VH1 Goes Boom

Baby boomers apparently aren't the only ones who want their VH1.

The channel's latest findings show a 50% increase in prime-time ratings in the allimportant 18-49-year-old demo for the period between third quarter '97 and third quarter '98. They also had a 100% increase in total day ratings for the demo during the same period. The third-quarter figures mark the highest ratings ever for the music network—and the ninth consecutive quarter of prime-time growth-breaking the record set last quarter.

VH1 also garnered a 25% prime-time household ratings increase between third quarter '97 and third quarter '98, with a 50% increase in total day ratings growth, reaching an average of 61 million viewers. This represents the highest concentration of adult viewers 18-49 for any major cable channel. Crowed VH1 President John Sykes: "Yahooooooo!! Now I can pay my Barney's bill!"

Gene Autry Dies

Another singing cowboy bites the dust.

Following the death of Roy Rogers last summer, Gene Autry died last Friday (10/2) after a long illness at the age of 91.

The Texas-born musician became a radio star in the '30s on WLS Chicago and the first great "sagebrush troubadour" in a series of Republic Pictures westerns.

Autry's best-known songs include "Rudolph The Red-Nosed Reindeer," "Tumbling Tumbleweeds," "That Silver-Haired Daddy of Mine" and his theme, "Back In The Saddle Again."

Autry went on to own several radio and television stations, as well as the California Angels baseball team. He is survived by his wife lackie.

R.E.M.'s What's "Up," Doc | Sweat In With

R.E.M. is leaner and meaner for their new Warner Bros. album, "Up," hitting the streets October 27, the 14th LP in the band's illustrious career and their sixth since signing with WB in 1988 for "Green." The initial single/video for the new project, "Daysleeper," has exploded at Post Modern radio this week.

"Up" marks the band's bow as a three-piece and first since '96's "New Adventures In Hi Fi," which sold 227,000

records in its debut week and racked up 950,000 in total sales.

Still, after inking a huge multi-album deal with WB just prior to putting out the album, those results were considered a disappointment in the wake of

two straight multi-platinum albums in '92's "Automatic For the People" (3.1 million) and '94's "Monster" (2.8 million).

Commented Warner Bros. Inc. Chairman/CEO Russ Thyret after we told him we were Robert Hilburn: "This is an absolutely great record. I'm very excited by its potential. Obviously, we're all disappointed the band isn't going to tour, but we are pulling out all the stops to deliver this album. We want it to be the most successful project ever for the group, who are working their asses off to promote it."

After a turbulent world tour interrupted by several medical emergencies, drummer Bill Berry has left the group to the three remaining original members: singer Michael Stipe, guitarist Peter Buck and bassist/ keyboardist Mike Mills.

The new album, produced by Pat McCarthy (U2, Counting Crows, k.d. lang) features several additional musicians, including Screaming Trees' Barrett Martin and Young Fresh Fellow Scott McCaughey.

And though the band has already announced it will not be touring, there will be a slew of TV spots, including an unprecedented two consecutive ap-

> pearances on Letterman (10/22-23), along with performances on Conan O'Brien (11/17), Rosie O'Donnell. and even "Sesame Street." The group will also be subjects of VH1's "Storytellers" and "Behind the Music" as

well as being honored as the channel's "Artist of the Month" for December.

R.E.M. will also perform at Neil Young's annual Bridge School benefit at the Shoreline Amphiteater outside San Francisco on October 17-18 and at this year's MTV European Video Awards in Milan for broadcast in the U.S. November 13.

Added Executive VP/GM Andy Schuon: "This is a band that's proven successful with or without touring. Radio has been telling us this is a return to form for them. Even though the dynamic has changed, the group's very proud of the album and working hard to promote it. I just wish they'd stop calling me collect."

The adds at MTV this week are Alanis Morissette (Mav), Third Eye Blind (Elek/EEG), Lenny Kravitz (Virgin), Blackstreet (Int) and Janet Jackson







LET THERE BE ROCK: Okay, so maybe it's not the best time in recorded history for new rock bands, although the notable exceptions like Matchbox 20, Creed, Korn and Marilyn Manson are definitely, uh, notable. But buzzers are clearly buzzin' about this being the time to take a swing at signing rock because the rock renaissance is coming. This

would, of course, be excellent news for labels like Hollywood (which just inked signing sweepstakes babies Simon Says and Loudmouth) and DreamWorks (Goldie's Buck Cherry is on the way), but maybe more importantly, working with artists without a Top 40 target date in mind might put a little of the "A" back in A&R. That said, the hugely buzzin' MK Ultra (the one from Georgia, not the one from the Bay Area, which has some action of its own) finds love at WJRR Orlando and WZTA Miami, as Wind-up looks close to inking the band... Meanwhile, with the emergence of the Extreme radio format, new rock may have additional outlets of exposure very soon. The new format breaks down into three airplay components: Hard Alternative (Tool, Zombie, Rage); Alternative Rock (Bush, Smashing Pumpkins, Sublime) and Grunge (all the bands from Seattle, duh). Former KXTE Las Vegas PD Mike Stern, who debuted the format in Vegas, has

now been pumping the rock to Detroit's faithful at WKRK. Operating on the theory that a significant generation gap occurs in listeners 30-years-old and younger, Stern is programming rock for guys (yeah, primarily guys, anyway) who don't really respond to Van Halen, Zep and AC/DC like their older counterparts. Knoxville and St. Louis are experimenting with their own versions right now, so stand by... Look for Power 106 mixman and former HITS loser C-Minus, aka Chris Rivas, to spin before and between all performances on the heavily rocking "Family Values Tour," featuring Korn, Ice Cube, Rammstein, Limp Bizkit and Orgy... The Beau Hillproduced and developed Rhino Party gets the nod at WFNX. Look for crazy weasel action starting now... After blowing minds at last month's "In The City" festival in Manchester, Muse has major heat from stateside labels Columbia, Interscope, RCA and Silvertone... Look for the Fred Ansis/ Steve Sessa-repped Jessica Riddle to ink with Hollywood's Julian Raymond... After a huge showcase turnout in NYC last month, the Eric Godtland/Tim Mandelbaumrepped Porter will set an LA date in the next two weeks. This one's gonna be weasely... Adam Haft gets the MCA Pub A&R chair in NYC... BUZZIN': Karen DeBerg, Lolita and Elijah.



The 24-year-old New Jersey native joined the Fugees with Wyclef Jean and Pras at 13, and along with an acting career which included roles on the soap opera "As

The World Turns" and the 1993 movie, "Sister Act 2," has had to grow up fast. Sales of the Fugees' second Ruffhouse/Sony album, "The Score," topped the scales at 17 million units worldwide. Her current solo debut, "The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill," which she wrote, performed, arranged, produced and selected both the studios and musicians, amassed the largest first-week sales of any female artist at 422,000-plus. It has now surpassed a million as it lodged in the #1 spot on the

HITS album chart.

Hill won't let these latest accomplishments go to her head, for her biggest 'comp to date is being mother to young son Zion and his newest sibling, due before the next million albums fly off the shelves. Her second biggest achievement? Getting out of the following conversation with HITS' version of Canadian Content, the thorougly miseducated Karen Bliss "Ing In Disquise."

Reading your press and your lyrics, you appear to have a strong sense of yourself and an intuitiveness about other people.

It comes through maturity and inspiration. I don't take credit for my lyrics because I think they're inspired by God. Some lyrics come out in five minutes and those are the ones I definitely think are inspired. I've also matured to that place. I've written in the past about things I thought I knew, but it wasn't until I really experienced those things that I really understood exactly what.

Working through success enabled you to realize who your true friends are?

Maturity, for any young woman, on any level, is what it is. To do it in the public eye, and in a successful band, is that much more heavy because you're young and naive, you're female, and there's a lot out there.

Were you naive?

I was. But I think I was smart. I don't think I was stupid, but I don't necessarily think naiveté is stupidity. I think it's not being exposed to a specific type of per-

son, not even being able to relate. There are people who hit so below the belt and you wouldn't even expect it because you know the rules, so you're going, "Whoa!"

In "To Zion," the song about your son, you comment on the people who had the audacity to tell you to choose your career over having a child that it's none of their business.

It's not. I was always one of those people who would make decisions to make everybody happy. Having my son marked the first of my decisions for myself, for my own emotional, spiritual well-being. There were people who put up a fight... "You're stupid." "It's a bad decision." That also helped to clarify who genuinely cared for me, and who was concerned about my well-being and sanity, and who was not, who was around me for a payday.

Does it make you feel uncomfortable knowing that you're responsible for someone

else's livelihood?

I'll tell you something. People will make you feel uncomfortable, but I have to be true to Lauryn Hill. The only thing I've ever tried to do is expose people I care about and people who I thought I trusted to opportunity. Not taking anything away from them, but I also had to be secure and happy for myself. Anybody who would fight that couldn't possibly be anyone that was good for me.

You talk about destiny in the title track and also in "Everything Is Everything"... Que será será. What is meant to be will be.

Karma is real. Everything happens for a reason. I definitely believe that if you go around stepping on toes, those who show no compassion will be shown no compassion. I know that to be true as a matter a fact. Consequence is no coincidence.

Is that why you started your non-profit foundation, the Refugee Project? To give something back?

The Refugee Project is just some energy I had. After a while, things were going so beautifully, it was like I'm supposed to do something with this. This wasn't all for me. It's just sharing the blessing. To me, it's not something just entertainers are responsible for doing. I think everybody should lend a hand when they can.

It's really just about providing access and opportunity and information to kids who don't have it.

Your lyrics, even the love songs, are not only very personal, but you actually include verbatim conversation.

A lot of people act surprised. They can't believe I did that, but I grew up on music that was written in this tradition. I grew up on "Distant Lover," "What's Goin' On," "Isn't She Lovely?" and "Ain't No Way," so I don't look at being honest as something foreign. To me, that's what music was and is. Music is about digging deep into your soul. It's all I know. It's all I relate to, so I think it would have been more difficult for me to do something more contrived and less emotional.

There's always a resolution in your lyrics.

I'm about resolution, reasoning it out.

In "Superstar," you write, "Everything you drop is so tired/Music is supposed to inspire." From where did those feelings arise?

Oh, probably, just frustration with hearing that everything is about money and money is everything because money is definitely not everything and money without responsibility is actually dangerous.

Did you find, as in the opening line on the album [in "Lost Ones"], that "It's funny how money changes a situation"?

It's very true. It didn't change me, so much as it changed how people perceived me. I think they automatically thought, "She's going to change. Let's start treating her differently." I've always been very happy living comfortably. I didn't go out there and buy a bunch of huge things for myself. My clothing isn't really different. My jewelry is the same. Actually, the first thing I did was buy my grandmother a house and make sure that she and my family were OK.

Do you mind talking about motherhood?

Motherhood, first of all, has been a large part of helping me to gain clarity, along with the steps that led up to me becoming a mother. When you have a child, all B.S. has to cease because it's no longer just you. Things I would have accepted because it was just me and I would have endured, I have no time for now. It's about surrounding my son with positive people and giving him a consistent positive environment,

where God and people who love and respect God are present. In the music business, that's not always so easy. You have to be careful and discern between characters who are around just to be around.

Have you always known that you'd be a good parent?

No! I only realized that when I had a child. [Laughs] Every parent is winging it. My mother, when she used to say to me, "I told you so," I thought that meant she knew every single thing in the world, and it's not until now that I realize that she was just doing her best.

Are you doing the same things your mother did?



[Laughs] I'm actually starting to dance like my mother! My God, I saw myself in the video to "Doo Wop," and geez, if it isn't my mom!!! One time, I heard this comic say the one thing she would never do is put her kid on the phone to say "Hi" about a thousand times. But I'm telling you, you do all of that.

Did you put your son on your answering machine?

Not yet. But I tried to put him on the album. I put the mic near him and I starting talking to him, "OK, Zion, come on, Zion." Any other time, he's like, "Wooo! Wooo!" but this particular time, he spit for about an hour.

You wrote recorded and produced much of "The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill" while you were pregnant.

Have you always been like that?

Absolutely. I'm pretty anal.

Were you the same way with the first Fugees record, ['93's] "Blunted On"? Not so much the first one, but I was like 17 at the time.

So you've been learning as you go along?

Definitely learning. That's why by the time "The Score" came around, I was, "Hey, you gotta put that up. No, that's too low." I was really specific about what I wanted. So "The Miseducation Of Lauryn Hill" turned out exactly how you wanted it to? It's as close to my heart as possible.

You've been quoted as saying your abilities as a producer have been largely

When some people are pregnant, their hair and nails grow; my creativity and my work ethic just expanded. I was nuts before, but I just became extra nuts, like I felt like I've got a multitude to do... X, Y and Z. I took a little bit of downtime, but it wasn't very long, maybe a couple of weeks, and then I got right back into the studio. But I made a commitment very early to music and family and when you love something so much, it's almost like a relationship. If it's someone you really want to speak to, you make the time.

In your role as producer, did you bring in the outside musicians?

I brought in musicians, drum programmers and worked very closely with all of them. I can't just work with anyone because there are certain genuine articles and a certain sound and sometimes it's a challenge to articulate exactly what you want. There are some people who take directions better than others and those relationships are really special ones.

What did you articulate to them?

I'll give you an example. Most of the songs I write on guitar first, but then there's a certain type of arpeggio I want it to be played in, so we had to go through a couple of different styles before we could find the one which what was right for that song. Or I'll play the bass line on piano or I'll hum one

and then we have to find that sound. Is it fretless? Is it upright? Is it electric? Can you mute the strings? I'm kind of weird with my slang. I'll say, "Give me more of that pretty tone-y style," and they know what I'm talking about.

There's plenty of live instrumentation on the album.

The first day I went to the studio, I filled it with every instrument I ever loved to hear—from celestes to organ to strings to horn to timpani drums to all types of persussion and harpsichords.

You certainly made sure they weren't buried in the mix.

Mixes are everything. I remember listening to Jimi Hendrix talk about how he wasn't around for the mixing of his first album. Even though the album was a masterpiece and everyone loved it, he felt there was so much that was lost because of the way it was mixed. The mix on this album was extremely important, making sure you heard every element. I put organ in because I wanted you to hear organ. I wanted you to hear Rhodes. I was very specific about how I wanted it to sound.

dismissed or ignored.

That's just the world of being a female. No matter how many times my name might have stood by Wyclef's on "The Score," it wasn't taken as a serious thing. But it's not anything I'm mad at. People have a tendency to think it's more of a vanity thing, and that there's really somebody doing the hard work, while the girl just shows up to sing. And that's not true. I think women are credited for their musicality, they're credited for their beauty, but others usually don't want to give them any credit for their creative and intellectual contributions. Whatever, though. That's where the world is right now.

Tell me about your independent label, Refugee Camp Entertainment.

It's in the process of being set up right now. I want to sign artists who have a very soulful and less orthodox approach to music.

Rap and Urban?

No, who knows? There are two types of music—good music and bad music and I like the good stuff, no matter what it is. \bullet





now you are probably familiar with the psychedelic echo-pop of "Downtime," the Gandharvas' first single from their MCA Records debut "Sold For A Smile." It's got one of those hooky choruses you can't help but bop your head to. It's kinda English pop, kinda American rock, a little punk and better than most Canadian exports. But, as guitarist Jud Ruhl explains, the Gandharvas are, in fact, sonically straddling the border between their native Canada and their U.S. neighbors—subtle for the States, but out there for Canada. And the English? "People think we're English because of our accents," says Jud with a laugh and a definite Canadian accent. "And we say we're from London."

London, Ontario, that is. The band—aside from Ruhl, members include vocalist Paul Jago, bassist/keyboardist Beau Cook, guitarist Brian Ward and drummer Tim McDonald—formed eight years ago while still in high school. Their first show was in the school auditorium, but by the time they were 18, the teens were playing the few local clubs, building a name for themselves. A couple of indie releases later, the five-piece got their first deal—and voila, the Gandharvas are big-time in Canada and making their way up the U.S. charts. HITS' own border-straddling Jennifer Clay "Mation" sold her own smile for a few words with the very soulful Ruhl... and let him keep the change.



You started playing pretty young. What was the band like back when you were teenagers?

We were like a garage punk-rock band; well, not really punk-rock, more metal actually. We like to say punk-rock because it's cool now, but the truth comes out. We were really more metal than anything. We were all fans of that stuff—I don't want to admit it. We started out doing maybe half covers, but we were writing our own stuff at the same time, too.

Tell me some metal covers you are not ashamed of.

That I'm not ashamed of? None. This was the early '90s in a pretty small town—and all those Seattle bands started breaking. We had a bit of Soundgarden and Jane's Addiction, of course, but then we had some Van Halen and AC/DC, too. It was just a weird mix of half classic-rock and half alternative.

You had two indie releases prior to "Sold For A Smile." How did your indie releases differ from your major label debut?

We've kind of reinvented ourselves for this one. We love working with textures and having parts intermingle with each other, but this is really straight-up compared to our last album. There's a huge pop sensibility on this one.

What do you mean by reinvent?

The first two albums we did in our hometown, so you would record in the day and then you would go home and not really think about it. This time, we moved out to Halifax [Nova Scotia] for a month-and-a-half and had to live together. Touring, you get to know each other really well, but this time we were really concentrated on the project; we had to get up everyday and go into the studio. Being together 24 hours a day really helped us discover what we were trying to reach. We figured out that we are from rock roots and we needed to keep it as simple, straightforward, effective and in-your-face as possible—and that's what happened. This last album has changed the way we think.

Why the title "Sold For A Smile"?

"Sold For A Smile" is a lyric from one of the songs, "Waiting For Something To Happen." You would really have to talk to [vocalist] Paul [Jago] about where that line sits in the song. Let me guess... you have a lot of lyric questions?

Of course. Is there a theme lyrically to this album?

This is what I get out of it: lyrically, this album means getting over anything trying to repress you. You rise above... That's a common theme in most of the songs. "Downtime," for sure.

Paul uses the word "someone," as in people, at least a dozen times. Even though he may have a certain "someone" in mind, it allows others to relate to the songs.

Absolutely... and that's what makes a good rock song. If you write so personally and no one can understand what you are talking about, it's hard to relate. You can get into the music just so much, but you really need to have contact with what's being said.

Why the cover of the Cyndi Lauper song, "Time After Time"?

We used to do that years ago in Canada as an encore, as a joke. There was a movie that we were trying to get on the soundtrack, and it was just after we recorded, so we had all the songs for the album already. Someone else told us to try it. [Laughs] Don't ask me how it ended up on the album, but it did. It's all right, but it's not going to end up a single. We're not gonna milk it anymore than it has been.

Was Gandharvas your original name?

No. We were called the Droogs, from "Clockwork Orange," y'know. But the name didn't really fit us because we're not violent. When we signed up in Canada, we knew we had to make a name change and that came from the "Bhagavad Gita." Do you know what it means? It probably says in the bio.

It says "celestial musicians to the Gods."

Kinda pompous, eh?

Do you think selecting a name like Gandharvas is a lot to live up to?

No. I don't think anyone really reads that much into a name. I know I don't. A name's a name and it's a good one. It's a little confusing at first. It took me a couple of days to get used to it.

There wasn't a great epiphany involved in choosing the name?

There's a bunch of different meanings for this name over the years, but there was one quote that said, "The Gandharvas were a group of musicians that, when they played, they either made people crazy or fall madly in love." Paul read that somewhere. Again... whatever. •

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




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Is Randy

Tori Amos had fully intended to put music aside for a while. Then life got in the way... just as she was preparing to take a rare sabbatical because she and future husband, sound engineer Mark Hawley—whom she married last February—were expecting a child.

 $^{\prime\prime}I$ had been doing music since I was two-and-a-half. I was not thinking about making a record. I was thinking about being a mom," Amos explains. Then she lost the baby in December $^{\prime\prime}96$.

"Obviously we were devastated and heart-broken," she says, "But the love doesn't

go away, that's the thing. My heart grew. People say being a mother changes you. Well, being a non-mother changed me. I appreciate life in a way I just didn't before."

"I'm always trying to get the voice out of my head that I've heard since I was a little girl that I didn't doggood enough."

That appreciation, and coming to terms with her loss, are themes that inform her new album, "From The Choirgirl Hotel" (Atlantic), which was recorded in Cornwall, England in a 200-year-old barn converted into a state-of-the-art recording studio.

Providing musical support were band members Steve Caton and Matt Chamberlin, along with programmer Andy Gray, bassists Justin Meldal-Johnsen and George Porter Jr., guitarist Stewart Boyle, pedal steel player Al Perkins and the Sinfonia of London. Recording and mixing were handled by her longtime associates, husband Mark Hawley and Marcel Van Limbeck.

Amos says it was very important for her growth as a musician to play with other musicians and de-emphasize the girl and her piano. "Choirgirl Hotel" follows '96's "Boys For Pele," an 18-song effort inspired by her relationships with men. It was her third solo album since her '92 debut, "Little Earthquakes," and its follow-up, '94's "Under The Pink."

From her residence in Ireland, this North Carolina minister's daughter talks with appealing warmth, humor and honesty about matters of life and music. Unfortunately, her conversation once again was with our Pittsburgh correspondent, former altar boy Rex "N Effect" Rutkoski, who snuck into the Choirgirl Hotel only to find he couldn't get the HITS corporate rate.

Does living in Ireland have an impact on your music?

There's a freedom I feel when I come here that's different than when I'm in England. Ireland has so much mythology and such a tragic history; you really feel all that from the people and the land. Yet they have a sense of humor, a way of looking at things, that puts your own problems in perspective. When I'm here, I think about taking chances. You're so far away from anything that's hip or underground.

This is a full-fledged band tour, right?

If you want to see my other shows repeated, you really won't like this show. I obviously do a few songs at piano because it's part of what I do. But at the same time, this really is about playing with musicians I respect, players I really have to work hard to keep up with. I wanted that challenge, not a gratuitous "here's a backbeat" kind of thing.

What do you enjoy so much about playing live?

I enjoy that more than anything. You can only do so much in a studio. Live, you're much more limited and it really is about playing. It is for us anyway. I just love the idea of people taking risks. We are working musicians; that's how we see ourselves. We have a lot of pride in that. This is our day gig and night gig. It's what we do. We all fought to get to this place.

Sometimes I think there is a sense of entitlement for young musicians who haven't had to play much [before achieving success]. They have a whole different lesson that they've got to learn. I have no idea what that would be like. We all have been playing for years. Just to have the opportunity to play our own stuff and not have some dingbell put 50 cents in a tip jar and ask you to play "Feelings" one more time...

Do you consider "Choirgirl" your best album?

You have to respect that each work is a reflection of your life at the time. Some people connect with different albums more than others. They seem to be connecting with this one. I can't look back at the others. They come to terrorize me... That's where I was in my life. There are things I would change on all my records. But that's like saying you would change what you did that night in the back of the Chevy ten years ago. [Laughs] But that's only because you didn't know she was a cross-dresser.

What do you hope to achieve with the new album?

I was listening to a lot of rhythm. I knew I wanted to sort of marry skins—acoustic drums—with electronics. It was live playing and yet there are a lot of electronics on this record. The album really became about the machine world and the acoustic world. It's your relationship with the machine. That's why even the artwork for the album had to have that machine quality feeling, because that's what the album had.

If "Boys For Pele" was about striving for wholeness, what is "From The Choirgirl Hotel" striving for?

I think "Pele" was a depressing record, but at the same time, I really became a different person because of it. I started looking to myself for things that I used to look to other people for. Since I miscarried, I have a deep respect for life. This little soul really taught me something. I'll never know this being in physical form, but it taught me things very few people in physical form have taught me.

When the music started coming again, it came on many levels. Obviously, there was the grief, and an incredible sense of understanding. In this record, I questioned things. I questioned every philosophy I was taught, every belief system, and I don't have any answers.

The good thing is, I have more of a sense of humor about the workings of the universe than I used to, and I think the Christian God sometimes is just having a margarita and can't do a whole lot for you that day. The way I was brought up is, if you pray hard enough, fear God enough, everything will be OK. That's a real manipulated lie. All these feelings were brought up. I just think it would be so much easier if we were taught these expectations.

Do you enjoy how people interpret your music?

People tell me interesting stories. As the years go on, I see I own the copyright, but I'm not the sole writer. The songs exist somewhere and I'm able to see them. Because of experiences I'm having, I'm finally able to see them and then I start interpreting them through the colors that I see because of my life experience. I believe in that creative force. It's constant.

Are you surprised sometimes at where your interest in music has brought you?

It's weird because when I was growing up, it was no different than if I was an athlete. I was trained to be a champion, or to be one of those bloody studs running in



the Kentucky Derby. When you are in music school at five, like I was, you're not there to hold hands and sing campfire songs. [Laughs] The only problem is you are sitting on the piano stool all day and your hips get big. But it's no different.

The tough thing is you sometimes forget about the music when you're trying so hard to be good enough, but you're never good enough. If you give a bad performance or can't play well that night, it's really tough. I came from the classical end. When you come from the pop end, you're not judged the same way. I'm always trying to get the voice out of my head that I've heard since I was a little girl that I didn't do good enough. I try to get to a place where it's about the music, and at the same time being with players I respect. And it's about striving, always hunting for that groove. The great George Porter, Jr. of the Meters has really taught me a great deal. He told me, "You find the pocket and that's good enough."

Is the Tori who is in the public eye much different from the one off-stage?

Yes. When I'm doing interviews, I try to be honest and open. Sometimes some of these journalists miss the humor. The three days I sometimes spend with a journalist on big pieces, sometimes I'll read them and it's not the three days I remember.

How is your relationship with radio?

Radio is a funny thing. It's not as brave as it was when I was growing up. A lot of those artists who were happening would not have a chance today. Some of those great albums that were really life-changing, you would have a hard time finding now. That's because somebody has decided demographically what people want. I can't understand music becoming like fast food. What about the good wine? Sometimes radio has to cultivate their artists. There are so many performers who do one album and you never hear from them again.

Your fans seem open to your growth and experimentation. They seem willing to follow whatever you want to do.

I'm very fortunate. If you really analyze what's going on out there, the public likes new artists. The public devours the first album. It's really hard right now to hang around. Whereas, in the '70s, I was buying records all the time. I waited in line to get my Led Zeppelin and James Taylor records, the new Joni Mitchell or Blondie. Now, people jump on to the next new thing quite a lot.

I'm really lucky. I have, for whatever reason, a fan base that says, "If you challenge yourself, we'll at least give it a spin." They will not be there if I sell out. The party would be over. That's the secret deal we've made between each other.

By what criteria do you judge whether an album is successful or not?

There is the obvious artistic success, and "Did you strike a chord and capture the imagination of the public?" Sometimes you don't do that, but other musicians say, "When you did this I really got what you were trying to do." Sometimes you rush the boundaries musically. Sometimes you try to achieve both. It's real tricky. The main thing is to be able to wake up with yourself.

Where are you on your spiritual journey?

Just drinking good coffee, hanging out with my friends, letting the days happen. Somebody said to me the other day, "I'm waiting for that time a few years from now when it all makes sense."•

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

Son Volt "Wide Swing Tremolo" (Warner Bros.): Uncle Tuple-who? Martin Sexton "The American" (Atlantic/ AG): On this live album featuring material from his first two, basically homegrown albums, this well-kept blue-eyed soul (patch) secret goes as far "out there," vocally, as Stevie Wonder, armed with only a guitar. "I Can't Stop Thinking Of You" captures the rising tension, mood and subtle drama of a

standard like a latter day acoustic Sinatra. Your jaw will drop at the surreally goofy lounge satire of the title track. Yodeling, whistling, speaking, falsetto, bourbon strained growls—he'll go a long way for an expression—like the brutally honest, ballsy self-definition he displays in "Glory Bound." 
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

of his songwriting deals with loneliness and heartbreak. He may seem a straightforward, all-American (and let's not forget lovely to look at) rock & roller, but he's actually certifiably insane. Speaking from Utah, where he was shooting the film "Shepherd," in which he plays a southern sheriff, Isaak's voice lapsed into different accents as he muttered phrases like, "Tell the others. Tell them each to bring marshmallows, a stick, a warm bedroll and a fuzzy hat. Meet me under the bridge. We shall take over the world." Often, the most deranged people are the most creative, and certainly the most entertaining-which is obviously the case with Isaak.

The avid surfer and former semi-pro boxer from Stockton, CA first shot into the musical spotlight with the song "Wicked Game" from his third album, '89's "Heart Shaped World." He has since released more albums full of beautiful, yearning ballads and love anthems like "Somebody's Crying" from '95's deeply personal "Forever Blue." Now, "Speak Of The Devil" marks another milestone in the career of the man, the musician, the maniac. It's more adventurous than ever, with some of his darkest lyrical moments ("Black Flowers"), as well as some of his lightest ("Flying, "Not Sleepy"). Isaak, backed by his long-time band Silvertone, gets more raw

and rocking as well, particularly on songs like the single "Please" and the title track. And with all of his personalities intact, he got on the phone with HITS' own Alexa "Sybil Is Just One Of My Many Names" Sherman, where the two got their very own party line going.

What was going on in your life when you were writing the new songs? If I had a personal life, it was kind of put on hold, because I wrote about 30 songs or more. I only stopped when my pen ran out of ink. It's a lot of work because you record and sing and then the band goes home, while you go back and just keep working. If you looked at my house the past year, every room has those big dry erase boards covered with lyrics. I'd write eight verses for every song and then pick the three or four I liked. A lot of these songs might seem really simple, but there were probably seven pages or an entire short story about what was in my head before I boiled it down.

What's the story behind "Black Flowers"?

That's a pretty dark song. When I was a kid, we had a house on Cemetery Lane. Not the cheeriest place, but you get used to it. Every day, we would see funerals and my mom used to say that if it was raining, the person would go straight to heaven—that God calls those people up with the rain. A lot of people ask me what I hope for, and I always say that I just hope nothing terrible happens. I guess it seems like a bizarre thing to say, but if nothing bad is happening, I'm tickled pink. Even if there's a blue sky ahead of you, something's going to go wrong and those are the black flowers that grow in the sky. Just look at old family photos for a reality jolt. I did that recently with my family, and it was a real mistake. We were watching all this old footage, and it was like, "Oh, there's Papa Bill in Santa Cruz on vacationyep, he died of cancer. Then, there's so-and-so-yeah, he left her when he turned gay and then she went and got paralyzed." I mean, they all got beat down by life. It's a tough fight. That's why you start off with a full head of hair and end up with none.

Are you trying to depress me?

It shouldn't be depressing. You've just got to realize that you have it really good and you'd better enjoy it. You've also got to learn to enjoy the fight. Look, if we make it through to the end, we don't get there all pink and smiley. We've got some road miles on us and we're going to look tough. When you get to that point, you should have enjoyed the fight all the way. I think "Black Flowers" contains some of the darkest lines I've ever put in a song: "Tell me mother, will I die? Yes, my child, and so shall I, and never know the reason why." That's pretty heavy.

But then songs like "Don't Get So Down On Yourself" can be very comforting.

That's exactly what it's meant for. I'm glad you got that. Nowadays, it seems like people split apart and they move to different places and they do get down on themselves. They feel like they're to blame and a lot of songs I hear are just like, "I love you baby, I wanna be with you." That's cool, but I think it's kind of neat to just have someone say, "Even if I'm not with you, I love you. I think about you. Your friends are all here for you." That one I wrote very quickly. It probably only took about five minutes. Of course, I went back and kept re-writing it.

You've been compared to Elvis and Roy Orbison. Can you ever escape that?

[Laughs] Well, I don't think those comparisons run very deep. I wish they did, because to me those are two of the biggest names in music. Yeah, I hit high notes and I sing about love and loneliness and I guess Roy did that. I love Elvis' style and I probably have more of that than I think. But, I don't think I'm much like Elvis when I do shows. Somebody once told me that if you try to do someone else, you'll never be as good at it, and I believe that. When I started out, those were people who were playing heavily on my turntable. It's funny, those are the bigger names, but there are a lot of other people that I listened to, like Pat Boone. I think he's as underrated as you can be. The guy was a fantastic singer. He has at least ten songs, which is a lot for anybody, that are just classic. "Love Letters In The Sand" was incredible. He sang things live and they'd come out sounding like they did on the record. How many people today can you say that about?

Tell me about the gunshots opening the last track on the album. Gunshots? I heard no gunshots. I was asleep, your honor... That's the soundtrack to a movie that doesn't exist anymore. In the beginning, in my mind, there's a guy walking down the street in Europe at night. It's about 1964. All of a sudden, somebody shoots at him. It's like a spy film. He's running and they're chasing him. Then, he gets to a phone, picks it up and it says, "Follow the girl," and he replies, "Super Magic 2000." That's his code name, see? And then he goes out into the night. I love that it ends with those little crickets. It was fun to do, because I got to pick out different gunshots and cricket sounds. •





Singer-songwriter Jude possesses one of those voices that stops you in your tracks. If this remarkably versatile instrument were his only musical asset, he'd probably still have a shot at the big time. But he's also a gifted, witty songwriter who can limn wrenching love songs and cold-blooded character assassinations with equal verve. His new Maverick Records release, "No One Is Really Beautiful," shows numerous facets of his gem-like talent, which only begs the question of why he'd waste his time with HITS' resident lump of coal, Simon "Et Tu Jude?" Glickman.

Tell us a bit about your background.

I was brought up mostly outside of Boston; we lived in Jamaica Plain when I was a kid, and moved to Washington State for a little while. We lived in the South, too. I've got a lot of family in the South-and in Rhode Island, too. I feel like an Easterner when I'm back East, but I also realize why I left. Like, "Oh, Jesus, the pizza's great, but the people..." They're a little closed-minded sometimes. But it's fun to be here on a mission.

What were your early musical influences?

My dad was a self-styled troubadour of sorts. He picked up a guitar and played around Europe for a couple of years. I think he benefited from being a folk-singing American in the '60s; he could just thumb into any town and make a living. So he told us those stories forever, and sang us those songs; that's where my introduction to music came from. I studied music later, and I sang in every group possible—a cappella groups, and at holidays from the time I was about six. But he got us hooked on songs. They were pretty sad, dirge-y things, but that was definitely the most influential. I listened to a lot of music... Beatles, Beach Boys, then I got into soul. He gave me Nat King Cole to listen to. He was a little retarded—like a lot of people, he found his stuff and stuck with it, so I didn't listen to a lot of the great '60s songwriters until later. I never heard Dylan until I'd graduated college! I'd been so brainwashed against him and his importance. My dad, like a lot of tolk singers, was really envious of him. Because Dylan cribbed a lot early on, like almost all writers do. Then he graduated to become one of the greats, but my dad didn't stick around for that. I'm glad, in a way, because I have a lot of friends whom I think are overly influenced by Dylan, or don't write songs because they feel intimidated by him.

So you had your own style before you encountered Dylan?

Absolutely. I didn't even own a Dylan album until about three years ago. I just heard the Beatles' "White Album" all the way through for the first time on vinyl, too. I knew the songs, but to hear it on a warm-sounding old record player, and take the breath between the sides, have that silence of expectation. It's just incredible, such a beautiful mess. But I was listening to "Abbey Road" while making my record—and "Paul Simon's Greatest Hits." He's almost too much of an influence, though he's something of a fallen idol for me now.

You had one album before this one.

A bunch of acoustic demos. I used a couple of songs from that one on the new record. I'll probably grab a couple more for the next album.

The new one has a very expansive, frequently orchestrated, classic-pop

I didn't want it to sound like a greatest hits record; I wanted it to have some scope. I get bored quickly, and change is nice. Those are the records I like most, unless I'm look-

ing for mood music. But that's kinda the way I am. It's another reason I think the record's pretty good—it's the way I am. It's the way the shows go. We started out with 25 songs, but we whittled 'em down, and these are the ones that were good enough. But there are a couple of melodic pieces I'm going to move toward on the next record. I have a lot of songs, and to make one record, I could've gone in one direction and underscored it, or tried to represent all the things I do, and that's what I did. My only concern is that it could've been more melodic. I didn't put on one or two of the most melodic pieces, in favor of lyrical things. But for a first work, I wanted to speak first. I'll certainly sing more next time.

There's not likely to be any disappointment in the level of melody or singing here.

Complexity of melody is something I'm getting more concerned with.

"Rick James" is certainly a departure, musically.

I don't know if it's such a departure from other songs on the album, like "Charlie Says." But I'm very happy with it; it came out like I wanted it to. It's about some dickhead I won't name. I like the chorus phrase because I think it's a good watershed with that reference. It feels good to open up into that funk sound right afterwards. It came out of a poem, and when it came to the chorus, I was vamping on the piano and it was getting funkier and funkier, and Rick James just sort of sprang to mind, because he's kind of a sexual icon. The song isn't really about one specific person—there was one person who triggered it a long time ago, but now when I sing it, it's certainly not about that person. Like I said, it was a poem long before it was a song.

Your songs tend to subvert expectation a lot, and you take on different personae in them.

Especially on "The Asshole Song," the last track. A friend told me that reminded him of Randy Newman, which was a huge compliment. Writing that was kind of interesting. I'd gotten this beat-up old piano, which I'd traded a guitar for. I'm not a particularly good piano player, and I had the mood or the feeling to write the song, and when I sat down, I tried to play what I thought a real arrogant, pseudo-Renaissance man would think was an inspired musical motif, which to me sounds like a cliché. And I thought, oh, well, he'd land upon this and think this was the best thing ever invented. Once I had that down, the lyrics just flowed, and how pleased [the narrator] was with himself. It became my favorite song to play for people who came over, for about a week or so. I never intended to record it; it was more of a writing exercise. But people would always ask for it. Then I figured, I'll end the record with it. It's like "Her Majesty"; I'll play it alone. But I ended up re-doing it and adding drums and David Campbell really wanted to add strings to it because he liked the melody so much. One of my favorite items is the sheet music in concert pitch that says "The Asshole Song." I'm gonna frame it. It's just marvelous. •

You were already very big in Sweden when your song started to get airplay in the U.S. You're not just an overnight success.

We recorded our first album in Sweden in '94. It's been a very smooth experience there, starting out very small and ending up big. If something like this happens on your first album, it's definitely going to be more confusing, I think.

What did you listen to starting out?

We all went to the same school, and I think all of us always had a thought of playing in a band. We hung around in bars at the end of high school, and pretty soon we just started playing records for each other. Mainly Cure albums. We just figured after a while that it would be very cool to start in a rock band, because it's better to be in a rock band standing in a bar than just being loose and standing in a bar. We come from this small industrial town in Sweden, where everything closes at six and there's nothing to do. There are two bars open, but they won't serve you if you're under 20 or so. So we always had to sneak in. The main reason we started the band, I think, was boredom. And very soon, that became all we talked about... music, music, music.

When did the group actually begin?

We started in 1990, and taught each other to play the instruments. We all started together... it's all the same members. I bought my first guitar in 1988; it was basically the same for all of us. You listened to records and had a faint idea of how to write a song. We listened to lots of the Cure, and I think you can hear that on the album. As soon as we got the hang of playing their songs, we started making up our own. At that time in Sweden, no one sang in Swedish; there were no rock bands singing in our native language. So we thought it would be a great idea to start a rock band and sing in Swedish. Then we spent every day in the rehearsal room for three-and-a-half years before we opened for the Cardigans in '93. In Sweden, record companies are very lazy; they're all based in Stockholm, and our town is 120 kilometers away, an hour-and-a-half by car. And no one would come see us. What if they missed the best band in the world just because the best band lives too far from Stockholm? But we got our deal about a year after the show with the Cardigans.

Did you have a lot of songs at that point?

We had about 50. When we got the deal, we started to play live a lot, just to get the experience. Then suddenly, we wrote ten new songs, and those became the album. It felt so good just going into the studio with completely new songs. We've tried to do that with the other albums as well, going in with fresh songs, no old songs at all.

Is the writing process collaborative?

It depends. Most of the time, I write the songs and bring them to the band, and they're the grand jury. That's always the hardest part. To sit down with an acoustic

guitar and play, while they're all sitting around in a circle, smoking. Saying nothing. You stop playing, and there's a pause, and you say, "Did you like it?" And someone says, "Well, I thought the middle eight was okay... But write a new verse and chorus!"

That must push you to do your best work.

Yes, it's a good thing, but I get so pissed-off every time. Sometimes I'll have a verse but no chorus, or the other way around, and someone else will write a part. Often it's Martin, the bass player. Sometimes he writes stuff, but he's so into strange chords, so he can never find a way to stop writing. So his songs are all ten minutes long. Then I have to go in and edit!

Had you toured outside of Sweden when you did your first record? No. We'd played in Stockholm and some festivals. We got very good press, but our first album sold about 5,000 copies. Then we went on a summer tour and suddenly people started to notice.

Your second record, "Verkligen" ["Really"], got you some recognition at home.

The day it came out was a very happy day for us, because the Beatles released their anthology on the same day we released our album, and we were number one and they were number two. That was a good thing. "Look here, mom... We beat the Beatles!"

That's pretty amazing.

I think it was the fact that we sang in Swedish. Because we did that, people started to listen to our kind of music, which they normally wouldn't. We weren't on the singles charts or anything, but people responded because they understood everything that was sung. So we got our strange noisy music onto the charts. We had a pretty broad audience, not just kids. That's how we finally got on the radio.

Why did you call the band Kent?

There were no good band names left, so we took a really bad one. Actually, Kent is a common male first name in Sweden, very popular in the early '70s. It's kind of a nerdy, loser name, so we thought that would be totally appropriate. We realized that it was lots of other things after we chose the name, like a brand of cigarette and a county in England where Mick Jagger and Keith Richards were from, a guitar brand, Clark Kent.

What went into the new record that was different?

On both the first and second albums, we spent so little time working on songs that everything was done in a couple of weeks after we rehearsed our heads off. This time, we had a few months off, half a year, actually, to just rehearse and write songs. We tried to keep everything very much together for the album. We wanted to have all the songs in the same mood. Of course, I wrote in both Swedish and English this time, which I'd never done before, either. ullet

New research out of WXTM (just in today). The record is #11 with the P1 listeners.

Familiarity is at 73%. The "Like a lot" scores are very high. strongest cell is 21-25 year olds.

What do you do when you're being credited with starting a whole movement with a name that, in a way, misrepresents what you're about? Royal Crown Revue are the granddads of the groundswell that's yielded the Brian Setzer Orchestra, Cherry Poppin' Daddies and Big Bad Voodoo Daddy, among others, but all they ask is for a fair chance to show what they can do, just like when they first formed.

In 1989, guitarist James Achor met ex-N.Y.C. vocalist Eddie Nichols in L.A. and shared a vision of blending the punked-up ska and rockabilly revivalism of their youths with R&B, jump blues, bebop and big band swing. Watt's own tenor saxist Mando

Dorame-who'd backed up legends like honkmeister Big Jay McNeely-bought into the concept, too. The trio expanded their idea to celebrate, on-stage and off, clothes, cars and culture of the '30s, '40s and '50s-including a lyrical stance that was a tongue-in-cheek take on classic Raymond Chandler noir. The mission was gradually joined by baritone saxman Bill Ungerman, trumpeter Scott Steen bassist Veikko Lepisto and drummer Daniel Glass.

The band's '91 indie label bow, "Kings of Gangster Bop," got them gigs all over North America and Europe, though none so fateful as their lengthy residency at LA's refurbished Derby Club, starting in '93. One pleased patron was Chuck Russell, who, when he made Jim Carrey's '94 film, "The Mask," tapped RCR to perform in a key nightclub scene. Ted Templeman [producer of everything from Van Halen to Van Morrison] later saw them at the Derby, too, signed them up and started producing their albums. As their fourth, "Contender" (WB), hit the stores, HITS' own less-than-noble Jim "Peasant" Green petitioned to obtain Royal [Crown] clarification from Nichols and Steen.

What have you got to do with this neo-swing revival?

Eddie Nichols: This music has always been around, but we get credit for starting it because we had the suits and the whole deal. We brought it back in a different way. We put it together as something that could be seen and experienced, not just heard. Most of the future bandleaders were in our audience. At the beginning, it was still an underground scene and everybody pretty much knew each other. Now it's spilled over across the board... I'm glad they're calling it neo-swing now, because most of us aren't playing swing per se. My band is more rhythm & blues and jazz from the late '40s and the '50s-jump blues and stuff like that

"Swing" may refer more to how people dance than the music itself.

Nichols: It bugs me that, on the one hand, kids'll come up to me and ask: "What is swing?" They have no history. They think what's happening now is swing. The people who do know what swing really is are going to have a difficult time accepting us. If they're thinking Benny Goodman, big bands, sitting down, mellow, they're not going to be ready for our presentation.

Now there's a scene, especially in Southern California, on the very traditional side. A bunch of the old guys are coming out and a bunch of younger guys, too, like my friend Eddie Reed has a real big band, really great, and he gets his charts, usually, from the source, like Artie Shaw and those guys. We just use elements of it.

Where do you get your horn charts?

Nichols: Bill Ungerman does our arrangements; he's great. We come up with ideas and he helps us write them up. The horns have always been a real integral part of the band. For a while, it was actually hurting us—a lot of people's ears are not ready for it. It's the same reason real jazz has a hard time getting through... You really have to listen and understand it to appreciate it.
Your new version of "Stormy Weather" is a remarkable combination of styles.

Nichols: We've been doing that song for years—there's a version of it on our very first album. It was more of a ballad, but this time we thought... Ya see, Sam Butera, Louis Prima's bandleader, would take any song and man, just really change it around to the most wonderful thing. Any time I see a record of his that's a cover of a standard, I must hear it. So we thought we'd approach it that way. Also, [tenor saxist]

Mando [Dorame] and I are big a cappella fans, and there's a version of it by the Spaniels that's an uptempo doo wop. So Mando wrote that horn riff. I may be a money hound, but the arrangement is so good and so different, maybe we should have changed the words and made it a new song completely.

The first single is "Zip Gun Bop." Could you explain the parenthetical subtitle, "Reloaded"?

Nichols: I've been doing this song for ten years. It was on our first record, and the first Warner Bros. album [their second, "Mugzy's Move"], and now this one... all different versions. The first version, the chorus was a major chord, and now the chorus is a minor. We changed the arrangement a little bit. The new one's, sonically, a fattened-up arrangement with many more vocal harmonies. It was Ted Templeman's idea, and, well, he's pretty smart that way.

The band has been doing some extracurricular activity with... Bette Midler?

Nichols: Ted's her producer also, and she loves traditional American music. For her new album, she wanted to do some rhythm & blues. So the band did this one recording of "One Monkey Don't Stop No Show" that was just... I was really proud of my guys 'cause we're usually—especially lately—trying to make something new out of something old, but this sounded like it was a 45 off a jukebox in the early '50s. They also did more of a pop song with her, and that was good, too. Also, I sang backup on the new album by Brian Setzer. He was a hero of mine as a kid, so what can I say?

You guys have the rep of being touring animals. But how the heck did you wind up opening for KISS?

Nichols: They saw us play and thought it would be cool, and we agreed. And then we got the gig, and...

Scott Steen: We were gonna be sick!

Nichols: We came out and it was awful. This one guy in a Molly Hatchet T-shirt was giving me the finger for like a half hour straight. But we didn't react, we just stuck to what we do, and by the end it changed. They really liked us!

Steen: Even the Molly Hatchet guy was standing there with a thoughtful expression on his face, like, "Hmmm, maybe these guys aren't so bad after all.


Nichols: It's like my favorite gig ever, it really is!

Who has the coolest car in the band?

Nichols: Mando would probably give me an argument on this-he has a 1948 Chevy Fleetline.

Steen: He also has a '61 Galaxy, a Sunliner.

Nichols: But I have a 1953 Hudson, and right now the engine's getting rebuilt by the guy who won NASCAR racing a Hudson in the '50s. •

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




Have you been working on new material while on the road?

Yeah, I've been writing. When we toured for "Ledbetter Heights," I didn't write anything on the road. There was just too much going on. There's still a lot going on, but I've been taking time out here and there to write. I just wrote a really cool song the other day and I've got a lot of ideas in the works.

Since you're such a guitar god, are the riffs the primary focus of your writing?

Usually, yes, but this song I came up with the other day started out with the idea of what I wanted the song to be about and then I put the music around it. But, yes, normally I write the guitar riffs first. Then I usually make an attempt at some lyrics and if I'm having a hard time, then I go to some of my partners and we collaborate. I participate in the writing of all the songs on the albums, except for the covers, obviously.

Has the recent break-up with your girlfriend been an inspiration for your writing?

Let me tell you what—that's probably the worst case of blues I've had to date. It was pretty bad. I was head-overheels in love and I guess, being a blues man, I should know better. But, I've already written a couple of songs about it. She was a great girl and a really sweet girl.

So were you the dumper or the dumpee?

I don't know exactly what happened. I went to Australia, and I got a phone call and that was it. No real explanation. We haven't talked much since it happened. She's been doing her own thing and I've just been trying to concentrate on my music. If we run into each other, then you never know what might happen. It was about eight months, and I've had much longer relationships before. I've been with a girl for five years. I left my girlfriend that I had for two years in order to be with Melody. But, see, these eight months were the most serious of them all. I swear to God, from the night we broke up, I've become a better player.

Well, you seem to pack a lot of emotion into your playing. Yeah, a lot of times bands are playing for the charts and following the trends, doing what's cool at the time. Personally, I play music that I love to play. I will not sacrifice my music just to take another step up. All of my music is about experiences I've been through, so I totally put myself in my own shoes. The blues is all about emotion and feeling and soul-searching. That's what I try to portray through my music.

Are there any people left that you want to meet and play with?

I'd like to play with John Lee Hooker. I've never played with him. I got to meet him once for about a minute. He didn't really even know who I was. We were at a B.B. King event here in Los Angeles and there were all these stars like Bonnie Raitt, Dr. John, B.B., Keb Mo and I was there right in the middle of it. walked up to John Lee and said, "Hi there, Mr. Hooker, my name's Kenny Wayne and I'm a young blues guitar player and you're one of my idols." And he was like, "Who?" [Laughs]. And I said, "I saw you play with Muddy Waters when I was three years old-my dad was the concert promoter who brought you to town." And he said, "Who's your dad?" And I said, "Ken Shepherd." And he said, "I don't know him either" and walked away. That was it. But, it didn't matter, 'cause I'd just met John Lee Hooker. It was so cool.

You mentioned Bonnie Raitt. Are there any female blues artists you really admire?

There are so many really talented women who play and sing the blues. Bonnie Raitt is a prime example. That woman can play a slide—she would tear my head off with a slide! And her voice is just like silk. I met her and she was familiar with me, which was cool. There's also Ruth Brown and a lot of lesser-knowns like Debbie Davis and all these obscure ladies who BLUES IS play blues guitar. There are a lot of women coming on this scene.

Do you ever feel like you've already done it all, with the success you've had?


I try to take it day by day. I try not to set goals. I mean, EMOTION AND everybody sets goals, but I don't want to say that, on my next record, I want to sell five million copies or by **FEELING AND SOUL**the time I'm 30 I want to be this or that. Because tomorrow everything could change. Sometimes, when I look back on all the things I've accomplished so far, WHAT I TRY TO I'm just in awe. Hanging out with Mick Jagger, Keith Richards and B.B. King-sometimes it doesn't even seem like you were really there. But I just feel like if there's more to come, then it will come.

He's got two Gold-plus albums under his belt. including the most recent "Trouble Is..." (Revolution/Reprise) and the fast-approaching-Platinum debut "Ledbetter Heights." His sophomore album alone has spawned #1 Active Rock single "Slow Ride," plus the huge Active Rock and APM charter "Blue On Black." He's been on the covers of virtually every guitar magazine in the country, posed shirtless with hot babes in Rolling Stone and made videos with Guess models. Plus, he's toured with legends like Bob Dylan, Aerosmith, the Eagles, the Rolling Stones and more. Maybe it's his Hanson-in-post-puberty good looks. Maybe it's the Shreveport, Louisiana native's smooth, southern charm. Or maybe it's the fact that he wails on the guitar like the demonic offspring of Jimi Hendrix and Stevie Ray Vaughan that makes people like B.B. King sit up and more than take notice of this prodigious talent.


But with all that, how does this most righteous rocker maintain his blues? While hanging in the Foundation Room

shepherd at Hollywood's House Of Blues just before playing a concert in celebration of his 21st birthday celebration of his 21st birthday (yes, now you should feel like a very old loser), he does exhibit all the confidence and satisfaction that his current level of success

warrants. Hell, even a recent break-up with his girlfriend [Melody Van Zant, daughter of late Lynyrd Skynyrd vocalist Ronnie Van Zant] has a silver lining; as Shepherd says of that sad episode, in his mellow drawl, "If the worst thing that comes out of it is that I write some hit songs, then touché, you know what I mean?" But them blues are always knockin' at even the happiest person's door, and HITS' downer-on-a-mission, Alexa "De-stroy The" Joy Sherman, was more than willing to help Shepherd get in touch with his pain during the following conversation.

Time to get smitten with Buffalo Tom's Chris Colbourn by Roxanne Ruben



How is this album different from your past five albums?

The most obvious thing on the one hand is that there's keyboard and we started to work with an outside musician, really, for the first time. But every year, we've used a different producer and that's always a huge step. Of course, every year I say that, but it's kind of true. This year, we used Dave Bianco, who was sort of a totally different guy. He wasn't from our circle at all. He

had made a record with Teenage Fanclub. But his experience was mostly with guys like Tom Petry. He was pretty full-on. We did pre-production, which was different for us. He was hard on us, but we're pretty hard on ourselves. He was musically challenging, but a really nice guy. I think he felt like, "You've done five records this way, so let's do something that's more of a collaboration."

What were some of the things he did differently?

It wasn't unusual for him to change the key of a song, which is sort of unheard of in our little world. Also, he challenged the lyrics. We had to debate about certain words that we wanted to use and what they meant and no one had really talked to us besides each other on that before. We never had an outside person say, "What do you mean by the word 'whore'?" It was interesting. If anything, he was like, "Well, that's cool." You just have to push yourself. It was a workout for me because I don't usually sing all that much. We had kind of already worked out who was going to sing what and why.

We rented this house down on Martha's Vineyard during the winter. And we'd spend most of the day, like hours, playing and fooling around with cover songs, everything from Ted Hawkins to My Bloody Valentine and the Spinanes. We did [the Spinanes'] "Hawaiian Baby." That's actually a b-side on one of the singles.

Was Rebecca Gates flattered that you were covering her song?

I just saw Rebecca in Boston. We've toured with her. She seemed underwhelmed, actually. I think she was embarrassed.

How have you kept it together over the years?

[Laughs] Therapy. I don't know; I think we just got older. When we first met, we were pretty close. Billy and I are from the same hometown and we all ended up going to the same college—University of Massachusetts at Amherst. We always saw each other at concerts and Tommy and I lived in the same house. That says a lot—the fact that we actually wanted to live together. Ten years later, with kids and marriages and everything, it still hasn't changed all that much. We still trade books and go to the same movies. We're pretty similar. But it can be hard.

What's your touring plan?

We're planning, at the moment, to tour with the Goo Goo Dolls. We went to Europe in September because we sell a lot of records there. We're going to bring a keyboardist on the road for the first time and that's very different for us. It adds a different texture. Now we're playing the old songs with keyboard.

BUFFALO TOM has endured over the years by remaining true to their music and not being seduced by any of the past and current musical trends. While so many bands may give a sonic nod of emulation to Radiohead or want to tuck a techno groove into a bridge somewhere, the Buffalo boys are still content to keep on producing their own sound.

On their sixth album, "Smitten," and first for Polydor, the Boston trio—singer/songwriter Bill Janovitz, Chris Colbourn and Tom Maginnis—have kept their legacy alive by making subtle changes in their songwriting and performing approach, with bassist Colbourn singing lead on his first single and Tom Gorman, formerly of Belly, adding more keyboard than on previous albums. What might be the most ear-catching element, however, is that the band sounds tighter than ever, thanks in large part to perfectionist producer Dave Bianco. While at his day job, Colbourn took time out to discuss his species' gradual extinction with HITS' own moonlighting former pizza pusher, Roxanne "Hire Her Please!" Ruben.

I just love "Treehouse," "Velvet Roof" off of "Let's Come Over" and "Sunflower Suit." We just did a little press thing where they played a retrospective of some of the other albums and I heard that song for the first time in a long time. It was great. Kind of crappy-sounding but I think it held up and it just reminded me of how great, how fun those years were.

You also wrote music for several theatrical productions.

That was cool, definitely something that I wanted to do. I always pay attention to the music that's going on in films. This student at the University of Massachusetts at Boston had been asking me for a while to do some scoring. They were just going to use Buffalo Tom music, but then they thought it would be great if I would write something. That's actually how I started writing most of the songs that I wrote for this current album. And I just went in and listened to the voices of the actors because they were so different. I listened to their voices and their timing, how they waited between each other's lines, then used that as kind of a guide toward how to fit the music in. The voices reminded me of certain kinds of music. I think that was a good way to write. I had never thought of that before.


It seemed to enhance the songwriting process for you.

It was certainly a good exercise because I think it's important to not be self-conscious about music. I've always tried to keep a job and write music at night and on the weekends. Like this play I did, I never thought these were going to be Buffalo Tom songs. I used instruments that I usually write on, like piano, because I was going through sound effects stuff, but I also used chords I don't normally play on bass or guitar.

What's your take on the state of music today?

It's funny. I've always been such a huge fan, I don't get as cynical about it. When I was a kid I got very into ska—the English Beat and stuff. Then there was this big ska revival in the late '70s-early '80s and now to have another one come around in my lifetime while I'm in a band is a curious thing. And then the swing music thing that the Stray Cats did seems to be coming back and people are really critical of that. But I really don't feel that cynical about it. When I was a kid and I got the Everly Brothers there were people that were like, "Those guys are old, you should listen to new music." But I always felt that listening to the Everly Bros. in 1980 was as valid as getting the new Sonic Youth record. Sure, it's a business. But I don't have any problem with the Spice Girls. That doesn't get me down. •

Candyskins "Death Of A Minor TV Celebrity" (Ultimate/Velvel): You probably know these luscious brit-popsters, even if you don't realize it; their cover of Buffalo Springfield's "For What it's Worth," from 1991's DGC debut, still gets PoMo spins now and then. Perhaps they were ahead of their time,

crafting bits of airy retro-rock well before bands like Oasis came along. But this Velvel debut (and fourth LP overall) proves timely, edgy and catchier than ever. Cop on to the irresistible "Feed It," or swoon to the dreamy title track for a start. "Death..." breathes new life into these long-lost limeys.

Less Than Jake "Hello Rockview" (Capitol): The name of this Gainesville, Florida six-piece means "less than cool," but don't be fooled--their second Capitol release (and fifth overall) is a crankin', skankin', dizzying moshpit full of punk-driven ska. They channel a euphoric, melodic rush into every rocking riff and bross note with a giddy on



ing riff and brass note with a giddy energy that bands like Green Day brought to the mainstream pop world. Their "History Of A Boring Town" single is racking up radio love and other cuts like "Scott Farcas Takes It On The Chin" prove just as worthy. It's more than Jake, really. (A.S.)



Soul Coughing "El Oso" (Slash/Warner Bros.): On their third album, this daring New York-bred quartet further refines its unpredictable cocktail of rock, groove, loops, noise and poetry—and the mix is completely intoxicating. Singer-guitarist M. Doughty's flinty vocals and inventive lyrics careen

against the band's ridiculously tight rhythms and sonic innovations, creating a deeply satisfying racket. Incessant, lovely single "Circles" and mantra-like masterpieces "Misinformed" and "Blame" will never leave your head. Forget the hacks; Soul Coughing is catching. (S.G.)

Buffalo Tom "Smitten" (Polydor/A&M): These PoMo veterans may have been out of sight for a while, but they've come stampeding back with this superb collection of muscular pop-rock. Opener and lead single "Rachael" is a knockout combo of hooks, harmonies and power chords that'll cause fans of the form to



rejoice; "Postcard" is a stirring, affecting mid-tempo rocker; evanescent ballad "Wiser" could easily widen the band's audience. One of the best discs we've herd in a while. (S.G.)







Bride Of Chucky OST Music From & Inspired By CMC

Quite possibly this label's coolest release to date, what with the pissed-off superock sounds of some of this decade's new favorites and yesterday's heavy underground heroes. Either way, it's thunder and lightning for your mind, with current radio charters



like Screamin' Cheetah Wheelies and Monster Magnet, as well as Motorhead and even the "Thunder Kiss 65" track from now-defunct White Zombie. It's no wonder Chucky's face looks like a cheese grater, considering he's been subjected to Judas Priest's "Blood Stained" or, better yet, Monster Magnet's "See You In Hell." Ouch! Powerman 5000 make the cut as well and special for the OST (not in the movie) are Coal Chamber's "Blisters" and Slayer's awesome "Human Disease." Not for the faint of stomach! Not ever. (JB)

Red Sky Knife Behind The Smile Endless Fight

If the term "crossover" refers to the growing trend of hardcore bands gradually becoming more and more metal, then this sixpiece from Pennsylvania could almost be called "crossed-over." There are few remnants of hardcore left here. A few breakdowns

Melt Banana, for those who don't know, are a crazy hyper-noise-punk-troupe from Japan that fuck shit up in ways you could never imagine. The new record, "Charlie," is fast, creative, intense and fun-and it's available through Revolver out of San Francisco... The American metalcore scene has a hot new contender-Pennsylvania's Red Sky (Endless Fight). They play brutal hardcore/ deathmetal music definitely worth checking out (review on previous page)... As a musical statement of strength and will power, the new Blood Axis (led by "Lords Of Chaos" author Michael Moynihan) serves up an esoteric mix of pipe-organ-ambience and spoken-word hedonism. 

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



Jive's Jazzy Jordan: Looking To Make The R. Kelly Green

The release of R. Kelly's double-CD "R" (live) has been postponed until 11/10. Disappointing news, but it goes a long way toward building public anticipation for an artist who, thanks to his massive "I Believe I Can Fly," has garnered mass appeal. Jazzy Jordan, VP Black Music Marketing Jive/ Verity, chatted with us about Jive's set-up for radio: "The number one thing we're doing is releasing a series of singles. Our first official release to radio was 'Half

On A Baby' [which went for adds 8/31]. Then we're coming with 'I'm Your Angel,' a duet with Celine Dion. Simultaneous with that is 'Home Alone,' which features a rap by Keith Murray." All three singles will be accompanied by videos, which have been shot already. How will Jive continue to superserve urban radio while exposing Kelly to a larger audience? "R. Kelly will always be true to his base," Jordan says. "You always have to be sure to take care of everybody. R. Kelly's goal is not to be a crossover artist; his goal is to create great music. Hopefully, it will be enjoyed and loved by everyone. Call him what you will, but his focus is to create a great album each time out. He's now such a phenomenon-such a multi-dimensional artist-that you can't just pigeonhole him in one particular category"... Notes: A steamy dance remix of Deborah Cox's "Nobody's Supposed To Be Here" (Arista) has been serviced to crossover stations, while urban stations are holding on to the more serious ballad mix. Hold tight-the remix will be serviced to urban in the near future... Aaron Hall's "All The Places (I Will Kiss You)" (MCA) surges into this week's "Sizzling Singles" Top 30, while TQ's "Westside" (Clockwork/Epic) continues its strong radio and retail presence... Jay-Z's "Can I Get A" (Def Jam/Mercury) is the big gun right now. Has it taken the steam out of Dru Hill's "How Deep Is Your Love"? Looks that way, especially from an airplay standpoint... Percolating: Kenny Lattimore's "Days Like This" (Columbia) and Usher's "One Day You'll Be Mine" (look for the new remix)... Question: Why didn't Brandy's "Top Of The World" go all the way? It lost momentum after looking like a solid bet to hit the, er, top of the charts... Seattle, home of Sir Mix-A-Lot and our own Nasty Nes, is 'bout to make some noise with Tony-O's "PhD. (Playa Hata Disease)" (Promised Land/Wyne Time/Sail). The song has a catchy yet edgy tone and a hook that will have you humming in a second. Here's the track's action from last week: #30 at Mass Pool in Boston, #17 at Soul City Sound Pool in Lexington, KY, #32 at First Break Record Pool in Sumter, SC and #23 at Northwest Dance Association in Seattle. Solo began with two men singing for their supper—and, for that matter, their breakfast and lunch. Vocalists Eunique Mack and

Darnell Chavis met when both were homeless in L.A., and they soon found themselves throwing down the sweet harmonies for loose change. They later hooked up with two other warblers, lames Smith and Daniele Stokes, and then veteran jazz bassist Robert Anderson. Their streetcorner vocal arrangements and Anderson's supple basslines formed a warm, cohesive whole. and they began winning over crowds in other cities. Though Smith was killed in what the group's bio describes as "a random act of street violence," the foursome decided to honor his memory by carrying on. They were performing in the streets of New York when they caught the ears of superproducers Jimmy Jam (who saw them perform from a cab) and Terry Lewis (who caught their dulcet tones while shopping in the SoHo district). Soon the quartet found themselves at Jam & Lewis' Flyte Tyme Studios in Minneapolis, recording what would become their album debut; it eventually sold over 600,000 units domestically. On Solo's follow-up, they've teamed up with fellow old-school soul fanatics Gerald Levert, Raphael Saadiq (of Tony! Toni! Toné!) and others to confect this creamy "New Classic Soul" valentine to doo-wop, Motown and every other sweet strain of black pop. Standouts include the sexy "Luv-All-Day," "Touch Me" and the sunny "Sumpthin Kinda Special." "Bruthas" gonna work it out.



Tim Bowman "Paradise"
InSync Music

"Smooth jazz" guitarist Tim Bowman once again injects a spiritual vein into the penthouse soundscape on this sophomore effort,

the follow-up to 1996's "Love, Joy, Peace." That debut release (boasting Bowman's sister Vicki Winans singing "Don't Let the Devil Ride") scored impressively at the format; Oregon's InSync Music. which has also put out recordings by Daniel Winans and "Star Search" champ Beau Williams, has shown itself to be a contender. Born ninth in a family of twelve kids in Detroit, Bowman discovered music at the International Gospel Center Church, where a divinely inspired axe-slinger took his breath away. "When I saw him," the musician recalls, "I wanted to do this." Watching country-quitar great Roy Clark on "Hee Haw" widened his appreciation of what could be done on the instrument, but jazz-pop superstar George Benson soon overshadowed all those earlier influences. After winning a music scholarship to Detroit Music School-and spending what he still deems "two of the most enlightening years of my life" there-Bowman played with his sister in the gospel group International Sound of Deliverance and, later, the Winans (sister Vickie married Marvin Winans). After much struggle, he decided to do his own CD and worked it at the grassroots; he may not be rolling in dough, but he loves what he's doing, and you can hear it in every note.
