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Quantum Leap Of The Week Award Winner: Brian Jennings To WGAR

Jennings is the PD at Clear Channel's KZKX/Lincoln, Neb., which is market 176, but will vault to the company's WGAR/Cleveland, Ohio, market No. 25, on April 2. Actually, when we first got Brian on the phone, he said Lincoln was No. 175, but upon further investigation, it was discovered they'd been passed up, which sparked this involuntary reaction from Jennings: "New Bedford, Mass.? What's that &%#@ about?" So, I guess what we're already seeing is that WGAR has itself a rather competitive new PD! Jennings will take over the programming reins at WGAR following the promotion of Meg Stevens, who left late last year to program Clear Channel's WMZQ/Washington and WPOC/ Baltimore. Jennings has programmed KZKX since 2000 but joined the station in 1998. Prior to his move to Lincoln, Jennings worked at KSKG in Salina, Kan. from 1996-1998. He started his career in country radio as a part-timer at KZSN/Wichita in 1994. In an understatement, Jennings told R&R, "I'm really excited, this is a great opportunity." Jennings went on to talk about his initial plans for WGAR, saying, "I plan on spending the first month taking a lot of notes and listening to a lot of people. They know exactly what they're doing, and I have a lot to learn from them."

More Comings & Goings From The Programming Department

Well, that takes care of one major PD opening, so we wonder who'll end up at Cumulus' WSM-FM (The Wolf)/Nashville after the announcement late last week that **Buddy Van Arsdale** is moving on to program Cox's WKHK (K-95)/Richmond. Van Arsdale programmed The Wolf for the last year, coming from Cumulus sister KHAY/Oxnard-Ventura, Calif., where he was the PD and cluster OM. In Richmond, Van Arsdale will replace long-time country programmer Jim Tice, who was at WKHK since 2000, after a long and successful run at WZZK/Birmingham. Van Arsdale starts the new gig on March 26, calling WKHK "one of the greatest heritage stations in country radio." He'll report directly to VP/GM Bob Willoughby, who called Van Arsdale "a disciplined, veteran PD who



will be a great addition to the Cox Radio/Richmond programming team."

We love that term "a cup of coffee" when referring to somebody who stays a short time somewhere, but what exactly constitutes a "cup of coffee?" One month? Two? Perhaps we should ask **Cleveland Wheeler**, who exited Citadel's KBUL (The Bull)/Reno, Nev. after nine weeks as PD and OM for Citadel's Reno cluster. It was a change of scenery on many levels for Wheeler, a member of the legendary "Q Morning Zoo" at WRBQ (Q105)/ Tampa, what with the move to country and Reno at the same time. In the wake of Wheeler's departure, Nick Elliott, who already programs Top 40 KWYL and hot AC KNEV at the Reno cluster, will now assume OM duties. Additionally, Derek Gunn, who already wears two hats as MD and promotion director, will take on interim PD responsibilities for The Bull.

It was bad enough Wisconsin ended up with the No. 2 seed in the Midwest regional for March Madness, but even before that it was mayhem in Madison as Mark Grantin ominously e-mailed R&R to tell us, "WWQM and I parted company today. I am no longer the PD. I can be reached at mgrantin@charter.net or 608-575-9513." So now there's a PD opening at the Mid-West Family Broadcasting outlet, and the fun didn't stop in the PD's office. The WWQM morning show will be in a state of transition soon when Jennifer Powers leaves the program. She and afternoon driver Zach Rogers were co-hosting after the departure of Mickey Miller. No word on a new PD yet.

Now some huge news about a guy whose first name is Big: "Big" Frank Edwards already programs Clear Channel's KRYS/Corpus Christi, Texas, but he's so good, the company just gave him more stuff to do, namely programming talk clustermate KKTX. There's just not enough time in the day ... even for a guy called "big" ... to take music calls, so morning co-host Chris O'Brien will step up and handle the music hotline, while Edwards works on changing his first name to "Gargantuan" or something similarly immense.

This Week At Callout America

Trace Adkins is in rare air. "Ladies Love Country Boys" is the No. 1 song and the No. 1 passion song for the sixth consecutive week. A first for Callout America too.

Keith Urban's "Stupid Boy" is at No. 2 and is the No. 2 passion song. Females rank this song at No. 1; men rank it at No. 2, up from No. 7 last week. The strength for this song is with core 35-44s at No. 1; younger 25-34 listeners rank the song at No. 2.

Rascal Flatts roar into the top five with "Stand" ranking at No. 3, up strong from last week's No. 10, and as the No. 6 passion song, up from No. 8. Females rank the song at No. 2 and at No. 3 passion. Core 35-44s are the strength at No. 4, up from No. 11.


Billy Currington moves into the top five with "Good Directions" ranking at No. 5 and as the No. 10 passion song, significantly ahead of the radio spin chart. Men rank this song at No. 5; women rank it at No. 8; in the demos, core 35-44s rank the song at No. 6.

Brooks & Dunn move strong with "Hillbilly Deluxe" into the top 10 at No. 9, up from No. 18. The track is showing strong passion scoring and is ranked as the No. 3 "Like a Lot" song, up from No. 9. Men are the strength at No. 4, and, in the demos, younger 25-34s are strong at No. 3.

The growth song of the week is "Fore She Was Mama" from **Clay Walker**, which ranks as the No. 14

With a company named Adventure Radio, it's no shock it would transform a station called "Gator" into a "Lucky Dog." WGZR/Savannah, Ga. will keep on playing "Today's Best Country & All-Time Favorites," but add local artists from Georgia and South Carolina. It's not just the name, the entire lineup is turned inside out: PD Brad Hansen joins morning show host/MD Laura Anderson for the

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daily extravaganza called "The Howlin' Good Morning Show." **Matthew James** will do middays, and **Michael** "**Sandman**" **Sanders** moves into afternoons from AC WMEZ/Pensacola, Fla. Sanders told **R&R** he was "happy as a pig in s*#* to get back to a format that is passionate and moving forward." For those of you keeping score, in this story alone, we've now officially mentioned Gators, Dogs, Pigs and S*#*.

Sticking with an animal theme for a moment, there's another PD opening; this one at Keymarket Communications' WOGI/Pittsburgh, also known as "Froggy." I suppose technically, this isn't an animal, but more like an amphibian. No matter, the point is, you're a programmer, you like the color green, and this is market No. 23. VP of programming Frank Bell is looking for at least five years' experience, and you can send your stuff to him at this address: Keymarket of PA LLC, 100 Ryan Court, Pittsburgh, PA 15205. This reptilian chain reaction all started when WOGI PD **Mark Lindow** announced a return to his former stomping ground, Citadel's WSJR/Wilkes Barre, as PD. Lindow fills the vacancy created when former PD Jim Dorman exited last month.

Pepper Daniels was already director of country programming and now oversees country KKJG,



On The Charts:

Chesney Wears No. 1 Crown; 'Ticks' Has Big Week

Up 633,000 audience impressions, Kenny Chesney's "Beer in Mexico" (BNA) becomes his 11th No. 1, interrupting a two-week run atop the chart by Trace Adkins' "Ladies Love Country Boys" (Capitol Nashville). While Adkins' song is pushed to No. 3, Chesney's single makes 32.7 million impressions, with spins detected at each of the 123 stations monitored by Nielsen Broadcast Data Systems for chart tabulation. WUSN/Chicago contributes the most audience impressions during the tracking week (1.4 million), followed by KEEY/ Minneapolis (985,000). Up 186,000 impressions, KILT/Houston turns in the biggest gain on the R&R Country panel. Chesney first reached No. 1 when "She's Got It All" spent three weeks atop the chart in late summer 1997.

Chesney also takes top honors on the R&R Country Indicator chart, where "Beer" rises 2-1 (3,798 plays at 94 reporters).

Concurrently, **Brad Paisley**'s clever new single, titled "Ticks" (Arista Nashville), takes the R&R Country chart's fattest gain during its first full week of airplay (March 5-11). Up 5.2 million impressions, "Ticks" is also awarded Breaker status (spins detected at 60% of the panel for the first time) with plays at 81 monitored stations (50-30). Paisley's new song takes the Most Added trophy on the R&R Country panel with 44 adds and ties **George Strait**'s "Wrapped" (MCA Nashville) on the

R&R Country Indicator panel (42 adds apiece).


