

Smile attempts blocking of U.S. release in Canada

In an unprecedented move, a Canadian record company, has made moves to restrict the Canadian release of a record. Dave Coutts, president of the Smile Music Group (Toronto) has approached Lenny Silvers, president of Amherst Records, and asked that there not be a simultaneous Canadian/ U.S. release on J.C. Mahoney's Has Anybody Seen America. Published through Maple Creek Music (BMIC), the single was released in Canada on the Smile label last year by the writer, J. Ian McLean. The single was an RPM "Pick" and it was described by RPM as being "the most powerful international record to ever come out of Canada"

Canadian programmers however, weren't "tuned in" to a record, "written by a Canadian about America", and the record stiffed after only a few weeks.

The Mahoney single, produced by Gary Mallabar at A&M in Los Angeles with backup by the Paul Williams' band, is scheduled for a June 25 release in the U.S., and would apparently be perfect timing for this U.S. election year.

Coutts is asking for a hold on the Canadian release (on the Amherst label) "until it gains some acceptance by U.S. programmers and is proving itself therebefore trying to convince Canadian programmers to play it."

Montreal's Gallant pacts with Toronto's Attic Records

Patsy Gallant, considered one of Quebec's superstars, has signed a recording contract with the Toronto-based Attic Records. Ben Kaye, Gallant's manager, explained the reason for signing with Attic as: "Although Patsy has been a star in Quebec for several years, we felt that the true impact of her talent has not been felt in the rest of Canada and the international market. We went with Attic because of their aggressiveness and their belief in Patsy's abilities."

Tina Charles to P.Q. for promotion junket

With her Columbia single, I Love To Love, topping the giant CKGM chart and her album, under the same title, one of the hottest selling in the province of Quebec, Britain's Tina Charles flew into Montreal on a promotion junket and to pick up Columbia Gold for her single.

Montreal discos and Varietes Musicales have done it again. The single was an overnight smash and chalked up sales in excess of 50,000 in a short space of time. Local radio stations discovered the single and, at press time, cash registers have coughed up a phenomenal 150,000 sales for the single.

Montreal's Disco Pool, servicing more than 75 of the city's discos, was instrumental in the success of the single which has now spread into the Ottawa area and is beginning to surface in Toronto. Attic's Tom Williams stated: "Obviously, being a small company we only sign people who we feel can make it in the international marketplace." continuing with "Of all the people we have talked to in Quebec, Patsy is the artist with the most potential for the international scene."

Initial release will be a single, From New York to L.A., produced by Ian Robertson. A French single by the talented bilingual artist will follow within the next few weeks.

Columbia Canada got an edge on their U.S. parent firm with a Canada first release for the group's new album, More Than Ever. The single, from the LP Boulevard (to be released late this month) was recorded at Eastern Sound and produced by McLauchlan and Finkelstein. It features McLauchlan's new band, the Silver Tractors, consisting of Dennis Pendrith, bass, Gene Martynec, guitars, Jon Andersen on drums and Ben Mink, mandolin and violin. The band was showcased for the first time at the Maple Leaf Gardens Olympic benefit show June 11.

A&M appoints new promo on West and East Coasts



A&M Canada has appointed two new sales and promotion reps, for B.C. and the Maritimes. Charlie Argall, with three years of A&M experience behind him, will be the label's first resident representative in the Maritimes. He will service all radio stations and accounts

from a Halifax base.

Similar duties will be covered in B.C. from a Vancouver base by Richard Broden, who has been an A&M Toronto area sales rep for the past two years.

The announcement was made by Joe Summers, National Marketing Director.

Hill hits airwaves on Montreal radio

Dan Hill returned from his tour of the U.S. east coast with a date at Montreal's Golem Coffeehouse. Hill, with bassist Alan Soberman, taped one of the four nights' shows for CJFM 96, broadcast later that

Continuing through Sept 18, the Festival, created by Negin, will also showcase Jeanna Glass' Artichoke starring Francis Hyland (Aug 2) and Suddenly Last Summer, which will star Toby Robins (Aug 30).

Susan Jacks to Polydor **Terry Jacks to produce**

Susan Jacks has signed to Polydor Canada.

Polydor's Sali Murphy reported that, as part of the new deal, Jacks will be produced by Terry Jacks, for the first time in four vears.

Her first release for the label will be the single, Memories Are Made Of You, recorded at Little Mountain Sound in Vancouver with Terry at the helm.

As to the renewed Poppy business relationship, Murphy quotes Susan Jacks as "I think it's great to be working tosaying, gether, motivating one another and generating new ideas. Although we keep our personal lives separate, we talk openly and relate well. We've both grown immeasurably in the last few years."

Terry Jacks' single, In My Father's Footsteps, was produced at Little Mountain not Can-Base as reported earlier.

Rollers get platinum at free 'CHUM rock fest

The Bay City Rollers, in town to record their latest LP, are slated to appear at Toronto's City Hall square for a special presentation from Capitol Sunday June 27.

At press time, plans were for the group to arrive onstage following a free outdoor concert featuring Sweet Blindness, sponsored by CHUM as part of a summer concert series.

As "special guests" of CHUM, the Rollers will be presented with Canadian Platinum awards by Arnold Goswich for their LPs Bay City Rollers and Rock 'N' Roll Love Letter.

The group is not expected to perform, but upwards of 100,000 fans were expected. according to CHUM's Roger Ashby, who reports that special precautions will be made by Metro police and City Hall security to keep the crowd in order.

In a Capitol press release, Karen Ball reports that the Rollers "have been overwhelmed by the generosity and patience of their Canadian fans during their stay in Toronto," and that their LP is close to com-pletion "thanks to the understanding and restraint shown by both fans and media.

Boule Noire's debut disc is number one in Quebec

Quebec's Boule Noire has topped the charts in that province with their first single release, Aimes-tu La Vie Comme Moi. The LP from which the single is taken has held top chart positions in Quebec for several weeks. Les Disques Parapluie reports over 60 stations in Quebec programming the single, plus airplay on Toronto's CHUM-FM, CBC radio, and KJAN Lafayette, Louisiana.

Boule Noire is George Thurston, vocals; Graham Chambers, drums; Jimmy Oliver, bass; David Bendeth, guitar; Zeek Gross, sax; and Robbie Vale, keyboards.

The group will be performing at the Olympics next month as part of a Quebec tour, and negotiations are underway with Music Shoppe to bring them to Toronto in August.

Boule Noire's next single, Loin Loin De La Ville, was shipped June 14.

Montreal pop giant CKGM playlisted the song the same week, a somewhat unusual move for the mainly English-language station. The station has been airing several French discs this year, for the first time, but the new Boule Noire single marks the first French song aired not already wellestablished by the French media.

Toronto retailers, press and radio VIPs had an opportunity to break bread in one of the city's better-known eateries, had a sneak listen to the Good Brothers' new album and sat in on a CHUM-FM "live" broadcast of the bluegrass group at the El Mocambo.

The memorable June 16th date included a bus trip in the well-appointed Big Mac bus, courtesty of MacDonald's, which dropped the unsuspecting industry tourists off at MacDonald's newest Toronto location. after a healthy fare of Big Macs, fries, shakes, apple pie and coffee, the junket headed for the El Mocambo and their night cap. RCA's vice-president and general manager, Ed Preston, was on hand for the full evening along with his promotion crew, Linda Dawe and Johnny Murphy and the label's publicity gal, Marghi Cocks.

That same weekend (Saturday) saw a "live" A&A window display by the Goods who performed for a capacity store and helped chalk up a healthy sales day for the downtown store.

The Goods are currently making good inroads on MOR and country playlists with their initial single release, That's The Kind of Man I Am, and are now enjoying good sales on their album, which was actually previewed at the recent Bluegrass '76 Festival in Carlisle, Ontario.

Tin Pan Canada?

How Canada's top publishers work

Of the thousands of Canadian songs written each year, only a few dozen ever hit the charts. Having a song that returns money is the work of music publishers.

Among Canada's more than 2,000 registered music publishing firms, there are a few dozen major, active firms dividing the lion's share of the music publishing dollar pie, which now stands at between \$4' and \$5 million a year.

Publishing firms vary in structure and activity. The five nominees for the recent RPM Readers' Poll Award for the publisher doing the most for Canadian music exemplify five different types of active publishing firms, all successfully "placing" songs from their catalogues on the hit lists.

April-Blackwood is the international publishing arm of a major international label, Columbia. The Attic Publishing Group is wholly-owned by the independent, Canadian Attic Records. Chappell is one of the world's oldest music publishers, recently taken over by a major international label, Polydor. Early Morning Music is the artistowned catalogue of Gordon Lightfoot's compositions._Quality Records, the only Canadian-owned "major" label, has two publishing firms (Shediac, CAPAC; Qualrec, BMIC).

Two big factors have contributed to

more than doubling the size of the performance royalities earned by publishers since 1969. The first, of course, is the CRTC regulations requiring radio stations to play at least 30% Canadian records (which may or may not have Canadian composers).

As Canada has become a larger record market, international publishing firms have come to treat more seriously the ownership and administration of Canadian rights to their copyrighted music, and they now almost always deal with Canadian publishers to represent them here. Previously, the Canadian rights where often lumped with the U.S.

Armed with catalogues of Canadian and foreign compositions, Canadian publishers are the only segment of the industry through which all music must pass; and their job is to pass it on primarily to record producers.

"Publishers," says Columbia A&R and producer Bob Gallo, "are the only people I'll let through the door. I need hit material, and that means starting with a good song with mass appeal."

Canadian publishers make their most money from placing songs by composers on their Canadian roster or having Canadian acts "cover" (songs already recorded by another writer) or place foreign songs in

Canada. An important and consistent source of income is the money made administrating foreign catalogues, songs from which are sold and airplayed here on foreign and Canadian-produced records.

In a subpublishing or administrative deal, involving a foreign catalogue, a publisher may get anywhere from a low of 7½ per cent of the publishing income for simple administration to a 50 per cent split for placing a cover of the song with a Canadian recording act.

To place songs, Attic's Al Mair says, "I don't just knock on doors; I concentrate on the artists who matter."

Capitol A&R chief Paul White, stressed the importance of knowing the artists who are "buying" material. Capitol is one of the bigger consumers of hit material in Canada, with at least two major artists -Anne Murray and Suzanne Stevens, who write none of their own songs.

There aren't many Canadian artists buying Cancon material right now. Most write their own, and those producers who buy are often looking for the strongest music possible, whether it was written here or not.

Every one of the five RPM Readers' Poll nominees has good international representation. April-Blackwood is part of their PUBLISHERS continued on page 11

The Vic Franklyn Show indie produced for '76

Toronto's William F. Cooke Television, a new independent production house, is entering the Canadian TV variety syndication game with a 26-show Vic Franklyn series, to be shot with a live audience at Toronto's 400-seat Ramada Inn (Zodiac Club) this summer and fall.

Produced by director Ron Meraska and writer Ian Anderson, the half-hour programmes will feature the rising Franklyn in both a short-hair casual and black tie image, using his easy-going direct audience appeal. The producers plan a mixture of Franklyn sung hits and medley duets with guest stars, with a segment where Franklyn and the band field requests from a live audience.

Production is set for Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays of the weeks of July 26, August 2, and September 13 and 20. Franklyn opens the Imperial Room season in October. Firmed up as Franklyn Show guests are: Julie Budd, Marilyn Jones, Arlene Fisher, Sammy Cahn, Tim Daniels, Kathy Stewart, Odia Coates, Freda Payne, and Gloria Kaye.

Cooke TV promo Michael Tzekas told RPM the show is already sold to independent stations in the Vancouver, Edmonton, Calgary, Winnipeg and Toronto markets, with the sales team now working in the east.

CHCH Hamilton originally planned a Vic Franklyn show and shot a pilot in Toronto's Casa Loma last year; but later scrapped the idea. Since that time, the popularity of Franklyn, who came to Canada from Wales in 1972, has been enhanced through hit airplay material from his recent Canadian Talent Library-produced LP.

The producers feel that, with its modern lighting and 16-track mixing board, the facilities at the Zodiac Room are ideal for TV production and recordings as well.

New discbiz promo for CBC-TV music stars

The promo folks at CBC are looking to enter into co-promotional deals with record companies to boost recording stars featured on variety television, CBC promo Franklyn Rasky told **RPM**.

Rasky, who has a background in advertising and journalism, took both top honours in this year's CBC in-house awards for his promotional efforts. His style is to single out one personality, for example Diane Stapley (the promotion for whom won Rasky promo effort of the year) and currently, RCA's Gloria Kaye, who is co-host of this summer's Sunshine Hour.

With a glossy press kit and a well-sched-

uled promo tour, Rasky works for radio and TV appearances and feature stories in national, local and the television supplement press. The promo seems to work, based on the audiences attracted to the Stapley show - audience size peaked with the end of the concentrated promo campaign, then trailed off through the show's run.

Jack Feeney, of RCA (a label to which many of Canada's TV music show hosts are signed) said he and RCA have tied many of their artists' new releases to TV appearances and the success of this is well documented. He remembered, for example, the debut of Roy Payne's hit, Born to Be Just Like A Gypsy, released by Tommy Hunter and performed a few times on his CBC show as the record was being readied for release. Hunter then guested Payne as a featured guest as the song broke. Feeney also pointed out RCA's Carlton Showband's success on their 10-year CTV Pig And Whistle Show breaking their own and other artists' songs.

The idea of co-promo deals with CBC or any other network, Feeney says, is new, but promotionally and economically sound.

Rasky feels this sort of cooperation is crucial to a star system in Canada: The record industry is the key to stardom.

"TV is only one element in the entertainment industry", Raskey told RPM, "there's film, clubs, concerts and records.

"We're striving to attain the same ends. I'm issuing an invitation, right now, in the pages of RPM to give us a call," he said explaining that the CBC is prepared to copromo artists with their labels and management when the artists are to be featured on television.

Recording stars set for CBC specials next season include Gino Vannelli, Rene Simard, Anne Murray, Gordon Lightfoot and Murray McLauchlan.

Canadian film fest to be aired on CTV net

CTV is featuring a July, 4-week, Saturday night series of major Canadian feature films, July 3-24. The series includes: Keir Dulla and Elizibeth Ashley in Paperback Hero (3), Karren Black and Christopher Plummer in The Pyx (10), Art Hindle and Trudy Young in Face Off (17).

Stompin Tom Connors stars in Across This Land, a musical journey across Canada (24).

CBC airs Summer of '76 to replace Bob MacLean

CBC will replace the weekday-noon Bob Maclean TVer with a four-week (July 5-30) run of Summer of '76, described as a "magazine show by women for people."

Hosted on alternate weeks by ACTRA award winner Jane Eastwood and Marilyn Peppiat, and backed with the live music of the Norm Amadeo Trio (featuring Eugene Amaro), the live music-talk show has already firmed up guests Stan Kenton, Billy Daniels, Sarah Caldwell, Genette Brantly and David Warrack. Every Wednesday, the show will feature a half-hour segment with compsosers and songwriters.

Regualr guests are Lynn Kinney (Mondays) and radio producer Doug Lennox (Fridays).

As well as presenting women hosts, the show is staffed primarily by women: director Marg Hastings, producer Dj Anderson, researcher Stacey Curtis, and organizer Leslie Cunian.

CBC promo Gary Protain describes the show as a "strong mix of serious talk, good music, ideas and, best of all, a sense of humor: certainly a change of pace for lunchtime viewing."

CTV expands production to six Canadian cities

CTV's new lineup of shows for next season includes productions from most major centres in Canada. Four new TV variety shows are being taped in six different cities.

In Toronto, CTV and Glen-Warren Productions are co-producing Stars On Ice, hosted by Alex Trebek, and with Pastrami Productions, CTV is taping The David Steinberg Show. Julie Amato's Julie is a CTV co-production with Champlain Productions in Montreal, and CTV is co-producing the 60-minute afternoon variety show, The Alan Hamel Show with BCTV, the network's Vancouver affiliate.

In Ottawa, Carlton Productions will co-produce The Connection celebrity panel show hosted by Trebek, with CTV's CJOH-TV.

Other CTV shows produced outside of Toronto include Kidstuff, a children's show, and First Impressions, a 30-minute game show, both produced with Champlain in Montreal, Let's Go, a children's show produced by CTV Winnipeg affiliate CKY-TV, and Pots And Pans, an excercise-cooking show produced by CTV affiliate CFRN-TV in Edmonton. There will be another half-season of the Rolf Harris Show, a BCTV production.



MAHOGANY RUSH Mahogany Rush IV Columbia KC 34190-H



This is Mahogany Rush's first Columbia LP, but as the title indicates, it's their fourth overall effort. The group is still with Kotai Records in Quebec, but instead of Capitol they're now signed to Columbia U.S.

Group leader Frank Marino began playing guitar at the age of 15, and his style, reminiscent of the late superstar Jimi Hendrix, gained him an immediate following in his hometown Montreal, which eventually grew to Detroit, the heavy-metal capitol of North America. He was backed then, and is now, by bassist Paul Harwood and drummer Jim Ayoub.

Hopefully by now Marino has shaken the Hendrix "reincarnation" tage, and the group will be accepted on its own ground.

Marino, now 21, is the group's producer, composer and singer. He's a guitar technician, and he knows how to use the tricks and techniques available in a good studio. (In this case, it's Tempo Studios in Montreal). The result is an electronicallytextured "wall of sound", with Marino's skills as a composer and guitarist shining through.

Although a single will likely be released, this is basically progressive FM material. Listen to I'm Going Away, with synthesized bass and mellotron by Marino, as well as Little Sexy Annie and Moonwalk.

It's rock suited for major international action, helped by the simultaneous Canadian-U.S. release of the album.

BRIAN & BRENDA RUSSELL Word Called Love Rocket PIG 2181-J

Formerly part of the Toronto music scene, this new recording couple are in good hands with E. John and his Rocket Records label. Helping out are Elton, his band, Jeff Baxter, Steve Cropper, and a crop of the best session men around, including Prakash John and Whitey Glan. Highly Prized Possession is the single, also try Please Pardon Me and Elton's Tell Me When The Whistle Blows.

SONS OF CHAMPLIN A Circle Filled With Love Ariola America ST 50007

Twelve cuts (a rarity these days) of solid disco, with touches of versatility (Hold On, To The Sea) and plenty of AM potential. Vocals and Composition mainly by Bill Champlin; fine production by Keith Olsen (Fleetwood Mac). AM and FM programmer will like Hold On, Slippery When It's Wet, Knickanick and previously mentioned songs. A strong package.

THE TROGGS The Trogg Tapes Penny Farthing PA-551-W

Those crazy Wild Things return with more pop-acid rock tunes to bring back the old times. Rock's old man with the youthful English voice belts out ten originals and one classic. A bit late for AM, perhaps, but FMers and those with fond memories of the late 60's pop scene will love it.

This should appeal to buyers of country, MOR, folk, and Kenny Rogers discs. Country and MOR programmers might try titler, Heavenly Sunshine, and track from UA movie, Trackdown, called Runaway Girl.

Peter Foldy reaches for new markets

Peter Foldy is the young-voiced singer who scored a national hit and U.S. trade action with Bondi Junction during the summer of 1973.

Since then, Kanata released two more singles which were successes mainly in the Maritimes, and a tour of the eastern provinces saw hundreds of young fans giving him a taste of the kind of screaming adulation reserved for pop stars.

But even after his move to Capitol following Kanata's demise, and the release of Hollywood, a Los Angeles production, a second national hit failed to materialize.

That's why the success of Roxanne is so important; an artist can survive, only so long, on mechanicals and royalties on a major hit.

Taking few chances, Foldy signed this spring with an American manager, Buz Wilburn and his Los Angeles-based Music Marketing International firm.

The new single was recorded at the Wally

parent firm's international web, Chappell has representatives in every country in the world.

Quality represents the New York Times catalogue in Canada and New York Times represents theirs in the U.S. Early Morning has representatives in most countries. The Attic publishing group represents several major international catalogues, for example the compositions of John Lennon and Paul McCartney, and recently-acquired works of Robbie Robertson (now verified as Canadian content). Attic is represented by A.T.V. in the U.S.

April-Blackwood recently acquired the complete 3,500-title catalogue of their U.S. parent firm, which is managing the Canadian subsidary's catalogue there.

Gordon Lightfoot's Early Morning is, exclusively, the catalogue of his compositions, about 160 songs to date. Beverly Lightfoot reports that, as of last fall, there were 227 covers of Lightfoot songs by other artists: more than 100 on If You Could Read My Mind alone, and about 40 on Early Morning Rain. In addition, Lightfoot is probably the most airplayed Canadian artist.

Two and a half years ago, the Quality catalogue contained 48 songs, Bill Kearns told RPM. Since then, Quality decided to get into publishing in a big way, bought the 4,000 song Broadland catalogue from BMIC and recently acquired the 7,500 song New York Times catalogue.

These international publishing webs are providing hit material for Canadian artists. Chappell's Jerry Renewych picked Loving You Baby, an old Elton John Bernie Toupin B-side cut, from the Dick James catalogue he handles in Canada, and flogged it to Rubber Bullet's John Driscoll, who made it one of the biggest pop hits of the year with his label's Wednesday group. He had similar success with It's All Right, recorded by Columbia's Crack Of Dawn and Just An-

Heider studios in Los Angeles, with seasoned sessionmen - Larry Carlton, Wilton Felder, Jim Gordon and David Foster as well as Dianne Brooks, who now lives in Los Angeles, on backup vocals. The session was produced and arranged by Milan Kymlicka.

Foldy doesn't feel guilty about going to the U.S. to record. He noted RPM's article on John Capek (June 19) which quotes the producer as saying that without as much work available, Toronto sessionmen aren't as experienced as those in New York or Los Angeles.

Foldy agreed, saying, "Musicians in Toronto are fine; it's just that in L.A. an artist has more of a choice of the kind of players he can use."

Foldy talked of the difficulty in Canada of trying to establish a star system when "most people pay more attention to the hype that comes from the States."

"An artist can make it big in the States with less effort than in Cánada. There's a readiness in the States to create stars, while here everyone is geared to following those stars."

In any case, Foldy retains his Canadian citizenship, and still lives in Toronto. (He's been living here since he came from Australia ten years ago; he finally became a naturalized citizen in March). He doesn't have any plans to move southward.

With the release of his Roxanne single last week, Foldy will be starting the standard promo tour. The single is a summer record, like Bondi, and Capitol will be promoting it as such.

"Capitol is great. They're terriffic people, and they seem to really like the record," boasted Foldy.

Foldy himself, though, is probably his own best promotion man, and that has kept him from being forgotten these past months by a business that naturally tends to forget people easily.

The Capitol artist plans to return to Los Angeles in the fall to tape another session,

other Fool, Keith Hampshire's latest.

New York Times Music in California found a song they thought was just right for Terry Jacks, and sent the tapes to Quality's Bill Kearns, who relayed them to Jacks, The result is Jacks' new single, In My Father's Footsteps.

As representatives, the active publisher can often break a hit in Canada. Last year, for example, Columbia introduced Blood, Sweat and Tears' Yesterday's Music (a Cancon song) at their June convention, then held back the release until after their summer shutdown. Al Mair, who represents the catalogue of writer David Clayton Thomas here, bought copies of the U.S. pressing of the single and mailed them out. By the time it was released here, it was airplayed on 12 major stations.

Going the other way, an active U.S. representative can boost earnings for a Canadian publisher. With their new relation to

and with the other songs from the Roxanne sessions, should have enough for a second LP.

With a new single, management, record company (in the U.S.), and presumably a tour in the near future, Foldy should reestablish the promising career he started some time ago.

their parent firm, April-Blackwood's Wayne Patton and Vivian Hicks report a strong interest in New York for their Canadian catalogue. Their fast-growing roster includes members of Columbia-label groups Next, Bond, Crack Of Dawn and Jackson Hawke and Tom Middleton, as well as their roster of French language writers associated with CBS Disques.

After placing a song, the active publisher may be more like a promotion man, pressing for the airplay from which performance royalties are derived. But none of the major Canadian publishers has yet been able to create anything like a record company's promo staff.

Chappell's Renewych told RPM he felt the publishers would have more money for promotion if they held on to all of their publishing rights when making record deals and make agreements involving cooperation in promotion instead.

Imagician band image co-ordinators

"It takes guts to innovate," said Saint John, New Brunswick-born Bruce Appleby, co-owner of Toronto's Warhol-esque, Imagician "band image co-ordinators" (Quality's Sweet Blindness, Columbia's Bond), approached after one year's opera-

tion to graphically visualize RCA Canada's Early Riser LP, the album debut of Three Hats Productions' THP Orchestra (who cover-versioned the Theme From S.W.A.T. to the tune of top-10 Canadian gold record status.)

Designing a strikingly visual album graphic, unique for a small and relatively young operation, Imagician's Appleby simply insists, "young blood and progressive energy is the key to creative success."

John Chisolm, Ian Guenther and Willie Morrison are Three Hats Productions. July 1975, singer/songwriter Morrison approached the five-month old Imagician to design the jacket for his RCA single, Pistolero.

February 1, 1976, RCA Canada released another Three Hat's production, the THP Orchestra cover version of Theme From S.W.A.T. Three Hat's Joan Chisolm asked Imagician to design the album graphic for THP's Early Riser debut LP, (featuring Theme From S.W.A.T.) suggesting Imagician incorporate some type of early riser theme, and Dawn Patrol, title of a featured track. Imagician were given two weeks to complete the assignment.

Popular conception of an early riser is someone waking in the morning and hopping out of bed.

"Our basic idea," said Toronto-born, Imagician co-owner Gurteen, "was to picture someone getting home from a night at the discos, coming home as opposed to getting up. Originally, we took some shots of myself in the shower, clothes on, with nylon stockings draped over the shower stall, but then decided that the idea was just a bit too sleezy."

Imagician eventually pictured young Gurteen, "dressed to the hilt", submerged in a hot tub, overflowing with champagne suds (Sunlight Dishsoap) with a bottle of Dawn Patrol wine, perched high in the corner.

Photographer Edie Steiner, handtinted her shot with photographer's oils and delivered the picture to graphic artist Richard Whyte (completing the design with stylized typography). Colour separation was handled by Toronto printers, Herzig-Sommerville. Finished product was sent to RCA's vice president and general manager

March 20, Theme From S.W.A.T. hit Number One position on RPM's Top 100 Singles chart, by end of March, earning gold status.

April 1, RCA threw a press reception at their Toronto studios, to fanfare the gold achievement and to "unveil" Imagician's album graphic, blown-up to poster size. Many observers were impressed by the picture's sensual implications, the ideal representation for THP Orchestra's instrumental play.

Appleby is currently approaching Canada's smaller independent record companies, who, like his Imagician, brim with young positive ideas, "receptive to unique and creative images."

Burrows touch puts O'Keefe in the running

Thomas Burrows, the new General Manager of Toronto's O'Keefe Centre is attempting to bring that big house out of the doldrums.

Taking over the O'Keefe, he has acquired some of the productions that were already set and is working to bring in newer and more exciting fare for the sagging Centre's stage.

More important he is opening the door to local media to participate in bringing the theatre back to becoming a showplace for entertainment in Canada.

At a press reception Burrows announced the summer schedule which kicked off with Godspell, followed by, Shirley MacLaine (June 28-July 3), Burt Bacharach and Anthony Newley (July 19-24), Marvin Hamlisch and a yet to be announced star (July 26-31), The Carpenters (Aug. 5-7) Fiddler On The Roof with Zero Mostel (Aug. 9-14), Plaza Suite (Aug. 23-28) and finally Porgy and Bess (Aug. 30-Sept. 11).

The Canadian Opera Company will have a short three week season this fall but plans to expand next year's season to ten weeks.


The National Ballet will extend its season this year to celebrate their 25th anniversary.

Burrows' new approach seems to be directed at making the Centre a place that many segments of society will frequent. He was aware that the theatre hasn't a hardcore of audience but specialized shows do bring in a special audience.

Christenson is talking more about his second LP now, which is almost finished, and a half-hour film documentary, Northern Express, featuring himself, (produced by his manager and producer of his records, Mel Shaw, and directed by Robert Diez d'aux) which Shaw premiered in mid-June.

Christenson broke with brother Peter to pursue music in different musical styles-Peter and the band are moving more to rock sounds, and Terry wants to explore avenues in the soft folk-country idiom that better fits, for now, a solo effort.

Christenson says he may play with his brother's band when his second LP is released, an LP which uses some rock cuts to create certain emotions. The LP, to be called Child Of The Sunset, is a concept, story set, based on the life of an Indian lad Christenson knew in the Georgian Bay area, where he grew up.

Buckeye backs Christenson on The Ghosts LP, with other capable studio musicians, on 12 songs written by the artist. All are published by Shaw's Corner Store publishing. Quality will choose and release a single soon.

Christenson is playing his own material in coffee houses and folk fests this summer. He played Toronto's Riverboat the week of his LP release and film premiere, and is scheduled to play London, Hamilton and Sudbury festivals this summer (possibly Kawartha and Ottawa as well).


When he was with Buckeye, Christenson told RPM, the band had too many styles and it was consequently harder to book. Now both he and the band are finding more work.

Toronto's Horseshoe Tavern is switching its policy away from Nashville-style country acts as their old regular customers are flocking to the dozens of new country rooms operating in the suburbs around the city. Horseshoe management is booking in younger, new country artists in the swing, outlaw and rock styles that are attracting a younger audience to country music these days

Ray Materick did his "Live" CKLW-FM studio gig, again, to promote Windsor's upcoming Folk Festival to be held during Canada Week and the International Freedom Festival. An hour of his music is to be featured with the interview. Materick's new Asylum Single, Northbound Plane, is actually his old single but the WEA people feel it is strong enough to make a bigger indent this time 'round.

Van Los in Vancouver tells us that Doug Rutledge is touring Alberta and Saskatchewan while the label is running with the first single from his new LP, Except You. Rutledge has toured over 12,000 miles as a single act and is set to play Edmonton this week, and then Peace River, Red Deer; Lethbridge, Revelstoke and Surrey. He'll be looking east, after he gets back in the studio in Vancouver.

Frank and Ruby Konken are out of the studio after the country duo laid tracks for their first release on their new label, Rada Records. Rada thought they should have a new name to match their new career and, with CKFG, radio station of the Konken's hometown Grand Forks B.C., held a name picking contest. Vera Hahornoff won the contest (and a dinner for two at Jolly Jack's) with the name K-Kountry. That's a long intro for a spin of K-Kountry's new single, Nashville Number One.

Boot bows Ham set

After 16 years in the business and four years of steady bookings in four clubs in the London, Ontario area, Boot Records' John Ham has his first album release. As soon as the discs came off the presses, he took several back to London selling 200 in a couple of weeks of club dates.

CFPL London is playing a few cuts from the LP, knowing his local popularity, but Ham looks to the LP, and the single from it, Springtime In The Country/Lady Please, to open the way to expand his base.

Ham has seen purse-strings tighten up in London-area country music clubs; he's gone from a five-piece band to a duo, himself and a drummer, to stay booked. Recently he had his first shot at being sandwiched between disco record sets.

Ham explained that London is by no means a poor town; but the downtown and the city's perimeter are controlled by a small number of real estate interests. Poor planning has allowed them to slow development around the city, forcing up downtown land values, and rents. Rising rents for club owners have already cost Ham three band members.

Ham performs from a repertoire of more than 500 songs; about 40 per cent of each performance are his originals, and many are becoming well known among his local following. He's written more than 150 songs, from which he feels he can draw enough material to set his own style as a recording artist: "I've waited this long; why

One would have a hard time trying to convince several thousand screaming Bay City Roller fans gathered at Toronto Airport, to greet their heroes, that they were the product of record company hype. And no one tried.

In fact, Toronto's two top-30 giants, CHUM and CFTR, both mounted promotions on their own, celebrating the Rollers' noisy arrival in town to tape their next LP at Soundstage with producer Jimmy Ienner and engineer David Palmer.

CHUM Music Director Roger Ashby explained to RPM that his station gave away about 300 Bay City Roller tee-shirts and 500 photos of the group to the airport crowd. The event was covered by CHUM's news team, who put together a 30-minute special, aired that weekend.

Rea musical drama set for CBC net airings

As part of their American Bicentennial salute, CBC Radio will be airing a musical special, Emperor Norton, written by singersongwriter David Rea and freelance broadcaster Doug Byers.

The special was taped last fall on 16 tracks at Thunder Sound and mixed in the CBC's 4S studio. Featured are actor Robert Chrisie who talks his way through the songs, along with Ian and Sylvia Tyson, and Rea, who all take supporting roles. Arrangements are by Milan Kymlicka.

Originally from Cleveland, Rea has been living in Toronto while writing songs for, and performing with, various Canadian artists. He has played with Gordon Lightfoot, Ian and Sylvia and Judy Collins, and has written Mississippi Queen and others for Mountain and Felix Pappalardi. His fourth LP, Scarred Guitar, is to be recorded shortly.

Emperor Norton is the story of Joshua A. Norton, who one day in San Francisco in 1859, declared himself Emperor of the United States.

The special will be aired on the CBC AM network June 27, and on CBC FM July 3.

(to England) about five days before they were to arrive here," Ashby reported, "and he came back with them on the plane. He spent quite a bit of time with them in England and on the plane, and the discussions he had formed the basis of the documentary."

Chuck Camroux, station manager for CFTR, told RPM that his station also flew a jock to England to return to Canada with the band. This time it was morning man Jim Brady, who arranged for the Rollers to call the station, on the air, from England "to say that they were with Jim Brady, and that they would be in Toronto soon, and that they hoped everyone would listen to their records on CFTR, and things like that." A Rolls Royce limo was sent to the airport on the big day to pick up Brady.

"We bought 6,000 records to give away," said Camroux, "and we bought flags and tee-shirts. We gave some away on the air, and we rented a parking lot near the station and moved in a Prizemobile. There were about 2,000 fans there at any given time. We had a p.a. piping the Rollers music, and kids were led in cheers of B-A-Y-C-I-T-Y while awaiting the running commentary on the plane's arrival, live from the airport by one of our newsmen."

There were 12,000 prizes given away that day, which means everyone received something.



Chappell maps new plans expands at New York conference

Chappell's Jerry Renewych recently returned from a two-day professional meeting of Chappell personnel, where he learned of new plans for expansion of the activities of the international publishing firm.

Chappell president Norman Weiser reported that the firm is opening New York and Los Angeles 16-track recording studios (which he says will pay for themselves in 18 months of operation).

Chappell is also moving into the book publishing field, Renewych reported, with popular style books about Elton John, The Beach Boys, Carole King, John Lennon, Rod Stewart and others. Chappell is test racking the books in Sears stores in the U.S. and will handle the distribution themselves.

Northland 45s one stop moves west to Vancouver

Northland Music Distributors, an Edmonton-based single-disc one stop, is expanding into British Columbia. Northland president William (Bill) Maxim recently announced the opening of a new Vancouver office to be managed by Debbe Petryga. Northland operations have previously covered Alberta and Saskatchewan from their Edmonton home office.

Northland is part of the Damon Productions Ltd. group, which includes Damon Sound Studios, Pet-Mac Publishing, 3pm Music, and the Damon and Mustard labels. Maxim has been head of Northland since 1974, when predecessor Garry McDonnall took full-time duties with Damon Productions.

Northland, by specializing in 45s, has rapidly expanded their marketing in Alberta and Saskatchewan with their Old Gold line of oldies plus current top 40 and country product, juke box strips for coin operators, Disneyland LPs, and record care kits.

Petryga will establish all these services in B.C. She has experience in a number of Edmonton retail record stores as well.

Smile Records have moved their headquarters and changed their name to account for the growth through their first three years in the record busines. Located at 1659 Bayview Avenue, Toronto, they're now the Smile Music Group with addition of publishing firms, Maple Creek Music (BMIC) and Snowberry Music (CAPAC).

In three years Smile has experienced six top-30 songs out of its ten releases (eight of them four-parts Cancon). The publishing wings have been spread lately, placing a J. Ian McLean composition on the new Tony Orlando And Dawn LP (making that a Cancon cut).

U.S. discbiz sales up with inflation

The Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) recently released figures which showed dollar value of record sales (at distributors suggested list price) just about kept up with inflation in 1975.

Total sales, at suggested list levels, were \$2.36 billion for the year compared with \$2.2 billion for 1974. The actual gross figures, given retail discount pricing, are estimated at slightly below \$1.9 billion.

RIAA figures showed sales of LP product climbing from \$1.36 to \$1.48 billion while singles sales fell from \$194 million to \$183 million. Unit sales of LPs rose from 276 million pieces to 282 million while 45 units sold, fell from 204 million to a surprisingly low at 164 million.

Eight-track tape unit sales climbed from 96.7 million in 1974 to 100.2 million in 1975 (list price dollar value from \$549 million to \$583 million). Cassettes sales grew from 15.3 million to 16.4 million pieces (list price dollar value \$87.2 million to \$98.8 million), while the quadraphonic tape market shrunk from 1.4 million unit sales to 1.1 million (\$11.2 million list to \$8.2 million) and reel to reel pre-recorded tapes sales declined from 500,000 to 400,000 units (list, \$2.5 million to \$2 million).


