Norby Walters Ultimately Wins His Appeal

Former booking agent Norby Walters has been exonerated on criminal mail fraud charges which date back to a 1989 racketeering conviction, in connection with his activities as a sports agent in which he signed college athletes before their NCAA eligibility expired. In September 1990 a Chicago federal appeals court overturned the '89 conviction on a technicality. But, since the federal appeals court did not address the mail fraud, racketeering and conspiracy charges brought against Walters, the possibility of a retrial existed. In December 1991, in an effort to avoid a retrial, Walters copped a very unusual plea bargain called an Alford Plea which means he admitted to doing what the government accused him of doing, but he denied that the activity was criminal in any way, according to entertainment attorney Gary Walters. His appeal was to determine whether or not his activity was actually criminal. On June 30th the U.S. Court of Appeals in Chicago ruled unanimously that Walters was innocent of any criminal conduct. The exoneration means that Walters can now venture into money making activities in relation to his case, which he was prohibited from earlier, due to the Son of Sam laws, which disallow any criminal to benefit financially from their crimes. Gary Walters, who is also Norby's son, said his father can now sort through book, television and film offers regarding his experiences in the sports business. The elder Walters is now living in Los Angeles where he plans to pursue a career in artist management and film production. He apparently has no plans to return to the booking agency or sports agent businesses.

Opening Night Glitches For Whitney Houston

Whitney Houston's first tour in two years got off to a rocky start on opening night at the James L. Knight Center in Miami. The July 5th concert started more than an hour late and the audience seemed to turn on Houston, reportedly booing her for her bad attitude. Tony Bulluck, Houston's tour manager told POLLSTAR that technical and logistical problems caused the show to be late in starting. Bulluck said the schedule began to get tight when they first arrived at the loading dock. He said Houston's tour is a six truck affair and the loading dock could only accommodate one truck at a time. And the elevator at the Knight Center could only accommodate one-quarter of a truck load per trip. He said those problems on their own would not have caused the show to start late, but the curtain drops malfunctioned and they did not have the

time or the supplies to take them completely down and repair them. They did a quick repair by clamping them up into place, but the show was still more than one hour late. When Houston finally arrived on stage she apparently snapped at a fan who approached the stage for an autograph. But Bulluck contends that Houston apologized for the delay immediately after her first number and she was eager to get on with the show. On July 13th Houston told "Entertainment Tonight" that she doesn't have an attitude and she blames problems with the audience on the Florida heat, which, she said, made the audience very impatient, unruly and kind of crazy. Gabriel Gabor, a spokesperson for the Knight Center, said that the most interesting aspect of the entire event was the press' response to the AP wire story generated out of Miami. He said during the week following the show, every news agency from television to tabloids called him for the big story, which he felt didn't exist. Bulluck agrees. He claimed that a Miami critic, who has never had anything good to say about Houston since her debut in 1985, was simply out for blood.

TERENCE TRENT D'ARBY

As a child Terence Trent D'Arby didn't realize that other children thought in words, because he thought in music. D'Arby feels like he was born a music man, with a passionate love of all types of music. For D'Arby, it is his intense passion for music that sets him apart as an artist, but he's not a big fan of the industry in which he makes his art. "I'm not sure it is inherent in...any person who aspires to be a true artist to...feel comfortable with a marriage where the commerce is seen as far more important than the art itself." He feels it is a profoundly frustrating time for people who aspire to pure expression. But he perseveres, recording music that he finds true to his artistic vision. "I don't really know that I could operate any other way."

Pegged as "The Next Big Thing", with the phenomenal success of his debut album, *Introducing The Hard Line According to Terence Trent D'Arby*, he earned himself a reputation as an arrogant brash musician who is difficult to work with. D'Arby's nightly antics frequently made the gossip columns and he is forever haunted by cocky quotes where he claimed he was a genius and he would be as famous as Michael Jackson and Madonna. When his second album, *Neither Fish Nor Flesh: A Soundtrack of Love, Faith, Hope & Destruction*, failed miserably the critics and public were more than willing to cut him down to size. He said the real tragedy of his earlier interviews was how terribly naive he was. "I actually thought that humor would translate....the fact that you were laughing when you said it....You realize, way too late, that that's just not the way it is going to come across." D'Arby said the sad part is, people will never let him forget the mistakes he made early on.

Now he is back with his third release, *Symphony or Damn (Exploring The Tension Inside The Sweetness)*. During the five years since his last hit, D'Arby went through several of managers, until he finally found one, Michael Lippman of Lippman Entertainment, he is very comfortable with, and whose vision matches his own. He said that a lot of people involved in artist management are only in it for the life style and the money, so it is really important that he work with a person who is a music lover, which he "absolutely" sees in Lippman. D'Arby's relationship with his record company, Columbia, has also improved with age. When he wouldn't let them release a fifth single from *Introducing The Hardline*, it was rumored that Columbia execs were feeling frustrated, and that their hands were tied unnecessarily. But D'Arby felt he was being overexposed. "It was my first album and I anticipated it was going to cost me somewhere down the line, and I was right....They just wanted to milk it, as a conglomerate would." But with this new album, D'Arby thinks Columbia prexy Don Jenner and his staff are doing a great job. "They've got a long term plan and they are trying to see it through to its fruition."

As D'Arby persists in following his vision he has only one regret, he didn't stay out on the road in support of his second album long enough. "If you have aspirations towards remaining true to your expression, you are going to have records which the public might not see at the time, or appreciate at the time. I'm certainly not the only artist that has gone through that....But the thing to do is always keep yourself in front of the people."



Columbia appears committed to returning D'Arby to his status of "The Next Big Thing", releasing two singles from the new album, one for alternative radio and one for urban contemporary. Columbia also is very supportive of D'Arby's current touring plans. D'Arby cancelled plans for a club tour earlier this year in favor of a supporting slot on Duran Duran's North American tour, which kicked off July 14th in Tampa. The decision to open for Duran came partially from the desire to give the consumer a bigger bang for their bucks. And D'Arby felt that it was a good way to cover a lot of territory and reach bigger audiences. He felt the club tour would have needed too much promotion. "Probably my least favorite thing in the world, outside of visiting the dentist, is promotion. And I'm quite adamant that I won't do a lot of promotion while I'm touring....When I'm touring I like to focus on that....And when things are in my way, I have a tendency to be....cranky, because I'm....a little bit resentful of the fact that something else is challenging my focus." But, D'Arby is looking forward to this tour. "To be honest with you, that's the only thing for me. Once I put out the album, that's a bit of a quiet victory for me. The thing that really allows me to put up with....the industry, is a chance to tour. That's when you, excuse my expression, get a chance to cut through the bull-shit and take it straight to the people, and experience that communal, tribal gathering....I kind of see it as a form of communion....a mass baptism."

D'Arby's father, an evangelist, always wanted his son to follow in his footsteps. "What we do is pretty much the same thing, he does it with the Bible and I do it with music." But D'Arby doesn't want to coerce his audiences into anything, he just wants to go out and present himself as honestly as possible. That is not an easy task when the world wants to see you as either a good guy or a bad guy. "Artists do tend to be very complex individuals....It's not a black or white situation, it is a very technocolored situation." D'Arby sees himself as a pretty nice guy who can be moody at times, vacillating between confidence and insecurity. But he is not interested in what his public persona is. "I don't go to sleep at night with a burning desire to find out whether people think I'm a decent human being." But when pressed for his impression of the public's perception of him he said, "There are two things people tend to say to me when they meet me, or talk to me. The first one is, 'gosh, you're really tall.' The second one is, 'you know, you're really nice'....If more and more people think that, then the perception will start to change. But who knows?" D'Arby's booking agent is Rob Prinz at Creative Artists Agency. D'Arby went with him to CAA, when Prinz left William Morris several years ago.



The Key To Music City

Swimming Your Way Through The Midwest

The floods in the Midwest, which have already caused about \$5 billion in damages, are also having some effect on the concert business. And the end is not yet in sight with weather reports for the area indicating there is more rain on the way. The floods in Minnesota forced the June 27th Lollapalooza show, scheduled for Harriet Island in St. Paul, to move indoors to the St. Paul Civic Center. Civic Center manager David Rosenwasser said the decision to move the show was necessary when it was predicted that Harriet Island would be under water by the 27th. Special arrangements for the last minute change of venue included fencing off an adjacent parking lot for the "village" and the second stage. One major concern was the question of security and safety in a general admission event. Rosenwasser said that it had been nearly 20 years since they had hosted a GA event, but they analyzed the safety concerns and were convinced that they could provide a safe and secure environment. And moving the show indoors proved to be a good call, being that it did, indeed rain, and one-third of Harriet Island was under water at showtime..... In Iowa things have gotten even worse. Over 30,000 people are without power in Des Moines and most of the city is without running water. Mike Grimaldi, GM at Veterans Memorial Auditorium told POLLSTAR that they are fortunate that the auditorium was built on a hill about 150 feet above the flooded areas downtown. The facility, the surrounding parking lots, and the adjacent Interstate 235 are all high and dry. Grimaldi said they were able to host the Grand Prix the weekend of July 9th, but had to cancel the finals on Sunday the 11th because it started raining again. Sammy Kershaw, who performed Saturday at the Grand Prix, spent the night with his guitarist and sound technician filling sand bags on a nearby street. As with the rest of Des Moines, the Veterans Memorial Auditorium is without running water but they do have electricity and may be used as an emergency shelter. The Postal Service, a car dealer and other local businesses are using the parking lot to store their vehicles. Fortunately, the venue doesn't have any shows scheduled for several weeks, but the shows booked for early August may have to be cancelled if the city is still without running water..... The Hilton Coliseum at The Iowa State Center in Ames has not been spared the wrath of the water. The coliseum has had up to 13 feet of standing water inside the facility. The water, which had covered the first row of seats on

the parquet level, had been pumped out of the building as of July 12th, but the rain hasn't stopped yet, and the facility manager has no definitive date as to when the coliseum will be able to reopen. There are no shows scheduled at the Hilton Coliseum until a September 5th Billy Ray Cyrus concert. They are proceeding with ticket sales and their box office remains open. Two other facilities at the Iowa State Center, Stephens Auditorium and Fisher Theater are unaffected by the flooding..... Further south, in Missouri, the floods have ravaged the streets of St. Louis, but the arch located at the edge of the Mississippi is still high and dry but an adjacent street is under water. The concerts under the arch for the annual V.P. Fair, which was the weekend of July 3rd, were able to take place, but they had to relocate more than 100 booths and amusement rides..... Irv Zuckerman of Contemporary Productions, which promotes shows all around the Midwest, said they have not had to cancel any concerts. Zuckerman said, "It is something we are watching day to day. And we do not anticipate canceling any shows." Although there is extensive flooding around St. Louis, the Riverport Amphitheatre has not been effected..... In Memphis, the flooding along the Mississippi hasn't had any effect on the Mud Island Amphitheatre which is located next to the ever-expanding river. The river is much wider around Memphis and it hasn't been effected by the problems up stream.

Mushroom Plans To Sprout Around The World

Mushroom Records, one of the world's largest remaining independent record companies, has sold 50 percent of the Australian-based label to Rupert Murdoch's News Ltd., one of the largest media companies in the world. Mushroom's owners, Michael Gudinski and Gary Ashley, will retain 50 percent of the company, which has annual sales of about \$50 million Australian. Gudinski said the sale will enable Mushroom to expand into international markets, including Britain and the United States, while retaining its independent status. The deal has allowed Mushroom U.K. to officially commence business in London this month. News Corp. Ltd., wholly-owns Festival Records, which is, and will continue to be, Mushroom's main Oz distributor. Mushroom's roster of artists includes Jimmy Barnes, Yothu Yindi, Kylie Minogue, Kate Ceberano, and Jason Donovan. Gudinski's concert promotion firm, Frontier Touring, was not part of the sale.

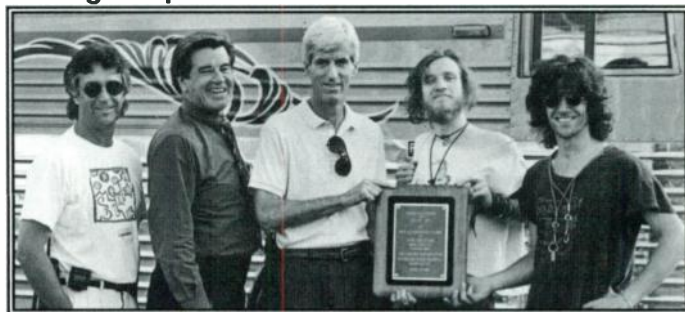

Three European Tour Tales

Fear of excessive noise, traffic and a possible threat to public order caused the police chief of Catanzaro, Italy to ban a concert by Sting scheduled for July 17. According to the Italian news agency AGI, Chief Gianni Carnevale said Sting would attract a young audience that would be "carried away by the impetuous rhythm" of the music and driven to behavior "predisposed to physical violence." Concert organizer Ruggero Pegna said his lawyers were looking into the matter. Sting, who called the ban "the sort of thing that happened in Yugoslavia" before war broke out there, went on to say, "If you give a police chief the power to deny people the right to artistic expression, you run the risk of becoming a repressive country." Sting says he wants to invite the chief to his show "so he can see for himself that nothing happens at my concerts." Sting will play in the nearby Calabrian city of Cosenza instead..... Jerry Lee Lewis was reportedly heckled off the stage during a recent performance in La Coruna, Spain by a disapproving crowd after he got up from his piano and booted a cameraman. The Killer stormed off the stage after the crowd turned on him with jeering whistles and boo's..... Billy Idol was detained at a Munich, Germany airport last month for a "rebel yell" of the illegal kind. Idol, who was on his way to Barcelona as part of a European publicity tour, was stopped by airport police when they suspected that he might be carrying a weapon, according to an article in Melody Maker. Ellen Zoe Golden, Idol's American publicist, said that the police didn't recognize the Idol sneer and ordered him to take off his boots. He allegedly said, "You damn Krauts can take a running jump," and followed it up with a "Heil Hitler" salute, which is a serious offense in Germany. While he was detained, German officials realized that he was an American rock star and they started asking him for autographs and tickets to his next American concert. Idol missed his plane, but continued on to Barcelona the next day after leaving a deposit to cover any possible fine. Idol's current album jumped 60 points on the German charts the following week.

Viewers were to get a full 112 minute show and the opportunity to buy exclusive Yanni box sets, a 10 minute video interview, framed photo, and a 'Dare to Dream' music video all for \$50. Yanni's show was beamed live from the Tampa Bay Performing Arts Center..... Authorities are blaming arson for the June 30th fire that gutted Pompeii's Nightclub in Cathedral City, Calif., the once

popular hangout for stars like Frank Sinatra and Lauren Bacall. The club's famous two-story decorative volcano survived the blaze and the owners say they plan to rebuild..... Mickey Gilley took his turn at the controls of a bulldozer July 7th as he tore off the charred front of his theatre which was closed by a May 10th fire. Construction of a new Mickey Gilley Theatre in Branson, Mo., was to begin as soon as demolition was completed. The new venue will be about 30 percent bigger and is expected to be completed by next April. Gilley estimated rebuilding costs at \$2.5 million, which is about \$1 million more than was covered by his insurance..... Country Music Television will add another two million homes in the U.K. starting September 1st when the video channel gets added to the Sky satellite system. CMT was launched in the U.K. last year but is currently only available in about 325,000 homes..... July 10th marked the debut of MTV invasion into Russian airspace. The music video operation will air 43 hours of programming on three channels spread across 11 time zones. Until the reforms in the mid-1980s, rock music was condemned by Soviet leaders as evidence of Western decadence. MTV and its various versions now have an audience estimated at 46 million in 32 countries. MTV also recently made a deal with Geffen Pictures to produce and develop a feature film, marking its first venture into moviemaking. MTV and Geffen will jointly develop "Joe's Apartment," MTV's live-action and animated short about a young man's efforts to cope with a big city and a tiny apartment full of talking cockroaches..... Two major public relations companies have made an affiliate relationship. The New York-based Terrie Williams Agency and Los Angeles-based Levine/Schneider will each serve as the other flackeries opposite coast office while retaining their own independent operation.

The Used CD Barbecue

Portland, Oregon record retailer, Music Millennium, is going on the road to express their opinion in the Garth Brooks-vs-Used CDs issue. They have been buying used Garth Brooks product to throw on their special "Bar-B-Q Garth Brooks Grill" where it is then torched. After receiving support from other retailers on the West Coast, the company decided to take its "Bar-B-Q For Retail Freedom!" project on the road and have already scheduled dates down the coast to Los Angeles. Owner Terry Currier thinks if the used CD issue gets out to the public, the indie retailers will win the

battle and he wants consumers to boycott the purchase of Garth's new release in September because the singer said he didn't want his albums sold in any store which trades in used product. So far Paul Anka is the only other artist to take a similar public stand.

Seattle Singer Murdered

Mia Zapata, 27, lead singer for the rock band The Gits, was found dead in an alley in Seattle's central area. Zapata's body was found early in the morning on July 7, and according to the King County medical examiners she had died of asphyxiation due to strangulation. The Gits had just finished recording its second album for Seattle's C/Z records and was scheduled to play the New Music Seminar and several dates on the Rock For Choice tour in late July. Police said they had no suspect nor a motive for the slaying.

Coping With Unruly Crowds

The managers of The Palace in Hollywood called police for assistance when a crowd of about 300 people milling around outside the venue started to become disruptive at about 2 a.m. July 3rd. Most of those involved appeared to have come from the nearby Arena Nightclub. No one was injured even when someone in the crowd fired shots which caused everyone to duck and run for cover. One man was arrested on charges of assault with a deadly weapon, but that was for tossing a bottle at a police officer. More than 35 police officers in riot gear responded to a call a few nights later at the Arena Nightclub where the rap group Pharcyde was performing a concert. The problems began when a crowd of several hundred was unable to get into the sold out July 6th show. A security guard at a nearby convenience store was injured when he was struck in the head with a rock. Police also reported that gun shots were heard as they arrived at the scene, however, no arrests were made..... Reasons for a June 15th brouhaha outside of Dekko's nightclub in Orlando, Fla., appear to be different than initially reported. The problem did not stem from a sold out reggae concert at the club, but from an announcement made by a local radio station that Luther Campbell of 2 Live Crew would be "in the house" that night. A spokesperson for Dekko's said

Campbell was not scheduled to perform, but rumors of his presence, coupled with a capacity crowd, incited the ruckus, which was confined to the streets outside of the club. Although the club suffered approximately \$2,300 in damages, no one inside was hurt, including Campbell who did show up to party hearty..... Promoters of a July 4th Soul Asylum concert in Somerset, Wisc., reached an agreement with the city which would bar officers from arresting people breaking the law at their July 4th concert in Float Rite Park. The agreement, which requires police officers to notify park security when they witness violations, will totally restrain and restrict officers, according to the local police chief. But promoter Randy Levy of Rose Productions said the agreement is necessary because of several ill-considered arrests at a June 20th concert. Levy said the police were grossly abusive when they arrested 35 people for violations like public urination, marijuana smoking, and under-age drinking. The July 4th show, which also featured the Gin Blossoms and Brother Cane, was a 25th birthday party for radio station KQRS with proceeds going to the Minnesota Missing Childrens Network.

Legal Griefs

The man accused of mailing threatening letters to Janet Jackson has been sentenced to two years in prison. Frank Paul Jones, 34, claimed he was married to Janet Jackson and allegedly threatened her and her boyfriend, big brother Michael, and director John Singleton..... Charges of disorderly conduct and property damage against Wilson Pickett will be dismissed in September after he performs a charity concert in Englewood, N.J. That will take care of the matter of spinning donuts on the lawn of his neighbor who also happens to be the city's mayor. Pickett still faces charges of drunken driving, refusing to take a breath test and resisting arrest in another trial scheduled to start August 11th. He also pleaded guilty earlier this month to a separate drunken driving offense from April '92 when he hit an 86-year-old pedestrian. Sentencing in that matter is scheduled for September 24th..... The Houston teenager who admitted murdering a Texas state trooper but asked for leniency because he claimed rap music provoked his actions has been sentenced to death. The jury took five days to reach the death penalty verdict on Ronald Ray Howard who had claimed that

"gangsta rap" songs by 2 Pac, Scarface, and Gangsta N.I.P. led to his actions. Even though the jury didn't buy that argument, it hasn't stopped the late trooper's widow from taking legal action against Tupac Shakur, Interscope Records and its parent company Time Warner. The suit charges corporate irresponsibility and is expected to go to trial sometime next year..... A Manhattan supreme court justice has finally resolved the dispute between Deborah Harry and manager Peter Leeds, who handled her career affairs when she was part of Blondie. Leeds had claimed his original contract with the now defunct group gave him rights which extended to Harry's solo career and he wanted commissions from her publishing and ASCAP income because those deals were made when he was still the group's manager. The judge ruled that Leeds is entitled to continue to receive commissions from income on all the Blondie albums released on Chrysalis but has no rights to monies from Harry's solo records released after 1985.

Bob Seger married Juanita Dorricott July 10th in Bloomfield Hills, Mich., but it was their 8-month-old child, Christopher Cole Seger, who stole the show when he showed up dressed in tails..... Las Vegas magician Melinda Saxe is currently shopping for a new attorney to represent her in her suit against Rich Little for invasion of privacy and intentional infliction of emotional distress related to a videotape that she claims Little secretly made of the two of them having sexual relations in 1988. Saxe's former attorney, Marvin Mitchelson, was found guilty of evading \$2 million in taxes and was sentenced to 2 1/2 years in prison, which he is currently appealing. 
Reopening The Queen
