Ed Leffler

Ed Leffler, 57, died of thyroid cancer October 16th at Cedar Sinai Medical Center in Los Angeles. Leffler, who was managing Van Halen and Jude Cole at the time of his death, began his career in the music industry 30 years ago as an agent at GAC. In the past, he had managed The Osmonds, The Carpenters and Petula Clark. He also managed Sammy Hagar's pre-Van Halen solo career and came on board as the band's manager shortly after Hagar replaced David Lee Roth. Leffler's E.L. Management is expected to wind down its affairs in the coming weeks before closing its doors. Although he was a tenacious negotiator on behalf of his clients, Leffler was also among the most widely respected managers in the business. In lieu of flowers, the family has asked for donations to the Ed Leffler Children's Cancer Research Fund at (310) 474-6313.

Axl vs. Stump

Axl Rose was in court last week to face civil charges that resulted from the July 1991 riot that broke out at the Riverport Amphitheatre near St. Louis during a Guns N' Roses concert. William "Stump" Stephenson took the stand October 18th and testified that he and a friend pushed their way to the front of the stage and then he held up a card bearing the name of his motorcycle club, the Saddle Tramps, trying to encourage Rose to take it. A videotape of the concert played earlier in the trial shows Rose, apparently irritated, taking the card and immediately tossing it aside. The videotape then revealed that when Rose spotted Stephenson taking unauthorized photographs, he yelled to the security guards to take his camera away. When the guards didn't respond promptly enough for Axl he said, "Never mind, I'll get the [expletive] thing myself," and then proceeded to jump off the stage. Stephenson testified that Rose landed on top of him and punched him several times causing ear and back injuries. But Rose's attorney claimed that Stephenson's lifestyle, including heavy weight lifting, frequent concert-going and a previous ear injury, was responsible for any injuries he suffered. And an orthopedist testified October 19th that Stephenson didn't appear to have any back trouble that could be attributed to the incident. The doctor told jurors that the slight bulge in one of Stephenson's spinal discs likely was a "degenerative phenomenon" resulting from an arthritic condition. When Axl took the stand as the first defense witness October 20th, he admitted that he did jump into the crowd, but only to take the camera away from Stephenson.

Earlier in the trial, jurors were shown another videotape where Axl, dressed in a t-shirt that said "St. Louis Sucks," testified that he only intended to stop Stephenson from taking unauthorized photos. Stephenson is seeking unspecified actual and punitive damages. An interesting note in the trial is that special precautions were taken to sneak Axl in and out of the courtroom, but apparently it was unnecessary. Only a handful of fans showed up to see the rocker appear in court, although the day he actually testified the courtroom was packed. The case was expected to go to the jury shortly. Meanwhile, the members of Guns N' Roses were acquitted October 21st of charges of drug abuse, possession and obscenity, which stemmed from a July 16th raid of the band's hotel rooms and private backstage areas in Buenos Aires, Argentina. When Argentine officials called in anti-drug squads and heavily armed troops to search GN'R's quarters, the hardest drugs they found were a stash of vitamins.

the cranberries

Three years ago when Noel and Mike Hogan, and their boyhood friend Fergal Lawlor started looking for a vocalist to accompany the instrumental songs they were writing, they never imagined that their musical hobby would garner the international attention that The Cranberries have since received. At that time, Noel was 18 years old, his brother Mike was 17, and the woman who completed their lineup, Dolores O'Riordan, and their drummer Lawlor were both 19. Noel Hogan told POLLSTAR that a lot has changed since Dolores joined the band. "Since then we've seen a lot and done a lot. We've traveled the whole world and...I think we've kind of grown up a bit...One day we were in Limerick [Ireland] in a room on our own. Nobody knew us and we were just rehearsing and it was grand. And then a few weeks later we were being flown around to play. We were brought to London for the first time...We knew nobody, and we didn't know what way the business worked."

But the unfamiliarity with the business didn't stop The Cranberries from pursuing the world that awaited them. As they wrap up their co-billed role on Suede's tour and get ready to support Duran Duran on the next leg of their North American tour, Noel, Mike, Dolores and Fergal prepare to take the stage in front of more people than they ever could have imagined at this early stage of their careers. Hogan said, "When we originally come over here [to America] we thought we'd be playing small clubs, to like 20 people....We thought it would be maybe two or three albums before our name would be known anywhere. But then it turned out to be the complete opposite of what we expected. I'm not really sure if it's a good thing or a bad thing yet... 'cause I think a band should be given a bit of time to build and not be huge today and gone tomorrow."

But The Cranberries haven't had the time to ease into their career. Hogan said Dolores had only been with the band for 12 weeks when they sent their demo to a few record companies. "We got a lot of response back....Then we did another demo soon after that...and sent that away. And it just built up more record company interest." Hogan said the interested companies wanted them to go to London to play, but the band couldn't afford to do that. "So they started coming around to see us or paying for us to go to London." Hogan said virtually every major label showed interest in the band. He said at one point they played a gig in Limerick and there were 32 A&R people there. Hogan said getting all that attention from the industry was scary and weird. "When we started it was just a hobby....It wasn't any big ambition. And when we did actually first record a demo, we didn't do anything with it until people that we knew around us said that we should send it away.... So we did, and then this all happened. It was something we didn't expect at all."

The Cranberries eventually signed with Island Records. Hogan said it was the trust they felt for the people at Island, rather than what the company promised to do for the band, that clinched the deal.

After they signed with Island they started looking for people to handle their career. "At first we were really young, so we didn't think we could handle it on our own....We got managers and all these type of people around us....It was grand for awhile because

we didn't have anything to worry about, we thought. But then we realized that things were no longer in our hands, that everybody was making decisions for us, and we were just kind of like puppets." Hogan said about a year after they signed with Island they got rid of the manager they were using. "It was at that stage that we took things into our own hands and decided that we were going to run our own lives and not hire people to do it for us. The way we work it now is that we make all the decisions and we're really happy with that. At least we all know what's going on." Hogan said he doesn't think that the industry people he'd crossed paths with meant any harm. "It's just if you let them take control too much they forget that you've got a life as well."

They enlisted the help of Rough Trade's Geoff Travis, who had signed the musically similar band The Sundays, as well as The Smiths, one of Hogan's major influences. Hogan said, "He just did it as kind of a friend at first. He was really into what we were doing, and he always kept in touch with us....Then we went through all these management troubles and things so he helped us....Later on, we asked him to manage us and he's been with us now a pretty long time, about two years." But while working in the United States, The Cranberries have a temporary management arrangement with Metropolitan Entertainment. "We're kind of on a trial with them, but there's nothing really sorted out as such, we're not really sure what the story with that is yet."

The Cranberries are booked in the U.K. and Europe by The Asgard Agency in London. When it came time to select an American booking agency, they told the two agencies that were interested in the band to get them a tour, and whoever landed them the best offer would be the agency they went with. Mitch Rose at Creative Artists Agency gave it a shot, and succeeded. "They got us the The The tour...and the tour we're on at the moment," Hogan said of the Suede tour they have just finished up.

Hogan said The Cranberries are happy with their current touring experience, but mixed in with their joy is a bit of fear. The thought of going from 300-capacity clubs to bigger venues with Duran Duran, like The Hollywood Bowl for example, is a bit overwhelming for the band. "It's going to be mad....At first, the size of the places and the crowds will be kind of scary for us....It'll take us a few weeks to adjust....[But] it will be good for us to get used to that, to get to know how things like that work." Hogan still wonders if the success of their first album, *Everybody Else Is Doing It, So Why Can't We?* will be a curse or a blessing. "It's a pressure I don't think we foresaw." Hogan said the only control they have over that situation is to continue to write good songs. "Just keep worrying about that and let the rest happen kind of behind your back."

Bring Up The House Lights Quick

The Budweiser Superfest show at The Great Western Forum in Inglewood, Calif., October 15th was cut short when a full-tilt fight broke out in front of the stage, complete with chair-throwing and physical brawling allegedly between rival gang members. The pandemonium at the show, which was headlined by Bell Biv DeVoe, broke out during SWV's set, and sent thousands of concert-goers scrambling toward the exits. The house was cleared before Inglewood police arrived in riot gear and there were no arrests made. Even though the concert was cut short, BBD had already played and a spokesperson for The Forum said the remaining acts, Big Daddy Kane and Silk, may have not performed anyway because the concert was already running late. No refunds were given and there were no reported injuries.

Elvis Was A No-Show But DiCamillo Was There

Short Items Of Note

Meat Loaf's *Bat Out Of Hell II* moved to the top of the SoundScan retail chart last week but don't expect him to hang onto the top spot for long. Pearl Jam released its new album titled *Vs.* on October 19th, and reports are it is blowing out the doors. Overanxious fans in Madison, Wis., shattered a display window at a record store when the crowd of about 300 fans who had lined up outside pressed against the glass. Three people were hurt but the store still reported selling 800 CDs within an hour of going on sale at midnight.... An unidentified woman tumbled 25 feet from the upper-deck at Veterans Stadium in Philadelphia after Game 3 of the World Series. A helicopter flew the woman to a hospital for evaluation. It wasn't immediately clear if the woman lost her balance or was pushed.... The irrepressible Kix Brooks customized his face when he accidentally hit himself with his guitar during Brooks & Dunn's encore October 15th at the Civic Center in McMinnville, Tenn. The wound required seven stitches.... Elton John's contributions to the fight against AIDS were applauded at the dedication of a state-of-the-art AIDS clinic in Atlanta October 14th. John, who lives in Atlanta, spoke briefly and was presented with a glass sculpture in honor of his commitment. Meanwhile, John and longtime-collaborator Bernie Taupin have reportedly asked author and comedian Stephen Fry to write a script for a musical which uses John/Taupin songs as

an aspect of the plot. Songs for the provisionally titled "The Trials of Eddie Davis" will include "Rocket Man" and "Goodbye Yellow Brick Road." The play, in which a songwriter falls into a coma and lets his imagination put his own life on trial, could open in London sometime next year.... There won't be a Big Banana Blues Party on the Caribbean island of St. Lucia this December after all. The three-day music festival that was to include artists like Robert Cray, Sting and Albert Collins was thrust into limbo last week after its major backer, Chrysalis, bowed out. Promoter Paxton Baker said that last minute efforts to find someone else to bankroll the show were unsuccessful.... Boxcar Willie used CPR to help save the life of a fan who had a heart attack in his Branson, Mo. theatre October 16th. Boxcar was signing autographs when the man collapsed in the lobby. The victim remained hospitalized in serious condition last week.... Concert Productions International is celebrating its 20th anniversary with a Simon and Garfunkel concert November 12th and a free Soul Asylum show November 8th. The Simon and Garfunkel show, which will be at Toronto's SkyDome, is a benefit to raise money for the local United Way. The free Soul Asylum show at The Warehouse on Toronto's waterfront is the company's way to say thank you to all the fans who have attended their CPI shows over the years.... The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame announced October 20th that John Lennon, Bob Marley, The Band, Elton John, Duane Eddy, Grateful Dead, Rod Stewart, and The Animals will be inducted at the 1994 ceremonies January 19th at the Waldorf Astoria in New York.

Agency For The Performing Arts plans to open an office in Nashville before the end of the year. Bonnie Sugarman will relocate from APA's Los Angeles office and will be joined by an as-yet-unannounced Music City booking veteran..... He's still Chevy Chase but the theatre is not. No sooner had his ill-fated late night talk show bit the dust, than painters scaled the Chevy Chase Theatre in Hollywood to wipe out any trace of the show. The building has gone by many names over the years, the last pre-Chevy moniker was the Aquarius Theatre. Perhaps it will become the Howard Sternatorium next..... Sub Pop came to an out-of-court settlement with Caroline Records which negated the remaining contract between the indie label and the Virgin-owned distributor. The undisclosed settlement came simultaneously with a new agreement between Sub Pop and Warner Music Group's Alternative Distribution Alliance. ADA, which distributes Restless, Matador and Mute, will re-release three recent Sub Pop titles which were distributed by the label itself after they had filed the \$12 million dollar suit against Caroline..... Mammoth Records has agreed to extend its exclusive indie distribution relationship with R.E.D. for three more years.

Phil Collins Wins Landmark EC Copyright Case

The European Court of Justice in Luxembourg closed two EC loopholes in the copyright protection laws governing artists' recordings. The court ruled October 20th that according to the rules of the EC Treaty, Phil Collins had to be given the same protection as German artists, something the German government hadn't previously granted foreign artists. The ruling will allow Collins to now initiate a German court action to stop sales of a bootleg recording of a 1983 concert that was recorded in

California. In a related case, the European court also ruled that recordings by Cliff Richard were governed by German copyright law even when they are imported from Denmark.

Legal Grievs

A 34-year-old Frenchman is suing everyone involved in a July 14th U2 concert in Marseille, claiming his hearing was seriously impaired after he attended the show. Mohamed Fofana said he sat as close to the stage as possible, and the buzzing and hissing sounds that suddenly drowned out the music didn't stop when the concert ended. A Marseille court will examine the case October 27th in an effort to determine if Fofana's hearing problems could be attributed to the sound equipment at the show..... One of the late Conway Twitty's daughters wants Tennessee officials to change a law guaranteeing a widow gets a third of her husband's estate, a home and a year's support. Kathy Jenkins thinks her father was unaware of the law, and already has sued to have the executors of Twitty's estate removed. The attorney representing the estate says Twitty was aware of the one-third law, and that Jenkins has a vendetta against Twitty's widow. Twitty's four

children each will receive one-sixth of the estate and about \$70,000 each from an insurance policy. The widow received several million dollars from insurance policies, a \$2.5 million house and a luxury car, Jenkins says. Meanwhile, a judge has denied a request by three of Twitty's children that the estate's executors be dismissed immediately. But the court ordered the executors to file an inventory and interim accounting of the estate by November 30th..... Fearing that the owner of the **Mountain Winery** in Saratoga, Calif., is near bankruptcy, the Tokai Bank obtained a writ in Santa Clara County Superior Court October 19th attaching about \$4 million of his personal property. Developer Ray Collishaw has fallen behind on loan payments to several banks, and the winery venue along with his house are facing the possibility of seizure if a settlement isn't reached. This year's Mountain Winery concert season ended quietly last week..... The president of the Nashville Association of Talent Directors, Miles Bell, plans on writing to Vice President Al Gore to seek help in defeating the proposed legislation to change the labor relations status of live performing artists. The NATD board is appealing to the VP to help him understand how devastating the passage of new laws would be to the industry. The AFM backed change would make artists **employees** rather than the independent contractors they now are. NATD contends that most musicians work above union scale and in the cases where musicians are underpaid, it is not the purchasers who have set the wage level but the band leaders who employ them..... **PolyGram Records** will hold a public auction of approximately 146 copyrighted works written and/or recorded by Larry Blackmon or his group Cameo prior to 1991. The bidding starts at \$250,000 and includes Cameo hits like "Word-Up."

Michael Jackson's Tour Problems Continue

Michael Jackson postponed another concert because of illness October 21st in Santiago, Chile. MJ called off the show just hours before he was to take the stage in front of 60,000 Chileans. Organizers said he was suffering from stomach problems. But there was speculation that MJ cancelled the concert because six people had died in a fierce gun battle between police and leftist

extremists at a bank only a mile from MJ's hotel. Concert organizers denied any link between the cancellation and the gun fight. The South American leg of the "Dangerous" tour hit a few pot holes from the very beginning, when a vehicle in MJ's entourage struck and injured a few people who were surrounding the car trying to get a glimpse of the introverted superstar when he was in Brazil. MJ had intended to go to a toy factory October 14th to buy toys for needy children, but when he spotted more than 500 fans waiting for him he didn't get out of the car and the entourage of automobiles turned around and beat a hasty retreat. It is unknown if Jackson was in the vehicle that stuck the fans and a cameraman. A spokesperson for Jackson said MJ will be covering all the medical expenses for the people injured. A 15-year-old boy fractured a leg bone and had to undergo surgery. And a 13-year-old girl was treated for lacerations on both legs and one arm. The cameraman suffered minor bruising and three other youths suffered minor injuries. MJ's two concerts at Sao Paulo's Morumbi stadium October 15 & 17 went off without a hitch, but since MJ has been in South America his fans have been distracted by impersonators who have been mingling with the entourage while journalists and fans fight to get near the real thing. However, promoters deny reports that MJ had hired the impersonators to purposefully lead fans and journalists off the track. And back in the States, there have been no new developments in the child abuse accusations brought against MJ. There was one interesting MJ report, however, which was available only to computer geeks surfing on the Internet. MTV's Adam Curry reports in his Cyber-Sleaze column that MJ plans to fly directly to Switzerland when he wraps-up his world tour to delay facing interrogation from Los Angeles police. Citing unnamed sources, Curry reports that MJ will officially check into a top Zurich clinic to recover from exhaustion and to seek treatment for the illness which is turning his skin white. Curry reports that members of MJ's tour entourage believe the Swiss trip will be nothing more than a ruse to delay his return because he is petrified about facing police.

George Michael vs. Sony

Testimony in George Michael's bid to break his long-term contract with Sony began last week in London's High Court. Michael's attorney told the court the contract's 15-year length amounts to exploitation of the pop singer. The contract also gives Sony exclusive rights to Michael's works, with no obligation to exploit them, attorney Mark Cran said. Cran also argued that Michael's net profit amounted to 55 cents per CD sold and 50 cents per cassette, while Sony clears \$3.65 per CD and \$2.25 per cassette. Michael, who owes Sony six more albums, says he won't record again if he loses the case. He has complained that he's been treated like "a piece of software" since Sony bought CBS Records in 1988. If Michael prevails, it could mean an end to long-term personal service contracts.

Promoter Sues James Brown And His Agent

James Brown and his booking agent have been sued for \$500,000 by a promoter who claims Brown backed out of a commitment to perform at the mammoth Louisiana Superdome in New Orleans two years ago. But agent Jeff Allen of Universal Attractions says the show was cancelled because terms of the contract weren't met. The suit, filed October 13th by Jerry Mayo

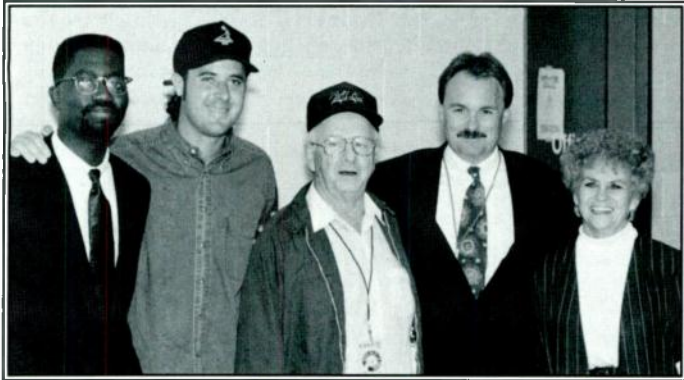

Enterprises Inc., claims that Brown signed a \$150,000 contract in June 1991 to perform that August. The suit claims Mayo paid \$15,000 immediately, and that he agreed to pay Brown an additional \$60,000 by July 25th, 1991. The suit claims both parties agreed to a reduction of the July 25th payment to \$47,500, but that Brown then cancelled his appearance by fax. Mayo is seeking reimbursement for his promotion expenses and an estimated \$350,000 in lost profits. Brown's camp denies wrongdoing. "The only lawsuit is in [Mayo's] mind," Allen told POLLSTAR. "The man purchased a James Brown date, did not send his deposits as per the contract, and in addition did not sell the tickets he should've sold to make himself happy, and he cancelled the date."

Coliseum Was Loaded To The Gills



Vince Gill packed the Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem, N.C., October 1st. It was his first concert after his stellar night at the CMA Awards. A&M Sharpens Its Urban Perspective

A&M Records is banking on its joint venture with Jimmy Jam and Terry Lewis' Perspective label to revive A&M's urban music sales, which have slumped since Janet Jackson departed for Virgin in 1991. A&M announced last week that it was closing its own R&B division and shifting its resources to Perspective Records. Under the deal, Perspective's promotion, publicity and A&R staff will be expanded. Perspective president Sharon Heyward, who took over the label earlier this year, will appoint the additional management and staff. Heyward also will design and direct marketing, sales and promotion efforts for A&M's R&B roster. All told, Perspective's staff is expected to jump from eight full-timers to 20-30. But five A&M employees were let go in the shuffle, including national R&B promotion director Larry Davis. Perspective will relocate its offices to A&M.

Washington's Porno Music Debate Continues


Washington's state supreme court heard arguments from music industry and state lawyers over whether music can be considered pornographic. An ACLU attorney told the justices that music can't be labeled pornographic because it is not a representative form of expression like pictures or books. A lawyer for the state said the legislature has the authority to "protect its children from material that is obscene to them and not to adults." The October 13th appeal hearing was over a law passed by the state legislature in 1992 which allowed a county prosecutor to ask a judge to

declare that a recording appeals to minors' prurient interests and offends community standards. If the local judge agreed, the recording would be labeled "adults only." A dealer who failed to label the recording or restrict its sales could be penalized with a \$500 fine and six months in jail. A King County superior court judge later declared the law unconstitutional, ruling that it is vague, causes record stores to censor themselves, might have a chilling effect on artistic instincts, and violates the right to free speech. The state is now appealing that ruling. A decision on the case is expected early next year.

He is one of the founders of the successful Music West confab which will remain independent of The Agency.... Fiala started his career with EC's Dan Bean as part of the original Concerts West team in the late 1960s.... Between The Dates

Oklahoma City, Fort Worth, San Antonio, Austin, Houston, and New Orleans have joined Atlanta on the list of cities for special INXS concerts. These are the performances for which tickets are sold in advance, but the venue is not announced until shortly before the show. But don't look for tickets to these dates at a TICKETMASTER outlet. Fred Rosen has branded the surprise venue idea as one of the dumbest concepts he's ever heard of and is refusing to allow their sale through the TM system. The secret venues are supposed to be smaller, more intimate locales than the majority of the stops on the tour. Of the venues that have been announced, an inside source said that the band was trying to play some places that normally don't host major tours. These "off the beaten path" venues include the Marine Terminal 28 in Toronto, and Route 30 Warehouse in North Versailles, PA..... 1993 may very well be remembered as the '70's revisited. So far the year has seen many of that decade's top artists on the road. Of course, acts such as the Dead, Steve Miller and Jimmy Buffett play the major arenas and amphitheatres almost every year, but this year saw everyone pounding the boards from The Bay City Rollers to Steely Dan. One '70's mainstay that has been enjoying a return to the business is EMERSON, LAKE & PALMER. The band kicked off the year with a North American tour, and before 1993 is over, a box set will be released in addition to a new album. Look for another tour in the late spring-early summer of 1994..... Another legend of the '70's, PAUL RODGERS is on the road, and ticket buyers are getting a two for one deal of sorts. Rodgers, along with a band that includes Neil Schon, is performing two sets each night. The first set features Rodger's tribute to Muddy Waters, and the second set will consist of his latest project - a set entirely of Jimi Hendrix classics. The ex-Free, ex-Bad Company, ex-Firm vocalist doesn't plan on making tributes his career. Expect a new album of original material in the near future..... THE KINKS have cancelled plans for a fall tour. A number of dates had already gone on sale when the band opted to return to the U.K..... Proceeds from the November 6-7 PEARL JAM shows at the Mesa Amphitheatre in Arizona will benefit the "Help Save Mt. Graham" campaign. Mt. Graham is a 10,700 ft. peak in the Southeastern part of the state. It is a sacred site to the San Carlos Apache Indians but it is also a coveted site for a cluster of telescope observatories..... This week's Route Book lists the final 1993 dates for the GRATEFUL DEAD, and New Year's Eve is not on the schedule. Long a San Francisco tradition, the Dead haven't played on the last day of the year since 1991, and there is speculation that they may never do it again. For 1994 expect the band to tour as usual, except that the summer tour has been pushed back to July due to the World Cup Soccer Championships taking the choice stadium sites in early summer.
