Camden thwarted, Katz signed his 76ers to a 29-year lease for the new arena. The 21,000-seat Spectrum 2 will be built on the site where the old JFK Stadium once sat. Ground for Spectrum 2 will be broken in the spring and the arena is expected to be opened no later than the winter of 1996.

Quake Fallout Continues To Mount

Last month's quake caused heavy damage to the **Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum**, and building inspectors have declared it unsafe to enter. Cracks can be seen in many of the building's columns, and also run through the concourse and tunnels. The building's trademark peristyle also has visible cracks. The lower part of the stadium, which was built in the early 1920s, has sunk several inches from the upper section, which was built in 1931. Coliseum officials estimate that repairs will cost at least \$35 million, but won't know more until a detailed inspection is complete — probably later this month. A recent 5.0 aftershock caused even further damage. Spokesperson Cindy Rubin told POLLSTAR that despite reports that the historic stadium may have to be leveled, coliseum officials are confident that repairs can be made. They're still holding out hope that the stadium can host Los Angeles Raiders and USC football games as scheduled this fall. The uninsured facility will need to secure federal or other funding before officials can go forward with the massive repairs needed to reopen the venue. The coliseum had hoped to host several major stadium concerts this year, but has already lost the Pink Floyd date to the Rose Bowl by default, so to speak.... UCLA officials predicted last week that **Royce Hall** will remain closed for at least two months, but might be out of commission until 1995. Architects said the theatre could be shored up enough to host events quickly, but the building had been slated for seismic strengthening before the quake. University officials are considering having the seismic strengthening done now rather than having to close the historic theatre again in the near future.

The Bunny And The Paisley Prince

Paisley Park Enterprises and Warner Bros. Records have terminated their joint venture by what was termed a "mutual agreement." Final decisions regarding the Paisley Park Records artist roster, employees and offices are pending and will be announced at a later date, but The Bunny will continue to release Prince records. Paisley Park could continue if it finds another distributor, and some of the artists might continue to be released via Warners. George Clinton, Mavis Staples, Rosie Gaines and Tyler Collins are the artists currently signed to Paisley Park.

World's Largest Concert Hall Planned For Tampa

What's being billed as the largest indoor concert hall in the world, with a capacity of 16,500, is on the drawing boards in Tampa, Fla. The project is being developed by Hamburg, Germany-based Deuteron Holding. Project director Grant Weyman said the new amphitheatre-style venue will host only rock shows. The \$30 million Deuteron Entertainment Complex could be completed by mid-1995, and is part of the city's plan to turn a run-down downtown seaport into a tourist destination. The theatre will stand 11 stories and have 12,500 fixed seats — none of which will be more than 125 feet from the proscenium stage. Deuteron exec Andreas Wankum said he wants the Tampa venue to be a prototype for his company to build in other markets.

Moving Towards The New Spectrum

Spectacor announced plans February 1st to move forward on The Spectrum 2 arena complex, to be built adjacent to the existing Spectrum in South Philadelphia. After years of negotiations and false starts, Philadelphia's basketball and hockey teams came to agreement over the \$180 million arena. An unnamed private investment group helped remove the financing roadblock by agreeing to provide a \$130 million construction and term loan. That financing will be added to a previous state grant of \$20 million and a \$6.5 million low-interest loan from the city, as well as an investment by Spectacor founder Ed Snider. The announcement came shortly after Camden County officials halted talks with Philadelphia 76ers owner Harold Katz regarding moving the team across the Delaware River to New Jersey. The officials had learned that Katz was continuing his negotiations to keep the team at The Spectrum in Philadelphia, and they refused to be used as a bargaining chip. With attempts to move to

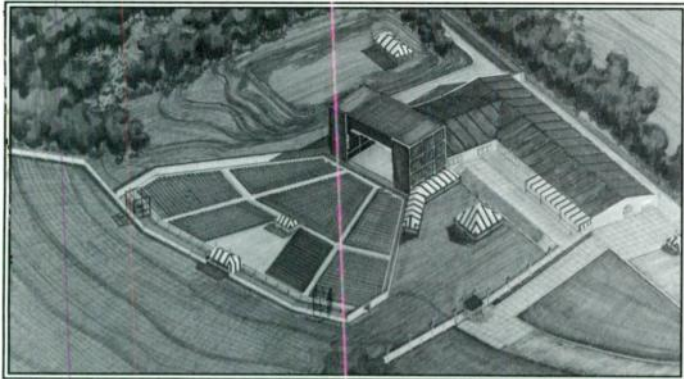

Most shows that were to be held in Royce Hall have been moved to the Wadsworth Theatre, but some had to be canceled because the Wadsworth has a smaller stage.... **Six Flags Magic Mountain**, which had been closed since the quake because the theme park's water supply was cut off, was scheduled to be back in operation on February 5th. Proceeds from last weekend were to be donated to the American Red Cross L.A. Earthquake Disaster Relief fund.... To help its L.A.-area employees. **Sony Music** has established an earthquake relief grant fund. Sony Music donated \$25,000 to the fund and parent company Sony Corporation of America matched the grant. The company also brought in representatives of a credit union to process additional financial aid programs. Sony Music will guarantee employees' quake-related loans and pay the interest for up to a year.

Building A Better Montage Mountain



Metropolitan Entertainment entered into a joint venture with Lackawanna County, Penn., to substantially upgrade the Montage Mountain Performing Arts Center last month. The improved facility, located at the Montage Mountain Ski Area near Scranton, will have a reserved seating area with up to 5,000 seats and a total capacity of about 16,000. The new shed should be completed in time to present a full slate of shows this season.

Music Video War

EMI Music, PolyGram Holding Inc., Sony Software Corp., Warner Music Group, and Ticketmaster Corp., announced January 31st that they plan to form a partnership that will operate an advertiser-supported, 24-hour music video channel which is going to be offered as a basic cable service in the U.S. and Puerto Rico. However, media analysts said the partnership may have a difficult time finding space on existing cable systems for a new cable channel. Larry Gerbrandt of Paul Kagan Associates said cable systems would hesitate to drop a well known channel like MTV, which has been in business for 13 years. But the five companies are seeking additional partners in the new venture, including cable television operators, and the new channel will presumably be launched on systems operated by Time Warner, which is the second-largest cable operator in the nation. Thus far, BMG and MCA have not signed on with the venture, although the four that are involved account for about 80 percent of sales in the recorded music business. With industry insiders already yelling "antitrust," the companies announced that they will continue to license their videos to other cable operators, like MTV, and they will also air videos licensed by companies other than their own. In response to the announcement, MTV's chief executive, Tom Freston, said there is not a lot of precedent in having a company's suppliers go into business against you.

Additionally, he said, if it is fair competition, MTV doesn't see a problem, but if the new venture turns out to be some kind of "OPEC-like cartel," it would then be viewed as an issue.

Murder In The Meadowlands?

The parents of a 19-year-old who died in 1989 after a Grateful Dead concert at the Meadowlands Sports Complex in New Jersey allege that state law enforcement officials conspired to conceal evidence that the teenager was murdered. Jay and Linda Katz of South Orange allege that their son, Adam Katz, was murdered by security guards and the evidence was withheld to make it appear that he committed suicide or died accidentally. After an autopsy was performed by an assistant Bergen County medical examiner, the death was ruled a homicide. The forensic specialist found a skull fracture inflicted by a blunt weapon. Adam Katz had been found lying unconscious on Route 120 near the arena, 10 feet from an overpass. But the attorney general at the time asked that the autopsy be reviewed, and after the second look the state's medical examiner found that Katz died of a fractured skull received after he fell or was pushed from a bridge. The county medical examiner disagrees, saying there should have been other injuries if he fell 25 feet from a bridge. Even though a judge had dismissed a portion of the parents' wrongful death lawsuit asking for punitive damages in December against the N.J. Sports and Exposition Authority, the rest of the case will now move forward in state Superior Court while that aspect is appealed.

BMG Gets Private

The Bertelsmann Music Group acquired the Private Music label on January 31st. Private Music and BMG's relationship began in 1987 with BMG distributing the imprint. Now BMG wholly owns the label, which was founded by Peter Baumann, an early member of Tangerine Dream. Baumann had sold half of his interest in the label to BMG in 1992. Among the artists on Private's roster are Yanni, Leo Kottke and A.J. Croce.

Michael Jackson

Michael Jackson reportedly asked his insurance company last week to help cover the expenses of the multi-million dollar settlement for the sexual molestation suit brought against him by a 14-year-old boy. However, Transamerica Insurance Group said MJ's personal liability policy didn't cover sex allegations. But the company did make a "one-time" offer in response to MJ's attorney's request which stated his client suffered "personal grief" and "substantial financial losses." But the offer wasn't accepted. All the speculation surrounding MJ and the charges brought against him has put more focus on the team MJ has assembled to handle his business and private affairs. Another change came this week when publicist Michael Levine confirmed that his firm, Levine/Schneider, had been hired by Jackson to handle some

public relations work. Levine/Schneider's client list includes Barbra Streisand and MJ's sister Janet. MJ's longtime publicist Lee Solters will continue working for MJ, but it is unclear what role each publicist will play. Not that there is any shortage of spin control needed by the beleaguered superstar. Last week, a man was arrested for defacing MJ's star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame. But that was just a drop in the bucket for publicists. A much bigger problem was bubbling under last week when a potentially damaging report surfaced claiming that private investigators for the 14-year-old conducted a search which unearthed a "significant number" of boys who claim they were also sexually abused by MJ. Meanwhile police are continuing their probe to see if criminal charges should be brought.

Eddie To Answer For Balch-ed Up Show

Eddie Vedder was summoned to appear in Boulder County Court to answer a charge of obstructing government operations stemming from an incident at the University of Colorado Thanksgiving weekend. At a November 27th concert, Vedder allegedly interfered with campus security guards who were attempting to remove a "disruptive" individual from the mosh pit, according to police. Vedder reportedly quit singing, stopped the music and told the campus police to get out of the pit. His comments incited the crowd to remove one of the guard's headsets, police said. The university guards were so intimidated they left the venue, Balch Fieldhouse, without the person they were trying to remove. The summons requires Vedder or his attorney to appear in court March 1st. If convicted, Vedder faces up to six months in jail and \$750 in fines.

Short Items Of Note

Cindy Wilson joined her former **B-52's** band mates for a few isolated performances last week — including two shows at CBGB's in New York to celebrate that club's anniversary. Steve Jensen of Direct Management Group, which manages the B-52's, said Wilson plans to join the band for some live dates this summer, which could possibly lead to some studio work. But for now, no permanent reunion can be confirmed.... **Ticketmaster** has entered a partnership with **Branson Tix** which, starting March 1st, will allow customers in 24 midwestern and southeastern states to purchase tickets to most of the major shows in Branson's theatres.... The first signings to the new **Arista Texas** label headed by Cameron Randall are Freddy Fender, Flaco Jimenez, Joel Nava, Rick Orozco and La Diferenzia. The

Atlantic Records has named producer **David Foster** — who has won eight Grammys and tops this year's list with seven nominations — a senior vice president under an exclusive, long-term production deal. He will produce established acts and develop new artists..... Former Supremes singer **Mary Wilson's** 14-year-old son was killed when a Jeep she was driving ran into a freeway median and overturned on Interstate 15 northeast of Barstow, California. Rafael Ferrer was pronounced dead at Barstow Community Hospital about two hours after the 7:30 a.m. accident January 29th. Wilson, 49, was taken to Loma Linda University Medical Center with injuries that are serious but not life threatening, according to a spokesperson for the singer. Both Wilson and her son were wearing their seat belts..... **Kevin Kelleher** has been appointed senior vice president and chief financial officer, Sony Music Entertainment. He had served as senior vice president and controller, Sony Music Entertainment since joining the company in January 1993.

Court Battle Begins Over Reba's Band Crash

Testimony began January 28th in the multi-million dollar wrongful death lawsuit stemming from the 1991 plane crash that killed most of Reba McEntire's band. The \$20 million suit brought by the parents of band leader Kirk Cappello claims the accident was caused by pilot error, but the air charter company blames an air traffic controller who turned his back on the radar screens for 90 seconds to type a report. Seven members of McEntire's band and her tour manager were killed in March 1991 when the plane they were in crashed into a mountain near San Diego after a concert there.

Auto Accident Postpones Flappers' Good Deed

A public presentation by Cypress Hill's DJ Muggs of \$10,000 to the founder of the "Goods For Guns" program in New York City had to be postponed January 27th after Muggs was in an auto

accident on the way to the ceremony. Muggs was not seriously hurt and was reportedly recovering at home. Cypress Hill member B-Real then flew in from Los Angeles and presented the "Goods For Guns" donation at a ceremony four days later. A representative from Columbia Records also presented \$10,000 to the program on behalf of the label. B-Real defended the violent images portrayed in some of his band's songs. "All the guys in Cypress Hill have experienced street violence themselves," B-Real said. "Our rhymes have described and exposed this violence to bring it to the attention of people to help things for the better."

Don't BET On It

The former chief financial officer of BET Holdings Inc. has pleaded guilty to embezzling \$1.9 million from the company that owns the Black Entertainment Television cable network. Antoinia O. Duncan admitted that from January 1988 to September 1992 she created six fictitious production companies for the purpose of deceiving BET into believing the bogus companies had rendered production-related services or products, and then charged BET for those expenses. Duncan, who used the money to buy real estate in Virginia and Delaware, earned \$170,000 a year at BET. She was fired in 1992 and has agreed to repay \$1.8 million to the company. She faces sentencing April 12th, and the maximum penalty is 10 years in prison and a \$250,000 fine. However, she is expected to receive consideration for her cooperation in the investigation. The missing funds made up nearly 50 percent of BET's quarterly profits.

DropKick Me Jesus Saved

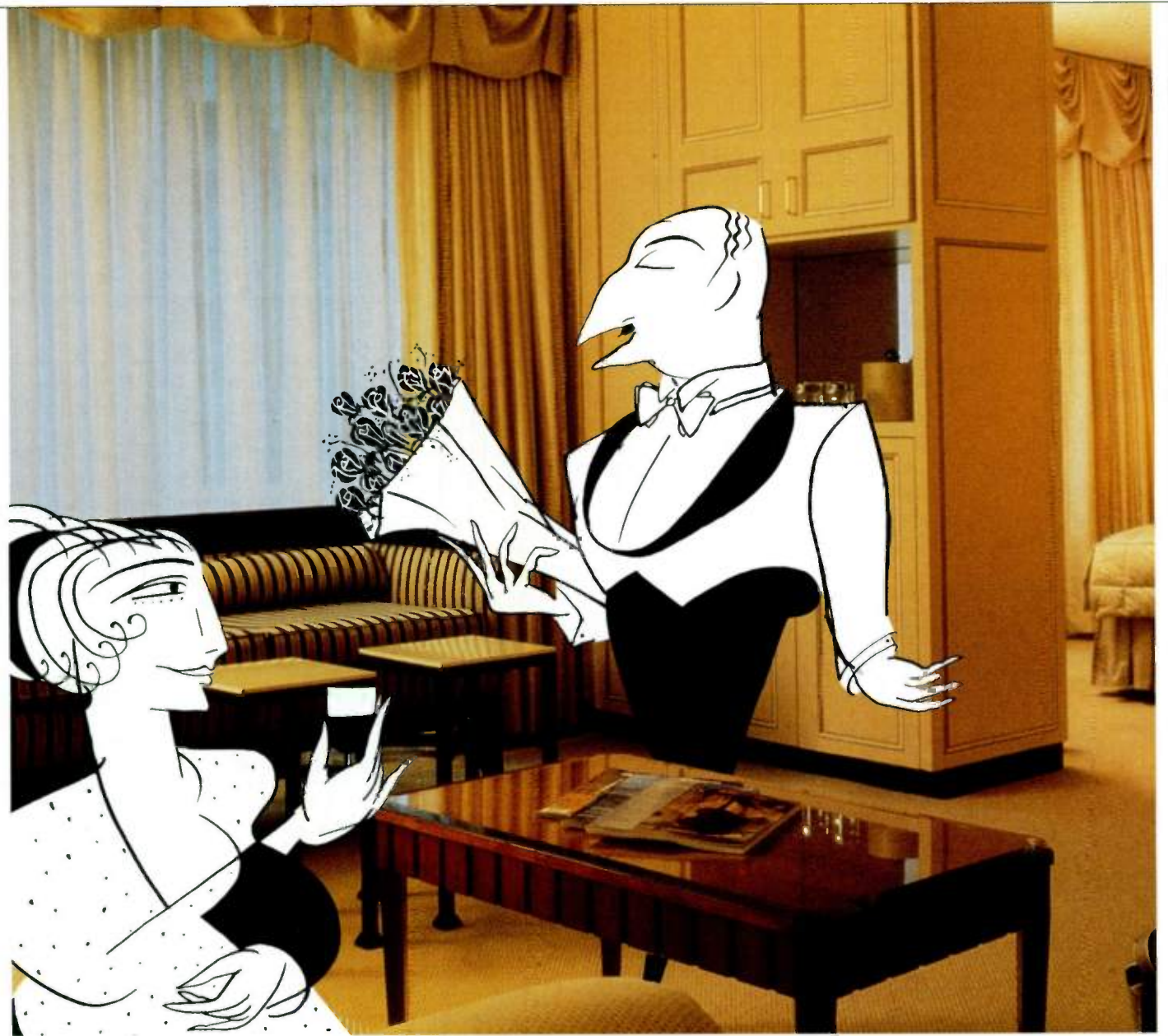
After originally being turned down, Canadian rock group DropKick Me Jesus was allowed to register its name with the government last week. The band was blocked from releasing its debut album because a government panel said its name "invokes violence in a religious context [and is] considered scandalous and contrary to public policy." But the panel reversed itself after learning the name came from a 1976 country hit made popular by Bobby Bare. Canadian musical groups have to register their names with the Ontario government's Ministry of Consumer and Commercial Relations in order to establish themselves as legitimate businesses.

Digable Planets

BEST NEW RAP / DANCE ARTIST TOUR

The New York City-based trio Digable Planets won the public's hearts and critics' praise all throughout 1993. Blending the language, sounds, style and culture of hip hop and jazz, Digable Planets crossed over genres to win accolades over mainstream rock artists. Many critics listed Digable in their top 10 lists of best new artists. They also are nominated for two Grammys.

Touring on the strength of their hit single "Rebirth of Slick (Cool Like Dat)" from their Pendulum/ERG debut *Reachin' (a new refutation of time and space)*, Digable Planets' road work proved they could cut it in the concert business. Their touring schedule took the members of the band, Butterfly (Ishmael Butler), Doodlebug (Craig Irving) and Ladybug (Mary Ann Vieira), across the U.S. where they sold out many major showcase clubs.

In concert Ladybug, Doodlebug and Butterfly are supported by a bassist, drummer, DJ, and a horn section of alto sax and trumpet, giving them a lot of room to improvise. They don't have a lot of stage experience, but that doesn't faze them. Making up-close contact with their audience drives the trio to pure enjoyment while performing.



Digable Planets' moniker exemplifies the philosophy and ideology of the band. They believe that each individual is like a planet, doing its own thing but still connected by the universe. And they relate to and admire insects for their strong individuality while working together in colonies. Working in Digable's universal colony is their manager Brenda Dash of Pipeline Entertainment, and their agent Cara Lewis at the William Morris Agency in New York.

Also nominated in this category were Cypress Hill, Onyx and SWV.



He only recently reached legal drinking age, but A.J. Croce already sounds like he's spent a lifetime in a dark, smokey club you might see in an old detective film.

A self-taught pianist and crooner, Croce's been

performing professionally since he was 13. His big band jazz sound was honed over the years at his mom's San Diego club, Croce's Top Hat, which she opened as a tribute to A.J.'s late father, Jim.

Croce and his five piece band do lots of improvising on stage, and don't keep a set list. Things get especially loose when he plays at his mom's club, where the band can play several sets a night. The group still plays there as much as they can.

Croce's self-titled debut on Private Music caught the public's attention early last year. Croce soon found himself headlining dates throughout North America and Europe on his first promotional tour. He also opened select dates for The Neville Brothers, Lyle Lovett, Robert Cray, John Prine, Bruce Cockburn, Buddy Guy, and Jay Leno.

Croce is booked by William Morris agent Clint Mitchell and is currently between managers.

Others nominated for Best New NAC/Jazz Artist Tour were Beth Nielsen Chapman, Joshua Redman and Peter White.

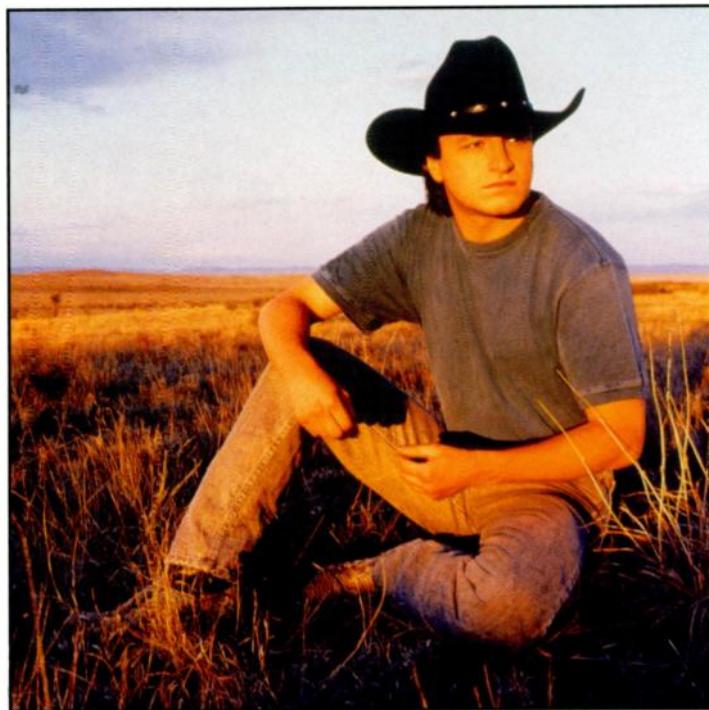
BEST NEW COUNTRY ARTIST TOUR

It's been almost two years since his second MCA recording, *Longnecks and Short Stories*, hit the streets, but Mark Chesnutt has hardly been taking a breather. He's been on the road playing practically anywhere that will have him. And he consistently walks off the stage having created a pack of new believers.

There's nothing complicated about Chesnutt's music or his presentation. It's straight-ahead country, just the way his mentor George Jones likes it. But there's no denying that Chesnutt has that extra something that makes him a real crowd-pleaser.

Besides a slew of headlining dates in 1993, Chesnutt opened for George Strait, George Jones and Sawyer Brown.

Chesnutt is recording a new album, but that won't keep him off the road in 1994. This year, things promise to get more elaborate. He's put together a full production, and will probably take it to 100 cities by year's end. Besides his headlining dates, he's scheduled to open about a dozen shows for Wynonna Judd during the first half of the year. Agent Tony Conway at Buddy Lee Attractions and manager Stan Byrd are the ones



responsible for organizing the necessary scheduling acrobatics.

Others nominated for Best New Country Artist Tour were Clay Walker, John Michael Montgomery and Toby Keith.



Okay, music critics, you've been put in your place again. In 1993, Stone Temple Pilots proved to be popular targets for those who are paid to pass judgment. But the group went over the pundits' heads and straight to the public's heart with *Core*, their debut release on Atlantic. To wit: STP won "honors" of worst band in *Rolling Stone's* yearly critics' survey, but the same magazine's poll of the public named STP 1993's best new band.

Now, after establishing a reputation for filling venues and sending the customers home happy, it's safe to add the concert industry to the still-growing list of STP faithful. The group kicked off '93 as the opening act on Megadeth's tour, but had attained headliner status in their own right by year's end. During the summer, the band hit the road with a traveling festival co-headlined by the Butthole Surfers that also featured Basehead, FIREHOSE and The Flaming Lips.

Through it all, singer Weiland, bassist Robert DeLeo, guitarist Dean DeLeo and drummer Eric Kretz could be counted on to whip the crowds into a shoe-throwing frenzy wherever they played. If the band lacked originality, as those stuffy critics complained, it certainly didn't lack energy or chops on stage.

Don Muller is given credit for "discovering" STP, and the William Morris agent, along with John Branigan, now represents the band. Steve Stewart handles the management chores.

Others nominated for Best New Rock Artist Tour were Big Head Todd & The Monsters, Blind Melon and The Cranberries.

Garth Brooks

MAJOR TOUR OF THE YEAR

With the possible exception of Ma Bell, it seemed everyone loved Garth Brooks in 1993. It came to be almost part of the routine that when tickets for a Brooks show went on sale, phone lines would be overloaded by fans anxious to see the show.

And why not? Brooks spared no expense to put on not just a show, but a spectacle in 1993. He even turned down the opportunity to headline halftime at the Super Bowl, reportedly because the National Football League wouldn't give him enough money to put on the elaborate production he had in mind.

Brooks' stage show included man-made thunder, fire and even rain. At one point, all the heavy equipment needed to pull off the event caused a grid over the stage at Texas Stadium to buckle as crews were setting up for a series of concerts. Luckily, no one was seriously hurt, and — thanks to the crew's doubled-up efforts — the shows went on as scheduled.

The tour evidently had no problem overcoming the high overhead. With 55 headlining dates in 1993, Brooks' shows raked in \$19,433,388 on 1,143,349



tickets sold for an average gross of \$670,117. A whopping 99 percent of the seats that went on sale during the year were filled, no doubt causing managers Bob Doyle and Pam Lewis of Doyle/Lewis Management to crack an unsolicited smile every now and again.

Brooks, the first country artist ever to take home Major Tour Of The Year honors, outtallied Bette Midler, The Grateful Dead, Jimmy Buffett, Peter Dinklage and Steely Dan.



A building that served as a Swedish men's hall after it was built in 1922 — you can still see some of the original fixtures — is now home to The Metro. In the nearly 12 years that owners Joe Shanahan and Joe Prino have run the Chicago nightclub, it has built a reputation as one of the nation's premier venues for showcasing national acts along with a healthy dose of the best in local talent. And that's no small feat considering Chicago boasts an array of great nightclubs and a fan base to support them.

The Metro

NIGHTCLUB VENUE OF THE YEAR

The 1,100-capacity club usually sticks to an alternative rock format, but there's room for other acts on occasion. The club works closely with Jam Productions, which promotes many of The Metro's major shows.

Wednesday nights are generally local showcase nights at The Metro. The club normally charges a \$3 cover for three bands, and often forgoes a cover for women on showcase nights. Smashing Pumpkins, Sonic Youth and Material Issue are among the bands that started playing Chicago at the Wednesday showcases, according to promotions manager John Bell.

Bell counts sold out performances by Prince, INXS, Indigo Girls, Smashing Pumpkins, Paul Westerberg, Bob Mould, Liz Phair and Cracker among 1993's high points at the club.

Other nominees for Nightclub Venue Of The Year were the 9:30 Club in Washington, D.C., Grizzly Rose in Denver, Irving Plaza in New York City, Park West in Chicago, Slim's in San Francisco, and The Edge in Orlando.

Anaheim Arena

BEST NEW MAJOR CONCERT VENUE



The Anaheim Arena, recently given the official moniker "Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim," celebrated its grand opening June 19th with a sold-out Barry Manilow concert. This striking new facility was designed to be unlike any other facility in the nation. The aim was to make the arena a "landmark" building for the City of Anaheim, a creative piece of art for the architects, Hellmuth, Obata & Kassabaum, and a structural accomplishment for its contractor, Huber, Hunt & Nichols. The exterior has 12-foot granite walls encircling the building and the green-glass archways on the north and south entrances are the arena's signature feature. Plus, there are 200,000 square feet of marble lining the interior walls and the concourse.

However, aesthetics are not the only highlight of this new facility. It is the only arena in the nation to use Hussey Seating's state-of-the-art portable riser system, which allows seats to be placed at the perfect angle for every event. With a 19,400-capacity for center stage concerts, the Anaheim Arena is now the largest indoor venue in Southern California.

The plans for a new facility in Orange County, which were first proposed in 1989, resulted in a public-private partnership between the City of Anaheim and Ogden Entertainment. As part of the preliminary dealings, Disney's NHL franchise, The Mighty Ducks of Anaheim, came in, assuring a major tenant for the arena, and a home for the NHL's newest franchise. Some of the high points of its first seven months included shows by Clint Black and Wynonna Judd, the "Young Messiah Tour," and a December show with Billy Joel. The Anaheim Arena's GM is Brad Mayne, and Tim Ryan is the assistant GM.

Also nominated were the Alamodome in San Antonio, Glen Helen Blockbuster Pavilion in San Bernardino, The Mark Of The Quad Cities in Moline, Ill., and North Charleston Coliseum in South Carolina.



For the fifth year in a row, the Red Rocks Amphitheatre outside Denver walked away with the Best Outdoor Concert Venue honors. Red Rocks, with its near-perfect acoustics and awe-inspiring surroundings, has proven itself as the natural wonder among outdoor facilities in the United States. The amphitheatre's 9,000 seats are literally carved out of the mountainside, resulting in a breathtaking 200-mile panoramic view of Colorado's landscape. Red Rocks was once listed by geographers among the Seven Wonders of the World, and has now become famous for its musical and cultural events.

Red Rocks Amphitheatre

BEST OUTDOOR CONCERT VENUE

The built-by-nature amphitheatre began hosting shows in 1911, before the structure for the theatre was even conceived. The original construction was partially funded through the Civilian Conservation Corps (C.C.C) in 1936. Red Rocks Park and Amphitheatre was one of the largest public works projects of FDR's New Deal. Officially opening as a venue in 1941, the stage of Red Rocks was long established before being graced by the Beatles and Jimi Hendrix in the 1960s.

The facility, owned and operated by the City Of Denver Theaters & Arenas department, is booked primarily by Fey Concert Company. Among the tours which stopped at the award-winning amphitheatre in 1993 were "The H.O.R.D.E. Festival," Sting, 10,000 Maniacs, Steve Miller Band, and Yanni.

Also nominated were Great Woods outside Boston, Greek Theatre in Los Angeles, Jones Beach Amphitheatre on Long Island, Pine Knob Music Theatre outside Detroit, Riverport Amphitheatre near St. Louis, and the Bay Area's Shoreline Amphitheatre.

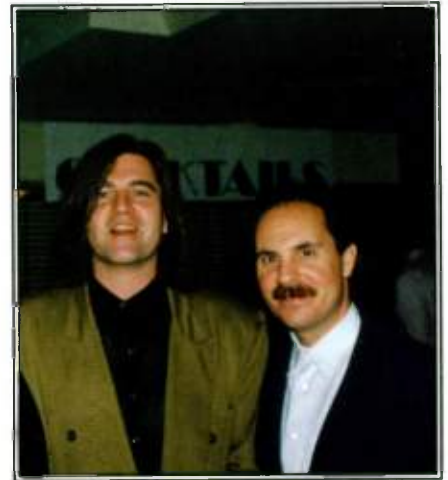

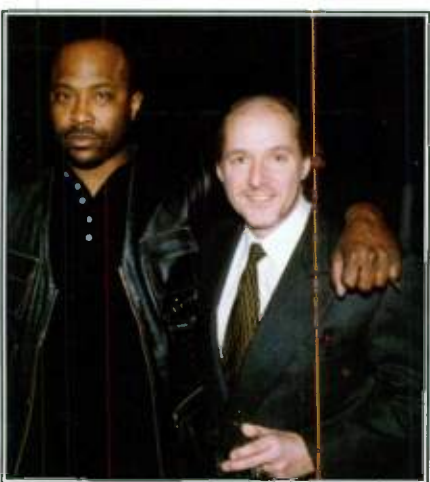

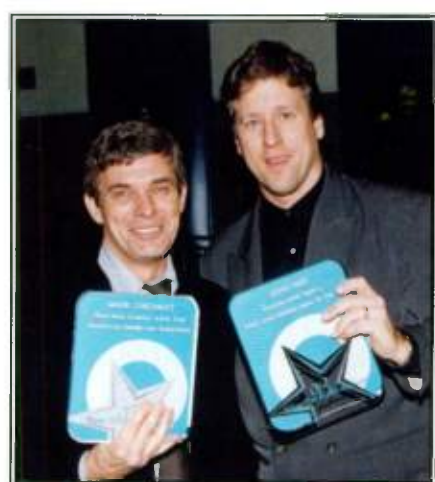

Radio City Music Hall

THEATRE OF THE YEAR

When Radio City Music Hall was officially declared a New York City landmark in 1978, there were questions about the vintage art deco building's future.

Since then, the 5,956-seat venue has found its niche hosting a combination of concerts and stage productions. Playing Radio City means prestige for many artists. Among the genre-busting line of musicians who graced Radio City's stage in 1993 were Prince, Barry Manilow, Naughty By Nature, Kenny G and Travis Tritt.

But it doesn't take a genius to figure out 1993's highlight at Radio City. One need look no further than Bette Midler. The Divine Ms. M sold \$11,119,320 worth of tickets in her 30 sellout shows during September and October en route to the biggest gross in concert industry history.

The venue's booking is overseen by Scott Sanders, who holds the titles of executive VP and executive producer of entertainment and creative development of Radio City Music Hall Productions. Among those assisting Sanders are Ed Micone, Jim Glancy, Joe Killian, and Bob Garcia.



Radio City's victory ended a three-year reign as Theatre Of The Year for Universal Amphitheatre in Los Angeles. Other nominees were the Fabulous Fox Theatre in St. Louis, Atlanta's Fox Theatre, Detroit's Fox Theatre, the Sunrise Musical Theatre near Miami, The Paramount in New York City, and The Warfield in San Francisco.



For more than 100 years and through several different buildings, the arena known as Madison Square Garden has served as the New York home of some of the most memorable sports and entertainment events in history.

Madison Square Garden

ARENA OF THE YEAR

Last year, The Garden saw many high-profile performers cross its stage. Peter Gabriel, Bobby Brown, Steely Dan, The Grateful Dead, Depeche Mode, Madonna, Luther Vandross, Neil Diamond, Rod Stewart, The Jerry Garcia Band, Mariah Carey and Janet Jackson all stopped at the world famous venue in 1993.

The average major concert gross at The Garden, which is a Paramount Communications Company, is more than \$1 million, and nearly everyone who is booked there sells out.

That wasn't always the case for the 20,000-seat venue. It was only a few years ago that The Garden appeared to be losing many major shows to the Meadowlands Arena in New Jersey. But with a major renovation completed and more aggressive management from Bob Gutkowsky and Wayne Sharp, the concert business has returned to Manhattan from the swamps of Jersey in a big way.

Also nominated for Arena Of The Year were the America West Arena in Phoenix; Orlando Arena; last year's winner The Palace of Auburn Hills; and The Spectrum in Philadelphia.

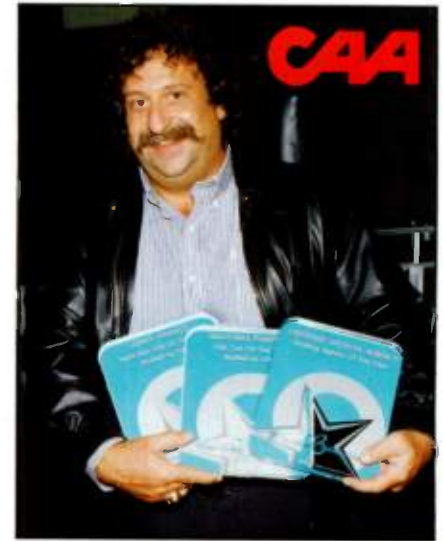
BOOKING AGENCY OF THE YEAR

In its relatively brief ten-year existence, Creative Artists Agency has now been voted Agency Of The Year for the fifth time. CAA has managed to maintain its small agency philosophy while continuing to slowly expand its list of agents and clients. Tom Ross, Kevin Gasser, Carole Kinzel, Rob Light, Brian Loucks, Mike Piranian, Rob Prinz, Mitch Rose and Rick Roskin in Beverly Hills, and Ron Baird, Rod Essig and John Huie in Nashville now make up the handpicked team that has come together since Mike Ovitz lured Tom Ross away from ICM. Ross believes it is his "all for one, and one for all" philosophy that makes CAA special.

For CAA, the old adage of "you're only as good as the agent you've signed with" is thrown to the wind. The agents at CAA feel an obligation on behalf of each other's clients to keep informed and to see that the work gets done. If a CAA artist's responsible agent isn't available, someone else in the office will be able to handle any needs that come up. Ross credits that philosophy and the intense dedication of the staff for the decade of success at Creative Artists Agency.

CAA's work ethic is shown through their success. It had 14 artists rank in the top 50 tours of 1993, including the second largest tour of the year, Rod Stewart's \$30.5 million

outing. Other top tours for CAA were Bette Midler's \$21.4 million tour, which ranked number five, Kenny G's \$18.1 million tour ranked 10th for the year, as well as Madonna's highly publicized "Girlie Show." And the agency finished the year sorting through the mountain of offers that will ultimately be the Barbra Streisand tour.



CAA has a core of superstar artists that would make any agent envious. However, that doesn't prohibit them from signing a host of cutting edge acts to their roster. Despite all the major headliners on their list, CAA is always in there fighting to sign hot news acts like A Tribe Called Quest, The Cranberries, Smashing Pumpkins or Counting Crows.

Also nominated were Monterey Peninsula Artists and the William Morris Agency, as well as first time nominees Pinnacle Entertainment and TwinTowers Touring.

NIGHTCLUB TALENT BUYER OF THE YEAR

In 1993, Miller booked performances at New York's Irving Plaza, Limelight, Academy, Roseland Ballroom and others. But the highlight for her year was Nirvana's performance at New York Coliseum, which she says had never been used as a concert facility before. The show sold out all 8,000 tickets within about an hour.

After graduating from college in 1987, Miller went to work for Seth Hurwitz at the 9:30 Club in Washington, D.C., as an office manager. She was soon promoted to GM of the nightclub and also began doing production for Hurwitz' larger I.M.P. shows.

In 1990, Miller hopped to Los Angeles to work for Triad Artists for about six months, but in April 1991, she returned to the East Coast where she joined the talent buying team at Delsener/Slater in New York City.

Other nominees for Nightclub Talent Buyer Of The Year were Jodi Goodman (Don Law Company), Dawn Holliday (Slim's in San Francisco), Seth Hurwitz (9:30 Club in D.C.), Elliot Lefko (MCA Concerts Canada), Nick Miller (Jam Productions), and Gary Osier (Billy Bob's Texas in Ft. Worth).

Delsener/Slater vice president Melissa Miller estimates her company booked about 160 shows into New York City-area clubs in 1993. "It was a great year talent-wise and it was a great year sales-wise for the clubs," she says.

John Huie

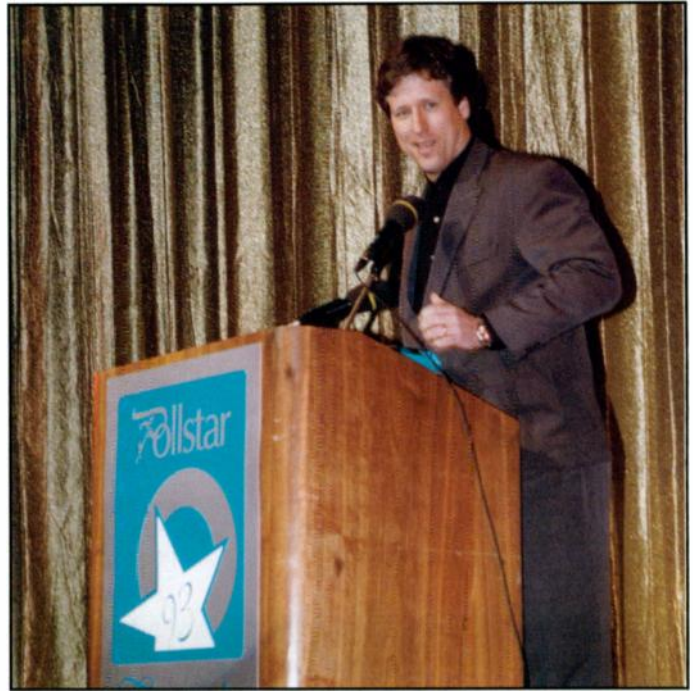
THIRD COAST AGENT OF THE YEAR

It's been just over two years since Creative Artists Agency opened its Nashville office — CAA's only satellite operation — and John Huie has been there from the beginning.

Huie counts the Dwight Yoakam/Suzy Bogguss, Michael W. Smith/D.C. Talk, and Steven Curtis Chapman tours among the year's major success stories because each far exceeded its expectations. Another major highlight was his election to the CMA board in 1993.

Huie started his career as an agent at The Paragon Agency in Macon, Ga. After a year, he moved to New York City where he helped Ian Copeland open Frontier Booking International. In 1984, he left F.B.I. and created his own New York-based agency, H-1. His clients there included Amy Grant, Michael W. Smith and other leading Christian artists. H-1 was instrumental in the contemporary Christian music industry's crossing over to a broader mass market.

In 1987, International Creative Management purchased H-1 and Huie moved to L.A. to head ICM's west coast contemporary music department. After 5 years, he left ICM to help CAA launch its Nashville office.



Other nominees for Third Coast Agent Of The Year were Sol Saffian of Buddy Lee Attractions, Rick Shipp of William Morris Agency, Buck Williams of Monterey Artists, and James Yelich of Chief Talent.



Wayne Sharp, vice president of music and variety at Madison Square Garden and The Paramount, is the first facility executive to receive this new award. Both of his facilities had banner years in 1993, and the industry obviously thinks Sharp deserves some of the credit. Apparently, so did his

superiors at MSG Enterprises, who boosted him from director of concerts to VP status before year's end.

Prior to joining The Garden in 1989, Sharp spent two years at CAA, working first with Bobby Brooks and then with Mike Piranian. He got his start in the entertainment business working his way through college at Barry Mendelson Presents in New Orleans. When he graduated from Loyola, he moved to New York and took a job with Howard Marks Management and went on the road for a year with KISS as their assistant tour manager.

FACILITY EXECUTIVE OF THE YEAR

Between his days with KISS and his start at CAA, Sharp managed Pee Wee Herman and also worked at Jim Rissmiller's Risky Business agency.

Sharp led Madison Square Garden and The Paramount through a very successful year with many highlights. In October alone they hosted 17 concerts in the arena and 22 shows in the Paramount — six Billy Joel shows, three Madonna concerts and four nights with Luther Vandross, just to name a few. But one of the brightest events of the year was the Paul Simon retrospective which ran 21 nights, and grossed more than \$8 million for the run.

Wayne Sharp looks forward to '94 knowing that if half of what he is currently working on comes through, 1994 will be another banner year.

Also nominated in the debut year for this category were Pat Christenson of Thomas & Mack Center, Gary Lane of Denver Theatres & Arenas, Mike McGee of The Summit, Claire Rothman of the Great Western Forum, and Tom Trzos of the Palace Of Auburn Hills and Pine Knob.

Missy Worth

RECORD COMPANY EXECUTIVE OF THE YEAR

Missy Worth had established herself as one of the players in the concert industry before leaving for the record business. She was voted Talent Buyer Of The Year by her peers in 1989 and shared those honors again in 1991 with Larry Vallon.

Worth worked her way to her new position as senior VP at Columbia Records by taking a variety of roads. She was Rob Kahane's secretary at Triad Artists. She's been a television agent and she has worked for Michael Lippman, Sandy Gallin and Alex Hodges.

But it was her position as VP of talent development for Sony Music that earned her the honors this year. In that capacity, Worth worked directly with managers and agents to assure that her company's artists ended up with the best tour packages available, even if it meant putting another label's band on a package with one of Sony's acts.

Starting off in the record industry, Worth had been told that record companies were not in the business of selling tickets. But Worth proved that record companies are not only in the business of helping their artists sell tickets, but that assisting in the promotion and

marketing of shows is in the best interest of an artist's career and therefore is in the record company's best interest as well. Worth feels it is an exciting phenomenon that record companies are now looking at the entire spectrum of an artist's career, including the live end.

Worth feels she should share her award with other execs at Sony Music, but was excited to be acknowledged by her peers for the innovative path she and Sony traveled in helping record companies get the most out of an artist's touring career.

Also nominated for Record Company Executive Of The Year were Jimmy Bowen from Liberty, Tim DuBois from Arista Nashville, Gary Gersh from Capitol, Danny Goldberg from Atlantic, Jim Guerinot from A&M, and Don Ienner from Columbia.



Terry Elam

TOUR MANAGER OF THE YEAR

Elam was Roy Orbison's tour manager from 1974 until Orbison's death in 1988, and worked for his estate until 1990. Then, agent Rick Shipp, who was with Triad at the time, asked Elam if he was interested in being Gill's tour manager. By May 1990, Elam had settled into his new job.

Actually, 1993 turned out to be somewhat of a break for Elam and the rest of Gill's crew. Elam estimates that in 1990 and 1991, Gill played between 170 and 190 dates each year. "That's when we were trying desperately to build a career," Elam said. Vince Gill's road life is now a bit less hectic and that makes Elam's a bit easier too.

Other nominees for Tour Manager Of The Year — a new Concert Industry Awards category in 1993 — were Bernie Boyle (Rod Stewart), Charlie Fernandez (Jimmy Buffett), Mike Frelone (Phish, k.d. lang), and George Travis (Mariah Carey, Bruce Springsteen).

Vince Gill played 105 tour dates in 1993 — not counting events like the Country Music Awards and the Grammys — and Terry Elam was there every step of the way.

Like many in his occupation, Elam started his career as a musician who usually ended up handling his bands' business duties. Eventually, he realized he had a better future handling the details than playing. "I realized there were a lot of people that had more talent musically than I had," Elam said.

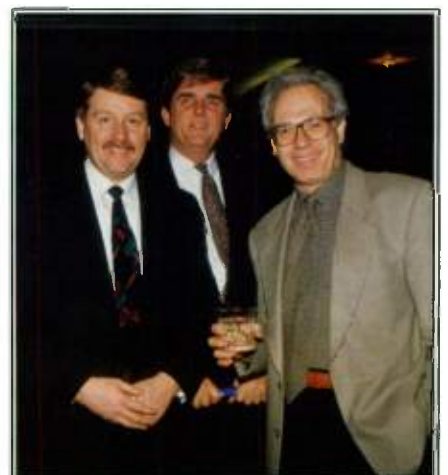

1993 Concert Industry Award Winners

Kelly Curtis

PERSONAL MANAGER OF THE YEAR

The efforts and effectiveness of a personal manager can best be observed by looking at the success of the artists he or she manages. In the case of Kelly Curtis, Pearl Jam's phenomenal climb to the top illustrates a job very well done.

The October release of Pearl Jam's second album, *Vs.*, shattered SoundScan's record for first-week sales with 950,000 units flying out the doors of retailers everywhere. Despite the band's attempt to keep down the hype over the album — they have yet to record a video or release a single — Eddie Vedder ended up on the cover of *Time* magazine as the perfect icon for angst-ridden Generation Xers. The band's debut album, *Ten*, continued to be strong on the charts even after the release of *Vs.* And the video for Pearl Jam's smash hit single "Jeremy" essentially couldn't be beat at MTV's Music Video Awards presentation. On the road, Pearl Jam is as good a bet as any, selling out virtually every concert date since the beginning, which is when the band first hooked up with Curtis.

He had been a road manager for quite a while, working primarily with Heart, when he shifted gears and started working as a promoter rep in Seattle. Through

that position, Curtis got together with Mother Love Bone and began managing them. When Mother Love Bone transformed into Pearl Jam, via Temple of the Dog, it was only natural that Curtis take over management responsibilities for the new band. He and Susan Silver, who manages Alice In Chains, worked under one roof for awhile, but they decided to split the company apart and Curtis set out on his own, opening the doors to Curtis Management.

Associates of Curtis say that his work with Pearl Jam is special because he is able to take five incredibly different people with five incredibly different ideas and put it all in focus — while keeping faith that everything will happen just the way it needs to. He is also a reclusive sort who refuses to have his picture published. Could too many people be hitting him up for comps these days?

Others nominated for Personal Manager Of The Year were Tim Collins (Aerosmith), Roger Davies (Tina Turner, Sade), Howard Kaufman (Jimmy Buffet, Lenny Kravitz), Allen Kavac (Meat Loaf, Duran Duran) and David Sonenberg (Spin Doctors).



There wasn't much room for bad news in 1993 for Alex Hodges, vice president and head of concert booking for the Nederlander Organization on the West Coast.

Ask Hodges about the year's highlights for Nederlander and he'll tick off a list much longer than would fit in this space. But among the notables were selling out a Paul McCartney show at

Anaheim Stadium; breaking boxoffice records for the Greek Theatre with five Tina Turner dates, then having that record topped by five Rod Stewart dates; watching the Spin Doctors sell out the 450-capacity Whiskey, the 1,456-capacity Wadsworth Theatre, and the 8,500-capacity Greek; and Elvis Costello's "The Juliet Letters" show featuring the Brodsky Quartet at UCLA's Royce Hall.

Alex Hodges

TALENT BUYER OF THE YEAR

Hodges got into the concert industry while attending Mercer University in the early '60s. He and a fraternity brother booked local Macon, Ga., acts — one of whom was Otis Redding. After some time in the military, Hodges returned to Macon to become an agent at Walden Artists and Promotions.

After awhile outside the industry, Phil Walden and the Allman Brothers Band lured Hodges back to Macon to form Paragon Agency in 1970. Hodges formed Empire Agency in 1979 and signed Stevie Ray Vaughan before he had a record deal. From there, he phased out Empire and moved to L.A. to become VP and head of the music department for the West Coast office of ICM. He left ICM to manage Stevie Ray Vaughan until Vaughan's tragic death in 1990. While he was still managing Vaughan, Hodges was recruited to run Nederlander's West Coast operations.

Other nominees for Talent Buyer Of The Year were Charlie Blum, Dave Hart, David Marsden, Ed Micone, Bob Romeo and Larry Vallon.

Jack Boyle

BILL GRAHAM AWARD PROMOTER OF THE YEAR

Jack Boyle won't fit your mold if your image of a concert promoter is some fast talking slickster in a shark skin suit. His unassuming appearance and low-key style, however, tend to obscure the fact that he is one of the most savvy businessmen in the concert industry. And with the passing of Bill Graham, few would argue that Boyle is now the dean of concert promoters in North America.

In his own roundabout way, Jack Boyle has turned \$1,100 he won in a poker game more than 30 years ago into the massive Cellar Door Concerts empire. He took the winnings from that game and bought a piece of a neighborhood bar. That soon became three bars. Eventually, promoting concerts became a side part to the operation.

Boyle's first foray into the national concert business was a Fats Domino show in 1965, but it wasn't until 1971 that he jumped headlong into concert promotion, starting with a Gordon Lightfoot show at Constitution Hall in Washington, D.C. Today the Cellar Door empire also includes nightclubs, theatres, restaurants and other businesses. In addition, the company has just announced plans for a major new amphitheatre in Virginia which will service the D.C. metro area.

Cellar Door has offices in six states — South Carolina, Virginia, Florida, Michigan, Wisconsin and Georgia. The people who run the offices are Boyle's partners, not just his employees — their profits rise when their offices do well, and fall when they don't. That kind of business

arrangement has allowed Boyle to attract some of the best people in the industry to run his various Cellar Door offices. Sometimes they are promoters who ran into hard times on their own. Such was the case with Bruce Kapp, who Boyle went out of his way to praise when he accepted his award.

Others nominated for the Bill Graham Award For Promoter Of The Year were Ron Delsener and Mitch Slater of Delsener/Slater, Arny Granat and Jerry Mickelson of Jam Productions, Don Law of Don Law Company, Louis Messina of Pace Concerts, Gregg Perloff of Bill Graham Presents, Paul Tollett and Rick Van Santen of Goldenvoice, and Irv Zuckerman of Contemporary Productions.



Fred Bohlander came from the Chicago area and started his career in the entertainment industry by managing local bands. He then joined the IFA staff in Chicago, where he met his future partner Dan Weiner. When IFA merged with CMA to form ICM, Bohlander and Weiner decided it was time to strike

out on their own. Together they founded Monterey Peninsula Artists on January 1, 1975. Their impressive beginning roster included Chicago, The Doobie Brothers, Bread, Leo Kottke, Jesse Colin Young, Cheech & Chong and Carole King.

There was quiet skepticism within the industry when they decided to set up shop for their new agency in the quaint coastal town of Carmel, California. Many thought they intended to take it easy and drop out of the mainstream. But that wasn't their intention at all. The idea to establish an agency outside of New York or Los

BOBBY BROOKS AWARD AGENT OF THE YEAR

Angeles came from a knowledge that living in one of those cities would have eventually become a burnout.

Obviously, living and working in a beautiful coastal environment is conducive to both good business and a real home life. Monterey Peninsula has done nothing but grow in its nearly 20 year existence, and it now boasts an extensive client list featuring many strong acts from many different musical genres. Bohlander also works closely with the staff at MPA's Nashville-based Monterey Artists division. Although the MPA offices actually moved up the road to Monterey this past year, that didn't seem to put a crimp on Bohlander's personal attitude.

If you ask anybody what is so special about Fred Bohlander, the responses will all be similar. "He is a good agent and one of the nicest men in the business today." And that's certainly in keeping with the spirit of the Bobby Brooks Award.

Others nominated for the Bobby Brooks Award For Agent Of The Year were John Dittmar of Pinnacle Entertainment, Carole Kinzel of CAA, Rob Light of CAA and Don Muller of William Morris.

Between The Dates

It's 194 feet long, 67 feet high, 63 feet wide, and seats 7. What is it? It's the **PINK FLOYD AIRSHIP**, and for the past three weeks it's been cruising the southern skies of the USA. The airship, the largest of its kind in existence, touched down last Thursday at Pasadena's Rose Bowl to announce Floyd's US tour. In addition to the dates in this week's Route Book, more markets are being scheduled and those dates will be released shortly. After Pasadena the airship will continue it's journey, visiting markets that are scheduled to host Pink Floyd this year. In order to meet the demands of the tour schedule, three identical stages, travelling in 48 trucks, will be hopscotching the country with each stage taking three days to assemble. The tour is being promoted across North America by Concert Productions International - USA, an operating division of the BCL Group..... The heavy hitters are definitely coming to bat this year. In addition to spring tours by Pink Floyd and Phil Collins you can add Texas boogie boys **ZZ TOP** to the list. The world tour will kick off in the late spring..... Hear that? That's the sound of money being thrown by promoters at **BARBRA STREISAND**. Could there be a pile of \$1 million-plus offers spread out across the table at CAA waiting for judgement day? Look for manager Marty Erlichman to make some sort of an announcement about the first few tour dates in the near future with Babs possibly hitting the road as early as April..... MTV's putting a new show on the road. It's a spoken word tour called **"FREE YOUR MIND,"** and it features poetry readings by Reg E. Gaines, Maggie Estep and John S. Hall, who as a member of King Missile composed that prophetic piece of music entitled "Detachable Penis." The tour will also feature guest appearances on select dates by Speech from Arrested Development, Lemonhead Evan Dando, Gil Scott-Heron, M.C. Lyte and MTV VJ Kennedy. Contests will be held in each market to select a local poet to open each show..... **JANET JACKSON** had to reschedule two dates and cancel two others due to a back injury which occurred during her January 24th show in Albany. Jackson rescheduled her January 25th Worcester Centrum date for January 30th, and her January 27th Spectrum date for the 31st. Both venues had originally scheduled Jackson for mid December, but had to reschedule for January due to flu-stricken band members. Jackson's planned shows for the Mobile Civic Center and the Memphis Pyramid were another story. Mobile was originally scheduled for the 28th but was pushed back one day, then cancelled, along with the Pyramid's February 1st show, due to travel logistics..... From the rumor mill: Will there be a summer **MOTLEY CRUE** tour? **DEPECHE MODE? INXS?**.... It's called **"DALTRY SINGS TOWNSHEND"** and tickets for the tribute to Peter Townshend at Carnegie Hall sold out in two and half hours last Tuesday, becoming one of the fastest sellouts in the venue's history. Appearing with Roger Daltrey will be guest of honor Townshend and Who bassist John Entwistle. Also appearing will be Pearl Jam's Eddie Vedder, Linda Perry from 4 Non Blondes, and The Chieftains. The Julliard Orchestra, conducted by Michael Kayen will also perform. Dates are February 23 & 24 with a special pay-per-view broadcast of the 23rd show scheduled for February 26th..... CD's, Guns and Money: **REBA McENTIRE'S** foray into the tickets for guns exchange, where the artist offered tickets for her February 19th show at Tulsa's Maybe Center Arena to the first one hundred people who turned in their firearms hasn't exactly thrilled everyone in Oklahoma. Buck Dickinson, who owns the Tulsa Gun and Pawn shop, has offered 10 percent off the purchase of guns and firearms equipment to anyone who brings in a Reba CD, cassette or concert ticket. Dickinson told POLLSTAR, "We've now had our offer accepted five times... Two people went into the local Walmart bought a tape and brought it in here in the sack with the receipt stapled to it. That should make her happy, she's selling more tapes." Dickinson feels that McEntire is one of the best female entertainers in the business, but when asked if he plans on seeing her next Tulsa performance he said, "I feel that I would be ambushing my own stand by going to the concert when I'm against what she happens to be doing at the moment." Dickinson plans to scrap any of the booty he collects from his "Trade In Reba" offer because, "We wouldn't let this stuff get back out on the streets."




