

MTV's New Spin

hat a difference a daypart makes.
At least that's what MTV Sr. VP Music Programming & Talent Relations Tom Calderone is hoping, as he launches the channel's new playlist, "MTV Guide," this week.

"We're trying to look at our rotation in terms of quality rather than quantity," he said. "Which is actually the exact opposite of your publication."

The new "MTV Guide" will now break down video play in terms of three separate dayparts: Daytime (6 AM-3:30 PM), Showtime (3:30 PM-12 midnight) and Late Night (midnight-6 AM). The playlist will include not only the daypart in which each video is played, but the estimated cumulative audience viewing the clip during that time period as well.

"This is more accurate in terms of the way we play music," explains Calderone, who adds that such categories as "Buzzworthy," "Jam of the Week" and "Spankin' New Video" will remain. "When I first got here, I kept bringing it up to the music department that we needed a more accurate way of measuring airplay. At the end of the day, we're all concerned about how many times a video is spun, but we also want to know how many viewers are going to see it in a certain daypart. We want to show people there's a quality side to our programming.'

Calderone insists that only the way the spins are being reported has changed; actual rotations remain the same. "We feel this system enables us to have real quality conversations with the labels in terms of strategy. We can show them how many people are actually watching and the value of spins in these individual dayparts."

Other changes include what Calderone calls a "new and improved M2 playlist" with new rotation categories and a third page "hot sheet," with news and programming information from the music and talent departments.

"This is in response to the industry's stated needs," says Calderone. "They already examine our airplay in terms of daypart anyway."

The new MTV reporting philosophy will undoubtedly be one of the main topics of conversation during the channel's traditional breakfast meeting with the labels, which takes place Thursday, February 23 at the Four Seasons in L.A.


UMVD Branches Out





Music, Film Keep Sony Sunny

Despite a sharp downturn in Sony Corp.'s mammoth electronics business, the company reported a 1.8% increase in net profit to \$968 million for the company's fiscal third quarter ending December 31. The increase reflects strong sales growth in the music division and higher video revenue from Sony's film studio.

The music group's operating income rose 22% to \$256 million on a 16.3% increase in sales of \$2.03 million, driven by releases from Celine Dion, Mariah Carey and George Michael. At Sony Pictures, operating income rose 11.9% to \$79.1 million on 16% lower revenue of \$1.17 billion. The sales decline was worsened by the yen's appreciation against the dollar and Sony's merger of its Loews Theaters unit with Cineplex Odeon. Sony said the studio's operating income was also boosted by increases in the television business, mostly from game shows. Said an unnamed source at the mothership: "We rike buy vower now, prease."

IN HER HIT SINGLE.

"Hands," Jewel Kilcher sings: "I won't be made useless/I won't be idle with despair." And she certainly hasn't. The 24-year-old Alaskan-born singer/songwriter/guitarist/poet/actress and philanthropist is about as productive an artist as they come.

She has just released "Spirit" (Atlantic), the long-awaited follow-up to the ten-million-seller, "Pieces Of You." Produced by Patrick Leonard [Madonna], the songs are more elaborately textured, the lyrics more reflective than those on her '95 Atlantic debut.

Earlier this year, Jewel released a collection of poems, "A Night Without Armor" [Harper Collins], along with a companion spoken-word album. The book went into 15 printings and became a New York Times best seller. She also acted for the first time, starring as a teenage bride during the Civil War, in the film "Ride With The Devil," directed by Ang Lee ["Ice Storm," "Sense & Sensibility"] and co-starring Tobey Maguire ["The Ice Storm," "Pleasantville"] and Skeet Ulrich ["As Good As It Gets"].

If that's not enough, along with her mother, advisor Nedra Carroll, Jewel has started a non-profit organization called Higher Ground For Humanity [HGH] to "support, inspire and empower new possibilities for humankind" through a variety of causes like Friends Of The Institute Of Poetic Sciences and The Centre For The Study Of Consciousness.

As for "Spirit," when Jewel was promoting her poetry tome, she revealed she had been writing "more classical type music" for her next album and even some songs in Latin, referring to it as "more of a Christmas album" in an abstract sense. While her original idea seemed to have changed during the creative process, what the album does have in common with the holiday "Spirit" is the subject of self-love and humanity, two topics completely foreign to the frozen tundra that is the heart of HITS' Canadian editor Karen Bliss "Ters On Her Fingers."

You initially wanted this new album to have a Christmas theme. What happened to that plan?

The album pretty much takes on its own life after awhile. You have to be loyal to it, see what it wants and not tell it what it should do.

Did you have the title, "Spirit," first?

No, I didn't title it until after I was done with the record.

What is "spirit" to you— resilience, character, soul?

To me, spirit is the whole enchilada. Spirituality is something we have to strive to or toward. It's not anything that we'll ever be denied of. We're naturally spiritual because we're spirits. You don't have to try any harder than that. How far you want to go with it is a whole other matter. You don't have to stand on one foot, wet your finger and pray to be struck by lightening [laughs]. I think, anytime someone says, "I'm happy," they're expressing their spirituality. Everytime they say, "Oops, I better apologize to that

you're stressed or you're tired or you're overjoyed. Throughout that process, you learn to cope.

As you started working on new material, what did you notice about your own writing style?

Like anything, you evolve. Your voice matures, your writing becomes more articulate, more musical. I don't know. I don't really think about it.

Your voice sounds so much better on this record.

I wasn't comfortable on the first record. I didn't think I was a great singer. I sang great in live shows, but, all of a sudden, when it came to do my record, having my voice recorded was a weird thing. People would see me in concert and go, "You're so much better live."

Vocally, you're a lot looser and more playful. "Do You" is very different from "Fat Boy."

I've always done stuff like that live. I've always been a live performer. For me to get it on tape is just learning to kind of loosen up.

You've said that you are committed to using your success as a positive platform.

person," that's investing in spirituality. I've never felt comfortable with terms—New Age, hippie, born-again. To me, spirituality is embracing the whole thing.

When did you start discovering and exploring spiritual, non-linear consciousness?

It's the way I was raised. When you're raised outdoors like that, it's sort of not normal. It's a weird thing. I wasn't raised around any extremists, though. When you see nature, and you see such tremendous beauty around you, you just have a sense of awe and wonder. If you're raised in a city full of violence, you tend not to have a sense of that beauty [laughs]. Most of it has to do with the way I was raised. I would sit quietly and have a little relationship with God, although I wouldn't call it that.

The past few years, you haven't had much time to yourself. Did you need a break in order to write this record?

I don't write for a record. At least so far I haven't. I write all the time. It happens constantly. I did four months of touring, then four months of a movie and the book at the same time; then I went right into the studio. Now I'm going back out on the road, so I never really had a break.

When "Pieces Of You" took off, it required you to be constantly on the road doing promotion. Were you comfortable with that?

It's always an adjustment. I don't think you're like, "This is great!" [Laughs] There are periods where

I don't know if I'd call it "positive." People gave me money so that I could get food when I was hungry, so I want to help other people. It's not positive. It's just responsible.

You've started a foundation with your mother called Higher Ground For Humanity. Can you tell me about that?

It's a non-profit organization that supports other non-profit organizations.

What's the criteria to receive that support?

It supports humanity. It can be spiritual, medicinal, emotional... anything from supporting American Indians by donating food and clothing, helping them establish the Turtle Lodge, to having support groups for people who deal with emotional loss, to medical clinics that are trying to discover new methods of treatment.

Will you be putting on benefit concerts or does a percentage of your royalties go to this foundation?

I'm actually not allowed to talk too much about this because *Vogue* is going to do an official announcement about it.

In "Hands," you write, "I won't be made useless" and in the chorus, "My hands are small, I know/But they're not yours/They are my own." Did you ever feel useless, that you couldn't make an impact on the world?

Definitely, and I sometimes still feel that way. I think everybody does. I think every kid looks at the world "THE

and says, "This isn't what I thought it was gonna be like. How am I supposed to exist here?" Many people get disillusioned. I feel the same thing.

When did you first have a glimmer that your music was making an impact?

It happens on different levels. When I performed in a coffee shop, I thought that was the biggest level. I thought, "This is nice." And it wasn't me affecting people; it was people affecting me, people basically giving me food at night and coming to my shows. It was really familial and had this reciprocity...

How do you feel when a fan tells you one of your songs inspired them?

I don't get too high on that. We all affect people. People inspire you to do the same or they inspire you to do something different than they do. That's normal. That's how it goes. I don't think about it too much. The writers that helped me develop were the honest ones, those who showed me their vanity as well as their beauty. All

[Laughs] It never really stopped for me. I never got a break. Your mother is a tremendous inspiration. You have a special relationship.

We're basically good friends. She's never assumed whom I was. She's always asked me whom I was, but she's never been the kind of mother who was overbearing, assumptive, suspicious or anything. She's always been a really great friend, who helps you to know yourself.

Does it ever become difficult having her manage you, too?

No, it's not the most natural thing. She's great. She's intensely bright and good at business, on top of the fact that she knows me emotionally and psychologically. No decision gets made that isn't good for me on all levels, so I still get to be a really sane balanced person in a really weird business.

How was the acting experience? Is it something you'd like to do again?

Yes, definitely. I don't think it was totally easy for me. It

I can do is try to be the same.

What was it like working with Patrick Leonard as producer?

Patrick's great. He has years of wisdom and musical experience that I don't, so I can say, "I want to do this, but I don't know how to do it," and he'll say, "This is who can do it for you." That's just invaluable.

"Spirit" is not a pop record. There's a depth to its textures.

I just laid out for Patrick what this was for me. It's also obvious what the songs are—they're more poetic, evocative, emotional and textural than they are overt pop, so to do anything else with the songs would make it look like a dog dressed up in a ballerina tutu or something [laughs]. It just isn't right.

How will you be taking "Spirit" on the road?

I'll have a band with me. I'm also going to take Steve Poltz with me. He's going to play acoustic guitar and open for me.

When does the touring begin?

I hit the road in January in a heavy way, to Australia, Malaysia and Japan first. Then North America in July, August, September, something like that.

Are you looking forward to it all starting again?

was stressful, just because I didn't know anything about the form. I didn't know what a "single" was, I didn't know what "hitting a mark" was, I just didn't know anything, so it was a huge learning curve. As far as acting goes, [director] Ang [Lee] just took endless time with me and nurtured me.

Did you find acting a natural extension of being a musical performer?

Acting is very different. It's not a live performance art. The hardest thing for me was performing without an audience: "Why would I act well if there's no audience? There's no one to impress?" [Laughs] I had to trick myself into it.

Through writing your book, how do you believe your poetry has improved?

I write a lot less about myself. Before I used to ask, "What is sensuality? What is sexuality?" You're like, 15, and, oh my god, I have breasts or something, which obviously isn't a real big deal to me now [laughs]. So I'm writing less about myself and more about inward things.

Do you plan on putting out another poetry book?

I have a second book coming out, in July, supposedly. We'll see if it gets done. It's more short stories and prose, but I haven't even started writing it yet.



Your material is a lot more directly emotional than what we usually hear from "power-pop" bands.

Waymon Boone: Initially, the idea was to form a band that had good songs and that came from an honest point-of-view, that represented who we are.

Is it true that you found your bandmates through classified ads?

James Cruz: We were actually in another band together.

Waymum: But he did answer an ad-he was one of two who did, and the other guy didn't have an arm. The same thing with Marc and John. We were playing together as a trio, without a drummer. Then we put in another ad. I think we're a bad example, because usually newspaper ads don't work, at least as well as they have for us. But we got Marc, and then maybe two or three months later, we got Jon.

Do you all have a similar set of likes and dislikes?

Wayman: Yes, and we all came from some sort of musical family, which is odd to me. All four of us had musical upbringings. We all came from separate worlds, but we all lived in the city, in synch with each other, as far as the things we listened to and liked.

What were the big influences?

Wayman: I went through two different stages. As a kid, I was listening to old soul, Motown, R&B music. As I got older, I was introduced to rock music; the turning point for me was Fleetwood Mac's "Rumours," which was the first rock record I ever listened to. As far as the biggest influences on me, it would be the Beatles, Bowie and the Jackson 5.

And then you began playing around the Northeast.

Waymum: Yes, with New York as our home base, our place of inbreeding. James and I signed a publishing deal and were immediately taken under the company's wing to develop the band. We did a great deal of touring around the country and Europe and got a lot of exposure. We really got our shit together. When the other two guys came aboard, it was like the missing pieces of a puzzle.

How was it working with Todd Rundgren?

Wayman: It was a really good, direct, immediate experience because he's very nofrills. He's a black-and-white-box kind of person. You just started working right away, whether you like it or not. Once we set up, we started pre-production and talked a little bit and then started recording. We recorded at Utopia, which is his studio, and he engineered the record. It was basically the band and him in a room. There wasn't anyone else involved; label people didn't come around too much. He has a strong way of distancing everyone outside of the process. As he puts it, all that other stuff can come in after he goes. Which was great, because we slidn't have any

outside influences or squabbles in the studio. He wouldn't even let us talk about stuff like what the first single would be; he was like, "I don't give a shit about singles." All the tracks are equally important to him.

Jonathon Svec: We'd finish and he'd say, "OK, what do you want to work on tomorrow?

Waymon: It took some of the preciousness out of it.

Any revelations from working in the studio?

Wayman: Todd definitely had a complete understanding of how not to be afraid to make a commitment to something. So if the idea came that you wanted to try something, do it without reservation. Just go for it, and better to fail than to do it half-assed. That was one great thing.

Even if you just find out that what you were doing before was better.

Waymon: If you wanted to do a drum take or a vocal take, just do it and don't worry about it. The worrying part is what takes away from the integrity of the performance. That's something we took with us.

Is the record close to what you envisioned? It's pretty muscular-sounding.

Waymon: Todd's based his career as an artist on that. He came to live shows, and understood what we were about as a live band. In fairness, we did spend a lot of time ourselves recording demos, but we spent just as much time—if not more—being a live act and constantly trying to bring that live energy back to recording. Based on Todd seeing the shows, he'd be more concerned about getting a really good one- or two-take performance.

Marc Shutsky: For myself, it was like, first or second drum takes, he'd be, like, "Yeah, that's great. Let's move on." I'd say, "Are you sure you don't want to do it again?" He'd say no. He was very into spontaneity, capturing a certain energy. I was surprised: I thought that making a record like this would be a ballbuster or something. Jonathon: We were ultra-prepared, so prepared we were able to go in and just do it. James: Also, he was key in picking the songs. We came in with shitloads of songs, and the ones he picked were the ones we really wanted to do; he picked songs we thought weren't gonna be able to go on the record. We recorded 15 songs, and 13 made it to the album.

Jonathon: There's a good consistency, a balance in the dynamics.

Do you feel you could produce yourselves using what you learned from making

Waymon: I don't how everybody else feels, but I know we got a lot of knowledge about our point-of-view and enough information so that we'd be capable of doing it ourselves next time .



How much pot do you go through on the road?

Brad Daddy X: Too much. When we're out on the road, we have a designated regulator on the bus who watches how much pot is distributed. Otherwise, we'll go through so much weed that it's ridiculous.

Is there anything you're trying to say with your music?

BDX: At our shows, there are always spoken-word pieces of enlightenment and awareness. Society, anarchy, freedom... ideas like that are incorporated into a Kottonmouth Kings show. I believe that we are all connected and from the created. We are all brought up in a society which tells us how to think and act. Life should be about being ourselves. We should go out and create our own reality and search for what we really want. A person's sanctuary could be a 20-foot wave, two hookers, a pile of cocaine or even yoga. It's whatever each individual feels he needs to fulfill his life.

I know a few of you are also in the Humble Gods. Which band started first? BDX: Kottonmouth Kings were originally just a studio project. I used to promote night clubs and mess around with hip-hop. I used to make beats in my home studio. Then D-Loc and Saint started hanging out at the studio, and we started recording some stuff. Eventually, we decided to do some shows, and it took off from there.

Tell me about your new hip-hop label.

BDX: We have a label called Suburban Noize through Capitol Records. Kottonmouth Kings are the first release on it. The next release will be by Grand Vernacular with DJ Circa, and then Too Rude featuring Dog-Boy, who collaborated with us on a few songs for our record. We also have a compilation coming out with all these people and more, including Pakelika. The masked man

does speak, but only through poetic forms. He'll eventually have his own record down the line.

Saint, I've been told that you're the most effective at causing controversy. What's something funny you've done recently which pissed someone off?

Saint Vicious: Have Brad X tell you, I can't talk about my own shit. BDX: Tempe, Arizona, at Hayden Square, playing an outdoor show with the Deftones. We just rocked 4,000 people there. Next door, a restaurant called Gibsons sectioned off the rooftop as a special bar area. Saint Dog goes up on top of the bar and starts pissing on the crowd. We have a picture of it. SV: What's funny is that it was a VIP area for the show, and everyone turned and started screaming when they saw what I was doing. Six security guards came and kicked me out. I was all wasted, so I slid down the roof and nearly landed on the manager of the place. I mean, if I rock the place, I should be able to piss on the crowd. F**k 'em.

What's a typical night for you guys after a show?

SV: We usually hang out by our booth, talk to the people in town and see what their particular vibe is all about. Then we get high and go on the bus. What we do after that, I'd rather not say. It's not the kind of stuff you want in print.

What's the most inspiring thing a fan has said to you?

SV: I don't remember anything in particular that someone's said, but there are the Kings' tattoos. One kid came up and showed me a six-inch tattoo of our logo on the back of his neck. I didn't know what to say. I was speechless. It's a cool thing to see people relating to our music so much that they'd do something like that. •

The Jimmy Rogers All-Stars "Blues Blues Blues" (Atlantic): Just before his death in 1997, Jimmy Rogers, who changed music history by electrifying blues guitar with Muddy Waters' first band, jammed with disciples Mick Jagger, Keith Richards, Eric Clapton, Steven Stills, Taj Mahal, Robert Plant and Jimmy Page. But be warned —this is no per-

functory tribute. It's a high-voltage jolt of hard-core Chicago blues. "Gonna Shoot You Right Down (Boom Boom)" is a time-warping psychotic reaction, with Rogers and Plant moaning and snarling in counterpoint to an epic guitar war between Clapton and Page. It sounds like the end of the world. (Brian Alcorn)

Adrian Belew "Salad Days" (Thirsty Ear): '80s "art-rock" may exist as a half-second blip on the radar of American music, but Adrian Belew, a king in King Crimson, was never pigeonholed by the genre. His nearly 20-year career has spanned prog-rocky albums as well as alt-pop hit singles. (Remember "Oh, Daddy"?). This gorgeously



stripped-down affair highlights his virtuoso guitar talents (check out the live "Three Of A Perfect Affair"), while the addition of string arrangements vivify tracks like "Men In Helicopters." These mixed greens, some of them B-sides, are turned over and revealed as "A" material. (J.T.)



Ani DiFranco "Up Up Up Up Up" (Righteous Babe): On her 12th release, DiFranco, picks up where her Grammy-nominated "Little Plastic Castles" left off. Her ability to turn traditional folkie instruments (acoustic guitar, banjo, standup bass) into a lush sonic backdrop is unparalleled, and often these sounds mesh with a Hammond B-3 or a funky

groove for what can only be described as a jazzy hoedown. It's a perfect setting for lyrics that push and pull at public and personal politics. The public politics come with songs like "'Tis Of Thee," which spins a Woodie Guthrie-like tale of injustice; the personal, in the single "Angry Anymore." (J.T.)





TRIED TO MAKE THIS TIME, IF YOU AN BELIEVE THAT."

TIME TO CATCH SOME FLIES WITH HONEY WITH SUGAR RAY'S MARK MCGRATH by David Jenison

Twelve years ago, Sugar Ray guitarist Rodney Sheppard received a message from his girlfriend. She had just gone to see a psychic palm reader, and the swami correctly predicted that she was dating a guy in a band, and that the group was going to become an overnight sensation. However, the psychic then told her to warn the band, because they would only have one hit and

then fade away as quickly as they appeared.

The members of Sugar Ray—Sheppard, singer Mark McGrath, bassist Murphy Karges, drummer Stan Frazier and DJ Craig Bullock—never forgot that story, especially with the immediate success of their single "Fly." But not to worry about any rejects from the Dionne Warwick Friends Network. The overwhelming success of their new single, "Every Morning," gave the band a Top 20 debut on the sales chart, and it seems like their new album, the aptly named "14:59" (Lava/Atlantic)—as in their Warholian 15 minutes are almost up—has surprising legs. The record, produced by the legendary David Kahne, delivers far more than anyone expected with remarkable pop hooks, a smooth summertime feel and a string of potential radio smashes. Singer Mark McGrath, who has been a reader of HITS Magazine since before he was even in the band, recently spoke with our own "16 Minutes and Counting" stuporstar David Jenison "Day Will Never Be The Same."

How was your approach to making "14:59" different than "Floored" or "Brownies and Lemonade"?

We tried to make an album that was listenable this time, if you can believe that. People seem to be shocked. They say the album has a lot of radio songs. Some people think we tried to write these types of songs, but I dare someone to try to write a hit. It's hard to do. If people can just fabricate hits, then everyone would be doing it. "Fly" pointed us in a direction. We didn't want to make 15 "Flys," but it definitely showed me where my voice wants to be on your speakers.

David Kahne is my favorite producer in music today. What is he like in the studio?

David Kahne is a total "hands-on" producer. He is so incredibly smart and talented that I don't even try to interact with him on that plane. With our band, he is involved in the songwriting process, he's the engineer, the psychologist, the resident alien. I don't even think he stops to use the bathroom. There are people who walk into your life and really affect it. A person might have five of them in a lifetime, and he is definitely one of ours

What has been your strangest encounter with a fan?

Some guy in Europe asked if I would sign his leg. I said I would, so he sat down and took his leg off. We were not prepared for that at all. It wasn't even a prosthetic leg. It was an old wooden one.

What is the oddest thing you've asked for on a contract rider?

We ask for socks and underwear because we sweat a lot on-stage. We'll show up at a gig, and the promoter asks, "What's with the underwear and socks?" I respond, "You'll find out when we leave them here tonight."

Did it bother you when "RPM," the second single from "Floored," didn't take off at radio?

It wasn't a surprise, believe me. I knew "Fly" was the anomaly on the record, and we were lucky to have just that song. I thought "RPM" was a great rock song that a segment of the population would dig. We also knew it wasn't a multi-format smash. We were in an awkward position trying to release the next single.

What is the oddest promotion the label has done with Sugar Ray?

During "Lemonade and Brownies," the label held a big contest in which people were supposed to videotape themselves running naked in a public place holding our CD. The prize was \$3,000 cash or the Mean Machine, my '68 Cadillac. Well, it was a nationwide contest, and only three f**kin' people responded to it. The girl who won just took the cash. It was so uneventful. We haven't brought it up since.


What did you think of the recent Cosmo article on you? Did the magazine characterize your love-life accurately?

The Cosmo article was a little too truthful. When it came out, this girl I was seeing started screaming and yelling at me, and my mom called crying and asking, "What kind of an animal did I raise here?" They were all jokes, people.

Has earning a bachelor's degree in communications helped you at all? I left USC completely prepared for nothing. Communications is the most ambiguous major you can take. I tried to go business, but I nearly failed the easiest math class there. The professor said, "I'll give you a C- if you promise not to go into business." I decided to try communications. I walk into my first class, and I see a bunch of football players sitting there. I knew this was the place I needed to be.

Why did you start reading HITS and other trade magazines so many years ago?

I don't know. I started reading these things in the '80s when I had no business reading them. I was buying metal magazines like RIP and Metal Edge, but they weren't enough for me. I wanted to see how the charts work, what spins were, who got added and who didn't. I followed all the bands like Warrant and Queensryche to see how they did. It was a hobby, and I was fortunate enough for my hobby to become my job. •

You've been playing some of these songs live since the Furthur Festival in '97.

I just feel something different with this project that I haven't felt in a long time. I mean, the last I4 months have been easily the most productive I4 months in our career.

What do you think accounts for that productivity?

When we were young men, we made a commitment to this thing, and over the years, I can see where I handled something wrong, or I internalized something, just the whole trip. To be able to take stock of it, to see what worked and what didn't and sorta push on... that's the whole idea for "By Your Side," anyway. The song itself is more about relationships and the lack of integrity among people, culturally. But to use it for the album title is more about us, and it's about rock & roll music, the kind of music we're playing. It's a very sincere sentiment to us, as opposed to "Three Snakes & A Charm," which was a riddle.

Did the events of the past couple of years, particularly losing Marc and Johnny, enable the band to hone in more on what it wanted to do, musically?

Definitely. Writing those songs and going through that dark period was a catalyst to get us here. Johnny and Marc were a big part of this for a long time; I have no ill feelings towards them. But those two guys were distracting us. So all these things have come to fruition over a period of time.

So what happened with Marc and Johnny?

We asked Marc to leave for his own health, and for us. Like I said, it was a distraction, and I wasn't going to be out here on the road and have Marc die. That just wasn't how it was going to go down. And if us firing him from the band would save his life, which I think it did, that's the way it's gonna be. And Johnny just quit; he just called and said, "I can't do this anymore." I guess Rich [Robinson] just had a conversation with Johnny, and he said he feels a tremendous amount of pressure lifted off of him, 'cause he knew we weren't in sync. So he's gone on and is doing his own thing.

How did you go about finding replacements?

Well, when Sven [Pipien, the Crowes' new bassist] came, we were excited 'cause here was a new sound. And I think that Rich always had to look over his shoulder at Johnny; I don't think Rich was ever totally secure with Johnny's musicianship. I think Johnny's feelings were hurt 'cause on "Three Snakes," Rich played the bass on everything except for one song. Now Rich doesn't have to worry about it, 'cause Sven is more adept at what we're trying to do. That's not a cut on Johnny; it's just how we see it.

Did you know early in the writing process for "By Your Side" that you were looking at a more straightforward rock album?

It's a simple thing; it's rhythmic. On "Southern Harmony," we got away from that tra-

TIME TO GO BACK TO BLACK WITH BLACK CROWES' CHRIS ROBINSON BY GARY GRAFF

Word has it the Black Crowes are shakin' their money maker again. Nearly everything you read about the Atlanta group's newly released fifth album, "By Your Side" (Columbia), hails its return to the crunchy rock roots of its 1990 debut, "Shake Your Money Maker"—the one that you have to figure some of these same people lambasted as being too much of a Stones/Faces wannabe when it came out.

That's a double-edged crock, of course: first of all, "Money Maker" was, and still is, big fun to listen to; and, secondly, the Crowes Whave spent the interim making some of the most bold and adventurous guitar-rock around, slam-dunking formulas and exploring musical and stylistic nuances without regard (but certainly hopes) for sales. So in that context, "By Your Side" is less a throwback than a synthesis of sensibilities—though there's no question that rockers such as the first single, "Kicking My Heart Around," "Go Faster" and "Horsehead" are among the Crowes' most straightforward tunes in years. "By Your Side" also leads the group out of one of the most turbulent periods of its decade-long career, during which it suffered the loss of two members [guitarist Marc Ford and bassist Johnny Colt], the dissolution of its label, American Recordings [which was absorbed into the Columbia fold] and even a Court TV lawsuit by a former road manager that was eventually tossed out. Now, however, the Crowes are back by our side and flying straighter than ever, as frontman Chris Robinson welcomes back HITS' own Norma Raye, Mr. Union Gap himself, Gary "Phuckett" Graff.

ditional hard-rock sort of rhythmic thing. We started swinging and we didn't go back to rocking for awhile. What's funny is when we started to write these songs—like we wrote "Go Faster" and "Kicking My Heart Around" in one day—we just straightened out the beats. And that's what makes it rock & roll.

What about the dissolution of American?

That's a whole other thing. I've always hated Rick Rubin, and he's always hated us. No one is more happy than me that he lost his record company; it couldn't have happened to a nicer guy, to be honest with you. What's funny is to be on Columbia, even though it is a more corporate thing... within that, we have more freedom. And we actually have more rapport with some of the people there. At American, I never knew what a record company did. We never had an A&R guy, you know? We have a product manager now; I didn't know what the hell that was. It's like, I'm 30 years old, and I've been doing this for ten years, and I didn't know what the music business was.

There are several out-and-out love songs on this album, which is rare for you—especially since your marriage was breaking up at the time.

[Laughs] That's one thing about this record—there is a lot of love on it, and I've never written love songs. I do think having a muse in my life like the woman I'm with now helped. I've never written songs like that; I've never had the motivation to. I think there's also a lot of humor on this album, which is something we haven't touched on before, except maybe on "Shake Your Money Maker," which was a lighter time and a lighter mood. And that's where we are now; we are very happy, and I think people see that. We're giving that energy off on-stage with this album, and I'm excited 'cause there are a lot of young kids who have never seen a proper rock & roll tour.

So rock isn't dead.

Man, rock & roll is still new, and I don't think people should give up on it just because corporate America tells you it's not hip. You know what I mean? 'Cause it's about soul, and I don't really hear a lot of soul in anything. So when something comes along that does have it, it's the odd thing out. We all have to be able to step back and make fun of ourselves. But music is important, you know what I mean? •

TIME FOR SOME FRICTION AND RELEASE WITH FURSLIDE'S JENNIFER TURNER BY ROXANNE RUBEN

Furslide is all about texture and, according to lead singer Jennifer Turner, friction and release. "Adventure" (Virgin), the new, N.Y.-based trio's debut, showcases the band members' varying musical mindsets. Whether it's the soft mesmerizing murmurs found in "Hawaii" or the edgy raucousness of "One Hit Downer," Furslide's material hones in on twisted and torn characters making their way through a love-weary world. Turner, the band's primary songwriter, translates her material with vocals that sonically cross-pollinate Shirley Manson and Liz Phair. The band—which also includes keyboardists Adam MacDougall and Jason Lader—enlisted the help of trip-hop/electronica maestro Nellee Hooper, who was seduced by Furslide when he caught an especially rousing performance in L.A. two years ago. Hooper provided his wit and whimsical nature behind the boards and the end result is an eclectic listening experience that embraces a number of musical influences—from rock, folk, blues and even country. HITS' resident former pizza pusher Roxanne "Roxannadanna" Ruben avoids the wrath of PETA to talk turkey with the band's lovely Jennifer Turner.

What's your musical philosophy?

To me, in life, every moment there's a million choices and you have to really learn how to trust your instincts to get from one moment to the next. You can't really second-guess yourself. That's the only thing I'm interested in—just flowing with it. Not worrying about what I just did because that's going to confuse what I'm doing next.

In music, that goes over very nicely. I love to hear music that just feels good; there are, like, cosmic messages that come through music like that. You hear that and you're like, "Alright, it's OK to be who I am." I definitely strive for that in everything I'm doing. Just relaxing and letting what's really supposed to be happening happen.

It's hard, because I don't feel like I've necessarily found all the answers—which I state very blatantly on the record—but it's also that I'm challenging each moment. I'm really trying hard not to be afraid. I don't necessarily pass everyday with flying colors, but I do my best and pretty much everyone in the band does as well.

You have a richly textured sound on the album. Is this representative of your live shows as well?

It actually has a lot to do with who we are, because of the parts we write. The three of us each play keyboards, especially Adam, who has been playing since he was like three years old. We put a lot of keyboards on the album. It was just inevitable that we all heard something to put down... different samples, different sounds. Live, we've hired a keyboard player to keep up with those sounds. It was too difficult for us to do it as a three-piece. We're still kind of working on the live show. Because we come from a roots/groove background and it's kind of hard to just play the songs. It'd be fun to stretch some stuff out.

You worked with Natalie Merchant on her "Tiger Lily" album.

She's an amazing person. I love her lyrics. She lives a

very simple lifestyle. She does what she believes in. She's very down-to-earth. It was an interesting combination, the two of us. We didn't necessarily get along very well, but I believe we had a profound respect for each other. She would say, "Can you rone that down a bit." It taught me a great deal about a "relaxed" pace.

Does this record mirror what was going on in your life when you were recording it?

The intensity level of these songs differs very greatly and that's something that was necessary because, at that time in our lives, everything was crazy. One day everything was really high and the next day things were just nuts. It's a very honest record; it reflects exactly what was going on. I listen to that record and it's like, "Yup, that was London, '97-98."

Isn't it amazing how music can bring back memories, good and bad?

Painful, painful! Isn't it funny when you're breaking up with somebody and it's a relationship that was very emotional and you're really feeling it? You're driving on the road, turn on the radio and it's like some cheesy guy who you know is faking it. who has nothing to do with real music. And he's singing this stupid song about love and you just start to sob. And, you're like, "I'm so glad no one else is here because I'm terribly embarrassed."

Does the "perfect" romance exist? It seems like something that is only found in the movies.

I guess you try not to dwell on it too much. What could be as opposed to what is. But definitely always striving for something better.

What are the dynamics in your band? Who wears the pants?

We wear some pretty big pants—we all get in there together and we fight, too. Like, "OK, that's my foot you're stepping on... Hell!!!?" It's crazy. Everybody does different stuff and everyone likes to take the lead. There haven't been definite roles carved out yet. Jason

takes a business standpoint, although I've gotten more involved lately. He tries to organize. I've been trying to set up a team across where we've been touring. I've just been meeting cool people and trying to keep up with them and come up with cool ideas. What we can do to let people know about what we're doing... Just trying to keep everybody psyched. It's hard because you run out of energy all the time. You putter out and hope that somebody can take over for awhile.


We all have a hard time relinquishing the direction if we think that what we're doing is really great. But we have to. We know, instinctually, to give whoever is really going strong the reigns and it works pretty well. You think about life being a series of ups and downs. You think of it also being friction, tension and release. The best music is all about that to me. Your life is a direct mirror of your music. We argue a lot and we make up a lot.

Nellee Hooper is from the world of trip-hop and electronica. It must have been a bit different to work with him.

He was really interesting. It was tun, but hard to work with someone more spontaneous than we are. It ended up being a lot of fun. There was tension and a lot of stuff to deal with. But, all in all, it was a learning experience. I listen to the record and it's exactly what our relationship is. We're a rock band and here was this triphop electronica guy and I was just really proud that he decided to go in the direction he did. For him to take a step and do something that he and none of his counterparts have done before. He's a great person.

So give us the real scoop on the name Furslide.

le's kind of the same thing. The idea of friction and release and I don't want to go so far as to say it's anything sexual. It's not necessarily that. As a matter of fact, I didn't even think of that until weeks later. That's the beginning of life. You've got friction and release.

She even enlisted a female from the audience to come onstage for help-to no avail. Suffice to say you had to be there... Remember the name Stephen Simmonds, a future hot prospect from the Priority Records camp... On her sophomore outing, fearless rapper Foxy Brown still has the Ill Na Na—but she's got more to talk about than her prowess in the bedroom. At the ripe old age of 19, she's lived more than most women twice her age. "When people hear this they're gonna say. "That girl went

ripe old age of 19, she's lived more than most women twice her age. "When people hear this, they're gonna say, 'That girl went through a lot at a young age," says the Brooklyn native. They're also gonna say she's still badass. "My Life" finds her in a starkly reflective mood, weighing "the high price for this high-priced life." The insistent guitar loop perfectly matches Foxy's sober litany here, and the wistfully sung refrain is chilling. But the mood lifts considerably for "Hot Spot," a stirring party jam with plenty of erotic content. A parade of guests shows up on "Chyna Doll," too. DMX joins in for "Dog & A Fox," a XXX-rated round of snaps that will have you alternately howling and slackjawed (if you have the "explicit" version of the disc, that is); Mya adds a lovely vocal to "JOB," a weary plaint about no-account males ("I'm a shopaholic with a heavy shoe habit," Foxy warns); Total pops by for the ultra-funky "I Can't"; Jay-Z is Foxy's partner in crime on "Bonnie & Clyde Part 2." There's plenty more, too. like the bangin' "Ride (Down South)," the rock-tinged "BWA" (featuring Mia X, Gangsta Boo and the refrain "I'm a muthafuckin' bitch"). "Chyna Doll" is one dangerous toy.

> > "Everybody in my family played some sort of instrument," remembers keyboardist Daryle

Chinn of his upbringing. "Being the baby, I wanted to be part of the whole family atmosphere." At age six, Chinn picked up a sax left at the familial home by the legendary Cannonball Adderly, and attempted to blow. He broke the reed, but not his desire to find his musical voice. He studied a range of instruments, including guitar, and was still a teen when he worked with organist supreme Jimmy Smith, who gave him his first shot as a composer. He's been turning out seamless smooth jazz ever since, and on "Passion" he's joined by saxophonists Gerald Albright (on "Spanish Lullaby" and "Day Dreaming") and Lincoln Adler as well as vocalist Grace Anderson, pianist Herman Jackson and others. Though comprised mostly of Chinn originals, "Passion" also features glossy takes on Jon B and Babyface's "Someone To Love," the Jimmy Jam-Terry Lewispenned "When I Think Of You" and the Mtume-Lucas tune "The Closer I Get To You." Fans of the genre will find plenty to enjoy here, from the percolating proto-funk of "Hold Me" and the sculpted Latinisms of "Fiesta" and "Baja Pacifica" to the gospelinflected pop of "I'll Be There." Closer "Africa," meanwhile, has a lilting groove and virtuosic, Jean-Luc Ponty-esque violin from Karren Briggs. This is some Chinn music you can actually enjoy.

10 WAYS TO INCREASE TSL: There's an old Top 40 programming precept—"If you can cume 'em, you can keep 'em." Get them in the store first, then get them to stay. Let's look at some ways to get listeners to spend more time with your station: 1.) Increase P1 listening. One of the best ways to do this is by designing music research

screens with 100% of your station's cume and a high percentage of P1 listeners (60-65%, since P1s generally contribute two-thirds or more of TSL). Reinforce the music brand by using the station name in connection with the music—"Star Music," "Kiss Artist," etc. Private concerts and "fly aways" with core artists are another way to brand the music and help increase P1 TSL and cume-to-core conversion. A memorable morning show is one of the best ways to increase P1 listening. Many stations are successfully creating personality benchmarks in other dayparts as well... 2.) Increase at-work listening. It is very much a 6AM-7PM game for Adult-targeted stations. Top 40 can also garner more at-work usage because most atwork listening is passive in nature. Come up with an at-work position that associates your station with the workplace such as "Kiss At-Work" or "The At-Work Mix." Direct marketing and nest marketing to the workplace can be effective. Music benchmarks such as an "All Request Lunch Hour," or "You Pick The Mix" are effective TSL generators... 3.) Advertise on television. Contrary to conventional industry belief, TV is more likely to increase TSL than curne, according to Arbitron expert David Lebow. Seeing the station advertised on TV aids recall and causes more listening occasions, which generates TSL... 4.) Maintain a very short music list. Curiously, TSL increases with short lists... 5.) Make appointments with listeners on promotions and music benchmarks. A lot of TSL today is created by increasing the number of listening occasions... 6.) Develop a station vibe that projects high entertainment value and passion. A great morning show is the most effective way to build brand depth and bond with listeners. Other "vibe" elements are creative, fun and topical promotions and entertaining production that connects emotionally. Involve your station in local lifestyle priorities and community needs... 7.) Balance vertical and horizontal music. Vertical songs (exclusive songs to your station) help distinguish your station musically, but they must be carefully programmed. Maintain familiarity and comfort for cume listeners... 8.) Be more effective at maintaining listeners through each quarterhour and recycling them to other hours. TV has this idea down to a science. They consistently and creatively billboard and tease viewers to keep them tuned in... 9.) Maintain music variety regardless of record label cycles. Resist the temptation to get sucked into playing too much of any one style... 10.) Make song-to-song flow a major daily priority. There is an art and science to flow; balance style, song strength, tempo, era and mood.


