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Winter '07 Ratings: Chicago Steady; Too Early To Say In L.A.

Winter 2007 results started rolling Monday, with Los Angeles and Chicago among the first noteworthy markets for country released. CBS Radio's **WUSN (US99)/Chicago** was down a bit 12+ from fall (3.3-3.1) but increased persons 25-54 (3.3-3.4). US99 PD **Mike Peterson** was very pleased with winter results, saying the radio station "continues to show great strength and consistency" in a world of "extreme market compression." Peterson pointed out that WUSN is ranked No. 2 nonethnic and is the No. 1-ranked nonethnic music station. The WUSN morning show with Lisa Dent and Ramblin' Ray are up two-tenths from the fall to a 3.7, ranked seventh overall; midday personality Trish Biondo is tied for eighth with a 3.5, while afternoon driver Drew Walker ranks fourth overall and No. 1 non-ethnic.

In SoCal, the story for Mt. Wilson Broadcasters **KKGO** (**Go Country 105**)/ **Los Angeles**, which flipped from classical KMZT (K-Mozart) on Feb. 26, isn't fully complete, although it did improve 0.6-0.8. According to KKGO PD **Mike Johnson**, the extrapolated first full month as a country station (March) was a 1.9 with a weekly cume of 562,000. 25-54 for March was 1.7. Johnson told **R&R**, "There are lots of smiles in West L.A. this afternoon." Commenting on the overall progress of Go Country, Johnson added, "We're very happy with where we are, and we have so many great things ahead of us; we're just very pleased." Meanwhile, CBS Radio's **KFRG** (**K-Frog**)/**Riverside**, which posted a huge 1.1 in Los Angeles in fall 2006, slipped to a 0.6 in winter '07.

It's Official In Philly: PPM Shows Bigger, Younger Cume

Bob McKay, PD of Beasley's **WXTU/Philadelphia**, is still wading through the piles of PPM data on his desk, but you won't find him complaining. Last Friday was rather historical, as Arbitron released the industry's first currency ratings from the industry's first electronic measurement system. Instead of quarterly measurement, ratings will now be delivered on a

monthly basis for persons 6 and older. While Philadelphia was the first market to go live with PPM, Arbitron plans to roll out the top 50 markets by 2010. Up next is Houston in June, followed by New York in December, then Chicago and Los Angeles in March 2008. So why is Bob McKay smiling? WXTU's cume of 834,000 is nearly double fall levels, and the station showed surprisingly strong numbers in younger demos, which McKay described as "noteworthy, because we'd never done that well." As McKay and others have pointed out during the testing for PPM, which first began in 2001, cume numbers increased significantly, while TSL — or AWTE (Average Weekly Time Exposed) as it is now referred to — has dropped. Still, according to McKay, while the comparable PPM number is lower than the diary methodology, WXTU had "the lowest turnover in the market" in that regard and ranks in the top five stations with persons 12+. Asked whether or not the first official PPM results met or exceeded his expectations, McKay told R&R, "I would say exceeded, because were are able to cultivate more young listening than ever before. That's meaningful." WXTU is Philadelphia's sixth-ranked station in persons 6+, with a weekly cume of 925,000 and a share of 5.5. Among other findings from Friday's PPM data, just over 96% of persons 6+ listened to radio in the course of a single week.

The Passing Of A Pioneer

After an extended illness, Irving Waugh died Friday, April 27 at the age of 94. Long associated with WSM/Nashville, Waugh joined the staff as a newsman and announcer in the 1940s, later joined the sales staff and eventually ran both the radio division and WSM-TV. He retired from the company in 1977. Waugh is credited with starting the Grand Ole Opry Birthday Celebration, which later spawned the annual Disc Jockey Convention, Country Music Month and the Country Music Association. In 1955, Waugh sold the Ralston-Purina Company a series of one-hour Grand Ole Opry specials, telecast on ABC-TV, which first brought the Opry to national television audiences. After recruiting Kraft Foods as a sponsor, Waugh helped the Country Music Association Awards show become the first music awards of any kind to be nationally televised. He served as executive producer of the CMA Awards show until 1993. Waugh was a longtime board member of both the Country Music Association and the Country Music Foundation and was a member of the International Radio and Television Executive Society, the Hollywood Radio and Television Executive Society.

Church is a former athlete at South Caldwell, but the next time he's in the stadium, on May 20, it'll be with his band to play a benefit for the school, featuring material from his debut album on Capitol Nashville, "Sinners Like Me."

Willie Nelson and his tour manager, David Anderson, avoided jail time last week when they pleaded guilty to a misdemeanor count of marijuana possession. You may recall back in September, Nelson; Anderson; Nelson's sister, Bobbie; and two drivers were cited during a commercial vehicle inspection. 


