ith 58k, Brand New's Science Fiction is #1 on this week's Sales Plus Streaming (SPS) Chart. This is the first self-released album to hit #1 since Frank Ocean's Blonde topped the chart in August of last year with 276k.

As for the remaining bows to appear within the Top 30, Kodak Black's Project Baby 2 (Atlantic) snags the #2 spot with 44k, Neck

Deep's The Peace and the Panic (Hopeless) is #7 with 31k, Dave East's Paranoia: A True Story (Mass Appeal/Def Jam) debuts at #11 with just south of 26k and A\$AP Ferg's Still Striving (RCA) can be found at #16 with 23k.

One of the week's most notable bumps belongs to Hollywood's Guardians of the Galaxy 2 soundtrack, which rises #30-24, thanks to DVD, Blu-ray and on-demand.

It's also worth noting that 21 Savage's Issa Album (Slaughter Gang/Epic), which houses "Bank Account"—the #1 track on our Streaming Songs Chart with 15m+ streams continues to earn. That album is #12 on the SPS chart this week.


When it comes to the SPS marketshare battle, UMG leads with 42%, SME is #2 with 33%, WMG is #3 with 20% and the indies follow with 6%.

Streeting this week are sets from Atlantic's Lil Uzi Vert, Matador's Queens of the Stone Age, SYCO/Epic's Fifth Harmony, RCA's A\$AP Mob, RCA Nashville's Old Dominion, Atlantic's The War on Drugs and Action Bronson, Big Machine's The Cadillac Three and Sub Pop's Iron & Wine.



Universal Music Latin America & Iberian Peninsula head Jesus Lopez replied that while un montón de dinero asombrosamente grande was technically correct, the song's title was now a more accurate descriptor. Monte later signed Google Translate to a 360 deal.

The Biz Rips Lyor a New One

The RIAA's Cary Sherman issued a response on 8/18 to You-Tube Music chief and erstwhile party clown Lyor Cohen's blogged remarks about YT's payments (which Cohen claims are bigger than Spotify's from its free tier). "Let's be real about what we know," goes the article, titled "Five Stubborn Truths About YouTube and the Value Gap." One of these is that the safe-harbor provision is not a "distraction" (as Lyor claims) but a means to keep artist payments low, and a threat to "music's fragile recovery." Furthermore:

"It's no mere 'distraction' when YouTube uses the safe harbor to skew negotiations with music creators in its favor; to offer a below-market rate and say 'take it or leave it,' knowing that by 'leaving it,' music creators will have to spend countless hours and resources sending takedown notices when they find unauthorized copy after copy of their music on YouTube, only to find them pop right back up again."

Sherman's piece also deflates the implication that Google is just starting in the subscription biz, noting that Google Play was launched a full seven years ago, and that it has attracted few paying users in the ensuing years while much smaller companies cultivated large and active subscriber bases.

YT's claim to transparency is also targeted, with the RIAA asserting that the video behemoth under-reports streams and constantly disputes rights holders' claims about numbers.

What's more, the Association says, YT pays "far less" to creators than all other ad-supported services "and nowhere near the \$3 per thousand streams in the U.S. that Lyor claims" (more like half that).


Sherman notes that 82% of all YouTube users are there for music, adding: "So the facts beg the questions: Why is YouTube

paying so little? Is this how a true partner values music? We don't think so."

The U.K.'s trade body, the **BPI**, also took issue with Cohen. Noted boss **Geoff Taylor**, "YouTube isn't helping to grow our subscriptions business, it's undermining it. According to research from **IPSOS**, one in five internet users say they don't pay for music because they get all the music they need from YouTube."

Irving Azoff, who asked rhetorically who Lyor thought he was "bullshitting" to Music Business Worldwide, had this to add: "He's living up to his name. Someone changed the pronunciation of his name years ago by dropping the 'o,' and it stuck." This, presumably, gave rise to the hit "Liar, Liar" by The Castaways.

ADELETTS? Taylor Swift has just launched the first ICBM in her fall offensive with the lead single for her 11/10 album reputation. The acceptance at radio on "Look What You Made Me Do" has been overwhelming, and the track appears to have more than enough muscle to debut at #1. Now that the project is in motion, there's a growing belief that Taylor has nothing less than Adele's seemingly unbeatable first-week U.S. record of 3.4m in her sights. There's no question that Taylor is going to evaluate the situation in minute detail in an effort to determine what is needed to attain the prize. Can the Target exclusive give her the physical muscle to challenge Adele, whose number was all sales and zero streams outside of "Hello"? Taylor will surely make her upcoming album streamable on all the services if she concludes that she has a shot. This super-sharp, ultracompetitive megastar is already in her war room, ready to press whatever buttons are required to enable her to hit her target.

THE GRASS ISN'T ALWAYS GREENER: Our rundown in the previous issue of certain top players who were rumored to be considering making new career choices has caused a quite a blowback in some quarters. Given the reactions to the piece, it seems prudent to provide some additional detail in an effort to clear the air. To begin with, some readers saw this singling out of certain players as a "power list," while it was simply an attempt to put the spotlight on certain much-gossiped-about individuals who are thought to possibly be in play at this particular time.

Top players including Steve Barnett, John Janick, Peter Edge, Steve Berman, Craig Kallman, Julie Greenwald, David Joseph, Jason Iley, Mike Dungan and Randy Goodman were purposely left out of the discussion because no one is chattering about them going anywhere. The same is true for Jody Gerson and Jon Platt—although rumors floating around six months ago had the latter two publishing execs being enticed to move to the label side, but neither expressed any interest. During the same time frame, Greenwald's attorney reportedly floated the possibility of a \$5m guarantee as the lever for his client to jump ship, but

that gambit never went anywhere. Nonetheless, if it's true, that \$5m figure suggests that Greenwald is probably being paid somewhat less than the label heads at Sony and UMG, who are thought to be making \$6m+. In any case, Greenwald and Kallman are having a great run, and some believe she's the highest-paid label exec at the company. That illustrates the point we made in the previous column about lower salaries at WMG. But some say that the company's recent strong earnings have created a more aggressive atmosphere when it

comes to poaching top executives—in which case Warner is no longer locked into paying considerably less for top executive talent than its rivals.

Among the loudest criticisms we received had to do with the absence of females in the list of execs potentially in play. The fact is that Gerson, UMG's Michele Anthony, Sony's Julie Swidler, Republic's Wendy Goldstein, CMG's Michelle Jubelirer, Motown's Ethiopia Habtemariam, Caroline's Jacqueline Saturn, Warner/Chappell's Katie Vinten, UMG Nashville's Cindy Mabe

and First Access Entertainment's Sarah Stennett appear to be solidly placed at this point. All of them not only hold lofty titles, they also have real clout and can move the needle. What's more, these female players aren't known to gossip about their next deals, in contrast to some of their alpha-male counterparts named in the last issue. Meanwhile, Epic head Sylvia Rhone, who is running one of the hottest labels in the business, is looking to hire some top players in a few key areas.

Others whose names have appeared on many a shortlist in recent months include Spotify's Troy Carter and Capitol's Scott Greer, who moved over to Def Jam as part of Paul Rosenberg's new team just after our last issue went to press, and Def Jam EVP Rick Sackheim. On the heels of the announcement of Steve Bartels' upcoming departure from Def Jam, Sackheim is being pursued by a West Coast label. The highly regarded promotion exec, who lives in Malibu, has been commuting to New York every other week since he joined the label in 2005. Vegas bookies

think it's 8 to-5 that he'll move on, but in the immortal words of **Yogi Berra**, it ain't over till it's over.

What we haven't seen in many years is a top lawyer moving from private practice to head a major label; the last legal eagle who took this flight path was **Peter Paterno**, who journeyed to Frontierland back in the early '90s. But there's some scuttlebutt suggesting another law-to-label move could be happening soon.

With Bartels' exit and the arrival of hip-hop specialist Rosenberg, some believe **Justin**

Bieber is headed to Republic, where he and Scooter Braun have had a number of successes, including Ariana Grande, Psy and Martin Garrix, as well as Bieber himself on his remix of Luis Fonsi's "Despacito" and "Friends," his recently released collaboration with Bloodpop. But this rumor is just smoke-Braun and Rosenberg are said to have an extremely strong relationship. The early favorite for the Democratic governorship of California, Braun is doing a spectacular job managing the career of the off-cycle Bieber, who has been hotter than ever

since his last album ran its course. Like Rosenberg, Braun would keep his client while playing his new role; he'd also move the state capital from Sacramento to Brentwood. Fake news? As for Rosenberg, he flew to the U.K. last week with **Eminem**, who headlined the **Reading & Leeds Festivals** (8/25-27) as part of the run-up to his forthcoming album, which is being described as a work in progress, with a strong shot at a late-2017 release.

THE STREAMING CONUNDRUM: A song can explode out of nowhere more easily than ever nowadays, thanks to the combustible combination of streaming and socials. Labels that move quickly to lock down projects that are moving the needle online are realizing a big upside. But how many stars and arena acts are coming out of streaming? Indeed, as long as the streaming platform continues to deliver cash like a gigantic ATM, how incentivized are rights owners to exercise the patience and make the commitment required to break artists? Those who assert that the ongoing develop-

ing of career artists is the engine that keeps the music business vital, including lawyers, managers, agents, and certain label execs, insist that this gold rush is a short-sighted strategy at this pivotal point, when the business should ultimately be focused on the long game. Managers claim they're doing more and more of the heavy lifting in artist development, which is all about building fan engagement. They contend that label involvement typically doesn't begin until major playlisting and radio enter the picture.



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

A big Ticketmaster initiative and Target exclusive with merch tie-ins were also touted, while iHeart trumpeted 20m first-day "total audience spins." It was announced at press time that the video would bow on the VMAs; new Apple spots starring Tay are also expected. Will the 15-track full-length be available on all streaming platforms, including Spotify? Will the set remain behind the paywall? If so, for how long?

No matter how it all shakes out, all eyes are on Tay once again. How big will this one get?

cott Greer is moving to Def Jam as EVP of Marketing & Commerce, starting next week. In his new post he'll oversee marketing, digital, commerce, branding and creative content initiatives at the label.

Greer most recently served as EVP at Capitol Music Group, and prior to that as SVP Marketing at Columbia; over the course of his career he's worked with Adele, Beyoncé, Katy Perry, Lil Yachty, Sam Smith, Halsey, Daft Punk, Jack White, Pharrell Williams, J Cole, Beck, Mary J. Blige and John Legend,

among many other artists.

He will be issued his turntables and crossfader immediately upon assuming his new post.

Amazon Echoes IN/WUSICCITY

hen Amazon got into the subscription streaming business last October, it had a built-in advantage: a large and loyal customer base that had been purchasing music on the e-commerce site for two decades. Essentially, they had the heart of mainstream America in their back pocket—including underserved country fans who were slow to stream their music.

In 2017, streaming has represented 38% of country-music consumption (up from 24% in 2016), about 15% lower than overall streaming.

Amazon's share of country streams is twice the industry average. In a typical week, half of its top streaming songs and albums are country. This gives them, as Warner Music Nashville topper John Esposito points out, "the biggest reach in the digital space" for the demo.

"Historically, the industry has taken a 'one-size-fits-all' approach to music streaming, which is not the best way to bring new listeners or new service providers into music streaming," explains Steve Boom, VP of Amazon Music. "We've been at our most successful where we've worked closely with the industry to offer new services and new models that expand the overall music streaming industry."

"Amazon's base is wider than most



streaming accounts, and they appeal to families just as country music does," notes UMG Nashville President Cindy Mabe. "The voice-activated Echo has really changed the ease of entry with our fan base. Additionally, Amazon is the place where so many of our customers already shop, they already trust them; and with only a voice-activated barrier to entry, Amazon is speaking directly to our consumer and teaching them the value and ease of streaming. No other account has targeted the country audience the same way, because we are not primarily composed of millennials."

"Our advantage is that we already have one of the largest customer bases in the world, and a core demographic that is in line with the country demographic—they are loyal and have a high discretionary income," says Kelly Rich, Amazon's Senior Label Relations Manager, Nashville. "Amazon is giving country music a level playing field with other genres and it's resonating with our customers."

"What is great about Amazon is that it's the only partner that has physical goods, digital downloads and a streaming service," emphasizes Ken Robold, EVP/COO, Sony Music Nashville. "This makes them very appealing from a label perspective."

The pre-existing retail platforms set the stage well. "Country music listeners have always felt at home in Amazon Music, even

before we launched streaming," says Boom. "Since launching streaming, we have invested heavily in country music programming and also marketing to those fans."

"The Amazon consumer seems to be a perfect fit with the country music consumer," Esposito adds, "and music being such a large part of Amazon's ecosystem gives them direct access to our consumer. They are able to listen to country music passively—streaming the hits—or actively, by artist and by creating their own playlists."

Amazon recently struck a deal with Garth Brooks to sponsor his current tour and exclusively stream his previously unavailable catalog. "Getting the Garth deal done was a huge boost," Robold says, "both for the service and the genre."

The affiliation, Boom adds, made a lot of sense to both sides. "Garth Brooks is the top-selling solo artist in U.S. history, and was looking for a real partnership when making his music available for streaming for the first time," he explains. "Given Amazon's

big base of country music fans, as well as our strong physical music business, we felt like it was the perfect match, and Garth has been an amazing partner."

Brooks himself seems happy with the results thus far. "As cool as Amazon is, it's the people who you get to work with there that make it an absolute blast," he says.

Manager Marion Kraft (Miranda Lambert, Ashley Monroe) says the Amazon folks "have come to town and are accessible and open to ideas and discussions on what our artists need to connect with their fanbase."

"Amazon has the ability to customize their marketing because of the data that they have access to," Kraft continues. "The Middle America consumer may be late to the game, but with Amazon's massive retail capability and access to built-in customers that are already using the service, then add in some simple 'tutorial marketing' about streaming, they may be able to capture the hearts and wallets of the country consumer after all."

Although all the major streamers have,

um, boots on the ground in Nashville, it's Amazon's success with country that's prompted labels to react.


"It has altered our strategy in several ways, especially in how we introduce our artists into the marketplace as well as how we market our artists within each of the services," says Robold. "One encouraging element has been the willingness of the partners to spend consumer dollars of their own on select releases if there is a compelling enough plan that will benefit both sides."

With a retail policy of deep discounting, Amazon applied the same strategy to streaming via its Amazon Music Unlimited on-demand service. (Its initial streaming service, Prime Music, debuted in 2014; it's included with Prime membership, which also includes free shipping, video and more). With Amazon Music Unlimited, Amazon Prime members could get "tens of millions" of songs for \$7.99 per month or \$79 per year, less than a Spotify or Apple subscription. Non-Prime members pay \$9.99 per month, comparable to other streaming services.

"Our strategy has always been to expand premium music streaming to more customers, or those who are late to adopt streaming, through innovative products like Prime Music and Amazon Music Unlimited," says Boom. "Prime Music caters to the mainstream listener, offering more than 2 million songs plus thousands of playlists and stations for ad-free listening as part of your Prime membership. With Amazon Music Unlimited, we're offering a full catalog music service that's easier to use than anything else in the marketplace, thanks to Alexa. And we're offering unique models, such as our \$3.99/ month Echo Plan, that are expanding the premium-streaming segment.'

About 78% of Amazon Prime members already listen to Amazon Music, according to Cowen analyst John Blackledge, who estimates there are 49m Amazon Prime members.

As streaming numbers grow, Amazon continues to upgrade its proprietary gear: They just released the Echo Show (\$230), with a touch screen. It can be redundant with other tablet and smartphone devices, but should provide an interesting test to see whether consumers' loyalty to Alexa and Amazon can parallel the love affair consumers have long had with Apple.

With Echo, Amazon is carving its own path in the streaming economy: By moving streaming from the smartphone to the home, it hopes to restore communal experience to music listening. Amazon estimates it will sell 10m Echos in 2017. By 2020, that figure could increase to 40m.

"Because of the Echo and Dot, music is

now more important to Amazon than ever," notes Cindy Mabe. "That has resulted in Amazon being one of the most aggressive accounts coming up with promotional opportunities with our artists."

"The first phase of streaming was all about the smartphone, including for Amazon," says Boom. "But we're entering a new phase where growth will also be driven by other devices that are used in different places. Listening to music on Echo has really captured people's imaginations. Whenever we see someone talk to Alexa for the first time to ask for their favorite song, their eyes light up when that song starts playing. Powerful, but simple."

The company uses Prime and Alexa to funnel users to a subscription option and a free Echo trial. Amazon says the conversion rate is high (though we don't know

the numbers). Alexa upsells Prime customers, and because Amazon customers' credit info is already on hand, all it takes is a click to upgrade.

Like Apple, Amazon has such a diversified and cash-intensive business that it's able to grow its streaming biz without stressing about an immediate return—though judging by its quick growth in streaming marketshare, that return is already materializing.

"At Amazon, we're always thinking about the long-term view because we're so focused on building the best possible experiences for our customers," Boom says. "Success at this stage is continually innovating to ensure Amazon Music is a destination that our customers love to use because it's easy to find, discover and listen to the songs and artists they enjoy. We are very bullish about the long-term future of the music industry."





The Grammy Whisperer Looks Into

ust as there are two locks for Grammy nominations for Album of the Year (Ed Sheeran and Kendrick Lamar), there are two locks for noms in the Best Country Album competition—Miranda Lambert's The Weight of These Wings and Chris Stapleton's From A Room: Volume 1.

But a dark horse has suddenly emerged. The recent death of country legend **Glen Campbell could** push his final studio album, *Adiós*, to a nomination or even a win in this category. More on that later.


Both Lambert and Stapleton took Best Country Album for their last studio albums—*Platinum* and *Traveller*, respectively. Both artists would make Grammy history if they won again this year. Lambert would become the first female solo artist to win twice in the category. Stapleton would become the first male solo artist to win twice in the category

since Roger Miller more than 50 years ago. (Unfortunately, the Grammys dropped the category between 1966 and 1993, leaving a rather big hole in my research. I hate it when that happens.)


The Weight of These Wings won Album of the Year at the Academy of Country Music Awards on April 2. Stapleton's album hadn't been released at that point. The two albums will almost certainly go head-to-head at the CMA Awards on 11/8.

Here's how three top country races are shaping up at this point. The Grammy eligibility period ends Sept. 30. Nominations will be announced on Nov. 28. The awards will be presented on Jan. 28 at Madison Square Garden.

First, here's something you should know: The final nominees in the country field are decided by a Nominations Review Committee, which takes a second look at the votes of rank-and-file members. That will probably work to the advantage of such critically acclaimed artists as Jason Isbell and the 400 Unit and work against such commercial heavyweights as Florida Georgia Line. Just sayin'.

BEST COUNTRY ALBUM

THE LIKELY NOMINEES

MIRANDA LAMBERT, The Weight of These Wings. (Produced by Frank Liddell, Eric Masse, Glenn Worf). This would be Lambert's fourth consecutive studio album to be nominated in this category. She would become the third female solo artist to amass four or more noms in this category, following Trisha Yearwood, who leads all artists (male or female) with eight noms, and Faith Hill, who has had four.

CHRIS STAPLETON, *From A Room: Volume 1*. (Produced by Dave Cobb, Stapleton). This would be Stapleton's second album in a row to be nominated in this category. This is the top-selling country album so far in 2017.

JASON ISBELL AND THE 400 UNIT, The Nashville Sound. (Produced by Dave Cobb). This would be Isbell's first nom in this category. Isbell won Best Americana Album for his last album, Something More Than Free. Note: Sturgill Simpson, who won Best Country Album this past year for A Sailor's Guide to Earth, followed a similar Grammy trajectory. His previous album, Metamodern Sounds in Country Music, had been nominated for Best Americana Album.

LITTLE BIG TOWN, *The Breaker*. (Produced by Jay Joyce). This was the quartet's return to country after its pop experiment *Wanderlust* fizzled. This would be its third nom in this category.

GLEN CAMPBELL, *Adiós*. (Produced by Carl Jackson). This is this year's big question mark. The committee that decides the final nominations has to know that if this is nominated, it would stand an excellent chance of winning. Would a Campbell win be seen as a fitting farewell to a widely respected artist, or could the Grammys be faulted for honoring the most important country artist of 1967 at the expense of the most important country artists of 2017? That question will be hotly debated when the committee meets. The answer to that question will likely determine whether the album is nominated or not.

DEEP GRAMMY TRIVIA: Campbell would be the first artist to win in this category posthumously, but he wouldn't be the first to be nominated posthumously. Jim Reeves was nominated posthumously for the 1964 award. Reeves was nominated again the following year, when he was joined by the long-departed Hank Williams (who died in 1953).

OTHER LEADING CONTENDERS

ZAC BROWN BAND, *Welcome Home*. (Produced by Dave Cobb). This would be the group's fourth nom in this category. That would put them in a tie with Dixie Chicks for the most noms in this category by a group. The band was nominated in this category with three consecutive studio albums, but missed out with its fourth major-label album, *Jekyll* + *Hyde*. Will its fifth major-label album put it back in the running? A nomination would potentially give producer Cobb three of the five nominees for Best Country Album.

ALISON KRAUSS, Windy City. (Produced by Buddy Cannon). This was Krauss' first solo studio album in nearly 18 years. It would be her third nom in this category (counting an album with Union Station).

BRANTLEY GILBERT, *The Devil Don't Sleep*. (Produced by Dann Huff. Executive producer: Scott Borchetta). This would be Gilbert's first nom in this category.

THOMAS RHETT, *Life Changes* (due Sept. 8). (Produced by Dann Huff, Jesse Frasure, Rhett). This would be Rhett's first nom in this category. This is his first album release since the, well, life-changing success of "Die a Happy Man."

LADY ANTEBELLUM, *Heart Break*. (Produced by busbee). The trio won back-to-back awards in this category with 2010's *Need You Now* and 2011's *Own the Night*, but wasn't nominated with its two subsequent studio albums.

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
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
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












ebut albums often do well in this category. In the past five years, debut albums by Hunter Hayes, Kacey Musgraves, Brandy Clark, Sam Hunt, Chris Stapleton (his solo debut) and Maren Morris (her major-label debut) have been nominated or won in this category. Will the pattern continue this year? Debut albums that have made noise this year include Brett Young's Brett Young (Produced by Dann Huff); Luke Combs' This One's for You (Produced by The Jackie Boyz, Sammy Mitchell, Scott Moffatt); and Kane Brown's Kane Brown (Produced by Dann Huff, Matthew McVaney).

SHANIA TWAIN, *Now* (due Sept. 29). (Produced by Ron Aniella, Jake Gosling, Jacquire King, Matthew Koma, Twain). This is Twain's first studio album in nearly 15 years. It would be her fourth consecutive studio album to receive a nom in this category. If it is nominated, she'll join that little club of women with four or more noms in this category—Yearwood, Hill, Lambert and Twain. (Now there's a law firm you'd enjoy doing business with.)

WILLIE NELSON, God's Problem Child. (Produced by Buddy Cannon). This would be Nelson's sixth nomination in this category. That would put him out front as the male solo artist with the most noms. He's currently tied for that distinction with George Strait, with five each.

GARTH BROOKS, Gunslinger. (Produced by Mark Miller). This category re-launched in 1994, so it missed out on the five years in which Brooks achieved megastardom. Even so, the country icon has been nominated here just once, with Sevens nearly 20 years ago.

KENNY CHESNEY, Cosmic Hallelujah. (Produced by Buddy Cannon, Chesney). Would you believe Chesney has never been nominated for Best Country Album? Chesney is one of the biggest country stars of the past two decades. Go figure.

ADDITIONAL POSSIBILITIES

Josh Turner, Deep South; Blackberry Smoke, Like an Arrow; Dylan Scott, Dylan Scott; Brett Eldredge's Brett Eldredge; Brad Paisley's Love and War; Lauren Alaina, Road Less Traveled; Old Dominion, Happy Endings (Aug. 25); Luke Combs, This One's for You; Kane Brown, Kane Brown; Chris Janson, Everybody (Sept. 22); Chase Rice, Lambs & Lions (Sept. 29).

NOTE: Reba McEntire's Sing It Now: Songs of Faith and Hope topped the country chart in February, but it will probably compete for Best Contemporary Christian Music Album. Another country star, Hillary Scott (of Lady Antebellum) won in that category this past year for Love Remains, which she recorded with The Scott Family.

BEST COUNTRY SOLO PERFORMANCE

In the six years that men and women have competed head-to-head in this category, women have won four times.

THE LIKELY NOMINEES

MIRANDA LAMBERT, "Tin Man." This would be Lambert's fourth nom in this category. That would put her just behind **Carrie Underwood** as the top nominee in the category's history. Underwood has been nominated five times.

CHRIS STAPLETON, "Broken Halos." This would be Stapleton's second nom in this category. He won two years ago for the title song from *Traveller*. If this wins, he'll become the first male artist to win twice since the combined male/female category was introduced in 2011.

SAM HUNT, "Body Like a Back Road." This would be Hunt's first nom in this category. This smash broke the record for most weeks at #1 on the country chart. The old record was held by **Florida Georgia Line**'s "Cruise"—which was passed over for a nom for Best Country Duo/ Group Performance.

BRETT YOUNG, "In Case You Didn't Know." This ballad is the year's second best-selling country hit.

GLEN CAMPBELL, "Adiós." Even if the committee decides not to nominate Campbell's album for Best Country Album, it could honor him by nominating the title track—a Jimmy Webb song—here.

NOTE: As noted above, **Carrie Underwood** has been nominated five times in this combined male/female category, missing out only one year. Her hit "Dirty Laundry" could keep her streak going, but it was released on Sept. 5, 2016—25 days before the end of the previous eligibility year. How rigorously does the Recording Academy enforce its eligibility period rules? I think we're about to find out.

OTHER LEADING CONTENDERS

LUKE COMBS, "Hurricane." This is one of the year's top country hits. **MAREN MORRIS**, "I Could Use a Love Song." Morris won in this category last year for "My Church." Both of these songs are from her album, *Hero*, which was nominated last year for Best Country Album.

KELSEA BALLERINI, "Yeah Boy." Ballerini's "Peter Pan" was passed over for a nom last year in this category, but she was nominated for Best New Artist.

DIERKS BENTLEY, "Black." This would be Bentley's second nom in this category. He was nominated four years ago for "Home."

ADDITIONAL POSSIBILITIES

Blake Shelton, "Every Time I Hear That Song;" Thomas Rhett, "Unforgettable;" Jon Pardi, "Heartache on the Dance Floor;" Dustin Lynch, "Small Town Boy;" Jason Aldean, "Any Ol' Barstool;" Luke Bryan, "Fast;" Brett Eldredge, "Somethin' I'm Good At;" Billy Currington, "Do I Make You Wanna;" Justin Moore, "Somebody Else Will;" Kenny Chesney, "Bar at the End of the World;" Brad Paisley, "Today;" RaeLynn, "Love Triangle;" Josh Turner, "All About You;" Brantley Gilbert, "The Ones That Like Me;" Walker Hayes, "You Broke Up With Me;" Kip Moore, "More Girls Like You;" Russell Dickerson, "Yours"; Chris Janson, "Fix a Drink"; Kane Brown, "Ain't No Stopping Us Now"; Shania Twain, "Life's About to Get Good"; Garth Brooks, "Let's Lay Down and Dance."

BEST COUNTRY DUO/ GROUP PERFORMANCE

ollaborations compete with tracks by ongoing groups and duos in this category. In the six years that they have competed here, collabos have taken at least two of the spots every year. Yet, a collabo has won the award just once in these six years. That was last year when Pentatonix's version of "Jolene," featuring the song's writer, Dolly Parton, took the award.

THE LIKELY NOMINEES

LITTLE BIG TOWN, "Better Man." This would be the group's fifth nom in this category. The group won for "Pontoon" and "Girl Crush." Little Big Town and The Civil Wars are the only two-time winners in the category's six-year history.

THOMAS RHETT featuring Maren Morris, "Craving You." These

two artists competed against each other at the Grammys this past year. Both were nominated for Best Country Song—he for "Die a Happy Man," she for "My Church."

TIM MCGRAW & FAITH HILL, "Speak to a Girl." Six of the couple's previous collaborations have received Grammy noms—and that's not even counting an all-star 1996 collabo on which they both appeared, "Hope: Country Music's Quest for a Cure."

KESHA featuring Dolly Parton, "Old Flames (Can't Hold a Candle to You)." This remake of Parton's 1980 hit (a country #1) has special meaning. Kesha's mom, Pebe Sebert, co-wrote the song. Women voters, especially, may be inclined to vote for Kesha as a show of support in her ongoing legal fight against her former producer. As noted above, Parton won in this category last year for a collaboration with Pentatonix. (Four other artists best known for pop or rock—Kelly Clarkson, Grace Potter, Elle King and P!nk—have been nominated in this category in the six years it has been presented.)

LADY ANTEBELLUM, "You Look Good." This funky track was a real departure for the trio, which won twice in a predecessor category, Best Country Performance by a Duo or Group with Vocals, for "I Run to You" and "Need You Now." Fun Fact: Lady A is the only country duo or group to win five Grammys in one night (for "Need You Now" and the album of the same name).

OTHER LEADING CONTENDERS

ZAC BROWN BAND, "My Old Man." The band won in a predecessor category, Best Country Collaboration with Vocals, for "As She's Walking Away," a collabo with **Alan Jackson**. Fun Fact: Zac Brown Band is the only country group or duo ever to win the Grammy for Best New Artist.

BROTHERS OSBORNE, "It Ain't My Fault." This would be the third straight year the duo has been nominated in this category with a song from its first full-length album, *Paun Shop*. It was nominated two years ago for "Stay a Little Longer" and this past year for "21 Summer."

FLORIDA GEORGIA LINE featuring Backstreet Boys, "God, Your Mama, and Me." The duo's #1 country smash "H.O.L.Y." wasn't nominated last year. But the presence of Backstreet Boys, who were nominated for Album and Record of the Year and Best New Artist back in the day, may prove irresistible to the committee. The Grammys love it when artists from different worlds come together.



Last month, after receiving an advance stream of the latest Arcade Fire album Everything Now, on the tenth listen through, I felt compelled to send Win Butler an email to convey my feelings. I've worked on the band's behalf since the release of Funeral, their 2004 debut, so sending him an email wasn't that unexpected: "Dear Win, I love it so. 'You Don't Deserve Love' kills me. Like I said when you first played it for me at Scott's house, it reminds me of NYC in 1981, when the arrival of Ed Koch as mayor made housing for artists unaffordable and it all went underground. Disco was strictly 'bridge and tunnel,' but hip-hop had caught our attention—knowing all the words to 'Rapper's Delight' was a college party trick, plus there was this incredible dance music coming out-Tom Tom Club, ESG, Bush Tetras, Material, Liquid Liquid, League of Gentleman (once a prog nerd...), etc. Protest songs with a killer beat. We'd go to Danceteria and the Peppermint Lounge to see our friends' bands-R.E.M., Pylon, Mission of Burma, etc., always for free, and dance for hours after. We were cool by any definable standard. I went to Oberlin and spent my days at the college radio station. We took road trips to DC for college radio conventions and discovered the Go-Go/Thrash scene, where Trouble Funk and Minor Threat would share a stage. When The Clash played 17 shows at the Bond International Casino, we pushed our way to the front of the stage for the two shows we were able to wrangle our way into. We would've never been allowed to enter Studio 54 or the Palladium or Area. Nor would we have wanted to. Your record captures what it felt like to be broke in NYC, before Koch had completely transformed Times Square into Disneyland. It was such a formative time in my life. Kids need an escape even more today than we did then—the music you're making now evokes that tension and heartfelt release. Here's to its success! I hope to see you soon-my love to all. xxkg"... Win's response was brief and very kind, which added fuel to my ongoing thesis that dance music, played on real instruments, with culturally aware lyrics, has an important place in current music. LCD Soundsystem's "Call the Police" harkens back to the "Fuck Art, Let's Dance" sentiment we felt at the onset of the Reagan administration. KROQ adding "Nobody Speak" by DJ Shadow f/Run the Jewels this week, which Lazlo at KRBZ has already played 800 times, is an important step toward giving a musical voice to how fucked things are right now. This song has been out for a while, with early support from KCMP, Alt Nation and KQGO, among others, and hearing it on the radio is a welcome antidote... Beck's new single, "Dear Life," which arrived yesterday, has the chorus, "Dear life, I'm holding on"—a highly relatable sentiment... As long as there's a faction of people self-ordained as the "Alt Right," I refuse to refer to our radio format as Alternative. As long as I am reading articles like "Why the Far Right Wants to Be the New 'Alternative' Culture" in the New York Times, I will refer to the format as Modern Rock. Thank you... Rarely, timed around a solar eclipse, perhaps, a song comes out that is PURE MAGIC. All of the "metrics" we pray for are immediate: Shazams, streams, calls, sales, etc. If we're lucky, we bear witness to one or two of those in our career. Alice Merton's "No Roots," released by our friends at Mom + Pop, is that record. Mark Hamilton at KNRK is the spin leader thus far, with nearly equal emphatic support from KGSR in Austin, Alt Nation and WFUZ in Wilkes-Barre. The ordered rollout of stations reminds me of Bishop Briggs' "River" (which has already sold gold/nearing platinum), except I think the chart success for "No Roots" will be even faster. David Jacobs is leading the charge on this—such an exciting project!... Arkells' "Knocking at the Door" has been #1 on the Canadian Modern Rock chart for the past 12 weeks. As they say up north, every record has a shot at going #1 in Canada, but it's unheard of for a song to stay there for as long as this one has! "Knocking at the Door" is an unmitigated smash.

NOT LOST IN TRANSLATION: It's been a banner year for Latin music. Let's start with Sony/ ATV's Latin division, not only because it claims Luis Fonsi. Daddy Yankee and "Despacito" co-scribe Erika Ender among its writers, but also a stake in smashes like Maluma's "Felices Los 4," Nicky Jam's "El Amante." Enrique Iglesias feat. Descemer Bueno and Zion & Lennox's "Súbeme La Radio," "Escapate Conmigo" by Wisin feat. Ozuma and "Chantaje" by Shakira feat. Maluma. Add Latin Publisher of the Year from the three leading PROs and you have what Marty Bandier calls "a perfect storm." Props to Marty and team, including President, Latin America and U.S. Latin Jorge Mejia and Co-Prexy Danny Strick... UMPG, meanwhile, may well have the next crossover megamonster with writer J Balvin's "Mi Gente" (recorded by Balvin with Willy William), which is a bona fide juggernaut. What might take the song to the next level? Company Chairman Jody Gerson, EVP of Latin Music Alexandra Lioutikoff and compadres have plenty more up their sleeves. They have two writers on the aforementioned "Felices Los 4" (Miky La Sensa & Eliezer Palacios), and a piece of two viral climbers: "Robarte Un Beso," recorded by Carlos Vives and Sebastian Yatra and co-penned by their Yatra, and "Krippy Kush" by Farruko, Bad Bunny and Ryssian and cowritten by the latter. of Jody, of course, is celebrating a mad marketshare gain, flying to second place on the pie chart and just two points behind leader Sony/ATV in the most recent tabulation... Warner/Chappell writers Andres Torres and Mauricio Rengifo also contributed to the monster "Despacito." Then there's writer/producer Chris Jeday's bow as an artist, "Ahora Dice" f/J Balvin, Ozuna and Arcángel (already smokin' on the video charts). Jedav co-wrote and produced "Súbeme La Radio" and multiple songs on Ozuna's new full-length. (Stay tuned for more news from the Latin world). Meanwhile. Big Jon's A&R rulers Rvan Press and Katie Vinten and team are celebrating, among other hits, the Shawn Mendes monster "There's Nothin' Holding Me Back" (Island) co-written by Scott Harris; DJ Khaled's "Wild Thoughts" (We The Best/Epic), co-penned by W/C writers Partynextdoor and Rihanna, which leads at Rhythmic and Urban radio and has traded the top spot at iTunes with "Despacito;" Portugal. The Man's powerhouse "Feel It Still" (co-written by Zach Carothers & Kyle O'Quin) scaled the Alternative chart; and Imagine Dragons' "Believer" (co-crafted by Justin Tranter and Mattman & Robin) leads at Hot AC... Writer/ producer Hudson Mohawke, who has worked with Kanye West, Drake, A\$AP Rocky, Pharrell, Lil Wayne, Future and John Legend, among others, has signed a worldwide copublishing deal with SONGS. In other SONGS news, props to Partner and Head of Creative Licensing Carianne Marshall on joining the MusiCares Foundation Board. Rumors that Carianne is demanding a South Park cartoon version of herself couldn't be confirmed at press time...

Gene Sandbloom is leaving KROQ. It's GENE SANDBLOOM hard for me to realize that, while I've bounced around labels here in Los Angeles, Gene has been at KROQ for 25 years. In today's media world, that's truly a remarkable achievement. The professionalism Gene exudes in this industry is priceless. It's always been priceless. Of course, in record promotion, you're not always going to hear what you want to, but Gene has a knack for letting you know what's going on, good or bad. If you need someone to go see a baby On the road again. band with you on a Tuesday night at

10pm, Gene's always been that guy, helping you out and making you look good with your bosses. I admire his love of the format and how he respects the process. Over the years, he's helped me break many songs, and I can't thank him enough for that. As Modern Rock moves forward, I can only hope that the people who come along and enter the format will be like Gene Sandbloom. We as an industry should only be so lucky. On a personal note, Gene has also inspired me and my family with travel. I could listen to him talk about all his trips around the world for hours. It's infectious.

Even more change is upon us this week, as Jack Daniel leaves WEND Charlotte after a 22-year run as the station's only Program Director. If memory serves, Jack's been in Charlotte radio for over 40 years—another truly remarkable achievement. This man's always been a total pro when I've called and asked him to play a wacky Alt record. Our pal and colleague Nan Fisher is super close with Jack, so I asked her to share a few thoughts.

I sit here today, still stunned by what's been announced. Jack Daniel and WEND have been synonyms for most of my career. I'll miss his humor, kindness and humanity. Being a radio guy is certainly a part of who Jack is, but he's also a caring and generous man, a loving husband, devoted father and grandfather (or "Paw Paw"; sorry, Jack....). Over the last months, Jack and I had a call time established—11am on Thursdays. So rather than calling on Wednesday, when I wanted to [and when the news broke], I called him on Thursday. At 11.
