# More Americans Believe Downloading Free Music Is 'Morally Wrong'

As of May 2003, some 50% of Americans aged 12-44 think that downloading music for free by way of the Internet is morally wrong. That's up from just 39% in 2002 and comes from a brand-new national survey of 12-44-year-olds conducted by Edison Media Research for release during R&R Convention 2003. The session will be held Thursday at 11:15am at the Beverly Hilton in Beverly Hills, CA. The data suggests that attitudes about file sharing may be starting to change. Among other interesting trends to emerge from this study: the number of downloaders who say they would not download music for free because they feel artists and record labels should be compensated is up from 5% to 14%; 12% of 12-17-year-olds who actively download music did not purchase a single CD in the last 12 months — a 15% increase in just one year; 61% of 12-17s have burned someone else's copy of a CD instead of buying their own copy, a 13% increase; 33% of downloaders say they would disable their file-sharing software if they received a pop-up message warning that they are at risk for legal penalties; the majority of 12-24-year-olds believe the music released by the record industry today is just as good as it used to be; and 8% of 12-24s say they are purchasing fewer music CDs because they are purchasing more DVDs instead.

#### **Deadline Set For Current Percentage Standard**

On May 13 **R&R** announced that it was setting a minimum standard of 25% current music airplay for its Country reporters. All but one reporter has indicated it would meet the guidelines. As we move forward with this new policy, **R&R** has set a deadline of July 14 for all reporters to meet and maintain that level of current airplay. Any reporter that has been consistently below 25% current prior to that date and is not at 25% current on that date (for music aired during the **R&R**/Mediabase chart week of July 6-12 will be removed from the **R&R** Country reporting panel.

Going forward, all **R&R** Country reporters will be evaluated on a three-week rolling average, during which time each station must maintain an average airplay ratio of 25% current music. After July 14, stations will be notified should they fall below that minimum on any given week. The event included speeches made by dignitaries including Florida Gov. Jeb Bush and Gen. Tommy Franks, as well as concert performances by Lee Greenwood, Ashley Gearing, Rebecca Lynn Howard, Chris Cagle, Darryl Worley, Charlie Daniels and Jo Dee Messina. WOYK PD Mike Culotta tells R&R, "It was a very emotional day. It kicked off with the dignitaries taking the stage. There was the national anthem, a prayer, the color guard and then speeches. Then Gen. Franks and the governor stepped down and talked to 'killed in action' families seated in front. During that, there was a scroll of all the names of those killed." Among the highlights, Culotta says, was when Jo Dee Messina finished her set and tried to get Franks to sing "America The Beautiful." Instead, he sang C.W. McCall's "Convoy" and the song "Is Anyone Goin' To San Antone." His wife was just shaking her head. "You could tell it wasn't the first time she had seen that performance," Culotta says.

#### R&R/Bullseye: The Threat Of Terror

This week's R&R Country Callout America by Bullseye two-part question has been in the field for a couple of weeks now, so it has an in-tab of 400 Country radio listeners ages 25-54, equally divided between males and females. The queries: "With the military action in Iraq and Afghanistan, the Israeli/Palestinian issues and general bad feelings toward the U.S. in the Middle East, do you think terrorists will strike inside the U.S. over the next year? And, on a scale of 1 to 5, with '1' meaning 'Not Safe At All' and '5' meaning 'Completely safe,' how safe do you feel against terrorist attacks in your home town?"

Of the total sample, 62% believe there will indeed be another terrorist strike within U.S. borders in the next 12 months. The high figure across cells and demos includes 70% of Females, and the low is 56% among Males. Country P1s seem to think there's a great risk, as 65% of them fell it will happen while 57%^ of the P2s think it's a possibility.

However, most people seem to think that someone else will be affected, as 74% say they feel either "very safe" or "somewhat safe" (an answer of either a four or a five). The highest percentage cell is for Men, 83% of whom said "very safe" (44%) or "somewhat safe" (39%). The lowest figures came in from P2s, females and 45-54s, with 70% in each cell responding with a four or a five.

Only 6% of the respondents say they "don't feel totally safe" (3%) or feel "Very unsafe (3%). The figures ranged from 2-4% across all sex and age cells.
