

the 2* spot this week and grabbing #2 Phones. STP's "Unglued" makes another upward move this week, landing at 4*. Three extra-large jumps this week come from Columbia's Alice In Chains, with 13-6* move, Atlantic's Collective Soul, with a 29-13* move, and A&M's Extreme, whose "Hip" track leaps from 30-16*. Lots of big debuts this week, with Tom Petty checking in at 21*, Nirvana logging the 24* slot, The Black Crowes falling in right behind at 25*, newcomers Bush nabbing the 27* spot and Texas metal aces Pantera entering the chart at 28*. The Most Added list shapes up with Bush grabbing the #1 prize, with the Stone Roses hitting #2 and Aerosmith at #3.

Geffen's Gross

Geffen Records earned a record \$505 million in worldwide grosses for 1994, with only 33 new titles released domestically and 24 internationally. That'll buy President Eddie Rosenblatt an awful lot of tennis balls.

The total was headed by chart-topping "Unplugged" albums from the Eagles and Nirvana, which had sold four and three million albums, respectively, by the end of the year. Aerosmith's "Big Ones" greatest hits record went double platinum.

But the label's real strength resided in breaking new artists, which it did spectacularly with Counting Crows, whose debut album sold five million copies as the fourth-biggest seller of '94. Weezer's self-titled debut has earned platinum while label bows by Beck and Hole both sold over half a million, earning critical raves in the process. The label also had four long-form video hits from Nirvana, Aerosmith, the Eagles and Peter Gabriel.

1995 promises more from such touted newcomers as Veruca Salt, Stone Roses, Slash, White Zombie, Lisa Loeb, Elastica and new rap acts The Roots and Genius.

Commented David Geffen: "Hey Jeffrey, Steven, do either of you have change for a \$10 million dollar bill?"

ot even the thought that the '97 ceremony would be held in Cleveland could cast a pall over the tenth annual Rock & Roll Hall of Fame induction ceremonies held last Thursday (12) at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City.

Highlights of the event, which was taped by MTV to air for the first-time ever last Wednesday night (18), included a Led Zeppelin reunion, a raucous set by honoree Neil Young and Crazy Horse and a duet between inductee Al Green and Willie Nelson, Iimmy Page and Robert Plant were joined by bassist John Paul Jones (the three sat at separate tables, by the way) and drummer Jason Bonham (son of the late band's John Bonham), as well as Aerosmith's Steve Tyler, bandmate Joe Perry and fellow inductee Young for a medley of "When the Levee Breaks" and "For What It's Worth." Young and Crazy Horse, along with members of Pearl Jam (including Eddie Vedder, who inducted the legendary singer/songwriter), played a grungey "F***in' Up," while the evening climaxed with a full-out jam on Martha & the Vandella's "Dancing In The Streets" as B-52's members Fred Schneider and Kate Pierson as well as Natalie Merchant did the mashed potato.

The induction speeches boasted several classic sound bites, such as Vedder thanking the "smart aleck" who seated his band next to the Ticketmaster table and threatening to start a food fight. Lou Reed, on hand with current love interest Laurie Anderson, inducted Zappa by calling him "a force for reason and honesty in a business deficit in these areas" while Melissa Etheridge thanked Janis Joplin "for traveling down the road carrying the ball and chain and... giving us a piece of her heart." Soul great Green sang an uplifting "Take Me To The River" and said of his induction: "I don't know about all the greatness. I would just like to keep on keeping on. How about that?" He then hocked a loogie in Robert Christgau's cream of mushroom soup.

Hall of Fame principals Ahmet Ertegun, Seymour Stein and Jann Wenner were also in high spirits, announcing the imminent fall opening of the \$92 million I.M. Pei-designed Museum in Cleveland, where the '97 ceremony is already slated to take place. Dress warm, folks.




SURVIVING 1995: 1994 was another double-digit growth year for radio revenues, and this year looks to be financially solid as well. Several major recorded music companies set new record highs last year. The future's so bright, we gotta wear shades, right? Well, potentially, but only if you're ready to adapt to the reality that this business has become for 1995 and beyond. The face of the way we do business has had some reconstructive surgery over the past 24 to 36 months. The future is here now. Are you ready to deal with it? 5 TRENDS FOR THE NEW YEAR: 1) If you're a radio programmer who has a solid track record in Top 40, the coming upticks in that format will bode you well. However, if you have no experience or understanding of other formats, now is the time to learn. Duopolies and a certain further expansion of ownership rules will create fewer jobs for programmers and those who have the knowledge and capacity to handle multi-formats simultaneously will be the most valuable to the radio owner of the new era. 2) You may want to learn as much as you can about Adult Album Alternative or Adult Post Modern, Alternative/Modern Rock and '70s/Arrow-type formats. These are clearly the three areas where major growth is coming in the near future. What long-term potential there is in these formats has yet to be proven, but there's enough fire right now to smoke a lot of operators into moving into these greener pastures. Bone up on Lyle Lovett, Peter Himmelman, Weezer, Pearl Jam, Fleetwood Mac and Seals & Crofts before it's too late. 3) Top 40 will begin to grow and prosper again, as more Core Artists develop for the format. Right now, Top 40 is still playing the best of everyone else's music (as they always must do), but when Top 40 has its own artists is when they kick in bigtime. 4) Record companies are still chasing too many records that evoke no passion, but "test well" with mainstream audiences.

Radio stations are still playing too many of these same records. The sooner the labels stop throwing good money after bad on these projects (they just plain don't sell) and the sooner radio refuses to inundate their listeners with this pablum, the better we'll all be. 5) Broadcasters who do well in this new environment will realize that they are in the service business. Listeners and advertisers alike must be super-served by a product that is backed with a full-blown customer service program. Other businesses are way too good at this already. People won't shop where they can't get superior service anymore, and that includes your spot on the dial. This is one area where radio can seize the moment and really outshine all other media. We are the last personal medium, and must stay intensely so if we're to be vital now and in the future. New and developing technologies are important to radio, but not at the expense of the product and the service. It won't really do you much good to have online, interactive loyal-listener clubs, data bases and the like if you don't have a high-demand/userfriendly product. 6) OK, so I lied. The record companies will sink more time, people and dollars than ever before into the area called Artist Development. This can only benefit radio greatly. Hit records are not so much the goal anymore. Hit artists are where the money is. And we all know the Japanese, Germans and Dutch are very interested in where the money is.





Hancing THE STREET

ong a reclusive, press-shy figure, Motown founder Berry Gordy has been entertaining the media at his Bel-Air estate to discuss his new tome, "To Be Loved, The Music, The Magic, The Memories of Motown: An Autobiography" (Warner Books) and companion cassette (Warner Audiobooks). Greeted at the door by longtime Gordy confidant and former Motown President Ewert Abner, I was led into Gordy's living room, where

vintage black and white photos on the wall featured Berry with all the Motown stars as well as the likes of Muhammad Ali, Jim Brown, Stevie Wonder, Frank Sinatra and even President Clinton. Looking healthy and happy, Gortly is an engaging story teller who is not — contrary to popular opinion — guarded in his answers to questions, and we got a chance to ask about all the Motown lore we always wanted to know.

Born in 1929 in Detroit, Gordy went through many career phases before founding Motown. He was a pro boxer, served in the Korean War from 1951-'53, then worked on the assembly line of the Lincoln-Mercury auto plant and opened a record store before turning to his first love — songwriting. An inductee of the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame and a recipient of the

Songwriters' Hall of Fame Abe Olman Publisher Award, Gordy will have his own legacy as an artist celebrated by this month's release of the 13-track "The Music, The Magic, The Memories of Motown: A Tribute to Berry Gordy," featuring Diana Ross, Smokey Robinson, the Temptations, the Four Tops and Shanice, among others, performing songs Gordy wrote himself.

The one-hour interview proceeded like a hundred-yard dash, as HITS' resident "Belly Up To The" bard Harvey Robert "Rubik's" Kubernik tried to squeeze as much into his allotted time as possible until the beleaquered Gordy escaped by crawling out the bathroom window of his own mansion.

Why did you write "To Be Loved"?

Several reasons. I wrote it, first of all, to set the record straight. I also wrote it because there were many unsung heroes in my company that were part of this operation, who were not known and who taught the artists how to walk, sing, dance, talk, even eat. These people have been with me 25-30 years and spent so much of their time and their life, really, working with these artists.

I also wanted to tell my story in my own words. Because, so often, I have wanted to read about my heroes... Martin Luther King, Jackie Robinson, J.F.K., Sugar Ray Robinson, Joe Louis... in their own words. Because when others write about you, they write about what they think you did. And it's nothing like writing your own story about not only what you


did but how you felt doing it, and more importantly, why you did what you did at that particular time. And that's what I tried to do.

In terms of setting the record straight, I felt I owed it to the people who have been following me for 35 years and believed in me and Motown, no matter what they had heard or read in the papers. Whether I like it or not, I'm a role model. I wanted young people to know that a company like Motown and its music couldn't have been created through devious means... being in the Mafia, cheating artists and all that garbage. And that's why I wrote it. It took so long because I didn't have the time before. I was busy building my dream, going for a vision, trying to focus on what we were doing.

In the book, you acknowledge how popular Motown was in Europe and especially,

The U.K. is very, very special to me. I think we were actually more popular over there than we were in our own country for what seemed like a long time. I loved the creativity they showed with our album covers and

[Laughs] "Tears Of A Clown" went to #1 in England and we hadn't



here. And when the Beatles' second album had three of our songs ["Money," "You've Really Got A Hold On Me" and "Please Mr. Postman"], it iust indicated to us that they obviously had been listening to our music and were aware of it, enjoying it and loving it. That's always

even released it

been very important to me.

You still own Jobete Music, a publishing catalog you've said you want to develop for emerging areas like TV, movies, interactive, commercials, multi-media, etc.

We don't know about the so-called super-highway, but whatever highway it is, we'll be on it somewhere. We're creative people and we love the business. Now that I've backed away from the record company side of it, I'm not racing so much. Now, it's simply, we've got the music. My son [Berry IV] and a few other people are really working it and I can now kind of reflect on what really makes me happy. It has made me happy to do this tour. I didn't think it was going to be this way.

When I started it, it was meant to be work and to get the book out. The publisher said, "We'll make it as light on you as possible." And now they're shocked because I've increased it.

It has been fun visiting the radio stations again. The level of respect when I heard about what Motown had done for their lives... when they got married, when they had kids... I had no idea.

It was a new experience for me. I've always been behind the scenes, so after 35 years, I was out there spewing all these great feelings and I realized, if anything had been missing in that time, that was it. Being out there with the people who were really the foundation of the company.

How do you feel not being directly involved in the record industry?

Great relief because the business has changed. My style of entrepreneurship wasn't fun anymore. I was too immersed in it and leaving was a major relief because I wanted Motown to live on. I wanted the legacy to go forward. That's why I continued to consult with Jheryl Busby when the company wanted to get out of their distribution deal with MCA and go to PolyGram. It was Jheryl who eventually made that decision to go and I was thrilled when they were able to see the real value of the company. Because it justified the legacy. Money has never been the main thing for me. It's the legacy that was important.

It was interesting to me to read about the Black Forum spoken word label you had at Motown, where people like Dr. Martin Luther King, Stokely Carmichael and Imamu Amiri Baraka, among others, were given a forum.

I put out several things by Dr. King, including "The Great March To Freedom" in Washington and probably the biggest, "I Have A Dream." Back in the '60s, there was a great deal of civil unrest and various people who had things to say. I was very closely connected to Dr. King... he taught me the wisdom of non-violence. As I said in the book, I was never a turn-the-other-cheek kind of guy. I just wasn't brought up that way. You just don't do that in the inner city. While we were victims, others were victims, too. White people were victims when they let their prejudices hold them back. To me, white was white. I didn't know from Jews, Italians, Greeks, Irish and so forth. Someone like [producer] George Goldner may have been white, but he had so much feeling and rhythm. He knew music. It didn't matter what color he was.

Life is not nearly as complicated as people make it. We got to get back to basic values. Two and two is four. Everyone wants the same things — happiness, peace, love. Each one of us is different, though, and I tell artists, "Bring out your own uniqueness." That's why you'll get your Stevie Wonder, your Marvin Gaye, your Smokey Robinson. You've got to

nurture that genius. If I was a genius of anything, it was bringing out the genius of others, because if they reach their potential, then I had felt that maybe I could reach mine. 99% of the people running around out there now with this great talent will never make it through this whole cycle of success. If you make it through the fame, fortune and power and you are not the same person you were when you started out, then you have been a failure.

I noticed in the book how you took the traditional connotations of words like "Boy," "Clan" and "Black" and turned them into positive, creative expressions by returning them to their root sources.

You've studied the book. No one on this tour has brought that out yet. And there are so many of those kinds of subtle things in there. I believe the source of many of the problems that are happening in the world today

is semantics. It's the meaning and the connotations that people put on words and that's why Diana [Ross] and I still call each other black. After a short while the meaning had changed and it meant affection, pride, love... I talked to Diana on the phone just yesterday. "Hi Black." "Hi Black."

I'm enjoying the fact you're getting these nuances, and hopefully, one of the things about our records is that they have a lot of nuances, too... that's what gives them legs. People hear it the first time and they don't get all the

words, but they like it, they dance to it and they want to listen to it again... they get something from it. You are bringing out the second layer of the culture.

I tell people this is not just about the music, singing and dancing, though. It's about life and how to make this a better world. That's why I want the young people to know this beautiful company was built by a lot of different principles, not just being a great artist or a great singer. Raw talent alone is not enough. You've got to have philosophies to go with it, and you've got to stop people from hurting themselves or other people unnecessarily.

Why did you move Motown to L.A. in the early '70s?

The movies and broadening my base. I'd been out here a few times and just loved the weather, but that was a secondary factor. But I was really

tired of the heavy change in the winter, getting out and digging your car out of the snow.

Let's talk about the artists. Smokey Rohinson.

My first impression was he was a great, great poet, but he didn't know how to really write songs or put songs together. When he learned how to put that stuff together, Smokey was incredible. When I turned down those first 100 songs, he got more excited with every song. And I said, "This guy has to be either crazy or one of the most special people I'll ever meet."

The Four Tops.

The epitome of loyalty, integrity and class. They've

been together for 40 years. is unheard of. I admire them the most of any of the artists.

The Temptations.

Legends. They've managed to keep their look and their style all these years and

Because they are legends, people want to be with the Temptations and they have proven that the group is stronger than any of its parts. The Temptations are an institution.

Diana Ross.

Special, magic, sensitive. When she does a song like "Somewhere" from "West Side Story" in front of an audience, she still cries. I mean, I've never seen her do the song without crying. In fact, we used to stop her from doing it every night of the week. She was so dramatic and then she did the second ending and it was too much on her emotionally. She gives all to her audience and is sincere and serious about it.

Marvin Gaye.

The truest artist I've ever known... whatever he was going through in his life he put on records. So if you want to know Marvin, just listen to one of his records

Stevie Wonder.

The most innovative person I've known. But also unique with his quality. He was as close to a genius, which is a word I don't like to use

for any of them because, ya know, Marvin could have been a genius, too. I don't like to throw it around, but Stevie was one of those kind of special, special, special people who had a sound and was extremely quick.

Michael Jackson.

Greatest entertainer in the world and one of the smartest people and businessmen in the world. He conducted his own career basically. He knows what he wanted. And from nine years of age, he was a thinker. I called him "Little Spongy" because he was a sponge and learned from everybody. He not only studied me, but he studied James Brown, Jackie Wilson, Marcel

Holland/Dozier/Holland.

Phenomenal. Absolutely brilliant. The three of them were different and they all complemented each other. Eddie did mostly vocals, Brian I always thought was the most talented, creative person. He was my protégé for many years. I thought Lamont was also a good writer, and he was good on

backgrounds. Brian would start off by coming up with a line like "Sugar pie (honey bunch)," then just pass it on to the next one. They had their own assembly line. And they were tremendous.

Norman Whitfield.

Probably the most underrated of all of the producers. Because he was producing himself. And he would deal with different sounds, different beats, change with the times and write his stuff. Barrett Strong worked with him as a writer on many of his things. Norman was innovative and he had fire. And a different kind of style. He could go from "Cloud Nine" to "Psychedelic Shack" to "Papa Was A Rolling Stone" to "Just My Imagination." Then he'd come right back with "War" and "Ain't Too Proud To Beg." He could take one chord on a song like "Papa Was A Rolling Stone" and do all these different beautiful melodies with it that many people could not really imagine he was doin'. He did it all by himself. He would work with the five guys in

> the Temps and change the for the right song, ya know, and he'd utilize all five of those leads in a way that was just incredible.

This is not just about the music, leads on each one. The would pick the right lead for the right song, va know, tones and his voice SINGING AND DANCING.... It's about life and how to make this a better world."

Stone Roses, "Second Coming" (Geffen): Yeah, so it's been roughly five years since they last graced us with their sonic presence. And sure, calling your sophomore release "Second Coming" is perhaps verging on the immodest, but what the hell? This album is worth every nano-second S.R. lovers spent suffering

through all the psych/pop pretenders in between just for the single, "Love Spreads," and the groovy, lusty good times of "Your Star Will Shine". So, we'll forgive these nutty Brits their trespasses. This time. (JF)

Throwing Muses, "University" (Sire/Reprise): Their eleventh and most commercial record will hopefuly move the Muses (now a trio) from underground heroes to mainstream stars in much the same manner "Last Splash" did the Breeders. This record is their strongest outing in a while and the band loses nothing in



the tilt towards a more traditional, verse-chorus-verse sound. "That's All You Wanted" and the first single, "Bright Yellow Gun," are cranky and smart, and Kristen Hersh is, as always, a force to be reckoned with. (Allison Stewart)



The Nields, "Bob On The Ceiling" (Performance Group): It's rare that a band unattached to any record label should come up with a record so finely tailored to the current needs of radio. Hooky songwriting, inventive harmonies and clever lyrics guarantee a certain amount of salivating from PoMo programmers, especially when hearing tracks like the

irresistible "Nice To Me" or the Cranberries-flavored vocals on "James." These New England natives have taken their strong folk/pop base, plugged in some tasty guitar licks and come up with an album to keep you humming all day long. (Julia Trainor)

Zumpano, "Look What The Rookie Did" (Sub Pop): Having dissolved their previous band, Glee, because the music was "artistically impure", percussionist Jason Zumpano and guitarist Michael Ledwidge then did some recruiting and formed the remarkably pure Zumpano. Pure, that is, if you consider the Zombies, Burt Bacharach and Hal David, and Pet Sounds consummate. Who



doesn't? Pop music that is both reeling and precise abounds here, all mixed up with crumbs of noise and general strangeness. If it sounds like a questionable blend, it is. That's exactly what's so appealing about Zumpano. You never know what's coming next, and it's good to the last song. (Anthony Hayes)



The JAMS Interview

EVERYTHING'S COMING UP ROSAS

n our futile search for the reason Northern Michigan is such a breeding ground for music industry movers (James Alexander, Kris McLendon), we rap with another major Michigan product, EMI Records' VP R&B Promotion, Dave Rosas. Kermit Crockett, who was then PD at WWWS (now WTLZ), gave Rosas his start in radio in his hometown, Saginaw, Ml. He stayed from 1981 until 1987 when he was hired by Virgin Records VP R&B Promotion Sharon Heyward to work as a local rep in Michigan. A year later, Rosas moved to Chicago to head Virgin's midwest division. Six months later, he became Co-National and moved to Los Angeles, In 1992, Rosas moved to EMI as its National Director of Black Music Promotion, eventually succeeding the departed Glynice Coleman in 1994. He considered departing, too, shortly after suffering through this interview with JAMS' twin towers Jerry Boulding and Kandace Taylor.

You had your first crossover smash with Soul II Soul's "Keep On Movin'" in 1988.

Right, and that was followed by Paula Abdul ("Straight Up," Opposites Attract") and After 7 ("Can't Stop"). Then we got EU ("Da Butt") out of Washington.

After that, you moved to New York and were promoted from Co-National to National Director of Promotion at Virgin.

Fast forward to 1992. There were budget cuts at Virgin, Sharon resigned and I took some time off. I wound up at EMI Records, headed by two people I really respected, Glynice Coleman and Daniel Glass. Eventually, both left EMI and in December of 1994, I became VP. What was EMI like when you joined the company?

Other than Arrested Development, we didn't have a lot of great product. I found a track by Eternal called "Stay," which went Top 10. We also had Gangstarr's "Mass Appeal" go Top 10.

There seems to be a serious problem in Urban Radio, particularly Urban Adult, in that they don't play enough currents. Do you agree?

I do agree. Many of them don't keep their playlists fresh, and it makes a difference. The perception is that the station has gone stale. That's dangerous today, especially with all the Churbans, duopolies and mergers. PDs and MDs don't want to take any chances. There is a "show me" mode. Nobody uses their guts anymore. These guys have got to start listening to music. Who are some of the PDs and MDs around the country that you respect?

Let's start with Doc Wynter and Chuck Atkins at KMJM in St.
Louis. Steve Hegwood and
Frankie Darcell at WJLB in
Detroit. There's a newcomer, Helen
Little, MD here in New York at
WBLS, who shows great potential.
Steve Crumbley has done a job in
Norfolk at WOWI. James T and
Jerry Rushen at WEDR in
Miami... There are so many.
Dave, you represent Chrysalis,
SBK, Pendulum as well as EMI
artists. Let's look at some upcoming projects.



for the Audience

Part Three: "Keep The Change"

Check it out. Both the ratings and the trends are down, quarterly revenues are off, margins are squeezed and everybody is feeling the pressure. The pressure begins with the GM, who fears losing face, year-end performance bonuses and possibly his/her job. Frustration and anger prevail.

As soon as the GM gets it, he calls in the sales manager and the PD so he/she can transfer some of the heat. The PD squirms and tries to explain why the ratings are down, but to no avail. The GM is breathing fire and roars, "I want results not excuses!" The PD and sales manager both leave the GM's office shaken, frustrated and angered.

Naturally, they both call emergency meetings, so that the heat can be transferred. Now the PD says, "Yo, gigs on the line, ratings have got to improve or somebody, maybe everybody, is going to go! You have got to arrange to change." So everybody adjusts to the pressure and heat because nobody wants to leave. Nobody wants a change... right? No, some changes are necessary. Change may be inevitable for career development. So before you say "Take this gig and shove it," or, "Keep the change," think about it for a moment. It always helps to take things in order.

As a format and an industry, Urban radio has come a long way. Yes, there's still a long way to go. To be seen as a industry that would serve our new audience's ever-growing, every-changing needs, urban radio has to keep up.

Generation X Changes

Recent studies have shown, despite stories to the contrary, many in our target audience are acquiring more education, going to school in greater numbers and staying in school longer. They, too, are part of the new "Black Generation X." The "Black Generation X." may be on fairly tight budgets, but they're willing to spend big bucks on items that meet their needs – such as fresh foods, entertainment – which includes music, movies and concerts. They may not all live in cities, but they overwhelmingly live in metropolitan areas. Perhaps most important, they're short on time. The average African-American member of the "Generation X Club" had 3.7 free hours a day in 1994, down from 4.75 hours in 1985, according to the Rand Corporation's Population Research Center.

The key to turning these demographic changes into listeners lies in understanding how various factors fit together to create or expand audience. Does this mean we've made such significant progress that we should feel satisfied? No way. And certainly this does not mean that we're more satisfied with the efforts of government. Nor does it mean that there is no hostility to those government programs which have failed.

What is significant is that those who listen to our radio stations and buy the jams we jam, have a lot of changing, growing, different and often conflicting interests. Those who went into unions 15 years ago have different notions about seniority than those who have just managed to get in. Black entrepreneurs are more concerned about such things as capital gains. The views of minority bankers on interest rates are likely to be very different from those of minority borrowers or civil rights organizations. The issues that concern the "Black Generation X" often transcend race.

Knife Support System

Why, you might ask, is it important for an urban music station to be involved with issues like these? After all, isn't the music the main reason folks frequent our frequencies? Yes, but there's a little change called image that's involved here. Urban stations, like other similarly formatted stations, profit by carving a niche in their listeners' and advertisers' minds. Once this is done, it's nearly impossible for a competitor to co-opt it from you.

It goes without saying that the public is far better served by having their favorite music station keep them fully informed so they don't have to change stations to get information (like sports scores) your research shows is important to them. Recent studies we've participated in have shown that black males are bummed out because they have to switch stations to find out what their favorite sports teams and players have done.

In our view, a unique-sounding, full-service station is likely to attract a more specialized adult audience segment. Isn't that what owners, managers and agencies really want? Yeah, right! Is that why they put us through so many changes? Next time you do auditorium tests or focus studies, see what kind of feedback you get from the adults when asked what they want besides their own personal favorite hit songs.

You know you've got to keep your station sharp, whether you're the program director, music director, air-talent, news person or manager. The bottom line is an approach that will enable you to use a particular format's commonly accepted musical parameters. Perhaps it is taking a bit of a chance, taking on new responsibilities with issues and talk segments and involvement elements.

It's not taking as much of a chance as you might think. You're going to do some public affairs programming anyhow, so why not make it meaningful? If no one had ever taken a chance, there would be no new urban formats. If no one had agreed to try some of the innovative things that have worked with urban-formatted stations and simply said, "Show me where it's already working or has worked," we might still be doing what we were doing ten years ago. [In some cases, we still are]. We could still be doing "me-too" formats, and failing.

Tomorrow and the day after will bring many changes with it and it will be here sooner than we think. With it will come many new questions which will have to be answered. The future is a reality that must be prepared for by all who want to be part of it. And, somehow, it has little feeling or patience for those who are not prepared.

Knowledge is perhaps the most important item that we can acquire and then pass on. Growth and changes are continuous and ongoing. Our growth must match that of the cities in which our stations are located. Many cities have grown so fast that their outskirts no longer cover their extremities.



ORPHEUS aka JUST 'O': Would you be a nervous wreck if you had to read this swamp doo-doo every week? Not if you're Just O, Nervous/Wreck Records' National Director of Urban Music. For the past eight months, this young man has deftly handled the workings of Black Moon, Smif-N-Wessun and Funkmaster Flex. A 1991 grad in telecommunications from Cayuga College, Just O began his career at the college's WDWN-FM and produced and directed a video show called "Straight Off



The Street." Upon graduation, he interned for a hot second at WOLF-AM/Syracuse, and then at Fox affiliate Channel 68 for six months. Just O



later did independent promotion, working, among others. Snoop Doggy Dogg, Queen Latifah and Das EFX. He then worked video promotion for Hippoh Records/Hit U Off Mgmt. Pet peeve: "Everybody trying to be so real, they're fake." SHOUT-OUTS: Rob Stone, Kevin Weeks, Bobbito and the memory of his brother Douglas Faison. Peace out!

When Guy blazed onto the music scene in 1988, there seemed to be limitless possibilities for the group. In one convenient package, you had super singers in brothers Aaron and Damian Hall and one incredibly talented producer in Teddy Riley. "Teddy's Jam," "Let's Chill," "My Fantasy" and "Wanna Get With You" were the tip of



the group's considerable iceberg. But like the supernova they were — poof! — Guy burned out. Ego clashes, fights, even a death on the road, were simply too much to sustain the group past their second, brilliant "The Future" album.

What to do, what to do?... For Teddy Riley, fame as a songwriter/producer for the likes of Michael Jackson, Bobby Brown, Wreckx 'N Effect, Heavy D & the Boyz, Johnny Kemp, Boy George and Keith Sweat guaranteed him a solid income for years to come. A move to Virginia Beach to produce acts and music for his Future Records label has yet to bear fruit, but not through inertia. Production was okay, but he wanted to work within the parameters of a four-member group. Enter BLACKstreet.

Riley and group members Chauncey Hannibal, David Hollister and Levi Little insist they are not just an extension of Guy, but a totally separate entity. And BLACKstreet has succeeded wildly. A little ditty from the 1992 "CB4" movie soundtrack called "Baby Be Mine" gave the group some fanfare. But the 1994 release of their self-titled album on Interscope, and radio's acceptance of "Booti Call," set the table for BLACKstreet's biggest single, the sensuous "Before I Let You Go." The song was #1 not once, but several times on the JAMS Quiet Storm Radio Airplay chart, reached the Top Five on JAMS' singles chart and made a strong showing on the Most Powerful Songs charts. The band's on a serious roll, where they met up with HITS Staff Writer Gary "Chrome Dome" Jackson going in the opposite direction.

How did the name come about?

Riley: That came from Joseph Stonestreet and Chauncey Hannibal Black. Why do we call him "Black"? Because every dark-skinned guy that comes from the ghetto, the street, is called "Black" or "Blue." So we say, "What's up, Black?" or "What's up, Blue?" And every light-skinned guy is called either "Red" or "Yellowman."

Levi, what's the music scene like in Paterson? Levi Little: There are a great deal of entertainers from Jersey, period, but Paterson has a lot of talent. Nobody has gone in there and pumped it. A place like Paterson or Philadelphia, you find all the talent in the world, but nobody goes in there and pulls it out. What we're gonna do is go back and harness some of that

Chauncey Hannibal: We all produce. You see, something that people don't know about this group is that we're musicians, too. Teddy hates for me to say this, but a lot of times I like to let people know that he's a very prolific keyboard player. He's a musician, and that's where I think he has the edge over a lot of producers. If you notice, Jimmy Jam, Terry Lewis, Babyface, these are all musicians first. They don't have to rely so much on machines. On this album, we use a lot of live instruments, thanks to Teddy's expertise and insight.

Did you expect "Before I Let You Go" to do so well?

Riley: Not at all. We were just rolling

How did BLACKstreet get together?

Teddy Riley: Chauncey and I have been together since we worked in Guy. We started writing tunes after Guy broke up, kept our heads together and said, you know, we should form a group. That's how we got together with Joseph Stonestreet [who left before the album release]. He didn't think nothing was gonna come out of BLACKstreet...

Well, we won't trust him for stock futures!
Riley: He went ahead and pursued his
own career, and we said one gorilla in the
unist ain't gonna stop no show! Chauncey
went to Paterson, New Jersey, and got
Levi, because he was the talk of the town.

We did the song "Baby Be Mine" on the "CB4" soundtrack, which really did good for us. But the record company didn't take it where we wanted it to be, so we split. I think we made the right decision going with Interscope because they don't have a four-member group like us. The attention is on and we're proud of that. We are on the bandwagon; we're in the front seat.

Teddy, you could have been just a producer and done fine.

Riley: I just felt like I needed to be in people's eyes. It's like, out of sight, out of mind. That's why Babyface came out with his album, and I said I want to still be out there, too. I said I wanted to do another group and still produce.

with the punches.

Hannibal: If you noticed, we were the only group this year to put out an uptempo song first with "Booti Call." Other groups put out ballads first. We always listen to that funk.
Riley: Ballads are strong, but if you really have the right uptempo songs, they promote a group's longevity. Why?
Because when people go to concerts, they want to hear the uptempo. If you ain't got that right uptempo, it's gonna be like this Ifolds his arms]. You should never sit down on an uptempo. Never!

There's a big Gap Band/Roger influence.
Riley: My part of the show is dedicated to Roger. I play vocoder, and I actually studied it behind Roger. I always said he was like a father to me. It's a little Gap Band, a little Stevie Wonder, a little Donny (Hathaway), a little George Clinton, Earth, Wind & Fire. We meant to do that because a lot of people don't look up to the legends. If you notice on the album, we have a category for people we give props to, the acts that are heroes to us.

I've read where you wanted to work with L.A. Reid and Babyface.

Riley: Right now, I have a mission to complete, which is this group, and I wanna come out with some more new artists like Guy, Keith Sweat and Johnny Kemp. I wanna do that once again.

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
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Hard to believe it's been 16 years since Rhino Records released its first record, Wild Man Fischer's "Go To Rhino Records," one of the earliest known attempts at subliminal advertising in the music biz. Who would a thunk it? When the Westwood, California record store "sicked" that little ditty on an unsuspecting public, it went on to turn the tide of what had previously been considered the "Golden Oldie." Today, Rhino Records is a phenomenal success story, a multimillion dollar, multi-media industry which owes its success to the quirky personalities and adventurous souls of its creators, the Rhino Bros. — President Richard Foos and Managing Director Harold Bronson. The two men have managed to turn their almost high school prank-like records into a flourishing business and the industry's most vital archival record company.

n 1993 alone, the label released more than 250 audio CD/cassette reissues, anthologies, compilations, box sets and home videos, with revenue exceeding \$55 million. The one-time "novelty label" expects to surpass \$60 million this year. Not too shabby for two guys who set out to share their warped senses of humor and unconventional musical tastes with the world via the Temple City Kazoo Orchestra's version of "Stairway to Heaven."

Do they miss producing those wacky records? "We would put them out in droves, if the world was only more accepting," Foos laments. To which Bronson adds, typically deadpan: "This outer facade of sophistication and acumen is liable to crumble and our true craziness threatens to burst through at any time." Funny, we say the same thing about HITS' resident Sybil — who managed to summon up 33 of her 57 different personalities to conduct the following interview — Joan "Which One Should We Make The Check Out To?" Tarshis.

An exclusive HITS dialogue with Rhino Records' President Richard Foos and Managing Director Harold Bronson by Joan Tarshis

What was the craziest stunt you ever did? **HAROLD BRONSON: There** was a lot of crazy stuff. After we hit with the Temple City Kazoo Orchestra, we had more of a budget for the second album, which we called the Kazoo Brothers because the Blues Brothers were happening at the time. We did an EP which we thought was really great. We were very happy with it. We spent a lot of time arranging it, recording it, the whole deal. It came out and radio had tightened up and nobody played it. We were really disappointed. To focus attention on it and to try to generate some press, we created this fictitious black organization, similar to the NAACP, and had them lambast the record. It was Richard's idea. We took out a post office box and sent out a press release. The only one who ran anything was the Hollywood Reporter.

RICHARD FOOS: One time, we picketed our own store. That was Harold's idea. We did it to protest our customers for boycotting us.

BRONSON: We thought we would get TV news coverage because when has ownership ever picketed their own store? But nobody came.

FOOS: We also picketed the store when vinyl was disappearing to "Save The Vinyl."

BRONSON: [Tongue-in-cheek] As you can see, we were very successful with that campaign.

FOOS: We were actually picketing the customers again, this time because they weren't buying vinyl.

BRONSON: We like coming up with these wacky ideas, but most of them haven't worked in the past, so it hasn't necessarily encouraged us to keep doing them. Our "Chantmania" album is one example of a new novelty record. Still, every now and then, even though we're not thinking about promotions or ideas, they seep out.

You just can't help yourselves.

BRONSON: Of course, if these things did work, if our novelty records got a lot of airplay and sold, I think we'd be all too happy to do a lot more of them. It's sort of a suppressed passion of ours to do crazy stuff. We've been talking about Rhino Films for a long time, and one of the original plans was to put some of these crazy ideas into film because film accomodates the craziness much more than the record business these days. The record business in the '50s and '60s was a lot wilder than it is today. We identify more with that spirit than the corporate '70s, '80s

I remember records in the shape of Christmas trees and fish heads.







BRONSON: And there was the record that played inside out. We really loved all that stuff, but none of it worked for us commercially. So it was a bit disappointing. But it enabled us to focus our energies more on the reissues, which obviously accounts for this building today.

The original focus on wackiness in the first couple of years was because that was what we could afford. The Wildman Fischer album cost \$500 to record. "The Rhino Royal" and the "Temple City Kazoo Orchestra" cost maybe

\$500 or \$1,000 each. We did the novelty stuff because we could afford it. It took a couple of years of profits before we could start doing reissues.

We all love that old music and there's a lot of people, like us, who do also. For the average person who grew up listening to the stuff on the radio in the '50s and '60s, there was a certain element of joy listening to that whether you bought it or not. These days, the songs you hear on the radio seem to be of a

much more serious nature.

What was the nuttiest compilation you ever released?

FOOS: I'd have to say "The Best Of 'Louis Louis'."

BRONSON: Who'd ever thought that people would buy nine different versions of the same song? But they did! To our knowledge, nobody had ever done anything like that. It's become one of our best sellers.

Another was the compilation of teenage death songs, which I think was inspired by an article Robert Hilburn wrote in the *L.A. Times* where he actually listed them. And I thought, "What a great idea for a compilation." The thing I liked best about it was the package had a dyecut slit so the back of the album looked like a Kleenex box with a piece of Rhino tissue coming out.

We really love pushing the creative envelope and doing things differently. It's not like these things sold extremely well, but they were, in fact, helped by these gimmicks we came up with. We also did a spoof on tour jackets - when people were into those - for the Wildman Fischer tour, which consisted of two club dates. It was in the form of a straitiacket. We also did "The World's Worst Record," which included a puke bag inside the shrink-wrap. We have thought about putting out "The World's Worst CD," but then we thought, unfortunately, "How many of these could we sell?" There's too much licensing involved. We do have "Battle Of The Bombs: Previews From The World's Worst Movies" on Rhino Home Video.

Do you play your own records at home? **BRONSON**: Do you think we have anything else in our record collections? I tend to play the ones I haven't heard for a while. If I haven't heard "The Best Of the Beau Brummels" in a while, I'll put that on. **FOOS**: I like the Neville Bros.

BRONSON: My favorite is the

British Invasion series. Unfortunately, my listening time has diminished considerably lately. Both "New Wave Hits of the '80s" vol. 6 - 10 and also "The Best of Dave, Dee, Beaky, Mick and Tich" have been on my CD player recently, but it took me a week to listen to them. I haven't listened to the Everly Brothers box set yet, but that's what's next up. I don't listen to all of the Rhino titles because there are so many of them. I don't even take all of them home.

How has the development of catalog departments for reissues at the major labels affected Rhino?

FOOS: We're flattered.

BRONSON: It forces us to be more creative. I think most companies wouldn't like the competition, but it's beneficial to the record collector that so much of this stuff is out. Whether some of the stuff should be out is questionable. But ultimately, it's good.

FOOS: I read a review of someone else's compilation that said. "It looks like Rhino, it feels like Rhino, but it isn't Rhino." The only thing we lament is that some of these people are stretching so much, it seems like they're making a compilation just to make a compilation. And it just becomes more clutter in a world full of clutter.

BRONSON: That sounds like a song... [Sings] "More Clutter In A Cluttered World" by David Clutterfield.

FOOS: We feel we're very discerning. All these reissues are almost like pollution. They confuse consumers. There are compilations of people with only a single hit! It sometimes gets a little ludicrous.

Has anybody beat you on something you really wanted?

BRONSON: Hollywood got the Dave Clark Five catalog and the Sony Legacy Series beat us out of "The Best Of The Flock." We were trying for Dean Martin, but he wanted too much money... uh, just joking about the Flock.

FOOS: We'd rather focus on the glass being 98% full rather than 2% empty.

BRONSON: We don't need to have it all to be happy.

How are things going with your Atlantic

BRONSON: The food's real good, but the chef has left.

FOOS: Atlantic had the foresight to allow us to develop their back catalog. When we were at Capitol/EMI, they began reissuing their own product at the same time as we were intelligently trying to assemble a release plan for their back catalog. It turned into a real mess

BRONSON: We felt Capitol/EMI

were competing with us, while at Atlantic, we felt they are encouraging and supporting us. So it's working out very well. We're very happy at Atlantic and very happy with WEA distribution.

Does direct mail work for you?

BRONSON: It's actually never been a big part. On the other hand, as much as we'd like, record stores can't stock 100% of Rhino product. **FOOS**: Not even our own stores.

BRONSON: Therefore, if people want some of the records that they can't get, how do they get them? Some stores special order; some stores don't. So we kind of need to have Rhino service the music fan, which is really what we're all about. What are some of your plans in the interactive area?

BRONSON: We're doing a CD-ROM on Rhino's hit songs of the '90s. It's going to be the first blank interactive CD-ROM. Put your own hits here.

Are you on-line yet?

BRONSON: We're on CompuServe. We plan to get into it more in the future, but we don't really know much about that stuff.

FOOS: We're low-techies.

What do you see in the future for Rhino? BRONSON: Everybody realizes all the various media are converging. We're definitely interested in being fully integrated, expanding the Rhino sensibility to film and books as we've done in music and video. Someday, everything will be on a little chip.

FOOS: In your tooth.

What about Rhino Theater?

BRONSON: Two years ago, we actually put on a play with Big Daddy at the Groundlings Theater on Melrose Avenue Wednesday nights. This was another idea we thought was great, but ultimately bombed! When the new Big Daddy album came out at the time, we thought that a novel way to break

them — since they don't get airplay — would be to tell the Big Daddy story in theatrical form. The first half was the story of Big Daddy and the second half was a mini-concert. It drew quite well for eight weeks, but it really didn't get the press attention we would have liked towards exposing in a novel way the music on a new album.

We have some TV and film ideas, but we are proceeding very slowly because we really don't have the wherewithal to produce them. More specifically, our company has grown so, most of our energy is focused elsewhere. Moving into the new building took a lot of time. Prior to that, we had to sort out our distribution deal.

Kid Rhino has really taken off.

FOOS: We've had a really good year with Kid Rhino. We've had the Flintstones, the Animaniacs and our first CD with the Looney Tunes characters. It's been really exciting.

How about Rhino Home Video?

BRONSON: We just put out a documentary on Ed Wood. "Look Back In Angora." We've already released three of his movies, including his classic "Plan 9 From Outer Space." We're thinking of having a cross-dressing party to celebrate it.

Is it true the floors in the new building are made out of old records?

FOOS: Recycled records and soft-

BRONSON: If you look at the floor closely, the black obviously is vinyl, the silvery gray is CD, and occasionally there will be some little bits of screws from cassettes and also some larger stuff from video cassettes. We wanted something physically to represent us in the building. ■

Your musical tastes are pretty unusual. How did you get such an eclectic background?

My father always had lots of music in the house, from Frank Sinatra to Leonard Bernstein. He was a classical music freak, but I also heard Dean Martin, Nat King Cole, Ella Fitzgerald, artists like that. I was into music from a very young age. I used to watch all the Beatles cartoons and was fascinated with them. The

first record I ever heard was "Hey Jude," which basically made me what I am today. I listened to every single Beatles' record that came out. Then I grew into other things. I listened to Marc Bolan, T-Rex and went into that punkfunk area with Rick James, Parliament and Prince, of course, who blew my mind totally. I didn't get into Bob Marley until I was leaving high school. There wasn't much reggae played in my house.

What does your dad do?

He's a college professor who's taught philosophy, psychology, systematic theology at Princeton, Columbia... now he's at the University of the West Indies. I grew up on campuses. It's like being a preacher's kid, though. You tend to go in the opposite direction. Fuck school. I was a rebel.

How would you describe your music?

Instead of world pop, it's more universal pop because it's very song-oriented. At the same time, an ethnic vibe is in there, the rock vibe is in there and the funk vibe is in there... but it's still pop.

Is it a coincidence that the single is called "Mishale," like the Beatles' song?

That's just the name of the girl I wrote it about. It was kind of weird because the Beatles are like gods to me and, of course, "Michelle" was one of their big hits, but it wasn't one of my favorites of theirs.

Why did you decide to pick up and move to England?

Basically because nothing was happening musically for me here. I had my little demo tape, so I did music for some radio commercials and bought my ticket. My mother knew somebody that I could stay with. Once I was there, my life changed. I met all these different people... and, of course, slept in train stations.

I thought you had a place to stay.

I did, but the lady turned out to be a real wacko; she thought I was cutting off pieces of her front door to let people in. She saw the


Wailers come to the house and pick me up and that did it... She knew I was on drugs and was going to call security. So I just packed and left. I told her, "These guys are the greatest reggae band ever." She called me a liar and a drug addict. So I spent a couple of days in Victoria Station.

I thank the God above that I called [Black Uhuru's] Michael Rose. I knew that Michael was going to be signed by Park Music and I knew he'd have to be in London at some time, so I just took a chance and he was there. It was wild. He told me to come on down. I had my tape with me. And he told everybody how good I was. The tape then filtered to New York and that's where I met Bruce Garfield and Eric Foster-White, my producer.

Are you a romantic?

I write a lot of stories about man and woman because I know that man and woman have never been able to get along. Men are so macho, they don't want to do certain things. Women don't understand some of man's needs. They just don't know how to relate. It's very hard to love one another. We're always trying to figure out some way to create some trouble between each other.

I could have written all sorts of things about the Third World, but I decided not to do that on my first record. I didn't want to preach to anybody because people don't know who I am yet. I want to get through the door first. I don't think there's anything out there like this album. There are not that many reggae artists with the balls to try what I'm trying. I can win or I can lose, but that's just me. I'm not going to change.


