The War In The Gulf Affects The Music Industry

CRISIS MANAGEMENT!

War Rocks Rock

The music biz is feeling the effects of events in the Middle East. Rock bands Cinderella and Slaughter cut short their European tour after last Sunday's London show because of the war in the Persian Gulf, postponing dates in Germany, Italy, France and Sweden until the summer. The groups' final concert at the Hammersmith Odeon was marked by tight security, including bombsniffing dogs. When the tour's German promoter allegedly received terrorist threats, the groups decided to head home. "Just think what great headlines we'd provide for terrorists with a name like ours," said lead singer Mark Slaughter. "But we just couldn't put all people's lives in danger."

In addition, the conflict has played havoc with MIDEM, the annual biz confab being held in Cannes this week. Delegates from U.S. companies like BMI, EMI Publishing, SBK Records, MCA Publishing, Warner Chappell and Windswept Pacific are among those who stayed away. European attendance is reportedly the same as last vear.

While it's far too early to determine if the Gulf war will send the economy into a tailspin, taking the music industry down with it, one thing's for sure - we're in the midst of a major crisis, and while sales don't seem to be suffering, the retail community can feel it.

Some retailers are claiming that initial volume hasn't decreased: however, product being sold has a different feel to it. Sandy Bean of Harmony House says that Ray Charles' "Greatest Hits Vol. 2" (Rhino), featuring the cut "America The Beautiful," is "selling like crazy."

According to Larry Webb of Music City Records Distributors: "Massive requests have been coming in for Waylon Jennings' Eagle,' Lee Greenwood's 'God Bless The USA' and Aaron Tippin's 'You've Got To Stand For Something."

Tower Westwood's Eric Coyne notes an increase in requests for George Michael's "Mother's Pride" (thanks to a local radio station's remix), while many reports continue to note Styx's "Show Me The Way" as a consistently hot mover.

Some outlets are saying the crisis has been felt at the cash register. "Yes, it's slowed considerably since the war broke out," said Alison Continued On Page 16

Original **Byrd** vocalist and songwriter Gene Clark, the one-time New Christy Minstrel who founded the band with Roger McGuinn, on being inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame: "It's very exciting because it gives the five original guys a chance to get together in one place at one time, which has been impossible for years because everyone's been doing their own thing. It's silly for

us to have any kind of animosity in a situation like this." Clark left the band back in the mid-'60s among hard feelings because he wrote so much of the group's material. "I don't think the other guys realized what that meant once the records started selling. When the checks began to come in and mine were larger, I don't think it sat very well with them."

The Centers for Disease Control report that, despite sex education and AIDS prevention programs, premarital sex among adolescent women has accelerated during the last two decades. The recent study shows that two years ago, 25.6% of 15year-old girls said they had premarital sex, compared to only 4.6% in 1970. For 18year-olds, the increase was from 39.4% to 69.5%; and







Evans with husband Mitchell Hochberg, Ahmet and Mica Ertegun, Selma (Mrs. Nesuhi) Ertegun with Seymour Stein and daughter Samantha, Jann and Jane Wenner, Bob Krasnow. Joe McEwen and Marv Ellen Cataneo McEwen. and Hope Geller. Gregg Lenny Kaye, Andy Paley, Mr. and Mrs. Art Levy, Corey Hart, Jackson Browne, Bob Merlis, Billy Gibbon of ZZ Top. Other highlights of the long and incredible night included La-Vern Baker's dazzling and presence, Curtis joyous Mayfield's heartwrenching appearance via satellite video from his home in Atlanta, where he remains paralyzed following last summer's onstage accident, and Bonnie Raitt's speech inducting John Lee Hooker, perhaps the best in the history of Hall of Fame Ceremonies. TOP 40 GOES TO WAR

With everyone in the business still reeling from the war in the Persian Gulf, we wanted to get a feel for the way Top 40 radio has dealt with this crisis. After talking with dozens of P.D.s over the first few days of the war, a definite pattern developed.

As usual, there were guys totally prepared with contingency plans in case of conflict and more than a few that seemed caught by surprise. Most of the stations went to continuous live coverage for the first two or three hours, and then down to one or two reports an hour. There were also a great many dedication shows and special music programming. Most are covering all of President Bush's press conferences and will break in with any new developments.

HITS talked with Brian Philips of KDWB in Minneapolis-St. Paul and Steve Douglas of KXXR in Kansas City, and came away with two very different slants on the crisis, perhaps revealing an insight into Top 40's future in gamering those 25+ demos it seeks.

Brian Philips, KDWB, Minneapolis-St. Paul: "It's too bad it had to be because of war, but this was a great opportunity to show that Top 40 is more than just a jukebox. We went with massive coverage. Our local news department had stringers out talking to support groups for families of servicemen. We dropped all contests and promos and went to music and info. The response has been great. We've been planning what to do for two months in case this happened. We're now running two reports an hour and will devote even more time if developments warrant it."

Steve Douglas, KXXR, Kansas City: "We were pretty tentative and subdued the first hour. We didn't ignore the war, but we felt that, with the image of the station, it wouldn't do us any good. Our listeners aren't looking to us to be some sort of emotional source or sounding board for this thing. In any market, you've got a jillion news talk stations and if anything is going on, they're watching TV anyway. All the stations were covering it, so we decided not to. We loosened up a bit and got a flood of calls from people that just wanted to have a good time, but we were careful not to insult the people that are really sensitive to it.

"I grabbed the Life section out of *USA Today* and said, "O.K., we're not the front page, we're the Life section. We'll talk about the TV news coverage of the war and cover it from sort of a secondary ring." So we never went to continuous coverage and we're not doing update reports except for our morning news. If it continues on for a long while and we start losing lots of lives, then we'll get more somber in our handling of the situation."



With the recent problems Top 40 radio is having attracting Adult numbers, this crisis could possibly point to a different way to attract and hold that upper demo besides just playing recurrents and oldies. Why can't Top 40 be more full-service, with news, weather, sports and entertainment info to help attract and hold

adults? Most stations are running news on the morning show and that's it for the rest of the day. With society becoming more information-oriented, shouldn't Top 40 take a look at itself to see if it might be missing an important tool to help deal with the adult problem it faces? •

Charismatic British singer/guitarist/songwriter Daniel Ash is a founding member of two arty-atmospheric PoMo pioneers — Bauhaus and his present band, Love and Rockets. Longtime bandmate David J. released his solo album last year, and now, after two years in the studio, it's Ash's turn. "Coming Down," as Ash would describe it, is a "most definitely blue album" — darkly sexual and sentimental all at once — bearing Ash's distinctively playful moody stamp. The first single, "This Love," is about "drugs, alcohol, prostitutes, confusion — all those horrible things — mixed in with love, but with lust overriding it." In other words, all the necessary components to make it a hip-grinding hit.

It's 80 degrees in L.A., as the whip-thin, sickly-pale, leather pants-clad Ash strides into the multi-windowed RCA Records conference room. Squinting suspiciously under the combination of neon lights and the ultra-bright glare of another beautiful Tinseltown day, Ash frowns. Muttering about the ill effects of fluorescence — "I don't understand why all the offices in the world have to have these lights beaming down all these positive ions; it drains your energy' - and murmuring his apologies, he closes the blinds, one by one, until the room grows dim. Ash's face grows visibly relaxed as he seats his jet-lagged body, which lets out a distinctive sound because HITS' practical joker Shari "Friends" Roman "Countrymen" had surreptitiously slipped a whoopie cushion under the rocker's tiny Brit butt.

row-mindedness. Contemporary music is always a sign of the times and we're living in a mass-produced society. If someone wants to steal a riff, let them. Music belongs to everyone. I don't think we should get hung up on possessing

What kind of music would piss you off? I find "cock-rock" very pathetic — it's like bad sex. Personally, I find it revolting. I'm not saying I'm a feminist — I've got my own problems like anybody else — but it's very derogatory towards women. I like to think I'm broadminded, but New Kids On The Block disturb me. But even that has a use — there's a certain age group that likes that kind of stuff. If they didn't need it, they wouldn't buy it.

What's happening with Love and Rockets? There have been rumors the band is really pretentious, but with the nature of the band it was a necessary thing. We were naive and young, very, very extreme and very arrogant.

Do you still have that arrogance? Back when we were doing Bauhaus, there was this kind of conceit, which is something that was valid at the time. But then you get a bit older. You get knocked a few times, you become humble and you realize you're not quite as good as you thought you were. It's a hell of a lesson to learn.

What was the inspiration for "Coming Down"?

Being a musician, I feed off my personal experiences. Only one track on this album "Candy Darling," which is about the Warhol character — was actually fabricated. I suspect some people get songs from reading books, which I think is bullshit. The good stuff is usually about relationships, because we as human beings are at a stage spiritually where we very much need each other.

So you were drawing from your own relationship? The album is very romantic, but very dark.

Well, my marriage sort of broke down, so the old cliche goes, and this album is the result. I only record when I'm feeling really uptight — when I'm wired or pissed off. With any art form, if you

want to create

something worthwhile, you have to be in an extreme emotional state, be it high or low. If you're just feeling mellow, you're going to come out with a lot of stuff that's pretty boring.

There's a real sexual edge to your music. (Ed. note: Whoa there, Shari...)

I hope so. That's what rock & roll is all about. From Eno's early sensual ambient stuff right through to Jerry Lee Lewis' "Great Balls Of Fire," which is an instant whack! If any band or song hasn't got that element, it can't work. Even the sad and lonely songs are about sex, because if you're sad and lonely, you're usually pissed off because you're not getting any. What do you think of the music sampling and culture synthesizing that's become so popular? Do you feel that a lot of new music is hopelessly derivative?

Use it, abuse it — it's all there to be used as long as it doesn't use you. People get too hung up about it. A purist might say, for example, don't use an electric quitar. It's all bullshit, musical snobbery and narbreaking up.

If it feels right, the band will get back together. We've always worked in an instinctive way. Me and Dave 'ust needed to get away from each other. We're extremely different people. Right now, I get more of a buzz from doing his.

Will you do a solo tour? I want to do alternative gigs — small places with tables and chairs where you can really get an atmosphere. I want to get the right smell. I want to use this fragrance that they use during communion in Catholic churches — incense and myrrh. I'd like to get a few hundred of those sticks burning during the gig to get the smell right into the audience. It's not a religious thing. I just want it to be something where you fall into a dark blue atmosphere but only for an hour, Like Mick Jagger said, everything gets boring after an hour. Do you get asked much about Bauhaus

anymore?

It's fading more and more. I'm really quite proud of Bauhaus. Sometimes we were





HITS' own wanderlust victim John Sutton-Smith scammed a free meal at Le Dome with the duo shortly before getting a real job and his own expense account.



It's been a while since the last Divinyls album.

Christina Amphlett: After Chrysalis dropped us a couple of years ago, we thought, what the hell, let's go to Paris and have some fun. We stayed in the Pigalle, the red light district, and we started writing again. Then we got another deal. The record sounds like a whole new beginning for you. Christina: Just to get off Chrysalis felt great. It was like being let out of jail.

Mark McEntee: They never seemed to understand what we were on about, and we didn't seem to have any friends there — but what the hell, that was the old days.

There's a real simple energy about the record that's infectious.

Christina: A lot of what inspired us was doing the album in Europe. I sang on the streetcomers of Paris and explored the darker sides of town, so that probably rubbed off on our music.

Mark: Well, that's more Chrissy. She adds the atmospheric side and I'm more the music. Christina: I'm a scatterbrain, so "I had this contortionist in the video touching herself — something a contortionist can do very well."

Mark puts everything into form and structure. We understand each other's style and we fit together very well in that way. It's hard to come by somebody whom you can work with as long as we have. The group's more pop-oriented than many of the other Aussie bands.

Christina: This album is more refined and subtle, while "Temperamental" was more rock and hitting you over the head. I think we've grown a lot on this record and maybe returned more to our pop roots. We took a lot of chances, things we hadn't done before. With a new label and writing overseas, we tried to think differently and do some new things.

Mark: Playing with a new set of musicians brought a freshness and excitement to it, too.

Where are you living right now? Christina: We don't really live anywhere at the moment. We've been living out of suitcases for the last year and a half.

Mark: Sometimes I pine for a bit of vegemite on toast, though. Did you have to cut your performing teeth on that gruelling Australian beer barn circuit?

Christina: That's the way you grow up in Australia. It's very harsh and it makes Australian music hard and brash. It's a very good training ground, but it's tough.

America has its own rites of passage.

Mark: Yeah, but when your music does get through, people go back to the early work. Take AC/DC. They're only really being appreciated in this country now, and they've done great stuff for years. Are you putting an Aussie band together for the tour? Christina: We're touring down

Christina: We're touring down there first and we're using some of the people we've worked with over the years.

Mark: Musicians there are more familiar with what we're doing,

so it's probably easier. You've done a video for the first single, "I Touch Myself." Christina: We shot it here in a nunnery in Pasadena. We sent the nuns away for the weekend to a hotel. So they were whooping it up around the pool. Nuns have got to do what they've got to do at times to make some money and keep everything going. I remember there were some nuns in London who played pool to raise money for their church. Will you send the nuns a copy of the video? Christina: I don't know that we will. I don't think they'd approve. I had this contortionist in the video touching herself — something a contortionist can do very well. When you first went on the road

on a musical career? Christina: I was singing on streetcomers in Europe to make money. I joined my first band when I was 14.

Mark: I've never worked an honest day in my life. I've just always played. O

TIME FOR A CUP OF JOE AND A DOUGHNUT

Call it backwoods-boogie-swamp-stomp-music, call it traditional Southern folk sounds or call it just pretty damn weird, but whatever it is that the Chickasaw Mudd Puppies play, it's darn entertaining! Mudd Pups Brant Slay and Ben Reynolds first met back at art school in Georgia (Brant was a sculptor, Ben studied photography), but it wasn't until Michael Stipe unloaded a sack of harmonicas on Slay that thoughts of music began to swim in their noggins. The two started jamming, which basically involved Slay "making noise with a harmonica" to Reynolds' guitar. Brant eventually added a washboard, bells, stompboard and hoots and hollers to his repertoire and the Chickasaw Mudd Puppies were born.



The boys soon bailed on art school with a mission — to bring the joys of porch music to an unsuspecting world. Last year, they released an EP on PolyGram called "White Dirt" (named after the Indian clay that is used in knopectate), and they have recently followed that up with a Michael Stipe and Willie Diron-produced full-length album simply titled "8 Track Stomp." The Chickasaw Mudd Puppies have also had a chance to experience life on the road courtesy of opening slots for the Rave-Ups, Violent Femmes and the Waterboys, but they knew they'd finally arrived when they sat down to chew the fat with HITS' anemic Erin "Go Bragh" Calley, who promptly left them holding the check.

W

hat do you think of the road life?

Ben Reynolds: [Laughs.] It's glamorous... for a day. The first time you get a deli tray, it's great, and then

after that you get dulled. You've got 30 minutes a day that you've got to be alert and then for the other 23 1/2 hours, you just kind of kick back.

Are you homesick at all?

Ben: I miss splitting logs. I haven't had a chance to split logs this year and I miss that. What's the first thing you'll do when you get home?

Ben: Go get my dog, Ten. It's spelled the Roman numeral way, "X." 'cause that was his number at the pound. I just love him so much. He's staying at a friend's across the creek. He actually took up over there before we left. You see, my dog loves to ride in the car and this guy delivers newspapers, so X wakes me up about 3 o'clock in the morning, goes over there and the guy cooks him pancakes and then they go deliver newspapers and then, about 9 or 10 o'clock, he's back at my house sitting by my car ready to go into town with me. He's got it all worked out.

What is it that inspires the Chickasaw Mudd Puppies?

Ben: Musically, our inspiration's traditionally Southern blues-type stuff and country. When I was growing up, I was listening to country, until it was time to rebel against mom and dad. Brant listened to a lot of Southern rock. Brant Slay: So did you, you 8-track-era

Ben: I heard them on the radio, but I don't think I ever owned a Lynyrd Skynyrd album. Last year, with the release of your debut EP, you said you weren't great musicians, but you made up for it with enthusiasm. This new album sounds pretty darn musical to me.

Ben: Well, we've been playing for a while

since the first record, so I hope we've gotten a little better.

Breast: We can actually say that we "play" now. It's a step up, I guess.

What did you say you did before then?

Ben: [Laughs.] It was all lip-synched.
Hillbilly Vamilli. We couldn't even admit to
ourselves that we had a band before. It was
like, "What do we do? We make noise and

we have a good time." I mean, I've never been in a band before. I used to sing in the shower, that was about it.

So are you a band now?

Brant I still won't admit to it. I don't know how to play anything. All I can do is put my feeling into a harmonica, and I guess I know a harmonica well enough to know where I'm supposed to be on it. I still have to ask Ben what key on the harmonica I should play on a particular song.

You play well enough to entertain people. Isn't that enough?

Ben: Yeah, I think we tend to apologize for the fact that we lack skill. I used to get real nervous 'cause every place you play there are always those five guitar players in the front row with their arms crossed thinking, "I can do that better than he can." And it's like yeah, you can. But I'm doing it. I'm having a good time and I'm not gonna feel guilty just because you're better than me.

You guys have a penchant for strange instruments.

Ben: I have this thing out at my house, like the top to an oxygen tank or something — it sounds great with a spoon.

Brant: Yeah, now we've got one of those little bells you see at hotel front desks.

We've also got a washboard with a bunch of cowbells on it, a train whistle, tomahawk cowbells and an electric cicada bug that makes all these squealing noises while its eves flash.

What kind of audiences have you been getting?

Ben: We had a couple of times where we had to stop the show because, unbelievably enough, people were slamdancing and hurting each other. We were playing a real highbrow ritry place, and all of a sudden we look down and there's a kid with his tooth lying on the floor. We thought that stuff went out in the '80s!

Brant: There II be 10-year-old kids out there having a good time and then there II be a 50-year-old guy really digging it, too.

Ben: When we've played some of the folk

testivals. I've seen 70- or 80-year-old women getting into it. It's real rewarding to see the more traditional people enjoying our music, too.

What would be the ultimate sign to you quys that you've made it?

Ben: To hear our tape blasting out from one of those low-riders. That'd be great!

Chagall Guevara, "Chagall Guevara" (MCA): The individual pedigrees of Chagall Guevara would truly amaze even you, our most discerning and cynical listener. Singer Steve Taylor even had a HUGE PoMo hit, "Jim Morrison's Grave." Produced by Matt Wallace, he of Replacements fame, this col-

laboration has fashioned an album of manic, guitar-driven, lyrically brilliant songs. Insightful, creative, reckless, furious, and inspiring rock 'n' roll is rarely found in such great depth as on this album. As Christgau would say, "A+."

Screaming Trees, "Uncle Anesthesia" (Epic): We've been patiently and anxiously awaiting the Screaming Trees major label debut LP, wading through side projects (Mark Lanegan's god-head solo record, Solomon Grundy and the Purple Outside), in quest of an elpee's worth of tunes. It's here. And it's great in every uncool paive way that you would



in every uncool, naive way that you would expect from a band that has toured extensively, yet still regards Seattle as a big city. This is "rock" music in its maiden glory; no frills, enviable hooks and musical intensity that is truly intoxicating.



Hollow Men, "Cresta" (Arista): The cover art, depicting various types of acid tabs, inspired fear that the Hollow Men would be "just another band from Manchester." All fears are abated; this band is from Leeds (home of the Mekons), and "Cresta" is successful in transcending current musical trends. In

fine voice, singer David Ashmore leads his band of accomplished musicians through his trippy visions, while they weave in and out with a concentration on rhythm. "Don't Slow Down" and "Barefoot Parade" are standouts.

Only Ones, "Special View" (Epic): Hooray to Sony Music for initiating the reissue of sixteen CDs under the heading of "Post Modern Pioneers." The 1979 US debut by the Only Ones, culled from their first two UK LPs, is one of the greatest albums of all time. Peter Perrett was a misguided and unappressive of the state of the state

DENVER NUGGET

Was KS104 originally intended as a dance-leaning Top 40?
No. The station was initially adult when we put it on the air. We would've preferred to do Top 40, but after doing research, we figured adult was where the best opportunity was. There were already two other Top 40s in the market in KRXY and KPKE.

Did you ever think a dance station could be a winner in Denver?


If someone told me in 1987 that this was going to be a successful formula, I probably would have doubted it. When I first arrived in the market, KIMN, the old AM, was still successful. It was pretty much Bryan Adams followed by Van Halen followed by Huey Lewis. The Top 40s were very white and pretty tight.

Whose brainstorm was it to change formats? It was my idea. But when we

did change formats in '87, we were much more mainstream - not a dance-oriented Top 40 by any means. We didn't really take a dance lean until '88, when our research showed that there was an opportunity to make the station more dance. There were a lot of people buying lots of dance records and going to the clubs. Do you think there's a rap backlash going on at Top 40? I think the kids will continue to like and buy rap until it becomes acceptable to their parents. But it's no longer hip when mom likes it, so then they'll find something else that's radical and that mom will hate. Rap, for the time being, is very polarized and will continue that way. It's still a strong factor as a music form. It sells and there are mass-appeal cuts. As a music form it's here to stay, but as far as radio goes, anything can happen. The amount of rap on the air will change.

What is happening to your

Dave Van Stone's path to radio greatness started right in his hometown of Santa Maria, California, where he got his first job doing weekends at KSEE. Dave took a giant step by moving to Las Vegas, and a gig doing nights at KLUC which eventually led to his first PD job, at L.V.'s KMJJ in 1978. After a stint as PD at KRQ in Tucson, Dave returned to the City of Slots to hold down the PD jobs at both KLUC and KMJJ. In 1983, he landed his biggest PD gig yet — at San Jose's KWSS. He then began his ascent up the executive ladder when Western Cities made him VP. After the company was bought by Nationwide, he became group PD, overseeing the programming of such stations as BJ105, WKZL, WPOC, WGAR, WNCI, KLUC, KZZP, KRQ, KZAP, KWSS and KISW. Today Van Stone finds himself programming KS104 in Denver, which he himself started for Western Cities back in 1987. One recent winter's day, while reflecting on how he has personally made Denver a better place to live and work, Dave's world was turned upside down and his living nightmare began with one innocuous little phrase. "Dave, it's for you.... Says he's Danny Ostrow."

bread-and-butter records? I don't think anything interesting is happening right now, especially in the dance area. We're not building a lot of artists' careers. We are definitely a more song-intensive format than we used to be. In the old days, if Journey came out with a record, you played it —

regardless. Today there are so few superstars and so few automatics on Top 40 radio. Right now I don't see a strong catalog being built for an oldies format in the future. How many disco records from the late '70s do you hear on oldies stations?

Does MTV have a profound effect on Top 40 — or KS104, for that matter?

It affected my playlist a few years back when it had more of a street buzz. Today I don't think MTV has as much of an effect. Five or six years ago, when MTV added a hit record, you could usually feel the impact pretty quickly. I still see some effect from certain videos, but I just don't think it has the impact it used to. Nothing against MTV, but I don't think people are watching it as much as they used to.

Is the recession going to change the way record companies do business with radio? They probably are going to be smarter in their expenditures, making some cutbacks inhouse and with promotional monies. I think it will be a period of belt-tightening when it comes to how much the labels spend on radio promotion.

What has made KS104 a winner?

Our staying power. We've been doing this for a while now and we've made gains every book except one. All this time we've continued to grow. What makes us good is that everyone, from the president of the company through the janitorial service, has been behind us. A lot of companies would have stepped back and said, "Well, this isn't going good; we didn't win overnight, so let's change formats." We have staying power because no matter what, we never became discouraged. We kept working hard and didn't worry about what everybody else was doing.


Aaron Tippin, "You've Got To Stand For Something" (RCA): country than Garth and Clint, Aaron Tippin's voice recalls Hank Williams Sr. as he breathes songs of everyday drama. Putting his stock on oldfashioned values and shouldering the blame for failed relationships in the ti-

tle track and "The Man Who Came Between Us (Was Me)," Tippin writes with a frankness matched only by **Emory Gor**dy's lean, straightforward production. "Many, Many, Many Beers Ago" and "In My Wildest Dreams" are pure fun.

Marty Stuart, "Tempted" (MCA): Carrying Johnny Cash & The Tennessee Two's rocking tradition, Marty Stuart attacks country with an attitude that's second to none. "Tempted" carries on "Hillbilly Rock-"s raucous spirit with the rollicking "Little Ways." But the twanging rendi-



tion of Neil Young's "Get Back To The Country," the yowling "I'm Blue, I'm Lonesome" and the mournful "Blue Train" establish the Lester Flatt alum as a force not only to be reckoned with, but to re-inject danger into Neobilly.



Daniele Alexander, "I Dream In Color" (Mercury): Working with producer Harold Shedd, Daniele Alexander's "I Dream" is closer to MOR than hard country — even as the bumping "I Know What I Do Know" plants a firm stake on that turf. Still the emphasis is on big ballads

like "Who Can She Turn To," delivered in Alexander's deep, often dramatic voice. It'll also make her and labelmate Butch Barker the Loretta and Conway of the '90s with "It Wasn't You, It Wasn't Me" and "How Dreams Get Started."

Pam Tillis, "Put Yourself In My Place" (Arista): Consummate songwriter, passionate singer and way-cool artist, Pam Tillis' focused her gifts on a stellar country LP that equals Rodnev Crowell's breakthrough "Diamonds & Dirt." Whether the fullbore ballad "Maybe It Was Memphis," the mandolin madrigal autobiography "Melancholy Child" or



the honky-tonk shuffles of "Draggin' My Chains" and "Ancient History," Tillis is a performer of pluck, who balances a wink and a weeper, thereby maximizing each's impact.



MARY, MARY QUITE CONTRARY

Washington D.C.'s Mary-Chapin Carpenter represents a brand-new breed of country artist. A singer/songwriter with an urban orientation. Carpenter's acoustic-based folkiness and downright sassy take on country is broadening Neobilly's ever-widening parameters. And though such straight-up shuffles as "How Do" and "You Win Again" have set country radio on fire, Carpenter is as capable of thoughtful balladry as good friend Shawn Colvin or the Indigo Girls — which is what's attracting the disenfranchised music fan from 18 to 35. After all, this is a young woman who turned in a heartfelt rendition of Tom Waits' "Downtown Train" on her "Hometown Girl" debut, celebrated her favorite article of clothing and all the things it'd seen in 'This Old Shirt" on her sophomore "State of the Heart," and tackled a rave-up treatment of "Right Now" on her latest, "Shooting Straight In The Dark." After charming America with her paean to the fate of the bottom-billed, "Opening Act," on this year's CMA Awards, Carpenter has tackled TV with appearances on "Late Night With David Letterman"



and "The Tonight Show." With all that forward momentum, one has to wonder why the young woman who constantly struggles against the "f-word" (as in format) would bother with HITS' answer to diarrhea of the mouth, Neobilly ballbuster Holly Gleason.

You've got a hyphen between your first and middle name. What's the deal?

About a year and a half ago, CBS asked me if I'd mind adding the hyphen. It was really a reaction to my angst that people would call me "Mary," because my name since the day I was born has been "Mary-Chapin."

Has it helped?

[Laughing.] From the way I can tell, it hasn't helped at all. I still have people calling me "Mary."

Where'd you get a name like that?

Chapin's my dad's first name, and Mary's from my mother, obviously: Mary Bowie Robertson. People call her "Bowie," though, and always have. It's one of those old Southern names.

You did a panel in New York about the new country, and you talked about the "f-word" — referring to the obvious limitations of formats. It was pretty funny.

Well, it used to be a joke. But, in a way, it's not a joke anymore. Radio's become so strictly formatted that you have to fit — and there's an awful lot of great music that doesn't. So, what happens to it?

Is that something you're conscious of when you're writing?

I don't know if I'm tuned in that way. I want to write good songs and I'm not sure whether I'm the person to judge that. Hopefully, you grow from project to project. Growth is what you go through every day — and you don't want to interfere with that just because you're worried about making something fit.

Writing seems to be a real focus for your life. Do you write all the time?

Out on the road, I don't write at all. Who does? If you know how, bottle it up and send it to me. So I try to write when I'm home.

Are you one of those writers who has to suffer to create?

I think it's a happening thing. I mean, why would I write when I'm happy? I'm too busy being happy, so I suppose you could start to think that your muse only finds you when you're brooding or falling out of love. Sometimes I think there's a fear of what will happen if everything's too perfect. Sometimes it makes you wonder if you seek misery because that's how you get your muse. Look at somebody like [John] Hiatt, who's led such a traumatic life. Now he's on the other side and he's doing it; his records are real testaments to survival!

Could it all come down to survival?

Maybe. Look at Bonnie Raitt.
She's always been there, putting records out. "Nick of Time," though, is such a badge because it proves she's a survivor. She got through it. And the thing of it is, surviving didn't take any of the edge off her music. Hiatt's "Seven Little Indians" is about as dark as it gets — yet he doesn't have to live that darkness to write about it.

"Shooting" certainly has its lighter moments.

Yeah, when I wrote "Haley Came To Baton Rouge," it was my favorite because it felt so good to come up with this little song from nowhere that was so happy. It was about Haley's Comet and it just came out.

I love "The Moon and St. Christopher." It's a beautiful song, with the piano and the simplicity of the arrangement. It seems like you left a lot of yourself all over it.

I sweated blood over that song. In

fact, I think that was the hardest song I've ever written because I felt stripped naked. Yet when I finished, it was the most intense sense of relief because even if I never write another song, I'd know that one song could stand forever. It was good.

You're one of those artists who stretches the boundaries of country music. Do you ever feel a little out of step, or wonder how you fit in?

I try to not get caught up in that too much. It can paralyze you.

Then how would you define the state of country music right now?

I don't know is my answer because I don't know what country music is anymore. It's not a negative — in fact, it actually makes it more interesting to me. Whatever changes Nashville's gone through over the last few years, I think it's been real healthy because it's embracing all kinds of new things and keeping the music from getting stagnant. ****
