**BGP Photo Archive Dispute**

**B**ILL GRAHAM PRESENTS IS suing the free-lance photographer it has been associated with for the last 18 years. The lawsuit, claiming fraud, accuses Ken Friedman of stealing photos that belong to BGP.

According to the company's Nicholas Clainos, BGP had a deal with Friedman to turn over all photos he snapped while working for the promoter. "He took pictures and secretly held them, and we didn't know he had them. But we paid him," Clainos told POLLSTAR. "He's taken our money and property, and he did it illegally."

Friedman couldn't disagree more. He told POLLSTAR his original agreement with BGP was to hand over original film from his shootings. "I never said to them I would deliver every frame of film from things that I shoot for them, that I would never keep any for myself," he countered. He has about two-and-a-half file drawers full of slides in his possession, he said.

"They knew full well that I was keeping slides from the shootings because I was selling them pictures

directly. I have receipts where they purchased photographic prints from me that they knew came from me."

All that aside, Friedman thinks this lawsuit is more about an underlying agenda than anything else. He said when SFX purchased BGP, the owners of the Bay Area-based promoter sold its photo archives as part of the deal.

Friedman said that just before the acquisition deal closed, BGP offered him \$15,000 to sign over copyright on the photos the company already had. The deal would have let Friedman keep the shots he had in his personal files, he said. "However, if I did not agree to that deal, they would sue me for fraud to repossess the pictures that were in my possession."

The way Friedman sees it, "They sold the archives without the copyright, claiming that it was theirs free and clear, and that there were no liens or encumbrances

on it. Then in order to get me to give them the copyright, they said, 'We're suing you to get back what you have.'"

As far as the copyright issue is concerned, Clainos said the two parties don't necessarily agree, but that has nothing to do with this lawsuit. "I didn't sue him over that."

But the topic is at the heart of Friedman's defense. He said BGP has between nine and 12 four-drawer file cabinets of slides he shot, which the company can use for promotional purposes. However, "They couldn't sell it free and clear and that's what they wanted," he said. He believes those slides are worth \$1 million.


The existence of contracts between BGP and the photographer is another bone of contention. Friedman said he never signed a contract with BGP defining photo shoot agreements. However,

## Short Items Of Note

**Celine Dion** canceled concerts scheduled April 13th to May 7th so she can be with her husband, who is undergoing radiation therapy for skin cancer. **Rene Angelil**, 56, was released from the hospital the week of March 28th, after doctors performed surgery on his neck. Radiation treatments will continue for six weeks. "Rene is the biggest priority in my life, and I want to be by his side as he continues his treatment," said Dion on April 7th. The concerts will be rescheduled for the fall. Among the shows affected was last week's benefit concert for the **Nebraska AIDS Project** at the Aksarben Coliseum in Omaha which has now been rescheduled for September 29th.

A \$1,000-a-plate audience witnessed **Tipper Gore** bang the drums with former members of the Grateful Dead on April 6th. The wanna-be first lady took to the conga drums at the fund-raiser dinner in support of her husband's presidential campaign. Al Gore's "an old friend," guitarist **Bob Weir** said at the San Jose, Calif., gala. "He's a real human being, and we're going to support him." Mrs. Gore shared the stage with Weir and percussionist **Mickey Hart**, keeping the beat to a rendition of Bob Dylan's "Queen Jane." The song speaks cynically about political pandering and disloyalty.

**Bossier City, La.**, held a groundbreaking ceremony March 30th to kick off the construction of its \$49 million multipurpose arena. The 270,000-square-foot complex will host sports, entertainment and civic functions, including minor-league ice hockey, for Bossier City, Shreveport and Northwest Louisiana. The 14,000-seat arena is expected to open in October 2000 and will operate year-round. LMI will manage and operate the venue, which was funded through existing sales taxes and city revenue derived from riverboat casino activities.

Members of the **Black Promoters Association** along with various religious leaders and activists were scheduled to lead a protest march at the headquarters of **Creative Artists Agency** and **William Morris Agency** in Beverly Hills last Friday. The protestors were to stage an illegal sit-in at CAA during the march, which was planned to draw attention to the BPA's \$700 million antitrust lawsuit against 40 major agencies and promoters. According to a press release, participants in the rally were to include the Rev. Joseph Lowery, activist Dick Gregory and New York-area politician Adam Clayton Powell IV.

**Boyz II Men** have not signed to **Magic Johnson's** newly formed management company as numerous reports have suggested. The vocal quartet released a statement early this month, saying the group and its manager, **Qadree El-Amin** of Southpaw Entertainment, have not struck any deals with Magic Johnson Management. A March 29th statement from Johnson's company incorrectly listed the Grammy-winning group and El-Amin as part of the firm. "Boyz II Men are comfortable with the management arrangement that we have in existence right now," singer Nathan Morris stated.

New York-based **Metropolitan Entertainment Group** extends its reach into Baltimore this summer after being awarded management and booking rights to the **Pier Six Concert Pavilion**. The city of Baltimore awarded the contract to MEG and its partner, real estate developer The Cordish Company. Scheduling of events for the 4,300-seat pavilion will begin immediately. David Geller, director of marketing and promotion for Pier Six, will serve as MEG's local promoter rep.

When the **Allman Brothers Band** departs on its 30th anniversary tour this summer, the veteran act's lineup will feature a new member. Nineteen-year-old blues sensation **Derek Trucks** will share lead guitar duties with Dickie Betts for the outing. Trucks will replace guitarist Jack Pearson, who is reportedly focusing on other projects. The tour will kick off June 12th at Red Rocks Amphitheatre outside of Denver.

A Kentucky judge has upheld a \$250 fine for a woman who last year attended a public festival sporting a **Marilyn Manson T-shirt**. The Manson affiliation didn't create the problem for Venus "Star" Morgan; it was the "I Am the God of F\*\*\*" slogan on the shirt that got her in trouble. Morgan wore the shirt to the Tater Days festival in Benton, Ky., and was later convicted of harassment and fined \$250 plus court costs. Her appeal of the conviction was denied April 2nd. Morgan's ACLU attorney said he would take the case to the state Court of Appeals with a claim that Morgan's T-shirt is protected as free speech.

The award-winning **Fairfield Four** will be among the honorees inducted into the **Gospel Music Association's Hall of Fame** on April 21st. The Nashville-based a capella group, formed in 1921, won last year's traditional soul gospel album Grammy for *I Couldn't Hear Nobody Pray*. Joining the Fairfield Four on the list of inductees are Billy Graham, the Florida Boys, The Cathedral Quartet, the Gaither Trio, Mighty Clouds of Joy, the Second Chapter of Acts, and George Younce.

Clainos claims BGP entered into many individual contract agreements with the free-lancer. "Sometimes our relationship with Ken was in writing and sometimes it wasn't," Clainos said.

But Friedman claims BGP has yet to produce any contracts. "If there was something in writing between us, it was requested through the courts," he said. "And it should have been part of [Clainos'] original lawsuit when he sued me."

The photographer fears this kind of dispute may be a bigger problem for the concert industry now that SFX is acquiring so many major promoters. "For them to step in and try and get the copyrights to all of the archives from any of these production companies, it's just one further step in controlling everything that's going on."

A trial date is scheduled for June 21st.

## Woodstock 1999

**D**ETAILS OF THE 30TH anniversary Woodstock festival, including a near-complete lineup, have been announced by event producers John Scher of Metropolitan Entertainment, Woodstock Ventures' Michael Lang and longtime U2 business associate Ossie Kilkenny.

The diverse list of acts includes rockers Aerosmith, Metallica, Limp Bizkit, Rage Against The Machine, Creed, KORN and Sugar Ray; hip-hop artists Ice Cube, Everlast and DMX; songstresses Sheryl Crow, Alanis Morissette and Jewel; jam bands Rusted Root, The Tragically Hip and Dave Matthews Band; and veterans George Clinton and Willie Nelson.

Other groups performing on one of the multiple stages during the July 23-25 event will be

The Chemical Brothers, moe., Fatboy Slim, Brian Setzer Orchestra, The Offspring, Los Lobos, Collective Soul, Counting Crows, Red Hot Chili Peppers, Guster, Foo Fighters, Live and Bush.

The exact schedule of when each band will perform has not been determined. Tickets cost \$150 for a three-day pass which includes camping access. They go on sale through Ticketmaster April 18th.

The mass gathering, banking on the wide appeal and success of its two predecessors, is expected to draw as many as 250,000 concert-goers to the former Griffiss Air Force Base in Rome, N.Y., located about an hour west of Albany. It is expected to pump about \$30 million into the area's economy.

The former military installation, renamed Griffiss Park, encompasses approximately 3,600 acres, with a 250-acre parcel in the center of the base slated as the camping site. There will be two main stages, a rave stage, multiple beer gardens, concession villages, arts and crafts displays, and a film festival.

Organizers have also secured an on-site hospital, 2,000 portable toilets, water, solid waste and sanitation systems, and stations for fire protection, transportation and communications. The lengthy runways, which once handled massive B-52 bombers, will be used for parking.

Lang and Scher fielded an array of questions about the upcoming \$30-million plus production during an April 8th press conference.

"We really went about booking this in a very similar fashion ... to

'94," Scher explained. "We were very careful and very slow in the process, meaning we identified acts that we thought were (musically) important to be on the festival.... We identified acts that we thought welcomed the spirit of Woodstock - cooperation, comradery."

More acts are expected to be announced as the festival grows nearer. Scher remarked that most of these artists will be on the "newer side," with some directed specifically for the rave stage.


"This isn't your parents' Woodstock," Scher said. "Our whole concept of this - it was in '94 and certainly seems to be of Michael's in '69 and certainly is in '99 - is that this is a music festival of artists that are relevant to the core audience that comes," he said, citing the late teens to late 20s population.

Arranging a lineup proved only to be one of many challenges in organizing this year's event. Considering the problems Scher and Lang encountered during the '94 festival, steps were made to alleviate any complications this time around.

"'94 was the first time it was attempted for 25 years. So for us, it was a big learning curve and the things that we really found were the things that we did right, I think," Lang said. "The things that we did wrong became very obvious to everyone, such as not dropping kids off in the camping area and having them deposit their tents in front of the stage - small mistakes like that."

Scher added, "We learned a lot of things, some of them were really almost governmental," referring to the Saugerties, N.Y., festival.

The synthesis of the acquisitions and integrations is a company that can provide ticketing to virtually anything requiring admissions – including museums, zoos, amusement parks and venues. It also facilitates the sale of tickets through its Web site, which features event listings, ticket auctions, and links or contact information to buy tickets from box offices, brokers and – even – Ticketmaster.

## Court Rules On Platters Pretenders

**A**FEDERAL APPEALS COURT has named Herb Reed “The Great Pretender,” granting the rights to The Platters name to the founder and last surviving member of the 1950s singing group.

The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals’ ruling ends a long-running feud between Reed and Martha Robi, widow of Paul Robi, who joined the group in 1954 and left when he was convicted on a drug offense in 1965.

In describing its task, the court said it was deciding “which party is ‘The Great Pretender,’” one of the group’s many hits, which also include “Only You” and “Smoke Gets In Your Eyes.”

As it happens with many veteran acts of years past, The Platters broke up during the ‘60s but separate touring bands with one or more original members subsequently

formed, each using a Platters-related name.

Federal courts upheld Robi’s right to call his group The Platters, the result of a lawsuit by a company that claimed assignments of rights from the original singers. Robi assigned the rights to his wife before he died and she continued to manage or license the name to a group calling itself The Platters, even though it had no original members.

When she sued Reed, a U.S. District Court judge ruled in 1997 that Reed’s rights to the name were superior to hers, a conclusion the appeals court upheld April 2nd in a 3-0 decision.

“Members of a group do not retain certain rights to use the group’s name when they leave the group,” the court said, citing previous rulings involving the groups Deep Purple, The Kingsmen, and The Buckingham.

Other rulings have concluded that a member who remains continuously with a group and is in a position to control its quality, such as Reed, keeps the right to use the name, even when that person is a manager rather than a performer, the court said.

It added that recognizing Reed’s rights to the name serves the public purposes of trademark-protection law.

“Allowing Martha Robi to organize a rival group called ‘The Platters’ and allowing it to perform

music as that group would lead to confusion among reasonable consumers,” a judge said in her ruling.

## Garth Keeps His Day Job

**T**HE CROONING COWBOY HUNG up his cleats recently and rode out of Peoria, Ariz., ending six weeks of spring training with the San Diego Padres.

Garth Brooks, who got his first RBI in 22 at-bats and helped the team finish the Arizona pre-season circuit with a 19-11-1 record, declined an offer to travel with the team as a non-roster player for the first month.

“We offered him a [Trevor] Hoffman deal, \$32 million for four years, but he said he could make that in a weekend, so he decided to shut her down,” said GM Kevin Towers on April 6th. The real reason,

Towers continued, was Brooks didn’t want to hinder the chances of a real ballplayer.

“I thought it was great,” Brooks said. “All my six weeks, all I wanted to do was contribute.”

Playing with the Padres meant more than the fulfillment of a boyhood dream, said Brooks, 37. He also jump-started his Touch ‘Em All Foundation, which earns money for kids’ charities based on players’ home runs, bases stolen and strike-out pitches. He said that 70 players, including Ken Griffey Jr., Roger Clemens, Kevin Brown, Andy Ashby, Larry Walker and Walt Weiss, have pledged to participate.

Brooks was invited to sing the national anthem at the Padres’ April 6th home opener, but his managers declined the offer on his behalf.

The Tennessee Highway Patrol discovered an open bottle of vodka in Jones' car, and two 911 calls reported Jones' vehicle swerving shortly before the crash. His family maintains he was talking on a cell phone at the time and that alcohol was not a contributing factor.

The district attorney presents the case to a grand jury next month.

## Pros On The Move

Universal Concerts welcomed **Buck Martin** as its new GM of the **Coors Amphitheatre** on April 5th. Martin recently resigned his post as VP of booking and event services at the Great Western Forum, where he had worked for 22 years.

A&R guru **John Kalodner** is starting his own imprint, **Portrait Records**, but says he's not interested in running the label. He told POLLSTAR that he's not ready to announce any artist or personnel roster details but said there will be a lot of "big hair" involved. That makes sense considering the acts that are rumored to be signing with Portrait: Damn Yankees, Cinderella, Great White, Ratt, and the smaller-coiffed Pat Benatar. Kalodner said he'll sign new artists, as well. Portrait product will be distributed by **Columbia**, and Kalodner will retain his position as senior VP of A&R at that label. He is said to be talking to Work Group executive Pam Edwards about heading the new venture.

**John Dotson** has joined **Brewman Music & Entertainment** in the newly created position of VP and GM/creative director. He will be responsible for copyright exploitation and the business administration of the publishing company. He will also continue representing his management roster, which includes Fiona Kernaghan and Dreaming In English. Dotson has previously worked at RCA, Arista and William Morris Nashville. He also worked as a tour manager for three years and as a manager for nine years, representing artists such as Steve Earle and Ricky Van Shelton.

**Mike Tyson** may have a job waiting for him when he gets out of prison. The boxer is reportedly going to start his own record label under the auspices of **Def Jam**. Tyson Records will focus on rap and R&B, and the heavyweight is said to want a hands-on role in the business. "Mike Tyson has always been looked upon as a magnet for talent," said Def Jam President Lyor Cohen. "The promotional opportunities are endless." According to news reports, two teen-age artists named Doni and Centell have signed on with the label.

## Manager's Bill Gets Lighter

**A** CALIFORNIA STATE LEGISLATOR is reevaluating a bill that would regulate artist managers much like the state regulates booking agents. Assemblywoman Sheila Kuehl (D-Santa Monica) said she plans to amend the bill she introduced so it would more specifically target unscrupulous managers, the *Los Angeles Times* reported.

The bill had added more stress to managers' lives because it proposed that they should be licensed as well as post a bond and record their agreements with artists. The assemblywoman said the issue of regulating all managers has been tabled for now.

This is a touchy subject for managers and agents because of the evolving role of managers as illustrated by the reemergence of Mike Ovitz. The former agent turned manager has all of the expertise and none of the regulations and fees.

Kuehl said the bill was intended to restrict managers who prey on aspiring actors who can't afford an agent. The bill stemmed from complaints by Los Angeles law enforcement officials that some young actors and parents of child actors were being exploited by managers who offered unrealistic promises and charged large fees.

Kuehl said she will continue to seek a crackdown on management fraud. The revised bill would require managers charging up-front fees to be contractually bound to offer refunds. ✪

**United Kingdom:** THE FESTIVAL season is well and truly upon us with V99 selling steadily; Glastonbury going on sale April 1; the Fleadh arriving soon; some of the names at the Cambridge Folk Festival announced this week, plus Reading due to reveal what promises to be a very hot bill in the next week.

The Fleadh (July 10) is the latest festival to reveal itself for the summer scene, complete with a classic lineup. The 10th anniversary Fleadh will feature Van Morrison, who also performed at the very first Fleadh, plus The Pretenders performing for the first time in three years, Barenaked Ladies, Afro Celt Sound System, The Saw Doctors, John Prine, Ron Sexsmith, Brian Kennedy, John Martyn and other bands on two stages. There will also be an assorted collection of new comedians for the third stage.

The initial response to the bill came via a flurry of overwhelming Internet sales. And a final "secret" headliner has yet to be revealed. This year sees the trans-Atlantic version of the Fleadh expanding, with four events spread across the U.S.

The Cambridge Folk Festival (July 30-August 1) is not on sale for another month, but names released so far are James Taylor, The Saw Doctors, Loudon Wainwright III, Oysterband, Hal Ketchum, and the Blind Boys of Alabama. Other artists are still being confirmed.

**Germany:** MARCEL AVRAM WAS released from jail one year into his three-and-a-half-year prison sentence.

The founder of Mama Concerts began serving his sentence in the spring of 1998; however, he had already served eight months during the investigation and repaid the sum owed to German tax authorities. The promoter was found guilty on 12 counts of tax evasion in December 1997 and was convicted of avoiding tax payment of around \$2.8 million between 1987 and 1994.

• TICKET SALES FOR THIS YEAR'S Hurricane Festival are three times higher than at the same time last

year, said promoter Guenther Linnartz at Scorpio. This, said Linnartz, is despite the fact that some people have criticised the bill for not being as strong as the previous two years. "But even so," he explained, "the advance sales obviously show that quite a lot of people now perceive Hurricane as a festival that has good bands and is good value for money."

The DM79 ticket price remains the same as last year. By comparison, it costs DM59 to see the Beastie Boys headline their own show. This festival ticket gives punters a package which includes Massive Attack, Marilyn Manson, Skunk Anansie, Bush, Stereolab, dEUS, and the Guano Apes among others.

Linnartz pointed out that the festival has only been on sale a month; last year it was announced before Christmas. "Last year, we had 40,000 people, and it isn't our intention to increase the capacity, but it can go up to 50,000 comfortably."

The new Southside Festival, a Hurricane co-promotion with MCT and Target, is also selling well in its first year, and the promoters are optimistic about a healthy turnout.

**Slovenia:** ALTHOUGH ONLY 1,000 kms from the Kosovo conflict, Slovenia's promoters say that the concert business is carrying on as usual. Igor Vidmar at Ropot has shows coming up with Bob Dylan and Alanis Morissette, and he is going ahead with bookings for a new summer festival, Alter 2000. Acts confirmed, so far, are Patti Smith and the Guano Apes.

Promoter Marijan Crnaric has recently set up a new company, Vynil, to handle promotions in Slovenia as he said the Croatian market is dormant for the moment. On the agenda this summer are two major co-promotions: Metallica with Ropot in Ljubljana in June and R.E.M. at Izola in July with Multimedia.

Crnaric is realistic about promoting in Slovenia, saying it is a short-term plan while Croatia's economy rebuilds itself. "I have to do business in Slovenia," he told POLLSTAR, "because salaries are higher and prices are cheaper. Slovenia is the most developed of the countries in this region and is on a par with the Czech Republic."

**Yugoslavia:** WHILE the international touring market waits with the rest of the world to see what happens in the war-torn Balkans region, one concert went ahead as scheduled two weeks ago. Local singer Gordana Trzan performed at a concert in Belgrade to protest the NATO air strikes.

Promoters in the region are taking things day by day, and fortunately, there has been no sudden boycott by U.S. artists travelling to Europe as there was during 1991's Gulf War.

At the Sava Centre in Belgrade, the next show on sale is Cubanismo, performing May 4, and Vanessa Mae is due to play June 6. Sava Centre chief George Milutinovic told POLLSTAR, "We are in daily or weekly contact with all the agents. Nobody has said no yet." When asked whether there was anti-American sentiment in the country, he said it was more a case of "anti-governmental feeling."

Promoters in other Balkans countries are not experiencing any direct effects at this stage, although they detect a certain degree of apprehension.

**Greece:** GREECE IS ONE OF THE countries that could suffer from the knock-on effect of geographical proximity to the Kosovo conflict. The Greek government has been vocal about proclaiming safety in the country, as some countries have given warnings to tourists not to visit Greece because of the war.

A Greek government spokesperson insisted, "Greece - we have repeatedly said - is not and will not become part of the problem. This crisis does not concern us but indirectly."

The United States recently issued a public announcement noting that the embassy in Athens had received threats. But it added that there have been no specific threats against American tourists.

Manolis Kilismanis at Anosi said that as far as the concert market is concerned, it is business as usual,

and the summer schedule is currently being confirmed. "During the Gulf War, bands thought Greece was too close to danger," explained Kilismanis. "But when they came, they saw that it wasn't a problem. In this case, it will depend on bands' understanding of the situation." Greece is a member of NATO and he stressed that there was no evident anti-American sentiment.

Anosi has confirmed Faithless for a May 15 concert, due to go on sale with Mike Oldfield, who will play Athens on July 19.

**Italy:** AS ONE OF THE CLOSEST countries to the Balkans crisis and the site of NATO bases involved in the conflict, Italy has promoters concerned, but they say that people are still buying tickets as they normally would. Claudio Trotta reported his best March in years, saying he had sold around 40,000 tickets in the last 10 days of the month for a range of shows around the country. He also said he has three sold-out Bruce Springsteen shows scheduled for this month.

Corrado Rizzotto at Indipendente is similarly buoyant, having upgraded a Cardigans show and about to go on sale with an Offspring date. At R&D, tickets continue to sell well for the Gods of Metal Festival.

Meanwhile, in Rome, the opening of the new Hard Rock Cafe was postponed, following an anti-war demonstration March 28, which resulted in smashed windows at the cafe. It is located opposite the U.S. embassy. No new opening date has been scheduled.

Sara  
Evans

**T**raditional country music is Sara Evans' first love. Her retro-sounding debut on RCA won her critical acclaim in Nashville and an Academy of Country

Music nomination for top new female vocalist. One reviewer even boasted, she's "so good, she's scary." However, that wasn't good enough for country radio.

While radio programmers admitted they loved Evans' music and thought she had star quality, they just couldn't overlook the fact that her songs weren't "commercial" enough for today's young, pop-happy country music listeners. Though Americana radio was receptive, Evans hoped her career would reach beyond that. So she set out to make the necessary changes.

"It was so tough not being successful at radio," she told POLLSTAR. "I was like, 'I'm not gonna be in this and just be an Americana artist and struggle because I want to tour.' That's my biggest love, to be on stage."

However, touring and touring in comfort are two different things. Evans knows that.

And she knows that radio can make or break her in that respect.

"With radio success comes offers and better paying gigs and also album sales, which allows you to tour more comfortably," she said. "So I made an effort to really get in the game and say, 'OK, I'm still gonna make a country record, but it's not gonna be so hard core where the fans aren't getting it.'"

The result: *No Place That Far*, Evans' sophomore release produced by Music Row veterans Buddy Cannon and Norro Wilson. "It's still country; it's just a little more contemporary," she said. It's an album that radio programmers were actually asking for.

With her first album, *Three Chords And The Truth*, Evans kept having to dodge the Americana stamp. "Although Americana is some of my favorite music, personally, it sort of hindered me at country radio," she said. "They look at it and say, 'Well, she's an Americana artist. She's too weird for us.'"

The "California sound" captured on that first record came with the help of Dwight Yoakam producer Pete Anderson. Apparently, commercial country was somewhat of an aversion to Anderson. Why? "It's because of Dwight," Evans said. "Dwight has kind of shunned radio. Pete has definitely shunned country radio." Evans didn't share that attitude, but radio programmers made assumptions based on the company she was keeping. "But I certainly didn't [dislike country radio]. I just love Pete, and I love his music."

Evans said it's too bad that program directors can't just play the music they like. "All the radio stations are bought up by these big companies, and then they hire consultants to tell them what to play; so it's more about promotion nowadays.

"But listen, I'm not grumbling because it's working for me right now, and I'm just really excited. I actually think they're doing a great job. I think we went through kind of a lull with some really bad music for a while, but I think the music is great right now."

The one place Evans doesn't have to worry about radio is on stage. That's where she can break out into her renditions of songs by legends like Patsy Cline or Hank Williams. "I can really do whatever I want in my live shows," she said. "I can do three or four old country songs and explain to the fans, 'This is another side of me that you haven't necessarily heard.'"

That's important because performing live and touring is what keeps Evans happy. See, the Missouri native is not the businesswoman type and never planned to have a full-time career. "I never wanted all that because I grew up on a farm, and if I wasn't a singer, I'd be a farmer. I'd just be at home having children and cooking.

"So when you get into this business, and you sign your deal, you realize that, 'I am a career woman.' So you kind of struggle against that. It's like, 'Ugh! I don't like this. All I want to do is be on stage. I'm a performer.' But so much of it is business, and you have to learn that."

No matter how much she'd like to be in denial about being a businesswoman, it turns out that Evans is actually a workaholic. "I make it my business to know exactly what's going on with everything, even as far as what color paper

my fan club letters are sent on. Just little details like that I think, 'Well, if you don't take care of it yourself, it may not get done the way you want it, and then you're going to be disappointed.'"

Not that Evans is alone in her quest for stardom. Between her two managers, Kip Krones and Brenner Van Meter; William Morris booking agent Keith Miller; a publicist; a business manager; a road manager; and a fan club

president, she's got plenty of help. And it's a good thing because she'll be taking some time off at the end of the year; she's expecting a baby in late August / early September.

Until then, Evans will stick to the road, touring behind *No Place That Far*, which has spent at least 12 weeks on the SoundScan album chart. She also joins country music divas Lorrie Morgan, Martina McBride and Mindy McCready in the CMT special "Girls Night Out." ✪


