





Edgar Loses Some Juice On Way To Poly Closure

The road to Seagram's purchase of PolyGram will be paved with the \$3.3 billion in cash that Seagram chief Edgar Bronfman will receive for his Tropicana juice business after PepsiCo agreed to purchase the unit late last week.

The move ends Bronfman's initial plans to raise the money in a public stock offering. The company had hoped

to raise \$3.5-\$4 billion through the stock offering, but said it would entertain offers from interested bidders.

Although Seagram got less than it originally expected for Tropicana, Wall Street reacted favorably to the news, with Seagram shares rising \$1.37 to \$41.18 in morning trading following the announcement Monday (7/20).

all-time first-week sales record halfway through their first day," babbled Newbury Comics' Sean Sweeney while waiting for someone to peel his tangerine. "The final sales total for the week made 'Hello Nasty' the fastest-selling new release in the company's history."

Meanwhile, Noreaga (Penalty) commandeers a big #3 debut for his "N.O.R.E." LP, leading off a whopping five acts in the Top 10 (three of them soundtracks) for the Warner Music Group, including City of Angels (WS/Reprise), Brandy (Atlantic), Barenaked Ladies (Reprise) and Dr. Dolittle (BE/Atlantic). Arista's Monica rounds out the Top 10 with "The Boy Is Mine" debuting at #10 and providing even more reason for retailers to install spittle guards by the cash registers.

Over at Cat's CDs and Cassettes in Nashville, Russell Cothran put down his commemorative crock of corn liquor long enough to hiccup the following: "This has definitely been one of the biggest release weeks of the year. And with titles all over the board, we've been seeing all kinds of different music buyers coming through the stores."

In a related story, Hugh Grant telephoned Marv Albert to congratulate him on a marvelously executed PR campaign.

WMG Numbers Familiar Song At Time Warner

As Gerald Levin's Time Warner continues its astounding rebound from Wall Steet goat to investor's best friend, Warner Music Group earnings continue to provide the sour note to the shareholders' otherwise euphoric symphony.

The music group's secondquarter earnings slipped 9.4% to \$96 million on 10% higher sales of \$905 million.

Time Warner reported an overall net profit of \$23 million for the second quarter, compared with a loss of \$49 million a year earlier. Overall operating income, before amortization and goodwill, rose 17% to \$1.16 billion on 10% higher revenue of \$6.5 billion.

The trend is not lost on analysts, who point to WMG's 21.2% drop in earnings for the first quarter of 1998 and its 40% slip in earnings in the fourth quarter of 1997.

Indeed, the WMG earnings slide is a familiar tune at TW, with many pointing to the first half of 1997, in which the music group posted a 24% drop in EBITDA with \$256 million, compared to \$311 million for the same period in 1996.

Many analysts believe WMG can turn things around simply by picking up the Michael Greene solo album, which was recently pulled from the Mercury Records release schedule.

Sir Colin Feels Heat Of Steamed Shareholders

One of the most tumultuous years in the storied history of EMI was reflected in a very lively EMI annual meeting in London, as shareholders voiced concern over the size of exit packages given to former executives.

Foremost on shareholders' minds was the approximately \$23 million paid to former EMI Music chief Jim Fifield.

"It seems that heads, Mr. Fifield wins, and tails, the shareholders lose in every case," said one shareholder to a round of applause.

"I'm afraid the situation with Jim Fifield was driven by his contractual situation," Sir Colin Southgate responded. "We have to pay the rate of the industry in which we operate," adding that, as an

American based in the U.S., Fifield's salary was justified.

Southgate argued that EMI managed to negotiate a smaller payout to Fifield than the amount he was to originally receive under his deal.

Southgate dispelled rumors that News Corp's Rupert Murdoch was making a play for the company. That speculation intensified after word spread that Murdoch was planning on spinning off 20% of his U.S. Fox Group.

"I know nothing about it. We haven't had an approach. It's absolute rubbish," said Southgate. "I think the fact that Mr. Murdoch's putting 20% of Fox on the market has more to do with his balance sheet problems than with buying EMI."


Concert in Washington, D.C., Grand Royal/Capitol's Beastie Boys—Mike D and Adams Yauch and Horovitz—have landed from outer space with their fifth album, "Hello Nasty," which is off to the fastest start in the band's history. This week, it debuted at #1 on the HITS Top 50 Albums chart on first-week sales of nearly 600,000 units.

■ Capitol Sr. VP Promotion/Marketing Phil Costello credits the band's wide appeal for the huge debut: "Very few artists out there can not only reinvent themselves, but blaze a path for other artists. The Beastie Boys have stayed in touch musically with what's going on and never taken their eyes off the youth move-

ment. They've been so far ahead of the curve, the curve is finally catching up to them. They appeal to everyone from 14 to 40, male and female, and there aren't too many groups with that kind of demographic."

- "Hello Nasty" is the Beastie Boys' fifth album, and the first since '94's "Ill Communication," which debuted at #1 and went on to sell more than two million albums, fueled by the band's co-headlining stint on Lollapalooza.
- "Check Your Head," released in '92 under the band's Grand Royal imprint through Capitol, also went double-Platinum on the strength of a tour ending five years off the road.
- The band's critically acclaimed '89 album, "Paul's Boutique," their first for Capitol, earned Platinum honors and proved the trio was more than a one-hit novelty act.

- The Beasties' Def Jam/Columbia bow, "Licensed To Ill," was the first rap album to ever go #1 on the charts, fueled by the hit single, "Fight For Your Right (To Party)." Setting the standard for rap-punk fusion, the album was the fastest-selling debut in the history of Columbia Records and eventually moved more than five million copies.
- Still, "Hello Nasty" could be the Boys' biggest yet. The album's first single, "Intergalactic," has taken Post Modern radio by storm, while the video has saturated MTV.
- Comments PD Robert Benjamin of WHFS DC: "It's been #1 phones for over two months now. By the way, I like forks."
- Meanwhile, retail has been blowing the record out. "Hello Nasty" debuted at #1 in Germany and the U.K., and in the Top Five in the Netherlands, France, Sweden, Switzerland, Norway, Ireland, Austria and Finland. Capitol Sr. VP Sales Joe McFadden has upped the total of albums on the street from 1.2 to 2 million to meet the demand.



- The band embarks on their first tour since '95's "Quadraphonic Joystick" on July 31 at Seattle's Key Arena. The Beasties will play on a rotating 360-degree stage and donate one dollar from every ticket sold to the Milarepa Fund, the non-profit organization founded by the group to help the Tibetan people.
- Guffawed Capitol Exec. VP/GM Lou Mann: "This was a textbook case on how to set up a record. Every base was covered. Praise the lord and pass the mushy peas."
- Added Costello: "You get all the fine points down, then get the f**k out of the way. Because it's all about the Beasties."

Indeed, the huge teams of personnel charged with studying how to implement the consolidation of two of the Six Stepsisters are stomping on uncharted terrain. Never before has the music industry experienced such a massive corporate undertaking, as each move sets an industry precedent.... And, remember the \$40 million Poly retention pool for key execs? Said \$\$\$ are designated for mid-level execs, whose names are submitted by division heads, who would receive 50% of their yearly salary at the closing of the deal & another 50% if they're still with the company six months later. INTELFEST IS FOR THE CHIL-DREN: Okay, sure, there was plenty of Intelfest-bashing going on by industry pros all last week, with one A&R rep going so far to say that the festival's second night of shows wasn't even up to the street action of an average Thursday night in NYC, which was doubtless the case. Yet if you think about the general public, if only for a second, you realize that \$40 buys the average music fan a pass good for four nights of unlimited access to music. This is, as they say, better than a slap on the ass with a splintery board. Even if said music fan only attended the big buzz shows like Sunny Day Real Estate, Shawn Mullins, Sunset Valley, Josh Rouse and Suzanne Wyllie, it comes out to be a pretty good deal, especially given NYC cover charges. I know it's a reach, but just imagine for a moment that you don't simply waltz past the burly/surly doorgoon every show for free, sit at a waiting VIP table

and actually have a day job to go to in the morning. Kind of aives you the chills... The buzz surrounding the Sunny Day Real Estate show at Irving Plaza on Friday (17) and Shawn Mullins' two-setter at the Bottom Line on Saturday (18) proved very real. The Sunny Day show was dominated by adoring fans, while pros huddled together in the back. [Editor's note: Last week we mistakenly wrote that Sunny Day has returned both its members from the Foo Fighters, when any music journalist not currently sucking a crack pipe knows full well that drummer William Goldsmith is the only one who is back with his old band. Bassist Nate Mendel remains a Foo Fighter.] Shawn Mullins also turned out an impressive list of heavies and followed his successful performances with label meetings at Universal, Columbia, Interscope and Atlantic. New manager Russell Carter is in the Big Apple as we write. Meanwhile, maybe the big-

gest New York story is Daniel Glass' new find Eden, the Aussie trio of girls who harmonize like CSN and have nothing but radio love wherever they've been played. As labels jockey to get into the derby, the question remains: Is there even a derby? Glass is planning to put the record through RED and have the CD single on the street in time for Eden's Lilith Fair kick-off in Boston on August 12. While Glass sorts through numerous film and TV offers for Eden, he's readying a full-length release for September. Will he make a go of it as an indie or let one of the clamoring majors become his partner? Stand by... Also making waves on the Lilith Fair tour is unsigned St. Louis singer/songwriter Robynn Ragland, whose "People You Know" track has won her local radio love and a rabid following. Lots of weasels making the trip to get a gander at both Eden and Robynn... Is Anna Wilson headed for Interscope? Jackie Hol-

land is shopping a hot one that has labels circling and looking for a way in... RCA signs Kent and gets an instant add at KROQ. Nice work, if you can get it... BUZZIN': Peter Cornell, Drop, Cleaner and Sway.

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FAIR LADY

Sarah McLachlan

was beaming from the stage of the Shoreline Amphitheater, south of San Francisco, surrounded by her cohorts, as she wrapped up the fourth show of the 1998 Lilith Fair. The festival is making its way across North America again this summer, with more dates and more artists than the previous incarnation. Considering last year's festival grossed about \$18 million, Sarah had reason to smile.

What started as an idea to fight the prejudices of concert promoters and radio programmers has blossomed into the biggest success story in live performance since Perry Farrell launched Lollapalooza. It's also helped Sarah chart her first Top Ten single, "Adia." It hasn't all been flowers and lace, however. According to Sarah's manager and Lilith co-founder Terry McBride, despite the benevolent history of the festival, there are still radio stations trying to shut Lilith out of venues. They may have an exclusive deal with the amphitheater, and don't want other stations, ones who play records by Lilith artists, to come around. "It's becoming brutal," says McBride. "I don't want to sue, but cut the corporate politics. They're asking for a major media backlash."

There have also been questions about Lilith's corporate sponsorships, and the lack of diversity on the bill. McBride claims the former makes it possible to donate money to charity, and as for the latter, "We almost get to the point of begging. It's not that these artists don't want to do it; sometimes they would just rather go out on their own."



The show goes on again this year, however, with headliners McLachlan, Natalie Merchant, the Indigo Girls and various other sistahs such as Liz Phair, Sinead O'Connor and Erykah Badu joining in at selected dates.

Sarah found creating and producing Lilith Fair—with three stages and a village of information and merchant booths—was a piece of cake compared to having to sit through an interview with HITS' own Woodstock alum Brian "He Took the Brown Acid" Griffith.

How does it feel to have your first Top Ten hit?

It feels really good, I was quite surprised. Terry emails me every couple of days, and I got it... I don't even know what it means, like Janet Jackson Top Ten? Like Mariah Carey Top Ten? Like Backstreet Boys Top Ten?!

How does this year's Lilith Fair differ from last year?

Well, there are 57 shows as opposed to 37, a couple more multiple-nighters, which is great for the crew. We have close to 120 artists this time as opposed to 70 last year. We also had much more start-up time, which was great. We had a great deal to learn last year; certain business things that fell by the wayside got a lot more developed this year. Bringing in young talent was something we wanted to do last year, but it started at the top of the list and ended up at the bottom. It was like... OK, it's a week before the tour, where are the local artists? Someone dropped the ball, so this year we did a national talent search in association with Levi's-one of our sponsors-and we now have a lot of local artists, which is really great. It's important for me to give people that opportunity and this is such a great platform for it.

Are the logistics of the tour harder on you this year? No, it's actually easier. Simply because I have a year of experience. I had never been in any kind of media spotlight in my life before we started this last tour, and as the spokesperson, I was really taken to task every step of the way. It was really a learning curve for me. From what started out as a simple idea to create a place to get together with your peers, it went into so many other things. I was constantly asked, "Why isn't it more like this?" or "You must hate men"... yada yada yada. It was tiring and it was hard work, but it was a great learning experience.

I've seen you be quite gracious when thrust into the spotlight.

Well, you know what? I usually am, but there have been one or two situations where I haven't and it's come back to haunt me. For a couple of interviews, I was in a totally foul mood and I got the question asked of me again: Why isn't the tour more diverse? How many times do I have to say, "We ask everybody"? People have a small window of opportunity for touring. Well I think I swore and half of it got printed and not that part where I said, "But we're really happy with who we do have"... It's always the juicy bits. And, of course, that was the hottest thing to talk about in a hundred million interviews. "So you're really bitter now." You know what, dear? You come sit in my shoes for a month.

So who declined to participate?

I hate to get into that because then it sounds like I'm focusing on who we didn't get rather than who we did.

How about a couple of examples? It may put

the diversity issue away.

Courtney [Love]'s doing a movie, so she couldn't do it. Sleater-Kinny said no last year and this year. Garbage is touring Europe so they couldn't do it. Shirley [Manson] sent me a lovely letter saying she was pleased that we asked, but they already had commitments.

Liz Phair wasn't on the bill here... I really wanted to see her.

She's now on the tour. We had the best press conference ever today. Between Liz and [Indigo Girls] Amy and Emily, they are just so articulate, so well-spoken and they know their shit. I learn stuff every-day from them.

So you are able to deflect some of these questions you've been asked a million times?

Yeah, I answer stuff the best I can, but the great thing is everybody else feels free to interact and so there are a great many different opinions, which is important.

How does it feel doing Lilith as opposed to your own tour?

In some ways, it's easier and in some ways, it's more difficult. When I do my own show, I have two hours to perform and it's a whole presentation, a wellrounded package of everything I am musically. When you're headlining a festival like Lilith, you have to take into consideration that people have been listening to music in the hot sun all day. They need to be energized. I write predominantly, uh, mid-tempo music, so I have to put on a little more of an aggressive show. It's also only 50 minutes long. Because I am the spokesperson, there's a great deal of press to be done... a lot of justifying and being gracious when you just want to tell people to f**k off. Actually the press has been pretty good this year. I think we put out a lot of fires because the bill is much more diverse this year.

What do you think about the detractors who say Lilith's just a clever marketing ploy and you are all just "too pretty"?

That statement could tell me a lot about you. Actually, I'm quoting another writer.

Are they a man or a woman?

It's a woman. Lilith does appeal to a certain demographic, though, just as an "Ozzfest" might.

We didn't try to market it this way. It's a safe place. People have a lot of respect for each other here. They are here to listen to the music, much more than to get f**ked up and cause shit. I went into this to see all these women that I love play live, and to get to know them; it wasn't to make a shitload of money.

Did you start Lilith in part because agents wouldn't book an all-female bill?

There were no huge political motivations. To have someone tell me, "You can't do this," when it's ludicrous? It's true. We did have hesitance from bookers we had no previous relationships with. They had never seen or done this before. Before that, I wanted to have Paula Cole open for me, and was told I couldn't put two women on the same bill. Four years ago, Tori Amos and I had records out at the same time, and I was told radio stations wouldn't add my record because they had added Tori that week—the token female artist. It was insulting.

But that's obviously changed.

Absolutely. It's changed dramatically. A lot of new formats have opened up in radio; it's definitely going in the right direction. People ask me if I think the Lilith Fair has had a significant effect on the industry and in that respect I don't see how it couldn't. It's sad when it comes down to the almighty buck; it turns people's heads. But we've proven that a lot of women musicians can get together and sell a whole lot of tickets.

To what do you attribute the shift in the ac-

ceptance of women artists?

Society always swings like a pendulum. Far to one side and far to the other and rarely does it seem to light in the middle for any period of time. If you want to talk about trends, grunge was certainly a trend; perhaps this is an alternative in some way. Much music that is made by women is not necessarily as angst-ridden or as dark. Not to say we are all light and fluffy and I hate these conversations because I end up categorizing everything. The oth-

er thing is, people in this day and age need something to connect them with other people and I think music has that gift. It offers the knowledge that there is someone out there who has gone through a shared experience.

You said there isn't a political agenda with Lilith, yet you are doing work for several charities, both nationally and locally.

Yeah, but it's a natural thing. I do that in my personal life also. It's a reflection of what I believe in

and a continuation of those goals. I'm really lucky as a human being that I was given some golden opportunities. I've seen enough poverty in my life, not personally, but around me, to know there are a lot of people who are less fortunate and are in really hard situations. Especially the rape and violence against women that has gone progressively skyward over the last ten years. There's obviously a great need for education and shelter for these women and their children. Also education for the men—and therapy. I think everybody should be in therapy. [Laughs] It's a wonderful thing.

Have you been in it long?

No, just a bit. It helped me out of an awful place. But back to the charities. Biore, one of our sponsors, is donating checks of \$20,000 throughout the summer, to breast cancer research, an association for anorexia nervosa, RAINN and LifeBEAT for the fight against AIDS. And, of course, a dollar from every ticket sold goes back into the local community. We tried to find causes that were worthy—they all are, that's the thing—but we had to pick just a few of them so the money doesn't get so diffuse it won't do any good. We wanted to give big chunks of money away.

This is not a gender-related question at all, but there are a lot of artists on the bill, and with a lot of artists there are a lot of egos. How do you deal with that?

That's a real misconception created by the record companies and the radio stations because of the war they have to wage to get played on the radio. I can honestly say I haven't encountered any egos here. If people have them, they leave them at the door. They understand that it's not welcome here. Nobody wants to hear that; they all want to hear just the dirt, but it's really true.

Erykah Badu is so amazing, she is so sweet... She has her mom and her baby with her. Sinead [O'-Connor] and all of her people are really fantastic. Of course, the Indigo Girls and I have been friends for a long time; they're awesome. They are so smart and so dedicated.

Shawn Colvin told me earlier this year how impressed she was with how well the festival was run.


It's the only way to do it. Many artists have said to me how different this is from other festivals, how unorganized they were. It's hard to be out on the road; we want to give everybody every convenience we can, to make the dressing rooms really nice and really comfortable. After all, it's your home for a day. We give them what they want in their riders and we have a huge staff ready to help any of the artists or management with whatever they need. We want it to be easy for them because it should be. •



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

TIME TO STRIP DOWN FOR ACTION WITH BARENAKED LADIES' TYLER STEWART BY KAREN BLISS

THE BARENAKED LADIES' career exploded in Canada in 1991 when then Toronto mayor June Rowlands banned the local pop group from performing at the city owned Nathan Phillips Square on New Year's Eve because she found its name distasteful. The move hit the media and their self-titled indie cassette hit the charts.

The band, whose quirky signature songs included "If I Had A \$1,000,000" and "Be My Yoko Ono," became the first unsigned group to earn a gold certification in Canada. BNL then won \$100,000 in Canadian money from Toronto modern rock station CFNY [now 102.1 The Edge] to record its '92 full-length debut, "Gordon," which facilitated a deal with Sire/WB Records (distributed in Canada by Warner Music).

Gordon sold a fraction shy of a million copies in Canada (the equivalent of ten times platinum), an impossible number to top for '94's sophomore album, "Maybe You Should Drive," which neared a respectable triple-platinum. Interest at home had begun to wane, but BNL was out to prove it was not just a media-hyped novelty act. They decided to build a story south of the border.

Just before the release of '96's "Born On A Pirate Ship" [Reprise], BNL acquired new management in Terry McBride of Vancouver-based Nettwerk Productions [Sarah McLachlan, Moist]. While sales plummeted in Canada, the band was making strides in America. But it wasn't until its live retrospective album, "Rock Spectacle," came out that things took off.

After re-releasing the live version of "The Old Apartment" (the single from "Born On A Pirate Ship"), they went Top Ten at Post-Modern radio as did the seven-year-old Canadian single "Brian Wilson," which crossed over to Top 40. That, coupled with a non-stop work ethic, earned the quintet a U.S. gold album now approaching platinum.

Without missing a beat, co-vocalist/guitarists Steve Page and Ed Robertson, bassist Jim Creeggan, drummer Tyler Stewart and keyboardist Kevin Hearn have just released a new studio album, "Stunt" [Reprise], which debuted at #3 on the HITS album chart. The record's eclectic sound ranges from the trippy rock/rap single, "One Week," to the rollicking "Alcohol" and lullaby "When You Dream." The album comes just two days before the band kicks off the 43-date H.O.R.D.E. tour, co-headlining with festival founder Blues Traveler. HITS' own biggest argument against Canadian content, Karen Bliss "Krieg Bop," chews the backbacon and tips a Molsons, eh?, with BNL's Tyler Stewart.

"WE'RE A BAND THAT

You guys were constantly on tour behind "Rock Spectacle." You just didn't give up until you had a Gold album.

And we'll continue to do so. We'll play in Canada this time as well, but our concentration is mostly on the U.S. now. It's a situation where we're more popular there and it's also more lucrative to play there. So until we sell a few more records here—and the Canadian industry and the audiences are behind us a little more—then we'll make an effort at coming back. Meanwhile, there's too much work to do in the U.S.

What was Nettwerk's strategy to break you?

A tour-your-f**king-ass-off strategy. I noticed mostly that Terry [McBride] had an amazing relationship with radio people and would get them on board. He was also good at forging relationships with the record company, Reprise... suggesting things and not taking no for an answer. Asking them to "try this and try that." But at the end of the day, they can always rely on us because we're a live show. We're a band that works. We aren't afraid to play on any stage because we have a great show. The only trick for Terry was getting people out to see us. It's been a developing game plan.

What's the plan for "Stunt"?

The build-up is important. "Rock Spectacle" went Gold in the U.S. three months ago, selling over 500,000. Radio came on board almost across the country on that one. We played a great many radio festival shows, did extremely well, and the next time we'd come through town, we'd have a sold-out show at a larger venue.

For this record, the single, "One Week," went to radio in the U.S. and the first week out, it was the number one most added song at Post Modern radio. We beat the Beastie Boys!!

How did you squeeze in the writing and recording of "Stunt" between all that touring?

[Steven Page and Ed Robertson] actually wrote it fairly fast; we got off the road around October or so, and they wrote songs galore for about a month in October and November. They came up with 15 songs or something like that. They squeezed it in because we got the H.O.R.D.E. tour, so we wanted to put out a new album. We got the OK from Reprise that they would significantly shorten the turnaround time they have for albums, which is usually eight to ten months, so we didn't go into the studio until February.

When did the "Rock Spectacle" tour come to an end?

The last show we did was New Year's Eve in Detroit, which was great; there was like 17,000 people there. It was our show.

Why did you use two producers on Stunt?

There were two producers because Susan Rogers, the woman we wanted to work with, had originally told us that she wasn't available to make a record; we saw her in December when we did some radio shows, one in Minneapolis, and she came backstage after. She'd gotten the demos of the new songs and came back to say she loved them, but she was booked to produce Rusted Root's new record, so she said, "Unless you want to try to do a record in two weeks, in February, that's the only time I have." And we were like, "Hmmm, that's a drag; we'd really like to work with you, but we didn't think we had time, but then we thought, "Well, why don't we try?" We figured, we'd start with her, and when she has to

leave, we'll take it from there.

You must have been pretty enamored of her work to undertake an arrangement like that.

She'd worked with bands that we really dug, like Geggy Tah, Odds and David Byrne, plus she worked with Prince for ten years, between "Purple Rain" and "Sign Of The Times," which is obviously some of his best work. We just liked her. She had a really great vibe.

You had finished most of the production on the album before she came in for those final weeks?

We spent almost two weeks in Toronto before she flew in for a few days. We just essentially tried to learn the songs, and then she worked with us a little bit on it, then we flew to Austin, and we just started rolling tape. The great thing about Susan is she is a really great engineer; she approaches things from an engineer's perspective. She's not necessarily a musician. It kind of helps because she knows how to get great sounds and how to make records, but her suggestions are also based more on what the listener would like to hear.

How was the process different from recording your past albums?

The bed tracks got laid down pretty fast, but then we came back to Scarborough, to Phase One, and worked with this guy David Leonard. He also worked with Prince for a few years, and also did Dwight Yoakam, John Cougar Mellencamp and Fishbone—he's a total veteran. What happened was, we thought we'd pretty much finished the record in Austin, and when we came to Toronto we thought, "Oh, there's only a few more overdubs to do." But what happened is the record sort of morphed into much more of a pop record. What we made in Austin was a pretty organic, bare-bones recording. When we came back to Toronto, we ended up adding a lot more that really brightened things up. Specifically, a song called "Light Up My Room."

That has sort of a Celtic feel.

Could be the 6/8 time that it's in. The wailing electric guitars in the chorus were added in Toronto. That's Ed [Robertson]. He sings that one as well. Overall, things just took shape a lot more. "Never Is Enough" had added things to it. "Who Needs Sleep" was practically reinvented.

When did Steve [Page]'s collaboration with Stephen Duffy [of "Tin Tin" fame] start? He and Steven have been writing together for about four years. They wrote several songs together on the "Maybe You Should Drive" record. They never really got together this time. They got together in England in '96 briefly, but a lot of writing was done by fax or phone.

"When You Dream" is about Steven's infant son?

That song was written directly out of his experiences of watching his kid sleep. That song really took shape in Toronto. We started off with a basic track with the guitar as a guide track. Steve sang it, then we took the guitar off and it was all sound effects. We ended up finally blending the two versions together.

"She's On Time" is about a woman's period—"It's the safest time of the month they say for love."

It's a celebration, too. I don't think there's a heterosexual guy in the world who hasn't had that experience with being a little less than careful with your girl-friend and then, bam, she has her period and everyone's happy.

That song is one of the two bonus tracks. The other is "Long Way Back Home," which is a lament. You're ovulating and I'm not around. It's bad timing. It's about a couple of anguished attempts to get pregnant and "She's On Time" is about her not being pregnant.

How many of you are fathers?

Just two. Steven and Ed.

After being together for a decade, is there an understanding among the non-fathers when one has to be home for birthdays and other family affairs?

Family is very important. Steven and Ed already make enough sacrifices going away and leaving their children. When I see their kids, and I haven't seen them in two months, I usually haven't seen them for as long as their own fathers haven't seen them. I don't know how they do it, quite frankly. It would be very hard for me.

"One Week" is a great song. The lyrics are so rapid-fire, it's almost impossible to sing along, even though you want to.

I guess that will be the trick. •

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



bluesy southerner. Falsetto rises and then falls gently into a soothing vibrato. The girl's got it, evidence in "Good Til Now" and "I'm Not Afraid To Die." 

Time for a busman's Halliday with Curve

Sad but true... Turkey knows no master. Well, maybe one, and one only-food. The scrappy brown-brindled fox terrier is ignoring its miffed owner—Curve crooner Toni Halliday and scampering from table to table in a London rehearsalstudio canteen, begging for breakfast handouts.

"Turkey! Get over here!" Halliday barks at her peripatetic pet. No response. The promise of a soundman's scrambled eggs is much more alluring. Ahhh, the irony. Several years ago, before she and guitarist partner Dean Garcia called it temporary quits, Halliday recalls a Curve concert in Seattle where the crowd-like her dazed dog-just wasn't paying attention. "The audience just stood there with their mouths open," she grumbles. "And we knew at that point, standing onstage in Seattle during the middle of grunge, doing 'Unreadable Communication' ... well, it was a moment of mass understanding, like 'Hello! See you in the next lifetime!' People just didn't get Curve. I know that as an absolute truth."

So Curve, the story goes, never officially broke up?

Toni Halliday: Never. It's just that we were forced into a situation beyond our control and we had to make a statement. We did say that we had every intention of working together again, but no one read that. They just saw the "Oh, they're not working together anymore" part at the beginning. But the last line said that Dean and I planned on hooking back up in the future; that it wasn't the end.

Dean Garcia: We always said that we'd stop if it wasn't feeling right, and we did. It was f***ed, I was f***ed... We had to stop, really.

Halliday: The thing is, we let go of the backing band, and that was it. But Curve was never the band, it was just Dean and I. They had nothing to do with it. But when we let the band go, everyone was like, "Hey! What's going on?" The Sundays let their original drummer and bass player go, and nobody said a thing. But we'd just been on a series of tours, basically, and we couldn't see the forest for the trees. And we decided we wanted to see that; we wanted to think in color again. So you save yourself, basically, because the "I," the "me," is the most important thing in the end. To each individual. So that's what we did-tried to save ourselves.

What did you discover in your time apart?

Garcia: That I needed to work with Toni again. You can do all sorts of stuff on your own, but if I haven't got Toni as a motivation, then there's nothing behind the music for me. I can write loads of music, but it's Toni who comes along, takes it and then finishes it. And it turns into something that goes out, rather than something that doesn't go out—a massive stockpile of odd blips and ideas.

How about you, Toni?

Halliday: Well, I got married to my hubby, [producer] Alan Moulder, did a thing with Leftfield, and started an all-female band with two of my girlfriends called Scylla. We tried to do a rock thing with chicks. We went on tour with the Longpigs, but it didn't quite work because my voice is so sweet. But I did learn to sing without any monitors, and I discovered I could get that distorted Kurt Cobain thing in my voice, but vaguely. I just wanted to be in a band with no technology, totally organic, with girls who could really f***ing play. I also learned how to have fun.

So you didn't figure out you needed Dean?

Halliday: No, I didn't, actually... Dean came and told me I needed him! He was really up-front about it, and I listened to him. I wasn't shut down. I love Dean, and I did want to work with him. There was never a point where I didn't. So we did ten tracks in six weeks... Bang, bang, bang. The time off had given us a chance to reflect and decide what we wanted to do with the sound, because the sound was so huge.

Your lyrics are almost like behavioral studies, especially "Chinese Burn," which totally blasts some cunning female peer of yours.

Halliday: That's just emotion. I was so mad the day we recorded that song. I just flipped out. One minute I was alright; five seconds later, I was screaming my head off. So the song is just a scream of abuse, and it's vicious. I mean, real vicious. But, lyrically speaking, you have to be wide-open, a real fly on the wall. Have you ever met a writer who isn't? There's a sixth sense, an intuition, and I just think I was born with it. Actors, witches—everyone's born with it. Then conditioning knocks the f***ing shit out of it... immediately. You can see children as pure forms, where they're just completely unadulterated spirits. Parents try to hide from them all the time, but children can practically see through walls—they can feel it.

I recall you had a very unusual childhood.

Tom "Not So Terrific" Lanham gets caught with the bat on

his shoulder.

Halliday: Yup. Dad was a pirate. He would steal from the rich to feed his little starving children. We traveled by boat, and we went on midnight flits all the time. We never paid port fees when we could afford it. And when he left my mother in Greece with no money and three children, that's when it all stopped. He just woke up one morning and told my mom he didn't love her anymore. She'd hit 36 or something, and he was off with some 19-year-old. And at the time, I thought, "Oh, how romantic! My dad doesn't love my mum anymore, but he told her and was really up-front about it!" And now I look at him and think, "What an asshole!" This wanker with three children just left us all to f***ing starve!

But that's probably why I am how I am-I was brought up by a lot of strong women. My mother was incredibly strong to get us back to England with no money. We didn't get on a plane. It was trains, boats, buses, all the way from Greece on, like, two pence or something. And I'll never forget standing on the escalator at King's Cross with all this luggage from Greece, and not one person would help us. It's like staring into the abyss—we've all been there, it's the dirty deed that needs to be done. People say to me, "Oh, you're a really good writer!" And I'm like, "Really?" I never think about it— I'm just a conduit, really, a receiver, a receptacle. I just live life. And shit happens, you go on a journey, and your job is to come back

and tell the story. And come clean about it all! •



Elle, among many others, for an album that was basically just her singing and playing acoustic guitar. A few of the tracks received nice airplay at specialty stations where your songs don't get on the air unless they're good, period. These songs were also the ones that originally, in demo form, interested A&M in signing her. The sparsely produced record really let the power and emotion of the lyrics and melodies shine through effortlessly, as though the songs had been written for years.

Griffin's second LP, "Flaming Red" [A&M], follows the same pattern and shows Griffin maturing as a writer and singer in a much more structured and produced setting. This time around, she's backed by a full band, as she teamed up with producer Jay Joyce, mixer Tom Lord-Alge and session drummer par excellence Kenny Aronoff, among others, down in Nashville. Griffin continues to forge her own sometimes guttural and bluesy, other times whimsical and whispery, vocal delivery, making her distinctive from other, less original, artists. With "One Big Love," ["Not just another silly love song," she insists] released as the first single, plans that include a national tour with at least three Lilith Tour dates and two songs on two different movie soundtracks ["The Newton Boys" & "Niagra, Niagra"], Ms. Griffin, over Seagram and Sevens, unfortunately had to endure the inane tirades of noted industry loser and sometime HITS scribe Jonathan "Oy" Grevatt.

Your first album, "Living With Ghosts," was pretty much you on acoustic guitar and vocals. Why, with this record, have you gone electric?

Well, those songs on the first album were the original demos that got me signed. I did do an electric version of some of them with a band and producer, but after all of us listened to both versions, we decided there was something very right about leaving those songs in their purest form. The whole thing happened so fast that when it was time to do this second record, I wanted to sit down with the producer [Jay Joyce] in Nashville and sort of get a lot of privacy around the work. So I did that and I really loved working with Jay, who also has a record with his great band called Iodine. The electric thing was just the obvious next thing for me to do.

The first single is "Big Love."

It's a song about sort of a grand notion of love. We are actually talking about doing a video for the track now also.

Do you feel that the Lilith Fair, and Women In Rock movement, is really just a PR angle that helps labels and managers break their bands or do you feel that there is something genuinely sincere about it?

Well, there do seem to be a lot more women on major labels now and on radio. There is the industry thinking out there now that, this is the way to make money. I have a really hard time not being offended when compared to other female artists. I mean, why doesn't someone compare me to The Clash?

I am kind of afraid about the backlash of this "Women in Rock" thing because, unfortunately, I think it is an industry trend, something that had to be given a name, like grunge, and look what happened to that. As far as Lilith is concerned, it will be great to capitalize on it, sure, but also to just be on the road with women will be rewarding for me. There is such a great energy backstage.

Which artist or artists was the one that made you say, "I want to do that when I grow up"?

Oh, definitely the Beatles, especially their "Greatest Hits Volumes 1 & 2." I mean, I literally cried when I heard those harmonies for the first time, as did many girls, I guess. Their lyrics really were paintings and told great stories.

Is your life better or worse since signing a record deal?


Some things are better and some things are not as easy. The good thing is that I can be a full-time artist now, but along with that comes a lot of work as well, such as promotion and interviews. I am having a great time meeting remarkable people that I otherwise probably wouldn't meet.

Record companies used to be homes to artists, places where they could develop their craft and grow, rather than a world of one-hit wonders.

I really am grateful to A&M for letting me put out that first record without any real shot at getting much airplay. They really have been great with me. I think what needs to change in general, though, is the artist's perception about what getting a record deal really means. Most artists feel that getting a record deal means entrance into the magical kingdom, but it's not magic. I've learned that I want to spend my time on this label, or any label, creating really good music. That's my sole focus. I can't worry about what it's going to sell. All I can be is extremely thankful that I get to play with these fabulous musicians I'm working with. I can't have any expectations beyond trying to create the best music I can. I have been writing and my goals now are to tour nationally and internationally and really learn how to front this band I have.

Which is more fun for you, playing live or in the studio?

Live is really my thing, but the studio experience with Jay was so great. We've been on the road now for about three weeks and, believe it or not, I love the bus. I mean, I'm used to traveling in the van, so this is definitely luxurious for me. I can actually stretch my legs out, imagine that. •

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World Radio History



What was living on a commune like?

I was very young when my mom and I moved on the commune. After that, we lived with about four other different families in a little guest house in a garden. It was also very communal. I just remember it being a very holistic and loving environment. I also remember, when there were other women who were pregnant, I got to satisfy one of my curiosities. I got to feed off of other women's breasts.

Dressed in a flaming red belly dancer's outfit, she

You were very close with your mother. How did you deal with her death?

I will always be dealing with it. I think of it as her moving on to the next plane. It has been the most profound experience ever. For the most part, I was aware of the gift of the angelic, of what I had in my mom, and aware that the love that we had for each other was the most exquisite. Her moving on has compelled me to share the love that we have always had for each other with the people I play for. I've basically been on the road, and my record came out after she left her body. The little time I've had to myself to process it has put me in a virtual reality to a certain degree. I'm on a mission to share the love that my mom gave to me.

You grew up in a show biz family. Was it assumed that you would enter it, too?

Not assumed, no. My mom was supportive of anything I did. In college, I thought that I would be a public defender for the underdog. I was influenced by "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington." I loved the notion of the little guy outsmarting the monolithic corporations. Idealizing the work that I do—it's at least as self-gratifying as altruistic—I would like to think that the music that I play is in a sense as healing as public law would have been.

Why didn't you pursue law?

I didn't pursue it because when I was in college I worked for a couple of grass-roots organizations that were trying tribute to her mother, who passed away in September just before the release of her debut album, a relationship which was and is the cornerstone of her life. A stand-up comedian and songwriter who had a relationship with Lenny Bruce during the last nine months of his life, Lotus Weinstock is often quoted by her daughter during the interview, as Lily continues "processing" her mother's passing nine months after the fact.

As a child, Lili and her mom lived on a commune in Los Angeles and at the age of eight, Lili had a dream that she could play violin, which she vigorously pursued. Encouraged by her mother, she appeared as a child actress on a TV series called "Kate Columbo," spending the money she earned on violin lessons and putting away the rest for college. She also co-starred as Rodney Dangerfield's daughter in "Easy Money." She attended Brown University and graduated in 1992 with a degree in political science, almost deciding to pursue law. She returned to L. A. after college and started sitting in with various performers, who asked her to play with their bands. Her career snowballed from there. In addition to Robert Plant and Jimmy Page, she's played with the likes of Porno For Pyros, B.B. King, No Doubt, Hootie and the Blowfish, Chaka Khan, Bush, Tracy Chapman, Tom Petty and others.

She hopes to play in front of more and more people, who will then buy her records and eventually breakthrough to radio in what she terms a "grass roots organic evolution." Lili chatted with HITS' Miami Beeee-occch correspondent Janet "Too Old To Rock & Roll, Too Young To Retire To Delray Beach" Trakin to discuss her latest achievements.

to get "teeth" put into the Community Reinvestment Act. My thesis was about the Community Reinvestment Act. I realized that the change that people were effecting was significant, but to me it felt so incremental that I didn't have the stomach for it.

My mom always said, "The most oppressed minority is the individual." I thought that once I got a taste of the adrenaline, the passion and total connectedness to my passion that I could have pursuing music, there was no question that I would follow my passion.

What was it like opening for Robert Plant and Jimmy Page?

It's such an honor to be part of their legacy. Their music is so seminal. From their beginnings to now, they're creating and inventing the moment. I can't think of another act that has had such potency and such a long creative life span. They're so intense now; I can only imagine what they were like in the '70s.

Who are your influences?

Growing up, I listened to my mom's music and classical music—Brahms and Tchaikovsky. The salient part of my upbringing is that I never listened to rock & roll or pop music and so now I'm a kid in a candy store, constantly turned onto things. I listen to Brian Eno, and imagine the delight when I listened to the Beatles "White Album" for the first time! I also listen to a lot of world music.

You write a lot about babies in your songs.

It's a cute way of making my humility tangible. Sometimes I feel sort of clumsy and grasping towards grace—reaching out for that jewel of wisdom, whatever it is that my heart responds to. Babies have a sense of purity; they're openhearted and wide-eyed. They are, in some cosmic way, informed by the many lifetimes that came before them. They're as close to the other side as anyone is that is not about to die. It's a purity informed by other realms where intuition is the guiding force. I'd like to have elements of that babyhood myself.


What was growing up in Watts like?

It was a rough upbringing, but Watts made me what I am-the fact that I appreciate whatever blessings come my way and take nothing for granted. The way I was raised and the environment of Watts made me appreciate life. There

of growing up in a place like that. I'm a Coca-Cola youth spokesman, and I go to the high schools and junior highs and try to make them realize that I'm from where they're from. I tell them that you can't use how you were raised as an excuse; this is what I was raised around and that's how I am.

How did you get hooked up with Coca-Cola?

My music teacher was called and told about Coke looking for 16-to-18-year-old black males for a national ad campaign. A friend and I found out about it two days before the audition. We arrived two hours late and found the lady holding the auditions with all her gear packed and waiting for a ride.

Her ride was stuck in traffic so we convinced her to let us do it anyway. She put us through the motions and after three callbacks I found out I got the gig-and went hollering up the street. She actually came to my first video shoot and I heavily emphasized to her that she changed my life by accepting me at that audition.

Were you trying to get a record deal before that?

No. But because of the exposure I got from the commercial, there was a 19- or 20-label bidding war over me. I had CEOs flying me in and out of town. I was blown away. It was a great experience, and the whole time I was just thinking, damn, all I did was a Coke commercial. Like I said, I'm from Watts, and whatever blessings God sends makes me want to reach back to where I come from.

Why RCA?

My management and I figured that RCA had a whole new regime of workers and that they had something to prove. Also, there

are lots of kids who tend to go in a different direction because wasn't a big roster with 50 different artists needing attention to deal with. They came correct, contractually; they gave me love as far as creative control goes. They let me have a lot of input as far as the direction and type of songs, producers; I was totally involved.

You wrote the first single, "Nobody Else."

Yeah. I wrote nine out of the twelve songs on the album. I was able to be in the studio and tell producers what to put in and what to take out and really express what I felt was needed to do to make the songs feel right for the album. I'm really proud that they let my mother's song, "Stay In Touch," get on there, because that song is very special to me.





She's cute, she's sexy and she's 17 years old: her voice is an appetizing blend of syrup and powdered sugar, and she's co-written the

material for this debut with a coterie of pros. Yep, Drea looks positioned to dominate the teeny-bopper hallways and the Adult-demo highways with equal ease. Lead single "Got Ya Back"-which Drea co-wrote with her sister Angela-is driven by a bass groove so deep it'll pry your fillings loose and a ruffneck rap from Bad Boy artist Black Rob. But when Drea launches into the chorus hook, any lingering resistance will dissolve like butter in the relentless summer sun. Producers Donnell Jones, Walter "Mucho" Scott, Darryl "88" Scott and Kenny "Smoove" Kornegay (who oversaw "Got Ya Back" and serves as Executive Producer of the whole project) provide a lush but sufficiently contemporary backdrop for the budding diva's often hushed delivery, walking the ever-eroding border between R&B and hip-hop with impressive agility. Other standouts include "Is This For Real," the sexedup "Body Rock" (with a chorus reminiscent of "Off The Wall"-era Michael Jackson and boasting a sample you'll recognize from the Beastie Boys' "Brass Monkey"), the anxious "Me Or Her" (with a theme much beloved by tabloid-TV shows) and the lovely and resolute "Not Gonna Letcha." Here she comes. You ready?



Joe Zawinul And The Zawinul Syndicate "World Tour" Zebra/ESC

Keyboardist/composer Joe Zawinul pushed the jazz/rock envelope in various ways over the last couple of decades with his joyously

adventurous band Weather Report. His travels with his own Zawinul Syndicate have been less chronicled, perhaps, but they are no less wide-ranging; indeed, the booklet accompanying this handsome two-disc live set provides a world-tour itinerary that's dizzying in its expansiveness. Joined by bass monster Victor Bailey (who fares surprisingly well for someone essentially filling Jaco Pastorius' shoes), guitarist Gary Poulson, percussionist/singer Manolo Badrena, drummer Paco Sery and a few others, Zawinul keeps the groove up front and the energy level high. Opener "Patriots" starts things off on an appropriately frantic note; it's followed by the gorgeous, cinematic "Sunday Morning/Sunday Evening." Then the band returns to pocketville with the twitchy funk of "Indiscretions." Other standouts: "Asi Trabajamos" (an ecstatic Latin workout by Badrena and Sery), The Zawinul/Salif Keita collaboration "Bimoya," the slammin' second-line workout "N'awlins" (check out Poulson's shredding here), the Juju-delic "Lost Tribes," the European odyssey "Slivovitz Trail" and the bop-piano meditation "When There Was Royalty." We highly recommend lighting a fat one and letting this whole set wash over you.







Sony Music has good reason to celebrate. Basking in the glow of the biggest year in their history, they hosted their annual convention at Miami's Fountainbleu Hotel last week, treating some 1,500 industry wags to three days of music. Sony Music Worldwide President/CEO Thomas D. Mottola and SMD honcho Danny Yarbrough boasted that revenues were up 17.3% to \$5.3 billion. Sony's fourth quarter (ending 3/31) and first quarter (ending 6/30) were also their biggest ever. Operating income increased 20% to \$410 million. On Thursday, Columbia touted their line-up with performances that included Jermaine Dupri, the Black Crowes, Bernard Butler, Anouk, Kenny Lattimore and a heartfelt speech by Bruce Springsteen. Brilliant sets by Maxwell and Lauryn Hill highlighted that night's banquet. Epic took over the next day, featuring sets by MJJ's Tatyana Ali, WORK's Neil Finn, Heather Nova and Esthero, and 550's Jon Secada, Jon B and Flight 16. Glenn Brunman touted four upcoming soundtracks: "Beloved" (with Oprah), "Slam" (hip-hop

poets), "Simon Birch" (think "Stand By Me"), and "Dance With Me" (salsa anyone?). Epic then wrapped the afternoon with sets by Tina Arena, Anggun and Color Me Badd. Set in Miami, there was a ton of very positive talk by the attendees at Sony's confab about a trimmed-down, back-to-the basics Alliance Entertainment. The one-stop operation now seems on track for a favorable vote, concluding 7/24, and final court approval on 7/30 of their stand-alone plan. Still in charge of the prestigious Barnes & Noble account, Eric Weisman and co. look about to re-emerge as an industry force... A 37% increase in revenues was attributed to Camelot's acquisition of the 150-store Wall chain... Last weekend's Ozzfest meets the Warped tour in Mpls. was massive. Hats off to Best Buy's marketing team on an awesome job of branding the event. Over 100,000 screaming fans can't be wrong... Boston mainstay Newbury Comics will celebrate their 20th anniversary with a bash at Boston's Harborlights Pavilion (9/5), including a performance by the legendary Bauhaus.



A FEW RANDOM NOTES FROM MY LAPTOP WRITTEN AT 20,000 FEET: Why didn't Armageddon do better at the box office? Most people agree it's a better movie than Deep Impact, the top movie of the summer so far. Could it be because of Ries and Trout's "Law Of Leadership?" Though the two movies are

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very different from each other, Armageddon was perceived to be this Summer's second asteroid-headed-for-Earth movie. It's better to be first than to be better. We see evidence of the same rule in radio all the time but keep launching also-rans, anyway... With all due respect to the others, if a young program director can attend only one convention a year it must be The Conclave. The sessions are usually good. But more important, there's a spirit of camaraderie among attendees that builds professional allies for life... Look for Modern Adult stations that already lean Pop to lean further. In some competitive situations, this will be smart. In others, this will cause the Modern Adult station to be perceived as just another Top 40 or Hot Adult. That's why some Modern Adult stations are about to crash and burn. Meanwhile, a new Adult Alternative format is taking shape that plays familiar songs in heavy rotations. Most Alternative stations will super-serve a younger core that increasingly likes different music than the older Alternative listeners... A new crop of young Hollywood stars is experiencing life in much the same way as your listeners. This can provide morning show topic-starters. Ben Affleck recently told USA Weekend that women are always trying to change their men. And Cameron Diaz told an interviewer that her beau Matt Dillon likes his mother—and suggests this as a litmus test for all boyfriends... Some of the most effective TV spots for radio, as measured by Arbitron, have bombed in focus groups. What most focus tests don't examine is whether it would get anyone's attention when shown in real lifewhile the viewer is talking on the phone or headed for the bathroom. Some spots that don't cut through get raves from focus groups. Meanwhile, some spots that do cut through are criticized for being obnoxious. Increasingly, radio marketing requires more than smart strategy. It takes creativity, too. A recent AP story outlines the creative process used to design theme parks, with some interesting parallels for radio. Reporter Mike Schneider writes, "Building a theme park involves a healthy tension between creative types, engineers & penny-counters. The creative types for instance, will envision a ride with high-speed moving simulators and filmed 3D action. The engineers decide if it's possible. The accountants decide if they can afford it." Sound familiar? If one of the three roles begins to dominate — if there's none of what Mike calls "healthy tension" — the process breaks down. Another potential problem is trying to wear all of those hats at once. First, create without limitations, then look at the idea's practicality & cost effectiveness.
