





Metal Blade a Priority

Priority Records Distribution has signed a long-term deal to distribute the bands on indie rock label Metal Blade, it was announced by Priority President Bryan "Turn Turn" Turner and Metal Blade Chairman/CEO Bryan Slagel "And Lox."

Metal Blade was formerly distributed by WEA. The first

release under the pact is "This Toilet Earth," the new album from conceptual gross-out act GWAR. Current bands on the roster include Cannibal Corpse, Mercyful Fate, Fates Warning, Skrew and Chemlab.

Said Turner: "I've always wanted to have a band called Skrew on my label, so I could say I screwed Skrew."

This week, "The Crow" jumps 13-2 on the HITS Top 50 Album chart, while the movie captures the #1 spot at the box office.



The first track, penned by Ray, is accompanied by a stunning video, but it is the duo's re-working of the traditional "This Train," which addresses the Holocaust with emotional force and searing detail, that has Leeds excited.

"In the wake of 'Schindler's List,' I would just love for Steven Spielberg to hear this," commented Harvey before sending a tape to Stuttering John instead.

In addition, the marketing department has set up an "Indigo Girls Information Line" (1-800-457-3027), which plays several tracks from the album, comments from Amy and Emily, updated tour information and a recording of Leeds' wife revealing their dysfunctional sex life.



FAMILIARITY BREEDS SUCCESS?

over the past several months, we have been thrust into a new world of plays or spins reported to us from all directions. Although much of contemporary radio has already been acclimated to this methodology for quite some time, to many it is a new experience.

For one, I have been testing some "new math" to this "new spin" at Top 40 radio and one burning question keeps popping up. The average number of songs being spun at Top 40 stations in the top 50 markets ranges between 45 and 52 current/ recurrents played at least five times a week. Of these, an average of only 19 songs are spun 20 times or more in a given week. As a programmer, 20 plays translates to three times a day, or almost once per daypart. All others play less, right down to once a day or fewer.

Since my first day in radio, the phrases "Play the hits"

and "Familiarity breeds success" have spelled two of the great commandments of Top 40 radio. If Top 40 is based on current hit music, and if we play the hits as prescribed. then something is wrong with this scenario. How can you familiarize your audience to 50 or more current songs with so little airplay exposure? And of the songs being given less than adequate spins, what is the probability of your audience hearing their favorites within the span of time they spend listening to your station?

This does not take into account whatever percentage of gold is played. Mathematically, it is an impossibility. Perhaps one of the failures of the Top 40 format in 1994 is the hits aren't familiar enough to your listeners. There have never been 50 or more legitimate hits at any given moment in the history of the format. The legendary Top 40 stations of the past 35 years didn't play that many titles. If

they played a true 40 list, then at least 15 of them were what we now call recurrents. WABC, KHJ, WLS, then later Z100, KIIS, B96 and Q105 playlists were built on 30 current hits or less played many times a day, plus a spice of oldies. Perhaps we should go back and examine the playlists of that era to regain our perspective. To win the game is to play the hits — a lot!

DXING: A great lesson in good radio can be heard annually on Derby Day in Louisville. Stations go "All Derby, All The Time" and do a masterful job of one thing entertainment. This year was no exception. WHAS talks to everyone but the horses. WDJX sounds like the ultimate Derby party. It's great radio... In Cincinnati, the Marc Chase-helmed WEBN has regained much of its spark on the air via a return to its heritage of great rock music and irreverent jocks who have something to say. Q102

sounds as unique as any Top 40 in America, thanks to Jimmy Steal's current on-air inventions... Further south, Y107 in Nashville, with a noticeable absence of their trademarked outrageousness. has matured as a hit-driven Top 40. Covote McCloud's morning show is still one of the most entertaining anywhere... Cat Thomas has WZYP Huntsville on target for a ratings comeback... And how does Rick Upton and MD Robin Flores get their entire playlist spun at P.T.'s???


AMBERT'S HOPS

n exclusive HITS dialogue with Craig Lambert, Executive VP, EastWest Records by Danny Fields

A product of Detroit's celebrated early '70s rock & roll scene and an ardent Motown fan, Craig Lambert is Executive Vice President of EastWest Records, the Atlantic Group label formed by the 1991 merger of EastWest and Atco. He reports directly to label CEO Sylvia Rhone.

Lambert's career began in his hometown, working locally for Warner Bros. and Capitol, eventually moving to the latter company's Hollywood Tower at the age of 21 as National Album Director. He returned to the midwest to Chicago as **Arista's National Album Promotion Director. He** opened his own independent management/promotion/marketing firm in that city, and then joined A&M, where he stayed for two years before coming to New York as VP of Promotion for the newly reactivated Atco imprint.

The competitive Lambert is a team guy, proud of what he's done, but eager to share credit where it's due and glad to be surrounded by players of commensurate intensity and dedication. Of course, intensity and dedication are no strangers to HITS' own epicurean, a man who never met a canape he didn't like, HITS' own Wolfgang Wannameet Danny "Au Gratin" Fields.



How has EastWest established its label identity over the past three years?

I didn't see the merger of East-West and Atco as a negative, but as a show of strength. Combining the two helped us with developing an already existing Atco catalog i.e. AC/DC and Bad Company, combined with the label's breaking acts like Pantera and the Rembrandts. Add in the artists on the existing EastWest roster like Simply Red, En Vogue and Gerald LeVert and we begin to have the

> makings of a strong combined artist roster. Though Sylvia and I had known each other, without having a close working relationship, what really surprised me was how she went to Doug [Morris] and the two of them decided that the two of us would be a perfect marriage. Working with Sylvia gave me a chance to build something new and exciting here. It was a remarkable opportunity I couldn't ignore.

How has the promotion picture

changed in the last couple of years with all the advances in technology?

I don't like the word "hype," but we try to make people aware of our excitement. But once that's done, the new technologies have made this business a lot more reality-based, so that we can make our business decisions based on solid information. You can't have records running up the charts looking like hits if, at the end of the day, they're not.

How has the role of promotion been affected by these changes? Promotion people have to be more than radio airplay-driven. They have to be sensitive to all the different formats as well as retail-wise and press-wise. We like to say, be the mayor of your market. You have to be in touch with every aspect that can influence or enhance the artist you're trying to develop.

I was taught a long time ago that a hit is a record that sells and establishes a fan base, but that hits alone don't essentially make an artist's career. Everyone wants a hit record, but artists' careers are more important. In signing an act, you're doing more than signing a record, you're hopefully establishing an artist who will have a long career... and create a catalog for your label which will sell for years to come. Sometimes it takes three or four albums before you really reap the benefits of having a platinum act. But the end result is really a payday for the artist and the label because catalog is what keeps every com-

pany alive.

The other thing to remember is that record companies aren't just driven by promotion departments. There's publicity, marketing, sales, all the creative aspects that go into the packaging of artists.

What radio format do you see room for out there?

Album rock stations could cer-

tainly open up a bit more. They should be playing more currents. Of course, a radio programmer could well say, "I'm not here to please a record company; I'm here to get ratings." But how many times do they have to get kicked in the head to realize that when you have so many choices, people want some variety and excitement? How many people want to hear "Stairway to Heaven" over and over again? There's a way to mix the best of the old and the new, a way to take the listener through the peaks and valleys of their listening habits - and still get ratings. Fortunate-

ly, it appears that this new Adult Post-Modern format has opened up doors to exploit new music, but at the same time catering to their base demo. This is like the early days of FM radio. And I'm very excited about it.

How about MTV?

MTV is the big P-1 in the sky. Without it, it's next to impossible to break certain acts. You need 'em. I wish, at times, they'd be more broad because so many acts who deserve a shot don't get one. But, of course, they have just so much time. Which is why the record companies are always jockeying for position. The same thing at radio.

What has surprised you most in working with Sylvia?

Surprise is a good word. She never ceases to amaze me with her vision. That's a word I don't like to overuse, but she sees so much going on, when others, myself included, are just starting to think about something. She strives for perfection in every way and she gets us to think in the same manner. She's very hands-on and very

Of course, things always change. But let's face it... everybody in this business loves to gossip.

What's your relationship like with Atlantic and the other labels in the Group?

It's a competitive atmosphere. And if it was anything else but that, Doug Morris, Danny Goldberg, Sylvia Rhone and Jimmy Iovine wouldn't be satisfied. If there's a number one slot and Atlantic and EastWest is going for it, I want EastWest to get it. Plain and simple.

Pantera has been a great act for the label. Tell me about their development.

First and foremost, they're fanconscious. They're not trying to

concerned with the artists. Not just the recording, but through the packaging, the artwork, the marketing plan... how the work of these artists is presented to the fans and the public.

How do you react to rumors she's being courted by other labels?

EastWest has been so successful in such a short amount of time, it's no surprise that people are interested in Sylvia Rhone. She is an incredible executive who has made an important contribution to the Time/Warner family. She's very involved not just in the music side of things, but in different other areas.

Sylvia may well leave EastWest one day, but I seriously doubt it.



make a record to please their record company; they're making a record to please their fans. Yes, we're extremely excited about them. You can engrave this in stone... Pantera represents the true meaning of artist development on the part of every department in this company. We've never compromised their credibility. We let our artists breathe. We let their artistry stand first and foremost. And Pantera is the best current example of that approach.

How about En Vogue?

The Supremes of the '90s. Just another example of our commitment to artist development.

Tell us some of your newer acts to look out for.

Watch for Billy Lawrence, a remarkable vocalist and writer. And Derek Oliver signed an act called Mother Station, which we're all very excited about and who are currently experiencing great acceptance at rock formats. For lack of a better comparison,

it's something like Janis Joplin meets Humble Pie.

This is going to be the most exciting year that anyone who works for EastWest has ever experienced. Of the new signings,

we're developing Buffalo Tom and we've got sophomore efforts from Dream Theater, Gerald LeVert and Men At Large, not to mention new signings like the Dambuilders and Sick Of It All and current development projects like Whale. In addition, there are upcoming releases from established catalog artists like AC/DC and Simply Red in the near future. We're not just putting records out; we're developing artists. That's the life's blood of our existence.

Do you have any ambitions to head your own label one day?

Absolutely. No question about it. This is all I've ever done, this is all I want to do, this is all I've ever known. [Laughs] I've never had a "real job." If I ever get to be President of a label, I'll probably act like the local promotion manager. I didn't know I wanted to be Executive Vice President. I didn't know I wanted to be a Senior Vice President. Do I have ambitions to be President? Of course. I think anyone in my position does. I like seeing guys like Phil Quartararo and Don Ienner emerge out of the promotion ranks. They have really been an inspiration for me as far as how I hope to continue to develop. They are true music men who never jeopardized their integrity, but stood firm about their beliefs and ideas of how they think things should be done.

What's the favorite piece of non-music-related memorabilia in your office?

I have a Louisville Slugger bat that I've had since 1989, when I came to New York. And I have many pictures of my daughter. But that's a dad thing, you know.

We have one more question.

No, I don't have any mirrors in my office, but I do have a full-blown, life-size poster of Dennis and Lenny picking my pockets for inspiration. ■





"working" the bodypainting booth. Except for the occasional indie who saw fit to "work" Bob Waugh and Robert Benjamin during the Fest, the "priority" of the label types in attendance was not to work records, but to enjoy being part of the "community" that WHFS has developed over the years (the operative word being "years" for those of you who have been on the air for ten minutes and expect the treatment of those who have paid their dues and developed bands in their market). Every, every, every band was brilliant, but (besides Steve Masters). the big, big, big highlight was

seeing 55,000 kids pogo to the Violent Femmes. Every kid knew every word to every song (not just the "hits"). Talk about paying your dues; after ten years, don't you think it's the Femmes' "time?" Congrats to all at WHFS for (once again) "setting the example." Incidentally, the station sounded amazing and the fave segue of Tipp, Isquith and me was R.E.M.'s "Boxcars" into the Pixies' "Here Comes Your Man." Yes kids, you can try this one at home...... Speaking of "good faith," another favorite programmer, Phil Manning is looking for bands for his June 26th event. Are you brain-dead? Why wouldn't you do everything in your minimal power to supply WOXY with a band? What medium market PD is more deserving? Duh...... The question is, just how ugly will things get in San Jose (and we're not talking about the scenery): KOME is on the air, with Jay Taylor in as APD/MD and our pal Kevin Weatherly consulting. Their target (for now) is Males 18-24 (that's funny, so is mine), concentrating on San Jose, a market where KITS does very well. While nobody expects KOME to start demanding "promotes" on shows in San Francisco, will KITS be willing to let bands play both markets to satisfy the needs of both stations, especially when their numbers in San Jose are particularly strong? Will labels be obliged to keep their artists from playing the Bay Area, so as to not piss off either station? Will Weatherly's involvement extend to programming decisions at KROQ? What about Lollapalooza? Richard Sands seems invigorated by all of this; let the games begin.



TIME FOR A RELIGIOUS EXPERIENCE WITH SAM PHILLIPS

by Allison Stewart

Sam Phillips started out her career as 19-year-old gospel singer Leslie Phillips, putting out several considerably successful spiritual records before signing with Virgin and starting over as a pop singer. Not only has Phillips put out one of the year's best records with the seamless and shimmery "Martinis and Bikinis" (Virgin), she is wise, friendly and married to T-Bone Burnett, the producer of all three of her secular records. She is also currently on tour with Counting Crows. "It'll have to be better than when I toured as a religious singer," she says. "I was playing in a prison one time when the lights went out. If there's a power failure, the last place you want to be is a medium-security correctional facility. Take my word on that one." Of course, even going to jail is preferable to the purgatory of being stuck in a room for 45 minutes with HITS' neo-love child Allison "Aquarius" Stewart.

Rumor has it you and T-Bone are putting together a country record.

Well, we finished "Martinis and Bikinis" and we had it on hold for months because Virgin was in this sort of transitional period. So T-Bone and I put together a bunch of country songs and recorded them, but I don't know when we're going to be able to do anything with them. We'd love to put it out, though, if someone would give us a chance. My dad was from Texas, but he didn't want us to know it. We could never listen to country music growing up. But I married a Texan and I lived in Texas for a while, so I'm sort of rediscovering my roots. My whole family came from Texas and Oklahoma... we even had an outlaw in the family that made the sheriff dance on the bar at gunpoint, that sort of thing.

Do you get a lot of what's-it-like-to-be-T-Bone'swife questions?

Yeah, it seems some people think, "Maybe T-Bone does everything and she doesn't have any talent." But it doesn't really bother me.

You must be incredibly strong-willed for that not to

Well, I guess it's because people don't really bug me about it that much. I'm not especially strong-willed. At least, I don't think so.

You don't really have a clearly defined image. Is there much pressure from people trying to mold you?

In the '8os, it was a lot worse. They wanted to put you into these slots - the sex kitten, the waif. There's not

much in between in terms of being just a normal woman. It's weird. They've really never known what to do with me. I just try not to embarrass myself. I draw the line, I guess, at anything humiliating.

I don't even know who my audience is. For the most part, I've only been out on the road opening for other people and I just sort of borrow their audiences. I mean, I've had people come up to me and some of them have been really lovely. But I don't know if you're supposed to like your audience. Are you?

You're only supposed to hate them after you get really famous. Then you can go around complaining about how they don't understand you.

That makes sense. I'll try to remember - the bigger

I get, the less I'll like them.

How much attention do you pay to how well you're doing on the charts?

I try not to look at them; it gets me thinking about the wrong things. I'd like more people to hear the record, but I haven't exactly been topping the charts, so I'm kind of used to it.

What do you think when you look back to when you were Leslie Phillips and making religious records?

I don't like them. I'm sorry some of them ever got released. I just consider that whole period to be my past life. I'm just glad I

got the chance to start

over artistically. There were some interesting times... it wasn't all awful. I toured coffee houses, churches, juvenile halls, prisons... you name it.

Singing all these religious songs, did people treat you like you were an oracle of God?

Yes! Totally! And it was like, what the fuck? I'm just a songwriter... I'm not a theologian! Leave me alone! I made my first record when I was 19, for goodness sake.

Have you ever wanted

to do anything else?

I've considered stopping being a singer and just being a songwriter. I would love to have a better singer sing my songs. I would probably be horrified at the way they sang them and chicken out and go, "No! You can't use my song! Give it back!" I've also thought, "Oh God, shouldn't I be doing something else for a living? I'm a grownup. Shouldn't I, like, get a iob?"

Does being a musician seem like a selfindulgent way to make a living?

Yeah, sometimes. And other times it seems like a really hard way to make a living. It's both, I guess. If that makes any sense. ■

What sort of freedom does your record label, Radioactive, offer you?

With this label, we have complete control over everything - like me and [guitarist] Jon [Morris] did the artwork for the album and, as far as picking the songs, the band all sat around and out of, like, the 40 songs we had, we voted on the ones we wanted on the record without anyone from the label. That's very unusual. Bands don't usually have that kind of freedom once they've signed that piece of paper. When we were in the studio, there was nobody breathing down our necks. We did everything the way we wanted to.

That's the sort of control you can only have with an indie label.

The whole thing with Radioactive is, it's an indie label, but it's backed by a major. We want to be around for a while and that's what they want, too.

What were the logistics of the distribution on your EP and album?

We put the EP out on Wasteland, a label which was basically created for us so we could go through Caroline. The album came out on Wasteland for two months, and then we went over to Radioactive, which is part of MCA and Uni, so at that point, our record was everywhere. Caroline did a great job and it got us into a lot of places that we wouldn't have been if we were on Radioactive/MCA. I mean, it wasn't so much about being an indie band, because we weren't out to fool anybody.

Did the success of "Believe" take you by surprise?

We had no idea this was gonna go to radio. We didn't think anything about radio or MTV. We weren't even going to do a video. We were going to save our money for tour support. But we did this video and MTV definitely changed things.

You had creative control over the video, too.

I co-directed it. We had barely enough money to do it and we ran out of film, so whatever we got, it was complete. If it looks good, it was complete luck. We were coming up with ideas the day of the shoot. I'm sure the record company wouldn't want to hear that.

How did you come to produce "Acid Eaters" for the Ramones?


We were labelmates, so that's how they heard our EP. The President of our label suggested it to Joey and Johnny and they were looking for somebody to come in that was kind of fresh. They'd worked with amazing, top-notch producers where the band started to sound like a big Ramones machine. Everything was starting to become too perfect, but if you listen to old Ramones records, they're not perfect and that's the beauty of the Ramones — it's punk-rock at its finest. So that's what I wanted to do.

I really like that raw approach to production.

I don't get too much into getting the perfect drum or guitar sound. It's like, if something's working, then we go with it. If it doesn't, well, you know, fuck it.

Since Dig has been so successful in such a short period of time, are you feeling any sort of backlash?

When you get to our level, you're kind of put on a table, where everybody starts dissecting you. We're at the stage right now where people are starting not to like us because maybe we're moving up a little too quickly. So it's kind of a weird place. And then we'll come out with our second album and we'll fit in and nestle into wherever we're supposed to be in this "world of music" and everything'll be fine! But yeah, it gets strange. And I personally start worrying about things like, "Oh God, what did we do here? Are we going over the top with this?" But one thing we know is, we're gonna make another album and that's important... to know you're actually gonna get a chance to record again.

Why did you name the record "Throwing Copper"?

CHAD TAYLOR: We went through millions of names. Some were horrible and pretentious and some were stupid. Everybody thinks it's throwing pennies or something in relation to the song "Waitress." But it's really like throwing lead from a gun, except it's throwing copper from a BB gun. Pat and Ed got these BB guns and they were saying, "I'm throwing coppers at you."

We wrote a body of music and didn't want to draw attention to just one song. We write albums, not singles. Just because "Selling The Drama" is the single, it doesn't make "White Discussion" less of a song. They hold equal ground and weight in the record and our minds and hopefully, in our listeners' minds.

Is "White Discussion" about the end of the world?


TAYLOR: It's hypothetical. For me, it's about, if we knew this was the end, what would you hang on to and what would you let go of? What are these fickle things we've attached ourselves to — guitars, lovers, houses, whatever you cherish. Do you take it with you? It's probably one of the most serious songs on the record. That's why we followed it up with "Horse," the least serious song.

We're four young guys. People get this goony view of our band, like we go around saying, "Oh, God, this is it." That's not the way we are. We're very happy. So we ended with "Horse," a light-hearted, cool country song. It makes the record like having sex. You have a climax and then afterward, you have "smoking the cigarette" music.

PATRICK DALHEIMER: I'm big into the country shit.

Most of the band's lyrics are philosophical. Does everyone in the band have the same philosophy?

TAYLOR: I identify a lot more with this record than "Mental

Jewelry," which was very anthem-like. Part of our earlier songs were us trying to get a record deal. We did all those rock band things and it seemed natural for us to play heavy-hitting, anthem-like songs like "You Are The World" and "Pieces Now." "Throwing Copper" is more intimate, with a more personal perspective — one-on-one and day-to-day, not me and the world.

DALHEIMER: We're on the same train of thought. I don't think any of us go off on the Krishnamurti kick as much as Ed does. Still, it's stuff that I have realized. I think about the things Ed has brought up through his readings.

TAYLOR: Pat and I express ourselves through our instruments while Ed does it with words. I would rather let Ed do the exploration and then just read his lyrics. Lyrics get to the point a lot faster than books. Poetry and books are fine, but I'm into songs. I relate much more to guitar players.

What kind of experience was going on your first national tour?

DALHEIMER: We got brain damage from an exhaust leak in the bus. We almost died from carbon monoxide poisoning.

TAYLOR: We named the bus "Evil," which is Live spelled backward. We scared the living hell out of old ladies. We started getting weird tastes in our mouths and everybody was tired and dizzy. Fortunately, when the bus is moving, there's always some air coming through. Live will never name a bus "Evil" again, though.

What do you like best about the music business?

TAYLOR: I like to tour and see different cities, but I get homesick. I'm out here with my buddies. We're in cities with parties thrown in our honor; I get to play guitar every night. But there's still something nagging at me that makes me wish we could sell a whole shit load of records and do the R.E.M. thing. ■

FOLLOWING MUSE

Time to get naked with Kristin

Hersh by Joan Tarshis

On her first solo release, "Hips And Makers" (Sire/Reprise), Throwing Muses' frontperson Kristin Hersh has allowed us a glimpse into the private letters of her life with a collection of songs that are seemingly so personal, one has to close one's eyes to listen. "Your God," the first single, features a much-acclaimed duet with Michael Stipe, a fact that almost buffeted the certainty that Hersh would have to hit the stage alone for the first time.

"Naked is exactly what it is," admits Hersh about her current performing experiences. "But you can be strong in that. At first, I would just take out my contacts so I couldn't see anybody and get very drunk. So I'd be blind and blind drunk." The talented singer/songwriter could also have used a pair of earplugs when she met up with a woman who can keep yacking — drunk, blind or dead... HITS' own tongue-flapping phenomenon, Joan "Wishes She Got Paid By The Word" Tarshis.

These songs sound extremely personal.

I made the demos for this record in the middle of the night. We'd put the babies to bed and go into this stable near our house. It was our photo album. And then both record companies wanted to put out those demos and I thought, "Ugh, it's not a real record... it's naked, it's my diary." I thought it was inappropriate for release because it's self-expression. Instead of the music talking, it seemed like me talking. And I think music you release to the public should be everybody's language, not just yours. But I made a real record out of it and it took only a couple of weeks. [Laughs] We went back into the stable and I didn't know what I was doing, so I did nothing really. I just played the songs and put a little percussion and cello here and there. When we were done with the album, I had to look at it and say, "Well, maybe my dorky life is universal. Maybe everybody has a dorky life."

How did you decide to go solo?

I didn't mean for this to be a solo album. I didn't even realize that's what I was doing. I usually work by myself until the band goes into rehearsal anyway. I didn't know it was going to be released as a real record, either — that they would write my name on the cover and stuff. But I was very interested in the physicality of playing acoustic guitars. I

always thought they were wimpy, that they were just pretty and provided a backdrop for sensitive poetry. But they're actually quite gutsy. Where I had always turned to amplifiers to make a sound raw, I did just the opposite and it worked incredibly. It's like banging on a tree. Muscles and air making sound... just the way our voices work. The instrument attracted some subtle, pretty songs and I wanted to put them down. I'm not very good at thinking ahead. I just do what the songs want me to and then I try to make sense of it after the fact.

When did you write "Your Ghosts"? In Scotland in the middle of the night. Songs kinda come whenever they want. Usually, I can't shut them up when I want to sleep. So I had been up all night with the boys in the band and the roadies and I decided to be a grown-up and stay up with the managers, drinking whiskey in a Scottish bar. I had never done that before. So we were up until 4:00 AM and when I went upstairs, I was just burning and pacing and I couldn't sleep. I threw open the windows and this huge moon came shining in, as goofy as it sounds. Well, I'm not one to start thinking, "I must write a song. I'm an artist with a capital A." Actually I just thought, "I'm never going to drink whiskey again." But I grabbed some stationery and wrote down all the words to "Your Ghost" and

what I thought the chords would be. And when it was done, I shut the windows and cooled down. It's simple without being simplistic.

My songs aren't usually that specific. I believe your life's experiences make chemicals in your body that have to match the chemicals in the song so that the song can almost inject you with something that feels like a color or chemical shooting through you and only then do you qualify as the singer of that song. My life experience plays a huge part in these songs, but I don't think they're stories about me. Everybody I've ever lost is in that song.

How would you describe "Song"?

I'm confused about what songs actually are because they hit me really hard when they come. I don't think they have anything to do with my feelings at all. I can be upset and write a happy song about highs I don't even understand because the songs have to say things that are independent of me.

Who are "They"?

There are songs everywhere. People think I'm from another planet. You go and have some babies and then tell me what's crazy. I don't know how to make a fingernail and my children have 20 perfect fingernails. I don't plan what comes out of their mouths, even though I made their lips. Even though I can't make lips. That's crazy.

hat can one expect from a female duo that names itself after an Irish goblin who appears charming, but then turns nasty? Certainly something more than two 22 year-old folkies singing about sweetness and light. And this wisdom beyond their years characterizes Natasha Jones and Sharon Lewis' self-titled debut album on Elektra, "Pooka."

Hailing from the North London area. where they share a flat with a young Frenchman, Jones and Lewis found the perfect setting for their debut U.S. performance in Sin-é, a small coffeehouse in the East Village. Sharon — dressed in a flannel shirt and big Eighth St. style combat boots - leaned on the stronger but more plaintive Natasha — wearing a Mexican drawstring pullover shirt - throughout the set, looking and smiling at her as if for reassurance. Admittedly nervous, the pair's remarks were punctuated by apologies of "We're shy" from Sharon to "We're not very professional" by Natasha when she introduced the group to the audience. But, as they picked up on the partisan crowd's warm and supportive response, Pooka shed their innocence and got into what they do best: singing their songs of unrequited love, the transient nature of relationships, love, pride, guilt and compromise.

The magic playfulness of Pooka's stage presence and lyrics was further marked by a charming sincerity in person the next day at Elektra headquarters. Leave it to these young dervishes to turn the tables on HITS' hapless correspondent Janet "Who's Roy" Trakin, who usually listens to other people's lives rather than talk about her own.

How did you meet and how long have you been together?

SHARON: We met at a club in Manchester. I was playing in a band and Natasha was playing on her own. She was doing her own songs and I was doing mine. We were

performing open mic spots at this club, where you go up and do a couple of songs. I went up to her afterwards and told her I liked her songs. We both got our A-level exams that day, so we had a lot in common. We both did art. We've only known each other for three years, and we've been together as a band for two years.

Who writes the music and who writes the words?

NATASHA: Both of us write the music and the words. It depends on the song whether we start writing together or separately. SHARON: The more personal songs are written separately, but the ones that are funny and quirky we write together. Something that is personal you can't really write with someone else.

Who were your influences?

NATASHA: I don't really have any influences. It's more about life inspiring us. SHARON: We don't want to sound like this person or that person. You can be influenced by the sound of traffic or a bad experience can give you an idea for a song. How did you get signed?

SHARON: We didn't really shop around tapes. We had a sort of naive attitude... positive and innocent. We took our guitars to London and thought we'd just go there to play and someone would like it. Luckily, they did.

NATASHA: People have the attitude that it isn't easy and they tell you you'll never get a record deal. But we were determined to get a record deal. It's an attitude that people respect and that's why you get signed - because you're so determined.

Were you intimidated by the industry crowd at Sin-é, where you played for the first time in the States?

SHARON: Yes, it wasn't a normal gig. Usually, people are really casual, talking and chatting during the set. But people were really tense last night. We weren't that relaxed. When we're relaxed, we play better, we laugh. It was also early, and we did a

short set. We would have liked to do a longer set where people could see us having fun.

Do you ever play electric?

SHARON: We bought electric guitars. We really like playing them, but for the time being, we're going to stick with acoustic. NATASHA: We have a hunger to experiment. We're dying to use any instrument, not just electric guitars. At the moment, the acoustic guitar is what we've learned to play, and it's the most convenient for this album.

In the song "The Car," you sing about the relationship between pride and love. Do you think that pride is necessarily an important thing when it comes to relationships?

SHARON: You generally need a bit of pride in life. You don't want to be too proud, but that song is also about forgiveness. I'm not saying let people walk all over you, but if there's something or someone you love and it's just because of your pride that you don't want to be with them, then that's not good. If you really love someone, you have to forgive them. You can't listen to the crowd and the gossip to decide what you want to do.


In "Boomerang," there's a great deal of female sexual imagery.

SHARON: I wrote that for a man I was in love with at the time. I don't know how sexual I meant it to be. I meant it to be quite warm and affectionate. Maybe those images were subconscious.

Will you come back here for a proper tour? NATASHA: We're coming back to America in the spring. We really enjoy playing and meeting new people, so that will be an important time in our career. The thing I like about playing for people I don't know is that you can reveal things about yourself that you can't reveal in front of people you do know. It's quite a perverse idea, but we get a kick out of it.

SHARON: The thing about touring is that you have to talk to the people you're playing for. If you just go back to your hotel room after a show, you can get really

dejected from it all.

here was a somber mood at the Smithereens' college press conference on April 8 as word of Kurt Cobain's suicide spread through the music industry and the world. Local students with tape recorders in hand gathered at RCA's midtown offices to hear the Smithereens promote their fifth album (and first for the label), "A Date With The Smithereens," instead sought answers from the group and pondered whether they were in the right business. With songs like "Seattle," where they poke fun at the banality of the scene, and having been mentioned in the same breath as the Beatles by Cobain as an inspiration for Nirvana's "Nevermind," the Smithereens were in the uncomfortable position of being the spokesmen for a new generation in many ways they helped spawn.

The veteran group of 14 years — singer/songwriter/guitarist Pat DiNizio, guitarist Jim Babjak, percussionist Dennis Diken and bassist Mike Mesaros — are still playing basic, driving songs with the emotional force of Pat's voice behind them. Purists at heart, the group has reunited with Don Dixon, who produced their earlier album "Especially For You" back in 1985. They even got the legendary Lou Reed to play on two songs, "Long Way Back Again" and "Point Of No Return." HITS' East Coast Trakin, Janet, whose memory doesn't go back that far, got the special opportunity to chat with the warm and hip-hop capped DiNizio in private while dying to see what was underneath the hat.

Do you think Kurt Cobain's suicide is an example of an artist who took rock & roll too seriously?

I never knew him, so I can't comment on that specifically. His suicide is certainly a sign of the times. John Lennon gets assassinated in 1980 and becomes a martyr, and conversely Kurt Cobain takes his own life in 1994 and he's become a martyr. It's sort of reflective of a different era. I don't think something like that would have been taken quite the way it's being taken these days. I can't presume to judge what he did

soon. Perhaps in his own mind.

What effect does it have on a band to be dropped from its label, as you were by Capitol?

It took just three weeks from the day we were dropped to be signed by RCA. Getting let go by Capitol was the logical end to the relationship, a change in regime. The so-called "grunge" youth movement came to the fore, and it made a band like us, who were steeped in the pop song tradition, seem a bit passé, but there was never any doubt that we would continue to do what we were doing.

How do you account for the band's longevity?

The fact that there was a history that actually predated the band's formation is one factor. The fact that the other three members of the band grew up together and learned to play their instruments together helped. There was a long-standing and long-lasting friendship that existed before we even started, which enabled us to transcend the problems that usually break up bands. We shared a common musical vision from the very first time we sat down and played our instruments.

How did you hook up with Lou Reed?

Back in 1986, we met him when we were the opening band for his "Mistrial" tour and we stayed in touch over the years. While we were recording, Lou called to wish us well. He mentioned that if we needed a guitar player, we should call him. As luck would have it, during the recording of one of the songs, "A Point Of No Return," we were having difficulty with a guitar solo. I called Lou and said, "Come down and give it a shot." He ended up playing on two of the songs. He was probably bored, being in between projects. His solos fit perfectly in the context of our material, a very odd and wonderful collaboration.

Even though you're happily married, there's a tone of loneliness and alienation in "War For My Mind."

That's a real reflection of my inner life at the time. Being married doesn't necessarily equal happiness. "War For My Mind" is about the emotion of growing up and dealing with things that are status quo in society. Like if you're a certain age and you're not married with children and all that goes with it, there might be something wrong with you. You might be perceived by those who are close to you with more traditional values as being a bit odd. It was mirrored by my coming to terms with being married, having a child and still having a question mark.

What groups reflect the Smithereens' taste in music?

The groups we admire and listen to sound nothing like us. The Stranglers were our all-time favorite band, the only group in recent memory that stylistically and musically changed from album to album much like Stanley Kubrick changed from film to film. One of my favorite bands ever was Husker Du. There's nothing that these so-called "alternative" bands do today that holds a candle to the records from that era.

Why did you return to Don Dixon?

I thought we were falling into certain work techniques and methods that were counter-productive to our music. All we ever wanted was to be a garage band. I think that was captured on our first few records. There were certain experiments we tried on the last record that were misguided, even though we thought they were honorable. We felt the need to go back to our roots to reinvent ourselves and become the four-piece New Jersey garage band we always were live. We finally had enough time in the studio with Don under our belts to know specifically what we wanted and how to get it.

RADIO: Leave well enough alone! Jingles and produced stagings are designed to stand alone, generally. So, no talk is required unless, of course, your PD instructs otherwise. Jingles and stagings are "fanfare" intros usually preceding familiar hit music requiring no further introduction. Talking behind them can diminish their effect. It's as important to know when not to talk as to know when. To overdo anything in a given moment on-air is to irritate certain listeners. Most likely, whatever you just did will be repeated within an hour or two anyway. Have confidence that your produced material will do its job, or work on new material that will do the job. But by all means, keep it simple. Later.



Would Epitaph, whose roster also boasts the currently buzzing Pennywise, consider an alignment with a major? Doubtful. But it isn't entirely out of the realm of possibility




