There Will Be A Doctor In The House After All

The highly anticipated Dr. Dre "Chronic Tour" originally scheduled to start July 8th will now kick-off September 7th at the Rochester War Memorial in upstate New York. See this week's Route Book for complete details. Dre has been serving a 90-day house arrest sentence which began the third week in June, but contrary to reports elsewhere, those associated with the tour claim that was not the reason it was postponed. Although Dre's house arrest doesn't end until later in September, he will still be able to do the tour. Attorney David Kenner represented Dre in the battery case which dates back to May 5, 1992. Dre pled no contest to the charges and was sentenced June 2nd. Kenner told POLLSTAR, "Basically, the house arrest program allows people to leave their house for purposes of their occupation or employment. Just because Dr. Dre happens to be an artist, nobody felt, including the court, that he should be penalized....that's his occupation, and part of the duties of his occupation is to do concerts." The tour is being coordinated by Dick Klotzman's United Entertainment which will work with local promoters on the dates. Klotzman said the only reason the tour was delayed was to allow Dre time to finish producing the new Snoop Dogg album. United VP Dennis Heffernan will supervise the tour along with Nina Jacobs. Given the hard core nature of the music, security is a major concern for everyone involved. Klotzman claims he is going to great lengths to provide a safe environment. Former Secret Service agents and U.S. Marshalls have been hired for the tour. While some major venues are wary of rap shows, the tour appears to be booked into many of the country's major arenas. Radio City Music Hall is not on the revised schedule which includes no NYC play and it is refunding tickets from its original July date. One interesting aspect of the tour will come in Los Angeles when Dre and Snoop Dogg will be joined by a 50-piece orchestra at the Greek Theatre.

Pennies On The Dollar

Joseph Entertainment Group, the biggest promoter casualty of the disastrous 1991 concert season, mailed 3,500 checks July 21st to settle accounts with 250 former employees and the thousands of fans left holding tickets to canceled concerts at Alpine Valley Music Theatre in East Troy, Wisconsin. The checks represent one of the last steps in winding down JEG after the Milwaukee promoter filed Chapter 11 bankruptcy in January 1992. Ticket holders who used credit cards to buy their tickets had already

received full refunds. The employees got about 40 percent of the pay they were due while fans received only 25 cents on the dollar.

Bauer-Kinnear And The Future Of Its Venues

MCA Concerts Northwest may just about be ready to take over another project from the financially strapped Bauer-Kinnear Enterprises, once the area's most active concert promotion company. Bauer-Kinnear, which is being pursued for more than \$160,000 in back taxes by the state of Washington and thousands more from various other creditors, may have to abandon its plans to build an 18,000-seat amphitheater in Black Diamond, Wash., according to a July 16th article in the Puget Sound Business Journal. The \$10 million shed, known as the Diamond Claw project, was proposed one year ago and was originally scheduled to open in 1994. MCA is reportedly in discussions to take over that project in addition to other Bauer-Kinnear venue assets. An attorney for Bauer-Kinnear has acknowledged the company is

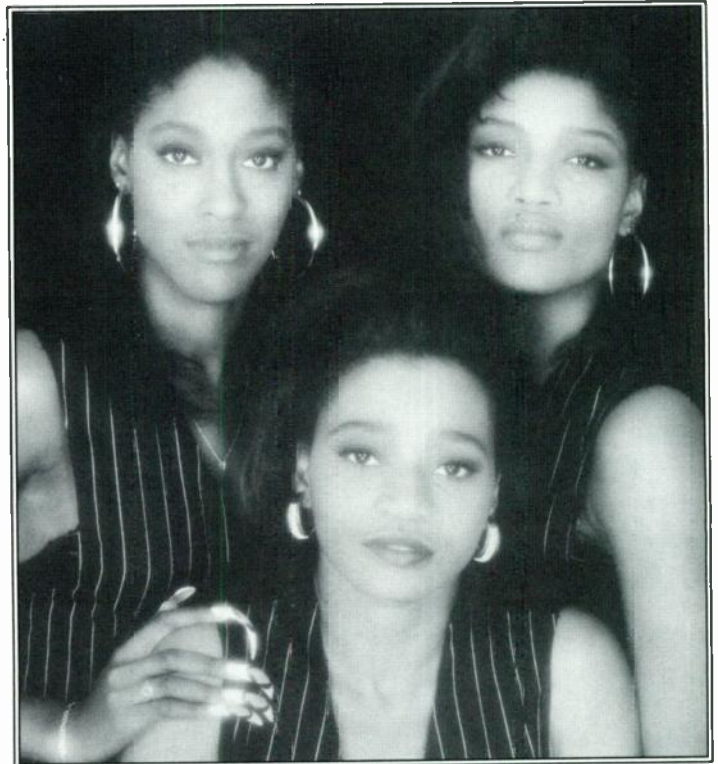
The **Concert Pulse** ranks each artist by their average boxoffice gross per city and is based on data reported within the last three months.



In just one year Sisters With Voices have made their mark on the music scene, going from their 'hoods in the Bronx and Brooklyn to sharing the stage with their childhood idols. Cheryl "Coko" Gamble, Tamara "Taj" Johnson and Leanne "Lelee" Lyons, who are all barely over the age of 18, are also all over the charts with three singles off their debut release on RCA, *It's About Time*. Coko, Taj and Lelee, who met when they were still children, have been singing most of their lives. Coko and Lelee started singing in church and by the age of 12 the three of them were harmonizing in the halls of their schools. They eventually formed a short-lived-band, *Female Edition*, inspired by the music of *New Edition*. After going their separate ways for a few years, Lelee and Coko got back together and formed a gospel group. When that didn't work out, they decided to audition singers for a new project. It was then that Taj joined and SWV was born. Not long after that musical union, a good friend of their's introduced them to manager Maureen Singleton of Singleton Management. SWV credits much of their success to Singleton. When asked how three young girls from the ghetto landed a record deal with RCA, the reply is simply, "Our manager shopped the demo." SWV sees this down to earth and street simple attitude as something that sets them apart from the crowded world of R&B vocal harmony groups. They express their attitude in all aspects of their lives and their careers, continuing to stay true to who they were before the big record deal.

The trio is understandably happy about their success. They are the only group to currently have three singles on the charts, with "Weak" at #2, "I'm So Into You" at #37 and "Right Here" at #43. But the one thing that does bother them is the industry's tendency to try to make them what they are not. The trio is currently on the road with the "Coca-Cola Summerfest" tour, sharing the stage with L.L. Cool J, Naughty by Nature, Silk, Shai, H-Town and Jade. "There's really no difficult part about being on tour because it's our job," said Lelee. "But it is real hectic being what people want you to be....It's hard, we have to smile when there is nothing to smile about." She also said she is not supposed to do certain things on stage, like pumping up the crowd by chanting, "Do that shit! Do that shit!" "They wouldn't want you to do it, but we know our audience, we know what they like....Yes, we do sing. But we are from the streets, and me especially....you can tell I'm from the 'hood, it is very obvious, so I'd be really stupid to try to change." Lelee said she has to be herself, because it feels better that way. "I think people will respect you more if you be yourself." Before signing to RCA, Lelee told the execs that if they wanted her to change she would rather not sign the contract. Taj agrees and said having to mind their P's and Q's can occasionally be rough. "The majority of the time it's real cool...but you can't please everybody. And that's the problem with this business, you have to."

SWV's success has had a twofold effect on one of their favorite pastimes, shopping. They shop as often as possible, but it is not always easy for them to have fun at malls, or anywhere else for that matter, because they are now being recognized by fans. Lelee said, "We like having fun just like any other teen-age kids, but we can't do it anymore.... We'll sign one person's autograph on the sneak-tip and we'll say something like, 'we're trying to shop right now, we would appreciate it if you would not tell anybody, if they don't




(L-R) Coko, Lelee, and Taj

already know, that we're in this mall'." She said they don't mean any disrespect to their fans, "But we also understand that things have changed for us." Their desire to stay true to who they really are also influences their fashion choices. Just like being true to themselves on stage, the trio doesn't like to dress in styles that don't really reflect who they are. Lelee said, "Me, I'm very choosy about what I wear....I'm....a sexy type of person, I really don't dig baggies too much, cause it's just not me. And that goes back to being yourself. I've never worn them and I ain't gonna start."

Even though they indulge themselves in fashion, they don't particularly like to be overindulged. Lelee said that she is not too crazy about fancy hotels and high dollar pampering. "I really don't like that too much, being pampered and all that, cause I'm not used to that. I was always independent and I had to do things on my own. They can keep the fancy hotels and stuff because that's money coming out of our pockets. As long as you have some privacy, a nice place to sleep and no rats and stuff, then your ok....but all of that pampering, they can keep that." The trio does not like to pretend to be something that they are not. Not only do they express that in their fashion and their attitude on stage, but also in the music they record in the studio. Lelee said they will not record a song if they don't believe in the message. "If the song wasn't about us, or there's something that we haven't experienced, we wouldn't even sing it because, then you'll be lying. And that's what a lot of artists do today....It's stupid to me."

SWV is feeling good about sharing the stage with performers they have been fans of for years, especially L.L. Cool J. Lelee, who has always admired Cool J, said, "I can't believe it....I went from hanging his pictures up on my wall to singing on the same stage....it's amazing." After the tour, Coko, Taj and Lelee are going to take some time off before going back into the studio. Lelee admits touring can be hectic, "but it's your job so you gotta take it or leave it." SWV is booked by Phil Casey at ICM.

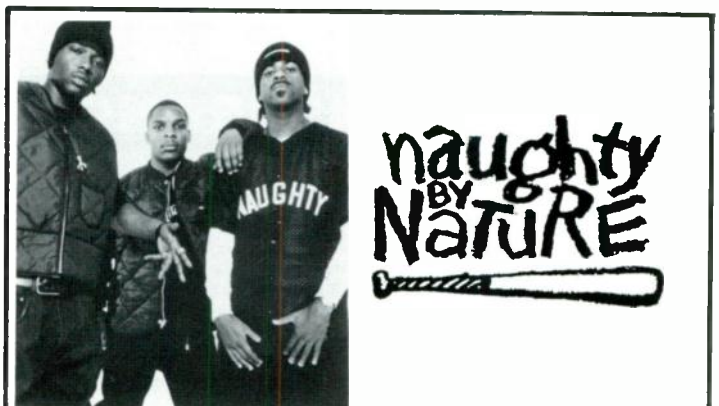

Okay, So What Really Happened

Last week we gave you the "official" reasons why Megadeth left the Aerosmith tour (Aerosmith: Mustaine wasn't happy. Megadeth: Promotional and production considerations were not met), but as they say in those late night TV adds, "But wait, there's more!" Dave Mustaine was interviewed by Dallas station KEGL's Mad Max Hammer backstage after their show at the Starplex Amphitheatre. KEGL P.D. Bryan Krysz told us that Mustaine said, "...Aw, it's been bullshit. They don't give us a soundcheck. We're really the headliners, but we'll let them call themselves headliners since they're so old and are gonna die any day now... This is their last hurrah." Mustaine went on to say that Aerosmith was scared that Megadeth was going to blow them off the stage. Because Mustaine was peppering his responses with the occasional profanity, Krysz eventually ordered the disk jockey to tape the interview, but by that time, according to Krysz, someone started jamming the frequency of KEGL's remote equipment. "Our guy's asking questions, and every time Mustaine goes to answer, they're jamming our frequency... The jock couldn't tell, everything he said was perfectly clear, but every time Mustaine talked they jammed him." That, in itself, is a real roadie who-dun-it. Krysz went on to say that the jock gave what was taped of the interview to someone at the Starplex, who in turn, gave it to Collins Management. Mustaine continued his radio career the following Saturday as a guest of the national Westwood One "Pirate Radio" program hosted by Lonny Friend. On that show Mustaine complained that their name wasn't on the tickets, they weren't allowed sound checks, they weren't allowed to fly their backdrop, and had so little room onstage that when he flicked his hair back he would hit the drums. After holding his tongue for awhile, Aerosmith manager Tim Collins decided to explain what really happened. "Ron Laffitte has been chasing me for a year to get Megadeth on the tour. That was their dream and their vision.

I had certain reservations but it looked like something that could work," said Collins. "We gave Megadeth and Dave Mustaine everything we gave Guns N' Roses when they opened for us. They got a fifty minute show, they got sound checks whenever technically possible, we gave them way over the agreed upon limit of comps, and we gave them all the stage space there was." So what was Mustaine unhappy about? Collins told POLLSTAR, "He had a delusion that it was a co-headline. He signed a contract in which he was a special guest star. He also signed a contract for 50 minutes but was demanding 60. He was demanding, demanding, demanding and a very unhappy guy. He wouldn't have been happy until he was closing the show, and even then he probably wouldn't have been happy." According to Collins, not all of Mustaine's demands were related to the concert stage. "He told me in a meeting that he expected he would get to go bowling and play basketball with Steven Tyler... I don't think I can remember the last time Steven Tyler went bowling." Collins added, "Dave told me to my face that he was thinking of pulling off the tour two days before [The Woodlands show]. I confronted him in Houston and asked, "Are you going to pull off our tour?" He said, "I was thinking of it, and still might, and if I want to I fucking will." Collins also mentioned drugs, in regards to Aerosmith's sobriety, and Dave Mustaine's recent rehabilitation. "From what I understand from his bandmates, Dave just got out of treatment for heroin addiction, and is real unhappy that he doesn't get to use his drugs anymore. I've been through that with Aerosmith. My guys are all recovering. So we had a lot of compassion for him. We really tried to work it out. I literally sat in a dressing room with Dave myself for an hour and a half. I met with his manager numerous times. Aerosmith has the utmost respect for his music and treated him with the utmost respect because we've been through it. I manage recovering people, I'm recovering myself, and I know life on the road is not a good place to be when you get newly sober." According to Collins the band made its decision to drop Megadeth in a late night meeting shortly after their Woodlands performance on July 26th. Collins said that at first he didn't want to bring all this out into the media, but after hearing Mustaine's comments on KEGL and the Westwood One program, he decided to present Aerosmith's side of the story. "My guys have been doing this for 23 years and they don't want

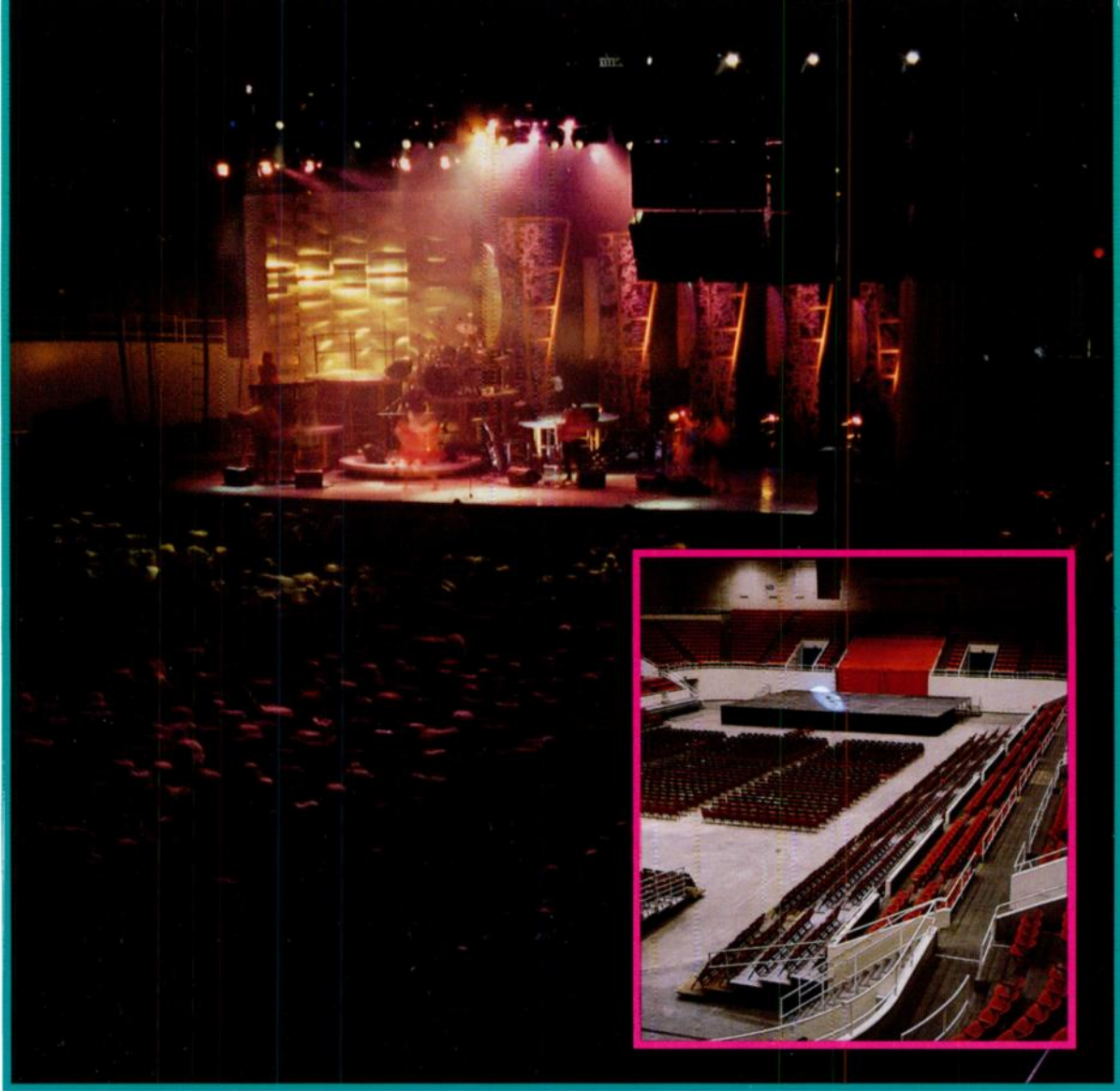

Rain Or Shine Isn't Always Black And Wy

About 7,500 fans were left angry and soaked to the bone when Clint Black was unable to take the stage July 16th at Hilton Head Community Stadium in South Carolina. Wynonna Judd was able to complete her set but before Black could come on stage lightning and heavy rains hit the venue. After waiting more than an hour for the weather to clear, the situation on stage was finally deemed unsafe and the audience was told the show was over. Many in the crowd were angered because the tickets said "rain or shine" and they weren't offered refunds. Promoter C&C Productions offered fans tickets to see an upcoming Kenny G show instead but that didn't satisfy many of the disgruntled country music fans. After two days of negative press blaming Black for the situation, an August 31st show at the nearby Savannah Civic Center was booked and fans are now being offered a chance to exchange their tickets for that show. One unhappy camper however, has filed a class action suit seeking her money back and reimbursement for mileage and parking, plus \$1 million in punitive damages.

Short Items Of Note

Jesse Tobias from the L.A. rock band Mother Tongue, has been named to fill the vacant guitarist slot in the Red Hot Chili Peppers. Tobias did not take part in the band's open auditions but was spotted by Anthony Keidis while performing with Mother Tongue. That band recently signed a deal with Epic Records and will now look for a replacement as The Peppers start preparations for their next album..... Cypress Hill's second album, *Black Sunday*, set a new sales record for first week sales of a rap album. The album debuted at No. 1 on the SoundScan retail charts selling more than 260,000 units. Although last week's No. 1, U2's *Zooropa* actually sold nearly 50,000 more albums than the

previous week, it was still more than 100,000 units shy of what it needed to retain the top spot..... Ted Mellencamp, younger brother of John Mellencamp, could be facing a few years in the crowbar hotel if convicted on two felony counts of dealing cocaine. Mellencamp, 40, was arrested along with thirty-four others July 20th in drug raids in southern Indiana. He was released after posting \$20,000 bail..... Ray Davies says he is planning to mount a theatrical production of the Kinks' 1974 rock opera "*Preservation Act II*." Davies said he has made some plot changes and wants to devote the time needed to get the project off the ground although he didn't specify a time table..... French singer Vanessa Paradis cancelled her world tour July 23rd under doctor's orders to take a long rest. Paradis has appeared in several films and Chanel perfume ads. She is canceling concerts scheduled for the next few weeks in Europe, Japan and the U.S..... A Country Music Association survey showed that the number of full-time country music radio stations in North America has jumped to a total of 2,402, an increase of 199 stations in just the past year..... Reba McEntire and husband Narvel Blackstock spent more than a million dollars to add four thoroughbred horses to their Nashville racing stable. The couple paid \$325,000 for a colt sired by a 1988 Kentucky Derby runner-up.

A New Owner For The Hartford Civic Center

The city-owned 16,500-capacity Hartford Civic Center is about to be leased to the state of Connecticut in a deal which should be finalized by early August. The state would operate the complex under its Development Authority, and will hire a private management company to actually run the operation. SMG's bid has been selected by the state over those placed by Ogden Entertainment and Centre Management, to run the Hartford venues once the state takes over this fall. The Hartford deal will represent the 39th facility to be operated under the SMG umbrella.

Musician Shot Outside NMS Club

Eric Tallman, lead singer of Erotic Exotic, was shot in the head July 23rd outside a New Music Seminar event at the Danceteria nightclub in New York City. Apparently, someone from an act which had performed earlier at the club returned and randomly

Legal Grievs

A federal judge threw out a major part of the lawsuit filed against Virgin Records by Yvette Marine, who claims she sang lead vocals on four of Paula Abdul's hits. The judge said Marine shouldn't receive any more money for her work on the album "Forever Your Girl" but that she can sue for public recognition. A jury will decide if the remaining allegations of copyright infringement and unfair competition have any merit. Abdul, although not named in the suit, took the stand herself and said Marine only contributed background vocals and swore the lead was hers alone..... A Superior Court judge in Los Angeles dismissed most of the fraud, negligence and breach of contract lawsuit by Martha Raye, who claimed Bette Midler stole her life story for the movie "For The Boys." The judge threw out all claims except breach of contract according Midler's reps. Raye, sued for \$5 million last year claiming she offered to sell her life story to Midler several years ago..... A judge in Nashville has issued a temporary restraining order against a Philadelphia woman accused of harassing Janis Ian. According to Ian's complaint, the woman threatened to kill her, sent pornographic love letters and packages containing human feces.

The Fine Art Of Confrontation

Devante Swing, a member of the group Jodeci, was attacked by two armed robbers July 23rd who ransacked his house in Teaneck, N.J., and made off with \$20,000 in jewelry. A New Jersey newspaper reported that Swing was bound, blindfolded and struck in the head. A roommate was also bound and kicked, but neither was seriously injured and both declined medical treatment. Separately, Swing and another member of Jodeci face charges of sexually assaulting an 18-year-old woman and threatening her with an assault rifle. Both have denied the charges..... Two men were convicted July 23rd in Australia on three charges of assault against music business entrepreneur Phil Tripp and his associate Lisa Treen. The pair spotted the men selling unlicensed t-shirts outside

the Tamworth Country Music Festival earlier this year and Tripp was photographing them when both of the men attacked.

The Wide World Of Venues

The Pittsburgh Civic Arena is slated to undergo some significant renovations before the start of the National Hockey League season in early October. The most significant change for concert industry tenants will be the addition of two new seating areas which will push the venue's seating capacity above 18,000. Among the other improvements will be expanded rest room facilities, the addition of 6 new luxury suites, the creation of club seating areas, a new press box, and expanded food service and merchandising locations..... Ground was broken July 16th on the 1,500-seat Lou Rawls Theatre & Cultural Center on Chicago's south side. It is being built on the original site of the Regal Theatre and assistance in funding is being provided by Rawls' non-profit Tobacco Road organization..... The new Fargodome in Fargo, N.D., found itself with four feet of water on its lower levels as a result of the heavy rains which fell July 15-16. Mike Lucas, Fargodome assistant marketing director, said that within one week of the flooding they were able to get the facility cleaned up and ready to host their next event..... The New York State Court of Appeals upheld a lower court ruling that blocked the city's Department of Parks and Recreation from demolishing the Naumberg Bandshell in Central Park. The 69-year-old limestone band shell was a private donation to the park back in 1923 and NYC has a law that requires the protection of such gifts..... Wayne Huizenga of Blockbuster Entertainment Corp., has obtained a seven-month option on a 273-acre site located west of the Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport for a sports and entertainment complex dubbed "Wayne's World" in honor of its backer. Huizenga announced plans in May to build a sport-entertainment village, which may include a baseball stadium with a retractable roof, an adjoining arena for hockey and possibly basketball, and a Disney-like theme park with production studios, water sports and a museum..... The Golden State Warriors of the NBA are insisting that their current home, the Oakland Coliseum, either be remodeled or replaced. The team feels strongly that it needs a venue with a capacity of 20,000 and about 100 luxury boxes in order to stay competitive with other teams in the league. And the truth is that Oakland Coliseum is one of the

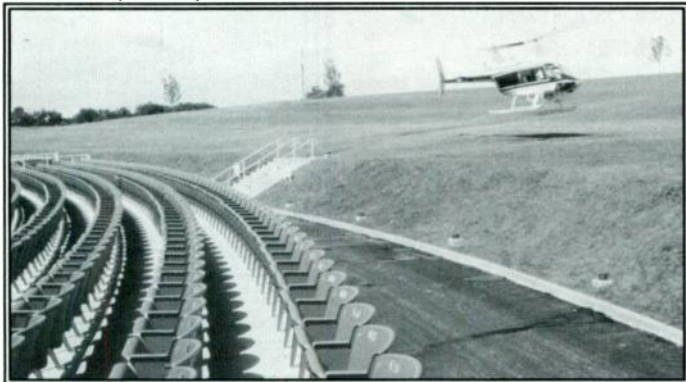

Two Hard Luck Stories

Capricorn Records group 311 narrowly escaped tragedy July 24th, when the RV they were driving, with a van in-tow, caught fire near Springfield, Missouri and destroyed both vehicles, all their instruments and clothing. Vocalist Nicholas Hexum received second degree burns on parts of his back and arms, and the rest of the band suffered minor injuries. The accident forced the cancellation of that night's date in Kansas City but they were able to resume their tour July 25th in Omaha..... New country artist **Doug Supernaw** has remained positive despite a run of bad luck. The latest incident began when Supernaw came down with a bad case of food poisoning in Richmond, Va., and he had to be hospitalized. Then while spending the night in Columbus, Ohio someone broke into his tour bus and stole all of his band's equipment. His guitar player then slipped, fell and fractured a disc in his lower back and was unable to continue. Supernaw's bad luck streak started back in March when he broke his neck surfing.

Contemporary Calls In Its Air Force



The Riverport Amphitheatre outside St. Louis brought in a helicopter to dry the shed's rain soaked hill the morning of its July 1st sold-out "Lollapalooza '93" show. The mission was accomplished in just two hours. Too bad that same strategy doesn't work on areas closer to the river.

Concert Business Help Floods In

A variety of concert business efforts are underway to aid flood-ravaged communities in the Midwest. On July 22nd Clint Black launched "Operation Heartland" with funds going towards reopening small scale community-based programs. Black will donate all of the proceeds from his August 27th concert in Des Moines, to set the program in motion..... Willie Nelson, who has helped raise more than \$13 million for Farm Aid, returned to the heartland for three shows to benefit Midwest flood victims. Nelson will donate the proceeds from the concerts, which were held the weekend of July 23rd in Minnesota and Illinois, to a family farmer's disaster fund that is part of Farm Aid. Nelson also presented a \$20,000 check to the Family Farm Disaster Fund, hoping to give farmers a "ray of hope" during the disaster..... Bon Jovi made arrangements for all local chapters of the American Red Cross Disaster Relief Fund to collect donations at his final 12 U.S. concert dates starting with the band's July 23rd concert in Indianapolis. The group plans to match whatever is donated up


through their last U.S. date at Merriweather Post on August 8th..... Air Supply will donate all proceeds from their August 12th show in Davenport, Iowa, to local flood relief agencies. The concert may be moved from the Adler Theatre to a larger venue because of the strong positive response to Air Supply's gesture. Graham Russell said he assumed the Davenport show would be canceled because of the floods, but when he heard it was still happening, the group decided that the proceeds should benefit area flood victims..... John Mellencamp and Blind Melon will donate proceeds from three "Concert's For The Heartland," held July 28th, 29th and 31st in Chicago, Indianapolis and St. Louis, to the American Red Cross for aid to flood victims. Bob Dylan was scheduled to join Mellencamp at the July 31st show in St. Louis. MTV, which is sponsoring the event, set up an 800 number and a special PO Box for viewer donations..... Irv Zuckerman of Contemporary Productions is putting together an all-star country benefit concert called "Willing To Help," at the Riverport Amphitheatre outside St. Louis. The August 1st concert will include, Kenny Rogers, Lorrie Morgan, Hal Ketchum, George Jones, Shenandoah, Martina McBride and Sawyer Brown.

Pros On The Move

Tom Tomlinson has been named Executive Director of the Orange County Performing Arts Center in southern California. Tomlinson had been head of the Alaska Center for the Performing Arts since April 1988. Tomlinson succeeds Thomas Kendrick who retires September 30th..... Hollywood Records has named Nick Terzo VP of A&R. Terzo had been an A&R exec at Columbia in L.A..... Jim Welch has been appointed director of A&R at Columbia. Welch was label director for Earache Records..... Former major label head Sal Licata has been named president of RED (Relativity Entertainment Distribution)..... Jacquie Perryman has been appointed VP of Arista's soundtrack division. She previously was head of Virgin's soundtrack operation..... Connie Baer is leaving the Gary Group PR firm to take a position as VP of Marketing at Sony Music Nashville, replacing the departing Mike Martinovich..... Stephen Carbone has left ICM to take a top commercial department post at CAA. CAA recently created two dozen television ads for Coca-Cola, and is now on the verge of inheriting the entire ad campaign.

Between The Dates

MADONNA starts her world tour this September in London, and it appears as if the itinerary still needs to tie up some loose ends. The "Girlic Show" could be in Paris on October 1st. Or it could be in Lisbon, Portugal on the 1st and Frankfurt, Germany on the 2nd. Or it could be in Italy during that time period. There is doubt on whether she will be performing in Bangkok. Thailand's Education Minister Samphan Thongsamak was quoted in newspapers as asking, "If she strips off her clothes in front of the audience, could we tolerate that?" The Minister went on to say that her performance would "...be against Thai people's ethics and culture and totally unacceptable." Thongsamak also said that although it would be inappropriate for her to perform in a stadium size venue, it would be okay if the show happened in a smaller, more intimate venue like a theatre. In other words, Bangkok fans can tolerate her when they're closer to the stage, but not when she's a small dot at one end of a sports field. Other countries listed for the tour include Israel, Argentina, Brazil, Mexico, Australia, New Zealand, Japan, and a limited number of U.S. dates..... The venerable Denver country music club, **GRIZZLY ROSE** is not just for country anymore. The 1200 seat venue has previously hosted Foreigner and 38 Special but the biggest surprise booking comes in August 24th when **THE KINKS** kick up their English boots and perform..... **ALBERT COLLINS** was hospitalized briefly in Switzerland when he started complaining of chest pains. The blues great had to cancel seven dates scheduled for July 31st through the end of August. A spokesperson for The Rosebud Agency said Collins did not suffer from a heart attack or stroke..... The **PETE TOWNSHEND** pay-per-view is now scheduled for August 7th at the Brooklyn Academy Of Music. But those arena-size dates at The Spectrum and Brendan Byrne Arena that we told you about have been changed. The Philadelphia play will now be at the Tower Theatre on August 10th and the old Meadowlands date is moved to the Jones Beach Amphitheatre on August 12th..... Being the **KING OF POP** is a full-time job. What with contributing a song to The "Addams Family Values" movie soundtrack, and collaborating with Sega on a video game, **MICHAEL JACKSON** has a pretty full plate. At least those were the reasons given for the cancellation of his tour opening performances in Hong Kong originally scheduled for August 15th & 16th and in Seoul August 20-21. Three-quarters of the tickets, priced upwards from \$38 to \$220, for the shows scheduled at a Hong Kong horse-race track had already been sold. Whether or not a later date will be scheduled at the track is anybody's guess. With the horse racing season about to start on September 12th, MJ would have to compete with the ponies to secure the venue. The tour is now set to open August 24th in Bangkok..... The second of a two day Reggae Roadblock festival scheduled for this past weekend at California State University in Dominguez Hills had to be cancelled when two acts that were to perform reportedly could not get U.S. work permits in time. Canadian rapper **SNOW**, who was scheduled for both Saturday and Sunday shows was apparently denied a U.S. visa because of an assault conviction last year in Toronto. The promoters decided to cancel the Sunday show when Les Têtes Brulées found it was also unable to get a work visa. At press time, the Saturday show featuring Pato Banton, Third World, and Culture was scheduled to go on as planned..... **RICKY SKAGGS**, **DENIECE WILLIAMS**, **AARON NEVILLE**, and **BEN E. KING** are among the artists scheduled to perform for Pope John Paul II on August 12th at the World Youth Day Music Festival in Denver. There's no word on whether Dave Mustaine was asked to perform.
