

After midnight in the streets of London's Soho or Kensington districts, kids just walk around aimlessly, looking, I suppose, for something tangable to know and understand, something that makes any kind of sense. I guess the kids here have a lot in common with their cousins in other parts of the world."

I asked BARRY for his thoughts on the British group scene...."Over here, I've seen the best groups in the world, and in general the bands are more ambitious, so much so that a lot of throat cutting and back stabbing goes on, more than would be expected. Most of the groups I have met were friendly and openly expressed what seems to be the common objective - to go to America and 'clean up'!"

A note to those people who like advance information on the big names of the future. Remember the name THE MOVE. We caught their act the other night in a Soho club and WOW. Five members in this group consisting of three guitars a drummer who can sing a low "E" and a vocalist with a fantastic voice, put on a stage performance such as I have never seen. Their closing number, "Watch Your Step" lasts 18 minutes and features a five minute drum solo and guitars being "cross played" and then chorded with a violin bow. It has to be seen to be believed.

This is an all-Canadian show, this year, and is drawing over 2500 teenage fans each night. This is the third year for C-FUN's Ex activity and says Red, "It's bigger and better. Much of this is due to the popularity of the Canadian talent.

Rick Honey is the new afternoon swinger at CJRL, as well as the teen rep for Northwestern Ontario. CJRL is an affiliate of CKPR in Port Arthur and like this Lakehead station is interested in boosting the best in Canadian discs. One of the latest CT releases high on the Kenora list is "The Lion Sleeps Tonight" by The Townsmen. Says Rick, "Watch it go all the way to the top". Another Canadian release making it in this area is "We've Got A Groovy Thing Going" by Wes Dakus on Capitol.

CHUM-FM CELEBRATES THIRD ANNIVERSARY



For those interested in keeping tab on the day to day programming CHUM-FM publishes, monthly, their Fine Arts Radio Programme Guide, obtained through their subscription services.




