



hristmas came early for the record industry this year.

The top seven albums are all new to the chart, topped by Arista rap duo OutKast's Speakerboxx/The Love Below double-CD, which copped #1 with an impressive sales total of more than 509k.

RCA's Dave Matthews was the runner-up, with more than 475k, followed by Flip/Interscope's Limp Bizkit (#3), Shady/Aftermath/Interscope Emimen

protégé Obie Trice (#4), Jive soul superstar R. Kelly (#5), Roadrunner/IDJ's Nickelback (#6) and Universal rapper Murphy Lee (#7).

Alliance Entertainment One-Stop Group's Tony Bazemore celebrated by voting for Gary Coleman for Governor of California, then immediately recalled the following quote: "This was by far the biggest slate of releases of the year. Just fantastic. OutKast and Dave Matthews both sold way above our expectations, and our expectations were very aggressive on both. Limp Bizkit fans were obviously coming out in droves. Two new rap artists did well as Obie Trice from Eminem's crew and Murphy Lee from Nelly's camp both had great debuts. R.Kelly's hits package also fared nicely."

For the first time since late last year, every album in the Top 10 sold more than 100k, rounded out by a trio of former chart-toppers in Def Jam/IDJ's DMX (#8), Aware/Columbia/CRG's John Mayer (#9) and Buena Vista/Hollywood's Hilary Duff (#10).

Geffen's Rob Zombie, with a combination CD/DVD greatest hits package bowed just outside the charmed circle at #11. Other newcomers included Epic's Fuel (#15), Pantera's Rhino best-of (#22), Universal's Baby Bash (#29), Epic's Gloria Estefan (#39), So Def/Arista's Anthony Hamilton (#42), Arista's Aretha Franklin (#46) and Curb's Totally Country Vol. 3 (#50).

Major gains were posted by Sony Soundtrax's *The Fighting Temptations* soundtrack (#29-21, +50%), Michael McDonald's *Motourn* album (#48-36, +32%), which continued to benefit from exposure of "Ain't No Mountair. High Enough" on the ubiquitous MCl phone TV commercial and **Arista Nashville**'s **Alan Jackson** (#14-10, +18%).

Next week, make way for RCA Nashville's Martina McBride, Arista's Dido and A&M/Interscope's Sting, while Def Jam South's Ludacris album will street as the first superstar album to boast UMG's new \$12.98 MSRP.

# WILD CARD PINK ARISTA

The feisty rebel of the Pop world is ready to stir things up again with her third album, Try This, streeting 11/11. "Trouble" is a pop-rock single, debuting its first week at Pop & proving once again that Pink is more than the typical Pop star. Adds include MTV, KFMD, WXSS, WNKS. WRVW and others. # Online Music Update: A Summary Judgment

e're tellin' ya, this online music thing has it all: pitched legal battles, political speechifying, family crises—all that's missing is profit.

But that could change, according to a report by UK research firm **Informa**. The outfit—which should be believed, since you've never heard of it—predicts global Internet music sales (including both CDs sold through e-tailers and digital files sold by the likes of Apple's iTunes, BuyMusic.com and newest a la carte vendor MusicMatch) will hit \$3.9 billion in 2008.

Of course, the firm also predicts \$4.7 billion in lost revenues next year from burning and unauthorized downloading. Hey, you win some—you lose some

Unfortunately, there's still the problem of peer-to-peer file sharing in 2003. The RIAA, which recently began litigating against individuals identified as excessive uploaders of copyright-

ed music, announced this week that 64 targets of its campaign had opted to settle. Add 838 voluntary pledges to stop illicit swapping, and you've got a good start.

RIAA Prez Cary Sherman added: "The music community's efforts have triggered a national conversation— especially between parents and kids—about what's legal and illegal when it comes to music on the Internet.... In the end, it will be decided not in the courtrooms, but at kitchen tables

across the country. We are heartened by the response so far."

Furthermore, RIAA Chairman Mitch Bainwol called on P2P networks to institute voluntary changes such as filtering and non-sharing as a default setting. "These systems should no longer induce music fans to break the law, diminish computer security, disregard privacy or compromise the integrity of content."


Perhaps the RIAA's much-criticized action is working. According to Nielsen/NetRatings, usage of popular P2P network Kazaa declined a whopping 41% between June and September.

While the RIAA is keeping mum about settlement figures, many observers (and even the political consultants on HBO's K Street) say the amounts exacted are designed to sting rather than cripple, despite some overrealous reports to the contrary in the mainstream press.

In another victory for the RIAA, the trade

consortium was granted a seat on California's High Tech Crime Advisory Committee this week, which will now add music and video piracy to its bailiwick.

But it wasn't all beer and skittles for the industry group, which was challenged in court by the ACLU last week on the grounds that RIAA efforts to obtain the identity of a Boston College student (currently known as Jane Doe) accused of massive file-trading violated her privacy rights.

# AFTRA, RIAA Pact On Health Care

usicians on RIAA member labels will now be provided with health care coverage, thanks to a groundbreaking agreement between the trade org and AFTRA.

Representatives of AFTRA and BMG, EMI Music, Sony Music Entertainment, Universal Music Group and Warner Music Group have reached tentative terms on an industry-wide collective bargaining agreement covering recording artists.

The agreement was unanimously approved by the AFTRA Board, and is being forwarded to membership for final ratification.

The AFTRA Sound Recordings Code covers both royal-ty artists and session vocalists performing on sound recordings. The centerpiece of the tentative agreement is an innovative structure that guarantees access to health insurance under the AFTRA Plan to all AFTRA-covered royalty artists under exclusive contract to a label.

AFTRA President John Connolly says: "For the first

time, every covered artist under contract to a major record label or other AFTRA signatory label is guaranteed access to basic health care for as long as the artist remains on the label's roster as an exclusive recording artist."

RIAA Chairman/CEO Mitch Bainwol adds the negotiations were "committed to providing health care coverage for roster artists... We are thrilled that we were able to reach an agreement to provide these benefits, especially given the current economics of our business."

Under the prior contract, only those artists whose annual royalty earnings reached the AFTRA Health Plan threshold (currently \$10,000 per year), could qualify for health coverage after their first year with a label. The new agreement will provide that the labels make special contributions on behalf of artists under exclusive contract whose annual royalty earnings do not meet the minimum threshold, thereby ensuring that artists qualify for individual health insurance each year that they are under contract to the label.

A Perfect Circle, Dave Matthews and Rancid were the artists most important to their listeners. First and foremost, Garett is a passionate music fan (what other programmer names Guided By Voices as their all-time favorite band!?), and in the quest to create compelling programming for the station's like-minoed audience, Garett launched "Big Sonic Chill," their nightly 10pm-2am show that he calls "a souncscape of chilled-out music that is etherest, dreamy and sensual all at once. . While other competing stations are talking about sex (Loveline), we're the only station providing programming that is a soundtrack for having sex." Even celibates can appreciate hearing depth tracks from Interpol, Air, Moby, Zero 7 and The Cure. Garett's latest musical obsession is the new Ryan Adams, which enclears him to us even more!

**SO ALIVE:** Happy 5764 to you and yours. I rang in the New Year with the **Radiohead** show at the Hollywood Bowl. Some might deem my manner of celebration heretical, but for decades, most of my spiritual inspiration has come from rock music, so this was an absolutely appropriate venue for my High Holidays observance. Although our respect for Radiohead never waned, *Kid A* and *Amnesiac* left many of us confused, and attentions wandered. *Hail to the Thief* restored everyone's faith in Radiohead's deserved status as one of the most **important** and **meaningful** bands currently making music. Even the most apathetic, research-driven programmer would've come away from Friday night's performance feeling inspired and electrified. Or so I choose to believe. Maybe my experience was heightened, not by the extremely close proximity to many recognizable celebrities, but by witnessing the sheer joy

of those nearby, whether it was the cute rave boy (with the girlfriend who couldn't find the beat to save her life), or **KROQ** APD **Gene Sandbloom** and his family. KROQ and Radiohead's decade-plus relationship was enhanced with yesterday's *Breakfast with Kevin & Bean* taping at **Capitol**, which was similar to the intimate radio gatherings I had the privilege to attend in NYC. Few bands evoke such passion from their fans. KROQ has managed to translate that passion into call-out success because they believe in this BAND. Last week's three sold-out **White Stripes** shows at the nearby Greek Theatre were populated by an equally enthusiastic crowd. This was a mainstream (for L.A.) audience—far beyond the alleged core of "hipsters" that radio programmers point to

when explaining why a left-of-center record garners big phones. If the Greek holds approximately 6,000 and the Bowl, at conservative estimates, holds 18,000, then Radiohead and the White Stripes were seen by 54,000 in L.A. last week. I find that incredible, encouraging and mind-blowing (all at once). I had reality-show commitments that precluded my attending the Jet/Kings of Leon gig at the Troubadour, which Erika said was completely brilliant. PoMo radio is beginning to find room for these buzz bands, with Elektra landing KRBZ, X-96, WDYL, WPLA and WWRX on "Are You Gonna Be My Girl" this week, as RCA reeled in KROX, WEDG, KRZQ and WRAX on "Molly's Chambers".... It isn't even PMS week, but I'm feeling pretty emotional about certain records. The OutKast's "Hey Ya" is a remarkable piece of music—some say it sounds like classic Prince (it reminds me of Disco Tex & the Sex-O-Lettes' "Get Dancin'") and it sounds incredible on KROQ. The new OutKast album was the first of many big Rock2k debuts this week, bowing at #1 with over 500k sold! Not bad for a double album! Dave Matthews occupies the #2 spot this week (after playing to 200k+ fans in Central Park) and Limp Bizkit's new one enters at #3 on the sales chart. Nickelback and Fuel also debuted in the Top 15, proving that kids wanna rock (to quote Bryan Adams, among others). The other song I can't stop playing is Ryan Adams' new single, "So Alive," which KBZT PD Garett Michaels compares to "Where the Streets Have No Name." Adds at PoMo this week included the aforementioned KBZT, WBCN, WBUZ, WLUM, WKRL, WHTG and more. Our friends at Island also had a breakthrough week with Thursday's "Signals Over the Air," including KDGE, WFNX, KXTE, WSUN, KWOD, WJBX and WBTZ. Howie and Christine are also THRILLED with the immediate response to the new Hoobastank single, "Out of Control," which showcases the band's growth from their first record.... Epic dropped the new Korn single, "Right Now," which was PoMo radio's answer to the question, "When will you add the new Korn single?" Jacqueline, Joel, JJ and Margie reeled in KROQ, Q101, KNDD, KNRK, KTBZ, WXDX, WXRK, WXTM, WZZN, CIMX, KFMA and many more within moments of the song's delivery, while also being #2 Most Acded with Audioslave's "I Am the Highway." Chris Cornell is the embodiment of a ROCK STAR. You can have your emo bands—I'll take the swagger and THAT VOICE any day.... Ted Volk and his team have a new Coldplay single, "Moses," from an upcoming live DVD/CD. While you overthink the research potential of a new song from the most successful band of the past year, WHFS, Q101, WBCN, KCNL and WROX have already added the track.... Switchfoot's own sold-out tour should pique your curiosity. How can the band sell over 1,200 tickets when you're not playing "Meant to Live"? Can you wrap your head around the notion that a band can build a base without your airplay? Now you can remedy the situation by adding the single, just as WJRR and WSUN did this week.... The band that changed my life, Television, will be headlining the Henry Fonda Theatre in a few hours. I'm so excited I keep forgetting to breathe.... Another big inspiration, Iggy Pop, has a new single going for adds next week. "Little Know it All" (featuring Sum 41) should be Iggy's biggest radio hit. If you're truly lucky, you'll have an opportunity in the near-future to see him perform. If your belief in the proverbial power of rock & roll has been dampened by factors beyond your control, an Iggy show will restore your faith... SONG TO HEAR: Interpol's "NYC"..... PEOPLE TO WATCH: Bryan Schock, Kevin Mays, Bob Waugh, Marco Collins, Jenni Sperandeo, Mary Shuminas, Susie Dunn, Gary Spivack, Howard Leon, Aaron Scott, Lisa Cristiano and Bill Burrs



The Raveonettes, Chain Gang of Love (Columbia/CRG): If love is a simple song played with conviction over three chords in B flat, drenched in titanic waves of tube-shattering fuzz, feedback and Jesus & Mary Chain squall—this Danish duo's full-length debut will save the world. Opener "Remember" sets the mood with rangy guitars and

reverb-soaked tambourine accents supporting deadpan duet vocals expressing impressionistic sentiments like (Girl can this summer turn you on/When you walk inside yourself/And feel the moon

"Girl can this summer turn you on/When you walk inside yourself/And feel the moon has let you down." "Noisy Summer" packs a Motown-like groove, but surrounded by a wall of noise that doesn't diminish the gorgeous pop instincts of producer Richard Gottehrer (Blondie, Go-Go's, Marshall Crenshaw, Strangeloves). Other highlights include "Love Can Destroy Everything," and "Little Animal," which superimposes manic fits of distortion over "Duke of Earl" changes. Chain us up. (JO)

The Darkness, Permission to Land (Atlantic/AG): Chart-toppers in their native U.K., brothers Justin and Dan Hawkins polish off the glorious cliches of metal for post-punks with tongues firmly in cheeks and bulges prominent in all their snakeskin-spandex crotch glory. Justin's falsetto, sounding like his balls are in a vise, comes and goes, sometimes in the course of a single note, while Dan's fast-fingered riffs partake of the clas-



sic AC/DC-Free-Sabbath-Thin Lizzy songbook. The first single, "I Believe In A Thing Called Love," and the anti/pro (?)-drug anthem, "Givin' Up" walk the thin line between parody and homage, but it's all in fun—operatic old-school metal, Spinal Tap by Puccini. And the classic Atlantic logo is reminiscent of another bludgeoning English blooze outfit that wasn't taken very seriously, Led Zeppelin. It sure looks like The Darkness will have the last laugh, too. (RT)



Rufus Wainwright, Want One (DreamWorks): The third time's the charm for this trailblazing singer-song-writer, who has delivered one of the year's deepest, most satisfying, records. Indulging his enviable flair for Beatlesque hooks with giant, sumptuous arrangements and operatic flourishes (producer Marius deVries helps keep the multitude of sounds in balance), Wainwright catapults to the first rank of solo male artists. Lead sin-

gle "I Don't Know What It Is" is a model of melodic grace; other highlights include the madly hooky "Movies of Myself," the rapturous "Go or Go Ahead," the rueful, baroque "14<sup>th</sup> Street" and, especially, the wrenchingly gorgeous finale "Dinner at Eight." Yes, in a perfect world, Want One would be a chart-topping sensation. More to the point, when it's playing, the world is perfect. (SG)

Pretty Girls Make Graves, The New Romance (Matador): With one foot in the barbed-wire guitars of Sonic Youth and Fugazi and the other squarely in step with their post-punk/nu-Wave contemporaries, Seattle-based Pretty Girls Make Graves have a sonic assault that is as tuneful as it is aggressive. The band's sophomore record is the kind of wide-open indierock record which takes off in a million directions,



similar to ...Trail of Dead, though not quite that extreme. Singer Andrea Zollo is the eye of the hurricane, cutting through the disjointed rhythms and herkyjerky guitar riffs with a calm, steady intonation that doesn't veer into histrionics when the music gets noisy on songs like "Something Bigger, Something Brighter," which could well describe her ascendance to stardom. (DS)


The music business lost a true pioneer and a dear friend last week when Martin Spector died of heart failure. He was 98 years old and survived by his wife of 61 years, Dorothy. Martin opened the first Spec's Music store in 1948 and began a legacy of music specialty retailing in Florida that still thrives today. At its height, Spec's boasted more than 70 stores with annual revenue in excess of \$80 million. His daughter Ann Lieff followed in her dad's footsteps, taking over as CEO in '80, but it's a testament to how much Spector loved this business, that he was still coming into the office every day until it was sold to Camelot in '98. In fact, Lieff tells us that on the day he passed, he was asking for the trades and wanting to know how Trans World's takeover of Wherehouse Music was faring. When Trans World took acquired Camelot, TW topper Bob Higgins astutely left the Spec's moniker on the Florida stores, seeing the truly invaluable brand that Spector had nurtured. Vet Beth Fath still heads up a small crew that

takes special care of the Spec's stores for parent company Trans World. But it's kind of amazing to look back and realize just how many stars in the business got their start, or came into their own while working at Spec's, Ron Phillips, formerly Valley, Amazon and now WEA Catalog. Cindy Barr. Blockbuster Music, now at AEC. David Miller, MCA, Sire, RCA, now EMM. Dave Garbarino, Geffen, now Elektra. Peter Blei and Guy Long both at AEC. Marc Zimet, Arista, now EMM, Jim Baumann, MSI Distribution. Eric Davidson. Jeff Clifford, Joe Andrules, Eddie Miller. Names we all know Pros in our business. Products of a chain that started some 14 years before the legendary Russ Solomon opened his first Tower location. Mr. Spector was a music quy. Not so much old guard, as the original guard. He will be missed... Last Monday (9/29), Trans World won court approval for the Wherehouse Music acquisition. Sun Capital did indeed try to make an end run, but to no avail. The original terms of \$35.6 million in cash and \$5 million in assumed liabilities remained unchanged. In a statement, Higgins reiterates his intentions to close 34 of WM's 145 stores. TW also got court approval Friday (9/26) for the acquisition of CD World, in Chapter 11 as well. With CDW's 13 stores and WM's 11, TW's store count now stands at 955. The guestion many insiders are asking is, will Sun Capital make a play for the troubled Tower Records chain currently on the block? Stay tuned.
