Jeff Ayeroff and Jordan Harris, who started Virgin Records U.S. operations in 1986, have resigned, according to a release from Virgin Music Group Worldwide Chairman and CEO Ken Berry.

Phil Quartararo has subsequently been appointed President and CEO of Virgin Records America Inc.

"I'm sorry to see Jordan and Jeff leave the company after all these years," commented Berry. "We've been both colleagues and friends. However, I am pleased to be able to place the company in the capable hands of Phil Quartararo."

Ayeroff and Harris were named Co-Chairmen following last year's merger of Charisma with the Virgin label. They are credited for building the label's artist roster as well as creating innovative marketing campaigns.

Berry concluded: "We are enjoying our most successful year ever, with three albums and three singles in the Top Ten. Virgin is stronger than ever and we're looking forward to an outstanding future."

announced performers Aerosmith, R.E.M. and Janet Jackson for the awards show.

In addition, Peter Gabriel, Sharon Stone and MTV Networks' chief Tom Freston's date for the evening, RuPaul, have been tapped as the show's first presenters.

A fter spending the last few weeks scratching and clawing at the top spot, Epic Soundtrax's "Sleepless In Seattle" assumed the throne of the HITS Album chart, edging out Cypress Hill, which slips to a strong #2.



MTV's Still Got It & More

ndustry rules to live by: #1) If MTV puts the right video Linto high rotation, they can single-handedly (or nearly single-handedly) explode it in sales. Case in point: Blind Melon's "No Rain" (Capitol). This video has been playing on the channel for about six weeks and averaging 20 plays a week. Its only back-up support for most of this run has been from isolated stations on the Post Modern radio side. The result: an album that was out for nearly a year and not selling is now exploding at retail and rack levels, and this week enters the national Top Ten. By the end of the month, Capitol will be releasing "No Rain" to Top 40, where its newfound magic will most probably explode it through the never-ending maze of radio fragmentation. However, everything that has happened and everything that will happen is due to the spark ignited by MTV. They do have the power when a video/song/band has that magic!!!... While some in the industry and most in radio wrote off Kris Kross (Ruffhouse/Columbia) as a one-shot, the people are most definitely not in agreement. Their new single has been selling well with limited exposure, and now their album hits the

street with great first-week numbers and a Top Ten debut. Can you imagine how big this would be with saturation airplay? Hey, just asking... Has anyone noticed how many albums Toni Braxton (La-Face/Arista) is selling? The record is already in the Top 25 and the smash single, "Another Sad Love Song," is just getting into real rotation in most markets. This artist is for real, and we've only seen the tip of the iceberg... Kudos to everyone at A&M for digging deep and committing hard to break the Gin Blossoms. Long-term payback is just starting... And speaking of long-term commitment, Interscope scores again as 2Pac soars into high gear and heads for Gold. MTV has been cautiously on the sidelines on this one, but they've gotta join soon... The Sleepless In Seattle album (Epic Soundtrax), featuring Jimmy Durante, Nat King Cole, Louis Armstrong and Gene Autry, is now #1, leading the most eclectic Top Ten in recent memory. Rap acts, adult acts, kids acts, Post Modern, R&B, new artists, veteran artists, long-term projects, fast-breaking projects - ANYTHING CAN HAPPEN in today's marketplace!!!







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ni Sr. VP of Marketing Eddie Gilreath has always liked a challenge. The Marylandborn and Philly area-raised Gilreath has never shied away from a tough job. For proof, one can look at his achievements over a career which has spanned stints at Motown ('70-'73), Warner Bros.

('73-'82) and Geffen ('86-'92). Being one of the few African-Americans to run a sales division while at Geffen, Eddie has always fought the notion of predetermined judgements, as when he told this magazine several years ago, "If a person of Caucasian descent can sell the O'Jays and Teddy Pendergrass, then why shouldn't a black person have the ability to sell Aerosmith?" These days, the Temple U. grad is busy being

known as simply one of the best in the biz, a standing he more than jeopardized by agreeing to sit down with HITS' resident round mound of sound, Joe "Mama Wears Army Boots" Medwick, who managed to slime a power lunch at the Universal commissary in the process.

On a day-to-day basis, what's the biggest difference between being at Geffen and your new position at Uni?

The difference is, at a label, you have to deal with every aspect of a release. You're not only involved in the marketing side, but you might be asked to help in choosing the artwork or even the selection of songs. There are a

number of areas you could be involved in. On the distribution side, you are handed the project and have to figure out the best way to take it to the marketplace and maximize its potential. Here, I'm dealing with a lot more individual releases, but on a different level.

What do you like most about your new duties?

One of the reasons I find distribution an exciting part of this industry is that you get to work with the various accounts on a more personal level. This move gives me much more time to work with people I sincerely enjoy being around. To spend time with a King James, who has a small independent shop in Philadelphia, and to get his views on the

industry, is enjoyable and extremely valuable. On the other side, I enjoy talking to a Jack Eugster, a Jim Bonk, an Ann Lieff or a Russ Solomon. Each one has a unique outlook in regard to what's going on at their respective accounts. Being able to go back to your home office and make decisions based on those comments is always a positive thing. For me, it's the only way to maintain that street contact. At distribution, you have to be a good listener as well as provide the proper services and professional responses that your customers expect.

What's it like working on so many substantially different projects?

For me, it's been very exciting because I'm a music junkie. I've always enjoyed all kinds of music. I'm lucky to be working with the staff at GRP, which has, without question, the best contemporary jazz roster today. MCA Nashville is one of the most respected labels around and has proven that emphatically over the last 12 months. And you know what kind of strength MCA Records has in the urban area. Combine those with Geffen, which maintains such strong and diverse pop and rock rosters, and you have to have a very diverse and strong company.

Do you think that the various musical genres have become too isolated because of niche marketing?

I don't think that we isolate them. What we try to do, in a micromarketed world, is take each element of a project and analyze it, then move towards the areas that will give us maximum exposure for that release. The kind of airplay and sales information that comes in from the branches, Soundscan and BDS, helps us really take a hard look and approach each project differently. We can now look at all those elements and decide how we are going to best approach the marketplace and what our next steps should be. We're now able to pinpoint where we want to go with much more accuracy. This allows our music to be made available to many more demographics than

The '90s have brought about a whole slew of new ways to reach the consumer. Do you see the retailer being left out in the cold in this shift?

The one thing I never lose sight of is the importance of the retailer. If we take a look at the retailer as an opportunity and not just a seller, you can take a whole new approach and find ways to market your releases with their

assistance more than ever before. If radio or MTV happens to give you exposure, then that becomes a bonus. But we've found that there are so many other ways of getting exposure than just the electronic media. Publicity has come a long way over the last few years. The word-of-mouth created by the printed word is much more prevalent today than it was just a

few years ago. Then there are talk shows like Arsenio, Leno, Letterman etc., which have been an incredible source of exposure. Very rarely do you receive that type of exposure and not have a positive feedback.

It seems that the marketing of music from films has reached another level of sophistication as well.

We have great movie soundtracks from Varese Sarabande that we are capable of working at four levels: theatrical, home video, cable and through network exposure. It may take a couple of years, but you really have four separate opportunities to promote the soundtrack. The key on soundtracks is that they become timeless and if the consumer has not been exposed, then it still remains a new project to that consumer. We have to take the approach that it's not over until every last person possible has had an opportunity to at least hear it and make a decision.

How do you react to the trend arguably launched by Nirvana which has brought metal and alternative fans together?

When Guns N' Roses first came out, neither Top 40 nor Album Radio wanted to play it. MTV was even a little concerned about it. Since then, Guns N' Roses has become part of the mainstream. I think the same thing has happened with Nirvana. When Nirvana first came out, it was different and unlike any project on mass radio. Now projects like that, whether they're more metal-oriented or a little more alternative, are seen as more mainstream due to their success.

How do you keep up your communications with the independent mom-and-pop stores which break new product?

In our distribution system, we have PDMs whose main job is to take those kind of projects to the marketplace, find those independent stores and begin to find ways to market those opportunities. They've been extremely successful over the past two years in identifying a certain type of music with those stores and have built up necessary credibility to

become very effective marketing alternative and urban music.

Geffen wasn't exactly known for its country roster. How did you like working with Tony Brown and the great crew at MCA Nashville?

What's not to like about country music? It's full of emotion, great lyrics, great sensitivity

and feeling. It's a musical genre that, in its present form, has generated a mass acceptance and MCA Nashville has most assuredly been at the forefront of bringing these great artists to the people. When you talk about Reba McEntire or Vince Gill, you're talking about complete talents. Those artists are not just performing on CMA or AMA shows anymore. They are doing Arsenio, Leno and all kinds of shows that are reaching audiences that not long ago viewed them as not having mass

appeal. But that's not the case today. They have become as relevant as Don Henley or Bobby Brown to all audiences.

But let's give credit where credit is due. The marketing ability of the staff at MCA Nashville is invaluable. Their sensitivity to how they market their artists is unbelievable. They are really at the top of the game. I don't know of any group that's as talented as the Nashville staff. They understand the artist, the marketplace and the audience, and they

know how to reach that audience in new and exciting ways.

There seems to be a lot of consolidation at retail going on. What's your view on that trend?

My biggest concern is that you lose a little of that competitive edge in a certain market-place because, instead of two or three accounts, you only have one. It can make it very difficult to do some of the marketing projects that you would like to. There are good points to market consolidation, but there are also some inherent dangers that would inhibit one from being as clever in their marketing approach as they would like to be. I'm not ecstatic about this change at this point. I may feel better about it later, but right now, there are some dangers I see that, in some ways, outweigh the positives.

Any comments on the ongoing used CD controversy?

We are currently reviewing all of our concerns, and those of our labels, and trying to determine what would be the best way to approach this sensitive issue.

What do you see in the near future for the health of the record business?

Going back to the 1992 Christmas holidays, there are clear signs of small growth. Consumer confidence seems to be building and we think that it will continue to grow. However, with the recent floods in the Midwest and the budget deficit controversy that will affect all of us, it will be necessary to carefully monitor sales trends and market in a more prudent manner. I don't think that we should be unduly cautious, but I do think that we should watch the market very closely. With all of this, we remain optimistic and we think 1993 will prove to be a very positive year for the industry.

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

Time for some kiwi and sheep with Straitjacket Fits

anging with Shayne Carter and David Wood was like playing Henry Blake to their Hawkeye and Trapper John... they may like you and even exhibit moments of genuine warmth, but you're constantly and often unknowingly being jabbed in the ribs at the same time. There's something about New Zealanders that's daunting to even the most erudite Yank. Besides the ongoing struggle to divine the meaning of colloquial speech patterns through rather flat Dunedin dialects, they are, as a whole, a bright and literate bunch. Whether the topic is Julie London records or global politics, Shayne and David are not merely well-informed, but downright insightful.

Their band, Straitjacket Fits, has been called one of the strangest, strongest guitar bands in the world. When their debut effort, the 1987 EP "Life In One Chord," came out, the Australian music weekly "On The Street" called it "arguably the best debut single of all time." Yet somehow, Shayne and the fellas have garnered little attention outside their native land. And to make matters worse, guitarist Andrew Brough left the band in late '91, taking his '60s pop sensibilities with him, following a U.S. tour with the La's during which relations between the two bands were strained by Straitjacket's insistence on blowing them off the stage nightly. The new album, "Blow" (Arista), reveals a relaxed, more focused line-up, featuring old Straitjacket pal Mark Peterson on guitar and the unmistakable Shayne Carter vocal presence in peak form. In somewhat less than peak form was HITS' own sheepophile, the man who loves not wisely but too wool, Joe "Baa Baa" Fleischer.

How has the band changed since Andrew Brough's departure?

SHAYNE CARTER: I don't think we've changed that much. Maybe we've been given the luxury of becoming what we always wanted to

become. We're more focused. Andrew's writing was quite a bit different from mine, and for a long time it worked because we'd meet up at this middle ground. By the time we'd done our second album ["Melt"],

there weren't really a hell of a lot of places that were obvious for us to go to next. It was sort of a culmination of what the band was. When Andrew left, he took his jangly, three-minute pop songs, stroke, dash, hyphen, comma kind of thing with him. I connected to his attitude as a writer, which put an emphasis on songs. We sound a bit more up-to-date now, but the echoes of the past are there, even if subliminally.

I think a lot of stuff on "Blow" correlates with our early stuff, even though we've tried to stay current and relevant. Music is about development. You have to stay abreast of that development. And we're very self-determined.

When you say "current," are you referring to any direct influence from a particular source?

SHAYNE: We just made a 90's type of record... one that sounds as if it was made in 1993. Not a record that people can say, "Oh, this was tinged with '60s psychedelia" or "These harmonies were ripped off from there."

It would seem, though, that this coveted English pop psychedelia that American bands shoot for is something your band gets pretty effortlessly.

SHAYNE: I'm actually not a great fan of psychedelic music.

DÅVID WOOD: It's not a studied thing. We don't have a rulebook. We've grown organically as a band. SHAYNE: It's just that we like the guitar not to do the obvious thing. DAVID: No rock cliches.

SHAYNE: This writer wrote the thing that makes Flying Nun [the band's New Zealand label] bands different from everyone else is that there are no R&B inflections in the music of, say, the Chills. I think we've got the most R&B influences of any of the others, though. We're a rock pop band, damnit, but I really like black music, too. That's one thing about New Zealand bands... you can't pigeonhole any of us into one genre. DAVID: We steal from anywhere...

shamelessly, too.
SHAYNE: But we're so inept that you can't tell where we've stolen from.
DAVID: It's like, "I love that drumbeat on the LL Cool J song —

we've got to steal it!"

SHAYNE: We actually did that, too. We stole a drumbeat from LL Cool J, then we found out that he had stolen it from the Black Crowes, which we were horrified to find out. But they had stolen it from Otis Redding, so that made it OK.

You guys seem to be getting a direct feed of American and English culture, and then American interpretations of England and vice versa. How does that affect your sensibilities?

DAVID: We get the world through our TV sets. We have the ability to decide what we think is cool and what is utter bollocks. Yet, it's not like the media is in your face all the time. SHAYNE: The images you get through the TV screen can really romanticize things. And as far as rock music goes, we probably get a more romantic version of it because we don't see it as often.

How do Americans compare to New Zealanders?

SHAYNE: Americans are a lot more confident, a lot brasher and in your face. But that's really a huge generalization. A lot of Americans don't really see beyond the coasts.

DAVID: New Zealanders are a lot more self-effacing. They'll take the total piss out of everything. And then you get Americans who will do what you've just been taking the piss out of and then you feel guilty and embarrassed and shrivel up.

SHAYNE: A great deal of our humor is missed because the dialect is quite flat. When you're being ironic, people dismiss it and think you're being rude. My feeling is that if there were a gathering of the League Of Nations, New Zealand would be sitting in the back of the room watching everybody else and making paper darts.

hat parts of your career do you control?

I'm always involved in what's going on, like, when we were negotiating my contract with Atlantic, I was totally involved. I read the contract, I knew what they were offering and then, I know where all the money is going. My manager can't sign checks until he gets my approval and a signature first. I like to know what's going on, definitely.

And, of course, you exercise control in the studio.

Yeah, as much as I wanted to. I'm not a control freak. I like to be open-minded and open to other people's ideas. Have you ever been able

to offer someone a song as a substitute for confessing something in person? Not really. Because I don't want to be that... obvious.

Presumably it's when people are interested in talking to you that you clam up.

Yeah, it's really strange. I must be unusual since my personal life has to suffer at the expense of all that. I'm lucky because I get to make music and... you can't have everything. I think I always will be grateful to fate.

Is it just fate?

Well, I started out doing the whole DIY "do it yourself" thing. I definitely believe that you can't just sit around waiting for a recording contract and hope that the label does everything for you. I believe in hard work, but I also believe that that's part of the big picture — it's included in your fate.

Do you expect the people

Everything's a phase. Nothing lasts forever. But I'm not thinking ahead; I'm thinking right now. I love my trio and I love those guys... it's good and I'm not thinking about changing it right now.

You opted out of the Australian leg of the Lemonheads' tour because of the groupie situation. Are you more likely to tour with bands that have more women in them?

No, no... that's 'cause I was so close to Evan that it

was bumming me out, but I wouldn't have that problem with anyone else... I don't think.

Do you think groupies on the whole need to be educated or should they be left alone?

I'm not down on them as a whole; that's just one point of view in the song "tk." I can understand how they're feeling because I have the same sort of feelings; you know, the feeling where you love a person's work so much and you feel so moved by what they do and you want to get close. But I would never offer my body to a stranger... that's their thing, you know?

That could be the only thing they think they can offer. It's a question of self-esteem.

Yeah, and I'm sure some of them have a really healthy attitude about it, like, some people really enjoy sex, and they don't mind if it's with a relative stranger. It's OK, it's just not my thing, but then there are other girls that just — you know, they make us look bad. Whatever... everyone should just do what she wants to do.


Do people ever come up to you and challenge your lyrics?



Palace Brothers "There is No-One ..." (Drag City). Although members of the Palace Brothers have spent time with the Breeders and sonic heroes Slint, their debut album is an musical spectrum away from anything else on the left of the dial. Will Oldham's lyrics and vocals resurrect the sorrowful spirit

of Nick Drake via the backwoods of Kentucky. On the label which spawned Pavement, the Palace Brothers lead the way through a lineage of country and bluegrass influences rarely explored by today's indie rock hopefuls. (Chris Carey)

Kinky Machine, "Kinky Machine" (MCA): This brilliant LP doesn't let up for a second, continuously reminding you of those great flared trousers that you used to wear whilst listening to Sweet and practicing your Ziggy Stardust stance. The melodies are addicting, the guitar licks are inspiring and these



eleven songs are trashy jewels that will make you happier than a pig in, uh, whatever. "Shockaholic" and "Going Out With God" are two of the standout tracks, but go ahead, ask Steve Masters what he thinks! (Nick Bull/the guitarist's cousin)



Nothing Painted "Power Blue. Trips..." (Kokopop/Shimmy): A slicing, shimmering trio fueled by singer Franklin Bruno, whose imagistic nonsequiturs "a donut full of novocaine" and giddy rhymes "she's cherubic/she's seraphic/she's omniscient when it comes to traffic" make language a tickling

feather. Virulently catchy guitar riffs and hyper, atmospheric rhythms make for a wry, brainy cross between heartland power-pop (Great Plains, Embarrassment) and arty punk. Bassist Joey Burns is also a member of Giant Sand. (Jason Cohen)

The Point, "Fingernoid Slink" (IRS): Strains of mid-80's "shoulda-beens" Altered Images and Haysi Fantayzee permeate this debut offering from Brit techno pop duo The Point. Sybil Syn and Christopher Little write, perform and produce tasty pop capsules spangled with classic references and



surprising arrangements that simultaneously recall and update the sound that give birth to the Rave craze. The psychedelic orientation of the first single "Hey Jane" and the frighteningly prophetic "Dance Is The Nu Sex" would make Siouxsie or Soft Cell awfully darn proud. (Joe Fleischer)

They're punk... and now they're rich. L.A.'s own **Bad Religion**, who have made a career for themselves by having more than one career, have signed their lives over to **Atlantic Records**. The band's self-produced seventh release, "Recipe for Hate," on the band-owned **Epitaph** label, will be included under the pact. Goal is to get "Hate" thru WEA system and in the street in conjunction with their September tour. (Hello, it's already August). If this deal does go down that quick, it'll be one for the books, tho' involvement of **Danny Goldberg**, combined with the band's own knowledge of negotiations (did we mention lead vocalist **Greg Graffin**'s gig as a college professor?) might make

this deal fly quicker than most. Signing marks second for new A&R geek on the scene, Mike Gitter, whose career as a rock writer left him wondering what he could do for the scores of fave raves on indie labels who didn't have the juice to get the ink. Ironically, Gitter's first signing, Jawbox, makes him two for two with bands who know their business. Jawbox bassist Kim Coletta managed her band for five years prior to their deal as well as

during contract negotions (with shark **Richard Grabel** at the table). Speaking of managers, the Bad Religion bunch is on the search. Kudos to agent **Andy Somers** who's believed in Religion since the early days... Update on **Sabbath** no-tour. All concerned, with exception of **Ozzy**, signed on the dotted lines for tour contracts and headed off on vacation. First they heard of Decline of Oz was thru label's reading press releases... Hands down exit-poll winners of **Lolla** — **Rage Against the Machine**... This week's arrest in East L.A. of two major T-shirt counterfeiting rings resulted in the confiscation of over \$2 million worth of silkscreening equipment and \$200K worth of T-shirts, but no designs from music world. We've got to wonder where all those thieves you see outside of concert venues are getting their goods. Tho' temporary restraining orders (at artist expense) can be utilized, there's not enough control going on in order to stop these illegal sales from happening. Hard to explain to a fan why they *shouldn't* buy that \$10 T-shirt outside that they'd be getting charged \$23 for inside... *In the studio:* **King's X** with **STP/Black Crowes** producer **Brendan O'Brien**. Pairing marks the first time the Kings have had anyone other than former manager/producer **Sam Taylor** slamming the knobs. *Temporarity out of the studio:* **Soundgarden**, which takes a break from recording their platinum follow-up to begin the **Neil Young**

An extra \$20 in your wallet will get you a front-row seat at the August 28 pay-perview of Iron Maiden's grand farewell to Bruce Dickinson. The live-via-satellite-via-tapedelay (huh?) will originate from London. If you don't have the double sawbuck, call Capitol's Dave Downey and trade in that catalog he sent you for a ringside seat at his house.



virtually impossible to hear yourself while you work. Was that really a funny line? Did you connect with that last thought? Are you effectively selling the station slogans and call-letters? You may have unknowingly developed bad on-air habits, and will have to actually hear yourself as others hear you to determine where to make the necessary corrections and improvements. If your station has an air-check skimmer, use it. If it doesn't, pop a cassette into your own boom box and review your work regularly... Finally, Hank Wiley was one of those people about whom you'd never hear anything bad. Though he and I weren't running buddies, we saw each other all over town and it was always fun and interesting to be around him. He will be missed.





AN EXCLUSIVE HITS INTER-VIEW WITH DON ROSE, PRESIDENT OF RYKODISC

sitting around a cocktail table at MIDEM a little over ten years ago, Don Rose, his brother-in-law Robert Simonds and entertainment attorney Arthur Mann had been taking the proverbial cocktail napkin notes on the feasibility of importing expensive Japanese CDs. And though it wasn't until the fall of '83 that CD hardware was "officially" launched in the U.S., Rykodisc's founding entrepreneurs had already mapped out the idea for a CD-only label.

In the decade that followed, Rykodisc has grown into one of the largest and most respected independent labels in the world, featuring a diverse roster and artist catalogs ranging from rock pioneers such as Jimi Hendrix, David Bowie, Richard Thompson, Frank Zappa and their latest addition, Elvis Costello, to new and established artists such as Nils Lofgren, Barking Tribe, Morphine and the successful launch of Bob Mould's PoMo hot shots Sugar.

As Rykodisc celebrates its tenth anniversary, the CDonly concept has taken a bit of a back seat because, for
Rose, it was always the music that came first. And, as he
says, it wasn't the quality of the sound that impressed
him and his partners about the new CD format as much
as it was its absence. "What was most surprising about
CDs was the quiet, not the dynamic of the sound, but
when the music stopped," he explains. "That was the
most striking thing. Between tracks, it was like somebody
pulled the plug." Rose most likely wished he could have
pulled the plug on HITS' own Siren of Surface Noise, a
woman who suffers from un-lockjaw, Joan "How Can I
Interview You If You Keep Interrupting Me" Tarshis.

What was the original inspiration for launching an all-CD label?

If we had any revelation about CDs, it was the convenience and suitability for a modern lifestyle. People are living in compact spaces and records were increasingly burdensome to those of us who moved around. The first CD player, however, was as big as a bread box.

We've just mutated over the years until we're no longer format-dependent. Since 1986, we've become a full format label. We even got into vinyl LPs and cassettes. We called the line CDQ, which was a high-quality analog line. CDQ stood for CD Quality Records and Cassettes — actually an anomaly that can't really exist. We got the idea from one of my favorite restaurants in Boston which has a specialty called Sushi Quality Tuna... it's grilled.

What other formats do you see Ryko utilizing?

Well, being true to our roots, we're always interested in new technologies. There will always be new delivery systems. For example, recordable portable digital formats arose from the fact that analog cassettes are really limited in terms of audio quality and so on. Naturally, we are intrigued with Mini-Disc and DCC. We've made a stand on the Mini-Disc world with eight titles. We've also done one DCC, Sugar's "Copper Blue," which is available in four formats — none of which are vinyl.

Which way do you think things are going to go?

Well, I think that the fact that there are two different digital formats is the biggest problem for either of them catching on. In those cases, the public tends to just turn it off. Secondly, I don't think the message is being clearly communicated that they're meant to succeed the analog cassette and not necessarily the Compact Disc. They're meant to be the portable and affordable formats. I also think the public has lost patience with the electronics in-

dustry, to a certain extent. They feel another box is being shoved down their throats during a recession. I think the CD is still the standard bearer in the foreseeable future.

Why did you start Rounder/East Side/Precision Distribution?

Over the last two years, the old system of regional distributors has slowly fallen apart. Schwartz Brothers, the biggest, oldest record distributor in the country since 1946, went bankrupt last year and a score of smaller ones did the same. With today's communication systems and couriers, you just don't need to be in Massachusetts to sell records in Massachusetts or in Colorado to sell records in Colorado. There are a number of other companies that are going national — Landmark, run by National, and a new one called Alliance.

It's our biggest strength and it's also our biggest weakness. It's only a weakness because we don't have a list of all the usual suspects every time we put out new product. As strictly an alternative label, we'd just go to those six people and make sure we had that Spin feature and those 12 radio stations and — it becomes a routine — which is fine. But because we're different, that's where it makes it tough. When we have a bluegrass record, we kind of start from scratch again and have to pick up where we left off two years ago when we had our last one. All those media people change, especially in the alternative market. You have public and college radio where people turn over frequently.

You've just acquired the Elvis Costello catalog.

I've been a mega-Elvis Costello fan since there was such a

It makes perfect sense to me. What they're saying is that their music distribution networks are not that effective for many kinds of projects. It just so happens that these networks are not that effective in breaking new alternative acts, nor were they priorities for them. It's the post-Nirvana syndrome: "We've got to break alternative rock acts." Matador and countless others have come into the major label fold and so they've got to be effective. It doesn't really affect us either way, but it's probably very smart that the majors are doing it.

How do you feel about the used CD wars?

We don't see used CDs as a threat at all. In fact, we're officially neutral. I do feel, however, that there's a very good case to be made that the net result is that more new CDs are

sold. The system gives people more reason to come back to record stores. Often, when people trade their CDs in for cash, they use the money for more CDs, new, used or whatever. The independent stores don't get the same kind of support and pricing from the majors that the chairts do. If this is something that keeps the small retailer alive, to be

a new outlet for our new stuff, I'm all for it. So maybe I'm not really neutral.

is this a good time to be an independent label?

This is a great time to be a medium-sized record company, because there are so few of us. Only one of the six majors is American-owned and all of them are media conglomerates. There's not a single one that's just a record company - not just an arm or division of an entertainment or media company. And with that trend, they've monopolized the media. We resent the majors for their stranglehold on the mass media — radio in particular. In the wake of all that, there's probably more opportunity for us now than ever because the majors have left a vacuum. Many other medium-sized record companies are now distributed by the majors or they're P&B's or they're completely owned and operated by the majors. There are different variations, but basically they're all part of that major label thing and they've really left us and a few others like us a big space. I can't believe that they're giving it away because there's a lot of business to be done in the middle ground.

What do you see in the next ten years for Rykodisc?

and Rose.

We found ourselves in a corner looking at these new national networks, whom we weren't necessarily in agreement with philosophically in regard to their approaches. Or we could consider, yet again, major label distribution. We've had lots of opportunity to go that route. Ultimately, our experience has been that we are a priority in our field. Now even if that field is small, or limited, we're well known and well positioned within it. And within a major label context, even an album like "Copper Blue, which will sell 300,000, has to be our biggest priority, just as it has to be our distributor's biggest priority.

The Sugar record was also the first test of our national network, because REP was just coming together at the time "Copper Blue" came out. At a major, that record would have had to struggle to get into their Top 20.

How is REP working?

Knock on wood, it's doing great. We've hired a lot of new sales staff and opened new sales offices and I just came from the first REP Convention in Austin, TX. Right now, we have four warehouses between the three companies which we are going to consolidate. We have over 40 sales reps, which is about the number you need across the country to cover the major accounts, and is comparable to what the majors have.

Is distribution the main difference between you and Rhino now?

There are a lot of differences. We've always had a lot of respect for what they do. Their volume and quantity of new releases is five or ten times what ours is. We tend to dote on a few gems. We're a lot harder to peg in our styles of music and the types of projects. In fact, we're impossible.

Do you consider that a strength?

thing, so we jumped on it immediately when there was an opportunity. But the way it actually came about was, we got a call from somebody at ICE [the CD newsletter] asking us to confirm that we had licensed the Elvis Costello back catalog. And we said, "No, but is it actually available." And they explained that the Columbia masters were reverting. So we contacted Jake Riviera's office immediately. Everything we've learned to do well will be put to prodigious use with the Elvis Costello catalog. There were so many singles and wild art work and different versions in the U.K. We're working together with Elvis' label Demon. There are 11 original albums and a BBC series contract album that's never been released here that Elvis did all the music for. We are planning a fall release. They are going to be universalized additions now, meaning they are going to be the same in the U.S. as in the U.K. So all the tracks that were originally on either the U.S. or U.K. versions will be on these versions - singles or B-sides - as they are appropriate. These were put on CD in the early days of CD and I don't think there's anybody who would deny the opportunity existed to do them to a much higher standard today.

How do you feel about the new major/independent distribution combos such as ADA?

We're watching all of these new technologies. Eventually, we'll have product in the ones that develop markets. We're happy to be among the first. That's a good niche for us. With multimedia, there's so much potential out there but it's dissipated with a lot of different formats. What made the CD a success is the thing we've never forgotten — a worldwide standard from the get-go. The kind of thing we'd be looking for is a technology which is as revolutionary as the CD was when it was introduced. We've been around for ten years and probably the most surprising things about us are that, one, people kind of discovered us at various points along the way and second, we've been around this long without really exploding. We've had a couple of mini-explosions in our growth, but if you really look back on it, it's been a steady thing. We're out here in the hinterlands just doing our thing. John Hammond, our marketing director, calls us the independent's independent. Even though that sounds like the department of redundancy department, it kind of sums it up. But do you know what really makes us a total music business anomaly after ten years?

What?

We've never been sued. You hear that sound? I'm knocking on wood. ■



"I feel very confident," says CEMA's Russ Bach about the lawsuits arising over the used CD issue. Says Bach: "If we lose that 20% [of business to used CDs]. we become non-profitable in five years unless we raise prices. We are ready to spend big bucks on attorneys to fight these lawsuits." And he is going to get every chance to prove that as another suit has come to light, filed by Boogie Records' Toledo-based parent company Nothing Beats Fun. Bach also re-asserts his intention not to service stores that deal in used product with the upcoming August 31 release by Garth Brooks "as per his request." Don Kulak of the I.M.R.A., who also filed suit last week, said there is little to no chance that any of the plaintiffs will get the "injunctive relief" that would force CEMA to relent. "The only way to get immediate injunctive relief is if the new sanctions would prove to be lifethreatening," he says. "Otherwise, it will be tacked on to the settlement at the conclusion of the case [should they win]." Boogie's Steve Essick said, "Pat O'Connor and I have been in business for 20 years and this is the first time we've ever needed lawyers." Are they still going to be carrying Garth product? "We don't know what we're going to do. If you






