



ollywood's Selena Gomez scores the first #1 album of her career this week with Stars Dance, whipping up 95k and ruling our Album Chart. (Her last release, 2011's When the Sun Goes Down, bowed with 78k and has sold 669k to date.)

That's enough reason for Ken Bunt and his Disney Music Group team to don their mouse ears in triumph. Add the ascent of the Teen

Beach soundtrack from #9 to #3 (54k, +113%) and you've got enough celebration for a Main Street Electrical Parade.

Two other debuts made the Top 10: Sony Music Latin's Marc Anthony (#5, 36k) and Cash Money/Republic's Rich Gang (#9, 22k). Anthony's prior album, 2010's *Iconos*, moved 24k and has done 225k RTD.

Jay Z (Roc-a-Fella/Roc Nation) moved down to #2 with 75k (-41%); Razor & Tie's Kidz Bop Kids slipped to #4 with 40k (-34%). Republic Nashville's Florida Georgia Line dipped just 5% (#6, 29k), while KidinaKorner/Interscope's Imagine Dragons retained the #7 post (27k, +3%).

Further down the chart, we find debuts from Vanguard's Edward Sharpe & the Magnetic Zeros (#13), The Rolling Stones' Hyde Park Live set for Virgin (#18) and Equal Vision's We Came as Romans (#22).

Streeting this week are Star Trak/Interscope's Robin Thicke (which will be next week's #1), Five Finger Death Punch (Prospect Park), Syco/Columbia's Emblem3, Strange/INgrooves rapper Tech N9ne and the Backstreet Boys (BMG Rights Management/RED).

Next Tuesday will see the release of sensibility/Columbia's The Civil Wars and Now 47 (UMe).

The Leak Heard 'Round the World: SoftBank's \$8.5b Bid for UMG, and What It All Means

n the ongoing conversation about what music is worth, a leaked story about a three-month-old rejected bid has reframed the narrative.

The Financial Times reported on 7/18 that Japanese telecom SoftBank had floated an \$8.5 billion cash bid for UMG three months earlier but was turned down outright by the label group's owner, Vivendi. Activist shareholders at Vivendi had been urging the French company to dispose of its media assets. But Vivendi insisted music was central to its overall strategy of consolidating around entertainment—particularly given the consumption of music via mobile devices—and refused SoftBank's offer. (Instead, Vivendi has begun shedding its telecom assets, but more about that in a moment.)

Needless to say, this is encouraging news for music valuation in general, which continues to rise, and UMG in particular.

While much speculation has centered on who leaked the story, the issue of why SoftBank was so strongly motivated to own the largest recorded-music group—and willing to pay considerably more than most analysts had said it was worth (it was most recently valued in the \$6.5 billion range)—seems more relevant.

The Japanese firm's pending acquisition of Sprint Nextel was approved by the FCC on 7/5 (its stock spiked in October after its sweetened offer of \$21.6 billion for Sprint was accepted, but Standard & Poor's lowered its credit rating to junk).

That approval was the last hurdle for SoftBank's big phone play—and its desire to have a music company in its pocket underscores the vast potential such players see in mobile streaming. In addition to being able to stock its own streaming options with music it owned, the Tokyo telecom would also have been able to rake in substantial licensing revenues.

But, of course, all that becomes moot given Vivendi's outright refusal of the offer. Chieftain Jean-Rene Fourtou has noted that without a cohesive media-based strategy, Vivendi's holdings would amount to little more than a list of discrete assets.


The sky-high bid for UMG has boosted valuations for all three major music groups, sources told the *New York Post's Claire Atkinson*. She speculates that the bid could aid Third Point's Daniel Loeb in his attempt to persuade Sony to spin out Sony Music and Sony Pictures by making the idea of a sale look more attractive to the Japanese conglom. Loeb is expected to revive efforts to break away the division in the coming weeks, according to a financial industry source.

Last week, Vivendi appeared to signal its intentions to reshape itself as a smaller company focused on media busi-

nesses, notably including UMG. The Wall Street Journal reports that the French company has entered talks to sell control of Africa-based Maroc Telecom to Emirates Telecommunications

Corp. for \$5.5 billion, potentially kicking off a series of deals that would pay down a mountain of debt and get rid of its telecommunications assets through sales or spinoffs.

Meanwhile, upon learning that the parent company will probably not change hands, the UMPG security staff put away the consolation weed and broke out the celebration weed.





THE BIG RACE: Industry handicappers are placing odds on which album hitting this fall will move the most units, and how it will impact label marketshare. The album that emerges triumphant will inevitably get a powerful boost from a smash radio single or singles, the most significant driver of album sales, as we're seeing now with Imagine Dragons and Florida Georgia Line, Will the winner be Eminem (whose previous LP debuted with 741k and has sold 4.46m to date) or Lady Gaga (with a 1.11m first week, bolstered by Amazon MP3's 99-cent sale, and 2.3m RTD), on Jimmy lovine and John Janick's IGA? Will the second volume of Justin Timberlake's The 20/20 Experience, on Peter Edge and Tom Corson's RCA, be as big as the first, which bowed with 968k and is now at 2.1m? Could it be Cash Money's Drake (631k, 2.04m) for Monte Lipman's Republic? What about the third album from One Direction on Rob Stringer's Columbia, who built tremendous momentum by releasing their first two LPs just eight months apart, oldschool style, totaling more



than 3.5m? Or Katy Perry, on Steve Barnett's CMG, whose 2010 album Teenage Dream got off to a surprisingly soft start, with a first week of just 192k, but achieved massive momentum behind a staggering 30m singles, going on to tally 2.74m? In terms of potential comebacks, there's more than a little pressure surrounding the Q4 releases from Columbia's Beyoncé. coming off a relatively disappointing sales performance with 2011's 4 (310k, 1.4m) and RCA's Britney Spears, who failed to hit a home run with her previous effort, 2011's Femme Fatale (276k, 777k). Likewise with RCA's Kings of Leon, whose sales dipped from 2.3m on their 2008 breakthrough Only by the Night (which contained the crossover smash "Use Somebody") to 730k on 2010's hitless Come Around Sundown. Will the all-important sophomore effort from Columbia's Foster the People approach the band's hit-driven debutalbum total of 970k? Then there's Mike Dungan's triumvirate of UMG Nashville power hitters: Luke Bryan (145k, 2.07m), who's expected to have the biggest late-summer debut with his 8/13 release; Scotty McCreery (197k, 1.18m); and Keith Urban (162k, 743k). And don't underestimate Brushfire/Republic's Jack Johnson (243k, 842k), who has quietly conducted one of the most consistently productive careers of the last decade. On the indie front, the most highprofile release will come from Merge: the follow-up to Arcade Fire's 2010 career album The Suburbs (156k, 770k), which won

the 2011 Grammy for Album

of the Year. It will also be interesting to see how Nine Inch Nails will fare in the band's return to a major, Columbia, following a couple of DIY releases that failed to sell significant numbers. In the record business, of course, there's always the possibility that a record will come out of nowhere and connection a massive scale; just look at Adele, who turned around the long-floundering record business almost singlehandedly in 2011, a positive year for album sales (+1.4%), track sales (+9%) and overall with TEA (+3.2%)... Guggenheim Partners' hoped-for acquisition of VEVO from Sony Music, UMG and their investor partners, which, according to some insiders, appeared to be a sure thing, has hit a snag and now may not close after all... Industry eyes are on Coldplay as the band transitions to Warner Bros. from Capitol through the Parlophone divestment. While manager Dave Holmes and WBR chief Cameron Strang are expected to form a solid working relationship, will the artist-friendly Rob Cavallo, who still holds the title of label Chairman, play a role in making the band members feel comfortable in their new home?... Rihanna has signed a new long-term contract with Roc Nation as part of its recent deal with UMG. Her future releases will probably continue to go through IDJ, continuing a productive long-term relationship with the Steve Bartels-led label, even as Roc Nation builds its own brand. On that subject, does Jay Brown (who manages Rihanna and Shakira) have the bandwidth to become a top major-label exec? And where does

ex-Mercury U.K. label head Jason lley fit into Jay Z's scheme?... Mariah Carey is shopping a new deal with one record left on her current contract with IDJ and is possibly headed back to Sony Music, where she would most likely reunite with Epic's L.A. Reid, who orchestrated her 6 million-selling 2006 album The Emancipation of Mimi. Carey's attorney and her new manager, Red Light's Bruce Eskowitz, are supposedly asking elephant bucks from UMG to stay... Names in the rumor mill: Troy Carter, Scott Rodger, Johnny Wright, Richard Griffiths, Larry Rudolph and iTunes Radio.

SOME THINGS TO PONDER AS MIDSUMMER NIGHTS BECOME A DREAM

IMAGINE DRAGONS

In a recent article in HITS, expert Grammy prognosticator and frequent contributor Paul Grein took a look at the first nine months of the eligibility period and how the Grammy favorites stack up. There is little to quibble about in his article (after all, last year he went 4-for-4 in the main categories), but there have been some major new developments in the Grammy picture during the last month.

a. Jay Z's Magna Carta Holy Grail, which was on Grein's "keep in mind" list, has exploded onto the scene with mega-press, mega-Samsung-download controversy, a sizable #1 album chart debut, a second week at #1 (unusual in this market, especially in the hip-hop field), one exploding hit single and more waiting on the runway. This project will easily be on the airwaves through the rest of the 2013 nominating process and into the final voting phase in early 2014. Look for across-the-board nominations.

b. New Zealand-based, 16-year-old songstress Lorde has burst onto the scene through her deal with Jason Flom's Lava Records, and Charlie Walk's Republic staff has delivered a nearly overnight success story. It's already blasting off at Alternative and Triple A, with Hot AC starting and Top 40 ready to do their part. "Royals" will be ubiquitous through the entire voting process. A Best New Artist nom, in a category that was rich with contenders last year but thus far in 2013 has been dominated by Macklemore & Ryan Lewis and Florida Georgia Line, should be a major consideration—as well as placing this production powerhouse as a long shot for Record of the Year.

c. Passenger's "Let Her Go," released by Nettwerk and now promoted by Peter Gray's WBR team, was a one-listen monster for me. Evocative of Cat Stevens, Al Stewart ("Year of the Cat") and almost as powerful as James Blunt's "Beautiful," this song was an instant winner at the recent Clear Channel meetings in New York—and for good reason. It is now the hottest breaking song on the Hot AC charts, and this fall is destined to contend for the top of the Pop charts as well. If you haven't heard it yet, I suggest you do. Voting in Best New Artist and in Song of the Year categories should be considered.

Interscope is hotttttttttttttttttt. As we approach October and the one-year anniversary of President John Janick's arrival in Santa Monica, we're duly impressed by the focus, turnaround and current hot streak of the long-stagnant onetime super-label. With five songs in the current Top 10, a conveyor belt full of hits in waiting and the laser approach employed by the label in making Imagine Dragons into the biggest rock band in the world, we applaud the performance of "Jimmy's Team" headed by Mr. Janick and the nose-to-the-grindstone, publicity-shy Steve Berman. As with Alabama and Ohio State in

college football or Kentucky and Indiana in college basketball, the dominance of labels like Interscope makes the whole music game healthier.

As we all await the second Justin Timberlake solo album this year, Justin himself and RCA have chosen to enter the two volumes of The 20/20 Experience as one continuous work for Album of the

Year consideration. Two albums from one solo artist have only once before been nominated in the Best Album category, in 1959—when Frank Sinatra did double duty—and the rules have since changed to allow only one album per year by an artist (exceptions are made for collaborations). But how much fun would it have been for Justin to have two this year? Maybe I'm just amusing myself, but the attention in

the press and the resulting ratings for the show could have been enormous. I'm sure Grammys producer Ken Ehrlich would've made a very big deal of it.

I'm still in awe of the marketing performance that Team Columbia, headed by Rob Stringer and Joel Klaiman, delivered on the Daft Punk album. Yes, it was a few months ago, and yes we live in a "what have you done for me lately?" world, but the brilliant job they did of creating awareness preradio and scoring big with a legacy act deserves to be

mentioned again—especially with the setup for The Civil Wars about to go into full effect. This is another challenging project, as the two-person group of **Joy** Williams and **John Paul White** has broken up, but my bet is that Columbia will again deliver a #1 debut. I am curious to see how this project plays out.

Finally, some of the stories we will be following in the coming months include:

a. Epic Records, which has recently changed marketing, A&R and promotion departments, has hit the ground running with big debuts by Ciara and Sara Bareilles, has brought back the LaFace label under L.A. Reid's auspices and reunited with its flagship act, TLC.

b. The yearlong battle for #1 marketshare between Monte and Avery Lipman's Republic and Peter Edge and Tom Corson's RCA

c. Who will perform on and who will be the biggest sales winners from the upcoming VMAs, to be aired this year from Barclays Center in Brooklyn. (Other than the just-announced Lady Gaga, that is.)

d. Warner Bros Records, where Cameron Strang will be assembling a team of key execs and trying to return the glory to Burbank.



If you want to know how a person really is, see how they treat me (or any of my "service industry" peers). Ted refers to the job as a "series of one-sided conversations," which doesn't necessarily bother me (I crack myself up), except when the same monologue is delivered repeatedly, with no discernible progress (the definition of "futility"). So we need to find other ways to fuel our passion for the job, whether it's a trip to Lollapalooza to see our first favorite bands (many Cure and Nine Inch Nails fans are excited for the weekend ahead), or a most-welcome add after months of effort (KTBZ added Tame Impala this week!), or an on-demand screening of the new Big Star documentary Nothing Can Hurt Us (which I highly recommend). I've heard others recommend something called a "vacation," but that concept is completely alien to me. The Divine Fits/Postal Service show last week was my break from stress. Obviously, I'm not the only burned-out, stressed-out person in the room, So how do we deal with it, besides "escaping" any way we can? Let's go basic: Treat others as you wish to be treated, even if you don't have to. You will be rewarded in your next life. Amber Miller, former PD of WEQX, has been hired to join the Caroline promotion team. Her flawless reputation, intelligence and passion for music will benefit her greatly as she embarks on this next phase of her career. Those who had always done good business with Amber when she was a PD owe her whatever help we can offer, even if we're "competing" for the same slot at a station.... Even when he thinks he can one-up me on the topic of punk rock (hah), I remain Nick Petropoulos' biggest fan. During his tenure at Glassnote, he's been instrumental in breaking many IMPORTANT bands for the format (like my faves Phoenix), and his tenacity and focus on building "Trying to be Cool" to its rightful place in the Top 10, deserves absolute respect and consideration from radio programmers. Unlike many labels, whose release schedule demands a weekly shift in priorities, Glassnote is in the enviable position of staying with a song until it's a hit, especially when there are many examples of fantastic call-out and increased sales in airplay markets. Programmers are always looking for the "next shiny band," and often forget that their audience still cares deeply about the band they're now being dismissive of, even when that band is valuable enough to headline their Xmas show.... Speaking of bands that your audience LOVES, it's still a few weeks away from release of the new Franz Ferdinand CD, and the first single "Right Action" is already Top 25! The band is playing a "secret" show tonight at the Echoplex, following a playback of the new record, and, like Coachella, I expect the setlist will be hit-after-hit-after-hit. Can't wait!... Since it's been at least a week since we've praised Capitol's Bill Carroll and Howard P. for setting the bar too high for the rest of us, we should hail them for launching the new Thirty Seconds to Mars single "City of Angels" to #1 Most Added this week, following early adds from KROQ, Live105, among others. This song is 30STM's most perfect anthem—an homage to theirs (and Bill's) adopted city.... Lots of love this week for Dennis Blair and the new Naked and Famous single he just launched. "Hearts Like Ours" is the band's best song to-date. VERY excited to hear it on the radio.... Kudos to Mike DePippa for staying the course on MS MR, which is now breaking after months of hard work by the label and the band! He's about to launch follow-ups on The Neighbourhood, Daft Punk and (soon) Nine Inch Nails.... Yes, I've heard the new Arcade Fire single. And yes, it's AMAZING. Patience, Grasshopper. your time is soon.... When Rob Goldklang says NoNoNo, you say YesYesYes!... SONG TO HEAR: Chvrches "The Mother We Share"....
