Franklin, Bon Jovi, Allman Bros., Chuck Berry, Al Green and TAFKAP (the artist formerly known as Prince), among others.


Tickets for the event will go on sale at Ticketmaster June 24. Plans for a worldwide television broadcast will be announced shortly.

#### Pearl Jammed

Pearl Jam angrily canceled their two sold-out shows at the Del Mar Fair scheduled for June 26-27 after the San Diego County Sheriff's Department expressed concern about possible crowd control. The 26,000 tickets for the two shows, which marked the group's only Southern California dates on their current tour, had sold out in 13 minutes.

The cancellation came as fair and police officials were working to beef up security by hiring additional private guards and Fred Rosen to take tickets.

Lead singer Eddie Vedder said in a statement released by the group's publicist: "Not to make enemies, but it seems the officials in San Diego have overreacted, creating an impossible situation. It's a shame really. Have a little faith." The statement added the band hopes to play for San Diego fans later this year at a rest-stop off an undisclosed freeway exit. Refunds are being made available by mail through ETM Entertainment Network, the band's ticket-broker for the rour.

### NEAR-TRUTHS

The full-frontal assault by conservative republicans on lyrics — with special emphasis on African-Americans — took on new dynamics with a swiftly called RIAA pow-wow in the Big Apple. Among the gunslingers representing their contingents were RIAA head honcho Jason Berman BMG's Strauss Zelnick. EMI's Jim Fifield, WMG's Doug Morris and Michael Fuchs. Poly's Eric Kronfeld. Sony's Dave Johnson and MCA's Al Teller. Among the results were 1) To investigate the possibility of more than one sticker to be placed on various releases. 2) To explore what detailed or more informative language would appear on said sticker or stickers. 3) To maintain a policy of self-policing by labels with no outside monitoring agency like the film industry's MPAA which could never keep up with the sheer volume of musical releases..... Post pow-wow buzzing has most labels, but not all, feeling they can support some kind of revised labelling system. Other chatter has some labels believing that Time Warner has shifted the burden of the attacks to the rest of the industry. Conversely, there are some CEOs who were less-than-thrilled at the

prospect of having Time Warner acting as the only voice of the industry... Meanwhile. there are more than a few concerned that a more detailed. reworded sticker or stickers will increase the possibility of successful local and state legislation that will prohibit the sale of stickered product. Up to this point, 27 states have attempted to pass such legislation and failed. Many believe those failures were due in part to the wording of the current sticker, which is too broad to be constitutionally legislated against.... Meanwhile, such prominent figures as Jesse Jackson, Maxine Waters and Al Sharpton are now pointing out the racial overtones of this current political agenda, and are urging TW not to buckle to any pressure..... Many are warning this is not just a Republican attack. Pointers point to a bi-partisan seizing of the family values issue that members of both parties can use to their political benefit.... And amid all this chatter stands Interscope. which is continuing to sell records full-steam ahead. Do not look for the House That Ted & Jimmy built to change their politics, stickering policy or artist roster. All eyes are on the forthcoming Dogg Pound album, produced by Dr. Dre. Many believe the release — or non-release - of the hardedged street project will become the watershed moment in the Time Warner-Interscope relationship. A possible refusal by TW to release the album will ultimately lead to a severing of the newly configured deal and the selling back of TW's \$120 million stake in Interscope - at a major discount. Possible consequences of that move would be an ugly message to the artistic community about TW and the possibility of Inter-

scope as a free agent in the competitive marketplace. Would any other companies make a play to replace Time Warner? Which ones? Said free agency scenario would again give Interscope 100% ownership of their own company. Would independent distribution then be a possibility? Action to come? Bet on it....BUT WAIT, THERE'S OTHER ACTION: Like all the chatter surrounding not one, but two new Dreamworks/ SKG labels to be marketed by Geffen Records. Look for one of the labels to focus on soundtracks. And yes, George Michael will be on board. Meanwhile, conventional wisdom has once again swung towards Mo Ostin as the ruler of the SKG musical empire..... Those involved in the soundtrack for Batman are dismayed over director Joel Schumacher pulling music out of the film at the eleventh hour. Said move did leave the U2 and Seal cuts over the credits. Watchers are busy watching the implications of Schumacher's last-second move on album sales ..... Wonderers wonder if the less-thanfruitful relationship between A&M and Jimmy Jam & Terry Lewis' Perspective imprint is

changing dramatically due, in part, to the recent exit of Sharon Heyward. Are other labels lining up for a possible strike? Action to come on this one.... Lots of curiosity at Virgin over where the Paula Abdul album will debut on next week's chart ..... Pearl Jam's decision to play Ticketmaster venues may provide the best proof of the anti-trust implication of the Justice Department inquiry — that you can't tour effectively without Ticketmaster. Look for the band to play TM venues on their own and as a backing band for Neil Young in the Fall..... Names in the Rumor Mill: Suge Knight, Tipper Gore, Tom Zutaut, Ron Sweeney and Fred Rosen.

Mercury's Catherine Wheel, who slam-dunked the crowd with hard-edged live versions of the songs from "Happy Days." The festivities made the NYPD Nude weekend in DC seem like a Mother Theresa event... The success of Green Day and Rancid has inspired a number of dead punk bands to reform, though Joey Ramone has threatened to disband that

seminal group after Perry Farrell's promise to give the Ramones a Lollapalooza gig fell through... Meanwhile, we caught legendary firstwavers the Dictators, featuring the remarkably still "Handsome" Dick Manitoba, sell-out two nights at CBGBs... Speaking of Lollapalooza, a call for a day-care nanny is out, what with Sonic Youth, Sinead O'Connor and Courtney Love (and who knows who else) bringing the little ones on tour... We found ourselves munching on crabcakes and com fritters at 11 a.m., staring into a hole slated to hold a time capsule on W. 57th St., where the Motown Cafe will rise. If Motown's Jhervl Busby, Brian Daneman and Traci Jordan could be up for the Four Tops and Boyz II Men's duet of the Beatles' "Yesterday," so could we... We climbed to the top of the Empire State Building to help Columbia and Pink Floyd celebrate the release of their new, live double-CD, which includes a complete in-concert version of "Dark Side of the Moon." Among the label luminaries who made the scene were Don lenner, John Ingrassia, John Leshay, Patricia Kiehl and Larry Jenkins. who spearheaded the mammoth promotion, which featured a laser light show from the landmark skyscraper after dark that pleased the thousands of fans standing on the street below to honor the venerable rock legends... R.E.M. mgr. Jefferson Holt invited Patti Smith to attend the band's Detroit show. where they covered her "Dancing Barefoot." The next night, for the band's afterparty at a club called Industria, Patti surprised everyone by playing a set with her band of local musicians, plus Lenny Kaye. 

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



# WHAT MAKES Lyor Rush

An exclusive HITS dialogue with Lyor Cohen, President/COO Rush Associated Labels/Def Jam by Roy Trakin

LYOR COMEN FOUND HIS WAY INTO THE RECORD INDUSTRY BY A CIRCUITOUS ROUTE. HIS MOM'S FAMILY WERE PI-ONEERS TO PALESTINE AND HIS GREAT-GRANDFATHER WAS A PARTICIPANT IN THE ZIONIST CONGRESS AND SIGNED ISRAEL'S VERSION OF THE CONSTITUTION AS WELL AS FOUNDING BANK MIZRACHI. LYOR WAS BORN IN MANHATTAN,

THEN RAISED IN LOS ANGELES BY HIS MOTHER'S SECOND HUSBAND, DR. PHILIP SHULMAN, HEAD OF PSYCHIATRY AT KAISER-PERMANENTE. HIS MOTHER, 2TVA SIRKIS, FOUNDED A NON-PROFIT LAW FIRM FOR THE WORKING POOR, WHICH WAS FEATURED ON A "GO MINUTES" SESMENT.

LYOR ATTENDED THE UNIVERSITY OF MIAMI, WHERE HE EARNED A DEGREE IN INTERNATIONAL FINANCE AND MARKETING, RETURNING TO LA.
TO WORK FOR BANK LEUMI, WHICH HE HATED. "I'VE NEVER OWNED A RECORD IN MY LIFE," HE SAYS. "ALL MY LITTLE BROTHERS ARE MUSICIANS AND RECORD COLLECTORS. MUSIC WAS ALWAYS PLAYED IN THE HOUSE ON THE INTERCOM SYSTEM, BUT I WAS NEVER INTERESTED IN
IT. I WAS ALWAYS MORE INTO SCENES RATHER THAN SPECIFIC MUSIC."

HE BEGAN ATTENDING HIP-HOP SHOWS PROMOTED AS UNCLE JAM'S ARMY IN THE EARLY '80S, WHICH HE CALLS "THE BEGINNINGS OF RAP CULTURE IN LOS ANGELES." THE SHOWS WERE BASICALLY D.J. HOOK-UPS WITH ACTS LIKE EGYPTIAN LOVER AND THE WRECKING CREW FEATURING OR. DRE, BUT WERE STILL DRAWING UPWARDS OF 16,000 PEOPLE AT THE L.A. SPORTS ARENA, WHICH MADE LYOR THINK TO HIMSELF, SOMETHING'S GOING ON HERE. HE STARTED HIS OWN MIX CLUB AT THE OLD STARDUST BALLROOM, HIRING BIG-NAME RAP ARTISTS TO APPEAR AT HIS VENUE AFTER PERFORMING AT UNCLE JAM'S ARMY SHOW EARLIER IN THE EVENING. AFTER FINALLY SUCCEEDING IN BOOKING RUN DMC, LYOR HOOKED UP WITH RUSSELL SIMMONS, WHO EVENTUALLY HIRED HIM TO BECOME THE GROUP'S ROAD MANAGER BECAUSE HE WAS THE ONLY ONE WITH A VALID PASSPORT FOR A U.K. TOUR THAT WAS SET TO START IN A FEW DAYS. HE DID THAT FOR THREE AND A HALF

YEARS AT THE SAME TIME AS HE WAS RUNNING RUSH MANAGEMENT, WORKING WITH SUCH ACTS AS THE BEASTIE BOYS AND PUBLIC ENEMY. HE ALSO HAD A MANAGEMENT COMPANY WITH RICK RUBIN, PETE GRANT MANAGEMENT, NAMED AFTER THE LEGENDARY LED ZEPPELIN Manager. Which handled slayer until Lyor Stepped away because he was offended "AS A JEW" BY THE BAND'S USE OF THE PHRASE "ANGEL OF DEATH." A NICKNAME FOR CON-CENTRATION CAMP "EXPERIMENTER." DR. MENGELE. "I THOUGHT THE POWER WAS WITH MANAGEMENT." HE RECALLS. "WHAT I DIDN'T REALIZE WAS, THE REAL MONEY WAS IN THE RECORD BUSINESS." #### What was it that first attracted you to the hip-hop scene?

When I first walked into the L.A. Sports Arena for Uncle Jam's Army, with 16,000 kids, I heard a beat that vibrated all over the arena with not one white person in sight. It was prior to the gangs drawing lines of distinction. It wasn't like there were all these shootings in public places. The whole submachine gun/pistol thing hadn't established itself yet. Before, they used to battle by the tongue. Now you have to jack up the thrill by ripping someone's head off and shitting down their throat.

### Your life was changed by the experience.

I was desperate to make an impact. It wasn't like I heard the cash registers

ringing. I wanted to find out where I belonged. I went to all these Uncle Jam's Army shows and they started importing New York talent. I said to myself, I'm sure I can get some white that night. So I went to my mother and told her I had a line on a group that talks instead of sings and I needed \$700 to put together a show with Social Distorion, Fear, Circle Jerks,

Red Hot Chili Peppers and the Dickies, starring Run DMC at the Mix Club, which was in the old Stardust Ballroom. I negotiated with this Korean force radio's ed with this Korean guy for the rights to do shows there. It was a no-brainer. Next

thing he knew, he was selling drinks to 3,600 punks.

### So that's how you met Russell Simmons.

Man, I called that muthafucker a thousand times. I was so relentless, it out there. By the time they finished, they were so satisfied, exhausted and happy. That kind of cultural mix didn't happen again until maybe seven vears later.

### So you were ahead of your time.

It was inevitable. I was at the right place at the right time.

Russell heard what I was doing in L.A., called me up and offered me a third of his company to come work for him. Rush was in an 8 x 10 office. Russell used to go down to the corner to get a hot dog for lunch. My family was divided; my father told me not to go without a contract. My mother said, the worst thing that'll happen is you'll be back at the end of the summer.


I went there and he jerked me on my deal. At the time, he had Run DMC.

Kurtis Blow, Whodini, Sparkee D., Jimmy Spicer, Davy D... Andre Harrell was working there at the time and I became his manager. He was part of Dr. Jekyll & Mr. Hyde. When he came in to work with Russell, that was the end of my third. But he still had aspirations to be an artist.

### How did you like being a road manager?

It was a very interesting and important time for me. I believe the greatest record executives came out of a background of road managing, regional promotion or retailing. It's the most critical experience I had. I draw on it every day. We're observers when the act and the

consumer get together. That's at the heart of the interaction. I saw what the kid said when Run didn't sign an autograph and I saw how he acted when he did. My job's like Henry Kissinger's: to bring people together. The act and the consumer. Once you achieve that, and of course, you need the right spin... you've done your job. If the act can't sell themselves, I can't sell them. The set-up is vital. I take twice as long to set up my records as my competitors. The most important element in my career development is, I use radio as my last stop, not my first. I go straight to the consumer and let them force radio's hand. That's why I'm so



### The set-up on the Montell Jordan record was exemplary.

The set-up on this record came when Slick Rick first recorded "Children's Story." Since we own the publishing, I guard these classics and don't let people use them too frequently because I dreamed of one day having a real singer sing on top of, say, "Children's Story." I rejected people wanting to use a sample of "Children's Story" over 500 times.

I look at it as a two-part process. You have to sell the building and you have to sell the consumer. The way I sell the building is to have the consumer sell it to them. I have to sell it to my own 48 people just as I have to sell it to the hundreds of people who work at PGD.

I try to get the consumer by giving the early retail stores, the mom-andpops whatever they need. The best sell is when a retailer calls up the L.A. branch of PGD and goes, "Jesus Christ! Why didn't you tell me about the Montell Jordan? Are you trying to put me out of business?" And then the L.A. branch calls his boss in the national office wondering if this is just another Def Jam record sneaking around them. The more they don't know about it, the more they feel they're being left out of something that's happening.

It's the domino theory of breaking records. My philosophy is, America is too big. Everything has to come from somewhere. Take Onyx. Everyone wanted me to go national with them, but I took a map, circled the tri-state area and said, "This is the United States." The best way to spread a record is to make it the biggest record from its original point of view and then hopefully it explodes out of the region and the shrapnel lands in Seattle and St. Louis. That's how I believe you spread a record — region by region. To me, the key is to find your shot, where your ears are. Where you have the best chance of success. It's like a boss. You don't set your employees up to fail; you set them up to succeed.

#### You seem to have a very unorthodox company in terms of structure.

I learned the record business via a very untraditional education. I hate the regurgitation of executive talent in the record business. None of my employees have ever had another

record company job. They're learning my way. They don't have the typical response, "This is not how you do it!" These people are all aggressive and hard-working. They've learned their

skills buying cheap and selling dear. They know how to commu-

The key people in this company are my head of

marketing, Julie Greenwald who, three years ago, was a teacher in a New Orleans ghetto. She was a summer intern for me, served as my assistant, and I just gave her more and more responsibilities. Kevin Riles, the head of promotion, Wes Johnson, Chris Lighty in A&R... all these people have a piece of our upside. Nobody can just come in and snatch them away. My people work for me a minimum of six years. All the people who used to work for me are now running shit. They pay them five times what I'm paying 'em.

#### How do you feel as a white, Jewish guy in black music?

There are no color lines in our building. We all look at ourselves as Bad News Bears. Everyone else wants to put us out of business by beating us. We have to be smarter than they are, more creative, we have to guard our art better. That's more important than any racial line. Russell [Simmons] validated me from the beginning. He had more tough times than I did. Not with the artists. Every artist was happy to see me. It was only the shady-ass business side where there was a problem, but it was never a big problem. I gained my power through the artists. They believed in me.

#### What does the PolyGram deal mean to you?

It was a real learning experience. We had never gone through the budgetary process before. We never had a business plan. Jim Caparro and his team - John Madison, Steve Corbin, Curt Eddy — are why they have been named the distributors of the year despite the fact they're just third in billing. They know the reason for Def Jam - our corporate philosophy, where we wanna go, how we're gonna get there. PGD is the best distribution company in the business. I also can't say enough about John Barbis and the Island team.

I told Alain Levy, in my mind, we are between a \$40 million and \$75 million a year company, with a net worth of more than \$100 million. My vision is to be the youth-oriented, cutting-edge, dangerous record company. And the only way we can grow is to make an acquisition of a label whose executive talent mirrors Def Jam. A company which also uses radio as a last step, not a first

step, which gets things done by any means necessary. A specifically allservice culture company.

Punk and rap are natural bedfellows. Teenagers, whether they're black, white, green or yellow, get validation from the fact their parents can't stand their scene or music.

I was invited to the PolyGram International Presidents' Meeting in London several months ago and I was tripping on the plane because the air is kinda short. And I had a vision. I saw an industry coming to me. We're five years away from the year 2000. The millenium is a reality. I just happen to be in a place where the kids are coming to. I'm in the right place at the right time. Within the last two years, all these rappers are talking about reality-based subjects. I think the consumer, whether they realize it or not, understands what's happening. And the next five years is about getting yourself ready for this new, reality-based era. The bill is coming due. It's like April 10, five days before tax

And that's what Def Jam is about. We can't outclout, outspend or outfinance our competitors. The only thing we can do is out-taste them, guard our logo and our art. All the decisions we make are, is it good for Def Jam? All of a sudden, the answers are a lot easier. When the consumer reaches into that 10,000 pieces of product and sees a Def Jam logo, there's a connection. That's the only way I can beat the competition.

My job isn't delivering a record; my job is getting a kid to buy a poster and put it up on his wall. I'm selling a Def Jam way of life.

#### What will be going on at Def Jam/RAL over the next six months?

The next biggest thing after Montell Jordan is Warren G., who is giving us two of his next albums simultaneously. One is called "The Twinz" and the other is called "Dove Shack." Warren G. never wanted to be a performer himself. When I first tried to sign him, he wanted to be a producer. The guy oozes creativity. The first time I went to his apartment, he had no furniture, but a recording studio in one room. The first thing that caught my eye was he had Carole King's "Tapestry" album and a Michael McDonald LP on vinyl. I sat in his couch until I signed him three days later. I knew immediately there was something special there. He didn't want to be a performer; he wanted to do a compilation album. "The G-Funk Era" album is a bunch of different groups. The Twinz and Dove Shack are both on there. So we're coming out with those albums simultaneously and calling it "The Month of the G." Just like we did "The Month of the Man" with Method Man and Redman.







### "Jazz changes over and over again... Jazz is change and change is jazz..." **D-Knowledge**

Yes, jazz is change, and change is jazz, a reflection of the roiling turmoil of time. Jazz's indisputable New Orleans origin, coupled with ragtime's evolvement at the turn of the century, marked the emergence of the automotive age. Man was going faster and faster inexorably into a new industrial age, and so did the music. As the 20th century unfolded, jazz has kept up the pace: The gin joint flops and racy hedonistic attitudes of the decade were captured in the dizzying Chicago dixieland of the '20s. In the '30s, the soothing textures of swing helped to ease America through an economically shaky era. The big band era of the '40s echoed an idealistic "stick-togetherness" borne of cooperative necessity during World War II. And the '40s, fresh off the Allied victory, witnessed the creation of a blistering new faction of jazz in be-bop.

Indeed, America was stretching out, ready to fulfill the promise of "Go West, young man" to create the 'burbs. The '50s "cool" was captured in such movies as "Rebel Without A Cause" and "Blackboard Jungle." In reality, the era reflected the "cold war" tensions of the "Red Menace," and the birth of the Civil Rights movement with Rosa Parks and the Woolworth lunch counter sit-ins. The '60s knocked the American dream off-kilter with the John and Robert Kennedy, Malcolm X and Martin Luther King assassinations, the "Woodstock Nation" and the Black Panther Party. "Cool" led to fusion and a sometimes spiritual, often ear-wracking, polyphonic onslaught. The '70s wit-

nessed jazz's marriage with the popular elements of the decade, funk and rock. The "me" attitude of the era led to an irreverence of things past as jazz suffered through its lowest popular ebb. Clubs that used to pack 'em in nearly went extinct trying to survive the decade.

'80s greed turned jazz into a corporate money-maker as festivals, led by the popular "Playboy Jazz Festival," resuscitated the music and brought America full circle back to jazz's rich heritage. And, due to the efforts of one amazing family, the Marsalises, jazz became a household word. In the '90s, new ideas such as hip-hop/jazz and acid jazz are still being formed at the decade's mid-point. A new set of "young lions" are keeping the tradition alive and are forging ahead to further redefine the music. Their efforts could not have been possible without the influence of the following ten most pivotal figures in jazz's incredible history. The list is compiled by HITS Staff Writer Gary "Stoned Wall" Jackson, one of the ten least pivotal figures in journalistic history.

### **BUDDY BOLDEN**

Generally acknowledged as the first musician to play what is commonly referred to as jazz. This cornet-playing New Orleans native ruled the early jazz scene. So we must pay homage to a man who was so popular in his day that he sometimes played in seven bands a night! Unfortunately, because Bolden began suffering from dementia in 1906,

and the first known jazz recordings were made in New York City in 1919, we'll never know what he sounded like except through legend. He passed away in 1931.

### LOUIS ARMSTRONG

There are arguments that Armstrong and clarinetist Sidney Bechet inherited Bolden's legacy, but it was Armstrong who took jazz to the world. Indeed, his title as "Jazz Ambassador" was well-earned. His cornet-playing remains astounding even to this day. But it was his unique vocal phrasing ("Hello Dolly," "What A Wonderful World") that won him international acclaim. For a compendium of his early career, check the Columbia release "The Louis Armstrong Story."

#### **DUKE ELLINGTON**

A larger-than-life influence in terms of playing and composing for a large orchestra. His contributions, "Take The A-Train," "Mood Indigo," "Sophisticated Lady" and "In A Sentimental Mood," merely hint at his genius. Equally impressive was his ear for major talent to occupy his big band. Bassist Oscar Pettiford, vocalist Al Hibbler, drummer Louis Bellson and the legendary Ella Fitzgerald are some of the major names to grace the Ellington podium.

### DIZZY GILLESPIE & CHARLIE PARKER

We profile Gillespie and Parker together because each played a monumental role in shaping be-bop. Each influenced the other in giving a high-octane kick to jazz as it eased out of the big band/swing era after World War II. Be-bop, considered much in the same vein as rap these days, represented such a radical step from the aforementioned styles of the '30s and early '40s that most purists forecast a quick demise. It endured basically because of both Gillespie and Parker's absolute command of the trumpet and alto sax, respectively. So large were their influences that they attracted such disciples as Miles Davis, Max Roach and Roy Haynes. So big was Parker's influence that the nightclub, Birdland, was named for him while he was still alive.

### BILLIE HOLIDAY

Lady Day single-handedly brought real blues to jazz. Her life story was on display with every aching note. Although others may say that Ella Fitzgerald, Lena Horne and Carmen McRae were jazz vocal interpreters, the reality is that Holiday was a pioneer who influenced vocalists during and after her death. Holiday also had the advantage of being a superior songwriter, whose "God Bless The Child," "Lady Sings The Blues," "Fine And Mellow" and "Don't Explain" remain classics to this day.

### MILES DAVIS

Of all the jazz giants throughout history, none has been as charismatic, enigmatic, influential, chameleon-like or prolific as Miles Davis. He emerged just after the genesis of be-bop with Charlie Parker's band in 1945. If there was a change in jazz's direction, Davis was at the forefront. In the "cool" era, there were no better recordings than "Kind of Blue" or "Sketches of Spain." The electric era spawned the great "Bitches Brew" and "In A Silent Way." Fusion saw "Live At The Fillmore" and "Live-Evil." Further experiments produced "Tutu," "Amandla" and the underappreciated "Siesta." Davis' last recording, 1991's "Do-Bop," forged new experimental ground by tapping into the burgeoning hip-hop genre.

### JOHN COLTRANE

Even though there were other, perhaps more influential jazz giants, none has been the recipient of more god-like adulation than saxphonist John Coltrane. It could be tied to the fact that he died just before achieving fame outside of the jazz circle. A prolific recorder, Coltrane hit his peak several years before his untimely death in 1967 with "A Love Supreme," a stratospheric exploration into the nether reaches of jazz. More down-to-earth classics include "My Favorite Things" and his subtle background work on Miles Davis' "Kind of Blue."

### ELLIS, BRANFORD & WYNTON MARSALIS

Ellis Marsalis would have been included in this list if only for having sired Branford and Wynton (along with trombonist Delfeayo) alone, two of the most influential jazz purveyors of the mid-'80s to the present. However, Ellis is an accomplished pianist whose influence was felt in New Orleans well before his sons made their impact. Wynton was the first of the Marsalises to gain international fame for winning Grammys in both the jazz and classical categories. He was the youngest player ever, at 18, to play in Art Blakey's prestigious Jazz Messengers. Branford, former leader of the "Tonight Show" band, is also held in high esteem for his sax playing. The more adventurous of the brothers, Branford has played live with such divergent acts as Sting and the Grateful Dead. Both brothers also go to great lengths to teach youngsters of the wonders of jazz, thus ensuring a continued life for the music.

privileged to program and later consult one of America's great, pure jazz radio stations, WJZZ-FM in Detroit. We really can't focus on Black Music Month without looking at the history of black music in America. And we can't look at black music in America without looking at jazz.

What's happening in markets like Washington, Philadelphia, Atlanta, Buffalo and Dallas is that NAC/ jazz-formatted stations are competing with and taking a huge slice of adult audiences from urban radio. The reason is simple: Jazz is mass appeal adult music with a colorful history and tradition.

Unfortunately, our industry's knowledge of jazz history is mostly filtered through the media, accomplished through fragments of old news footage, bygone sitcoms, cult movies, concerts, BET, MTV, all-oldies weekends, monitored playlists and jazz on Sundays. But attracting an aging population is something that could benefit

A quick look at who this aging population is shows how it has changed. The radicals of the '70s are fast becoming middle-age consumers of the '90s. Women are having fewer children today than previous generations. Advances in health and medicine are increasing life expectancy. Now, for the first time in our history, there are more people over 49 than there are teens. All of this has taken its toll with so-called adult formats. How do you program your radio station so that two generations will want to listen? Nearly every station owner and manager in the country is spending endless hours and big bucks trying to find the ideal format path. Some have re-discovered jazz.

For a country that has extolled, sold and been obsessed with youth, this shift of the major portion of the population into middle age and beyond has urban radio scrambling for advice on how to deal with and program to this growing market segment. Many stations have begun to look at artists who have a jazz flavor or a sound to which jazz enthusiasts can relate.

Listeners over 40 now control more than 70% of the total net worth of this country. And, yes, you can rock 'em with re-currents, but that does not assure you of victory. Stations looking to appeal to this powerful consumer group will have to re-design their formats to meet their needs and desires. Artists such a George Duke, Phil Perry, Marcus Miller, Gerald Alston, Najee and ignore in the '90s.

### JAZZ ROOTS


The thing some people find most frustrating about jazz is perhaps the best thing about it: it defies neat categorization. You can't say the blues isn't jazz when all jazz arguably flows from it. Too many jazz musicians learned to play in the church not to consider gospel an integral part of jazz music. And although R&B, rock and soul are, on the surface, different from jazz, they wouldn't even exist if jazz hadn't come first.

From the straight-ahead be-bop era to the jubileestyle choruses of gospel, from the African rhythms and Brazilian riffs adopted by African-American musicians, from the contemporary songs of the Beth Chorneau Fourtet to the smoky ballads of trumpeter Joe Wilder, jazz is alive and well in the '90s.

There is a whole glorious point to jazz. Because of how it uses improvisation, there's practically a summary of a lifetime every time a musician performs. The goal is to try to give a sampling of as large a spectrum as possible so that people can appreciate the vast reaches of this music and the legitimacy of every style.

There are even some pundits who claim a strong correlation between modern jazz and classical music. Like classical music, there are no oldies with jazz. Duke Ellington is not out of date simply because he died. The music of Coltrane, Monk and Miles is not erased; it becomes part of the jazz library. Jazz is inexorably woven into the fabric of the past, present and future. And because of this, younger listeners, particularly males, are now tuning to radio stations whose musical menu includes jazz artists.

Some stations, such as WBLS/New York, have extended their jazz on Sundays. Hal Jackson, who was one of this country's first African-American d.j.s, currently hosts a Sunday jazz show in New York, which is among the highest-rated in its time slot. Other stations have attempted to work some jazz songs into their evening and midday dayparts. And guess what? When it's promoted in front, and done right, it works! Perhaps it's because the love that went into making jazz music is felt by its listeners and fans. Perhaps that's why, like love, jazz is more easily demonstrated than defined.

What are your basic duties?

Because Al is part-time, I coordinate the music for him, line up interviews, pull promotions together, compile concert information and get artists to stop by the station in order to associ-

ate our name with them when people think about jazz.

Are you happy with the results of trying to fill that void in the market?

The latest Arbitron shows we were #1 in the 18-25 and 34-55 demos in our time slot on Sundays. This is a good indication that we are on the right track.

What's the biggest difference in airing the show on a commercial vs. a college station?

With the commercial recognition, it lets the labels and concert promoters know that Tampa is a viable city for bringing a lot of the big acts through for the jazz community. Record reps have said they can definitely see more activity in the Tampa Bay area since we've been on. Record sales and awareness have increased, from new age artists like Otmar Liebert to George Benson and McCoy Tyner, because we have an older population due to the retirement community. There are also a lot of hip, affluent, young pockets as well who go for the newer, more contemporary, sounds.

Do you lean toward traditional, fusion or new age?

We tend to lean more contemporary. But, depending on the artists and the music, we may incorporate some traditional stuff like Wynton Marsalis. We don't go into straight-ahead music too strong because we don't have the programming hours. We don't play a lot of new age either because there just isn't enough time. We try to do a little bit of everything in keeping with 93.3's hit mode. We also try to expose new music like Chris Botti. We also play a lot of the older fusion like Weather Report. We don't program a lot of acid jazz because our core listeners came from "The Wave."

What do you bring to the show that makes people tune in?

I try to bring recognition to the jazz show by programming plenty of new music. We also have the "Producer's Corner," where, every week, I pick a new song that has the poThe odd couple of radio formats has to be Jazz and Top 40. Think oil and water. Dodgers and Yankees, Moses and Pharoah... The surface elements just don't appear to be compatible at all. Or so it seems. At WFLZ (93.3)/Tampa, though, a successful marriage between the two disparate formats has been achieved in harmonious fashion, thanks to a pair of local radio veterans.

It all came about because of a void left in the Tampa radio market when the prevailing commercial 24-hour jazz station, WHVE/"The Wave," changed its format to adult alternative. A year later, 93.3 recruited Al Santana, one of the most popular jocks from "The Wave," to host a new jazz show airing 7am-10am, "The Sunday Jazz Jam," produced by WFLZ Programming and Promotion Assistant Dennis "Big D" Clark. "The show has been on the air for two years," Clark relates. "I got involved because I used to do some contemporary jazz on college radio. Since I had some knowledge of the music, I assumed the role of music coordinator and producer." JAMZ Broadcast Editor "Yes She" Kandace Taylor sat with Clark to talk about the success of this unseemly union. No, not Taylor and Clark...

Does it help or hinder you that the jazz show is on a Top 40 station?


In the beginning, it hindered us because people didn't realize we were there. But now people have discovered they can be hip like their kids and listen to the same station. It unites two different generations. We teasingly say, "The Sunday Jazz Jam gives the station a warm, fuzzy side." It's a good balance. None of this could have happened if it wasn't for GM Dave Reihart, our programmer BJ Harris or APD Jeff Tanner. They've all been very supportive.

What are your ideas on promoting jazz?

Programmers and producers should have strong relationships with label reps because they are the ones who are going to get the product to you and help you with promotions. In-stores with local retailers are also very important. The signing of CDs and photos can get people excited about artists and their projects.


What is your goal for the show?

What we're really trying to show the community is that a jazz show can be viable. It's all about the community forming relationships with the station.

Dialogue with Kevin Eubanks by Scott Yanow



Were you surprised at Branford Marsalis' decision to take a leave of absence from the "Tonight Show"?

Yes, it caught me a bit by surprise. He had pulled me aside a while before to talk about maybe leaving, but I didn't expect it to happen.

How did you learn that you were going to be the new bandleader?

Branford asked me if I'd be interested in the job and said that he was going to bring up my name to Jay Leno. Jay then asked me about it and we decided to give it a shot.

### Do you think the band's role will change at all from how it was with Branford?

No, the role remains the same. Of course, when different people lead groups, they have different ideas that they are trying to achieve. We deal with all different kinds of music, so we have to be able to play many styles as authentically as possible. It is my job to help the band be as much of an asset to the show as possible.

### How long did it take to plan and record your most recent record, "Spiritalk 2"?

It took about six months to write, two days to record and it was all done live. I've been playing acoustically for years and I love the sound of a steel string guitar. It blends well on the album with the bass, trombone and flute. I always prefer acoustic instruments in general for they have a much more natural sound.

### How did you happen to start on the guitar?

Actually, I started on violin, playing it for six years, then trumpet for four and I've always played piano. Guitar kind of snuck in there when I was 13 and I stuck with that.

### What was it about jazz that made you want to play it as opposed to other styles of music?

I originally listened to funk and rock. I found that one can learn a lot more about music by playing jazz than by playing almost any other type of music for one has to understand melody, harmony and interacting with other in-

ith the surprising decision by Branford Marsalis to take a leave of absence as leader of the "Tonight Show" Band, guitarist Kevin Eubanks has smoothly taken control, both as the musical director and in the roll of the good-natured bantering sidekick to Jay Leno that Marsalis refused to assume. Eubanks has been considered one of the most stimulating and virtually unclassifiable quitarists in jazz ever since he made his recording debut in 1982. struments to create a blend. Musicians cannot play jazz without learning more and more about music.

### When did you know that you were going to be a professional musician?

I was seven. My mother, uncle and brothers were always playing music and my whole family was very much into music. It's hard to put into words how much easier it is when one grows up surrounded by musicians. I took a lot for granted until I met people who did not come from a musical household. I believed in myself as a player a lot earlier than if I had to guess whether it was possible to be a musician. Before I even started playing professionally, I always knew it was what I was going to be; there was never a second thought about it.

### Being on the "Tonight Show." do you get many opportunities to play in clubs with your own group?

No, unfortunately not and I'm not really all that interested in being a sideman at this point. There are certain musicians who I enjoy playing with and I'd rather wait for the opportunity to do that because I'm after a specific sound and style.

#### What are your goals for the future?

I'd like to better balance my career with my personal life while still progressing musically. It seems like up until now, my career has outweighed my personal life and I want to try to get a better balance. At the same time, I feel that I'm on to something important musically and I don't want to lose that.

How did you get started in the business?

I was a disc jockey in Philadelphia when I was 19 at a 24-hour jazz station, WHAT-FM, in my second year of college. I always wanted to be a record producer, but I thought by being a disc jockey, I would be able to meet the musicians and the record companies. You know, to have a forum in which to attack the record production.

When did you first meet Nesuhi Ertegun?

I had been in correspondence with Nesuhi Ertegun at Atlantic since I was 14. I heard a Ray Charles record on the radio in my grandmother's kitchen on a Friday night and I went nuts! The planet put its brakes on for me when I heard "Ain't That Love." That was in like '54, '55. As a result of hearing that record, I became a Ray Charles fiend and then upon discovering that he was with Atlantic Records, I then became an Atlantic Records lunatic! So I started to write Nesuhi letters with the hope, at that time, of becoming a record producer.

### How did your relationship with Nesuhi develop into reality?

After we were in contact by letter and phone for about seven or eight years, Nesuhi used to let me come up and sit in on his sessions with Herbie Mann, Hank Crawford, Betty Carter. So I learned by being allowed to come and watch. In those days, there wasn't anywhere you could go to learn to be a record producer. After I drove him to the edge of insanity bugging him to let me produce records, he told me to find someone that no one had ever heard. He would give me a budget and this would be my only chance. If the record went, then we could talk about maybe doing a second record.

### Tell us about your first project.

I was in touch with all the jazz clubs in Philly because they were all sponsors of the station. Jack Goldenburg, owner of a club called Pep's, knew I was looking to find a live act. Jack called me at the station one night and told

loel Dorn is a multi-Grammy-winning producer whose work for Atlantic Records has garnered five platinum and ten gold records. Dorn literally grew up on Atlantic Records' music during the '50s, a particularly fertile time that saw Ray Charles, John Coltrane, Herbie Mann, Hank Crawford and the Modern Jazz Quartet, among others, make it the decade's top label, outdistancing even Columbia Records' stable of jazz studs such as Miles Davis and Thelonious Monk. Dorn joined Atlantic as a staff producer in the late '60s and kept its legacy intact with Rahsaan Roland Kirk, Hurbert Laws, Eddie Harris and Les McCann, reaching a pinnacle with Roberta Flack and, later, Bette Midler.

In 1967, along with Gene Paul, son of legendary guitarist/inventor Les Paul, Dorn began working under the guidance of his mentor and driving force behind Atlantic jazz. Nesuhi Ertegun, brother of Atlantic Records founder Ahmet Ertegun. Dorn's approach to production was conceptual, creating frameworks and settings that were more like parties in which the musicians could work. He lit candles and welcomed visitors ranging from labelmate King Curtis to celebrities such as Muhammad Ali and Faye Dunaway. Dorn would then kick back, while partner Paul made sure that the technology never got in the way. What they produced - along with Ertegun - were some of the brightest moments in jazz. Dorn took time out from doing something really interesting — like overseeing Atlantic jazz reissues through Rhino Records to something excruciatingly tedious, a chat with JAMZ Research Editor and jazz buff Quincy "What's?" Newell.



me he had found my guy. Mongo Santamaria had a big hit with "Watermelon Man" at the time and he had a new group that was touring behind the record. Jack told me that the flute player was unbelievable. [That was when] I heard Hubert Laws for the first time. I leaped at him like

a lion out of the brush. I signed him to Atlantic, made the first Hubert Laws record, "Laws of Jazz," and it did very well. He went on to win downbeat magazine's "New Artist Deserving Of Wider Recognition." Surprisingly, on that record, it was Laws, a new piano player, Chick Corea, bassist Richard Davis and the drummer was Joe Chambers! So the first record I ever made wasn't a bad group of guys!

You brought other successful projects to Atlantic.

I had been on the radio for about six or seven years and developed really solid relationships with a lot of musicians. So when I went to Atlantic, I brought Roland Kirk and Yusef Lateef with me. Les McCann and I kind of arrived at the same time, so I did his records. I also did a Herbie Mann record and an Eddie Harris record.

You eventually picked up where Nesuhi left off and became Atlantic's jazz authority.

Nesuhi was a legendary producer, but for a producer of that status, he was egoless. He had done all the great Atlantic recordings with Coltrane, Ornette Coleman, Charles Mingus, The Modern Jazz Quartet, all the classic stuff. So in the mid-'60s, he said, "Listen, I'm not in the clubs anymore... it's time to turn it over to somebody young." I was lucky enough that he picked me to be his protégé. I was blown away. I always wanted to be a producer for Atlantic because it was such a magical companv. I was overwhelmed by the fact that not only did they have Coltrane, but the Drifters, too!

Who are some of the artists that you've produced over the years?

Les McCann, Eddie Harris, Herbie Mann, Hubert Laws, Freddie Hubbard, Charles Mingus, Junior Mance, Ray Bryant, Yusef Lateef, Oscar Brown Jr., Jimmy Scott, Roberta Flack and Bette Midler, both of whom I discovered, Donnie Hathaway, Don McLean, Aaron Neville, the Neville Brothers, Peter Allen. I did Kate Smith! I've made about 250 records last time I counted.


Why did you leave Atlantic?

Atlantic was being sold and Nesuhi was in Europe setting up their European division. I felt the era was coming to an end. I didn't feel things would be the same, so after being there for seven years, I thought it was time to venture out and do some other things.

How did you become involved in the Atlantic/Rhino jazz catalog?

Rhino has a house full of these young kids that know master numbers and who played drums on which session. I really had to convince my way into Rhino. [Rhino President | Richard Foos understood what I was saying

and gave me the opportunity to do what I said I could do. which was to do a re-issue in the same spirit as the original recordings. He gave me the complete freedom to do what I wanted. So I put it together the way I thought Nesuhi and I would've put it together. I've never been hap-

pier with the result of any work I've ever done in my life than I am with the Rhino/Atlantic Jazz Gallery Series. I can't believe that I had the opportunity to write the history of Atlantic's jazz in the way that I thought would best present it to a new generation and preserve it for the generation that had heard it before.

Where do you see jazz headed?

I don't know where anything's going, but I do know this: Some originals are starting to emerge now. I have a production deal with Epic where I work for a label called Epicure. One of the musicians that I'm recording is a young drummer named Leon Parker. He's an original, even though he's part of the neo-classical generation. There is a saxophone player on Atlantic named James Carter; he's an original. I think what's happening is that the music has been kept alive and now the people who have kept it alive are starting to produce some originals.

Any other projects?

We're continuing with the Atlantic/Rhino reissues. In August, we're coming out with the complete John Coltrane on Atlantic, seven CDs. The heavyweight champion. I've found some stuff by Coltrane that no one ever knew existed. There's going to be one CD which includes takes of Coltrane classics no one's ever heard. The complete Coltrane has a 75-page book, six CDs plus the bonus CD. We're going to do a Charles Lloyd box and a Milt Jackson box. Also for Rhino, I'm doing a video and CD history of the Montreux Jazz Festival. Also a four-CD set, "The History of Ella Fitzgerald," on Decca.

Is there anyone out there you would like to work with if the opportunity arose?

There is one person I would really like to make a record with before I die and that's Ray Charles.

PUTTING THE MIX

Why did you put a jazz video show on in Dallas? I wanted to bring a show to Dallas that was very versatile. What they had wasn't geared toward the older crowd. The main attraction was being able to put out a family show that the whole household could enjoy. So everyone gets a piece of something that will strike their interest, which works out to jazz for the older people, R&B for the middle-aged people and hip-hop for the youngsters. That's how I came with the name "Jazz Video Mix." The first thing people think of when they hear the name of the show is that it's only a jazz show. But the concept is a mixture of the various types of African-American cultural sounds, ranging from jazz all the way to today's music.

How did you come up with the concept?

I did a lot of research on my market before I pursued the show. Everything I wanted to find out, I got from the publie, just asking questions, talking to various people without them knowing why I'm asking these questions, just striking up conversations. I wanted to know what their real feelings were. I went ahead trying to prove to record companies that there weren't enough jazz shows out there and there was a hungry audience waiting for one.


Why didn't you try to make it an all-jazz show?

I wanted the show to have variety. It's very important for the younger generation of the African-American community to know about jazz music and all it has to offer. I think the only way the young folks could ever get hip and educated about jazz is to have the type of show they can relate to. The mix format is calculated and very deliberate. When they watch the show, they say: "Hey, jazz is not so bad after all... it's really pretty deep.'

Do you feel like you're educating the younger generation?

It's important that the people who made jazz what it is are not forgotten. And it's very important that the young folks know the meaning of jazz and where it's coming from. They need to understand the different philosophies of what the music has to offer. When you get that mix of jazz, R&B and hip-hop, everybody seems to be able to sit down and enjoy it and learn from it. You get the older generation and young folks interacting together around the TV in a positive way, each one teaching the other.

With jazz's standing as the progenitor of all music that African-Americans hold dear, it was only a matter of time before today's generation demanded this most traditional music in video form. Jazz lovers, regardless of age, want to see their music onscreen alongside



Jazz music videos occupy a unique place in today's music scene. They attract an older demographic to the more youthful video medium. The challenge is to maintain jazz's integrity while battling the forces of MTV, BET and The Box to present jazz in a configuration young viewers can identify with. For an example of how this works, JAMZ Research Assistant Aaron Boulding "And The Beautiful," sauntered off to Dallas to talk with "Jazz Video Mix'''s Marty Capers about jazz and videos before holing up in the Texas Book Depository for the rest of his ill-fated visit.

What has been your most satisfying experience with "Jazz Video Mix"?

Last 4th of July, the local jazz station ("The Oasis") and I sponsored a concert. It was the most beautiful thing I've ever seen, with hip-hoppers and jazz fans coming together to see artists like Richard Elliot and a local group called Fingerprints, among others. I was overwhelmed because I was expecting a much older crowd, but a lot of the younger people were dedicated viewers of the show. I think there's something particular about "Jazz Video Mix" that makes it appealing. I hope I'm presenting viewers with a total package of the African-American music experience.

### How did all of your experiences lead to your present post?

They gave me a really good background for what I'm doing now. I don't think I would be able to do this job otherwise. Especially if you look at the amount of time I've been working in this industry. Being the leader of a band taught me about pro-

duction and how to negotiate contracts. Club promotions taught me how to deal with record companies, the hip-hop people and set up release parties. Being a road manager, I learned how to cope with the difficulties that artists have when out on tour. I am able to relate to the artists, promoters and the reps on the road.

Why is it so great to work for Motown?

In terms of being able to grow, I don't think there is any better place in the world for a young black person to be than Motown, with Clarence Avant, Jheryl Busby, Steve McKeever, Oscar Fields, James Cochran, Paris Eley, Cynthia Manley. They and Motown are icons in this business. I was very fortunate to come into the company when it was expanding. There was a need for people to go beyond the call of duty. I wouldn't have received that opportunity at any other record company.

What is your marketing plan for MoJAZZ this quarter?

The main thing is to bring the artists out into the streets. We're going back to the old school methodology that Motown had back in the day. You have to play to win. That means you have to expose your artists to the marketplace. We are also targeting radio by releasing multi-formatted music. We want to foster collaboration with our artists. You'll start to see everybody playing on each other's records, just like Motown used to do in the past. A lot more visibility at conventions and festivals.

Our mentality is to market MoJAZZ as a street label. We want to be viewed as a solid, urban, contemporary-based jazz label. We want to take care of that middle ground between jazz and R&B.

Many labels rank radio in terms of importance, but you don't seem to have the same philosophy.

Commercial, secondary stations, non reporting, college stations. We want to be on everybody's dial! We feel we have the music that fits most people's formats. Radio has been very receptive to our music, especially in regards to Norman Brown.

Who are some of the artists we can expect to hear this year? Eric Reed, Ronnie Martin, our first female vocalist. The basketball player, Wayman Tisdale. A new project from Norman Brown. J. Spencer with a matured sound and a new image. And much more...

MoJAZZ VP A&R Motown/GM MoJAZZ Bruce Walker launched his career in the music business by sneaking out of the house against his parents' wishes to teach himself to play percussion. Although he played in several Top 40 cover bands, he joined the corporate world after graduation, but hated it. He went on to recruit athletes for Whittier College, then worked with local politicians on minority student programs before going into the defense industry. He did some radio spots and club promotions and served as Public Relations Director for the Academy of Songwriters before he went to Japan to play and produce records.

When he returned to the States, Walker's friend [Motown National Director of Pop Promotion] Michael Williams hired him as an internation he went over to work in the A&R department with Cynthia Manley before [Motown Sr. VP A&R] Steve McKeever offered him a gig as project coordinator. Three years later, he's moved up the ranks from A&R Manager to A&R Department Manager to GM Custom Labels (MoJAZZ & Mad Sounds) to Associate Director of Product Management to his current gig as Sr. Director for MoJAZZ, where he was quickly brought to his knees by a swift boot in the groin from JAMZ' feisty Goddess "Kick The" Kandace Taylor.

### What is the MoJAZZ Cafe?

We're establishing a venue for people to come out and have a good time on Wednesday nights. It's a place where local musicians and international musicians, basically the hottest cats around, can come in and know that on Wednesday nights they have a place in L.A. where they can jam! It's where the old school meets the new school. We'll be selling T-shirts, hats, coffee mugs and all kinds of MoJAZZ merchandise. We hope to establish MoJAZZ Cafes around the country.

What's the key to Bruce Walker?

Having traveled a great deal and being the middle child have given me the ability to handle my position. Understanding what each person's objective is and working together, we can have some success. I'm trying to learn and grow everyday.

We give our people free reign. If you have an idea, bring it to the table. Steve McKeever told me at the start, you gotta learn from your mistakes and have an open mind enough to know when something isn't working, try something else.



# ROLL, OVER BEETHOVEN: HAM, S. LASSICAL After working with Jimmy Jam &

How did you learn all those instruments?

I grew up in South Central Los Angeles listening to jazz and going to church. Music was always around. My father was a musician, a percussionist. He and his buddies would do sets around L.A., Texas and New York. In elementary school, we had a music course and I chose the violin as my instrument. I practiced a lot, learned my scales. In junior high, I started to play the sax. Then I played around on my father's organ and then I took guitar lessons for a while. I just kept picking up different instruments.

How did you get involved in rap?

I started to hang out on the L.A. rap scene, meeting people like Ice T, Eazy E, Dr. Dre, Yo Yo, Jinx. When they found out I could play all these instruments, I got a chance to play on a lot of their stuff. I would add keyboards, lay down the bass, program the drums, add some sax, whatever I felt their stuff needed. Often, I didn't get eredit, but I was happy to be down.

When did you start concentrating on your own material?

After working on so many other people's projects for so long, I decided to do my own. After producing demos for people and shopping deals for them, I decided to use the tracks for myself.

How did you develop your unique style?

I started experimenting with different rhyme flows. I didn't want to be a singer, just whining and begging all the time. I wanted a melodic rhyme flow. "Hip Hop Jazz," the first cut on the album, was a demo I did three years ago. I just put on the headphones and free-styled over it. That's when I began to develop my style, which is like a singing flow that I call "SmooveMadScat."

Tell me about your first single, "Good Thangz."

"Good Thangz" was the last track I did. The idea was, like, to do a song with a slow melody, but with a gangsta flow. The female voice on the track is kinda deep and raspy, and I'm coming across kinda smooth. I thought it would be a different twist.

How did you get your deal with Underworld?

I had met [Underworld partner] Darryl Porter when I was shopping groups. I ran into him again in the green room at the "Arsenio Hall Show." At the time, I was playing with Domino. We hooked up and he played my stuff for the

whole. His first solo album. "The Funky Descendent." seems like the complete antithesis of his original foray into the business. In reality, Hami is a classically trained musician who plays violin. tenor and alto sax, keyboards, classical guitar, bass, drums, percussion. flute, piano, organ and the

kitchen sink. As if this weren't enough, he also produces other artists such as MoKenStef and is an accomplished singer, rapper and DJ.

HITS' own hip-hop goddess "Slo-Mo" Shannita Williams sat down with Hami to discuss his individuality, his classical and jazz influences and his access to a Capitol publicity expense account for lunch.

Hughes Brothers [producer/directors of "Menace II Society" and Underworld Records co-partners]. They loved it and were ready to talk.

How did you incorporate your classical training into the album?

The whole album is based on classical music. You would never notice it, though. The melody of the third song, "Leave It Alone," is based on Bach's "Concerto in D Minor for Two Violins." A lot of the music on the album is based on classical melodies or rhythms. Except I would use a synthesized bass instead of a cello. I just replaced the classical instrument with something modern.

You're very into Beethoven.

The album was originally titled "The Funky Descendant of Beethoven." Beethoven, to me, represents many different moods. When he's mad or sad or angry, it came through in his music. I'm like that, too. I was into Beethoven even before I found out about his African ancestry.

How did people react to your interest in classical music?

It wasn't easy walking around South Central when I was younger carrying a violin case and being into Beethoven, Bach and Mozart. That's what kids today have to do. They have to learn to be original and not just do what everyone else is doing.

# ATLANTIC ATL

Why is Atlantic Jazz back on the map?

[Atlantic Group Chairman/CEO] Ahmet Ertegun founded this company on jazz and R&B. It has a very rich legacy and, over the past decade or so, since the passing of his brother [Nesuhi], there has never really been a focus on the music. In the fall of '93, the powers-that-be wanted to make their new business their old business, meaning jazz. I don't believe a record company can call itself a full-service label without jazz, so they brought me aboard as head of the division.

How do you position jazz at Atlantic?

Eulis Cathey is my National Director of Promotions, Kim Ewing our publicist and Nicole Sutherland our departmental assistant. It's just the four of us. We felt it was important to bring the Atlantic legacy to the forefront. We did that by signing a few new artists right off, like Cyrus Chestnut, drummer Carl Allen and saxophonist Wes Anderson. It was just real important to step out and say, "We're back!" With that concerted effort—when you have someone calling radio and someone talking to publications every day plugging the artist into certain marketing opportunities—you can't help but be recognized.

How does it feel to be the only woman heading a jazz division at a major label?

The only time I really think about it is when someone brings it to my attention. I'm just here doing my job. I guess it feels good that I'm able to look at some of the people that I work with, some of the people that taught me, and know that I'm in the same meetings that they're in, doing the same thing that they're doing. People have been giving me the same type of respect that they're getting. I don't feel any pressure because I've been doing this for awhile. My experience and hard work are what

Native New Yorker Michelle Taylor has been a jazz specialist for ten years, beginning at Blue Note Records as a promotion assistant. Since then, she has made stops at EMI Records, Verve Records and RCA Records' Novus label before being named Senior Director of the Atlantic Jazz division in 1994. She oversees the careers of many new "young lions" such as James Carter, Cyrus Chestnut, Rohn Lawrence, Straight Ahead and Wes Anderson. However, JAMZ Research Assistant and resident lackey Joshua "Fought The Battle of Jericho" Miller probed more deeply and got Taylor to admit a passion to hunt wild boar with rocker Ted Nugent.


has enabled me to get where I'm at. It's a matter of being good at what you do and keeping a level of integrity.

Are there disadvantages to being a woman? I haven't experienced any. Within the music industry, the whole climate is changing as far as male vs. female goes. Being a female in the business of jazz is wonderful. The level of respect is there all across the board: my contemporaries, the musicians, the agents and the managers. Respect has to be earned. At this point, I think that I have earned it.

What are the differences in marketing traditional vs. contemporary jazz?

They are two very distinct styles. Contemporary music is more appealing to the masses because it's easier for them to understand. But jazz is jazz is jazz. Just because you play "contemporary jazz" does not mean that you are going to sell any more records than a straight-ahead musician or that you are going to get any more gigs. There are several contemporary artists that have broken through and have done real well, as have some traditional artists.

With traditional artists, you have to be more careful



where you place your dollars because there is a smaller circle within which to work. My goal is to change that. I want to see some of these traditional artists sell 100,000 units or even get gold records. We have to go outside of the norm and really think about breaking the artist as

opposed to the music that he plays. So many of these artists are so versatile. We have to open up our ways of thinking about this music and try to incorporate them into the mainstream.

### How important are radio and retail?

Without them, we wouldn't be able to expose artists. There are many other avenues now for exposure but, initially, radio needs to be there and, of course, retail. We need people talking about our records in the stores. Also, it's important jazz is played on other radio formats. You do hear it being played on Quiet Storm from time to time. And some jazz artists have been fortunate enough to break through into the Adult Pop or Triple-A market. I think that can happen; we just have to be creative in our programing.

### Is there room for growth for young jazz executives?

There's always room for growth. Young people are always full of

ideas and they're not restricted to old ways of thinking. While there aren't that many positions available in the jazz arena, when they do become available, young people should seek them out because jazz is a very challenging genre, one that really gets your creative juices flowing. Because it's not readily accepted by the masses, you have to be creative and versatile. We welcome new blood. I was young once, too, and someone took a chance on me. You really have to do your homework to survive... that's what I tell young people who are interested in coming in. Pay attention and know who the movers and shakers are.

### Where do you see jazz going?

There are a lot of talented young musicians as well as a great many veteran musicians experimenting and moving in different directions. It's very healthy. People are becoming more comfortable with jazz. Corporate America is starting to spend money on jazz. You hear jazz in commercials. You see jazz on billboards. You see jazz in publications that would have never written about jazz before. Jazz is getting healthier. The future looks good. The music's in good hands. I'm very excited about what's to come.

### Where would you like to take the Atlantic Jazz department?

I want the roster to grow into one that's dynamic. I want us to include all facets of this music: contemporary, traditional and even some of the newer forms that lend themselves to the genre, like hip-hop. I want us to continue doing what we're doing, making the consumer aware that Atlantic has great jazz to offer. I think we're moving along those lines because we have young talent, but we also have veterans like the Modern Jazz Quartet. The jazz business is a tough business. It's a matter of just having good music to put out. I'd like to see us sell more records, continue to sign top-notch quality artists and further the Atlantic jazz legacy.

What new jazz projects do you have coming up?



We think this song will garner even more action, especially in the clubs, where DJs can feast on five separate versions. Look for the album, "Scent of Attraction," in the next several weeks.



### PRINCE MARKIE DEE "Crunch Time" Soul Convention/Motown

Prince Markie Dee blends a smooth, street-wise hip-hop sensibility with a touch of R&B on "Crunch Time." The song has a bouncing, playful

rhythm backed with a hefty chorus that's infectious in its singalong intentions. The East Coast gets much props throughout, as Dee switches lines with rapper Hasan The Love Child over basketball metaphors galore. The CD single contains a radio edit, LP, instrumental and a cappella versions.





The man who brought you one of last year's biggest singles, "Hot-stepper," returns with another hotly added song. This one chills the pace a bit at the

## ENCHANTED "Love Vacation" RCA

A smooth ride is offered from the first note to the pleasing last shimmer. If you recall 1991's woefully overlooked "Innocence," you've got a

smattering of what to expect: hypnotic groove, masterful production, thoughtful choices of instruments and a seductively mysterious vocal chant. Look for Quiet Storm and evening shows to latch onto this song, while club DJs will be able to mix seven versions, including a Spanish translation. Sounds like multi-demos to us.



CHRIS ISAAK sits in his shiny '64 Chevy Nova and waits, crouching in the dark, peeking over the steering wheel with a squinty eye. What's he waiting for? Just a parking space for a rather popular S.F. seafood restaurant, nothing more. Bay Area natives will go to exhaustive lengths for good parking, it's true, but a psychologist might dub Isaak's behavior as a tad obsessive-compulsive. Which makes sense, since the princely pompadoured film 'n' rock-vid heartthrob has been somewhat obsessed lately. His three-year affair with a certain ex-manager recently hit the skids, and he didn't just dwell on the breakup - he penned a 13-song concept album about it, the haunting new "Forever Blue" on Reprise. Ironically, it's his best - and most musically upbeat - work to date. In fact, the record works like therapy, starting with the sinister R&B production of "Baby Did A Bad, Bad Thing," edging into the whining "Don't Leave Me On My Own," slinking low into the hushed title track, then finally crawling out on its belly with the tombstone-final cowpoke dirge "The End Of Everything." Along the path, there are sunshiny rockabilly revivals that seem to forecast some hope - "Somebody's Crying," "I Believe," "There She Goes." But no... This wake is as brassy as a street-parading New Orleans funeral, though it can't disguise the fact something died here, something Isaak held remarkably dear. And for added David Lynch-ish effect, the disc ends with bluebirds twittering happily, a la "Blue Velvet," offering a false sense of security that all is right in our tortured tunesmith's little world. Of course, that facade came crashing to the ground the moment he came face-to-face with the probing proboscis of HITS' NoCal filibusterer, Tom "Wishes He Were Paid By The Word" Lanham.

So, a break-up, hunh?

I remember thinking this last year — if life was a pinball game, all of a sudden I got to that advanced stage where you go, "Oooh! I never got to THIS part of it before! It's the 'Griefatorium!' Look, I can barely walk! This is neat." You reach a point where people say, "Are you OK?" and you respond with [mumbled whisper]: "Yeah, sure."

Good-looking rock stars aren't supposed to go through things like this.

That's what I said to her as we broke up. "I'm a handsome rock star! You can't do this to me!" [Launching into a credible Cagney] "Nobody does this to me, see? You're not walkin' out on ME, I'm walkin' out on YOU, see?" That's kind of how it was. I took off in my car thinking I'm gone, I'm outta here. And I started driving from L.A. to San Francisco with this horrible feeling of missing someone already, like, "I'm in the picture, but where's she?" I got a ticket that day, too. I was literally drivin' and cryin'.

"Forever Blue" is written in a pretty honest first person, an approach you seldom use.

You hear that first person, and you're IN the song, looking out, and it's a lot stronger. On this album, more than ever, is a very specific picture in my head of one person... because it was very specific and fresh when I wrote it. If anything, I had to edit out a lot of stuff — some things I toned down, thinking, "This is too dark" or "This is too specific to our relationship; no one would understand it but us." I tried to pull back from that a little bit, and use songs that other people could relate to.

So I just wrote things down, and in a weird way, it was like doing math — I looked at it, thinking, "What went wrong and where?" And I saw it: "Right here, no matter how I add up this column, it comes out that she doesn't love me. She may say this, but it doesn't add up." It came out to that every time, and when that happened, it was much more final and devastating. I still kept imagining that maybe she'd come back and say,

"Why, honey, you misunderstood! When I placed that snake on your pillow, it was a... a... a love charm!" What, exactly was the "bad, bad thing" that brought this on?


The main thing that happened I couldn't talk about, because it would still be painful for her. I could say that it came like an explosion, when I was totally unaware, and it was like, one day you have a relationship and you think everything's pretty good, and the next, nothing.


You caught her on a date with Dom DeLuise!

Actually, I would've been damn proud of that. Infidelity I could've forgiven pretty easily. But I think the bad, bad thing, when you cut through all the incidents, is when you find out that they don't love you when you thought they did. You know what'll make you sad? Look at someone you love who's done you wrong, then look at a picture of 'em when they were a kid, and think that somewhere along the way, someone slapped 'em, hit 'em or punched 'em — either psychologically or physically, and it came out on you. A lot of times, they themselves don't have much to do with it.

#### So you're finally making some progress in getting over this?

People keep telling me, "You should talk to somebody." And you go, "Yeah... but why should I talk to somebody else when I really wanna talk to her?" Why pay somebody else? It'd be cheaper to take her out to dinner, wouldn't it? But I wouldn't change too much about my life - the only thing that I would want to do differently is I wish that I'd been nicer to some people and that's about it. But I'm working on that, I'm improving. Or at least not getting worse at the same rate I was. But if I had one thing I could do right now, if someone said the world was going to end in a couple of hours, I'd say, "Well, how long will it take me to get to my ex's house?" And people say, "Well, why don't you do that, then?" And I say, "Because I know the world isn't going to end right away." In real life, we have to go on for a long, long time.■

Working around his current project, a film about the late graffiti artist/painter Jean-Michel Basquiat, 42-year-old Julian Schnabel, accomplished artist and sculptor, squeezed HITS into his busy schedule, meeting us at the building on 11th Street near the Hudson River which houses his home and studio. The vastly impressive loft space on the floor above his home contains two of his own works, 20' by 20' paintings, one a

textured abstract and the other a biomorphic image running down the middle against a dark background. There, amid hanged paintings of Jean-Michel, he discussed his entree into music with his Island Records bow, "Every Silver Lining Mas A Cloud."

Bearing the influences of Schnabel's close friends John Cale and Lou Reed, the album is a marvelous first effort for this well-connected and established artist, full of soft laments like "Carey Came Back," and Jubilant rockers such as "She's Dancing, He's Dreaming" and "Immigration Song."

On record and in person, Julian touches on all the people that are closest to him, his second wife Olatz, with whom he has 18-month-old twin sons, actor Gary Oldman and Carey Burtt. He points out a piano he bought with Cale, and tells me about how he once suggested to him at Andy Warhol's wake that a requiem should

be done in Warhol's honor.

In true Schnabel style, the release of this record was ballyhooed with a listening party for friends and honchos held at the Tenth Street Lounge on the Lower East Side, with an impressive spread of hors d'oeuvres. HITS' hungry N.Y. correspondent Janet "She Remembers Choo-Choo Coleman" Trakin's only regret was that she forgot to take a doggy bag.

#### When did you first realize that you were an artist?

I didn't have a choice. I never decided I was going to be an artist. My father didn't pay much attention to me when I was little. Now he does. My mother was very supportive and took me to museums. I guess I was able to draw, so it was a Pavlovian beginning. I've been painting for 40 years, since I was three years old. When I was 15, I had a band — as I was always interested in music. When I moved to Texas, it was a little harder to find people that were interested in the same music as me. Painting was always something I did by myself... it's like breathing to me.

#### What artists inspired you?

I liked Picasso a lot, and Vincent Van Gogh when I was younger. Later, I became more interested in Italian painters like Giotto and Fra Angelico. It depends on the painting. I like the monk cells in Florence. I like Carvaggio and Pierre De La Francesca.

#### Did you ever struggle as an artist?

I struggle every day. I'm struggling to get through this day right now. But were there times I didn't have any money? Absolutely. You just figure out what you have to do to get through to the end of the day. Or what you have to sell in order to survive. I've sold boxes of old sunglasses at 50 cents a pair. I've also had a lot of different types of jobs. I was a cab driver and a cook.

However, I was always painting, so when I wasn't cooking or doing something like that, I was doing my art.

#### Why did you make this record?

These are love songs I wrote to somebody. I wrote all the songs in two weeks. It took me about a year to record them, but I guess it took me 42 years to make a record. I was always interested in painting, just as I was always interested in music. Whenever I'm painting, I'm always listening to something. Whether it's Ennio Morricone's soundtrack to "1900," Bernard Herrman, Miles, the Sex Pistols or John Cale.

#### You sound a lot like John Cale on the album.

I don't know that I sound like him. He's got a beautiful voice. Certainly, I like John Cale a lot. He's a good friend of mine.

#### The beginning of "Carey Came Back" sounds like the intro to "Walk On The Wild Side."

It does sound like that. You learn that there's a finite set of notes, and you start playing them, and you hear a bunch of tunes all the time. It's funny. That one song "I Tried" sounds a little like "Pat Garrett and Billy The Kid." Sometimes my voice sounds like Johnny Cash. I lived in Texas, so it sounds like I'm from Texas when I'm singing.

#### Is "I Tried" about being worthy enough to be

It's about having a family and losing your family, and separation. It's about how things don't work out sometimes. It's a

love song.

#### In "If You Leave, Don't Come Back" there is an ultimatum. Do you think ultimatums work?

I think I could have been saying, "If you leave, please come back." I think there's anger in some of the songs as much as hope. There's frustration and insane moments of laughing at yourself or the pathetic situation you might find yourself in because you're in love with somebody. People have said to me that the song offers a perfect way of getting somebody back. I don't take it that literally.

#### is "When I Was Young" a projection into the future when Olatz might no longer be around?

She doesn't have to be gone. I think what happens is that even if something is biographical or autobiographical, you end up making it fiction. You make up these songs by taking experiences from different relationships and blending them together. There may be a sadness or a certain quality that comes from the loss of one relationship that gets blended into another relationship. Yes, it's a projection if Olatz wasn't there anymore, but the fact is, that's not the case. At the time those songs were written, there was a lot of doubt about the possibility of the relationship happening, and I was talking to myself writing it. I was pretty disturbed and anxious about the whole thing. It's like when you're dying, your whole life runs in front of you in a couple of seconds.

## TIME TO FIND THE POT OF GOLD AT THE END OF THE RAINBOW WITH A HOUSE'S DAVE COUSE by Jason Cohen

A House is an Irish trio that made two littleheard records for Sire in the late '80s. Left for dead everywhere but their home country in the aftermath, the band surprised both the British press and discerning U.S. listeners when, with a refurbished line-up and a little help from producer [and ex-Orange Juice] Edwyn Collins, they re-emerged with '92's blisteringly cynical but joyously orchestrated popfest "I Am The Greatest" (Radioactive). Their new one is "Wide-Eyed and Ignorant," recorded mostly in '93 and finally out from Radioactive a year after its British release. It's a typically bittersweet cocktail of folksy melodicism, soulful punk energy and leader Dave Couse's sharp-tongued wordplay - plus horns, brassy female vocals and even musical saw on one track. With espresso machines and Van Morrison humming in the background, the carrot-topped Couse met up with HITS' Gaelic wannabe Jason "O" Cohen at — where else? — notorious East Village cafe and Eire-types hangout Si-né.

#### Where in Ireland are you from?

We all used to live on the same block in Dublin, where you're either in a band or you write poetry... there's fuck-all to do. You wouldn't believe how many bands are in Ireland. No one has a job over there; you have to find a way to occupy your time.

#### How long has this band been around?

We actually formed in `85, and we released our first single in '86, `Kick Me Again, Jesus," on our own label... 200 copies.

#### Do you like your first two records?

We were very naive with the first album. We were youngsters. But we're bitter old cynics now, y'know? We've been through the mill. We've been on and off labels like you wouldn't believe. For the first album, the record company got these producers who polished up the sound... they made it too nice, too big-sounding and didn't really keep much spirit on the record. But we were really proud of the second LP; we made it the way we wanted it. If we hadn't made that move, the band would have broken up by now - we would have lost all respect for ourselves because we would have made two albums that we were unhappy with. And what's the point of that, y'know?


#### How did you hook up with Edwyn Collins?

We've known him for awhile. We didn't see him for about four years and he was playing an acoustic gig at a small pub in Dublin, so we just went down to see him. A lot of people had asked him to produce before, but he never did. It's great... he's a very creative man. He adds a real flavor to our songs and brings out what's in the band.

#### You've mastered the art of talking rather than singing.

Well, y'see, I don't have a really good voice at all. I can't really sing, so I try to utilize my voice as much as I can. It's just another instrument, isn't it? You've got to try to make the most of it.

#### Are the words as autobiographical as thanseem?

My songs in the first person are about what I've experienced. A lot of the song titles are "I" ["I Wanted Too Much," "I Lie," "I Am Afraid"]. It's true, "I Am Afraid" is exactly how I feel. Everyone feels that way. Some people won't show it, 'cause maybe they're too young; it's very uncool to show your feelings. I was like that, but I'm afraid to be on my own; it's quite nerve-wracking. I'm afraid of a lot of things. I don't want to go bald, but I am. You have to face up to things. It's just honesty; people who are honest get a lot more respect. It's very brave to admit that you're a coward.

#### Catholicism seems to linger pretty strongly in your songs.

We're all Catholics. What it preaches essentially is wonderful; if everybody could actually live by the rules that were in it, it would be a great world to live in. All it preaches is "love thy neighbor, be easy on each other, no violence," all that crap. Which is very nice — it's a laid-back religion. But the thing about it is, in Ireland, the people bitch about each other all week, they hate each other, and then on Sunday they all go to mass to honor this God that preaches everything they don't do during the week. It's amazing. These staunch Catholics are the worst bigots in the world.

## Despite its title, the song "I Am The Greatest" paints a troubled picture of music-making and the record biz.

It was my frustration at the industry. It's all too complicated nowadays; there's too many people taking control of it. In the old days, it was just about music, and the record companies bowed down to the artists, but now the artists are bowing to the record companies. "Artists"... What a horrible word... "People in bands." Plus it's much more difficult nowadays. My theory is that there are just as many geniuses out there nowadays; it's just that it's much more difficult to do anything new. I've wracked my brain trying to think of anything new, and all you can do is basically write good songs and try to make them as different as possible to give your band an identity.

#### You could always try out folk music.

I write songs for a band, know what I mean? You use amplification to bring your point across as well. They say if you can't play a song on an acoustic guitar, it's a crap song, but I mean... that's bullshit. You need all the extras, too.

BEGGARS: High school buddies Eli Braden and Jeremy Kunz not only have a knack for writing pop songs rich with harmonies and hooks, they know how to spot the big "O" (that's "opportunity") when it comes knocking. After opening up for The Call in 1991, the duo took frontman Michael Been up on his offer

## It's Hard To Be A Saint In The City time for a shrimp on the barble with ed kuepper by



You and [fellow Saints founder] Chris Bailey still don't like each other very much, do you?

Chris feels a certain degree of bitterness and resentment towards me. I'm actually quite gracious towards

him. I think he's been indiscreet in some of his rantings and ravings, but I don't know, it's a funny situation in a lot of ways, because Chris kept going with the Saints, and I felt that was not a proper thing to do, even though I do recall saying, "If you want to keep it going, you can do so." It was a commercial decision on his part, but Chris likes to trump himself up as being the standard-bearer, the last soldier on the hill holding the flag and that wasn't really the case.

I had formed the Laughing Clowns and it was a total uphill battle because we weren't playing what the Saints were playing, we were doing something else, and so the Clowns went through a rocky period and Chris came back with a new shiny version of the Saints and made a killing. But he shouldn't have done it — for his own career. He should have been Chris Bailey much earlier on, because I don't think his version of the Saints really added to it.

#### Years later, though, you formed your own band called the Aints...

Yeah, because it's my prerogative to do so. The Aints was something that I had aboil for many years before it actually came together. I'd been wanting to take up some strands of things that I

Ed Kuepper was a Saint, and later he became an Aint. This 39year-old Australian punk pioneer also led the horn-laden Laughing Clowns, and nurtures quite the musical career under his own name, one that continues to be consistently unpredictable and impressively prolific. Since 1986's "Electrical Storm," Kuepper has been in a thrilling state of nonstop mutation, his output ranging from stripped-down acoustic balladry and knife-edge electro-folk to incendiary guitar-noise and orchestrated melodicism. Capitol released one of his records in '88 and then, after six years of import-only purgatory, Restless stepped in, Issuing a new record "Character Assassination," as well as the career retrospective "Butterfly Net" and now, "Honey's Steel Gold." Kuepper hooked up with MTS' Eccent-pert Jason "Voice of His Generation" Cohen in New York at the end of his brief U.S. tour, which sent him scurrying back Down Under.

thought could have developed a little bit further, because the Saints moved and developed very rapidly once we left Brisbane. We did the first album, and that was sort of indicative of what we were like in

'75-'76, but there was also a period of the Saints previous to that which was actually slower, and in some ways heavier, and in some ways a little bit more psychedelic. Anyway, I was always fascinated by that "pre-fast" era of the Saints, because I thought it captured an intensity, the searing heat of Brisbane. I wanted to take some of that and mingle with some areas of music that the Laughing Clowns hadn't explored to the fullest. So that's basically what the Aints were about.

Do you make distinctions between the Aints and your various other work solo and leading groups?

I can look at writing in a pretty sort of broad way, or I can narrow the focus if I want to achieve a certain mood or ambiance, and that's what I did with the Aints.

[The solo acoustic] "Today Wonder" is the album that was the true liberator, actually. Without it, the Aints wouldn't have been, because it was during that album that I realized what I needed to do. I see "Today Wonder" and maybe [the Aints'] "SLSQ" as sort of the two ends of what I did in the '90s.

#### Do you still live in Brisbane?

No, I live in Sydney. I sort of moved out of

Brisbane when the Saints left. I got up there sometimes, but it's not really all that viable a thing for me to live there at the moment. I'd quite like to, though. I like the fact that it's even smaller than Sydney, and more of a redneck sort of place; it's sort of inspiring in some ways.

What kind of music did you listen to as a kid?

I listened to the radio. I suppose what my mum liked was sort of passed on to me — Elvis, Hank Williams, Johnny Cash, Jim Reeves... The radio

Williams, Johnny Cash, Jim Reeves... The radio was really good in the '60s, and there was a lot of stuff there... the Easybeats, the Beatles, the Kinks. Also, when I first heard Sun Ra, that sort of music, made a connection with Australia to me, just the intensity of that, and that was a big influence on the Aints, and on the Clowns as well. Is it strange to finally be in America with a record deal

I wouldn't go so far as to say I thought, "Well, America can go fuck itself," I just sort of thought... "It's obviously there, it's the biggest record market in the world, but as far as I'm concerned, it's a big unknown." I don't think anyone really knows where things will sort of connect, so it's a matter of, most importantly, not gearing anything to the U.S. market. I didn't think about it for a while; I thought, when the time was right, something would happen.

How do you approach your lyrics — storytelling or autobiography?

I actually spend a lot of time on the lyrics, but I like them to sort of blend into the song; I actually feel uncomfortable when people ask me to go into them in great depth. I tend to edit things fairly brutally, because I think the melody is what's most important. I don't try to squeeze a line onto a melody; I'll chop things out rather than do that. Melody is what basically makes it work; the lyric is sort of there as a secondary thing.





Was L.A. once a nice place to live? I can't even imagine...

Well, I think it still is if you can find the right place to watch it all go down. Getting out of town helps. If you're here too long, you run the risk of thinking the whole world thinks like L.A. does. Which, of course, it doesn't. It's a place that's all about appearances. What you see is what you "think" you saw. And what you saw is what you're "sold" to see. Jaded doesn't begin to describe it, but hey, put me in a mountain cabin and I end up like Jack Nicholson at the Overlook Hotel.

#### What was it like at I.R.S. in the early days?

Well, there were only about three or four people working there then and there were about 50 bands. Now it's kinda the other way around and everybody's got voice mail... see I'm held to an ancient contract. I feel like Patrick McGoohan in an old episode of "The Prisoner." But then who knows, let's both pray for deliverance.

You're often compared with Raymond Chandler. What authors inspired you to write your dusky diaries of city life?

I grew up watching a lot of things on TV that still resonate with me. I was always drawn to film-noir, "Twilight Zone," "Outer Limits." Charles Bukowski really showed me you could take a seemingly dull and uninteresting life and make it worth reading. I loved his sense of humor, kinda like laughing on your way to the gallows. Henry Miller too, of course, is a favorite of mine. He was a writing machine. I didn't read

Chandler really until a few years ago because I'd become too self-conscious. I'd like to think that what I do is a little bit more than just "detective stories." For me, its always been about atmosphere. The music has to take you somewhere.

What made you decide to form a new band? Didn't you learn about band politics in Wall Of Voodoo? Are you back for more abuse?

First off, Drywall is more of a concept than it is a band per se. It's a side project I started with the idea that we'd put out three of these recordings, a trilogy of "apocalyptic documents" culminating in the year 2000. "Work The Dumb Oracle" is just the first one. Creatively, I needed another outlet for music that could be more abstract. This one is like James Ellroy meets Jackson Pollack at a broken-down radio shack. At the moment, I'm about to start another solo record, and that'll be the next thing to come out. Artistically speaking, one side feeds the other, and now I get to go look under the D's in record stores.

is it true that you used outdated '80s synthesizers on the Brywall album?

Well, the older equipment is just more creative because it has knobs and dials to twist. You can really blow 'em up, kinda like sonic terrorism.

As we approach the millennium, who were the greatest thinkers of the 20th century?

Hey, who am !? Alistaire Cooke? If I had to pick three important figures, I'd say Sam Phillips for inventing "rock and roll culture" as we know it, Tesla for electricity, and Henry Ford for the Stan Ridgway and his bandmates in Wall of Voodoo cohabitated a studio apartment somewhere between Selma and Yucca Streets in Hollywood, existing on a diet of pancake mix and Folgers crystals, drawing musical inspiration from Mexican velvet paintings. Eventually a figure loomed over their apartment, greeting them with the words, "Hi, I'm Miles Copeland. I'd like to sign you guys." Wall of Voodoo soon had a hit in "Mexican Radio." Ridgway — a born loner — then left the band to make his own hits, "Don't Box Me in" from "Rumblefish" with Stewart Copeland and "Drive She Said," from his Raymond Chandleresque solo album, "The Big Heat."

At this point, the law of physics defied itself. Stan left I.R.S. for Geffen only to languish in relative obscurity. L.A. itself began to rattle and fray at the time, and when Stan emerged again — this time with a minimalist trio called Drywall — a darker picture outside Stan's window warranted darker sounds. Teetering on the industrial, Stan calls Drywall "a mad side project," but acknowledges that side projects often become the tails that wag the dog.

Back on I.R.S., Stan has traded pancake mix for Tacol Bell's 99 cents menu, and has left Hollywood for the squalor-by-the-sea of Venice where, he says, "If the city goes up in flames, I can run into the ocean."

Alanis Morissette "Jagged Little Pill" (Maverick/Reprise): 20-year-old Alanis Morissette possesses a voice and emotion far beyond her age. Putting forth a world-wise, cunning and beautifully put-together presence on songs like "Hand In My Pocket" and the first single, "You Oughta Know," in which she fashions a weapon out of the sorrow born

from a failed relationship and plunges it into the psyche of the break-erup-er. This kind of strength and passion permeates "Jagged Little Pill" and breaks through time after time, surrounding and supporting her compositions like shining musical armor. (Anthony Hayes)



After a five-month doldrum, retailers are rejoicing as a veritable gaggle of records hit the street last week and are flying out the doors like it was Xmas. Pink Floyd, Soul Asylum, Batman, Primus and All-4-One are all debuting in or around the Top 20, and with June still promising blockbusters like Mr. Jackson, Neil Young and Bon Jovi, it would seem that summer has finally started in earnest... The NARM conventions are starting to take shape, at least for this year and next. After that, it's anyone's guess. There is still a battle to be fought as to whether or not the spring conference will be moved to July or August. According to NARM VP Jim Donio, there are strong opinions being voiced on both sides and nothing has been decided as of yet. The fall conference, being held again at the Arizona Biltmore in Phoenix from October 20-24, is usually a four-part affair, including retail, indies, wholesale and rack. But even this conference is being pared down to include only wholesale. One segment will focus on the indies and another will combine both racks and onestops. Next year's spring confab (which was already booked and couldn't have been moved, even if that decision had been made) will take place at the Sheraton in Washington DC March 22-25,

and will be capped on the final evening by a Gala Congressional Event scheduled for Constitution Hall. (No word as to whether Bob Dole will attend to party with all of us "purveyors of evil"). Donio tells "Rerap" that although there will be plenty of entertainment, it's still too early to tell what form it will take. The only certainty is that there will be absolutely no formal product presentations. The traditional three-hour shows are officially a thing of the past... Add NARM: BMG has announced that they will be the first of the Big Six distributors to participate in NARM On-Line, a new "free electronic information service designed to enhance member communications." BMG's Pete Jones explains: "This electronic bulletin board allows us to provide retailers with the most up-to-date and accurate information available." Included in the service will be catalog number, UPC number, artist, title, label, price, genre and configuration of all available product. Ultimately, facts will be added concerning album content, tracks, producers, etc. NARM's Yale Hoffstein expects the rest of the Big Six to be on board within the next six months... Navarre's Eric Paulson, Mike Gaffney, David Beisell and Frank Mooney were all on hand for the black tie, invitation-only soirce featuring Fonologee (on the Navarre-distributed Moulin D'Or label) in Arlington, Texas at the "Great Hall" on the campus of the Texas Boys School where the LP was recorded. Fonologee is a group of 20 kids between the ages of 8 and 13 culled from the Grammy-winning Texas Boys Choir, and they reportedly knocked out the packed house... Veteran musichoncho Kevin Brunkhorst, who has been a buyer with both Bassin Distributors and CD One-Stop for the last five years, is now a free agent and can be reached at (305) 450-8269 or KB305 (Waol.com.




