

Government To Probe Media For Smoking Gun

In response to the Columbine High School massacre and growing pressure from numerous sources—notably his Republican rivals—**President Clinton** announced on Tuesday (1) that he'd ordered a \$1 million study to be undertaken jointly by the FTC and the Justice Department—of how the entertainment industry markets violence to children.

The investigation, which is expected to take as long as 18

Atlantic Loves Lava, Flom


Jason Flom celebrated 20 years with Atlantic Records by signing a new, long-term contract to continue as President of the four-year-old Lava label and Senior Vice President of Atlantic, it was announced by Atlantic Group Co-Chairman/Co-CEO Val Azzoli after losing a putting contest with the veteran label exec.

Commented Azzoli: "From the day nearly 20 years ago when he started putting up AC/DC posters in record stores, Jason's career has been driven by a true fan's passion for music. One of the most naturally gifted A&R executives in the 51-year history of Atlantic, he has been responsible for not only identifying and signing a remarkable string of chart-topping artists, but also for bringing a rich diversity of music to the company. And I'm not letting him leave until I whip him at golf."

Added Flom: "My goal is to continue to build Lava into a brand name which represents

quality music from a select roster of great artists and get my handicap down to zero."

Flom began his career as a trainee field merchandiser at Atlantic before signing his first Gold act, Zebra, to the label. He proceeded to ink such million-selling bands as Twisted Sister, Skid Row, White Lion and Tori Amos before being named VP A&R, then Sr. VP for the label. Other signings

under his leadership include Clannad, Stone Temple Pilots, All-4-One and Donna Lewis.

Lava, established in March '95, has produced such artists as Sugar Ray, Edwin McCain, the Corrs, Trans-Siberian Orchestra, Davíd Garza, Jon Brion and his latest success story, Kid Rock.

His extra-musical ventures include serving on the Board of Families Against Mandatory Minimums (F.A.M.M.). Flom and filmmaker Martin Scorsese will be honored at the ACLU's Torch of Liberty Awards event July 12, 1999.

D.E.N. Gets G.A.S.

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Vowing to integrate sweeping new concepts into the process of music distribution—all while keeping an eye peeled on their bulging stock portfolios—G.A.S. Entertainment principals Gary Gersh and John Silva announced they have joined interactive multimedia startup Digital Entertainment Network to launch den. music group.

Gersh and Silva will be Co-Presidents of the new subsidiary and will serve as Directors on the Digital Entertainment Network board.

Gersh and Silva will be responsible for keeping DEN's burgeoning slate of globally distributed cybertelevision musically fed. The company creates highly interactive niche programming which enables users to isolate and purchase items such as music, clothes and accessories on demand.

In addition, the duo will

sign and develop artists for distribution over the Internet. Gersh and Silva told HITS a traditional brick & mortar deal will also be cut. "A traditional brick & mortar deal will also be cut," they said in their newly acquired cybergeneration whine.

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Among the immediate "key initiatives" to be undertaken by Gersh and Silva are:

■ Straight 50/50% partnerships with artists.

■ Shorter-term artist deals, "enabling artists to pursue new and emerging career opportunities."



"Our stance on rock is bullish," insists Columbia Records GM/Executive VP Will Botwin, thinking he was talking to Spin. "We believe in it as part of the mix. Our success in other areas allows us to stay focused, be patient and aggressive, and we're taking advantage of that now."

Aside from the highly visible success of standard bearers like Aerosmith and The Offspring, the label is now starting to break Lo Fidelity Allstars, while continuing to make strides on new groups like Train, System of A Down, Splender and Tal Bachman.

Lo Fidelity Allstars' "Battle-Flag" started at Post Modern and

is now crossing to Active Rock, with the album going over 10,000 in OTC sales for the first time last week. The group came from U.K. label Skin Records.

"We went out ALLSTARS and found an audi-

ence for them early on, market by market," says Columbia Records Sr. VP Marketing Tom Corson, who points to press coverage and a dynamic video as key elements of the campaign. "Even if we're selling only 1,000 copies a week, we want to stay in the game long enough so that when we do turn the corner on the more massmedia outlets like radio and MTV, it sticks."

The label is trying a similar approach with Train, who were signed over a year ago, and have been steadily touring since then. Columbia put out the band's selftitled debut on Aware Records through sister distributor RED and is now seeing growth in markets such as Birmingham, Columbia, SC and Houston.

"We've had the opportunity to take a long-term, grass-roots approach," said Columbia Records Group Executive VP John Ingrassia when we called to ask

him if he wanted to renew his Billboard subscription. "Our tour marketing staff works closely to make the most out of each local opportunity."

Thrash-rockers System of a Down, whose album has already sold more than 100,000 copies thanks to non-stop touring, are another band being nurtured by the label. The L.A.-based rockers will be playing the main stage at Ozfest this summer.

"With System of a Down, we went to lifestyle accounts, getting music and posters to places like hair salons and hip boutiques," says Columbia Sr. VP Sales Tom Donnarumma, who

Also on tap is the third album this Fall from Toronto-based rockers Our Lady Peace, a band Columbia has seen go from 80,000 sold of their RED-distributed debut to 700,000 for the follow-up, "Clumsy."

"We're poised to go multiplatinum this time," says Columbia Records Group Sr. VP Promotion Jerry Blair of Our Lady Peace after giving us his drycleaning to do. "Now that they're positioned correctly, if they have the right radio song, things could blow up."

Concludes Botwin: "We're taking the long-term view. Groups like Train and System of a Down are examples of our dedication."

Added Columbia Sr. VP Media/Strategic Marketing Larry Jenkins: "When can I tell Donnie this is running in Billboard?"





The idea is for DEN, which is breaking ground in multimedia by bringing interactive television-type content to the Web, to integrate Gersh and Silva's content into DEN programs, through which albums will be available for sale, as well as shoes, backpacks, skateboards, loaves of bread, etc... The second major Net development has downloadable music seller EMusic.com (né Goodnoise) not only trumpeting its name change, but announcing that venerated Geffen icon Ed Rosenblatt has resurfaced to join the company's board of directors. Said EMusic chairman Bob Kohn, "EMusic.com is focused on pioneering a shift in the way consumers access and experience their music. Eddie's vast knowledge of the economics and complexities of the music industry will be extremely valuable as we continue to grow the market for downloadable music." Couldn't hurt that stock price, either, eh? EMusic also announced an exclusive license agreement with King Biscuit Entertainment under which dozens of live "Flower Hour" recordings will be made available as MP3 files for download to aciddamaged, computer-illiterate hippie has-beens.

Dialing Up For Dollars

n a move to get its big ol' stinky cyberfoot in the bustling Internet music door, overgrown 'Net portal America Online has announced that it has purchased netcaster Spinner Networks Inc. and MP3 software developer Nullsoft Inc. for \$400 million in stock. Spinner's online jukebox attracts about 1.5 million listeners a month, while Nullsoft is the maker of the popular Winamp MP3 player and SHOUTcast MP3 streaming program. MP3 listeners can now expect to be logged off their players without warning. Meanwhile: ARTISTdirect, Inc., creator of official online "stores" for artists such as the Rolling Stones, Beastie Boys and Beck and pro-

prietor of the Ultimate Band List (www.ubl.com), has scored \$15 million in financing from various venture capital concerns. ■ Internet portal Lycos, Inc. has partnered with TCI Music subsidiary DMX, a 24/7 cable/satellite music provider, in a multiyear deal to transmit DMX content over Lycos Web sites. In exchange for content, Lycos will promote the DMX brand.

■ Launch Media, Inc. has announced its first-quarter results, posting net revenues of \$2.4 million, up 85% from \$1.3 million the year before. Net loss for the quarter rose to \$6.7 million, or \$0.79 a share, compared to \$5.4 million, or \$1.00 per share, for the year-before period.

SDMI Ready To Pull Trigger

espite claims by the digital rights activists of the Electronic Frontier Foundation (www.eff.com) that the RIAA "seems to be attempting to abolish or obsolete all open formats," the major label-supported SDMI is preparing to announce the finalization of its framework for portable digital download players on June 30. According to the RIAA's Susan Lewis, the so-called "trigger" to be incorporated into SDMI portables won't lock out users' existing music libraries once triggered by "Phase 2" SDMI-com-

pliant music; they will simply refuse to play new content until users upgrade their software, after which they will play everything but newly-pirated content. Also: ■ The RIAA has named Karen Allen the association's Internet Music Evangelist. Allen will go door to door on a bicycle and thump bibles.

■ Even as the SDMI gets it together, the second-annual MP3 Summit is set to take place in San Diego on June 15-16. The forum is sponsored by soonto-go-public MP3 agitator MP3.com...

Peppers, Leppard Set to Stream

n June 4th, Warner Bros.' **Red Hot Chili Peppers** and Island/Def Jam's Def Leppard will make their new albums available in their entirety for streaming in the RealAudio format on the Web on June 4, prior to their official June 8 release date. To listen to the albums, users will need RealNetworks' free RealPlayer G2, available at www.real.com. Some insiders say that the use of the pioneering but scratchy RealAudio format will whet the whistle of fans and make them eager to hear the new music in a higher fidelity format. Meanwhile:

■ In a press release we needed to read aloud to ourselves slowly, InterTrust Technologies Corp. announced shipment of its third commercial release of Meta-Trust Utility, Commerce 1.2 to its MetaTrust partners. We think this means InterTrust has made updates to its security and rights-management technology, which includes flexible payment methods, enhanced risk management and fraud protection. But we got a headache and stopped reading.

And in a move that has both the music and technology communities saying, "Uh, what?" Al Teller's AtomicPop announced it will release the new Public Enemy record, "There's A Poison Going On," on Zip disc for \$16.98. The Zip disks use Iomega's Record/Play technology in conjunction with Liquid Audio for lomega and cannot be copied or distributed, making them just like a CD except you also need a Zip drive and you can't make copies. Said P.E. leader Chuck D: "Technology beats technology every time, and 'Poison's' the whooping stick in this matter. The fact that the album is on a Zip disk is mind boggling." We couldn't agree more.





THE NOSE & FOREHEAD KNOWS: Hope you enjoyed quest weasel columnist David Adelson's State of the A&R Union piece last week as much as we did. The fact that the already-difficult job of finding and developing talent for a major label has become compounded by the use of quarterly numbers to determine if departments are on point is a grim reality. The band will also get the red-carpet rollout at Reprise, Capitol, EMI Music (which has already made an offer) and Warner/Chappell. Next week, Riley and the band return to NYC for meetings with Atlantic and Island/Def Jam and to huddle with attorney Peter Lewit. Heavy management derby also in progress now... Jeff McCluskey has huge action with River, a British band on Instinctive. Lots of radio play and heavy turnouts for recent shows mean this one will get nutty... Big ups to Tim Devine, as Columbia and Foodchain team



BACKSTREET'S BACK - ALRIGHT!

An exclusive HITS dialogue with the Backstreet Boys' Kevin Richardson BY GARY GRAFF

hat flurry of shrill, histrionic screams filling the air these days are coming from record stores as a legion of adolescent girls pick up their copies of the Backstreet Boys' new album, "Millennium" (Jive/BMG). A big deal? How about the biggest pop culture story this side of "The Phantom Menace"? One chain-store exec in Detroit said, "I thought Ricky Martin was exciting, but this is bigger. This is huge." At presstime, it looked like the album would sail way over one million, breaking Garth Brooks' record along the way. And it better be. The Boys' self-titled '97 effort sold 27 million copies worldwide, launched a slew of hits ("Quit Playing Games (With My Heart)," "As Long As You Love Me," "Everybody (Backstreet's Back)" and made the quintet—Nick Carter, Howie Dorough, Brian "B Rok" Littrell, A. J. McLean and Kevin Richardson— the biggest stars in Orlando since Shaq split for the left coast. It also made the world safe again for boy bands and *Tiger Beat* subscribers.

In short, a whole industry depends on "Millennium" being a hit. But the new album also comes on the heels of a year's worth of tsuris for our heroes, including several family deaths, open-heart surgery for group member Brian Littrell and a nasty lawsuit to extricate the band from Louis Pearlman, the Orlando impressario who put it together. But so far all signs are in the Boys' favor; the album is blowing out of stores, and the first single, "I Want It That Way," is scoring huge radio adds. The Boys have engaged in a major media blast that's run from "Saturday Night Live" to Nickelodeon, Rosie to Leno and has even included a tongue-in-cheek he-man ad campaign. The Boys kick off the "Millennium" world tour in Europe and are slated to hit North America in September. A long voyage must begin with the first step, as BBoy Kevin Richardson finds out after tripping over HITS' Motor City Bad Boy Gary "Detroit Pissed On" Graff.

What did the group set out to accomplish on this album?

Just that we've learned and grown a lot. We were just trying to make good music that not only we loved to sing and perform but that our fans would like. We feel like this album's deeper lyrically, but it's not over our fans' heads. We're just trying to evolve with the times in order to stay in the pop music scene. We're just trying to keep evolving just like Madonna, Janet and Michael have done—so we have a long career.

How much of that is related to the actual sounds used in the songs?

The melodies, the basic songs themselves, are very catchy. No matter what year it is, a great, catchy melody has to be the main skeleton of your song. As far as evolving, it's the sounds you use—the snare, the kicks, the pads you put underneath. It's a challenge for Max Martin, whom we've been working with for the past three albums. Some of the sounds we put on are very eclectic. The overall feel is very big.

What kind of pressure did you feel in making the new album after the great success of "Backstreet Boys"?

We've set ourselves up for a sophomore slump by selling ten million in the U.S. on a debut album. Actually, we've already made it through our sophomore slump everywhere else because this will be our third album around the world, but only our second album here. We put the pressure on ourselves to make better music. We're not really looking at the sales. If you make good music and keep trying to outdo your last album as far as quality, the sales will come.

Do you feel the group has something to prove to people?

Something I came to realize in the past year—which initially bothered me, but now I've come to accept—is the fact you just can't please everybody. Everyone is not gonna like us or our music. There are going to be some people who absolutely hate us or love us. Or make fun of us. That's fine; it's kinda like if you see yourselves in a tabloid, then you've approached a level of success that people know who you are.

The first single, "I Want It That Way," seems to have picked up where you guys left off.

It's #1 in, like, seven countries right now. I think that's a really good sign. And I'm not bragging. I'm just saying it's kind of like, "Whew! That's a weight lifted off our shoulders. They're still responding." It was great to be overseas a few weeks ago to promote the single and do TV shows like "Top of the Pops" in London, with a live studio audience. The first time we did the song, even though they had never heard it before, they were singing it with us. That was a great sign.

How did that song get chosen to be the first single?

It's a nice bridge between the two albums. It's the most reminiscent of the last album. It's not like "Don't Want You Back," which is kind of a little edgier and different. So this is a good way to jump into the new album, and we'll bring the newer-sounding stuff later, when people have had a chance to hear the whole thing.

What's your feeling about all the groups that followed in your wake—NSYNC, 98 Degrees, C-Note? You guys really spearheaded a movement.

It's flattering that we've kinda launched this whole new genre of music. At the same time, it lets the public know just how record companies think. As soon as one label gets

The main thing for us is we just want people to know that everything they hear on the album is real. It's us singing. It's our voices. It's us coming up with the treatments for our videos and the ideas for our tours, putting it together. We're not guys who are told what to do or where to be.

It's not like the critics can affect sales or anything like that.

Critics are critics. You can't let things like that bother you. It's frustrating, but what can you do? We think the album has beautiful melodies and beautiful songs on it. We're not trying to be, like, the Joni Mitchell or Jimi Hendrix of our time. We're just trying to make good music that makes people happy and forget about their problems. We're not trying to send a message.

Were you more involved production-wise on "Millennium" than previous albums? Definitely. We want to get involved and write even more. But at the same time, we realize it's a growing process; we don't want to just jump into it and say, "OK, we're going to write this whole album ourselves." We're learned a great deal from the producers we've been working with over the past three, four, five years we've been recording. We felt we had some songs that were definitely of the caliber to be included on our album. But as a group, with our record label, we worked together and picked the songs out. Howle wrote a couple of songs. A.J. wrote some. And from the songs we'd all written,

the songs Brian wrote and the song I wrote were of the caliber that they deserved to be

something that's successful, others want something just like it. They're finding and creating groups just like us—which is kinda frustrating but, at the same time, it's flattering. As long as everybody's making good music, it's all good.

Do you feel a rivalry with any of those groups?

A lot of stuff's been created in the press between us and NSYNC, that we're rivals who are fighting and competing with one another. But most of that is media hype. The conflicts we've had with management... that was the main thing. We don't have anything against those guys personally. We think they're good guys. We think they're good singers. It was just the conflict with our management keeping the fact from us that they were involved with NSYNC, too. That kinda surprised us. We thought it was a conflict to have two of the same thing. That frustrated us, and it hurt us.

As far as our feelings towards the other groups, personally, we have nothing against them; they're pursuing their dreams like we're trying to pursue ours. We're just concerned about what we're doing, not everybody else.

What's the status of your lawsuit against Lou Pearlman?

Over and done with. Basically, the deals we had weren't what they should have been. We realize as artists, when you first sign a deal, either with management or a label, you don't get the best deal in the world because you're a newcomer and have to prove yourself. We've long since proved ourselves to our management and our record label. Our management, when we wanted to go back in and talk about numbers, control and

things, they were like, "Yeah, yeah, yeah. We'll get to it." Two, three years go by, and still they don't get to it. We're out there touring the whole time; we don't want want our career to suffer because of business issues. Finally, in order to be taken seriously, we had to take legal action. We didn't want to do that. We had to stand up and make a stand so things would be fair.

So you're happy with the settlement?

In negotiations, each side has to sacrifice a little bit. If everybody walks away totally happy, then something's not right; at least that's the wisdom that's been given to me by our new management. Now, things are the way they need to be. Now, we no longer have any involvement with Pearlman and [Johnny] Wright. We've moved on.

What's your perspective on the kind of success you've had?

Next to "Titanic," the biggest-selling album of the year, which is incredible. We were nominated for a Grammy, which is incredible. We won two *Billboard* awards, which is incredible. We performed on the American Music Awards and lost to Aerosmith, which is incredible; it's great to lose to Aerosmith. So a lot of great things were happening for us. But internally, Brlan went through heart surgery. Me and Brian lost our grandfathers. Howie lost his sister. We were going through legal battles that, mentally, just drained us. We were approaching the burn-out point. It was probably the hardest year of my 27 years on this planet.

You also had to move out of your house, didn't you?

I haven't moved yet, but I've realized I'm gonna need to move. I'll be sitting in the house and it looks like there's lightning outside, and it's actually light bulbs from people taking pictures of the house. I've had paparazzi in my backyard, people leaving things on the doorstop. It hasn't been too bad, but at the same time, I don't feel like I have any privacy. I'm a country boy, anyway; I grew up on a farm. So I'm gonna find me some acreage, a spot by myself out in the middle of nowhere.


Do you have a favorite road anecdote about fans trying to get to you?

When we went to Argentina, we were driving from the airport to our hotel, and we had three girls piled up on a moped going down the interstate, like, four lanes of traffic. We had girls hanging out of taxi cabs with their cameras, people swerving around all over the place. I've never seen anything like it; I thought somebody was going to get killed. That scared all of us; we were like, "Oh my God." We couldn't believe it. Then, when we got to the hotel, there were 7,000 people outside. And we were like, "Is Michael Jackson out here on tour, staying at the same hotel."

Any good parts of stardom?

I'll give you a perfect example. The other night we did a satellite radio broadcast all over the United States. Before we did that, we had a little girl come in from the Make a Wish Foundation. She said she was going to come in dressed as a little princess because she thought we were her princes. She was adorable, and she has a terminal disease. It breaks your heart; I lost my father to cancer. So it's moments like that which make you thankful you can make somebody happy and forget about their problems, if only for a moment.

I enjoy creating in the studio, too. I enjoyed writing; I wrote a track, "Back To Your Heart," for the album, played on it, co-produced it with Steve Lipson, a great producer who's worked with Annie Lennox. And getting to work with Shania, Elton... The bad part is the business, but that comes with it. You can't do one without the other, but



now that we have the business stuff set, I think it's gonna be a great year. Talk about the song you co-wrote.

I wrote it with Gary Baker, who wrote "I Swear," a huge, Grammy Award-winning song. He wrote a couple of songs on our last album, and I wanted to write with him because I liked his personality. He grew up in the country like me, and he's actually a country songwriter. I liked the vibe I got from him. So I went to his home, stayed with him for a week and wrote two or three songs, and "Back To Your Heart" was one of them. I just sat down at the piano and played this little hook I had. He was like, "Wow, play that again," and within two hours, we had a song. It's a song from a real personal perspective for me, about a guy who thinks the grass is greener on the other side, but finds out that it's not. A guy who finally realizes what he has. It can be about a lot of things—the business, a relationship, a love life. There needs to be a balance.

What are the tour plans?

Actually, I just got out of a fitting, trying on all the different outfits for the tour. Being that the album is titled "Millennium," we're going to make the show on a futuristic tip. The tour is called "Into the Millennium," and I think people are going to be really shocked when they see it. It's like a journey; when you walk into the arena, it's going to be like a whole atmosphere. I feel like we're going to take people somewhere. We're trying to take it as far as we can; we're in a position now where we have the ability to put together and come up with some creative ideas.

I don't want to give away too much, but we're going to be performing in the round, which will be really challenging. The stage is a pentagon, a five-sided stage. In the round, there's really no place to hide, so it's going to be challenging to do quick changes and choreography. Also, we're going to use in-ear monitors. We used regular stage monitors on our last tour, and we could hardly hear them, so the in-ear monitors will definitely help.•





TIME FOR A HATCHET JOB WITH THE CRANBERRIES BY SHARON STEINBACH

Why has there been such a long time since your last record? Dolores O'Riordan: When we came off the road, it was an adjustment period for everybody. It was like going cold turkey. It was wonderful, but it did take awhile to fill the day, learn how to relax, to cook and do your own laundry. It's like you're on a rollercoaster. We all got away and took vacations. We wanted to be just regular people. It was nice to sit at home and watch MTV.

Fergal Lawler: After the last tour, we were really stressed-out. We needed a break. We cancelled the last tour. No one was enjoying it anymore. But after awhile off, we started missing each other. We started getting bored and said let's go back rehearsing again. That excitement was back.

Have the changes in your personal lives such as Dolores' baby and band-member marriages changed the music?

Dolores: It's happier now. You get to a point in your life where you go through things, and for a long time there's a lot of strain just being in the band and having to work so hard to get somewhere. Then you get to point where you begin to enjoy your life. The break was really good for us.

Fergal: We're all a lot older now, and we're all kind of more relaxed. We don't get as stressed-out.

Your songs are a lot about relationships and the feelings attached to them.

Dolores: I think this album is not as personal; it's more about other people's experiences. It's a little more mature. I guess there's more life behind it.

Is there a method to the songwriting?

Noel Hogan: For me, it's a chord I try to put together. You just know when you're in the right mood. You can just be sitting at home with the guitar. It's not like you walk down the street, and go, "Eureka, I've got it!" I think Dolores works the same way; she's at home just messing around. I guess because we all listen to different things, everyone brings that in and it blends nicely. If just one of us left, it would be completely different; you couldn't really bring someone else in. It's just a family at this point. **Fergal**: That's what makes us the Cranberries; we've got a bit of everyone's personality.

What was the motivation behind the song about child abuse?

Dolores: After having my son, I suddenly wondered, how could anyone try to hurt a child? It really ruins their life. Like Sinead O'Connor is so tal-

After a three-year hiatus, Limerick, Ireland's Cranberries return with their fourth album, "Bury The Hatchet" (Island).

The band took some time off to recover from the exhaustion caused by constant touring, and to take care of their personal lives.
 Lead singer Dolores O'Riordan gave birth to a baby boy 18 months ago, while bassist Mike Hogan and drummer Fergal Lawler tied the knot with their respective longtime girlfriends.

 With their 1993 debut, "Everybody's Doing It So Why Can't We," the Cranberries' success shot up rapidly with such hits as "Dreams" and "Linger" helping sales reach over six million units worldwide.
 The next two efforts, "No Need To Argue" and "To The Faithful Departed," sold more than 28 million albums total to date.

■ The 13 new songs on "Bury The Hatchet"—written by O'Riordan and guitarist Noel Hogan, and self-produced with Benedict Fenner [Brian Eno, James, Laurie Anderson]—are filled with sweet, memorable pop melodies mixed with some edgy rock curves.

The first single, "Promises," is a considerably hard-hitting contrast to the tender "Fee Fee Fo" (a song about child abuse) or the delicate closing tune, "Dying In The Sun."

HITS' own honorary Irishwoman Sharon "O" Steinbach lifts a pint with the band, who haven't had this much fun since Mrs. O'Leary's cow kicked over the lamp.

ented, yet she still has dark things from being a kid. A rough childhood makes it so difficult to move on to be an adult. I have a lot of female friends who've had bad experiences. Most girls have one bad experience in their lives when someone decides they're taking control of you. It just shouldn't happen. Particularly to a child. But that's the only real dark song on the album.

How important are politics in your music?

Dolores: We've consciously steered clear of that. "Zombie" was written from a completely humanitarian standpoint; it was not a political situation. I wrote the song because it happened that a child was killed. That was my motivation to write the song. It was really sad. People might have thought we were a political band or something, and it's fine, but we've shied away from those kinds of things because I don't think we should be recognized as that.

How has the Seagram/PolyGram merger affected the band?

Fergal: We met the new people from here. Now that the dust has cleared, they all seem very focused. It's better that we didn't release our album at that time. I'm sure it would have affected us if we did.

Is there anything you don't like about being in the music business? Dolores: The annoying thing is that it's very much an all-or-nothing career, which is very difficult. You can't go to work from 9-5 like a regular person. You have to go to work and live work for a few weeks, and leave your home and go places. It's not very stable and it's not a great balance as a job goes. It's very difficult to live your life in a normal way. But at the same time, it's got the attraction.

What's the most fun about playing in a rock band? Dolores: Playing live.

Mike Hogan: Rehearsing a piece of music, when people start jamming around, and then it begins to happen.

Noel: Performing a song live for the first time is great..

ON LABEL AND MANAGEMENT CHANGES:

"We got off the road in the summer of '97 and took a couple of months to put together the songs. By November, we were in pre-production, making the third record for Columbia with the legendary John Kalodner. We finished the record in New York—it was the first time we'd decided to go to a big city and really make a record in a major studio. But we delivered the record and the label didn't quite get it. So we decided to take our tapes and find another label. In the meantime, we remixed, re-cut and wrote some new songs, so it took about another year to get this new record out. Just about the time we started making the record in New York with John, our manager also decided to retire."

ON GOING POP:

"There are still several tracks from the original, early Columbia record. Musically, this is probably the most radio-accessible record we've ever done. It started out that way and it never really veered from that path. It's definitely more radio-accessible than the last two. We were tossing around different titles for the album, but the song title 'New Pop Sunday' seemed, in a good way, to really describe what we were doing. This is Sponge's pop record. Some people may argue that it isn't, but to me, it definitely is. The funny thing is, people have always equated this band with the edgier stuff. But now, some of the edges are smoothed over a bit."

ON THE SINGLE "LIVE HERE WITHOUT YOU":

"An obvious pick. I was kind of making the play to have 'Planet Girls' as the first single—you know, oud guitars and all of this cool screaming. But, who knows? It might be the next one. I also like 'When You're On Fire Baby, Roll.' Or maybe 'Radio Prayer' would be the way to go—that one's a bit more reminiscent of 'Molly.'"

ON HEARING THEIR SONGS ON THE RADIO:

"It's always good to hear it on the radio. You've sat through a thousand mixes of it in the studio, and suddenly it's on the radio and it's just more compressed and sounds so much cooler. I don't know. There's some excitement there still—I'm not that jaded yet."

ON GETTING BACK TO TOURING:

"We've been known to do some serious, non-stop, relentless touring. The fact of the matter is that it took too long to get this new record out. The last time we were on the road was with Iggy Pop and the Reverend Horton Heat in the summer of '97. So it's been a while. But, it's just a matter of getting going again. It's a little rough and edgy for the first couple of shows, but then we get in the groove again and we've got nothing to worry about. It's just auto-pilot. We're going to be out there headlining clubs and it's going to be awesome to see the fans again. When we get out on the road and do what we do, it will just take off."

ON NEW BEGINNINGS:

"The fresh start thing is cool. It's a challenge and you know what? I still don't take it for granted. We can't go out there with the mind-set that we can rest on our laurels. So, you've got to take advantage of it. The only thing I take advantage of is the experience. I'm just looking forward to the challenge of getting back out there and doing it, man."•

TIME TO COME CLEAN WITH SPONGE'S VINNIE DOMBROSKI

THE HISTORY: Motor City fivesome Spongelead singer Vinnie Dombroski, guitarists Mike Cross and Joey Mazzola, bassist Tim Cross and drummer Charlie Grover—took the alternative rock scene by storm with their 1994 Columbia Records debut, "Rotting Piñata." Powered by adrenalized cuts like "Molly (Sixteen Candles)" and "Plowed," the LP reaped commercial rewards and built anticipation for '96's critically acclaimed follow-up, "Wax Ecstatic."

THE NEW ALBUM: Following label and management changes, the band is finally able to bring their third full-length, "New Pop Sunday," to the public on Beyond Records (the new imprint established by the Left Bank Organization). Still showcasing those patented heavy rhythms, layered chunks of hard-hitting riffage and gravel-throated vocal intensity, their irresistible, melodic pop edge is brought into sharper focus, as the LP title attests. Songs like "My Lackluster Love" recall both Richard Butler and David Bowie in one, fell, glitter-rocking swoop, while the piano-laden single, "Live Here Without You," features the band at its most urgently beautiful. They bust out the bluecollar, working-class cock-rock on cuts like "Planet Girls" and "When You're On Fire Baby, Roll." It's new and improved and ready to soak up fans new and old. In fact, the only thing to make Sponge's Vinnie Dombrowski throw in the towel at this point would be the drivel spewed by HITS' own very wet blanket, Alexa Joy "To the World" Sherman, as she lodged the following report.



Reveille (advance) Elektra/EEG

Aggressive, angry rap and blistering metallic sounds meet to form the furious "rap/rock" sound getting so much love right now. These guys are one of Massachusetts' finest exports, right behind rock mavens Staind. Every one of the 5,000 residents in their home-



town could probably hear them practicing in their basement, judging from the sounds on this super-tight, heavy LP. With influences from House Of Pain and Tool to Black Sabbath and Public Enemy, it's no wonder that scorching hot songs like "Flesh And Blood" and the gripping "Dark Horizons" are mind-blowing. Powered by blazing guitars and hard-hitting rhythms reminiscent of Deftones, Korn and Rage A.T.M., they're primed for stardom and very relevant. Consider this your wake-up call. (JB)

Goatsnake "T" Man's Ruin

From the charred pits of remorse and dread comes the mighty Goatsnake—creeping, crawling, slithering and searching through the dark, dank undergrowth of your mind. A completely devastating rhythm section (ex-Obsessed) and the de-tuned, Sabbath-

inspired guitar riffs of ex-Engine Kid Greg Anderson make for some of the heaviest music to ever escape from the whole stoner/doomrock scene. The Pete Stahl [Scream, Wool] vocals say it all with the style and sincerity of a true creative veteran. They're all veterans and the songs reflect that. The Snake is real, so don't turn a cold shoulder. Look him dead-square in the beady eyes and give him a big fat tongue kiss. You'll be better for it. (JS)



LAST GASP: After spending only a few fast days stumbling through the 60,000plus European metal citizens that hiked, packed and trudged their way to Holland's Dynamo Festival, we see clearly that something is dead-wrong with the American metal scene. After witnessing bands like Nile and **Cryptopsy**, who struggle to pack clubs here in the States, play to 8,000–10,000 super-appreciative fans on the SIDE STAGE at Dynamo, we here at *HITS* metalpunkhardcore have realized the age-old truth: if you can't beat 'em, quit. So if you haven't been hooked into this program and wish to be, do so at Hitsatan@aol.com. Otherwise, don't confuse this lack of page-space with a lack of hope. As most of you know, the scene here is getting stronger by the day and with labels like Relapse, Victory, Century Media, NBA, Hydra Head, Equal Vision, Slap A Ham, Necropolis and the rest out there keeping it real, the future continues to be as bright as you want it to be. Slick Rick "The Art of Storytelling" Def Jam

We've seen a number of old schoolers re-enter the music scene with the hopes of recapturing their initial level of success, only to have them

tragically crash and burn. However, rapper Slick Rick proves an exception to the rule. On his latest album, hip-hop's original minstrel remains suave and debonair, all the while showcasing the British-bent poetics for which he's known. Expect an assortment of beats by some of today's top producers, such as Dame Grease and Clark Kent, as well as contributions by the likes of Nas and Raekwon. The mix-show favorite "Street Talkin," featuring Outkast, has Slick Rick delivering his trademark charismatic vocals interspersed with clever staccatos. On "Impress The Kid," he re-works the hook from Van McCoy's '70s anthem "The Hustle," lays down an effective bassline, and ends up with an upbeat '90s hit. Another to consider is "Two Way Street," which is his narrative on the topics of temptation and fidelity. Die-hard fans will be pleased with the last few tracks, where Slick Rick reunites with his partner in rhyme, Doug E. Fresh, for live versions of "La Di Da Di" and "The Show." We could go on and on about the overall greatness of this album, but it suffices to say that Slick Rick made few changes to his original music-making formula. Perhaps others failed as a result of attempting to reinvent themselves and their sound. Slick Rick remains true in both style and content. Few will be disappointed. (Therese Quiambao)

With the ubiquitous use of the word "diva" bandied about, the term has been reduced to its lowest common denominator. It's an all-

too-frequent occurrence to slap "diva" onto every fresh-faced young tart, and too many middle-of-the-road wannabes. The Latin-derived "diva" refers to "a goddess, a prima donna." In more modern terms, it means the finest of vocalists-one who transcends her particular genre of music, whether it be pop, opera, etc. With so many disposable artists out today, how does one cut to the chase and get to the meat of the matter? Get your hands on "Ultimate Divas," an aptly-titled collection. Reference Ella Fitzgerald's "Someone To Watch Over Me," then savor Sarah Vaughn's saucy "Broken Hearted Melody." We are so used to Judy Garland's "Wizard of Oz" rendition of "Somewhere Over The Rainbow" that we may be overwhelmed by the intensity of her early-'60s TV special version, but it's worthy of the disc. Annie Lennox's "Why," Toni Braxton's "Un-Break My Heart," Dionne Warwick's "I'll Never Love This Way Again," Aretha Franklin's stunning "Nessun Dorma" and Whitney Houston's "I Have Nothing" (note Arista's wealth of divas!) bring the listener to the modern world, while this reviewer's all-time fave, Chaka Khan, puts her personal stamp on "My Funny Valentine." There's more on this 18-cut mistresspiece, all satisfying and worthy of "Ultimate Diva" status. (Gary Jackson)


