Distributors Dramatically Reverse Used-CD Policy

Michael Fights Back

Tapes obtained by several media outlets seem to confirm Michael lackson's allegations that the father of the 13-yearold boy at the center of the police investigation into child molestation charges against the superstar was using the information to blackmail the singer.

The man, identified as a dentist on L.A.'s Westside, is heard telling the boy's stepfather on the phone, "There will be a massacre if I don't get what I want." At no time did he reveal what he might want from Jackson or detail any allegations against him, but did threaten to make his accusations against the superstar public.

Jackson private investigator Anthony Pellicano revealed details of an August 4 meeting between Michael, the boy and his father, where the father threatened Jackson he'd make the child molestation charges public unless the singer helped further his screenwriting career. Pellicano said he offered the father a \$350,000 movie development deal on behalf of Jackson, but that he then angrily demanded \$20 million over four years to remain silent.

Say Goodbye To Hollywood

Peter Paterno will leave his position as President of Hollywood Records when his contract expires in November, according to — that's right — a faxed memo from the Walt Disney Company. This release was official.

Said Disney Chairman/CEO Michael Eisner: "Frank Wells and I want to declare our genuinely deep appreciation to Peter for the excellent job he has done in starting up our record label and introducing us to the delightful members of Sacred Reich."

Eisner went on to laud Paterno's acquisitions of the Queen and Dave Clark Five catalogues, the distribution arrangement he negotiated with Elektra and WEA and his signing of new artists such as Brian Setzer Orchestra, Ghost of an American Airman and rappers Organized Konfusion.

Paterno has not announced his future plans.

ithin days of one another, CEMA and WEA have reversed their policies on withholding co-op ad dollars from retailers that sell used CDs, with Uni reportedly set to follow. Sony, the remaining participant in the used-CD conflict, was not available for comment.

CEMA was the first to announce its decision. Last Thursday (26), distribution head Russ Bach issued a statement that said, "We continue to be concerned about the unchecked growth of the used-CD market and the issues it raises... However, we recognize that there are deeply held views on both sides of this issue and we would prefer to resolve our differences with used-CD sellers through market-based solutions rather than through the courts."

Then, on Monday (30), WEA sent out a press release stating they had "concluded that the intense controversy and litigation generated by its policy is detrimental to the cooperative spirit between WEA and its dealers..."

WEA qualified its new position only by saying retailers will get co-op dollars "provided they otherwise meet WEA's advertising policy terms and conditions applicable to all other customers."

However, CEMA asks that retailers not sell CDs clearly marked "promotional" (and will now mark their promos accordingly), not sell used CDs of specific titles which at the time are being supported by co-op funds and not advertise used CDs with new CDs. CEMA also requests that used-CDs be separately displayed and clearly marked.

The legal ramifications of all this are not immediately clear.

Wherehouse plans to remove CEMA from its lawsuit "when the terms of the settlement agreement are finalized," but has yet to move on WEA or Uni. "We have not had the same level of discussions with WEA as we have had with CEMA," said Bruce Jesse of Wherehouse. For more of this garbage, see this week's Re-Rap column on page 73.

New Music Explosion

n interesting phenomenon is occurring at Top 40 radio — the active audience is getting active again! While the last several years have found an audience generally apathetic about the disposable dance music and one-off hit records from noncareer artists, there is now a body of music that seems to be galvanizing the 18-34 core. You can call it Alternative, Post Modern, Generation X or whatever tag you want — the fact is, it is Mass Appeal Pop.

Take a look at your request tallies from a year ago and from five to six years ago — you'll notice that the bulk of your calls were for re-currents and older product. The actives who were taking the time to pick up the phone and call your radio station were not hip to, or passionate about, the new music on the air (low-end teen reaction records excepted). Look at your phone sheets now unless you're a Churban or Dance station — and here's what you're getting calls for: Soul Asylum, Stone Temple Pilots, Blind Melon, Lenny Kravitz, Chili Peppers, Gin Blossoms, Tears for Fears, Pearl Jam, Spin Doctors... What is this music that people are passionate about and

We can no longer dismiss these artists as being "fringe" or of narrow appeal. Remember that MTV is stronger than ever right now, and they are breaking acts. The nuclear explosion of Blind Melon is the most recent example. Look back on Pearl Jam and Spin Doctors. Remember how you felt about those records when they came out? "Nothing we

asking you to play?

need to deal with, that's not us..." "Yeah, I like it, but my audience doesn't want to hear that type of music on my radio station." Guess what, it's their radio station, and this is what they want. This is the dawning of a whole new generation of musical artists that America's vouth feel connected to, want to be identified with, want to be a part of. Go to your local mall and try to find young people who aren't dressed like Pearl Jam if you doubt this. The number of Top 40s who never played Pearl Jam is staggering. Some people just don't get it.

This music is bigger than vou can comprehend. It crosses more boundaries than you think. Keith Naftaly played Nirvana on KMEL. Bob Case played Pearl Jam on KUBE! This body of music can literally be the catalvst that resurrects the format. Now more than ever, we must listen to the listeners; they know what they want. This wasn't the case a few vears back. Then, there wasn't really anything they wanted. Now, there is. As Natalie Merchant said. "Give 'em what they want!"

An exclusive HITS radio interview with MARK SHANDS, PD WHJX Jacksonville, FL

Like it or not, RAP IS A MAJOR FACTOR IN CONTEMPORARY MUSIC TODAY.

Tell me about WHJX.

We are an Urban station, moving to a more mainstream bent. Our spring Arbitron was very strong with good showings 12+ and 18-34. We are trying to capitalize on WAPE's move to Hot Adult while also trying to be more musically correct then our urban competition WJBT. Their staff is made up mostly of people who were here at one time. They are currently doing more of a full/adult urban format.

What is up with the station's finances? Before I got here, the station was low on billing, but that has increased by 60-70% over the last year. The station was bought at a high price, as many were a few years back, so we are hoping to refinance the loan.

What are the economic problems of doing a start-up in the Urban format?

We used to think how great it would be to do a start-up format or a format change — the excitement of the new logo, new stickers, TV and billboard ads, etc. We have had to do what we're doing now without any of that. We have had to do it with the music and with the talent.

Jerry Clifton is great at finding, reading and challenging talented people. Most people don't know how to utilize those resources, but he does. It makes it sort of magical. Hard times can even help an active format because we can reap the

benefits of word-of-mouth quickly, as the numbers have indicated. We can use our music the way most stations use their contests and promotions. It's a lot of work in a struggling economy. Also, we are promoting ourselves using our own transmitter — a novel concept, but an effective one.

Compare yourself with other stations in the Clifton group.

The stations tend to change over time. They come on kind of young and not so worried about dayparting — the pressure is not as great to bend the format to pull 25-35+ numbers, but to get 25-34 numbers by being a great radio station. We play the big hits of lacksonville without worrving about playing more Rod Stewart, Phil Collins or Elton John like the APE is doing now. We don't feel those are hit artists. We base that on retail sales in Jacksonville. We are very aggressive, our air talents are younger and are selling the music by relating to both black and white kids aged 12-34. The wordof-mouth is working because we've seen our cume double and we're just getting started.

What is the industry's perception of the station?

Maybe it's time for the industry to stop drawing a line between urban and pop radio, like this is black and this is white. Dr. Dre, SWV, Janet, Silk and Jodeci are neither black nor white records — they are hit records. No other major industry does that— even on TV, there aren't black and white stations. To many labels, we are a zebra... they can't tell if we're white with black stripes or black with white ones. We appeal to both black and white because contemporary music does.

ark Shands' first gig was in WKOR Starksville, Mississippi, before he landed with Lee Abrams at WRNO New Orleans. He was at Miami's Y100 and sister station 13Q in

Pittsburgh, then nailed his first PD gig with the Clifton-consulted Y100 in Daytona Beach (now 1100). He was an APD at 195 Miami and PWR96 Miami, then it was onto PD gigs at WHKW Tuscaloosa, Alabama, WCKZ Charlotte and his current post at WHJX, where his spring Arbitron numbers went 4.7-7.8 12+, edging the area's legendary WAPE. Pretty impressive figures, until you consider it brought HITS' version of an ambulance chaser, "Shoddy" Todd Hensley, out of the woodwork and sniffing around for this story.

records — they ARE HIT RECORDS."

This isn't a Clifton thing... it's nationwide. This is mass appeal. The labels are archaic.

The talk of the last year has been of Generation X — people who like alternative and rap. Could there be such a radio station?

There are a million ways to peel an orange. You can do just about anything if you construct it in a logical way. To some extent, there is block formatting here with the Quiet Storm late night program, which is pretty different from what we do the rest of the day, but it fits. It could be done, but I'm not sure if it would be mass appeal.

How did you take on the legendary station in the market, WAPE?

WAPE is a legendary set of calls, but now they are in more competition with the other adult stations — WIVY or The Coast 103. I'm sure they made a choice... Do you try to out-Clifton Clifton, or lock up the upper demos and hang on to them? It reminds me of the position Y100 Miami took when I was there.

Does rap appeal to 35-year-old females?

In most cases probably not, but in my instance, I'm not targeting a white 35 year-old woman. My cut off is 34 years. Rap records are almost like novelty records... they have a window of mass appeal acceptance that comes and goes rather quickly. Turn on TV and you'll see the Pillsbury Doughboy rapping. Who is their target? Not a kid with a boom box. Like it or not, rap is a major factor in contemporary music today.





Boston native Lou Maglia was one of six children of a waiter father and housewife mother. His introduction to the record business was running the Book Clearing House, a retail book and record store on Boyleston St., which carried mostly classical albums until he took it over and began to stock U.K. imports and hard-to-find bootlegs. "It was a very hip, political store," he says. "Especially during the days of the Vietnam War." Maglia showed an acumen for promotion and marketing early on in his career by sending some of his rare finds to local station WBCN, where the d.j.s would add that the discs could be purchased only at Lou's store.

Maglia's first label gig was at London Records before he joined Elektra as a regional marketing man for New England and the Midwest in '74. He remained at the label for 12 years, rising to **Executive VP/GM** before taking over as President of Island in 1986, where he was credited with transforming U2 into an international superstar act, boosting the careers of Robert Palmer and Melissa Etheridge and breaking rap acts Tone Loc and Young MC.

In 1990, with the help of BMG, Maglia launched Zoo Entertainment as a west coast-based, multi-media company

dedicated to long-term artist development. The label achieved its first bona-fide success story with the rock parody of Green Jelly, which parlayed a videoonly release into a subsequent gold album which has sold nearly three-quarters of a million copies to date. Other label artists who are breaking out include Lollapalooza faves Tool, critically acclaimed PoMo singer/songwriter Matthew Sweet, R&B stylist Phyllis Hyman, slide guitarist Sonny Landreth, dance-pop artists Cause & Effect, cult faves Big Star, Earth, Wind & Fire leader Phillip Bailey, the mysterious Spelvins and Dallas groundbreaking industrialismos Course of Empire. Promising recent signings include SoCentral metal funkateers Spade Ghetto Destruction, inked after a

bidding war with several other labels, and the manic pop energy of Love Jones. Maglia is in the midst of breaking the company into the world of animation by forming a partnership with the Green Jelly collective for a video production house.

A plain-talking man who means what he says — and always takes care of those around him — Zoo's Lou Maglia took time out from manging on an Italian meal to wipe spaghetti sauce off the face of HITS' resident schnorrer, Sr. Editor Roy "There Is Too Such A Thing As A Free Lunch" Trakin.

How does it feel that your first bona fide success at Zoo Entertainment was spurred by a character called Shitman?

[Laughs.] I smelled it coming. Seriously, the basis of this label is as an artist development company. I first saw Green Jelly at the Club With No Name at one in the morning. Kevin Coogan convinced me to go see them. We talked about their visual, comic book aspects and the different ways you could get a base built on this type of act, i.e. comic book conventions, etc.

That first night, I was afraid for my life to be on the floor because it was mayhem. They induced these kids into forming a major mosh pit. I remember a beer bottle shattering above my head, showering me and the audience with beer and glass, and nobody blinked an eye. Which was an omen that there was something going on. That night, I said this band was either going to sell ten or ten million... That whole "Green Jelly sucks" motto worked pretty well as a marketing angle. The video-only concept gave us an opportunity to do something like that. I think the entire thing cost just \$75,000. And that excited me.

The director, Fred Stuhr, did a tremendous job. Didn't he just do the Claymation on the new Tool video?

There are a bunch of people who live and work together in a loft on Hollywood and Wiltern, above the Irish Club, including members of Green Jelly and Tool. You go up a narrow flight of stairs to this complex and there's 14 people living together. They set up all their equipment there. Tool recorded two or three tracks from their first EP at a New Year's Eve party they held there. That's where Green Jelly started shooting their video. They did everything themselves. We're starting a new video production company with them in EMI's old facility on Sunset and Orange. We're buying a million dollars worth of the latest technological equipment for video animation, editing bays and a small recording studio. They have a bunch of offers on the table already. including MTV series programming.

BMG has been awfully patient with Zoo. With the success of Green Jelly, Matthew Sweet and now Tool, do you feel you're turning a corner?

From my prior experiences at Elektra and Island, approach and strategy are things you can put down on paper, but the reality of a start-up situation has to be evolutionary. You have to do things one step at a

time and things change as you go along. The biggest surprise

for me on moving out to Los Angeles from New York to start this label was how long a journey this was going to be. As a new label, you can't just come in and sign Madonna, no matter how much money you have. I wanted to start Zoo with new talent that excited me. And to spend the time and energy to develop them.

[BMG Chairman/CEO] Michael Dornemann wanted a West Coast company that could begin to develop relationships with music and film companies and all other aspects of the entertainment business. I talked to a great many people when I first left Island about starting up a new label. But Michael came after me pretty hot and heavy. I had great relationships with the international people at BMG because Island had been distributed by them outside the U.S. They did an amazing job for me on acts like Melissa Etheridge, Anthrax and Womack & Womack. And that's another of my philosophies — a new company should set its sights on the world market rather than just in the U.S. With the competition, cost involved and impossibility of getting your foot in the door at radio and MTV in the beginning, the real potential is in the global marketplace.

Is that something you learned from your time at Island?

Chris Blackwell basically taught me the music business is an international industry. We're making those kinds of inroads with our artists now. And that's one of the most difficult things about starting a new label without a proven back catalog. Everything you do must yield a return on your investment. Now, we're taking probably one-fifth of our budgets for international development. We're building international bases for all of our artists.

What kind of timetable do you have before Zoo will turn a profit?

BMG is a privately held company with no debts. There are no stockholder pressures to perform. They can make their own decisions and do whatever they want. Their first want and need from Zoo Entertainment is to have product to sell in the rest of the world. Green Jelly's selling well wherever it has been released. And I think Matthew Sweet and Tool have the same kind of potential.

BMG seems to be positioning Zoo as its alternative rock label.

We're a diverse label. We've had three Top Five R&B singles with Phyllis Hyman from our licensing deal with Gamble & Huff's Philly International. But BMG's main expectation is that they'll have a product source for the rest of the world. As for the profitability aspect, having a staff of 43 people continuing to try to develop new acts without any catalogue income is always going to be an investment situation. Our second fiscal year ended July 1, and it was a terrific year. We had 800,000 Green Jelly singles and 650,000 albums in the U.S. But we put that money back into the company, so it's not going to be a profitable situation until we've established these groups as platinum acts. The music business is cyclical. You have to accomodate for those

cycles by paying close attention to the roster and vour projections. When you're running a big machine, you need a lot of fuel. Sometimes, it's hard to imagine how big companies like Warners and Sony can be profitable.

You've been pretty savvy about marketing the image of Zoo.

BMG loves the fact they have an L.A.-based organization. Michael [Dornemann] was out recently talking to some very significant Hollywood players about the potential synergy record labels could have with film studios and he was floored by people telling him Zoo was a real cool label, mentioning Green Jelly and Tool. People involved in that area are real aware of

everything from Shitman dolls to watches to lunch boxes. Your kids are gonna

Do you still enjoy what you're doing?

Absolutely. For me, the food and the fuel to maintain and continue my enthusiasm and drive is obviously not money - except to make alimony payments. My motivation comes from crawling my way to the mixing board of the Lollapalooza tour to see a band in Tool that I originally signed when they played before an audience of 20 people. And to see them do it before 30,000 people in a very short period of time... that's what the business is all about for me. People responding to your vision. Hopefully, it doesn't take too long. Because it's more difficult to do than it's ever been. And almost painful to bang your head against the wall week after week with radio. Especially in the

us. My original concept was to have a multi-media We're creating for Green Jelly

company which had an interaction with all aspects of the entertainment business. For instance, I was instrumental in bringing Nice Man Merchandising into the BMG fold. Many of the things we're getting involved in with Green Jelly were Zoo visions from the beginning. And this is the means to get into comic books, video games, CD-ROM and merchandising.

beginning, when we didn't have a full staff. I didn't want a bunch of guys sitting around reading Billboard because they had nothing to do.

You really proved you could turn a record label around at Island.

That was a perfect marriage. There was a person with world vision, taste and style in Chris Blackwell, while I was a very competent marketing person who took that vision and brought it to the marketplace. Bob Marley was a legend, but he'd only sold 200,000 records in the past. I took him and sold a million in the first year I was there. U2's biggest record had sold 1.2 million; I sold three million units in catalog the first year. I just exploited the shit out of it.

How did you explode U2 at the time of

I made sure the band's albums were released simultaneously around the world, which Chris never did. The mixing of the singles by Steve Lillywhite was all predetermined. We made videos on three tracks up front. I reserviced the entire U2 catalogue to Album Radio three months before the new album shipped.

The basic structure at Island was, I ran the company day-to-day. One of the big problems in the past was that Chris couldn't be there all the time. So he turned the company over to me. He never made one decision without going through me. And that's how it worked. I

be in a club in Paris seeing a Moroccan-Egyptian-African band with 16 different rhythms going on simultaneously and if it turns him on musically, he'll commit to it. Our relationship was over when PolyGram bought the company, only because I couldn't commit to his creative vision within a corporate structure, which demands you keep things within budgetary guidelines. I broke a five-year deal with them to leave, but there's one thing I can attest to. I'm a meticulously honest person. I have never taken a nickel that wasn't mine. And I always take care of the people around me.

Can you be a nice guy and succeed in this business?

success to failure. There's a great deal of room in that for them to act rather than just react. It gives them the flexibility to make their own decisions, to be autonomous.

Tell us about the recent signing of Spade Ghetto Destruction, a band you bid against other labels to nab.

That's one of those rare situations, like Green Jelly and Tool... an act that just knocked my dick in the dirt the first time I saw them. I didn't even hear them play their first note before I signed them. These guys were just so intense tuning up, I was won over.

Love Jones is another recent signing.

They're like Green Jelly. They're very creative visually.

did things for him he always dreamed of. He always wanted a retail store, so I opened Island Trading Company at the offices on 4th and Broadway. Because I needed more room for my offices, I moved the mailroom to a storefront across the street, which doubled as a retail outlet.

Do you feel Island has lost much of its identity since being purchased by PolyGram?

Island's image as a label is now more connected to PolyGram Distribution, which is the last connection to the consumer before a record hits the streets. Creatively, though, Chris Blackwell will die with his fingers on the company. He's still a visionary. He could

You have to be true to your beliefs. And if your beliefs are that music is an art form and a business at the same time, everything will be alright. Sometimes, you have to be cruel and make tough decisions — like looking an artist in the eye and saying, "It ain't happening." That's a very painful situation. But now that our roster is developed and the company is functioning fairly effectively, I'm more into the street end of things, where I can pick up a hot 12" record. You have to stay focused. You can't commit to things you don't really believe can happen because it takes away from everything else.

As for my staff, I allow people a 51-49 ratio of

The night I first saw them was when they opened for Tool at the Scientology Center. At first, I saw the kids' jaws drop, going, "What the fuck is this?," then they started bopping along to it. And the humor... this thing could be as big as you want it to be. You don't have to hype it, either. Just let it evolve and find its audience. When Tool comes off the Lollapalooza tour, they're going straight into the studio with Love Jones. And that's how I like all my artists to be. Interactive and working with one another.

Finally, this is probably the best staff I've ever worked with. We may be a little thin, but that's only because we're lean and mean.

all, and the talent is in the house, but an improved ACC and a tough outof-conference slate throws up one too many yellow flags. 5) MICHIGAN: As talent goes, they're loaded as always, and with the fortunes of Big Ten perennials Ohio State and Iowa, their biggest hurdles are Notre Dame and a trip to Happy Valley vs. Penn State. 6) COLORADO: Until recently, the Big Eight was Nebraska, Oklahoma and some other schools in states with only one area code. Now the Buffalos are in a maintenance posture attracting more national talent than ever. Miami looms as an early-season litmus test. 7) TEXAS A&M: Everybody who owns a Powerbook is dogging the SWC, and that translates to a show over the Aggies. Facts remain, this traditional powerhouse has the guns to win in any conference. Schedule this year doesn't hurt either. 8) WASHINGTON: With recent developments bringing down the wrath of the Pac 10 and resignation of head man Don James, this will be a team with a mission — nothing to lose; pride to gain. You won't see them in Pasadena or any other bowl, but this bunch will make life miserable for the rest of the pack. 9) SYRACUSE: Not since the glory days of Jim Brown, Ernie Davis and Floyd Little have the orange skies over upper New York not been what the winds blew north from the Apple. Speed kills defense in the campus wars, and these guys could win the Kentucky Derby. 10) PENN STATE: Their inaugural season in the Big Ten (Eleven) will be a successful one indeed, though young and rebuilding. Joe Paterno has a mission, and Pasadena just might be his reward. Other teams to watch: Florida, Nebraska, Arizona, North Carolina and Southern California. Darkhorses: Arkansas, Pittsburgh, Wisconsin, South Carolina and Southern Mississippi, Coaching vacancies to come at year end: LSU, Tulane, California, Purdue and West Virginia. Now tee it high, and let 'em fly.





erve deserves. Since emerging from their quaint northern England hometown of Wigan two years ago, the young quartet — singer Richard Ashcroft, guitarist Nick McCabe, bassist Simon Jones and drummer Pete Salisbury — has earned gobs o' adulation from Britain's finicky musical press. Hype notwithstanding, Verve's music — echo-drenched, escapist tales and eerie travelogues of mind expansion — is beautifully captured on "Storm In Heaven," their debut album on Virgin's Vernon Yard imprint. Prior to their recent L.A. media blitz and Whisky performance, the band's Richard Ashcroft and Nick McCabe came face-to-face with the mass of curls that is HITS'

thrillseeker Jon "Goodbye I'm" Levy.

Are you comfortable with your growing public profile and increasing media interest?

RICHARD ASHCROFT: My whole opinion of stardom is I don't care. I don't care if people are looking in my bin in the morning, seeing if I've got stains in my underpants when I throw them out. As long as you can keep on top of yourself, as long as you've got your close friends back home who know you and bring you back down to earth and say, "So fucking what that your record's doing well?" My friends've known me five, ten years before I was in a band. They're pleased for me, but whenever we get out of line, they can cut straight through you, and that's what you need. All the bullshit that comes with being in the public eye is water off a duck's back as far as I'm concerned.

Name a few songs on the album that encapsulate Verve's musical approach.

RICHARD: "Virtual World," because the way it was recorded was extremely loose. We just had the chords — no words whatsoever. We went in there and just played the thing, no planning involved. We got the atmosphere right. It was the most organic of the tracks on the album. Another one is "Slide Away." It's the second song we ever wrote, and it's stood the test of time. When you can keep a song for a couple of years and still get excited when you play it, that's the most important thing. We took a lot of ideas, feelings and drugs down to Wales for a couple of weeks. We had some good E experiences down there which found me about six in the morning talking to cows and things like that. We can't create under, where everything's written down and they've got hundreds of pieces of paper all over the studio and it's reality regimented — that's why

albums can sound so forced and planned.

NICK MCCABE: "Star Sail." It was recorded about four o'clock in the moming, stoned out of our minds — just messing about with this song we had half written. And the producer just started the tape. He didn't tell us he had recorded it until after we came out of the studio.

How do U.S. and British audiences differ?

NICK: It's strange because, when you play in a place where no one has seen you before, it's like starting from scratch. Audiences vary, even in Britain: you play one town and get an ecstatic reaction, and another town you get the armsfolded thing. Jumping around out of genuine excitement is fine by me, but if they're watching, taking it in, getting transported, that's great, too. We want people who are into the head side of it, and also peop'e who are into the adrenaline mode.

RICHARD: It's important not to become one of those bands that everyone just stomps around to... and then they don't remember a single note of music or don't see a moment of what goes on onstage. It's the greatest achievement when you've got, like 500 virgin ears out there that don't know what to expect, and you come out and win them over. That was the raw adrenaline rush of our first early gigs in London. Music's not about playing in front of the converted every night. It's about winning over the heathen, sweaty mob.

Do you consider yourselves part of any kind of British music scene?

RICHARD: We're a completely separate entity. I'd be very

upset if we got lumped in with other bands. If there are four other bands that sound like you, drink with you, sleep with you, say the same things in interviews as you, you're safe as long as you're the thing that's happening at the time. But if you come from the north of England, doing things on your own terms, it's a lot harder, because people can't pigeonhole you and they have no reference points. It's hard when you've spent a lot of time and energy and you're drained when you come out of the studio, and then someone says you sound like a band that you fucking loathe. That's when you get pissed off.

What comparisons have pissed you off? RICHARD: Slowdive. I haven't heard their new stuff, so I suppose that's a bit off center. I don't like being compared to anyone, and by the time we get to the second and third albums, people will be compared to us. It's just trying to get your own place in this whole fucking massive jungle which is music. How has the L.A. promo pageant been going?

RICHARD: Pretty intense. Last night, we were on "Loveline" and that was weird. Before that, we were cru-sing down Hollywood Blvd., and that was a good moment. We're just saying "no" to things that we don't want to do, doing things that we know aren't going to piss us off and we're not going to look stupid doing. We haven't done anything that's made us look stupid vet

Whoeps, you just blew it with this HTS interview.
RICHARD: I guess this is the first of many a misdemeanor I'm going to be committing while in Los Angeles.





With the general consensus being don't add it, just play the damn thing, if you don't dig the system, help us change that portion of it as well. Until that gets rectified, effective immediately, our new system is set up to take a maximum of seven adds per station. Please keep that in mind for future reporting. Report deadlines will be Tuesday

at 3 PM Pacific Time. The majority of the stations that report to us feel this is a great system and since most of them report off a log anyway, it's making their lives easier, too. Once again we stress, if you don't understand any of this, please call us immediately... Cathedral got more spins than any other record this week. This is great news for the band, who are preparing their visas as we write this to hit the shores for their tour with Mercyful Fate (which still leads in re-

MUSICAL FLACKS: The recent moves of ex-Capitol Publicity VP Larry Jenkins and leading indie Leyla Turkkan to Sony and Ron Shapiro from MCA to Atlantic have underscored the biggest domino effect in label publicity departments since the flurry of new start-up companies three years ago. With five late-night talk shows competing for musical talent, publicists with a skill for TV are in high demand, and starting to make a commensurate salary. In fact, the salary for a Sr. Director of Publicity *begins* in the \$60-70,000 range, which is not quite what a promo exec. gets, but still an impressive boost over just a few short years ago. Now that ex-Virgin/Charisma PR head Audrey Strahl is enscon-

The industry is still buzzing over the news that CEMA and WEA have reversed their positions on granting co-op ad dollars to retailers dealing in used CDs. (See article on page 13). Neither Sony nor Uni were available for comment, although at press-time the hot rumor was that Uni was going to follow suit at any moment. Most every retailer we have talked with has taken a very conciliatory tone. Scott Young of Wherehouse issued a statement on Friday saying, "We are pleased... Wherehouse Entertainment is satisfied that CEMA's new position represents a fair and reasonable approach to this issue." No terms of the settlement agreement between CEMA and Wherehouse were released. Wherehouse's Bruce Jesse would only comment, "We are both satisfied that the issues have been resolved." Negotiations are ongoing between Wherehouse and WEA. WEA made a point of noting in their statement that they "are confident that the policy [WEA] is now withdrawing is lawful." They also added that they "will monitor how [co-op] money is spent to verify that none of it is used for advertising that promotes used CDs." The newly formed I.M.R.A. was also pleased but, according to Don Kulok, has yet to take either CEMA or WEA

off their own lawsuit. They are still seeking unspecified damages and it would appear that there might be more than just the co-op money issue being discussed. I.M.R.A.'s membership will be meeting September 8 to discuss the current terms being offered. Nonetheless, Don Rosenberg of the Record Exchange (and a founding member of the I.M.R.A.) said, "I'm delighted they have changed their minds and I applaud their efforts to deal with the promo problem. I've missed working with them and am eagerly looking forward to promoting their product again." Does he think that the others will follow? "I don't know what went into the decision to place sanctions against used product in the first place. So I have no idea what's going to go into the decision to undo it." Roman Kotrys of Repeat the Beat Records (and one of the most outspoken retailers involved) said, "One small step for... hold on, that's already been used." But seriously, folks, "I've never stood up for anything in my life. But I just know we're right about this. I feel very good about how all the little guys across the U.S. got this thing going. The best thing to come out of all of this has been the I.M.R.A." Music Millenium's Terry Cummings (he of the much publicized Garth Brooks BBQ) noted, "There are going to be some bruised feelings, but not mine. I'm just glad to get back down to business." In the midst of all this elation, many have wondered (off the record) if the independents' victory might be a bit of a double-edged sword. Now that it looks like Wherehouse (as well as the independents) is winning the right to sell used CDs, will other large chains follow suit? And if they do, what will be the effect on the independent retail scene? Stay tuned.


