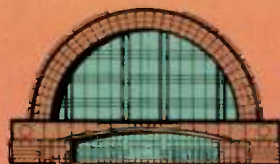

Ugly Kid Security

The lead singer of Ugly Kid Joe was arrested August 27th after allegedly urging the crowd at Cooper Stadium in Columbus, Ohio to attack security guards during his performance. Detective Zachary Scott said William W. Crane IV screamed "kill the pigs," then jumped on a security guard's back and hit him with a microphone stand. The audience at the show, which was headlined by Def Leppard, responded with cheering and a few fans near the stage also attacked the guard, who still managed to escape without serious injury. Crane was charged with felony assault and with inciting violence. He was held overnight at the county jail and then released on a \$185,000 bond the next day. Police were unsure what prompted Crane's outburst. A group spokesperson said they are investigating the matter. And if Crane is indicted, "he will plead not guilty to all charges and will vigorously defend himself in the appropriate court of law."

Michael Jackson: The World Tour

Michael Jackson's world tour continues to be plagued by difficulties as MJ's health problems have already caused him to reschedule at least one show in every stop so far; Thailand, Singapore and Taiwan. During Jackson's first sold-out concert in Singapore August 29th, which was his 35th birthday, he appeared to be handling the tropical heat better than he had in Bangkok, where he rescheduled his second show suffering from what his doctor called dehydration. The stage at Singapore's National Stadium was equipped with special industrial-sized fans blowing across blocks of dry ice to cool the singer, and his backstage digs were also equipped with special air-conditioning units. Jackson's performance, which was interrupted when his band broke into "Happy Birthday," came off without a hitch, but he didn't manage to make it to the stage for his second show the following night. His physician said Jackson became dizzy, started vomiting and developed an acute migraine headache shortly after he arrived at National Stadium the night of August 30th. A decision to postpone the concert was made but not announced until an hour after the show was scheduled to start. With riot control crews standing by, members of the press were taken aside and notified, and local VIPs were escorted out of the stadium before the crowd was told the show was off. When the audience was told that Jackson had left the stadium to go back to his hotel, the crowd roared in disbelief and many were angry because of the postponement. When MJ finally took the stage

September 1st, however, he was greeted with a solid five minutes of applause. Elizabeth Taylor, who had flown in to lend her moral support to MJ, made a special public appearance when she was driven around the open-air stadium in a cart before the concert began. Jackson seemed perfectly healthy and his physician said he does not anticipate any further medical problems after a series of MRI brain scans revealed nothing abnormal. But Jackson did push back his first show in Taiwan, because of logistical reasons related to all the postponements. Not that he needed any more bad press, but MJ also had a run-in with reporters while he was still in Bangkok when members of his crew got involved in a confrontation with the locals while shooting a video with Thai air force cadets. Jackson had made arrangements to film the video with them because he liked their uniforms, according to the *Bangkok Post*. But during the filming, Jackson's bodyguards and Thai police attempted to stop a crowd of photographers from getting close ups and that upset the press.

Blind Melon

Blind Melon's phenomenal rise up the charts is not as much an overnight success story as it is evidence of what a band can accomplish if the enthusiasm they have for their art is truly supported by the industry's enthusiasm for commerce. Their self-titled debut release on Capitol Records has been out for nearly a year, but with the July appointment of Gary Gersh as Capitol's new president, Blind Melon had the good fortune of becoming one of the label's two major priorities. That position has made the summer of '93 one to remember for Blind Melon, with remarkable retail sales that have yielded a gold record. And the relentless exposure of their "Bee Girl" MTV Buzz Clip video for the single "No Rain" is making such an impact that Blind Melon is quickly becoming one of the best known "new" bands on the scene.

Blind Melon's buzz was triggered when they were chosen to open MTV's 1992 "120 Minutes" tour even before they had their first record out. Lead singer Shannon Hoon is reluctant to talk about that early buzz, because it inevitably takes the focus off Blind Melon and puts it on Hoon's over-exposed relationship with Axl Rose. But because of his strong commitment to honesty, Hoon risks being asked preposterous questions about Rose's love life, and admits that when his hometown friend asked him to appear in GN'R's video for "Don't Cry," it inadvertently brought a great deal of attention to Blind Melon, even though they weren't playing in clubs around L.A. With only five songs in their repertoire, Blind Melon was approached by a lawyer who wanted to shop their tape to some record companies. He started bringing people to their rehearsal space to see if they could actually play what had been heard on the tape. Eventually, Capitol made them an offer they couldn't refuse. But Blind Melon had decided that they first wanted to do a couple of club tours and they also wanted to leave L.A., before starting to record.

By this time they had started seeking management. Hoon solicited advice about various management deals from a couple of friends he had made through Axl, Doug Goldstein and Chris Jones. About a week before Blind Melon was going to decide on its future management, Goldstein and Jones "threw their hat in the ring," suggesting Blind Melon go with their company, Big FD Entertainment. Hoon respected their honest approach to working with people and had already built a trusting friendship with them, so it was a natural choice. As it turns out, their communication with Big FD would be the only real conduit Blind Melon had with the industry once they left Los Angeles.

Hoon said he and his band mates, guitarists Roger Stevens and Christopher Thorn, bassist Brad Smith and drummer Glen Graham, were concerned that Capitol was not going to be thrilled about their decision to postpone recording and depart Smogsville. But, surprisingly, they were very fortunate to have the cooperation of their new label. "We were actually kind of nervous that we were already going to butt heads [with Capitol], because, obviously, we'd just signed and the first thing they wanted us to do was go and make a record. We could have gone into the studio and wrote the rest of the record, but in that type of environment how honest is it really going to come out?" The group wanted to move back

to an environment that was reminiscent of the small towns they had grown up in. "And so we chose Durham, North Carolina....We set up in a five bedroom house and everything came naturally....it was unforced and not premeditated....Things seemed to flow a lot more homespun and organically." Hoon said that the freedom of creative control the label gave them is a result of the success "indie" bands are having. "Nowadays I think a lot of labels are letting bands do that, with the success of Pearl Jam and Nirvana.... Rather than the '80s when everybody was turned into Bon Jovi. You would sign and then all of a sudden they would dress you and tell you what kind of market to attack and all that shit. But I think now, a lot of record labels and bands, are communicating more on an artistic level....They're letting the artists do the art, and that's the way it should be."

And that freedom has allowed Blind Melon to record an album that does not comfortably fit a specific genre. Their genre-blending style, combined with their affiliation with agents Shelley Shaw and Bill Elson of International Creative Management, has provided Blind Melon with an opportunity to share the stage with an eclectic mix of performers, some of whom have been inspiration to the band for years. Hoon said playing with Neil Young on his current tour will be something that will eternally remain a pinnacle of his career. "Neil Young's going to hit the opening chords of a few songs that's gonna make my knees wobble and my eyes tear up."

But playing in front of audiences who have come to see Neil Young, Guns N' Roses, Ozzy Osbourne, Soundgarden, or John Mellencamp is not always the easiest thing. But it's something Hoon embraces. "I enjoy playing to crowds who don't understand us because I really have nothing to lose there and everything to gain. I love being introduced to new music, therefore I love introducing people to new music, by being on the other end for a change." But being on the other end makes him realize that people who watch Blind Melon on stage are often thinking, "these guys are keeping us from seeing Ozzy, or Guns N' Roses."

He said this was especially evident at Mellencamp's flood relief show at Deer Creek in Indianapolis. "The thing that really bothered me was that during John's set, he had thanked us for....doing the shows....and there was a part of the crowd that were booing us....That doesn't disappoint me at all....What does, is the ignorance of those who don't realize the music wasn't the most important thing about that day, it was support. And that should be enough right there to at least make you tolerate what comes out of the PA speakers. Even though musically, we don't share a common bond....at least we know our heads are in the right place, as far as caring and supporting....A lot of people who were at the show didn't realize that and that's what bothered me."

Aerosmith Gets Floored

Michael Jackson: The Nightmare

And on the other side of MJ's world, the scandal surrounding the alleged child abuse and extortion plot continues to mushroom. On August 30th, CBS News broadcast excerpts of a tape in which a man, purportedly the father of the boy Jackson is accused of molesting, threatens to destroy MJ's reputation. Hollywood shamus Anthony Pellicano said the conversation on the tape is between the 13-year-old's father and stepfather, and exposes an extortion plot gone sour. However, the details of the man's complaint with Jackson were not disclosed on the tape, and no reference to molestation or extortion are evident. Pellicano, who works for MJ, also claims that he and Jackson met with the man and his son August 4th, when the man first threatened to go public with the molestation accusation if Jackson did not fund a \$20 million film project. Pellicano said the 13-year-old "gave all kinds of expressions of disbelief" when the father accused Jackson, and the meeting broke up with the father yelling that he was going to ruin Jackson's career and reputation. Pellicano says he offered the father \$350,000 the following day in an attempt to set him up and expose the extortion plot. But another private investigator, Ernie Rizzo, surfaced August 31st and began telling the press that Pellicano's offer was made to silence the 13-year-old and his father. Rizzo also said that Pellicano had doctored the tape which allegedly exposed a conversation incriminating the father. However, the father's new attorney, Richard Hirsch, countered the statements, saying that Rizzo does not have any authority to speak for the father, the mother or the son. The next day, September 1st, Pellicano and Jackson's attorney, Howard Weitzman, released another tape of a conversation between Pellicano and lawyer Barry Rothman, who was representing the 13-year-old's father at the time. Heard on that tape are two men having a heated discussion over negotiations for the father to be paid money by Jackson to develop a movie project. Weitzman and Pellicano said they believe the tape bolsters their claim that there was an extortion plot brewing. But there is no mention of sexual molestation allegations on the tape, which was apparently recorded August

17th, the same day the father made his original complaint to Child Protective Services. Amidst the confusion, high-profile attorney Gloria Allred was retained by the boy's parents to represent the 13-year-old. Speculation that the child might be a pawn in his parents' custody battle appeared to have been squelched by Allred at a September 2nd news conference in which she said she intended to make sure the boy's allegations against MJ were taken seriously and that the boy was ready to testify in court. In the meantime, as most of Jackson's family proclaimed their support, the L.A.P.D. headed to Las Vegas to search a hotel suite where Jackson allegedly spent the night with the 13-year-old, his mother and sister. But police were unable to produce any physical evidence supporting the alleged molestation, and no charges have been filed. And it seems that LaToya Jackson's estrangement from the Jackson family isn't going to get any better. She told reporters that Michael used to have young boys spend the night in his bedroom at the family home, and she doesn't really know if the molestation allegations might not be true. LaToya also said that she had warned her brother that hanging out with little boys could get him in trouble. MJ's parents Joe and Katherine along with brothers Jermaine, Randy, and Jackie and sister Rebbie left for Taipei September 2nd.

Paterno Exits Hollywood

Peter Paterno won't be returning as president of Hollywood Records when his contract expires in November, Disney top gun Michael Eisner announced August 27th. "Peter started Hollywood Records from scratch and poured tremendous energy into creating an important new entertainment unit for us," Eisner said. Paterno hasn't announced his future plans, and no replacement has been named. Hollywood executive VP Wes Hein will take charge of operations in the interim. Paterno left his highly successful show biz law practice to launch the label in January 1990 but it has never achieved more than a modest level of success. Despite some hefty financial losses, Eisner indicated that he remained committed to keeping the record company as an important part of the entertainment giant's operations.

Upset Promoter Doesn't Get Naughty By Nature

Naughty By Nature abruptly canceled a five-city Texas tour August 19th and Houston promoter Louie Gavrel is threatening legal action against the band and possibly their management. Booking agent for the shows, Stacey Sussman of Famous Artists Agency, reportedly told the promoter that the tour was canceled because "monies for the entire week [of shows] were not forwarded to our office in a timely fashion." But Gavrel told POLLSTAR that the money was transferred to the bank within the agreed upon time and the bank president in Laredo had given the band a reference number to verify the transfer. Gavrel said the group claimed they couldn't hold their tour bus reservation without his money and that was why they were cancelling the show. Gavrel also said the band claimed Famous Artists did not have the authority to book the shows in the first place. An attorney for Gavrel said the group and its management could face a civil lawsuit seeking damages of more than \$500,000. No one from Famous Artists or Flavor Unit management was available for comment, but Cara Lewis at William Morris said that Gavrel's dates were never confirmed and that Famous didn't have the authority to book the act.

Henley vs. Geffen

Don Henley stepped up his legal battle with Geffen Records August 31st when he filed an amendment to his cross-complaint in Los Angeles Superior Court, alleging that Geffen conspired with other major record companies in an effort to blackball him. Geffen had filed a complaint against Henley in January of this year for breach of contract, but Henley's original cross-complaint, filed in March, contends that, under a California statute which limits personal service contracts to seven years, he has a right to leave Geffen and seek a record deal elsewhere. The complaint, filed by heavyweight attorney Don Engel, also alleges that Henley's record deal with Geffen became void when David Geffen stopped being actively involved in the supervision of the company that bears his name. Henley contends that Geffen's direct involvement in the company was a condition of his


contract. The amendment to Henley's cross-complaint goes a step further in alleging that Geffen interfered with Henley's attempts to secure a recording contract with another record company. Specifically, it alleges that David Geffen conspired with top executives from Sony, Time-Warner and EMI in an effort to deprive recording artists, including Henley, the benefits of California's seven-year rule. The rule would free artists every seven years so they could seek the full market value of their services, instead of being forced to remain with one company for their entire career. Henley alleges that the other major record companies agreed not to sign him on the basis of his claim that he is free of his obligations to Geffen because of the seven-year statute. The seven-year statute was enacted 50 years ago to free actors from long-term studio deals, but it has never been fully tested in court. Record companies say they believe the statute won't hold up in court, but they have been reluctant to test it because an adverse ruling could create contractual havoc for every label. Geffen declined to comment on this latest salvo.

Distributors Drop Used CD Battle

CEMA, WEA, UNI and Sony distribution companies have all withdrawn their short-lived policies of not offering co-op advertising to retailers that sell used CDs, provided certain requirements are met to assure that the funds are only used to support the sale of new CDs. The independent announcements, which came August 26th from CEMA, August 30th from WEA, September 1st from UNI, and September 2nd from Sony, will (Continued Page 9)

likely lead to the complete dropping of the Warehouse Records' restraint of trade suit brought against the four companies. A separate but similar action filed by the Independent Music Retailers Association, which represents about 200 music stores across the nation, will likely also fade away.

Still Autograph Crazy After All These Years

Family Feud Over Conway Twitty's Estate

Conway Twitty's family is feuding over control of his estate. Twitty's will named his longtime business manager and his accountant as executors, but one of his daughters, Kathy Jenkins, has filed papers seeking their ouster. Jenkins claims the co-executors told the family the estate was broke, and recommended the immediate sale of Twitty's tour bus and trailer. She said the bus was then sold for less than its value. It also charges family members were not allowed to see the books from two Twitty companies, and that the executors fabricated the money troubles. But Twitty's widow, Dee Henry Jenkins, says she supports Hugh Carden, who has served as Twitty's business manager since 1967, and Donald Garis, a CPA who first worked with Twitty in 1972, as executors. "As the largest single creditor of the estate, I can't imagine that someone who knows nothing about Conway's business could step in and attempt to settle these matters," she said. Twitty's son, Michael Jenkins, says he supports the current executors as well. Twitty's two other children haven't said publicly which side they support, but Kathy Jenkins says they're on her side. Twitty's widow said the children were paid \$45,000 to \$55,000 a year by one of Twitty's companies, but the executors removed them from the payroll because their salaries were a drain on the estate, since the children weren't providing any services. Court papers don't list the value of the state, which includes the Twitty City amusement park outside Nashville.

Ogden Wins Hartford Battle At The 11th Hour

What they had thought was a done deal, unraveled at the last minute as Spectacor withdrew from negotiations with the Connecticut Development Authority to take over the private management of the Hartford Civic Center. SMG's negotiations were terminated August 23rd. On September 1st, Ogden

Entertainment Services announced it had been awarded the management contract for the 16,500-capacity venue. Other Ogden managed facilities include the Great Western Forum, the new Anaheim Arena, the Target Center in Minneapolis, the Sports Palace in Mexico City, the Mullins Center at the University of Massachusetts in Amherst, and the new Olympic 2000 Victoria Station Arena in Manchester, England.

Africa Fete Tour Wrap

Short Items Of Note

Tanya Tucker broke her tailbone after slipping in the shower of her tour bus. She cancelled two shows at the Western Idaho Fair following the August 26th accident, disappointing about 8,700 fans who were already in the stands. Tucker was released from a Boise hospital a day later and wasn't expected to miss any other tour dates..... A chronic abdominal problem sent **Tammy Wynette** to a Jackson, Tenn., hospital for two days of observation on August 28th. Wynette had been en route to a show in Fort Worth which had to be cancelled. The same problem caused Wynette to cancel a performance in Rhode Island in early August..... Still trying to collect more than \$3.5 million in back taxes from **Jerry Lee Lewis**, the IRS went through with plans to auction his lease on a Nesbit, Miss. estate. Keith Sellers, a Memphis car dealer, paid \$32,800 for the lease on August 25th. He is negotiating with the property owner, one of Lewis' former managers, to buy the 6,000-square-foot home outright. Lewis had the legal right to live at the home until his death although he didn't officially own it. The Killer has 180 days to buy back the lease at the auction price plus 20 percent..... **Axl Rose's** ex-girlfriend begs to differ with his account of the jewelry aspect of their breakup. Stephanie Seymour says she's given the jewelry she accumulated during the relationship to her lawyer, and plans to donate the items herself to charity. Last week, Axl's camp announced he filed suit against the model, claiming assault and mental and emotional abuse. He also asked for the return of the jewelry so he could give them to a worthy cause..... **Garth Brooks** has set his sites on Hollywood. Brooks says he's working on a screenplay that grew out of a song on his new (Continued Page 11)

Brooks says he's interested in writing, directing and scoring movies. Acting, Garth says, isn't his bag..... EMI Records Group has snatched a 50 percent interest in **Pendulum Records**. The label's roster includes Digable Planets, Lisa Lisa, and Meli'sa Morgan, among others. Pendulum is headed by Ruben Rodriguez and plans to release seven albums over the next year, which will be promoted by both ERG and Pendulum.

The Trial Of Rick James

Rick James' trial, in which he is accused of assault with a deadly weapon, aggravated mayhem, torture, forcible oral copulation, making terrorist threats and furnishing cocaine, got underway August 23rd in San Fernando, Calif. The criminal charges stem from two separate incidents which occurred in 1991 and 1992. In the opening statements the prosecutor said James is a cocaine addict who thinks he can get away with hurting women. James' attorney argued that the alleged victims are "parasitic groupies" and claimed there is no evidence linking James to their injuries. The alleged victim of the 1991 incident took the stand August 24th and testified that she took crack cocaine and had sex with James for six days before he tortured her because he thought she had stolen some of his coke. She said James called her into his bedroom, tied her naked body to a chair, slapped her in the face with a gun butt, doused her with alcohol and burned her legs and abdomen with a hot cocaine pipe, a lighter and a hot kitchen knife. James let her go after about 40 minutes, saying he doubted she could have lied under such torture, she said. But then he ordered her to have oral sex with his girlfriend, Tanya Hijazi, the 26-year-old woman testified. James then joined the girls and they all had sex together, according to testimony. She went on to testify that she remained with James and Hijazi and continued to take cocaine into the next day, but then she went to the hospital, where administrators called the police because of the severity of the burns. The woman did not tell the police anything and returned to James' home that weekend for more cocaine, she said. A few days later she went back to James' house, and this time he

threatened her because he thought she had told the police about the incident. "He said he could pay someone \$5,000 to rip out my tongue and throw acid in my face," she said. After that incident she decided to go to the police. Mary Sauger, the alleged victim in another incident, took the stand August 30th and testified that in November 1992 James and Hijazi invited her to a room at the St. James Club in West Hollywood to talk about a record label James established. She said Hijazi got angry and began slapping her, and then James joined in the attack. Sauger said she lost consciousness, only to be revived with a glass of water in the face followed by several more hours of slapping. Sauger also testified she still has problems with her left eye. During the trial, James, who could face life in prison if convicted, dozed off and began snoring, prompting the judge to call a 10-minute recess. Earlier this month, Hijazi pleaded guilty to assault with a deadly weapon in the Sauger case in return for having all other charges dropped. She faces a prison term of four years, but the plea bargain agreement does not require her to testify against James. Sauger also filed a civil lawsuit against James and Hijazi August 18th in Los Angeles seeking unspecified damages.

Obituaries

Rockin' Dopsie Sr., 61, the accordion-toting "King of Zydeco," suffered a fatal heart attack August 26th in Opelousas, La. He had not been ill prior to being stricken and had no known history of heart disease. Dopsie, whose real name was Alton Rubin Sr., played on Paul Simon's *Graceland* album and released his first and only major-label album on Atlantic in late 1991..... Former sports agent Lloyd Bloom, 36, was found shot to death at his Malibu residence August 26th. A spokesperson for the sheriff's department said Bloom was shot several times in the upper body. No weapon was found and there were no obvious signs of a break-in. Bloom made national headlines several years ago along with former booking agent Norby Walters when they both became targets of the government after admitting they had signed college athletes for representation before their NCAA eligibility had been completed. The *Los Angeles Times* reported that Bloom owed a number of people money and that several of his associates said they were not surprised about his slaying.

October is the month to be in the Big Apple with PAUL SIMON performing a retrospective look at his career at The Paramount and the Divine Miss M, BETTE MIDLER continues her performances at Radio City Music Hall. Could this be the start of a trend? Major artists performing for a month or more at a single venue?..... The "TROUBADOURS OF FOLK" tour has been cancelled. The first cancellation was followed by announcements of the entire tour being called off with Concert Associates stating the reason being, "Because organizers did not fulfill contractual obligations on schedule." Advance ticket sales had been described by several local promoters as "light."


