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


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
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THE "OTHER" BOSS







Valentine's Day Boosts Retail Overall, but Once Again It's All About 50 Cent, as Rapper Pumps Out...

hile this week's HITS Album chart is filled with sales prompted by Valentine's Day, the top slot is once again reserved for a guy who expresses his love by blowing away the competition.

Shady/Aftermath/Interscope rap sensation 50 Cent shot an arrow in the air, and it landed at #1, with remarkable second-week sales of 801k, a less than 1% drop from his huge opening, giving hiphop's newest superstar 1.6 million units moved in less than two weeks. Can you say "humongous"?



Chicago

Virgin Entertainment Group's Jerry Suarez can, but just barely: "Valentine's Day is traditionally a huge week for record sales, and this year proved to be no exception. The 50 Cent phenomenon continued virtually unabated. It's hard to recall a record that decreased so little in its second week of release."

Open Wide/Columbia/CRG's Dixie Chicks stayed at #2 with 161k and a 49% increase. Blue Note's Norah Jones (#3, +39%), Lava/Atlantic's Kid Rock (#4, +23%) and Epic/SMS's Chicago (#5, +55%) all topped 100k, collectively replacing chocolate, roses and Hallmark cards as this year's fave Valentine's Day gifts.

Debuting MCA Nashville cowboy George Strait (#6), Arista's Avril Lavigne (#7, +22%), Mercury/IDI's Shania Twain (#8, +57%), Epic's J.Lo (#9) and GM/Elektra's Missy Elliott (#10) rounded out the Top 10.

Just outside the Top 10, J Records' Rod Stewart (#11) and 143/Reprise boy crooner Josh Groban (#12) registered romantic sales gains of 79% and 90%, respectively.

Continued Suarez: "Almost everything was up from last week—not only some obvious titles like Dixie Chicks, Norah Jones and Chicago, but also Rod Stewart and Josh Groban."

MCA Nashville's Vince Gill (#13) and Aware/Columbia Grammy nominee John Mayer (#14) partially owed their high chart debuts to Cupid as well.

In all, 36 of the Top 50 boasted sales increases of 35% or more, notably Blackground/Universal's Aaliyah (#15, +48%), Capitol's Coldplay (#20, +39%), UTV's Elton John best-of (#32, +93%) and WB's Faith Hill (#35, +92%).

Here's looking forward to Mother's Day, Father's Day and Secretary's Day.

Zapin Is DreamWorks' Expanding Man

Ross "The Boss" Zapin has been tapped to oversee the combined Rock and Modern Rock promotion departments at DreamWorks Records, while continuing to look after the label's video promotion activities.

As part of his duties, he is now required to pick up the check if he invites **Howard Stern** to dinner for his birthday.

The appointment was announced by DreamWorks Records' "Herrrrree'sssss" Johnny Barbis, to whom Zapin reports.

Said Barbis: "Ross has done an outstanding job of raising awareness of our artists at radio. He's shown real leadership in not only getting songs played, but in looking after the overall development of artists' careers. Ross has worn two hats at Dream-Works for a while now, getting impressive results in both the radio and video arenas, so we have no doubt he will

excel in his increased responsibilities as head of our recently combined Rock and Modern Rock promotion efforts. He's every bit as articulate as Beetlejuice in pitching records to radio and TV."

The N.Y.-based Zapin will maintain his role as Dream-Works' chief liaison to MTV Networks and other major video outlets, insisting that VJ Martha Quinn always takes his calls.

Zapin formerly spearheaded the company's Modern Rock promotion efforts, in addition to his video promotion duties.

Zapin remarked: "I must thank Johnny Barbis for this tremendous opportunity to grow in my career at Dream-Works. He has shown the kind of support and creativity that you dream of in a boss—at most labels I'd never have the freedom to do all the things I've done on Johnny's watch. I'm also extremely grateful to my team members in the department, Matt

Smith and Jeff Gillis. These guys are critical in making sure we get the job done. [DreamWorks Records principal executive] Michael Ostin, too, has been very important in my forward movement at DreamWorks. He has shown great faith in my abilities from day one. With this incredible group working alongside me, I'm looking forward to major success for our artists in 2003. Now, can I get a Baba-booey!?"

Lisa Marie Presley is proving to be more than just a tabloid sensation, as the radio reception to "Lights Out," the first single from her eagerly awaited Capitol album, To Whom It May Concern, would have made her famous daddy proud.

It was the impetus of label President Andy Slater that put the project back in the fast lane after the singer was originally signed to Glen Ballard's Java label, distributed by Capitol at the time.

Slater said, at first, he couldn't "find the artist in the record," but immediately responded to Presley's lyrics. "She's not afraid to face the real issues of her life. When I met her, she radiated the kind of charisma it takes to be a successful recording artist. It was just a matter of finding the right context sonically. And I always loved the music of her father, Jerry Lee Lewis."

Elvis and Priscilla's little girl, who was 9 when her father died in 1977, apparently has enough talent to offset the tabloid headlines generated by her brief marriages to Michael Jackson and Nicolas Cage.

"Lights Out," produced by Slater, has scored several bigmarket adds since hitting radio Feb. 10, including N.Y.'s Z100 and WPLJ and L.A.'s KIIS and KYSR. The album lands at retail April 8.

Label Sr. VP Promotion Dan Hubbert donned his white spangled jumpsuit and raved about a recent promotour that took Lisa Marie to Atlanta, Boston, Dallas, Houston, L.A., N.Y. and S.F.: "We wanted to have her in the marketplace talking about the record, to introduce her to radio as an artist and songwriter. People realize this record can stand on its own."

The video was delivered to various outlets this week and

immediately added by VH1.

"Lights Out" deals directly with her legacy ("Someone turned the lights out there in Memphis/That's where my family's buried and gone"). Lisa Marie shows her sass in the expletive-charged rocker "S.O.B" ("I'm just a son of a bitch no matter what you say"). These two, along with "The Road Between" and "Nobody Noticed It," both dealing with romantic loss, make up the four-song sampler sent to media earlier this month with an EPK. Presley collaborated with producer Eric Rosse (Tori Amos), Slater, Ballard, Clif Magnes and first husband Danny Keough on the album.

"The record is about her and from her," says label product manager Sharon Lord. "When you talk to her, you can see who she is and what she's about. The next step is to have her play live."

Beer and Trakin Flap Their Lips, Drool, Blow Smoke

You wanna know who'll win big at Sunday night's Grammy Awards, don't you, Bunky? Who do you think we are, Mistress Cleo? But our lack of prescience and brain cells won't stop certain HITS staffers from foisting their opinions on you, our reader. Take it away, pinheads.

LENNY BEER: I want to deal with this whole issue of Norah Jones and whether there will be a sweep. Everyone's claiming that Bruce Springsteen will win Album of the Year. I'm a giant Springsteen fan, but if I had to take five Springsteen albums to a desert island, this wouldn't be one of them. I can see lifetime achievement victories, but not in a year when Norah Jones is so strong. Steely Dan and Bob Dylan both won for albums that were clearly not their best. York City and the album deals so much with the aftermath of 9/11.

BEER: But the voters aren't all in New York City. There will be a lot of votes from Nashville for the Dixie Chicks and a lot from St. Louis for Nelly and probably a few from Detroit for Eminem. I also wouldn't be surprised if there were a lot of votes from Nashville for Norah as well. My point is, Springsteen is the favorite for Album of the Year, but I don't see him winning it. He does win Male Rock Vocal Performance and Rock Album of the Year, though.

TRAKIN: So you're feeling a Norah Jones sweep is on the boards, like Alicia Keys last year.

BEER: Yes, although I'm still angry Alicia wasn't nominated for Best Album of the Year last year.

TRAKIN: So Norah wins both Record of the Year and Song of the Year?

BEER: Yep.

TRAKIN: You don't feel "The Rising" itself has a shot as Song of the Year?

BEER: Norah.

TRAKIN: I guess we don't have to discuss Best New Artist?

BEER: Norah. In Best Female Pop Vocal, you have Norah Jones against the almost-unbeatable Grammy perennial Sheryl Crow. If Norah doesn't win this category, then Mike Greene may still somehow be involved with the voting.

TRAKIN: Pop Performance by Duo or Group. Do you feel **Bowling** for Soup has a shot here?

BEER: I don't care who wins in this category.

TRAKIN: Ion Bon Iovi won't like hearing that.

BEER: Pop Collaboration with Vocals? Hard to vote against Sheryl Crow here, though where's "It's So Easy" from?

TRAKIN: Can Avril Lavigne avoid a shutout?

BEER: Best Female Rock Vocal could be the one category where Avril wins for "Sk8ter Boi," but she will have to beat Crow, even if it is for a song, "Steve McQueen," that no one's heard—especially Steve. How about Male Pop Vocal Performance? You have Elton John, Sting, John Mayer, James Taylor and Craig David.

TRAKIN: Well, you have three Academy favorites in Elton, Sting and Taylor. Maybe they split the geezer vote and Mayer gets in, as Paul Grein predicted. But I have to say Taylor feels like the favorite in this category.

BEER: I'll take Sting. How 'bout Rock Performance for a Duo or Group? TRAKIN: Grein thought the *Spider-Man* track has the best shot here, although Coldplay has been steadily building good momentum in the marketplace.

BEER: I'm going with Coldplay.

TRAKIN: Yeah, I like them in the Alternative Music Album category, too, over Beck, Elvis Costello, Clinic and Soundtrack of

Our Lives. OK, so let's recap. Norah Jones wins Album of the Year, Record of the Year, Song of the Year, Best New Artist, Best Pop Vocal Album, Best Female Pop Vocal Performance. In other words, all six of the categories she's nominated in. And I take it Producer of the Year has to be Arif Mardin, then.


TRAKIN: How about Best Polka album?

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As New-Artist Debuts Go, 50 Cent Stacks Up

In its first full week of release following a massive, 806k debut on only four days of sales, 50 Cent's Get Rich or Die Tryin' (Shady/Aftermath/Interscope) has held up incredibly well, dipping less than 1% to 801k. That's roughly 89,000 albums for each of the nine bullet holes in the Queens rapper's unusually resilient body.


Of course, the sales period for Get Rich represented on this week's chart is seven days compared to only four days last week, but any way you slice it, selling over 800k two charts in a row looks mighty good in these trying times.

Indeed, 50 Cent now has the distinction of having the highest first-week sales for a debut album by a new artist since they started counting. At 806k, he edges out previous record-holder Snoop Doggy Dogg, whose Doggystyle wowed observers in 1993 by selling 803k in its first week. Previous runner-up Ricky Martin, whose 2000 debut moved almost 661k in its first week, is now bumped to third place.

Only two albums of any kind had higher first weeks last year: Shania Twain's Up! at 874k and Eminem's The Eminem Show at 1.3 million. And in the case of 50 Cent co-producer/label owner Eminem, that 1.3 million was really a "second week," coming after the album's release date was moved forward to

Memorial Day weekend, and the resulting two-to-three-day sales flurry caused the album to chart at #1 on sales of 311k the previous week.

Looking back even further, only two 2001 albums had first weeks higher than 50 Cent's: Creed's Weathered at 887k and NSYNC's Celebrity at 1.8 million. Of course, back in the heady days of 2000, before the Internet ruined everything, five albums had million-plus first weeks: Backstreet Boys (1.6m), Limp Bizkit (1.0m), Eminem (1.7m), NSYNC (2.4m) and Britney Spears (1.3m).

COME BACK HOME: As much as I crave spending February sweeps glued to the television, the Interpol tour has motivated me to hit the road and visit PoMo radio stations, with the band in tow. The first week has been fascinating (this adjective is on loan from Ted Volk). Here's what I know: People care deeply about music. It defines them. Their allegiance to a genre or individual band makes them instantly part of a community of like-minded fans. This, unfortunately, is rarely measured in record sales and research. How, then, does a programmer reflect the passion of the enthusiasts without alienating his mainstream listeners who require a level of familiarity and comfort in their radio experience? Obviously, "balance" is critical, but of equal or greater importance is the need for the on-air staff and those involved in musical decisions to be in touch with the burgeoning underground. KNDD MD Seth Resler is out every night seeing bands (thanks, Seth, for

also taking me to see *Daredevil*. Of all the movies I've seen, it was definitely one of them). Seth is living the life of The End's audience, especially with his newly acquired Xbox, and was the first to "hear" the Evanescence song as the smash it's quickly become... Being around the Live105 team is a privilege. Since Sean Demery's arrival, the station has revisited its "roots" as an important cultural force in San Francisco. One of Sean's priorities was to empower his staff, allowing Aaron Axelsen the freedom to be the musical savant that he is, while also encouraging the on-air jocks to be spontaneous and involved. When I can sit across from Sean, discussing Jean Luc-Ponty "depth tracks" from our youth, as 100 listeners file into an off-site performance studio for an Interpol Live105 session, I'm ecstatic for the future of

the format.... We paid a visit to KROQ yesterday afternoon. The band was truly nervous—it's KROQ, after all! It couldn't have been a better experience for them, which is yet another reason why KROQ is an extraordinary station. Here's a relatively unknown band (by commercial radio standards) being made to feel like their visit was the most important event of the day (even though we interrupted the music meeting). Many programmers won't even emerge from their inner-sanctum offices when a band drops by. Without the music, the station is just a vehicle for selling widgets.... Seeing all of the adds this week for the new White Stripes single, "Seven Nation Army," is more invigorating than the two-liter bottle of Diet Mountain Dew I needed to get my aging, sleep-deprived, gravity-stricken ass out of bed this morning. Stations that have never played the White Stripes added this single out-of-the box!.... Does immediate acceptance of this new White Stripes single signify a shift in the mainstream? One week might not be considered a trend, but factor in these other successes, like the new AFI single being added this week at WOCL, WXTM and WMFS, or The D4 finding PoMo love from KXTE and WLUM? When Lynn McDonnell can pull in KROX, WBJX, WLRS, CIMX and KTEG on The Used in the same week that WHFS adds The Soundtrack of Our Lives, KXTE adds Trapt and KXRK, WMRQ, WZNE, KRZQ and KSYR add Johnny Cash, this indicates a seismic change! Of course, without the SMASHES, playing all of our favorite fringe records would be the sound of one hand clapping. Or our "personal jukebox" as Tom Calderone used to call it. Hearing a new one-listen hit for the first time is thrilling. It's the veritable needle-in-the-haystack that keeps us all on our toes. The Ataris' "In This Diary" has generated that kind of excitement from everyone. The song is nearly closed out at PoMo, including new adds from Y100, KPNT, 91X, KXRK, KMYZ, WXTM, KNRK, WSUN and lots more! Columbia has an amazing band, The Raveonettes, joining the Interpol tour next week. Guess where I'll be???.... Epic has a bounty of PoMo hits right now. Chevelle have unseated the Foo Fighters for the coveted #1 spot on the HITS PoMo chart; Audioslave's "Like a Stone" should be renamed "Like a Smash," as the band leaps to #3 on the chart; Revis' "Caught in the Rain" is an example of a one-listen hit, prompting much love this week, including KDGE, KRBZ, WRAZ, WZNE and a dozen more. Jacqueline and J.J. also pulled in a spectacular Y100 add on Mudvayne and lots of new Pearl Jam love. I'll let Erika fill you in on the rest of this week's milestones—I need a quick nap before tonight's Interpol show. Lucky for you, reading this column has already put you to sleep... Erika here: Just a few more tidbits while Ivana is napping. I am only here to help. *grin* What's going on with (hed) Planet Earth, you ask? Well, let me tell you. New adds this week from KNRK, WJRR, KSYR, WCYY and WEEO make "Blackout" a perfect addition to your snowstorm (or for all you WestCoasters—your sunshine!). "Life Goes By" from Special Goodness might be just what the doctor ordered. Pat from Weezer joins his pal Atom from Rocket From the Crypt for this little slice of shoe-gazing pop. KROQ knows what's good for them and added it last week. This week those trend-setters added Liam Lynch's "United States of Whatever," a song 91X has been spinning for weeks and WPLY actually played LAST YEAR... I am sure my time is just about up, but before I go let me throw in a few bands I love for those of you who forget that I'm just a few pages away...Hot Hot Heat, Electric Six and Brand New. There you go. Now on to your regularly scheduled broadcast. Over and out. SONG TO HEAR: Linkin Park's "Somewhere I Belong"..... PEOPLE TO WATCH: Rob Goldklang, Darren Eggleston, Steve Nice, Jeremy Smith, Jaime Cooley, Phil Manning, Paul Kriegler, Gary Spivack, Alan Galbraith, Russ Schenck, Howard Leon and Gaby Skolnek

JACK DEVOSS MD/WWCD Columbus



One reason Columbus PoMo station CD101 is often among the first to add the coolest new records is that Jack DeVoss is among the most musically aware MDs in the format. His personal tastes run the gamut: "First and foremost, there's the Clash," he says. "Also Neil Diamond, the Velvet Underground and Johnny Cash (with whom I share a birthday)." And, while being early champions of acts like Interpol, the D4 and Watershed is vital to pleasing the station's core audience, Jack stresses the importance of "not alienating the cume." Consequently, they are never far from a time-tested track by core artists like U2, Pearl Jam or RHCP. However, when asked to elaborate further on why the station has dominated the Columbus PoMo market for so long, Jack is typically enigmatic: "I am a member of a race of immortals who have lived among you for centuries. We wait for the time of the gathering when we'll be assembled to fight for the prize. There can be only one." Jack's clearly seen Highlander one too many times.

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

The Music, The Music (Capitol): Anyone looking for a fresh fix of Britpop psychedelia along the lines of The Stone Roses need look no further than this Leeds foursome, who whip up a gripping mix of tripped-out guitars spiked with the occasional synth oscillation. Amid the resulting heavy atmospherics, familiar blues riffs sometimes reveal themselves, while a nasty slide solo here or

flanged dobro there suggest a nod to Led Zeppelin's bluesy bent. Meanwhile, single "Take the Long Road and Walk It" takes a page from Cream's "Crossroads," further expanding the historical vibe, as does singer Robert Harvey's metal-inspired vocal on groover "The Truth Is No Words." Taking it to the next level. (JO)

Richard Ashcroft, Human Conditions (Hut/Virgin): The former Verve frontman is far too contemplative to write a simple love song; he seeks a larger context. On "Science of Silence," from the middle of Ashcroft's second solo album, he intones, "We are on a rock, spinning silently/Won't you please get close to me?"—and that couplet sums up the theme of the record. On Human



Conditions, Ashcroft is part refined soul man, part Celtic shaman, and he puts across the dense verbiage with an incantatory fervor that draws on the Van of Astral Weeks and the Marvin of What's Goin' On? His mesmerizing vocals, set off by elegant orchestrations over unhurried grooves, keep the vibe percolating, from the metaphysical-epic opener "Check the Meaning" to the closing "Nature Is the Law," graced by a heavenly chorale arranged and sung by Brian Wilson. (BS)



Massive Attack, 100th Window (Virgin): This U.K. band helped shape the contours of modern electronic pop and practically invented trip-hop; Window shows they're still pushing the envelope. The new disc melds disaffected voices, minimalist beats, roiling, dubby bass lines and frosty keyboard textures into a sonic evocation of this tense era. Sinead O'Connor contributes vocals on three

tracks, notably the hypnotic "Special Cases," while Horace Andy and Robert "3D" Del Naja assay the narcotic, dystopian funk of "Butterfly Caught," among others. With most of these moody tracks extending well beyond the seven-minute mark, Window ain't no disco party. But for those "orange-alert" days, it's just the ticket. (SG)

We're A Happy Family: A Tribute to the Ramones (Columbia/CRG): On this labor of love conceived and carried out by Andy Gould, ex-manager Gary Kurfirst, Johnny Ramone and Rob Zombie, 15 bands prove how hard it is to improve upon perfection. Metallica must slow down to catch up to "53rd & 3rd," Kiss' "Do You Remember Rock 'N' Roll Radio" shows what they'd sound like if they could



write a hook, and by accenting the other beat, the Chili Peppers turn "Havana Affair" into a brooding, mystery dance. But it's the Pretenders ("Something to Believe In"), Pete Yorn ("I Wanna Be Your Boyfriend") and newcomers Rooney ("Here Today, Gone Tomorrow") who nail the romantic heart at the core of the bruddas' comic-book nihilism by inscribing their own epitaphs onto punk's Rosetta Stone. (RT)



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

In solid rotation at KBBT, KBOS, KDON, KMEL, KSEQ, KSFM, KXJM, KZZP, WERQ, WJHM, WJMN, WMBX, WNVZ, WPGC and WWKX. 3) Nivea's "Laundromat." What a great success story this young lady has created for herself. Strazza continues to entertain great airplay gains, as the single pulls in early phones at some key stations. New airplay from KBXX, WJHM and WMBX this week. Don't sleep. 4) Snoop Dogg's "Beautiful." I say this because the hook is so strong. It's pulling in Top 10 phones all over the West Coast as the video impacts BET and more and more folks on the East Coast become believers. Watch this single come together as the video gains exposure. 5) Tyrese's "How You Gonna Act Like That." This was starting to fizzle a minute ago, but it seems to have kicked into full gear lately. Research has determined its fate. Airplay gains are very solid the past two weeks as the single approaches Top 10 on the charts. J Records has really done a fabulous job with it. Great work on the part of Michael Williams. K, that's it for me. But before I go, I need to point out the incredible week Gary Marella had on Brian McKnight. "Shoulda, Woulda, Coulda" was Most Added in the format, pulling in heavy players like KUBE, KXJM, WPOW, WZMX, KMEL, KYLD, KBBT, KKFR, KSFM and a slew of others. Could it be a hit? 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

As the NARM confab approaches, we had a chance to talk with Prexy Pam Horovitz about the many changes the convention is going through. After this year, NARM will be moving to August (San Diego '04), the new "summit" format being used throughout the rest of the year on an "as-needed" basis. Horovitz is understandably proud of the success of last fall's summit. And she agrees that the singles issue probably has ultimately had the most traction. After that event, every one of the majors has addressed retail's pleas for singles to make a comeback. "We've been really encouraged by the receptiveness of all of the companies to at least talk about it. They've been very willing to look at the economics, the timing, the cannibalization and charts issues." Copy protection was obviously also a hotbutton issue. How workable is it? How to label it? Look for the rest of Horovitz' comments on everything from how much more music will be included in this year's convention (product

presentations are back) to the revitalized trade show, in the upcoming special HITS NARM issue... The huge sales gains on DVD movies has been one of the few bright spots in the world of entertainment retail. But retailers generally have still been slow to embrace DVD music video product. The #1 selling title in any given week is usually around some 4-5,000 pieces. A respectable number, no doubt, but hardly enough to light the world on fire. Last fall's Paul McCartney tour DVD sold some 60k the first week, buoyed by a terrific marketing campaign. But how many DVD music titles will coincide with the entire DVD being aired on national TV during the fourth quarter? But, it would do retailers a service to notice that Columbia had two titles last week that did great business with no national specials. The Dixie Chicks sold a whopping 50k and John Mayer sold some 22k of longform DVD music titles. Both pieces had very normal drivers, such as hit singles. Dixie Chicks have one single, "Landslide," working at Pop formats and another, "Traveling Soldier," starting up at Country. Mayer has a massive hit in "Your Body Is a Wonderland," sequeing nicely to "Why Georgia." Not that the Saturday Night Live appearance hurt the Chicks, either, but these are two DVD titles that are selling because they are the right acts with the proper marketing set-up. Just thought it was worthy of mention.

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
