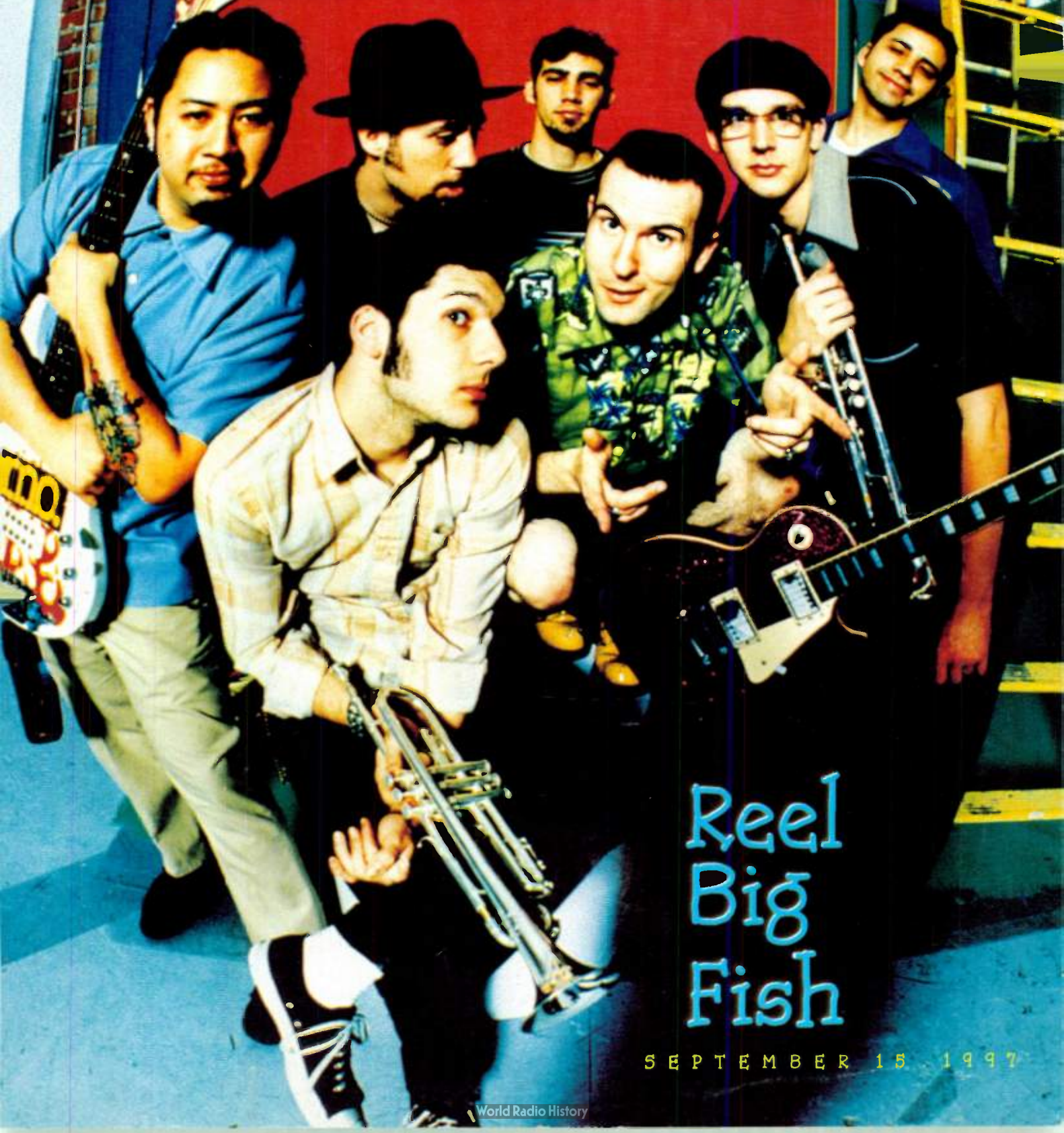

Buddy Lee vs. William Morris

A NASHVILLE JURY HAS ruled unanimously in favor of Buddy Lee Attractions in the agency's four-year legal battle against the William Morris Agency and former agent Joe Harris, now deceased. After a three-week trial, the jury reached a verdict September 5th, awarding Buddy Lee damages of \$250,000 from WMA and \$200,000 from Harris' estate.

A WMA spokesman said the agency will appeal the verdict and the organization is very confident it will be exonerated. The spokesman said there is no basis for an award of damages or liability. A source close to the case said Buddy Lee had sought damages of more than twice the total awarded by the jury.

Buddy Lee filed suit against WMA and Harris in September 1993 after Harris left Buddy Lee to join the larger agency. Trisha Yearwood and Great Plains followed Harris to WMA but Buddy Lee contended there was a clause in Harris' employment contract that prohibited him from representing any of the agency's artists for two years after leaving the company.

Along with breach of contract, the lawsuit claimed that Harris

and WMA jointly conspired to induce Buddy Lee acts to follow Harris. Buddy Lee was granted an injunction preventing any of Harris' acts from signing with WMA and Harris resigned from WMA about three months after signing on. He joined APA's Nashville operations and became a vice president there. Harris died in his sleep January 20, 1996, not long after the two-year injunction expired.

McGraw Fights Back

LAWYERS FOR CURB RECORDING artist Tim McGraw asked a federal appeals court to overturn a ruling that gives his former manager a portion of his earnings. McGraw was sued by Carol Booth of Monroe, La., in 1993. Booth claimed she was illegally dumped as McGraw's manager after investing about \$15,000 in his early career. The suit claims McGraw signed a five-year management contract with Booth in 1989, then signed with a record company the next year.

An arbitration panel in Louisiana ruled in 1995 that Booth's contract was valid and, as a result,

McGraw owes her \$320,917 plus legal expenses. The panel also ruled that Booth should receive 15 percent of gross revenues McGraw received after he signed with the record company.

Darrell Cherry, a New Orleans attorney representing McGraw, told the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals that having the arbitration hearing in Louisiana instead of New York was an error, making the ruling invalid. But Booth's attorney, Phillip Lawrence, said McGraw's lawyers never objected to the location. "You could have asked for other relief," said Chief Judge Henry Politz, one of the three judges hearing the arguments. "I have a real problem,

Barbie's Parents Are Not Amused

AMATTEL CORP. SPOKESPERSON said the toy manufacturer is not amused with the Danish pop group Aqua's new hit song, "Barbie Girl." Mattel thinks the song portrays women as sex objects and also violates its rights to the doll's name and image. "We have expressed our extreme dissatisfaction with the song and with what we believe is a strong case for trademark violation, said Sean Fitzgerald, a Mattel spokesman. "If Aqua or anybody else is interested in dancing with Barbie dolls, they're going to have to ask us first."

Lawyers representing Mattel and MCA Records, which distributes the single, have reportedly been in discussions for more than a month over the song. "Barbie Girl' is just intended to be a fun, upbeat summer song," said an MCA representative. "We are not amused," Fitzgerald said. The packaging for the single contains a disclaimer saying the song was not approved by Barbie's manufacturers.

Spicy Sex-Change Scam

POLICE HAVE RECOVERED more than 1,900 tickets sold for a phony Spice Girls concert. The bogus concert was a scam by Akram Abdullah-Wasi to pay for a sex-change operation, according

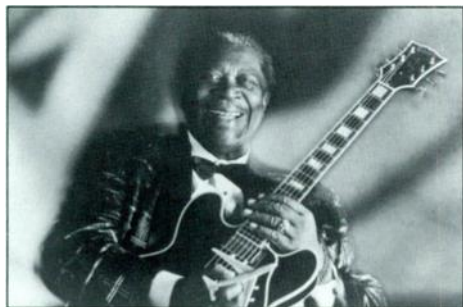
to police. The concert was scheduled to take place July 29th on the Big Island of Hawaii. Abdullah-Wasi, formerly known as John Lewis, allegedly told police he sold the tickets to raise money for the operation. He charged \$40 for adults and \$25 for students for the fake concert. Police discovered the concert, billed as "Summer Blast '97," was bogus after calling Spice Girls representatives. The show was also to feature the dance group Freak Nasty. Charges in the ticket scam are still pending. Abdullah-Wasi was being held on unrelated theft and forgery charges.

The Bittersweet Taste of Sublime

THE SOUND OF SUBLIME'S rock/hip-hop/reggae/punk hybrid is all over the radio and video waves. The band's third album, *Sublime*, has sold more than 2 million copies, with new fans amassing every day. And the group recently won an MTV Music Video Award for best alternative video. What some of the new fans don't know, however, is that Sublime isn't a band anymore. Abbey Konowitch, executive VP of MCA Records, said, "I really believe that at least half the people who have purchased the album are not aware that the group is no longer [active.]"

Sublime's lead singer and driving force, Bradley Nowell, died of a heroin overdose in San Francisco, May 25, 1996. The latest album was release two months after Nowell's death.

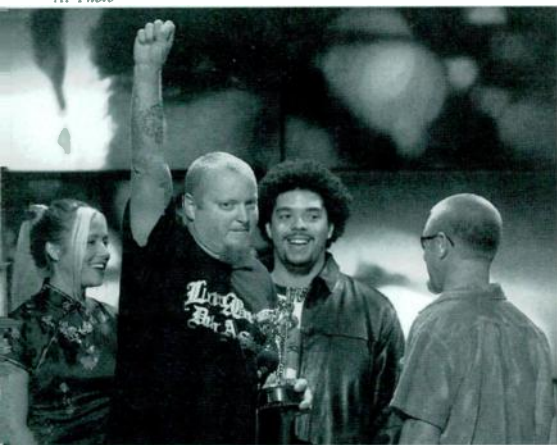

For awhile, it looked like Sublime fans would be able to get a taste of the band live, however. Surviving bandmates Eric Wilson and Bud Gaugh got together with the people who worked with Sublime in the studio and hit the road with a band called the Long Beach Dub All Stars.

"The people who jumped on the last album and were just all Brad crazy, we can't do anything for them."

Sublime was a three piece band comprising Nowell, Wilson and Gaugh. In the studio, however, they had many contributors, including their producer Miguel, who is also prexy of Skunk Records, the band's indie. Miguel told POLLSTAR that the Long Beach Dub All Stars was created as a tribute to Sublime and Nowell. The All Stars spent the past 12 months touring at a grass roots level, playing areas they thought paid a lot of respect to Sublime. They have since called it quits.

Miguel said there is a whole realm of people who want Nowell to still be here and Sublime to still come to town. "And there was a whole group of people who understood that Brad was gone but still

wanted to know what Bud and Eric were up to." The Dub All Stars toured for those fans. "The people who jumped on the last album and were just all Brad crazy, we can't do anything for them," Miguel said.

A nationwide tour for the Dub All Stars is not on the horizon, however. "It's fun to go out there and play the music but it's kind of tough too," Miguel said. "It's bittersweet feelings so it's not the kind of thing we want

to beat to death.... It was just for the [hard core] fans. The emphasis was on people who give a shit about people who are still alive. There's no way we could possibly cater to all Brad's fans now; there's fuckin' millions of them."

The Long Beach Dub All Stars have disbanded but are expected to play two upcoming charity concerts. One concert will benefit the Surfrider Foundation. The other show, a benefit for musicians with drug

and alcohol problems, was a personal request by Nowell's widow, Troy.

Fans, however, can look forward to new music. Miguel said MCA is releasing a record of out-takes, rarities and B-sides in November called *Second Hand Smoke*. And there will be a live Sublime album down the road.

Wu-Tang Wasn't There

WU-TANG CLAN'S ATTORNEY said his clients did not assault an employee of their label backstage at the New World Music Theatre near Chicago. Peter Frankel told *Addicted To Noise* that he can verify without any problem that Wu-Tang member GZA wasn't

Short Items Of Note

Metropolitan Entertainment Group has landed the exclusive rights to the 1951 movie "Go Man Go," which is the story of the most pivotal point in the **Harlem Globetrotters'** career. Under the deal, MEG will produce "Go Man Go" as a Broadway musical.

Ticketmaster Group, Inc., has purchased an additional one-third interest in its **Ticketmaster-Southeast** joint venture from Time Warner Inc. for \$9.5 million in cash. The deal gives TM two-thirds ownership of the venture. The remaining one-third interest is owned by Seagram's MCA unit.

More than 100 students at University of California at Berkeley signed up to take a class to study the poems of **Tupac Shakur**. "He's the Bob Dylan of our day," said Arvand Elihu, a junior who will teach the class for full credit with the university's approval.

Dolly Parton will tell her life story in a musical she is writing, which is scheduled to premiere at her Dollywood amusement park in Tennessee next spring. But die hard fans won't get to see the star at every production of the musical. "We're building it so they can plug me in when I'm here," Parton told the Dollywood Foundation Board of Directors. It is unclear who will be plugged in when Parton is not around.

Bass player **Roy Huskey Jr.**, 41, died September 6th in Nashville after a bout with cancer. Huskey had performed with many top-notch talents during his career including Chet Atkins, Garth Brooks, Johnny Cash, Vince Gill, Alan Jackson and Emmylou Harris.

The 1998 **Grammy Awards** will be held in New York for the second year in a row, it was announced September 8th. Though the Grammys had been alternating between New York and Los Angeles for the past few years, the decision to stay in the Big Apple was not unexpected. On the eve of this year's music awards at Madison Square Garden in February, officials indicated an agreement had been reached to hold the event in New York for two consecutive years.

even in the state at the time the alleged beating took place. Loud Records marketing and promotions manager Jessiah Styles told police that Wu-Tang members GZA, Method Man, Raekwon and Inspectah Deck assaulted him in their dressing room following the August 29th concert. A police investigator said he has to take depositions from the Wu-Tang members before any official charges are filed in the case.

The New Crown

CINCINNATI'S FORMER RIVER-front Coliseum is less than three weeks from re-opening as the newly-renovated Crown. The facility is in the midst of a \$14 million face lift which will replace its vinyl seats with cozy cloth seats, its concrete walls with fresh paint and tile and expand its concession areas and restroom facilities.

The renovation and renaming of the building may finally help put

to rest the site's reputation as the scene of the most deadly rock tragedy in U.S. history; 11 concert-goers died there in 1979, crushed while trying to get in to see The Who.

Nederlander and the Cincinnati Cyclones hockey team are partners in the ownership group that purchased the venue last February for \$21 million. Nederlander will manage the building but will not serve as exclusive promoter. The company will reportedly work with regional promoters such as Belkin Productions and Sunshine Promotions to bring in shows. The building is the first major arena to be part owned by a promoter.

Nederlander Management President Mike Smith told *The Cincinnati Post* the renovation will put the venue back on the concert map. He predicted the arena will double the number of concerts and entertainment events from past years. If the Crown's opening month line-up is any indication, the facility is off to a great start.

Fleetwood Mac will christen the venue October 3rd. Other events booked for the first month include Reba McEntire / Brooks & Dunn, Motley Crue, "Lord of the Dance," an NBA exhibition game and the first home games for the Cincinnati Cyclones team and Cincinnati Silverbacks soccer team.

Jacksons Do It Again

JERMAINE JACKSON ONCE AGAIN plans to reunite his family for a musical performance and awards ceremony to benefit charity. Jackson's "Earthvision '98" will be broadcast live July 2nd from the Heridon Theater in Athens, Greece. The 90-minute program will have a similar format to the "Jackson Family Honors," held in Las Vegas in 1994. Hopefully, it won't have a similar fate. Jackson said his entire family has been invited to attend, however, he is not guaranteeing everyone will show up. Producers of the "Jackson Family Honors" claimed that show failed because Michael Jackson did not perform solo. Jermaine Jackson has also invited yet-to-be named entertainers to perform and honor Muhammad Ali, Sophia Loren, Stevie Wonder and Bishop

Desmond Tutu for their service to humanity. "Earthvision '98" will benefit the Sunshine Foundation, which grants the wishes of terminally ill, handicapped and abused children, and two unspecified European charities.

Shakur's Estate Sued Again

THE MAN WHO WAS BEATEN BY Tupac Shakur and his posse hours before the rapper was shot in Las Vegas has filed a lawsuit against Shakur's estate. Orlando Anderson's lawsuit contends that he was assaulted by Shakur and several Death Row Records employees in the lobby of the MGM Grand Hotel the night Shakur was shot, according to the *Los Angeles Times*. The suit, filed in Los Angeles Superior Court, also names Death Row and its chief, Marion "Suge" Knight, as defendants, the *Times* said. The suit also alleges that Anderson suffered physical injuries and severe emotional and mental distress. The ruckus between Shakur's camp and Anderson reportedly stemmed from gang rivalry. A police affidavit said Anderson was attacked because he had allegedly stolen a gold chain from one of the Death Row employees during a gang scuffle a month earlier at a Los Angeles-area mall, the *Times* said. Anderson was informed last fall that he was a suspect in Shakur's killing but he was never arrested or charged. In February, Las Vegas police told the *Times* that Anderson was still considered a suspect in Shakur's shooting but the investigation remains stalled.

The Best Of Canadian Country

PAUL BRANDT AND TERRI Clark were the big winners at the CCMA's 16th annual Canadian Country Music Awards at Hamilton Place in Ontario September 8th. Nominated for seven

awards, Calgary native Brandt came away with four: male vocalist of the year and single, video and SOCAN song of the year for his self-penned "I Do." Canadian country music fans chose Clark over Brandt, Shania Twain, Prairie Oyster, and Michelle Wright for the high honor of CMT/Maple Leaf Foods Fan's Choice Award. Clark also snagged female vocalist of the year as well as album of the year for her release *Just The Same*. Clark, who won the rising star award last year, gave up her crown this year to newcomer Julian Austin. New Canadian country group Farmer's Daughter shocked Prairie Oyster fans when it was named best duo or group. Twain, a huge winner the last couple of years, was given a special award to recognize the fact that her CD, *The Woman In Me*, has become the best selling album of all time by a female country artist. She also won honors for top selling album in Canada.

Sexual Harassment Accusations

A LAWSUIT FILED LAST WEEK accuses a former VP of A&M Records of sexually harassing his male assistant. In his Superior Court suit, Heath Byers claims former A&R exec Mark Mazzetti made repeated sexual overtures, reportedly including lewd comments, unwanted touching, undressing himself while Byers was in his office and showing up at Byers' home unexpectedly.

The \$10 million suit also names A&M and its parent company, PolyGram. Byers charges that A&M took no action when he initially complained about Mazzetti.

Mazzetti issued a statement September 9th denying all the allegations. His attorney, Jay Coggan, reportedly asserted that Byers invented the accusations to pressure Mazzetti into promoting him.

Mazzetti plans to bring his own lawsuit against A&M for wrongful-

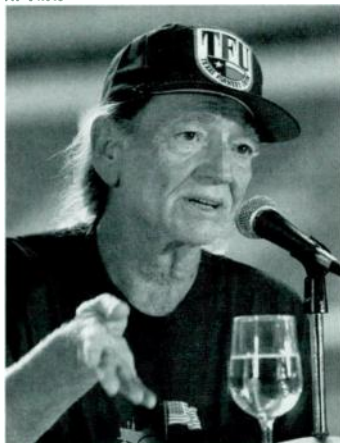

MTV Video Awards Highlights

THIS YEAR'S MTV MUSIC Video Awards show September 4th was filled with many references to the recent death of Diana, Princess of Wales. The mood was somber with tributes to The Notorious B.I.G. as well as props going out to others who have died recently including Tupac Shakur and Sublime's Brad Nowell.

One of the evening's highlights happened when Sting joined Puff Daddy and Faith Evans to pay tribute to Biggie. Puff Daddy heavily sampled Sting's "Every Breath You Take" for his song "I'll Be Missing You," which honors the slain rapper.

The evening wasn't all serious, though. Host Chris Rock made what some consider the joke of the year when he likened buying a Spice Girls album to buying heroin: "You know somebody's doing it, but nobody admits it."

Is A Fair Fee Fair?

NEW MEXICO STATE FAIR officials have been hearing from perturbed patrons who bought tickets to an ice show at Tingley Coliseum and then had to pay an entrance fee to the State Fair on top of it. Tickets to "Walt Disney on Ice Presents Toy Story" cost up to \$14.50 and the entrance fee to the fair was \$4, double the price of last year. "I'm already paying more than \$14 a ticket for my wife and me and our two kids to see the show and then they want us to pay \$4 more to get on the fairgrounds even though we're not going to the fair," an irate consumer complained to *The Albuquerque Tribune*. "I don't mind paying the extra money if we were going to the fair after the show. But we're not. Parents should at least be warned." Newspaper ads did warn: "State Fair admission not included in ticket price." And print on the tickets read: "Ticket price does not include fair admission." The policy of charging fair admission on top of costs for concerts at Tingley has always been on the

books. GM John Garcia told POLLSTAR that even with fair admission, consumers are getting a good entertainment value.

Master P's Fans Know No Limit

NEW ORLEANS RAPPER-entrepreneur Master P has quickly made his mark on the music scene. He's gone from selling 200,000 records out of the back seat of his car to a multi-platinum rapper/producer. Master P's No Limit label has had a string of successes, including the multi-platinum "I'm Bout It" soundtrack. Last week, his No Limit/Priority release *Ghetto D* jumped from No. 137 to the top spot on the SoundScan chart, with more than 250,000 units sold.

With that kind of splash, it shouldn't have been a surprise that thousands of people would turn out to see him perform. Apparently, an Atlanta-area concert organizer underestimated the Master P's drawing power and that created a big problem on September 4th.

Master P was scheduled to perform at the International Ballroom, a converted airplane hangar located in Doraville, just northeast of Atlanta. The hall was reportedly designed to hold about 5,000

people. It turned out that 6,000 tickets were sold for the show and an additional 6,000 people showed up hoping to get in. Before the scheduled 8 p.m. start time, a group of 30 to 40 "unruly" people got in the facility through a side exit.

The interlopers reportedly did not have tickets and an article in the *Atlanta Journal-Constitution* said the group was causing problems and police were called in to restore order. The police wound up using pepper spray during their efforts to send half of the waiting crowd home. Tension mounted in the audience, which paid as much as \$100 a pop for a seat only to endure overcrowding and pepper spray. In order to quell flaring tempers, Master P came out to address the remaining people and the show got underway with the opening acts.

Then a fight broke out in the back of the venue, witnesses told the *Journal-Constitution*, and the crowd pushed forward, demolishing the stage and damaging equipment. According to the Doraville police, the damage totalled several thousand dollars. At that point, the newspaper said Master P's representatives concluded it would be a security risk for the rapper to perform.

About 30 police officers from the surrounding area were called in after the fight started and someone fired shots into the air. Six of-

ficers were assaulted by people in the audience and Doraville police said concert-goers were trying to yank people out of their cars and start fights.

Even after the venue was evacuated, traffic along the adjacent highway was blocked in both directions and more shots were fired. Javiar Macias, who apparently owns the International Ballroom, was cited for creating a disturbance and public nuisance. Macias has not been available for comment, and at press time, Master P was not available through his No Limit Records label.

Rage Appeases The Machine

GREAT WOODS CENTER FOR the Performing Arts and Rage Against the Machine have donated a total of \$20,000 to the town of Mansfield, Mass., as an apology for violating a community curfew. Rage's August 21st show at the amphitheatre ran until 1:30 a.m., a definite violation of the 11 p.m. music curfew. The concert was canceled the day-of-show because Rage's Zach de la Rocha had injured his ankle and storms on the eastern seaboard were wreaking havoc on travel in the Boston area.

Before the cancellation was announced, Great Woods instead decided to opt for a weather delay and the show was back on. Rage,

however, took the stage much later than expected, causing the concert to run into the wee small hours.

The following day, the venue and Mansfield's selectmen were inundated with complaints from area residents, and at one point, the selectmen were said to be considering suspending or restricting Great Woods' operating license or leveling a fine against the venue. It turned out they didn't have the power to fine Great Woods, and since the curfew violation was an isolated incident, it didn't seem fair to meddle with the shed's license.

Great Woods purchased newspaper ads offering an apology to the community and Great Woods GM Bruce Montgomery told the selectmen that the venue and the band wanted to settle the issue with a donation. The \$20,000 will be distributed to local charities. Representatives for Rage said the band had no comment about the donation.

In other Rage news, a Washington state sheriff tried to stop a September 12th Rage Against the Machine concert at the Gorge Amphitheatre scheduled but did not succeed. Grant County Sheriff William Wiester complained that problems with inadequate security, traffic control, drugs, sanitation, emergency services and pedestrian safety would pose a danger to those in the community, according to the *Seattle Times*. The chief deputy prosecutor for Grant

County, Stephen J. Hallstrom, filed court documents September 5th reportedly alleging mismanagement of the facility by its owners, Universal Concerts. He cited problems at the venue related to "high-maintenance" events such as the Phish and Lollapalooza concerts last month, the *Times* said. Universal defended the company's crowded control efforts and pointed out that recent problems had nothing directly to do with the concerts.

In a nine-page document supporting the county's motion, Wiester reportedly referred to the "violent and anti-law enforcement" philosophies of Rage Against the Machine and Wu-Tang Clan, which was originally on the bill but canceled. Wiester said he assigned a detective to collect information from local police departments in jurisdictions where Rage and Wu-Tang Clan had played. Based on those reports, Wiester decided his department would not be able to handle the security risks he believed the two groups would create, the *Times* said.

On September 9th, Grant County Superior Court Judge Ken Jorgensen ruled that there was not sufficient evidence to prove that the band's performance would cause trouble. He reportedly said he couldn't grant an injunction for a show on the pretense that something *might* occur. ✦

Reel Big Fish

For years, Reel Big Fish had musician trouble — horn section trouble, to be exact. In its earliest days, the band comprised singer/guitarist Aaron Barrett, bassist Matt Wong and drummer Andrew Gonzales and they did mostly covers.

A horn section isn't so important if you're going to play

Wham!, Warrant and Jimi Hendrix hits, but if ska is your biggest influence, well, that's different. For the love of ska, Reel Big Fish had to get reliable horn players, so they did what a lot of bands do; they put up fliers and they recruited. “We figured out a way around our problem,” said Barrett. “We'd grow our own horn players. We got 'em right out of the high school band and we've brought them up to be Reel Big Fish.”

He's not kidding. The trumpet players, Tavis Werts and Scott Klopfenstein, and the trombonists, Dan Regan and Grant Barry, were very much in their teens when they joined the band. Even now, none of the four can legally buy a beer in all 50 states.

Barrett said he doesn't expect any of his bandmates to grow up in the near future. Reel Big Fish will always retain their youthful exuberance, which is fitting considering a certain demographic statistic. “A major chunk of their audience is underage,” said Ken Fermaglich, one of the band's Artists & Audience agents. “The band won't play any show that's not all-ages. They won't play 16-plus or 14-plus... they want 10-year-olds to get in. We see kids at these shows with their parents.”

If Reel Big Fish has its way, those kids will be safe, too. The band has taken a stand against moshing and stage diving. Barrett is so adamant about his audience's safety, he and the rest of the Fish walked off stage during a Warped Tour show this summer when the crowd refused to chill. “We're the band that doesn't like people getting squashed,” said Barrett. “I've had too many people complain to me about

getting hurt and not being able to enjoy the show because of people falling on their heads and stuff.” His viewpoint is understandable since the band came up playing to predominantly ska audiences where kids were skanking, not slamming.

Even though this band's music isn't pure, unadulterated ska, Reel Big Fish definitely has a place on the ska scene. After securing a solid fan base on the Long Beach home turf, the group broadened its horizons by touring with other ska-loving acts. Being associated with a particular style of music comes with the blessing of appreciative fans and the curse of the hard-core purists.

Like No Doubt and Goldfinger before them, Reel Big Fish have been accused of selling out its true ska roots for a shot at fame. “It's so weird. You'd think people would be happy when the kind of music they like gets popular,” said Barrett. “I always wanted to share stuff with people. I'd get sad when nobody had heard about a band that I really liked.”

Rather than get all defensive and uppity about their music, Reel Big Fish put their usual sarcastic spin on things and wrote a song about what big sellouts they are. The scales of irony just about tipped over when “Sell Out” became their breakthrough radio hit. Their album, *Turn the Radio Off*, had been out for about six months and the band had been touring constantly when the single finally broke. The late radio success was not a fluke, though; it fit into the Reel Big Fish plan.

“The band had already developed a fan base by supporting several other bands,” said Fermaglich. “When we first signed the band six months ago, we wanted them to headline to develop that fan base. We thought radio would eventually catch up and that's essentially what happened. We just got added at the modern rock station in Chicago, but even before that, we sold out the House of Blues in Chicago three weeks in advance.”

Read between the lines and it's very easy to see that underneath the airplay and the album sales is a bunch of very supportive fans. A capacity crowd of 3,500 filled the Hollywood Palladium late last month, making it clear that Reel Big Fish hasn't sold out as far as kids back home are concerned. It's not just a So. Cal. phenomenon, either. “Everything on

this tour is sold out in advance, whether or not they're doing well at radio in the market,” said Fermaglich.

Reel Big Fish is on the road in the States through the beginning of October. Then it's off to Australia for The Warped Tour's run Downunder, followed by some dates in Japan. Their strangest gig will take place November 17th when they perform a Fish-flavored “Star Spangled Banner” before a Miami Dolphins football game. ★

United Kingdom: RICHARD Branson is working on plans to hold a charity concert to honour the memory of Diana, Princess of Wales. Will Whitehorn, head of corporate affairs at Virgin, said discussions with the organisers of the Princess Diana Memorial Fund are ongoing and that an announcement is expected later this week. At this stage, all that is known is the date — the bank holiday weekend of August next year, which will be the anniversary of her death — and that it is likely to be a Live Aid-style event in Hyde Park, linking up with a simultaneous concert in New York City's Central Park.

Promoters are being approached to organise the show, although no one has been confirmed yet. Artists such as Sting, Paul McCartney and the Rolling Stones have reportedly committed their support to the event. Branson's record label, V2, will also put out a tribute album later this month. All proceeds from the *Diana Queen of Hearts* album will go to her memorial fund. Elton John's specially rewritten version of "Candle in the Wind," which he is pictured here singing at the funeral of the princess, has been recorded as a single with Sir George Martin and will go on sale this week, also to raise money for the fund.

• GENESIS HAS POSTPONED THE start of the UK leg of its tour due to production logistics. The tour kicks off in the US in November and continues through to January, which doesn't leave enough time to ship the report-

edly massive production across the Atlantic in time to start at Cardiff International Arena on January 27.

The first four shows have therefore been moved and the tour now kicks off at the NEC in Birmingham on February 25. John Giddings at Solo, agent and promoter of the UK tour, said, "It was easier to move the UK shows now, in September; it meant rescheduling four or five shows for the sake of the bigger picture.

• THE ROLLING STONES' EUROPEAN tour plans look set to be finalised in October. Agent John Giddings is considering a number of possibilities, including a festival-style line-up for the UK dates. He said this format worked well in Europe during the "Voodoo Lounge" tour and there may be a few similar events on the "Bridges to Babylon" tour next summer.

• WATCH FOR THE MINUTES OF THE Regional Promoters Association (RPA), which will be circulated to those who didn't attend as well as members. The key points raised at the summer convention of UK club promoters highlighted areas which could improve business for the ailing club circuit. Around 40 promoters attended the meeting at the Charlotte in Leicester. The RPA is set to become affiliated with the Concert Promoters Association (CPA), which will certainly lend it some weight.

One of the first aims of the RPA is to obtain a zero PRS rating for clubs below 300 capacity, but this battle has only just begun. The other key issues were how to compete with festivals and how to deal with cancellations. The increasing number of festivals has been eating into the club market and many promoters suffered earlier this year. Bands are not playing their usual warm-up gigs and festivals are "poaching" acts that could fill clubs during the summer months. RPA members said there is a summer audience out there that hasn't bought tickets for the major festivals and wants to see bands.

Agents have become reluctant to put new acts forward for summer club dates and the question raised was, "Isn't it better to play to a packed venue rather than to a festival audience of 40 people in a field at midday?" The perennial gripe over cancellations, which are reportedly on the increase, led to discussions of a CPA standard cancellation fee, which would allow promoters to cover their costs, at least.

There was also talk of compiling a "blacklist" of allegedly "flaky agents" who have a reputation for cancelling their shows.

• AT WEMBLEY, HALF-YEARLY results revealed a drop in the venues' operating profits. The profit at the Wembley complex was down to £5.7 million, compared with £7.91 million last year, but this can be largely attributed to the slow start to the stadium concert season and also, last year's Euro96 football tournament was a significant boost to the 1996 figures.

Bookings were also down at Wembley Arena, with 54 events in the first half of the year, compared to 72 in the same period last year. However, arena bookings for the next six months are up by 8 percent on last year. Despite these figures, overall results for Wembley plc show a strong performance, even with the significant dent caused by litigation costs in the USA over the Pacer CATS ticketing case.

Germany: LAST WEEK, CHRIS Brosch at 2Day was awaiting confirmation of Oasis' German dates. Brosch hopes to put five shows on sale in the next week. Although there hasn't been any repetition of the unofficial advertising of the German shows to UK fans, Brosch says he is getting several calls every day from British bus companies wanting to organise Oasis trips to Germany. Other shows promoted by 2Day this autumn include Daft Punk, who will be doing 12 dates in Germany, Foo Fighters, Johnny Clegg, Yo La Tengo, Gus Gus and Mary Coughlan.

• MICHELLE WRIGHT IS CURRENTLY touring Germany for the first time and promoter Moderne Welt says the response to her six shows has been very positive, with a lot of TV appearances backing up the promotional campaign. Another country artist playing Germany for the first time this year was Steve Earle, who sold out his show in Hamburg back in February. Earle returns to Germany with The Dukers for four more shows this autumn.

Other Moderne Welt shows this season include a very successful Barclay James Harvest tour, which is pulling audiences of around 4,000 per show; Mary Black; Sister 7 with Abra Moore; John Mayall; Joan Baez; the original UFO line-up; and Paul Young. Looking ahead to 1998, Moderne Welt is coordinating dates in January for an Alannah Myles tour of Germany, Austria and Switzerland; also expected is Grand Funk Railroad.

• A STATE COURT HAS CONVICTED 13 neo-Nazis of displaying Nazi emblems and of attempting to organize a skinhead concert, a spokesman for the Thuringia court said last week. Those convicted were among 175 suspected extreme rightists that police arrested September 6 en route to a banned concert in the town of Triptis. District officials had banned the concert because they did not want a neo-Nazi gathering in the area. Those convicted received three and four month imprisonment plus two years' probation, or were fined.

• THE VOLKSWAGEN SOUND Foundation has nominated the first recipients of its sponsorship funding. Doc.Vox from Osnabruck and Menino from Bad Neuenahr have both received support from the foundation on their latest tours.

The Latin-pop band Menino have been touring Brazil through the past month in a VW tour bus, playing gigs to raise money for the country's street children. Meanwhile, Doc.Vox is gearing up for a 19-date tour of Germany starting on September 26, which will also use a tour bus provided by Volkswagen.

Austria: RICHARD HOERMANN AT Artist Marketing has taken on the management of the hotly tipped BMG act Paradise Now!. The band received rave reviews at Popkomm last month and will support Tiamat on their European tour through the autumn. Hoermann has also already started work on the Kelly Family's next indoor tour after selling a total of 65,000 tickets for recent shows in Vienna and Prague.

Ticket sales continue to outstrip most other artists in Austria and Artist Marketing was also involved in the coordination of the Kelly Family's first concert in Ljubljana, which sold over 30,000 tickets and was the biggest open air show in the Balkan area to date. The Backstreet Boys show in Vienna was also a big success, with 35,000 tickets sold. Upcoming shows promoted by Artist Marketing include Paula Cole, Joan Baez, Megadeth, Whitesnake, Al Di Meola, N-Sync and John Mayall.

Sweden: EMA TELSTAR'S JAN GILLE has been invited by the Country Music Association to be a VIP guest at the CMA Awards in Nashville on September 24. Gille will also participate in a panel discussion at the SRO International Conference entitled "Building an

International Development Strategy." Although EMA Telstar is not a country specialist as such, the company works with all genres of music and has promoted artists like Garth Brooks, Johnny Cash and Emmylou Harris over the years.

Holland: TICKETS WENT ON SALE at the weekend for the seventh Heineken Night of the Proms. Confirmed headliners are Simple Minds and Coolio, plus Total Touch, pianist Wayne Marshall and Il Novecento Orchestra, conducted by Robert Groslot. The annual series of concerts, which brings together classical and pop under one roof, and one sponsor, takes place November 25 to December 1 at the Ahoy in Rotterdam.

Organised by the Van Hoorn company, it is one of the key Heineken events on the calendar. This year, there will also be a Heineken Night of the Proms in Zurich, Switzerland at the Hallenstadion. Simple Minds and Wayne Marshall have been confirmed for this concert on November 21.



GIGS & BYTES

► Shiver me timbers! Cary Sherman, senior executive VP and general counsel of the Recording Industry Association of America — RIAA — (www.riaa.com) testified on behalf of the U.S. recording industry before the Senate Judiciary Committee a couple of weeks ago on the topic of **online piracy**. Sherman cited cases where the RIAA had brought copyright infringement actions against three music archive sites that were making unauthorized copies available for download and warned of the impact online piracy would have, not only on artists, but on legitimate music sites trying to make a buck. During his testimony, Sherman asked the committee, “Why would anybody buy music from a Web entrepreneur when the same music is available from a Web pirate for free?”

Sherman also testified against the concept of tweaking current copyright laws to protect ISPs from copyright prosecution. While ISPs have sought such a change, stating that they are only carriers and not responsible for the content that makes its way through their systems, Sherman said, “Frankly, we don’t see it. In theory, bookstores are all technically at risk that they are committing or contributing to copyright infringement by virtue of their ordinary, day-to-day business operations. And the same can be said for record retailers, magazine publishers, TV broadcasters, and scores of others. And they’ve all been at risk for years.”

Congressional hearings on Internet piracy continue this week. On September 16th, the House Judiciary subcommittee on Intellectual Property will hold hearings on protecting the ISPs from liability, and on September 17th, the subcommittee will hear testimony regarding new laws that are to be put into effect to comply with the World Intellectual Property Organization treaty agreed upon earlier this year. Since this is an entertainment issue, Congress always likes to hear from a celeb or two. This time it will be the man in black, **Johnny Cash**, who will appear before the subcommittee.

► **DVD vs Divx**. Could this be like VHS and BETA? The Digital Video Disc, touted as the next step in home entertainment, is still in it’s infancy and there’s already a big-bucks challenger to the format. Digital Video Express (www.divx.com), owned by electronic appliance chain Circuit City (www.circuitcity.com) and entertainment law firm Ziffren, Brittenham, Branca & Fischer plans on having a digital disc that you can buy for about \$5.00, watch a couple of times, then toss it. The Divx disc includes special encryption technology. Once you

insert the Divx disc into your player, the disc notes the time and after 48 hours have passed, the disc is “locked” from viewing. If you want to watch the movie one more time, a few dollars more will unlock the disc. If you want to buy the movie, a fee of about \$20.00 will unlock the disc for keeps. The upside is that there are no movies to return to the video rental store, since you can just throw the disc away. The downside is that the Divx players are expected to cost about \$100 more than the DVD players, which currently go for about \$500. But even the downside has an upside. While the DVD players can’t play the Divx discs, the Divx players can play both formats. Digital Video Express has won support for the new format from several

(www.aol.com) to provide its users with the song. However, response was so tremendous that Capitol announced they would give the full length streaming song for free. The original pricing plans go in effect on September 23rd. Duran Duran and/or movie fans already know the band took its name from a character in that 60s sci-fi epic Jane Fonda flic, *Barbarella*.

► Microsoft Music Central (musiccentral.msn.com) has dumped their in-house news team, known as **Totally Live News**, and replaced it with the MusicNewswire (www.musicnewswire.com), which features links to various trade pub and general music publication stories.

► Oh yeah, in case you haven't heard, H&R Block sold **Compuserve** (www.compuserve.com) to WorldCom Inc, which turned around and swapped the online services' customer accounts to **America Online** in exchange for AOL's network services business. Of course, there was some money involved. WorldCom got Compuserve in a stock trade worth \$1.2 billion. And AOL snagged \$175 million from WorldCom in exchange for the online service's network hardware.

AOL has assured Compuserve users that there will be no changes in the online network. For AOL, it's kind of like owning both Park Place and Boardwalk. As you might have guessed, the Justice Department is looking into the deal, focusing on AOL's ability to raise prices without having to worry about competition.

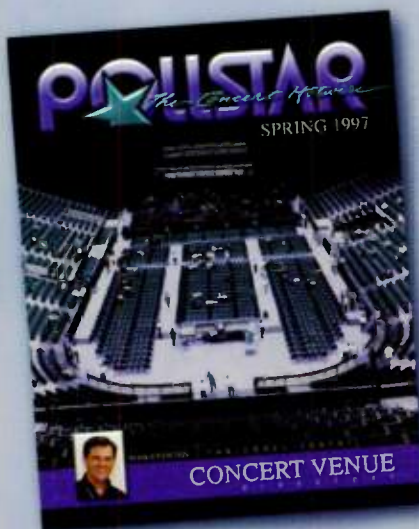
