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





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HITS TOP FIFTY SINGLES



Crew Jury Selection Underway

First-day jury selection in the Florida obscenity trial of **2 Live Crew** was slowed by legal wrangling over the racial makeup of the jury pool.


The band is charged with a misdemeanor obscenity charge as a result of a June 10 "adults only" performance at a Hollywood, Florida nightclub.

Defense attorney Bruce Rogow, who also defended recently convicted Florida retailer Charles Freeman (see related story on page 11), has challenged Broward County's voter-based jury pool as unconstitutional in cases that depend on community standards like obscenity.

Rogow told the Associated Press: "Because it relies only on voter registration lists, it leaves you always with a pretty middle-class, semi-middle-aged, disproportionately white jury pool, because those are the people who register to vote in the greatest numbers."

According to officials, only 8.5 percent of registered voters in Broward County are black.

over 500,000 apiece, while the long-form home video from A*Vision Entertainment has gone gold for selling over 25,000 units. Rush-released last July 4, the "Banned In the U.S.A." single resulted in the largest initial shipment in Atlantic's history.

NASHVILLE— Well, the sequins are off and the hair deflated as emergent acts like the Kentucky Headhunters (Mercury), Clint Black (RCA), Vince Gill (MCA), Garth Brooks (Capitol) and Kathy Mattea (Mercury) prove a new day has arrived in Neobilly. More Ozzy Nightmarés

More parents who've lost control of their childrens' lives have decided to sue musicians those children listened to prior to committing suicide.

Two separate productliability cases are being considered jointly in Macon, Georgia, as Thomas Waller of Fitzgerald, Ga., claims his son killed himself after listening to a 1980 recording of Ozzy Osbourne's "Suicide Solution."

The other case involves 43-year-old Hattie Hamilton, who charges her son took his life after listening to the same song from Osbourne's live album, "Tribute."

Both Waller and Hamilton are seeking \$1 million for pain and suffering, \$3 million for wrongful death and \$5 million in punitive damages.

Besides Osbourne, other defendants are CBS Records, Jet Records, Essex Music International and cowriters Randy Rhodes and Bob Daisley.





What Constitution?? Freeman Found Guilty

"The jury didn't understand my culture. They didn't understand rap."

Charles Freeman, Record Retailer Convicted Of Selling Obscene Material

Lauderdale retailer Charles Freeman has been convicted of obscenity for selling 2 Live Crew's "As Nasty As They Wanna Be."

The all-white, six-person jury convicted the black retailer of the misdemeanor charge after deliberating less than three hours. He faces a possible one-year sentence and a \$1000 fine. Freeman's attorney, Bruce Rogow, said an appeal is likely. At press sentencing time, scheduled for Nov. 2.

"As soon as they found me guilty, I knew I had to take this thing to the end," Freeman told HITS. "Hopefully, it won't go this far, but maybe the Supreme Court is where we have to end up."

Freeman was arrested by an undercover police officer June 8, just two days after a U.S. District Court judge

ruled the 2 Live Crew project part of the 2 million+ units in violation of community obscenity standards, and banned its sale in three South Florida counties. It is not known if the sale to that officer has been counted as

the project has sold to date.


During the trial, the defense failed in its attempts to introduce into evidence other rap records by groups like Geto Boys and Ice Cube, as well as sexually explicit magazines and XXX-rated videos that are sold at outlets adjacent to Freeman's store, but not considered in violation of community obscenity standards.


"It's hard to define what's obscene and what isn't," said Freeman. "Apparently, the court wasn't interested in seeing what else is being sold legally in this state." The conviction marks the first time in U.S. history that someone has been convicted of selling obscene musical works.

"Even the people at the courthouse thought it was a joke," said Freeman. "No one could believe the prosecution went as far as it did, let alone finding me guilty."

In an incredible display of legal acumen, Assistant State Attorney Leslie Robson told Daily Variety: "The First Amendment does not give you the right to say what you want, when you want and where you want." OK.

"Basically, I'm the number two guy at PGD," states Jim Caparro, Senior Vice President of Sales & Branch Distribution for **PolyGram** Group Distribution. That's as succinct a job description as you're likely to find, but to elaborate, Caparro has been working behind the scenes for 20 years in the distribution arena, making sure that artists get their best shot in the marketplace. The biz veteran began his career in 1973, working his way through "the CBS training school," first in record manufacturing, then as a sales rep and sales manager. before finally exiting in September '88 as Epic's Vice President of Sales when a choice opportunity beckoned in the form of Poly-Gram. While there, Caparro functioned as head of sales and distribution until April of this year when the label's distribution arm — as a result of PolyGram Holding, Inc.'s purchase of A&M and Island — officially broke away to become separate entity known as PGD. Describing the company's philosophy, Caparro aptly states, "We don't wanna sell units, we wanna sell artists." It's a noble work ethic, one he feels, in the long run, will help PGD - which now services Island, A&M and the Poly-Gram group of labels, including Mercury and the soon-to-be-renamed Polydor, among others distinguish itself from the rest of the distribution pack. HITS' meganerd Michael Amicone, one guy who certainly hasn't distinguished himself from anyone, met up with Caparro for this exclusive tête-a-tête, whatever the hell that means.

BRANCHING O U T



How can you ensure that a record is well-positioned in a store — out of the bins and in front where the customer can readily see it?

There's a saying that I have: We should try to get our unequal fair share every day. As part of every sales call, a sales rep should be looking for his or her unequal fair share — doing more than just writing orders — to ensure that we're getting maximum visibility in, say, a Wherehouse. If it means working with a customer to get a record out front, then we're trying to do that.

What methods do you employ to help persuade the powersthat-be at a record store to see things your way?

Obviously, awareness is the first thing. It's doing all the basics — increasing the store's interest, increasing the awareness at the home offices. And obviously, we're aggressively advertising, promoting and marketing it with the store, so it's on sale as often as possible.

Superstar product basically sells itself. When you're working on a new band's release, what sort of incentives do you

make available to retailers?

There are many things we do similar to others. We're heavily involved in customers' artist development campaigns — helping to advertise and promote those as much as possible. But we also try to go a step further, and that's where our branch marketing staffs come in. Each branch has a marketing team of product development reps who are responsible for communicating to the entire marketplace — not just our customer base, but to all the mom-and-pops and all the smaller dealers that we're not selling to directly. We want to make them aware of what we're selling and what we're trying to promote. When it comes to developing acts, there isn't much we won't do to try and break an artist. We've got to do everything possible to let the potential consumer know a record's out there and the artist development campaigns are a very valuable ingredient in doing that. There have been some complaints in the past that the campaigns have tumed into profit centers for our customers. I'm not inclined to agree. We're a firm believer in them. Obviously, there are a helluva lot more ingredients, but that's a very integral part of trying to stimulate interest once people are in the store.

What is your position on the disposable CD longbox?

There's no question that the CD is overpackaged right now. It's a problem for our customers as well as us. Obviously, we have to be sensitive to the whole environmental issue, and we also have to be sensitive to our customers' fears. They're concerned about the merchandising issue, the fixturing issue and the security issue. And they're absolutely correct — those are major concems. I do think there's a compromise package waiting to be found that would take care of the environmental issue and yet allow effective in-store merchandising. It's just that we haven't put our finger on the right one yet.

How do you feel about record labeling?

I think our industry has been sensitive to it and has taken very positive steps. I think we're on the path of prudently governing ourselves. However, if there are instances where the sticker itself becomes a

censure with certain customers, then that defeats the purpose of what we're trying to police. And it's disappointing that some dealers would opt not to sell a stickered product. Let the consumer decide what's right and what's wrong.

sations with them, we have managed to eliminate some of their objections.

For example?

The artwork on the new Scorpions release. Our PolyGram label, during its normal review process,

Does a record with a sticker or something controversial about it require any special handling when it goes through the distribution system?

We try to let our customers know up-front about something that's coming down the road which may be objectionable, and in converrealized that the art may be objectionable. It had a picture of a woman surrounded by scorpions. We had some of our customers take a look at it, got their feedback on it and then made decisions accordingly, which was to modify the art slightly.

How do you set priorities as far as which records to

work harder?

It's our position to attack every record with as much energy and effort as possible. The labels are the ones that set priorities with regard to "work" projects. On occasion, we sit in on meetings with the labels, and we're continually talking with the sales, promotion and marketing departments, trying to get a fix on where their priorities are and what direction they're taking. One of the things that we're trying to do with PGD - in order to make it a bit different, and hopefully better than the others is to ensure that we are in-step with our labels and their music. How do you manage to keep

your troops excited about every release?

It's a sense of attitude, and fortunately, we're blessed with a group of branch managers that are among the best I've ever seen. Our field force has a lot of pride, and they're motivated to try to make PGD into what we know it can be. We have a long road to go yet, but we're well on our way.

Have there been any recent records you felt fell through the distribution cracks?

Since the creation of PGD, I really don't think there have been any. We're still working on some longterm projects that might take awhile, but we're not giving up on them — such as the Company of Wolves on Mercury or Hothouse Flowers on Polydor. These are projects that we refuse to let die the label's commitment is there, and we're there to support that commitment. We're not gonna give up on those records until the last one's sold.

Which particular success stories are you proudest of?

Each label has several current projects that make me proud of the way our people have responded. On Island Records, for example, the Anthrax and Dino records are off to wonderful starts. On the PolyGram front, the Tony! Toni! Tone! and "The Wall" projects are off to great starts. I'm pleased with the job that the field staff has done with the Kentucky Headhunters, helping our Nashville division push this thing towards platinum. A&M is very pleased thus far with the development of the Neville Bros. and John Hiatt. We're trying to be

partners with our labels by being their biggest cheerleaders and supporters on the street.

You make it sound like one big happy family.

We're blending together really well. All of our companies are infused with the notion of making it work better than anyplace else.

PGD's makeover into a separate entity has certainly seemed problem-free.

Many people are pleasantly surprised how smooth the transition has been, especially when you consider that it's much more than just moving a warehouse or shifting artists from one label to another. We're very proud of the fact that we've gotten PGD off the ground and it's at the point it is today. The changes that have come about over the last nine months have been very significant. We acquired two major record companies and brought them into the distribution network with very tew problems. It wasn't a simple transformation. It was a major philosophical restructuring of practices as well as people.

It has certainly helped you in the marketplace to have all that recent superstar product to distribute.

Perception certainly helps a great deal in our business. It certainly would have been the perception that all the changes at PGD were positive if we had more big hits running through the system right away — because our industry appreciates hits. But once all our labels started to come with big

new releases, as they did beginning in August, perception began to change. Janet Jackson's album was our biggest record for a long while in the early stages of the transition. When we came with the

would rather attack every day with new records and exciting music than just sit back and wait for hit records to come through the system.

How do you compare PGD

"If ... the sticker itself becomes a censure with certain customers, then that defeats the purpose of what we're trying to police."

Bon Jovi record in August, that was a tremendous release that did wonders as well. Obviously, hits cure a lot of ills. But our industry shouldn't rely on the big hits in order to survive. If we do our job at PGD — day in and day out — in developing new artists, we'll evolve into a very successful operation. I

with the other major distribution organizations?

All of our competitors have strong points. Hopefully, with our company, you will find some of their strengths, as well as some unique strengths of our own. We're trying to act rather than react to our labels' needs. We're going after

all our projects in all our markets with all our customers with the attitude of trying to get our unequal fair share.

In what areas could PGD improve?

I'd like us to be even quicker in response to certain breakout projects. As an industry, we must be able to look at individual markets or individual customers who are sensing a bubbling under with a particular record and be able to fuel that fire immediately. It all goes back to acting rather than reacting.

From your vantage point, is the music industry in a healthy state right now?

I think the industry is moderately successful right now. There are some clouds overhead. I think some of our customers have expanded dramatically, and the cost of servicing that expansion is significant. I just think that the overall industry has to be a little bit cautious about expansion right now. In some markets, you see a saturation of retail outlets. It's a problem when there's a record store on every comer of every block. And there are a great many significant issues — among them, counterfeiting and CD packaging - that need to be resolved. Counterfeiting is one of our biggest problems. We don't appreciate how serious it is. Many, many millions of units have been counterfeited, and it's a dramatic drain on our business. It's a major underground industry that needs to be cut off. *



Matraca Berg, "Lying To The Moon" (RCA): With a voice that swings from strong and feisty (as on "Baby, Walk On") to outright sultry (the jazz-tinged "I Got It Bad"), Matraca Berg sings and writes with burning passion. Whether it's story-songs about fading Southern beauticians (the well-etched

"Alice In The Looking Glass") or haunting bluegrass ("Appalachian Rain"), Berg uses small detail and vocal nuances to nail her emotional bull's-eyes. Produced by Wendy Waldman and Josh Leo, this is the debut of an important talent.

"Pirates of the Mississippi" (Capitol): With metal bands getting harder to tell apart without a scorecard and The Kentucky Headhunters finding a toehold, the time is right for Southern rock & roll. Enter Pirates, a five-man aggregation which isn't afraid to balance Hank Williams'



"Honky Tonk Blues" with their own barreling originals. With full-tilt playing, an emphasis on harmonies and a sound smooth as blended bourbon, Pirates don't bludgeon their boogie, especially on the hooky "Talkin' Bout Love."



"Texas Tornados" (Reprise): In Texas music, Doug Sahm, Augie Myers, Freddy Fender and Flaco Jimenez are deities and rightfully so. Together, they're a Tex-Mex musical Mt. Rushmore moving through a meltdown of styles that could only be the result of collective life-experience.

"Who Were You Thinking Of" is norteño-country, while "Adios Mexico" blows the cobwebs from your head as it sweeps your feet to the dance floor. Expansionist country/rock/blues/etc. that appeals to the adventurous.

Chet Atkins/Mark Knopfler, "Neck and Neck" (Columbia): It's a gross understatement Chet Atkins and Mark Knopfler are standard-setting guitarists. Each defined a style with awesome technique. Which is very nice for the layman, but isn't what makes "Neck and Neck" so cool.



Together, they sound like they're having fun, trading lines and feeding off each other. "There'll Be Some Changes Made" is tongue-in-cheek humor that finds the pair singing and poking fun, while "Sweet Dreams" is quietly eloquent.



way home from the station after giving it to him, she heard it on the radio.

Scoops are cool — I got my degree in journalism, so I understand. You want to get the jump on the competition and break things. That's fine. But to turn around, tape the song and then send it out to radio stations across the country, that's something else altogether. And to see my family get dragged into this, that's not cool. I have a problem when people from the station are telling television that my Mom came in there begging them to play it. After she left the station, they had a meeting about it and they decided to put it on the air early, but they shouldn't have dragged my Mom into it. I haven't talked to Wade Carter [the responsible d. j.], but I'm going to try to avoid that as long as I can. Not because of what I might say to him on a professional level, but because of what I might say to him as a friend and those are the kinds of things you can't take back.

It seemed like the first album really exploded from the point when it went gold.

I love the old Capitol family and I don't mean anything against them, but the new Capitol is an aggressive record company. They believe that you have to put records in the stores to sell 'em. Since Jimmy Bowen took over, things have really been moving. We went from 300,000 to almost platinum since April on an album that had been out over a year at that point. We had two multipleweek #1s with "If Tomorrow Never Comes" and "The Dance," which was the first-ever #1 never released as a single. Capitol finally decided they could sell records if people could find them. It certainly looked like a struggle for the first year or so.

I want my whole career to be that way. I want to have something to work for because, if you're on the top of the hill, you have nothing to strive for. The greatest gift in my career has been a kid from Houston named Clint Black. Having him out there in front of me, getting all the thunder, has really given me something to go for.

Is there a natural sense of competition there?

I don't know if anybody's ever sat down and compared us, but the similarities are weird. We have the same obscure influences outside country. He was born two days before me. He has three songs he didn't write in his show that I was thinking of doing and I've got two in my show that he was considering.

So you two know each other?

Oh yeah. We see each other at award shows and stuff. He's a real nice guy. If I'd've had thrown in my face what he's had to deal with over the last year, I don't know how I would've coped. And you don't resent being in his shadow?

When I first came out - since I wore a cowboy hat - people treated me like just another "hat act." They'd say I was trying to be like George Strait, or sometimes Clint Black, and I'd think, "Clint's album was released almost the same day mine was. Why would I try to be like him?" It was just a little frustrating because I wanted people to listen to my music for what it was.

You're primarily a writer. Is it hard to find time for that with the increasing demands of stardom?

Yeah. It hurts to know that there was a time when someone could look at you a certain way and you could sit down and write a song about it in five minutes. Now you don't have those five minutes to really concentrate, and that's painful because you have no way to get it out. Any plans to rectify the situation? Next year has been scheduled to give me a two-week-on/two-week-off thing, so I can go downtown and write with a Pat Algier or a Kent Blazey. I did a lot of writing before I got my deal, and that was real important to me. The last year or so has been spent concentrating on being an artist and everything else has fallen by the wayside. I'd like to get back to writing. I'm ready now.

What makes a great song for you? I think you want to relate, to strike a chord in someone's memory. When they hear a song that just doubles 'em over and they go, "Oh! That's not fair. I don't ever want to think of that feeling again." Fogelberg is one of those guys who does that to me a lot. In fact, most of the people I love and who do that to me are artists that don't really have a home the James Taylors and Billy Joels. They make great music that isn't geared for any specific audience.

Those aren't exactly country artists. No, my heroes are lyricists. I don't love 'em as much for their music as I do for what they say and how it makes me feel. When it comes to music, there's nothing like good driving country for me. Or a waltz. Or some swing. My wife and I used to dance all the time, and that's the stuff that really moves you on the dance floor.

Is it true you met your wife breaking up a fight in the ladies room? Yeah. I was one of the smallest bouncers, so I got to handle a lot of the female disputes. Is that what you called them? No, we called them cat fights. And that's how you met your wife. What was the

brain a while to catch up to my body and realize how lucky I was. Are you nervous about the CMAs? I wish they were over. I've always been the underdog but, with all those nominations, there's suddenly a lot of light in my corner and I kinda wish it'd go back to being dark again. Not that I'm complaining, because I'm very flattered, but it's just that awards and I have rarely gone together. I have a fan club meeting after every show and the first thing I hear is that I'm going to sweep the awards. Well, that'd be nice, but I don't know. Still, your fans tend to get real involved in it and I just don't want anybody's heart to get broken. Regardless, it's still been a pretty incredible year.

[My wife] Sandy and I just looked at our first house, and it looks like we're going to be able to buy it with one big payment. That's amazing. But even more so is the fact that people out there want to see us play. There was a time when nobody cared and the only thing I ever signed was a check. Now all that's changed - and it's wonderful.

At first, it was the way she looked then, it's just and the way she was built. It took my

gotten better and better.

Did you always want to be a singer? Actually, I wanted to be a professional ball player 'til midway through college even though I wasn't playing ball. That's still my fantasy - to play one day of Major League baseball. I'd like to play third base, not have anything hit to me and not get my uniform dirty. I could just stand around with that black stuff under my eyes and drink it all in. With songs as serious as yours, it proves people don't shy away from content, especially older fans. Actually, country music crowds are getting younger and younger. Teens and pre-teens are actually coming to the shows. I think there's a responsibility that comes with those kinds of audiences, because kids are like playdough — whatever you throw up against them sticks. Kids are getting square again, and I think that's cool. It used to be that they were teenagers before their time, raising all kinds of hell at eight and nine. Now they're almost in their 20s at that age. They're a lot more responsible and they seem to know

When it finished, I turned to the other country station in Nashville just as the solo from the song was playing. Since

It all started innocently enough, when David Cassidy was awakened by KLOS' "Mark & Brian," who decided to send up the former teen idol's birthday with a phone call. "I just told them it was lonely at the top and lonelier at the bottom," laughs the goodnatured 40-year-old son of character actor Jack Cassidy and actress Evelyn Ward. "It's all the same ride, and once you embrace that, you don't feel as if you have to prove anything to anyone." A follow-up trip to the station led to Cassidy playing some demos of songs he'd been working on, which happened to be heard by an Enigma art director, who set the wheels in motion for David to be signed by the Culver City label. All of a sudden, 12 years after his last U.S. album and 15 years after performing live in this country, David Cassidy was hot again.

At his peak, playing Keith Partridge in the hit TV series, "The Partridge Family," David Cassidy was a superstar whose very first single, "I Think I Love You," went straight to #1 and sold more than 6 million copies around the world. His new album is bound to be a bit of a surprise for those who remember David from his bubblegum days. "David Cassidy," the album, is a mature, rock & rolling work whose first single, "Lyin' To Myself," was one of the most added records in the country its first week out. Produced by a variety of top-name sessioneers, including Phil Ramone, E. T. Thorngren, Greg Edward and Carter, it puts David Cassidy back at the center of the pop universe once again, marking an unlikely but very welcome comeback. In this era of '70s nostalgia for smile buttons, disco and "Have A Nice Day," David Cassidy looks back only once, when he samples his own "I Think I Love You" on the new album's playful version of "Hi-Heel Sneakers."

The first thing you notice about David Cassidy is he's not afraid to make fun of himself or his image. He's comfortable with his success — and the years that have passed since those triumphs. He hangs with his girlfriend Sue Shifrin, who co-wrote several songs on the new LP. He feels his musical abilities have always been misunderstood by people who thought he was the character he played on TV. "While we were cutting this Partridge Family stuff, I was out seeing Jimi Hendrix," he told HITS' own Reuben Kincaid lookalike Roy Trakin. "You can only imagine what it was like to look up and see Danny Bonaduce playing bass, while I was doing sessions with people like Larry Carlton, Jim Gordon and Hal Blaine."

WE THINK WE LOVE HIM

You don't seem to mind that people consider you a camp curiosity.

Even when I thought I was out of fashion, and really didn't know what the fuck I wanted to do, I just looked at it as, this is really an interesting hand I've been dealthere, and how am I going to play it? The only thing I wouldn't do is try to go back and re-create what came before. That's done. It was time to do something else. It

just took me a long time to decide what I wanted to do. When Mark & Brian invited me on their show, I wasn't interested in getting a record deal. I had decided it wasn't going to happen. And I didn't want to go out there and get my guts kicked in by hearing how uncool or out of the groove I was. Or hearing some guy who had never sold or made a record tell me what a genius he was by saying I didn't

have that drum sound right.
You began recording a solo record in
Nashville back in '82.

I did three sides with Larry Butler, but I felt like a stranger in a strange land. They didn't get me; I didn't get them. For whatever reason, it didn't work out. I wanted to see if I could toke my pop thing and graft it onto that. I didn't want to be a country artist. I went to New York to do

some theater, then I came back to L. A. and kicked around for awhile, but nothing was going on. I received an offer to go to England, where I wrote and recorded an album, "Romance," for Arista U.K., which was a hit in Europe, but I had become disillusioned with the music business.

Was it difficult to avoid the typecasting after being in "The Partridge Family?"
People always wanted me to go back and

make that kind of record. In the music business, you have to have a really definite idea of what you want to do. I've always been the kind of guy who has felt, let's go into this and see what happens. "You're doing things my way" has never been my approach. When going into a creative situation with a writer-producer, I've always felt, let's see what we can develop together. That's where the great stuff I've ever created as an actor has occurred. Let's play the scene and see how it goes.

I guess it's easy for that to be interpreted as weakness in the record business.

I think people perceive it as someone who's not really sure where he's going and what he wants to be. But that's not true at all. George Michael, for instance, has the most uncanny way of removing himself from himself. It's beyond objectivity. He sees the entire picture and how he fits into it — whether it's the next video, the next album, how he's going to look, how he's going to sound, who he's going to play with. That's a phenomenal talent.

He certainly was able to recover from the teenybopper stigma of Wham!

He had the ability to get to the next step.

And tremendous record company support.

And great management. Which is importent. It was a classic case of the artist, management and label deciding what they wanted to do, how to do it and having the talent to bring it off.

There seems to be a tremendous amount of interest in your return.

Back when I was in "The Partridge Family," all the journalists were older. Now, all the writers I speak to are my age or younger. They grew up with me. They know everything I've ever done. I talked to one guy this morning who said to me, "I've spoken to a lot of people in the entertainment business, but I've never been as

excited as I am talking to you." I really appreciate hearing stuff like that. I knew how genuine it was. I could hear it in his voice. He didn't have to say anything more. It's nice to know writers aren't looking at me half-cocked and strange like they did when I first started out. I am this guy. I've been this guy for a long time and I've finally come to accept it. Not only am I not denying my past, I like it.

Did you ever wish you hadn't gone through it?

A thousand times. If only I hadn't gone to that meeting and done this film instead of that television show, I would've been someone else. But if I hadn't, I wouldn't have learned all the things I've learned about myself in life. Maybe I would have had a certain artistic credibility I wished I'd had at that time. But I've been dealt a great hand, even if it didn't always seem that way. At times, it was horrible. I was this guy locked up in this body, pictured on the back of lunch boxes and bubblegum cards. It can take your soul away. Donny Osmond was what you saw. I wasn't.

Did Donny's comeback influence you at all? It had nothing to do with what I'm doing, though we did have some of the same problems. But Donny was Donny. I was an actor playing a part. Keith Partridge was not me. At all. And it's taken this long for people to realize that.

"I Think I Love You" was released as a Partridge Family single featuring David Cassidy.

Bell Records was very smart. They put out Partridge Family albums as well as David Cassidy albums. One would come out every three or four months. In the beginning, most of the songs were written by outside songwriters. I started writing more later on.

What was "The Partridge Family" experience like?

I was an actor trying to pay the rent. I came to L. A. from New York, where I had done Broadway, and started working my ass off. I did ten leads on episodes in a year before I landed the gig in "The Partridge Family" when I was 19. I went into this audition that they had to twist my arm for because I read the script and thought it was horrible. Shirley [Jones, his real-life stepmother] was cast way after me. My mind was blown when I found out

end up coming to you. Enigma called and wanted to make a record with me. I thought they wanted me to go back and do what I had done, but they really liked the demos of the new stuff. You worked a bit with Mick Ronson in the late '70s.

He and I met in New York and began playing a little bit. He was floundering and so was I, looking for a direction. We decided to get together and see how people would respond. I liked him a lot. He's a very musical guy. He didn't want to be a foil for me, because he had already done that. He wanted to be an equal member in a band. We did some demos and rehearsed awhile, but it never quite happened. David Bowie was supposed to produce an album of mine about a year before that, but that never happened, either. I've heard he's done that to people before, though.

You had no plans to get back into the music business.

The interesting thing about it is, once you give up hoping things will happen, they

direction and input. I've never had the head of the company, head of promotion, head of A&R and head of publicity involved in what I was doing to this degree. How do you think this album will do? I think people are going to be surprised. I've heard shocked.

A lot of people have been reassessing the '70s and even looking back fondly on it. People are recognizing, like they did with the '50s and '60s, that the '70s had something to offer, including the last gasp of innocence. There was a lot of good music that came out of that period.

What's success like for you the second time around?

I appreciate every breath I take, honestly, when I get up in the morning. I love what I get to do every day. I walk down the street and people come up to me and say, "Wow, man. Can I just tell you what you've meant to me in my life?" That's great. Anyone who wouldn't be complimented by that is out of their mind. What's the biggest misconception about

That I was Keith Partridge. It's taken me a

long time to find the humor in it. I used to pretend it didn't bother me, but it did. Now, it's just hysterical.







It's been brought to my attention that some new releases are not being given a shot at airplay at a number of stations around the country. It's not because they are BAD records, or HOMOGENIZED cover versions. It's because (check THIS out) they're "TOO BLACK" !!!!! WHAT THE HELL DOES THIS MEAN? What makes a record TOO BLACK for BLACK Radio? Since the first recordings of George Johnson and Bessie Smith, there have been records recorded by and for Blacks. It's been called Race Music, Blues, Hoochie-Coochie, Rock & Roll, Hip-Hop, and a million other names. Although this music was meant primarily for the Black listener, multitudes of non-blacks have embraced this art form. The truth of the matter is that this music is mass ap-

peal music. Everybody likes it. The real deal is that some consultants, some GMs, and even some PDs and MDs, think that simply because a record has a funky beat, a hard edge, or poignant lyrics, it will offend non-black listeners. THAT'S BULLSHIT!!!! AREN'T BLACK PEOPLE YOUR CORE AUDIENCE? And why do you think non-blacks are tuning in? As I learned as a programmer, where approximately 30% of my audience was non-black, people, regardless of race, were tuning in because they wanted to hear BLACK music. PERIOD. GIVE IT TO THEM!!! If your station needs consulting, that's cool. But my advice to the consultants calling records "TOO BLACK" is to CONSULT your stations, not INSULT them. LATER.

Aaaab Italia! Land of da Vinci, Fiat, opera, pizza and provolone, where governments are measured in minutes and only crime is organized. Now, the country in the shape of a boot is bome to the dance sensation Black Box. Not since Enrico Caruso bas such feelgood music been beard from Italy. It is a sound that is everywhere — in the clubs and on the streets. Producer Daniele Davoll, with his partners, former TV jingle writers Mirko Limoni and Valerio Semplici, have captured the dancing feet of Europe as Mussolini never could. Giving voice to their creation is the talented and lovely Katrin. Like most ex-model disco singers born in France but living in Italy, Katrin speaks only French and Italian, making the supreme success of "Dreamland," Black Box's RCA debut LP, all the more incredible. Katrin learned the English lyrics phonetically for the seven months it took to make the album. But her lack of English only adds to the excitement of an interview, taking it from mere publicity to bigb diplomacy. To demonstrate this thrill, HITS is including in the conversation both what we imagined Katrin said and the official RCA interpretation, supplied by magnificent translator Patrizia Nicoloso. And because our ace investigative reporter (and shameless womanizer) H. Lee David didn't trust getting bis information second-band, be brought along Biancamaria Longoni — a UCLA Pb.D. and brain chemistry researcher — and Lynn Boyden-Weiner — a cultural attache with the Italian consulate in LA. — along for the ride. Whatta card!

Do you want to be in music for the rest of your life or do you want to take the success and retire early?

Katrin: I want to stay in music forever. It's what I do. It's what I love.

You only sing now, Are you planning to do more in the future?

Katrin I don't feel yet that I'm able to write my own songs. But I'm working towards that. It's important to me that it's something I start to do.

Aside from this interview, what's been the saddest moment of your life?

Katrin: There's no one instance. I'm always sad when I'm away from home. I'd rather be at home.

Then what are your happiest moments? Katrin: Getting my hands around your scrawny little neck, you pencil-dick little geek. Tell him when I have a microphone in my band and I'm up onstage. Performing is the greatest thrill for me. RCA Int: You heard her; I don't need



FINE, FINE CHERRY PIE

Warrant has taken its share of blows of late. From overheated rock critics who claim that the L.A.-based five-piece hard-pop band is viciously sexist, to metal bands labeling them pansies, Warrant has been getting major grief. The band chooses to go by the adage that living well is the best revenge and are thoroughly enjoying their last laugh. The title cut and first single off the band's sophomore album, "Cherry Pie," has stormed into the Top 40, and shows every chance of following its predecessor, "Dirty, Rotten, Filthy, Stinking Rich," into the multi-platinum ranks. HITS caught up with lead singer Jani Lane in the Green Room of the "Arsenio Hall Show" just before the band left on the first leg of its tour opening for Poison, practicing his devastating impression of the program's host for correspondent Sharon Liveten, who can do a mean Joan Rivers when prompted.

This record is a bit different from the first one.

I think we've been unfairly labeled as California beach bimbos. I hope this record changes that perception, because it's generally a more diverse album. It's definitely a heavier record, and that was intentional. We went into the studio a little more focused than

one. I didn't want to get caught in the situation where you come off 16 months touring and 30 days later, the record company wants the new album. I heard that "Cherry Pie" wasn't on the album at first but that it was written at the request of Donnie Ienner.

Sort of. After he got the record, Donnie

Was the record written before you went into the studio?

I started writing this record before we had even finished recording the last

called me up and said that he'd listened to the record and loved it, but he wanted one more song. Two days later, I sent him the demo of "Cherry Pie" and got a call saying, "That's it! That's the first single. I can't believe you did

it!" He said the only time he'd heard that happening before was when Jon Landau told Springsteen he needed one more song, and Bruce came back with "Dancing In The Dark."

How do you normally write songs?
The influences can come from
anywhere — watching TV, women,
tequila, a line or phrase someone says.
I wrote the song "Mr. Rainmaker"
after the name of our bus.

The strongest songs on this album aren't about women and booze.

I have a tough time dealing with artists that are overly political. I still have a gut feeling that rock & roll should be fun. There's a happy balance that you have to keep. For every U2, there should be a fun band that wants nothing better than to go out and party. But we have some "important" songs, too. "Uncle Tom's Cabin" is a very storyoriented song, with a different subject matter for us. There's also "Song and Dance Man," which talks about how, after the novelty of sex and money wear off, you still have to get down to what the meaning of it all is. If you think in metaphysical terms, you have to believe that there is more of a purpose for us being here than just to sit around, get laid and drunk.

That's pretty philosophical for a guy who's been labeled a sexist pig.

I probably think too much for my own good. That's the kind of shit that keeps you up at four in the morning, when you're trying to get to sleep and instead you're discussing the meaning of life with yourself. I am not a sexist. I guess a lot of really conservative people were upset about the cover of "Cherry Pie," because there was that slice of pie in front of the girl's crotch. It was meant to be funny. C'mon, it's all in fun! I have a tremendous amount of respect for women, I really do. I'm not a chauvinist. I love women: they're some of the most intelligent people I know.

What's behind the "Ode to Tipper Gore"?

The censorship issue has gotten so out of hand. "Ode to Tipper Gore" is totally exaggerated, but sometimes you have to exaggerate to make a point. That's what we did. It's done in a tongue-in-cheek way. Hopefully, we won't have record burnings in the Bible Belt, but it's a serious topic.

What's your goal?


I want to define Warrant a little more with each record, so that, by the fifth or sixth album, people will have a real good idea of what the band's about and they'll stop giving us shit about being a brainless bunch of ditzes from California. I hope they'll understand that it's just fun music and that occasionally we even come up with something that you might be able to relate to personally. I think some of our ballads are really good. Perhaps down the road, people will get the joke. Let's face it, money is great. Anybody who tells you it's not is a liar. But with money comes a lot of responsibilities. It's not the bottom line with me. I didn't get into this to become the richest man in the world. I got into it to put a smile on people's faces.

What about the future?

I wouldn't mind having Don Ienner's job in about 12 years. I like the way he handles situations. I just sit back, watch and learn. If I ever get into a position where I want to stop going out, getting sweaty and banging my head, maybe that would be a good alternative.
