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Scott Richards exits MCA

Toronto: The ongoing game of corporate changes and axings continues with foreign-owned record companies with yet another very prominent and capable young record executive becoming a casualty. Scott Richards, who headed up the MCA label in Canada as Vice President, has been given notice that his services are no longer required.

Mr. Richards, at 35, was one of the youngest top executives in the Canadian record industry and, in spite of his young years, is a seventeen year veteran of the business. He has been associated with MCA for the past eight years, the last four as head of the Canadian operation, one incidentally that fared better on the market, per capita, than the parent company.

Prior to that he was with RCA and before that was involved in sales and promotion for the Apex Company, a division of The Compo Com-

CRIA shows home taping widespread

Toronto: The first of two studies on home taping commissioned by CRIA has shown that the practice of home taping is widespread in Canada, CRIA President Brian Robertson said that officials in the Canadian industry share the views of those in the U.S. and Europe: home taping is eroding the business base of the recording industry. To find out to just what extent this is happening, two studies were commissioned one on blank tape sales was handled by Market Facts of Canada and a second is being undertaken by the Gallup Poll of Canada. The Market Facts study involved 2,000 tape recorder owners across the country. Over 81% admitted to purchasing blank tape for their own use, while 55.6% said that they used the tapes to record music from borrowed records (29.6%) and radio and TV broadcasts (26%). As well, 41.6% said they recorded music from their own record collections. Taping of music in a live situation amounted to only 3.8%, and the total amount of recording done for educational and spoken word purposes was 6.6 and 17.5% respectively. Regarding the types of blank tapes purchased, cassettes were dominant with 84.3% of the market. Eight track cartridges followed with 18.1% and reel-to-reel tapes came last with 12.9%. Respondents said that they favoured 60 and 90 minute tapes and bought at least six per year. Robertson said that CRIA is waiting for the results of the second survey before determining what action must be taken.

pany which, in 1971, became MCA.

Mr. Richards is highly respected in the industry for his innovative and creative abilities in the A&R and marketing fields. One of his greatest triumphs was the phenomenal success of Trooper, who in their seven years with MCA, have sold well over a million albums, nationally. Hot Shots alone has sold almost half a million copies. It was also Scott Richards who designed and executed the successful Neil Diamond, Diamond series and brought back the Apex label from obscurity to industry prominence.

One industry observer noted, "It's a sad day for the industry when a young, highly experienced record executive of the stature of Scott Richards becomes one of the pawns

of the business. Richards is a thinker and a doer and the industry can ill afford to lose someone with these credentials."

The industry in Canada has seen tremendous change over the past year. Although MCA sources are unavailable for comment, the company is reportedly in the midst of a major structural change in Canada and the U.S. which is creating concern in the industry as to the future of the label.

The MCA label operation will now come under the responsibility of George Burns, Vice President of MCA Distribution.

B.C. stages an all-out assault on Eastern Canada

If you were in the business during the mid-sixtics you might recall how the Quebec music industry came into its own. Quebec artists could sell hundreds of thousands of records within the boundaries of their own province. French language tabloids, of which there were many, were very positive about the Quebec groups and local radio stations were programming better than 30% Quebec content recordings. The result was an explosion in the Quebec music industry. Quebec had a point to prove and they went ahead and proved it.

The strategy that resulted in this explosion was peculiar to the Quebec music industry. However, the invasion of the rest of Canada with these highly successful regional records did not occur because of the language

barrier, and the refusal, at that time, of the Quebec groups to tour the rest of Canada.

Now the same thing is happening in British Columbia where the artists of that province are experiencing regional hits that are spilling over into the rest of Canada. B.C. has a point to prove and it would appear that there are enough people jumping on the bandwagon to hype local records, to show the east that the west is important. The hits are spreading into the east very successfully which all proves that the industry does run very well on positives even though they are regional, initially.

There is such a disturbing resentment of the east by the west that eastern acceptance of western product is, in fact, very good for the industry. The west has done this before with the Poppy Family, Terry Jacks and a few other recording acts but never on the scale of popularity they are currently enjoying. Ironically, there have even been a couple of eastern

groups that have succeeded past the barrier of the Rockies

It's hard to tell whether the same provincial and territorial squabbling goes on in the U.S., but since that industry is very healthy, it's doubtful that a hit in L.A. would be resented in New York City. If you call it protectionism, you might ask if hits in Canada are kept from happening in the U.S.

Considering that each area of Canada wants to play games with each other and since foreign records simply spillover into Canada as hits, we might suggest that very little can be done to create international hits if we are still fighting the concept of a national hit.

Therefore the best we can ask for is a few regional hits that might spill over into other parts of Canada while we fight over very provincial matters and each province does their sabre rattling. Not very smart nor productive.

Toronto: Arpad Joo, Music Director/Conductor of the Calgary Philharmonic Orchestra, has signed an exclusive worlwide contract with Sefel Records. A GUIDELINE AS TO HOW THE RPM 100 IS COMPILED

The RPM 100 is a national chart compiled weekly from national sales and radio station airplay and chart action. The top 50 records are computed from sales and airplay.

The computation of the records from 51 to 100 is based on early airplay, chart action and regional sales and breakouts. The chart is based on samplings from markets across Canada and indicates trends that may not be prevalent in all areas of Canada. Shaded numbers indicate a strong upward trend and gains in airplay or sales. This chart is offered as a guide to new product and an indication of trends in Canadian markets.

NEW ALBUMS

LOVERBOY

Columbia NJC-36762-H Rock/pop

Loverboy are a five-piece, Vancouver-based band founded on the roots of a lot of individual experience. The members' studio experience shows, but so does the group's own individual identity. Group founders Mike Reno and Paul Dean wrote most of the material. Reno's lead vocals, Dean's guitar and the keyboards of Doug Johnson are very much upfront throughout the LP. The Loverboy sound is very much driving rock, very accessible to both AM and FM formats, with rich harmonies and instrument blend. The songs are particularly strong, with colourful lyrics and themes, and among the best cuts are the first single, The Kid Is Hot Tonight, and two powerful songs, Turn Me Loose and D.O.A. Produced by Bruce Fairbairn at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound.

QUEEN

The Game - Elektra X5E-513-P Rock

Suggested List \$9.29

Queen have always turned out strong albums, and this one is no exception. There is a variety
of music here, with more of an accent on hard rock than in the recent past. There is also
a hint of rockabilly, as heard in such tunes as Crazy Little Thing Called Love and Don't
Try Suicide. The layered vocals that Queen popularized with Bohemian Rhapsody aren't
that prominent here, but crop up now and again. The title cut is the best example of that
style. Brian May unleashes some blistering guitar solos in songs like Dragon Attack and
even in Save Me, a tender ballad. Queen fans shouldn't be disappointed with this album.
Produced by Oueen.

BOB DYLAN

Saved - CBS XFC-36553-H Gospel/tock

Dylan's second gospel album is similar to his first in tone, but the tunes are much stronger in terms of writing and delivery. Most are moderately-paced songs, averaging around the five-minute mark. Covenant Woman clocks in at just over six minutes. The only rockers are Solid Rock and the title track; Are You Ready is a refreshing blues number. The element of black gospel is very prevalent in the arrangements, which are quite an improvement over Slow Train Coming. Dylan's voice is also much better, huskier than before but still rather nasal. All songs are Dylan pennings except A Satisfied Mind and Saved, co-written by Dylan and Tim Drummond. Recorded in Muscle Shoals and produced by Jerry Wexler and Barry Beckett.

GEORGE THURSTON

Premiere - Unison UNE-1003-H Pop Suggested List \$9.29 Long established as a major star in the Quebec market under the name of Boule Noire, Thurston makes his English language debut album in an impressive way, using veteran producer Peter Alves and the Muscle Shoals Rhythm Section, as well as a thorough selection of Montreal's finest session players and vocalists to create a rich set of strong material with a blend of sounds pretty much all its own. The music is very energetic without reverting to noise, the sound is clear and crisp, and the material (mostly contributed by the Montreal people involved in the project) is diverse and well-constructed. The set primarily blends pop and soul with a touch of reggae. Lyrics enclosed.

DAVID DUNBAR

In Concert - World Records WRC-1005 (J.C. Ent.) Classical Suggested List \$7.98 Don't be fooled by the title; this is a studio album. It's the first Canadian disc from this English transplant; it's a homegrown effort, recorded at Mercey Brothers Studio in Elmira, Ontario and engineered by Paul David Mercey. Modern pieces are on the first side, including three originals, with works by Haydn, Brahms and Chopin on the other. Dunbar takes many liberties in his own pieces; Prelude In Eb is perhaps the most experimental. Those by the masters are handled with much precision and expression. Dunbar pays a lot of attention to dynamics here. This album was mastered at the Lacquer Channel in Toronto and manufactured by World Records.

LOUIS LAWLOR

Classical Guitar - York Richmond Records WRCI-808 (J.C. Ent.) Classical S.L. \$7.98 Lawlor's excellent debut LP is clean and simple from the plain album jacket to the almost understated execution of the music. All pieces are rendered with care, although the Canadian guitarist seems to have chosen mostly sleepy tunes. Only the Sor studies, Villa Lobos' Prelude No. 3 and parts of the Albeniz standard, Asturias, have fiery passages. Also included in this fine package are Two Pavanes by Milan, written originally for the vihuela (a lutelike instrument) and selections from Bach's First Cello Suite. Recorded in England. No producer given.

THE HUNT

Back On The Hunt - Daffodil Records SBA-16058-F rock

This album by the Hunt is the band's first for Daffodil, It goes beyond the heavy metal syndrome and explores the realm of progressive rock at times, with exercisions into pop along the way. Like most hard rock bands, this trio base their sound around the guitar, but also add keyboards here and there for colour. Sometimes, the group resembles Max Webster in sound (If Only We Had Tried, Heart Bender), especially on side one. Pop is more abundant on the other side, most notably in the cover of the Beatles' It's All Too Much. The title tune is also very strong and has good single potential. Other noteworthy tracks include the Free tune, Little Bit Of Love, and Tell Me Why. Recorded at Master's Workshop, Toronto and produced by Steve Vaughan.

CBS Records is currently launching the recording careers of Loverboy, a new five-piece rock band out of Vancouver. The release of the group's debut album, self-titled, and a single, The Kid Is Hot, marks the second CBS project out of Vancouver this month, following hot on the heels of Straight Lines.

Loverboy are comprised of five

new band ready to break internationally well-established veterans of other major Canadian bands. The two founders, who also contribute most of the material, are guitarist Paul Dean and lead vocalist Mike Reno. They got together in early 1979 and began writing material and finding other musicians to fill out the band.

The first addition was drummer Matt Frenette, an experienced concert and studio musician. Next was keyboard player Doug Johnson, an imaginative musician who has also contributed some of the writing, notably on a very powerful song from the album titled D.O.A. Finally, rounding out the group is bassist Scott Smith, who also has an extensive background in the studio and on the road. And now, a year and a half later, Loverboy are with CBS and CBS is excited about it.

Paul Dean feels Loverboy is the end result of all the places where the group's members have been. He doesn't like to discuss past bands in which they have played, and while four of the members were born in Vancouver (bassist Scott Smith is a Winnipeg native), he adds, "We don't even really want to be from Vancouver - we'd like to be from the moon. We don't want any stigmas attached; we don't want any comparisons drawn." In other words, Loverboy don't want to be lumped in with the rest of the 'rising crop of West Coast bands. Dean allows that the group would like to be a rising band. "But we don't want to fall back on all our backgrounds. We want to try to avoid that. We're a brand new band from Mars!'

Loverboy are definitely a rock group. Their sound is powerful, driving, but at the same time, Dean's guitar work and Johnson's keyboards blend smoothly, and the band's harmonies are rich, giving the group a very mainstream sound which should be accessible to a wide variety of markets, formats and demographics. "I think it's pretty well mainstream," agrees Dean, "and I'm not ashamed of that. Mainstream today is a lot different than it was ten years ago. It's heavy, a little bit new wave - it's everything that we want to play and want to represent."

Going for AM, FM and live appeal

Unlike many new bands on their first albums, Loverboy should quickly establish a musical identity. They have a sound pretty much all their own, and their material is strong. Some of their themes and lyrics are a little unusual, which will only add to the group's identity. Johnson's contribution D.O.A., for instance, is about a girl runaway who finds life too fast in the fast lane. The single,

The Kid Is Hot, is about this week's rock star ("But where will he be tomorrow?"), and Prissy Prissy is a half angry, half sad song about a pretty face.

Paul Dean feels the album has appeal for more than just the FM fan. "When we conceived the album, we had about 30 songs to choose from, and we narrowed it down to nine. We wanted to be able to play it on AM and FM, and live, and we wanted to still be playing these tunes a couple of years down the road and getting off on them."

The Kid Is Hot is a mild shot at the success of the new wave fad, "In every bar that you go into," notes Dean, "every band is jumping on the wagon. They've all got their skinny ties and their buttons and short hair. I just took a shot at it. But I really love some of those bands it's just a friendly little jab.'

The Loverboy album was produced by Bruce Fairbairn (of Prism fame) at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound. The sound is rich, with carefully layered guitar, keyboard and vocal parts over a steady rhythm section. It doesn't really sound like there are a lot of parts, but Dean points out, "Some of the songs have three or four keyboard parts, and some have five or six guitar parts. But the way they're mixed, you don't really hear them." And what's most important, adds Dean, is that "Doug and I can cover them really easily on stage. We wanted to keep it fairly raw in the drums and the bass and vocals, but we kind of spruced it up a little bit with Nancy Nash doing vocals. We can't do that live, but we can cover the rest of it.

Setting up the tour with the success of the LP

The live show is very important to Loverboy. It was during a club appearance in Vancouver that the group was discovered by CBS, along with a number of other record companies, and it was CBS' A&R Director, Jeff Burns, who managed to land the group over the interests of several other labels.

However, in the immediate future, there are no specific plans for a Loverboy tour. That will wait the initial reaction to the album. Dean expects the group will be opening act on a concert tour in the near future, and Loverboy will be working on their concert show. "Right now, we're going to be doing warmups and keeping everything as efficient as possible. After that, when we've sold a few albums and get some production money, we'll be putting together a hetter show."

Right now, the group are playing in clubs, keeping their stage show tight while they wait for the album's release. "We're waiting for the album to break a bit of ground for us, to get our demand up. That's the way

it has to work - the album comes out, people start to hear it, people want to start seeing it, and then the potential for ticket sales is there. The promoters become aware of it, and they put you on a warm-up tour. There's so many bands around with albums out already who are trying to get the ball rolling for themselves, more than we could at this point. We're virtually unknown. But once the album's out, I can't see where there's going to be any problem getting the tour together.'

When the group start touring, they will likely be performing both in Canada and the U.S. CBS signed Loverboy in Canada, and when the album was recorded, it was presented to Columbia in the U.S. The American company liked what it heard and signed the group. The single will be out there at the end of the month, with the album following in mid-August. There may well be other international releases, too, Key representatives of Columbia U.S. and CBS Canada will be presenting the Loverboy album, along with various other projects, at a worldwide CBS meeting in the near future, and Dean feels confident there will be further signed release deals there.

The Loverboy show is a high-energy

one. The band work very hard, but Dean is quick to add, "We're not monkeys. We don't chase each other around and giggle in each other's ears. We're trying to have a little bit of class." And the crowds definitely get off. "That's how we geared our writing, to the street level. We play music for beer drinkers."

Should the debut album take off as CBS and Loverboy are hoping, the group don't intend to be a onealbum wonder. They have a lot of material ready, and expect to continue writing new songs. "We have about four albums worth right now," notes Dean. "We've got one recorded, and we've got about three more to choose from, to narrow down for the second album. And by that time, we'll have another album written, I'm sure. So we'll still have that three album margin. We're always writing. The unrecorded material is already road-tested. Loverboy have received comparably good response with it live, "And we've got a few gimmicks left," Dean adds. "We didn't want to pull all the stops out with the first album." It's the old argument of direction versus diversity, where a group can establish enough of its own sound to succeed without being so locked into that sound that it burns out quickly. It's a fine line, and Paul Dean is confident that Loverboy can straddle that line.

Sterling aren't your average city kids

New York City: Sterling, a new A&M group from New York, say that they would rather be city kids on their debut LP titled City Kids. However, the talent of this quartet shows them to be more than the average kids from the streets of New York. City Kids is fresh and energetic, full of brash rhythms, sparkling guitar work and crisp vocals. Sterling have only been together for two years and are comprised of bassist David Kissell, guitarist/ keyboardist Stevie Pickett, and brothers Steve and Mike Kehr on drums and guitar respectively. They would seem to be headed for the new wave slot (which includes almost anything these days) but maintain they are much more than just a new wave band.

The signing of the group is rather significant, especially considering that they were signed by none other than Jerry Moss, Chairman of the Board of A&M Records. David Kissell told the story of the 'discovery' of the group by A&M. "We were playing clubs in New York and developed a following. Through a time period of two years, we were playing the circuit and inviting a lot of record companies down. Jerry Moss came to New York with David Kershenbaum (who produced City Kids) and came to see us on a Thursday night. He listened to the first set, came backstage and said, 'Who do I talk to, who are your lawyers?' There was no messing around. He stayed for the second set, then we talked for a long time. The next day, we signed. It was that fast."

The music on City Kids shows a wide

variety of influences and styles, from hard rock to new wave. Said Kissell regarding this, "We approached writing as four individuals. Everybody writes in the band, and I think we've all got different influences. We've all grown up with everything from the late 60's and early 70's." A lot of the arrangements are similar to those of the Cars, but unintentionally. Most of the tunes average around the three-minute mark because Sterling didn't want their songs to have long guitar breaks. The vocals are divided between the four singers; Kissell's voice being the most distinctive due to its mellowness. And as on record, there are four singers on stage. Sterling have no set front man.

Their songs vary from topical themes to social satire; tunes like Robosexual and Phony People fit into the latter. Robosexual is not just a sci-fi tune. "It's a prediction of what the social problems may be in the future," said Kissell. "Everybody's talking about this lib and that lib. Just wait 'til they start having problems with robots."

One of the most outstanding cuts on the album, and the current single, is the cover of Baby It's You. "That culminated out of a lot of jamming," said Kissell. "We horse around in the studio with a lot of different stuff. One day, we were playing it, and it sounded hot so we played it live. That's the only copy tune we've ever played, outside of Brown Sugar and Please Please Me." Kissell said that they based their version on the hit by Smith some years ago. When asked if he'd heard the Beatles' version, he replied, "We didn't know until the record was released that the

Beatles even did it."

Leary of being labelled

Sterling are leary of being labelled. About the new wave sound, Kissell remarked, "We're influenced by it, but when you start with labels, you get into semantics. To some people, new wave would be exactly what we are, and others say we're a hard rock band. Different songs have different characteristics. Things like Robosexual have new wave in them, but It's Me is rock & roll. I think it's just what attitude suits the song. I don't feel you could do City Kid any other way.

way.
"Everything is done - not tongue in cheek - but with humour (especially the social satire material). We're not looking at anything negatively or indulgently. It's an observation of an issue (Robosexual, Phony People), and in a positive way. We really want to change the look of things, but we're not trying to be un-believable. We literally live what you see. There's a certain amount of honesty here as opposed to getting up (on stage) and faking it. We're not into any trick bag, even in the way we record. Every cut on the album was generally a first take, and we never went beyond three takes. That's one reason the live performance is true to the album. And Sterling certainly seem to be generating a lot of excitement with their live performances.

Capitol to release debut LP by Iron Maiden

Toronto: Iron Maiden's self-titled debut album will be released on Capitol's Harvest label. This album sold 200,000 units throughout Europe, Japan and Australia, and will be released in Canada during the week of July 14. These five British rockers also had two singles that made their way into the top five in their home land, Running Free and Sanctuary. Iron Maiden's line-up consists of Paul Di'Anno (vocals), Steve Harris (bass, vocals), Dennis Stratton (guitar, vocals), Dave Murray (guitar) and Clive Burr (drums). The band's success began last year; they proved their worth on a British tour with heavy metal act Judas Priest.

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Make Your Monday's Rock now Taylor's Showcase

Vancouver: The highly successful Make Your Monday's Rock, held at Gary Taylor's Rock Room in conjunction with CFUN, has completed its four phases during which 48 bands benefitted from the exposure. The series is now over and Taylor has announced that the Rock Room has now entered into a series of Showcase Nights. Like the Make Your Monday's Rock, the Showcase Nights

will showcase three bands each Monday night with each band representing a different music form i.e. rock, fusion, country etc.

Taylor explained to RPM that the main reason for the showcases are "to discover new bands, vocalist and instrumentalists who have little or no exposure, or have had exposure with little or no results. We also want to help these bands secure management, agencies, recording contracts and to give musicians the opportunity to play in a professional environment." Taylor continued with, "I think this would give them better insight as to the level of musical

competence they have reached." Taylor concluded with, "We really want to create an atmosphere of musical learning and the sharing of each other's musical knowledge, thereby speeding up the process of a serious career in the music industry."

Taylor is hopeful of receiving the same kind of support from the recording/music community as well as the press/radio/TV personalities as he did with his Make Your Mondays Rock promotion. Reflecting the West Coast's positive spirit about their entertainment industry Taylor notes: "We are continually trying to give as much exposure to local talent as possible. We totally believe that Vancouver will become one of the most important ports of music in North America. With encouragement such as our Showcase Nights, many of the young, dedicated bands are sure to make it."

Segarini signs to Anthem

Toronto: Toronto new waver Bob Segarini has moved from Epic to Anthem Records, and has been signed to a six-year recording and publishing agreement. Segarini made his vinyl debut on Bomb Records with Gotta Have Pop (which was issued on multicoloured vinyl for a limited time), then did his second album, Goodbye L.A., for the label. He is currently recording his first Anthem album (as yet untitled) at Studio 306 in Toronto.

Billy Joel on top of charts

Billy Joel is a double chart-topper this week. GLASS HOUSES stays at the top for the fourth week and IT'S STILL ROCK AND ROLL TO ME moves to number one on the singles chart. It's the same story at most stations right across the country.

The top quarter of the album chart remains quite stable this week. The greatest leap on the chart is made by the Rolling Stones' EMOTIONAL RESCUE. It jumps from 63 to 39. Bob Dylan also makes a substantial move upward from 64 to 49 with SAVED. CULTOSAURUS ERECTUS by Blue Oyster Cult on Columbia enters the chart at 87.

Some prime movers with tremendous radio response are: ECHO BEACH by Martha & The Muffins (number 6); TIRED OF TOEIN' THE LINE by Rocky Burnette (14), LET MY LOVE OPEN THE DOOR by Pete Townshend (22); and LET ME LOVE YOU TONIGHT by Pure Prairie League (27).

Watch out for the Manhattans' SHINING STAR (Columbia) at 68 this week and TAKE A LITTLE RHYTHM by Ali Thomson (A&M) at 69. Both are pleasant summertime tunes.

Rio Records - Record company with a distribution base

Toronto: Rio Records is a new company in the record business with a rather unusual approach to coming into existence. Where most young companies begin either as record producers and label or as distributors, Rio intends to do both. And where most such companies begin as a label and evolve into other areas, Rio has begun primarily as a distributor of other labels and product acquired through buy-sell, licensing and leasing deals.

Rio Records was founded last month by Dominique Zgarka and John Bennett, two young veterans of the Canadian music industry. Bennett's history includes publishing experience with Marc Jordan's catalogue (through manager Bernie Schaeffer) and a period administrating Capitol's Screen Gems Music. More recently, he spent a year as a product manager with CBS Records, and he also has management involvement with Edward Bear and Marc Jordan.

Zgarka entered the industry in Montreal during the heyday of disco, when he became involved in an export/distribution business, Downstairs Records. He also spent time with Trans Canada Records, before joining CBS Records as Disco Product Manager. Zgarka later returned to Trans Canada to open the company's Toronto offices, and when those

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offices closed, he and Bennett formed Rio Records.

Between them, Zgarka and Bennett have substantial experience in many areas of the music business, and their complementary understanding of those areas prompted them to form the company together. As Bennett notes, "I'll find them and he'll sell them."

Distribution is the initial priority

Most new record companies begin with a couple of acts, producing and releasing their records, and then perhaps evolving into publishing, management, and occasionally, distribution. With Rio, it's the other way around. Bennett notes, "We have buysell arrangements, we distribute other labels, and we are in the midst of signing some acts directly. Rio Records is a label, but the major part of the umbrella is a distribution company.

However, unlike most Canadian distributors, Rio doesn't set up warehouses and deal with rack jobbers directly. Zgarka explains, "When I was with Trans Canada, I saw the hardships of starting in distribution, and also the fact that by starting a new distribution house, it's obviously weaker than the established ones. We decided it would be better for us to have somebody distribute us. Then we had the two avenues of either the majors or the independents. For all kinds of reasons, we took a different system than usually exists in Canada. We went to three different independent distributors.'

An independent network

Rio will be considered the national distributor for its product, but handling the physical distribution, region by region, will be Dee Jays Music in the West, an established top distributor; Zgarka's former company, Downstairs Records, in Quebec (a young, aggressive company whose credits include the Freddie James hit of last year); and another aggressive and fast-growing company, Trend Records, in Ontario, Manitoba and the East. In fact, for Trend, the acquisition of the Rio product has led to the addition of extra office and warehouse space and sales staff. The two companies hope to grow together.

Actually, Rio's system is similar to that used by many large U.S. independents, and Zgarka notes, "So far we're very happy with the system." Bennett concurs. "We can demand a degree of attention from these people that we know we couldn't from a major, which might be putting out ten new albums a week." And the advantage of working more closely with the independents, Bennett adds, is "the idea of selling every last album we can sell on a record, whether it's

at 9,000 or 59,000."

Rio signs Bomb Records

Rio Records has already begun to amass an impressive catalogue of product and labels. Perhaps foremost among these is Toronto's Bomb Records. Rio will distribute, through its independent network, all existing and future Bomb product except for certain titles by the Wives and Segarini (there will be a live broadcast LP by Segarini titled On The Radio). In addition to Bomb's flow of leased product releases from Europe, upcoming Bomb product includes new domestic product from three Ontario rock groups, the Secrets, the Scenics and True Confessions.

In addition, Rio's agreement with Downstairs is a reciprocal one in which Rio will distribute outside of Quebec all of Downstairs' own product, an agreement which involves material in English and French. Artists include such names as Freddie James, Geraldine Hunt and the Zebras (formerly Moonquake). Separate from those agreements is a deal with the group of labels under the Panache umbrella. The labels hail from France but release largely English language product.

Another label deal is with Vierge Records out of Quebec, a label owned by the prestigious Bobinason studio. The label includes many noteworthy Quebec artists who will be recording English albums in the near future. Vierge product, both French and English, will be distributed nationally, including Quebec, by Rio Records. Rio has also completed a label deal with the Toronto-based Ultra label, whose catalogue includes product by O Ji Ji and Jeannette Brantley. A number of other deals are in the works, both domestic and international. In fact, Bennett notes that even without advertising of any kind, people around the world have learned about Rio Records and are sending tapes.

Bennett describes Rio's first priority as distribution, "making sure the distributors know how we think, how we want to market records, and so forth." Marketing will usually be an important part of the services Rio will provide. And even, as with Bomb Records, when the company chooses to do its own promotion, Rio will be involved in other marketing operations, such as merchandising at the point of purchase.

The basic Rio staff at present consists of Bennett and Zgarka. There is also a Montreal office. Working the French product there will be Gilles Gravell, a noted producer, and another producer, Pat Deserio, will be handling English language material. Zgarka's brother Michel, another veteran of the Quebec music scene, will also assist the Montreal

office. The Rio staff will be supplemented by independents working on various projects as they come up. Using independents, Bennett and Zgarka explained, will ensure the most enthusiastic people working each individual project in each market.

In the future - label, publishing & management

Of course, Rio Records is also a label, and although the label's current releases are all product acquired from outside, Zgarka and Bennett do plan to establish a roster of their own. Bennett, who will be in charge of A&R, points out, "We had anticipated taking three or four months to do that, but we've come across an act that we're really interested in, and we'll probably speed that whole process up."

The company's rationale is that by establishing the distribution operation, Rio will free enough funds to take the risk of recording a new act, and even more importantly, the firm will be able to develop the act's career by producing more than one record before needing to turn a profit. Many new labels fail because their new artists don't become profitable before the money runs out. Rio's distribution success will hedge against that danger.

Rio Records would like eventually to branch into publishing and management as well. The publishing will be delved into selectively (Rio already administers some of its French language titles), and only when Bennett and Zgarka feel they can exploit the material. "It's important to stress that we don't want to be sharks about it," notes Bennett. "We don't want to just have a catalogue of hundreds of songs hoping one of them's going to click one day."

Management is a more long-term goal. Rio would like eventually to handle the careers of some of the artists signed to recording deals with the label. Again, the company is fitting those plans into its philosophy of doing what's best for the acts and the firm. "At a certain level," notes Bennett, "bands don't need managers, and they're just throwing away a percentage of their income by having one. At another level, they definitely do need management, and an awful lot of mileage can be gotten out of a good act."

Rio Records doesn't intend to become locked into a specific musical image. "I think one of the big traps in starting a company is having all your eggs in one basket, having all your attention focused on a particular market," Bennett stresses. "Who are we to tell the public what they should buy? So we'll have classical product, country, disco, rock - everything." "We're not going to be one of those companies that specialize in one kind of music," adds Zgarka. "There's nothing wrong with that, but it's just not our idea."

Vancouver's Ironhorse part with Scotti Bros.

Lynden, Washington: Guitarist Randy Bachman and keyboard player Frank Ludwig, the leaders of Ironhorse, have announced an amicable parting of the ways with the group's label, Scotti Brothers Records. Under the separation, attributed to musical differences, all contractual obligations are severed.

The split between group and label comes shortly after the release of a second Ironhorse album, Everything Is Grey, as well as a single from that album, What's Your Hurry Darlin'. In a communique issued from the group's Lynden, Washington headquarters, Ironhorse sources noted that the Scotti Brothers label's recent severance of its international distribution commitments limited the label's marketing effectiveness. The communique said in part, "Although What's Your Hurry Darlin' reached top ten charts in western Canada and received strong playlisting elsewhere, it suffered from minimal product release, U.S. shipping problems and U.S. parent company instability resulting from the Scottis' break with WEA International and the Greenburgs' departure from Atlantic (Scotti Bros.' distributor) to form their own Atlantic-distributed label."

Ironhorse is a project which was established by Bachman last year along with another guitarist, Tom Sparks. They released a debut album, self-titled, at that time, along with a single, Sweet Lui-Louise, a Bachman penning. For the veteran Bachman, the group was the next step in continuing career which had achieved major international prominence with the Guess Who and Bachman-Turner Overdrive, plus a degree of national success with Brave Belt and with a solo album, Survivor. This year, keyboard player Frank

Ludwig replaced Tom Sparks in the group. Sparks remains close to Ironhaving contributed material and musicianship to the new album and maintaining close personal ties with the other group members.

But it is the addition of Ludwig to the Bachman team which is likely to solidify the success story. Formerly a key member of Trooper, another very prominent Vancouver-area band, Ludwig is a very strong singer and musician. And as a writer, his credentials are well-established. Ludwig's pennings include Round Round We Go, one of Trooper's biggest hits. Of Ludwig, Randy Bachman notes, "Frank fills the void of co-writing and lead vocals that Burton Cummings and Fred Turner did in the

"When I was with Tom Sparks," Bachman explains, "it was more like two soloists. We weren't really like a group. We didn't complement each other enough to sound like a group. But I'm really a fan of Tom's, the way he plays and writes and sings.'

Bachman had been Trooper's producer through the first five albums, and had known Ludwig well. When Ludwig decided to leave Trooper, he approached Bachman, and it evolved from that into a full partnership in the creative end. Ludwig recalls, "It dates back to the time when Randy was no longer going to be producing Trooper. We met out in the hall, and he said, 'You know, if you ever get tired of working with Trooper, I'd love to work with you." It turned out that Ludwig had, in fact, been considering leaving Trooper, which wasn't offering him the outlet he needed as a singer and songwriter.

One thing led to another. "We started writing together," says Bach-

man. "He just kind of fit into Iron-horse." So Sparks left the group, but they remain close. Bachman is producing a solo album for him including, among other material, most of the Sparks songs originally destined for the Ironhorse set. "It sounds terrific," notes Bachman, "but it's very difficult to believe that it's the same musicians on both albums.

As a member of Ironhorse, Luclwig has fit right in, up front with Bachman, playing the keyboards and handling most of the lead vocals. Bachman notes, "For me it was a treat to find a guy with his type of voice, that is so flexible, who can sing ballads as well as screaming rockers. My voice is only good for certain songs. Frank has a well-rounded voice. It was like finding another Burton Cummings. And Frank's as good a writing partner as I had in Burton.

Also of major significance is Ludwig's considerable skill as a keyboard player. What he has added to Bachman's guitar is a warming effect and a diversity of sound, a diversity that made the current album much more pop-oriented than the Ironhorse debut.

One song Ludwig did not write with Bachman was the single, What's Your Hurry Darlin'. The song was co-written by Bachman with Carl Wilson of the Beach Boys, a teamup that was made last summer when Ironhorse opened a Beach Boys tour. Originally a ballad, the song was sped up somewhat into a pop song. It was one of several songs the two wrote together - two of them appear on the Beach Boys' Keepin' The Summer Alive LP.

Ludwig handles lead vocals on the single, a last-minute decision made by Bachman when he realized Ludwig could sing the song better ("It's tough to be your own producer," Bachman sighs.). The song spent almost three months on the national charts in Canada.

With the split from Scotti Brothers, the status of Ironhorse is now undetermined. Bachman and Ludwig are continuing to work together, although there is a likelihood of a change in the group's name. The two are now finishing demo tapes for a new album project, and several majors have already shown an interest. In Canada, though, Everything Is

In Canada, though, Everything Is Grey continues to achieve good sales and media acclaim, and Bachman and Ludwig are hoping to continue marketing the album. They will be releasing a follow-up single, a much heavier tune titled Symphony.

As was the case last year, the success of the current projects remains very important. Neither Bachman nor Ludwig is interested in having people come to see them for nostalgia reasons. Bachman notes, "We don't want to go out and have Frank sing Round Round We Go and have me sing Taking Care Of Business. We're not Sha Na Na yet! We want to be able to go out and have the new material recognized." - J.J. Linden

Jazz comes to Summerfolk '80

Owen Sound, Ontario: This year's Summerfolk Festival in Owen Sound will have a touch of jazz with an appearance by the David Amram Quintet. Included in this group of musicians are Ray Mantilla, Steve Berrios, Jerry Dodgian, Victor Vanegas and of course, Amram himself. They will focus on latin-American jazz. Also coming to the festival will be Chicago blues and jazz pianist Blind John Davis, and the Empire Stove & Furnace Dixieland Jazz Band. These jazz artists will appear with the usual blend of folk and blues the festival is known for. It all happens at Kelso Beach on the shores of Georgian Bay, August 15-17.

Gordon Lightfoot on tour

Toronto on September 1 with further dates in Ontario at the end of the month. Then it's back to the U.S. in October and November, with an appearance in Vancouver slated for November 15. The date that was to follow there on the next day has been cancelled.

WEA recording artist Gordon Lightfoot will be on tour in the U.S. during the month of August, working from east to west. Most of the engagements will be in smaller cities with a few stops in major markets like L.A., San Diego, Highland Park (Chicago) and Minneapolis. He will be in

Percy & The Teardrops release Almost Live

Kingston, Ontario: Percy & The Teardrops, a Kingston-based rock & roll band, have released their first album on their own Drop label. Titled Almost Live, the album is an accurate portrayal of the band on stage, as the bedtracks were done in a scant three hours at Marc Sound in Ottawa. To get the right feel for things, the group had to go through their stage moves in the studio. (It must have looked pretty strange to the engineers.) The material is a cross-section of what they do in concert.

The LP opens with the Ventures' classic Walk Don't Run and moves through a well-balanced mixture of

infectious rock & roll tunes and sentimental doo-wop ditties. Two other instrumentals (Bumble Boogie and Guitar Boogie Shuffle) are present, as are a couple of originals penned by keyboardist John Stimpson, Rock 'N Roll Train and Coconuts & Island Ladies. The latter is more of a ballad than an old-style rock & roll tune. According to Percy (Tom Revell), the songs are among their most requested and were put on the LP as a thank you to the fans. Bill Haley's Rock Around The Clock is at the top of the heap in this category.

The album was done, said Reveil, to sound like a live set on stage. The group wasn't after a big production effort or super sound quality, but merely an album full of energetic rock & roll - a party album. Because there wasn't much overdubbing, the sound remains faithful to the live context and the versions of the songs are fairly close to the originals. Rather than being something new, Almost Live is really a compilation of what Percy & The Teardrops have done in the past. More original material will be included on the next LP, as the hand is slowly moving away from the greaser image.

Percy & The Teardrops came into being in 1971 when rock & roll was not exactly a popular thing anymore. "We are one of the original new wave bands," said Revell. "We were playing rock & roll when it wasn't cool." But they've always had an audience, and most of their dates have been one-nighters. They have also been lucky enough to work around home much of the time, and even have weekends off once in a while.

Since 1971, 15 Teardrops have passed through the ranks and only

two originals remain. drummer Percy Moran (aiias Tom Revell) and bassist Simon J. Lemox (Joe Brady). The others are rhythm guitarist B.J. Boomer (Bernie Smith), who handles most of the lead vocals, keyboardist Ike 'Fingers' Taylor (John Stimpson), and lead guitarist Smitty Gilles. The group doesn't really have a set front man; Percy is in charge of all theatrics.

On stage, they run through three sets, a 50's rock & roll set, a 60's British pop set, and an up-to-date new wave set of rockabilly numbers that are now in vogue. These days, grease is a big thing in bars, thanks to TV shows like Happy Days and Sha Na Na. And with the success of new wave acts like Elvis Costello and rockabilly artists like Robert Gordon, things are really starting to happen for Percy & The Teardrops.

CANO in free concert in Ottawa

A&M recording artists CANO participated in a free concert in Ottawa's Major Hill Park, June 30. The event was sponsored by CHEZ-FM radio, Carling Brewery and the Canada Day committee as part of the Canada Day celebrations. The concert began at dusk and continued for three hours. Fist, a new A&M signing out of Ottawa, opened for CANO before an estimated 45,000 fans. Fist's debut album, Hot Spikes, is slated for a July 15 release. CANO will be playing select dates in Ontario, as well as four on the current Joan Armatradings tour. After that, CANO will head back into the studio to start working on their next album.

has undertaken an enormous project. Over 45 stations across the country are already involved and the excitement is growing. Private AM radio must keep in tune with the times, and Sunday Sunday will provide the information and entertainment in a popular format that radio audiences desire.



Industry endorses new nomination method

Toronto: The July 12th issue of RPM outlined the new nomination procedure for the Big Country Awards, and the overall reaction would indicate that the industry sanctions this change.

"Many influential people within the country industry have given the new system their vote of approval," says Walt Grealis who is the originator of the Big Country Awards. "We must move ahead and not stand still in this fast moving business, and this change is a step in the right direction.

There was one letter and a couple of phone calls indicating confusion and opposition to the changes but these are thinking people and they realized how progressive the idea was and it appears now to have strong endorsement by the majority of the

country music community.

"Country people are, for the most part, sensible people and they must realize that six years ago when we started Big Country and then ACME that we have made a significant contribution to the Canadian country music industry. We want to do everything possible to promote the industry. We would never do anything that

would hurt the industry and we felt, that since changes had been suggested many times, we would like to see this progressive move happen. I can see where a few people might not have read the changes thoroughly or might not have understood them, but I'm sure a few enquiries would clear up any difficult areas."

Apparently the main concern was that the nomination ballot appeared to reflect the last three months. This new system is considered much better because it is tabulated on the last twelve months.

"Who could argue with the logic

of this sytem?" asks Stan Klees the co-founder of the Big Country Awards, "It must make sense to everyone. It's just logical and the results are what matters, not the grumbling from a few negative people. Do we want the Canadian country industry to stand still?"

All the categories would be based on twelve months of chart action with a point system. Television Show, Country DJ and Artist Of The Year would be write-ins.

Nominations will be announced on July 31st with the voting ballot being mailed August 8th.

Besides doing his own material, he has written songs for the Allen Sisters and the Rhythm Pals. He got his big break when Emcee Productions, originally formed to promote Canadian talent, put up the money for a demo session in which

he recorded four tunes, Emcee also published those songs and got Anderson the deal with Maple Haze. From there, Burns did all the leg work, and the album was roughly a year in production. McCallum considers Shoppin' Bag Lady to be one of the most expensive country albums produced in Canada. A major promotion-

al push is planned by Maple Haze upon release of the LP. The second single, scheduled for release just before the album, will be the title track. Both Anderson and McCallum have a lot of faith in Maple Haze. Said McCallum, "It's independents like this that are keeping country going in Canada."

Snocan's Jim Allen Prepping for Winnipeg

Brampton, Ontario: Snocan recording artist Jim Allen, currently making gains with his Snocan single, Gee I'd Love To Be With Her Tonight, is currently preparing a promo and performance tour of South Central and Northern Ontario that will bring him into Winnipeg in time for Big Country. Allen and his group, The Way It Is, have just completed a series of dates in Ontario including the Seaburg Hotel in Wallaceburg after which they moved on to North Bay. After a week off, the group's first holiday in several months, they will prepare for their trip west.

Allen is actually a native of Brandon, Manitoba and is looking forward to reaquainting himself with on-air personalities from many of the Mani-

toba centres who will be attending Big Country.

Allen's group comprises drummer Steve Brennan, bass man Gary Yardley, Mike Burns on lead and Allen who plays keyboards, fiddle and lead guitar. The Tonight single, an Allen original was produced at Ottawa's Snocan studios.

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
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
