Old Velvel Is Back

When Walter Yetnikoff abruptly departed as CEO of Sony's CBS Records division in September 1990, many industry observers assumed it wouldn't be long before he resurfaced in another position of power within the record business. Then in January 1991, Yetnikoff started his own company, Velvel Musical Industries. But the longtime recording industry giant didn't specify what kind of company Velvel was, and aside from the formal announcement, there was nothing else forthcoming from its outspoken founder. Was there a noncompete clause in Yetnikoff's Sony contract buyout? The true reasons behind Yetnikoff's long silence may never be revealed, but why else would he wait until now to make Velvel's presence felt? On September 3rd, Yetnikoff and Navarre Corp. announced the formation of Velvel Records. The independent label has already acquired a non-controlling interest in Razor & Tie Records, a NYC-based indie, and has struck a deal with Bottom Line Records, another small imprint. In a Velvel press release, Yetnikoff said the upstart label is absolutely not affiliated with any of the majors and that it would "break many of the traditional rules of the industry, competing on a level playing field with the major labels, with a reach only previously enjoyed by those major labels." Yetnikoff is certainly capable of putting his money where his mouth is. It has long been thought his split with Sony and CBS netted him around \$40 million, not to mention the money he salted away while at the helm of CBS Records. During his reign, Yetnikoff was involved with signing and/or guiding the careers of Michael Jackson, Bruce Springsteen, Billy Joel and many other superstars. Former Mercury Nashville chief Bob Frank has been named president of Velvel and three acts have already signed on: Babyfat, Band De Soleil and Five-Eight. Frank is in the process of filling executive positions in marketing, media, A&R, promotions and finance. Velvel product will be distributed by Navarre in North America. Velvel is also getting into music publishing and will pursue new media and technology ventures. The Minneapolis-based Navarre specializes in publishing and distributing music, software and interactive CD-ROM products. It is also a major content provider to the Internet. A&M Exits Music City Derby

A&M Records' Nashville office closed its doors September 3rd. The demise of the label's Third Coast office came after an unsuccessful six-month search for a partner to head up the operation, the company stated. The label had been without permanent leadership since prexy Harold Shedd left in June. VP/GM Steve Miller exited the company last March and sales and marketing exec Larry Milam was acting as temporary GM. In making the announcement, A&M Records chairman Al Cafaro said, "Without strong creative leadership, the level of investment needed to be competitive in today's crowded country music marketplace made no sense. Continuing the search — treading water, so to speak — would be a disservice to the artists on the label and would imperil the success of current projects such as Toby Keith." Keith and the rest of the existing roster of A&M Nashville artists will be folded into Mercury Nashville. Those acts include 4-Runner, Amie Comeaux, Chely Wright and Davis Daniel. A&M Nashville was originally launched as Polydor Nashville two and a half years ago and was changed to A&M as part of a restructuring of the PolyGram labels earlier this year.


Change Of Venue

The State Theatre in Portland, Maine, was forced to cancel its August 30th Jimmy Cliff and August 31st Tori Amos concerts because of potentially unsafe conditions in the ceiling. The historic 1929 theatre has some imperfections and cracks in the ceiling plaster and experts from the city and a private contractor ordered it closed for safety reasons. The theatre's programming director, Stephen Bailey, stressed that the problems in the ceiling are plaster related and not a structural safety issue. The theatre was working to correct the problems at press time and hopes to reopen as soon as possible..... With renovations complete, the Huntridge Theatre in Las Vegas is scheduled to reopen October 20th with Goldenvoice at the helm. The historic Huntridge Theatre is the only all-ages venue in Las Vegas for all forms of music. Goldenvoice has negotiated an exclusive first-right-of-refusal option to book all alternative acts into the 800-capacity

theatre. The Huntridge was closed in July 1995 after the ceiling collapsed a few hours before a Circle Jerks show..... PromoWest Productions assumed daily operations of the venerable Agora Ballroom in Cleveland September 3rd. The deal stems from the company's longstanding relationship with Agora owner Hank LoConti. PromoWest currently owns the Newport Music Hall in Columbus, which used to be part of the Agora chain.

Pros On The Move

Gerry Gerrard has left Artists & Audience and is reportedly operating his own agency under the Chaotica Inc. moniker. Chaotica is the name Gerrard uses for his rave-production company. Apparently, the rave shows he did this summer, like the Organic festival in June, sparked his interest and he plans to work more closely with English techno bands in developing similar types of events..... Nick Light is leaving Mercury Records in New York to become the new VP of artist development and touring at MCA Records in Los Angeles. Light told POLLSTAR he expects to be in place at MCA no later than October 1st. Light most recently was senior director artist development and touring at Mercury in New York..... Ivy Bauer has been appointed director of marketing for the Landmark Convention Center in Tacoma, Wash. Bauer has an extensive background as a concert promoter in the Northwest. The Landmark complex includes the 1,620-seat Egyptian art-deco Temple Theatre and an 800 seat ballroom..... Gaylord Entertainment executive VP/COO Richard Evans has resigned to become president/CEO of

HotStar Of The Week

RICOCHET

It was a good time for new country bands to enter the crowded Nashville marketplace when Ricochet did it a couple of years ago. Several country chart toppers were calling it quits or taking a break. There was an opportunity to fill in some of those gaps and Ricochet was waiting in the wings for its turn.

"We saw a big open spot in the market for bands," Ricochet lead singer/lead guitarist Heath Wright told POLLSTAR. "I think a lot of labels saw that open spot and that void in the market and so they started signing a whole bunch of new bands," he said. "And fortunately, country radio took to us and a few of our friends out there — Lonestar and Perfect Stranger — and country music saw a new surge of bands."

Ricochet's recent success with its self-titled Columbia Nashville debut didn't come from the luck of a changing market alone. The band has been on tour since its inception in 1993 trying to make a name for itself. "It didn't make sense for us to try to find work in Nashville because there's so many great musicians there that will work for next to nothing," Wright said. So the band took its act on the road, building up quite a following in places like St. Louis and Columbia, Mo. "We would spend five days in one city as a club band," he said.

Fortunately, the six members of Ricochet are a tight knit group of friends and family that have been able to live together on and off the road. Even on their days off, they find themselves back in each other's company. Wright said, "Whenever we would get home from a two or three week trip, we'd spend a couple of days off and then you could find us all together at the same house having a barbecue or something like that. We're so used to being together all the time, that we don't know how not to be together."

It's important to the band that each player is a full member and not just a touring musician. "We didn't want to have a certain number of guys on the album cover, and then you go out and you see a couple of extra people on stage," Wright said. "In my opinion, that always sort of gives the impression, 'Well, those guys can't sound like their records unless they take out side players.' And I always hated that," he said. "So we talked about it from the start and we said that whoever we bring into this band would be a full member of the band."

Drummer Jeff Bryant and his fiddle/mandolin/guitar playing brother, Junior Bryant, recruited Wright to play in their West Texas band in mid-1993. Within a matter of weeks, that band came to the end of its rope and the three began Ricochet as a new project with a new idea. The plan was to ensure a strong element of traditional country instrumentation with fiddle and pedal steel. Wright said the first order of business was to find a keyboard player — enter Eddie Kilgallon, who had placed an ad in the *Nashville Scene* newspaper hoping to find a gig. Next, Wright imported his best childhood friend, bass player Greg Cook, from Oklahoma. The band's only original Tennessean, steel player Teddy Carr, had just come off the road with Clay Walker when he was added to the mix in early 1994. The sextet has been a team every since.

Even though Ricochet was able to make a living off touring, that wasn't enough to meet the band's goal. "We had planned on putting a band together that would be marketable and commercial," Wright said. "We wanted to be able to find people that can play as well as stay together and have a certain visual mix also." He said

the band found what it needed in this group of guys. "Music is a contact sport [to us]. We love to get up there and have a good time and sort of work off of each other's energy and work off the energy that's coming to us from the crowd. And that was important to us in putting the band together — finding something that could eventually become a recording act."

Just a few months after getting all the members in place, Ricochet landed a development deal with Columbia Nashville. But the band really had to prove itself to win that deal. Co-manager and co-producer Ron Chancey introduced the idea to his son Blake Chancey, the senior director of A&R at Columbia. The younger Chancey, concerned about getting flack for signing a band that was associated with his dad, didn't want to get involved. But with a little convincing, he agreed to give Ricochet a listen. But from the start, Wright said the younger Chancey had a plan to get out of the situation. "He was gonna bring another A&R guy out from the label, have him listen, and then have him pass so that Blake wouldn't have to be the bad guy. So he brought Cliff Audretch out with him, who's the A&R head over all Sony — Epic and Columbia," Wright said. As the story goes, the next Monday morning when the label asked how Ricochet was, Audretch said, "I think it's probably the best live band I've ever heard."

The developmental deal with Columbia evolved into a full blown deal and now, Wright said the label has made Ricochet a top priority. He said the label's promotions team helped take the band's first single, "Daddy's Money," to number No. 1 on national charts and its second single, "What Do I Know," to No. 3.

The band members got an unexpected surprise after Fourth of July weekend when they sang an a cappella version of "The Star Spangled Banner" and that ended up in the country charts the next week. "We couldn't believe it," Wright said. "We had the No. 1 and the Hot Shot debut the same week." The band's latest single, "Love Is Stronger Than Pride," broke a couple of weeks ago and is also making its way up the charts.

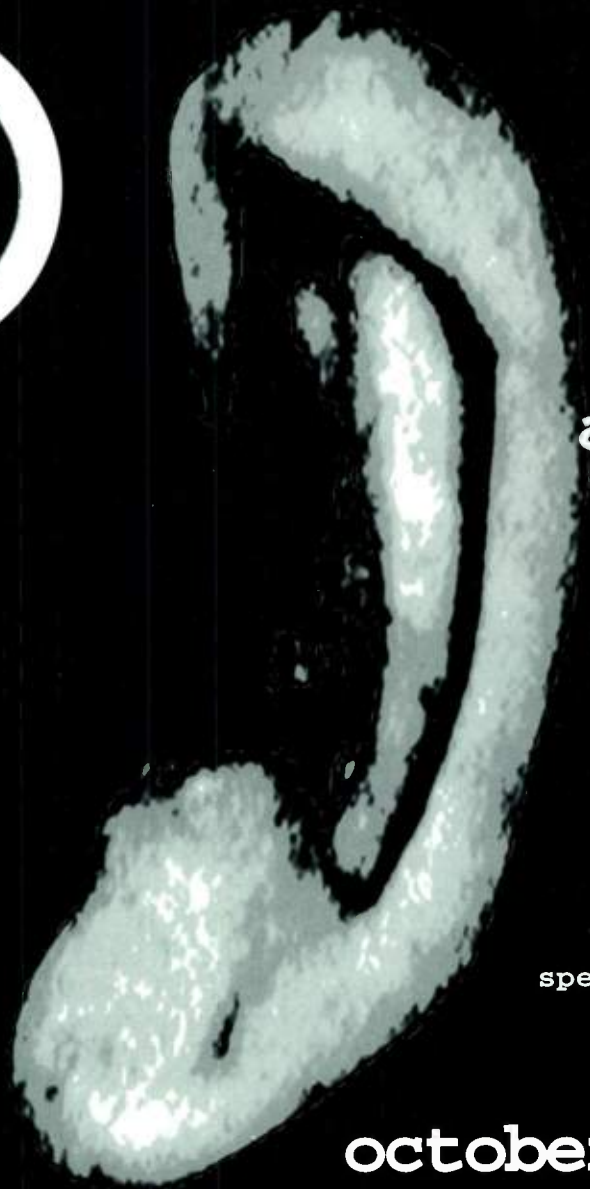
Ricochet's success at radio and record stores doesn't make touring any less of a priority. "The hardest part of our day is waiting for the nighttime to get here so that we can go out and play in front of an audience," Wright said. The band just finished a tour supporting Marty Stuart and Travis Tritt and is going out with Tracy Lawrence and Tracy Byrd in October. In the meantime, William Morris agent Mark Roeder has Ricochet headlining clubs and hitting plenty of fairs and rodeos.

The Concert For Manglerdesh

Emmylou Harris, Steve Earle, Nanci Griffith, Trisha Yearwood and Rodney Crowell will get together October 8th at the Ryman Auditorium in Nashville to do a benefit concert for veteran road manager Phil Kaufman. Kaufman was diagnosed with prostate cancer earlier this year and his prognosis is good. Funds from this benefit, The Concert For Manglerdesh, will be used to send Kaufman to Seattle for Brachytherapy, which is radioactive seed implantation. The Concert for Manglerdesh gets its name from Kaufman's infamous moniker, *Road Mangler Deluxe*. Kaufman, who does not have health insurance, is the longtime road manager for Emmylou Harris and once worked as the "executive nanny" to Mick Jagger. He also reportedly helped fulfill the late Gram Parsons final wish by stealing his body after his death in 1973 and burning his coffin at the Joshua Tree Monument.

Horning In On The Memphis Horns?

Al Green has been sued by the Memphis Horns, who claim the singer is misusing their name. Andre Love and Wayne Jackson have used the Memphis Horns moniker since 1969. In a lawsuit filed August 30th in federal court, the two men claim Green was trying to capitalize on their popularity. The suit says Green referred to some of his horn players as the Memphis Horns from the stage during a performance. Love and Jackson, who have performed as the Memphis Horns with everyone from Jimmy

Buffett to Elvis, did not ask for a specified amount of money, only for expenses in bringing the lawsuit, Green's profits from using the name, and "such other relief as may be just." The suit also asks that Green be ordered to publicly clarify that members of his back-up band have no affiliation with Love and Jackson.

Gleason Says How Sweet He Is



The **Jackie Gleason Theater's Most Valuable Promoter** award for the 1995-96 season is presented to **Fantasma Productions' Jon Stoll** (center). Stoll was given the MVP honor for bringing the venue shows by Liza Minnelli, Jackie Mason, Donna Summer, the Gipsy Kings and the August 13th Tracy Chapman show during which the award was presented. Giving Stoll a hand are the Miami Beach theatre's **Claudia Arguelles**, **Bob Papke**, **Manny Fernandez** and **William Overfelt**.

MTV Music Video Awards

Unpredictability has been a key feature of the MTV Music Video Awards program, but the September 4th show broadcast from Radio City Music Hall in NYC didn't leave much to surprise. As many expected, the Smashing Pumpkins took home the most honors, winning seven out of eight nominations, including best video for "Tonight, Tonight." The Pumpkins also won best alternative video, a category the band said it was proud to still be a part of. Alanis Morissette's "Ironic" won three awards — best female artist, new artist and editing. The only real surprise was Coolio's sweep in the black music categories, especially

Tom Makoul: Finally Out Of The Bull's Eye

It's been more than a year since promoter Thomas Makoul served 60 nights in a work-release center after pleading guilty to defrauding at least 20 major artists including Aerosmith, Tony Bennett and James Taylor. Makoul, a veteran concert promoter who operated Makoul Productions in Allentown, also had plead guilty in U.S. District Court in Philadelphia March 6, 1995, to falsifying tax returns. The promoter could have faced a maximum penalty of nine years in prison and a \$360,000 fine. Instead, he was sentenced to five years probation and 60 days in a work release program. Today, Makoul is back in business, promoting concerts under a new company name, DancingDog. He's moving forward, trying to put together the pieces of his life after a long ordeal during which his entire business operation was put under a microscope. Makoul says he's turning over a new leaf and he wants to alert other promoters that they are essentially sitting ducks if they inflate or pad expenses.

You've said the nature of the concert business essentially forced you to pad expenses. Can you explain that?

I had many open discussions with agents that I was relatively close with about how these kinds of deals just breed padding. I would be told, "Tom, you can't change the concert business. Are you in or are you out? That's the deal [so] stop your whining." There was a time when the deals were fair, when they were based on box office figures. The guarantee might be \$25,000 plus 65 - 70 percent of boxoffice receipts over a certain dollar figure. Everything was simple and there was no padding

When do you think the change came?

Around the mid '80s. There's a number of reasons why the guarantees started climbing. The business was there, in some cases, to justify it. In other cases, it was justifying the expenses on the road. The bands had to make more money because this was their time. When they get their shot, they want to make as much as they can. Then there are factors like the band's cost of the shows going up. A lot of these costs in the business are as a result of all the support people and services that come in to play on any one tour. You have bus companies, you have truck companies, you have road crews. It's not just sound and lights. And everybody's entitled to make a living. People have families and they have to eat so everybody has to be paid. There is also what I call the theory of relativity where, within an agency, everything seems to be measured against their top artist. If their top artist got \$100,000, well then, everybody else would be measured against that act. Then artist B should be able to get \$65,000 and if artist B gets \$65,000, then artist C should be able to get \$50,000. I don't think there are any accurate methods used to determine what the price should be of the bands. All those different factors came into play and the end result was that the cost went up. So the deals started to change to these 85/15 deals.

You've said what happened to you should be a concern to all promoters.

I've had discussions with agents that I trust and can talk with, and I'll ask them, "When you get a promoter's expenses, do you really believe that



those are real expenses?" And they'll say, "No way." It's kind of like, "Yeah we know what goes on, but don't get caught. If you get caught, we don't know what's going on." In my own case, it's kind of like driving on the highway and everybody's doing 75 miles an hour and you get stopped. You say to the cop, "But everybody's going 75," and the cop says, "Yeah, but I caught you." That's kind of the case that happened with me. Actually, my case was a direct outgrowth of the investigation into Electric Factory.

What can promoters do if they find it difficult to make money without "speeding" on the tour highway?

The problem is that everybody's against the wall here. The agent has to get the guarantee that the artist wants or he's going to lose the act to another agency. The promoter wants to stay in business, so he has to go with the flow and take the deals the way that they're offered to him. If there's a show with a \$10,000 profit and you're not allowed to put in your office staff or your production manager or your office overhead, you have a hard time paying your expenses out of the 10 or 15 percent that the artist allows you to make. The agents know that and the managers know that. They know that it's rampant. And when the promoter faxes in expenses, agents don't really believe they're real but they need to get the high guarantee for their artist so they look the other way. If they held the promoter's feet to the fire on expenses, and by they I mean the agents and managers, then no way could the promoter survive. He couldn't make enough money, he could not pay the guarantees. Anytime a deal is based on expenses, where the profit of the promoter is enhanced by showing higher costs, the temptation to pad is very strong. And when the promoter knows that the artist is padding his cost — what they're paying for their sound and lights, road crew, for trucks, for hotels, etc. — then the promoter justifies in his mind that it's OK to level the playing field and pad some of his expenses. That's the way the business operates. Just like everybody else in the show, from the caterers to security to the road crews to the bus people, everybody gets paid. But yet there is such a lack of caring to see that a deal is structured so that the promoter can make money. And that lack of concern is what also fuels a kind of survivalist instinct or attitude on the part of the promoter. He has to do what he has to do just to survive and pay his bills. Without the promoter there is no business. That's what's the amazing part about it all. The promoter is the fuel that moves the wheel; there's no question. And yet there's an attitude that permeates the whole industry that, well, you shouldn't have taken the show. You shouldn't have agreed to the guarantee. Yes, that's true, but we're all in it together. We're supposed to be partners in it, working together — the promoter, the agent, the manager and the artist. But there's a very cool attitude toward the promoter, that basically he's disposable. If he bails out, if he can't meet his obligations, then OK, throw him away and let's bring in the next guy who can, rather than looking at it and saying, "Look, this guy's been in business a long time, he's always done good, the deals are tight, you've got to take care of him." And the way

that they take care of the promoter is by looking the other way with the padding. Only nobody talks about it.

What can promoters do to survive without inflating expenses?

First, the promoter has to understand the process of how the business works and then understand that padding expenses is illegal. When Electric Factory came under investigation, it really didn't stop anything. It made people take pause for a moment. Everybody stood back and looked for a few seconds and then jumped right back in again. But the promoters have to understand the consequences of their actions as they try to survive. And in my own case, I've even had agents, more than a few, tell me to raise my expenses. I never liked it. I tried to get different deals and I know agents that I have dealt with know this to be true. What do you do after you've been in this business pretty much all of your adult life and now you're faced with a fork in the road? You don't want to just walk away from it so you try to change it. If you can't change it, you go along. You go along to get along. You can call it ignorance if you like, but I didn't have any idea that what I was doing was illegal. I thought of it just like a leveling of the playing field. Now that I know this, I feel sorry for promoters who are sitting out there basically like sitting ducks. Promoters who have been inflating expenses are all targets. If the IRS or the Justice Department comes down on them, there's no way they can protect themselves from it. When a promoter faxes in expenses to an agent that he knows are not real expenses, that's wire fraud and mail fraud. The government knows how the business operates. They don't have an understanding of the give and take; They're looking at it in the strict sense to the letter of the law and they want to see

a change. It could probably never be proved, but the agent on the receiving end of those inflated expenses, who will never admit that they know that the expenses are not true, is probably as guilty as the promoter is. But the government knows that would be very hard to prove, if not impossible. So, knowing that now, how can anybody in their right mind continue that process? This is what is so serious about the whole thing. Agents are kind of caught in the middle of the whole thing. In my own case, if I had known that I could get in trouble for it, I would have immediately stopped. I wouldn't let anyone get me into a situation where I could place myself in peril. And that's what promoters are doing. Let them be warned. Somewhere it has to stop and I believe that it has to stop with the promoter. You can't turn and point the finger and say, "Well the whole business does it." That doesn't do any good because nobody is going to protect you. Nobody's going to stand up for you. Everybody's got to cover their own behinds. And the only way that you're going to do that is by stopping the nonsense. Now, if you are not going to pad, that's going to have a domino effect. Because if you don't pad, and you send in real expenses, you are not going to be able to pay the guarantees. And if the acts can't get the guarantees they want, then they're going to have to reduce the size of their shows and it's going to have a backward domino effect throughout the industry. But if any promoter understands the risk and continues to do it, well then, God bless them. They're braver than I am. In my own case, I was very lucky getting the 60 days work release. At night, I would go to this place that was basically like a dormitory. I'd sleep there then I'd leave in the morning. I got five years probation and there were no fines and no restitution.

Didn't you eventually plead guilty?

From the day that the IRS agent walked into my office, which was March of '92, it was three and a half years of Chinese water torture. By the time the day came for me to either plead guilty or not guilty or go to trial, I was psychologically wiped out. The whole process had just completely depleted me and all I wanted to do was to end it — get it behind me. So, they offered me a deal, and I had a good chance of not going to jail so I decided to take it. If I had fought it and lost, then I definitely would have gone to jail. And as far as the charges against me go, the figures that they came up with were way, way, way out of line. The government did their own inflating. All they did is take the offer sheets and total them up and compare them to actual payments, and they called that inflation or padding. They did not take into consideration, at all, whether or not a show made money or not. They simply looked at it as padding. If I had wanted to fight it, the figure would have come way down. Over the four years, the real figure was one-third of what they said, spread out over all our shows. But you know, you just reach a point where you just want to get it over with.

So now you are back in business. Has it been difficult for you to come back after this ordeal?

Well, I looked at Electric Factory and they didn't lose a step. In fact, they are probably doing better today than they've ever done. They weren't blackballed from the business. So, I really expect to be treated the same way. If Electric Factory was not discriminated against, then I don't feel that I should be. I have more than 20 years in this business and I've built some very good relationships with a lot of people. Most people are very supportive of me. There's a couple of people who I'm going to have to work on, but it was always that way.

Are you anxious to get back into the business or is there a sour taste left in your mouth?

I'm not going to get caught speeding again. I just will not do it. The shows that I do will be deals where I don't have to do that. Or if I do accept an 85/15 deal, it's going to be 100 percent straight expenses. It's as simple as that. And it would really have to be somebody I'm confident is a sure home run. My goal is to do things differently and not get caught in the same traps that I got caught in before and forced to do shows because I have an obligation to do them or because I have a staff of people that I have to keep busy. I'm going to be more selective and do things the right way.

Do you think there is an overwhelming propensity to cheat in the concert business?

I believe that there's many class people in this business. It's like in any business, there's good and there's bad. I believe that the whole process has to start with the promoter. A promoter, pardon the expression, shits like an elephant when a show loses money and eats like a bird when it makes money. What happened to Electric Factory and what happened to me is what's happening presently to a couple of other people, whether or not it's come out yet. It didn't stop with me, believe me. They're on to other people. It's going to have to change and it's going to have to start with the promoter because he's the one who's apt to say, "Hey, I'm not going to jail so that this band can make this money."

There were reports that you had a gambling problem. Who alleged there was gambling?

At the sentencing hearing, there were different people who came into

court to speak for me. And incidently, while I'm on that, it should be noted that the IRS agent who headed the investigation against me and against Electric Factory, came into court and spoke on my behalf at the sentencing hearing. He took a lot of heat for doing that. The judge said that during 20 years on the bench, he'd never seen that happen. The IRS agent said I was basically forced to do it by the way that the industry operates. This was a very important factor to the judge. But back to the gambling, various people came in to speak on my behalf during sentencing. And whether I like it or not, the district attorney's job is to throw gasoline on the fire. First of all, the very nature of this business is gambling. Anybody who is a promoter is a risk taker and, in a way, he's gambling. I never play cards, never go to the horse races, never play blackjack, dice, whatever. But I bet on football games and I do it legally. If I had an opinion on a football game, I would send somebody out to Las Vegas — put them on a plane — and send them to Vegas to make a bet for me. That's 100 percent legal. That's the only thing I ever did. Well, when this one person who came into court to speak for me, the U.S. attorney got up to say that this person made trips to Las Vegas for me on what he called gambling junkets. It was really a non-issue. There were no gambling losses that caused me to do the padding. I did the padding to survive. Basically, I looked at it as an investment when I'm betting on a football game. And I've got to tell you, there's a few agents in this business that have made a fair amount of money off of my picks. It's actually fun. And it's legal. So the allegation that I had a gambling problem is ridiculous. The Assistant U.S. District Attorney was trying to imply that there's something wrong with sending somebody to Las Vegas to bet on a football game. But that's part of his job, I suppose.

You wanted to talk about the charge of falsifying your tax return.

Never did I intentionally sign the tax return knowing that there were wrong figures on it. In my office, as in any office I would imagine, you rely on other people to do your tax return. The accountant does it. At the end of every year, the girls in my office would put together the figures and give them to the accountant. The accountant would do the tax return and give me the finished product. I'd ask some questions, then I'd sign the return. I had nothing to do with the figures being put together. They took me apart for the years 1987 through 1991 — I mean put me under a microscope — and what they finally came up with was the 1987 returns. They didn't find anything on the other ones. But there was nothing intentional. It was a mistake. A relatively new staff person gave the accountant wrong figures. Everybody told them, my office people, my accountant, told them I had nothing to do with the return being put together, but I signed it. It was not intentional, but after three and a half years of work, they had to come up with something. Do I feel I could have won had I contested that? Absolutely! But they lumped the two charges together and you couldn't separate them. When they put three and a half years into you, and that's the best they can come up with, then that's what they're going to use. They didn't find any tax evasion, paper trails, hidden money, nothing like that.

What is the broader lesson that needs to be learned here?

What I thought was acceptable in the business, and what is actually legally acceptable, are two different things. And that was a distinction that I failed to make and I paid a severe price for it. And to top it off, at the same time, I was going through a divorce. Talk about wanting to jump off a bridge. It was the most difficult thing that I've ever gone through in my life. And it is a mistake that *I will not ever make again.* ✪

EURO NEWS

United Kingdom

● **ERASURE** have announced their first tour in four years, which includes 21 dates in the UK and Germany. Agent Dan Silvert at V.A.T has booked the tour for the self-managed duo and says it is proving a very hot ticket with many venues having sold out within a day of going on sale. Silver says the tour of venues from 850 capacity to around 2,100 will take Erasure back to its core fan base. "After a four year gap, Erasure are now making themselves very accessible to the fans." He says there are no plans to add multiple nights to the tour and future tour plans for '97, when the new album is due for release, will be announced at a later stage. Four years ago, with the "Phantasmagorical Entertainment" tour, Erasure sold out an 18 night residency at the Manchester Apollo and 15 nights at the then Hammersmith Odeon.

● Ian Huffam at **FAIR WARNING WASTED TALENT** has beat the pack to become the agent for the much touted **SYMPOSIUM**. He is currently putting together a club tour for the infectious-signed band in the October-November time period.

● It's a quiet time for shows at the moment, but the club gigs are the ones which stand out and September is a good time for new bands. Country rockers **BR5-49** were in London for two packed shows at the Borderline following an appearance in Germany at the BMG conference and a couple of shows in Holland. Agent Paul Fenn at **ASGARD** says there is a good buzz about the band whose album is due for release in the UK on September 16, and he is waiting to confirm a future European tour schedule for the band.

● New, but very familiar, **The NEUROTIC OUTSIDERS** have announced another one-off date, this time at the LA2, on September 25.

● Meanwhile there will be a feast of new bands on offer at the annual **CAMDEN CRAWL** on September 19. Six Camden venues will take part in this mini-indoor festival, which features 20 new bands with the running order being saved for an on-the-night surprise. Bands on the agenda include Bawl, Chin Drum, Dweeb, Eska, Mogwai, Beth Orton, Urusei Yatsura and The Delgados among others. Sub Pop band the **SCUD MOUNTAIN BOYS** will make its UK live debut at the Crawl, with a Powerhaus gig the following day. It looks like the band will attract a hefty agent presence, as no European agent is in place yet and the band has been getting glowing reviews for the recently released Massachusetts album. A second Sub Pop band due to make its UK debut this autumn are Seattle veterans **THE FASTBACKS** who will be supporting Pearl Jam at Wembley Arena on October 28 and 29. By the way, those two dates are sold-out.

● Continuing on the theme of a possible new US invasion, **SUPERDRAG** and **NADA SURF** are crossing the pond for a double bill of club dates around the country, booked by Mike Dewdney at ITB. Superdrag actually make their UK debut as special guests of 16 Horsepower on September 9 at The Camden Monarch. The five gigs next month follow the release on Elektra of their debut UK singles with the albums due for release on October 28.

Ireland

● Dublin will be overrun with industry executives this week as the annual **IN THE CITY** circus puts the spotlight on the already vibrant music scene there. One of the conference highlights will be celebrity interviewer Ed Bicknell tackling Clive Davis, hopefully repeating the success of his previous ITC interviews with Malcolm MacLaren and Alan Grubman. Other panelists include Paul McGuinness, Virgin's Paul Conroy, Mushroom's Korda Marshall on A&R and marketing, Stuart Watson on going global, and Michael Guido on when to drop a band.

Germany

● A group of country music promoters have set up a working party to discuss the profile of **COUNTRY MUSIC** in Germany and a meeting has been scheduled for September 10 in Frankfurt. **KARLHEINZ SIBER** of Muff music management is one of the members of the self-styled "Arbeitskreis Country Music". He said that at this level, the meeting is a chance to put forward suggestions and ideas as there is no formal struc-

ture or funding for the group. Although he is hopeful that if any of the ideas resulting from the meeting make an impact on the Country Music Association, there may be any opportunity to get proper funding to develop them further. "The goal, of course, is to improve the stature, image and presence of country music in the German media, and in public opinion at large," said Siber. "Several proposals on how to achieve this will be presented at the meeting." One of the key issues on the agenda will be how to counteract the negative image of country music in Germany, which is often associated with the traditional "oompah" circuit. The "New American Music" label will almost certainly be discussed in this context.

Denmark

● The **BACKSTREET BOYS** managed to sell out Vega in two days without any publicity and a second show sold out equally swiftly as soon as it was announced. That makes a total of 3,000 tickets in around a week. Vega booker **PETER SORENSEN** couldn't be happier about the results of the first show on sale at the new venue which has its opening night this week. He says the teen fan base is so strong in Denmark that promoters ICO hardly had a chance to put together the posters or advertising for the first Backstreet Boys gig and that it sold out on the strength of a mention in a teen magazine. The second show was added following pressure from the fans who besieged their local ticket outlets with enquiries.

● ICO is also promoting **FAITHLESS**, a British dance act which has been doing big business in Germany with two singles in the top 20, and the band looks set to repeat the pattern in Scandinavia, with a number one single and number four album in Norway. Other ICO shows confirmed for this autumn are a double-bill featuring D-Blockx and Dubwar and the Crazy Gods of Endless Noise.

Switzerland

● The **BACKSTREET BOYS** yet again are the top selling show, this time in the winter schedule of the **GOOD NEWS AGENCY**. The band sold out their December 20 show at the 10,000 capacity Hallenstadion almost immediately and Good News and co-promoter for this show, the **FREE & VIRGIN AGENCY**, are currently negotiating to add a second date. **CELINE DION** is another best-seller for Good News, with two Hallenstadion shows on November 3 and 4 already sold out.

Romania

● With less than two weeks before **MICHAEL JACKSON** plays Bucharest, Romania on September 14, a little over 10,000 tickets have been sold out of a potential 80,000 capacity at the National Stadium. However the local promoter, **CARDINAL MULTI-MEDIA PROD. CO.** (CMMC is partly owned by "HIStory" tour producer **MARCEL AVRAM**) defends the figure saying that advance sales in Romania are never very strong. With tickets priced at \$15 and \$19, and the average salary around £100 per month, it's hardly surprising. However, the Romanian market is improving slowly, with tighter copyright laws strengthening the record-buying potential. But the tickets for the "HIStory" concert are the lowest price on the tour so far and CMMC is getting a lot of enquiries from Jackson fans in other countries around Europe. One recent request from France wanted to bulk buy 400 tickets. CMMC also promoted Jackson in 1992 and last year put on the Rod Stewart, Joe Cocker and Eros Ramazzotti show which toured Europe. A show with the Gipsy Kings later this autumn is the only other concert on the CMMC books, although they are waiting for confirmation as to whether Tina Turner will play there in November.

Italy

● Best selling acts for **BARLEY ARTS** at the start of the winter season are **PEARL JAM** and **METALLICA**, which are doing very well on advance sales even though most of Italy has only just returned from the month-long summer holidays.

Spain

● **SHOWMARKET 96**, a Spanish trade fair aimed specifically at the live entertainment industry, is set for November 21-23 at the **PALAU SAN JORDI** in Barcelona. In its first year, last November, ShowMarket had 4,600 participants from 22 countries. Because of the Spanish language connection, there is a strong Latin American connection, but the organisers intend to expand the focus of the exhibition. With 160 exhibition stands in the main area, they are expecting around 6,000 participants this year, in-

● The final five nominations in all categories for Australia's most prestigious music awards, the **ARIA'S** (Australian Record Industry Awards) are out. The names were announced at a star-studded bash at Sydney's Hard Rock Cafe August 26. The actual awards will be presented in Sydney on September 30 with guest international presenters including Chris Isaak and Harry Connick Jr. In the major categories the nominees are:

Best Album — John Farnham, Nick Cave & The Bad Seeds, You Am I, Regurgitator, Finn

Best Single — Tina Arena, Nick Cave and Kylie Minogue, Powderfinger, You Am I, Amonia,

Best Group — The Badloves, Crowded House, Regurgitator, silverchair, You Am I

Best Female Artist — Christine Anu, Tina Arena, Kate Ceberano, Deni Hines, Max Sharam

Best Male Artist — Diesel, John Farnham, Dave Graney, Paul Kelly, Tex Perkins

● A meeting of the creditors of **STEVE PAV'S GOLDEN SOUNDS PRESENTS** Pty Ltd will be held in Sydney on August 30 to, amongst other things, look at a "Report As To Affairs," and "consider the appointment of a liquidator." The company's debts appear to amount to \$263,714 with 86 creditors. By far the largest debt is to Michael Coppel Presents who are owed \$60,000. It's an unfortunate situation for someone who's done so many great tours.

● Mid-August **MUSHROOM RECORDS** head **MICHAEL GUDINSKI** confirmed that the label is planning to establish an office in the States. No further information is available at this stage but it'll be the company's first attempt at breaking into that market since a fairly disastrous attempt in the early '80s. With UK successes for Ash, Garbage and Peter Andre one can only assume their chances of getting something happening this time around are far greater.

● **BIG CITY PROMOTIONS** have announced September dates for **ANGELIQUE KIDJO**.

● Although no promoter has been identified, American band **ARCHERS OF LOAF** will be touring Australia in September through the early part of October. Billed as the 'Weird Cousin' tour, the band will perform on all dates with **MAGIC DIRT**.

● **MICHAEL COPPEL** has announced the full schedule for **STEELEYE SPAN** who return to Australia in late September — early October for their fourth Australian tour.

● Two noted older forces in the music industry have teamed up together. **JIMMY BARNES** is setting out on the media trail he so loves with the tutelage of publicist to the stars **PATTI MOSTYN** who has been working in fashion and special events of late rather than the music hand holding she cut her teeth on.

● Contrary to rumours, **CLANNAD** have not postponed their October tour of Australia. Although a full schedule was not available at press time they'll play Melbourne's Concert Hall on October 3. The promoter is **ADRIAN BOHM**.

● A fax from **BILL SILVA PRESENTS** in San Diego informs me that **UN-**

WRITTEN LAW are touring Australia in September, playing with **NO DOUBT** as well as headlining their own shows. The dates are being put together by **FRONTIER TOURING** and the **HARBOUR AGENCY**.

● Word is that **KATE CEBERANO** is now being managed by ex-Jason Donovan svengali and former concert promoter **RICHARD EAST**. One assumes this is for the rest of the world outside Australia as she has been managed by her mother Cherie for yonks.

● **SIX AND OUT - BIG DAY OUT** is the slogan for next year's Big Day Out extravaganza which pretty much confirms the widespread rumours that this will be the last time the festival's creators **KEN WEST** and **VIVIAN LEES** do their thang. Tickets for the Big Day Out are going on sale in the second week of October. Ken West is currently in the midst of a month long overseas trip, no doubt finalising the headlining international acts.

● **YOTHU YINDI** took centre stage at Atlanta's **PARALYMPIC** games on August 25. The band performed their hit song "World Turning," which was symbolically mixed with the famous Australian ballad *Waltzing Matilda* to mark the passing over of the games from Atlanta to Australia.



considering he was up against some of the best selling artists of the year like Bone Thugs-N-Harmony, Tupac Shakur, and Dr. Dre. Other winners included the Foo Fighters (group video for "Big Me"), Beck (male video for "Where It's At"), Fugees (R&B video for "Killing Me Softly") and Metallica (hard rock video for "Until It Sleeps"). This year's coveted Viewer's Choice award went to Bush. MTV has been known to open the awards show with a surprise (remember Michael Jackson and Lisa Marie Presley's infamous kiss) but this year they saved the "best" for last. When Van Halen, with David Lee Roth, took the stage to present best male video, the reunited rock gods got a standing ovation — simply for appearing together on a stage after more than a decade apart.

I'm Paul Stanley And You're Not



KISS sightings abound as the reunion tour traverses the country looking for copycat promoters trying to make their way into the spotlight. When the band stopped at the Pittsburgh Civic Arena July 21st and 22nd, Paul Stanley had to reveal his hairy chest to prove he was the real thing. The grand impersonator is promoter Rich Engler (L) from Dicesare Engler, which promoted both of the sold-out dates.

Legal Grievs

Minority shareholders can proceed with their lawsuit against country singer **Bill Anderson** and the estate of **Conway Twitty** over losses from the **Po Folks** restaurant chain, the state Supreme Court ruled September 3rd. Lawyers for the shareholders claim subsidiary companies that Twitty and Anderson have controlling interest in abused their fiduciary duty to the small shareholders by failing to get fair market value for Po Folks stock. In 1985, Anderson and Twitty agreed to sell their interests in Po Folks in return for getting out of \$3.2 million in bank loans. That sale left Po Folks' minority shareholders with nothing to show for their combined \$685,000 worth of stock in the 61-restaurant group.... **Wilson Pickett** must take a drug counselor with him when he travels to perform at the St. Louis Blues Heritage Festival since he apparently violated his parole by testing positive for cocaine use August 20th. Pickett pleaded guilty in July to being under the influence of cocaine while serving five years probation for hitting an 86-year-old man while driving drunk in 1992. The 55-year-old singer checked into a N.Y. drug treatment center in August but the facility unexpectedly closed before his 28-day treatment program was completed. If Pickett fails a drug test upon his return from St. Louis, his bail will be revoked and he will immediately go to jail, the judge said.... **David Byrne** filed a suit August 20th against his former Talking Head bandmates and manager Gary Kurfirst in an attempt to stop the upcoming release on Radioactive/MCA called *No Talking Just Head*.

Former Talking Heads members Tina Weymouth, Chris Frantz and Jerry Harrison recorded the album and named their new band **The Heads**. In the suit, filed in U.S. District Court in New York, Byrne claims the release of an album by The Heads, which features some all-star guest vocalists, is a wrongful use in commerce and dilutes the trademark. The suit claims the use of the name "The Heads" for an upcoming album and tour will cause irreparable injury to the reputation of the Talking Heads. Another claim against just Weymouth and Frantz says the plan to record and tour as The Heads is a breach of a 1987 Talking Heads agreement with Warner Bros., which holds the rights to the Talking Heads catalog. Warner Bros. was reportedly evaluating whether or not to file an independent action.

Short Items Of Note

The \$5.5 million Bel-Air, Calif., house the **Sony Corp.** bought from its former studio chairman, **Peter Guber**, in 1992 recently sold for a mere \$2 million, according to the *Los Angeles Times*. The Japanese corporation quietly took its \$3.5 million loss which seems typical of the deals that happened as a result of the Guber-Peters-Schulhof era.... Meanwhile, EMI Group Plc chief executive **James Fifield** made \$1.4 million September 2nd by exercising stock options and immediately selling them for a 100 percent profit, according to a Reuter's report. Fifield bought 126,542 shares valued at \$1.46 million and then sold them for \$2.86 million. The options exercised were adjusted to reflect the demerger last month of the EMI music business from Thorn's rental business.... **Speech** of Arrested Development is head of an Atlanta-based concert promotion company called House of Vagabond. The firm is one of the top urban concert promoters in Atlanta and has produced shows featuring Queen Latifah, the Fugees, Ben Harper, the Pharcyde, D'Angelo and more.... **Fareed Haque** will not move with Melanie Jordin to her new company, Jordin Entertainment. The artist will continue to be represented by A Train Management.... Founder of the Philadelphia Folk Festival **Robert Siegel**, 67, died August 31st of complications from a brain tumor. Siegel guided the festival for 18 years and helped it achieve financial independence and international attention.

Between The Dates

■ "It's just like the arrival of Yuri Gagarin many years ago," said a Prague street merchant, comparing the first man in space with last week's visit by **MICHAEL JACKSON** to the Czech Republic's capital city. Of course, Gagarin didn't wear lipstick and eye shadow when he made his historic space voyage. But then, he probably wasn't much of a dancer when it came to the moonwalk. Jackson's "HIStory" world tour was set to kick off September 7th in Prague, and the city probably hadn't seen so much excitement since the fall of Communism. Greeting Jackson's arrival, on a hill overlooking the city, was the 33 foot statue that is featured on the cover of his latest album. At one time the hillside was the site where the Communists built a massive statue of Stalin. But that statue was blown up shortly after the dictator's death in 1953. Two torches on either side of MJ's statue were lit recalling the days when Stalin's "Cult of Personality" kept two Olympic size torches lit alongside the Communist monument. After sitting on the tarmac for a half hour, decked out in a gold lame and red outfit and holding a white umbrella, Jackson greeted his fans. Then it was a police-escorted Rolls Royce ride through screaming fans into the city to Jackson's hotel, where his penthouse suite faced his monolithic doppelganger. Fans climbed trees and roofs to see Jackson, who's entourage took over five floors of the Intercontinental Hotel. According to Reuters, Jackson's Prague promoter, Serge Grimaux, said Jackson arrived several days before the concert so he could mingle like a "normal tourist." "He has a big interest in meeting people and doesn't want to be too incognito," Grimaux told reporters. Actually, it's probably next to impossible to blend in with the crowd when a 33 foot likeness of one's self overlooks the city.

■ Jacko was scheduled to start his world tour in front of 130,000 fans at Prague's Letna Park. The new MJ tour promises to be his most ambitious undertaking yet. Here are a few technical details on **MJ's MASSIVE PRODUCTION**. The stage measures 210 feet wide by 60 feet deep, 70 feet from ground to roof and boasts a performance area measuring 45 feet deep by 80 feet wide. The stage was built by U.K.-based Edwin Shirley Staging, and features three Jumbotrons, one on either side and one in the center. Lighting and special effects were designed by Peter Morse, who also designed Jackson's 1993 "Dangerous" tour. The production, designed by Jackson, Michael Cotton, Kenny Ortega and engineered by John McGraw, includes numerous special effects and lasers. The stage takes three days to construct, two days to put into production, then after the performance, an entire day to break down. In all, seven stages will be in various states of construction or dismantlement during the world tour. A small community of singers, dancers, techs, and musicians numbering about 140 will be traveling with the Jackson tour. The number grows to 300 with the hiring of additional stage hands in each city that Jackson performs. With the exception of some locals protesting the statue, Prague has experienced none of the controversy that has plagued some of the other planned tour stops. Casablanca was cancelled without reason by the locals, and in Seoul, several local groups have bitterly protested Jacko's scheduled appearance for two shows in October.

■ Speaking of acts that are known for excessive make-up, a small fire up in the truss rigging caused a minor glitch in the August 31st KISS concert at the **TACOMA DOME**. The venue's Mike Combs told POLLSTAR that just prior to the band's encore set, the pyrotechnics sparked a rigging support that was buffered with burlap. "It wasn't a huge flame but it obviously had to be put out," Combs said. The house lights were turned on and the band announced that the show would be put on hold temporarily. The crowd cheered as a rigger climbed up to the trussing with a fire extinguisher and put the flames out. The show was held up for about 15 minutes, after which time KISS reclaimed the stage and finished the show like nothing happened, Combs said. Who knows, maybe it could be a regular part of the show by next week. Or by the end of the year, which will find KISS rocking in 1997 in a New Year's eve performance at New Jersey's Meadowlands Arena.

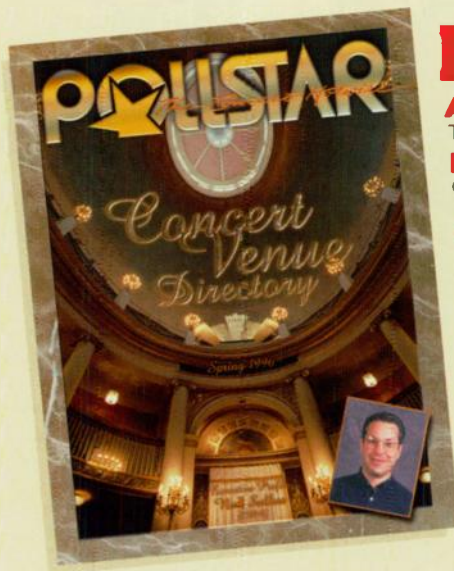
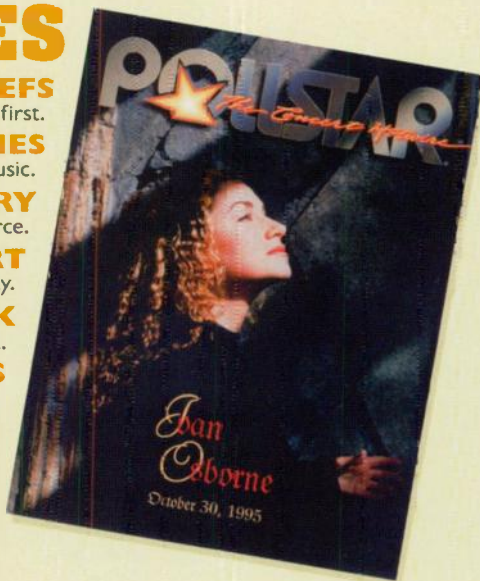

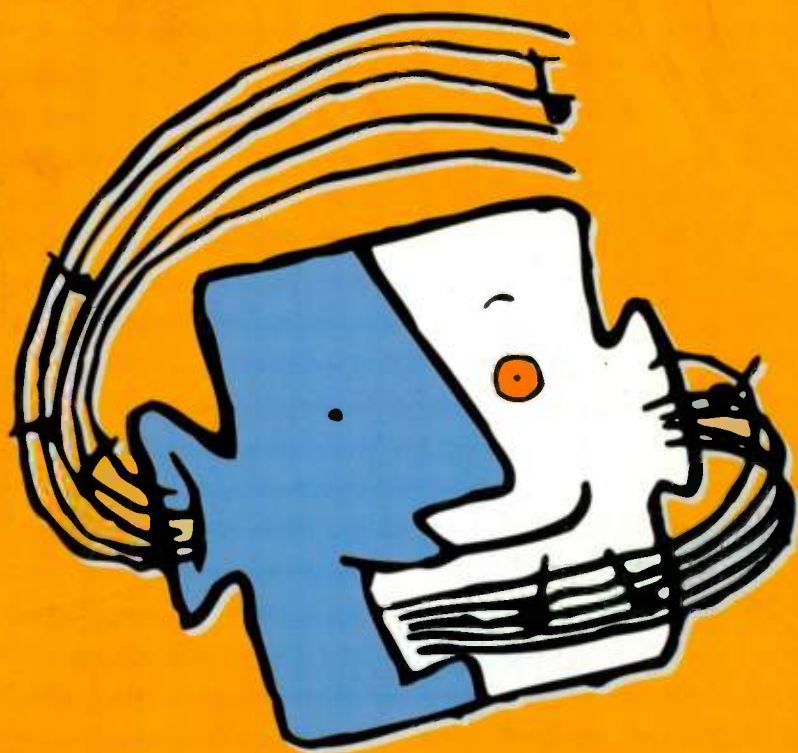
