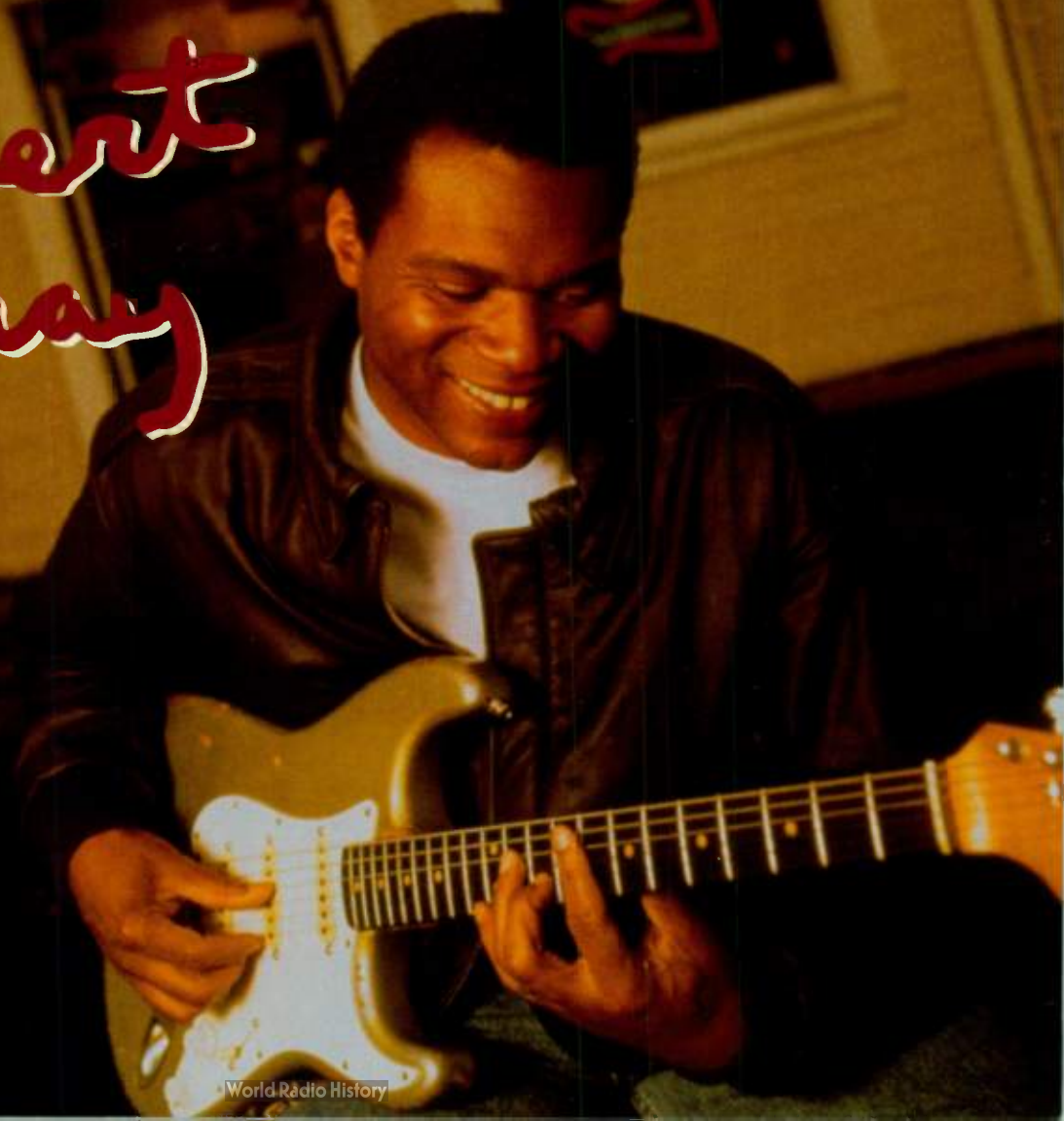


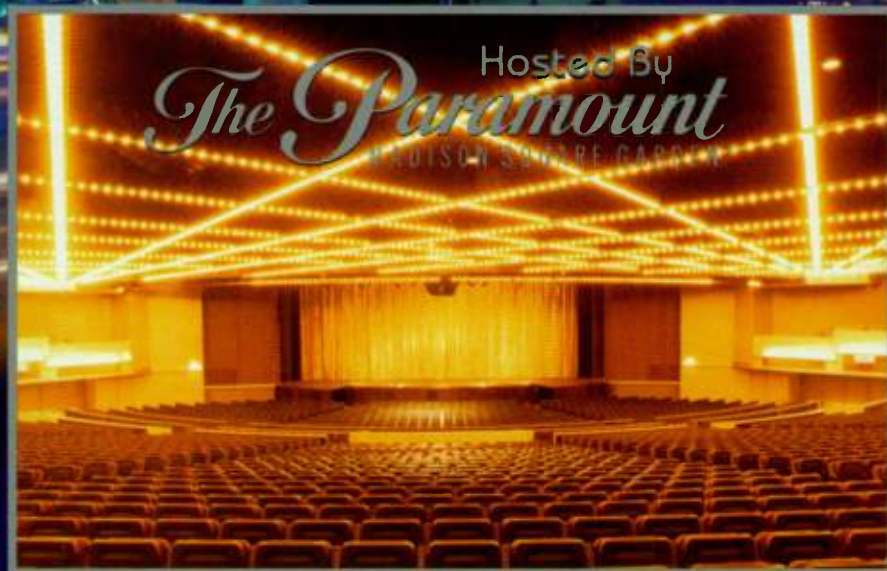

The 1993 Concert Industry Awards

POLLSTAR is pleased to announce that the 1993 Concert Industry Awards will be held January 24th at The Paramount in New York City's Madison Square Garden complex. This marks the return of the event to NYC after three years in Los Angeles. The fully catered awards party will occur in the Paramount's foyer and private clubs, with the awards presentation held in the theatre. Returning to host this year's event is Bobcat Goldthwait. Bobcat had everyone rolling in the aisles at last year's awards at the Pantages Theatre in Hollywood, and we are honored that he will get to reprise his industry skewering on the East Coast. Details on tickets will be announced in the coming weeks, but in the meantime, mark the date on your calendar. And one other thing. If you ever thought of takin' the ball to the hoop against Patrick Ewing on the floor of the Garden, well you'll have to dream on. But playin' a little roundball there against some of your friends and foes just might be a reality. Stay tuned.

Beach Boys Fans May Get Stiffed

Two businessmen from Santa Rosa, Calif., attempted to give concert promoting a shot but abandoned ship when advance ticket sales for an October 3rd Beach Boys concert didn't meet their expectations. Doing business as Grab Bag Productions, the pair had enlisted the help of former Cotati Cabaret owner Steve Heffelfinger to handle the arrangements for the concert at the 8,000-capacity Rohnert Park Stadium, 40 miles north of San Francisco. Heffelfinger, who says he is under contract not to reveal the names of the investors, told POLLSTAR he had been assured that the backing money would be there no matter how the concert went. Grab Bag paid the standard 50 percent deposit but did it in a series of payments. That caused red flags to go up at ICM, and when the agency found out that the tickets for the show weren't even available through the normal BASS computerized outlets, they began to question Grab Bag's ability to stage the concert. As is customary in such situations, the agency asked for the remaining 50 percent of the guarantee up front, but were only given 10 percent more. A couple of days before the show, promotion people for the Beach Boys called a local radio station to coordinate an interview and were informed that the promoter had cancelled the show. Later that day, Heffelfinger left a message with the Beach Boys' office notifying them that the concert was cancelled. In the midst of the business dealings, the 1,000 or more fans who had already laid down \$22.50 were left

out in the cold with nothing but a recorded message at Grab Bag to turn to. The message promised a resolution soon and Heffelfinger told POLLSTAR that refunds were basically the investors responsibility. But ICM agent Robert Norman said Heffelfinger signed the contracts on behalf of Grab Bag and he should also be liable for refunds. In Santa Rosa, ticket buyers are being told that there will be no refunds because all their money went to the Beach Boys. This appears to be a clear breach of contract situation in which the deposit is routinely forfeited to the artist and the promoter normally eats the expenses and refunds the ticket money, which should have been held in trust. That apparently wasn't the case and it doesn't bode well for the fans now holding worthless ducats. ICM pointed out that the original deposit was made before tickets went on sale and it has no plans to return any of the money. On October 6th, the recorded message at Grab Bag was changed, informing callers that the company couldn't get their deposit back from the Beach Boys so they have been forced to file bankruptcy, and any claims should be directed to their lawyers. Heffelfinger's attorney said they are hoping the trustee handling the bankruptcy will continue their attempts to recover the money from the Beach Boys.

Snoopin' Around In Court

Snoop Doggy Dogg and two co-defendants entered not guilty pleas on murder charges stemming from the August shooting death of a reputed gang member. Snoop Dogg was among three people charged with murder after his bodyguard allegedly shot Phillip Waldemariam in a Los Angeles park. Snoop's lawyer claims Waldemariam was stalking the rapper and the shooting was in self defense. Police, however, suspect the incident may be gang-related. The D.A.'s office also added a new count against Snoop October 1st, charging him with being a felon (he was convicted of selling cocaine in 1990) in possession of a firearm. Snoop Dogg remains free on \$1 million bail. Meanwhile, Snoop's manager, Marion (Suge) Knight, who is also the CEO at

Robert Cray

You could probably find Robert Cray rolling the radio dial back and forth during the late '50s and early '60s, trying to absorb the strange sounds that emanated from the speaker. There were lots of different towns — his father was in the Army, so the family didn't stay in one place for long — and the radio stations were playing lots of different music. Of course, there was the blues. But there also was gospel, rhythm and blues, rock and roll, and jazz. "There are only two types of music," Cray says. "Good and bad." Cray liked the whole range of what he heard, but he was especially drawn to the blues. "I wanted to be a blues player because I was just fascinated by the lifestyles," he says. "For example, someone like Howlin' Wolf. On his records you would hear him literally howling on it. Just the idea of him saying in his songs that he had to get out the window, he was sneakin' around, he was a tail-dragger, he was a back door man, all these kinds of things." Cray's love of the music drew him to books about some of the great players. And in 1965, when he was almost 12, he picked up the guitar for the first time.

What you hear when Robert Cray plays guitar and sings today is what happens when everything he's heard over the years gets thrown together, with a distinct slant toward the blues. "When we play, you can hear all kinds of different influences," he says. "It's blues, it's rhythm and blues, it's got rock in it, it's got this and that." Cray sees this as the reason his records have managed to slip onto commercial radio once in awhile, a feat practically unheard of for a blues act in the '90s. "My biggest gripe about the music business is basically with radio and the formats," Cray says. "I remember listening to the radio when you could hear just about anything back-to-back. I mean, it's not just bad for guys playing blues or R&B, but alternative and rock is all separated.... there's this kind of country and that kind of country music. It's ridiculous. If somebody comes along with a new and exciting sound, where's he or she gonna go?"

Then again, when somebody's as talented as Cray, he or she will generally get noticed sooner or later — even by radio. Cray was "discovered" in 1977, when the Robert Cray Band played the San Francisco Blues Festival for the first time. "We were really ecstatic the day after because I got my little picture in the *San Francisco Chronicle*, and it was really cool," he says. The buzz from the festival helped his group to land a spot on a bill with John Lee Hooker, where Mike Kappus of the Rosebud Agency first approached him. "He said that he wanted to handle us, but at that time his roster was pretty full and he didn't have enough people to take care of us," Cray said. But Kappus did put Cray on a short Muddy Waters tour. Muddy brought Cray out nightly for an encore and started calling him his new adopted son. "Playing with Muddy made me pretty nervous," Cray says. "But I got a chance to sit back and talk with him and he made me feel pretty comfortable." Kappus took over the booking of Cray's band a



couple of years later, and has been managing them as well for about eight years.

Cray's band has recorded eight albums since 1978, including the just-released Mercury recording *Shame + A Sin*. Cray sees the new album as his return to more traditional blues after adopting a more R&B sound on his previous two releases. "We had the opportunity to work with the Memphis Horns," Cray says of his prior releases. "And knowing they were in the band, I wanted to use them to full advantage. The R&B is just as important as the blues, as far as my taste is concerned. Then for this new record they left, so it was a whole different scene." *Shame + A Sin* also marks the first time Cray has produced an album himself. "We wanted to do things a little bit different," he says of the recording process. "We got an upright piano and messed around with it a little bit...kind of detuned it in certain spots. We took the head off of the bass drum on some of the songs, kept some of the first-take solos with the band in the room at one time. We just had a whole lot of fun."

But it's performing before a crowd that gives Cray the most pleasure. "It's fun in the studio, but that's not what the whole thing's about," he says. "It's playing for the people." The slow economy kept Cray from touring as much as he would have liked over the past year, but things are looking up. He recently kicked off a new North American tour, which has dates scheduled through December 3rd and more to be announced. And he headlined the San Francisco Blues Festival for the first time September 26th, which he admits was both a great honor and a nerve-racking experience. "It was actually a whole lot of pressure because I live here in the Bay Area now, and there had been so much press," he says. "My picture was on the poster — I couldn't go anywhere without seeing it. I had a good time but I was glad when it was done with." Cray says the nervousness was odd, because he normally doesn't feel pressure when he's performing. "I have a couple places where it makes me really nervous to play. That's home, either where my parents live up in the Northwest, or here in the Bay Area. Other than that, I can go anywhere and feel pretty comfortable."

As he approaches his 20th year as leader of his own band, Robert Cray will also have the honor of co-hosting the 14th annual W.C. Handy Blues Awards on October 10th in Memphis. Cray has won eleven "Handys" to go with his six Grammys over the years, and says he's grateful he's been able to follow his musical instincts. "Whether we're playing the rhythm and blues or the blues, it's always been our choice," he says. "And that's really cool."

Banks Move To Foreclose On Mountain Winery

The owner of the Mountain Winery in Saratoga, Calif., is facing foreclosure proceedings again. Tokai Bank, the major lender, and another lender, San Jose National Bank, are reportedly owed more than \$3 million. On September 30th, Tokai Bank asked a judge to seize owner Ray Collishaw's personal assets, according to a report in the *San Jose Mercury News*. The judge is scheduled to make a decision on that in three weeks. Since July, three artists have cancelled dates at the venue claiming payments weren't made as promised. Tokai Bank started foreclosure proceedings at the end of the 1992 concert season, but backed off when Collishaw agreed to hand over proceeds from this year's concert series to the bank. More than \$2 million of the \$4 million debt to Tokai Bank has been paid since then, but the bank says Collishaw is now \$800,000 behind schedule. San Jose National Bank, of which Collishaw was a founding director, says Collishaw has defaulted on a \$2.5 million loan. The loan was secured by the winery property and vacant commercial property south of San Jose. In court papers, Collishaw's lawyers call the banks vindictive and coldhearted, and say to meet their demands will force Collishaw into bankruptcy.

Bon Jovi Faces Riots And Rental Counters

Bon Jovi fans have created quite a ruckus in Southeast Asia during the band's recent concert appearances in the Philippines and Thailand. Crowd control problems erupted at both the September 29th and 30th Bon Jovi concerts at Manila's Rizal Memorial Baseball Stadium. Several people were arrested and

scores of fans were hurt September 29th after the group stopped the concert because of heavy rains. Angry fans pelted the stage with soda bottles, broke chairs and set fires after the band failed to return from a 30-minute break. Independent television station ABS-CBN said Jon Bon Jovi had threatened to stop the concert earlier after fans got out of control and broke through the divider between the 200 peso seating area and the 1,200 peso (\$41) seats in front of the stage. Some ticket holders were requesting a refund because Bon Jovi only performed five songs, but most were apparently satisfied with gaining entrance to the following night's performance. Overcrowding at that show apparently resulted in more riotous behavior at the stadium. And the chaos wasn't limited to the venues. While Bon Jovi made their way through the Bangkok airport October 3rd, hundreds of fans pushed past security forcing members of the band to scatter. Jon Bon Jovi reportedly jumped over a car rental counter and had to hide in a closet until Thai police regained order.

Madonna: The Anti-Value

Despite Rabbis in Tel Aviv calling for her to tone down her show and police blocking her attempts to visit holy sites in Jerusalem, Madonna succeeded in presenting her October 5th concert in tact as well as visiting the religious sites uninterrupted. However, she did cause a bit of a ruckus when she refused to stay at Jerusalem's luxurious King David Hotel because she didn't have a whole floor to herself. Madonna intended to stay in Jerusalem because she wanted to be closer to the holy sites. But when the hotel said they couldn't provide the Material Girl and her entourage with an entire floor because the week she was there it was Sukkoth, one of three Jewish holidays of pilgrimage to Jerusalem, she packed up and moved to Tel Aviv. After two days of sightseeing, including sneaking into Jerusalem's Old City disguised as an elderly woman, Madonna took the stage in front of 50,000 screaming fans. She impressed the audience by peppering her greetings with some Hebrew. But she did commit a faux pas by describing the proudly secular Tel Aviv as "holy." Also on October 5th, top Roman Catholic officials in Puerto Rico called for the cancellation of Madonna's October 26th concert in San Juan. Cardinal Luis Aponte Martinez said, "Madonna is an anti-value for the Puerto Rican people, the church and our youth."

MCA Concerts Strikes New Gorge Deal

MCA Concerts Northwest and local officials in Grant County, Wash., have negotiated a truce that will limit the size of future shows at The Gorge amphitheatre if MCA purchases the venue. Residents of the area surrounding the remote amphitheatre, located 140 miles outside of Seattle, have complained that large concert crowds are causing problems. "You try and keep peace in the valley and work with them, not against them," said Neil Jacobsen, who heads MCA Concerts Northwest. "And they've been very fair." There are about 52,000 residents in communities surrounding The Gorge, but the venue has drawn crowds of 18,500 from an area that stretches from Oregon to Idaho. Next year, the promoters can have five concerts with up to 18,500 people, three with up to 15,000 and 12 with up to 13,500. "If I

could do 20 shows there next year, I would be ecstatic," Jacobsen told POLLSTAR. "We did 14 this year which was a record for the venue; 20 would be great." The new agreement also requires MCA to pay for reserve law officers at the site, give fans information packets, improve lighting and signs, and clean up the site. "On our own we were doing a garbage patrol around the community, to clean up after shows," Jacobsen said. "We were already doing all these things which now are written [into the agreement]." Meanwhile, Jacobsen says MCA is close to completing a deal to buy The Gorge site from its private owners.

Legal Grievs

Officials at the Guthrie Theatre in Minneapolis suspect an employee theft accounted for about a fourth of the venue's \$400,000 operating deficit for the 1992-93 season. The matter has been turned over to the police for criminal investigation. "The loss is at least \$100,000, but more investigation will be needed to pinpoint the precise amount," a theatre spokesperson said. Citing the ongoing investigation, police and theatre officials refused to identify the employee or provide further comment.... Allman Brothers guitarist Dickey Betts pled guilty to disorderly conduct October 5th and was fined \$295 for pushing a police officer who tried to intervene in an argument between Betts and his wife. The July 31st incident occurred at the couple's hotel room in Saratoga Springs, NY following an Allman's show at SPAC.... The civil case brought against Axl Rose by a man who claims he suffered a permanent back injury in a concert melee is about to get underway. William Stephenson says he was hurt when he was struck by Rose at GN'R's disastrous July 1991 show at the Riverport Amphitheatre outside St. Louis. Stephenson had been taking pictures of the show when Rose stopped the show and dove into the crowd. The trial is expected to begin this week.... Onyx rapper Sticky Fingaz, a.k.a. Kirk Jones, is facing misdemeanor battery charges after allegedly assaulting a passenger on a New York-bound United Airlines flight, according to a report in *Entertainment Weekly*. When the flight attendant asked Jones to turn off his Walkman during take-off, he threw it at her. Another passenger on the flight reportedly said, "come on, guys," and by the time he turned around, three

members of the Onyx entourage were on top of him. Onyx's manager claims that the Jones didn't hear the attendant, and the other passenger, who was treated for bruises at a Chicago hospital, provoked the attack..... **Chuck D** of Public Enemy has settled a lawsuit with the McKenzie River Corporation, which manufactures St. Ides Malt Liquor. Chuck D had sued the company for \$5 million two years ago after it used an unauthorized sample of his voice on a commercial for the malt liquor. The rapper has been known for publicly condemning malt liquor companies for targeting their advertising at black youths. D's attorney said the undisclosed sum of the settlement was "substantial."..... A group of California ticket buyers have been granted class-action status in their lawsuit against **Ticketmaster** and **BASS**. The San Francisco Superior Court action alleges antitrust practices by the two companies. The class-action status allows 10 plaintiffs to potentially include the millions of other Californians who have purchased tickets from TM or BASS and paid their service charges. The suit alleges the two ticket firms illegally agreed to not compete in each others territory, in essence, agreeing to share in an off-site, state-wide, ticket sellers' monopoly. The granting of class-action status does not necessarily mean that the case has any merit..... **Wilson Pickett** was sentenced October 1st to one year in jail and five years probation after pleading guilty to a charge of assault by auto stemming from an accident in which he hit an 86-year-old pedestrian. Pickett, 52, also must pay a \$5,000 fine, continue to receive alcohol treatment and perform 200 hours of community service specifically related to drunken driving education. Pickett will begin serving his sentence January 3rd, but will return to the courthouse October 20th for the resumption of a trial over an unrelated drunk driving incident in May 1991.

Short Items Of Note

Toronto looks to be a shoo-in for the next NBA franchise, but a group headed by concert promoters **Michael Cohl** and **Bill Ballard**, which also included Magic Johnson, won't own the team. The league's expansion committee is recommending a Toronto group headed by catering and food service company exec John Bitove Jr. be allowed to buy an expansion franchise. The group intends to build a 22,000 seat downtown arena which won't be shared with the Maple Leafs hockey franchise. The team is expected to play its first season in 1995-96 at The SkyDome while the new arena is under construction..... It was a good year for at least two major venues. The **Pine Knob Music Theatre** outside Detroit boasted an attendance increase of more than 46,000. Pine Knob, perhaps the most active major shed in the country, had 83 shows and sold over 706,000 tickets during its 1993 season. On the indoor arena front, **The Spectrum** in Philadelphia also has something to brag about. The venue hosted 13 concerts in September, more than any other arena its size that month..... **Ian Copeland** has signed a book deal with Simon & Schuster to publish his autobiography. Copeland had originally sold the rights to his story to Bantam Books in 1989, but Bantam kept sending it back because they wanted more dirt on F.B.I.'s bands. Copeland was represented by William Morris in the deal..... **Boblo Island's** management team decided to close the Michigan amusement park for the season after its owner was seriously injured in a traffic accident. Michael Moodenbaugh was in critical condition at Riverside Hospital in Toledo last week. Park staffers felt there weren't enough senior employees

to coordinate upcoming events. An October 9th show by Acid Test was the only concert date remaining on Boblo Island's schedule, and had to be cancelled..... **Garth Brooks** and his wife Sandy are expecting their second child. Due date unknown.

CMA Goes SRO Again

To the surprise of — well, no one, really — Garth Brooks took home the touring artist of the year trophy at the fourth annual SRO Awards, sponsored by the Country Music Association. A record crowd of more than 700 registrants attended the confab October 1st at the Nashville Convention Center. The awards honor outstanding professional achievement in the country music touring industry. Suzy Bogguss hosted the ceremonies, and Carlene Carter and Doug Stone provided the foot-stomping entertainment. Among the award presenters were Hal Ketchum, Doug Supernaw and Deborah Allen. The 21-year-old Hughes twins directed "Menace II Society," and also served as executive producers of the movie's soundtrack.... Industry veterans Stephen Powers and Don Grierson have formed **Drive Entertainment**. The new multifaceted company includes a new label which plans to focus on family and children's music. First release comes this month from Sharon, Lois & Bram.

Pros On The Move

Ogden Entertainment Services has named **Ron Ewing** executive director of the Hartford Civic Center in Connecticut. Ewing, who has held top posts in four Ogden-managed facilities, was most recently executive director of the Sioux Falls Arena in South Dakota. Ogden took over the Hartford venue's management September 1st.... Geffen/DGC Records has appointed **Bob Catania** to its national promotion staff. Catania, who comes to Geffen/DGC from his position as VP of top-40 promotion at Elektra, will set up shop in New York, but will report to label GM Bill Bennett in Los Angeles.... **Shelton Stanfill** has resigned his position as president/CEO of the Wolf Trap Foundation for the Performing Arts to become president of the Los Angeles Music Center.... **Lawrence Lahaie** has been tapped as the new public events manager for the City of Omaha. He was director of operations at the America West Arena in Phoenix until May of this year. He'll oversee the renovation of the 10,000-plus seat Civic Auditorium and manage the 2,700-seat Orpheum Theater and 19,000-seat Rosenblatt Stadium.

Perhaps It's Time To Get Outski

Some musicians visiting Moscow found themselves watching troops attack the Russian parliament building last week. Dan Seals was practicing at a Moscow hotel when the fighting started about two miles away. He was appearing in Moscow as part of the 54-member Baha'i World Congress Choir which had sung in Red Square for Moscow television only hours earlier. "We've been rehearsing with machine guns accompanying us," choir director Tom Price said. The group was invited to perform throughout Russia, Ukraine and Moldavia. Michigan rock band Somthin' Wild also witnessed the fighting from their 23rd floor hotel room after their last gig in a three-night tour of Moscow clubs. The lucky group, which has since returned home, won the tour in a battle of the bands sponsored by WRIF-FM in Detroit.

Woodstock In The '90s

Three organizers of the 1969 Woodstock festival, John Roberts, Joel Rosenman and Michael Lang, have won a round in the fight to present "the official" 25th anniversary concert. After losing a bid to hold the show on Yasgur's Farm, the site of the original concert, the promoters, who are operating under the name Woodstock Ventures, took their proposal to the town where they originally wanted to stage the '69 festival, Saugerties, New York. The Town Board of Saugerties voted unanimously September 22nd to approve the concept of "Woodstock II," which is to be held August 13-14, 1994. The agreement will net the town \$4 per ticket. The promoters hope to draw 250,000 people, only this time they would like them all to buy tickets. Meanwhile back on Yasgur's Farm in Bethel, the National Multiple Sclerosis Society proceeds with competing plans for "the Festival at Yasgur's Farm," complete with \$150 tickets and security provided by the National Guard and overseen by retired NATO commanders.

Obituary

Joseph Astrella, 39, who most recently worked as a guitar tech on Tina Turner's tour, died in Shrewsbury, Mass., October 3rd after a short illness. A road veteran since the mid '70s, he had also worked for The Cars, Hall & Oates, Stevie Wonder and Boston.

Look for white sign." They should have added a reminder to gas up before leaving because it's out in the desert beyond Palm Springs more than 100 miles from L.A.... **INXS** hits the road November 5th in Tampa. Although most of the venues will be announced when tickets go on sale, a couple of shows will be at locations that won't be announced until shortly before showtime. Such is the case for the October 9th show in Atlanta. Those concerts will take place at smaller, more intimate venues....
