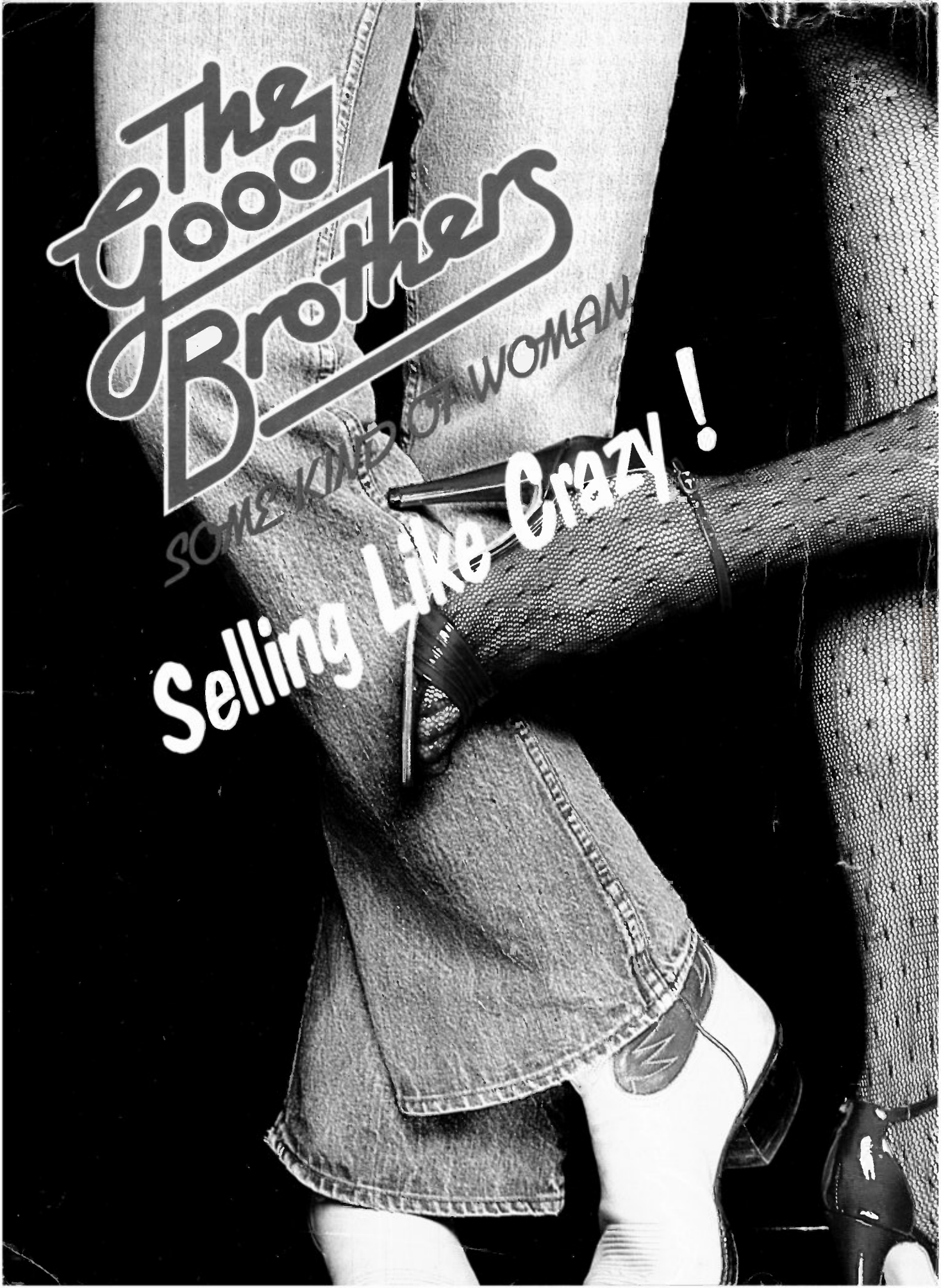

Supreme Court decision sparks industry battle

The Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) and the Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA) would appear to be drawing battlelines over a Supreme Court decision in favour of Blue Crest Music, a music publisher, and against the Compo Company (a now defunct pressing plant) and Canusa Records. In the 1969 action, Blue Crest claimed copyright infringement over a French version of the Dallas Frazier/Lou Crest composition, There Goes My Everything. Apparently a decision, initially, had been made in favour of the manufacturer but was reversed by the federal court on appeal. The manufacturers then asked leave to appeal to the Supreme Court, which was granted last December. Acting on behalf of the manufacturers in the action was the CRIA's legal counsel, Paul Amos of Montreal with the law firm of Ogilvy-Renault acting as legal liaison.

The Supreme Court decided that a pressing plant does indeed share liability with a record label for copyright infringement. The decision was brought down Oct. 2nd and announced by Leonard Feist, President of the NMPA on Oct. 15 at a Toronto reception hosted by the American association. The gathering included invited members of the recording community (manufacturers), many of whom were obviously disturbed over the setting for the announcement.

"It was a very serious decision from the record manufacturers' point of view", noted Brian Robertson, President of the CRIA. "It makes them (the manufacturers) absolutely vulnerable, if they're pressing for a record company and if that record company goes bankrupt or can't pay. It makes the presser liable for all mechanical royalties, which could run into the millions of dollars."

The CRIA held a meeting Oct. 30 at which all the custom pressers and manufacturers were represented. "A summit meeting," noted Robertson, "to decide what action the industry can take, or what safeguards are necessary to combat the Supreme Court ruling." He went on to further point out that "There will obviously have to be some safeguards made, from an industry point of view, because it just makes all the pressers vulnerable for non-payment of royalties."

Hurt feelings was not the intention, explained Cyril Devereux, General Manager of the CMRRA. He was referring to the

announcement of the decision at the NMPA reception. "I had intended on making the announcement at the joint NMPA/CMRRA meeting which was held just prior to the reception. It was an oversight on my part." Devereux was hopeful that there would be

an understanding by the manufacturers that although the Supreme Court decision was all-encompassing, "the main thing is to try to catch the fly-by-nighters who press up a couple of thousand records and then disappears. Multiply that by about 30 or 40 times, and you're into a lot of records over a period of time."

Devereux explained that "Long before the decision was brought down, we circularized pressers and studios advising them of the liability. We offered them a quantity of printed letters that explained that the customer was responsible for the royalties. We also supplied them with a quantity of licence applications." The response from the manufacturers was apparently only fair.

The recent demise of GRT, in Canada, was also of much concern to the CMRRA. It's too early to speculate on what action will be taken by the CMRRA in this case, as the Receiver is currently attempting to raise monies. A substantial sum has apparently already been raised with the reported negotiation by Capitol for masters by Prism. An announcement is expected shortly in this regard.

The Knack back on top of singles chart with Good Girls Don't

The Knack's GOOD GIRLS DON'T (Capitol) moves up to number one on the RPM Singles chart this week, as the Eagles' HEARTACHE TONIGHT (Asylum) jumps from 13 to 2. On the album chart, Led Zeppelin's IN THROUGH THE OUT DOOR (Swang Song) maintains the top spot for the second week.

Substantial gains are made on the album chart by Styx's CORNERSTONE (A&M), moving from 28 to 17; Jethro Tull's STORMWATCH (Chrysalis) from 31 to 20; Fleetwood Mac's TUSK (Warner Bros.) from 81 to 55; April Wine's HARDER . . . FASTER (Aquarius) from 88 to 62; and RISE by Herb Alpert (A&M) from 91 to 69.

The Styx single BABE (A&M) continues to move up the chart, jumping from 27 to 13, along with Blondie's DREAMING (Chrysalis) from 35 to 23; Supertramp's TAKE THE LONG WAY HOME (A&M) from 54 to 36; Commodores' STILL (Motown) from 64 to 41, and Boney M's GOTTA GO HOME (Atlantic) from 61 to 43. MIDNIGHT MUSIC by Canada's Martin Stevens (Columbia) bounces back up the chart from 90 to 69.

COOL CHANGE by The Little River Band (Capitol) enters the singles chart at 91 showing strong airplay. Also new to the same chart are Stevie Wonder's SEND ONE YOUR LOVE (Motown) at 93; Richard Stepp's HOLIDAY IN HOLLYWOOD (Infinity) at No. 95; and Kenny Loggins' solo effort THIS IS IT (Columbia) at 97, with his album KEEP THE FIRE on the chart at 100.

Bee Gees hit the album chart again with their GREATEST HITS (RSO) at 87; Pat

Benatar's IN THE HEAT OF THE NIGHT (Chrysalis) enters at 96; and two A&M albums, Joan Armatrading's STEPPIN' OUT and Cano's RENDEZVOUS, are at 97 and 98 respectively.

CBS' Brinsley Schwartz vets scoring Canada hits

Two veterans of the influential late sixties British rock group Brinsley Schwartz, Nick Lowe and Ian Gomm, are currently achieving major successes in the Canadian market with product on two different labels both distributed here by CBS Records.

Noted bassist/producer Nick Lowe, best known as producer of three successful Columbia albums for Elvis Costello, has reached gold status and is rapidly moving towards Canadian platinum with his second album, *Labour Of Lust*. The album contains Lowe's first major hit single, *Cruel To Be Kind*, which was coincidentally written by Ian Gomm. Lowe's first Columbia effort, *Pure Pop For Now People*, achieved respectable sales and has become a cult classic. Lowe has also achieved platinum as a producer with Costello's most recent album, *Armed Forces*.

Gomm, a veteran of Brinsley Schwartz, is also making major gains in Canada with his second album on the Stiff label, *Gomm With The Wind*. The album includes the breakout single *Hold On*. Gomm has now been confirmed for Canadian debut appearances November 18 at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver and

December 1 at Toronto's El Mocambo.

The influence of Brinsley Schwartz is widespread and becoming more heavily recognized each month. Guitarist Schwartz himself is a member of Graham Parker & The Rumour, one of the bands which has most influenced Costello. Schwartz also recently sat in on the debut album of

Rachel Sweet on Stiff, titled *Fool Around*. Bassist Lowe, apart from his career as artist and producer, is also a member of Dave Edmunds' band *Rockpile*. Edmunds is on release with a new WEA album, *Repeat When Necessary*, and is breaking out with a new hit single, *Girls Talk*, written by none other than Elvis Costello.

TCD to distribute LPs on SQN's jazz, kids' labels

Earl Rosen, Vice President of Toronto's SQN Records Limited (Sine Qua Non), has announced the finalization of an agreement with the Ottawa-based TCD Records & Tapes whereby the Ottawa company will distribute the upcoming album *I Lost My Pet Lizard*, a new release on SQN's Teddy Records label.

The children's record is by the Toronto duo of Paul & Brenda Hoffert, and is described as 'pop songs for kids'. The album includes the vocal support of Brenda Hoffert and such noteworthy vocalists as Bob McBride, Don Francks and Cree Summer Francks, Clare Bewley and Dick Smith, as well as instrumental efforts from many of the country's top session musicians including Ralph Cole, Eugene Amaro, Guido Basso, Ron Hughes, Russ Little and Mike Malone. The lyrics, written by

Brenda Hoffert, are all animal songs. The music, by veteran composer Paul Hoffert, range from pop, rock and disco to country, MOR and even reggae. TCD President Harvey Glatt noted, "This is the first children's record I've heard written in today's styles. It should have a tremendous appeal to children and adults."

Rosen and Glatt also announced that TCD will be distributing SQN's first jazz release. The album is titled *Walking On Air*, featuring Jim Galloway and Dick Wellstood on SQN's Bittersweet Jazz label. The set also features contributions three cuts to the set, which was produced by Galloway and Ted O'Reilly. The jazz set is already available in Canada, with the children's release being scheduled for an October 26 release.

Australian government to sponsor gala at Musexpo

Roddy S. Shashoul, President of the Musexpo trade fair, has announced the confirmation of a second annual Australian Night gala to take place during the 1979 Musexpo, November 4-8 in Miami Beach, Fla. Shashoua also noted that for the first time, the Australian government will be participating in the gala as co-sponsor.

The gala is slated for Tuesday, Nov. 6

at the Showroom of the headquarter Konover Hotel. It will follow a first time Australian beer, wine and cheese sampling party and will be open to all Musexpo participants, trade and general press media in attendance. Among the Australian artists confirmed to perform at the gala are the Four Kinsmen, Lee Conway and Bluestone.

CBS release single from Guy Lafleur LP on Unison

CBS Records, newly signed distributors of the Montreal-based Unison label, have released a debut single from Lafleur, a combination disco music/hockey instructional album featuring the Montreal Canadiens superstar Guy Lafleur. The single, titled *Power Play*, is already reported achieving solid airplay right across Canada, with particular strength in the Montreal and Vancouver areas.

The album features six cuts, all with hockey titles such as *Face-off*, *Skating*, *Shooting and Scoring*. Two of the cuts, including *Power Play*, are all-music cuts, featuring the vocal talents of noted Montreal disco group *Toulouse*. The other four tracks feature Lafleur discussing the various aspects of the game of hockey, over a disco music background. The set was produced by noted Montrealers Peter Alves and Jack Lenz, who also composed the music. Associate producers were France Smith and Gino Soccio. Recording took place at Montreal facilities Studio Six, Unison and Studio Experience.

The album also comes with an enclosed poster of Lafleur in full colour, and a black and white 16-page instructional booklet documenting the instructions on the album and also featuring several pages of action shots of Lafleur.

The *Power Play* single is currently available on seven inch only, but CBS report a 12" version is now in the works.

FEATURE ALBUMS

ERNE SMITH

To Behold Jah - Generation (Boot) GEN-3011-K Reggae Suggested List \$7.98
Jamaican singer-songwriter Smith, a long-term Toronto resident, has been well-known on the fast-growing Canadian reggae scene for some time, as well as the Toronto club circuit, and it's about time the rest of the country discovered him. Through Boot's new Generation reggae label it becomes possible. The material is original and well-written, solidly produced by Smith at Toronto's RCA and Phase One Studios. The band is strong and tight, harmonies are rich but not too widespread, and the tempo ranges from laid-back and poignant, near gospel in intensity, to frenetic and joyous. All-told, an excellent LP to discover reggae with. All cuts four parts Cancon.

RONNIE HAWKINS

The Hawk - United Artists UA-LA968-H-F Rock Suggested List \$8.98
Hawkins, one of rockabilly and rock & roll's early shining lights, returns with his first new album in several years, and it's a very strong effort, displaying perhaps what that early sound would have been with today's facilities and production technique. The material is as genuine as ever, from South In New Orleans to Jerry Reed's Ain't That Lovin' You Baby, Willie Dixon's My Babe, Chuck Berry's Let It Rock, and even a very non-bluegrass version of Blue Moon Of Kentucky. Producer Keith Allison has added highly accredited session players, some of whom date back (including Paul Butterfield & The Band's Garth Hudson) for a solid, up-to-date sound. Not Cancon.

HAGOOD HARDY

The Hagood Hardy Collection - Attic LAT-1073-H MOR Suggested List \$8.98
Release of this excellently packaged compilation of Hardy's hits and other top material is designed to coincide with the Christmas season, and there's little doubt the set will be a top family item come December. It's been a while since the pianist/vibe player/composer's last release, and without this reminder, one might forget the fine quality of his compositions and productions, either for listening to up close (or playing at MOR and AC formats), or as relaxing background music. All the material is original, produced by Hardy through the years, and is fully Cancon. Contains The Homecoming, Maybe Tomorrow, Jennifer's Song and many others.

SAGA

Images At Twilight - Polydor 2424-202-Q Rock Suggested List \$8.98
Second album from five-piece Toronto-based band is a carefully composed and produced set which again specializes in keyboards. The songs were basically written by band members, with lead vocalist Jim Crichton, also the group's bass player, involved in writing all but one cut. The music is fairly high energy rock, with Crichton's brother Ian breaking up the all-keyboard sound on guitars. The influence of progressive music is here, but the set is basically an AOR rock album ranging from heavy pop to not quite heavy rock. Produced by Paul Gross and arranged by the band. Recorded at Toronto's Phase One with engineers Alan Thorne and Mick Walsh. Lyrics enclosed on well-designed inner sleeve.

BILL HUGHES

Dream Master - Epic NJE-35521-H Pop Suggested List \$8.98
Debut album by Ontario singer-songwriter Hughes is a very high quality production showing the studio expertise of producer Henry 'Lewy' (of Joni Mitchell credit). The set features all original ballads, pop songs and light rockers, well sung by Hughes, whose substantial studio experience includes a full slate of jingles. The L.A. production features top studio names such as drummers Jeff Porcaro & Russ Kunkel, Lincoln Mayorga on piano, synthesizers from Ian Underwood and background vocals from Colleen Peterson, Jose Feliciano and many others. Two cuts produced in Canada, one each by Hughes (Sounds Interchange) and Dale Jacobs (Total Sound West). Lyrics.

LYNX

We Are The People - Quality SV-2050-M Rock Suggested List 8.98
Third album release from the hard driving Toronto rock group. Of the original band members, only keyboard player/vocalist Tony Caputo remains. He, along with guitarist/vocalist Jerry Donnelly, anchor a much more focused sound than they have displayed in the past. Also new to Lynx is their relationship with producers Ed Cobb and James Pike, U.S. studio men associated with the AVI label on which the set will be released south of the border. The music is still straight ahead rock, with no holds barred. Caputo was responsible for most of the material, collaborating with Cobb on two cuts. More AOR potential than Lynx's past two sets. Produced at Producer's Workshop, Hollywood.

THE IMPS

In The Tube - Tube Records WRC-1-926-J.C. Ent. Rock Suggested List \$7.98
Debut release from the new Tube Records label, designed to record Canadian artists live from the Picadilly Tube in Toronto. The set is also a debut for the Imps, a three-piece band led by guitarist/vocalist Frank Soda, who also wrote all the material. Most of the music is straight ahead rock, and of the seven songs, only two really change the pace. They are Going Down The Tube Blues and the somewhat more progressive TV People. The LP was produced at the Tube by CHUM-FM's Larry Wilson and noted producer/artist Robert Connolly, and mixed by Mark Wright at Phase One Studios. Unusual jacket artwork should gain some attention for the set in the stores.

NEW ALBUMS

20/20

Epic/Portrait NJR-36205-H Rock

Suggested List \$8.98

Debut album by an exciting young four-piece group out of the budding Los Angeles club circuit could be a major breakout act and a sample of what's to come in the 80's. The material is energetic power pop, somewhere between AOR and heavy Top 40, with several cuts serving as possible singles. All the songs were written by group members, with all four artists contributing. Production is handled by L.A. studio veteran Earle Mankey, who also engineered (studio not mentioned). The music is simple, 60's influenced, with basically a guitar sound, and fairly tight, basic harmonies. The band are already receiving good press on the U.S. West Coast, and this set could break them.

INTERVIEW

Big Oceans - Virgin V-2123-Q Rock

Suggested List \$8.98

The Virgin label, out of the U.K., has a knack for coming up with exciting, young British rock groups with original, high energy sounds. Interview are no exception. All cuts but one are written by singer Jeff Starrs, lead guitar/keyboard player Pete Allerhand and guitarist Alan Brain. The music features rich harmonies and a full sound, driving rock softened by the harmonies and by keyboards, phase shifters and other tools which give the final result excellent pop potential for Top 40 and AOR. Particularly good possible singles are You Didn't Have To Lie To Me and the only cover, Gary U.S. Bond's Feet Start Walking.

LEO KOTTKE

Balance - Chrysalis CHR-1234-F Rock

Suggested List \$8.98

Through the years, veteran guitarist Kottke has been most noted for his guitar work, specializing in acoustic guitar solos and singing the occasional song. This album should quickly change the image. Most of the songs are vocal, with Kottke doing a much better job of singing than he has shown in the past. All but two of the cuts are self-penned - the exceptions are Jorma Kaukonen instrumental Embryonic Journey, a high energy acoustic band production, and obscure Buddy Holly cut Learning The Game, a ballad sung with only acoustic 12-string guitar accompaniment. Despite the change in approach, Kottke is still an excellent guitarist, giving the set a nice identity.

FOGHAT

Boogie Motel - Bearsville XBHS-6990-P Rock

Suggested List \$9.29

Foghat are a very much established heavy metal group in the U.S., but due to quirks in their tour schedules early in their career, somehow never have become well-known in Canada. Still, their albums are highly collectible for the rock fan, highly playable for the album format. Much of the material is not too heavy, and the working in of some acoustic guitar and classy doubled slide guitar lines make the album more accessible to the AM band as well. However, this album likely doesn't contain the smash single which would establish the group north of the border and make Canadian tour dates possible. Produced by Foghat & Tony Outeda; no studio info.

CRYSTAL GAYLE

Classic Crystal - United Artists LOO-928-F Pop/country

Suggested List \$8.98

With Gayle recently leaving the U.A. label, this last release is a greatest hits package tracing her illustrious career from the early country hits, like Somebody Loves You and I'll Get Over You, through pop success with Don't It Make My Brown Eyes Blue to the more recent Why Have You Left The One You Left Me For. Although her success is still most prominent in the country field, this look back through the past few years shows the artist's versatility, as well as producer Allen Reynolds' skill at finding good songs for her, some of which he wrote himself. Recorded mostly at Jack's Tracks in Nashville. A must for her fans.

JOHN DENVER & THE MUPPETS

A Christmas Together - RCA AFL-1-3451-N Christmas

Suggested List \$8.98

One of the first major Christmas releases of the new season features veteran RCA artist, singer-songwriter Denver, along with the cast of the Muppets, perhaps the world's most popular television show. The material is basically traditional Xmas favourites, with a few Denver compositions thrown in, and the artist and near-human characters share equal parts in the festivities. The set is very well produced by studio veteran Milton Okun (studio info not given), and the musicians appearing on the album read like a who's who of top industry veterans. Well packaged, with a fold-out jacket and full-size poster enclosed.

JOHNNY MATHIS

Mathis Magic - Columbia JC-36216-H Adult/pop

Suggested List \$8.98

The veteran songster is back with another very high class production of material geared directly between adult contemporary and light pop. The range is from the poignant She Believes In Me and Billy Joel's New York State Of Mind to light disco versions of such popular old tunes as Night And Day and That Old Black Magic. In the recently established Mathis tradition, the artist again shares the microphone with a talented female vocalist, this time Stephanie Lawrence on You Saved My Life, a likely single. Mathis can again expect wholehearted AC support on any of many possible single releases. Produced by Jack Gold in Los Angeles.

WEATHER REPORT

8:30 - Columbia/ARC PC-2-36030-H Jazz

Suggested List \$14.98

A double live album from one of the world's most renowned jazz groups. Weather Report are four highly acclaimed instrumentalists - keyboard master Joe Zawinul, sax player Wayne Shorter, Jaco Pastorius on bass and occasional drums, and drummer Peter Erskine. Together, they provide some of the most intriguing, thought provoking heavy jazz ever created. This set was recorded live during a recent world tour which took them to seemingly every country but Canada. The material is almost all original. Live recording is by Ray Thompson, mixing at Devonshire Sound, and the group can take personal credit for the production.

THE KORGIS

Rialto Recs. RLT-101-K Rock

Suggested List \$8.98

The Korgis are actually a British duet comprised of James Warren and Andy Davis, who write and perform in a very modern pop-oriented rock idiom, with Warren playing bass and Davis on keyboards and mandolin. The songs are catchy, slightly unusual in theme and title (Dirty Postcards, Young & Russian, Art School Annexe and so on). Still, a very easy, lighthearted set, self-produced and quite likely a breakthrough album. The album should be successful at FM radio, with possible singles in I Just Can't Help It If I Had You, two less unusual cuts (though unusual, the other cuts are not at all offensive). Also out of the ordinary is the no guitar sound - mostly keyboards.

JIMMY MESSINA

Oasis - Columbia JC-36140-H Pop

Suggested List \$8.98

For veteran singer/musician/songwriter/producer Messina, whose career spans very noteworthy stops with Buffalo Springfield, Poco and most recently, Loggins & Messina, Oasis is a first try at a debut effort. The result is worth the time and seasoning. The set, which Messina produced himself at Santa Barbara, is very much geared to the modern pop sound expected by AOR programmers. It is easy to listen to, yet quite sophisticated musically, with elements of pop jazz on some selections, pure pop and fairly gentle rock on most of the others, and a couple of ballads. All songs penned or co-penned by Messina; some are possible singles. Lyrics enclosed.

Attic releasing debut LP

by ex-Groovie Roy Loney

Attic Records are readying release of a debut album by Californian Roy Loney, a former member of popular San Francisco rock group the Flamin' Groovies. The album, titled *Out After Dark*, will be Loney's first product release since the Groovies' original split-up in 1971 (The group have since re-formed with new members and are recording on Sire.).

Loney is now touring with his group, Roy Loney & The Phantom Movers. The group includes two other former Groovies members, drummer Danny Mihm and James Farrell on guitar. An upcoming tour is expected to include dates in Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa.

Yvonne Elliman sets 4th LP for PolyGram's RSO

RSO recording artist Yvonne Elliman has completed her fourth album for release on the PolyGram-distributed label later in the month. The album, titled *Yvonne*, includes the artist's current single, *Love Pains*. The cuts on the album were produced by Robert Apperle and Steve Barri.

The set also includes a complete variety of major session musicians sitting in. Among them are Steve Cropper, Lee Ritenour, Jim Keltner, Richie Zito, Tom Snow, Eric Carmen, Michael Omartian and Dr. John. Dr. John accompanies Elliman on a cover of noted R&B song *Hit The Road Jack*.

Intersong to sub-publish the music on Pope's LP

The U.S.-based publishing firm of Intersong Music has announced the acquisition of Canadian and U.S. sub-publishing rights to the music contained on the recently released album *Pope John Paul II Sings At The Festival of Sacrosong*. The album was issued in North America on Infinity Records.

The historical recording was made at the 11th Sacrosong Festival, held in Krakow, Poland during the Pope's recent return to his homeland. The ecumenical festival was actually founded by His Holiness when still Cardinal Wojtyla, Archbishop of Krakow. The album actually features the Pope joining the large choir in song at the festival.

The set was released with co-operation of the Pontifical Mission Society and the Festival Of Sacrosong, with proceeds going to the Pontifical Mission Society and the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

In announcing the sub-publishing agreement, Intersong Vice President and General Manager Don Oriolo stated, "All of us at Intersong feel that it is a great honour to be involved with such a meaningful project."

NEW ALBUMS

THE DE GARMO & KEY BAND

Straight On - Lamb & Lion LL-1043 (Word Recs.) Rock

New release by four-piece rock group led by guitarist/vocalist Dana Key and keyboard player Edward De Garmo is out on the Christian music label Lamb & Lion, distributed by World Records. Still, the set merits a listen from programmers not in the gospel field by trade. It is an album of competently composed and performed mid-tempo rock songs which serve as an expression of belief rather than preaching to the listener. As such, it should be compatible with AOR formats who have accepted similar types of product through the years on non-gospel labels. Produced by Joseph Hardy with De Garmo and Key at Ardent Studios, Memphis. Lyrics enclosed.

NICOLETTE LARSON

In The Nick Of Time - Warner Bros. XHS-3370-P Pop

Suggested List \$9.29

A follow-up to her highly successful debut LP Nicolette, this set is another very L.A. sounding, finely honed pop album from noted producer Ted Templeman. The material ranges from the R&B-pop sounds of such songs as the title cut, Lauren Wood's Breaking Too Many Hearts, the Supremes' Back In My Arms and Leiber-Stoller's Dancin' Jones to the jazz-influenced camp of 1941 song Daddy and Rio De Janeiro Blue. There are softer moments in Karla Bonoff's Isn't It Always Love and Lowell George's Trouble, and Let Me Go Love, a duet with co-writer Michael McDonald, is a prime single possibility. Recorded in L.A. Lyrics enclosed.

ARETHA FRANKLIN

La Diva - Atlantic QSD-19248-P Pop/soul

Suggested List \$8.98

Franklin, one of the most influential gospel and soul artists of the sixties, is back with what amounts to a modernized production of the same music she has been singing for years. A few of the tracks are given a somewhat disco production by producers Charles Kipps and the late Van McCoy, but more of the music is soul, ranging from funky upbeat to ballads with a horn sound. Franklin's voice is as good as ever, if not even better, and the range of top New York session players (lead vocals added in L.A.) include guitarist Cornell Dupree and keyboard players McCoy and Richard Tee. A good bet for U.S. black radio, some disco and possible Top 40 action here.

SHOES

Present Tense - Elektra 6E-244-P Rock/pop

Suggested List \$8.98

Debut album from a good, tight British group in the new pop vein. The songs are basic, well constructed and produced by Mike Stone with a very live sound. The music is written by brothers Jeff (guitars) and John (bass) Murphy and guitarist Gary Klebe, who are also joined in the group by Skip Meyer on drums. AOR airplay this album is gaining in its early days of release is well deserved, although most of the possible singles are more closely geared to the British pop market. The set should be more successful at FM radio in North America. The sound is basically driving rock and very much guitar oriented. Few if any overdubs. Lyrics enclosed.

THE POLICE

Reggatta De Blanc - A&M SP-4792-W Rock

Suggested List \$8.98

Another energetic rock release from the British trio who established themselves with their last set, Outlandos D'Amour. The new album is very basic, with all parts performed by the group using guitars, bass and drums, and very few overdubs. Side one is somewhat heavier than side two, mostly driving rock. Side two ranges down from hard rock to near pop energy, with a taste of reggae thrown in. FM radio supported the group's debut, with the addition of a hit single in Roxanne. The new set is not quite as well equipped for AM radio, but should increase the band's FM profile and their following in general. Produced by the group and Nigel Gray at Surrey Sound in England.

STAN GETZ

Children Of The World - Columbia JC-35992-H Jazz

Suggested List \$8.98

For veteran sax virtuoso Getz, a fun project in honour of the International Year of the Child. Children Of The World is not a children's release, nor is it likely to appeal to pre-teens, but it is an excellently constructed easy jazz set which should appeal to a very wide demographic, not only jazz enthusiasts. All the material was written, arranged and conducted by Lalo Schiffrin, with the exception of Don't Cry For Me Argentina from Evita. The set was produced by Getz, using a wide range of the top jazz musicians on the continent (including Schiffrin, Stanley Clarke and Paulinho da Costa), and ranges in sound from the playful to the poignant. Thorough liner notes included on inner sleeve.

THE SINCEROS

The Sound Of Sunbathing - Columbia JC-36134-H Pop/rock

Suggested List \$8.98

An exciting new outing from a new pop band from Britain. The term pop here doesn't necessarily indicate Top 40. The group have a driving sound, but smoothly produced, neither too heavy nor too light. Guitarist/vocalist Mark Kjeldsen wrote eight out of ten songs, with one each from keyboard player/vocalist Don Snow and bassist/vocalist Ron Francois. Apart from the group's instrumental sound, which is tight and easy to listen to, the band's three part harmonies, which appear throughout the set but are not overused, are full and rich. The songs are well written on standard themes and several cuts could do well as singles. The entire LP could gain solid FM support as well. Produced by Joe Wissert in London.

PolyGram's Eric Clapton sets for 1980 world tour

Noted British guitarist/singer/songwriter Eric Clapton, who has achieved world success through his recent albums on the RSO label, is gearing up for a massive world tour in 1980 which will take him behind the Iron Curtain for the first time.

The tour begins in early November and will cover Iron Curtain countries Poland, Czechoslovakia and Yugoslavia, as well as Israel, Austria, Japan, Thailand, the Philippines, Hong Kong and Britain.

For the tour, Clapton has put together an all-British band comprised of keyboard player Chris Stainton, bassist Dave Markee, drummer Henry Spinetti and guitarist Albert Lee. Lee, heavily accredited on both sides of the ocean, toured with Clapton through Britain in 1978.

Prior to embarking on the British leg of the tour, Clapton will begin work on a new album to follow the international success Backless. The album is expected for release in the spring tying in with U.K. dates. Backless, like its RSO predecessor Slowhand, achieved platinum status in Canada.

PolyGram releases early set from John Stewart

Veteran singer-songwriter John Stewart finally achieved international recognition last year with his first major hit album, Bombs Away Dream Babies, on the PolyGram-distributed RSO label. The album also included the smash hit Gold and another highly successful single, Midnight Wind.

Now PolyGram have released Fire In The Wind, a previously recorded Stewart album, his first for RSO and not previously released in Canada. The album is the predecessor to Bombs Away Dream Babies, and is being released due to fan response to the latest album. The set was self-produced and contains original material. What it doesn't contain is the performance and production assistance of Fleetwood Mac members Lindsey Buckingham and Stevie Nicks present on Bombs Away. The result is an equally distinctive equally well-performed, written and produced effort lacking only the association with the supergroup which helped break the last album.

Stewart, long established in the U.S. as a major cult figure, began his career in the early sixties with the Furies, later becoming leader of the Cumberland Three and ultimately joining noted folk group the Kingston Trio. Since the trio's dissolution in 1967, Stewart has recorded a long series of successful but not breakthrough albums, as well as achieving covers on a number of his songs. One of them, Daydream Believer, became a major hit for the Monkees and has recently been issued on Anne Murray's new album.

Bruce Allen changes gears after BTO

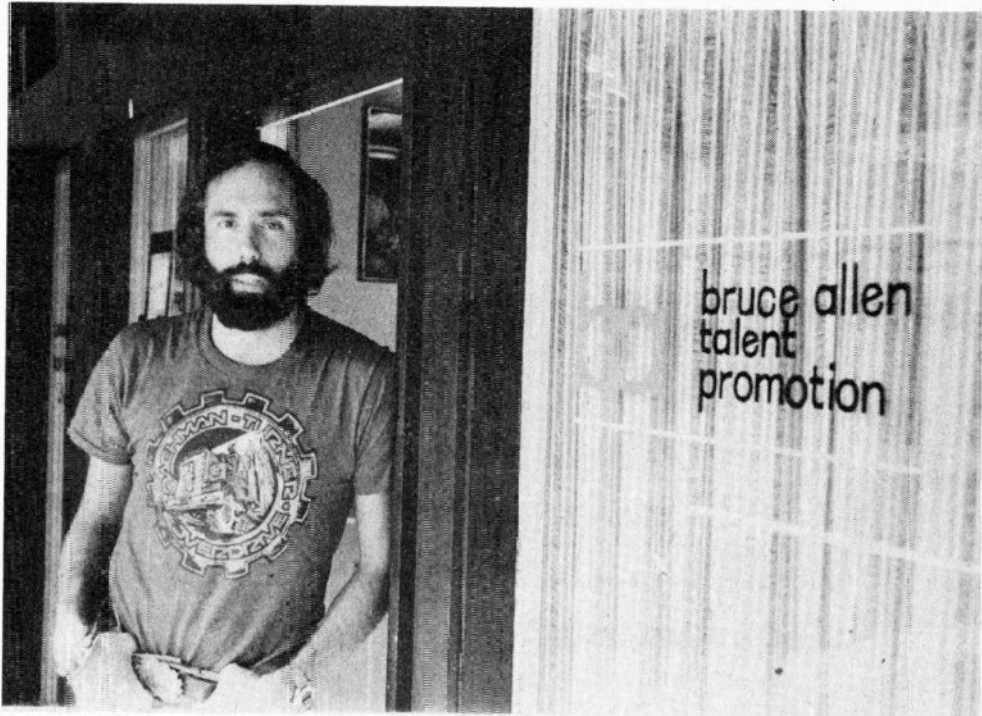
At their height in 1974, Bachman Turner Overdrive became a catalyst that spurred other bands on the west coast to emulate their success. Since then, there has been a steady increase in world calibre entertainment from Vancouver - a growth that has not been matched by a proportionate increase in personal managers. Bruce Allen still rules the west in the field of industry wheeling and dealing. Of late, he has mellowed in temperament, expanded his artist roster, and removed himself from the day to day operations of the booking business. Longtime partner Sam Feldman has moved into different quarters to handle the newly created S.L. Feldman & Associates booking agency. While Allen maintains a financial interest in the agency, he prefers to shift his fulltime energies towards artist representation. He dismisses rumours about a rift between Feldman and himself.

"There were so many things coming out of one office, that to do anything properly we had to make a decision to separate. People think there's a split up, but the money is divided the same way it always was. Nothing's happened - Sam's just opened up a new division. It's like Woodwards having a store on Hastings Street and another one in Oakridge."

Observers who have kept pace with Allen over the years have noticed a definite philosophy for how he conducts business. For instance, those who help him break a group in the early stages can count on being around afterwards when the act is better established. This would only appear to be common sense, but it's surprising how many band managers ignore those who laboured to break early ground for them.

I'm not in favour of what the Bee Gees did, selling all their dates to Concerts West, because there was a Donald K. Donald who was there when they were hungry - putting them into the Queen Elizabeth Theatre in front of a three quarters full house. All of a sudden they get big and pass him by. I hope I will always be there with the little guy who helps my act when they're coming up. That's my philosophy, because anyone could promote Rod Stewart tomorrow and sell out like that. That doesn't take talent. The real promoter is the guy who busts his ass at the low level and sells those tickets when you're not a household word."

Consistent with this view, Allen has rewarded those within his organization who have shown loyalty and skill over the years. Craig MacDowell runs MCM, an in-house company that produces all concerts for Prism and Trooper west of Thunder Bay. As well, more responsibility has been delegated to road managers like Gary Bouchard and Jean LaLoge. This has been an important move because Bruce Allen has increasingly found himself tied down in Vancouver, looking after administrative details for Prism, Bryan Adams, Lover Boy, Dogstar and independent record pro-

ducers Bruce Fairbairn and Jim Vallance. Ask Allen why he and Sam Feldman are still about the only game in town when it comes to professional management, and he'll seize the opportunity to expound upon a favourite subject.

"One of my pet peeves in this industry is that a lot of agents tend to pass themselves off as managers when they aren't. It's just an extra way for them to grind some money out of groups who can't really afford it. There's only a certain period of time when a group needs a manager. They sure as hell don't need one when they're working in bars - they need an agent. Management is needed when a group has a tape of original material and wants to secure a record deal. There's just too many people in this town masquerading as managers."

Involvement with BTO paid him some tidy dividends, but Bruce Allen insists that a good manager does not necessarily have to be wealthy. In fact, he is against the practise of advancing money to clients on the grounds that it kills initiative. He feels the good manager is the one who knocks on every door in sight to advance an artist's career. The shoddy manager is the one who flourishes by preying on an artist's ego.

"The reason they can get away with it is very simple - when a BTO, Heart, Prism, or Trooper make it, there's a lot of groups who think they're just as good. Naturally they have a lot of pride and wonder why they aren't discovered. They're so desperate to get out of the bar and high school circuit that they grasp at anything. There

have been some terrible deals that have gone down and there are groups in this town that are never going to make a cent off records. They've either given it all away or have very low point deals and would have to sell two million records to start making money."

One band with no such worries is Bachman Turner Overdrive. So far little has been said about the superstar quartet that first brought Allen his notoriety. Apparently the band is in retirement, but it's a source of pride with their manager that the guys are set for life and will never have to reunite to make some quick dollars playing revival shows. For Allen, life goes on - albeit at a less aggressive pace than in the BTO era. Along with Prism, he's made the adjustment to going into the same halls where BTO used to headline but as a second or third on the bill. This role reversal may grate a bit, but then there's too many challenges lying ahead for him to lose sleep over it.

"I had a reputation for being a shouter and a screamer and I can still do that, but I don't need to anymore. I'm established now and people know what I'm doing so I don't have to beat my chest every day to prove it. I also feel that I'm relating better to my acts - I used to think of them as straight product, but there are people behind those drums, guitars and microphones. It's a very interesting transformation and I think with the two separate offices I'll have more time to sit here and discuss things with them as associates instead of as employees."

Ain't Misbehavin'

strides and struts for
Fats Waller

Rent parties, stride piano, places like The Cotton Club, Connie's Inn and the Apollo were signs of the times and an integral part of life within New York's Harlem district in the 1930's. Existence was day-to-day, with music and dance reigning supreme as a vent for everyday uncertainties and frustrations. Ordinary people played the roles, while stride piano legend Fats Waller provided the heart, soul, and

much of the soundtrack to a period of America's musical past that lasted almost two decades.

About two years ago, an East 73rd Street company calling themselves The Manhattan Theatre Club took it upon themselves to bring back the music and lifestyle that was Fats Waller. With an idea conceived by Murray Horwitz and Richard Maltby Jr., and under Maltby's direction, the M.T.C. produced and presented *Ain't Misbehavin'* as part of their 1977-1978 Season of Contemporary Plays and Musical Evenings. In almost no time, the cabaret style production began to draw positive reaction and more crowds than the tiny theatre could hold, thus warranting a shot at the proverbial big time. There were no letdowns when *Ain't Misbehavin'* opened on Broadway at the Longacre Theatre on May 9, 1978. In fact, not one New York reviewer had anything less than acclaim for the musical. When the dust finally cleared, the *Ain't Misbehavin'* troupe had much to show for their efforts, including three Tony Awards, the New York Drama Critics' Circle Award, the Outer Critics' Circle Award and the Drama Desk Award, all under the category of best musical during the 1977-1978 season. Richard Maltby Jr. received a Tony for Best Director of a Musical, and to top matters off, the RCA original cast soundtrack album picked up a Grammy Award. The Broadway success of *Ain't Misbehavin'* became an event to be shared and spawned five subsequent touring companies, one that went across the Atlantic to become a London hit. Most recently, the musical has rolled northwards for a spree of dates in most major Canadian cities, as well as the current two and a half month stop at

Toronto's Royal Alexandra Theatre from October 15 to December 1. Repeating his role as Musical Director, this time with the national tour, Richard Maltby Jr. brings to Toronto a tight two act package of over 30 memorable numbers that recreate the magic of Fats Waller's era. Performers Evan Bell, Debra Byrd, Yvonne Taylor, Jackie Lowe and Lonnie McNeil are accompanied onstage by a six piece band led by conductor/pianist J. Leonard Oxley. The cast sing and dance their way through such Waller classics as Honeysuckle Rose, Your Feet's Too Big, Mean To Me and I Can't Give You Anything But Love, in an energetic expose revealing much of the character, charm and wit of the 300 pound jazzman.

Thomas (Fats) Waller was a true to life jolly fat man, and was gifted as composer, musician and singer. He had a natural sense of humour and his overindulgence in women, booze and food made him a legend in his time. Often regarded as one of the best known black entertainers, Fats was born to deeply religious parents in Greenwich Village in 1904. Fats' father firmly believed that jazz was the devil's music, which probably explains why he reared his son on classical piano and church organ. Fats' professional career began as an organist at the 135th Street Lincoln Theatre and under the wing of his mentor, the great stride pianist James P. Johnston, Fats Waller soon became a popular name within New York music circles and rent parties. His increasing popularity and the success of a number of tunes he composed for the musicals *Keep Shufflin'* and *Hot Chocolate*, earned Fats a rather restrictive recording contract with RCA Victor, restrictive in

the sense that he was pushed in to a mold that produced, as one Toronto journalist put it, "some of the silliest tunes ever dreamed up." That mold, as more of a jazz comedian, became hard to shake, and the serious side of Fats Waller was seldom understood. But even with the strings attached, Fats often managed to pull the wool over, by slipping jazz licks and quips into many of his songs. Life to the hilt, seasoned generously with gin, caught up with Fats Waller at an early age. Twice married and the father of two children, he died at the age of 39 aboard the *Sante Fe Chief* near Kansas City, leaving behind an unparalleled past, much of it on sheet music and captured on record.

RCA's Jack Feeney, President of Sunbury/Dunbar Music Publishing, Manager of Country A&R, recalls seeing Fats perform on two occasions in the late '30's, once at Toronto's Shea's Theatre, formerly occupying the same site as the new city hall, and again at Burlington's former lakeside hub of activity, The Brant Inn. "He (Fats) always seemed to have a drink by his side," marvels Feeney, "but it never seemed to affect his playing. He had a driving style that kept the band going." That same style recreated in the stage presentation of *Ain't Misbehavin'*, (interestingly subtitled, *The New Fats Waller Musical Show*) has been recorded under RCA's classical Red Seal label and features a double album set by the original Broadway cast. The package was released late in 1978 and has since enjoyed a Grammy Award, and substantial success on both sides of the border, and of course has been going extremely well in Canada in tandem with the musical's tour dates.

Feldman steps out with new plans and new agency

In an industry that's inundated with calling cards and personalized stationery, Sam Feldman's new letterhead will undoubtedly grab its fair share of eyeballs. Set against a beige background is a telephone dial, with the 'dialing' holes actually embossed onto the surface. To properly look after the interests of Trooper and Doug & The Slugs, Feldman has to rely heavily on his telephone. As well, his new company S.L. Feldman and Associates must double as a booking agency - an agency that will try to revive the glory days of its predecessor, Bruce Allen Talent. That agency was first established by Bruce Allen back in 1966. In 1972 he offered Sam Feldman a partnership in the firm, and the two went on to become a very winning combination.

One boom year followed another until recently when the disco explosion, combined with his own yearning to be a full-time manager, convinced Allen to get out of the booking side of the business. Equally ambitious to expand his managerial profile, Feldman was willing to oversee the agency's rebirth. The partners subsequently agreed on a name change - S. L. Feldman & Associates and on a relocation to the rapidly expanding False Creek district.

The new company boasts three agents - Brian Wadsworth, Elaine Chick and Rob Hoskins. Noting a resurgence for live music in Vancouver and in interior cities like Kamloops and Prince George, Feldman feels confident that the trio will be able to grab off a sizeable share of the B.C. market. Alberta is still a going concern but Feldman points out that the Calgary office of Bruce Allen Talent is now owned by Dennis Tkach and is run as a franchise.

Until very recently, Trooper was Sam Feldman's only client when it came to personal management. Having helped to establish them as one of Canada's most successful acts, Feldman now feels able to expand the roster. Incoming artists like Doug & The Slugs are virtually assured of receiving expert guidance in all phases of their career. Office manager Ingrid Moll also happens to have a thorough knowledge of immigration laws. This is an invaluable asset for any band that has to tour internationally. While accountant Harry Wanstall and publicist Alison Glass still base out of Bruce Allen's Gastown complex, the graphics team of James O'Mara and David Sharpe now have space in Feldman's office. Another important tenant is Overdrive Trips, A trucking company of which Feldman is a director. Managed by Greg Skaaravik, it turns a profit by going coast to coast with in-house groups, bands like Trooper and Prism, and with outside acts like The Allman Brothers, Chilliwack, Heart and Supertramp.

The Feldman office was recently completed when road manager Randy Berswick was given a much expanded role with Trooper and Linda Wolfe was hired as a secretary. Feldman admits that it would now be very easy to go on a signing spree that would fill his stable with new talent. For now, his hands are full with Doug &

The Slugs and he wants them to be like Trooper in getting the best shot possible for stardom.

"Major artists are big business and, as much as they might appear to be carefree rebels, they're just as concerned with their longterm livelihood as you or I. We've all heard horror stories from the 1950's of artists who signed a contract, got a Cadillac, sold millions of records, and never saw a penny. You have to be business-like to protect the artist and to prevent that from happening. You've also got to be creative with your input to the artist and to the record company that is going to promote him."

A number one priority for Feldman is to get Doug & The Slugs a major record deal. Already there is a "buzz" from many North American companies, but Feldman suggests that if the right European deal came along he'd listen. Totally unique, Doug & The Slugs have virtually come out of nowhere to win themselves a devoted audience in the last year. Himself a fan, Feldman is amazed at what they accomplished at the grassroots level.

"Tell me another group, on the verge

of overexposure in their hometown, that can go into a 1200 seat venue (The Commodore) and sell it out at \$6 a ticket? The band is very charismatic, but the opposite of Vegas schtick. Because they injected creativity into their act from square one, they're an inspiration for other groups that want to get to the top of the ladder right away. Certainly the audiences are there to support them."

Burning both ends of the candle with Trooper and Doug & The Slugs, Feldman seems to have his game plan pretty well mapped out for the months ahead. However, he's aware that future finds may depend on how smoothly his booking agency runs. For that reason alone he's willing to put a lot of time and energy into realizing that goal.

"I've definitely had to take a step backwards to reinvolve myself at the working level of the agency to see it stays active and successful. But it's an integral part of this whole operation because it keeps new artists working and gaining experience so that one day they can develop into something that can be marketed at an international level." - **Richard Skelly**

Edmonton writer Archbold moves east to Toronto

Don Archbold, Edmonton producer and songwriter, is pulling up stakes and moving to Toronto. Archbold has scored the music for many documentaries as well as CBC radio and television shows and independent films.

Much of his Edmonton work involved Damon Productions as well as productions for Jack Hennig. He has been involved in

a local CBC radio show that teaches music appreciation to children as well as a daily CBC television show titled Country Joy. Archbold has recently scored the music for an independent film titled Parallals.

Archbold's move to Toronto was prompted by a need for his type of services and the obvious track record that he has established in the Edmonton area.

London readies Aznavour, Claudja Barry releases

London Records of Canada are preparing for the release of major albums from Charles Aznavour and Claudja Barry.

The Aznavour release, titled *We Were Happy Then*, is London's first product ever from the world-renowned French MOR artist. It comes through London's brand new agreement with New York-based DRG Records, through which London has acquired Canadian manufacturing and distribution on the label.

The album is a brand new English language release, sung by Aznavour, featuring all new material. It was recorded in London, England, and is being slated for an early November release.

London is also readying a fourth album from disco artist Claudja Barry. Barry, a native of Jamaica, was raised in Toronto, now lives in Germany but still qualifies as a Canadian, making her own compositions Cancon. The new album, *Feel The Fire*, will be shipped in early November, with the title cut issued as a single in mid-October. It was again produced by Barry's manager, Jurgen Korduletsch, recorded in Germany for release on the London-distrib-

uted Lollipop label.

The set is a follow-up to Barry's major breakthrough album, *I Wanna Be Loved By You*, which is gold in Canada. The last album also included the smash hit (*Boogie Woogie*) *Dancin' Shoes*, which has sold almost 250,000 units in Canada.

Joe Woodhouse to handle Party Time novelty line

Joe Woodhouse, a veteran of record sales and promotion and most recently with Tree House, has taken a slightly different direction and is now associate agent for Party Time Novelties. He will be based in London, Ontario and will cover the southwest portion of the province. The line comprises horns, balloons, blowups and other children's favourites for such occasions as Halloween, Easter, Christmas, birthdays etc.

Woodhouse will be covering major chains including Simpson's, Sears, K-Mart, Zellers, Miracle Mart and Towers.

RCA's John Ellis tours Maritimes

RCA recording artist John Ellis, currently on release with his VIK/RCA single, Captain Courageous, recently made a promotion tour of the Maritimes where he found the red carpet treatment from many of the radio stations on his circuit.

With his first release for the VIK label, Ellis has established himself as a contemporary rock and adult-oriented performer which gives him a wide scope on which to promote his new album and follow-up singles.

PolyGram ready new album from U.K.'s Boomtown Rats

PolyGram Canada are preparing for the imminent release of a new album by British rock group the Boomtown Rats. The album, titled *The Fine Art Of Surfacing*, will be the group's third release on the PolyGram-distributed Mercury label (and on CBS' Epic label in the U.S.).

Release of the album comes shortly on the heels of the North American release of the group's current single, *I Don't Like Mondays*. The controversial single is a smash hit in Britain, where it is about to become only the 25th platinum record in the country's history. In Canada, the single is already achieving major airplay success and solid early sales. The airplay includes chart numbers at CHUM Toronto, CFUN Vancouver and CKLC Kingston.

Reaction to the album, even before release, has been heavier than ever for the six-piece rock group led by Bob Geldof. Advance orders on the album have PolyGram confident the set will outsell the group's self-titled debut and more recent *A Tonic For The Troops*.

London to distribute Montreal's Unidisc Recs.

London Records of Canada have announced the signing of an agreement whereby London will distribute the Montreal-based Unidisc Records label in Canada, effective October 15. The deal was concluded by London's Gary Chalmers and George Cuccuzella, head of Unidisc.

The Unidisc roster includes two major disco artists already achieving trade chart notices in both Canada and the U.S. They are teen star Freddie James, currently successful on RPM's pop chart as well as international disco charts, and Kat Mandu, who are currently on the U.S. trade disco charts. Upcoming further product on the Unidisc label includes an album and 12" from Hydro, a 12" single from *Night-life Unlimited*, and an album and 12" from Tangerue.

CBS/Epic to distribute new Pavillion label

CBS Records Canada have announced the completion of a worldwide distribution pact wherein CBS' Epic Records label will distribute the new Pavillion Records label out of the U.S. The label is owned by heavy-weight producer John Luongo. Luongo is best known as co-producer of albums by such artists as the Jacksons, Deniece Williams, Sly Stone, Melba Moore and Jackie Moore, among others.

The first release on the new Pavillion label will be a single and 12" by Canadian vocalist Barbara Law. Titled *Take All Of Me*, the single was produced by noted Canadian producer Harry Hinde, whose credits include the Raes. The single will be the title track of Law's upcoming Pavillion album debut. It qualifies as two parts Canadian content.

Rockin' Deltones new band at T.O.'s Isabella

The Lower East Side room downstairs at Toronto's Isabella Hotel has a new house band, a rockabilly group called the Rockin' Deltones. The move to install a house band downstairs follows the hotel's continuing success with the Cameo Blues Band, who play regularly at the upstairs Cameo Room.

The Rockin' Deltones are led by pianist Scott Cushnie, a veteran musician on the Toronto scene and a survivor of the original rock & roll movement of the late 50's and early 60's. Cushnie, as a teenager, toured the South with one of Ronnie Hawkins' early groups, which also included Levon Helm and Fred Carter. In addition to participation in several local bands and performing his own material in piano bars, Cushnie also has the distinction of having toured with Boston-based heavy metal group Aerosmith.

Joining Cushnie in the nucleus of the group are lead guitarist/vocalist Mitchell Lewis and the long-term rhythm section of bassist Terry Wilkins and drummer Bucky Berger. They will be joined from time to time by other musicians, and guest players will fill in for regular members involved in other projects. For the next few weeks, for instance, Ron Hedland is replacing drummer Berger, who is touring Europe with singer Jack Grunsky.

The Lower East Side is a small room, but its policy of hiring top roots-oriented music has kept it constantly packed for years. Spokespeople for the club expressed their feeling that the Rockin' Deltones will continue to pack the club over the foreseeable future.

Robin Williams Casablanca debut LP gold in Canada

Reality - What A Concept, the debut album of noted comic/actor Robin Williams on the Casablanca label, has been certified gold in Canada with sales beyond the 50,000 unit mark. For Williams, who is best known for his starring role as the alien Mork on the highly successful Mork & Mindy television series, the album is a return to the clubs and the stand-up comedy

of his roots.

The success of the album's another step in a meteorically rising career. In addition to the album and another season of Mork & Mindy, Williams continues to perform in the occasional major club. He is also writing a screenplay and has been signed to star in the title role of Paramount's upcoming feature film Popeye.

Epic's Highstreet tour Canada in support of LP

Epic recording group Highstreet, a Sherbrooke, Quebec-based rock group with a strong sense of roots, are currently completing a major national tour of Canada in support of their debut album on the Epic label, *She Won't Be Waiting*.

The tour began last June at Montreal's new Pretzel Enchaîne room, and was followed by a big outdoor concert in Sherbrooke, presented by radio station CKTS and attended by about 5,000 people. Highstreet then toured the Maritimes for three weeks, topped off by a very successful date at the Misty Moon in Halifax. The Maritimes swing was followed by a western tour, which has included dates at the Place in Lethbridge, two appearances at Calgary's Refinery, Harpo's in Victoria, and Gary Taylor's Rock Room and the Savoy in Vancouver. During the western swing of the tour, Highstreet also opened for James Cotton in Banff and Jasper, Alberta, and for Doucette at the Pacific Coliseum in Vancouver.

On their return home to Quebec, the group will be appearing at the Southwood in Winnipeg, the Continental in Thunder Bay, Ottawa's Carlton University and Dollar Bill's in Kingston.

In the meantime, CBS are now releasing

the group's debut single on Epic titled *Bad Life*. The single is from the debut album, and was remixed at Toronto's Sounds Interchange by independent producer Stacy Heydon.

PolyGram have released a new double album from Casablanca recording group the Village People. The new set is titled *Live And Sleazy*. The release follows the announcement that lead vocalist Victor Willis had left the group, to be replaced by newcomer Ray Simpson, brother of Ashford & Simpson's Valerie Simpson.

The double set is actually two completely different albums packaged into one set. The first album is a live recording, featuring former singer Willis and including such major hits for the group as *Macho Man*, *Y.M.C.A.* and *In The Navy*. The second album, featuring Simpson, is a new studio set which includes the band's new single,

Sleazy. The single is available in both seven and twelve-inch configurations.

The *Sleazy* part of the set also shows a marked change in the direction for the top selling group. The Village People are coming out of a straight disco format and moving into new wave influenced rock sound. PolyGram described the sound as "rougher, tougher and meaner."

The album is the fifth release from the Village People, following the multiple platinum self-titled debut, *Macho Man*, *Cruisin'* and *Go West*. Their above-mentioned hit singles are also all at least platinum in Canada.

PolyGram issue second LP from Toronto group Saga

PolyGram Canada are currently releasing a second album from Toronto-based progressive rock group Saga. The album, titled *Images At Twilight*, was produced at Toronto's Phase One Studios by Paul Gross, the same producer-studio combination that handled the group's debut album. The new set is being scheduled for a near-simultaneous release worldwide. The debut album has now been released in North America, Japan and most European territor-

ies on the Polydor label.

The five-piece rock group are led creatively by the songwriting team of bass player Jim Crichton and lead vocalist Michael Sadler. The two are joined by Ian Crichton, Greg Chadd and Steve Negus.

The album contains eight original compositions, and PolyGram describe it as "an exciting development of the potential demonstrated on the debut LP."

PolyGram releases Rats' I Don't Like Mondays

PolyGram have released in Canada the controversial British hit single *I Don't Like Mondays* by Ensign/Mercury recording group the Boomtown Rats. The single, not previously available on album, was written when group leader Bob Geldof read an article about a 16-year-old girl in San Diego who shot and killed two men and wounded eight children in a schoolyard, and later explained to police that the reason for the shootings was "I don't like Mondays." The single is a major hit in Britain, a number one chart item for several weeks, with sales in excess of 900,000 units in the U.K. alone.

The single sparked major controversy in the U.S. when the girl's lawyer protested its issue in the U.S., where the group's product is released on Columbia, claiming release would prejudice the girl's trial.

Meanwhile, the group have completed recording of their upcoming third album on Ensign/Mercury, containing the single. The album was produced in Holland by Mutt Lange, and most of the material

is again written by Geldof. The band have embarked on a major British tour, which will include three dates at the prestigious Hammersmith Odeon in London.

Zappa PolyGram debut Sheik Yerbouti Cdn. gold

PolyGram have announced CRIA certification of a gold album (50,000 units sold) for Frank Zappa's *Sheik Yerbouti*, the artist's debut album since his signing with PolyGram and the initiation of his own Zappa label. PolyGram spokespersons also note Canada was the first country in the world to achieve gold on the album, which also produced Zappa's first ever chart single in *Dancin' Fool*.

Zappa has recently released his second album on the Zappa label, a set titled *Joe's Garage, Act 1*. The album is a concept set based loosely on the rock & roll life. The underlying plot is a futuristic society, policed by a narrator known as the Central Scrutinizer, in which music becomes illegal. Central characters include a rock band called *Toad-O* (one cut is titled *Toad-O Line!*), Joe, who owns the garage, and his girlfriend Mary, who leaves him to run off with the band and their roadies. The set is constructed in the form of a play, with an enclosed fold-out containing lyrics, scenarios and other information. The story is left unfinished, an open invitation to an 'act two' on some future project.

Dire Straits' Communique Canadian double platinum

Communique, the second album release of Mercury recording group Dire Straits, has been certified double platinum for Canada by the CRIA, with sales in excess of 200,000 units. For the four-piece British group, led by the songwriting, lead vocals and lead guitar of Mark Knopfler, this achievement again stresses the young group's very rapid rise to international prominence. Only two years ago, they began rehearsing in a London flat.

Communique joins the success of the group's debut album, a self-titled effort which is well beyond triple platinum status in Canada. A single release from the debut, *Sultans Of Swing*, is gold (75,000 units). From the current album, the first single, *Lady Writer*, is receiving solid airplay on both AM and FM, and a follow-up, *Once Upon A Time In The West*, is being prepared for release shortly.

I Was Made For Lovin' You Kiss' 1st platinum single

Casablanca recording group Kiss have achieved their first ever platinum single with their current smash hit, *I Was Made For Lovin' You*, the first release taken from their highly successful *Dynasty* album on the PolyGram distributed label. The single has sold in excess of 150,000 units in Canada.

In fact, the current album and single have become the group's first major hits worldwide. The album achieved gold status in France, the four-piece band's first ever European gold. The single, boosted by very rapid and solid acceptance from programmers and the group's first disco support has also achieved top ten positions in Holland, Belgium, Germany, South Africa and the U.S., as well as Canada, where it is a number one hit.

The New York-based group, noted for their outrageous stage show, their white-face masks, lighting, staging and pyrotechnics, recently performed at Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens and the Montreal Forum before large, enthusiastic audiences, garnering very favourable press reaction.

PolyGram ready new LP by Virgin group XTC

PolyGram have slated October for release of a third album on the Virgin label by British rock group XTC. The album, titled *Drums And Wires*, follows their self-titled debut and follow-up, *Go 2*, which established a following for the group in Canada.

Drums And Wires features the addition of guitarist David Gregory. Gregory replaces keyboard player Barry Andrews, who has left the group to tour with Iggy Pop. Of the 13 cuts on the album, five are written by member Colin Moulding and seven by Andy Partridge. The set includes the group's current British single, *Making Plans For Nigel*.

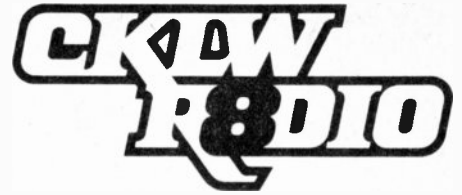

DANCE MUSIC HYPE

While it is surely known that the city of Toronto is bigger than the island of Malta, the record industry is booming here. Because of its size, its not because of domestically produced product, but rather from the large influx of imported product.

Although because of its nearness, a large portion of this importing is from Italy, with Germany, France, Holland and for the latest in disco - England seems to be the best source. Although disco is extremely popular here due to radio (Radio Luxembourg is easily received, as is Malta Cable 2), but even the latest in Country & Western is very well received here. Beautiful Body by the Bellamy Brothers is a smash here, and according to record retailers Charley Pride and Jim Reeves are very popular.

Most, if not all use the British Top 75 charts as a purchasing guideline. Most feel that that is the only chart to go by - Music Week and another called The Dealer, also from England. The price range is almost typical of any country, a 7" 45 is about 60p or about \$1.75 from Italy and 75p for those from England or France. 12"

singles here are not like the U.S.A. or Canada (who use the 12" particularly to market disco product) the cost for all countries is 1.50 pounds (\$4.25) and considerably cheaper than in America. The LP is quite expensive though, at 3.50 pounds it works out to about \$10.00 and only West Germany and the U.K. are that high in price. The biggest shock was seeing Boney M.'s new LP, An Oceans Fantasy selling for 5.25 pounds in London.

But disco is very much alive here. Michael Jackson's Don't Stop Till You Get Enough is very big in Malta, as is You Can Do It by Al Hudson and Last Train by Ladies Choice, which was mentioned as an import in Disco Hype a few weeks ago. New Wave Disco is also gaining strength here, marking heavily with the B52's and Gary Numan's Cars (which is currently No. 1 in England. The Knack was also a big success here as well.

With contemporary pop and oldies also taking the radio time, record sales in Malta depend on (when it comes to disco) its strength of radio. Everyone has a radio in their home, and the discotheque scene is very embryonic here at this time. In that comparison, there is a long evening out period ahead but still, the shops are extremely well equipped for a viable industry on the lovely island.

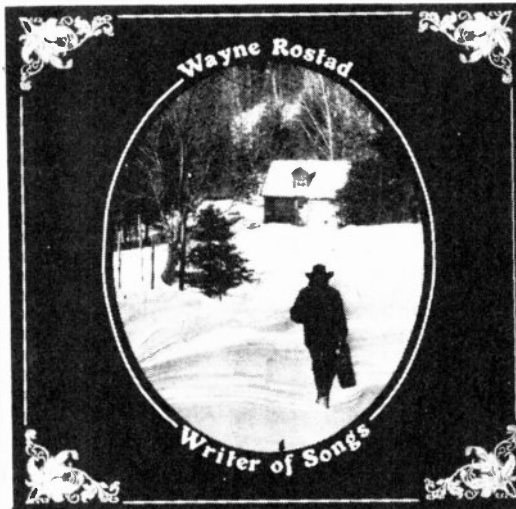

Canada's Morning Music to run Cash's publishing

In a move described as a milestone in the Canadian music publishing industry, Mississauga-based Morning Music, a division of the Boot Group, has entered into an agreement to administer internationally a major U.S. publishing concern, namely the three publishing companies of country star Johnny Cash. The companies are House Of Cash, Song Of Cash and Family Of Man.

Morning Music will be handling the Cash catalogues from their head office just outside of Toronto. The move is not the first time Cash has become involved with business located in Canada. His personal manager for many years was Saul Holiff of London, Ontario, and he was recently signed to release an album in Canada and the U.S. through the Toronto-based Cachet Records.

Cash formed the publishing operations in 1969. Initially they published country music only, including not only Cash's songs but also those of the Carter Family, brother Tommy Cash, the Statler Brothers, Dick Feller and Billy Edd Wheeler. More recently, the operation has expanded into the field of contemporary music, including the songs of Cash's daughter Rosanne, a CBS artist married to WEA artist Rodney Crowell, and daughter Carlene Carter, a WEA artist married to CBS artist Nick Lowe. The firm also has signed noted country songwriter Billy Joe Shaver. Cash himself, having just concluded his 25th year in the music business, continues to

be one of the world's top selling male vocalists.

Morning Music was formed in 1970 by artist Stompin' Tom Connors, manager Jury Krytiuk and Toronto composer/arranger Mark Altman. The company has remained heavily involved in the promotion of Canadian copyrights around the world. Morning Music has also grown in the number of foreign catalogues it represents for Canada. Among them are Lawrence Welk's group of publishing catalogues, Ray Griff's Blue Echo Music, Jack Clement's Jack Music, TV and film movie firms Musicways and Filmways, and the Zomba firm, which includes the copyrights of such rock artists as City Boy, Graham Parker & The Rumour and Rachel Sweet.

In 1974, the firm began to acquire foreign administration rights for a number of major U.S. catalogues, leading to Morning Music playing an instrumental role in the international development of such artists as Don Williams and Crystal Gayle. Morning has also signed administrative agreements with a variety of Canadian publishing houses, including Ian Tyson's Speckled Bird Music, Liona Boyd's Mid Continental Publications, Fogo Music (Ryan's Fancy), Canadian Brass Publications, Mike Graham's Debar Music, Eddie Eastman's Puffin' Island Music, and V Music Company, a division of V Records.

Morning Music President Jury Krytiuk

asked why Cash would choose a Canadian firm to administer his publishing concerns, noted, "With the wonders of jet travel, Telex and the phone, the world has become much smaller in recent years. If we can get the job done as well as, or better than, one of our U.S. competitors, then why shouldn't John consider us?"

Alberta Slim rides again

Alberta Slim, a country music pioneer from the Prairies, has resurfaced with a new single Surrey Centennial Song b/w The Hanging Of Louis Riel. The grizzled veteran has resided on the west coast for the past few years, devoting much of his spare time to volunteer work for the cerebral palsy children's hospital. Royalties from his latest release will be donated to that hospital and Slim recently completed a mailing of the single to stations across Canada. Retail copies of the Gold Records release will be accompanied with a souvenir sleeve that traces the history of Surrey, a municipality which lies some twenty miles south of Vancouver.

The last major Alberta Slim project took place in 1974 when he released *Dief The Chief*, a compilation of speeches made by the late Prime Minister. His biggest fame was achieved back in the '40's on RCA

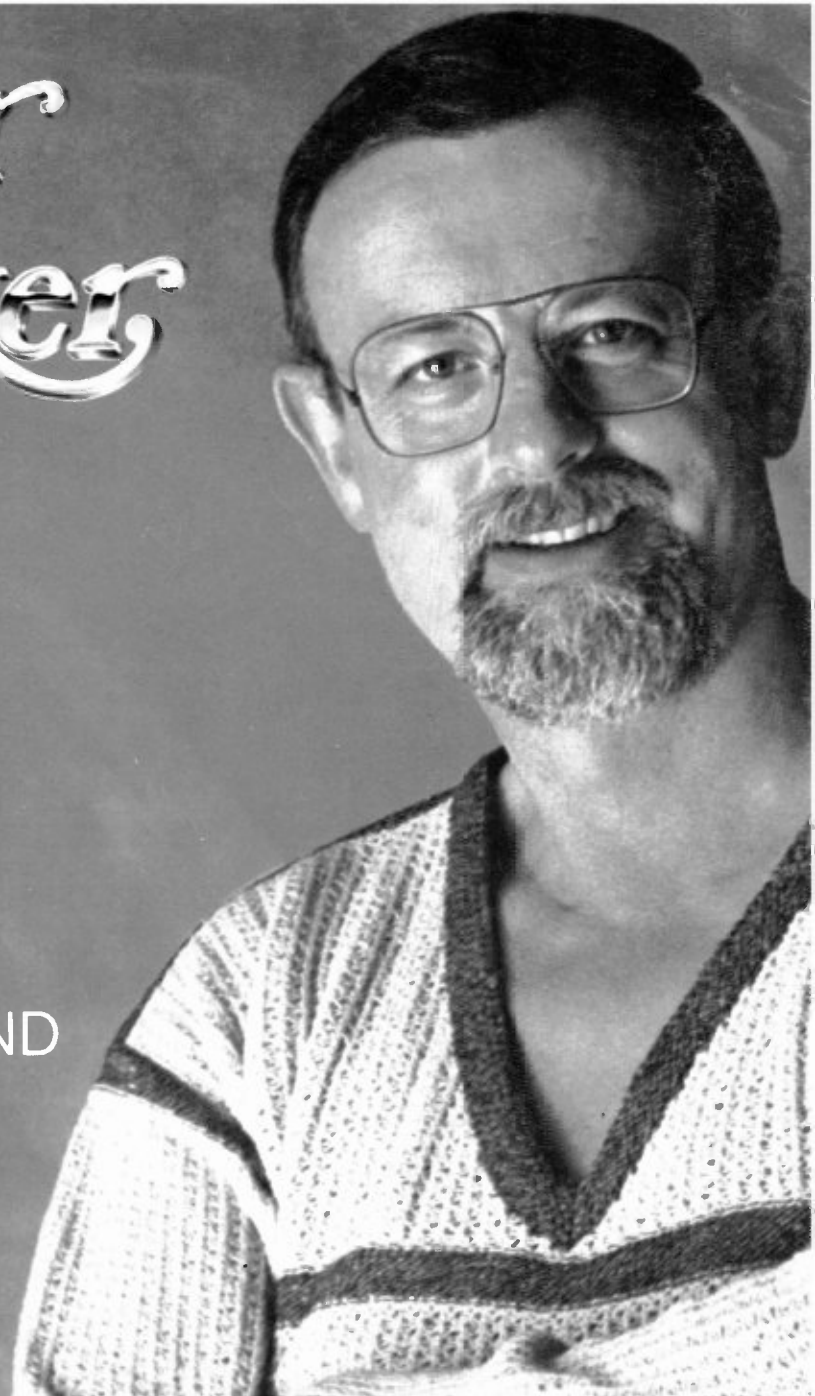
