Troubadour issues first kids' single from Raffi

Toronto: The Toronto-based Troubadour label has released a single by noted children's artist Raffi. The single titled *All I Really Need*, is from the artist's upcoming album *Baby Beluga*. The single is the first children's single ever released by Raffi, whose three children's albums have been landmark successes for the small independent label.

Raffi's first children's record, *Singable Songs For The Very Young*, became the first domestic children's record ever to achieve gold status in Canada, and more recently, became the first ever Canadian platinum children's LP. The artist's other two children's albums, *More Singable Songs* and *Corner Grocery Store*, are also gold in Canada.

Raffi has just completed a highly successful ten-show tour of Newfoundland. All shows were sold out. The artist is currently involved in an unusual radio-department store cross-promotion. As part of a series of stars on the Canadian scene, Raffi is being interviewed by CKEY's Jim

Paulson live from Trinity Way at the Eaton Centre in Toronto. Other guests in the series include sports stars Rick Bosetti and Wayne Gretsky, broadcaster/writer Barbara Amiel and the Canadian Brass.

In addition to his recording career, Raffi is a frequent touring artist. Future dates include a major fall tour highlighted by two shows at Toronto's Convocation Hall (Nov. 8-9).

All I Really Need is being packaged in a special single sleeve. A&M, who distribute the Troubadour label, are confident the single is capable of achieving radio airplay.

Cooper no-show causes riots at Toronto's CNE

Toronto: For the third time this summer, a major outdoor concert in Toronto has been marred by fan unrest and rioting, with over ten fans injured and over 30 arrested.

This time, the cause of the riots was the failure of Alice Cooper to appear at his August 19 concert at the CNE Grandstand. The Warner Bros. recording artist was slated to begin around 9:30 pm, following an opening act performance by Toronto group Zon. Shortly after ten, Cooper's lead guitarist Davey Johnstone told the roughly 13,000 fans that Cooper would appear shortly, and that his band would perform without him for a while.

After ten minutes went by and nothing happened, with the crowd growing more and more restless, Grandstand stage manager Richard Smerdon announced that Cooper was ill and had been admitted to hospital, causing the show to be cancelled. Later, however, CNE public relations staff allegedly denied that Cooper was in hospital, saying only that he was ill.

Upon hearing the concert was cancelled, many of the fans began to rampage, throwing chairs and debris and storming the stage. A number of people jumped the restraining gate between the audience and the stage, and a large number of fans surged toward the stage. This was followed by a barrage of bottles, frisbees and other debris. Thousands of chairs were thrown, many of them ending up in large piles and on the stage.

As a result of the chaos and the damage, the CNE was forced to cancel its August 20 Canadian group showcase spectacular, a concert intended to stimulate further interest in a number of Canadian groups. A spokesman at the Exhibition explained that the show was cancelled due to damage at the Grandstand and the CNE's inability to repair over 500 chairs in time for the performance. He added that fear of further crowd violence was not a factor. The Grandstand lineup is expected to continue as usual August 21 with Burton Cummings.

There have been two previous major incidents involving crowd violence at outdoor concerts this summer. On May 29, fans returning from a Goddo/Nash The Slash bill damaged a number of public transit vehicles and a subway station after leaving Ontario Place, and four days later, also at Ontario Place, 1,000 fans battled with Metro Toronto policemen for about two hours after being told they could not enter the Forum to see a Teenage Head/Segarini concert.

Anne Murray - - hanging on to superstardom

Toronto: It's been a typical month for Capitol recording artist Anne Murray. The Toronto-based chanteuse has just come off highly successful dates in the U.S. and stopped back in Toronto to pick up a few awards - - namely, double platinum for her *Let's Keep It That Way* album, gold on the new *Somebody's Waiting*, a CARAS award as Female Artist of the Decade and four Junos. Murray also gave another in a nearly endless series of interviews, this time in preparation for her already sold-out six days at the O'Keefe Centre in Toronto. The dates, August 26-31, have been sold out for over two months, making them the quickest sellout dates in 20 years at the O'Keefe.

For Murray, the O'Keefe dates will be her first at the prestigious hall. She has played every other major Toronto venue, from Massey Hall to the CNE, the Ontario Place Forum, the Imperial Room and even the Royal Alex, a stage not normally used for music concerts. All of her Toronto dates, like most of her appearances around the world, have sold out with an alacrity that has become predictable for Murray.

One unusual twist to the O'Keefe dates is that all net proceeds from the opening night show will go to the Canadian Save The Children Fund. Murray has been Honorary Chairman of Cansave for two years, an important involvement for her. "I'd always thought of getting involved in something like Save The Children. I used to see the ads on television all the time for those things, and I'd always write down the address and then lose it. Then in the Year of the Child, I got twigged. So I started making noises about getting involved in the Year of the Child. Canada Save The Children called. It's great. They're tremendous people, and they're very professional. It's been a good association."

Capitol readies a "bona fide greatest hits album"

Capitol is releasing a greatest hits package from Murray in the next few weeks. It marks her first hits set in over a decade of recording with the label. One reason it has taken so long is that Murray didn't want a hits package unless the songs were genuine hits. And they are, beginning with *Snowbird*, going through such early hits as *Danny's Song* and *Love Song*, and culminating in the recent flow of chart toppers, like *You Needed Me*, *I Just Fall In Love Again* and *Shadows In The Moonlight*. The final cut is

Murray's new contribution to the *Urban Cowboy* soundtrack, *Could I Have This Dance*, which will be released as a single from the hits album. That song should be another hit, and indeed, Murray is confident. "It sounds like it should do well - - it feels good to me. It's one of those things you feel every now and then about a song."

"It's really nice to be able to have a bona fide greatest hits album. We've talked about a greatest hits album in the past, but with fillers in it here and there. I've always said that I'd never allow it to happen unless it was real. It's a real milestone for me."

"It's funny," Murray continues. "I listened to the album the other night for the first time. It's in chronological order, and my whole life passed in front of my eyes - - the images that were conjured up, and the road and all. To have all those songs together on one album was just mind-boggling to me."

Sustained momentum makes Murray a superstar

Anne Murray is indeed a superstar worldwide. Any doubts of that were certainly erased when she was awarded a star on the Walkway Of Fame in Hollywood. Although she has had

hit records off and on throughout her career, the momentum needed to make a superstar has been evident mostly in the last two to three years.

Those years have been very good ones for Murray. "The momentum has been there, the kind of momentum that's required. I never did have it before. I had big hits, but they weren't consecutive big hits. There'd be a year, maybe two years in between. That's not the way it works." Of course, it is a relative statement - - many artists wait all their lives hoping for a hit the size of one of Murray's more modest successes. But it can still be discouraging. Murray recalls, "I had so many people saying to me, it's just a matter of time - - you know, that old intangible talk. I got sick of hearing it - - it was don't tell me about that, do something about it."

"But I guess timing has a lot to do with those things too. When the time was right, I was ready. In '77, it had been three years since I had had a hit. All of a sudden, *You Needed Me* came along. It was a shock, because I couldn't imagine why anyone would send it to me!" Written by Randy Goodrum, *You Needed Me* is generally hailed as one of the best songs ever written. Although it wasn't the first single released off *Let's Keep*

It That Way (it followed the country hit Walk Right Back), Murray felt the song was a hit from the first moment she recorded it. "I knew it was a hit. I just knew it. Maybe you can say that's easy to say in hindsight, but I said it then and I told everyone. It's a sentiment you can't deny. It's a wonderful song, and it's so simple. It's just one of those happy combinations of the music and the song and the person. It's magic."

The joys of motherhood

You Needed Me re-launched Anne Murray's climb to the top. "Then it was a matter of keeping that momentum going," notes the artist. "And then I had a baby!" Which brings us to the joys of motherhood. For most ladies in show business, motherhood delays the career, often halts it in its tracks. Oddly, Murray's two pregnancies (a son, William, in 1977 and a daughter, Dawn, last year) have drawn almost as much media attention as her hits. Thus, rather than hindering her career, motherhood has kept her name in the news even while she was sidetracked from performing and recording.

At any rate, You Needed Me remained a hot record for so long that Murray's pregnancy didn't keep her off the charts at all. Then I Just Fall In Love Again became another major hit. "So by the time I was ready to come back, I still had sustained that momentum. It worked out fine." In fact, motherhood has suited Murray's career so well that manager Leonard Rambeau jokes, "The last two singles have died. Any chance you could be pregnant again?"

State fairs, concerts and another new album

Looking toward the future, Murray's schedule comprises a number of major state fairs in the U.S., as well as another series of dates in the high-class clubs and halls. The state fairs in particular are a regular event for the artist. "They're great, because you do two shows a night and you can get to a lot of people. And the pressure's off - - everyone's dressed in jeans and T-shirts, and you come out and just sign your songs. It's real easy."

Following the summer season, Murray will be going back into the studio in October to record a new album, again with producer Jim Ed Norman. Norman has been the guiding light in Murray's recording career for the past four albums, dating back to the turnaround project of Let's Keep It That Way and of course, You Needed Me.

So with a long string of hits, Grammys and Junos, gold, platinum and multiple platinum records around the world, Anne Murray arrives as a genuine superstar, and perhaps the only one ever to come out of Canada. Although her first major release, Snowbird, quickly became a hit, it

hasn't all been easy for her. "The dues have to come sometime. For me, they didn't come before my first hit, they came after. But they've got to come."

And perhaps that's why, with all the honours, all the success and the trappings of stardom (even her own bank!), Anne Murray remains congenial and unaffected. "I don't really think about it at all," she notes.

"That's someone else. You have to step back and just remove yourself from it, and get on with it. That's part of the job, and that's what I do. It's all very flattering, but it doesn't hit you until later. It won't hit me for another couple of years, and I'll be walking down Hollywood and Vine and look down. But you can't think about that, or you get too involved in your own self-importance."

Toronto: Toronto-based rock group Rhinegold have signed a long-term international management agreement with Stephen L. Glass, also of Toronto. The group, who perform classical-influenced rock music, have been a regular part of the Ontario club scene for several years and have attracted a solid following.

Glass' clients for management include another Toronto act, Kid Rainbow. The manager has already been in contact with major North American and European record companies and publishers, and Rhinegold, as a result, are currently in the studio recording.

After several years more or less on the sidelines, Vancouver songstress Susan Jacks is back and, with highly acclaimed ex-husband Terry Jacks handling production, stronger than ever. This set is a basic adult contemporary collection of mostly ballads, ranging from the country-flavoured classics We Had It All and A Fool Such As I to the Bobby Lind penning of Elusive Butterfly and A Young Girl, once a hit for Noel Harrison. Four cuts were contributed by Terry Jacks, including the two singles released to date, All The Tea In China and Twice As Strong. Recorded at The Sound Works, Evergreen and Little Mountain Sound, Vancouver. Most of the strings arranged and conducted by Matthew McCauley.

VLADYMER ROGOV

Love Is A Killer - Change CLP-8011-J Rock

A German native of Russian background, and now a long-time Canadian, Rogov first sprung on the scene with a two-sided single, All Around The World/Dancing Girls, which achieved very strong airplay support. Those cuts are not on this debut album, but the material is just as idiosyncratic, unusual and strong. With production by pop session man J.J. Stewart and rock guitarist Stacy Heydon, the set blends pop accessibility with rock energy. The material, all original, bears both of those influences, a pinch of dance-oriented flavour, and even some progressive sounds, and as you might expect, a touch of Europe. Recorded at Sounds Interchange in Toronto. Lyrics enclosed.

FIST

Hot Spikes - A&M SP-4823-W Rock

Fist are a young rock band from Ottawa who first made the rounds a couple of years ago with an album on their own label. The set showed promise but never took off. Now with A&M, people should begin soon to get excited about this hard-driving four-piece group. Hot Spikes is basically a straight-ahead, no-holds-barred rock set, with the material written by group leaders Ron Chenier and Jeff Nystrom, who share lead vocals and play guitar and bass respectively (John Chenier plays drums and Ed Eagan keyboards). Mixed in with the rock are the odd pop-accessible song and two rock ballads, What Am I To Do and Lord I Miss You. Produced by George Semkiw at Amber Studios in Toronto.

A GUIDELINE AS TO HOW THE RPM 100 IS COMPILED

The RPM 100 is a national chart compiled weekly from national sales and radio station airplay and chart action. The top 50 records are computed from sales and airplay.

The computation of the records from 51 to 100 is based on early airplay, chart action and regional sales and breakouts. The chart is based on samplings from markets across Canada and indicates trends that may not be prevalent in all areas of Canada. Shaded numbers indicate a strong upward trend and gains in airplay or sales. This chart is offered as a guide to new product and an indication of trends in Canadian markets.

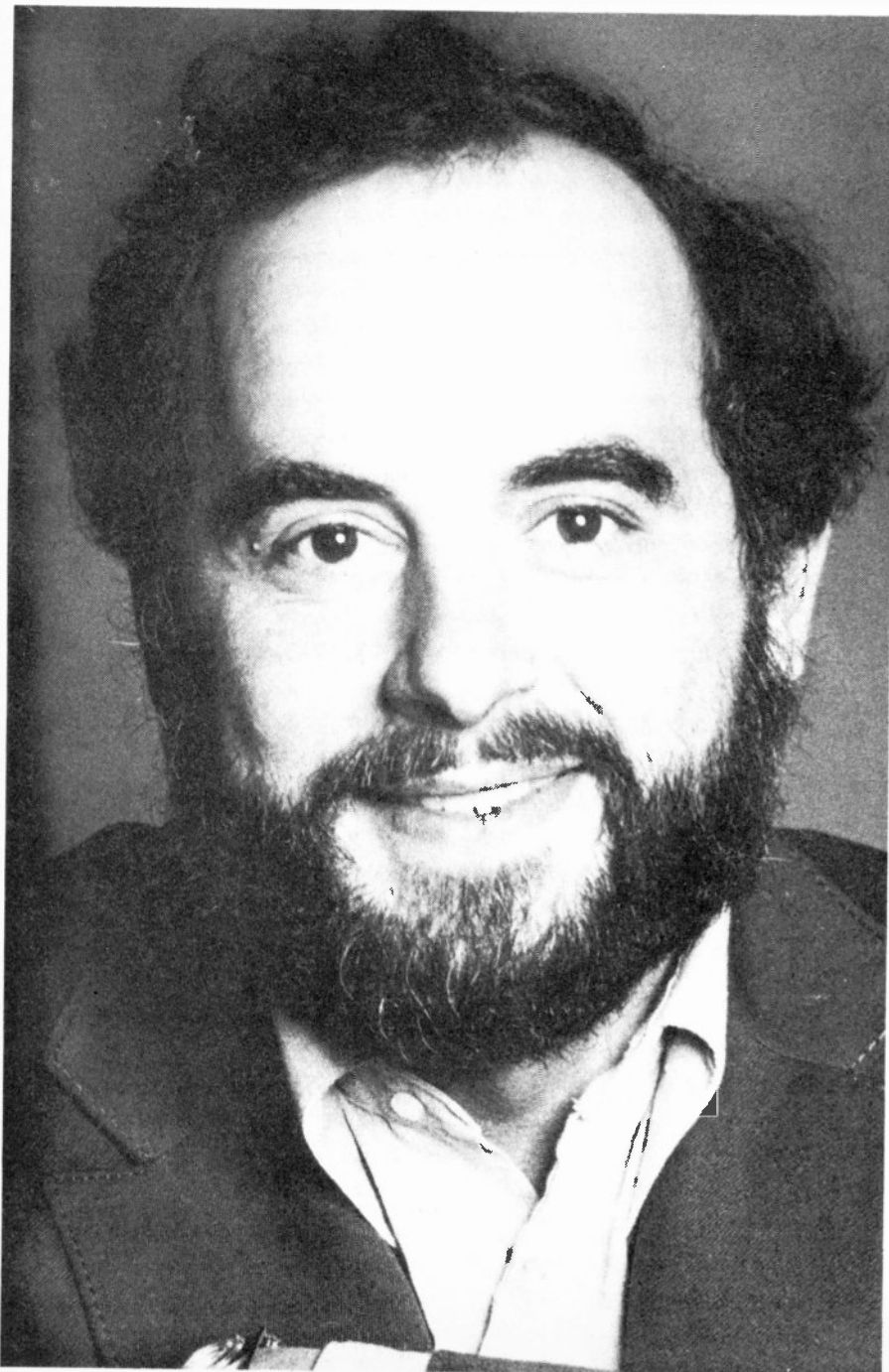

Belt-tightening good for the industry - Gerry Lacoursiere



A&M was one of the first of the independent U.S. labels to unshackle itself from a licensing deal and go solo. That was almost ten years ago. The times have been good for A&M over these building years but, like the record industry generally, A&M is beginning to feel the pinch of a world economic squeeze. Gerry Lacoursiere, President of A&M Records (Canada), talked with RPM's Walt Grealis, reflecting on the years gone by and how he views the record industry today.

Grealis: What's the biggest change in the business you've experienced lately?

Lacoursiere: Probably the cost of doing business. Let's look at nine and a half years ago when we broke the Miguel Rios record. The biggest plus we had was energy. If we wanted to buy an ad in RPM or anyplace else, look at the rates it costs now as opposed to then.

Grealis: I guess your staff numbers have changed as well?

Lacoursiere: Sure. If you'll remember back when we started, we had five people in the company - three of them out in the field, and we were able to generate the kind of enthusiasm and the excitement that was on the street. To duplicate that today, I don't know if it's the difference in the ideals of people or not. To come up with that today it would probably cost you fifty times as much, if you can actually do it. I remember sitting down with George Wilson of CFRB (Toronto), having dinner celebrating the Miguel Rios record, because Wilson was one of the first to play the record. Wilson was making comments about how we (A&M) had a great company. I remember telling him 'George you've got to realize one thing, you're talking to two fifths of the company, Liam Mullen.' He was surprised. 'You mean you only have five people in the company?' It was just that on the street we were bigger than life. I don't know if you can have that happen today.

Grealis: What's the personnel strength of your company in Canada today?

We went from five to eighty-five people.

Grealis: You would think it would be easier now.

Lacoursiere: One of the problems, as you grow, is the communication problem. Everybody's feeling and believing the same thing, at the same time. Whereas with five people it was very easy. There was never a communication problem with a small operation. I think that's one of the problems you do have as you grow. It's communicating the excitement immediately through the whole company.

Grealis: At five people what would your market share be?

Lacoursiere: At that point we weren't really interested in market share. We were interested in survival. In 1970 we did a million dollars the first year. Where the industry sales were in 1970, I'm not too sure.

Grealis: But obviously now, and with eighty-five employees, your market share has increased significantly?

Lacoursiere: Sure, plus the market has increased.

Grealis: You've probably had your share, perhaps a larger share of the supergroups, then any label?

Lacoursiere: I'd say we are a leader in this field. You're talking about Supertramp, Styx, Peter Frampton and Nazareth. I never thought of it that way but sure, we've had our share.

Grealis: The industry is obviously going through some trying times where the bottom line is becoming more and more prominent, making for cutbacks. Has this had a demoralizing effect on your employees?

Lacoursiere: Well, surprising as it may seem, we haven't had to resort to cutbacks, based on being forced into this situation. There may be a day when we'll have to get into that but fortunately we haven't got into that type of situation yet.

Grealis: Well, you must have undergone some change in thinking with regard to expenditures versus revenue?

Lacoursiere: Well, last summer we were affected indirectly through cutbacks that were happening in the States. Our people in Canada started to get a little nervous when they saw a number of people being released in the States and then a number let go in England. My answer to them was that there was no reason why we have to be faced with something like that because the main reason we are here is to create an act whether it's by us going into the studios, starting from scratch, like with a Bryan Adams or Shari Ulrich (Hometown Band) or any of our Canadian acts or taking a Supertramp and having a lot of success in the market before it happens anyplace else. If you look at our percentage of business compared to the U.S., you will notice we've always enjoyed a very good share, probably averaging out about 20%. Where we picked that up was not that we did a better job on a Peter Frampton, it was that we were selling Nazareth when they weren't selling Nazareth. Another was Chris deBurgh when they (U.S.) didn't know who he was. Supertramp, was much bigger here, proportionately, than anywhere else. That's where you pick up your market shares or your percentage markups to the States. There's no reason why we can't do that today with Sterling, Split Enz and Live Wire, as long as everyone in the company has the same attitude. There should never be a situation where you have to have

layoffs, unless the whole business is totally down, and even if you have a big record and you only sell a thousand copies, then you have to look at making some changes.

Grealis: So the morale factor at A&M is still very high?

Lacoursiere: Yes, the morale is high, not as high as it has been, because when you come off a year like last year, where we sold a million albums on Breakfast In America and a million on Crime Of The Century, it's very hard for your people to look at a 15,000 seller and be totally excited. Because we used to get excited in the past - when business was good, at 50,000, 75,000 and 100,000 copies being sold.

Grealis: What part of your operation suffers most when you're faced with a situation of not being able to duplicate last year's sales?

Lacoursiere: Expenses. You start asking questions before you make an expenditure, and if it still makes sense you go ahead and spend it. If you have doubts, you pass on that and maybe try to find another area.

Grealis: Now you're talking about cutbacks?

Lacoursiere: Yes, when you're looking at cutbacks you're trying to cut back in areas where it doesn't effect you on the street as far as gaining consumer sales. If you can cut back in other areas and spend your money a little more wisely to get to that consumer, to be a little more effective, that's what we look at as far as cutbacks are concerned.

Grealis: What you're saying then is that the image of A&M is very important and it doesn't suffer?

Lacoursiere: That's right. We don't want anything to hurt our street sales. We can look at paper sleeves, or no sleeves and I can pick up a lot of dollars on the bottom line.

Grealis: Do you believe that when things get tough you should concentrate heavier on promotion and publicity?

Lacoursiere: Yes - we try to be a little more active in this area because that's how you get to the street. If you stop and look at this business, the consumer is the only customer you really have. Everything else is middleman.

Grealis: What's your feelings about the real link between your product and the consumer - the \$3.00 an hour clerk in the retail store?

Lacoursiere: It's never been a happy relationship. In fact, in the past two months we've been trying to formally plan to get to that \$3.00 an hour clerk and make him part of our business, to let him feel the excitement of record entertainment. It's like a funnel-type thing. The lower down you get the less expertise you have, whereas at the top you might have a lot of expertise but it never flows down to the bottom, so you've got everything

trying to flow through this funnel and one comes out at a time where there's been a thousand put in. The \$3.00 an hour clerk may or may not be knowledgeable. In most cases, in the last four or five years, the \$3.00 an hour clerk has really upgraded himself, because you're getting more and more music people. They're there not because of the \$3.00 but because of a love of the music and excitement in the industry.

Grealis: Do they get enough incentive to really show an interest in the business?

Lacoursiere: I've always believed that the music itself is incentive.

Grealis: You're talking about the A&A's, Sam's, A&B Sounds and Records On Wheels - what about the K-Marts and Woolcos?

Lacoursiere: At the K-Marts and Woolcos you don't have the \$3.00 an hour clerks as I perceive them. You have the housewives who are putting in three days a week and I don't think you'll ever get them totally involved in the business of selling records unless you have a housewife clerk who is a Kenny Rogers fan. She'll do a hell of a job on Kenny Rogers but when it comes to Nazareth or Supertramp, Triumph, or Joe Jackson she doesn't care, period. And there's no way you're going to get her involved in that kind of music. Plus, the following week she might be selling candies anyway. There's no way, I don't think, that the industry can really upgrade that particular type of clerk.

Grealis: Has anyone tried?

Lacoursiere: Sure, but that type of clerk is going to be there for just a short period of time.

Grealis: Isn't management at those major department stores interested in increasing their business through more knowledgeable staff?

Lacoursiere: If they truly wanted to be in the record business, they should have someone specializing in music who is going to be in charge of that record department. They should know music and be able to train the staff so that they can give the kind of service that the customer may expect and get at the mainline stores. If you look at department stores, they're competing with price on a Yonge Street store. They're saying 'we don't have the markup to get the kind of people to really give the service.' It's because they just compete on the one level. But they don't realize they're not really competing with the A&A's or Wheels. The shoppers in department stores are a completely different kind of shopper. They may plan on going into a record store once a year, but they go into Eaton's or The Bay on a regular basis and when they go to the record department they're looking for a particular record. So the mix in a department store has to be a little more spread to get the classical, adult, the rock and roll and

children's records. Whereas a Records On Wheels doesn't have to have the same kind of spread.

Grealis: What you're saying then is that the department stores aren't really concentrating on one particular market?

Lacoursiere: The department store people can figure out the type of customer they have and what kind of customer the store caters to - and they should be able to gear down to that type of customer. They can do a lot more and be much more effective and not use prices as a barometer to compete.

Grealis: Is it harder to break a record today than it was?

Lacoursiere: Yes. I think the station formats have changed an awful lot. The tip sheets have become more and more the bible. The programmer still has the philosophy 'when in doubt, don't.' Some of the stations that were the pioneers in the past have now achieved gigantic ratings and they've adopted a philosophy that they would talk against, years ago, the 'when in doubt' philosophy. So they're no longer taking shots.

Grealis: Well, A&M has had good experience at accomplishing good record sales without the help of radio. Do you think you can still do that?

Lacoursiere: Yes - that has happened, at one point. A&M is only one company that was doing that, so there wasn't much competition for in-store play.

Grealis: Was that how you broke Supertramp?

Lacoursiere: We had help with radio, but it wasn't across the board help. We had a combination of in-store play and radio play. It worked very nicely together, beginning in Montreal. All of a sudden we had hit sales in Montreal and we decided to spread it. Outside of Montreal it was very hard to get play initially for Crime Of The Century. So our alternative was in-store play and, if you're the only one coming in to give the clerk an album to play, and no one else is coming in after you, you have a nice edge. I think in the last three or four years everyone is doing the same thing, so the competition has been much different.

Grealis: Does regional activity hurt you on Cancon releases?

Lacoursiere: To start it, no. But if you can't spread it, you've got to believe it can hurt you. If you get one market popping with a record and you're getting hit sales and you can't get, say a Toronto going on the record, and it takes you two months - by the time you get Toronto going on it, Vancouver, Calgary and Edmonton are finished and you end up selling as many records but you never get the same kind of stature for that artist or that particular record.

Grealis: Even if you do suffer from regional only action on a single, it

would still help with album sales wouldn't it?

Lacoursiere: Sure, if you break the single in every market, then you have a national hit, even if it wasn't national all at one time, you still get your sales. The album will come out and the act is known in every market so you're going to get the impact on the album that you might have lost on the single and, hopefully, the next time around everybody goes out of the box and you've got such a great single and nobody is worried about regions. It can drive you crazy when you have a record that's very big in Montreal, maybe a No. 1 record in Montreal with number one sales and you can't get anyone else to play the record at major stations outside of Montreal. Toronto doesn't play it, Calgary doesn't play it, Vancouver doesn't play it. At that point you know you have a hit record and once you look at it and, say we sold 50,000 records in Montreal and Montreal is 20% of the market - if everybody had played it in the same ratio, we could have sold 150,000 records.

Grealis: What irritates you most about the industry?

Lacoursiere: I think the lack of a feeling of excitement. The blase type of feeling, where it's not too cool to get excited about a record.

Grealis: Is this feeling something unique to Canada?

Lacoursiere: No - I think it happens in the States also, maybe to a lesser extent because you have more people to draw from. You may hit ten people and you have one guy who gets excited. Whereas here in Canada you may end up being in a particular market and you find that ten out of ten have the attitude of 'Oh yeah, what else is new.' I was talking to one of the major retailers recently and he made the comment that there's really nothing exciting as far as music coming out, and if you take that attitude there will never be anything exciting because what makes a record exciting is you getting excited about it. We, in the industry, are there to create this excitement, and if we don't get enthused about the product, how the hell is the consumer going to get enthused? Can you imagine someone walking into your store and asking 'what's new?' and you answer, 'Oh there's nothing exciting.'

Grealis: So what you're saying is the initial enthusiasm has to come from the people in the industry?

Lacoursiere: Absolutely.

Grealis: Are you finding it more difficult now to transfer this enthusiasm down the line, to the retailer, the racker?

Lacoursiere: Yes - I would think so.

Grealis: Is this because of their negative attitude toward the business?

Lacoursiere: Yes - the attitude is a major factor. Also, everybody is looking more and more at the bottom line.

Grealis: Are returns hurting more now than ever?

Lacoursiere: They have been hurting and I think we're also paying for a lot of sins from the last three or four years. We've always been into an up market and the philosophy has always been get more out there, where you might have been happy with an initial shipment of 50,000 and then you hear of another company that went out with 75,000, and you get caught up in a bidding war. You then have to get 75,000 and then 100,000, then 125,000. When time were good, no one worried about having an extra 500 records in the warehouse. All of a sudden the cost of money is up, business is down and now they're saying 'hey what do we do with these 500 records?' So they return it now when they should have returned it a year and a half ago. I think overall, the industry is going in a direction that's going to be very healthy for everybody - you buy and then you sell that through and you re-order. It's going to put a little more crush on the manufacturer to be able to supply on a short cycle, because you won't find people buying a three week supply and find out they have a three year supply. If you have 20, 30 or 40 accounts doing that, it doesn't take long before you're eating a lot of records.

Grealis: Are you getting tighter on returns now?

Lacoursiere: Depending on the account. We're always looking for a plus business when a salesman goes into an account, and if it gets to the point where at the end of the year we're not making any dollars servicing the account, somewhere along the line we're going to have to make a decision and decide if we're better off not being in business with these people and pull the plug.

Grealis: So you can see that this downturn is a temporary stop gap and it's eventually going to be good for the industry?

Lacoursiere: Definitely - I think it's going to get people thinking as far as the record business is concerned and not just strictly records. I think we always needed that kind of balance. Let's take the analogy that you can't make a hundred dollars a week and spend \$150. to live on. You have to live within your means and you have to have something extra for that rainy day. In any business, the extra is your profit. If you suddenly have a bad quarter or bad six months, you're not closing up shop because you don't have any more money. You go to the bank to draw on past profits to carry you through a bad time. There are many ways to stay in business - it just takes a little common sense and perhaps this belt tightening period we're going through now will bring about a better understanding of the business from all facets of the industry.

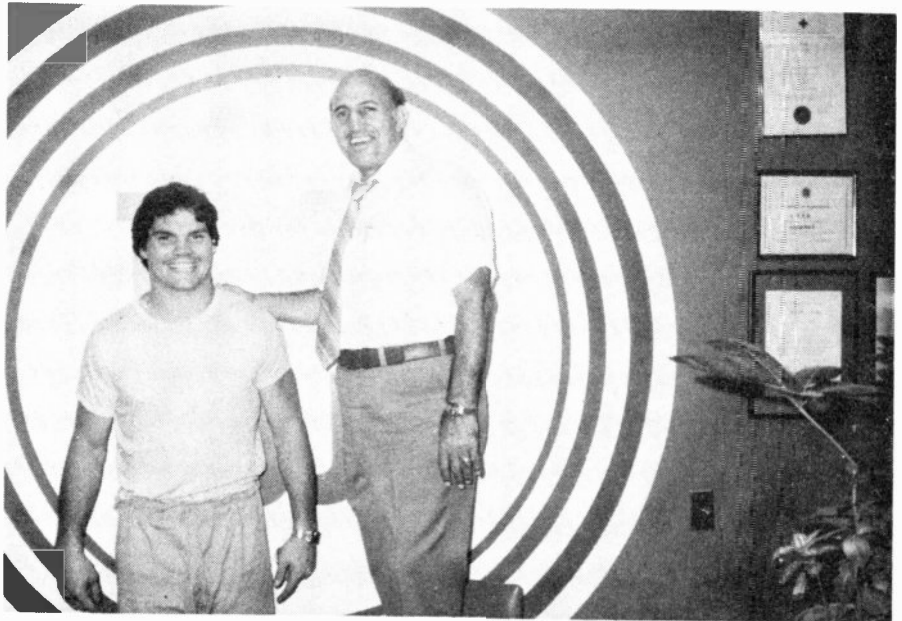

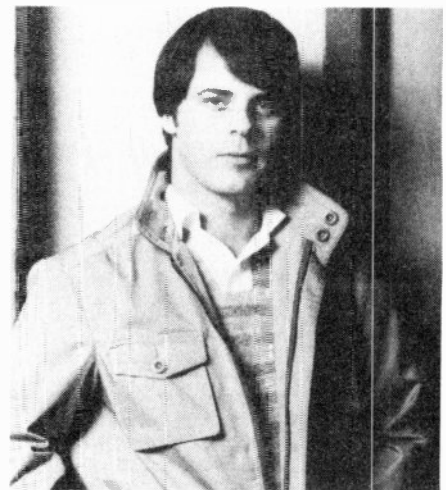

Edmonton's Dyna-West international in scope

Edmonton: It seems ironic that a well-known country backup group would choose a Canadian label to launch their product but that's what's happened for Dyna-West with Doyle Singer and the Buckaroos. Their first single, Nashville Woman, a Doyle original with Nobody's Fool, a Buck Owens classic on the flip, enjoyed moderate success in Canada and in the Southwestern U.S. The single also heralded a major change in the Buckaroos with Doyle, usually seen as a quiet bass player on the Hee Haw series, now becoming visible as a solo artist with the Buckaroos supplying instrumental backup. The other members of the group are Don Lee, lead guitarist, steelman Terry Christoferson, drummer Rick Taylor and Jim Shaw on keyboards.

Dyna-West has also created sound national recognition for their Canon acts. Tim Williams, who has become known from coast to coast and stronger with each release, garnered heavy airplay with his most recent release, Lean On Me.

Dave Paul and the Silver Dollar Band are now well established in the west and are readying their new album, Good As Gold. It's expected that several singles will be culled from the album. Meanwhile, the group have increased their activity on the

club and concert scene.

Patti Mayo is also enjoying national acceptance with her newest album release. One of the more popular cuts on the album, Love Me Or Leave Me, has added to the sales of the album with heavy programmer play of the cut attracting buyers, particularly in the prairie provinces.

New to Dyna-West are Loretta Lee and Greg Olson and both are expected to have product shortly. The latter introduced himself to local programmers with a regional release of Glen Reed's penning of Raging River.

Country music makes up a major part of the action for Dyna-West but they have also scored well with adult contemporary releases and signings. A European group, Peter, Sue and Marc, have become popular in North

America through their Dyna-West releases. The group's albums have gone gold in Europe and are expected to follow suit in Canada.

A local signing, Bayley and Creaghan appear to be gaining ground with the adult crowd through their first album release titled Music For Flute And Guitar. The album has shown early indications of popularity at the University Campus level and is now in its second pressing. A second album is already in the works.

Dyna-West is also active in the religious field. Ben Bogaardt of the Bogaardt Brothers, is on release with an album titled The Lord's Mountain Girl. Word of mouth reaction has already tagged this release a success with the possibility of crossover into the adult-oriented field through radio play.

CHARTOLOGY TRACES CANCON HISTORY HIT BY HIT FOR OVER A DECADE

Although the telephone directory isn't the greatest reading, we find that we can't be without it. In any reference that shows the names and numbers and figures, the story line is missing, but to many the story is told by what happened and who made it happen and the plot unfolds over the years.

In this chartology, Brendan Lyttle shows the history of those early days and names the artists who gallantly tried to cut hits in Canada. Often they did succeed on a regional scale or a national scale, and some even succeeded on an international scale.

It's all here. The names, the figures, the dates. If you follow the story line, it will lead you through the shabby three-track studios and the copy-versions of foreign hits, to the first poorly equipped four-track studio and eventually the 30% CRTC AM radio ruling that lead to Canada's superstars and the luxury of 24 and 32-track studios, the finest in the world.

The cast of characters reads like the who's who of Cancon. The plot thickens as some artists expatriate. The mystery of many artists' nationality. Are they Canadian? Is it Cancon? Explore the mysteries of the MAPL logo and find out about the CRTC regulation designed to solve the problem.

International intrigue enters the picture as some artists score with international chart listings and you'll hang in suspense as you watch a single climb to number one on Billboard and wonder if it will get a bullet.

This study is like a vault of Canadian gold, platinum and chrome and tarnished silver-plated stampers. Many of the records listed are collector's items while others are hits again on television promoted composites.

We wish we could list every composer of every song and every producer of every master and every manager, promoter and roadie who built this history of Cancon, but the research contained here was vast and only the dollars from the CRTC Research Directorate could make such a project possible, and the work of someone like Brendan Lyttle to bring it into being.

It doesn't end here. Today, the industry has a great deal of glamour and the new faces don't really remember that it had a lack lustre beginning and some of them don't care. For those who do care, this is a history book and an adventure that some of us were lucky enough to live through.

In the words of Pierre Juneau, "The prophets of doom, the messengers of mediocrity, will be overwhelmed by the new generation of competent, creative, confident artisans and by all those of preceding generations who have already demonstrated their freshness of mind, their talent and their capacity for inspired leadership."

That says it all.

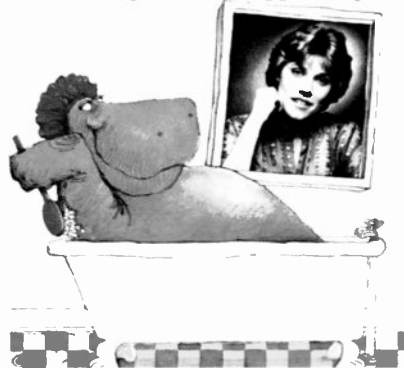
