Emmis Rocks, NBC Rolls (Over)

Seven years ago, Emmis Broadcasting began operation in Indianapolis with just one station and sparse staff.

How times have changed.

Last week, Emmis purchased five NBC O&O stations for a whopping \$121.5 million. That brings the Emmis radio station total to 12.

The stations in the deal are WNBC-AM and WYNY-FM in WKQX-FM, York: Chicago; WJIB-FM, Boston; and KYUU-FM, San Francisco.

Emmis already owns an AM-FM combo in New York (WFAN-AM & WQHT-FM) and FCC cross-ownership regulations require Emmis to sell one pair. Despite some insiders' claim that Emmis will try to trade the New York properties for an FM station in a high growth market, the company's President & CEO Jeff Smulyan told Hits:

"There is no set plan yet. We're just going to wait and see what happens. We're going to take bids from people and figure out the best alternative."

Regarding personnel changes at the stations, Smulyan noted: "Our strategy is always to keep the people that we inherit. First we will give them the benefit of the doubt. We'll probably need some more people, but we just don't know yet."

For NBC, the sale spells the end of an era, one that saw the broadcasting giant rise as a pioneer in radio. None of NBC's stations could exactly be termed profit blockbusters. One source speculated that the five stations sold to Emmis collectively lost close to \$1 million last year, with losses from the two New York stations overriding gains by the other three.

NBC did not include two of its properties in the sale to Emmis. WKYS-FM Washington will likely go to a minority buyer in the next couple of weeks. Sources are saying that station could fetch up to \$40 million, with an additional \$10 million tax credit for NBC for selling to a minority buyer.

KNBR-AM in San Francisco was withdrawn from the group sale because its value is tied up in the San Francisco Giants baseball franchise. That agreement ends next year.

For now, Emmis is sitting pretty in the driver's seat and looking directly into the future. "We'd like to think this isn't the end," said Emmis' Smulyan. "We just want to keep growing. That's our goal."

And the company is not without its share of fans on the outside. According to

Z100 Supremo Scott Shannon who rang in from his carphone, "Emmis is a very progressive company. I have immense respect for them and feel the level broadcasting will improve dramatically. Now get out of my face and go bother some other bobo." (For further details, see the Wavelength column.)


Night At The Opera

ON RECORDS By Lenny Beer

The Top Of The Chart

SOUNDTRACKS: The Dirty Dancing soundtrack (RCA) continues to astound. It has increased in sales every week since the movie was released to video stores and is pulling away from the powerful George Michael (Columbia) set and a strong group of top album sellers. The LP has already produced three strong Top Ten singles winners and shows no letup in sight. Now, the powerful Good Morning Vietnam (A&M) soundtrack is making its move. The movie has reached the 70 million ticket level and the album is really kicking in. With the Louis Armstrong single now reaching a solid rotation level at radio, exposure for the project will be increasing every week. Whether or not this album has the power to overtake the RCA winner is still to be seen. However, it is becoming more and more obvious that it will shortly be a contender in the national Top Five.

TOP TEN WINNERS: Album sales do not always (or even usually) follow pretty patterns. They surge, level, fall and often surge again. Longevity is the key to megasellers. Take David Lee Roth's solo album (WB) for example. It has quickly soared into the Top Ten, but its initial surge now seems to be leveling in the 5-10 range. It should hold in that range for some time based on maximum singles and video play aiding its sellthrough. However, its chances for chart-topping status appear to rest on the possibility of mul-

tiple hit cuts..... Debbie Gibson's album (Atlantic) has had a much different pattern. It started slowly and didn't really catch fire until late in the growth pattern of her second hit single. Its first surge took the elpee to #10 where it sat for weeks. Then with the solid help of her third 45, the album surged again to #7. Now, after another leveling period, the album is gaining ground again and in position to make another run for the top..... Now, AC/DC (Atlantic) is soaring out of the chute as heavy metal albums tend to do. It is an immediate contender for the Top Ten, but probably not for the top. Then again, if it can produce that mass appeal hit (Whitesnake (Geffen) did it, Dokken (Elektra) just missed), the sky is the limit.

INT'L WINNER: Look out for the Pet Shop Boys' remake of "Always On My Mind" (EMI/Manh). It has been their biggest European hit to date and it ships here next week. We look for quick action at Top 40 radio.

Denver's Got Hart






n Brad Hunt's 75 Rock office, staffers are talking an alphabet soup of call-letters like FMI, BCN, YUU, XKS and KTU while running memos and making calls. There's electricity in the air at Elektra these days, as Hunt and his staff are clearly charged up by the fact 1987 was the label's biggest year to date. Under President Bob Krasnow's direction, Hunt, the new Senior VP of Promotion, and his staff have helped bring Elektra back to the top of the charts.

"Never give up," says Hunt of his philosophy. Someone sticks his head into the office while we're talking, and tells the promotion topper that Atlanta's "on" and Boston's an "add." Hunt claps his hands and furiously jots down the info.

As the bearded exec explains, platinum and gold don't come easy when you're dealing with a roster that is comprised largely of developing acts. But the company's strategy of nurturing homegrown talent from its own roster rather than acquiring established stars has resulted in an enormous payback. During Hunt's five years with Elektra, after coming over from MCA— first as a regional promotion manager in Boston, then east coast album radio director and now, Sr. VP— he has worked heretofore unknowns like the Georgia Satellites, Dokken, the Cure and Simply Red into charting acts.





What do you think is most responsible for Elektra's resurgence?

First of all, obviously, the top management of the label. Bob Krasnow has a great pair of ears and he's been able to sign the right acts. Another thing is, we don't let projects die. Everybody involved in this company is instilled with that fact. For example, I'm sitting here talking about 150,000 units for 10,000 Maniacs this time; last time they did 20,000 records. Guadalcanal Diary, which we're working on album radio right now, did about 20,000 on their last record; at this point, their new album is at about 60,000. And that goes for act after act after act. We don't give up. We took our groups and decided to stick with them. We set goals for ourselves. Nobody in-house ever suggested a quick-fix solution of any kind. The path was to stay with the projects we had. And it's panned out. We had the biggest year in our history last year.

What are your plans for this

We have a lot of urban contemporary product coming out in '88. And we're going to get on these records early, like we did with Keith Sweat. We didn't wait for that record to go Top Five R&B before we serviced it to Top 40. The Peabo Bryson record is the same thing; we serviced that record to all three formats at the same time. It's all a matter of getting these records to radio a little bit earlier. Time is always of the essence. I think you lose records by waiting too long and that is a definite problem for most record companies.

What are the big priorities for this first quarter?


We have this Keith Sweat record, which is crossing over in a hurry. We already have a lot of major market radio and we're getting a lot more. The Dokken record is a millionand-a-half and we're trying to

cross a single over to Top 40. It's another one of those that's not going to go away. With Dokken, we were scratching and clawing four years ago to get to 100,000; this time we're fifteen times that. I think the Cure's "Hot Hot Hot" is going to be the single which will bring them over the plateau we've already established.

Here's a quick history of the Cure. Their top album, which was the last one for their previous label, sold less than 50,000 units. We signed the band and they did 400,000 for the "Head On The Door" album. We just knew the time was right for them. It had been building. This band had always been able to come to anyone's town and sell out the hockey rink. Then, we put out that greatest hits record and it is almost at 800,000 now. It's been out a year-and-a-half and it did 4,000 pieces yesterday. Then we released this two-record set, and a lot of people said we were taking a chance on a \$13.98 two-LP package. It might have been a risk but the bottom line was. the music was in the grooves. Robert Smith is an extremely talented songwriter. Eventually, radio has to catch on to what the public already knows.

You just can't throw in the towel. It's real easy when the first single doesn't do so well to just lay back. But Bob Krasnow's A&R philosophy permeates this entire company. We go into every project with that as a reality. What we're doing is building for the long run at Elektra Records. We don't go out and spend millions of dollars for superstars: to develop we're trying platinum acts ourselves. And it works. We've got a 10,000 Maniacs record that is at 150,000 units with little or no airplay on any format, but the public has caught on. We just released a new single, "Like the Weather," which we're working at album radio, adult and Top 40. It's time to move that base into mass appeal.

10,000 Maniacs started at college radio. How important



is the format in breaking new acts?

No question about it, college radio does extremely well with a lot of our acts. The Cure emerged out of college radio. The Screaming Blue Messiahs are another college band we've enjoyed success with. College radio is very important. It not only gives groups a sales base to work off of, it helps with touring, also. The exposure really allows new bands to play clubs and the smaller venues in most major cities. That, in turn, offers you the opportunity to get the programmers from commercial radio out to see the band, and then you've got 'em. College radio enables these bands to secure dates across the country.

Do live shows have as much of an effect on the marketplace today as they once did?

For the most part, [touring] still sells records. When the Cure go into a marketplace, they sell a lot of records. Constant touring has definitely helped 10,000 Maniacs. Once you get that sales base, it gives you a story to go to radio with. The effect of touring is real important to us and it's

one of the things that we demand from our bands. As a result, when they go on the road, we give them total support.

At what point do you decide to take a college radio success to the next step?

We don't wait for a record to go #1. We generally work these projects in conjunction with album radio or straight out of the box. We don't wait until a record has run its course at college because I think there are a lot of places where the formats — especially college and album radio — complement each other. I think it's more a matter of *not* waiting. We try to be aggressive. If you snooze, you lose.

What's been the biggest surprise for you in terms of breaking an act?

The Georgia Satellites. I sometimes wonder whether anybody even here knew how big this act would be. When you get a song like "Keep Your Hands To Yourself," which breaks that quickly at album radio and crosses as quickly as it did Top 40, and you go platinum on a band that nobody knew two-and-a-half months before, I think that has to be the greatest gratification

so far.

The other satisfaction comes from getting a record after you've worked really hard on it. For example, with Simply Red, it seemed to take forever but we finally wound up with a #1 record with "Holding Back The Years." We stretched the Anita Baker record out over two vears and it still sells 10,000 pieces every day and continues to grow. It'll be at four million before she even releases her next album. And with the Cure, it took five months to bring that single home.

How do you turn a regional buzz into a national blast?

A clear example of how a record happens is with Simply Red. Simply Red was largely a western phenomenon which started in San Francisco and spread up and down the coast, making everybody else pay attention to it. KYUU in S. F. just beat "Holding Back The Years" to death and wouldn't let up even before it was released as a single. Once you had San Francisco, Los San Angeles. Diego, Sacramento and San Jose, you couldn't deny the record any longer. So there's a situation where a region of the country took a record and bases covered.

What do you see as the differences between Elektra and other record companies you've worked for?

It's tough to make an across-the-board generalization but I think the difference between us and other labels is that everybody at the top level of management in the promotion department at this company has come up through the field staff. It's not very often we hire from the outside. The CBS Group may be the only other label in the same position. I've been here five years and everybody has come up through the ranks. We stress communication among the staff on a daily basis and I'm not just talking about the national staff filtering down through the local staff. All of our local promotion managers call one another and talk with one another. I think it's a real inspiration when people see that there's opportunity to rise. Like, "Hey, if this asshole can make it all the way up from Boston to Senior Vice President, maybe I can go from Detroit or wherever to the top." (laughs) I think that's real important. It gives everyone a big incentive.

broke it in the marketplace, which allowed us to take it to the rest of the country. That's what a region can do these days— make a story for the record. With Simply Red, it was the third single from that album which hit. That was a long time down the line.

My experience has always been that it's real hard to tell a regional story unless you've got all the players in. If you have a two or three-format record, it means you've covered both or all formats within that region. Otherwise, if you lose a place somewhere down the line, it's almost like the domino theory. You've got to make sure you have all your

Another major thing is, because most of our acts have been signed in the last five years, we've worked these groups. We know them from day one. Toughest thing about leaving this record company and you can ask Dave Urso, Mike Bone or anybody else - is, one, the people, and 1-A, the roster. Because we've done it. When you bust your ass to get the Cure and when you bust your ass to break Georgia Satellites and Simply Red and Howard Jones and all those people, it's very tough to leave. You're alwavs inspired to build on what you did the last time. So that makes us just a tad different.

An exclusive Hits interview with Reggie Blackwell, P.D., WBCY in Charlotte, NC

his Martinsville, VA native, a 20-year broadcasting veteran, was a Citizen's Band freak who got his start in radio while still a high school student at WHEE in his hometown. While attending Appalcahian State in Boone, NC, he worked nights at WATA before stints in Georgia, Orlando

When did you decide that radio was in your future?

I was into electronics and had built a Citizen's Band radio kit. I talked to several people in the community and one of them happened to be the V. P. of the local radio station, which was WHEE. He started holding Citizen's Band radio meetings at his station. I became interested in all the buttons, turntables and the hype. I had to have it. That's what got me into it, believe it or not.

How big a part did music play in your choice?

I was always a musician. My family was musically inclined and, from the time I was a toddler, I was always playing a piano or something. So, I had a pretty deep background in music. In fact, when I went to college, I majored in music. Since that is what radio's product is, I have a very deep interest in current pop music.

Who were some of your heroes in radio at the time?

I was one of the guys that would sit in a tiny bedroom in Virginia at night and tune in my 9volt transistor to WLS in Chicago with Art Roberts, Dick Biondi, Fred Winston, Larry Lujack and Johns "Records" Landecker. I remember the battles between WLS and WCFL in those days. I keep thinking back to those times and remembering what I'd listen to and what it used to sound like, what the jocks used to do. Some of the things I still do on the air today go back to listening to WLS back then.

Did hearing great radio when

you were young contribute at all to your current success?

Oh yeah. You see, now you don't get to hear a lot of great radio unless you hear it in your own market. Those 100,000-watt FM's only go so far and then they drop off. You just don't hear a lot of markets unless you have a listen line number. You used to be able to hear those clear channel stations like KOMA in Oklahoma City and WNBC and WABC in New York City. We got to hear big market radio and big market ideas. That would wear off on you. Today, all you have is what you pick up on tape, listen lines and what the guy across the street is doing.

and Jacksonville, FL, where he took his first P. D. gig at WAIV. He followed with P. D. posts at KOPA in Phoenix, WROQ in Charlotte and WKZL in Winston-Salem before assuming his current job at WBCY last October.

because they are very resilient and able to adapt a lot better than we think. I don't believe it bothers them too much until they get into their teens. Then, they start developing friends and long relationships and that's when it starts to hurt.

What's going on in the Charlotte market?

Charlotte, with the addition of an NBA team next season, is going to bring in a lot of new business, new people, new attitudes and a little more professionalism because this is basically a laid-back, middle American, southern town. We have a lot of blue collar workers, try to keep up with as many people as possible. Naturally I try to talk more with people in my region to get better feedback because they're living the same kind of life I am.

Does Top 40 radio need and is it ready to accept, some new rock bands into its mix?

Well, it depends how big your balls are. Remember, in 1977 and '78, disco killed Top 40 radio because there wasn't an alternative, and, if you take a look at research from market to market, most people state that disco/dance happens to be a form of music that is low on the totem pole as far as individual tastes go. The biggest requests now are for rock, preferably older rock. I foresee formats running into a rock-based, older, familiar sound.

Now this "New Rock" music is a familiar sound. I heard a lot of this music back in the '60s. I hear a lot of the same chords, tones and attitudes. Also, consider that middle America Charlotte in the past few months has opened three alternative clubs. A lot of bands record here, too. Most of this music appeals to 18-24-year-olds. That is a demo that's very hard to get to return diaries, so you don't get any feedback in the Arbitron. But that music sells. I think it's something that Top 40 should take a look at. You have to be very careful because not all of it is that good. But a lot of it is quality stuff. Look at Bryan Ferry. Or 10,000 Maniacs, who are starting to get Adult action. Or Love & Rockets, Warren Zevon....the kids 18-24 are dancing to it while the teens are dancing to Jody Watley, Tiffany and Madonna. Yes, it is a viable product.

Program Directors are forced to move a great deal. How do you and your family deal with that?

I try to hide. See you when you get there. Call the movers. It gets to the point now that you get into a routine and you know what it takes. Once again, experience allows you to resist a lot of the pressures and stress that you have to go through. I think the biggest thing in moving is getting used to the new location. It has its drawbacks and it is a pain in the ass sometimes, but you do get used to it after awhile.

I think it affects my wife and myself more than it does the kids

but this is also the financial center of the South. We're seeing a lot of white collar growth and, as a result, you're starting to see more cosmopolitan styles cropping up. Some of the conservativism is starting to go. The whole southern power structure is beginning to change.

Who do you talk with in the industry on a regular basis?

I try to touch base with most everyone I can. I don't really network with any one particular group of people. I've been in the business over twenty years and my acquaintances run deep, so I

THE LATEST ON **UP AND COMING BANDS**

English rhythmic popsters, Underworld kicked off the release of their U.S. debut on SIRE this week with a live listening party at Evergreen Studios in Burbank. The album "Underneath the Radar", produced by Rupert Hine, was itself recorded in one take and the band re-enacted the event for the benefit of all the gathered faithful. including most of the WARNERS tribe, to witness. The title track is the lead off single in various re-mixed permutations, plus video accompaniment.....Another new pop contender, So are looking good with "Are You Sure" from their debut album "Horseshow in the Glove" on EMI/MANHATTAN, which also comes with an impressive video that's getting wide TV airplay.....Robyn Hitchcock & the Egyptians may finally be getting the radio respect they deserve with the single "Balloon Man" from his latest release on A&M "Globe of Frogs".....Likewise the Godfathers are raising a few programming eyebrows with their worthy single "Birth School Work Death", off the EPIC album of the same name......Another new prospect is the new Canadian rock band, Blvd with their first release on MCA called "Boulevard" which features a hot first single "Never Give Up". Blvd. marks the first signing incidentally by MCA Canada's office. And also on MCA is the first by Will & the Kill, Austin guitar-rock led by Will Sexton, Charlie's younger brother. The first single is called "Hearts of Steel" and the album is produced by Austin neighbor, Joe Ely. The 12" goes to Album Radio and Alternative this week and a video is on the way, also filmed in Austin......Country contender Jimmy Dale Gilmore has his new record "Fair Square" out on HIGHTONE, also produced by Joe Ely.....The first single from Nashville-based songwriter, Pat McLaughlin's upcoming CAPITOL debut is out now, called "Wrong Number" while the first single off country chanteuse Nanci Griffith's new album "Little Love Affairs" is out on MCA called "I Knew Love" and Nanci is out on tour in support.....Highly respected guitarist/producer (Los Lobos, Costello etc.), T-Bone Burnett is touring behind his first release for COLUMBIA called "The Talking Animals", which features a vocal contribution from U2's Bono....And speaking of Bono, MCA has released a mighty compilation album from Self-Aid, the benefit concert held last year in Ireland to help create jobs for the Irish unemployed. Entitled "Live for Ireland", it features Elvis Costello doing the reggae classic, "Many Rivers to Cross", the Pogues with "Dirty Old Town", Van Morrison singing "Here Comes the Knight" - a new song, not the old Van nugget - plus U2, the Boomtown Rats, Christy Moore and others.......When will European band the Sugarcubes ever see the light of day on a major U.S. label? The band had a huge U.K. hit with "Birthday" and are a tipped to have the same success here..... Let's get a few things straight here: the new Morrissey project is on SIRE/REPRISE; as are The Mighty Lemon Drops and The Wild Swans. Jane Siberry is on REPRISE (just Reprise) and Underworld, Echo & The Bunnymen and Martini Ranch are on SIRE/WB. Are you clear now?..... And speaking of Martini Ranch, they've just released a hot new 12" called "Reach" that should be serviced to Top 40 anyday now. There's an album due in a couple of weeks, and the buzz is really starting to go on this one.

Big Chill Down Under

Hits interview
with Icehouse's
Iva Davies

Icehouse first came to the US seven years ago as one of many Australian bands trying to find success over here. Since then, they have built a solid following with their self-titled debut and subsequent three albums and EP. But it's with the current "Man Of Colours" that the sextet—fronted by original member, vocalist/keyboardist/guitarist Iva Davies—began to get some serious Top 40 action. The new single, "Electric Blue," the band's collaboration with John Oates, follows the success of "Crazy," combining the technosynth and pop sensibility which classically-trained Davies has been experimenting with from the start.

The new album came in the charts at #1 in Australia.

Before this, we never had a national number one of any description. It's bizarre. What normally happens in Australia is people usually wear out on an act pretty quickly. You'd better make your retirement plan in three albums. And that's what's even nicer about having the fifth album do as well as it has.

The big difference on this album is that it's more of a rock album in the traditional sense.

The producer (David Lord) was great for me. He's a classical musician and he and I really work well together. I'm sure he would be a disaster with most rock 'n' roll bands. And I'm a disaster with most rock 'n' roll producers. Keith Forsey and I still don't know what happened in that period. I sort of made an album and he happened to be there.

I think the basic problem with rock 'n' roll musicians is that if they're not trained, the

way they go about things in the studio is clumsy and inefficient. So producers are already resigned to the fact the album is going to take six months to make. That was the your record and see you later." Last year, I was in New York, we'd just finished up a tour and, through a mutual friend, he found out where we were, came over, and said we should

funny thing about working with Keith Forsey because we had nine tracks ready to mix in eleven days. He brought his own engineer and both of them sat in the studio with their jaws on the floor, looking at each other going, "I don't believe it's finished."

How did the collaboration with John Oates come about?

I first met him in 1981 at an airport in Australia. He had just bought one of our albums, he recognized me and said, "I'm John Oates. I just bought

write some songs. I called him back in Sydney and said, "Listen, I've given myself a deadline and I can't get over to New York." He said, "I'll come to you." He packed up his guitar, flew out and worked in my studio for two weeks.

You've played with Yellow Magic Orchestra's Yukihiro Takahashi on one of his solo LP's. How does the Japanese approach to recording differ from the Western approach?

The Japanese have a method which is obviously famous in other businesses and

they apply the same mentality to music. They have a bevy of engineers, all of whom read music. One interpreter played me a backing track. He turned around and said, "Yuki thinks it would be a good idea if you wrote some lyrics." I said, "Now?" They said "Yes, now." Then, I had to write a set of lyrics and a vocal line on the spot. Then they said, "Yuki thinks it would be a good idea if you sang it." So I had to go in and sing it. They gave me two takes for that.

You've written music for a ballet ("Boxes") and a film (Russell Mulcahy's "Razorback"). Do you have any plans for any more such projects?

Well, the first thing I've got to do is have a holiday. Then, rather then go into another album, I may do something else because we did this one pretty quickly. There have been a few offers of more ballets and a stage production, a Broadway type thing. I'm really icky about stuff like that. I don't see myself as Andrew Lloyd Webber.




