

Three members from the old Banff Playboys moved into Nelson and formed this new impact group which will be touring the interior of British Columbia.

The Ugly Ducklings dropped into the CJRL studios in Kenora on their way back from the west and were interviewed by Rick Hamilton. They've just released their first Yorktown LP.

Garry notes that he was pleased to see that The Staccatos are still keeping up with their image of putting on an outstanding show. The "Let's Run Away" group played the Brockville area for three days and have an open invitation to return. Another group that's real popular are The British Modbeats from St. Catherines, Writes Garry "They had the patrons of the Tiki Club spellbound with their very polished showmanship. Performance-wise I would have to say that they are the top of the class."



The Bathurst folks were without their usual morning habit, CKBC, because of a fire at their transmitter site. At 9 AM, Nov. 30, the alarm rang in master control which indicated that the station was off the air. The remote control system couldn't rectify matters so engineer Paquet hustled over to the transmitter site and found the coupling house and main tower in flames. Firemen put the blaze out in minutes but the equipment suffered extensive damage which cut the operating power of CKBC in half. They were back on the air within an hour but won't be back to full power for a couple of weekS. Denis Menard flipped the Nancy Sinatra single "Sugar Town" and found great reaction to "Summer Wind" which is sung by Nancy's

writer and producer, Lee Hazelwood. Nancy sings the melody with him.

Pete Borbely of CHOW Welland has incorporated an hour featurette in his show known as "The Nosey Hour". Listeners give him a call and jaw a little (he has a time limit on each call). Pete finds this gives him a chance to know the wants of his listeners and besides that they enjoy being on the air, which adds to the drawing power of the station. "Grizzly Bear" by The Youngbloods has been getting great phone reaction at CHOW as has "Talk Talk" by The Music Machine.





Nice to hear from our cousin Hank. Secord at CKRM in Regina writes to tell me that he feels the Capitol folks are leaning on the wrong side of the new Diane Leigh single. "Two Shades of Blue" is the favoured side in Regina. Well it just goes to prove that Diane must have two very strong sides. Play them both. Hank also tells me that the Regina based Soundaround Records will have some country goodies in the New Year. Also a few Regina raves for the Irwin Prescott waxing of "Chew Tobacco Rag". Thank you Hank for the good western words. Let's hear more from the west.

Up in Aylmer, Ontario, Bruce Shaver, of Bison Records, sends along some notes on the new Odie Workman record that has been released for Bison by Sparton. The side is "Take This Heart Of Mine", and it is already showing up on my chart. Bruce mentions that CJOB-FM and CHOK are just a few stations that are programming Odie's record. How about you other cousins jumping on the haywagon? Something I didn't know was that Steve Glenn of CHOK Sarnia was picked No. 1 Country disc jockey for 1966/67. Congratulations Steve.

If any of you are interested in joining an association that promotes country music and all Canadian music, you should drop a note to APCM, 102 Avenue Road, Toronto. They'll put you on the mailing list for all the information. If you believe in Canadian country music, you should join up.

That Melbourne single by Bob King, "Working On The Country Road" is really starting to get the spins. Bill Sweet's "Town and Country" playlist gives it a whopping big No. 7.

Well, Russ Vernon is fed up with what's been going on in the Calgary and area country scene and he's heading for the U.S. So if you record folks have been sending Russ, new releases. STOP. Russ tells me it's a real sad scene in Calgary. There's only 3¼ hours of country picking and that's from a six station city. Ellie tells me Calgary is having problems with the teen sounds as well. What's going on in the home of the world's greatest Stampede? Bill Pudifin sends news from CFGM of the great success they are having with Canadian country talent. Besides including the new discs on their regular playlists, they are also presenting a Canadian talent hour every Saturday at 8 PM. The hour is made up of two segments, the first is a half hour of Canadian country singers and instrumentalists, on record; the second is devoted to live Canadian talent. They feature a different guest artist every week backed by a live band. This is the second of a 13 week presentation. On the completion of the first series, CFGM supplied listeners with a fine photo brochure of the artists that had appeared on the series. The Country Gentlemen have been programming "Gonna Catch My Breath" from the new Jimmy James Arc album, "With A Song For You". Reaction has been good and Bill feels it has great single potential.

Joan Ziegler, manager of Sayer's in Islington, gives top billing to Donovan's "Yellow" with "Renee", "Clarksville" and Sledge's "Tears Me Up" backing up good sales as well. Dove's "Cry" is starting to happen along with Sandy Posey's "Single Girl". The Standells are showing good form with their "Why Pick On Me".

Louise Giroux, hit buyer for Sherman's Rack Sales in Ottawa, reports "Mellow Yellow" and the Monkees "Believer" as top sellers. The Chicago Loop are also coming on strong with "She Comes To Me". Simon and his friend and their "Hazy Shade of Winter", ? and The Mysterians look good. A real strong item is "Talk Talk" by The Music Machine with the Association's "Heebie Jeebies" starting to pick up action. Top selling LP is "Winchester Cathedral" followed closely by The Monkees, Mama's and Papa's and Dr. Zhivago.

"Mellow Yellow" is also the big item at Jerome's in the Lakehead. Janeen Marczak also lists "Time After Time" and "Talk Talk" as top sellers. Two gals getting action in the north are Sandy Posey and Nancy Sinatra. The Chicago Loop, Animals and Wilson Pickett are beginning to show.

Paul Misener has been having a run on the new Simon and Garfunkle album, "Parsley Sage & Rosemary". Jim Reeves' Christmas LP is the top selling Christmas item at Paul's Alliston store. Nancy Sinatra's "Sugar Town" is followed closely by Sandy Posey's "Single Girl''. The Cyrkle, Animals and Music Machine are moving well ahead. The British Modbeats have broken into the Alliston area with their "Love's Just A Broken Heart". Another Canadian group seeing action are the Ugly Ducklings with their "Just In Case".

Dell Bown reports great action on the Monkees "Believer" as well as their LP. "Summer Wine" and "Stop Stop Stop" are also moving well. The Scoundrelz "Heartbreak Hotel" and another great Canadian group, The Esquires with "A Multitude Of Sins" are both catching good action.



# USA

The Mae West legend has been bolstered by another great album which makes two in the one year. Her first "Way Out West", on Capitol brought Miss West to the attention of the teenagers with meterial like "Shout" and "Daytripper". Her latest, "Wild Christmas" which was also produced by David Mallet, is again a masterpiece of bringing the blues, rock and the twenties closer together. Miss West, now 74, takes on the old Presley number "Santa Bring My Baby Back To Me" and does it as if it were written for her. Other selections include "Santa Baby", "My New Years Resolutions" and "Put The Loot In The Boot, Santa". Although it's a little late for this Christmas, the album will no doubt become an evergreen. 

polls. In addition, they were voted into three second places in the singles tallies. No other act achieved a comparable combined rating. Stones Mick Jagger and Keith Richard, who have written most of the Stones material, have just signed a new three year publishing deal which guarantees them \$1,000,000. Also from Grevatt comes news of the move to newer quar-



ters of Musicor Records. Their new location on West 55th. St., also houses their newly acquired New York distrib, Trinity Record Distributors of Hartford. An eight track custom studio is on the drawing boards with hopes for completion of the studio, in the rear of the building, in early 1967. Ren also sends news that Roy Orbison is off to England on a rush visit to star in the first show of the New Year for British Television's "Sunday At The Palladium". Orbison's big hit across the pond is "There Won't be Many Coming Home" which was just released a couple of weeks ago and is already in the Top 20. Orbison heads down under for several appearances in Australia and New Zealand and returns to the UK for a five week tour of England and Ireland in February. More Grevatt news has it that Bobby Goldsboro, who is currently making it with "Blue Autumn", has been laid up in his home town of Dotham Alabama, with strep throat. Bobby hopes to be well enough to make his appearance at the San Remo Festival as well as appearances in England and France.



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The BEACH BOYS have just left Britain after a whirlwind tour of this island which fans will not forget for some time to come. The boys will likely be back here next year.

Another top act to set Britain on fire was the FOUR TOPS who did a two performance only visit to London two weeks ago. The success of this group is a tribute to the general success of the TAMLA MOTOWN sound in Britain.

Meanwhile in New York, DUSTY SPRINGFIELD'S opening night at Basin Street was marred due to the reported dispute between band leader BUDDY RICH and Dusty over top billing. Dusty's contract reportedly has her as undisputed top billing, but Mr. Rich obviously felt this was an injustice to himself and he is reported to have made a mess of the big opening by keeping Dusty waiting for 21/2 hours while he introduced celebrities in the audience and by apparently refusing Dusty proper rehearsal time with the orchestra. From what we can gather though, press reviews were full of praise for Dusty despite the messed up opening.



Producer is Bernard Cowan of NYC///Toronto's Passing Fancy are getting set to debut their Columbia waxing of "I'm Losing Tonight" and "A Passing Fancy"///The Guess Who have just released one of their strongest Quality singles to date. "His Girl" and "It's My Pride" has been picked up by R & B Discs (England) for release in Europe and the UK. Also from Quality comes "Girl In The Window" and "Born Of Hate" by the Winnipeg based Eternals. This release is pending, state-side. The group is managed by Terry Morris, of the Peg///Bob Harrington's Reo single "Changes" has been picked up by. BGM Industries Del Discos S.A. for release in South America. They've also taken on the Barry single of "How Does That Grab You Darlin" (Ukranian) by Gloria Kaye///The French Canadian market is buzzing with the acceptance of two very strong Quality outings. ## YEAR END EDITORIAL

Perhaps this would be a good time to look back on the past three years and what has happened to the Canadian music industry. Three years ago, the Canadian public seldom heard a Canadian-made record. Their entire interest was focused on the great U.S. record production centres. England was only brewing up the storm that was to come. Canada was practically standing still in the record business. A few artists were buying their backgrounds in Nashville. The \$1.98 Canadian country "quickies" were making a dollar or two, and occasionally a local "thit" would rear its head and sell a couple of thousand.

Today, Canadian record buyers are looking to Canadian recording artists as stars. If you have any doubts about this (as I have had up until recently) then you would be most interested in the reaction to the RPM 100 chart (which promotes domestic product and reports on Canadian music) and the great interest in the RPM Starline Photo Album. Today, RPM is being subscribed to by teenagers who, two years ago, didn't know nor cared less about who the Canadian stars were.

It is doubtful that Canadian programmers or record companies can fully appreciate what has happened, and the potential of the bomb we are sitting on. The Canadian music industry is ripe. It is far bigger than we can appreciate. If given the opportunity, Canadian artists and Canadian recordings could make a major breakthrough into the international market. The sound was always here. Constantly there have been good producers making great records with good Canadian compositions. The artist who, today, walks into a studio is a better musician in many cases than many of his foreign counterparts. Less bad product comes out of Canada than many other countries. Canada still experiences the "rush into the studio" productions, but more and more experienced people are looking after the A&R functions and more and more Canadian recordings are becoming "in demand" for world release.

In '67 the eyes of the world will turn to Canada. Our Centennial year will make it easier to interest the world in Canadian music. The newly formed Association for the Promotion of Canadian Music will do a great deal to ballyhoo our domestic product. The Centennial and Expo themes will be broadcast throughout the world. Canada's newly equipped and modern recording studios will assist in creating an even better sound. In its growing pains, the industry has found reason to unite to fight for its survival and the results will be beneficial.

As a further indication of the forward move, RPM has grown into a consumer magazine. Soon the story of the artists, the disc jockey, the record man and the entire industry will be known by the record buyer. Your RPM ads will reach out to thousands. There is no doubt....the industry is ON THE WAY!!!!!



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
