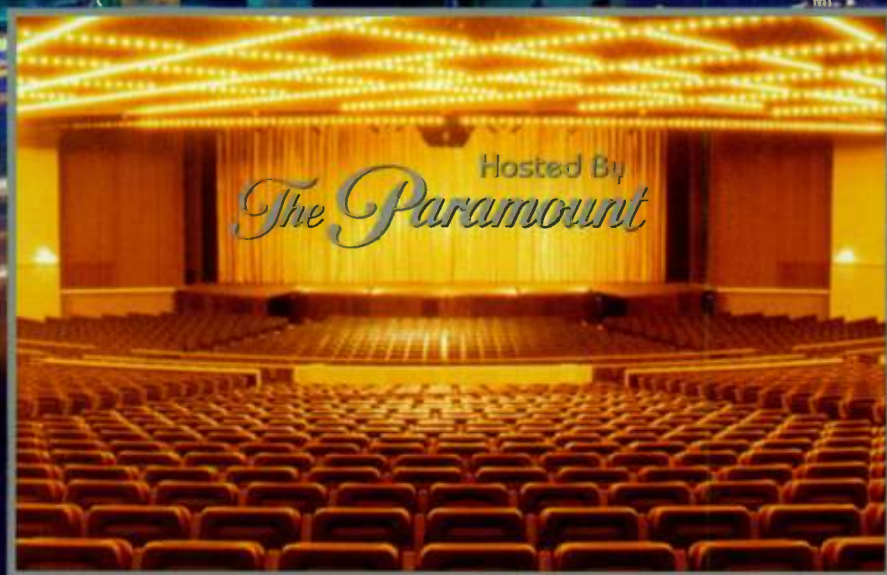

The Concert Industry Awards Basketball Extravaganza will be held at 1:30 p.m. Monday, January 24th in Madison Square Garden. This could be the chance of a lifetime for anyone who has ever dreamed about what it would be like to play basketball at the Garden. POLLSTAR and MSG are pleased to host this pre-awards game on the New York Knicks home floor with all proceeds going to the Bobby Brooks Foundation. ### Cellar Door Plans New D.C.-Area Amphitheatre

Cellar Door concerts should formally announce plans for a 21,000-seat amphitheatre in Gainesville, Va., in the next week or two, company President David Williams told POLLSTAR. Though Williams said he was unable to confirm details of the project, the *Washington Post* reported that the amphitheatre would be the first major development to follow a proposed Disney theme park in the same area. The venue would play host to up to 45 shows yearly between May and October at an 80-acre site purchased by Cellar Door on December 20th.

### The New ITG

The past year has been a difficult one for International Talent Group. The agency didn't have any of its biggest clients working in 1993, and it underwent a significant restructuring as Michael Farrell and Wayne Forte dissolved their partnership. Some of ITG's competitors would like you to write off the agency. Don't. The company, now headed by Farrell in Los Angeles and the

tandem of Joel Peresman and Marty Diamond in New York, has refocused its energy for the future. The agency has shed some of its smaller acts and intends to give greater individual attention to its artists. And although Forte took a number of strong acts with him to his new agency, ITG wasted no time in signing several major acts, including Stevie Nicks, Tasmin Archer, and Shonen Knife, to take their spot on the roster. The Solo-ITG partnership with John Giddings in England is still in place, as is Camden-ITG, the Los Angeles-based film, TV and literary wing of the company. And while ITG did not represent any of the Top 50 tours of 1993, that won't be the case this year, as both the Phil Collins and Pink Floyd tours will likely be among this year's most lucrative outings.

### Coping With Arena-Size Mosh Pits

Arena managers are finding creative ways to satisfy Nirvana's demand for open seating on the floor during the band's current U.S. tour. Past problems have given festival seating arrangements for large arenas a bad name, but bands like Nirvana and Pearl Jam want to satisfy their fans who want to mosh and body surf. And if a venue won't provide the right atmosphere, the groups are ready to pass them buy. Venue managers are tackling the problem in different ways. The San Diego Sports Arena sold only general admission tickets for Nirvana's December 29th performance. About 3,500 floor access tickets also were sold, and were priced a dollar higher. Those with floor access were wristbanded to prevent overcrowding and security was beefed up. Arena operations manager Mark Neiber said he'd use a similar setup again for the right act. "If we did a Pearl Jam or a Nirvana or someone like that, you know they're going to mosh," he said. "You wouldn't want to have seats there, because they'd just get in the way and basically cause more problems." At Nirvana's December 30th concert at the Great Western Forum outside Los Angeles, an elaborate and very specific seating and security plan was executed to provide a safe dancing area on the

# TONY BENNETT

Modern rock fans have found something new — new to them at least. After 45 years in show business, Tony Bennett is entertaining the grandchildren of his original fans. And the young crowd is discovering something their elders have known all along — the man who left his heart in San Francisco is one of the best singers ever, and you can quote Frank Sinatra on that one.

Bennett just finished up a tour of acoustic Christmas shows sponsored by major alternative rock radio stations, where he stole the show at every stop. How does a gray-haired crooner who came to fame in the 1950s manage to reach the MTV generation? Bennett told POLLSTAR that his son is responsible for putting him in front of the young adults who make up today's pop music market. Bennett's son Danny started managing his father's career 11 years ago, and it was his idea to put his dad on SCTV, *The Simpsons*, David Letterman, and MTV's Music Video Awards.

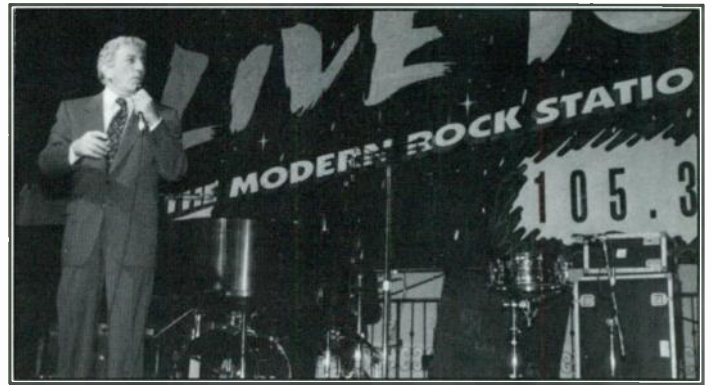
"At first I was dubious of the whole thing," said Bennett. But his son convinced him, saying, "Just do these shows, I know they're going to pick up on where your at." Bennett said his son's vision was right because the interest in him keeps building. "When we finally did these shows, these Christmas parties for all the alternative stations around the country, the audiences went crazy. In Washington, D.C., we did three songs and got four standing ovations. It was amazing."

Bennett said he has been able to cross over because he is still doing his own thing, without compromise. "I'm not trying to meet any fashion that's going on. I'm doing what I was doing in the '50s, but they consider me cool and hip. I've been unplugged for years."

The new-found audience can be attributed to playing the acoustic shows, as well as getting his video played on MTV and VH-1. But Bennett credits the fans. "I think the young adults' tastes are changing ever since the advent of the CD. All of a sudden they hear [music] without any surface scratches and they're saying, 'I didn't know [a big band] sounded like that.' And I think also the young people are starting to say, 'Hey maybe our parents really weren't that wrong.' But one thing I'm finding out is that the young people are much hipper than the jaded set that I perform to usually."

Bennett said even though he has been playing to sold out crowds at prestigious venues like Carnegie Hall, Radio City Music Hall or Royal Albert Hall in London, there is an open-minded attitude that is evident at the modern rock concerts. He said young people's tastes are getting more eclectic. "There's a major change going on. They accept me completely at the hipper stage, and they just go crazy. And they're very bright — that's the one thing I noticed. They're very with it and no one's pulling the wool over their eyes. They can read between the lines and they know something that's phoney and something that's real." Bennett also said playing with the same musicians for 12 years — the Ralph Sharon trio — and being able to keep their performances energetic and spontaneous has a lot to do with his new-found appeal.

But Tony Bennett isn't just a singer. He has a very successful second career as a painter of fine art, and he couldn't be happier with the way his son is managing his dual careers. "What he's acquired for me is something that every performer in the art world

would envy." Bennett can paint or record whatever he wants, whenever he wants. "He's worked out that kind of contract with Sony." Whatever he records, Columbia will release. "And they're very happy with it. Each [release] has sold more and more. It's the first time in 37 years that I'm allowed to just be free and do what I know from my experience."

Tony Bennett's new album, *Stepping Out*, a tribute to Fred Astaire, is his 95th release. Early in his career he recorded three albums a year, but then took 10 years off because he refused to record what Columbia suggested. "When I left, they wanted me to record cover songs like Janis Joplin." When he wouldn't comply, he was told he would no longer be wanted. Bennett had been going "nuts" with his deadlines, so he decided to take a break from recording and focus on painting and performing live.

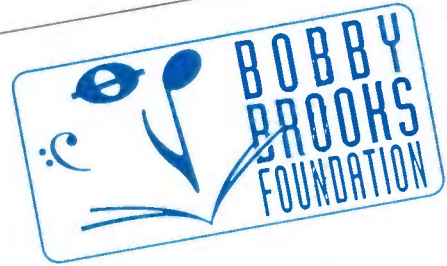
And he is very thankful for the public's support. "I still kept doing sold out business, 'cause [the public is] very loyal. It was difficult 'cause the record producers always wanted me to do some silly little production song, a novelty song so they could make a quick buck. I always fought that. I want my catalog to be a hit, not [just one] record. So it was worth waiting for." Bennett said he became a better painter during those 10 years, as well as becoming recognized as a fine artist. "Then Danny acquired this really great contract for me at Columbia, and they've been great to me. Sony's just great to me."

Tony Bennett has dates on the books through 1995. Rob Heller at the William Morris Agency has been his responsible agent for nearly two years. "He's done a fantastic job putting me in the most wonderful venues. Almost every date is an event." Bennett attributes the longevity of his touring career to being able to have a circuit to play. He said that it is different today because of the way pop artists are marketed to audiences.

"Years ago if you made it, if you kept your wits about yourself, you were able to sustain and stay in the business because you had a circuit. Today it's very tough. A performer's good for maybe two years. And then they hit bottom and can't climb back up. I wish the producers and the buyers of talent would be a little more sensitive about looking down the line to make sure these kids don't get hurt. Instead of treating them like an obsolescent object — I wish they'd give them more time to grow, give them a circuit to work. If the record's big then they book them, and when it isn't big they don't call them. I think that is pretty cruel."

Tony Bennett will be profiled on ABC television's Day One January 27th. Film crews traveled with him during his acoustic Christmas tour and the piece will highlight his career as both a performer and a painter. This year, his art will be on display at the Smithsonian Institution as well as on concert stages.

floor. Forum GM Claire Rothman said that only 2,000 people were permitted on the arena floor, and if concert goers didn't have a ticket specifically for the floor, they were not allowed to come down from their reserved seats. Rothman said the Forum, which has used festival seating at Grateful Dead concerts, looks forward to using the Nirvana seating plan for future concerts. At the Oakland Coliseum, the entire arena was GA for Nirvana's New Year's Eve show. The Coliseum often uses the GA setup at Grateful Dead concerts, but it is not the normal concert set-up at the venue. Other than the expected bumps and bruises, there were no reports of serious injury at any of the events. In related news, Tad was taken off the Nirvana tour, apparently because the band's namesake said something a tad derogatory about Courtney Love, Kurt Cobain's wife, in the English press. Chokebore was enlisted at the last minute to take Tad's place on the bill, which also included the Butthole Surfers. Bobcat Goldthwait acted as MC at some shows. At the stroke of midnight on New Year's Eve, Goldthwait was lowered upside down from the ceiling of the Coliseum wearing only a diaper. He began his descent slowly, but finished with a thud onto the stage. Bobcat's dents, dementia and diaper rash are not expected to keep him from hosting the Concert Industry Awards January 24th in NYC.

## Elton's Savage Assault On Hall's Boxoffice

## Marcel And Mama Go After Michael Jackson

After months of negotiations to determine who will pay for the huge debts left in the wake of Michael Jackson's cancelled "Dangerous World Tour," tour promoter Marcel Avram and his companies have hit the beleaguered singer with a \$20 million lawsuit. Avram, Mama Concerts (the German concert promotion firm in which he is a major partner), and Pebbles Music Inc. (a California company Mama and Avram set up to handle the tour), filed the suit in Los Angeles Superior Court December 28th. It claims that MJ failed to meet his contractual tour obligations and he knowingly concealed and misrepresented his ability to perform, which was ultimately hindered by his self-admitted drug dependence and the pending sexual abuse investigation. Avram's high-powered attorney, Donald Engel, said the suit was brought only as a last resort. "Our client was not anxious to add to

Michael Jackson's problems.... But we seem to be getting nowhere and we have received no relief," Engel said. According to the attorney, Avram has given MJ more than \$2 million in advances, \$900,000 alone for the canceled dates. The total estimated expenses for the tour were projected to be nearly \$37 million, with MJ guaranteed a minimum advance payment of \$5.25 million for the 43 concerts. The suit specifies eight separate complaints — breach of contract, fraud, fraudulent concealment, negligent misrepresentation, constructive fraud, rescission, breach of fiduciary duty and conspiracy to defraud. The lawsuit also claims that two Jackson corporations, MJJ Enterprises, Inc. and TTC Touring Corp., are simply fictitious fronts and they shouldn't be allowed to shelter MJ from personal responsibility for tour debts. Among the allegations made in the lawsuit are: the tour cancellation caused irreparable damage to Avram's business reputation; local promoters obligated themselves to millions of dollars in financial obligations based solely on Avram's personal guarantee that MJ would perform, and now at least two of them are suing Avram for expense reimbursement; MJ and his advisors knowingly and deliberately concealed MJ's addiction to drugs, even though MJ had guaranteed he was under no disability which would prevent him from performing his obligations; MJ's addiction to drugs including morphine and demerol was so entrenched during mid-1993 that there was no reasonable possibility that he would be able to complete the tour; MJ knowingly submitted a fraudulent physical report, which the promotion company used to secure tour cancellation insurance from Lloyds of London, which now may not honor the policy; MJ and his people hid the true facts about MJ's drug addiction until the November announcement that he was canceling the tour to check into a drug rehab program; Avram provided MJ with a fully equipped rehearsal facility for the month prior to the start of the tour at a cost in excess of \$1.5 million, but MJ spent no more than 45 minutes rehearsing there; on August 19th MJ requested that the tour be either canceled or postponed because he was sick, at which time Avram requested that MJ submit to a physical examination by an independent physician, but he refused; at about the same time, MJ and/or his advisors became aware that police were about to serve a search warrant on one of his homes as part of their investigation into

child molestation charges; on August 20th Jackson jumped on a plane to Thailand and the tour was suddenly back on, solely because MJ wanted to avoid U.S. authorities; the Jackson camp tried to conceal the police investigation from the tour promoter even though it would have a significant impact on the tour; the tour cancellation left more than 160 tour employees suddenly without work; when he actually took the stage MJ turned in a less than "first-class" performance; after MJ was examined by his personal physician in Bangkok prior to the first canceled date, he and his advisors were informed that he was seriously addicted to drugs and that he probably would be unable to perform the scheduled concerts, but that information was kept from Avram; when MJ suddenly canceled the second scheduled concert in Bangkok his attending physician refused to certify that an illness or physical condition had prevented the performance; MJ only performed 24 out of 33 scheduled concerts during the first leg of the tour, and only 16 of these were on their originally scheduled dates; on November 11th MJ covertly left Mexico City and has since refused to communicate with Avram or his representatives; MJ refused to perform any of the remaining 10 scheduled concerts and more than 250,000 of MJ's fans who had purchased tickets for the remaining 10 concerts were left out in the cold without warning; the cancellation resulted in financial losses in excess of \$15 million for the various local promoters, as well as for Avram and his companies, which now stand exposed to a myriad of huge liability claims and lawsuits. Thus far, the Jackson camp has declined to make any comment on the lawsuit.

## Chapel Hill Concerts Canceled

The concert schedule at the University of North Carolina's Dean Smith Center saw plans for two concerts evaporate from the facility when the school's chancellor vetoed the idea of a Grateful Dead show and the county commissioners denied a pyrotechnic permit for a Janet Jackson concert for which tickets were already on sale. That January 8th concert was canceled by Jackson shortly after Orange County denied them a pyro permit because of alleged safety reasons, even though the same effects are being used without problem on all other tour dates. A spokesperson for the facility said it was an unusual move because the fire marshal's office had already agreed that the pyro effects were within the bounds of safety.

## Change Of Venues

Great Woods has announced plans to expand seating capacity from 15,000 to 19,900 for the 1994 season. The increase comes from reconfiguring the lawn seat entrances and adding bleachers to the back of the venue. The Don Law-booked amphitheatre outside Boston also will be able to take advantage of improved traffic flows since the main road into the venue is being widened. Meanwhile, the new amphitheatre Law and his partners are working to build at the old Pease Air Force Base in New Hampshire has been given the working title of Great Bay..... The 1,500-capacity Rockefeller's West venue in Houston has changed its name to the Bayou City Theatre and is now being booked by Promoter Line Inc..... The owners of the Wayne Newton Theatre have put the 3,000-seat venue on the market for \$15 million, leaving Newton's future in Branson up in the air. The new owner would have the option of continuing Newton's contract or bringing in another star, said Gary Snadon, one of the building's owners. Snadon said Newton doesn't have a stake in the theatre, but has been offered the chance to buy it. The theatre is now closed for the season, and due to re-open on April 25th, a spokesperson told POLLSTAR. Snadon said Newton will return to headline in the spring if the theatre isn't sold by that time..... Oklahoma City voters approved a five-year, one-cent sales tax increase to finance improvements for downtown sports, entertainment, cultural and recreation facilities on December 14th. Among the plans are a \$36 million remodeling of the 56-year-old Civic Center Music Hall and a new 20,000-seat arena. The new tax is expected to generate \$238 million..... After closing the Pompano Beach Amphitheater's gates three weeks after its Labor Day opening, the city's recreation director continues the search for a new promoter and hopes to choose one within the next two months. The 2,700-seat shed, originally booked by Florida Suncoast Attractions, has hosted a few big band and jazz concerts, but a spokesperson for the city said they hope to attract bigger names when they secure a promoter. Fantasma Productions and four other South Florida companies submitted proposals to the city. Cellar Door had shown interest in the amphitheatre but did not submit a proposal..... More than three years after rejecting a proposal for a Paul McCartney concert at

## Promoters Ready For Babs Bidding Wars

Barbra Streisand made a triumphant return to the stage in Las Vegas New Year's Eve and New Year's Day for her first paid concert performances in more than two decades. Streisand's concerts at the new MGM Grand Garden arena drew more than 15,000 each night, and with tickets ranging from \$50 to \$1,000, it has to have been the highest grossing arena concert in pop music history — bringing in a conservative estimate of \$12 million for the two nights. Both shows featured a Who's Who audience of Hollywood stars, musicians and industry insiders. Michael Jackson also showed up, making it his first live public appearance since he canceled his tour in November. Another surprise was when Streisand invited Saturday Night Live's Mike Myers on stage to appear as his alter ego, Streisand-super-fan Linda Richman, host of the fictional "Coffee Talk." Myers and Streisand bantered like old chums before he left the stage. Streisand, who stayed away from live performing because of her tendency to be a perfectionist and from fear of forgetting the words to her songs, belted out her classics with the aid of more than a dozen TelePromPTers, and was backed by a 64-piece orchestra conducted by Marvin Hamlisch. However, she did get a miscue on a lyric from her song "Evergreen" but managed to get past it with a joke and a smile. Streisand had also shunned paid live performances apparently because of safety concerns. For these shows, nine airport-style metal detectors were used and the bottleneck they caused resulted in the show starting an hour late. At the end of the New Year's Eve show, Streisand emphatically exclaimed, "I did it, I did it, I did it!" And when she was called back for an encore she took a jab at the new 5,005

room hotel, which had just opened December 18th, saying she was glad to be called back on stage because it meant she didn't have to go back to her room. It seems many of the rooms at the luxury resort, including Streisand's, had no hot water. Other guests also complained that there were no soap holders in the showers, the phone system was overloaded and the reservation system bogged down leaving some guests waiting for hours. A spokesperson for the resort said the MGM Grand had a few glitches, but all in all everything was going well. Streisand had said if she enjoyed the experience, she would consider doing more concerts. And her manager, Marty Erlichman, said January 3rd that she would decide within 10 days whether to "go back on the road." Indications are that such a tour would probably be initially limited to multiple show engagements in only a handful of cities. Also, in honor of her return to Vegas, Kirk Kerkerian, a major stockholder in the MGM Grand, donated \$3.5 million to a variety of charitable organizations handpicked by Streisand herself. The donation did not have any "official" strings attached, but insiders say it was the frosting on the cake that made Barbra decide to do her concerts at the Grand Garden. And how big would a Streisand tour be? Consensus among talent buyers is that she could virtually write her own ticket and sell it for whatever she wants. That's a fact Sony Signatures, which had the merchandising rights to the Streisand concerts, would support. According to Sony's Del Furano, the per caps averaged more than \$40 per person, for total sales of more than \$1 million. The \$15 average at concerts by superstar level performers like U2, Madonna, Paul McCartney or The Rolling Stones pales in comparison. Even merchandise sales at the Super Bowl, the yardstick by which event merchandising had been judged until the Streisand shows, generally averaged \$15 to \$20 per attendee.

## Wynette Fights Off Life-Threatening Infection

Tammy Wynette was undergoing tests and treatment in a Pittsburgh hospital late last week after surviving a near-fatal bile duct infection. Wynette, 51, was in critical condition and on life support after she was first hospitalized at Nashville's Baptist Hospital December 29th. By January 2nd, Wynette was well enough to issue a statement thanking her fans and God. "I don't remember a lot but I feel wonderful to be alive and want to thank everyone for their prayers," she said. She was transferred to the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center on January 5th. The illness set in quickly. The night before she was admitted to the hospital, she recorded a duet with Aaron Neville. Tests later showed the infection was caused by a narrowing in her bile duct system. Doctors were to enlarge the area by inflating a tiny balloon inside the duct. Thus far, only a January 6th show at the Grand Palace in Branson has had to be postponed. At this point, it's possible she might actually be well enough to return to the stage in time for her next show January 15th in Tucson.

## Legal Grievs

**Artimus Pyle**, the former drummer for Lynyrd Skynyrd, was sentenced in Jacksonville, Fla., to eight years of probation for molesting two young sisters. Pyle was originally charged with capital sexual battery in the assaults on the 4- and 8-year-old girls, but he pleaded guilty December 22nd to a lesser charge. Pyle, who was arrested in October 1992 after the girls reported sexual encounters with him in their Jacksonville Beach home, .....

was also ordered to undergo psychosexual counseling and pay for counseling for his victims. If convicted on the original charges, Pyle could have faced a life sentence in prison..... **Wilson Pickett** was convicted December 23rd of drunken driving, resisting arrest and refusing to take a Breathalyzer test. The conviction stemmed from a May 1991 incident in which Pickett drove his car in circles on his neighbor's lawn, who also happens to be the mayor of Englewood, N.J. Mayor Donald Aronson had also brought a malicious mischief charge against Pickett, but dropped that charge in exchange for Pickett's promise to play a charity benefit concert. Pickett was sentenced to one year's probation, which will run concurrently with a one-year jail term he started serving in the Bergen County Jail January 3rd. That sentence stemmed from a conviction from another drunk driving incident that occurred in April 1992..... A judge has awarded **Dee Henry Jenkins**, the widow of **Conway Twitty**, support of \$22,104 a month until June. The December 29th decision was the first ruling in a court battle over Twitty's \$6 million estate. Three of Twitty's four children, who are Jenkins' stepchildren, are claiming Jenkins was awarded a disproportionate amount of Twitty's estate.

## Stern's New Year's Bash Breaks Pay-TV Record

Preliminary numbers show FCC nemesis **Howard Stern's** New Year's Eve special was the top-grossing entertainment pay-per-view event of all time, beating out a 1991 concert by **New Kids On The Block**. Main Events Television estimated that more than 270,000 homes paid an average of \$39.95 for the special, which would put the show's gross at about \$12 million. Viewers who forked out the bucks can say they saw a woman eat live maggots, watched "Star Wars" actor **Mark Hamill** lick chocolate sauce off a woman's breast, and saw Stern offer **John Wayne Bobbitt** \$15,000 to expose his reattached penis to the camera, an offer **Bobbitt** declined. Reviews of the show were less than kind.

KIIS-FM DJ Rick Dees, who competes with Stern's radio show in Los Angeles, issued \$40 "refunds" to about 150 listeners who complained about the show during his January 4th air shift. The station claims it logged more than 2,000 calls from less-than-satisfied Stern viewers during Dees' program. The program reportedly has given the Fox TV network second thoughts about giving Stern a job as late-night talk show host. The *Hollywood Reporter* quoted unnamed sources at the network as saying Fox chief Rupert Murdoch backed away from negotiations with Stern after the show. The top pay-per-view event of all time was last year's boxing match between Evander Holyfield and George Foreman, which was seen in about 1.4 million homes.

## More Trouble For Michael

As if being barraged by lawsuits for sexual molestation, breach of contract and copyright infringement isn't enough, the Children's Peace Foundation of Beverly Hills filed a \$25 million lawsuit against Michael Jackson. The suit, filed December 13th, alleges MJ, a licensing company and three law firms engaged in a "pervasive pattern of fraud" in business dealings and product representation, and interfered with an agreement to pay the charity commissions on the sale of MJ-licensed merchandise. And in the sexual molestation suit, the attorney for the teenager suing MJ said the singer is "stonewalling" his investigation. Attorney Larry Feldman filed a Superior Court motion December 30th asking the court to compel MJ to answer written questions in the civil suit. MJ is scheduled to be deposed January 18th, and his attorney repeatedly claimed that there are several legitimate reasons not to answer the pre-deposition questions, including a potential criminal investigation. Attorney Howard Weitzman said compelling MJ to answer questions and turn over certain documents would violate his constitutional rights and the privacy rights of others. The teenager's attorney has been seeking the name of every child who ever spent time with MJ. Feldman is also asking that MJ be ordered to pay \$8,470, an amount he claims his law firm has spent on efforts to get info from MJ. On January 4th, Feldman filed court documents in an effort to obtain nude photographs taken of MJ by law enforcement officials. But MJ's attorney claims that the photographs will not prove anything. However, if Feldman is denied access to the photographs, he has requested MJ submit to another search, or that the court bar the photos from being entered as evidence in the civil trial. MJ was photographed last month in an effort to corroborate the teenager's description of his genitals. The hearing for the new motion is scheduled for January 19th, one day after MJ is scheduled to give his much anticipated deposition. And in a surprise move, MJ appeared as a presenter at the NAACP's 26th annual Image Awards January 5th, proclaiming his innocence in front of a highly supportive audience. MJ said, "Not only am I presumed innocent, I am innocent. And I know that the truth will be my salvation." The awards program was taped and will be broadcast January 22nd on NBC. Meanwhile, the PBS documentary series *Frontline* will examine the media frenzy over MJ when it airs *Tabloid Truth* on February 15th.

## The Demon Dinosaur

A Free Pentecostal pastor is claiming that Barney the purple dinosaur is a New Age demon who is leading America's children into the world of the occult. In Rev. Joseph Chambers' new booklet, "The Purple Messiah," he cites Barney's use of the

phrase "Shimboree, Shimbora" as an example of words spoken at a seance. He also claims Barney endorses a politically correct extreme liberal-left agenda which teaches kids that pedophiles and homosexuals are on the same level as parents. The reverend says that Barney is anti-Christian and his program is an insidious attack on the family institution.

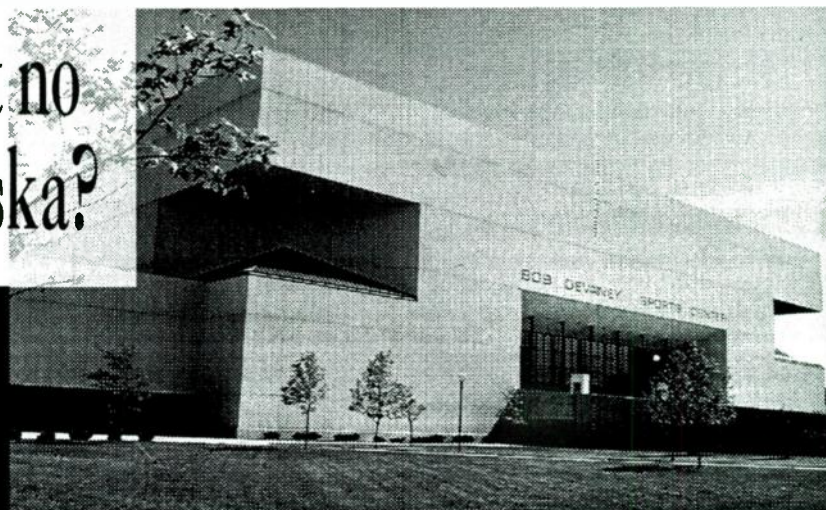
