectonic shift going on. Everyone has to feel this is a pivotal moment in music. I think by next year we'll see a different cast of characters."

TO RECAP: All three of these new artists broke in the fourth quarter (thus the reason we call them The Q4 Three), and with the current Rock appetite,

we expect them to grow all year, building toward the big Q4 score, which comes with their second Christmas. Watch this space for updates.



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THE POLITICAL HEAT IS ON


or weeks we've been covering the increasing politicization of the music industry. There's the fight in Sacramento over SB1246, which seeks to repeal the 1987 amendment to California's seven-vear labor statute, allowing music companies to sue for damages arising from undelivered albums in the event an artist attempts to void a contract after seven years. The fight spawned the birth of the Recording Artists Coalition, led by a number of artists, managers and attorneys, Its express purpose is to give artists a political voice—and political fundraising power.

But that's hardly it. Artists like the Dixle Chicks and Courtney Love are going to court and question-

ing labels' accounting practices-while actively seeking to reform the way the music industry does business. "Is this a matter of the artists biting the hands that feed them?" manager Simon Renshaw of The Firm, which represents the Dixie Chicks, asks rhetorically. "It's more like them slapping the hands that are reaching into their back pockets."

With RAC planning to use the revenues from the four Grammy-eve benefit concerts to subsidize political lobbying, thus pressuring the RIAA to follow suit, the price of poker in DC and Sacramento is definitely going up.

This Tuesday (2/20). The Firm hosted a political fundraiser titled "Winning Back the House and Winning Back Artists' Rights" for House Democratic Leader Richard Gephardt of Missouri and ranking Democrat on the House Ju-



diciary Committee John Conyers of Michigan, who recently announced his intention to request an oversight hearing before said committee to investigate music-industry business practices. The soiree, hosted by Firm chiefs Jeff Kwatinetz and David Baram, raised over \$300,000 for Gephardt and the Democratic party.

Among those in attendance were artists Sheryl Crow, Dexter Holland, Lionel Richie, the Crystal Method, BT and Incubus; managers Irving Azoff, Jim Guerinot, Steve Rennie, John Leshay, Andy Gould and Richard Bishop; entertainment attorneys Gary Stiffelman, John Branca, Jay Cooper, Eric Greenspan, Peter Paterno, Gene Salomon,

Fred Goldring and Ken Hertz: industry leaders like CAA's Richard Lovitt and Rob Light and EMI Publishing's Steve Backer; and politicos like state Senator Kevin Murray, California Speaker Emeritus of the State Assembly Robert Hertzberg and California Attorney General Bill Lockyer; among others.

Following interviews in recent issues with Renshaw, Murray, the RAC's Don Henley and industry attorney Eric Kronfeld, this week we offer selected highlights from Kwatinetz and company's gathering-which we hear was even more provocative than these excerpts suggest-along with a follow-up chat with artist advocate Murray. Did we mention the politicization of the music industry?

Strange Bedfellows Engage in Some Foreplay at Kwatinetz Confab

Convers: "It's so important that artists come together. I came here prepared to comment on the indentured servitude that artists find themselves in. Everybody said, 'Wait a minute, this is slavery. Convers, not indentured servitude. These guys are really under the yolk."

Gephardt: "In every chapter of human history, there is always a fight about power. Politics is a substitute for violence. It is the method we have chosen to arbitrate that fight over power. It is a very serious business, with very serious consequences. Look at Enron. It is a story about the wielding of power against the rights of individuals

for selfishness, avarice and greed. The Democratic Party is very diverse. If you go to the Republican caucus in the house, you'll see white men. You'd feel like you might be in a country club somewhere. If you go to my caucus, you'll see women, Hispanics-about 37 of them-you'll see African American—50 some odd—you'll see gays and lesbians. The Democratic Party in the house looks like and acts like America. It is America. I'm proud of this party, and I'm proud of what it represents. We've got a big job ahead of us. We've got to mobilize."

Convers: "The recording industry is one of the most well-organized special interests on Capitol Hill. At the dawn of the digital age of music, the recording industry is getting its piece of the pie on the information superhighway. If you, the artists, are not careful, they will also take your piece of the pie. That is why I am so proud that you are getting organized and getting politically active."

Kwatinetz: "It is up to us to make it better for not just ourselves but for the many who cannot afford or are not able to affect change. And the major second labels, now numbering five, are all powerful concentrations of capital, and they don't want change."

Convers: "I believe the root cause of the problem is the consolidation in the radio business. What makes it worse is that this consolidation has spread to the concert-ticket, concert-venue and even the music-video market. Companies like Clear Channel control everything, and they are not using their power to benefit artists or consumers."

Gephardt: "Artists have always been disorganized. you're always isolated, you're always on tour or whatever...you don't have the organizing ability of five giant corporations. I'm not being critical of them. They have their interests and they play an important role in our society. But they don't share your views on lots of issues. If you don't come together, as you are doing, then you have no voice. You have no way to be heard to insert yourself in F R O N T

G



anything to make it better for you and your colleagues. I admire you for doing this. I think it's the right thing to do."

Conyers: "The fight is raging over licensing payments for artists when their music is played on an Internet radio station or a wholly owned record-company monopoly service like **Pressplay**. The record companies gave lip service to artists' rights during the **Napster** fight. They claimed to oppose Napster because artists weren't getting a dime. Now that they have their own Internet music services, they have changed their tunes. They are trying to set up a system where artists only get 9% of revenues, by calling it a 'royalty,' instead of the 50/50 payment they deserve."

Kwatinetz: "Instead of getting involved when specific issues seem to have greater than usual consequences, the artist community must be involved over time and committed for the long haul. Some actions will have dramatic impact. Yet others may only spur gradual changes. Either way, the artist community, to

be effective, must consistently, through action, show that it cares enough to stay involved. Those who profit off the product of our artists will not let up. The RI-AA will not let up. Neither should we."

Conyers: "It is clear to everyone in Congress now, not just those of us who've been following the music industry for years, that the record companies don't always speak for the musicians. Let me be unequivocal: We must place reasonable limits on the length of recording contracts. Too many artists have been forced into contracts for 10, 15 or 20 albums that tie them to one label for decades—nothing could stifle creativity more than that. This

would literally tie an artist to a label for life, otherwise known as 'indentured servitude.' If Sen. Murray is successful in repealing the exemption, the labels have threatened to simply shift these contracts to other states. That is why I am planning to introduce legislation that provide federal standards as a backstop and help us avoid a race to the bottom between the states."



THE MORE, THE MURRAY-ER

While California Sen. Kevin Murray did not speak at this week's Democratic fundraiser at The Firm, he did give us the following update on a number of relevant issues:

Can you update us on the potential for compromise? Has this issue advanced at all in terms of the two sides coming together?

No, it hasn't, really. There are various people talking about various things, but certainly nothing concrete in the way of a compromise has been moved forward.

Is it still your goal to pass SB 1246 as it stands? Yes, I am clearly pushing to pass it as it is.

Has the issue of "tacking," or the resetting of the seven-year clock when a deal is renegotiated, been raised with you at this point?

Yes. I think that everybody on both sides has used that as a potential meeting place. But even that is bogged down in how you define what it is. How do you define when it's a new contract? Frankly, it's a valid theory, it's just ambiguous in terms of where the parties are now.

Why won't anyone from any of the record companies go on the record about this issue? Some say it's their fear of alienating artists, others say its arrogance.

I think the latter. With very few exceptions, none of them have called me, either. Usually, when things go wrong in the entertainment business, somebody says, hey, let's sit down and work this out. I think [the record companies'] arrogance has prevented them from doing that.

Do you interpret their silence as a presumption that they will win and that 1246 will not be passed?

I don't see, given the current climate, given the fact that the international AFL-

CIO has weighed in on the artist side, how anyone could come up with the assumption that they're going to win. I mean, it's a fight and things happen—you could win, you could lose—I don't know how anybody could come up with the conclusion that it's a slam dunk.

And you know, the idea of them angering artists is one thing, but think about how much good will the record companies could engender for themselves with artists if one of them stepped forward and said, "We don't want to be fighting with artists—let's work this out." Would not every artist say, "God, that's a forward thinking record executive who cares about artists"? But they haven't said that. Instead, they've had a very adversarial position.

Another thing is, they're vulnerable on so many issues. I get e-mail virtually every day from someone else saying, "Hey, good work on what you're doing, but have you looked at this?" It seems to me that the record companies would have a vested interest—and I'm not expecting anybody to just roll over here—in stepping forward and talking to the press, to at least try to explain their position so that they don't seem like bad guys.

Rep. Gephardt has been called "intellectually correct" rather than merely politically expedient. Is this your approach as well?

I want to find the best possible solution, and I don't disagree that compromise is often the best possible solution. But this is also a game of posturing and leverage, and pretty much everybody understands that. The event at The Firm this week was, frankly, the result of Jeff [Kwatinetz] really twisting arms and dragging people, kicking and screaming sometimes, to the party. But once they're there, they get it. The best thing is that the artists now have a voice.

The mere mention of the man's name conjures up images of Hans Brinker and wooden shoes...not to mention dykes and hash bars.





Q1-Q2 is a time when new projects are launched and year-end releases that were initially overshadowed by superstand albums get reloaded. A shining example is **WB**'s **Linkin Park**, which came out in October 2000 and broke through big-time during the first six months of 2001. The band wound up with the best-selling album of last year—not bad for an act

ou already know that cable and satellite service Music Choice—which reaches into some 28 million homes with 40-plus music channels, a concert series and more—is an increasingly substantial piece of the puzzle when it comes to targeted impressions for your records. Shouldn't it be a part of your promotion plan? Just because it doesn't have an on-air vocal presence, MC has been segregated from labels' radio campaigns. But with their commercialfree, demo-dicing formats (Classic Country, R&B Hits or Boleros, anyone?) and on-screen info menus, Music Choice has shown it can scratch music fans' itches in places commercial radio often can't reach via the same spigot that dispenses their TV shows. This captive audience isn't just exposed to new (and favorite) music; CDs can be purchased directly. thanks to a brand-new distribution/fulfillment deal with Alliance. What's more, MC tracks sales in the markets it services, and guess what? They've achieved impact not only with plays and the concerts themselves, but with impressions from an average of 175 30-second spots promoting the concert series up and down cable and satellite dials and elsewhere. The concerts themselves are 60-minute video extravaganzas mixing established acts (the Cranberries are up next, 2/25-3/10) and up-and-comers. "It's an important vehicle to us, so we can show we can help sales," proclaims CEO Dave Del Beccaro, "and besides the concert itself, the promotion related to the concert raises awareness—cable, radio and exposure on MC itself. The more useful we are to the music industry, the more helpful that is for us in the long term." Del Beccaro also points out that MC doesn't bend the performers to some TV-production template. "Unlike

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he Copyright Arbitration Royalty Panel (CARP) has spoken regarding rates for Internet radio. The per-Performance Fee for webcasters and commercial broadcasters is .07 cents for simulcasts of offline broadcasts and .14 cents for "all other Internet transmissions." The ephemeral license fee is set at 9% of Performance Fees due. The minimum fee is \$500 per license. Meanwhile, the U.S. Copyright Office has proposed stringent rules on data reporting for streamed programming—which is what recordbiz reps had wanted... Sirius, XM and ASCAP have entered into a licensing pact... The U.S. Supreme Court has agreed to hear a challenge to the Copyright Term Extension Act of 1998... The 30-day break in the Napster case is over with no settlement. Judge Patel's noises about investigating industry control and alleged "misuse" of copyrights have journos smelling blood as the parties return to court... Digital media company SightSound's claim to patents on the vending of audio and video downloads on the Net got a boost last week in its claim against CDNow and N2K. A federal magistrate swatted down CDNow's argument that since the patent only referred to "telecommunications networks," online activity was exempted—meaning the case can now go to trial. SightSound recently reached out to MusicNet and Pressplay... RealNetworks plans to offer software to let wireless carriers stream media to portable devices ... 

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NEAR TRUTHS

Insiders saying Jeff Kwatinetz's Democratic fundraiser this week, which added \$300k to the Dems' Congressional Committee war chest, coupled with the expected \$1 million to be raised by the RAC concerts prior to the Grammys next week, will serve to raise the price of poker being played in both Sacramento and Washington, as issues raised by RAC and State Sen. Kevin Murray appear increasingly on federal legislators' radars, including those of a saber-rattling Rep. John Convers and Speaker of the House hopeful Dick Gephardt, both of whom spoke at the Kwatinetz shindig. Talk that the lack of public response from high-level Big Five officials has created a press vacuum on the label side, even as the avalanche of coverage of artist concerns continues—with some even saying a visible boycott of the Grammys next week is being tossed around by artists and their reps. Insiders saying this imbalance is contributing to some execs rethinking their hard-line positions. Has friction among the RIAA's Executive Committee increased to the point that one or more member



companies are considering breaking ranks?... Another possible Big Five flashpoint is the Dixie Chicks' fraudulent-accounting suit against Sony. Were they to be signed by another RIAA-member label, tongues wagging that the Chicks would be willing to indemnify said label. No leap of logic to see such moves could further erode the sometimes tenuous relationships that have held the RIAA together... And speaking of free agency, Fleetwood Mac, whose last album sold north of 5 million, are said to be taking their next album to a non-WMG label for \$8-10 million. What about Stevie Nicks, who's still tied to Warner? Will the deal end up back inside WMG, or could the Mac go Nickless?... Despite researcher John Coleman's study indicating that Mariah Carey has confused her fan base, lips flapping that a deal between M.C. and one label frontrunner appears imminent, with a likely guarantee of less than \$5 million per album... Meanwhile, EMI brass said to be trying to avoid scuttling another artist deal as execs attempt to win back Robbie Williams, whose deal has reportedly lapsed. Williams, whose last album sold over 5 million, has been making the rounds in L.A., proclaiming himself free to walk. Action to come... Many wondering if Mike Greene's teflon coat will continue to hold up against next week's inevitable installment of "Kill Mike Greene" in the Los Angeles Times. What will this year's theme be? Names in the Rumor Mill: Jay Cooper, Irving Azoff, John Branca, Jim Guerinot, Howard Kaufman, Jerry Blair and

Nancy Berry.

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o think that it was only a year ago I was at the W Hotel in L.A. at a small, discrete J Records showcase for a new talent. This young chick with braids came out, in front of what had to be no more than 25 folks, and sat behind a keyboard. From the very first note she hit to the last, she made love to that room—she blew everyone away. Her mom was chillin'; on the side of the stage, and I just remember the glow on this woman's face. There was so much love, warmth and pride in it. I've seen that very same glow in Alicia's face ever since. This young, beautiful talent has grown, in such a short time, into one of the music industry's leading ladies. Her music is timeless. Her style is transcendent. Her passion is exuberant. So it's a year later, and Miss Thing not only has two hit singles under her belt and has sold over 4 million copies of Songs In A Minor, but has also grabbed six Grammy nominations. I just had to catch up to find out where her head's at, 'cause I can't imagine what it must be like to be her right now. (Actually, I'm lying. I really just wanted to know what she was planning to wear.) Because she's such a class act, she took time out in the middle of her tour to call me. (Actually, she really just wanted me to stop torturing her label.)

Where were you when you found out about your Grammy nominations?

In the car on the way to rehearsal, talking to my brother on the phone. Just talking stuff. A call came in and I was ignoring it. I was trying to talk to my brother 'cause I hadn't talked to him in so long. I checked my messages and it was Mr. Davis telling me about the whole rundown. And I was like... OH! It was kind of crazy. It was really hot to find out.

Did you ever imagine you would be where you are today?

I definitely had confidence that, if you work hard and follow your heart, you will get to where you want to be. I can't say I thought it would happen this quickly; the album just dropped in June.

You just blew the fuck up. What is the biggest surprise for you this past year?

This is all one big surprise. Every different situation has been its own. From back to the first Clive pre-Grammy party, to the Oprah show, to Prince showing love... Being on my own tour now, opening up for Maxwell. I mean, it's been one damn big bangin' surprise. But backed with hard work.

Have you started writing material for the next album?

Oh, definitely. I've been doing that since before the album. Right now it's all about finishing the first half of the tour. Then I'm going to sit down for two months and get the songs out. And have a really great time doing it.

Where do you get your inspiration? Your records are so deep and have so much behind them.

Thank you. It just happens to be the way things affect me, whether it's my own personal experience or experiences from those that I am close to and can relate to. But it's definitely a life-drawing thing. Just how I sit back and look at things... Or if I'm having a conversation with someone and I'm like, "Oh my gosh, that's true." Or when I'm watching TV. In the car. On a train. It just comes from living.

Is everything that's happening what you imagined it would be?

I don't quite know. I mean, you have your little fantasies, or whatever, but it is definitely more involved than any of my fantasies.

Just involved in the sense of what goes into it. You don't quite think of everything that goes into the end result when you're fantasizing...the differ-



ent situations, the personalities of people, politics or whatever. It's definitely figuring how you deal with each situation as it comes.

What are you going to wear to the Grammys?

Oooooh, you better wait and see; it's going to be crazy! I love it! Give me a hint.

I can't.

Who's your stylist?

I work with Patty Wilson and she's the bomb. But from the hair and the clothes, it's definitely going to be something. Let's say...drama.

How is it compared to what you wore at the AMAs?

That was a little drama. But I can't even describe it. Let's just say fun. That's kinda what it's gonna be.

Who are you going with?

My crew. My family. The people who have helped me and gave their blood, sweat and tears every day. My manager, of course, and my partners who did the album with me. My moms, definitely. I tried to get grandma to come, but she is like, "You know, I just want to cry at home watching the TV." She will be with me in spirit. It's definitely going to be a great evening.

Have you met India. Arie? Do you feel any competition with her? Yes, I have met her. No, I feel kind of a kinship actually. We were able to do two or three interviews together and I've never really done that before. But it was a wonderful experience. To watch her go though the process—she is such an inspirational, strong woman. It

Who impresses you the most as an artist amongst your contemporaries?

I have to say Jill Scott and Lauryn Hill. Two people who really have a spirituality to them. They are definitely grounded and wise.

Was Prince a big influence in your musical style?

Definitely musically and maybe more so lyrically, and stylistically as well. **How about other influences?**

There's so many. Everybody from Donnie Hathaway, Stevie Wonder, Nina Simone, Aretha Franklin, Curtis Mayfield, Isaac Hayes, Alanis Morissette, U2, Nirvana, Beethoven, Chopin. A little bit of everybody.

I keep going back to the fact that you are so young but at the same time seasoned. We went to the same high school, right? The High School of Performing Arts?

Yeah, but you went to LaGuardia. And I went to a different version of LaGuardia. It was on 48th Street. It was called Professional Performing Arts.

What is the one thing about you that would surprise people if they knew?

Ummm...let's see. I wear the ugliest boots on the bus, but they're warm. They're like slippers. They look the worst. Everyone calls them "moon boots." I feel like an idiot, but they're so comfortable and you just chill out in them.

Thanks for calling, girl. I know it's been hectic with the tour and all.

was just really cool to be able to get to know her in that way. She's great. I'm so proud of her and all that she has done. I don't feel any of that competitive garbage. As a matter of fact, the first time I met her was at HITS.

That's right. I have a picture of that.

Are you going to thank God or Clive Davis first in your acceptance speech?

Oh, now you know it's God first, of course. I mean, you know, Mr. Davis has put in so much work, experience and knowledge. And so has my manager, Jeff Robinson. But it's all nothing without God.

Is there a particular category you would like to win?

Kind of, but, whatever. It's not even that big of a deal. I'm kind of leaning towards Song of the Year, if I had to choose. If I could even choose, which I can't. But that would be something special to me.

How do you feel about being put in the "neosoul" category?

I'm not big on categories 'cause I feel it puts you in a box. I'm all about breaking out the box. But it sounds good. It has a nice ring to it.

What was your inspiration for "Fallin"?

Life and the relationships that I was experiencing at the time, with my mother and my man especially. Just that back and forth thing that goes down in everything you care about.

Was it always the choice for the first single?

No, actually it was going to be "Girlfriend." We were kind of feeling that. But "Fallin" made such an impact when we would play it, so we said, "Why not? It says it all." I'm happy we did that.

Thank you Liz. It's all good and I'm sure I will see you again soon. Thanks for the flowers again. That was really nice.

You're so welcome. Did you do anything special for your birthday? I was doing a show and we just started partying on-stage. I had this after thing... We rented out this nice spot in Philly. We hung out and it was really, really special

National Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences for the past 14 years, is on a mission from God—to deliver the message of music to the masses.

Under Greene's watch, the **Grammy Awards** have grown in stature to become the world's premier music event. He has led the growth of the Academy's membership from 3,200 to more than 20,000 music industry professionals. In addition, he's expanded the Academy into 12 regional offices. The Latin Recording Academy, with its own awards ceremony, currently has an office in Miami and will soon be expanding into Europe.

Along the way, however, Greene has come under frequent attack. A hot-button target of criticism, the embattled NARAS honcho has had to defend his business practices, his salary, harassment charges, threats of lawsuits and allegations of self-righteousness, only to emerge unscathed.

Of course, he emerged far from unscathed after this conversation with **HITS'** resident gadfly **Marc** "Chuck Philips Couldn't Wear His Jock Strap" **Pollack**.

Since you've taken charge at NARAS, it's reasonable to say that you have put the Grammy Awards on a par with the Academy Awards in

terms of universal appeal.

We had five employees when I came in 1987, and we have significantly grown since then. The Awards structure is something that is now at least reflective of what's going on. I was on the phone with [Island Def Jam CEO] Lyor Cohen yesterday and I said, "Do you remember years ago, you and I were talking about how there's no way that DMX was going to get a nomination?" Today, we're sitting here with OutKast scoring two major nominations, DMX is in, Jay-Z is in. We had 3,000 members then and now we have 20,000. We have to do a better job at being the destination for people to come to with their issues. I don't care if it's advocacy, seven-year personal services rules, work for hire or intellectual property protection. People need to feel like they

Are you always completely comfortable with the decisions that the nominating committee makes?

No, God no. It's a contentious bunch of people. I would have it no other way. I'll get 10 calls from label people today and they'll all be pissed. If I'm an artist, I want my label person—whether it's an A&R director or chairman or whatever—to have that passion. That is something that the nominating committee needs. They need to have different points of view, to bring different experiences to the table. I basically sit up there as a kind of traffic cop. And we don't take the final votes publicly. What happens is, we narrow a few things down, but we end up with like eight, nine or 10 nominees and then everybody has their individual ballots and votes.

So you have nothing to do with the final selections.

I know people think that I sit there with this long cat o' nine tails, but it's not

can come to this organization and have a voice.

How relevant are the Grammys?

I think they're relevant, but my three sons—22, 18 and 16—who are all musicians, think they're stupid. I did an Access Hollywood interview last week, and they asked me, "What is the one recording you thought should have been nominated this year, but wasn't?" And I said the new Rufus Wainwright album. It's a great record by a young kid, ahead of the pack. But it's tough for a smaller artist or a smaller record company to squirrel their way into prominence within the Awards structure. We still need to work on that. Two years ago, we went to online balloting. Next year, we're going to go to online voting. If you're a voting member, I want you to be able to get on the web, click on every recording and hear it with decent audio quality; something that's better than an MP3.

The truth is, a lot of people don't even listen to the nominated songs, but vote for the names they recognize.

It happens, especially in the big four categories. I introduced the national nominating committee meeting structures four years ago and I'll tell you the best example of how this thing works. I chair the committee which oversees the Album of the Year, Record of the Year, Song of the Year and New Artist categories. We take the 20 top vote-getters from membership and by God, they're going to listen to all of them! This year, a lot of people asked, "How did India.Arie get four nominations?" Well, it's simple: She came out very high up with the membership. In our group, it's shut up and sit back because we're going to play Bob Dylan, Radiohead, Alicia Keys and all the rest. And having the opportunity to hear these things in their totality—you hear the production, the songs, the performances and the other qualities that push these records to the forefront of the nomination process.

true. I come from a rock background, so I love Bob Dylan's record. A lot of people in that room did not like that record. I love the organic nature of it. A lot of people in that room were saying, "That is the biggest piece of...." You know they discount a lot of the things I say totally out of hand.

Do you feel that you have to top yourself every year in terms of the show? It is very important that the public have a unique opportunity to see the big acts, like the U2s. In the midst of that, probably more important to me, is that we create opportunities for discovery. Our viewing public continues to get younger. We've quadrupled our 18-34 marketshare over the last six years. The public tunes in and they trust us. You don't see wild ratings swings in our show. You know, during my speech, there is a drop in viewership, but you really do see it building throughout the show. They want to see Shakira, Ricky Martin, Sinead O'Connor, Seal...but they also want to see brand-new artists that have never been anywhere else. One of the things I'm working on with Westwood One is the very first Grammy radio series. It's going to be a syndicated show. We have a working title, The Grammy Discovery Series. For example, Peter Gabriel will do an hour and play the seven most important new recordings that he has found, Or Paul Simon, Joni Mitchell, Bono... The idea is to have a celebrity shepherd the listeners through some new music. Because whether new music is on the Grammy Awards, or whether it's on the cesspool of radio that's out there now, there are very few ways to break new talent. When I was on the road, and afterwards, when I became a producer, I realized that a great song with a great performance and a great production, somehow or another, would always find a way for the public to access it. I don't think that's true anymore, and that is a terrible thing. It's part of the Academy's job, through the Internet, the Grammy show itself or a radio series, to work with the labels to get new music heard.



Will this be a banner year for the Grammys?

When I look at any year's nominations, I either get a sinking feeling or a wow feeling. There have been years in the past where I have had that sinking feeling. I'm a musician. I wake up as a songwriter, horn player, piano player, singer and I go to sleep that way. God put me in a spot to try to make things better for Mike the musician. This is a mission. When a songwriter or musician reads off what's in those envelopes, it's the scariest moment for me. When Jethro Tull won the best hard rock/metal Grammy, that was probably the low point in my career. I looked up and said, "Is flute metal?" This year, I won't have to bullshit myself. The nominees this year, like India.Arie, Alicia Keys, Stevie Nicks, Bob Dylan—these are songwriters. And a singer-songwriter, as long as they're true to themselves, can retain their fans for 50 years. Bob Dylan will have his fans for a lifetime.

Let's talk about Alicia Keys not getting a nomination in the Album category.

You know, it's hard. She was on the final ballot and you never really know what goes through people's minds. Most in the industry would say that she should have been there instead of India.Arie. Sit down with the two records and forget the hype, the numbers and the rest of it and just listen to the songs. Our folks are producers, engineers, songwriters and musicians; they don't care about the hype. They listen to the record. From an industry perception—certainly from Clive Davis' point of view, Alicia Keys should be in the Album of the Year category instead of India.Arie. From the committee's perspective, they listened to two albums back-to-back and made their choice. That's the way it works. What the industry responds to is often quite different from what a musician responds to.

You brought back Jon Stewart as Grammy host. Were there any other candidates considered?

We screwed Jon last year. Whoopie was down. She was in the Green Room and had a medical issue about two weeks before the show and we called Jon and said, "We need you to do this." And he came in and proved such a damn trouper! He was wonderful on the show, but he can be spectacular. We wanted to show him a vote of confidence by giving him time to prepare. We had Billy Crystal for three years. He's great, but he graduated to the Oscars. I truly believe Jon has the same capacity and the same reverence for the music. He's a fan. We've had some hosts that weren't music fans and you could tell. I'm optimistic that Jon might be around for awhile.

Do you think the Dick Clark lawsuit was a publicity stunt for the AMAs? Why would he sue me personally? He didn't want to piss off Michael Jackson. He didn't want to piss off CBS. He didn't want to piss off the Academy. so, in order to try to get AMA ratings up, he figured he'd sue me personally. There's no question I have been very specific over the years about how our industry needs a November show to drive sales towards the holidays. We've been trying to get him out of our face for years. The fact is, when I came in, the AMAs were cleaning the Grammys' clock, and now we're cleaning theirs. His ratings weren't even as good this year as they were last year. We will work this out because I'm a fan of anything that puts music on television for the public. My job, and it's very clearly delineated in our agreement with CBS, is to deliver a unique television special. This year, we have 987 individual nominees and I have less than 20 performance slots. Why would you present anything that was on TV a few weeks before with that kind of selection? It doesn't make sense. But you know, it's not just the AMAs, it's the People's Choice, it's anything that's on that month before the show. We have to be very, very circumspect and we are.

There has been some criticism that there are too many categories.


I don't think you can ever get it completely right in music. God didn't intend to have artists compete; it's a pretty silly concept. But since we do, we have an Awards nominations committee, which meets in April. The dance community lobbied this organization for five years back in the early '90s. It's our job to decide, how do you delineate a dance recording from a pop recording? Once we get to that point, we have a screening committee and then the membership votes on whether to add the category. You have to be open to new trends; once they stabilize, they need to be looked at. The biggest mistake the Academy ever made occurred before I was President. I told them, "We have to recognize hard rock and metal." So we added the category. Unfortunately, we didn't have a corresponding membership in that community. Which is how Jethro Tull ended up winning. And that turned out to be a great wake-up call for us.

With all the media attention you've received, how do you stay focused on the job?

Well, you have to know the truth about yourself, which changes everyday. As a leader, my obligation is not only to the 150 people that work for me, but also to the entire membership. They look into my eyes. I mean, I'm a hood ornament and I don't care if it's a Bentley hood ornament, it's going to have bugs on it, because it's out in front. And there's nothing you can do about

that. There's a book I've read, Lincoln On Leadership. Lincoln had a very interesting way of dealing. Imagine his position during the Civil War. He had people shooting at him! But he had a great cautionary policy, which was, never read your good press or your bad press. I haven't read any of Chuck Philips' articles. I don't read the good articles, either. I have a communications department that points out, with our legal counsel, anything in the press they think I need to deal with. And I look at it in the same way that I would look at a lawsuit with a Taiwanese company using the Grammy name, or whatever. And you have to realize that there are people who don't like you and never will. But the people who like you, the ones who are your friends, already know the truth about vou. It's really the folks in the middle who aren't quite sure—and with me, there's nobody in the middle. The people who love me will burn down a city for me. The people who hate me would love to see me in a major car accident. This company has had one lawsuit in the 13 years I've been here, and that didn't have anything to do with me. The difference is, anytime I jaywalk. I've got a guy at the L.A. Times on a vendetta, who wants to turn it into, "And while jaywalking, sources say, Michael Greene threw down four school children!" And the fact is, that can't influence the mission. The mission is either burning inside of you everyday. or the outside noise distracts you to the point that you lose focus, And our mission is a lot louder than the noise.

NEVER GONNA STOP: Although I'd love to see you and partake in rewarding activities like multi-label dinners, awards banquets, meaningful late-night conversations with drunk radio programmers and reliving the feeling of not being in the "cool clique," I won't be attending this year's possibly final **Gavin Convention.** Inspired by the **White Stripes** video for "Fell In Love With A Gir," I'll be sending a Lego replica of myself. **Erika**, however, will be there in all of her three-dimensional magnificence, "representing" at the **Moth, Tenacious D** and **Elbow** shows, which you'll try to fit in between lap dances at **Mitchell**

Bros. I can't believe I'm missing it!.... Despite the PMS, whining, bloat and daily panic attacks, sometimes it's fun to be me. Whether it's playing hooky from deadline last Tuesday to see Pete Yorn, Jimmy Eat World (who rule), Lit and Default play at 99X's Fat Tuesday show, spending Sunday night at a sold-out Jack Johnson show with 1500 kids who knew the words to every song, calling Chris Carabba from Dashboard Confessional because I heard he's a big Phantom Planet fan, or meeting Willie Nelson (on his bus!), and telling him that "Angel Flying

Too Close to the Ground" is one of the greatest songs of all time, I never take these opportunities for granted. There's enormous joy in watching your friends and proteges pull in week-defining adds, fr'instance WBCN adding Pete Yorn's "Strange Condition;" KROX adding Phantom Planet's "California"; MTV adding Dashboard Confessional's "Screaming Infidelities" video; KROQ, WHFS, WBCN, WZZN, CIMX and WOXY adding the White Stripes; KTBZ and a dozen more Jack Johnson adds; and 91X, KMYZ and WAVF adding Starsailor's "Good Souls," each achievement eliciting cheers from the HITS squad and a volley of congratulatory IMs.... From our bird's-eye perch, we watch hit records unfold, occasionally coaxing our peers off the nearby ledge when there's an unforeseen hiccup—a spate of bad research, an unfulfilled commitment, a band with a sudden aversion to flying (and they're headlining your show tomorrow night) and other sleep-crushing events that send us reeling. Remaining focused on the goal is critical. It's what has enabled Shannah Miller at Arista to vault Adema's "The Way You Like It" to Top 20 PoMo and Active, with the album selling nearly 15k this week! A great call-out story is emerging as well—already Top 10 at WXTM, WPBZ and KXTE. Before you know it, the Adema album will be GOLD and Arista will have broken a rock band!..... While you were watching Men's Curling (not a sport), Steve Leeds and Howard Leon were causing a seismic shift in what's considered "PoMo" with every new Jack Johnson add. "Flake" has already been a massive hit at 91X, KPOI, KCNL and WAVF, and now it's spreading to land-locked regions. Album sales exceed 10k this week, with the benefit of only a smattering of airplay. Jack Johnson is a special artist. His fan base is genuine, constantly growing through touring, Internet word-of-mouth and creating a sense of "community" among his fans. His audience looks like yours, but to insist he appear on your radio station's festival before you add the record is to miss an enormous opportunity. Rather, I'd be doing everything I possibly could to be the "presenting" station when Jack comes into your market. Send your street team to the show to learn how marketing is done at the true "street" level. Follow it up with a "field trip" to see Dashboard Confessional. Can the fervent passion these artists inspire in their fans be translated to your radio station? Can you make your audience care as deeply about what you do? It's a goal worth pursuing.... In addition to these "flavor" records, PoMo programmers are searching for big smash ROCK records. Rob Zombie's "Never Gonna Stop" certainly fits the bill—name recognition, immediate phones, explosive sales, a sold-out tour, all leading up to new adds this week from KROQ, KEDJ, WXZZ and KNRQ. Looking for another hit? Follow the lead of our friends at WNFZ, KCXX, WSRM, KPOI and KROX, who added Drowning Pool's "Tear Away" this week. Not quite sated? Columbia has a three-pronged approach to filling your ROCK needs: System Of A Down's latest smash, "Toxicity," Lostprophets' "Shinobi vs. Dragon Ninja" (new this week at 99X, WBJX and more) and Quarashi's "Stick 'Em Up" (more early adds from Q101 and KMYZ). Rob Goldklang has a secret weapon up his sleeve—it's called Earshot. 99X PD Chris Williams has been screaming about "Get Away" since he first heard the single to anyone in, uh, ear shot. 99X, WXTM, WMRQ, WMFS and WPLA came in with early adds this week. Will you be next?.... Former WJBX MD Lance Hale is the new PD at WLRS. We hail him... It doesn't take a genius to recognize the brilliance of Andrew W.K.'s "Party Hard," although we'd never accuse James VanOsdol of being anything but. MTV added the video this week; your add will soon follow.... SONG TO HEAR: Moby's "We Are All Made of Stars"..... PEOPLE TO WATCH: Todd Sievers, Dennis Blair, Gaby Skolenk, JJ Grossman, Matt Pollack and Kris Metzdorf.



Remember when you thought a CD was the newest and the greatest? Not to make you feel old, but that was roughly 20 years ago. Although the CD represents a digital master of a recording, it uses dated technology. A new era of audio has emerged in the form of DVD-Audio (DVD-A) and Super Audio CD (SACD). Both formats offer much more storage capacity and better audio quality than the CD. The competing formats face a number of obstacles in their paths to mainstream consumer acceptance. DVD-A is represented by the more than 230 companies that make up the DVD Forum. The group (Pioneer, Toshiba and Sony) aims to harness the momentum created by the DVD-Video format. SACD (Sony and Philips), meanwhile, faces the bigger hurdle of not only introducing an unfamiliar format but also the hardware needed to play SACD media. But don't expect Sony to be left behind again, as it was with BetaMax.



HOW MUCH MUST I LIVE THROUGH? Home Town Hero came by the asylum for a hang last week. Yes, I did write about them last year. Yes, I'm still addicted to their album and I know they'll be huge. But I didn't know most of them were in hardcore bands before they started writing these HUGE smashes. Wait till Gaby Skolnek or Raymond McGlamery send you this gem. Once you catch 'em live, you'll be an even bigger believer. Back to those two in a sec... Another band that splashed in this space in '01 is Earshot. WMFS' Rob Cressman and WZTA's Gregg Steele told me how amazing they were before I even heard them. When Rittberg played me "Get Away," the words "congratulations" and "home run" came out of my mouth. WAAF, WZTA, KUPD, WXTB, KRXQ, KXXR, WJRR and many others with great ears have already smacked it on their playlist weeks before the impact. Steele knows it's gonna be outta the park: "Earshot is an easy listen-watch the phones light up!" He also has them playing this year's Bonzai. Did you see that lineup? He has Kid Rock, Puddle Of Mudd, Rob Zombie, Sevendust, Kevin Martin (ex-Candlebox frontman with new band You), Adema, Local H, Custom, X-ecutioners, Apex Theory, Mesh STL, Gravity Kills, lostprophets, Fu Manchu, Headstrong and Course Of Nature on 4/26... Rittberg is also kicking ass with "Cold" from Static-X. Everyone is saying how awesome it sounds on the air, just as it does in Queen Of The Damned... 



These guys shred. And "Your Fool" is up to 33 spins on Columbus, OH, Modern Adult WBNS!... Response from the non-comm world to Ivan Neville's record, Saturday Morning Music, has been extremely positive. Commercial stations will get the Keb' Mo'-like"Lost Ball" in early March for adds on 3/18—right after Maui, where Ivan will perform. And trust me, the band is HOT... You've heard the hype before: "They're the next big Brit band!" "Mercury Prize nominees!" "They're better than Radiohead!" Just deal with it and make way for The Next Big Thing, No. 348,383. Meet Elbow.

Combining Coldplay's melancholy (and lovely organ turns), Pink Floyd's prog trippiness, the Beta Band's cool (and, of course, the obligatory Radiohead comparison), these five English mates met in college in the early '90s and have stuck together ever since. While they may be poised to be the latest overnight success, it wasn't always so easy.

Signed to Island U.K. in 1998, the band was dropped within a year. Later linked to EMI, they exited within a couple of months. After finding a home for two successful EPs on Manchester-based independent label Uglyman, Elbow is now comfortably signed to V2 in the U.K. and U.S. The Stateside buzz began to build when imports of the domestically released *Asleep in the Back* began moving so strongly, the band was able to pop over to the U.S. for a brief tour late last year. With a proper U.S. club tour just begun, Elbow's ready to keep the good times rolling. Unfortunately, those good times stopped when HITS' "*Dr.*" J.R. Griffin tried to tickle Elbow frontman Guy Garvey's funnybone.

You've been together for 10 years with the same guys. Why is it clicking now?

We were shit for years—we were crap live. It was terrible. We kept doing what we did and got better and better and better. The reason it was so fucked up before is that we listened to record scouts, took their advice and thought, "Well, if we compromise to get the deal, then we can do what we want." And that doesn't happen. If you're serious about your stuff, you make your noise and wait for them to come calling.

Was there ever a point when you wanted to give up?

We used to say, "We'll give it until March." I'm not sure why it was March, but maybe as we were approaching the end of the year, we had the mark of time passing. So we'd say, "Four more months and that's it." But by the time March came along, we'd have a new gig booked, or we'd have a demo or we'd have written a new song. And that kept us moving.

Did your Mercury Prize nomination affect things?

We found out that the judges actually wanted joint winners for the first year. And that the panelists were arguing over us and [winner] PJ Harvey. That's a huge compliment. The Mercury Prize has led me to some great music that I otherwise would not have heard, because I don't read music mags. So to be included on a list next to people who directly influenced the album—like Polly Harvey and Radiohead—it's fucking great.

You've dubbed the band "nu-prog"-and you're not kidding, right?

That's something very deliberate. "prog" has been such a dirty word for such a long time, for obvious reasons. It's self-indulgent by nature, it's all of this LSD-induced shit. But out of wild experimentation, you always break new ground. The prog movement is responsible for the way a lot of modern studio bands sound, and I didn't like the fact that people didn't admit it as an influence. Jonny Greenwood [from Radiohead] has listened to Yes an awful lot—but he won't admit it, because prog's such a filthy, dirty word. So I bet our keyboardist that I could single-handedly make prog a not-dirty word. And you wouldn't believe how many bands are admitting to it since. Our media-friendly soundbite—and feel free to use this—is: "We're prog, without the solos." And I won the bet; there are a few bands coming up as "nu-prog" now and I like that.

But for all of your prog-rockiness, the lyrics are pretty damn good, too.

I don't know. I'm not a naturally talented lyricist. It takes me an awfully long time—probably because I don't read enough. But all of my favorite music has very strong, honest lyrics. If I was to write something that sounded nice, but wasn't really about anything, I would be insulting my band. I can't let them down by writing half-assed lyrics. We work very hard on the music and trust each other with our work. That's how we've been together for the past 10 years. If everybody doesn't love it, it's vetoed, it's off. Everybody has to be happy with the final output.

Talk about the album title.

You develop a dialogue of words that people outside of the group don't understand. All musicians do that. I have a friend who talks about music in shape and color. He looks at it like a painting. Our band talks about journey and distance and room and there's a lot of geography involved. The album's called *Asleep in the Back* because of that feeling of comfort you get when you're a kid sleeping in the back of a car. My favorite records are the kind that have gotten me through the most troubled times. And we wanted to make a record that would do that.

The album sounds like it's about a woman.

It centers around one relationship I had—the big one. It's a sad and sordid tale and I fucked up things deliberately. Now, she has what she wants and I have what I want. And we're still good friends.

Has she heard the album?


Oh, yeah.

What does she think?

She loves it. There are parts she can't listen to, though. And I've asked her to not come to our shows. If I see her in the audience, I can't fucking perform. It'll fuck up the whole night.

Chris Isaak Always Got Tonight (Reprise): While he's never phoned it in, Isaak's Orbison-noir sound is so well-oiled, so much a part of him, that his music can come off as automatic if he doesn't challenge himself. The smooth operator has no such problem here on his eighth album—indeed, Isaak hasn't sounded this fiery since his self-titled second LP way

back in '86. The record works up a sweat on the title song and "Notice the Ring," but it's arching folk-rockers like first single "Let Me Down Easy," the yearning "Somebody to Love" and the ultra-hooky "Cool Love" that shape its heart. Isaak may be a one-trick pony, but it's still a neat trick. (B.S.)

Joey Ramone, *Don't Worry About Me* (Sanctuary): Through his Hall of Fame 25-year career with the Ramones—before his death from cancer last year—Joey was the mop-topped, gangly scarecrow heart behind the band's epic three-chord beat. His first-ever solo album is a bittersweet nod to his favorite pop epiphanies (Brill Building, surf music,



the Who and garage psychedeia), whether warbling about "What a Wonderful World" this is or his Valentine to CNBC financial reporter "Maria Bartiromo." When he rails, "Sitting in a hospital bed/I want my life... It really sucks," in "I Got Knocked Down (But I'll Get Up)," even non-fans will mourn the loss of one of rock's most dedicated followers. (R.T.)



Nitin Sawhney Prophesy V2: On his V2 debut, Sawney weaves a together a concept record that questions the human race's ever-increasing reliance on technology, using the world's music as his canvas. Elements of drum-n-bass and trip-hop are coiled around a South African choir, Indian strings, Brazilian melodies, acoustic quitars, the

London Community Gospel Choir, female vocals from Cheb Mami and Nina Miranda, plus spoken word bits from Nelson Mandela and a Chicago cab driver. Though a fairly mellow set, the Big-Beat feeling "Ripping Out Tears" uses crunchy guitars to raise the level of passion from questioning to lashing out. It's a hypnotic, intelligent and provoking work. (D.S.)

Brendan Benson Lapalco (Star Time): This exceptionally gifted power-popster's big-label debut a few years back may not have been the flavor of the moment, but it demonstrated huge gifts. On this confident follow-up, Benson once again collaborates with pop genius Jason Falkner (who co-wrote five tracks) and cultivates a typical-



ly eclectic musical vibe, whether turning out driving jangle-rock or wistful ballads. Our pick to click is the relentless, Beatlesque "Folk Singer," but you'll also dig the edgy bounce of "Good to Me," the swoony psychedelia of "Just Like Me" and the frenetically catchy "I'm Easy." (S.G.)

INTERESTING CONVERSATIONS: As you may or may not be aware, my fine employers here at this magazine actually pay me to do things most people would consider recreation. I go to concerts at some of the best venues in the country, listening parties at some of the finest clubs, dinners at the most exclusive restaurants, and on and on. Not a bad gig, huh? Then, the other thing I get paid to do, believe it or not, is talk on the phone all day with radio programmers and record promoters—some of whom have been friends of mine for over a decade. Our conversations are wide-ranging and usually cover many topics, not all of which have to do with the music business. Interestingly enough though, all last week while on the phone, music was the only thing folks wanted to speak about. It seemed that everybody had an exciting story to relay. Let me share some of them with you... It started during a chat with new KBOS MD Pattie Moreno. She is completely fired up about Val and Gary's Corey record. It seems that "Hush Lil' Lady" was a winner on their battle for five consecutive nights and is now proceeding to absolutely blow up their phones—so much so that the reaction resulted in an add this week. There's also a good feeling about this record in the halls of KBBT in San Antonio, where JD Gonzalez was quick to point out that he is picking up a very nice street vibe on this project. Look out for this one, as the stories continue to roll in. Also gotta tell you how much I love Motown's new Raphael Saadiq/D'Angelo jam, "Be Here." Great song. And speaking of great songs, how 'bout the recent re-explosion of the India. Arie record, now sporting a four-week sales trend of #83 to #74 to #53 to #43. Hmmmm—think "Video" was/is a hit?... Later, I was talking with J's Michael Williams, who was predicting a huge impact week for the new Busta Rhymes track. Happy to report that his crystal ball was right on the money, as "Pass the Courvoisier" is far and away this week's Most Added record. Congrats to the J crew for swimming in alphabet soup, as WJMH, WLLD, KBMB, KXJM, WWKX, KMEL, WBTS and a zillion more come to the party. Add to that terrific early support from radio at WXYV (43x), HOT 97 (22x), 92Q (23x) and KPWR (17x), a great video, and an album that's nearly Platinum already, and this sure feels like another winner for Busta... I also have to tell you about what happened to my friend Steve Kicklighter at KYWL Spokane. He called me a week or so ago and asked me to send him the B2K record. I did, and now, just a week later, he's back on my phone screaming that "Uh Huh" is already Top Five in requests! Yes, the song is that reactive, and also hit #1 on TRL for a few days last week. Can you say, "missed one"? The good news is that it's never too late to go back and play a hit record—just ask WJHM and WWKX, who added it this week. Maybe you should do the same. And while we're on the topic of Epic records that are catching fire, let's not forget Glenn Lewis—a track that picks up great new adds this week at KYLD, KZZP, WEZB, KPRR and others, and is also generating major phone action at WZMX, KQBT, KBMB and KXJM. Can't wait to see his showcase in a few days (weekly obligatory gay reference—because, hello, he is fine!). Thanks to Mike Lieberman for the hook-up... Unquestionably the biggest buzz record during my almost completely musical conversations with radio over the past week or so has to be "Rainy Days" from Mary and Ja Rule. Folks singing the praises of this song include Brian Wallace, Mark McCray, Robb Royale, Tommy Del Rio and on and on. Johnny Coppola is very happy—and well in front of his official impact date of March 4. Johnny's got some action on the dance front at MCA, too, as Funky Green Dogs picks up an early add at WPYM Miami, and DJ Encore finds its way onto the air at WKTU... While we're on the subject of dance/pop, I must remind you one more time about how big Capitol's Kylie Minogue record has become. PDs that can play it now are. It's currently just outside the Top 10 at Rhythm, and the CD looks like it's going to move well over 100K units in its first week. And most everyone thought I was on crack when I started talking about this song last October... Finally, wrapping up my recap of last week's musical calls, I also have to congratulate Whited, Samson and the ArtistDirect crew. They were anticipating, and delivered, a Most Added week on No Good. "Ballin' Boy" picks up new airplay at KDGS, KXME, KXHT, KSEQ and others, and there's already good support at radio for the jam at KQBT, WPOW and KBBT—watch it grow from there... That's about it for now. Back to the phones, and back to the schmoozing. I lead such a tough life, no? Until next week—C-ya...



Lots of drama.

It was a case of "What's wrong with this picture." on 2/14 at the swanky Four Seasons Hotel, as the first West Coast Hip-Hop Summit went down, with "ghetto birds" and enough police manpower to make attendees and hotel guests think they were in South Central rather than Beverly Hills. With Nation of Islam leader the Honorable Minister Louis Farrakhan receiving top billing on a star-studded

dais that included Rush Communications honcho Russell Simmons, KKBT and KPWR L.A. morning men Steve Harvey and Big Boy, hip-hop activists Michael Concepcion and Davey D, the three-hour Summit was rocked by a verbal exchange between late-arriving Tha Row Records head Suge Knight and former Death Row Records artist Jewell. The purpose of the one-day summit, attended by approximately 500 of the West Coast's hip-hop elite, was to lay the groundwork for a national summit, tentatively scheduled for June. The first Summit, held last June 14 in NYC, sparked a number of initiatives, including a literacy program sponsored by Sean "P. Diddy" Combs. The undercard of the West Coast Summit, the much-anticipated meeting between producer Dr. Dre and Knight, failed to come off after Dre pulled a no-show. In his keynote address, Farrakhan focused on the hip-hop community's need to "accept the responsibility that God has bestowed upon you... You are the teacher, the second mother and father. You have to accept the responsibility to be something that feeds a mind, not destroys it." Farrakhan's hourplus speech was followed by comments including Davey D's Take your street hustle and turn it into a business hustle," and Big Boy's "I will be a channel for Bloods and Crips, as long as it's positive." Knight, who was scheduled to deliver the opening remarks, arrived nearly a half-hour after Farrakhan's speech concluded. Flanked by a 40-member entourage that included Mack 10 and Kurupt, Knight began promisingly, after pitching his "Gawtti" clothing line and Tha Row roster, with "We can't get into a cycle where we mess up our dollars," and "If we don't own or control lour musicl, we'll be out." Knight diverted from his focus with comments on gays and lesbians ("Men wanna be women and women wanna be men."), and East Coast hip-hoppers ("Where's P Diddy, Puff Daddy or whatever he calls himself nowadays?"). Simmons later pointed out that it was a West Coast summit. Things heated up when Jewell, from the back of the room, entered into a shouting match with Knight, saying cryptically, "I can't sit here and let the devil do his business," throwing the room into chaos for several minutes. Knight quickly wrapped up his comments, and Simmons and Ben Muhammad regained control by addressing key issues to be discussed at the upcoming national Summit, including political empowerment, the Sarah Jones First Amendment-rights controversy, the creation of political agendas via the formation of political action committees (PACs) and seminars on financial responsibility. Overall, despite the brief diversion, attendees expressed confidence that the June Summit will be positive. Co-organizer Minister Muhammad said, "If anyone thought that there wouldn't be any drama at a Hip-Hop Summit, then they don't know hip-hop.


Virgin Entertainment Group opened its long-awaited Boston location last Friday (2/15). As with any event hosted by Sir Richard Branson, hoopla was not in short supply. He rode in on a huge float, dressed as the Mad Hatter and flanked by the New England Patriot cheerleaders, eight-foot tall lobsters and models dressed as British Redcoats, while Pink's "Get The Party Started" blared over loudspeakers. Branson and CEO Glenn Ward had thrown a VIP party for 500 the night before, with V2's Heather Nova playing an acoustic set. Alien Ant Farm performed at the opening itself. Sr. VP Product & Mktg. N.A. Dave Alder says the newest of the chain's 22 stateside locations weighs in at some 40k sq. ft. spread over three floors. Interesting that the music department occupies the second and third floors, leaving the first floor to DVD, VHS and video games. Although it seems to be a statement about what formats are on the rise (and which are not), Alder says it was simply a decision to keep

Toronto is on deck, with negotiations ongoing to find the next U.S. site... As we surmised a few weeks ago, UMVD honcho Jim Urie has indeed upped the highly respected Mike Greene to Sr. VP Field Sales & Mktg., awarding him the entire national account base for the runaway marketshare leader. This follows on the heels of Curt Eddy's departure to head up sales at Hollywood Records. Greene and Eddy were splitting the national account base for UMVD... Alliance Entertainment has signed on provide CD fulfillment to Music Choice's satellite and cable TV channels. Music Choice launched a program last year that enables viewers to order CDs directly from their TV systems. Alliance will benefit from MC's impressive 22 million household reach... AFIM is hosting quite a few events at the upcoming NARM confab, including "The Indies Sound Off" Tuesday (3/12) at Golden Gate Hall. Using smoke, mirrors and a dash of blackmail, Newbury Comics exec Duncan Brown has convinced yours truly, Billboard's Ed Christman, CMJ's Marc Cope and Album Network's George Saadi to share the stage as "facilitators," meaning attendance is mandatory.





Consultant's Corner

Just when we thought that there's nothing more exciting than the Olympic sport of curling, along comes Radio Think Tank's Ken Anthony, who puts us on ice with "Making Current Music Decisions" before heating us back up with Zzzzz...

For my next piece in the illustrious Consultant's Corner, I'd like to write about a basic programming decision that programmer's deal with on a regular basis, but don't often break down to its essential

elements; making current music decisions. If your station plays current music, deciding what new music gets played is the ultimate programming challenge. This may ruffle the feathers of some of our record label friends, but I'm of the opinion that the charts and label priorities are the least important factors in making solid current music decisions for a radio station. There are three important factors involved in the process, and they're listed here in order of importance.

1. Gut/Station Sound: The first and most important decision about what current music to play on your radio station has to be based on gut. Having a "great ear" for finding new music isn't something you can train someone to have. A great music programmer has a knack for following their "gut" instincts in playing new music that will usually pique listener interest. The song needs to fit the sound of the station as well.

2. Callout Research: After a song has been on the radio for awhile, callout research is used to gauge the success. There are many intangibles involved in this process. What is the screening criteria for the listeners? Are you testing the right hook? How many times have you tested the same person before discarding their input? Some type of music research is necessary to support continued airplay of current music. Requests and sales are also important, but callout research is the most effective way of determining how well new music is performing because it deals with the 80% of your audience who never call a radio station with a request or buy a new CD.

3. The Charts and Record Labels: Beyond simple gut and callout research, charts and record label priorities are also important factors in helping programmers make current music decisions. The charts are based on spins, which are a good barometer of a song's success on other radio stations. A station's spins are usually based on their OWN positive callout research, sales and requests. A label's commitment to a new artist and song is another element in a programmer's decision to commit to a new track. A label that champions their artist with radio promotions like concert tieins, product, merchandise and other forms of non-traditional support sends a message to radio that this artist matters to the label. Label support also breeds confidence in a programmer's decision to step out on current music they have a gut feel for. Once the music is on the radio the audience ultimately approves or disapproves of the new music through callout research, requests, and sales.


