A Mosh Pit Safety Star

Paul Wertheimer of Crowd Management Strategies was arrested for battery at the Pearl Jam concert July 11th at Soldier Field in Chicago. Wertheimer, who was pulled out of the mosh pit, detained at the side of the stage and later arrested, claims he was set up by a combination of parties including representatives of the band, concert promoter Jam Productions and Star Security. Wertheimer told POLLSTAR he believed Jam and Star Security were angry over an investigative report aired on a Chicago television station about safety violations at local concert halls. That news report included video footage which was shot without permission at a Slayer concert at the Aragon Ballroom where Jam promotes and Star handles security. "Evidently, what the segment showed was damaging and embarrassing to both those parties," Wertheimer said. The security consultant said Jam and Star blamed him for the report, though he contends he was simply used as an expert source and wasn't a participant in filming at the venue. Wertheimer said the televised reports laid a foundation for the conflict but when he decided to notify local officials, including the mayor, of his concerns about the plans for festival seating at the July 11th Pearl Jam show at Soldier Field, it only added fuel to the fire. Wertheimer claims when he went to a Grateful Dead concert earlier in the week of the Pearl Jam show, he found his picture and a photo of the television reporter plastered up around the facility like "wanted posters." He said he felt intimidated and threatened by the public display of his photo. Jam and Star both contend that the photos were only placed in the security areas at the entrance in order to alert personnel of the possibility of Wertheimer and the reporter, Larry Yellen, trying to sneak in cameras. Dan DiSilvestro, president of Star Security, told POLLSTAR, "At the Grateful Dead, we were instructed to watch out for hidden cameras coming in and the most likely suspects would be Yellen and Wertheimer.... That's the only reason for those pictures being up." Following the Dead concert, Wertheimer had his attorney send a letter to Jam and the GM of Soldier Field demanding that the fliers with his picture be taken down. Wertheimer said when he showed up at the Pearl Jam show on the 11th, the posters were still up and in plain view of the public. Wertheimer said he then realized the Pearl Jam camp was participating in the set up. He said he recently had been contacted by members of the media who asked if he was working

for Ticketmaster against Pearl Jam. That, coupled with the fact that the San Diego Sheriff's department used him as a source when compiling the safety report that helped lead to the cancellation of Pearl Jam's shows in Del Mar, "exploited Pearl Jam's own paranoia about who I was and what I was doing," Wertheimer said. While at the PJ show at Soldier Field, Wertheimer said he went into the mosh pit to get a first hand look at the action. He claims he was helping some kids who had gone down in a pile-up when he realized he was being pointed at from about 20 yards away. "I was fingered [by] Jerry Melee; he's a nationally prominent security consultant [who works for PJ]," Wertheimer said. "He knew who I was, obviously. I certainly knew who he was. Even though I'd never met him, we'd debated through the media on issues of safety." Wertheimer claims a Star Security person came into the pit, pulled his arm behind his back and started pushing him out of the pit saying, "don't resist." But Army Granat of Jam Promotions said two of Pearl Jam's security guys, one from the stage and one from the side of the stage, saw Wertheimer push and shove somebody in the audience so they pointed him out to Star's personnel. Wertheimer was then taken to a holding area, which was the game plan for anyone causing trouble at the show, according to Star Security. Granat told POLLSTAR Pearl Jam's security has a policy of snapping Polaroid photographs of anyone who cause

Artist Profile ★



With the assembly line-like influx of predatory acts crawling all over the music business looking for their "big break" these days, KORN's lethal dose of tasteful success has been both refreshing and just a little surprising. While many groups now boast repertoires that defy pigeon-holing, KORN effortlessly stands out by instinctively knowing how to channel and focus those diverse influences ranging from hardcore to hip-hop and back to classical and metal. And this is one band that has never had to worry about coming up with a distinctive image scheme.

KORN's quiet odyssey began in what was to become the punk mecca of Huntington Beach, Calif. It was 1993 and Bakersfield escapees Brian Welch (co-lead guitar), James "Munk" Munkey (co-lead guitar), Fieldy (bass guitar) and David Silveria (drums and percussion) were just a *little* fed up with the motley string of singers they seemed to be attracting. Looking to break their jinx, the members of KORN enlisted fellow Bakersfield native Jonathan Davis, who proved to be the missing link that turned the band's fortune around very quickly.

KORN is hardly Davis' "band" but the singer's riveting charisma and fascinating life experiences has undeniably impacted every aspect of the group's career. Oddly, the voice — the most organic of instruments — was the last musical tool Davis discovered after growing up in an environment most professional musicians would die for. Davis' father owned a music store and operated a music school adjacent to the shop where Davis said he would typically grab an instrument and sponge up some knowledge. "The teachers would give me pointers in-between their lessons. I had free run of the place and all the instruments I could ever want! I just played everything!" he said.

Davis' father also purchased the recording studio previously owned by Bakersfield's own country and western legend, Buck Owens; KORN proceeded to ring in the new era of ownership by laying down several tracks there for their self-titled debut which was released in 1994 on Epic's Immortal label offshoot.

KORN's CD was an impressive performer on both the alternative and metal charts for much of 1994, continuing to maintain momentum into 1995 on the strength of the band's tireless touring ethic. The metal community rallied behind KORN first and a much talked-about appearance at last year's Foundations Forum further solidified KORN's status within the genre, although the group has successfully broadened its fan base to better reflect the multi-dimensional character of its music.

KORN deliberately accepted the opportunity — and the challenge — of touring with disparate acts such as House Of Pain, Danzig, and Sick Of It All in order to experience vastly different audiences first-hand. "The audiences were definitely different," Davis remembered. "Like, [with] Sick Of It All, you're getting all the hardcore kids and [with] House Of Pain, it's a lot of hip-hop kids. I mean, there's different audiences and they seem to really dig us. It's really cool to see that." KORN's distinctive amalgamation of heavy guitars and vocals backed with intricate rhythmic patterns and offbeat instrumentation impressed doubters from every faction, as did Davis' no-nonsense lyrics on tracks such as "Daddy" (about child abuse, whereby Davis' actual vocal booth sobbing was recorded without his knowledge) and "Helmet In The Bush" (tackling amphetamine abuse).

The members of KORN are exceedingly careful in ensuring that their business affairs are conducted in a manner befitting their creative philosophy. Davis explained the band's strategy. "We wanted to build a fan base and do it slowly because [otherwise] we [would have] become a one hit wonder. You know, you rise up to the top fast without anyone ever hearing your shows and knowing what you're all about. And then you're gone. We've built up such an incredible fan base! Our fans are so loyal! We're just steppin' up level by level. And it's payin' off." KORN is looked after by Jeff Kwatinetz and Peter Katsis from Q Management, of whom Davis emoted, "I love those guys. I'd do anything for them. I *trust* them, and that's what I really need." Davis and drummer David Silveria take care of KORN's business in their own way, as well. "KORN is our business. David's really into the business side of things and I take care of people on the way. I really run it like a business, like it should be. Our management looks over everything and makes sure it's being done right."

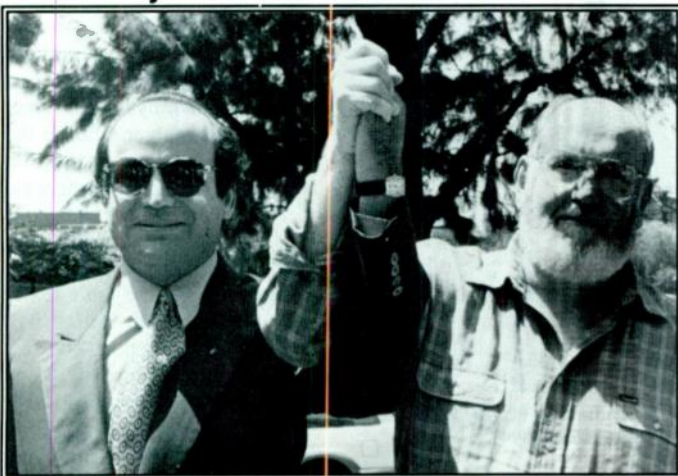
One thing Q Management and ICM's Andy Somers (David Chumbley of Primary Talent handles bookings abroad) have seen to is securing KORN a gig at The Limelight at this year's CMJ Music Marathon. "Most people have to label us and we've already done the metal thing. Now we're starting to cross over into alternative and they'll probably try and call us somethin' else," surmised the bagpipe virtuoso good-naturedly. "I don't care, but I can't classify us." Remember, this is the only "hard" band to emerge from Huntington Beach, or so Davis reckons. "People tripped out when we came out 'cause Huntington Beach is so punk. They didn't even call us punk rock. They called us 'hard' punk rock. I don't know... If we're from any 'scene,' I just think we're from the Bakersfield scene because we all grew up there."

The band has an affectionate love-hate relationship with the agrarian outpost between L.A. and San Francisco. "That whole Bakersfield vibe's wacked," said Davis. "Stephen King should go there. He'd have a fucking lovely time. You gotta go to Bakersfield to understand what I'm talking about... When you fly in there, it looks like the armpit of hell!"

Currently finishing up a grueling summer stint supporting Megadeth with Flotsam & Jetsam and Fear Factory, KORN is gearing up for the next eclectic chapter in its tour diary: co-headlining with industrial kingpins KMFDM. Davis expects the band will resume writing in December, squeeze in two months for pre-production amidst more live shows, and have new product out by this time next year. ★

disturbances. And when the band's tour manager was called to where Wertheimer was being held, he raised the camera to his face to take the photo and Wertheimer hit it with his elbow injuring the road manager. Wertheimer said no one had asked for his identification but they obviously knew who he was, supporting his conspiracy theory. He said when he saw the camera coming at him, he simply raised his arm to cover his face and it bumped the camera. Wertheimer insists the way the situation was handled was not typical of the way other fans were treated and that Melee went as far as to say he was going to find "the kid" that was allegedly pushed in the mosh pit and "force him to press charges." Jam and Star obviously see the situation very differently. They maintain they were just doing their jobs and definitely were not deliberately hassling the security consultant. "Had he come to the show and not been seen doing something, he would have just left the show without incident," Granat said. "It seems he always has to create a stir." There is obviously no love lost between Wertheimer and certain members of the concert industry. Those who spoke against Wertheimer to POLLSTAR questioned his credibility as a security consultant, his methodology in compiling his often inflammatory statistics and his motives for actions. Wertheimer, on the other hand, contends that the concert industry continues to "have its head in the sand" over safety issues and he urges everyone to come together to insure safe concert environments for all fans. Wertheimer was charged by police for hitting the camera and released on bail after spending about six hours in the crowbar hotel. In August, a judge dismissed the case. Pearl Jam and its security personnel were unavailable for comment. However, Pearl Jam spokesperson Nicole Vandenberg said the band has no interest in setting up Paul Wertheimer, despite his complaints.

Gold Mountain Buys Out BCL Interest

BCL Entertainment Group has sold its interest in Gold Mountain Entertainment back to the management company's principals. Toronto's John Labatt Ltd., which owns a majority interest in BCL, has stated its intention to divest itself of all entertainment assets in order to concentrate on its core business of making brewskis. BCL, which stands for Ballard, Cohl and Labatt, is the

parent company which controls both CPI and Brockum as well as investments in Gold Mountain and International Talent Group. The Gold Mountain interest appears to be the first entertainment asset to be shed by the company. The deal was announced August 24th by Gold Mountain co-founder Ron Stone. As part of the restructuring to complete the buyout of BCL, John Silva has been made a full partner in the management powerhouse.

A Bizarre But Happy Ending

Police are investigating the bizarre disappearance of Cypress Hill manager and Immortal Records owner Happy Walters, who was apparently abducted off the streets of Los Angeles August 24th and later found in Long Beach after a 48-hour search. A source told POLLSTAR that when Walters stopped at an ATM near La Cienega and Pico, he was struck on the head and hijacked along with his car. An unconscious Walters was then dumped in the bushes of a high-crime area of Long Beach, apparently with a cigar burn on his forehead and a line shaved in his hair. When he came to, he had no idea who or where he was or what had happened. Walters tried to call for a taxi from a pay phone but was told a cab wouldn't venture to that neighborhood to pick him up. Walters eventually persuaded the manager of a McDonalds to phone a cab for him. The driver took him to a hotel where he slept until late the next day. When Walters woke, he realized what had happened and asked a hotel clerk for help. He was taken to a county hospital but was told since he had no gunshot wounds, he was OK and to come back on Monday for a check of

A Look At Radio Festivals ★

The concept of radio festivals has developed from being a "thank you" to advertising clients into one of the most highly-visible marketing promotions a station undertakes in a year.

Twice a year (for summer and acoustic Christmas shows), radio stations solicit record companies to provide acts for their upcoming concerts. The stations' goal is to get acts on the bill that will convince listeners the concert is definitely *the* event not to be missed.

Stations across the country that scheduled their shows at the beginning of the summer have already seen positive results in their Arbitron ratings. And stations with shows that played in August can more than likely expect the same.

Many have criticized radio stations for getting involved in the concert promoting business. But no one can deny the benefit of the radio festival vehicle to acts just beginning to make their mark in the industry. As a matter of fact, radio festivals are now perceived as an essential component when trying to break a new act. However, putting an act on a festival bill does not guarantee success.

Rob Kahane of Trauma Records, which had Bush and the Phunk Junkeez on a majority of the summer shows, told POLLSTAR an act must be prepared to really work the larger stage if it decides to participate in a radio show. "It's similar to if you have a great song and make a terrible video, it doesn't help your career," Kahane said. "If you have a captive audience at [a radio fest] of 15,000 or 20,000 people and you put on a terrible show, it's going to set you back tremendously. I think the rule of thumb is that you better be prepared or capable of showcasing yourself in the best possible light.... There were bands out there [playing radio fests this summer] that never should have been on the big stage. They weren't ready for it and I could see that hurting them." Kahane said he heard quite a few comments from others involved in radio fests to support his views.

If a band is prepared to show the larger audience what it can aspire to, it has a better chance of reaping the benefits of playing at a radio station-sponsored festival. And the benefits for artists can be two fold: One, an increase in exposure generally results in an increase in sales, and two, radio festivals allow a band that is at a club stage in its career to see

if it can pull off a strong performance at a larger venue.

"It gave Bush an opportunity to see if they could reach beyond a club sized stage and audience to a shed size or a 20,000-to 30,000-person audience," Kahane said. "For us, it was an exceptional experience in the sense that ... you could see the band's stage presence and their ability to project to that number of people. The opportunity wouldn't have been there without the radio shows."

Bush, which played at a majority of summer fests this year, was cited by many industry executives as being the quintessential

that we were pushing through, on a weekly basis, the chains."

Despite the benefits to the artists and the radio stations, radio festivals do stir up a bit of controversy. In fact, some in the record business speak so negatively about radio fests, they refused to go on the record for fear of retribution. "I hate them," said one unnamed VP at a major record company. "We are nearly forced to participate and they cost us a lot of money."

Participation in a radio festival guarantees an act heavy rotation during the concert's promotion. An acts refusal to participate reportedly can mean an artist will no longer be on the playlist of that particular radio station. American Recordings Marc Geiger, who is a co-founder of the seminal alterna-rock fest Lollapalooza, said radio fests are terrible but the way they are booked is not exactly "blackmail," or "payola" as some have called it. "Blackmail is a pretty strong word," Geiger said. "But yea, [radio fests] are more like implicit blackmail."

"The problem is that alternative radio, in general, used to be about one thing. Now, it's more like pop radio. It's about research; it's about requests; it's about SoundScan which tallies up to instant gratification.... It has nothing to do with whether it's a great artist or not anymore. They just take whatever's hot at the moment." Geiger said radio festivals operate the same way.

So, a problem can arise when a record company pays for one of its artists to play a radio fest. There isn't really any guarantee the station will continue to support the act later on down the road. "You have to prove yourself all over again and that, to me, isn't fair," Geiger said. "But I'm a realist and I understand that's how pop radio always worked."

Other record company spokespeople agree saying if a label lives by the motto "You scratch my back, I'll scratch yours," its back may always have an itch. Though Trauma's Kahane is very supportive of radio fests, he said it is important that radio stations remember the cost, expense and effort record companies go through to provide artists when they are needed for the concerts. "It's very important radio stations remember [what we go through] so that

band to look at as an example of the benefits of radio fests. In addition to the growth in stage presence, the fests added a major boost in sales for Bush, as it did for most bands, following stops in the market at a radio show. Kahane noticed a significant increase in sales for both Bush and the Phunk Junkeez. "We tracked [SoundScan] in each market and it was incredible — I mean absolutely phenomenal — on both acts," Kahane said. "There was not one market that we participated in a radio show where we did not increase, substantially, the number of units

when we need help on certain things, they're there for us in a timely way," Kahane said. "That's the way it is supposed to work. But sometimes these people have no memory at all."

"The bottom line is managers love radio festivals and record companies hate them," said an anonymous record company executive. "The band gets exposure, which is good for the act and the manager, the radio station gets the act and the successful promotion, and the record companies are forced to pick up the bill."

And agents don't seem to be thrilled about radio festivals either because it means added work with no compensation, at all. One agent who had acts participating in radio festivals all summer long said on the condition of anonymity, "You can't say anything bad about radio people anyway; They'll just dis you." The agent added sarcastically, "Radio is good. I love everybody at radio. They can do no wrong and if they do wrong you just say, 'That was good!'"

Radio is so important that some who don't like the way festivals work, feel they are forced to play the game by radio's rules. And radio executives know that record company executives don't like doing the festivals because its a "pain in the butt" to them.

Richard Balsbaugh, CEO of Pyramid Broadcasting, which owns KISS FM in Boston, a station that is a frontrunner in the development of radio station-sponsored festivals, told POLLSTAR that some of the criticism surrounding the concerts is unfounded, particularly the idea that radio fests are nothing more than modern-day payola. "I think it's bullshit, to tell you the truth," Balsbaugh said. "I'm the one owner that really resents that everybody has to use 'payola' [to define] what would be a normal type of

working relationship between radio and records. People seem to forget that the record industry is what we're about. We play records. That's our product. Should we [really] have an arms length relationship with record companies?" Balsbaugh said it doesn't make any sense for a radio to have a band at a concert if the record is not playable in the first place. "However, if ... you have a group that's really extended themselves and a record company that's extended themselves to help our radio station for a concert, and [the decision to add a record] is close between that act and another one, the [act

that participates] is going to get the nod. Now is that payola? I don't think so. I think it's just smart business."

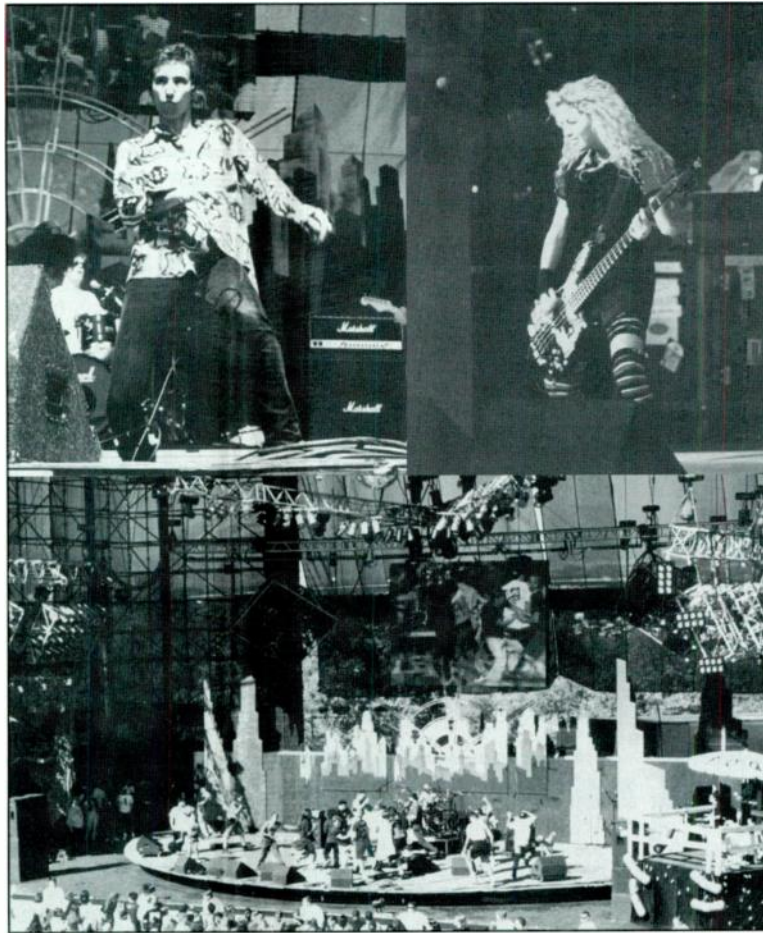
Ted Volk, Geffen's director of alternative promotion, said the "play for airplay" nature of radio fests is really not anything uncommon particularly when there are two stations competing in one market. "I think this has been going on for much longer, before these radio shows became a significant tool," Volk said. "To me [fearing retribution from radio] is not a big surprise. You just have to be able to deal with what you choose to do for your particular artist. Obviously, if you have a

a very envious position to be in." But every artist isn't at the stage in their career to take advantage of the timing of radio fests. "Bush is a good example because you're dealing with a band that is hot at that particular moment. That helps," Volk said. "But if you take a look at another act that was on the down side of that, it isn't going to help."

Volk said the fests are just a tool. "It's an expensive tool and you just have to deal with it." Others agreed, saying radio definitely holds the cards when it comes to promotion of artists. "It has nothing with [radio concerts] being a cancer [on the music business]. It's just that radio stations have had a tremendous amount of success from these shows and if they've had success of, they're going to try to continue to achieve that," Volk said. "But can they help break an act?" he asked. "It's hard to say. I think it definitely brings [an act] to more people than they normally would play to at that level of their career. That's for sure. But does it help [develop a career]? I don't think it hurts."

Another aspect of radio festivals that irks some in the concert business is the fact that the shows take "perfectly good plays" out of a promoter's season. That complaint, obviously from a promoters point of view, asserts that an act may only pass through a market once per season, especially if it's not a U.S.-based act. And if that one time is for a radio station festival, well, the picture paints itself. "The live end of the business has become de-prioritized as radio fest and even MTV have become more popular," Geiger said. "That can be evidenced by the lack of true arena headliners from the 'alternative' market place."

Radio festival supporters, on the other hand, believe that radio fests encourage concert-goers to buy more tickets. If a band peaks the interest of a fan with only a sample of its music during the short set time allotted during a radio fest, it likely means additional tickets sales when the act does its own headlining show in the area. However, Geiger points out that after an artist has basically given up a play in the market for free, it truly may hurt the act's own "actual" concert appearances.★

developing act and you have two stations playing the record and [the band] only plays one show, it doesn't matter if it's you, me or anybody, we're going to be upset. And I think that's a normal reaction. To assume that a station won't get upset is kinda crazy."

Volk, who had acts on only a couple of festivals this summer because of routing conflicts, said he is envious of the Bush camp because the band was able to do almost all of the radio shows. "It's put Bush in a great position. They've sold a lot of records and they're getting the next single [added]. That's

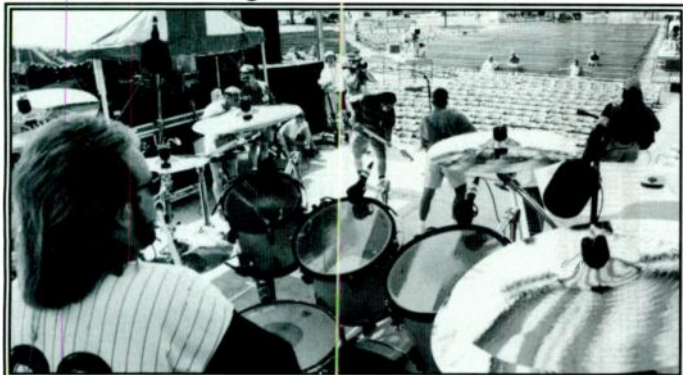

Heart Surgery For K.T. Oslin

K.T. Oslin, 54, was admitted to Nashville's St. Thomas Hospital August 28th and underwent triple coronary artery bypass surgery the following day. The three-time Grammy winner's publicist said Oslin had been feeling "light-headed and easily winded lately," and a trip to her doctor revealed the arterial blockages. The procedure was completely successful and Oslin was expected to be released from the hospital last weekend.

Legal Grievs

Todd Miller, a University of Iowa student, claims to have permanently lost his sense of smell when he suffered multiple injuries to his legs, back and head during a Metallica show at the school's Carver Hawkeye Arena January 28, 1993. Metallica's attorneys are now booked for an October 14, 1996 date in Iowa City's Johnson County District Court. Miller is suing both the group and the State of Iowa for an undisclosed figure. Court records indicate that Miller claims he was lifted out of his third row spot in the audience by the crowd and was unceremoniously dumped on his head.... Four people are suing for damages after being injured when a deck collapsed at a Wentzville, Mo., campground July 6th. The Grateful Dead were playing several miles away at the Riverport Amphitheatre when the incident occurred and it's assumed that most of those injured were Deadheads who didn't have tickets to that night's concert. The lawsuits against campground owner Pinewoods Enterprise Inc. and Douglas Bledsoe, who arranged the accommodations, each seek more than \$25,000 for negligence and personal injury. The deck collapsed when hundreds of people swarmed onto the structure during a thunderstorm. The incident sent 108 people to hospitals. A lawyer for one of the injured fans said his client's neck was broken and he "spends most of his time in a wheelchair." St. Charles County Building Department director David Hammond said his department's investigation showed there were not enough nails in the deck to support the load for

which it was designed.... The sons of Tito Jackson and his former wife, the late Delores Jackson, have brought a wrongful death lawsuit against the man who pulled their mother's body from a pool last year. The plaintiffs, who will release their debut record under the name 3T later this month, also claim that L.A. District Attorney Gil Garcetti did not file murder charges against Donald Bohana despite evidence of wrongful death because of the embarrassment caused when the sexual misconduct accusations against Michael Jackson in 1993 turned out to be "unfounded." Delores Jackson died in August 1994, of "asphyxia due to drowning, alcohol intake and blunt force traumatic injuries," according to the coroner's office which listed the death as suspicious. According to the lawsuit, Bohana was upset because Ms. Jackson, his girlfriend, wouldn't bail him out of bankruptcy so he beat her for four hours and then held her head underwater. Though the autopsy report stated the injuries "favor a non-accidental origin" and support the possibility of "assisted drowning," prosecutors have not filed any charges in the case. The lawsuit, seeking unspecified damages against Bohana, was filed just days before the statute of limitations expired.

Short Items Of Note

Buddy Lee Attractions agent **Sol Saffian** has taken an indefinite leave of absence in order to spend more time with his wife who has been battling a serious illness for the past two years. The leave was supported by agency proxy Tony Conway. At press time, no decision had been made on which agent will cover Saffian's Northeast territory..... Reports continued last week that the **Walt Disney Co.**'s proposed investment in Rockefeller Center is aimed solely at gaining control of **Radio City Music Hall**. An investment group including Disney recently agreed to invest \$250 million in the troubled real estate investment trust that holds the mortgage to Rockefeller Center. An unnamed Disney source told the *New York Post* that plans to take control of Radio City are "in the works." Another Disney official told the *Post* if the Magic Kingdom gets control of Gotham's landmark concert venue, Radio City would get a "Disney face lift." All of this is a long way from a done deal and new bidders are likely to emerge in the coming weeks..... Two crew members shooting a music video for **Meat Loaf** died in a helicopter crash August 29th in California's Sequoia National Forest. The helicopter reportedly clipped power cables before it went down near Kernville, taking the lives of pilot **Henry Ugoiti**, 42, of Camarillo and cameraman **Mike Shea**, 69, of Los Angeles. Though Meat Loaf was in the helicopter during most of the video shoot, he was not in it when it went down. Meat Loaf publicist Michele Schweitzer told POLLSTAR, "They touched down and let him off, and then they went back up and that's when the accident happened." Meat Loaf was planning to resume shooting of the video August 31st..... Connecticut Attorney General Richard Blumenthal and the owners of the **Lake Compounce** amusement park agreed to give jilted **Guns 'N Roses** fans Christmas in August. A June 1991 GNR concert at the park was cancelled when Lake Compounce's then-managing general partner Joseph Balestrieri encountered severe financial problems and went out of business. Fans who had paid by credit card got their money back but about 8,000 people who didn't were left holding worthless tickets. Now, three years later, Lake Compounce's owners have agreed on a consolation prize for those hapless fans in the form of free season passes to the park. Blumenthal suggests that fans purchase their tickets with a credit card whenever possible and stresses the importance of acting

quickly on getting a refund following a cancellation announcement. Blumenthal is looking for public support of legislation which would tighten controls for refunds on concert cancellations, while Lake Compounce's owners are working to regenerate the venue's image..... Joyce Poole, who retired as an administrative assistant at the **Dane County Exposition Center** in Madison, Wisc., some nine years ago, knows what it feels like to have the long hand of the law finally catch up and question your rock 'n roll conscience. Poole asked for her manager's permission to take home several of the facility's autographed photographs as mementos, including a photo of **Janis Joplin** now estimated to be worth some \$3,000. Former Expo Center manager Roy Gumtow gave Poole the photos without consulting with civic officials, assuming the items probably lacked authenticity and were hardly collector's items. Last spring, Poole apparently sold her going-away gift — the autographed photo of Joplin which dates back to a 1969 show at the coliseum — along with signed pictures of Benny Goodman and Tina Turner to an Ohio dealer for \$675 as part of a "joint venture" with Gumtow, who now denies any involvement with the plan. The Joplin item was featured in a sales catalog and a collector who had seen the photo hanging at the Coliseum smelled a rat and called the police. Police are now trying to determine what, if any, laws may have been broken.

Obituaries

Former Billy Joel bandleader **Douglas Stegmeyer**, 43, was found dead in his Long Island music studio/apartment of an apparently self-inflicted gunshot wound August 24th. His body was found after fellow musician Dean Krauss called the police when he couldn't get Stegmeyer to answer the door. Krauss said the bassist hadn't shown any signs of being in a suicidal state when he saw him the day before..... **Ronnie White**, 57, one of the founding members of The Miracles, died August 26th of leukemia in Detroit. White, who co-wrote the Motown hits "My Girl" and "My Guy" with Smokey Robinson, was also credited with helping discover the 11-year-old sensation "Little Stevie Wonder." The Miracles disbanded in 1978 and in recent years, White sold real estate.

Miller's manager, Scott Boorey, told **POLLSTAR** that this was something that Miller has wanted to do for years, go on a small blues tour after he does the usual summer shed dates..... **OZZY OSBOURNE** is back and will do a theatre tour starting in October..... **BOINGO** is calling it quits. U.K. News Report

(London) As TAKE THAT ended a sold-out run of ten shows at EARL'S COURT, hundreds of fans were left in the lurch by the disappearance of a Nottingham ticket agency. The police are investigating complaints from fans who bought tickets as part of a package advertised by The Concert and Theatre Ticket Agency (CITA). Although tickets were advertised in national newspapers, according to promoter Danny Betesh at Kennedy Street, CITA was not one of their appointed agents. Speaking for Kennedy Street promotions, Linda Betesh told POLLSTAR, "We know nothing about them. The only thing we can do is to impress upon the public not to buy tickets except from the official outlets. Unfortunately these things happen." Fans reportedly spent an average of £100 on tickets which were part of a London overnight stay package deal. Police are looking for the two owners of the company, Kevin Bacon and Andrew Scott. It is not clear whether the agency actually had tickets to sell (purchase was limited to four per person), but according to sources, CITA was also offering packages to see the Rolling Stones in Rotterdam..... Meanwhile, Earls Court has notched up another hot ticket with OASIS booked in for a 19,000 capacity, all-standing arena show on November 5th. Promoted by MCP, it will be the biggest shows the band has performed to date, and it looks like a second date will be announced soon..... The holiday weekend saw the last of the major summer festivals. READING FESTIVAL passed without any major disturbances despite the lack of police presence on site. The Mean Fiddler's event coordinator, Melvin Benn, says, "The police did what they always do — dealt with crime, but they made no contribution to the smooth running of the event. That was down to the organisation that the Mean Fiddler put in and to the willingness of the audience." However, the hundred or so arrests for theft, disorder and various other minor offences outside the festival site caused the police to comment that the event needs "proper policing" in the future. Highlights of the festival included COURTNEY LOVE being carried off the stage (instead of storming off early for whatever reason) after she had single-handedly dismantled Hole's backline and kicked a monitor into the pit. Later the widow Cobain apparently tried to divert attention from the SMASHING PUMPKINS headlining slot by going into the audience. However most people seem to agree that GREEN DAY's quirky yet blistering set had already snatched most of the limelight from the Pumpkins. Apart from the excellent fireworks closing BJORK's set, her performance was notable for encouraging the first Reading streaker to leap on stage and hug her! The FOO FIGHTERS also staked their claim as Reading headliners — the band was due to follow up the Reading performance with a one-off date at the Manchester Academy on September 5. The new Carlsberg Stage for new and unsigned bands proved to be a very popular addition to the festival set up..... MCP's MONSTERS OF ROCK festival at Donington also passed without incident, although with METALLICA headlining, it could hardly be described as a "peaceful" event. As the band's first and only European performance in two years, Donington attracted a record number of international TV crews and press..... SINEAD O'CONNOR made a rare appearance at the "What Women Want" concert at the Royal Festival Hall, organised to tie in with the Beijing conference for women and promoted by Serious Speakout. It was her second and probably last performance in the UK this year. With the PRETENDERS on the same bill, the presence of a full rock outfit blasted any preconceptions of the hall's acoustics. Angelique Kidjo, Sarah Jane Morris and Zap Mama also played at the sell-out concert..... PAUL MCCARTNEY's company MPL is promoting two BUDDY HOLLY TRIBUTE shows at the Shepherds Bush Empire on September 7 and 8. The shows will feature The Crickets, Carl Perkins, Mike Berry & The Outlaws and The Rapiers. Of course, the McCartney connection means the probability of star surprise guests is fairly high. McCartney started a Buddy Holly Week in 1976 organising competitions for Holly look-alikes and sound-a-likes. This year's Holly birthday anniversary tribute will be the first time in 15 years it has been opened to the public..... Primary Talent's Martin Hopewell has taken on US band, EDGE PARK, who are about to embark on a debut UK tour this month. The band has been in London recording its second album and Hopewell admits it is unusual for him to get involved with a band in the early stages of its career, but he is enthusiastic about their potential. Hopewell's co-director Steve Hedges has also been heavily backing a new talent this summer. Hedges has been squiring New Zealand band the MUTTON BIRDS to most European festivals this year and has secured a support slot on Chris Isaak's European dates starting on September 4th.

Australian News Report

(Sydney) LEO KOTKE returns once again to Australia in September for a tour which will see him performing with Pepe Romero and Paco Pena..... Following the success of her single "Shy Guy," Jamaican singer **DIANA KING** is touring Australia in September. The national tour is being sponsored by the Brashs retail chain. King will tour with her nine piece band comprising Nigerian, Jamaican and American musicians, singers and dancers..... There's rumours around that **BMG RECORDS** and recent signing **ANTI ANTI** might not be completely happy little bunnies at present. From what I hear there's a bit of 'discussion' about some images used in an interactive component scheduled for a forthcoming release. Apparently the band have been told that using such images goes against the company's international policy of what is, and what isn't, acceptable..... Touring Australia in October for Feel Promotions are **DUB WAR**, the UK group formed in 1993 who have been described as an "incredible musical collage of ragga, punk, thrash and rap."..... **BUTCH VIG** arrives in Australia on September 6 for a promo tour to talk up his band **GARBAGE** and their debut album. The band is one of the first international acts to be signed worldwide to Mushroom for all territories except North America..... **GEORGE LEVENDIS** who's currently BMG's national marketing manager, has been promoted and will relocate to London where he'll head up the marketing division of Arista U.K..... **MUSHROOM RECORDS** is embarking on its second annual traveling roadshow, an audio/video/live presentation of upcoming releases on the Mushroom and associated labels. Among those appearing at these extravaganzas are chairman **MICHAEL GUDINSKI**..... The **ARIA AWARDS** nominations will be announced at the Hard Rock Cafe in Sydney on September 5. The presentation of Australia's most prestigious record industry awards will take place October 2..... Now I've had one of these anonymous fax's sent before which purports to have the inside gossip on what's happening in that **CROWDED HOUSE** of **FINN** brothers. The last one was a little off the mark and the latest, also bearing the name Australian Securities Commission on the top of the fax, says that, "Capitol Records have refused to release the new album recorded by brothers Neil and Tim Finn in the U.S. The company has decided that the album, titled *Finn*, has no commercial potential in the American market."..... You'd think press releases like the one that came from Mushroom Records on August 23 are about the last thing **JIMMY BARNES** needs at present. "*Barnes Turns Down Jagger In Favour Of Sister-In-Law*" screams the headline. It goes on the say that, "Fresh from touring with the **ROLLING STONES** and blowing away an 87,000 audience in Germany, Barnes returns home tomorrow (August 24) to attend his Sister-in-Law's wedding. The Rolling Stones were so impressed with Jimmy's performance, he was invited to do more shows on the tour, but unfortunately Jimmy's commitment to attend his Sister-in-Law's wedding and touring commitments by his lead guitarist meant Jimmy had to decline the Stone's offer." No-one's doubting that Barnes played at least one show on the bill with the Stones but my sources overseas suggest that Big Country were the main support for the Stones in Germany. Maybe Barnes played before them and maybe he "blew away" 87,000 people but one has to wonder why anyone would turn down more Stones dates to attend an in-laws wedding..... The Musician's Union Of Australia (MUA) has lead the charge to require pubs and other venues to supply **SOUND SYSTEMS** in-house or fully reimburse musicians for the cost of hiring their own PA's. Federal Secretary, John McAuliffe, who lodged the application on behalf of the union, says, "For too long, musicians have been subsidising the industry by being made to carry the high costs of the industry's own infrastructure... Any venue that claims to present entertainment should be presenting that entertainment at the highest possible standard. A professional standard PA should be fitted for their patrons." MUA claims the move should go a long way towards stamping out the "exploitative practice of venues back-charging bands for the use of in-house PA's."..... Manager Andrew McManus and the **DIVINYLS** have parted company. The band have a single coming out in the coming months on BMG and are currently completing their next album..... **AUSMUSIC** is sponsoring a seminar in September entitled "Doing Music Business In China And Southeast Asia" conducted by American entertainment industry veteran **JEFFREY CHEEN**. Cheen is a Hong Kong-based consultant to the People's Republic of China and has record and video distribution deals in that and other Asian territories. Cheen will clarify such issues as the different territories, local and foreign music, distribution channels, publishing and copyright, touring, studios and currency exchange.
