
RIAA MAPS Drug Plan

Following its semi-annual meeting on September 5 in New York, the RIAA Board of Directors has unanimously agreed to broaden its current substance abuse programs "to combat this problem at all levels of the industry."

The initiative provides a three-year \$2 million grant to fund additional outreach through the Musicians' Assistance Program (MAP).

Said RIAA President Hilary Rosen: "This record company effort achieves a much-needed balance between private and public initiatives. MAP will help everyone working both inside and outside the established music community to become better educated about helping friends and associates deal positively with their drug and alcohol addictions."

According to an RIAA statement, the program will be a two-pronged effort which will include better communication of the wide range of internal record label services and support programs that currently exist and an outreach/intervention program through Buddy Arnold's Musicians' Assistance Program.



Lost in "Space"

The poster campaign for the Warner Bros. movie "Space Jam," which stars basketball superstar Michael Jordan along with Looney Tunes characters Bugs Bunny, the Tasmanian Devil, Tweety Bird and Daffy Duck, has proved to be very popular with the public. So popular, in fact, that early last month, when "teaser" posters went up at 250 L.A. area bus shelters, 209 of them were stolen within days.

Outdoor Systems, which manages the bus shelter ads, has had to install surveillance cameras at random sites, where the thefts have been accompanied by broken glass and damaged frames. Police officials report Elmer Fudd is being held over for questioning in the case.

The movie, which opens in mid-November, has an accompanying soundtrack on Atlantic Records slated for release on November 5.

Said a Warners spokesman: "We wish they'd save their enthusiasm for the movie itself. We haven't had this kind of excitement since Porky Pig picketed outside the Oscar Mayer weiner factory."

Fourth scenario is the release of BLACKstreet's Interscope album "Another Level." The band's already packing a smash single, "No Diggity," featuring Dr. Dre, and weasels are looking for monster first-week sales for the Teddy Riley-produced album.

And finally, there's old stand-by Rush (Atlantic) whose first-day numbers showed they're still flicking their Bics for those knuckleheads from Canada.

Crow Won't Fly At Wal-Mart

Grammy winner Sheryl Crow's new self-titled A&M album, the follow-up to her eight-million-selling "Tuesday Night Music Club," has been banned from Wal-Mart Stores because of a song lyric suggesting the nation's largest retailer sells guns to children. The album is slated to come out September 24.

In "Love Is A Good Thing," which she co-wrote with Tad Wadhams, Crow sings, "Watch our children as they kill each other/with a gun they bought at the Wal-Mart discount stores."

"Sometimes it's not about business, it's about art," said PGD President Jim Caparro. "We will do nothing to interfere with the artistic force and energy of Sheryl Crow and everything to support A&M in its commitment to the artist."

Wal-Mart's decision could cost Crow anywhere from 200,000-400,000 in CD sales, according to Caparro, if it

doesn't purchase the album for it's 2,265 stores. The outlet stopped carrying handguns in 1994 after several law suits involving the sale of weapons used in subsequent crimes.

Said Wal-mart spokesman Dale Ingram: "Selling a record implying behavior that is against all we stand for is something we just could not profit from."

Added A&M President Al Cafaro: "Sheryl has my complete support. In their decision not to carry this record, Wal-Mart is choosing guns over music. Everyday in America, children are dying by guns bought legally. Sheryl's responsibility as an artist is to reveal the truth, and it is our responsibility as a record company to defend her ability to do so."

At presstime, rumors that Crow was considering an offer to change the name of the store to I.C. Penney and make the gun a Kathie Lee Gifford polyester jumpsuit went unfounded.

All Eyez On Tupac

As Tupac Shakur remains unconscious and in critical condition at Las Vegas' University Medical Center from being shot four times last Saturday night (9/7), witnesses to the drive-by shooting have so far refused to talk to police, according to the Los Angeles Times.

The shooting took place after Shakur, Death Row head "Suge" Knight, who was in the car with the rapper, and their entourage had attended the Mike Tyson-Bruce Seldon heavyweight championship fight earlier that evening at the MGM Grand. A white Cadillac reportedly pulled up to the car Shakur and Knight were in while it was stopped at a red light on one of Las Vegas' busiest streets, Flamingo Road, just off the Strip.

A hospital spokesman says Shakur is likely to survive, but surgeons had to remove a lung because it was so severely punctured with bullets. There was speculation the shooting stemmed from a gang-style retaliation from the Crips against Knight's long-standing Blood affiliations or a confrontation between rival entourages earlier at the MGM Grand. Shakur was shot five times in New York in 1994 while being robbed outside his recording studio and is currently battling charges he violated probation in both N.Y. and L.A. He was convicted of sexual abuse and sentenced to 4 1/2 years in prison for a November '93 incident involving a female fan in a Manhattan hotel room.

Sunny Joe White Dies

Innovative Boston radio programmer Sunny Joe White was found dead on the sofa of his apartment from a heart attack last Saturday night (9/7)

at the age of 42. White had been under medical care for an enlarged heart and was hospitalized last week following a heart attack.

Along with Pyramid owner Richie Balsbaugh, White built Boston's original Kiss 108 (WXKS) into one of the most influential Top 40 stations in the country in the late '70s and '80s. He'd recently been doing consulting and onair work for WILD-AM.

Monroe Mourned

Bill Monroe, the man who laid the groundwork for country music as the Father of Bluegrass, died last Monday (9/9) in a Springfield, TN nursing home at the age of 84. Monroe suffered a stroke earlier this year.

Monroe played mandolin with his band the Blue Grass Boys, creating a fusion of American music whose elements included gospel harmonies and Celtic fiddling, blues and folk songs, Tin Pan Alley pop and jazz-tinged improvisations.

Monroe grew up on a Kentucky farm, where both his mother and an uncle were fiddlers. The youngest of eight chil-

dren, he was forced to play mandolin when his older brothers grabbed the family's fiddle and guitar. After forming the Blue Grass Boys in 1939, Monroe appeared on the Grand Ole Opry radio broadcasts every Saturday in between non-stop touring. His sidemen in the band included guitarist Lester Flatt and banjo player Earl Scruggs.

Monroe was named to the Country Music Hall of Fame in 1970, earned the first Grammy for a Bluegrass recording in '89 and was given a NARAS Lifetime Achievement Award in '93. He is survived by a son, James, and a grandson.



An exclusive HITS dialogue with Metallica by Katherine Turman

Funny how the album that so many fans purported to "hate" (before they'd even heard it!) has, to date, sold more than three million records damestically and has been hanging around the Tap10 of the album charts. Metallica's heavy "Load" (Elektra) has flown off the shelves since its June 4 release, and helped make the Bay Area quartet this summer's Lollapawinners. Yeah, guys with short hair can, like, unh, rock.

Starting with the release of Metallica, or the "Black Album" in 1991, the band—singer guitarist James Hetfield, drummer Lars Ulrich, guitarist Kirk Hammett and bassist Jason Newsted—began moving away from the earlier thrash attack of albums such as '84's "Ride The Lightning" and '86's "Master Of Puppets."

Yet, as anyone who caught the mighty Met during the recent Lollapalooza jaunt realized, Metallica are as heavy, speedy and aggressive as ever. Short hair and "new image" aside, alternative they still ain't. Mainstream in terms of sales (their last album, '91's "Metallica," topped the nine million mark), but still a far cry from Hootie in terms of mass acceptance, the band's varied influences are all evident on the Bob Rock-produced "Load," indicating there are many more musical avenues left for Metallica to explore. In the 15 years since forming in Los Angeles with now Megadeth ruler Dave Mustaine on guitar, Metallica have remained intense, uncompromising and accessible, an impressive track record that shows no signs of abating, even with the disastrous decision to put their future in the hands of HITS' resident Goddess of Grunge Katherine Turman "Al Zone."

L A R S **ULRICH** Drummer:

Metallica took criticism for going commercial with the '91 "Black" album.

What does commercial mean? To turn it around, instead of saying it's more accessible to more people, you can also say it turns fewer people off. Seriously. When you make a record that sounds the way ours did, it was less annoying to more people.

Don't you like annoying people?

Annoying people on purpose is not right. Doing anything on purpose is not right. Anything you do should be natural... Whatever we do, whether it's "Metal Militia" or "Battery," from the more extreme stuff to the softer

material, it's all been completely natural. That's a very important thing about Metallica... It's very, very pure. And commercial... When you go from making ten-minute songs that travel between ten different musical landscapes to "Enter Sandman," it's no secret that people will point to you and go, "What's going on here?" I know deep in my heart and soul that it was the direction we wanted to try to go, the only thing we hadn't explored.

So this time around, I again feel 100% pure about this. For instance, we've never played in the key of A before. Some people will say A is where a lot of rock and roll is. A, E, A, E. Yeah, it might be more in that direction, but it sounds great. I love it. In a year, we might be puking, but right now, this is what we want to do.

The whole intra-band structure has shifted, I understand. How did that happen?

It took the "Black" album to get to this point. You gotta remember where we came from when we met Bob Rock. We were very anal, very self-centered. Even more than now, believe me. And we were so caught up in the way we were doing things, and all of a sudden there's this guy sitting in the studio throwing all these suggestions at us. All of a sud-

den, Bob said, "If you want to come across sounding lively, you have to start playing like a band, acting like a band, being more like a band," because it was very much the James and Lars show up until then. We used to guard it like the fucking Crown Jewels or something. We would sit and tell everyone, yes, it was a band, but I think everyone knew that me and James pretty much took care of everything. We have been, for years and years, guarding Metallica from the outside world. And I think we found ourselves even guarding Metallica a little bit from Kirk and Jason in a very, very bizarre way. Obviously, I'm slightly exaggerating, but generally, we are much more of a team of four guys now.

You're a very look-to-the-future, controlled sort of person. Do you think about the inevitable end of Metallica?

One side of me says, when it fizzes out, just walk away and do something else, but at the same time, who the fuck am I to tell Pat Travers he can't play clubs up and down the West Coast? What is that? I mean, if he is having a good time playing clubs, who the fuck am I and why shouldn't he? It's a very tough thing to talk about, because I don't have an answer. I'm talking more as Lars the music fan, not Lars the guy in Metallica.

Could you walk away? Would your ego let you leave?

I think so, yeah. It's very hard to talk about... I do believe that we have some kind of ability to avoid getting ourselves in too many embarrassing or degrading situations. We do put ourselves in some, but I think we have a pretty high batting average compared to a lot of other bands. Sounds

arrogant, but we're totally alive, almost in the moment of what's going on around us. I think we have a much better chance of recognizing when it's over than a lot of other bands. It's something I feel in the bottom of my heart. And, once that happens, there are other things in life that need to be explored. Speaking only for myself, I will go for them and be OK with that. Metallica is the only band I've ever been in. I think Metallica will be the only band I'll ever be in. The purity of that is enough. Once this ride is over, I could never give the same amount of dedication and commitment to anything else after Metallica.

Did you guys discuss "imaging" before deciding to cut your hair short or what to wear on-stage?

Actually, I can f**king wear whatever I damn well please this time. Because wearing a f**king black T-shirt and that same damn pair of jeans that I wore 302 times on stage last tour, I'm not going to do that, because it's just so damn same-y. This time I'm going to wear whatever I f**king want; if I want to go out wearing goddamn pajamas, I'm gonna do that not that I'm going to, but you know what I'm saying. If I want to wear a big chicken suit on stage, I'm gonna do that!

"Relaxed" was an adjective I've seen used about the "Load" sessions. How did that happen?

I mean, there was tension, but, you know, that tension was more focused toward the tapes, the music, rather than going at each other. And also we're much more mature now. Much of it has to do with the fact that we'd been home for the longest amount of time ever since this goddamn band started. We've been home almost three years. I'm 33 now. I've been in the band for 13 years; Lars and James have been together 15. I joined the band when I was 20. Fuckin' hell! I

mean, 13 years! Some people don't even have a three-year career and we're going on our 13th!

When you joined the band, what was your vision?

I just wanted to go traveling and like, you know, play nice clubs! I love being on tour, I live for being on tour. It's fun. As a musician, it really helps my chops and I'm noticing that now, more than anything. When we finish on-stage now, we just go back to the hotel room, smoke some pot and start playing guitar for four or five hours.

I've gotten so much better as a musician after experiencing the fruits of all that labor now, here in the studio, because all the stuff that I learned in those hotel rooms and all the music I wrote in those hotel rooms are now the songs, and all the licks that you've learned, I'm using in the songs.

I hear you're a closet jazz fan.

I listen mainly to horn or trumpet players like Miles, John Coltrane, Chet Baker, Cannonball Adderly... they've influenced my sense of phrasing and melody, because those guys can play the most beautiful melodies. It just sounds so great... they have a way of letting their notes sing and breathe, which has influenced me a lot.

Were you any more involved in songwriting and lyrics this time around?

No lyrical contributions, but, yeah, when it came time to get the songs together, I just had a ton of farking music. We wrote 28 songs. I contributed on six songs; six out of 14... that's not so bad. That's almost half. I'm also playing rhythm guitar on this album, which I never used to do.

Before, James would take care of all the rhythms. This time, I'm playing a lot of them... We want to be able to play two different parts that interlock. So we've come up with alternate guitar parts. And it's great to listen to. You know, on the left side, you hear James doing his great guitar thing. And on the right side, me doing my thing on top of his, and it works out really well. It's very soulful... there's a lot of "swing" to it, you know? From note to note, it's very loose... not as tight as previous Metallica albums. There's one song where everything is played so laid-back behind the beat, you'd think we were playing on a front porch somewhere, drinking martinis or gin and tonics all day!

A M E S HETFIELD

Singer/Lyricist/Guitarist:

"The House That Jack Built" is about substance abuse, correct?

I don't really want to get into where the lyrics came from, and especially what they mean. I want people to how should I put it? accept them with no preconceptions of what they're supposed to be. I'm trying to get people to think a little more. To me, it's pretty interesting when people tell me what it's about. It's pretty lame, me just saying, "This means that." No one's wrong. They just got something else out of it, which I like.

I understand Tom Waits is a favorite lyricist of yours.

I've been looking at lyrics as lyrics instead of just hearing the song and going, "Oh, that fits in, that's kinda cool." Actually sitting down and kind of experimenting with listening to different types... I guess maybe my mind is a little more keened in on some of the lyric stuff now. I never really gave two shits about the lyrics before. I mean, I cared about my own, but others I didn't pay much attention to. There are certain artists that I think are really good lyric writers... though I'm not sure whether they mean to be, whether they study it, or it just seems to come from within.

I'm just getting more curious about people and why they write the way they do, and how they go about it. There's certain

stuff in Tom Waits and Leonard Cohen that I know is a bit artsy-fartsy shit, but it's got some real deep meanings in there. There are all sorts of metaphors and beatnik qualities to it all, which gets a little comball. But there's some deep shit I really like.

I understand that you have an album's worth of material left over for a second record?

Something like that. We're just trying to shorten up the cycles. That's kinda what we're after. Five years between albums is ridiculous.

Offstage, you seem to be cut-ups, not serious, yet you're anything but light-hearted on this record.

People do wonder about that. We don't like being clowns on the record. This is serious shit. When it comes down to music, we're serious as a heart attack. Humor is no doubt a part of our lives. You have to be humorous or else you're gonna get sucked under. There might be a couple songs that are a little more tongue-in-cheek, or sarcasm directed at ourselves. That's about as far as it goes. Stuff like the "Garage

Days" [covers EP]... that was kinda goofy, it was fun. Jason was just coming into the group, we just went in and about the tunes.

"One," you or your management actual-

ly researched the lyrical ideas. Any of that on this record?

Most of it's from within. I've dug in quite a bit deeper, and I've found some things that have been f**king with me and will continue to forever more. A lot of people say: "These lyrics aren't as angry, now you're older and more mature, you've grown up, you're rich, you're no longer unhappy." People are f**ked up, they're f**ked-up forever, no matter what. Even if you come to terms with your f**ked up-ness, it doesn't go away. Maturity doesn't change it. You're no longer the angry teenager... Now you're the angry middle-aged fellow, or whatever. But there's some deep shit going on still.

Is there still a metal underground like the one Metallica arose from?

It's hard to say. If it is, it's really, really underground. As far as metal goes, I haven't heard a whole lot of

JASON NEWSTED Bassist:

stuff that's really appealed to me. Sepultura is getting interesting; the

drum stuff. I love drums. C.O.C. I just

love. Unfortunately, Kyuss is no

longer around; I thought they were

really unique and had a vibe to them.

Did you personally set up any challenges or goals for "Load"?

I think I did. And it didn't come just from myself, it also came from other interactions that have happened in the band in the last year or so, too. James and Lars have opened up considerably. To Kirk, mainly. James and Lars were open to Kirk's ideas before, but they have to come to it a lot more now. But mine were... just a different thing. They used to be so closed about their music to anyone; it didn't matter if it was Kirk or me or anybody, they were always just closed to other music. It was them two and BOOM! And I think people were familiar with that some-

what. And now... it's just time, maturity and opening up and things have come around. I kinda spoke up in a few different ways for myself, like, "It's coming down to it guys, you either love me or ... "

But it all worked out for the best. You must feel great about the record.

I'm pleased at what we were able to get down on tape, and the freedom that those guys let us have this time, to really kind of let me be myself more. This was the first recording since I was in Flotsam & Jetsam that I really feel that I've been able to kind of go crazy on. This was the first Metallica recording where I really got to voice my own thing, so that's a good feeling... for those guys as much as me. They realized that the band is getting stronger because of it.

Did you have any input into lyrics this time around?


I gave James about 30 pages of my scribbles, strictly drivel, I mean... Some was about "your special person" or "people sharing a soul" or those kind of things. But there was a lot of stuff about agitation, frustration... those gnarly things. And different scary stuff, too. Genetic weird cybercrap... just different stuff. Plus some things that were poetic and shit. If a few quick words come up, that's all I ever want. I throw this stuff at him so that hopefully he can take a word from there, a word from here and somehow spur something in him. My

main concern in Metallica is to play "cool bass stuff," adding mood and expression to James' great songs. I mean, he writes great songs. That's all there is to it. I'm just trying to do my best to make his songs even better.

This was the first Metallica into the group, we just went in and bashed them out. It's fun, but it gets a recording where I really got to little old. I'd rather be more serious voice my own thing, so that's a In the past, on "Naming Names" or good feeling... for those guys as much as me.





ASK LOVABLE 43-YEAR-OLD ECCENTRIC ROBYN HITCHCOCK when he first knew he was different—just a little weirder than his British school chums—and he proffers the expected reply: "You mean, when did I start not growing up?" Seated poolside at his posh Hollywood hotel, he goes on to tell of his protective parents, "Both quite unworldly people, who encouraged me to feel both brilliant and inadequate. I was obviously something really special—this was drummed into me—but at the same time, I was a hapless impractical person who was never going to be able to do much by myself. I was just too clever for this world." Frown. Protracted sigh. "So that's what I grew up to be."

As is the case in most ugly duckling stories, negatives transform into positives once adulthood hits. For the past two decades, Hitchcock has made those childhood eccentricities work for him, simply by focusing his

songwriter's eye on fun, oddball subjects that most composers overlook.

His new "Moss Elixir" (WB) sketchbook follows suit—the cello-bowed opener "Sinister But She Was Happy" employs playful, but unforgettable imagery like French actress Jeanne Moreau, a "kinder spider half inclined to free you" and "a chandelier festooned with leeches." The horn-salted road map of "DeChirico Street" is a cavalcade of similar curiosities: "I was followed home by a weighing machine on DeChirico Street... and the numbers turned to fingers/And the fingers turned to flies/And then buzzed around your portrait." Hitchcock warbles all these twisted thoughts in a blatantly British voice that's as charming as it is daffy, like the kid in grade school who'd horrify teachers by bringing a shrunken head or pet tarantula to show and tell. HITS' own schoolboy in disgrace, Tom "Won't Let Me" Lanham, helps Robyn polish the apple.

Let's start with "DeChirico Street." It's almost like "The Phantom Tollbooth"—surrealistic versions of children's literature.

I write for adults as children, basically. People have often said, "Why don't you do a children's book?" In many ways, I was never really forced to grow up. I had a very sheltered background, so a lot of the things you should do when you're quite young, I didn't do until I was much older. So I've always been able to maintain that profile of coming across quite childlike.

As for your surrealism, that's a 20th century expression, but what it really is, is dreaming. And I suppose people like Bosch had it years ago. The surrealists deliberately juxtaposed things that were jarring. In my way of working, things glide through one after the other like they do in a dream, and you don't really have any power to control that. You're unlikely, even while the dream is happening, to say, "This is out of order, this normally doesn't happen." When a dream is happening, anything can take place, and I don't think you have the capacity to reflect on it. It's almost as if you're there with your eyelids propped open and you're forced to view whatever your mind parades before you. And I think that's probably the way my stuff works.

Sort of like the collage work of Max Ernst?

What's funny about surrealism is that it took so long to happen, because I really think it's a natural thing that the mind does. The mind, for some reason, needs to scramble things; you'd go insane if you didn't dream. It's not enough that you lie down with your eyes shut... you must sleep, and more importantly, you must dream. That function in my songs is very much an extension of that—my mental health is practically guaranteed by producing this stuff.

Do you keep a dream diary?

I'm actually quite happy to forget them. They're usually very turbulent. What I like best is having bland dreams. Waking up in the morning, my girlfriend and I turn to each other and say, "What did you get?" And it's nothing that's too shocking. When your dreams mess you around too much, it's just like coming back from an eight-hour plane trip, waking up in the morning and going, "Jeez, where have I been? That was tiring!" So you have to lie there in bed for awhile, just to get over your dreams.

David Bowie once said that the older a performer gets, the more he's left with only two questions—How much time do I have left, and what am I supposed to be doing with it anyway? Which seems to be what you're saying in "Speed Of Things," discussing the recent death of your father.

I've always thought about death, ever since I was very young. You're encouraged to romanticize it when you're little, with all this stuff about ghosts "from beyond the grave" and dead lovers, which I took quite to heart. I developed a sort of healthy affection for spectral figures, and they became much more important than the things I could actually see. But I personally can't really take things in until they've gone and I can look back on them.

So I spend most of my time looking backwards. And, of course, now I've got an awful lot of backwards to look at. So I spend a lot of time just digesting things. I try to chew my life carefully before I swallow it. Unlike Bowie, I don't look to the future—but he's right, that's what we should be doing. But I'm still ruminating on my past, and it's part of that rumination that produces songs.

With the "Speed Of Things," my dad had just died and I was having a panic attack in a cafe on the Isle of Wight, because I'd drunk too much the night before and I'm getting a bit old for that kind of thing. It was the terror of the moment, and I quickly wrote this stuff down. And I'd also seen my children get to full height. Now I just grow tomatoes. My stepson and daughter are not gonna get any taller now unless something radioactive strikes them. You fed them in the high-chair and the next thing you know, they're out dating.

I also threw earth onto my father's coffin, and I started remembering him again when I was really small. And it all goes by so very fast. It's true that life speeds up as you get older. You hit 40 and think it's great, but then you kind of think you'll go back to being 39. "OK, I've seen 40. Great! Thank you."

But the great thing is, you've not only stayed young at heart, but you still look like a kid, too!

I've got the aspects of a kid because I'm basically an innocent. I don't mean that I haven't done bad things, but I'm an innocent person. I'm easily told what to do; I'm easily led. In other words, I'm no Clint Eastwood.

Writer/director/actor Ed Burns is down to just two fighting brothers in "She's The One," his follow-up to the critically- acclaimed low-budget sleeper, "The Brothers McMullen." Starring Burns and Mike McGlone as Mickey and Francis Fitzpatrick, two feuding brothers with three women in the middle—played by Cameron Diaz, Jennifer Aniston and Burns' real-life steady, Maxine Bahns—the film details their romantic problems, which are exacerbated by the misguided advice of their father, played by veteran actor John Mahoney. Reviewers have remarked on the similarity of the two films, but those who liked the first movie's irreverent take on sex, Catholicism and male bonding have been likewise drawn to



Did you always want Tom Petty to do the music for the movie?

No, but only because I never dreamed that I could get someone like him to do the score for a little \$3.5 million movie. What happened was that Tom's manager was friends with a guy at Fox and Tom had mentioned he was interested in doing a score, and this guy suggested that Tom "check out the new movie by the kid who did 'The Brothers McMullen.'" Suddenly, I get a phone call saying, "Tom loves the movie, he wants to meet you. Get on a plane." So I come out here and we met, and for me, just meeting the guy was one of the highlights of my life, because I'd been a fan since I was a kid. But we hit it off.

Is it true that he surprised you with how much material he wrote?

Yeah, Tom said, "I'm gonna write a tune for you," and it was going to be for either opening or closing credits, and then maybe we'd incorporate that into the basic score. Two weeks later, he's got three songs written, and I said, "Can we use 'em all?" and he's like, "Sure." So then he went into the studio with the Heartbreakers and we incorporated the themes of all three songs into the score. Then he decided to write another five songs, so suddenly you've got eight songs—enough for an album. So then he and the band went in again after we'd finished and recorded another five tunes, and I still can't believe it.

How involved were you in the sessions?

When we did the score, I was there every day, all day long, if only so I could be around for this free Tom Petty concert. It was great because we worked pretty closely on it, and he's got this great cinematic sense. This is a rock & roll score for a movie that has no montage, few establishing shots and that's almost all dialogue—and yet the music never fights the dialogue nor steps on it. And he recognized that and knew immediately if it worked or not. And if it didn't, he'd say, "Fine, let's start over from scratch and come up with something else." And I had suggestions from time to time, and one of them stuck, so I felt good.

He really seemed to enjoy it. And I got to sit back and watch these guys just make the film better and elevate every scene. And I think he was inspired because they then went off and wrote another ten songs.

What other music do you love?

I'm your basic suburban white boy rock & roll fan. Growing up it was Tom, Neil Young, Bruce, Zeppelin, Skynyrd, and now I'm into Soundgarden, Pearl Jam, Black Crowes. Predictable stuff.

Is the music aspect of your films still a learning process for you?

Very much so. With "McMullen," I had no idea what I wanted to do musically. I was just fortunate that we came up with the idea of using traditional Irish folk music, and again, I was amazed at how music could affect the film. So for this, I originally wanted to do something like "The Graduate," or the way "Breakfast At Tiffany's" used "Moon River." I wanted one song that'd be the theme, and then use it throughout the film, and we kind of did that, only using three different songs. And music really helps me with the comedy. Tom came up with that jazzy, playful thing for all the scenes in the limo with Frances and his driver, and the minute you hear those piano keys, you immediately smile.

"McMullen" cost just \$25,000 and made over \$10 million, making it the most profitable film of 1995. You must be rich.

If you can believe it, and it's amazing, we're still in the hole, according to the accounting statements. They tell us we're going to see money—but we haven't seen it yet. Welcome to Hollywood!

It's ironic that there is so much talk of sex in this movie and there is none in it. Is that intentional?

Oh yeah. Most of the time when I'm in the theater and it's time for the love scene is where you lose me. I can't remember the last love scene I've seen that was actually hot or erotic. I think the moment where Mickey and Heather almost kiss is far more erotic and has much more tension than if we'd stripped down and started humping on the kitchen floor.

Where do you see your career going in 10 years?

[Laughs] It's all downhill from here. I know the films I like and I'm trying to stay there. Trying to make these smaller, character pieces and the good thing about them is that you don't need a lot of money to make them, so I'm going to be able to maintain my creative control. The other good thing about keeping your budget low is that these things don't need to go out and make \$50 million. So ten years from now, hopefully if I'm doing about a film every year, I'll have seven to nine films and I'm sure some will suck, but maybe a few will be good.

Instead, on their 1994 Epic Records debut "EDC," Satchel carved their own Prince-like smooth and sensual musical niche, led by the heart-breaking voice of Shawn Smith. Their follow-up, "The Family" (Epic), is a natural, focused progression, once again emoting with sweet, sad songs and a touch of humor.



This musical family's roots run deep in the Seattle forests. Shawn not only plays keys and sings with Satchel, he also lends his talents to the bands Pigeonhead and Brad. With Satchel drummer Regan Hagar (formerly of Malfunkshun) and guitarist Stone Gossard (you know, of Pearl Jam), Brad recorded one of the best records of 1993 in "Shame." In addition, Stone produced "The Family" and has a label called Loosegroove with Regan. To make matters even more complicated, they have a new bass player, Mike Berg, who has played in bands with Regan, but used to be their roadie. Shawn refers to him as "a really consistent and honest dude." Although they're not a guitarbeavy band, guitars are important to their sound, and so is guitarist John Hoag.

deliver it— to HITS' own dysfunctional family member Jennifer "100 Pounds of" Clay.



It's been two years since "EDC." Why so long in between albums?

That's just the way things rolled. We were going to have to work with a producer, and it was really hard to find somebody. We only took three weeks to record it, though.

"EDC" was self-produced. Why did you feel you needed a producer this time?

It was felt that maybe the last album had some holes in it and that maybe we needed some focus. We were looking at producers and the only people that I would want to work with are people like Flood. And, you know, you can't work with him.

Is it that you guys are difficult to work with, or is it that you don't think people share your vision?

It's difficult to work with someone telling you what to do—unless you respect them. It's just hard for me to have any kind of police officer in the room and that's what a producer can be a lot of the time.

So Stone was less a cop and more of a focusing element?

He's just a good organizer. He has a clipboard and he keeps the ball rolling. Plus, I trust him. I trust his opinion. If he doesn't like something, that makes it easier to accept.

Calling the album "The Family" sounds almost Mafioso. And the band is referred to as the Satchel Partnership. Is it really like a family?

We're ultimately brothers or sisters, either way. There's a family vibe.

Your songs are very personal.

This album is actually the least personal stuff I've done. It's a different kind of personal.

Why?

I don't really know. I think because I was more of a tortured artist before. I feel I was less tortured this time.

Was your first single, "Isn't That Right," written with someone particular in mind?

There were no girls involved in my life at the time. There wasn't that element, which some-

times there is. [Laughs] Because girls are good inspiration for songwriting.

It's also pretty sad.

[Laughs] Well, there are not many humorous songs on the album. That's a sad song, but it's also... [Laughs] I guess it's humorous in some sick way.

Are you lonely?

Yeah. I'm romantic all the time, so it's hard. Isn't that maybe where some of those songs come from?

[Laughs] You got me there.

Why the "O" in "Time O' The Year?"

Because it was clever. You know, "Sign O' The Times." It's a Prince thing. High Prince. That's what that is.

The more rockin' "Some More Trouble" seems to be tackling some weighty issues. Is that about racial prejudice or hate crimes?


It's a global level of hate song. [Laughs] No particular hate. It just means that there is a lot of hate going on out there.

Do you see a lot of that kind of thing in Seattle?


Not in my vision of Seattle. Racial prejudice is more underlying and hidden here. So when you do find out what it's really like, it's really intense. But everyone is so liberal here, it's so subtle. See, I come from Bakersfield, where it's so over the top. It's a pretty weird place. I think it got weirder right when I was leaving. Things got pretty heavy there. One minute there were no guns, and the next minute there were guns everywhere. It used to be just the cowboys had guns.

Were you in any bands in Bakersfield?

No, I wasn't really into what was going on, what they were playing. In the years that I would have been playing in a high school band, I was listening to other kinds of music. Zapp and stuff. I was really into dance music at the time, Prince and all that. [Laughs] There's nothing else to do in Bakersfield except listen to music, drink and smoke weed.

Louise Wener—the outspoken, guitar-brandishing leader of Brit-popsters Sleeper, which also includes guitarist Jon Stewart, Somali bassist Dild Osman and drummer Andy Maclure—knew exactly what she was doing when she dubbed her band's sophomore Arista disc "The It Girl." Her inspiration? Silent film star Clara Bow, whose exotic flapper look and libidinous off-screen lifestyle came to symbolize the flaming youth of the Roaring Twenties. At the height of her popularity, the voluptuous vamp was even mentioned in a coach-posted notice to USC athletes: "Clara Bow is off limits to all members of this football team."

"Isn't it depressing that there are no great film stars any more?" sighs Wener, whose risque quotes have often landed her in a Bow-big heap of trouble. "They're so bland and there's something so... ordinary about them. There's no spark, no imagination or character, no Bette Davises any more. They're all so one-dimensional."

Wener should know. In video after Sleeper video, the camera takes to her doe-eyed Theda Bara beauty like a fish to water, and she works her lens time like "Pandora's Box"-era Louise Brooks. A la Bow, however, she's not just another pretty face; through perky, new wave-ish tracks like "Statuesque," "Shrinkwrapped" and "Sale Of The Century," Wener shakes her first at outdated ladylike mores and strict social convention. And in "Dress Like Your Mother," she angrily watches an old chum get whipped into shape by the no-Clara Bows system: "You sold your punk records/Read the book instead/You lost your sense of humor/But you kept the queen is dead... you dress like your mother." The old It Girl herself—knocking back cocktails from her champagne-filled bathtub—couldn't have put it any better. Too bad she had to relate it all to HITS' own locch Boy, Tom "He's No Rudolf Valentino" Lanham.

In "Feeling Peaky" and "Dress Like Your Mother," it seems like you're speaking for the average British shopgirl, your typical hard-working nine to fiver.

Definitely, because that's what I feel I am. I grew up in that environment, and that's what everything around me was like. And when you live most

of your life like that, you write from that experience.

Someone recently said to me, "Well, how can that be relevant to you now?" But there was always this feeling of frustration in my household that was totally palpable—you could feel it all the time. My father was so frustrated and repressed in what he was doing. He was brilliant at his job, but he wanted so much more, and he grew up in post-war '50s Britain—he had a family he had to support and he had to get a job to support them with. He didn't have an education; he was 14 when he left school to work. He was in the Air Force right through World War II, then went and got another job. So we sort of grew up with that feeling of "If only..." from him.

Was there a point where you finally said, "This existence is definitely not my cup of tea," and cut the cord?

It wasn't so much that, because I really had nothing but respect for both of my parents, which is quite an unusual thing, I suppose. What they did for me, my brother and sister was to say, "Don't be afraid of doing something different—go out and take the risk. We didn't, but we'll support you, even if you f**k up." Which was great. But my Dad got totally screwed out of his pension, and that was kind of a seminal moment. After that, he started pushing it on all of us to do whatever we liked, because it was more important to have freedom then to toe the line for someone else for years and years.

And now you've become free enough—songwriting-wise—to openly discuss racier topics like lust and sex.

That's something I grew up with as well, because it was something that was never talked about in our family. My mum once took me aside and said, "Look, sex is much more trouble than it's worth." That was kind of her view of it. And when I was a kid, I was shy for a very long time. Then I went through this thing where I sort of cracked when I was about 13 and went completely mad. You know, there's that very strange period you go

through when you're young and you're very much defined by what people at school think about you, and I got all these mates who were outside of school, so I was living this dual existence. I sort of freaked out for awhile. Which turned out to be a good thing, actually.

Today's It Girls are probably the supermodels.

Certain women are relevant just because they look a certain way. I never bought into that and I'll continue to criticize it for as long as I have a breath. It's difficult, because there are so many things you're supposed to live up to, so many ways you're supposed to look, so many ways you're supposed to behave. And most of the time, men are freed from that.


I suppose the average girl should rail against it where she can, try not to fit in too much. I think the danger comes—and this is quite a strong topic with Sleeper—from the idea of wanting to fit in, to belong. But once you join the club, you've bought into all those stereotypes. And I never wanted to do that.

Did people in the music industry try to mold you?

They tried, but they got very, very short shrift. They want you to wear certain clothes, they want you to say certain things, and be careful about what you say. There's this whole idea about being careful because it's a paranoid industry, really, and everyone's really scared you'll step out of line or say the wrong thing. And that just bores me to death—the idea of being careful. There's never been an interview I've done where I didn't get shit from somebody about something—if you talk about sex, politics, AIDS or any of those things. It's like people don't even want to talk about this stuff because they're scared to step out of line. But I think that's more of an English thing than an American one.

Then again, in "Factor 41," you sing, "Now I'm bored of being sycophantic/So get your knickers down." In the end, it all comes down to basic human urges.

Exactly. And that's what we're like. I mean, I like the lofty stuff, but I also like the basic stuff, the natural human impulse that we all have. A lot of people go around trying to pretend that they don't have them or they don't want to talk about them. Are most people in denial? In England, yes. Most definitely.





Lazer Boy "Forget Nothing" (Freek Records): Lazer Boy are a British experimental band led by a very Barrett-like **Dave Lazenby**. His recorded creations are reminiscent of **The Fall** (maybe it's his monotone, spoken yell) and deal in repetition as the salvation of the pop song

as a wired-for-sound Wire would have wanted (try "Crazy Business"). There is a fine art to the hypnotic droning that entrances, makes a point, then retreats to the next song of strung-out poems and melodies. Lazer Boy is a series of psychedelic, edgy visions of that ideal song. (C.B.)

Loop Guru "Amrita... all these and the Japanese Soup Warriors" (World Domination): Amrita couldn't get further away from the suburban, rain-stick carrying "Gregorian disco" so often found posing in the electronic/world beat sections of our local record stores. It's a recording that effortlessly and genuinely transcends social, geographic and musical barriers, paying

homage on the way to Western and Eastern cultures. Salman Gita and Jumud expertly combine seemingly unassociated textural fragments so well, this record could be called "new world music," and be the benchmark by which others will be judged. (Richard Winn)





The Descendents "Everything Sucks" (Epitaph): It's a good year for wrenching punkrawk. Epitaph, who have proven they know these things best, deliver The Descendents after eight years of bands copping their aggro, all-out rock. Only The Descendents manage to squarely base

that on the simplicity and charm of three-minute, no-fuss 45rpm songs. "I'm The One" is a heavy rotator, "Rotting Out" is probably already blasting out of cars anywhere kids and aging punk fans live. If you've missed the purity of The Descendents screaming, "All!," it's back, with **Dr. Milo** having finished college and everyone at their best ever. (C.B.)

Nerf Herder "Nerf Herder" (My Records): It was inevitable that someone would equate hearing Journey out of a Camaro window and its painful suburban memories while drowning them out with the local modern rock station in your own car. The sum in Nerf Herder, a good garage band with an uncanny

ability to entertain mall rats and jaded critics alike with a "Star Wars" name and lyrics about Van Halen, south Detroit (still doesn't exist), and crashing through windows on acid. Little My Records (headed up by Lagwagon) found this first and it's an overly radio-friendly gem. (C.B.)

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Time to chill with Frosted's Jane Wiedlin by Scott Wilson

The music industry eats its young. There are very few artists that manage to enjoy anything like an actual career. Jane Wiedlin stands as a shining exception, returning once more to the fray with an aggressive new pop/punk band Frosted, which just released "Cold" their debut album on DGC.

Jane, of course, was a founding member of the Go-Go's, a band that helped define the fledgling MTV generation back in the early '8os. That band became superstars over the course of their three albums. When things came unraveled, Jane became a solo artist, releasing three more albums on her own.

Now she is finally ready to show the world her punk leanings as the lead singer/songwriter for Frosted, alongside bandmates Lance Porter on drums, guitarist Brian Waters and bassist Sean Mott. The foursome went into the studio with Elastica producer Marc Waterman and emerged with a gritty album of power-pop/punk songs that will force the listening public to reassess their opinion about Jane. She has managed to make a record that proves how vital she still is, despite the fact she's an accomplished veteran. Which only serves to spotlight how pathetic HITS' quite-unaccomplished greenhorn Scott Wilson "Pickett" really is.

What was your role in the Go-Go's?

I wrote a lot of the music and most of the lyrics, but we always tried to keep the band a democracy.

Bands are never democracies, though, are they?

No... and I wouldn't really do that again because there are always going to be people who are disgruntled. Luckily, everyone had something good to contribute, but they didn't always realize it was what they were good at. I think it's easier if there's one person who's a leader, as long as they're willing to consider other people's ideas.

Is that what happens in Frosted?

Yeah. Those guys know I'm the boss. I've written all the songs, which may or may not change in the future, but I really value their opinions, and I consistently solicit those opinions. I try to keep everyone happy, but ultimately it's my band.

How is it different being the leader of a band as opposed to being a solo artist?

Maybe it's a false illusion, but I have this sense of comfort, like there's a support group there, someone to bounce ideas off of. As a solo artist, you have the producer bringing in all these different musicians, and each one changes the song a little bit. Ultimately, you get this record, and you're not even sure where it came from.

So the vision was more the producers' than yours when you were doing your solo albums?

I think so. I definitely look back at my records and know I tried to keep a handle on them, but I think they're the producers' records. But I don't really have any regrets. It's just the way it happens. I chose the guys in Frosted because I like their ideas, I like the way they play. We ended up with a more organic sound.

What was it like working with Marc Waterman as producer?

He's like a mad scientist in the studio. He didn't like it when a song sounded too normal. We brought all these cheap toys, and we'd put noises all over things. With guitar sounds, he would really take the time to try all these combinations. Every song got individual treatment, which was nice. Another thing I liked was, he was very nurturing, because I was very nervous about doing lead vocals. He made me feel so at ease that I think I got more out of my vocals than I have in the past, emotionally.

Many think a good producer is someone who just takes a snapshot of what's going on.

Yeah. This record was recorded very quickly. We laid down the basic tracks in three days, so I like the feeling of spontaneity it has. At the same time, when it comes to the finishing touches, sometimes it's the littlest things that take the longest, but ultimately make the songs magical. I think the care with which this album was recorded really comes through.

Kevin Salem recently said this is the lamest time in music, that young people will take whatever you shovel at them. Do you agree? Wow. Those are pretty strong words. That's being a little overly dramatic. I actually am excited about the way things are now. It's kind of like it was in '87, except it's commercially acceptable. In '78, there were all these bands making great noisy pop music, but nobody wanted to listen. Now a lot of people want to hear it, so I don't think it's such a rotten time to be around.


Do you think the mainstream has come to you?

I think music has come back around to where I'm from instead of vice versa, and it took someone I trust to sort of slap me in the face by pointing out what's going on, telling me it's what I know how to do, and why didn't I just do it. I'm very, very grateful to [DGC A&R exec] Jim [Barber] for that.

How did you manage to make a career out of something that most people are in and out of in a couple of years?

I know, I feel so blessed and fortunate. There have been whole years when I was panicked, thinking it was all going to go away. In a word, it's songwriting. I guess everyone knows that. You have so much more longevity in this business if you write. Also, I'm very lucky that my first band was the Go-Go's. I think there are people out there who are willing to give me more chances because of it. Of course, it becomes a double-edged sword because then you're always being compared to that standard.

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IF IT WEREN'T FOR "BOYS," I probably would never have found the amazing band Scarce. Well, someone might have called me at some point to tell me about 'em, but if I hadn't picked up the soundtrack to the flick "Boys" and listened to this certain band named Scarce singing some effervescent song aptly named "Honeysimple," I might have never discovered this quiet diamond in the large black rough. Well, the heartache, headache, comatose and pain have finally departed, and now Scarce is planning to give out their own heart-aches with their vast array of climatic vibrations, eager lyrics and pleasing melodies. Their latest, "Dead Sexy" (A&M), eats you alive, and leaves you feeling quite scarce vourself...

After the following conversation, it's no wonder the band's Joyce Raskin is left hoping HITS' domeheaded poet/critic/rocker/ post-slacker and recently named Manager of W.C. Publicity for Elektra, Brian S. "For Seudo (sic)-Intellectual" Gross, makes himself just as scarce.

When did you start playing bass?

When I was 14. My brother had a friend who had a band, and they said, "We need a bass player, so teach your sister how to play bass." My brother had been playing for awhile, and so he and my Dad said I should do it 'cause it would be really fun.

You were the kind of girl who'd rather hang out with the boys?

Not at all, but if I hadn't gotten into playing in the band, I would have been way girlish because I took ballet and had a ton of girl friends. Once I got into music, though, I was in this man's world. It was strange. I hated it at first. I would cry. Then I worked through it.

Who's the ultimate female bass player? Uhh, gee, let me think.

While you're thinking, what's your favorite fast-food restaurant?

Denny's? But I don't think that's fast food. It is sit-down.

I really don't like fast food. I try to avoid it as much as possible. Well, my favorite bass player-I have a couple of them. Kim from Jawbox is pretty awesome. Kim Gordon from Sonic Youth. I really just love to watch women play. I think PJ Harvey is amazing.


What's the worst place you've played so far? Philadelphia! I don't like that city. Everytime

"Summertime," come together?

Well, it was when Chick was in the hospital, over the summer. Overall, it's about everything that was going down in the hospital. I was just trying to deal with what was happening to him. I was feeling separated. All these people came in from his past and present, and it was a weird scene. It's as if, when someone is down, everybody wants to be a part of it. I'm not saying it was good or bad, it was just strange, because it went from being our little world, the three of us, to 5 billion other people involved. It was about losing touch with Chick.

What were you thinking about in terms of the band's future?

I think I was more sad than anything because Chick and I became really, really close, especially in the last couple of months before it happened. He was my best friend. Someone who was normally up and around is not here, and it got real scary. Was he gonna be OK? Were we ever gonna do this again? Is he gonna be able to do anything? It made me realize something about life. It made me appreciate everything I had, because it all could be gone by tomorrow.

You must have to talk about Chick's illness a lot

It doesn't bother me. That summer, while it was going on, it certainly was hard. At the time, looking at him in his state, I had to get away. It was really hard to watch someone who was normally like, your mentor and your friend, somebody really strong, lying there with tubes everywhere. He handled the situation so well while it was going on. He was like, whatever! I did get a chance to write while all this was going on. I got a four-track, so I just wrote songs.

What other famous rock couples in music history would you compare to the relationship you have with Chick?

With the way Chick and I are on-stage, I would say John and Exene in X or Kim Deal and Black Francis in the Pixies.


What about Sonny and Cher? The Osmonds?


Maybe. We do have a cool chemistry, and we just kind of go with it. It changes all the time. Sometimes we hate each other. Sometimes we get really pissed off at each other. It's really a brother/sister thing. It's actually like a big brother beating up the little sister.


Now you both have significant others.


Yeah, so it's as if you can flirt with someone, or play music with someone, and just know that there is nothing else there. And it's never going to be any other way. It has never been a question, really, since we are both really great friends. Many times I have been with guys and I have felt like they didn't respect me. When Chick asked me to play in this band, he was like, "I want this person to be in my band, not because she's a girl, but because I think this person is a really great musician." I think it's extra fun that I just happen to be a woman, but it is not an issue. This is probably the first time where I have been in a band and it hasn't been an issue, which is nice. People see me as a woman, but I would hope they would really see me as a musician. It makes me happy when I feel that vibe.

Crash Crash Test Dummies' Brad Roberts by Janet Trakin

The Crash Test Dummies are back with the follow-up to their hugely successful "God Shuffled His Feet," "A Worm's Life" (Arista Records). Actually, it's their third record, having released the little-known "The Ghosts That Haunt Me" in 1990, so they don't have to worry about the sophomore jinx. "God Shuffled His Feet" went Gold, Platinum or double-Platinum in 16 countries and earned the group honors such as the MTV People's Choice Award and Breakthrough Artist of the Year while the British Music Industry Awards bestowed a nomination on the band for Best International Group.

As hard as it is to follow-up such a smash, "A Worm's Life" has the same winning ingredients without sounding like a carbon copy. It has the detached philosophical outlook that is the trademark of lyricist/lead vocalist Brad Roberts. An ex-philosophy student in Canada, Brad teams up with Ellen Reid on keyboards, who supplies the harmonies to accent Brad's deep baritone voice. Harmonica player Benjamin Darvil provides some lighter moments to "All Of This Ugly," a song about vultures and death that Roberts turns into a celebration of looking on the bright side. Brad's brother Dan rounds out the group as bassist while Mitch Dorge takes care of the drumming chores.

There are both hard and soft songs on the collection, with "My Enemies" courting a mean guitar solo and "There Are Many Dangers" utilizing a slow melody to underscore a metaphor-filled, paternalistic warning about keeping it all together. Brad continues to treat us to his whimsical sense of humor, especially on "My Enemies," where he imagines dictators in bathing suits. Perhaps Roberts sees the world through rose-colored glasses, but the positive lessons one learns from these songs are like a crash course in Philosophy 101.

After an 18-month tour and subsequent year-long sabbatical, the CT Dummies headed to Compass Point studio in the Bahamas, where they spent three-and-a-half months recording "A Worm's Life." The results should please old fans and win them some new ones. Brad, dressed immaculately in a black Tshirt, black vest, black jeans and black oxfords, was not the stuffy intellectual one expected, but a really down-to-earth, honest and handsome young man of 32 who had no idea what he was getting into when he agreed to this chat with HITS' sassy sibling Janet "Rich Kotite Must Go!!" Trakin.

Were you surprised at the success of "God Shuffled His Feet"?

I certainly was. I think anybody who assumes they're going to do well is probably being awfully cocky because it's a big old competitive world out there. I had no idea we'd do so well, so I was very pleased.

Time for the early bird to catch the worm

Has the huge success of "God Shuffled His Feet" changed you?

I understand much more clearly now than ever about how the music business works. That will be an ongoing process, I'm sure. I don't know everything yet, but I have an idea of how the politics and the power structures are put together. When I first entered the music business, I really had no clue about how anything worked. I thought that DJs on radio stations just played songs that they liked. Later, I found out that there were meetings devoted to what would actually get on the air. I've learned quite a bit since then.

How did you feel about Weird Al Yankovic doing a take off on "Hmm, Hmm, Hmm, Hmm"? I was very pleased with Weird Al. It was a real milestone for us. Having Weird Al cover your song meant that you've done something right. I suppose a lot of people would feel that they have been offended or made fun of, but that certainly is not the case. I think Weird Al is funny and does a really good job with all the songs he reworks and makes videos of. What did you do during your sabbatical?

I really like New York City, so I came here and hung out as a tourist for a while. I also ended up moving from Winnipeg, Manitoba to London, England. Eventually, I got around to writing the record. I wrote most of it during a writing trip to Prague in the Czech Republic. Once that was done, we went to Dublin and did a bunch of pre-production and arranged the tunes. We then went to Compass Point and spent three-and-a-half months making the record.

Your study of philosophy has influenced your songwriting.

To be honest, when I was a student up until high school, I really wasn't very good. I didn't excel at school. When I went to the university, I had some very good profs my first year, particularly in the philosophy and English departments. For the first time in my life, I became interested in reading. I became very absorbed in that. I can't say I loved philosophy. I actually had to have my ass kicked in to enjoy it by someone who knew more than I did.

Why did you decide to produce your own album?

On our first two records, we needed a producer simply because we had never made a record before and we needed that kind of guidance. But after we had made a couple of records, we observed what producers do, and we learned a great deal. We thought we could do that ourselves. There's certainly no point in paying someone an exorbitant amount to do something that you can do yourself.

What are your expectations for "A Worm's Life"?

I don't know how it will do in the market. I think that on the one hand, probably 20% to 25% of our fans will be willing to go buy the record just out of curiosity. However, after that, you have to win people all over again. Taking sales past that basic core of fans requires a lot of luck, a lot of timing and hard work. Whether all those factors will come together is a really good question. My fingers are crossed.

How did you first get into music?

When I was about eight years old, I started buying those K-Tel "22 Greatest Hits" records. Then, when I was 13, I joined the KISS army, and became a massive KISS fan, as everybody else was at that time in the late '70s. Then, when I was about 15, I started listening to a .band called XTC, who influenced the work I do now a great deal.

The other thing is, I come from a musical background. My parents and grandparents all play instruments and sing. Although none of them ever did it for a living, I think it is in my

genes to have an aptitude for music. You seem to draw material from everyday life, as in the title song and "He Likes To Feel It."

I would say that the sources for the lyrics come from a wide variety of areas. Conversations I've overheard, television shows, books I've read, memories. All these things combine to become the stuff of lyrics.

Is "An Old Scab" about writer's block?

Yes, it is. I thought that it would be interesting to write a song about how difficult writing a song is. That way, I could take my writer's block and use it as a way of solving my problems. I guess it's kind of like cheating, but I do what I can.◆

The Cardigans "First Band On The Moon" (Mercury): Fans of true, unabashed pop gems are swooning worldwide. The Cardigans have topped their previous critics' darling, "Life," with a stunning record of unforgettable songs. From the lush, acid-jazz cool of "Your New Cuckoo" to the smash

"Lovefool" and the sassy "Been It," The Cardigans have more than lived up to multi-platinum expectations. Anyone wanting to wax nostalgic over '60s AM radio love songs, mix up a lounge cocktail or slink into a vampy version of Sabbath's "Iron Man" just needs pop pioneers The Cardigans, already far into orbit. As we fuel up for Fall, we need weapons that win and fresh jamz to keep those fickle fingers faithful. Here's what the doctor recommends this week. Let's start with the most-added record from last week, Bone Thugs-N-Harmony's "Day Of Our Livez" (East West/Elektra), one of the key kuts from the soundtrack to the flick "Set It Off." Did you see the group on the "MTV Video Music Awards" last week? Awesome! They kicked off their tour with Keith Sweat and SWV last week. Obviously, Richard Nash (pic-




tured) and the krew at Elektra are elated, but "not surprised." Andre Carson, PD at WPEG/Charlotte, and his MD Nate Quick were among the first to hear and add this "killer kut." Incidentally, Andre says he just had not only an incredible Spring book, but some strong trends following the book. The song also got early adds from O.M. Steve Crumbley and Lorenzo "Ice T" Thomas at WXYV-FM Baltimore. In their native Cleveland, WZAK's Bobby Rush and Lankford Stephens put it right in. Other early believers include KKBT, WPGC, KPRS, WOWI, WAMO, KIPR, WPLZ, WBLX, WKKV, WKYS, WROU, WQQK, WJMH, WQUE, WTLC, WEJM and WBLK. Another note on Sweat: His self-titled album shot past NAS' "It Was Written" (Columbia) as the nation's topselling black album. There are lots more singles to come, so be prepared... Then there's Donell Jones' "Knocks Me Off My Feet" (Laface/Arista). If you ask Lionel Ridenour or David Linton, they'll tell you why it is fast becoming one of urban radio's most loved songs. But the answer is simple, it goes where it needs to go and it will take some listeners with it. Expect heavy phone after minimal airplay with this groover, which is already proving to be a strong reaction record. Out-the-box airplay at WGCI, WXYV, WOWI, WTLC, WPLZ, KMJM, WHRK, WZAK, WKND, WWDM, KIPR, WAAA and WBLX. Ridenour and Linton are also elated over Outkast's "ATLiens" album, which streaked onto our "Active Albums" chart in the #3 position. Not only that, but 112's self-titled album (Bad


Boy/Arista) accomplished the same thing, entering the chart at #8. What's going on over at Arista? Better yet, don't stop!... This is the week New Edition goes for their second #1 record. Their first, "Hit Me Off," is still topping the charts. The sophomore record is called "I'm Still In Love With You" and features the velvety-smooth and sexy chops of lead vocalist Ralph Tresvant. A sure sign of success is its #1 Most-Added status this week. The song is from the new album "Home Again" (MCA), out this week. This soulful bal-

lad showcases what originally made New Edition a staple for urban, Top 40 and crossover radio. Make room for this anthem now as the classic should be spinning well into the fall... Get ready for the new Toni Braxton smash, "Unbreak My Heart" (LaFace/Arista), the second single from her "Secrets" album. This one is a quality piece of work with more than enough relevance to keep her on the minds of the masses. Braxton is still one of the few female artists who is able to go from the most delicate sonic purrs to pure power in a heartbeat. By the way, was that Toni Braxton we saw during the MTV awards with NBA bad boy Dennis Rodman? Also, early indications are that the video, from those who have seen it, surpasses the one for "You Make Me High"... Look for these songs to impact your listeners in the very near future, but please be aware that the add dates are subject to change: The Braids' "Bohemian Rhapsody" (9/23), 112's "Come See Me" (9/23), Kenny G's "Moments" (9/23), En Vogue's "Don't Let Go (Love)" (9/23), E-40, f/Too \$hort & K-Ci Hailey's "Rapper's Ball" (9/30) and Horace Brown's "How Can We Stop" (9/30). Also down the line a bit, look for Bebe & CeCe Winans' "Must Be From Heaven," Ice Cube's "The World Is Mine," Adriana Evans' "Reality," Sandra St. Victor's "Rise," Curtis Mayfield's "New World Order," Eric Benet's "Spiritual Thing" and Somethin' For The People's "Can You Feel Me." Word!

tracks) album is out and is jammed with radio-friendly singles, such as Salt-N-Pepa's "Champagne," Passion's "Where I'm From," Jodeci members K-Ci & Jojo's "How Could You" and Tasha's "I Wanna Know Your Name"... Old School: "Dance Floor Divas" (Rhino) is a must-have, featuring cuts from A Taste Of Honey ("Boogie Oogie Oogie"), Silver Convention ("Fly Robin Fly"), Evelyn "Champagne" King ("Shame"), Vicki Sue Robinson ("Turn The Beat Around"), Candi Staton ("Young Hearts Run Free"), Gwen McCrae ("Rockin' Chair") and much more... Jazz Riffs: Saxophonist Art Porter has a fine album with "Lay Your

Hands On Me" (Verve Forecast), featuring several tasty Quiet Storm/urban adult cuts from Brian McKnight ("Just Wanna Be With You" and "Forever Love") and a long-awaited return to action by Lalah Hathaway ("One More Chance"). Check out "Candlelights" and "Wishful Thinking" while you're at it... Rapper Paperboy returns with his second effort, "City To



City" (Next Plateau). It features "P's Cure," "Hundreds & Hundreds (In God We Trust)," "Swayz Groove," "Pockets Phat" and a notable duet with Run DMC's Run (Joseph Simmons) on "East West Groove"... Clubby: "Club Epic Volume 6" (Epic) is billed as "a collection of classic dance mixes." No pretensions. Classic club mixes of Cindy Lauper's "Change Of Heart," Wham's "I'm Your Man," Gloria Estefan & Miami Sound Machine's "Rhythm Is Gonna Get You" and Claudja Barry's "Down Cand Counting" will keep club djs — and you — busy for hours...



Harmolodics: Saxophonist Ornette Coleman created the concept of "harmolodics," a theory that breaks down the wall between harmony and melody. Coleman better explains: "In harmolodies, the melody is not the lead. The melody occupies the same concept as a written document, such as a letter. One

writes as they wish in the same song." To that end, two CDs of the same title have been released — "Sound Museum: Three Ladies" and "Sound Museum: Hidden Man" (Harmolodic/Verve) — that demonstrate Coleman's concept. Each title is of a different length on both CDs and boldly shatters listeners' pre-conceived ideas of how structure works in music. It's an idea that will not be fully grasped until well into the next century, when Coleman will finally be recognized as the genius he truly is...



"Sunny" Joe White - Touched By Genius, Loved By His Peers

We are all saddened by the passing of radio legend "Sunny" Joe White in Boston this past weekend. He was discovered at his home on Saturday, September 7. According to published reports, White had been battling a substance abuse problem. Autopsy reports were not available to pinpoint the exact time of death. but friends became concerned when they had not seen White for several days prior to the discovery of his body. White ended his career almost where he began, at Nash Comunication's WILD-AM Boston. Over the past several years, White had been battling heart disease and, at the time of his death, was awaiting a heart donor. Sunny Joe was probably best known for his programming and on-air antics at WXKS-FM (Kiss 108) Boston, where he took the station to its highest ratings in the mid-'80s before leaving in 1990. He was one of the few African-American programmers to successfully program at a Top 40 station. White subsequently worked at WZOU-FM and then-WVBF-FM before ending his career at WILD as an air personality and consultant. WILD PD Ken Johnson said of White: "Sunny Joe White was one of the two programmers in the country that I learned anything from. He was-by far-the greatest. I learned style, programming and formatting from him, but I think the most important things that I picked up were his love for radio and the music. He was passionate about both, and those are the two things that drive me in this business. He was a genius as far as I'm concerned." Funeral services were held at Concord Baptist Church in Roxbury, September II... Kathy Brown, PD of Radio One's WWIN-FM (Majic 95.9) Baltimore, has announced that Randy Dennis, who was the wake-up dude for sister station WERQ-FM (92-Q), will segue to WWIN for similar morning duties, beginning September 10. Dennis replaces 15-year Baltimore vet Tim Watts, who exits. Dennis will be joined in the morning by J.C. White. Brown and White (she's a lady) both worked in Milwaukee: White did middays at WKKV-FM (V-100) and Brown was PD at WMCS-AM. Meanwhile, WERQ PD Tom Calococci has already picked Dennis'

replacement. He is Frank Skii, who will do the dawn patrol beginning September 23. Skii had been paired with Jean Ross as part of the wake-up team at Infinity's WXYV-FM (V 103), whose morning show is now titled "Ross & Company"... From the Juice Inside Rumors department: Has V 103's Steve Crumbley been having serious skull sessions with former WERQ PD Russ Allen, who returned to his native Baltimore after his former station, KSOL-FM San Francisco, was sold and changed formats to Spanish? Stay tuned... If you've been wondering where former WKYS-FM Washington PD "Big" George Hamilton is, we've found him. He's back with VP/GM Cliff Fletcher at WWWZ-FM Charleston, SC as PD... The "King Of Pop," Michael Jackson, caused pandemonium during a surprise visit to Prague's St. Vitus Cathedral last weekend. Hundreds of fans mobbed the gothic structure, climbing on pews to get a look at the singer, whose performance on September 7 launched his "HIStory World Tour." Jackson also visited Czech President Vaclav Havel, a selfdescribed Rolling Stones fanatic, at his office...







It is almost a certainty now that Wherehouse Records, currently fighting their way out of Chapter 11, will indeed not be sold. New CEO Bruce Ogilvie and company were back in court with the manufacturers, the bond holders and Cerberus Partners (who now own the entire \$94 million in "senior" debt) on Sept. 5 and won approval extending the filing period for its "stand alone" reorganization plan until Sept 27. big news is Some Wherehouse now has "exclusive" right to file such a plan. The manufacturers (who could have also filed a plan) had already come to an agreement to let this be the case, but the bond holders (who stand to lose the most money) were still fighting to file their own plan and were overruled by Judge Helen Balick. This means that Wherehouse will submit a plan by 9/27, it will be argued on 11/4, with a hearing to consider confirmation on 12/13. The reorganization will obviously include some store closings. Some 21 of the current 281 stores are being closed at the present time, and another 30 closings will most likely be included in the the stand alone plan. The corporate offices in Torrance, CA will be vacated and moved into the Distribution Center in nearby Carson for a savings of some \$700,000

per year, and Wherehouse has already started "outsourcing" the operation of its IBM mainframe for another annual savings of \$300,000... Eric Paulson's Navarre adds yet another very impressive feather in their corporate cap, with the announcement of a huge co-venture agreement between industry vet Walter Yetnikoff and the formation of VelVel Records. VelVel will serve as an "active, full-service umbrella company for a diverse group of both new and established independent music labels, providing funding, marketing, promotional and creative support." VelVel has apparently already signed a deal with Bottom Line Records and has acquired a "non-controlling interest" in Razor & Tie Records. This comes as Navarre is also beefing up its Music Division Sales Management Team. More on that next week. Stay tuned... Georgia-based Ichiban Records has just signed an exclusive distribution contract with KOCH International. The 12-year old urban label has made its mark dealing mainly in blues, gospel, jazz, R&B and rap, giving KOCH its first label that addresses those specific formats. "Ichiban has a strong track record-70 chart titles-and is one of America's preeminent indie labels," says President Michael Koch. "We are extremely pleased to welcome them to our family of labels, which now-finally-includes urban music." Until now, Ichiban had been using five different indie distributors to cover the nation: INDI (with Big State handling the Southeast and Malverne the East), MDI in the Southwest, MS Dist. for the West Coast and the Midwest, Select-O-Hits for parts of the Southeast and Passport for Colorado. Valley Record Distributors have always bought product directly from Ichiban, and insiders tell us that will probably go unchanged.


