'A Great Loss For Country Music'

That's how Dierks Bentley summed up the passing of Porter Wagoner, who died Sunday evening (Oct. 28) in Nashville at the age of 80 after being released to hospice care on Friday (Oct. 26). Wagoner had entered the hospital on Oct. 15 and was diagnosed with lung cancer. 2007 was quite a year for the country music icon and Hall of Famer. In May, Wagoner celebrated his 50th year in the Grand Ole Opry. Pete Fisher, VP/GM of the Opry, said the Opry family of musicians and performers was deeply saddened by the news: "His passion for the Opry and all of country music was truly immeasurable." After years without a recording contract, Wagoner signed with ANTI-Records, an eclectic Los Angeles label best known for alt-rock acts like Tom Waits, Nick Cave and Neko Case. The CD "Wagonmaster," produced with Marty Stuart, was released in June 2007 and earned Wagoner some of the best reviews of his career. Over the summer, he also was the opening act for the influential rock duo The White Stripes at a sold-out show at New York's Madison Square Garden. At the time, Wagoner told the Associated Press, "I was thinking while on stage last night, 'This is the biggest, most well-known arena in the country, and here I am performing at it.'

Missouri-born Wagoner signed with RCA Records in 1955 and joined the Opry in 1957. He hosted his own syndicated TV show for 21 years beginning in 1960. In 1967, he introduced the world to Dolly Parton; together, they went on to become the Country Music Association's duo of the year in 1970 and 1971. In a statement today, Parton said of Wagoner, "I went over on Sunday afternoon and spent his last few hours with Porter and his family, so I was able to say goodbye. I sang for him and prayed with him. It felt good that I had the opportunity to say goodbye properly. His family is very grateful to everyone for all their help." Wagoner is survived by three children: Richard, Debra and Denise. Late this afternoon, details about Wagoner's funeral were announced. Visitation will be Wednesday (Oct. 31) from 2-8 p.m. at the Woodlawn Funeral Home at 660 Thompson Lane in Nashville.



Today's Last Word

As we've passed along the news of one superstar performer after another for the 41st annual CMA Awards show, happening Nov. 7 in Nashville, Ken Johnson, who programs the Open Road Channel for XM Satellite Radio, has been asking, "What are they thinking?" Here's Ken:

"It's a shame that the Country Music Association has chosen to ignore the accomplishments of those who have significantly contributed to the rich heritage of country music. It's no secret that the country music recording industry has actively pushed veteran performers into the background at every opportunity, but it now appears that those who control the content of the CMA Awards Show have also forgotten whose shoulders they stand upon.

"For the first time since the CMA Awards program was televised in 1968, there will be no acknowledgment of the new Country Music Hall of Fame inductees. During a three-hour program that includes not one, but two Rascal Flatts performances and an abundance of unknown country wannabes and rock has-beens, the CMA and ABC-



TV cannot spare a few precious minutes to acknowledge the induction of Mel Tillis, Ralph Emery and Vince Gill. That's right, not even Vince Gill who hosted the CMA Awards Show 12 times!

"The earliest days of the televised CMA Awards was a one-hour program on NBC-TV's Kraft Music Hall. Even within that tight schedule, a segment was reserved to honor the newest Hall of Fame members. It proved to be some of the original 'reality TV.' Lured to the broadcast under the pretense of honoring another performer, the look on the inductee's faces as their name was announced was absolutely priceless. It's because that honor means so much. Hall of Fame membership is the ultimate recognition for a lifetime of work that has significantly impacted country music and influenced a new generation of artists.

"In recent years, the stature of this honor has been diminished by the CMA. When Carl Smith was inducted, he was only allowed to wave his hat at the TV camera from his seat in the audience. What happened to the reverence and importance that this special honor embodies? Can you imagine the Academy Awards acknowledging their Lifetime Achievement Award winner in such a disgraceful fashion or choosing to exclude the recipient from their televised program?

"The Country Music Hall of Fame building in Nashville is an impressive facility. It archives the precious history of the music of America's working class. But it would not exist were it not for the contributions of the important men and women who have left their indelible mark on the industry and in our hearts. Why the CMA has now chosen to ignore them is unforgivable. Swift Logs Third Top 10; Cyrus Repeats Most Added On Indicator Panel

Newcomer **Taylor Swift** collects her third consecutive top 10 on the R&R Country chart as "Our Song" (Big Machine) gains 1.7 million audience impressions and jumps 13-10. In doing so, Swift becomes the third solo female this decade to score three straight top 10 singles from a debut album. **Gretchen Wilson** became the decade's first such artist when she competed in the top 10 with "Redneck Woman," "Here for the Party" and "When I Think About Cheatin'" (2004-05). "American Idol" winner **Carrie Underwood** followed Wilson's feat with four top 10 songs from "Some Hearts" (2006-07).

Swift's new single also marks her quickest top 10 climb, as she reaches that part of the chart in 11 weeks. Her debut single, "Tim McGraw," needed 24 weeks, and "Teardrops on My Guitar" cracked the top 10 in its 20th chart week.

While **Brad Paisley**'s "Letter to Me" (Arista Nashville) encores as the Most Added title on the R&R Country list (21 adds), **Billy Ray Cyrus** (with **Miley Cyrus**) narrowly edges Paisley's tally on the R&R Country Indicator scorecard. Cyrus' "Ready, Set, Don't Go" (Walt Disney/Lyric Street) is that chart's Most Added title for a second week (28 adds), just ahead of Paisley's 27 adds with "Letter."
