positions as well. Until a successor is named, Liberty and Patriot will be run by acting co-general managers, senior VP of business affairs Wayne Halper and senior VP of promotion Bill Catino. EMI Music prexy/CEO Jim Fifield will assume the co-chairman position at the Christian Music Group with Billy Ray Hearn. Bowen's retirement becomes effective March 31st.

Boyz Face Curfew

A Boyz II Men concert scheduled for January 23rd at the Palace Of Auburn Hills near Detroit had to be rescheduled because an equipment truck delay pushed the show beyond the venue's 2 a.m. curfew. Jim McCue, director of events for the arena, said a truck containing Boyz II Men's band gear got delayed in Ohio and ultimately led to the show's postponement. The start of the show was held until about 10:30 p.m. when opening act Brandy hit the stage. Babyface then did his set but it was nearly 1:45 a.m. when he finished. Although their gear had arrived, Boyz II Men couldn't overcome a rapidly approaching curfew of 2 a.m. which is defined in the venue's operating license, and therefore did not take the stage. The group will instead return to the market for a July 7th show at Pine Knob. Ticket stubs can be exchanged for tickets to the rescheduled show or the Palace Of Auburn Hills is giving refunds to those who are unhappy with the situation. McCue said the facility did everything it could to make the show happen, including renting local equipment, but with the show starting 2½ hours late and the band's equipment showing up after 11 p.m., it was impossible to do.

Accommodating Ticket Scalpers

The Phoenix City Council voted to block off an empty lot across the street from the America West Arena so that ticket scalpers would have a safe place to make their sales. The arena's director

Festival Seating Ban Causes Pantera Cancellation

A January 31st Pantera show at Hirsch Memorial Coliseum in Shreveport, La., was aborted over an issue of festival seating that stemmed from a new law that went into effect January 1st. The Louisiana Life Safety Code, written by the National Fire Protection Association, in a nutshell says that festival seating will no longer be allowed in the state. For the Pantera show, the coliseum put 400 temporary chairs down in compliance with the law but the band refused to play calling the removable chairs a hazard to the audience. Pantera's manager, Walter O'Brien from Concrete Management, said in a statement that the chairs can become dangerous if concert-goers throw them around. And rather than risk fans getting hurt, the band chose to cancel the show. Bob Fox, operations director of the coliseum said the new law hurts business because they've always used festival seating for rock concerts. "We've been fortunate not to have any problems [in the past], however, I do see the Fire Department's side, where it is a safety concern. We just want what's fair to everybody." The facility held the doors for an hour while it tried to reach a compromise with the band and the promoter, Pace Concerts, but to no avail. When the nearly 3,000 fans waiting outside were told they wouldn't be able to see Pantera perform, the crowd got a little rowdy and four people were arrested. Charges included battery, inciting a riot and cruelty to an animal — somebody apparently punched a police horse in the neck. The facility is issuing refunds and is in negotiations with Pace over the financial losses incurred, Fox said.

A Legend Steps Down

Jimmy Bowen is retiring from his post as prexy of EMI's Liberty Records citing health problems. Bowen, 57, underwent surgery for cancer of the thyroid in December. During his 40 year career in the music industry, Bowen has had a hand in almost every aspect of the business — from songwriter to musician to producer to label exec. He has produced hit songs for the likes of Dean Martin and Frank Sinatra. In the last few years, he has been part of the mushrooming success of Garth Brooks and contemporary country music. He has also achieved major accomplishments in advancing Christian music. In fact, Bowen serves as co-chairman of EMI's Christian Music Group. He is also prexy/CEO of Liberty spinoff, Patriot Records. He is retiring from those

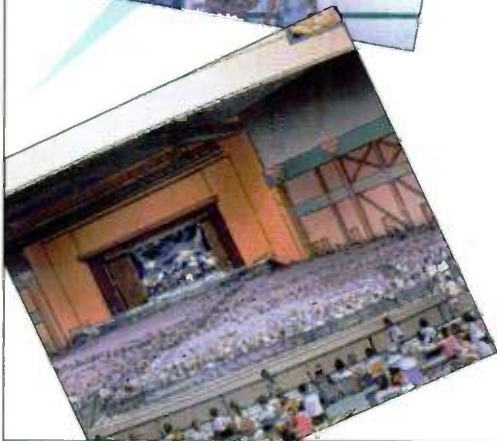

Pete Droge

It looks like 1995 may be Pete Droge's year. He kicked off the year in high-visibility style with an appearance on the David Letterman show, a news piece on MTV, interviews with both *Rolling Stone* and *Entertainment Weekly*, and a showcase at the House of Blues in New Orleans during the Gavin Convention. To top it off, Droge just landed the opening slot on part of the Tom Petty & the Heartbreakers tour and he is about to hit the road for a week with Sheryl Crow and Freddy Johnston.

Droge recently spoke with POLLSTAR from his home in Portland where he was playing with his new toys, a 1966 12-string Gibson ES 335 and a new distortion pedal called the "Big Muff." Droge has been into "toys" for as long as he can remember. "When I was four years old, my mom had a ukelele and one day I picked it up and got really into hammering on it and strumming on it as hard as I could without knowing any chords — just making up these little songs," Droge said. The singer/songwriter still has a cassette recording of those early songs and since then, he has diligently pursued his musical muse.

Droge took piano lessons in grade school and started playing the guitar when he was in junior high. When he was in eighth grade, he got his first electric guitar. "From that point, I was pretty seriously into it and pretty much had decided that was the thing I wanted to occupy all my time with," Droge said. "School suddenly was not a priority anymore." Droge, who was living in his hometown of Seattle, started playing in garage bands when he was in high school and once he got to college, he started playing solo acoustic gigs at coffeehouses, earning all the free espresso he could drink and a five pound bag of coffee. It was around that time that Droge was working in a pizza parlor and playing music at parties with a good friend who was also a musician, Mike McCreedy.

Droge is a bit hesitant about "dropping names" but he respects the way the Pearl Jam guitarist helped him out. Of McCreedy, Droge said, "He wound up joining that band and becoming a big star and when he came off the road, he believed in my music and we made a tape together. The overall, real positive, cool thing about it is, here's a guy who is in a position where he could just sit in his house at the top of the hill and be content. But instead, he gave someone like me a break. To me, that's the story."

McCreedy gave the tape to Brendan "Bud" O'Brien who was producing Pearl Jam's *Vs.* at the time. O'Brien, who happened to just have acquired signing power at American Recordings, liked what he heard, played some music with Droge and decided to sign him to the label.

Though Droge's music is drastically different from Pearl Jam's, he apparently has something in common with the mega-band — its low-key approach to exposure. Droge's debut, *Necktie Second*, was released without the benefit of a media blitz. "That is something that was deliberate and I love it," Droge said. "American's pitch was, 'We're into what you're doing and we want you to have a long-term career, therefore we don't want to hype you out of the box and have you shoot up and then shoot down.' I feel fortunate that [American] feels that way about my career. I get nauseated when I see somebody's picture too much and I can sense when things are being hyped — when the label just decides, 'We're going to shovel lots of dollars behind it and give it the big push and



nothing's going to stop it.' I think it's a shame when a genuine artist, somebody whose really passionate and heartfelt about what they do, gets that kind of treatment. It taints it in some cases when things are pushed too hard and forced." If the way Droge is slowly bubbling onto the scene is any indication of a long-term career, American's approach is working well.

Getting started on the road was also done in a non-traditional way for Droge, who spent quite a bit of time in 1994 doing a "residency tour." Marc Geiger at American thought a strong base could be built if Droge set up shop in a major city and played the regional circuit before moving on to the next part of the country. Droge and his band first went to the Northeast and spent six weeks circling around from New York, to Boston, to Philadelphia then to D.C., stopping once a week in each city. He then moved on to the Midwest and so forth.

The residency tour was handled by Droge's agent, Shelley Shaw from ICM. Shaw was initially drawn to Droge because the style of his music provides a lot of different options for support slots. "We could go out and be an opener for a young thrashy alternative band as well as being an opener for [established] song driven singer/songwriter type people. I think she was thrilled by the possibility of that," Droge said about Shaw.

And speaking of thrilled, Droge, who is managed by Pearl Jam manager Kelly Curtis, is very excited about opening for Tom Petty. "I'm really psyched about it. It's something that I've sort of been channeling my energies towards for a long time," he said. The Petty tour is the ultimate slot in Droge's eyes because he will enjoy seeing Petty and the Heartbreakers perform night after night. He also thinks Petty fans will understand his music. "So I think its going to be a great thing and I'm totally excited about it," he said. ★

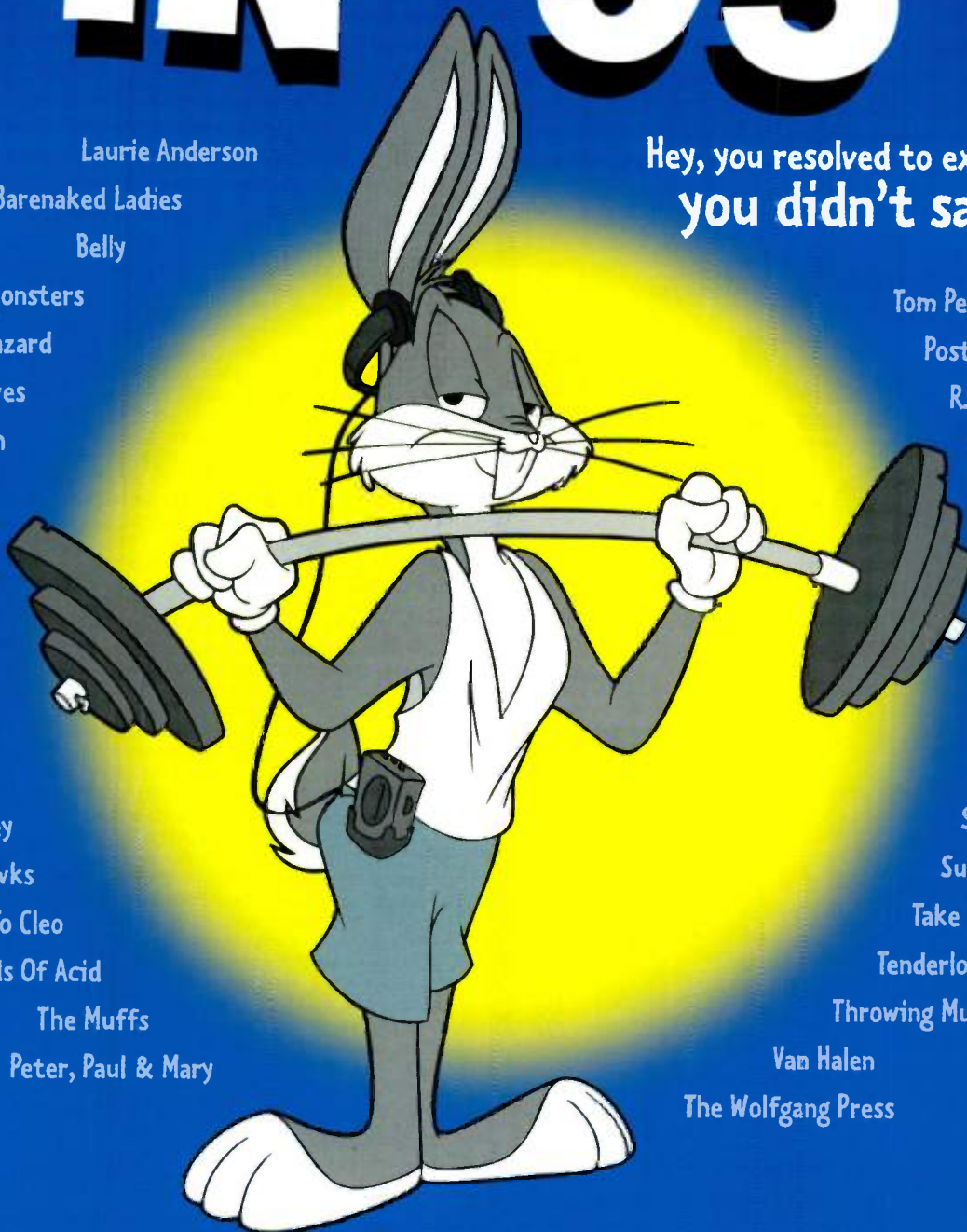

U.K. News Report

(London) **OGDEN ENTERTAINMENT** has reinforced its presence in the UK with the announcement that the company has secured a 20 year operating contract for the new 10,500 capacity **NEWCASTLE ARENA**. The £10 million project will be designed to accommodate the usual range of sport and music events and construction starts in the next month. It is due to open this autumn. Architecturally, the lightweight structure will be similar to designs seen in the USA and Japan, but it will be a first for Britain. The arena is the culmination of many years planning on the part of **CHAS CHANDLER** (otherwise known as ex-bass-player with The Animals and the man who "discovered" Hendrix) and **NIGEL STANGER**, directors of Park Arena. With Ogden securing the management of a third UK venue, it will certainly increase competition for shows on the arena circuit. It is a two-edged sword for other venue operators. On the sports front, it will be good for the ice-hockey circuit in particular, but the Newcastle Arena's closest rival, Sheffield Arena, may have to fight a little harder for shows in that corner of England.... Festival rumours abound, with the summer season looming large. **GLASTONBURY** is definitely going ahead for its 25th anniversary event, failing into its usual slot on the last weekend in June. I have been reliably informed that the headliners for Saturday night will be the Stone Roses and Simple Minds, and Sting will close the last night. Glastonbury booker Martin Elbourne is a very busy man, as he is also putting together a bill for the **ISLE OF WIGHT FESTIVAL**, which is now, definitely going ahead. It is looking like a four-day event, with a site capacity of 75,000. The festival will take place on the same end of August bank holiday weekend as the **READING FESTIVAL**. It will be interesting to see how an already oversubscribed market can support two major festivals on the same weekend at the end of the summer. It should make for some pretty exciting line-ups at both festivals. A muddy weekend on the Isle of Wight does sound a lot more appealing than a weekend in a muddy field in Reading, but the Isle of Wight will have a strong emphasis on dance acts (agent Dan Silver at VAT says quite a large proportion of his roster is in the running for a slot), so the conflict of interest may be limited. As well as booking the Reading Festival, The Mean Fiddler Organisation is also faced with getting a seriously hot bill together for the **PHOENIX**. It's the one festival nobody seems to have heard any rumours about, so the MFO is keeping any plans very firmly under its hat for that one.... And as if there weren't enough open air shows already firmly engraved on this summer's calendar, insiders say there will be a very big, multiple bill show at **KNEBORTH** on July 1st, featuring Lisa Stansfield, Meat Loaf, Sting and Bryan Adams.... There are also rumblings about a free concert for 130,000 people in **HYDE PARK**, London (where Pavarotti performed free in 1991) on the first of May to celebrate what we call VE day (the end of WWII), which has its fiftieth anniversary this year. No promoters are involved at this stage, but a few rock and roll production people have been involved in preliminary production meetings.... The **SHEPHERDS BUSH EMPIRE** had its first ever allocated seated concert at the end of January, when **KATHY MATTEA** played a sell-out show there. This means the venue will now operate as a 1,200 seater or 2,000 standing/seated hall.... **CELINE DION** is probably the first Canadian act to reach No. 1 in the album and singles chart simultaneously. Agent John Giddings at Solo-ITG is booking a UK tour for May. Another Solo-ITG band notching up almost as many column inches as record sales is **LET LOOSE**, the self proclaimed new pop sensations of the decade. The band has had three hit singles so far and Giddings is currently booking their first UK tour for April. With the traditional pop prerequisites of catchy tunes and boyish good looks, Let Loose are tipped to be the Duran Duran of the Nineties (minus the make-up). Interesting to note that Giddings is agent for both bands. And as if he didn't have enough successes to worry about, skating duo **TORVILLE & DEAN** are nine months into a farewell world tour, which has grossed in the region of £20 million so far.... The original walrus of love, **BARRY WHITE**, is back for a six date arena tour in March, promoted by **KENNEDY STREET ENTERPRISES**, who scooped Wembley's annual Promoter of The Year Award for 1994. Kennedy Street promoted a total of 19 shows (including Take That and Barry Manilow) at the arena last year. The ratings put **PHIL MCINTYRE** in second place, **MEL BUSH** in third and **HARVEY GOLDSMITH** and **MARSHALL ARTS** tying for fourth place.... While you were all watching the Super Bowl, football fan, **TIM PARSONS** of MCP threw a party at the Royal Albert Hall after the **BLACK CROWES'** second sell-out show there with a live screening of the game.... Mike Greek at ICM-Fair Warning/Wasted Talent has signed **BUSH**, another great British band that is storming a path in the US and no-one over here has heard of.

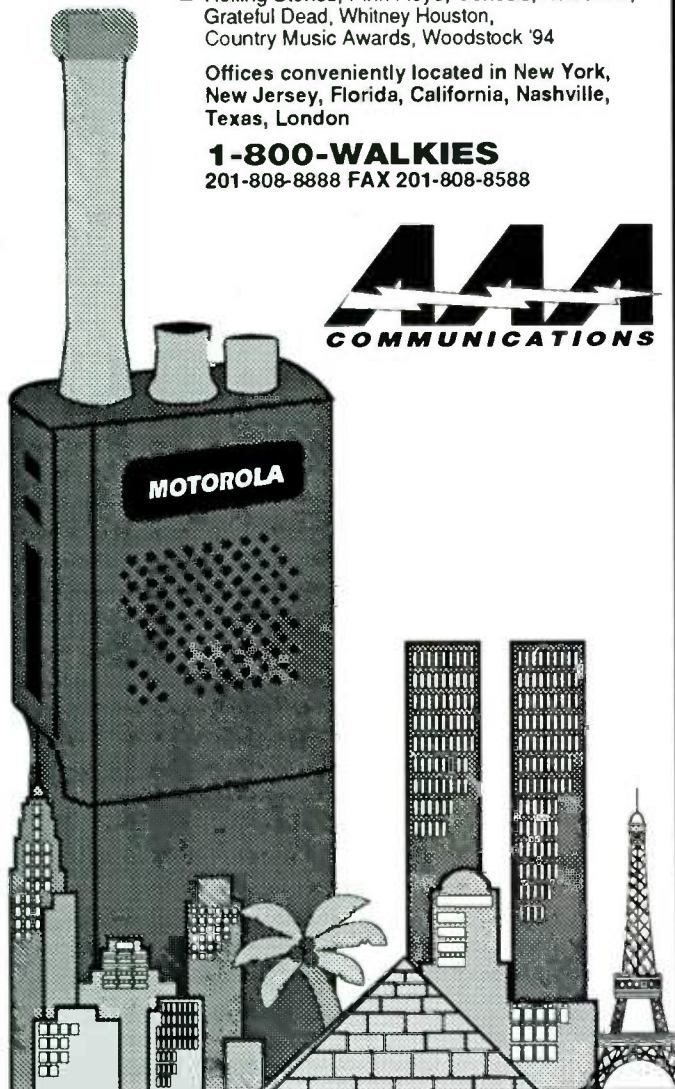

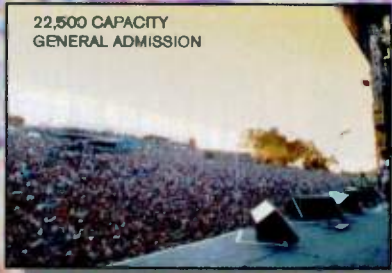

of security, George Bevans, told POLLSTAR the move was a safety measure. He said, "We had the general public gathering on the public right-of-ways and thereby blocking sidewalks and making people move out to the street to get by." For that reason, the city and the venue wanted to put people in an area where passing traffic would be less hazardous. There had been a city ordinance in place forbidding scalping on streets and sidewalks but it was seldom enforced. Bevans said, "I think this is just an attempt to strengthen the law and get everybody to realize that it's more of a safety issue right now." Some officials have voiced concern that restricting scalpers to one lot may lead to fights over space and customers. But Bevans said the police department has assured the venue that the situation will be monitored very closely for the first couple of months.

Avalon Makes San Diego Arena Deal

Avalon Attractions and Arena Group 2000 announced a joint venture January 30th to form a new company, Avalon Entertainment Partners. The company will promote concerts and other live entertainment at venues around San Diego as well as promote Latino concerts on a nationwide basis. Arena Group 2000 operates the San Diego Sports Arena and has an exclusive agreement to develop a new downtown sports and entertainment center in cooperation with the City of San Diego. Avalon has promoted events in San Diego since 1977 and has maintained a San Diego office since 1987. David Swift, who directs Avalon's San Diego operations, will serve as VP of Avalon Entertainment Partners. Despite the joint venture, the Sports Arena will continue to be available to other concert promoters.

In A Country Jam

Larry Barr, the organizer of Country Jam, now known as Country Thunder, has some creditors concerned about being involved in this year's event but Gil Cunningham of the Don Romeo Agency in Omaha is not one of them. Cunningham said the acts he's booked with Barr always get paid. "I've worked with Larry for six years," Cunningham said. "And I'm not in the least bit worried." However, other associates of Barr's said they will not do business with him again because of outstanding debts. But

Barr is going forward with the festival's plans. He said ticket requests and inquires are at an all-time high. And he also said he has paid 60 percent of last year's debts and expects this year's festival to bring in more income. The three-day music festival and camp-out is being held this year in a rural community east of Phoenix, the fourth location for the country music festival. Others have been held in Eau Claire and Lake Geneva, Wis., and Grand Junction, Colo. Barr said he has sold or is in the process of selling two of those festivals and is keeping only the Arizona and Lake Geneva locations.

The Retirement Of J. Geils

Four members of the dismantled J. Geils Band filed a federal lawsuit against Smith Barney Inc., claiming mismanagement of a pension fund cost them at least \$450,000. In the suit, filed last October, John Geils Jr., Stephen Bladd, Richard Salwitz and Seth Justman said they wanted safe investments but claim Smith Barney broker Kathleen Hegenbart generated big commissions for herself buying and selling high-risk securities. Smith Barney's lawyers said any money lost was due to a volatile stock market in the mid-'80s. A hearing is scheduled for March 15th.

CMA Gets Frosty With The Great White North

The Country Music Association is moving this summer's board meeting from Toronto to Boston as a protest to the banishment of America's Country Music Television from Canadian cable. In a

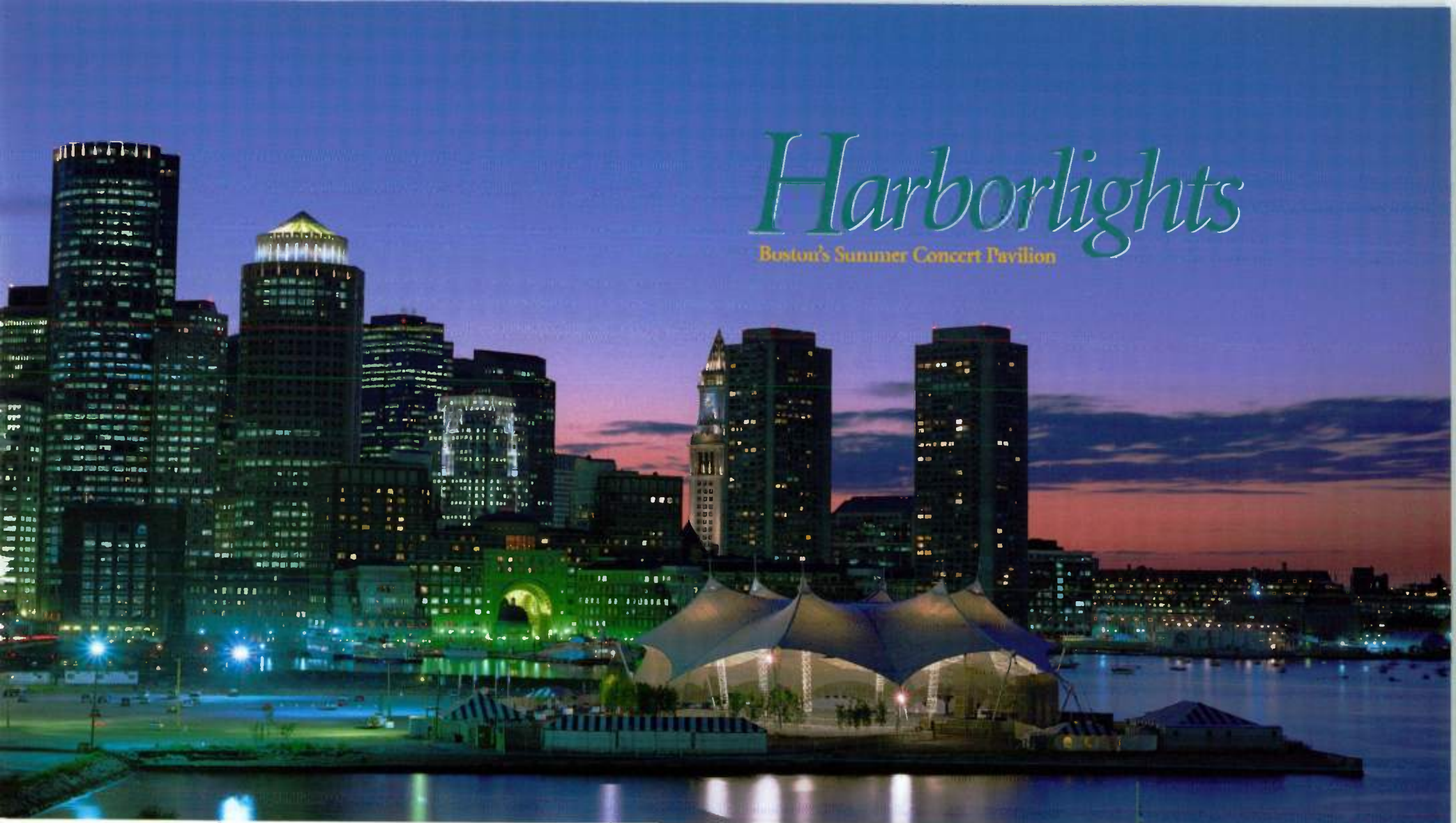

The CMA board meeting would have been the 10th time the organization had met in Toronto. CMT was dropped as of January 1st when a new Canadian country music channel, New Country Network, went on the air. In an earlier retaliation move, CMT reportedly banned videos by Canadian-based artists without U.S. record company deals. Appeals by CMT have been dismissed by both the Supreme Court of Canada and Canada's Federal Court of Appeals. CMT has filed a petition with the U.S. Trade Representative seeking redress.

Fiddlegate

Veteran fiddler Thomas M. Williams Jr. has brought a \$20 million suit against several Republican organizations for injuries he suffered during a 1992 rally for Oliver North. The veteran "Hee-Haw" regular was performing on the back of a flatbed truck at the rally when scaffolding and other equipment collapsed and fell on him, according to the suit. The list of defendants include the Suffolk Republican Party, the state GOP, the 4th Congressional District GOP, the Republican-backed Victory '92 organization, and the trucking company owned by the former head of Suffolk's GOP. Most of the defendants will ask a Richmond, Va., Circuit Court judge to let them off the hook. A hearing was scheduled January 31st to determine who can be sued and whether the entire matter should be moved to Suffolk, Va., where the rally occurred.

Willie & The Hemp Jive


The Texas cops that found pot in Willie Nelson's car last year may have conducted an illegal search, according to the singer's attorney. Nelson was arrested after police found him sleeping in the back-seat of his car on the side of the road. The officers peered through the window of Nelson's car and apparently saw a joint in the ashtray. They searched the rest of the vehicle and found less than two ounces of wacky weed. Nelson told police

he had pulled over alongside Interstate 35 to take a nap. He said he was on his way home to Austin after playing cards with buddies in Hillsboro. Attorney Joe Turner called the legality of the search by Hewitt police "the essence of the case." The prosecutor said, "In my opinion, the Hewitt Police Department acted within the bounds of the law and the Constitution, meaning that any fruits of their search should be admissible as evidence." A judge in Waco postponed Nelson's case last week for a seventh time since his arrest last May. The pretrial hearing to test the validity of the search was scheduled for March 1st.

The Dick Clark Music Awards

Boyz II Men, with three honors, dominated the 22nd Annual American Music Awards, broadcast January 30th from the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles. Reba McEntire and Michael Bolton followed on the vocal-quartet's heels with two awards each. The nominations for the Dick Clark-produced television program were compiled from sales information supplied by *Radio & Records* and SoundScan, and were chosen by a national sampling of 20,000 people who obviously like their music on the mainstream side. Counting Crows took home the favorite artist award in the alternative category beating out Green Day and Nine Inch Nails. The pop sensation from Sweden, Ace of Base, was named best group and best new artist in the pop-rock category. Other winners included Snoop Doggy Dogg for favorite rap/hip-hop artist, Mariah Carey for best pop-rock female, Garth Brooks for best country male, Vince Gill for country single and Nirvana for favorite heavy metal-hard rock artist. The less-than-spectacular show had a few high notes, namely the duet sung by Madonna and Babyface. Maddie, in elegant style, belted out her new song, "Take a Bow," with pristine perfection and Babyface added his sultry smooth vocals making it one of the few highlights of a largely dismal show. Another much hyped performance didn't fare as well. Robert Plant and Jimmy Page, who as part of Led Zeppelin accepted a special International Artist Award, delivered an uninspired rendition of their hit "Black Dog" prior to accepting the award via satellite. The third surviving member of Led Zep, John Paul Jones, was called out to accept his honor in the flesh. Contrary to the little stab he threw at his former band-mates at

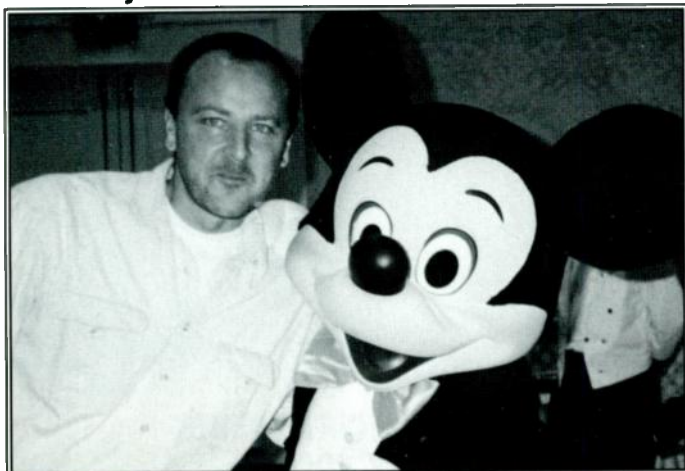

TAFKAP received his Dick Clark ordained Award of Merit which recognizes "outstanding contributions to the musical entertainment of the American public." The ex-Prince had the word "slave" painted on his cheek and during his acceptance speech, he tried to reassure those concerned about Paisley Park's financial disarray. TAFKAP also sparked some controversy when he stood sucking a lollipop and refused to sing during the finale which honored the 10th anniversary of the recording, "We Are The World." An all-star group including Quincy Jones, Michael Bolton, Faith Hill, Vince Gill, Paula Abdul and Anita Baker joined in the sing-along of the famine-relief anthem but it sounded more like a group of non-professionals who were obviously not well rehearsed and didn't appear to know the song's words.

Ambassador To Go Dark In May

The 1,200-seat Ambassador Auditorium in Pasadena will end its operation as a major performing arts venue May 18th after twenty years of service to Southern California jazz and arts patrons, it was announced January 27th. In the past, 50 percent of the Ambassador's operating expenses were subsidized by the auditorium's owners, The Worldwide Church of God. The church has suffered declining income in recent years and must now cease funding the arts. The 1995/96 season was scheduled but without the \$2.5 million subsidy from the church, the season had to be cancelled. However, the balance of the 1994/95 season will run as scheduled through the end of May. The hall, which sits on the 40-acres that comprise the Worldwide Church of God's headquarters, will continue to be used for religious services but its future as a performing arts center is uncertain.

Someday Can Be A Long Day

PolyGram promo rep Ken Ashdown went to the limits for the new Bon Jovi single when he chained himself to a parking meter outside of a radio station in Vancouver to protest the station's decision to not add the song "Someday I'll Be Saturday Night." Between The Dates

Last year's big stadium tour co-bill of **ELTON JOHN** and **BILLY JOEL** returns to cover some markets that were missed in 1994. Included will be West Coast stops in San Diego and the MGM Grand Garden in Las Vegas, which looks to be the only non-stadium show on the tour. At press time, the San Diego date hadn't been officially announced, but the word is that the show at Jack Murphy Stadium may well be the only California stop on this tour. If they don't do another leg later in the year after the weather warms up, there will still be quite a few major markets that didn't get to see the dueling piano pounders. Last year's tour only made it as far west as San Antonio..... U.S. promoters who booked **VAN HALEN** can exhale now. SoundScan reports that the new album, *Balance*, sold nearly 300,000 units during the first week of sales, making it the number one selling album in the nation. Garth Brooks' *Hits* album, which had been the top selling product for several weeks, was bumped down to number two with approximately 200,000 sold..... The **CLINT BLACK** dates listed in this week's Route Book end February 19th, and that's going to be it until this summer when Lisa Hartman's husband hits the road in July and August..... **CLINTON GREGORY** suffered a sprained wrist, head and neck injuries, and minor facial cuts when he was run over by his own car. "There were some tree limbs in the driveway of the old house where I used to live," Gregory said. "I got out to move them and the car jumped out of park and ran over my little bony self." Gregory explained that most of his injuries came from falling down..... After 27 years of producing musical and comedy attractions around the U.S., St. Louis based **CONTEMPORARY PRODUCTIONS** is taking its first stab at Broadway. The company has posted some huge grosses around the country with **ROB BECKER**'s "Defending The Caveman" show and now figures it's time to take it to the Great White Way. The show opens at the Helen Hayes Theatre in March..... Traveling so far west, that they're in the east, **AIR SUPPLY** will become the second Australian band to play in **CHINA**. The first band of Aussies was Yothu Yindi. China seems to be getting a little more friendly towards Western artists desire to perform in the country. Paul Simon, Paula Abdul, John Denver, and B.B. King have already done it and **ROXETTE** is reportedly going into the Communist country later this month. Despite the cultural relaxation, **MADONNA**, who once tried unsuccessfully to get permission to play there, is probably still a bit to provocative for the land of Mao. There are news reports that the socially more acceptable duo of **KENNY G** and **WHITNEY HOUSTON** are trying to organize a concert on the Great Wall..... There's been concern that the March 27-28 **ROLLING STONES** concerts at Melbourne's Cricket Ground would delay the Australian Football League's season opener. The AFL has scheduled games just three days after the Stones shows. The Cricket Ground, a major Australian stop for world tours, suffered some field damage after a Madonna concert two years ago. Venue officials say that the circumstances were different when Maddie played, shortly after a U2 concert took place. It was before Christmas, and the ground was softer. Venue officials say they are bringing in a better field covering which they have obtained from Wembley Stadium in London so that the start of "Footy" season isn't delayed.

Australian News Report

(Sydney) The Frontier Touring Company have every reason to be delighted by PEARL JAM's concert sales. The 12,000 tickets to their Sydney Entertainment Centre concert on March 10th sold out in 12 minutes on January 23. One person wanted to camp outside the centre for three weeks before tickets went on sale. Fans camped at the venue from the previous Friday, with more than 200 over the weekend. The longest wait for tickets was in Perth, where some fans camped for four days. Tickets to all Pearl Jam indoor shows (except Canberra on March 14) were sold out before 11 a.m. on the day they were made available. Melbourne tickets sold out in eight minutes..... The TAMWORTH COUNTRY MUSIC FESTIVAL held at the end of January each year is the biggest and most important gathering of the country music fraternity in Australia. Traditionally a very Australian-only affair this year it featured performances by JANN BROWN and WYLIE & THE WILD WEST SHOW who both have albums released here through the recently established Massive Country label. The most prestigious awards are The Golden Guitars which were given out January 28th. Among the artists winning awards were Graeme Connors (song, album, and male vocal), Gina Jeffreys (female vocal), Lee Kernaghan (top selling album), Dead Ringer Band (vocal group), and Clint Beatie (new talent)..... The Lollapalooza-like BIG DAY OUT series of concerts has sold out everywhere. In Sydney, over 30,000 tickets at \$A50 were sold out weeks before the show and promoter Ken West estimates that he could have sold double that number. And yes, COURTNEY LOVE kept herself out of trouble long enough to do the shows. In fact, after last week's court appearance there's been no media reports pertaining to Courtney. The Big Day Out attracted a significant number of international visitors. Amongst them were Rob Gordon and Trip Du Bois from Atlas/Polydor in the States who, besides soaking up all the action, were in Australia to see the UNDERGROUND LOVERS and talk with them about their upcoming Atlas release in the U.S. Also in town were Paul Franklin from big U.K. agency Primary Talent, and Chris Coyle from Industrial Management (U.S. managers of The Clouds)..... Michael Coppel has announced that SLAYER will be touring Australia in March. A full itinerary wasn't available at press time but they play Sydney's 6,000 seater Hordern Pavilion on March 28th with special guests Biohazard..... With the heavy international traffic currently coming through Australia it appears to be affecting some of the bigger local acts. On January 24th the Sydney Entertainment Centre was host to a mega bill on the "Breaking Of The Dry Tour," with MIDNIGHT OIL, CROWDED HOUSE and HUNTERS & COLLECTORS all sharing the bill. Unfortunately it only managed to attract a two thirds house in the 12,000 seater venue..... In the wake of the announcement that PETER JAMIESON is leaving BMG International and being replaced by MICHAEL SMELLIE, the big speculation is who will take over the reins at BMG in Australia. There's two schools of thought - one punting for CHRIS GILBEY, the other suggesting that BMG will import someone from overseas. The word is that if the latter happens then there'll be some big changes over in North Sydney. Then again both lots of speculation might be completely out-the-window.
