
Warner Alliance Aids Black Church Fund

Warner Bros.' Nashville and Black Music divisions have joined with Warner Alliance for the September 10 release of "No Weapon," a five-song cassette, to raise money for the National Council of Churches' Burned Churches Building Fund.

The title track, featuring Beverly Crawford, has just been released to radio. Other artists featured on the Warner Alliance compilation include Carlton Pearson, Andrae Crouch, the Winans and the Brooklyn Tabernacle Choir. A portion of the proceeds from sales will go to the building fund.

The National Council of Churches has targeted over 55 churches for rebuilding and is now trying to raise \$12 million toward the cost of restoration.

Commented Warner Alliance VP Gospel Music Demetrus Alexander, who helped spearhead the effort: "It was our desire to make a tangible contribution to a cause that has directly or indirectly affected all of us. What was meant to be damaging has simply revealed a unity and a hope that some of us didn't even know existed."



An exclusive HITS dialogue with Danny Goldberg, President/CEO Mercury Records by Jonathan Grevatt

ercury President/CEO Danny Goldberg decided on a career in the music business when he received a free copy of the Beatles' "White Album" at *Billboard*, where he was working as a clerk. He then forayed into music journalism and wrote for *Rolling Stone* and the *Village Voice*, and was later hired by the late, great Peter Grant as Led Zeppelin's publicist and Vice President of their Swan Song Records in the mid-'70s.

In 1983, he formed the legendary Gold Mountain Entertainment where, over the years, his company managed a stable of superstar artists, including Nirvana, Bonnie Raitt, Hole, Sonic Youth and Rickie Lee Jones. In 1991, Doug Morris hired Danny as Sr. VP on the West Coast for Atlantic Records, and in 1993, he was promoted to President of Atlantic, where he was instrumental in signing Stone Temple Pilots, Jewel, Collective Soul, Liz Phair (via the Matador deal), made the Mammoth Records and Curb Records deals, which spawned recent breakthroughs from Seven Mary Three and LeAnn Rimes. The executives he hired at Atlantic included Tim Sommer, who signed Hootie & the Blowfish, and Ron Shapiro, since promoted to Atlantic's GM.

In November of '94, Morris anointed Goldberg Chairman/CEO of Warner Bros. Records, where he experienced perhaps the strangest eight months of his very eventful career. He has run Mercury since last November and with the label now looking incredibly good with 311, the Refreshments, the Def Jam stable, Gina Thompson, the Jerky Boys and a brand-new John Mellencamp album on deck, the G man and HITS' own industry vet Jonathan "Can I E-Mail You My Resumé?" Grevatt sat down and talked about his tumultuous exit from the Bunny and his new job and goals at Mercury.

Anything you would like to say about your Time/Warner experience?

I feel good about the progress we made while I was at Atlantic. As far as Warner Bros. goes, the Warner Music Group corporate convulsions were weird and unpleasant and I deeply regret having gotten involved in that part of it. If I had it to do over again, I would have focused exclusively on the record business. I'm sure I still would have left, because I felt morally obligated to be loyal to Doug and, once he was fired, my days were numbered no matter what. The happy surprise for me and the silver lining in the Warner Bros. experience was that, under stress, I formed relationships with Russ Thyret, Steven Baker, Jeff Gold, Howie Klein, Rich Fitzgerald and some of the other people there who turned out to be very gracious. I think we will have decent personal relationships for life. And, of course, I get a great deal of pleasure out of the fact that Sylvia Rhone, Jimmy Iovine and Ted Field are all having such a great year.

Are you still in touch with Doug Morris?

I haven't spoken to him much since I started at Mercury. It's a little awkward, after being so close, to be working for competing companies, but I'll always be grateful to Doug for giving me a shot at running a company and for being a great teacher.

How does the corporate culture of PolyGram differ from that of Warner Music?

The main difference is that people at PolyGram get along with each other much, much better. I already knew the international company was extra-

ordinary and dominant in many parts of the world, but I didn't know someone like David Munns, who is head of PolyGram International, would be so friendly and accessible and supportive. Likewise, I never before felt the comfort level and intimacy that I already feel with Jim Caparro and his team at PGD. When I encounter American colleagues like Al Cafaro, Johnny Barbis, Chuck Mitchell and Andre Harrell, it's always relaxed and friendly. At the senior level, it's a pleasure to work for Roger Ames, who's run record companies for years, and to have an ultimate boss like Alain Levy who, likewise, comes from the record business. Because of their background, it can take 30 seconds to communicate certain things about the business to them that would take 30 minutes with other corporate types. And in America, PolyGram has Eric Kronfeld as COO, who not only was a lawyer representing artists for years, he actually managed Lou Reed. There's no one in a position comparable to Eric's who has had to take those kinds of phone calls.

Your big album of the moment is 311. How did 311 become part of Mercury?
311 is signed to Capricorn and several months ago, Mercury created a

joint venture with Capricorn. Phil Walden started this incarnation of Capricorn about five years ago, backed, ironically, by Mo Ostin at Warner Bros. A couple of years later, Phil's lawyer Lee Phillips called me when I was still at Atlantic. Apparently, Bob Morgado was pressuring Mo to divest of label deals and he didn't like Capricorn. I met Phil and was very impressed by the roster he was already developing. He had 311 as well as Ian Moore, the Freddy Jones Band and Widespread Panic, but it was politically impossible to pick up a label at Atlantic that was out of favor corporately.

Capricorn made a distribution deal with Relativity and continued to develop their artists. When that deal was coming to an end, Phil wanted a partner and because I jumped at it, helped by Kronfeld and PolyGram execs William Feeny and Helen Murphy, we were able to close the deal quickly. Happily for all of us, the 311 album, which was at about 250,000 after nine months, was ripe for modern rock radio, MTV, active rock and, hopefully, some pop radio. The album has just gone platinum, less than a hundred days after we took it over. Phil has some other great artists coming, particularly Syd Straw and Cake, which just got added at Live 105 and who are one of the most original new artists I've heard in years.

You've made a number of other label deals as well.

Mouth Almighty is a poetry label run by Bill Adler, Jim Coffman and Bob Holman. They used to call it NUYO and through them, we are getting a new Maggie Estep album next year and a brilliant EP from Allen Ginsberg. Triloka is a new age/world music label whose roster includs Jai Uttal. Scratchie is owned by Darcy and James from the Smashing Pumpkins along with Jeremy Freeman. Their first release is Fullslej. We also recently did a deal with Tim/Kerr Records, led by Thor Lindsay, who discovered Everclear, among many others.

What about other A&R?

First of all, I inherited a lot of good stuff from Ed Eckstine. Joan Osborne, who comes to us through Rick Chertoff's label Blue Gorilla. Rusted Root, who went platinum on their first album, have a brilliant new record produced by Jerry Harrison.

The Refreshments, signed by Peter Lubin, have sold more than 150,000 and the second track is developing beautifully. Peter also signed Ocean Rhue among others

Gina Thompson and Ill Al Skratch were both signed by Bruce Carbone, who's also serving as the A&R liaison to Vanessa Williams, who has both a Christmas record and a new studio album coming, and Tony Toni Tone have just finished a great new album.

Tom Vickers was set up by Ed with an imprint called Parachute, which includes Lauren Christie and Martin Page. And, of course, I inherited a great superstar roster signed in the '80s, including my old friends KISS, Bon Jovi, Lionel Richie, whose album still has a lot of life left in it, and John Mellencamp's latest, which is brilliant beyond words. Next year, we

expect new albums from Brian McKnight, Will Downing, Oleta Adams and the Mighty, Mighty Bosstones, among others.

The new team in New York includes Steve Greenberg, who worked with me at Atlantic and brought in the Scratchie deal and is developing several exciting new projects. Jim Fouratt, formerly of HITS, David Silver and consultants Claudia Gonson and Frankie LaRocka are also on the team.

In Los Angeles, Allison Hamamura is Sr. VP/W.C. GM and has recently signed Fitz of Depression and was instrumental in signing Morrissey. Also on the West Coast is Jenny Price, who signed Jewel at Atlantic; Ruth Richards, Howard Paar, Peter Kinnaird and as a consultant, Greg Werckman. Rick Chertoff, in addition to having produced the Joan Osborne record and developing other projects for Blue Gorilla, is an A&R guru to a lot of our people just by dint of being in our offices, and Doug Schoemer, who primarily works for Rick, also gets involved in some Mercury stuff.

Other new signings include Chuck D, which to me is the artistic equivalent of signing Bob Dylan or Leonard Cohen; the Jerky Boys, whom I got to know when their two platinum albums were released on Select through Atlantic and God Street Wine, who will have a new album next year. There are a number of other wonderful new and developing artists. From our European companies, we have the Cardigans, Catherine Wheel, INXS, Def Leppard and a new act exploding in England, Alicia's Attick.

Are you surprised by how well the KISS tour has done?

No. I did publicity for KISS in the mid-'70s, co-managed them in the '80s and have long been steeped in the dynamic of the KISS Army, so it was an opportunity waiting to happen and I talked to Gene Simmons and Paul Stanley about it as soon as I got to Mercury. You've got to hand it to Gene and Paul and Doc McGhee—they couldn't have done it any better.

How have the new affiliations with Mercury Nashville and Def Jam been working? Luke Lewis, President of Mercury/Nashville, is doing a brilliant job, as is his A&R head Keith Stegall. Luke and I were already friends and most of what I do is tell Luke how great they are. Additionally, we expect several projects that Mercury/Nashville will generate that the rest of Mercury would be involved in marketing.

We took over marketing and promotion for Def Jam several months ago after Island and Def Jam both decided to uncouple. By the way, this

changeover is an example of what I love about PolyGram. Chris Blackwell and I talked for about five minutes, Lyor and Russell and I had one meeting and it was done. At other companies, it would have been months of drama. Russell Simmons, in addition to his many other talents, is one of the great record executives, and so is Lyor Cohen. Our role is that Waymon Jones, Mercury's head of R&B, promotion and marketing, works Def Jam records, as does our pop promotion staff and Mercury also provides various other services to Def Jam. Russell and Lyor, of course, are totally responsible for the A&R and the artist development, the videos and many other areas where their expertise has made them the premier rap label of all time.

What's new on the promotion and marketing side?

One of the first things I did when I got to Mercury was to name David Leach General Manager. He had been "acting GM" and we quickly bonded and he has my total support and gratitude for the job he's done. In addition to what was already a very strong promotion and marketing team, newcomers include Celia Hirschman, who came from A&M and was named VP Marketing shortly before I arrived; Jason Lynn, whom I worked closely with at Atlantic, is VP of alternative marketing and video promotion; Rob Moore, formerly head of publicity at 4AD, has joined the publicity department, and Dana Millman, who worked with me at Gold Mountain, is an A&R VP charged with coordinating A&R-related matters inside and outside of the company.

You started as a journalist. Who was your favorite interview?

Van Morrison. I interviewed him for Jazz and Pop just before "Moondance" came out. I thought I'd died and gone to heaven. He was absolutely my favorite artist. He was sometimes monosyllabic, sometimes eloquent, but always totally real. The thing I loved about journalism was that you do it by yourself and by the end of the process, you have a tangible result of your labors. Fortunately or unfortunately, I wasn't talented enough to make a living that way.

Any amusing Led Zeppelin anecdotes you'd like to share?

The last time I spoke to Zeppelin's manager, the late Peter Grant, about a year before he died, he was fondly recollecting an anecdote of John Bonham grabbing my balls in Paris and I'm pretty sure that it was a story I semi-invented for one of the Zeppelin books which got repeated enough

times that Peter himself told it back to me, laughing uproariously at the "memory" of it. The point is, when you work with legends like this, after a certain length of time, it's hard to remember what actually happened as distinguished from stories that have taken on a life of their own after a hundred tellings.

One thing I do recall vividly is that Peter Grant was a great teacher. He understood, better than anyone else of his generation, the value and power of artists and I've integrated that consciousness into everything I've done since.

Was running a major record company a goal of yours from the start?

Not early in my career. After working for Peter, what I wanted to be was a manager and I loved managing artists. I miss the intimacy of some of the relationships I had as a manager. But once I turned 40 and our first child was born, I got nervous running a small business. Once I was inside Atlantic—yes, I wanted to be President as quickly as possible.

Do you still have any interest in Gold Mountain?

No, I completely divested myself from it as of the end of 1992.

What is the key to breaking an act?

Having good artists. I recognize the complexity, the anxiety, the stress, the work and the talent necessary to promote and market music, and I spend a lot of my time working with Leach and the other marketing executives—but the key to it all is signing the right talent in the first place. Give the Mercury team a Joan Osborne record and they can kick ass. The problem is finding artists as good as Joan Osborne.

What's good about the music business and what's bad these days?

What's good is that, with the declining cost of recording, genius can emerge from anywhere and a lot of the visionaries are still attracted to music as a medium. What's bad is that a lot of people who are not visionaries are attracted to the business as well.

Where does Danny Goldberg want to be in ten years?

I don't like to think like that. There's a certain amount of rational planning necessary—next year's budgets, where the kids are going to school, etc. But beyond that, I'm really trying to live in the moment and have as much intensity as possible in what I'm doing now.

Are politics in your future?

Not electoral politics. First of all, Rosemary would kill me. Furthermore, it's too much about raising money. But I'll always be an activist. I've raised money for some of the House Democrats. I stepped down as Chair of the Southern California ACLU when I moved to New York. Lee Masters is the new Chair. But I am still President of that ACLU and I stay involved with them.

Have you ever thought about writing a book?

I think about it a lot, but it's a lot harder to actually do it than it is to think about it.



Your band is unique in that it has a funk-rock hit single, which is a feat even the Chili Peppers have 't pour attribute the success of "Down"?

It probably has a lot to do with the groundwork laid by the Beastie Boys and the Chili Peppers in the '80s and early '90s. I also think it has a lot to do with touring and our work ethic. We knew that if we just kept doing it, everybody would come around, including radio and MTV. The kids were immediately there in small numbers, but the response we got was always really good. Now we're even getting some MTV respect, and that's helping record sales a lot. That's never been that big a deal to us because of the touring. But radio picked up this single really quickly, and now with MTV, it's been really wonderful.

Was radio behind the record when it was released a year ago?

They were trying to, but it didn't spread like it has recently. But they were always there. Radio has been excited since the first album—they really got behind us. I do all the radio interviews for the band, so I know radio was there. I prefer doing radio to regular interviews, because it's immediate and on-the-fly, like a show. It puts me center stage, and I like that. Regular interviews are a little too subdued for me. But that's OK; you can stay.

Are you astonished by the MTV support?

Yeah, definitely. I'm amazed by how much sales increase each week and how fast we're going up the charts. It's not too fast or too slow. It seems just right.

There are tons of bands experimenting with funk-rock, yet the sound hasn't seemed to really capture the public's imagination.

I honestly don't think it's been done as well as we're doing it, because we're perfectionists. We've been doing this for six years. We practice all the time and we play out more than most bands, and we're very critical of our live performances. The other bands that tried to get it going just didn't have it nailed on the musical side, and that's such an important part. I think that's what made the Chili Peppers so good; they have great live shows and they're fantastic musicians.

There seem to be more than a few funk-rock bands who are overly technical, but neglectful in the songwriting department.

They don't have that street vibe, which you've got to have. It's got to be hip. It can't just be straight funky. Something that's funky on paper wouldn't necessarily be funky in a live setting. And everybody needs to be doing their part, and that's another thing I really like about this band. I don't think there's a weak link whatsoever. Everybody's putting in their share. Sometimes I wish the bass was louder in the mix, but that's not the other band members' fault. Next time we record, I'm going to be on the producer, who will probably be our soundman, Scott Ralston. He's great. He's

Time to husk the corn with 311's P-Nut by Bruce Britt

n their self-titled third album for Capricorn, now distributed through Mercury, the Nebraska quintet known as 311 work themselves into a motivational funk. Defying the alternapop dictum that angst is best, the members of 311—vocalist/guitarist Nicholas Hexum, drummer Chad Sexton, Timothy J. Mahoney, bassist P-Nut and vocalist/scratcher Count SA dish up groove-heavy rock featuring positive sentiments like "You've got to trust your instinct and let go of regret" and "It's the 311 bliss/too smooth for pissed lyrics." In their most eloquent moment, the band observes that "guns are for pussies."

Indeed, aside from the occasional obscenity, 311 creates reggae-fied funk even Tipper Gore might approve of. And anyone who believes positive pop doesn't cut it with today's record buyers, think again: 311's inspirational rock is turning a handsome profit. The quintet's new album has been certified Gold and is going on Platinum, with the single "Down" earning MTV Buzz Clip status, saturation radio play and Top Ten status.

Hailing from the funk mecca of Omaha, Nebraska, 311 played their first gig in '90 opening for Fugazi. Relocating to L.A. in '93, the band's first two Capricorn Records albums, "Music" and "Grassroots," drew from a wide range of influences like Bad Brains, Sly Stone, Bob Marley, Curtis Mayfield and Public Enemy.

Released over a year ago, "311" has slowly wormed its way into the Top 40. The band recently opened for none other than KISS at N.Y.'s Madison Square Garden. Just days before that much-anticipated gig, bassist P-Nut graciously invited HITS' beanpole Bruce "Peanut" Britt "Le" into his Hollywood Hills apartment to chew the fat... only to have the guy swallow the whole thing.



been bugging us to let him produce an album since the beginning. So I'm going to be all over his ass to crank up the bass.

Will you guys ever do a ballad?

We've already done a ballad, but we did it in our way, so nobody really noticed. "Paradise" on the first album was a ballad, as well as "Lose" from "Grassroots." But we don't write classic ballads. It's got to be a little more interesting for us. It can't be just quarter notes where it's so simple it hurts. It's got to be so the kids at Bass Institute of Technology will pay attention. It's funny, but whenever we go to Boston, I see the kids who go to Berklee School of Music, and they're all staring at my fingers. You want to say, "C'mon, man, just have some fun, dig the music and just react." It's weird.

Technical proficiency must be an important part of your appeal. That's certainly the case with bands like the Chili Peppers and Primus.

Yeah, but [Primus bassist] Les Claypool would be nothing without a certain songwriting structure. Technically, he's amazing. He does a lot of two-handed slap, machine gun triplets. He's simply one of the best bassists on the planet, but it's his knack for writing songs that makes him such a genius.

Who else do you admire, musically speaking?

I was a big George Clinton fan, so Bootsy [Collins] laid some very nice roots for me. My brother Matthew was always playing Bootsy. My brother also never let me play with a pick. Somehow he just knew that playing bass with a pick was weak. There really aren't many bass players that I really listen to besides Les, because he's really doing something new. I've been listening to a lot of Tad lately, as well as Curtis Mayfield. Capricom seems to be a label where a band like 311 can develop.

We are now that Mercury is distributing them. There's a lot more money to promote and hit radio over the head. [Mercury President] Danny Goldberg and his clout alone can make MTV listen. It's a nice little love triangle

Positivity is supposedly the kiss of death for an alternative band.

We're just not negative thinkers. Our lives haven't been that hard. We didn't see our parents get killed or anything. We've been through some divorces and things, but overall, we're happy and glad to be musicians. I'm not angry about anything except guns and the drug wars. I'm very content. I think negativity is popular because it's a territorial thing - it makes you try to appear bigger than you really are. But that's not our vibe. Sure, I might get mad at the other driver on the freeway sometimes, but I don't get angry for the sake of it. I've got my bicycle, I've got my bass. I let my aggressions out on the road. I don't have time to

Nebraska isn't exactly known as the funk capital of the U.S. Why did this music have such an effect on you guys?

Because it was different. Being musicians, we thought it was really interesting to jump into something brand-new. We felt we could do whatever we wanted with it. We weren't just jumping on the funk bandwagon. We were doing hip-hop, reggae—just throwing it all in. We really feel we can do whatever we want and people will appreciate it because we laid the groundwork. We're not like Weezer. Now if those guys try to do anything different, people will probably be bored. We've always tried to be as diverse as we can.

Even though the band currently resides in L.A., you must be heroes back in Omaha.

Yeah, and it's great. The last time we played there, about 3,300 people showed up to this place called Mancuso Music Hall. We did an even bigger show at the horse track. It was the second largest show ever in Nebraska, second only to the Beach Boys. Just our luck some guys from out of state have the record, but we're determined to get it back.

How would you describe the new album?

It seems to be the straightest one we've ever done. It's very diverse, but not as outgoing as the other two. It's so cool to record an album. It's like going to work and bringing your bass with you. You just hang out and drink cappuccinos. It's so cool to watch everything come together. It's like a nice tattoo—when they start out with the black you can't tell what it's going to look like, then they put the colors in and it looks nice.

Are you excited to be opening up for KISS? I'm very excited. I missed them growing up because I'm from the generation before. We had the KISS gap. I'm still very excited to be

playing with them, because they're living legends. KISS fans have been waiting 12 years to see the original lineup. We're gonna look like little kids up there.


What's it like experiencing eventual stardom rather than overnight success?

It's been like a steady, slow thing. It hasn't been a big explosion, but I've been supporting myself for six years just playing music, and it's been a steady increase into a higher tax bracket. I just bought a new truck, so I can't buy any more shit. I've got to make sure I can make the payments





Everyone keeps talking about you as a tortured

I'm not happy, but I'm certainly not tortured. I don't think you have to be one or the other. The things that cause me stress are thinking about playing good shows, trying to be a better guitar player, and where my next songs are coming from.

Is it difficult to play your music live, to open yourself up in front of strangers?

No, I mostly think about the performances. It was easier in the past because the songs on "Bakesale" and "Bubble & Scrape" were recorded pretty early on in the songs' development, so when we were playing live, I thought we were out-doing the recorded versions. This time though, we knew the songs better. Most of my songs had been around for a year or two before we recorded them. Jason's songs we learned the day we cut them. We recorded as a band on every song on this record, so in that way it's a lot different than the other records, and less of a complication.

The tracks that Jason wrote are hard-edged and aggressive, while you continue to move closer to power-pop.

Yeah, I guess so. There are some exceptions to that rule, but that's true. Songs like "Ocean" are more of a continuation of what was going on with my songs on "Bakesale," except it's a little more realized structurally. It's also less tossed together.

Are there more expectations with this record now that you have had a hit with Folk Implosion?

I'm sure. Not for us, but for the record company and people who have been watching from

the sidelines for years. They're telling us it could really break out. I don't expect that to happen, and I'm not going to be bummed out when it ANYTHING LIKE THAT." doesn't. It would be kind of unfair to judge Sebadoh by the standard set by "Natural One."

You didn't think about that when you went in the studio?

I just couldn't do that. That would've felt really bogus and strange. It'd also probably alienate Bob and Jason, too. "We're going to play a sample on this song..." No, we try to keep things natural, so to speak.

Is there a concern about becoming critics' darlings?

I don't know. I feel like we've received plenty of negative press. I've never been hailed as the new Paul Westerberg or anything like that. He's probably suffered under that more so than us, but he's probably sold more, too. If we did every record like this one, worked on them really hard. I'd be more bummed about not selling more. I just don't want to be bitter. It never looks good. You have to realize that selling even 10,000 records should be considered a total success.

You should be getting more credit for shaping the current alternative music scene.

The stuff I've been into-Velvet Underground, the Stooges, hard-core, Joy Division-was pretty underground. I don't think I've ever thought I needed to sell a lot of records to be a success. As far as getting credit, in a way we are, because it's obvious bands like Superdrag and Nada Surf have listened to their share of Sebadoh records. We influence musicians a lot,

There are bands we feel more personally involved with. Those whose progression we follow more closely than others, whose triumphs and tragedies affect us more deeply. Sebadoh is certainly one of those bands. Perhaps it's because lead singer Lou Barlow is at the heart of the emo-core genre, brazenly opening his tender psyche up for all to ponder. Another contributing factor has to be the very intimate nature of the recordings themselves. Lou has been dubbed the King of Lo-Fi, because of Sebadoh itself as well as his other projects, including Sentidoh and the Folk Implosion, which garnered him his first hit with "Natural One," from last year's "Kids" soundtrack.

Barlow matriculated from the school of hard-knocks that is Dinosaur (pre- Jr.) to concentrate on what had been his side projects. Jason Loewenstein joined and grew to be the gritty, electric counterpart to complement Lou's more acoustic leanings after co-founder Eric Gaffney finally ended his on-again off-again status. They are at the center of the band, trading off instruments and songwriting duties. Bob Fay completes the line-up on drums.

Their latest effort, "Harmacy" (Sub Pop), witnesses the band's continued development as the pride of the nearunderground. The highlights from past efforts are there, only more so, as Lou lets it all hang out and Jason refuses to allow the edge to soften. Lou picks the shoulder of HITS' Scott Wilson to cry on, and ends up with a mouth full of dandruff for his efforts.

> which is the most flattering thing. Although, if we sold a lot of records and bands all dissed us, I don't think that would bother me, either. I just think it's so sad when people are considered failures because they only went Gold. I mean, that's fucking incredible.


> How come Sebadoh has never gone to a major label? We consider Sub Pop to be a major. If we were to have success here, it would mean a lot more. We're very compatible. It's not like we're eccentric cousins in the basement of some major label. "Here's Lou Barlow. He's here to fish in all the other bands." At some point, I might be willing to play that role, but right now we're just emerging from our adolescence.


Who do you think of as your musical peers?

Flaming Lips and Pavement, because they've been around for a while. They're approximately the same age as us. They've tasted more success than we have, so they're a couple steps ahead of us, which I've always seen as inspirational. They're signs to me that things can work out. I thought Nirvana were weirdly similar because they had the same sort of bad attitude about success. It's too bad Kurt had to be a martyr in the end.

TIME FOR A BRUSH WITH FAME WITH RED HOUSE PAINTERS' MARK KOZELEK

Mark Kozelek formed Red House Painters in 1989 after moving to San Francisco from Massillon, OH. Within a year, Kozelek, guitarist Gordon Mack, bassist Jerry Vessel and drummer Anthony Koutos were playing local venues on a regular basis and creating a considerable buzz.

One of the people seduced by the Red House Painters' downhearted sound was Mark Eitzel, then a member of American Music Club. He enthusiastically peddled their demo tape to various record companies, including Ivo Watts-Russell at Britain's prestigious 4AD label. Watts-Russell signed Red House Painters, selected six tracks from their demo and released it as the band's debut album, "Down Colorful Hill," in 1992.

This set off a tide of critical acclaim. Although their sound proved too unwieldy for radio, the band quickly built up a loyal cult following. This was sealed with the release of their '93 eponymous double album, and its companion disc of out-takes, released a few months later. Red House Painters released an EP covering Kiss' "Shock Me" in '94, then their final album for 4AD in 1995, "Ocean Beach."

After a bout of creative differences with the label, Phil Carney replaced Mack on guitar duties and the group bowed out of its deal, signing on with filmmaker John Hughes' newly developed Island sub-label, Supreme Recordings, for its more rock-oriented new release, "Songs For A Blue Guitar." The new disc may sound slightly more ragged than the group's past efforts, but it still includes stellar Painters moments like "Make Like Paper" and an impressive cover of the Cars' "All Mixed Up," the disc's first single. What wasn't so impressive was the hack work turned in by HITS' S.F. treat, Aidin "Rice-A-Roni" Vaziri after this chat with Kozelek.

The excuse we used—4AD and us—to get away from each other was that we couldn't agree on a sequence for this record. Ivo was adamant that he wanted songs to be edited, that he wanted songs to be taken out, and I was adamant about leaving it the way we wanted the record to be. So we said we wanted to take it somewhere else, and they called us back and said go ahead.

But the truth is, obviously, the other areas of our relationship with the label weren't very good, because how important is a guitar solo, or taking a song off, or adding a song on? The truth is, if the other areas of our relationship with the label were in good shape, I would have been willing to compromise. But we were in a situation where our recording budgets were getting smaller, our tour budgets were getting smaller, and the enthusiasm of the label towards our band was just shrinking. And then, on top of that, we weren't allowed to make the record we wanted to make. That was a bad situation for us to be in.

How is the situation with Supreme/Island different?

Now we have a label that completely believes in artistic control. We made this record, got it mastered and turned it into Island before they even heard it. The budgets we are getting for tours, video and promotion are just way more fair; the label is being way more generous. Everyone at the label is great... they are all completely besides themselves about working with our band. I feel like we are in a completely different world now than we were during our last year at 4AD. 4AD didn't even want to release "Ocean Beach." I was going nuts. I was almost in tears going, "I spent a year working on this record. I wish it would have turned out better. But you can't tell me it's not worthy of being put in record stores."

Of course, that record didn't go on to sell well. 4AD didn't promote it. But it got really good reviews. It got a four-star review in *Rolling Stone*, and some people tell me it's their favorite record of ours. So I had to use that as a barometer when it came down to making changes on this record.

Was this supposed to be your solo record?


What happened was, I ended up producing a record for a local singer/songwriter and I met some musicians through doing that. I got this idea in my head to play with other people, because I hadn't played with anyone outside the band for five or six years. I thought maybe I'd just completely experiment. I thought about playing with these musicians without rehearsing, without any pre-production. We were just going to go into the studio, play some songs that weren't quite finished and experiment. I should have finished that record for 4AD and then I could have gone out and done some solo shows. I would have been done with that by the end of last year, and my band would have went on to make another record. We would have been finishing it up now, and maybe by the beginning of next year, Red House Painters would have went on and done something.

But the label-switching really delayed things. I made this record as an experiment and ended up in a war with my label. It put me behind six or nine months, so by the time this came out, the band was ready to play. So the best thing to do was call this Red House Painters and just get on with it, go out and tour, whatever. It would be completely retarded for this album to come out and me go and tour by myself and not do anything with the band until the beginning of next year. It wouldn't

What have been the major lessons you've learned over the past five years?

There are some things you figure out after awhile. You come to a place in your life where you want to do as much as you want to do, and you need people who are enthusiastic, who are behind it and are going to be into it.

It's kind of ironic that we're connected with this label that has no reputation yet, and they're letting us put out a record that this ultra-hip label wouldn't. That's the thing I've learned... the whole indie credibility thing is just so stupid and meaningless.







Jason Falkner: The music-geek elite have long revered the talents of Jason Falkner from his days in the "paisley underground" touring with the final incarnation of The Three O'Clock (1988), through the blissful, syrupy year with Jellyfish (1990), to the Ivana-adored poppy creation the Grays (1994). 

ANYBODY THAT FORMS A GROUP WRITES SONGS AND RELEASES

TIME FOR SOME HELLFIRE AND PENALTY KICKS WITH MANIC STREET PREACHERS' JAMES DEAN BRADFIELD BY LILY MOAYERI

I didn't really know much about the group before this record.

I didn't think so. If you don't sell records in a country, then that's a mere extension of people not wanting to know about you. It's an obvious conclusion to come to. I don't actually have that much of an ego to think, "Why the flook don't you like us?" But anybody that forms a group, writes songs and releases records and says they don't care if people like them are complete liars. You've just got to draw the line, "You don't like us, fine." I'm not in the game of talking people around... if somebody doesn't like me, fine.

I listened to the first three albums ["Generation Terrorists," "Gold Against The Soul" and "The Holy Bible"] after I got "Everything Must Go" and they sound very different.

Yeah, they do sound different. I've always been a big fan of that Burt Bacharach kind of vibe, but my biggest influence is the Clash and I also like

the first Guns 'N Roses album. Another one of my big influences is Public Enemy. We come from a background in Wales where working class culture completely failed, which kind of really politicized us. We were a band that desperately wanted to believe in something and we couldn't find anything we wanted to believe in.

The "Holy Bible" never got released here.

Ironically enough, that was the first album since "Generation Terrorists" where we were going to release it and tour to support it, but then the Richie thing happened. Obviously, we're not going to do anything as a band without Richie and the record company said, if you're not going to tour, we won't release the record and that's what happened.

So what about the disappearance of Richie?

When you're in a band, there are usually two members that know each other and the rest don't really know each other. We've all known each other since we were ten years old or before. For this to happen to us is a deep and personal situation. It's really weird, but we've got to talk about it in business because we get asked about it and people get drawn into it because it's really mythological and iconoclastic to them. But, if you can get rid of all that baggage by someone not realizing what you've done before, that's really cool. That's why we've tried to start again. When somebody doesn't ask us about the Richie thing, it's a relief, because it's so personal.

You and Sean write the music and Nicky and Richie write the lyrics. Isn't it unusual for the lead singer not to write the lyrics?

I've written lyrics a lot of my life, but my own lyrics have never, ever

Football—that's soccer to you American people—can be a unifying entity for the British. 
But back to more serious matters of life and death. England's playing Germany and the violence in the crowd at the Sporting Club in New York is just simmering under the surface. This isn't just a game, it's war. If you're German, you better leave this place... it's British territory. James is downing whiskeys and Cokes broken up by beers. He's smoked an entire pack of cigarettes in two hours. He won't sit down 'cause that would mean bad luck for the Brits. He yells obscenities at the large screen TVs as he watches the ball being dribbled to the wrong side of the field. England loses during penalties, which is just devastating for James. He calls me a voyeuristic nasty witch who enjoys seeing other people in pain. He claims my fantasy must be to be assaulted 'cause I'm antagonizing him big-time. Then he just breaks down and babbles, "I'm sorry, you're gracious and beautiful and you're not a witch. My vision of the future has just been shattered. Did you actually realize how sad people felt at the end of a losing game?"

England's loss overshadows everything else that has gone wrong in James' life up to this point: The loss of his manager to cancer, the disappearance of his rhythm guitar player, Richard James Edwards, off the face of the earth and the fact that he has to spend the next few hours trapped with the inanity of HITS' very own die-hard Britbrat Lily "It's All A Blur To Her" Moayeri.

> inspired me to write music. I'm in lost territory 'cause I'm not writing the lyrics and I'm singing them, so I made a decision that for me to actually be this front person, I've got to write music to the lyrics. Their lyrics actually give me the inspiration to write music. We grew up with each other. We were best of friends before we ever thought of forming a band. When you're best friends with somebody, there's no ego involved. We each did what we could to the best of our ability.


How do you think America's going to react to you this time? You're going to be touring with Oasis, right?

The one thing you learn about America is: if a British band comes to America and they're really gung-ho and they go, "We are British and we're going to break America," people just switch off. I can understand that. We just come here and do our stuff. Something happens, it happens and if it doesn't, we're not going to be insulted. Of course, we'd like to sell records here, but we're not going to push ourselves on people. We can understand that America, as a pure statement, has its own culture. So why the flock, by default, should they take us on board? It either happens or it doesn't and we're not going to say, "You should like us 'cause we're f**king amazing." We're not going to say that anymore.

"DEALING WITH A REALLY TIGHT-KNIT BAND REOUIRES A LIGHT TOUCH."



Time for some "Dust" in the wind with Screaming Trees' Van Conner BY

F or a while, it seemed Screaming Trees would take their place alongside Nirvana, Pearl Jam, Alice In Chains and Soundgarden as Seattle's favorite radio-friendly unit-shifters. As of 1991, the Trees had eight recordings to their credit, all of them pioneering grunge efforts. But somewhere along the way, the quartet distanced themselves from the pack, refining a bluesy brand of modern pop that was far too emotionally dense for mainstream consumption. Led by enigmatic singer Mike Lanegan, the Trees gradually transformed themselves into the thinking man's alternative band, a move that resulted in increased credibility and relatively subdued record sales.

Now, four years after their critically-acclaimed "Sweet Oblivion" album, the band has returned with its most realized recording yet. Produced by roots-rock maven George Drakoulias, "Dust" (Epic) finds Screaming Trees surfing the turbulent alternarock waters with panache. The album ably showcases Lanegan's wolfish baritone voice and features guest contributions

from Heartbreakers keyboardist Benmont Tench, Pearl Jam guitarist Mike McCready and Masters Of Reality singer Chris Goss. Add unexpected instrumental textures like mellotron, tabla and harmonium and you've got an album that comes across like the Trees' own personal "Sgt. Pepper."

"Dust" is certainly Screaming Trees' most difficult album. Recording commenced in 1994 with the "Sweet Oblivion" team of Don Fleming and John Agnello producing and engineering. The results—an entire album's worth of material—were scrapped, with Fleming and Agnello jettisoned in favor of Drakoulias. While they labored to create "Dust," drummer Barrett Martin joined members of Alice In Chains to record the Mad Season album, while Lanegan released his second solo disc, "Whiskey For The Holy Ghost."

The band just finished up the Lollapalooza tour as bassist Van Conner prepares for the final pit-stop, a grueling session with HITS' resident disgruntled postal worker syndrome poster boy Bruce "Will Play Air Guitar For Food" Britt

You scrapped an entire album's worth of material before coming up with the material on "Dust." Why?

Actually, we wrote about 300 songs. We write a song or two a day. Out of those, we came up with the ten on the record. The first time we got close to being done, but the songs sucked. There was just no spark. We were recording in Seattle, and everybody just wanted to go home because we live there. We just couldn't get anything done. If you're out of town, there's nothing to do but record.

What happened with Don Fleming and John Agnello?

The first record ["Sweet Oblivion"] went really well with them. It wasn't their fault; it was our fault. I think they got sick of us being so bummed. Then they had a rift. One day John busted a bottle over Don's head. I remember hazily John taking an empty bottle of Jack Daniels and busting it over Don's head. Don proceeded to crawl around the studio and a helicopter came and took him away. That's what I remember, though, like I said, it's hazy. That was the last time we heard from Don. John and us moved on as well. That's how you get rid of people in this organization. We don't call in and fire you; we just bust a bottle over your head.

It took a couple of years for us to record this album. The cool thing is, when we came back, radio had changed more in our favor than with the last record. People are more ready to accept us now than two years ago.

After a while, did you get the sense that the fates were against you? We had our ups and downs. Actually, we had a lot of downs. But we pushed it all the way through, and it worked out. Everybody stood by us—management, our friends and family, even the people who buy our records. It helps tremendously when you're down and out and everybody gives you the space you need.

How did George Drakoulias work out?

It's been my experience that when you get with the thing that seems most weird, it always ends up bringing something new to the proceedings. Actually, we first talked to George back in 1990 for the "Uncle Anesthesia" record, but by then we already had somebody. Then we spoke to him for the "Sweet Oblivion" album, but he was busy. We just thought this guy's a freak, so it just might work. Plus he has a kind of strange personality. He believes no method is the best method. He's got 10 million ideas that he runs by you and you get to pick. Plus he dances a lot in the studio. It's fun to have a guy dancing in the studio.

Are you difficult to work with in the studio?

Dealing with a really tight-knit band requires a light touch. So a producer has to balance everything. You have to have a referee to keep everything flowing.

How would you describe "Dust"?

For me, it's as good or better than our last record. The new one's got the same foundation as "Sweet Oblivion," but it definitely goes crazier, and the songs are more emotional. We finally got to do stuff we wanted to do. It's a fairly muted record compared to "Sweet Oblivion," which was more metallic

and grungier.

A few people have said that to me, and I totally disagree. I think this record rages way more than our last one. It starts with "Halo Of Ashes" and just goes from there. This record has a little more backup vocals and it's less raw, but at the same time, there's less studio trickery. Basically, it's just dry. There's very little in the way of reverb or effects. It was much more haphazard, which is a fun way to record because you make mistakes that end up becoming part of the songs. I think "Dying Days" and "Gospel Plow" are totally over-the-top songs with these big choruses, which I like.

There seems to be a strong Middle Eastern/Persian feel to some of the songs.

That influence has always been in our music. It was less detectable in the past because we never played the music on actual Middle Eastern instruments—we'd played them through guitars. But this time there's a lot of mellotron, tabla, harmonium, things like that. Over the years we've collected all these instruments, and George brought all his stuff. One of my favorite songs ever is "Tomorrow Never Knows" by the Beatles.

Do you think all the side projects have helped or hurt the band?

Every time someone plays other projects, they come back with new ideas that are useful to Screaming Trees. Like right now, I'm working with the drummer from Mudhoney [Dan Peters], the bassist from Tad [Kurt Danielson] and my other brother Patrick on guitar. I play guitar and sing. After working with those guys, I came back to Screaming Trees with a new energy.

How has the Lollapalooza experience been for the band?

It's been fun, pretty mellow. Today is way too hot, though. If I'm the last guy to talk to you, please tell my wife I love her, OK?◆



The far north island of Cape Breton, neatly nestled off the coast of Nova Scotia, is an unlikely place to find a pop star, but the 21-year-old fiddle wizard Ashley MacIsaac is a most unlikely pop star. His just-out-in-America, Platinum-in-Canada debut, "Hi How Are You Today?" (A&M), is a delightfully kooky conglomeration of Celtic traditionals blended with a bounty of more-current musical trends. The result is a frenetic, unusual sound that's like nothing you've ever heard before. Unafraid to dip his bow into a sonic highland of ambient lullabies, industrial grunge grooves and manic punk, the extremely out MacIsaac, with his peroxided hair and glam-cum-"Braveheart" wardrobe, redefines notions of traditional music by bringing them into the present. Without ever sacrificing the passion and fire of the Celtic tradition, MacIsaac's collaborations with Northof-the-Border artists like the Halifax indiepop combo Jale, or hip-hop collective Bass Is Base, prove this self-described "fiddle slut" to be a modern rarity, a genuine original. HITS' genuine fake MacMichael MacKrugman dons his kilt and blows the bagpipes for the occasion.



Cape Breton. Not exactly Music City.

No, but it's a microcosm of any area, and when you look at it in that sense, there's more music there per capita than anywhere.

What's the population?

Well, Cape Breton itself, the whole island has about 90,000 people on it. It's basically four counties and the whole western side of the island, Inverness County, where I was raised... that's where the majority of the traditional musicians are from. There are about 5,000 people there, and out of the 5,000, there are about 300 working fiddle players. All the time, doing gigs nightly. It's like fiddle central. It's pretty bizarre.

Tell me a little about the island's Celtic roots.

Without getting into everything, they were settled by the Scotch in like, the early 1800s. The land there is very similar, and the people that went there to work it could farm the same way they farmed in Scotland, and the fishing is there, as well as the mining industry. But music was the main sort of source of culture.

Has the music changed from the influx of other cultures?

Well, yeah. The other cultures that came in basically took it on, like the natives that are there, the Micmac Canadians, and the French people, all basically play Scottish music, and it's definitely been adapted by them. Nobody put in any pop influence really at all, and then all of a sudden, I showed up.

How old were you when you started playing?

Eight-and-a-half or nine. I was step-dancing before that, which is the traditional dance, and I was around the concert scene for probably three years.

So you were like Macauley Culkin with a fiddle.

Exactly. I had huge, curly hair and did not look in any way that I would be adaptable to like, American pop culture. I looked like a little Scot boy.

Was there much rock music?

Tons. From the '70s to the mid-'80s, that was the music of choice for most young people. But my father's a fiddle player, so I never was into anything, really, other than my own music, and was never objective about it until maybe two or three years ago. If I got asked to play the fiddle for a square dance, I'd play because I was a fiddler. Whatever the case was. Then, three, maybe four years ago, I came to New York and did a play here for about four months, and went back and basical-

ly started looking at what it was that I was doing.

Tell me a little about that experience. Joanne Akalitis [esteemed avant-garde theater director and former wife of Phillip Glass] discovered you up in Cape Breton. How exactly did that come about?

Phillip Glass bought a place there about 25 years ago. It has all these cottages out in the woods, so a lot of artists came up and stayed there over the years with them. She was there at a square dance one night while on vacation, and about a week after she went back to New York, I got a message on my machine. I don't remember meeting her at the dance that night or anything, but she asked me to go to New York. At that point, I had been reading the *Village Voice* for about a year, so I was like. "Sure!"

So you're 17 and all of a sudden you're performing in an off-Broadway production of "Woyzeck." It must have been quite the culture shock.

It wasn't. Because I.knew everything that was gonna be here, and I actually did do it when I got here. Like, I'd read the ads for the King David Theater, and I went and hung out there on the first night I was here. Shit like that, the availability of doing anything that you wanted.

"Hi How Are You Today?" ping-pongs from trad Celtic music to hip-hop to punk. Not unlike some serious channel-surfing.

That's basically because I was around different musicians at different points in the recording. I had certain ideas, but a lot of it just came up as I was meeting different people. I probably had some directional view on what the other musicians are doing, but the main thing was that I was playing my fiddle tunes the way that I play them. The structure had to come from them.


You've developed quite the rep as a showman. You wear costumes, like kilts with kitschy platform shoes, and you play your fiddle like a hardcore punk rocker.


I've always had the sense that I was a performer, that I was putting on a show. But it's just still my gig, my music, and I don't think it has that much affect on people's minds really anymore. At this point people have looked at it, and they say, "Oh, OK, well, that's Ash."

Surely the real purists flip when when they hear you do your cover of "Staying Alive."

Some of them tend to have come to the assumption that I'm a bit of a freak. But that's basically correct.

Time to pump up the volume with Pink Noise Test's Lawrence Glass and Kirk Hellie by Janiss Garza

If the Jesus & Mary Chain were having a cheerful day, they'd be Pink Noise Test. The L.A.-based quartet—singer Lawrence Glass, guitarist Kirk Hellie, bassist Michael Hill and drummer Peter Kelly—take catchy, often upbeat melodies and shake 'em up with various samples and noise. The result is raw-edged techno-pop without the self-abusive tirades of Nine Inch Nails or the feral anger of Ministry. The wry humor of some of the tunes on Pink Noise Test's debut, "The Electric Train EP" (Boy's Life, now distributed by Interscope), even puts a smile on your face. Whoever said loud music had to be depressing? Certainly it's nowhere near as depressing as Glass and Hellie being forced to endure the probing inquiries of HITS' own sonic reducer Janiss "Cherry" Garza.

In spite of the technology you add to your songs, they sound like they could be played acoustically.

LAWRENCE GLASS: Every now and then, we'll write a song that's sort of based around an effect, but that's pretty rare. Usually, it's song first.

KIRK HELLIE: I think they're almost always born out of the melody. It's never just like, here's a guitar riff, or here are chords. It's always, there's a melody and here are the chords to work with that.

GLASS: Melody is definitely the start of everything for us. Your sense of humor is more playful than nasty and biting.

GLASS: We all try to bring a certain wit to what we're playing. The lyrics aren't any different than the guitar.

HELLIE: It's not really thought out or contrived. Everyone's just being who they are.

if the samples or your equipment screws up, does it ever throw you off?

HELLIE: If something happens to the gear, we just go for it, and take it into something different. In fact, sometimes those are our best moments. **GLASS:** The unexpected happens live. That's what's great about this band. We just take it off on a different tangent. Also, a lot of what the

band. We just take it off on a different tangent. Also, a lot of what the guitar does live is, just by its nature, unpredictable. So that's just built into the songs.

HELLIE: Most of the stuff's live samples anyway. All those loops are just things that we create live.

GLASS: Yeah, we aren't going in with, like, pre-recorded DATs, at least not yet.

HELLIE: If there's a glitch or something, that becomes part of the sample. If you're in front of an audience, you can't just erase it or change it. You go with it and that's it. You can't be too serious about that. That's why we drink so much when we play!

GLASS: It has a lot to do with the alcohol.

Do you guys remember any completely wild mistakes?

HELLIE: We have an oil-drip pan that we set on a couple of trash cans, and then we have one of those really big massagers, and we just turn it on and rattle it on the oil drip pans, and the whole thing is just this big, metallic rumble. And our drummer brought a massager that had an extension cord on it. And I guess the stage wasn't big enough or some-

thing, and he leaned over and the cord came out of the wall, right at the crucial moment. And at another time during the same song, he was draining power out of the entire club somehow. The lights were dimming and his guitar amp was going in and out. It was ridiculous.

GIASS: That club, by the way, has closed since then. I like to take some of the responsibility for that.

What kind of non-musical instruments do you use to play with?

HELLIE: We did a show where we used all kinds of stuff like balloons. You can put a contact mic on everything.

GLASS: Just the friction of rubber is a cool sound, if it's done right.

HELLIE: We buy little things at Toy R Us we've used.

GLASS: Like a cool little keyboard.

HELLIE: A "Pocahontas" keyboard. It was like \$14, and didn't have the right pitches on it. Like when you go to hit middle C, it's not C. But it did have a little note slider on it.

GLASS: You can find stuff all over and just try to figure out ways that it'll work.

Have you ever had an accident that wound up being the basis of a song?

GLASS: Once in a very great while, an effect will just be so cool that it might inspire something else, but usually those things sort of get filed away and used when they're appropriate. We don't try to force them into things. Just whatever works.

HELLIE: Lawrence and I have a good idea of where the songs are at before we even show them to everybody, but then once that happens,

there are all kinds of funny little things that occur.

GLASS: Things definitely change because of [bassist] Mike [Hill] and [drummer] Pete [Kelly]. There's no doubt about that.

HELLIE: And when they do, it's great. We even changed stuff on the EP, like the thing in "All The Shame To Me," the bridge breakdown, Mike's playing that part now. He just stumbled across a hideous noise, and I was like, "F**k it!" That tops what I'm doing.

GLASS: Can't argue with that.

HELLIE: And now he's taking it over, you know. It's great. Whatever's the ugliest. Whatever's gonna irritate people more, that's what we go for.◆






OM MISSISSIPPI

"Definition Of A Band" Is Mint Condition's Definition Of A Band

MINTY COOL!

Do you miss it? The feel you get listening to a REAL band? Even when recorded, you can feel the difference between a faux, producer-driven, sample-heavy act and an honest-to-goodness riffing band. The bass pops, the drums snap and the guitars reverberate. You don't feel you're listening to a metronome. That's the experience of listening to the music of Stokley, Jeffrey Allen, O'Dell, Larry Waddell, Ricky Kinchen and Keri Lewis – aka Mint Condition. The one thing that

sets Mint Condition apart from most artists or groups is that they are a real band. Judging from the way it has been received, they now have a real hit single, "What Kind Of Man Would I Be" (Perspective), and a genuine hit album, "Definition Of A Band," a unique mixture of funk, soul, rock, jazz Caribbean and African rhythms they like to refer to as "gumbo." JAMZ VP Jerry "Rigged" Boulding talked the energy out of Mint Condition's Stokley, Larry and Ricky. Does anyone have jumper cables out there?

Though your core has changed slightly, you've maintained your signature sound.

Stokley: We've been playing together since the early '80s and we'd like to feel that we've grown and evolved, both individually and collectively.

How long did it take to complete "Definition Of A Band?"

Ricky: We actually did the album maybe twice over. And because we wanted this album to represent what we're really all about as a band, we kept doing more songs until we got the right combination.

You premiered several new cuts on KKBT Los Angeles.

Stokley: We had fun hanging out and enjoyed sharing our music with the audience and getting that direct feedback. They tell you exactly what they think 'cause they can't see you. Know what I mean?

How did you come up with the album's title?

Larry: There still are some people who don't realize we are a band as opposed to a singing group that doesn't play any instruments. So we wanted a title that would explain a little more to people what we are really about. We play our own



instruments, write all of our material and perform it.

Did you have a special concept in mind when you began working on the album? Stokley: We've pretty much been able to call the shots on our material right from the get-go. This album is basically a continuation of what we've been doing; just a little more so. We basically wanted to show that we're accomplished musicians, that we're a band and we wanted to bring that to the forefront. You live life;

you write about it. We wrote about things we've experienced. We tried to create what's inside us.

There are some social things on the album, such as missing children and lifting up as a people, as well as love and male-female relationships.

Larry: We got more in-depth this time about a lot of issues, including love.

Talk about your relationship with fellow Minneapolis natives Jimmy Jam & Terry Lewis.

Ricky: Around 1989, we played the First Avenue Club, where Prince, The Time and a lot of Minneapolis stars were first discovered. We were actually singing "Breaking My Heart" then. As soon as they heard Stokley hit it, Jam and Lewis immediately said: "You all got a deal." And we've never looked back.

How have you grown as artists and as a band?

Stokley: We've gotten a lot tighter and better on our individual axes. When you come to our live shows, you're going to get energy and some crazy stuff on stage that will have you laughin'. You're also going to get plenty of good music and a lot of different arrangements. You're going to get a show.

Who influenced you the most when you were growing up?

Stokley: Many people, locally, along with all the bands in the '70s like Parliament, Earth Wind & Fire, Ohio Players, Cameo, the Commodores and naturally, Prince and The Time.

What's down the road for Mint Condition?

Ricky: More production. We'll be working with other groups and solo artists. Also more creative stuff, songwriting and Mint Condition Records. We'd eventually like to do soundtracks and movie scores, too.







In Miami, Evergreen's newly acquired 100,000 watt urban powerhouse WEDR-FM was flat (5.7) and tied with Top 40/Dance WPOW-FM, which climbed (5.5-5.7) to lead the market. Cox's WHQT-FM (Hot-105) (4.8-4.4) tied with Hispanic WAQI-AM (4.0-4.4) for 5th place. In the 25-54

match-up, it was WEDR at the top, but flat (6.1), while Hot-105 placed 4th with 5.5. WEDR also took top honors in the 18-34 battle (9.8-9.3)... In Kansas City, country WDAF-AM lost almost half a share (8.4-8.0), but still dominated the market. Carter's 100,000-watt mainstream Urban KPRS-FM was flat (7.9), which placed them 2nd overall. Top 40 Hot AC KMXV-FM (5.1-5.2) finished 8th. Jazz/NAC KCIY-FM (The City) inched up (3.3-3.4), which placed the station 14th overall. In the 25-54 "demo derby," KPRS and AOR KYYS (7.4) tied for 3rd overall... In Milwaukee, country WMIL-FM was off a trace, but led the market (9.8-9.7). Urban WKKV-FM was up slightly (6.1-6.2) to tie for 6th place with AOR WLZR-FM. Jazz/NAC WJZI-FM was up sharply (2.0-2.8), which placed them 12th. Urban AM daytimer WNOV was flat (2.5) for 14th place... In "the Big Easy," Clear Channel's WQUE-FM was down (13.2-12.5), but still led the format and the market and was the only station in double digits. Sister station Urban Adult WYLD-FM was up half a share (7.5-8.0) for a strong 2nd. Top 40 KHOM-FM added over half a share (5.0-5.6), which locked them in 5th place. New Top 40 convert WEZB-FM (B-97) began their climb (3.6-3.8) to tie with AC WLTS-FM (4.3-3.8).

PGD has called a time-out. In a major reversal, at least for the time being, PGD has agreed to "temporarily suspend the company's [anti-theft] source tagging effort." In return, both Checkpoint Systems (the rival technology company) and the Target retail chain have dropped anti-trust suits against the distributor. PGD was the first of the Big Six to announce that they were indeed, after years of arguments and delays, going to implement the NARMapproved Sensormatic technology. CEO Jim Caparro: "We are confident our method of analyzing and choosing the available technology was well-executed and clearly within the law. However, any innovation which disrupts the smooth flow of business is counterproductive." Although PGD retains the right to restart their source-tagging process whenever they choose, no clear date has been set for any such occurence. Caparro also states that no monies changed hands in the deal. The same suits, however, are apparently still pending against NARM. Forbidden by their lawyers to discuss the matter, NARM released this statement: "NARM regrets that this litigation can succeed in delaying, if only on a temporary basis, the implementation of source tagging, an initiative the music industry has been

working for years to establish, in order to reduce the escalating costs associated with theft, costs which are ultimately borne by the consumers. NARM remains fully committed to seeing through to fruition the EAS Source Tagging initiative that it has been working on for nearly a decade. NARM is heartened by the fact that Poly-Gram has reaffirmed its commitment to Source Tagging and is confident that Source Tagging will become a reality in the near-future." Stay tuned... Valley Record Distributors has signed a "strategic alliance" with Miamibased JFL Distributors in which the two companies will jointly market each others' catalogs. Valley's Rob Cain insists that they have not purchased JFL per se: "JFL's sales staff does not work for, or report to, Valley brass." But they will indeed be selling Valley product and vice versa. JFL will also be keeping their warehouse facilities open, housing their "strong suit" of more than 20,000 vinyl titles... As Pearl Jam is flying out of stores, Valley Records' Ron Phillips is not the only one to call to file a complaint. It seems Sony put "not only the UPC sticker (probably at the request of the band), but the closure seal 'dog bone' on the outside of the shrinkwrap." Apparently, the dog bones are simply falling off the packages. "Of course if the dog bone is missing, Sony will not take this piece of product back in returns. We feel it is unfair to impose a returns penalty in this situation." Duly noted. But with any luck at all, returns on this particular title won't be much of an issue... Mad Platter's owner Don Watson hosted a massive record release party for Noise Records' Skeletones last week. Reports have it more than 700 people showed up at the renowned Riverside, CA indie retailer, as the hometown boys ska-rocketed the house.
