





Forever Her Vocals


Singer Paula Abdul was vindicated when a federal court jury rejected back-up vocalist Yvette Marine's claim she sang co-lead vocals on the performer's debut album, "Forever Your Girl."

Marine had sued Abdul's label Virgin, claiming her voice was blended with the singer's on key songs on the album. She also claimed her credit as backup singer was a deception advanced by the label on the public.

The five-man, four-woman jury took less than four hours to reach a verdict, claiming that Abdul's voice was "dominant" in the recordings they heard. The singer expressed gratitude to her record company for "showing their commitment to me as an artist" through back-up spokesperson Martha Wash.

Marine said she was disappointed, but felt she proved conclusively she wasn't lying when she said she sang on the album. The session vocalist will now sue Nirvana, Stone Temple Pilots, Aerosmith and Barbra Streisand, claiming she sang on their records.

Idol Boasts

Billy Idol is getting a little tired of questions about his relationship with alleged "Madam to the Stars," Heidi Fleiss. On last week's Tonight Show, Idol told host Jay Leno from now on, reporters will have to pay \$1,000 per question to the music industry AIDS charity, LIFEbeat, if they want to ask him about Heidi.

Idol claims the media is wasting too much time and money on covering Fleiss when there are other, more important issues in the world. Billy told Jay he met Heidi at a nightclub and had been to her house to watch TV, but reiterated the claim he's never paid for sex. Virtual sex, maybe... actual sex, no.

Billy Joel's latest Columbia project, "River Of Dreams," debuted at #1 this week, overwhelming the field and sending Sony counterpart "Sleepless In Seattle" back to #2 after one week on the throne.

The move gives Big Red seven albums in the Top 20, including #3 Cypress Hill, #10 Soul Asylum, #11 Kris Kross, #15 Barbra Streisand, #19 Onyx and #20 James Taylor.

"Phenomenal!!," shouted out Kevin Hawkins of Philly's Wee Three. "We had a better first week on Billy Joel than we had on U2." (Ed Note: Multisyllable words in Kevin's quote courtesy of our editors.)

Among the accounts reporting the project at #1 are: Natl. Record Mart, Abbey Road, Lechmere, Round Up, The Wiz and Harmony House, among zillions and zillions of others.

"We sold the hell out of it," said CD One-Stop's Dave Carroll. "Billy drove the sales for the week and that's saying something because we had the best week since the fourth quarter of '92!"

When reached at his spacious Madison Ave. office, Columbia President **Don Ienner** told us to turn down the damn air conditioner.





Seated behind the desk of his modest office in one of his trademarked blue denim shirts. a welltanned Geffen President Eddie Rosenblatt is the picture of the successful west coast record executive. The well-liked leader — often praised for having created a warm, familial atmosphere at the label — has been at the helm of Geffen Records since its inception in 1980. He is a strong supporter of artists being given creative freedom — which is why the recent media brouhaha over Nirvana's latest album being rejected by the label annoyed him so.

Rosenblatt began his career with Cleveland-based indie record distributor Cosnat back in 1957, followed by a stint as GM for yet another indie in Main Line. In '67, he moved to Cali as Sales Manager for A&M Records, becoming Manager of TA Records three years later. In '71, Eddie began a long career with Warner Bros. Records as Sales Manager, then VP and Director of Sales and Promotion. He was one of the key founders of WEA, which grew to become the largest record distribution system in the world. In '80, David Geffen tapped him to head his new record company.

Starting from ground zero, the label boasted a glittering roster which has included, at one time or another, Aerosmith, Cher, Peter Gabriel, Guns N' Roses, Don Henley, Rickie Lee Jones, Joni Mitchell, Stone Roses, Tesla, The Sundays, Robbie Robertson, Siouxsie & the Banshees, Maria McKee, Edie Brickell, Kitaro, Nelson, Coverdale-Page, Jackyl, XTC, Elton John, John Lennon, Donna Summer, Pat Metheny, The Waterboys, Nirvana, Sonic Youth and the cast albums for "Dreamgirls," "Cats," "Les Miserables" and "Miss Saigon."

Determinedly low-key, Rosenblatt has been married for almost 40 years to his wife Bobbie, a former teacher and educational therapist. His passions include tennis, books, movies, the Lakers and getting rid of HITS' incredibly nosey Sr. Editor "Ubu" Roy Trakin as quickly as possible.

The label has made several changes in its executive staff over the last few years, capped off now with Gary Gersh leaving to take over as President of Capitol.

There were three different situations in the executive changes you're referring to. Eddie Gilreath wanted to change his life and now he's one of the people running Uni Distribution. Al Coury wanted to play golf and Gary was given the opportunity to run his own company, which scratched the itch that he had. But a company really has to be about empowering people and giving them the ability to grow within the company structure. We've moved and promoted quite a few people within the company, for instance, Mark Kates from promotion to A&R, Luke Wood from publicity to marketing, Todd Sullivan from the mailroom to A&R, Christina Rood from receptionist to international marketing.

How do you feel Gary will do as head of a label?

I think he'll be great. He's a talented young man. All the feelings I have about Gary are based on friendship and love — but life goes on.

After all the years you'd been involved with WEA, how has it been working with Uni?

It's been pretty much business as usual. The knock on Uni used to be they had a major problem in shipping records; however, they brought in a guy named Pete Scifres to handle that and he made the necessary changes.

We've gone through a situation of shipping around 30,000-40,000 Nirvana albums as an initial order, which is what we suggested. Of course, that record exploded, and we had very few complaints from retailers about being out of stock. And right in the middle of that, we shipped 4.3 million of the two Guns N' Roses records and did not have one problem from any dealer, rack or one-stop that they didn't get their records.

I certainly can't help make Uni into another WEA because obviously, there's not the volume; we ship a lot less releases. As far as we're concerned, Uni is the right place for us and we're helping MCA Records in their rock area because we're training the Uni people to those different marketing methods — as opposed to urban or country records.

My friends at other labels use distribution as a major selling point when they're in competition with us over an artist. The reality is, what is distribution's job? To get records into the stores. That's all. Hits are made in the recording studio. And I am a marketing guy of 35 years saying that. I wish I

could sit here and tell you of the brilliant ideas I've come up with that have turned a record that has not been commercially successful into a huge smash. But it's the record company which handles the media, from where, generally, comes the motivation for the consumer to actually go in and buy a record. People overrate the importance of one distribution system over another.

Do you see Geffen getting into other kinds of music besides rock & roll? At this particular time, we are a rock & roll record company, though rock has a tendency to redefine itself on an hourly basis. We have tried different forays into urban music and have not been successful. As I said, MCA does that as well as anybody. I think we're gonna stay where we are from a creative and marketing standpoint. We do rock & roll well, although our roster does include Pat Metheny, Joni Mitchell and Kitaro, which represent a pretty wide range.

We hear all this stuff about niches. There are now three different kinds of alternative radio, three or four kinds of Top 40, three or four kinds of Album Radio. We are a niche record company.

Have you ever seen as much fragmentation in the record market as there is today?

I just keep waiting at our marketing meetings for someone to talk about a radio station whose demographic is 32-year-old gay transsexual crossdressers who will only make love to their uncles, aunts or cousins. It just gets narrower and narrower. Many times, you have a record you believe in, based on your own ears or gut, that you feel would be perfect for an alternative audience, but with alternative radio being so splintered, it's confusing and difficult as to which niche it actually fits.

With the breakdown of Top 40, has radio become less of a factor in breaking records?

You have to be able to react and change quickly by coming up with extraordinary ideas. We have a record by Murray Attaway that we gave away to

retailers to see what they could do with it because we really believed in it. You also have to be sensitive to certain moments in the life of an album. Take our White Zombie record, for example. This record won't die. We put a stake in its heart at least three times. You pay no attention to it and then, all of a sudden, it grabs you by the nose and tweaks you until you see stars in front of your eyes. We're selling 12,000 records a week. We put this band on the road in a van for a year and had 'em sleeping five to a room. They're now on the Anthrax tour.

You're now able to target more specifically where your sales and airplay are coming from.

We're all going through a learning curve while trying not to turn into technocrats. This is a business where people have made careers — including yours truly — out of a great deal of enthusiasm and energy and a modicum of intelligence and schooling. The danger here is you can't get totally involved in the research and information to the detriment of the older way of doing things... the enthusiasm and energy and ability to find the right radio station for your record. If you take what radio says they want at face value, you're dead. You have to be aware of what they want, but sometimes they don't know what they want. You have to teach them and educate them and tell them what else you're doing asides from radio — touring information, video play, the artist's image, etc.

You have always been rather low-key regarding publicity for yourself. What is your role in this company?

That's the question I was hoping you wouldn't ask. Frankly, I don't think it's important to have a high media profile for myself. One of the pleasantries about having the company sold and creating a relationship with the MCA people has been the opportunity to spend some quality time with Lew Wasserman. In talking with Lew, you're listening to more than 50 years of stories, ideas, concepts, thoughts and accumulated knowledge. And I said to him just recently, "Lew, you've got to write the book." I mean, the guy's dealt with everybody from Howard Hughes to Cary Grant to Marilyn Monroe to Ronald Reagan. And he said he'd never write the book because this isn't about him, it's about the artists. And I quickly understood why they were always in conservative black suits, white shirts and ties. They never wanted to get in the way of the artists. And that's how I feel. This record company is really about the artists and their music. It's up to us to help the artists make the best record that

they can make at this particular time in their careers and to market that record sensitively and properly and to sell as many as we can sell. Sometimes success is measured without a lot of commas and zeros, because you're setting up a particular artist for a career. We at Geffen Records believe more in a long-term situation than a short-term one.

What are your thoughts on press reports of the label's alleged unhappiness with the new Nirvana album?

This is a process between the artist and the label, which shouldn't end up in Newsweek magazine. In this case, we just find it annoying. As Chris Novaselic put it, "Wow, we got a full page in Newsweek. How much does that cost?" It's a concern to me if the press doesn't get its facts straight. Frankly, supporting artistic freedom can be a very bumpy ride for a record company. It's not a black or white situation. Nirvana has made a fabulous record that we are thrilled to death with and a perfect record at this particular time in their careers. We support the band in whatever it is they want to do. And we go on from there. When a magazine with the credibility of Newsweek reports a story like that, it takes on its own life.

And it has an effect on other bands the label is trying to sign.

Exactly. The media certainly isn't aware of what's going on. We have to have credibility two ways. On the media level and in the artistic community — the lawyers, the agents, the managers, etc. Fortunately, most people know what kind of record company we are. We'll survive this without any major blows, because the band was so supportive of us.

What does the new Nirvana record sound like?

Who would have thought the first record would do what it did? If you had said several of the tracks on that album would get played on mainstream Top 40 radio stations, someone would have had you committed. I believe Kurt Cobain is one of the pre-eminent songwriters in rock today. He kind of hides his songs through some very aggressive rock & roll music and chords, but the bottom line is, he writes great songs. He has his own particular way of presenting his music and his thoughts. This is a very hard-sounding record, but no more so than the first one, and we're just thrilled with it. It comes out mid-September.

What is the future of the brand of white rock & roll represented by Geffen acts like Coverdale/Page and Aerosmith? Were you satisfied with their perfor-





mances in the marketplace?

We've got a long way to go before we can evaluate either yet. Certainly this kind of mainstream, rock & roll, party-down music is going through a problematic period right now. But we have seen various other areas of rock go through problematic periods in the late '70s when disco hit. The reality is, at this point, these records are not very threatening to the parents of a young teenager who would take home a record of this type. Because that young man's parents grew up with the Rolling Stones, AC/DC and Led Zeppelin. And we all know part of the rock & roll experience is scaring the shit out of your parents. That's why we're seeing these middle-class white kids gravitating to rap records. But we're also seeing, once these kids hit 20, they get off of that, whereas in the past, they stuck with rock & roll into their 30s. I still think it's too early to break out the funeral march for this kind of music, though.

What do you see in the future for record retail stores? Are they in danger of being pushed out by direct digital delivery to the home?

I don't see people being able to pick up their phones and order the new Aerosmith CD tomorrow, if that's what you mean. I'm not saying it's a fantasy.

It's a dream and certain dreams come true, but they take a long time to do so. If the retailers would spend their time worrying about things that are germane to them making a profit — selling the product at the right price, training their employees, making sure that their individual stores are aware of specific promotions — we would all be a lot better off than if they worried about records coming out of a chute somewhere. The problem is, many times retail and radio get between us and the consumer. We have to try to figure out a way to utilize these home shopping networks properly. If Macy's can get into it, why can't Tower, Musicland and Camelot? But let's let the scientists figure out the dreams and let's deal with the reality... and the reality is, for many people, walking into a record store is a frightening experience today. We have to make it a warm, fuzzy relationship.

How often do you talk to David Geffen?

Three times a day. In fact, I should be calling him back now. Anything I say is going to make me sound like a sycophant, but he is an integral part of this record company. We communicate all the time, whether he's in or out of the office. We have regularly scheduled meetings and he is totally aware of everything we do. He loves the record business for the same reasons today as he has for his entire career: you get instant gratification. Every day there are charts and sales figures to tell how well you're doing. He has been a force with this company since Day One because he can see the forest for the trees. He has this great broad view and a wealth of experience. It's just been incredible for me to learn from him.

Do you still get the same personal satisfaction from being President of Geffen that you did at the beginning? Have you ever entertained offers from other labels seriously?


This is my job. I love it here. I have a very entrepreneurial feel in that I was here from the start. The only reason I re-signed a new long-term deal is that I'm having such a good time. I still get off on the music and the excitement of a White Zombie record. Or the initial response to an Urge Overkill record. Certainly, to listen to a Peter Gabriel or an Aerosmith or a Coverdale/Page record and to see the response to those records is extremely exciting. Or to hear the music of a brand-new band like the Counting Crows and to feel the hair stand up on your arm... I just love it. I'm very fortunate in that everyone who works here, if not hired directly by me, has kind of indirectly passed through me. So I'm surrounded by people I really like and respect. If I'm to go to another record company and deal with people who've been hired by three or four different regimes, that's real tough. I've gone through real tough times, starting a company without a catalog. Don't forget, a record company needs a catalog, a steady flow of releases and hits... We started with nothing! To be able to keep that going by looking for younger people to move into higher places within the company, that's the enjoyable part.

Did the Indie Rock Dork Secret Police really take down the names of people they suspected were in the building for the very first time? One more thing: Nice limo (whoever you are). Stay tuned... HIP TO THE HIPS: The big kids showed up at the L.A. dates of Chico, CA faves Mother Hips, who are touring in support of their much-admired, self-produced album "Back To The Grotto." With both record and publishing deals still up for grabs for this inventive and occasionally astonishing band, we'll be following their progress very closely. Will they still be unsigned by CMJ? Don't bet on it... HEY SCOUTS: Has your boss asked you, "So, what's all this hubbub about Sponge?" yet? You'll need to know... BUZZIN': Maryann Earl, Crazy Alice, Emma Christian.







Time for some New England clam chowder and Boston cream pie with Aimee Mann

Wo-Mann of the Year

With every other asinine aspect of '70s pop culture back like a bad case of crabs, why shouldn't navelgazing introspection be au courant again? The difference this time around is that the "I'm-so-sensitive" schtick is gone, replaced by the smart visions of Juliana Hatfield, Liz Phair and Lisa Germano. Perhaps the biggest surprise is that one of the best of this new wave of folk riot grrrls is Aimee Mann, the former leader of new wave faves 'Til Tuesday. Ms. Mann's Imago debut, "Whatever," is the year's most stunning disc, each track a little oasis of pop insight amidst a desert full o' grungy dreck. HITS' own fly in the ointment, fellow Beantowner Johnny Angel "Food Cake," caught up with the platinum-pated chanteuse at her digs in Boston during the recent heat wave, and in-between slugs of ice tea, discussed her amazing new release, the perfidy of the record biz, punk-rock pasts and the Red Sox resurgence.

People seem to love "Whatever." How does it feel to be the critics' darling?

I don't mind it at all. I'm really happy with the album, which is weird, because most people tend to pick apart their records.

It must seem odd to you that the world is so into the kind of music your first band, Young Snakes, played, which was a forerunner of groups like Babes In Toyland and Hole.

I wish people would move along in their tastes, but maybe there's nowhere left to go. People in the industry were frightened of the Young Snakes and the noisiness of that whole post-punk trip. We really thought we were happening, but our audience was so small. You know how it is - you get played once on 'BCN, you're mentioned in the Phoenix and you think you're a big deal, but nobody's ever gonna hear of you. That audience is still really small. Take Nirvana. Bands have been playing that kind of crunchy-guitar-rockbordering-on-metal for years, but they happened to be pop enough so they broke out. Great.

Do you like being on a smaller label in Imago?

Most record companies have nothing to do with music itself; most don't even know how to do their own business. It's a lot of random fumbling about, like the A&R man saying, "Yeah, I dig this song, but the public won't, they might dig this one, let's make the one I don't like the single." At my last label, they wanted me to do stuff like write with Diane Warren... as if she had some magic songwriting potion. They didn't work the last 'Til Tuesday record at all. I mean, we'd play a town, sell out the venue and the radio station would tell us, "The record company didn't send us this, but my girlfriend bought one, so we played that copy." Truly unbelievable. Then they said they wanted to go in and make another record right away. The last 'Til Tuesday record did 250,000 units, but that was down from the first two, so we could tell they were just going through the motions.

I love the song "I've Had It." Anyone who has ever played in a band can relate to that.

That's great, you really got it! Yeah, the thing with "I've Had It" is that I really was at the end of my rope. They'd send you to New York to play in front of these industry geeks at the China Club, and, well, I'd had it.

What's the new lineup, the next single and the inevitable tour?

Clayton Scobel on guitar, Brian Stevens from the Cavedogs on bass — I roped him into this — and Milt Sutton on drums. No keyboards on this tour. It will be more acoustic.

Second single will be "Say Anything," and I think we're doing a shed tour with the Kinks.

Will you be doing "Voices Carry"?

Probably... we'll fuck it up somehow, though.

Did you play the "Boston Music Awards" this year?

Awards" this year? Had to — you know — support the scene and all. We did "Should Have Known" with ten guitars at once. The event is kind of silly; it exists to sell \$50 tickets to little girls who want to sit with New Kids On The Block. This year, they gave Aerosmith an award for being defenders of the First Amendment because they donated some money to some cause. So Alan Dershowitz is at the podium hyping Steven Tyler as this great humanitarian... it was hilarious. The only reason Aerosmith is so into this free-speech thing is so they can show tits in their videos. I get along with them, I guess, but they're part of this rock & roll legend/lifestyle/myth that I won't buy into. Life is too short for that.

The record is very personal and much less off-hand than in the nast.

I don't think it was a conscious decision; there was just so much to write about. Also, I had more time to come up with new songs... we just made so many demos. I had a great

many things to pick from.

I remember years ago, you told me that "there is no such thing as constructive criticism." I believe that was during the first 'Til Tuesday backlash in Boston, right after you guys got signed.

That figures. I didn't know I was such a hard-ass back then. It's not like I'm bitter about my ups and downs. I really have always felt the same way. My favorite 'Til Tuesday song was always "Coming Up Close." But I always thought it was a nick from "Boys Of Summer."

Well, we toured with Tom Petty and his guitarist wrote the music for that song, so it was a little one, yeah. I always wondered when someone would pick that up; it seemed so obvious to me. I guess you've become a pretty good critic, John.

Fabulon, "All Girls Are Pretty" (Chrysalis/ERG). Part Prince and Bowie, part Sly Stone and KC, Fabulon powers his stormy emotional themes with gutteral grooves of pure hormonal splendor. The lead hit single "In A Mood," only abrades the surface of this pop auteur's brilliant fusing of catching

pop structure and insidious samples and riffs culled from "Purple Rain"-era Prince ("Love And Affection"), "Magical Mystery Tour"-era Beatles ("Jon") and even the Association on his venerating send-up of the classic "Cherish." Simply Fab.

JPS Experience, "Bleeding Star" (Matador): After an impressive showing on the recent Noiseyland Tour, JPS Experience release their third full-length album. Straying from the quirky songwriting exhibited by some of their fellow New Zealanders, the quartet takes on a decidedly British C-86 in-



fluence with a hypnotic sound full of psychedelic guitar work and Beatlesque melodies. Guitarists David Mulcahy and James Laing create a lush wall of sound on "Into You" that echoes the Jesus and Mary Chain, only with shimmering vocal harmonies.



Tripping Daisy, "Bill" (Island): Dallas aural botanists Tripping Daisy tend a meadow free of the weeds of pretension and positively exploding with the blooms of psychedelic-tinged organically-grown sonic flora. The looselyspinning "Change Of Mind" creaks and juts like one of the neurotic carousels

engineered by Syd Barrett. While the dissolving "Brown-Eyed Pickle Boy" smacks sweetly of the pungent seasoning employed by Executive Chef of the Disoriented Express Perry Farrell. Feeling a little too connected? Trip with Daisy.

Hollyfaith, "Purrrr" (Epic): If you've been suffering a lack of faith in power chord-driven, authentic rock n' roll, then chew the wafer with hollyfaith. Rob Aldridge, the band's resident rakish possesses blonde frontman, roundest, weightiest vocal tone since Eric Burdon and lets out his "repressed



Southern Baptist upbringing" with every biblical belt. When he soars above the balmy, overdriven tube amp clamor on the drunken "Zero" or the pointed "Who Is You," you may be struck by the light of a day when presidents resigned and noisy rock oozed through the walls of your neighbor's garage.







Happy Anniversary. No, not us, but the original rockfest Woodstock, which went down 24 years ago this month. In the "Life imitates Art" dept., the late Bill Graham predicted the event would result in bands upping the ante for their guarantees. While inflation accounts for a majority of the price increases, Graham was somewhat right. It's ironic that one of the bands which debuted at the rock fest recently toured with some tix prices hitting \$65 face value. Of course, Graham also suggested that the way to control the then-crowd of 400-500,000 (depending on which mud slide you were standing in), was to dig a hole and let everyone fall in. Fortunately, no one listened... While

talking touring, we always thought a local play date would help a band either get added or increase rotation at radio. Unfortunately, some stations get the co-present by threatening to drop the record; then reap the benefits of time buys and promotions from both the label and the promoter — which include full CD and tix giveaways — then drop the record the week after the band leaves town. If the show's neutral, some stations drop the record

because they didn't get the co-present. Sound familiar?... The Kiss tribute release previously mentioned still includes surprises like Stevie Wonder and Lenny Kravitz as well as Megadeth, Extreme and Gunners. All performances were self-produced with exception of Anthrax, whose track was done by Kissers Stanley and Simmons. Kiss members will be donating their royalties to various pediatric aids foundations... Rock and Roll Hall of Fame has named Dennis Barrie Director of the museum. If his name isn't familiar, his reputation may be. Barrie was arrested and later acquitted on obscenity charges while director of the Contemporary Arts Center in Cincy for the Robert Mapplethorpe photography exhibit... Ministry's Al Jourgensen made a homeboy pit stop in Chicago and onto the stage during recent Anthrax show. Jourgensen had such a good time, he then followed the band in his own car to a few more performances. Speaking of Jourgensen, a new Revolting Cocks record is slated for an early October release on Warner/Sire with the cast of a thousand guests including Timothy Leary. And while a recent feature on Chicago credits Wax Trax founders Jim Nash and Danny Flesher with the formation of industrial rock, some believe it was Jourgensen and fellow Cocksman Paul Barker who brought bands like Ministry, Revolting Cocks, Thrill Kill Kult and KMFDM to the label. With the



Take one. Anthrax's Scott lan may be the only person on the planet who takes more photos than Sacred Reich and you can see how thrilled they look. Take two. Someone please tell Scott Ian his band left town without him. Take three. Someone tell all of them to get the hell back on the bus and stop with the pictures already.



How do you keep from getting lost in the shuffle of all the Seattle bands?

KEVIN MARTIN: [Laughs.] It's tough being from Seattle now. The media jumps on everything, and they're just as much to blame for the backlash as all the Seattle bands are. Everybody started coming here expecting to find success in this town. Then you've got the real bands that've always been from here, who created the Seattle music scene, who knew that it's all not just a bunch of hype. This music's been around for a long time, but now all these people decide that they like it, so we're getting a backlash.

Popularity has a way of killing underground music — especially with the corporate factor figured in. Do you think popularity will kill the Seattle sound?

KEVIN: I think it already has. You've got independent labels all over the place, but they can't supply to meet the demands the way major labels can. You can't get to the public as easily with 10,000 CDs and limited tours. Alternative music has had limited

appeal because it's had limits in getting to the public. You gotta go with what's best, and hope for the best in the future.

Your song "Change" is about looking to the future. What do you guys see in your future?

KEVIN: Well, hopefully, I see us playing our music. I'd also like to see some change in the world.

Were your parents supportive of your musical pursuits?

KEVIN: My parents were both musicians, so there was a lot of support there. One day they just sort of pushed me towards a drum kit and said, "Get to work." My family comes to all our shows.

You guys got signed fairly quickly. How'd you pull off avoiding all the crap?

KEVIN: We haven't. Not yet. [Laughs.] The way I look at it is every band is different in its own way. When four or five people get together to create a sound, they're going to touch people. It's a combination of a lot of things. Each band plays to and appeals to

different people. If this didn't happen here in Seattle, we would've gone and made it happen somewhere else. The industry was looking at Seattle at the time. Nobody can second-guess the music industry — or anyone else. We'd like it if people didn't see us as a "Seattle band," and just let us be us. A lot of bands in Seattle that aren't signed are bitter because it's not happening for them. It's not going to happen for everyone. It's more than just the city.

Is there a lot of backbiting?

KEVIN: Definitely. But, not everyone's bad-mouthing each other. You have to be happy for yourself. You earned your success, so what if someone else is jealous? If they are, they're not people you want around anyways.

Are you scared by some of the nightmare lives that rock musicians can lead?

KEVIN: The media would like us to think that all rock stars are fucked up on heroin or something like that. But we make it to practice every day. Maybe some day we'll all be such drunks that we can't make it to practice, but we're going to try to keep our heads straight. We worked hard to get where we are. Everyone has some problem, but you only hear about the ones that celebrities have.

What are your fans like?

KEVIN: We get everything from the butt-rockers to frat guys. We get a very strange crowd. A butt-rocker is one of those guys in tight leather pants shaking his butt with a girl in white pumps.

What kind of things can you do now that you couldn't have done two years ago?

KEVIN: Buy new furniture. Everything I had before got tossed, so now I can go home to some nice stuff for a change.

he name comes from a song by Midnight Oil — "Box Of Candles" reconfigured into Candlebox. The name implies luminesence; an aid in viewing one's surroundings; a light identifying something you might've simply passed by in the dark.

Literally.

figuratively or musically. Candlebox is far from a simple flame that leans with every passing breeze. Don't think of Candlebox as a Seattle band... think of it as a band. Don't think of lead vocalist Kevin Martin, guitarist Peter Klett, bassist Bardi Martin and drummer Scott Mercado as Seattle musicians... think of them as musicians. There was no magic music lottery for these four - they worked hard for their success. They sold everything they owned to pay for their first demo -48 hours in the studio later produced a tape that caught the attention of Madonna's Maverick Records. Two years later, Candlebox is still straining against eternal categorization, a problem shared by HITS' answer to Beavis & Butthead, metalhead Sam "Are We Not" Mendiestein, who has been dubbed a mental



midget since birth.

BEAT'S ME

WHERE HAVE ALL THE PROMOS GONE?: The used-CD controversy is now spilling over into the practice of promos and advances. Several record labels are re-thinking the use of these industry staples by adding their own wrinkles to the process. Capitol Records recently sent out advance promos of their five-CD Beach Boys package in sets of blank, numbered, generic CDs, with xeroxed copies of the liner notes and a color slide of the package. Of course, some local retailers insisted the "blank" set had a "collectible" value which made it worth even more than the regular version. Zoo Entertainment will not be mailing out any "d.j. copies" of their upcoming Big Star live album,

claiming the 10,000 or so promos they'd ordinarily distribute would go to precisely those fans that make up the audience for long-time cult figure Alex Chilton. "It's about time Alex got something in return for his efforts, commented label President Lou Maglia. CD advances are starting to replace cassettes as the medium of choice, but several labels are taking steps to prevent bootlegging, which has become endemic, especially in the rap area, where pirated copies often proceed the actual releases to the marketplace. Motown Rec-


ords inserts a voiceover on its advances to discourage pre-release airplay. Tommy Boy has gone one better by mailing out advances of **De La Soul**'s new "Buhloone Mind State" album with the sound of a braying donkey repeating every minute or so to discourage bootleggers. Only trouble is, as the band's **Posdnuos** told the *Village Voice*: "A lot of people *like* it with the donkey noises. They think it's part of the album."

MIXED MEDIA: Johnny Clegg & Savuka flew 8.000 miles to put on a rousing show at the Wiltern Theater, only to be greeted with the news they'd been dropped by Capitol Records... What A&R exec tooled down to the red-hot Beck showcase at L.A.'s Al's Bar in a block-long stretch limo incongruously parked outside the downtown dive? The hotly pursued singer/songwriter kinda Emo Phillips meets Neil Young meets Kurt Cobain - is signed to BMG Music and is being courted by at least a dozen labels... RERAP

What a week! CEMA did an abrupt about-face last Thursday (12), informing all accounts involved in selling used CDs that they could indeed order product on the new Garth Brooks "In Pieces" release. CEMA and Capitol Records have yet to comment on the turn-around, but a wide range of comments have been pouring in from retail. Wherehouse's Bruce Jesse (by the way, what day of the week is this guy not on national TV?) said, "We're happy as a clam! All along, we wanted to sell the CD and we're glad we're going to get it." Less enthused is Terry Currier of Music Millenium, whose wellpublicized Garth BBQs helped fuel the debate. Currier said he will not be ordering any Garth product unless Brooks makes a public retraction. "He's the one that made these statements and I think he owes a great many people an apology." Pete Smolen of Sounds Familiar in Columbia. NC. said. "I was incredulous when this all started, but last Monday it got even more absurd when my rep solicited me on the cassette, but not the CD." Is he going to stock it now? Smolen said he didn't know. "If I'm standing by myself, then it doesn't make a lot of sense. But if I got the word that there were 500 stores banding together, that

be different." Rosenberg of the Record Exchange said. "I've ordered 500 CDs and 200 cassettes. We will have no part of a ban on any product. It's not my decision what my customers should and should not buy. Maybe my customers will choose not to buy it, but I can't make that decision for them whether it's Garth or 2 Live Crew." Would they be promoting it? "Not as much as we've been doing on U2 [which has been supported with co-op dollars from PGD]." Rosenberg replied. "But I'm pleased. This is a positive step. Maybe this means that things wil be moving in a more positive direction." Stay tuned... All of this came right on the heels of NARAS chief Michael Greene stating, for the record, his total support of both Garth Brooks' opinions and the distributors' policies. "Retailers are selling used CDs with absolutely no regard for the impact of such short-sighted behavior upon the future of our music community. Songwriters, recording artists, producers and all other music industry professionals are being defrauded of the royalties they depend upon to earn a living." Greene takes the retailers to task for selling promotional CDs simply because they most often do not say the word "promotional" on them. He compares the sales of used CDs to the "record rental" debate and wonders if stores dealing in used product will encourage the distributors to consider more seriously the instituting of interactive digital delivery systems (by-passing the stores completely). Greene also asked "all artists to join Garth Brooks and NARAS to fight this shortsighted division in the music industry."... Interesting side note: Back on November 30, 1992. Brooks Garth told HITS magazine in an interview with Gary Graff: "Between you and me, I wouldn't buy a CD at \$16.95 no matter who it was."




