ombining the best of vintage analog with state-of-the-art digital, Silent Sounds Recording Studios has developed an incredible niche not only as a great recording facility, but a premiere room for overdubs, mixing and particularly vocal recording.

Owner Steve Jacobson has a big heart and as a musician and producer himself, he understands budgets better than most people. With over 20 years of experience, he has earned a reputation for being generous with his rates. Jacobson is also quite proud to have built up a high-profile clientele that has come to appreciate the perfect blend of a warm and cozy vibe and an extremely high-tech, professional environment equipped with some of the finest gear available.

Some of these clients, or, as he likes to call them, "guests," include Billy Gibbons/ZZ Top, Laurence Tolhurst/the Cure, Ice-T, DJ Quik, the late soul greats Rick James, Billy Preston and Ike Turner, George Clinton, Bobby Womack, Bootsy Collins, Leo Sayer, Tiffany, Wu Tang's Killah Priest, Canibus, Oliver Stone and Regency Films, and many others.

Twenty years ago when Jacobson's studio first emerged in its infant stage, his original intention was to build Silent Sounds as a facility for his own projects. He is currently working on a double-album concept record, resembling Pink Floyd and Radiohead tunes, geared towards "raising awareness and spreading love." Jacobson designed and built the studio from the ground up with Jim Morgan, a highly respected engineer/producer/ room designer (who also teaches at Musicians Institute).

Starting with a 16-track recorder, Jacobson first opened the facility, located on Melrose Avenue in the trendy heart of West Hollywood, to the public as a way to make money to pay off some of the equipment. The ongoing success of Silent Sounds has allowed him to continually add to a large arsenal of equipment from top manufacturers.

Currently, Silent Sounds boasts having both a Pro Tools HD3 (with Apogee converters and tons of plug ins), and a 2", 24-track analog tape machine. Jacobson is also proud to offer a world-class selection of some of the finest gear available, including his favorite microphone, a fantastic U-47 Tube which is a vocalist's dream. The facility also has numerous other top-of-the-line mics (Neumann, AKG, Senheiser, Soundeluxe, Shure, Rode etc.). It also has some of the best pre-amps, compresssors, and EQs available (Manley, GML, Avalon, etc.), as well as a perfectly tuned room with a fantastic sounding monitor system, a full MIDI setup, an amazing sounding live room for drums etc, and topnotch engineers.

"When you open a smaller studio," Jacobson adds, "you know you're not going to be the Record Plant in every way, but you can totally be on that par by choosing specialties. For example, I challenge any world-class studio to say that they get a better sounding vocal recording than we do in our vibey vocal room with what I call 'our famous \$20,000 vocal chain' (U-47 Tube microphone, GML Mic pre, Manley Variable MU Tube compressor, Avalon EQ, Mogami cabling, directly to 24-track 2" analog tape, converted at 192 Khz thru

Apogee converters). Jacobson loves having his own dream studio where he can record his music with the best tools while sharing the wealth with others. "It's really an amazing place," he says proudly. "I cannot tell you how many people have commented that they're amazed at the magic they achieve when they come here and they won't go anywhere else. The reason Silent Sounds is such a unique gem is because every single purchase and every decision that I have ever made regarding this facility has been made from my heart and soul."

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

or L.A. singer/songwriter Jeff Austin Black the road to releasing a debut album was a lengthy one. Releasing one album's worth of material on his own, and eventually going on to release an EP through a joint venture with Safeway Inc. and the Prostate Cancer Foundation, Black generated enough buzz to warrant the interest of various labels, including his current home, Rainman Inc.

The songwriter kicked off his solo career with a full-length called Criminal. Making it available through his website and at live shows, Black was eventually able to place one of his songs on the TV show, CSI: Miami. The singer garnered label interest and went on to sign with Takes The Biscuit Records out of New York, But after a year of waiting for a proper full-length to be released by the label, Black lost his patience. "I thought the record was going to die and the label didn't have any money left."

It was at this point that the head of the Prostate Cancer Foundation, Michael Milken, approached Black about a possible deal with the supermarket chain, Safeway Inc. The enthused artist agreed to record a three-song EP for the foundation, which was played and sold at Safeway stores nationwide. Black ended up selling 100,000 copies of the EP and generated a bit of a buzz. "I wasn't sure the record I had made was ever going to see the light of day, so I just thought it would be better to be heard than not at all. Plus, it was for a good cause. And Safeway Inc. was willing to pay for the distribution, so it made sense."

Shortly thereafter, Black's manager set up a meeting with Rainman Inc., who were highly interested in the Angelino's material. Based on past experiences with the industry, Black was mutually interested in signing on with an independent label. "You have to generate a buzz and keep momentum going. Luckily, we hooked up with Rainman, and the relationship's been great so far."

Jeff Austin Black's label debut, Human, is in stores now.

rought to Nashville at the tender age of 15 by a producer, Katy Perry would rather not name, she began songwriting for others. Since this was one of Perry's earliest exposures to "secular music," she had no reference points, which meant that her writing perspective was untainted.

"I went home one night and was watching VH1 with my mom, I saw Glen Ballard talking about Alanis Morissette. The next day I came into the office where I work on clearing submissions for Taxi and said, "I want to work with Glen Ballard!"


Phone caffs were made and a meeting was eventually set up with Ballard in Los Angeles. Perry's dad drove. "I made him wait in the car because sometimes when you're young, you feel your parents are going to ruin everything," says Perry. "Glen was between sessions so I pulled out my guitar and played him a song. He played cool, but then I got the call that said, "I've been looking for you."

Ballard brought Perry to Los Angeles which eventually led to her recording a couple of songs with The Matrix for an unreleased proiect. Eventually, a label deal was signed, but not to Capitol. It doesn't matter which, since the people who signed Perry were laid off. Freed of those ties, Perry's demo eventually found its way into the hands of Jason Flom, chairman and CEO for Virgin Records. Flom came down to see Perry perform at the Viper Room. He flipped out and signed her.

I was listening to a song at work and I got a call from a 212 number," she says of the fateful call from Flom. He said, 'I love you! You're the best!' He tells me that all the time. It's nice when a chairman is your biggest fan."

Perry's debut for Capitol Records will be released this year.

ichael St. Germain leads a charmed life. How so? Well, St. Germain was signed — the first time — after playing only six gigs with his new band Crash Radio. Thereafter, his A&R rep, Freddy Cameron, did exactly what all artists hope their A&R peeps would do and stuck by his artist through good times and bad.

It all began when Cameron, an A&R rep for Matt Serletic's Melisma Productions/Arista, was invited to see an act perform at The Gig Hollywood. "They sucked," Cameron recalls. As he was leaving he noticed a line of a hundred or so people waiting to get into the club. "It intrigued me," he notes, "but I was tired and wanted to go home."

Nonetheless, in his car he had second thoughts and went back. "I thought I'd be remiss in my duties if I didn't check out at least one song," he says. He ended up staying for the entire set; but, also noticed other A&R in the club. Afterwards, A&R reps besieged St. Germain. Meanwhile, Cameron quietly slipped his card to the bass player and left. "I was so excited," he enthuses, "that I called my mom and told her I found my dream artist."

The next day Cameron passionately pitched the act to his boss and later arranged a meeting. Serletic signed them immediately. Before anything got going, however, Serletic took the helm of Virgin Records and took the band and Cameron with him. He produced their album about a year later. By then, though, things had changed. St. Germain remembers, "Matt told me, 'I'm responsible to shareholders now." Soon after the label dismissed Serletic and St. Germain was lett in limbo.

That's when Cameron stepped up and stood by St. Germain, while lawyers fought for his freedom, Cameron and St. Germain left Virgin together with the album Serletic produced. By now, a strong bond had been established between the two of them; and they formed Undisputed HiFi to release the album.

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PRODUCER CROSSTALK



David Bottrill

Peter Gabriel, Staind, Silverchair and Tool

Producer, mixer and engineer David Bottrill edged into production with a job at Grant Avenue Studios in Hamilton, Canada. There he worked on a variety of projects and, after a few years, studio owner Daniel Lanois invited him to England to assist on a Peter Gabriel album. Ultimately he was tapped to engineer Gabriel's So and remained to work in England for 19 years. He's now back in Canada and has produced for Staind, Silverchair and Tool. Bottrill's pre-production process is largely about helping artists to become comfortable with their songs without losing the energy of nascent music. 'It's really about nailing the song so it feels comfortable to play," he explains. "You want to keep the spirit of that first recording, but you want to make sure everyone knows where they're going. It's important to get the song feeling good in rehearsal. Then you've got a great canvas to build on."

Clearly, getting good sound is a priority. But in Bottrill's hierarchy there are elements that rank higher. "We can all get great sound, but the greatest sounds in the world don't stand up to a great performance," he explains. "We've all heard those records made way back when — Aretha Franklin, Mahalia Jackson — where the recording wasn't as pristine as today, but the emotions were there. If you get the emotion and spirit right the sounds follow."

There have been times in the studio when Bottrill could sense that there was something wrong with the mood. In those cases when Bottrill wasn't getting the sound he craved, he'd have artists wrap for the night. He found that when they came back the next morning, within two or three takes he'd get the sound he was after. He recalls such a session with Robert Fripp. "We broke at night and came in the next morning," he says. "We turned on, hit record and that was it. We got it in one take." If mood and setting are important, how are they established? Bottrill has a number of strategies. "Sometimes I'll get a PA for artists to play to instead of [listening through] headphones," he says. "Also, I'll get the mix sounding so good in their headphones that it sounds like a record already. If you can get the lines of communication open, that also helps with both speed and performance and I think that's one of a producer's most important functions."

Bottrill has faced a number of challenges in the studio, but has found that in the past the most demanding was helping an artist to maintain his or her focus. What about the future? What's going to become harder for producers? "Trying to do the quality of work that we do without any money," he asserts. "Music is becoming more of a loss-leader. We're trying to create a commercial for a band with really no budget. Over the last few years budgets have dropped and the expectations for output haven't. Some of the bigger projects will still have a budget, but on everything else at least location compromises will have to be made."

Three of the essential things he's learned as a producer are:

- · The importance of melody.
- · Patience.
- · Diplomacy.

"You have to consider the opinions of the artist and the label without trying to please them all," Bottrill notes. "But give everyone their moment to talk. If you show that you listen, everyone feels that they're part of the process."

X-Tempo Designs pok DAW Foot Controller

What is a pok? It's a DAW foot controller that uses wireless USB technology on the 2.4Ghz radio frequency band for hands-free control over your workstation. It makes use of the built-in keyboard shortcut keys that are part of every DAW's software program. pok has eight footswitches and comes with a Pro Tools set of quick keys as default, but the pedal button functions are mappable via the included pok editing software. It's easy to add, remove or reassign any button to any user

preference. Each button can store up to three commands with button eight acting as shift/function key. Up to 22 commands per pok "profile" or con-

figuration are possible.

Running on three AA batteries for months of operation, pok requires no driver installation and supports MAC or PCs running Digital Performer. Logic, Cubase, GarageBand and Ableton Live. pok can be used anywhere in the vicinity of your studio's DAW within 80 feet - like out in the studio so you can record yourself without taking your hands off your guitar or on stage as a way to run your rig while DJing at a live gig. It transmits your commands to a small USB dongle receiver plugged into your computer. Since each pairing of a pok pedal and the receiver dongle creates a new radio link, two or more poks will operate in the same studio on different computers or you can use more than one pok to control the same DAW.

The unit sets up in a second, and as a test I was able to control my Pro Tools rig from two houses away down my street. I found the buttons were easy to tap on and worked reliably every time without any additional delay. The default Pro Tools functions are all I would ever need to do with my feet. pok is a winner with everyone who comes to my Tones4\$ Studios.

pok's case and buttons are made of tough ABS plastic with a clear anodized aluminum or stainless steel faceplate and steel base plate. The switches are made by Alps and pok comes with a set of removable adhesive labels to name each footswitch, pok comes in a graphite or moon rock finish and sells for \$599MSRP complete with carrying case. Marco Beltrami

Boarding the 3:10 To Yuma

he film 3:10 to Yuma is much more than a glorified horse opera. With star turns by Russell Crow and Christian Balé, plus newcomer Ben Foster and a grizzled Peter Fonda, this speltbinding drama redefines the meaning of the word "taunt." Composer Marco Beltrami says that the film called for a specific set of invented sounds. "On a straight ahead orchestral project it's easier; for this film we had to get the instruments, come up with the



palette of sounds and create the sonic template. All of that takes time." Notable among the effects is the tack piano. "In the old days the felt would wear out and they'd put tacks on the hammers," says the composer. "Those tacks give it that honky-tonk sound. We found a 19th Century pump organ on EBay. It's one of the main sounds, the wind going through the bellows has a breathing sound, and also the organ itself, in conjunction with the strings, gives it an out of tune, distinguished sound." Beltrami added jaw harps, acoustic guitars, fiddles, banjos and tin whistles to the mix, plus frame drums, which he notes were played by Native American percussionists a century ago. Prepared piano adds another color. "The first sound in the movie is fishing wire being dragged across the strings of the piano; it gives an insidious resonance that became the sound of the character, Ben Wade, as played by Russell Crow." The more traditional musical elements include the sound of a full orchestra with acoustic guitars driving the rhythm, and a triumphant solo trumpet, evoking a border-crossing southwestern flavor.

Beltrami is no stranger to the genre, having also contributed the score to *The Three Burials of Melquiades Estrada*, directed by Tommy Lee Jones. 3:10 To Yuma director James Mangold — a musically adept auteur noted for his Johnny Cash biopic Walk the Line — had already temped the film with much of Beltrami's previous score. "James is a very smart guy," avows Beltrami. "It was almost like an older way of working with a director. He wasn't about hitting specific things; he wanted to hear different pieces of music. If he liked it he'd say, 'Why don't we try using the music for this particular scene and see how it goes and worry about making it fit to picture later.' It's a refreshing way to work rather than working your way through and trying to shoehorn all of the cuts."

Born in Italy, Beltrami migrated to the U.S. with his family to Long Island, NY, where he began playing piano at age six. At Brown University, his mastery of creating soundscapes with analog synths was balanced with his orchestral interests. After a stint studying in Italy with avant-garde composer Luigi Nono, Beltrami was awarded a scholarship to the Yale School of music. He migrated to California in the early 90's to study at USC with Jerry Goldsmith, the composer who became his mentor. Wes Craven's Scream franchise established Beltrami as a commercial composer. Although he has resisted being categorized as a horror specialist, Hellboy, I, Robot, Terminator 3: Rise of the Machines, The Omen (2006 remake) and Resident Evil — with contributions by Marilyn Manson — are among his big-screen credits.

The influence of Ennio Morricone, the Italian composer famous for his "spaghetti western" music, is an undeniable color in any genre specific film, and Beltrami gives appropriate props to the maestro. "If there is any Morricone reference, it is the way that he would put scores together in classic westerns by taking sounds that aren't traditionally orchestral and using them in a musical way, anything from a ticking clock to voices." For 3:10 To Yuma, Beltrami recorded the chimes of a grandfather clock and reconfigured them as a rhythmic loop.

Next up for Beltrami are scores for In The Electric Mist, directed by Bertrand, and music for Lionsgate's upcoming thriller The Eye starring Jessica Alba. An unqualified critical success, 3:10 to Yuma has gained Beltrami a nomination for the Critics' Choice Awards from the Broadcast Film Critics Association for Best Original Score and the original motion picture soundtrack has been released by Lionsgate.





her grandma's garage. Offered three demos deals, she was passed on by the "Three Big C's": Capitol, CBS and Columbia. While working in a Mailbox Plus



Signed as a songwriter for Peer, she proceeded to get turned down by the likes of Madonna, Taylor Dayne and Sheryl Crow for being "too inside, too personal and too dirty." Peer decided to sell her as a singer/songwriter in her own right. Subject of a subsequent bidding war, one of her songs was picked by the producers of the Jeff Gold-blum film Fathers and Sons.

Signed and then dropped by A&M, this artist continued making demos. One of those ended up in the hands of the infamous Long Gone John of Sympathy For the Record Industry (Hole, the White Stripes, Bad Religion). He liked her demos just as they were, eventually releasing a CD of material as the Chubbies.

Keeping up with the times, Kantzalis put up a site for the band on MySpace, releasing the band's Official Greatest Hits. That's where Wienerschnitzel found her, marking the artist's first placement in a commercial. "The producer of the commercial was looking for independent music for the spots and he just thought 'Play Me' was a perfect fit for the dancing weenie," says Kantzalis.



An on-the-spot deal is against all odds, though you may be able to develop the groundwork for a future one. If you already have a deal in place and want to perform for a specific company to showcase your music, you must book with them many months in advance, prior to the convention. See Namm.org.

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Absolutely The Best Advice on Purchasing New Gear This Year

Shopping for instruments and audio gear can make your day. In fact, choosing and buying the tools of your trade should be a great experience. Unfortunately, that's not always the case. Usually, you're less than satisfied when you're less than informed. So that you can enjoy the process, the way you should, Music Connection contacted online and offline retailers, as well as artists, producers and recording engineers; and, asked them to share their best buying tips with us.

RESEARCH RULES

Let's start with something everyone should know: Ask for advice from people you know and trust. Check out the gear reviews in magazines, and read what others are saying online in the forums and music blogs. -TJ Milian, Sam Ash Music

Smaller manufacturers frequently have a short mark-up and ship fewer items. And, when these limited editions are gone, that's it. So, doing a little research and asking a few questions is advisable. If you really like something that's in short supply, you should buy it when the opportunity arises. Otherwise, you could lose out.

Ken Daniels, TrueTone Music

Some people think they know the wholesale cost of an item and try to use it to get the lowest possible price. But, there are different price schedules for retailers. Just because you found one number on the internet doesn't mean that's what we paid for it.

Also, if you bring in a low quote that you want us to beat, make sure it's legitimate. We WILL check, and it could be embarrassing if you're wrong. -Ken Daniels, TrueTone Music

Many manufacturers have set minimum prices for their dealers. Search online for the best price, but be wary of fly-by-night websites that offer super low prices. Buying from an unauthorized dealer is risky and could mean that you won't be covered under the manufacturer's warranty. -TJ Milian, Sam Ash

RUDE IS CRUDE

There's no reason to be rude or hostile to a sales rep. Although being loud and obnoxious can get results, it's not necessary and won't get you a better deal. In fact, if you think you have to be that way, well, maybe you're shopping in the wrong place. Some customers have such a bad reputation that when they come in the sales reps either hide or want to go on a break. You'll get a lot better service if you're civil. In fact, establishing and nurturing a good relationship with a sales rep can be very beneficial for future purchases. —Ken Daniels, TrueTone Music

TECH SUPPORT

When buying hardware and/or software for recording purposes, "techsupport" is major. Often the manufacturer's support leaves a lot to be desired, if you get any at all. For example, if you buy a Pro Tools rig from Sweetwater (or other friendly retailer) and need tech support — but the stupid Digidesign "free support" period is over - you can call and they'll advise you simply because you bought the gear from them. Tech support is also handy for assessing unconventional or old gear that doesn't have a corporate help-line.

And, even when there is a help-line, many companies charge by the minute for any support advice they give. Because of that, it's a factor you need to consider. Otherwise, you may have to pay an expert to help you

THE BEST DEAL

Getting "the best deal" always involves the total package and never

just the best price. The best deal will involve knowledgeable product support before and after the sale is complete. I always advise my customers to consider how they are going to find assistance if they run into technical issues. Customers should receive free tech support with every item they purchase to ensure that their gear is always up and running properly. - Ryan Murphy, Sweetwater

You should never buy solely on price. Other factors should be considered. Will an instrument be "set up" for you? Will you get help after the purchase? What kind of additional services are offered? Those all contribute to the "best deal." —Ken Daniels, TrueTone Music

Most stores will beat or at least match the lowest price you found. If you want to try your hand at negotiating a better price, ask for the store manager and introduce yourself. It should be easy — simply ask for the best price. When negotiating, be firm, but not rude. Explain how you plan to use the gear. Mention competitors you have shopped with in the past and how you would like to do business at this store instead. It doesn't hurt to talk about other gear you're considering buying in the future as well. If the manager agrees to a price you like, shake hands and enjoy your new purchase. -TJ Milian, Sam Ash Music

DON'T SHOP TILL YOU DROP

While most retailers will match or better a "legitimate" low price, some customers play the "match" game until they lose. They'll go from store to store to get the lowest quotes and play one retailer against the other, over and over again. After awhile, it gets ridiculous. You can overplay this game and end up with nothing. -Ken Daniels, TrueTone Music

THE ONLINE ADVANTAGE

I attend the NAMM show for many product demos, and while I am sent gear for review, there are times when I make a purchase and more often than not it is online where prices are lower and you can sometimes talk them out of charging extra for shipping. Does that approach undercut local dealers? Yes, unfortunately. But if I can't get reliable product demos in-store, then what good is shopping at the local store?

G-Man, artist, gear reviewer

I've bought lots of stuff online that I was already familiar with. In the last few years I've bought three Vox Pathfinder Amps from Guitar Center and Sam Ash over the internet, as well as strings, straps, pedals etc.

But, I would never buy a guitar online. You have to go into a store and play it — no matter what the brand or model, because they ALL play a little differently. However, I bought my video camera (for The Composers' Corner) online, sight unseen, from B&H Cameras based on a recommendation, and a number of other pieces of gear for my studio over the internet. Prices are usually lower and you can compare them nationwide.

Some online retailers don't charge sales tax, but the shipping and insurance charges can exceed your savings. So, always check to see if you're really saving money, or paying more than you should.

TRY BEFORE YOU BUY

Visit a store that has knowledgeable salespeople. Ask lots of questions. Test the gear and spend as much time as you need. Try various brands and models to make sure you find exactly what you want.

Obviously, the biggest advantage to offline shopping is being able to try out the gear. Ironically, this has resulted in my not making a purchase at least 50 percent of the time as I discover the gizmo cannot be made to work properly by the in-store personnel. When you find someone who truly knows the product, that is joyful. But, it's getting more and more rare.

If you encounter a sales person who's not knowledgeable, or able to answer your questions, ask for another sales rep. They should be able to find someone who has the information you need.

RETURNS, EXCHANGES & TAX BREAKS

Go to a store that offers a good return/exchange policy and a solid price guarantee. Many stores offer interest-free financing terms so you don't have to pay for a year or more. If you're buying gear for your business, check to see if you qualify for the California postproduction reduced tax rate (currently 3 percent instead of 8.25 percent in L.A. County).

BE HAPPY

Don't keep shopping after you buy. Don't fret if you find the same thing cheaper months later. It happens to everybody, if you wait long enough. At various times during the year, manufacturers will offer incentives, but it's totally unpredictable. We don't always know when they're going to lower their prices and, sometimes, it even surprises us. Think of it as a life lesson.

TAX TIPS

End-of-the-year purchases can be financially beneficial for some musicians and studio owners. To learn how take advantage of potential tax breaks, you should check out a few websites that break it down for you. Artstaxinfo (http://www.artstaxinfo.com/musicians.shtml) speaks directly to musicians and explains travel, meal, vehicle, and equipment expenses (for both gigging and studio musicians), and whether or not you can deduct them.

Taxesq (http://www.taxesq.com/taxinfo/179Deduction.html) offers a nuts-and-bolts explanation of Section 179 (first year depreciation allowance for equipment), and how to take advantage of it.

An article found at (http://www.isquare.com/tax12.cfm) features a list of common deductible business expenses, which is pretty helpful if you consider yourself self-employed or own your own studio.

Of course, every musician and studio owner's situation is different, but these tips could give you something to talk about with your tax advisor.

Material: Brandon Mayer & The Hidden Powers combine folk and alternative rock with a dash of Cajun spice. Their material has an interesting "down home" feel, while still being trendy — like Coldplay meets the Smiths. Some of the songs are power-pop while others are more rootsy. A few of their tunes incorporate nice catchy moments, like "I Should Have Married You," "When We Walk Back Home" and "To Feel Love You've Got To Give Love."

Musicianship: Although the musicianship is competent and the players have good chemistry, they could gel better as a unit. Mayer's vocals are solid and he plays guitar and accordion skillfully. Brothers Evan and Jesse Dixon also do a

good job as the rhythm section. Graulty is an excellent "parts" player, and his guitar work fits well with the music. Frank's trumpet offers a nice touch too, adding a different flavor to the mix.

Performance: Mayer opened the show solo, playing accordion while he sang. With his passionate vocal delivery, he sounded a lot like Chris Martin. With the band onstage, the music had a good feel, albeit a bit low key. The players came across well, but the show could have been more dynamic. The interplay with the audience was somewhat introspective, but still well received. Generally speaking, it was a respectable, but less than overwhelming performance.

Summary: Brandon Mayer has an eclectic and interesting style of writing. He has solid ideas and his music has an appeal that should go over well with the alt-indie crowd. However, his band could develop a bit more so they can deliver the material with more confidence

Material: Singer/songwriter Elizabeth Nicole stakes out her own territory between Miley Cyrus and Kelly Clarkson. Not quite Disney, but not yet adult, her material reflects that transitionary period between adolescence and adulthood, making her songs ideal for TV shows like *The Hills* (MTV) and Gossip Girl (CW). Though the tunes are poplicious, her lyrics take them beyond your typical teen-pop pabulum; and, are often the strongest part of her songs.

Musicianship: Matt Emmer and Jon Epcar provide competent accompaniment, but could be more dynamic. At times, their low key, understated style undermines the music's vitality. But, things heat up considerably when Nicole sits behind the piano. In fact, her vocals are more expressive then, and her range is wider, adding a dimension to the music that gives it depth and soul.

Performance: Nicole had plenty of appeal, but there was a distinct disconnect when she stood center stage. It seemed as if the mechanics of her performance were more important than her delivery. As a result, she came across like a practiced entertainer instead of an emotional communicator. It wasn't until she played piano and sang that she finally revealed her artistic abilities. It was then that she became a musician, expressing real emotions and heartfelt feelings. The change was so stunning that the best song of the evening occurred during that interlude.


Summary: Nicole is a talented artist with a lot going for her. Pretty, young and charming, she's easy to like. But, she needs direction and guidance to help her avoid the credibility gap that plagues so many actor/artist crossovers. To be more effective musically, Nicole may just have to forget about acting when she's performing onstage and simply feel the music.

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

Material: This singer/songwriter plays as if he graduated from the Townes Van Zandt / Steve Earle school of music. Like those iconoclastic artists, Jon Geiger displays an unwillingness to conform to the rules of genre classification. Drawing from rock, country, roots and blues, Geiger constructs a form of contemporary Americana that is uniquely his own. Songs such as "Goodbye Today" have a Tom Waits "Ol' 55" feel, while "Working Man" channels Charlie Daniels.

Musicianship: Geiger's musicianship is impeccable, with his guitar playing especially noteworthy. Much like Richie Havens, Cat Stevens, and Keith Urban, his rhythms blaze with scorching intensity. Vocally, Geiger's voice is strong and deep, projecting a soulful machismo that is very appealing. In fact, there were moments during the show when his vocals alone silenced the room. The only criticism would focus on his tendency to end songs with a flourish of guitar licks. However, he does it so skillfully that you forgive the indulgence.

Performance: Like a coiled spring about to explode, Geiger presented a potent presence. His rapport with the audience was warm and engaging; and his set was artfully paced. But, at times, you wished this artist would just let loose and not be so contained. Occasionally, he exhibited flashes of spontaneity and lost his self-control. It was in those fleeting instances that you fully realized and, even more significantly, felt the true brilliance of his artistry.

Summary: Jon Geiger is an accomplished and polished songwriter with material that has both depth and strength. But, his live performance could use a jolt of electricity. If Geiger can "complete" the package and perform as well as he writes, he could become an accomplished artist with a successful career ahead of him.

Material: A native of Park City, UT, 20-year-old Alexa Wilkinson brings an uncanny ability to transform everyday life into memorable art.

Her genre of choice is pop-rock, but her appeal is broad based. She mixes her craft with a myriad of influences, including swing, country and Americana. Her song "Of Graves" is receiving airplay on XM Radio. While several other songs are worthy of attention, "Heaven Won't Mind" and "Good Fight" are at the head of the class.

Musicianship: Wilkinson crafts an incredible sound from diverse sources. Ben Carter is the shining star, supplying both electrifying guitar riffs and backing vocals. Sebastian Aymmans and Ryan Cross provide a strong foundation for the rest of the band. The addition of L.A. local Rachel Assil is icing on the proverbial cake, topped off with a cherry that is the piercing vocals of Wilkinson.

Performance: With chemistry that was so thick it spread to the audience, Wilkinson and her band gave the crowd an unforgettable evening. She skillfully crafted an introduction for every song, drawing the audience into the mix. With great dynamics, Wilkinson gradually built the set to a predictable, but enjoyable climax. Moreover, Wilkinson displayed honesty and sincerity when she forgot the lyrics to a song she'd never performed before. In fact, she turned the mistake into another link in the chain she had connected throughout her music and lyrics.

Summary: Alexa Wilkinson's music is a treat for all ages, and displays excellent depth for such a young performer. Her tunes are catchy, memorable and fun. With continuing development, Wilkinson should be able to attain the attention A&R representatives and launch an exciting career as an artist.



The Players: Logan Roberts, vocals, guitar; Robert Ridley, lead guitar; David Huet, bass; Alex Roberts, drums.

Material: Following in the footsteps of Black Label Society, Strong Arm Down's material is heavy and thick, with short choruses and lyrics that are peppered with curses and declarations of lust. Their sound doesn't just follow the lead of other heavy metal bands; instead they incorporate an element of softer rock with catchy bridges. As a result, the songs allow room for non-metal fans to peek into the dark side while appreciating the lighter melodies with heavy bass.

Musicianship: These guys are a hard working band and it shows in their well-synched solos. Roberts' slamming of the skins isn't particularly complex, yet he provides a competent beat. Huet is a strong bassist, indulging in solos while staying aware of the drummer's pacing. Ridley plays traditional metal progressions, which provide a hard edge to the rhythms. The vocals are gritty but not exaggerated. These musicians go deep, and mostly on pitch, resulting in a resounding roar.

Performance: Logan Roberts enjoyed being the center of attention and was perfect at his job. He had great interaction with the audience, urging them to "move forward, I'm getting cold up here." Additionally, he was charismatic and likeable; and, with his Cheshire Cat grin, he was entertaining and amusing as well. Brother Alex also oozed appeal from behind his kit. Covering Pigmy Love Circus' "Drug Run to Fontana," with help from guest vocalist Mike Savage, created a high-energy conclusion. Summary: The influence of bands like Pantera is obvious, but Strong Arm Down produce a lighter product, mainly due to Roberts' vocals. Although they don't immediately entice hard rock metal haters into the genre, they do mark their music with a commercially viable edge. That allows people, not used to this style, to take another look. As well they should.

Material: The Slants are an energetic, electro Asian pop-punk band, playing music that is heavily influenced by Japanese culture. In fact, they do an updated version of

an ancient Japanese song, "Sakura, Sakura," using 21st century technology, i.e. synthesizers and electric guitar effects. Well known and very popular in the anime community, this act could potentially be a mainstay in the electromusic scene.

Musicianship: One of the highlights of listening to the Slants is hearing the talented contributions of Gaijin, especially his keyboard work on "Sakura, Sakura." The band also experiments with vocal melodies on the chorus of "Capture Me Burning," but Jen Cho (keyboards) along with Simon Young (bass) tend to be drowned out by the band's volume. Overall, Aron's vocal skills are only average, but the band is still able to make a solid point that it's here to get the party started.

Performance: Frontman Aron jumped off the drum riser, swung his microphone overhead and landed center stage as the Slants began their set with the song, "Welcome to Doomtown." Young also had a great rock star move: standing on Aron's back while playing his bass solo. Surprisingly, their energetic antics did not inspire either keyboard player to follow suit. Instead, they stood motionless throughout the entire performance.

Summary: Anyone who likes to dance would enjoy the Slants. With their energetic and charismatic frontman and innovative approach, they could make a mark based on their ability to combine old-school Japanese culture with 21st century music. With a little more rehearsal time spent on harmonies, this band could produce great theme songs for a variety of anime projects.
