Prince's "Alphabet St." single is receiving Top 40, Black/Dance and Alternative support. Hornsby's "Valley Road" hit is scoring at Top 40, Pop/Adult, Album Radio and even "Wave" formats. The Dirty Dancing Michael (RCA), George (Columbia) and **Michael** Jackson (Epic) albums that have dominated the charts for the entire year to date may begin to step aside for these hot new winners.

B orn in Connecticut, Dick Wingate's career was propelled forward with a blend of guts, ears, talent and luck. While still in college, he rose from DJ to MD to PD at Brown University's station, WBRU. A few years later, Wingate moved to WPLR in New Haven where he grew disillusioned with the new direction of Album Radio and began working for Chess/Janus Records. Discovered by Columbia Records, Wingate began his tenure there as a product manager, developing marketing campaigns for such acts as Bruce Springsteen, Peter Tosh, Dr. Feelgood and Pink Floyd. He was also instrumental in introducing Elvis Costello and Nick Lowe to the American market.

In 1979, Wingate moved to Epic Records, where he was named Director of Talent Acquisition. As disco gave way to the excitement of punk, Wingate signed a label deal with Stiff Records, where he attempted to break Lene Lovich, Ian Dury, Wreckless Eric and others in the U.S. by showcasing them in clubs. The fact that they missed the start of MTV by only a few years still wrankles Wingate.

During the remainder of the '70s, Wingate turned to Australian talent like Angel City and Flash and the Pan. In the early '80s, he cut his teeth as executive producer of Garland Jeffries' critically acclaimed, "Escape Artist," helped sign Eddy Grant, and executive produced 'Til Tuesday's hit album, "Voices Carry."

Settled in his office at PolyGram, Wingate holds the reigns of A&R, where in two short years he has personally signed or overseen the signing of a variety of talent, including Robert Cray, the Fat Boys, Kingdom Come, LA Guns, Tom Kimmel and others.

Hits interview

What were your first musical experiences?

I was basically a folkie who played acoustic guitar. I knew all the Kingston Trio songs, Peter, Paul and Mary, "Lemon Tree," but that's about the extent of my musical career.

What was your first job in the business?

When I went to work as a DJ at WBRU-FM in Providence, I was a very progressive jock and my shows were very free-form. I went from DJ to Music Director to Program Director. I played mostly English Invasion music, jazz, whatever worked, and we were very involved with local musicians. That's missing from radio today for the most part. The early '70s were radio's finest hours.

Why did you leave radio?

I left when Album Radio started getting formatted. I began to make

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the move into the music business and, for a year, I straddled both. I ran east coast operations for Chess/Janus— everything from charts and retail to publicity, radio promotion and artist development— plus working for WPLR on weekends. I did it all out of my apartment...and I still live there!

What do you remember most about your years at Columbia Records?

Columbia gave me the opportunity to work with all the most difficult artists because I was the youngest and hippest guy in the marketing department and they figured the acts could relate to me. I knew Springsteen from WBRU, so it gave me a leg up. They gave me the Springsteen account and they said, "Maybe he'll communicate with you."

I spent a lot of time in '77 dealing with Peter Tosh, who was a madman. I made trips to Jamaica to try and get album covers done. I worked with Dr. Feelgood, who were like the first punk band.

lot of people in the company. I spent much of 1978 on the road with "The Darkness On The Edge Of Town" tour. In fact, there's a picture of us in Dave Marsh's first book, with a couple of pages about the problems that I went through getting "Darkness On The Edge Of Town" out, in terms of the cover art and the marketing plan. There's a picture of us looking at the covers coming off the printing press. People still come up to me, sort of incredulously asking, "Is that you in the Springsteen book? It doesn't look like you." And that's because I had really long hair and a really long beard and people used to think I looked like a cross between Jesus Christ and George Harrison. You notice I don't keep a copy of that book around the office because I look at the way I look in that picture and I groan.

What were the highlights of your stay at Epic?

Signing 'Til Tuesday, putting them in the studio with Mike

Then I was very involved with the launching of Elvis Costello and Nick Lowe in this country, who I product-managed. I am very proud of the marketing we did on the first Elvis albums. And Pink Floyd, who were really very hard to deal with, but of course, worth the effort.


What was it like working with Bruce Springsteen?

Springsteen was a real challenge because he was coming out of a period of being out of the public eye because of his law suit with former manager Mike Appel. It was a tense situation— he was served an injuction from recording for a year. He was a bit withdrawn as a result and he didn't talk to a

Thome and coming up with what I felt was a totally fresh and unique record in "Voices Carry," which nobody else in the company wanted to release as the first single. I had to really fight for it. And to have that song go Top 10 and their album go gold on their first single was really gratifying. I'm hoping their third album, which is just about to be finished, will be a big hit. I know that Don Grierson has spent a lot of time with them since he took over Epic's A&R department. Aimee Mann is a great talent; she's going to be around a long time.

What was your transition to PolyGram like?

I was in need of a new creative

challenge and Dick Asher offered it. It was not smooth because I came in and inherited a staff of people, who I had to make decisions about. In the beginning, I didn't know most of them from a hole in the wall. I look back after two years and the staff has done a great job...in fact brilliant. So I had to make very few changes. But when I got here, that was the thing that hung over my head the most.

How has PolyGram changed since you've been there?

PolyGram was where people went when they couldn't get deals at CBS and Warner Brothers. I think we've shown we work real hard on the records, and now we're a label of choice. Every act to us is a critical act. There are no favor releases on PolyGram. That means every record that comes out on PolyGram has a *raison d' etre*. It has an A&R guy who signed it and we wanted the act. There are no "puts" here. The only label deals we've made were Tin Pan Apple (Fat Boys, et. al.) and MiKa, the new label of Michael Lippman and Rob Kahane.

PolyGram has become known for its strength in handling metal.

It's a tradition for this label and it comes down to credibility. We talked to everybody last fall about setting up the L.A. Guns and Kingdom Come records. We went out of the box with something like 65,000 L.A. Guns records, which has become almost 300,000 in a matter of months. And, of course, Kingdom Come, signed by A&R wiz Derek Shulman, is absolutely

amazing in and of itself— that's a whole other story. We shipped 700,000 records because of the excitement on a radio and retail level. Not because we were pushing it out. We have a new Scorpions album and then a new Cinderella record coming in July. Def Leppard is still hot after six months out. The fourth Bon Jovi album is due in the fall and we're looking forward to another megasuccess.

You've always had an affinity for women singers.

I think there are too many male voices on Album Radio. Top 40 seems to have finally come around, but it's primarily dance records. I really believe there's a whole lot of room for some rock 'n' roll female artists besides Heart, who are essentially a pop act now, and Joan Jett and the one or two others that people know by name.

When I arrived here, the roster was so dominated by men, you couldn't even count the female artists on one hand. It bothers me that Album Radio is so inherently macho. It bothers me that it's nearly impossible to get a female act played there.

We felt a big vacuum in that area, so we signed Joanna Dean and Face To Face, featuring Laurie Sargent, two LP's which have just been released. We also signed a unique artist named Michelle Shocked, who had a number one alternative LP in the UK charts, recorded in Texas on a Walkman, "Texas Campfire Tapes." We've made her first real record with Pete Anderson producing, and I think it's an outstanding record. It will be released in the late summer, because we're just getting the "Campfire" album out, on which you can hear the trucks rumbling by and the crickets chirping. It's the only album released that cost \$3.00 to make.

developing acts like Yngwie Malmsteen, Angela Winbush, taking the Moody Blues back to platinum, crossing Cameo pop, etc.

Second, songwriting is an area of emphasis this year, but that's always the case, too. Tom Kimmel is a great tunesmith who will have a big hit when he does his next album. Ivan Neville (a third generation Neville) is an incredible singer/songwriter whose debut album is produced by Danny Kortchmar. It takes some real musical chances.

"Top 40...is a more interesting format [because it's] willing to play any song that sounds like a hit no matter who it's by."

We certainly came in under budget with that one!

On the pop side, a hot female artist we're most excited about is Nia Peeples. She's the former TV star of "Fame" and "Top of the Pops" and the single's breaking quickly. And Vanessa Williams' single on Wing, Ed Eckstine's label, was the most added cut on urban radio this week.

What are your priorities for the label?

First, as always, artist development. We've worked hard on And that's the third major priority for us....taking musical chances, crossing boundaries. Robert Cray was our first. It put us on the map. Now, with artists like Ivan Neville, Dan Reed Network, Michelle Shocked and Tony Toni Toné (on Wing), we're trying to cross more boundaries and break down some preconceptions at radio.

What makes an ideal A&R person?

Every A&R person should idolize the work of John Hammond

and if they don't, I can't understand why they're in A&R. I think the great danger in A&R people is that they try to do too much in a short period of time. I think patience is the greatest virtue an A&R person can have the willingness to stand up and fight for something. And not just bail out after an unsuccessful start. You have to believe, not just in the album but in the act. I think what's forgotten too much in this business is that not every great act had a hit on their first or even second album. U2 is a great example. There's too much emphasis on instant success.

How does your A&R department shepherd an act through release day?

We are there for every stage of setting up the record. After it's delivered, we're involved with the product managers in laying out the marketing campaign. We try to work as closely as possible with the marketing and promotion departments in strategizing the release dates. We are involved right through the process; some labels are not. The key thing in setting up a record is being able to translate your vision, which may be sometimes hard to describe, to the rest of the company. That can be as important as making the record.

THE LATEST ON UP AND COMING BANDS by John Sutton-Smith

LOVE YOU LIVE: As predicted a couple of weeks ago, it's turning out to be bumper to bumper on the live circuit for Post Modern music bands from coast to coast and a great opportunity to find out what these young groups, many of whom are touring the U.S. for the first time, sound like up close and personal.....For example, a sampling of just some of the shows in L.A. last week saw the charismatic young R&B vocalist Terence Trent D'Arby, funky showman Morris Day and late-model rockers Will & the Kill all hitting town Friday night, while singer-songwriter Tracy Chapman, who put on a remarkable performance, and reggae scion Ziggy Marley came through Wednesday; Minneapolis trash rockers Soul Asylum and anglo-gothic Peter Murphy followed on the next two nights and, on the weekend, Boston indie favorites Salem 66 played a double-bill with the highly-regarded West Coast band the Bel-IFires, whose "What You Wanted" track, from their EP of the same name, is starting to figure strongly on PoMo stations while the impressive video is also making an impactLove and Rockets also added a two-night stand during the week, full of lots of surprises, including an Adam Ant cover and a generous amount of some much-appreciated earlier material, plus an opening appearance by Jane's Addiction And on Sunday we rested and caught up with some new releases.....Like former Undertone and current Irish crooner Feargal Sharkey, who has just put out his latest album on VIR-GIN, called "Wish," produced by Danny Kortchmar. Tracks in-"Cold Cold Streets" and "Strangest Girl in clude Paradise"...... The "Colors" soundtrack is turning out to be a big hit for WARNER BROS., as the movie continues to draw large crowds. The title track, performed by rapper Ice-T, "Let the Rhythm Run" by Salt-n-Pepa and "Everywhere I Go" by Rick James are all getting some serious dance action, as is Eric B. & Rakim's "Paid in Full" re-mix. Another soundtrack destined for chart success is "Sweet Lies," from the upcoming movie, which features three new Robert Palmer cuts, including the title track and single on ISLAND Nu Shooz are back with their latest release on ATLANTIC called "Told U So," also the title of the first single......Kings of the Sun, from Australia, are one of the bright new hopes on RCA with their first self-titled U.S. releaseNew on ENIGMA is the first Devo album in some time, called "Total Devo," with highlight tracks "Baby Doll," "Disco Dancer" and "The Shadow"; also a self-titled debut from Velvet Elvis, produced by Mitch Easter And new on ISLAND through BEGGARS BANQUET is European outfit Passion Fodder's debut, called "Fat Tuesday".....Just out on VIRGIN is Hue & Cry with "Seduced and Abandoned"......Easter have released a 12" track called "Manhattan Boy" from their self-titled LP on CHAMELEON, the label also responsible for El Grupo Sexo's latest release, "Up Periscope" as well as Chronic Disorder, whose first album, "The Drums of War," features an upbeat rendition of the Bob Marley/Peter Tosh classic "Get Up Stand Up"......The new metal label MECHANIC has released the first of its promised demo tapes, this one of four songs by new act Violence to be re-cut for the album, due next month.



Camper Van Beethoven, "Our Beloved Revolutionary Sweetheart" (Virgin): Quintessential Po-Mo band's long-awaited major label bow after series of critically-praised indie efforts finds Santa Cruz crazies delivering in their inimitable style as "cowboys on acid." First single, "Eye of Fatima, Pt.

1," establishes band's mix of traditional C&W fiddling, arenarock guitar heroics and avant-garde psychedelia. Credit producer **Dennis Herring** and Virgin for refining, rather than tampering with, the band's idiosyncratic approach.

The Sugarcubes, "Life's Too Good" (Elektra): Icelandic unit looks to duplicate its success on U. K. indie charts with stateside release of first elpee. Group masterfully straddles art and pop, alternating moody, Siouxsie and the Banshee-style set-pieces such as "Traitor" and "Coldsweat," with B-52



dance ditties like "Motorcrash." Female chanteuse **Björk** (pronounced *Berk*) and her throaty vocals highlight the seductive first single, "Birthday," while "Blue Eyed Pop" has the decadent appeal of **Roxy Music**'s "Love Is The Drug."



"Velvet Elvis" (Enigma): Produced by Mitch Easter, this rock group from Lexington, KY, makes its Enigma debut after a four-song EP and indie LP, and it's a thoroughly engaging pop effort with verve and twang. Singer / songwriter / guitarist Dan Trisko shows impressive talent on the REM-esque "When It

Comes," "I Got Everything" and "Over and Out," though the "Shattered"-meets-Lou Reed bite of "What In The World" has the most potential Album Radio-wise. Overall, enough hooks to start a bait shop.

Rotondi, "Play On" (ROM): L. A.based outfit is in the mode of Brave Combo and "Weird Al" Yankovic, bringing pop-rock pizazz to the polka, but also dabbles in other accordionbased music such as cajun, zydeco, ska and norteño. First effort for long-time Elektra exec Keith Holzman's ROM



label is more straight-forward than either of those two, though you have to like a band that can play both a soul-calypso tune called "Modern Man In Search of a Soul," as well as a rockin' tarantella (that's Italian) tribute to their namesake, 93-year-old **Dr. Pietro Rotondi**. What next? Klezmer-rock?

Did a lot of Bauhaus fans show up at the concerts?

Less and less actually. The Bauhaus fans have transmuted, if you like, into Peter Murphy fans. The music I'm playing now has been well-received and there's an awareness of what I'm doing. I have a couple of Bauhaus songs I've put aside to use just in case it feels right. I call them "satellite songs." But none of them are quintessential Bauhaus.

Anyone who saw "The Hunger" won't soon forget the band performing the song.

That was Bauhaus miming to the version we re-recorded, which was essentially live. The idea was we were supposed to be playing in the background, but it turned into more of a feature than (director) Tony Scott had in mind. It was such a powerful visual thing. He just set us up on-stage and told us to do our bit.

is the current show very theatrical?

Not overtly. I don't use props and such. I'm still relying on the basic lighting because of the budget I have to work with.

Do you mind the frequent comparisons to David Bowie?

It doesn't bother me because I know it's not real. It's just a very easy thing to level at you. He's got thin high cheekbones and so do I. I've got a low baritone and a high end to my voice and so does he. I'm very theatrical and powerful on stage, so I can see where that's the easiest comparison to make. I don't mind. People have to compare you to someone.

There are certainly some similarities to Peter Gabriel on the new album.

That's a compliment. I've never seen him play live. The only theatrical thing I've seen is that photo of him with the sunflower head back in his Genesis days. Like him, I'm interested in conveying a song in a visual way.

There's a real wide-screen quality to the production.

The word that comes to mind for this album is beauty. That's what I wanhe. I got off on that. I didn't want to pour all the angst element into it this time. I used my voice as a singer more. There's a difference between portraying a song with a character and just singing it. I'm discovering much more about my voice and its range. This album proves there's more breadth to what I can do as a songwriter. And it prevents categorizing me as weird, dark, mysterious and evil.

There are many religious themes which run through songs like "Socrates The Python."

I'm not trying to be prophetic or lecture. I'm not trying to convert you to any way of thought. Religions today are being manipulated by man, not God. It drives me crazy to see those preachers on American TV. If there's an evil, they are it. If they want to burn my record, it's absolutely fine by me. Those people should be jailed. They're every bit as bad as Iranian Shiite extremists.

From the sublime to the ridiculous, what made you cover "Funtime?"

The album is so diverse, I just wanted to put something on there to show Peter Murphy is not just obsessed with sitting in a room and contemplating existence. I'm an active searcher. And that means being in life and with people. Outside, not always inside. It was just one of the songs we played as an encore. Just pure fun.







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PICK YOUR POISON

Interview By Sharon Liveten

Poison, the band of a thousand shades of eye shadow, saw their 1985 Enigma/Capitol debut album, "Look What the Cat Dragged In," sell well over two million copies. The band's androgynous look created a huge furor among fans and detractors alike. One reason was that the boys in this band— Bret Michaels, Rikki Rockett, Bobby Dall and C.C. DeVille consistently looked better than their flock of female fans. But it was Poison's full-throttle glam-rock that brought in the platinum.

The band's long-awaited second elpee, "Open Up and Say Aaah!," is already creating a tidal wave. While the single,

This **record** is quite a change for Poison.

We could have written another "Talk Dirty To Me," and it would have been another hit. But that's not the way I want to do it. I write what I feel, and if that means taking a chance, all right. People are always going to say "Poison should sound like this, or that." But as soon as we start listening to what other people think we should sound like, I think we've failed. People should also remember that our first record was recorded in October of 1985. From then until now, the only things people got to hear was what was recorded then. But I've heard us writing songs every day, and changing. For me it's been a gradual change, because I see it every dav.

Is it just a case of maturity?

When we started out, all of our songs were like "I Want Action" and "Talk Dirty To Me" those are young songs, but that's the way it should be. If our first album was like what our fifth album would be, where would we go? Besides, being on the road

and playing makes you grow up a little.

How so?

We went out in May 1986 and we didn't get back until October of '87. The funny thing is that when we started out, it was like party, party, party. That's all we wanted to do. Then it stops. I think David is one of the greatest people. If they said to me "Bret, you have to die, but you can come back as somebody," I'd love to return as David Lee Roth. But we sat down and talked about it,

is the most important thing, because it's easy to get drunk every night all you have to do is open a few bottles. But it's hard to go on stage and perform a good show every night and the only thing that really matters is the show. and he said, "I've heard a lot of people tell me that you're trying to rip me off, but I don't think you're like me. And I'm not like you." It's true, we're really not alike.

Given Poison's past success, the band probably could have headlined its own shows. Why didn't you?

We're not ready. At this point a year ago, I would have said, "We headline or screw the world," but now I figured we aren't ready. I realized that we have a lot to learn before we can do that. When we do headline, I don't want anyone to see anything less than 110%. I don't want to do a half-assed set, or get off-stage and know that we put on a half-assed show, but at least we're making money. I want to go out and blow people's minds. When we do headline I think that will happen.

CROSSOVERS WINNER!

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Diamond Dave is in a good mood these days, and no wonder. The ex-Van Halen vocalist/exhibitionist is doing what he does best, stomping the boards on a mammoth, year-long tour promoting his latest solo album, "Skyscraper."

Despite a messy public divorce from VH, followed by some acrimonious feuding and the disappointment of his cancelled "Crazy From The Heat" film, the singer hasn't missed a beat. His band features the killer talents of guitarists Steve Vai and the bass/drummer brother team of Matt and Greg Bissonette. Dave's current jaunt, which features Poison as an opening act, launches his most spectacular and extravagant stage show yet, with a 28' flying surfboard and a descent into the center of the arena in a regulation-size boxing ring. And that's just for starters. Never at a loss for words, Roth happily discusses the tour, the album, his film career and his philosophy of life.

How's the tour going?

To most musicians that means, how's the crowd responding? And the answer is incredible. To the average manager, it means, how're the tickets selling? And the answer is, wonderfully. And if you ask the record company, it means, how's the record selling? Well, we just went platinum. So that makes us all happy. We're zoomin'.

I hear you surf across the crowd...

You bet. This music's gotta look like it sounds, so when that giant wave of sound wells up from under your seat, then hey, what's a wave without somebody to surf it? You can expect musical gymnastics the likes of which I don't think have ever been heard in rock 'n' roll before. But this band also has total control over the dynamics and subtleties as well as the power, so we're playing some very sophisticated moves as well as the most free-ranging, most spontaneous combustion you could possibly get on a night-to-night basis.

Do you ever worry that all the theatrics might get in the way of the music?

That's why I save 'em till the end. I don't want to distract from the plain power of the music, but I like showbiz too! I'll tell you, when I was 8 or 9, my folks took me to see Mary Martin dangling on a wire as Peter Pan and I never forgot it. When I got home, I'd fix up two ropes from a tree, hang a plank between them, and lie on 'em and let her go. That was my introduction to showbiz. I've never looked back since.

What counts for me is the *fun* of doing a show or an album. *That's* what it's all about, not the platinum albums hanging on the office wall or the box-office receipts. Of course, it's a high stress operation,

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and it's not for the timid. Not if you intend to stick around for a while, and I do.

There's alot of straight-ahead rock 'n' roll on "Skyscraper" but there's also a wistful quality on tracks like "Damn Good." Is David Lee Roth mellowing?

Hell no! I wanted to show a different side, but I think it's a side I've always had. Just never shown it much. I did "Crazy From The Heat" when I thought I was still in a band, and that was more of a vacation postcard. Immediately people started thinking I'd made this wrong turn into vaudeville or whatever, but it was just another side of me, that's all.

Are you back on speaking terms now with the guys from Van Halen?

Nope, not at all. It all turned pretty ugly, and that pains me a great deal because I'm very proud of what we accomplished together and I have great memories. We're like trains going off on different tracks and in different directions. I who hasn't all kinds of preconceived notions, without performing in your private life as well.

Do you have a steady girlfriend?

You bet! I always joke that it's 'til death us do part, or a different time zone. But the truth is, it's not so much that I'm gonna go out and fool around with other women, as that I'm *totally* obsessed with what we're doing here.

When you're not on-stage, do you keep a low profile?

Not really. I know how much the bus costs. I'm in the streets constantly. I do it on the road and I do it at home. I eat where everyone else eats, and people are amazed! Especially because I don't go out in disguise. I like to hang out. That's where I do my best research and get to see what people are all about.

will say that Van Halen's a band that's been going for 10 years or so. I've had to start from scratch.

Despite your well-documented media image, next to nothing is known about your private life. For instance, you never seem to pop up in the gossip columns.

(Laughs hard) Yeah, that's true, and it's because I guard my private life zealously. I've noticed over the years that if anybody points a mike or a camera at me, I automatically start performing, and I think that's true of a lot of people, especially people who aren't normally performers. But when that starts to happen in your private life at home, then you're in big trouble. Hey, it's tough enough to find a girlfriend who isn't directly effected by

Do you ever get hassled by fans on the street?

Not unless I dress up like some fuckin' drum major (laughs). I know certain colleagues, without mentioning anyone with Dutch surnames, that just can't understand why they have so much trouble going out for a burger when they're dressed like Taras Bulba and the War Lord Huns and it's only fuckin' Molene, Iowa.

How do you react to the criticism of rock videos that emphasize sex and violence?

(Incredulous) Me? Guilty? Hey, I glorify women. I celebrate 'em. There's a lotta talk about video sluts and the terrible way rock 'n' roll portrays women. The fact is, there aren't *any* women in the new "Skyscraper" videos, and in the past, on clips like "California Girls" or "Just A Gigolo," women got the best roles. They aren't tied up or holding whips like in some bands' videos, and they don't get chained up in cages and dragged off. If they do, it was probably their suggestion!

What does rock 'n' roll mean to you?

Rock 'n' roll has always been a great ritual, like a gathering of the clans, a meeting of the tribes. It's a ritual of sharing— sharing dances, sharing sounds, sharing *energy*. Energy is the keystone to rock, and somebody has to organize it. Somebody's got to fix up the lights and make sure there's plenty of snacks and that a good time will be had by all. And that's the business I'm in.

If you weren't in the music business, what do you think you'd be doing?

I always feel a well-organized tour is just like running the Marines or the Army. You've got to have discipline and organization and faith that your commander-inchief is going to pull it off. I often fantasize that if I had to leave America and the music business, I could do worse than hook up with the military of another country and whip 'em into shape. I'm good at motivating people.

Are you always so upbeat?

Catastrophe is lurking round every corner, there's always imminent danger, and the important thing is not to get negative about life and your problems. I remember reading this story about Andy Warhol, who back in the '60s started carrying a little cassette recorder around with him and taping every conversation, every scene that developed around him. Years later, he said that he realized there was no such thing as problems or negativity in his life— merely better tapes. I think he was right. T'S N | P P E R T M E

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


