"We're really looking to concentrate on the creativity and the passion of the music we're involved in," said A&M's indefatigable Sr VP of Promotion **Charlie Minor** who added, "Have line 3 hold, tell Line 4 I'll call back and put lines 6 and 8 to my other phone."

"When you've been together as long as the people at A&M have, you know the basics," Minor continued. "What we always have to remind ourselves is how lucky we are to be in a business which is built around more than service and delivery — to reset and reinforce our goals."

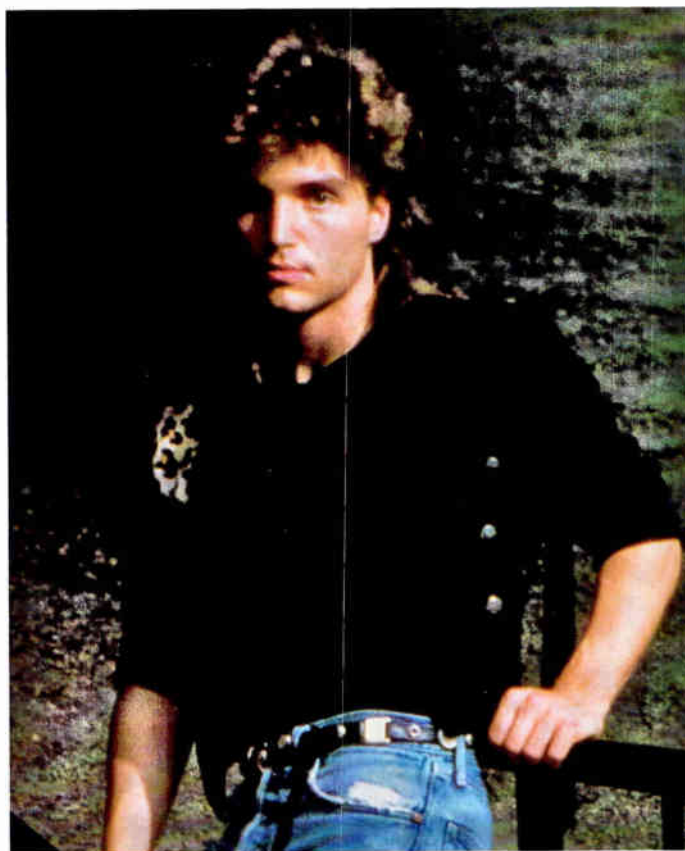
Before you go Charlie, will you say it?

She has been heralded by the press as the best new artist of the year. She has a debut album which is continuing to skyrocket at retail and she has captured a firm hold on playlists of three different radio formats. Now a fourth format has fallen into place for Elektra's **Tracy Chapman**. Top 40 has come on board.

"I think Top 40 just needed to see all the elements come together," said Elektra's Sr VP of Promotion **Brad Hunt**. "Album Rock, Pop Adult and Post Modern radio embraced her, the New Age format embraced her, all the video outlets embraced her."

"There is always a certain amount of disbelief when something is this big at retail," Hunt continued. "And just like anything else, Top 40 needed to see the trend continue. The one thing that you can never hype is a trend."

RALBOVSKY

An exclusive Hits interview with Steve Ralbovsky, Sr. VP, A&R, A&M,
by Iain Blair



*"The challenge and excitement and reward of this job

Steve Ralbovsky, A&M's hot-shot Senior Vice President of A&R, has come a long way since he was born 30 years ago in New York City. Always an impassioned music-lover, and an eclectic one, he landed his first job in the business as a d.j. on a local radio station— at the tender age of 14. Later, at Buffalo State, he programmed the college station, and, on leaving, began working with Gary Kurfist as a road manager for such acts as Talking Heads and B52's from '79 through '81.

After spending another few years in management, guiding the careers of artists like Tom Verlaine, Ralbovsky hooked up with Gary Gersh and joined EMI's New York A&R operation in '83. Eight months later, Columbia snapped him up. During his three-year stint there, Ralbovsky enforced his gunslinger status by bringing Def Jam home to roost at CBS. So it wasn't a total surprise when late last year, A&M made him an offer he couldn't refuse.

Articulate, enthusiastic and a fast-talker, Ralbovsky is now based in L.A., but has kept an office in Manhattan and will divide his time between the two coasts for the benefit of his artists and frequent flyer program.

ROLLING WITH

You were pursued by several labels. What made you choose A&M?

I've always been a big fan of A&M since I first became aware of the different labels behind the artists. It was a mixture of their commitment to those artists over many years, along with the sheer hard work and success story of a company which originally started off in a garage. The fact that they could have Karen Carpenter and the Sex Pistols on the same label, albeit for only two weeks, intrigued me. So it was all that—taste, style, reputation—so, when I met Jerry Moss and Gil Friesen, I just thought, "This feels real good." All my gut instincts said "Yes," and when I sat back and considered the label roster, that was another big plus. I believe artist rosters are emblematic of a company, and A&M's a label that's always stuck with its artists through thick and thin.

It appeared that you were happy and doing well at Columbia.

I was, and it was an extremely tough decision to

make. It definitely wasn't a case where I felt limited or hampered, and *had* to move. You know, my sales were working real well and everything was running smoothly. But when a Jerry Moss wants to meet with you, you meet.

So you left Columbia on good terms?

Absolutely. There were no hard feelings. They understood my position. I look back on my years with CBS very fondly. I learned a hell of a lot about the business there.

Before that, you were at EMI for 8 months before you joined Columbia. What was behind that move?

I just thought it'd be a great opportunity, the kind that doesn't come along too often, so I went for it, even though at the time I felt a lot of CBS' recent signings had been woefully mainstream and unimaginative. I've always been into a wide range of music, not just pop or rock, but country, blues, jazz, R&B, etc., and the first thing I told CBS was that I couldn't—and

wouldn't—change my outlook. I *had* to be eclectic, and I had to have a free rein. I didn't want to be slotted into a little box. To their credit, they agreed and backed me up all the way. I met with Al Teller, received his blessing, and started in the fall of '84. The first group I signed was The Outfield.

Bringing Def Jam to the label was quite a coup. How did that come about?

I'd originally met Russell Simmons when I was at EMI, and he was beginning to look for a home for his acts, which included Run-D.M.C., with his younger brother Joe, and the Beastie Boys. I always believed rap was going to be very commercially successful, so naturally I brought him over to Columbia as soon as I could. In the meantime, Russell had met Rick Rubin, whom I met on the set of "Krush Groove," and we ended up structuring an exclusive deal for them. My job basically consisted of seeing what acts we wanted to work on together, and it turned out to be the Beastie Boys, LL Cool J, and Oran Juice Jones, so it was a pretty successful operation.

Were your A&R responsibilities fairly broad at Columbia or more focused on areas like Def Jam?

That was the great educational aspect for me—they were extremely broad. In addition to Def Jam and signing new American acts, I was also able to expand more into the cutting edge of the British scene, like Rough Trade, etc., and bring all that influence to bear. And then of course, I was also working with a lot of established superstars, like Jagger

and Pink Floyd, and getting their albums happening. So it was very eclectic, which suited me.

Could you outline your A&R strategy now that you're at A&M?

My main strategy is to utilize the passion of the people working in this department through a very broad-based musical approach to infuse the overall label in a great variety of areas. My philosophy has always been that this "business" is about the music first and foremost. Everything else comes second, including the business. If you're not excited and passionate about the music you're working with, you're in the wrong business. You have to be inspirational and feel inspired yourself.

Is being bi-coastal a big advantage in terms of inspiring your team?

Absolutely. It allows me to take care of business here in L.A. while at the same time developing a New York presence with our A&M office there, and we have a lot of new things going on out there. We have this brand new dance label, Vendetta Records, based in New York, so it's very important for me to keep a high profile there. Of course, the incessant traveling isn't always easy, but I actually find I can get a lot of work done on planes.

What were your immediate A&R goals at A&M?

First, there's my signing of Vendetta. I want to get that happening. Second, we're going to be paying more attention to hard rock/heavy metal acts, something A&M's

not been noted for in the past. It's a matter of recognizing teen music like that will always be a big market, and George Drakoulias in the New York office has been very instrumental in this area. I also recently signed our first rap artist, Raheem, from Rap-A-Lot records in Houston. This kid is only 16 and unbelievable, so rap's another area we're looking closely at now. And we're also getting more into country, which is a personal favorite. We just signed The Wagoneers— Patrick Clifford and David Conrad should get the credit for that. So to sum it up, overall, there's a lot more diversification, which is important for the future.

Who are the key players on your A&M team?

I feel we've got an extremely strong team that's also well balanced. In New York, there's George Drakoulias and Patrick Clifford, while back here, there's Aaron Jacoves and Bryan Huttenhower, and I musn't forget Geoffrey Schulman, who's the administration guy that keeps the whole machine ticking ever so smoothly.

What makes a good A&M exec?

Simple. A real passion for music, and an ability to motivate that passion. You also need to be a team player, as well as have commitment and the courage of your convictions. For instance, I signed Jason and The Scorchers back in '83, and I just re-signed them here because I still believe in them. Any good A&M man has got to understand the business, but you can't allow yourself to become swamped by it. The job starts and ends with the music.

I'd also like to mention in passing a special debt to my

friend and attorney, the late Owen Epstein.

How important is it to break new artists?

That's really what A&M is all about, the challenge of breaking something new and different. Of course, you deal with the established artists, but really the new ones are the lifeblood for the future, and the most fun. You know, if you're at all competent, it's easy to maintain and sell an established superstar where the marketplace is already well-defined. The challenge and excitement and reward of this job lies in creating something new.

What's your attitude toward signing an act?

Again, it's a simple, gut reaction. If I hear an act that just puts the hairs up on the back of my neck, I know I'm onto something. Of course, it doesn't happen that often. And then, after that initial rush, you have to consider the long-term— do they have vision, commitment? It's a rarefied commodity, but the fun is in digging around for it and bringing it to light.

What about some of the new acts you're working with?

It's a real eclectic bunch. We're working on artists that range from Iggy Pop to Amy Grant and the Wagoneers. Then there's Simple Minds, who are currently recording their next album with Trevor Horn in England, and John Hiatt— yet another artist A&M's stuck by over the years— who's doing his next album with Glyn Johns producing. I've also got a personal stake in seeing Paul Kelly break. I think the guy's sensa-

tional, and the last album was well-received, so I'm hoping this one will push him over the edge. I'm also working closely with Soul Asylum, who come from a real alternative underground scene. So, there's many different projects going on, a great deal of which might not appear like "traditional" A&M choices.

What about developmental deals?

That's something I started when I was still at Columbia. It's the idea that many talents need nurturing and help along the way, so I'd set up a promising songwriter with some basic studio equipment, and perhaps a travel budget to meet and collaborate with other writers and artists, etc. It's a way of putting something back into the music scene and literally seeing what develops, and I feel it's an important policy which eventually will become an industry standard.

How do you feel about the current music scene?

I think it's extremely healthy right now. There's a lot of exciting stuff out there, and from a purely personal standpoint, I like the fact it's so varied. There's rap, heavy metal, country, cross-over dance music, traditional pop— and

they're all doing well on the charts.

What about the state of radio?

Of course, I wish it'd loosen up more. Any creative person knows it's too formatted and narrow-cast, but I'm hopeful for the future.

What do you listen to at home?

I'm a big country fan, and I love Tom Waits and George Jones. I'd sign 'em here tomorrow if I could.

What turns you off?

Any formula posturing in any format, and any mechanical response. I really hate that attitude, "Hey, if you don't like this song, I got something more rock/more rap/more R&B, etc."

How do you see the future of A&M?

To continue as a tasteful, artistic label, with a more diversified approach. The important thing is to pace ourselves and not try to grow too fast. It's easy to get tangled up with too many records and, if you're not careful, to let something good slip between the cracks.

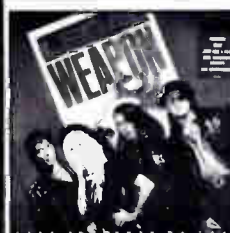

Paul Kelly & the Messengers, "Under The Sun" (A&M): The fifth LP for this well-traveled Aussie is his second stateside, and a worthy, 14-song successor to last year's similarly prolific debut, "Gossip." The **Beatle** harmonies are interspersed with Rickenbacker guitars in "Untouchable," the pedal steel rings out real **Byrds**-like on "Big Heart," and there are passing nods to **Dylan**, **Holly**, the **Beach Boys** and the **Everlys**. Can Kelly's exuberant eclecticism overcome tight-listed U. S. radio? That'll tell the tale.

"Stealin Horses" (Arista): When the Lexington, KY, duo of vocalist-guitarist-songwriter **Kiya Heartwood** and drummer-singer **Kopana Terry** stick to the country-pop of songs like "Where All The Rivers Run," their highly-touted LP lives up to the buzz. Arista's "in-house" producer, **Greg Ladanyi**, provides a straight-ahead rock backdrop, with contributions from the likes of **Neil Young** on harmonica and guitarist **Waddy Wachtel**. This should appeal to PoMo outlets with Album Rock roots and an eye to the "new country."



Legal Weapon, "Life Sentence To Love" (MCA): The hype on these long-time L. A. club mainstays' major label bow after three indie efforts has been minimal, but singer/songwriter **Kat Arthur** turns out to boast pipes and pen capable of soaring pop-rock anthems like "Hurt." Thanks to producer **Dave Jerden**, the raw live edge has been maintained, though the arrangements are now hammered into radio readiness. Co-writer **Brian Hansen's** guitar is still crunchy, especially on the title track, which fades to metal frenzy.

Shona Laing, "South" (TVT): This New Zealand techno-folkie is a one-time teen star Down Under, a veteran of six albums, the latest of which is her U. S. debut. The multi-talented pop diva not only sings and writes, she co-produced, programmed the drum machines, played keyboards and acoustic guitar.... everything 'cept write the bio. At her best, Shona's a cross between **Annie Lennox** and a more animated **Gary Numan**, with a political conscience. The wide-screen, anti-nuclear set-piece, "Soviet Snow," could be a sleeper at Anglo-synth-dance Top 40's.

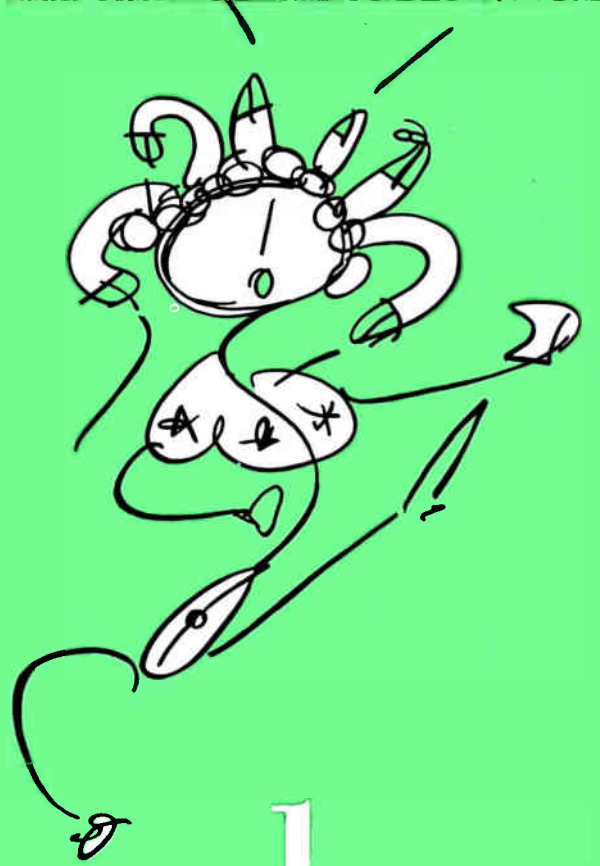

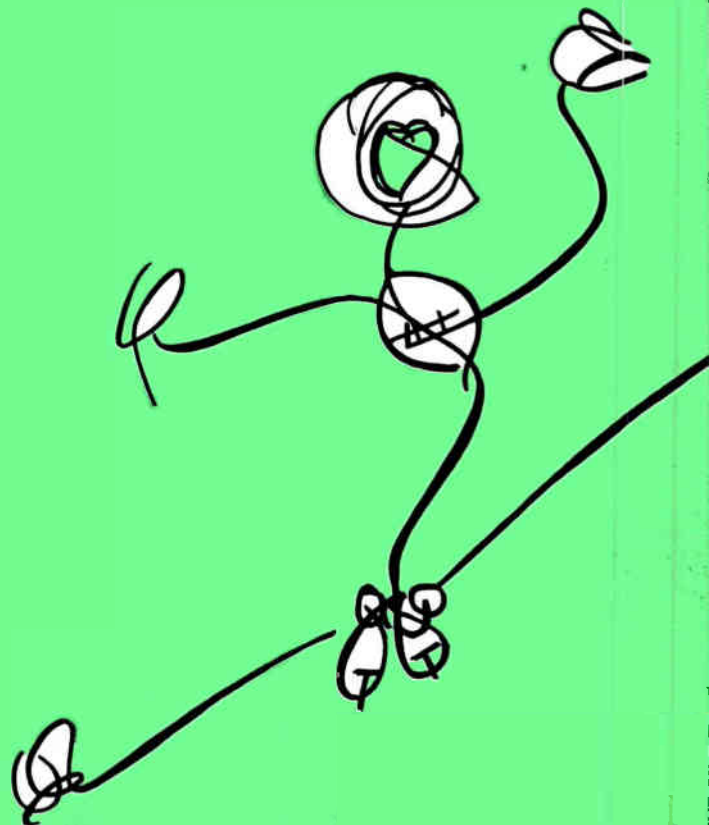
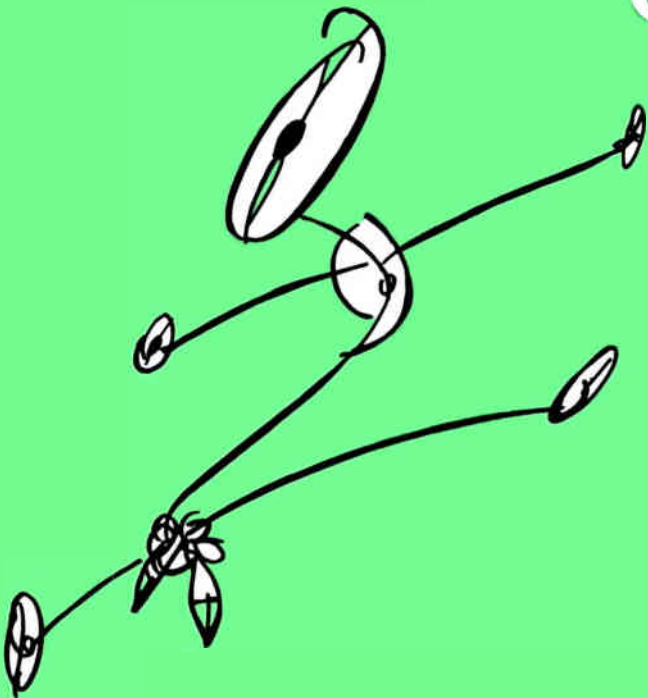

THE LATEST ON UP AND COMING BANDS

by John Sutton-Smith

CHERCHEZ LA FEMME: This has been the year that the female performer has stepped into the spotlight of new music en masse. The emergence of so many women all at once and into so many areas of the genre is unheralded in recent pop history.....The rock market has taken to the dramatic pop of **Sinead O'Connor** and is about to do the same with **Bjork** of the oft-mentioned **Sugar-cubes**. **Concrete Blonde's** **Johnette** and **Cynthia Isabella** of the **Bel-Fires** have both shown strong college support and pop crossover potential while other budding rockers include **Joanna Dean's** harder-edged debut on **POLYGRAM**, the **Throwing Muses** on **SIRE**, **Kat Arthur** of **Legal Weapon** whose first for **MCA** has just been released, and the much-admired newcomer **Melissa Etheridge**, receiver of many raves for her **ISLAND** album and her rousing live shows.....The R&B world has long been a bastion of female success from **Whitney** to **Sade**, but young English singer, **Tracey Thorne** of **Everything But the Girl** is surely a powerful contender for huge success in the future, though the band's first two albums for **SIRE** were almost criminally neglected by radio, their third album "Idlewyld" is out now, full of soul/Top 40 tracks; and an even younger **Tracie Spencer** is also a force to be reckoned with down the road as her first single for **CAPITOL**, "Symptoms of True Love," already suggests.....And then there are a number of artists embracing parts of the country/folk/blues form of which **Tracy Chapman** is currently the most outstanding example. Her debut for **ELEKTRA** is an album that most likely would not have been made however without the pioneering work done last year by **Suzanne Vega** in opening up radio to that direction.....**Toni Childs'** "Union" album on **A & M**, **Michelle Shocked's** roughly-hewn, but engaging debut, "The Texas Campfire Tapes" on **POLYGRAM**, **Cindy Lee Berryhill's** similarly- affecting "Who's Gonna Save the World?" on **RHINO** and New Zealander **Shona Laing's** "Soviet Snow" on **TVT** are also encouraging notices of great things to come.....The country field has two future superstars in **Rosie Flores** and **k.d. Lang**, while **Marti Jones**, **Eliza Gilkyson** and **Lucinda Williams** have all produced powerful and provocative albums which defy the confining categories of folk, pop and country with little airplay exposure as a result.....This, of course, is not true of pop queen **Tiffany**, who has had little trouble with identification in the teen market, although the **Go-Go's** offshoots **Jane Wiedlin** and **House of Schock** have yet to break through on the scale of **Belinda**.....For many of these new women artists, the way was paved in some respects by last year's success of **10,000 Maniacs** and **Vega** as well as artists like **Joan Armatrading**, **Chrissie Hynde**, **Rickie Lee Jones** and **Kate Bush**, who all contributed to breaking down the barriers of perception, proving women can be pioneers of rock idioms also.....**ADD TRACY:** The recent release of the **Primitive's** U.S. debut "Lovely" on **RCA** is sure to add the name of **Tracy Tracy** to the long list of like-minded monikers on the post-mod-femme scene. The lead singer for the celebrated young Brit-pop band shows her strong vocal suit on the album's first single "Crash".....

A remarkably unique project with some remarkably unique liner notes.

Suggested Cuts

"Unconditional Love" is an accessible, moody cut that deserves your attention.

Label Comments:

"It looks great," said A&M's Sr VP of Promotion **Charlie Minor**. "The Bay Area is totally excited about it, we have great response out of the Northwest, we're starting to get feedback from the Southeast and it's starting to spread up and down the East Coast. This is a very creative, well put-together record, and people are just now starting to understand that this is not just another piece of vinyl."

While few expect this youngster to draw a concert audience, a warm-up spot for a series of Trini Lopez lounge dates is being discussed. Humor your local Columbia rep and give this one a listen, maybe you'll get a Johnny Mathis promotion.

Suggested Cuts

"Monkey" is the fifth single from an album that has yet to kick in. Look, some artists just aren't destined for fame.

Label Comments:

"We're thinking of targeting a female audience this time around," said Columbia VP of Promotion **Marc Benesch** who kept referring to the artist as **Al Michaels**. "Sure, we might get lucky with a couple of small market stations here and there, but the important thing is that we're giving this kid a shot — futile as it may seem."

Virgins may be playing it safe in this era of new sexual awareness, but Camper Van Beethoven swears it wasn't thinking safe in its move, after three indie albums, to Virgin. Well-known on Post-Modern airwaves, the Northern Cal quintet is preparing to introduce itself to a wider audience—just in case there are some people who are not familiar with the band's underground hit, "Take The Skinheads Bowling."

Camper Van Beethoven is singer-guitarist David Lowery, drummer Chris Pederson, violinist Jonathan Segel, bassist Victor Krummenacher and guitarist Greg Lisher. Their first three albums totaled almost 100,000 copies in sales. Their Virgin Records' bow, which Lowery says "is intended to be more of a rock 'n' roll record, a little heavier and harder," is "Our Beloved Revolutionary Sweetheart." Lowery offers a crash course on this former college party band in this Hits interview.

What does the Virgin contract mean to you?

The reason we got into it, instead of staying with an independent company, is we'd like to see our records in more stores. I suppose some people view that as being commercial, but I think if you make music you want to have it available to as many people as possible so they can make up their minds. We're still doing exactly what we like, which is what we've always done.

Is there a sense of additional pressure being on a mainstream label?

Certainly there are a lot more people thinking of things to keep you busy. There are more interviews to do, more press and radio, more things to decide. We've done videos but we've never really coordinated them with the release of a record. There are demands for more and more shows. Obviously I

wish there was some way of doing all this and not having to work so hard. I like playing live shows and seeing parts of the country. I just wish we could do it for four weeks at a time.

What do you think the public perception of Camper Van Beethoven is?

I think the public thinks from the articles they've read that we're

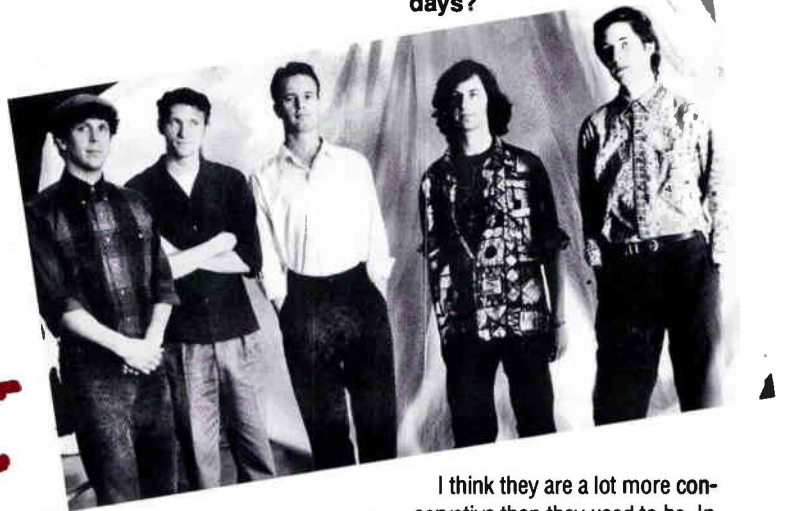
pretty strange.

How do you evaluate the qualities that make the band special?

We try to change our style all the time. The fact we're the same five people is the thread that holds it together. We are fairly eclectic, though. We get kind of conceptual about what we want a song to

sound like. It's not like we're a bunch of kids from somewhere in the sticks who just want to play rock 'n' roll. I used to think we were an art band, but I see us now more in terms of classical groups such as the Beatles, Kinks, Stones and Zeppelin.

Would you be a different group had you grown up in another part of the country?



I think we follow a West Coast tradition of bringing in these strange influences from left field and making something new of it. Little Feat, the Mothers, Kaleidoscope did that. And I think somehow we fell into that, though I'm not quite sure how.

How do you resist the pressure to tailor your music to a particular audience?

We live in Santa Cruz, kind of off the beaten track. We started out playing music for a very local

audience. Now we have our own audience and they like us for our music, so the pressures aren't as great on us. Maybe we will be dropped by the record company, but we will go on doing what we've always done. I can't imagine playing in any band where you do what others want you to do.

What did you learn from touring with R.E.M.?

I learned I never want to play big stadiums. The biggest place we want to play is 1,000-seaters. Those are the halls made for music. It's a lot more work to communicate with an audience in a big place. Opening for R.E.M. did us some good, but not as much as I would have imagined.

Do you think record companies play it too safe these days?

I think they are a lot more conservative than they used to be. In the '60s and '70s, there were a lot more weird songs on radio. I can't imagine a song like "Strawberry Fields Forever" on the radio today. They'd say it was too strange and they can't play it. People are a lot more broad-minded than the business world gives them credit for.

Do you see indies becoming more of a presence in music?

I think it would be great if indies could be a major force, but it seems like the cards are stacked against them.

What about Post-Modern, alternative radio?

In some ways college radio is becoming almost like junior Album Radio. They're not as open as they were three years ago.

Can Camper Van Beethoven break through to a mass audience?

I certainly think this is the best record we've put out. I just want to keep making a living so I can go to the dentist. I don't allow myself to think any farther ahead than that.

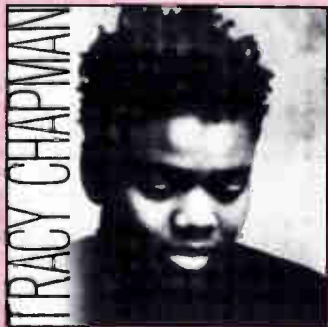

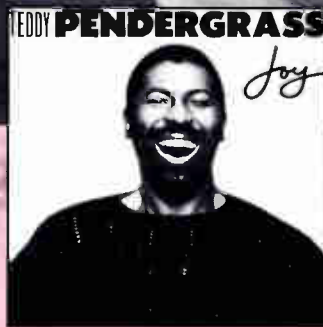

Playin' The Hits In Houston

HITS June 20, 1988

This Cottonwood, Idaho, native got his first radio job at KRLC in Lewiston, Idaho, before moving on to become a P.D. at KYNO in Fresno, CA and an M.D. at KGB in San Diego, CA. Paul was a d.j. at KFRC in San Francisco in '72, then took over as P.D. under the name Eric Chase at Top 40 KIQQ in L. A. A stint as M.D. at KFI in the same city preceded a stay at KJR in Seattle. In '83, he joined KRBE in Houston, doing afternoons at the station, which was then Adult Pop. He took KRBE-AM classic-rock in 1984, before taking over as P.D. of the Top 40 FM three years ago.

What inspired your radio career and how did you get your first job in broadcasting?

I was in high school and we had some debate and extemporaneous speaking competitions. There was one category called news announcing, if I recall correctly. They handed you some wire copy and the idea was to imitate a newsman. I've always been good at imitating anything. So, I sounded like a *newsman* and I won the thing and it inspired me. I thought, maybe I can do something like that, so I called the local d.j., Larry Huffman, who is the guy that does all the Orange County International Raceway

type of commercials. He now has a small Orange County agency which does all the tractor pulls and stuff like that. He told me to come on up to the station and pull cards and stuff like that for him. So, I hung around there for awhile. Finally, they said, if I went to Ogden's in Burbank and got a first class license, they would hire me. I guess they didn't realize that I would do it, which I did, because, when I came back and said hire me, they didn't have anything for me to do. Initially, they had me do some news and, eventually, I ended up with the one night-time Top 40 shift. Of course, the station was block-programmed at the time.

What stations did you listen to as a kid?

My main influence was in the summer of '65, when I went down to L. A. It was a young d.j.'s heaven. There were four Top 40 stations—KHJ, KBLA, KFWB and KRLA. It was the most awesome thing I'd ever heard. They all sounded great to me. That whole summer I sat around imitating B. Mitchell Reed and Humble Harv. One at a time, of course, because those guys had really different styles. It was a fine summer. Kind of a footnote to the time, KROQ's Rick Carroll was my classmate at Ogden's. I remember him because he knew every oldie in the world—the label and the flipside, too.

Tell us about KRBE'S music.

When I first took over KRBE, I went back to what I knew, which, for me, was Drake Radio. I cut the

list to nothing, like twenty records. It lasted about a week and there was such a public furor, that it was apparent the approach wouldn't work in Houston. This is a long-list type of town. They want a great deal of music. When I came to Houston, I didn't know anything about Texas. I never thought I'd live in Texas in a million years. This is a very hip town. They are into very progressive types of music. I learned right away that you have to play a lot of records. So what I did was pay a lot of attention to the clubs and the street scene to find out what they wanted to hear. It's been a mix of the dance alternative-type music and basic Top 40. It's an exciting and fresh package that has worked for us. We also dig around the import bins to try to be on top of things before other people even know they exist. We try not to play a mass quantity of those, but we will take one and beat it to death to make a hit out of it in Houston. It's tough for the competition to deal with when they can't even find it.

That's the game we play and that's definitely why we're successful. Music is everything. Positioning, of course, ties it all together. The only position left to us was more music, so we had to go for that and attack our competition for too much talk. We did that pretty effectively and it's what has kept us on top.

You worked for a successful Top 40 station, KFRC, in San Francisco. There is a new Top 40 entry in S. F., KYUU. Can a mass-appeal straight-ahead Top 40 still work there?

The key in S. F., which I think most people who have lived there know, is signal. An FM with a good signal—and there are only about two of them that have one—can be just as big as KFRC was. It's obviously a Top 40 town. It didn't just suddenly change. As far as urban product goes, KFRC always played people like the Detroit Emeralds along with the hits that are hits for everyone else. So, you definitely have to cover that. A really true Top 40 with a strong signal could be an awesome thing in S. F. in my opinion. There is probably a pent-up demand for it.
