Roof Grid Collapses During Concert Set Up

Sixteen crew members were hurt when an overhead grid gave way as workers were setting up the stage for Garth Brooks' landmark shows at Texas Stadium. All the victims of the September 17th accident have since been released from the hospital, and six returned to work the same day. Promoter Glenn Smith said the worst injury was a broken bone. Smith said nearly all the injuries were to members of the local crew working on or near the stage at the time of the accident. Workers were trying to suspend 200,000 pounds of sound and lighting equipment from a honeycomb-shaped steel grid that was to hang from the Mountain Productions' stage roof when the structure suddenly buckled into a "V" shape. So far, the reason the system failed hasn't been determined. Stage crews had to work frantically to replace the faulty structure in time for the shows. "48 hours ago, we had 72 hours of work to do," Smith told POLLSTAR just minutes before the doors opened for the first concert. "The people here have just done a wonderful job getting this show ready to go." Garth did some damage control himself after fans flooded phone lines trying to find out if the shows would still go on. At a press conference, he said the failed equipment was being removed and a new staging and lighting scheme was in place. The new system doesn't use an overhead grid and much of the lighting and sound gear has been suspended from other parts of the football stadium. "Nothing like this has ever been done before," said Smith. It's not clear how much of that was purely out of necessity.

Dr. Dre's Chronic Tour Appears Terminal

Dr. Dre's Chronic Tour was put on indefinite hold after a brush with the law in Milwaukee. But a press release issued by Dre's Death Row Records blames the cancellations on problems with the tour's promoters rather than on any legal problems. Three drivers of vans rented by the tour entourage of Snoop Doggy Dogg and Dr. Dre told police they counted five guns pointed at their heads during an argument over the way to a motel following their Milwaukee concert September 16th. The drivers said they exited the vehicles and walked about a block to a Milwaukee police station to report the incident. Police took five members of the rappers' entourage into custody, but couldn't find Snoop Dogg or Dre. Each van carried about 20 people, including fans. Exactly who carried the guns wasn't clear. A prosecutor said

charges would not be filed because he doubted a jury would convict anyone of armed robbery, and lesser charges would be a waste of time. A lawyer for Snoop Dogg and Dr. Dre said he'd be "absolutely flabbergasted if they have guns because they have security people with them and they don't do that kind of thing." Since he's free on bail and facing murder charges, carrying a gun would be a clear violation for Snoop Dogg, and with all his myriad of legal problems, it wouldn't be good for Dre either. Pine Knob was supposed to be the next stop on the tour, but when the local crew greeted the equipment trucks, the truck drivers had the honor of telling the venue's staff that the rappers weren't coming. Star Lake Amphitheatre was next on the schedule, but the venue didn't receive word of the cancellation until about 8:00 a.m. the day of the show. Other venues were told of the "change of plans" at the beginning of the week. On September 22nd, Death Row Records issued a press release claiming the tour was "postponed due to the failure of the promoter to live up to its obligations." A spokesman for the tour's producer, United Entertainment, told POLLSTAR, "United Entertainment has lived up to its obligations and is in the process of discussing new dates for the tour. United is proud to say that seven shows did go on as planned, there were no incidents at those shows, and those shows were received well. The shows were good, the people in the house were good, and the buildings cooperated with us." But a source close to the tour told POLLSTAR that it probably would have continued if not for the Milwaukee melee. The source said both Snoop Dogg and Dre immediately flew home to L.A. after the van incident. Meanwhile, a judge has reduced the bail for one of the two men arrested with Snoop Dogg earlier this month for the murder of a suspected gang member in Los Angeles. At a September 15th hearing, a judge reduced bail for Sean Smith from \$1 million to \$200,000. Police believe Smith was in a Jeep with Snoop Dogg and the alleged triggerman when the shooting took place. McKinley Lee, who said he was serving as Snoop's bodyguard when he shot a man, is still being held without bail. Snoop Dogg remains free on \$1 million bail.

SHAWN camp

Shawn Camp had dreamed of taking the stage at the Grand Ole Opry ever since he was a very young boy. As a toddler, he played with toy guitars. A real guitar replaced the toys when he was five, and he added mandolin to his cache when he was eight. By the time he hit 15, Camp had picked up the fiddle and started playing with local bands around his home state of Arkansas. After his 16th birthday, he went on the road with a bluegrass band and he's been wearing out highway maps ever since.

Camp was barely 20 years old, and already an in-demand touring player, when his childhood dream was about to be realized. It was his first night working in Nashville, and he was going to be on the Grand Ole Opry with the legendary Osborne Brothers. "It was real scary for me," Camp said. "I just remember that big red curtain comin' up, and walkin' out on that hardwood floor, feeling those boards creak....There's a lot of history and a lot of love in that Opry house...It is something I hope to go back and do with my own music someday."

But the Opry wasn't the only dream the singer/songwriter had. He'd been dreaming of having a record deal for so long, he can't actually remember when it started. He inched his way into the record business by spending 2 1/2 years writing songs for a Los Angeles based music publisher. It was at that time, while he was also doing showcases in Nashville, that he began to draw the interest of several labels. Also during that pre-record deal era, Camp met one of his future managers, Tanya Crouch, who was then working at the publishing company.

Camp eventually found "the right home," with Warner/Reprise Records and was immediately advised by label officials to find a good management team. Crouch, a former Triad Artists agent, had expressed an interest in managing Camp's career, and had been talking about forming a management company with veteran country music talent buyer Bob Romeo. One weekend Romeo visited Nashville and Crouch invited Camp to play some songs for him. "I went over to his hotel and played guitar for him and sung some tunes that I had written....He told Tanya right there, 'Well let's do this, let's try to get this goin'.'" So Crouch and Romeo signed Camp, started Turn Key Management, and opened an office in Nashville.

It was through Camp's relationship with his management team that he got hooked up with Steve Dahl and Cindy Grimes of Monterey Artists. Camp said Dahl and Grimes have booked him in a lot of great opening act slots. He can now look back on sharing the stage with Brooks & Dunn, Tanya Tucker, Suzy Bogguss, Alan Jackson, Trisha Yearwood and Restless Heart, all before he even had a record out. And Camp is eagerly looking forward to a couple of dates in the near future, supporting Charlie Daniels and George Jones. He said he has met Daniels just one time but, "You know, he's a fiddle player too, so it's kinda cool." And the opportunity to open for Jones is something he is also thrilled about. "He's such an influence to everybody in country music, that I'm real excited about gettin' to shake his hand."



But regardless of the big players he is sharing stages with, Camp realizes that he still has a long way to go before he achieves his dream of playing his own music on the Opry stage. "I feel like I definitely have quite a few more dues to pay. I'm just startin' out. I'm a baby act, as far as all this goes. And I just hope I can keep playin' my music long enough to where I can do that."

Along with live performances and a recording contract, the realization of Camp's dream included sharing the radio waves with his childhood idols. But Camp said that may not be realistic in today's environment because of the new nature of country music. "It's different. My dreams....were to be on the playlists as they were in the '60s or '70s....You never think about it till you get here, but the artists have changed so much....It's not the legends that I dreamed of being heard on the radio with. There's great artists now that I respect and admire, but none can compare to the older ones, I guess." Camp said he's been influenced by all kinds of music and his list of favorites is long, including Bill Monroe, Johnny Cash, Elvis, Roger Miller, Tom T. Hall, Ernest Tubb, and Jerry Reed.

Camp is actually melancholy about country radio today. "It's sad to me because there's a lot of pop on country radio....I like that fine, but I feel like country music needs a home, too." However, Camp said it's also a good thing because it's attracted people that were old rock and rollers who are mellowing out. "I'm not knockin' them. I just wish there was a place for the older guys that are still in this business. There are great singers and great performers that can still sell a large number of albums that aren't on the charts. That can't get on the charts because radio won't play them. I think that's a little sad because they're still just as good as they ever were."

Shawn Camp has followed his dreams a long way in 27 years, from pickin' guitar under an Arkansas shade tree to showcasing at the CMA's SRO '93 gathering in Nashville this week. As his first single, "Fallin' Never Felt So Good," works its way up the charts, Reprise is getting ready for the October 26th release of his self-titled debut. All of which puts him one step closer to the day he will play his own music on the stage of the Grand Ole Opry.

World Radio History

Concert Biz At The Forefront In Flood Relief

Nashville Labels Team To Break New Acts

The Nashville arms of Sony, Arista, and Giant Records are coming together to launch "Nashville's New Country," a national tour concept they hope will help break new acts. The idea involves a coordinated effort between the record companies, regional radio stations and country music showcase clubs. The first tour, which features Darryl & Don Ellis (Sony Music/Epic), Dude Mowry (Arista), and Rhonda Vincent (Giant) kicks off October 3rd at In Cahoots in Oklahoma City. The labels hope to eventually establish a regular circuit of clubs which host about one NNC show per month. The costs for the tour are being partially underwritten by the labels but the shows are not free, although admission will be modest for a three act package.

Tix Service Charge Leads To Confrontations

Iconoclastic punk rockers Fugazi played Memorial Hall in Kansas City, Kansas on Saturday, August 28th, but not without a few confrontations with the venue's management. The house lights were brought up during the show after announcements by the band criticizing the day-of-show ticket service charges created crowd control problems, according to building manager Bryant Kincaid. The concert was promoted by a partnership of Kansas City promoters Grant Hall, Jeff Fortier and Dave Budin; and Denver, promoter Doug Kauffman of Nobody in Particular Presents. Fugazi arrived at the hall with the understanding that there would be no day-of-show service charge at the venue. Vertigo Touring's Lisa Miller, the agent booking the tour, said that the band did not want a day-of-show charge because "it didn't make sense to pay a service charge at the box office, and then immediately enter the venue for the show." Kincaid, president of Memorial Management, the private firm hired by the city to manage Memorial Hall said, "That day-of-show service charge is established through the agreement with Ticketmaster and the city and is in place on every show. The boxoffice here operates as a Ticketmaster outlet." Kincaid said that none of this should have been a surprise to the promoters since it was in the rental agreement they signed in June. How the band and its agent came to believe that there would not be a day-of-show service charge is still not clear. In any case, no one told the band and they went ballistic when they found out. According to Kincaid, hand-printed signs containing "derogatory" remarks

about the service charge were hung at the venue. During the show, Fugazi lead singer Ian MacKaye made remarks that operations manager Breck Kincaid described as "... political things against Ticketmaster and their service charge." MacKaye told POLLSTAR, "We criticized [the day-of-show charge], and said it was abusive. I thought it sucked." Reportedly, MacKaye also urged fans to come down from the balcony and join the rest of the people on the floor. All of this prompted the management to turn on the house lights and keep them on for the remainder of the show as the building's security, armed off-duty policeman in uniform, worked to return fans to their proper seats. After the show, several other confrontations occurred between members of the band's entourage and the building's management. David Levine, a technician for Rat Sound, claims he was assaulted and had his video camera broken and then confiscated. Bryant Kincaid said the camera got broken when Levine suddenly turned around and hit him in the head with it as he was trying to clear him out of the lobby so he could lock up. The camera was later returned but not the tape that was in it. Kincaid said he kept the tape because they had no right to take his picture. There were also reports of a gun being waved at crew members, but Kincaid said the only guns on the premises belonged to off-duty police working the show. Members of the Fugazi entourage called police and filed a complaint but by the time officers arrived, the building was locked up and there was little left to investigate.

Short Items Of Note

Meat Loaf's *Bat Out Of Hell II: Back Into Hell* lived up to its name and debuted at No. 3, selling nearly 150,000 units its first week out, according to SoundScan. In an ordinary world that may have put him at No. 1, but Garth Brooks keeps that honor while continuing to move more than 200,000 units a week.... A 9-foot bronze statue of the late Stevie Ray Vaughan will be dedicated October 3rd along the shore of Town Lake in Austin.... An all-jazz cable television channel will be launched by Black Entertainment Television in the fall of 1994. **BET On Jazz: The Cable Jazz Channel** hopes to fill the need for more programming as digital-compression technology increases the number of stations cable systems can carry. The advertiser-supported channel will feature music videos, live in-studio

Michael Jackson

Last week Michael Jackson was hit with a civil suit alleging he molested a teenage boy. This week threats of another lawsuit surfaced when MJ's management told a South African promoter that they were unable to reschedule two concerts there because of logistical problems and political violence. Promoter Anant Singh said the cancellation leaves him with nearly \$300,000 in out of pocket expenses, and he plans to seek legal action for non-performance. MJ, who was originally scheduled to perform in Johannesburg September 30th and October 2nd, did make his two shows in Tel Aviv September 19th and 21st. At the first show, which was attended by about 50,000 fans, more than 300 people were treated for heat exhaustion. The second night MJ broke the all-time Israeli attendance record when about 100,000 people showed up to Tel Aviv's Hayarkon Park. Meanwhile, the police investigation into the molestation accusations continues in Los Angeles. On September 21st two California detectives were sent to Manila to question the Filipino couple who claimed they witnessed "abnormalities" in MJ's behavior toward young boys. After three hours of questioning, neither the Quindoys or the detectives would say much, although Mark Quindoy displayed a diary which he said had extensive details of life at MJ's Neverland estate. However, a TV tabloid show said it had learned that the Quindoys had given the investigators the names of four boys they claim were fondled by MJ at his ranch. MJ's private investigator, Anthony Pellicano said the Quindoys, who used to work at the Neverland ranch, were also motivated by their own failed extortion attempt, just as he insists the original allegations stemmed from a \$20 million extortion plan gone awry. There were several people, however, who came forward

to dispute the allegations against Jackson. In addition to the mother of teenage AIDS victim Ryan White, another former Neverland employee spoke up in MJ's defense.

It's A Cool Idea Mon

In a unique cross-promotion Sony's Columbia/Chaos Records and Associated Booking Corporation have planned a concert tour with seven reggae artists featured on the soundtrack to the up-coming Walt Disney movie "Cool Runnings". The film is a John Candy comedy based on the story of the Jamaican bobsled team that competed in the 1988 Winter Olympics. The all-Jamaican movie soundtrack is the first of its kind since "The Harder They Come" in the 1970s. The uncommon combining of film, recordings and live performances will feature the music of Supercat, Tiger, Tony Rebel, Worl-A-Girl, Wailing Souls, Diana King and Carla Marshall. The soundtrack is set for release September 28th, the movie opens nationwide on October 1st and the tour kicks off October 23rd in Orlando.

Pros On The Move

Doug Logan has resigned as senior VP and head of the facility management division of Ogden Entertainment Services. Ogden announced that it is consolidating its senior management into its New York office, and that Logan declined to make the move for personal reasons. Logan had split his time between the NYC office and his home in Illinois. Personnel from Ogden's Rosemont, Ill., offices, including the Ogden Presents staff, are expected to relocate to NYC by the end of the year when Logan officially departs. Ogden Entertainment executive VP John MacAniff expressed disappointment at Logan's departure. And well he should. When Logan took the job in 1986, Ogden only had four venue management contracts. Today there are 35 in five countries..... **Tommy Mottola** has been upped to president/chief operating officer of worldwide music operations for Sony Music Entertainment. Mottola, who had been head of the U.S. division of the company, will still report to chairman/CEO Michael Schulhof..... **Jill Willis**, executive VP of Paisley Park Enterprises and Prince's co-manager, has left the purple empire, citing philosophical differences. Gilbert Davidson is expected to

Saved By The Tale Of The Tape

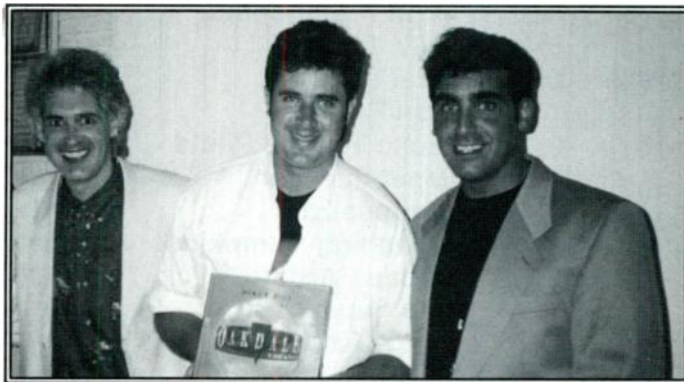
The lead singer of Ugly Kid Joe, Whitfield Crane, plead no contest to a misdemeanor charge of disorderly conduct, and was ordered to pay a \$100 fine and court costs. Crane had originally been charged with felonious assault and inciting violence after an August 27th concert where he allegedly encouraged the audience to follow his lead and attack security guards. The prosecutors agreed to the lesser charge because the band had a videotape of the show that provided conflicting evidence. Crane's attorney said the violation is a minor infraction, and his client is happy the case has been resolved.

Rick James Now Has A Reason To Super Freak

Rick James was convicted on charges of assault, false imprisonment and furnishing cocaine in the criminal trial stemming from two separate nights of alleged drug abuse, kinky-violent sex, and physical and mental torture. James was acquitted on the charge that he tortured one of the alleged victims, Mary Sauger, at the St. James's Club in 1992. The jury deadlocked on the other charges of torture, assault with a deadly weapon, aggravated mayhem, forcible oral copulation, dissuading a witness by force and making terrorist threats, with an 11-1 vote in favor of conviction. The DA said he would seek a retrial on those counts, due to the close nature of the vote. James, who is scheduled to be sentenced October 8th, unsuccessfully requested to remain free long enough to marry his co-defendant, girlfriend and mother of his child, Tanya Hijazi, before her sentencing. Hijazi, who plead guilty to one assault charge in exchange for all other charges being dropped, was sentenced to four years in prison September 21st. At her sentencing the judge said she could return to court on the day James is sentenced so they can

get married. But he also said they would have to find someone else to perform the ceremony for their "farce" of a marriage. James is expected to get nine years in prison, a far cry from the life sentence he would have received if convicted on all counts.

The show, which will be hosted by Vince Gill and Clint Black, will also honor Willie Nelson with the 1993 Hall of Fame Award. SRO'93, the CMA's annual entertainment expo, begins the following day at the Nashville Convention Center. SRO'93 will showcase over 25 artists for the movers and shakers in the country music business. In addition to this week's cover artist, Shawn Camp, the stellar talent line-up also includes Joy White, Doug Supernaw, Brother Phelps, Kelly Willis, Tracy Byrd, Toby Keith, and Lari White.

Raging At A Biggy

A 15-year-old white rapper charged racism after the plug was pulled on his performance at Raging Waters in San Dimas, Calif., September 11th. But the general manager of the water fun park said it was all a publicity stunt pulled by an unknown performer. Biggy Smallz, whose real name is Tim Bigelow, claims Raging Waters officials told him to "get the black dancers off the stage" after he performed a song called "I Like Black Women, Too." His four female dancers were dressed in tight shirts and baggy shorts that exposed the top of their thong bikinis. Park general manager Kent Lemaster told POLLSTAR he received seven complaints during the first two minutes of the performance. "They were asked to stop their show because their show was vulgar and had sexual overtones that were unsuitable for a family theme park," Lemaster said. He added that G-strings aren't allowed in the park. "They would be shut down in Disneyland or any family-oriented park." Lemaster denied that race played a factor in the show's termination. "There were no racist comments made whatsoever," Lemaster said. "We had two black groups perform prior to this group and there were no problems.... We wouldn't hesitate to have those groups back again." The Biggy Smallz camp insists his act isn't lewd, and the manager of

Rapper Busted In Milwaukee

Paul A. Clark, a member of the Florida-based rap group Poison Clan, was arrested in Milwaukee on charges of trafficking in cocaine and being a felon in possession of a firearm. A warrant from Georgia was discovered when the van he was traveling in was stopped for speeding on Interstate 94. A spokesperson for the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Department said, "During a subsequent consent search of the vehicle, a small amount of marijuana, a loaded .38-caliber semiautomatic handgun and a second loaded magazine for the gun were found under the van's carpeting." The other members of the Luke Records act and several of their road crew were questioned and then released.

The Best In Canadian Country

Michelle Wright dominated the Canadian Country Music Awards September 18th when she took home the best female vocalist award for the fourth year in a row. Wright, who was recently named top new female vocalist at the 28th Annual Academy of Country Music Awards, also won the awards for best single and best video for "He Would Be Sixteen," as well as being voted entertainer of the year by fans across Canada. George Fox took home the best male vocalist award. The best vocal group award went to The Rankin Family, who were also awarded the rising star award.

The Twitty Family Feud

A cease-fire of sorts has been reached between Conway Twitty's widow and one of his daughters, but two of Twitty's other children have joined a suit to remove the estate's executors. The restraining order that kept the executors Twitty named from controlling the estate was lifted after an agreement was made between Kathy Ann Jenkins, Twitty's daughter, and his widow, Dee Henry Jenkins. Under the agreement, the executors will now consult with Twitty's children on business decisions. Still pending is a hearing on Kathy Jenkins' petition to remove Hugh Carden and Donald Garis, two of Twitty's long-time business

associates, as executors. Two of Twitty's other children, Joni and Jimmy Jenkins, have joined the suit. They charge the executors are more concerned with protecting the rights of Twitty's widow than the rights of the children.


An Echo From The Branson Boom


Tourism officials in Branson say the number of folks trekking to the country music mecca was down noticeably this summer. They blame the sagging numbers on the Flood of '93. Branson itself did not experience severe flooding, but a chamber of commerce official says the public's perception was that all of Missouri was underwater. Actual visitor counts won't be available until the end of the year, but it now looks like they won't hit the record 5.5 million visitors that had been predicted. If there hadn't been so much growth, the drop-off probably would not have been so obvious. Scores of new motels, theatres and tourism shops have opened in the past year. The quality of that growth is also starting to bother some state officials. A Missouri state agency is warning Branson developers to obey construction laws or risk punishment. "Every John Doe who wants to throw up a hotel or a theatre down there is trying to do it without proper design going into it," said Shirley Cramer-Benson, executive director of the state Board for Architects, Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors. Eighteen months into the investigation, no buildings have been identified as unsafe, according to a report in the *Kansas City Star*. But several architects and engineers are facing disciplinary action for violations that so far haven't been made public.

Country Shorts

The 97th annual Frontier Days celebration in Cheyenne, Wyoming had a record attendance of more than 200,000. Of course the event was bolstered by the fact that Garth Brooks chose to open his tour there..... Clint Black will make his big-screen debut in a new movie based on the TV series "Maverick." Black will play a riverboat gambler alongside Mel Gibson, Jodie Foster and James Garner..... Wynonna Judd has reportedly been asked to be a spokesperson for Ultra Slim Fast. The singer has lost 20 pounds since she started using the "food" product and is now said to be negotiating an endorsement deal.

Between The Dates

The Bonzos are back on the bus! **FIRESIGN THEATRE**, the four-man performing, writing, and producing collaboration which began on Los Angeles radio in 1966, and reached legendary status as a comedy group in the 1970's before they disbanded, is back. Phil Proctor, Peter Bergman, Phil Austin and David Ossman will embark on the "25th Anniversary Reunion Tour Of Firesign Theatre" on October 28th in Denver.... Tickets went on sale this past weekend for the first dates to be announced for the upcoming **PEARL JAM** tour. Pearl Jam, with Urge Overkill supporting, will be at San Jose's Events Center October 30th, and Berkeley's Greek Theatre on the 31st. More dates are in the process of being confirmed.... After **PAUL SIMON** finishes his career retrospective at New York's Paramount, he will play Toronto and Japan as **SIMON & GARFUNKEL**. Art Garfunkel appears as a special guest on the New York dates, but the new shows announced in this week's Route Book will consist of all Simon & Garfunkel material. No word yet on a US tour.... They drive a hard bargain in Rimini, Italy. It was there **THE MIGHTY MIGHTY BOSSTONES**, on tour with Fishbone and Stone Temple Pilots, ran into a person selling bootleg Bosstones and Fishbone merchandise. When members of both bands confronted the peddler, he pulled out a knife and stabbed Joe Gittleman, bass player for the Bosstones, narrowly missing a lung. The Bosstones' road merchandiser was stabbed four times. Both he and Gittleman are recuperating from their injuries. The Bosstones had to drop off the tour, which was in it's final few days, but Gittleman is expected to be in action next week for a music video shoot.... **SUEDE** had to postpone the opening dates of its second US tour due to the death of guitarist Bernard Butler's father. 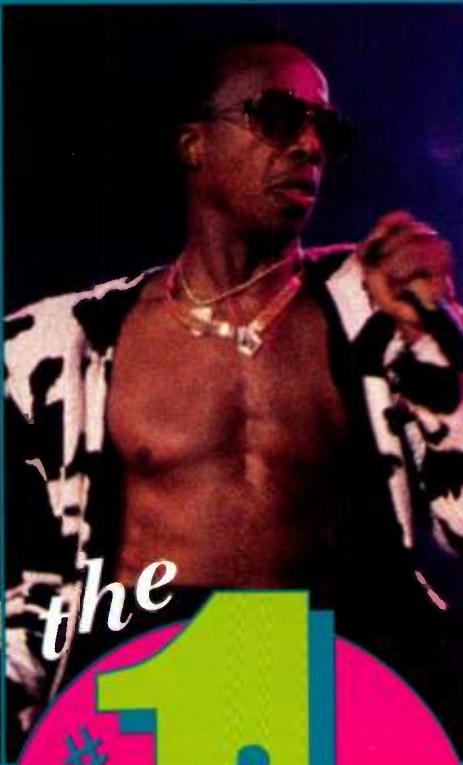

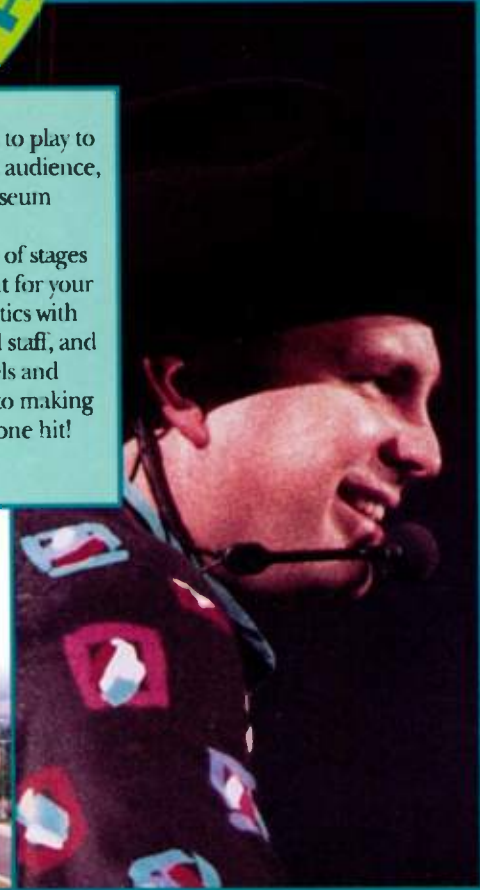

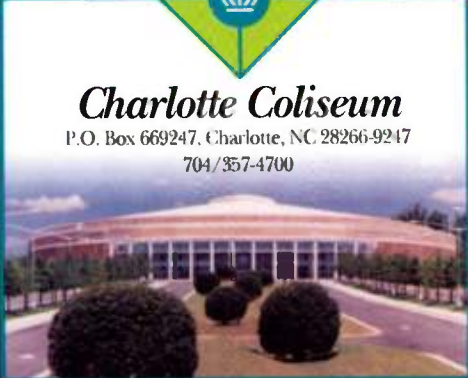
